# CAROLINA RETURNS FROM BYE WEEK TO HOST ARIZONA CARDINALS

# CAROLINA VS. ARIZONA

Carolina is back in action this week as the team hosts the Arizona Cardinals in a game at Bank of America Stadium.

Carolina enters the game at 1-5 while Arizona holds a 3-3-1 record following a 6-6 overtime tie against Seattle on Sunday Night Football.

Despite not playing in the same division, the Panthers and Cardinals are familiar foes. Sunday's game will be the 10th matchup between the teams in the last 10 seasons, including three postseason meetings (2008, 2014, 2015).

The teams last met in last season's NFC Championship.

- Panthers wide receiver Ted Ginn, Jr. played for the Cardinals in 2014.
- Panthers long snapper J.J. Jansen is a native to Phoenix, Ariz.
- Panthers running back Fozzy Whittaker spent time during the 2012 season on Arizona's practice squad.
- Panthers cornerback Teddy Williams appeared in three games for Arizona in 2013 at wide receiver, recording one reception for 51 yards and one touchdown.
- Cardinals general manager Steve Keim played collegiately at North Carolina State.
- Cardinals assistant head coach/offensive coach Tom Moore worked as the offensive coordinator at Wake Forest University in 1969.
- Cardinals offensive coordinator Harold Goodwin is also a native to Columbia, S.C.

## THE HEAD COACHES



### Ron RIVERA

NFL: 20th season Panthers: 6th season

**Regular Season:** 48-37-1 (.564)

**Postseason:** 3-3 (.500)

Ron Rivera became the fourth coach in Carolina Panthers history on January 11, 2011.

In five seasons, Rivera has guided the team to a Super Bowl appearance, an NFC Championship and three NFC South titles. He is a two-time (2013 and 2015) Associated Press NFL Coach of the Year award winner.

In 2015, Rivera led the Panthers to the second Super Bowl appearance in team history following a franchise-best 15-1 record and their third consecutive NFC South championship. In the process, Carolina became the fourth team in the Super Bowl era to start a season 14-0, joining the 1972 Miami Dolphins, 2007 New England Patriots and 2009 Indianapolis Colts. Carolina's 18-game regular season winning streak was the longest in NFC history. In 2014, Rivera led the Panthers to their second consecutive NFC South championship and the team's first playoff win since 2005. The Panthers became the first team since 1970 to overcome a six-game losing streak and win their division. In 2013, Rivera directed Carolina to 12 wins, the NFC South title and its first playoff appearance since 2008.

Before joining the Panthers, Rivera was an assistant coach with the San Diego Chargers (2007-2010), Chicago Bears (2004-06, 1997-98) and Philadelphia Eagles (1999-2003). In 2006, the Bears defense led the NFL with 44 takeaways, helping propel Chicago to an appearance in Super Bowl XLI. He is just the third Latino head coach in NFL history, joining Tom Flores with the Oakland Raiders (1979-1987) and Seattle Seahawks (1992-94) and Tom Fears with the New Orleans Saints (1967-1970).

A second-round draft choice in 1984 by Chicago, Rivera played nine seasons with the Bears. Primarily an outside linebacker, he was a member of the 1985 Super Bowl XX winning team.

Rivera played linebacker at Cal (1980-83), where he finished as the school's all-time leader in sacks (22) and tackles (336).

Born January 7, 1962 in Fort Ord, Calif., Rivera and his wife, Stephanie, have two children—Christopher and Courtney.

### **Bruce ARIANS**

NFL: 24th season Cardinals: 4th season

**Regular Season:** 37-17-1 (.682)

**Postseason:** 1-2 (.33)

Bruce Arians became an NFL head coach for the first time when hired by Arizona on January 17, 2013. He led Cardinals to 10-6 record in 2013 and the following year was selected as AP NFL Coach of the Year by leading Cardinals to an 11-5 mark. Arians also won Coach of the Year in 2012 with Indianapolis and became the first person in NFL history to win NFL Coach of the Year honors twice in a three-year span with different teams.

In Arians' first season with the Cardinals, the team finished 10-6. Arizona doubled its win total from 2011 and the five-win improvement equaled the best one-season turnaround in team history. Arizona's 11 victories in 2014 tied the franchise record for wins.

Arians came to Arizona after working as offensive coordinator for the Indianapolis Colts in 2012, while also serving 12 games as interim head coach during Chuck Pagano's absence while being treated for leukemia. He led Indianapolis to a 9-3 record and helped the Colts clinch a playoff berth while tying the NFL record for most wins ever by an interim coach.

Arians previously coached at the pro level with Pittsburgh (2004-11), Cleveland (2001-03), Indianapolis (1998-2000), New Orleans (1996) and Kansas City (1989-1992).

Arians played quarterback (1972-74) at Virginia Tech. Collegiately, he was head coach at Temple (1983-88). He also coached at Virginia Tech (1977), Mississippi State (1978-1980, 1993-95) and Alabama (1981-82, 1997).

Born October 3, 1952 in Paterson, N.J., Arians and his wife, Christine, have two children—son, Jake and daughter, Kristi Anne.

# CAROLINA 49, ARIZONA 15 NFC CHAMPIONSHIP

#### JANUARY 24, 2016 • BANK OF AMERICA STADIUM • CHARLOTTE, N.C.

Carolina won the NFC Championship and advanced to the second Super Bowl in franchise history with a 49-15 victory over Arizona at Bank of America Stadium. Quarterback Cam Newton threw for two touchdowns and ran for two more to become just the fourth quarterback in NFL history to produce multiple rushing and passing touchdowns in the same postseason game. Defensively, linebacker Luke Kuechly and safeties Kurt Coleman and Tre Boston came up with two takeaways. The Panthers dominated the early portions of the game to take a 24-7 lead into halftime. Following halftime, Carolina took the opening kickoff of the second half and kept the ball more than seven minutes before kicking a field goal. The defense - minus linebacker Thomas Davis (arm) and safety Roman Harper (eye) - then forced a three-and-out. Carolina then marched 79 yards, finished off by Newton runs of 11 and then 12 for the touchdown for a 34-7 lead. Carolina started the game hot as the team's first three drives of the game resulted in scores. Kicker Graham Gano got it going with a 45-yard field goal, then Ted Ginn, Jr. found the end zone against his former team. After Ginn set the table with a 32-yard punt return, he scored on a reverse from the 22-yard line when Newton faked a handoff, faked a run and pitched it back to Ginn, who eventually weaved his way all the way back across the field for the touchdown. On Carolina's next possession, facing a third-and-long from its own 14-yard line, Newton spotted Corey Brown open at the 40. Brown got past safety Rashad Johnson and sped to an 86-vard score, the longest play in Panthers postseason history. Down 17-0, Arizona did threaten to get back into it midway through the second quarter, when the Cardinals led a 79-yard touchdown drive, capped by David Johnson's 1-yard touchdown run with 5:44 left in the half. The Arizona defense followed with a three-and-out, and the Cardinals appeared set to get good field position off a short Brad Nortman punt, but Patrick Peterson muffed it. Cornerback Teddy Williams recovered it at the Arizona 46, and five plays later Newton scored with a 1-yard run for a 24-7 lead just after the two-minute warning. Three of the next four plays resulted in turnovers but with both teams missing out on scoring opportunities in the process. A Peterson interception and 72-yard return to the Carolina 22 negated a scoring chance created by a Charles Johnson strip-sack and Boston fumble recovery, but then Coleman made a leaping interception of Palmer on the next snap in the end zone. Coleman added a second interception midway through the fourth quarter, and Newton directed an 86-yard drive capped by a 5-yard touchdown pass to rookie Devin Funchess for a 42-15 lead. On Arizona's next offensive snap, Kuechly intercepted Palmer and returned it 21 yards for a touchdown that capped the scoring. Boston then added an interception – Palmer's fourth and final to go with two lost fumbles.

#### GROUND AND POUND

In Week Six at New Orleans (10/16/16), the Panthers produced 103 rushing yards as a team. Since the start of the 2013 season, Carolina has rushed for 100 or more yards in 47 of its 54 regular season games, including 32 of the past 33.

The Panthers franchise record streak of 30 consecutive regular season games with at least 100 rushing yards was snapped in Week Four vs. Atlanta (10/2/16). The streak was the longest in the NFL since Pittsburgh produced 43 consecutive during the 1974-77 seasons.

Since the start of the 2013 season, Carolina has rushed for 100 or more yards in 47 of its 54 regular season games, including 32 of the past 33.

## STEWART REACHES 5,000

In 2015, running back Jonathan Stewart surpassed the 5,000 career rushing yards mark. Stewart (5,972) joins DeAngelo Williams (6,846 from 2006-14) as the only backs in team history with at least 5,000 rushing yards. Stewart needs just 28 yards to join Williams as the only backs in Panthers history with at least 6,000 rushing yards.

Stewart missed three games this season due to a hamstring injury, but he stands just 874 yards behind DeAngelo Williams for the team's all-time mark.

Last season, Stewart's 989 rushing yards ranked eighth in the NFL. He rushed a career-high 242 times, the seventh-most in the NFL. Stewart's six touchdowns are his most since he tallied 10 touchdowns in back-to-back seasons in 2008 and 2009.

## BENJAMIN RETURNS TO THE LINEUP

Wide receiver Kelvin Benjamin, the Panthers first-round draft choice in 2014, returned to the lineup in Week One at Denver (9/8/16) after missing all of last season with a knee injury.

Benjamin is tied for seventh in the NFL with four receiving touchdowns and has totaled 394 yards on 29 receptions.

In 2014, Benjamin ranked third among NFL rookies with 1,008 receiving yards, 73 receptions and nine receiving touchdowns. Fifty of Benjamin's 73 catches resulted in first downs, second among rookies to only New York Giants receiver Odell Beckham, Jr. (57).

That season Benjamin and tight end Greg Olsen finished the year tied for the team lead with 1,008 receiving yards, becoming the first pair of Panthers to each gain 1,000 receiving yards in a single season since Muhsin Muhammad and Patrick Jeffers in 1999.

Benjamin's numbers are the best by a rookie in Panthers history, surpassing Keary Colbert's numbers in 2004 (47 for 754 and five).

Olsen has started 70 consecutive games for Carolina, also the second-longest streak among active tight ends behind Witten (153), and the fourh-longest consecutive starts streak in Panthers history.

## OLSEN LEADS THE WAY AT TIGHT END

In 2015, tight end Greg Olsen tallied a career-high 1,104 receiving yards, his second consecutive season with 1,000 yards. He is just the seventh tight end in NFL history with consecutive 1,000-yard seasons.

Olsen has tallied four consecutive seasons with at least 800 yards and has registered at least 500 yards in seven of the past eight seasons. 2015 was also the third consecutive 70-catch season for Olsen and the sixth 50-catch season of his career. Olsen's seven touchdown catches in 2015 make him the only active NFL tight end with five or more touchdowns in every season since 2008.

Olsen owns the top four single-season reception totals and four of the top five single-season receiving yards totals by a tight end in team history. In 2014, Olsen totaled a career-high 84 receptions, a new Panthers tight end record, surpassing his own team record of 73 catches (2013).

Tight end Greg Olsen joined the Panthers in 2011 after a trade with the Chicago Bears in exchange for a third-round draft choice. Since then, Olsen has totaled 387 receptions for 4,921 yards and 31 touchdowns, putting him among the team's all-time leaders.

In 2015, Olsen became the Panthers all-time receiving yards leader among tight ends and the Panthers all-time receptions leader among tight ends. In Week One at Denver (9/8/16), Newton produced his 32nd game with both a passing and rushing touchdown, breaking a tie with Pro Football Hall of Famer Steve Young for the most in NFL history. He produced his 33rd such game in Week Six at New Orleans (10/16/16).

Newton is one of just three players in NFL history, along with Peyton Manning of the Indianapolis Colts from 1998-2002 and Andy Dalton of the Cincinnati Bengals from 2011-15, to have at least 3,000 passing yards in each of their first five seasons.

Newton rushed for 636 yards in 2015, his fifth consecutive of at least 500 rushing yards. Newton joins Randall Cunningham and Michael Vick (six each) as the only quarterbacks with five or more 500-yard rushing seasons in a career. He is the only player in NFL history to have five seasons with 3,000 or more passing yards and 500 or more rushing yards at any point in a career.

## KUECHLY IS A TACKLING MACHINE

Despite missing three games in 2015, linebacker Luke Kuechly finished 12th in the NFL with 118 tackles according to press box stats.

A 13-year NFL veteran, Lee is a four-time All-Pro (2007, 2009, 2011, 2012) and a three-time Pro Bowler (2007, 2009, 2011).

Lee ranks seventh all-time in gross punting average (46.3), eighth all-time in net average (39.5) and eighth all-time in punts inside the 20 (339) in NFL history.

In 2015, Lee set Browns single-season records with a 46.7-yard gross average and a 40.1-yard net average. He punted 70 times with 25 punts inside the 20-yard line.

In 2011, Lee recorded the second-best single-season net punting average in league history (44.0). He followed that performance with a 43.2 net punting average in 2012, the sixth-best single-season average in NFL history. In 2007, Lee recorded 42 punts downed inside the 20, which is tied for the third-best total in NFL history.

## GANO GETS HIS KICKS



In Week Three vs. Minnesota kicker Graham Gano scored four points to pass wide receiver Steve Smith (454 from 2001-13) for second on the franchise's all-time points scored list. Gano has 469 points in his Panthers career (2012-present). John Kasay (1,482 from 1995-2010) is the franchise's all-time leader.

In Week Two vs. San Francisco (9/18/16), Gano set a career high with 16 points by converting all four field goal attempts and

four of five PATs (one was blocked).

Last season, Gano set the Panthers franchise record with 146 points in 2015, surpassing John Kasay's previous record of 145 in 1996. Gano's 146 points ranked second in the NFL behind New England's Stephen Gostkowski (151).

Gano made 30-of-36 field goals in 2015. The 30 field goals tied for fifth-most in the NFL and third-most in a season in team history. Gano kicked two game-wining field goals (final two minutes of the fourth quarter or in overtime) in 2015.

Gano earned his first career Player of the Month Award, garnering NFC Special Teams Player of the Month for November

In addition to his field goal abilities, Gano has been important in the field position game. Since the start of 2013, Gano leads the NFL with a 73.9 touchback percentage.

In 2014, Gano placed 61 of his 79 kickoffs resulted in touchbacks. The 77.2 percent touchback rate was best in the League and his 61 kickoffs were the most in the NFC.

In 2013, 63 of Gano's 79 kickoffs resulted in touchbacks. His 79.7 touchback percentage was the top mark in the NFL that season and is the highest percentage in a season since Brad Daluiso in 1992 (81.3 percent).
