FLORIDA ATLANTIC UNIVERSITY

Founded in 1961, Florida Atlantic University is a comprehensive public university that is currently serving more than 30,000 undergraduate and graduate students at sites strategically located along the state's southeastern coastline. Long known as an outstanding teaching institution, FAU is undergoing rapid development as a center of cutting-edge research, particularly in the biomedical arena. The process has been accelerated by the University's partnerships with two-internationally known biomedical research organizations: The Scripps Research Institute and the Max Planck Florida Institute for Neuroscience. Additionally, FAU's Charles E. Schmidt College of Medicine recently welcomed its fourth class of students.

Through a well-developed network of partner campuses, FAU serves students at locations and sites throughout its six-county service region in southeast Florida as well as through distance learning. FAU's student body, which ranks as the most ethnically and culturally diverse in Florida's State University System, includes men and women in both traditional and non-traditional age. Modern student housing is available on the Boca Raton and Jupiter campuses, and all campuses offer attractive and varied dining facilities. The University community is served by an excellent library system that has more than 374,000 full-text electronic books and 18,000 full-text electronic journals, plus access to several hundred proprietary databases.

A member of Conference USA, FAU has 19 men's and women's intercollegiate teams, including the

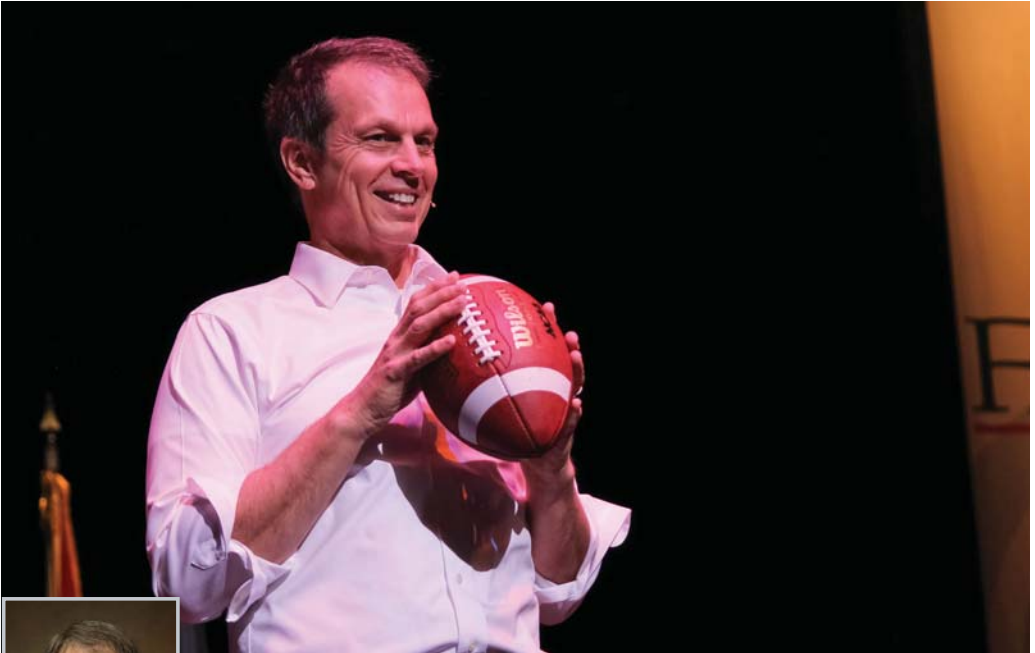
NCAA Division I football team that has won two bowl games. The Boca Raton campus is home to a 30,000-seat football stadium.

FAU's 10 academically distinguished colleges are the Dorothy F. Schmidt College of Arts and Letters, the College of Business, the College of Design and Social Inquiry, the College of Education, the College of Engineering and Computer Science, the Graduate College, the Harriet L. Wilkes Honors College, the Charles E. Schmidt College of Medicine, the Christine E. Lynn College of Nursing and the Charles E. Schmidt College of Science.

The University currently offers more than 180 undergraduate and graduate degree programs and is accredited by the Southern Association of Colleges and Schools. Additionally, the University holds membership in the National Association of State Universities and Land-Grant Colleges and the Council of Graduate Schools.

FAU has fully-funded Eminent Scholar Chairs in disciplines that include the arts of humanities, brain science, community education, engineering, growth management, Holocaust and Judaic studies, international business, marine biology, nursing, philosophy and social science.

FAU is committed to serving the educational needs of persons of retirement age through non-credit courses offered by the Lifelong Learning Society, which is believed to be the largest and most successful organization of its kind in the United States. PRESIDENT | FLORIDA ATLANTIC UNIVERSITY

John Kelly was named president of Florida Atlantic University by unanimous vote of the FAU Board of Trustees on January 17, 2014, becoming the seventh president in the University's 50-year history. Upon his arrival, President Kelly declared his intention to make FAU the fastest-improving university in America, and it soon became clear that goal was within reach. In 2016, the Florida Board of Governors ranked FAU the top-performing public university in the state, based on the Board's performance-based funding metrics across 11 participating universities.

Highlights of President Kelly's first three years in office include announcement of a record-breaking \$16 million gift from the Schmidt Family Foundation to build a premier academic/athletic facility on the Boca Raton campus — the largest single gift in the University's history. He also announced an agreement with Scripps Florida and the Max Planck Florida Institute for Neuroscience to establish a unique partnership on the Jupiter campus. The program offers FAU students the rare and valuable opportunity to work side by side with some of the

world's most distinguished biomedical researchers, including Nobel Laureates.

President Kelly came to FAU from Clemson University, where he held a succession of leadership positions over a 28-year period. As president of FAU, he oversees an institution that currently serves more than 30,000 undergraduate and graduate students on six campuses along more than 100 miles of Florida's east coast. One of the largest employers in South Florida, FAU has more than 3,000 employees, including 1,000 dedicated faculty members, and an operating budget in excess of \$750 million. The University has an annual economic impact of \$6.3 billion and is conducting millions of dollars' worth of funded research in such critically important fields as drug discovery, biotechnology, ocean engineering and marine science.

President Kelly holds a bachelor's degree from Clemson and both a master's degree and a Ph.D. from The Ohio State University. He is married to FAU First Lady Carolyn Kelly, and they are the parents of Carly and Stella.

FACULTY ATHLETIC REPRESENTATIVE

Kim Dunn joined Florida Atlantic University in 2001 and is currently an associate professor in the School of Accounting. She was named FAU's Faculty Athletics Representative to the NCAA in the fall of 2014. Prior to joining FAU, she was an assistant professor at Baruch College - City University of New York. Her primary teaching and research interests are in financial accounting. She has eight years of experience in the banking industry and has published in *Auditing: A Journal of Practice and Theory*, *Issues in Accounting Education*, *Journal of Information Systems*, *Journal of Investing*, *Managerial Auditing*, and *Review of Accounting Studies*. She was recently ranked 41st in the nation for her publications in accounting education research. She has served as director of the School of Accounting, faculty

adviser to Beta Alpha Psi and director of the Accounting Scholars Program. Over her career, she has taught introductory accounting to more than three-thousand students. She was awarded the Beta Alpha Psi Teaching Excellence Award, Alumni Association Degree of Difference Award, College of Business Distinguished Teacher of the Year, Steward Distinguished Professorship, and College of Business Master Teacher.

Kim is married to her high-school sweetheart, Ray, and they have two sons, Brandon and Caleb. In her spare time, Kim enjoys travel, golf and FAU sports.

Pat Chun

VICE PRESIDENT AND DIRECTOR OF ATHLETICS

Patrick "Pat" Chun has overseen a transformation of the Florida Atlantic University Department of Athletics that has yielded unprecedented successes. Chun has focused on building a culture of excellence and enriching the overall experiences of the student-athlete.

The Owls have posted an overall winning record the last three years, held a 3.0 GPA in back-to-back years for the first time in history and set records in academic achievement, fundraising and community outreach. Over the past 24 months, seven teams have either won conference championships, been ranked highest in school history or finished with winning seasons in addition to several individual champions.

Chun has strengthened the department through the hiring of staffs led by: Patrick Baker (women's soccer), Michael Curry (men's basketball), Ricardo Gonzalez (men's tennis), Lara Preacco (men's and women's swimming and diving), Capri Grotowski (beach volleyball), Kathy Guadagnino (women's golf) and most recently Jim Jabir (women's basketball) and Lane Kiffin (football).

As part of the commitment to outreach, the annual fundraising organization was renamed the Owl Scholarship Fund (OSF). On December 2, 2015, FAU announced the largest single gift in university history, \$16 million from the Schmidt Family Foundation, towards the design and construction of a new athletics facility to be named the Schmidt Family Complex for Academic and Athletic Excellence.

Another South Florida connection was the creation of the Boca Raton Bowl. The inaugural game was played at FAU Stadium on December 23, 2014 and is the result of an

all-encompassing partnership. Another Chun-engineered partnership came in August of 2013, in the form of a 10-year agreement with Learfield Sports which is expected to generate \$25 million over the life of the agreement. In 2015, the football program recorded its first FAU Stadium sellout, a second consecutive year of student attendance growth, and a cultural shift that showed leadership in community outreach.

Chun engineered FAU's 2013 move into C-USA, and a monumental step towards the goal of student-athlete success occurred with the launch of a strategic plan, the first in the program's history which was introduced along with identified core values.

Prior to FAU, Chun spent 15 years at The Ohio State University, ultimately elevating to Executive Associate AD for External Relations. The last three years of his four-year oversight of external relations, OSU saw record fundraising totaling \$122 million. He was a member of the senior team that authored the then-largest multimedia rights deal in intercollegiate athletics history.

In July 2016, Chun was named to the NACDA executive committee. He currently serves on the NCAA Baseball Rules Committee, and previously served on the NCAA Division I Baseball Committee, the NAADD executive committee and was part of the inaugural Division 1A Athletics Directors Association Fellowship Program class.

Chun earned a bachelor's degree from Ohio State and a master's degree from Duquesne. He and his wife, Natalie, an OSU alumna, have three daughters (Vanna, Kennedy and Gretta).



ABOUT CONFERENCE USA 2017

Conference USA begins its 23rd year in 2017-18 as it continues to compete and promote the success of its student-athletes. The league has adapted to the ever-changing landscape of collegiate athletics over its first two-plus decades, but the commitment to excellence, integrity, leadership and its student athletes in competition, academics and community is unwavering.

Conference USA enjoys a far-reaching fan base with its 14 members: Charlotte, FIU, Florida Atlantic, Louisiana Tech, Marshall, Middle Tennessee, North Texas, Old Dominion, Rice, Southern Miss, UAB, UTEP, UTSA and WKU.

Debuting in 1995, Conference USA teams have combined for 100 bowl appearances in football, 106 NCAA Tournament appearances in basketball, including three Final Fours, 69 NCAA baseball appearances including six College World Series berths, 89 NCAA soccer tournament appearances including four trips to the College Cup, and 39 individual national champions in track and field and cross country.

Success is not limited to athletic achievement, however, as 220 Conference USA student-athletes have garnered Academic All-America honors, 749 have achieved academic all-district laurels and thousands of student-athletes have earned a college degree.

Conference USA sponsors competition in 19 sports – nine for men (baseball, basketball, cross country, football, golf, soccer, tennis, and indoor and outdoor track and field) and 10 for women (basketball, cross country, golf, soccer, softball, swimming and diving, tennis, indoor and outdoor track and field, and volleyball).

The league promotes the scholar-athlete ideal, honoring outstanding academic achievement with numerous conference-sponsored awards, including the Commissioner's Honor Roll and the Commissioner's Academic Medal as well as sport-specific All-Academic teams.

C-USA annually awards postgraduate scholarships, along with the Sport Academic Awards, Scholar-Athletes of the Year and the Institutional Academic Excellence Award. Additionally, Conference USA presents a Spirit of Service Award three times each year, recognizing student-athletes who excel on the field, in the classroom and give back to the community through significant service efforts and participation.

SUCCESS ON THE PLAYING FIELD

Conference USA performers have achieved great

success in competition, placing the league among the top conferences in the nation.

- *Conference USA has nine bowl affiliations through the 2019 season, securing a minimum of five berths annually. Conference USA has primary bowl tie-ins with the Bahamas Bowl, Boca Raton Bowl, Gildan New Mexico Bowl, Hawai'i Bowl, R+L Carriers New Orleans Bowl, St. Petersburg Bowl and Zaxby's Heart of Dallas Bowl, along with secondary arrangements with the Camping World Independence Bowl and the Lockheed Martin Armed Forces Bowl.

In addition to the numerous NCAA Tournament berths, C-USA has sent four men's soccer teams to the NCAA College Cup, three softball teams to the Women's College World Series and three volleyball teams to the NCAA Sweet 16. The league has also had 39 national champions in NCAA track and field competition, one national champion in diving, and numerous NCAA individual and team competitors in cross country, golf, swimming, tennis, and track and field. Overall, Conference USA teams and individuals have made more than 2,000 NCAA appearances.

SUCCESS OFF THE FIELD

C-USA institutions are among the nation's best in academic performance of student-athletes, bolstered by the fact that student-athletes at league schools have a higher graduation rate than the general student population. Among C-USA's 5,000 student-athletes, there are champions off the playing field as well. In 22 years, more than 33,000 student-athletes have been named to the Commissioner's Honor Roll or received the Commissioner's Academic Medal, indicative of outstanding achievement in the classroom.

C-USA IN THE COMMUNITY

The conference's current footprint is concentrated with 14 members in 10 states and a combined area population of more than 30 million. With a commitment to community involvement, the conference developed several initiatives to maintain strong ties in C-USA cities, as well as with fans and alumni across the country. C-USA schools also place a priority on giving back to their communities through volunteer service with local and national organizations. Individually, student-athletes are recognized each season through the Spirit of Service award.

COACHING STAFF



Lane Kiffin

HEAD COACH

Lane Kiffin was named Florida Atlantic University's head football coach on Dec. 13, 2016.

Kiffin came to FAU with extensive college and professional coaching experience and will accelerate the development of the University's ambitions to transform college football in south Florida all while continuing the Owls' football team's classroom successes.

Kiffin joins the FAU Owls after three seasons at the University of Alabama, where he served as the Tide's offensive coordinator and quarterbacks coach. He was a finalist for the Frank Broyles Award in 2014, which goes to the country's best assistant coach.

His final season with the Tide, Kiffin mentored Jalen Hurt, the first freshman to start at quarterback in head coach Nick Saban's career. Hurt finished 13-1 as the starting QB and guided Alabama to a SEC Title and to the National Championship game. Hurt was a Freshman All-American, the SEC Offensive Player of the year and the SEC Freshman of the Year. He was a finalist for the Manning Award, the Earl Campbell Tyler Rose Award, a semifinalist for the Walter Camp Player of the Year and the Davey O'Brien Award, presented annually to the nation's top quarterback. Hurt completed 240 passes for a total of 2,780 yards compared to just nine INTS. He tossed 23 touchdowns

and scored another 12 with his feet and was a 1,161-yard rusher.

In 2015, Kiffin oversaw the development of quarterback Jake Coker, who finished his career 14-0 as a starter at Alabama and led the nation in completion percentage over the final 10 games of the season at 72.2 percent. Coker threw for 3,110 yards with 21 touchdowns, which ranks as the second-most passing yards in school history. On the ground, Kiffin fed Heisman Trophy running back Derrick Henry the ball a school- and SEC- record 395 times for a record 2,219 yards and 23 touchdowns. Henry's 2,219 yards was also the fifth-most rushing yards in a single season in college football history.

One of Kiffin's first responsibilities at Alabama was identifying a starting quarterback and then developing Blake Sims in 2014. With three-year starter and All-American AJ McCarron off to the NFL, Kiffin oversaw Sims' rise to the top of the Alabama depth chart en route to a school-record 3,487 passing yards and 3,837 yards of total offense while completing 64.5 percent of his passes. He ranked tied for fourth nationally in total QBR (83.7) and seventh in passing efficiency (157.9). Sims was selected second-team All-SEC, named to the Senior Bowl, tabbed as a finalist for the Manning Award and a semifinalist for



the Davey O'Brien Award.

Kiffin's offense ranked 17th nationally in total offense per game (484.5) while scoring an average of 36.9 points per game. The passing game averaged a school-record 277.9 yards per game (3,890) to rank 28th nationally and fourth in the SEC. Amari Cooper won the Biletnikoff Award as the nation's best receiver, after catching a school- and SEC-record 124 passes for a UA-record 1,727 receiving yards and 16 touchdowns.

Kiffin spent the previous three-plus seasons as the head coach at Southern California, where he compiled a record of 28-15. Kiffin's 2012 USC squad went 7-6 overall and 5-4 in the Pac-12 South, good for second place. Wide receiver Marquise Lee was a unanimous First Team All-American and won the Biletnikoff Award while also being named the Pac-12 Offensive Player of the Year. Quarterback Matt Barkley, who won the Wuerffel Trophy, set conference records for passing yards and passing touchdowns.

Kiffin led the Trojans to a 10-2 record in 2011 and a sixth-place finish in the final Associated Press poll. The team finished first in the Pac-12 South with a 7-2 mark. His 2011 USC offense produced a 3,500-yard passer, a pair of 1,000-yard receivers and a 1,000-yard rusher. Three Trojans earned First Team All-America honors (Matt Kalil, Robert Woods and T.J. McDonald) and five were named Freshman All-Americans.

In his first year as the head coach at USC, Kiffin led the Trojans to an 8-5 record (5-4 Pac-10). Before his

arrival, the Trojans were averaging 26.5 points per game in scoring offense and 389.1 yards per game in total offense. In his first two seasons, those numbers increased to 31.0 points per game and 431.5 yards in 2011 and 35.8 points and 456.8 yards in 2012.

Prior to his tenure at Southern California, Kiffin served as the head coach at Tennessee in 2009. He led the Volunteers to a second-place finish in the SEC East and an appearance in the Chick-fil-A Bowl. The Volunteers' offense jumped at least 34 places in every national statistical category over the 2008 figures. Tennessee improved from 17.3 to 29.3 points per game while going from 268.8 to 383.5 yards per game in total offense.

Kiffin came to Tennessee from the Oakland Raiders, where he served as head coach from 2007-08. At 31, he was the youngest head coach in the NFL's modern era. Oakland's offense significantly improved in his first year, up 7.2 points per game and 48.6 yards per game from 2006.

Prior to his first head coaching job, Kiffin spent six years as an assistant coach for Pete Carroll at Southern California, including two years as the offensive coordinator (2005-06). During his first tenure with the Trojans, USC captured two national championships and compiled a 65-12 record. Kiffin was promoted to passing game coordinator in 2004 and helped Matt Leinart win the Heisman Trophy as he passed for 3,322 yards with 33 touchdowns and just six interceptions.



He took over as USC's offensive coordinator in 2005 and led the Trojans to a scoring average of 49.1 points per game and 579.8 yards per game of total offense during his two years as offensive coordinator. Kiffin started at USC in 2001 as the tight ends coach and then coached the wide receivers during his remaining five years.

Kiffin graduated from Fresno State in 1998 after playing quarterback for three seasons (1994-96) for the Bulldogs. He began his coaching career as a

student assistant at Fresno State under Pat Hill in 1997 and 1998. He moved on to Colorado State in 1999 as offensive line assistant. He spent the 2000 season as defensive quality control assistant with the Jacksonville Jaguars under Tom Coughlin.

Kiffin attended Bloomington (Minn.) Jefferson High, where he played football, basketball and baseball. He has two daughters, Landry and Presley, and one son, Knox.

At FAU

Kendal Briles joined the Florida Atlantic coaching staff in January of 2017 with his primary focus geared towards the Owls' offense.

At Baylor

Biles comes to FAU with a decade's worth of experience, including three years of work as the offensive coordinator of Baylor's high-powered offense. He took over the play-calling reins in Dec. of 2014 prior to Baylor's appearance in the 2015 Goodyear Cotton Bowl. Previous to the Cotton Bowl, Briles spent three seasons as the passing game coordinator and seven years coaching the Bears' receiving corps.

Honored for his recruiting ability, Briles was named the Big 12 Recruiter of the Year in 2013 and 2014 and earned multiple Big 12 Recruiter of the Year awards in 2014 (Rivals, Scout, 247Sports) after Baylor signed a class ranked No. 22 nationally by ESPN and No. 23 by Scout.

On the field, Briles mentored four All-Americans and five total NFL prospects during seven seasons as wide receivers coach. He coached two of the most prolific receivers in school history, All-Americans Kendall Wright (Tennessee Titans) and Terrance Williams (Dallas Cowboys), as well as 2013 All-American Antwan Goodley (Green Bay Packers)

and 2014 All-American Corey Coleman (Cleveland Browns). His pupils also included All-Big 12 honorees and NFL signees Lanear Sampson (Pittsburgh Steelers), Tevin Reese (San Diego Chargers) and tight end Jordan Najvar (Dallas Cowboys). As passing game coordinator, Briles helped guide a top five-ranked passing attack for four straight seasons from 2011 to 2014 (No. 4 in 2014, No. 5 in 2013, No. 4 in 2012, No. 4 in 2011).

After his first season as offensive coordinator, Briles was named a 2015 Broyles Award finalist (by the Rotary Club of Little Rock) and National Quarterbacks Coach of the Year finalist (by FootballScoop). The Bears persevered through an injury-plagued season to finish No. 13 nationally and played in a school-record sixth straight bowl game. The Baylor offense again led the nation in both scoring (48.1 points/game) and total offense (616.2 yards/game) for the third consecutive season, and its rushing offense finished No. 2 nationally (326.7 yards/game).

Nine Baylor offensive players earned 2015 All-Big 12 honors, led by a pair of unanimous All-Americans in Spencer Drango and Biletnikoff Award winner Coleman. Briles mentored Baylor quarterback Seth Russell, who earned All-Big 12 honorable mention despite an injury-shortened season, putting up

astounding statistical numbers through seven games – 35 combined TDs and 358.0 yards-per-game in total offense – leading BU to a No. 2 national ranking.

Following multiple quarterback injuries, Briles orchestrated an offensive switch at season's end that culminated in the Russell Athletic Bowl, when a wide receiver and several running backs took snaps in wildcat/single-wing formations. Baylor crushed No. 10 North Carolina with a punishing rushing attack that amassed an NCAA bowl record 645 yards on the ground (as well as a Russell Athletic Bowl-record 756 total yards).

The record-setting Bears offense averaged 365.9 passing yards per game en route to the 2014 Big 12 Championship. Briles' 2014 receiving corps included honorable mention All-American Coleman (1,119 yards, 11 TDs) All-Big 12 honoree Goodley and Freshman All-American KD Cannon.

Briles was a FootballScoop finalist for 2014 National Wide Receivers Coach of the Year. In 2013, the Big 12 champions averaged 359.1 yards through the air and "Wide Receiver U" boasted All-American Goodley (1,339 yards, 13 TDs) and All-Big 12 selections Reese (First Team) and Levi Norwood (Honorable Mention).

Briles was recognized in 2013 as the "Big 12 Recruiter of the Year" by Scout/FOXSportsNet and a national "Top 50 Recruiter" by 247Sports following Baylor's signing class that was ranked 24th by Athlon and 25th by Scout.com.

In 2012, Williams broke the school record for single-season receiving yards (1,832) and set single-game marks of 17 receptions and 314 yards at West Virginia en route to being named just the sixth unanimous All-American in Baylor history. Wright concluded his Baylor career with every major school receiving record (16 total) under Briles' tutelage. In addition to Wright, Briles also coached All-Big 12 honoree Reese, a sophomore in 2011 who totaled 877 yards and seven TDs on 51 receptions. Briles entered coaching in 2008 following a highly successful high school and collegiate playing career.

Collegiate Playing Career

Briles began his collegiate playing career at the University of Texas where he redshirted as a true freshman (2001). He played in seven games as a safety in 2002, but was slowed due to an ankle injury. In his first game on defense, Briles picked off two passes in the Longhorns' shutout of Baylor to share player of the game honors.

In 2003, when Art Briles was named Houston's head coach, the younger Briles left the Longhorn program for the opportunity to play once more for his father, this time at Houston. Kendal sat out the 2003 season due to transfer rules, then caught 25 passes for 311 yards as a 2004 junior. In his final season at Houston, Briles ranked second on the team in receptions with 45 catches for 369 yards and one touchdown. Born in Abilene, Texas, Kendal Briles worked in private business in the Houston area after graduating from the UH with a sport management degree in 2005.

High School Playing Career

Briles gained his prep experience at both Wolfforth Frenship High School and Stephenville High School. He was a two-time Texas 4A Offensive Player of the Year and First Team All-State quarterback while also playing safety. He totaled 9,322 yards of total offense and 98 total touchdowns over his final two high school seasons. He spent his senior season at Wolfforth Frenship and earned his second Offensive Player of the Year honor after passing for 3,584 yards and 35 touchdowns while rushing for 1,074 yards and 19 scores.

As a junior, playing for his father at Stephenville, Briles earned 1999 Texas 4A Offensive Player of the Year recognition after leading the team to a 16-0 record and the 4A state title. He passed for 3,137 yards and 28 touchdowns as a junior while rushing for 1,331 yards and 16 scores. He also earned a pair of letters in track, was an all-district basketball player and was a 2014 Texas High School Football Hall of Fame inductee.

Chris Kiffin

At FAU

Chris Kiffin joined the Florida Atlantic staff in December of 2016. His early arrival was instrumental in the staff's transition period.

At Ole Miss

Kiffin served as the Ole Miss defensive line coach and defensive recruiting coordinator beginning in December of 2011.

Kiffin's recruiting trail efforts earned him 2013 National Recruiter of the Year honors by Scout.com after helping Ole Miss land a top five signing class. He also was tabbed one of the nation's top 50 recruiters by 247Sports and helped the Rebels land a total of four top 15 classes, including the 2016 haul that was ranked as high as No. 4 by ESPN.com.

Kiffin entered 2016 with an acclaimed defensive end in Marquis Haynes, a Jacksonville, Fla. product. Haynes entered the year ranked as the No. 81 best collegiate player overall by NFL.com and as the No. 8 defensive end by Lindy's. By season's end the junior had tallied seven sacks, 11 TFLs, eight hurries and three forced fumbles. Haynes was a Preseason All-SEC selection by Athlon, Birmingham News and Lindy's.

Kiffin guided another strong defensive line in 2015,

which helped the Rebels rank in the top three among SEC teams in tackles for loss (8.1/game - seventh in NCAA), interceptions (15 - T-23rd in NCAA) and takeaways (23 - T-38th in NCAA). His prized pupils included Hornung Award finalist and First Team All-American Robert Nkemdiche, who was taken in the first round (29th overall) of the 2016 NFL Draft by the Arizona Cardinals. Rebel defensive linemen combined for 24 sacks in 2015, led by a school record-tying 10 from sophomore Haynes. In two years under Kiffin's tutelage, Haynes recorded 17.5 career sacks, tied for the fourth most in Ole Miss history.

Kiffin helped develop one of the deepest and most talented defensive lines in not only the SEC, but in the nation in 2014. Their work in the trenches helped Ole Miss top the nation in scoring defense (16.0) and fewest touchdowns allowed (24), while also leading the SEC in interceptions (22), turnovers forced (32), tackles for loss (7.6/game) and opponent third-down conversion (33.0 percent).

Nkemdiche was a 2014 All-America choice by multiple outlets following his junior season, as his constant pressure and collapsing the pocket caused havoc for opposing quarterbacks. He posted seven TFLs and three sacks and helped the Rebels rank in

the SEC's top three in tackles for a loss (8.1 per game), a mark that ranked the team seventh nationally. Haynes led the team with 9.0 tackles for loss and he set an Ole Miss freshman record with 7.5 sacks. That mark was fourth most among all freshmen in the country, en route to Freshman All-America honors.

With Kiffin guiding him, Nkemdiche made a major impact on the defensive line in 2013 as well by ranking third on the team in tackles for loss (8.0) and second among SEC freshmen in TFLs per outing (0.73). Nkemdiche was named First Team Freshman All-America and SEC All-Freshman.

Kiffin helped coach a much-improved Rebel front line in his first year in Oxford. His unit helped Ole Miss rank first in the SEC and fourth nationally in tackles for loss (7.9/game) and second in the SEC and 11th nationally in sacks (2.9/game). Those numbers were dramatic improvements over 4.75 TFLs and 1.08 sacks per game in 2011.

Under Kiffin, defensive end C.J. Johnson saw tremendous improvement from his rookie campaign as he recorded 6.5 sacks, tied for eighth most in the SEC, versus just one sack in 2011. Nose tackle Issac Gross was named First Team Freshman All-America and SEC All-Freshman after he tallied 10.0 TFLs (second-most by an SEC freshman behind teammate Denzel Nkemdiche) and 2.5 sacks.

At Arkansas State

Kiffin spent the previous season, 2011, as Arkansas State's defensive line coach where he helped coach an ASU defense that led the Sun Belt Conference in total defense (331.46 ypg) and scoring defense (20.77 ppg), ranking in the top 25 in the NCAA in both categories. Arkansas State also led the league and ranked eighth

in the nation in tackles for loss (7.62 pg) and tied for 15th in the NCAA in QB sacks (2.69 pg).

At ASU

Kiffin mentored Sun Belt Defensive Player of the Year Brandon Joiner, who tied for third in the nation in sacks and 10th in TFLs. He also coached Dorvus Woods to Second Team All-Conference honors.

At USC

Kiffin joined the A-State coaching staff after serving as an administrative assistant for the USC defense in 2010. The Trojans finished the year 8-5 with a 28-14 victory over UCLA in Rose Bowl stadium.

At Nebraska

Prior to joining the staff at USC, Kiffin was in charge of offensive quality control at Nebraska from Feb. 2008 through Feb. 2010. During his two seasons at Nebraska, the Cornhuskers compiled a 20-8 record and played in two bowl games, including a 33-0 victory over Arizona in the 2009 Holiday Bowl.

Tampa Bay Buccaneers

Before Nebraska, Kiffin was a quality control intern with the NFL's Tampa Bay Buccaneers in 2006. During his time with the Bucs, Kiffin gained experience working with the defensive line during off-season OTAs and mini-camps.

At Idaho

Kiffin gained his first coaching experience at Idaho where he was a student assistant during the 2005 and 2006 campaigns.

As a Collegiate Player at Colorado State

A four-year football letterman as a defensive tackle at Colorado State from 2000-05 under then-Head Coach Sonny Lubick, Kiffin earned his bachelor's degree from the school in 2005.

At FAU

Corey Batoon came to FAU in January of 2017 and will focus his attention on the Owls' special teams with the safeties, and also will serve as co-defensive coordinator

At Ole Miss

Batoon joined the Owls after a four-year stint on the Ole Miss staff where he was promoted to assistant coach for safeties and special teams coordinator in January 2015.

In his first season coaching safeties, Batoon helped guide a Rebel defense that returned four interceptions for touchdowns, including two by All-American safety Trae Elston. The four pick-sixes tied a school record that dates back to 1938. In total, Ole Miss ranked second in the SEC with 15 interceptions and third with 23 turnovers throughout the 2015 season.

Elston earned First Team All-SEC honors, while fellow senior safety Mike Hilton was a Second Team All-SEC pick in 2015.

Ole Miss was also among the nation's best in kick coverage, ranking among the top 32 in both punt return defense and kickoff return defense. The kicking game was especially strong in 2015, as sophomore Gary Wunderlich led all SEC kickers and

ranked in the nation's top 20 with 120 points on 19-of-25 field goals and a school-record 63-of-63 PATs.

A 20-year veteran in the college coaching ranks, Batoon served as Ole Miss' assistant athletics director for recruiting operations in 2013 and 2014 after his first position with the Rebels, assistant AD for player development.

He has helped the Rebels land four straight top 15 signing classes, including the 2013 and 2016 hauls that ranked among the nation's top five. He also contributed to the program advancing to four straight bowls, for the first time since 1997-2000.

At Arkansas State

Batoon arrived in Oxford after three seasons as an assistant coach at Arkansas State, where he coached cornerbacks, safeties and special teams during his tenure. Serving under Head Coach Hugh Freeze in 2011, Batoon tutored cornerbacks Darryl Feemster and Darron Edwards to All-Sun Belt Conference honors, as A-State led the league in total defense (331.46 ypg) and scoring defense (20.77 ppg).

In 2010, Batoon coached First Team All-Sun Belt Conference safety M.D. Jennings, who recorded 84 tackles, three interceptions, four pass break-ups, two fumble recoveries and one forced fumble. Jennings and Keclie McCray ranked second and third on the

team in tackles, respectively, as the duo combined to post 163 tackles. Both Jennings and fellow safety Adrian Hills were named the Sun Belt Conference Defensive Player of the Week once in 2011, and the safety corps was responsible for seven of ASU's 11 interceptions.

Batoon's first season at ASU saw the Red Wolves' secondary help lead the defense to a Sun Belt Conference No. 1 ranking in total defense and No. 2 ranking in passing defense.

At Northern Arizona

Prior to Arkansas State, Batoon spent the previous 11 seasons as the assistant head coach, defensive coordinator and secondary coach at Northern Arizona. He also spent time as the special teams

coordinator during his NAU tenure.

At Howard

His alma matter came knocking on his door and asked the Miami native to return to the program, but as the head coach in 2011. All told, Harrell served as Howard University’s head coach for five seasons. During his Howard tenure student-athletes worked under the premise that athletics and academics were evaluated equally. In 2012 he was honored by the D.C. Touchdown Club as the Local College Coach of the Year at its inaugural awards dinner.

At Bowie State

Before coming to Howard, Harrell spent two seasons as the offensive coordinator for Bowie State, from 2009-10.

At Howard

He returned to his alma mater to gain his first collegiate coaching experience. He focused his attention on Howard’s wide receivers from 2002-04. Howard posted a 6-5 record in 2002, a 4-7 mark in 2003 and a 6-5 mark in 2004, including splitting two overtime games.

Garin Justice

OFFENSIVE LINE COACH

At FAU

How do you welcome a new coach to the program? You provide him with a talented unit, returning all but one starter and you have talented freshmen and true freshmen ready to contribute. That is exactly the way Garin Justice started the 2016 preseason camp. Justice had prepared the line in the spring to play the up-tempo offense and returned a unit following the summer that were conditioned and ready to play. Two weeks into preseason camp, the dominos began to fall. Justice would be asked to shuffle and reshuffle the deck for nine different starting rotations in nine games and he lost four projected starters in the first three weeks of the season. Despite the herculean effort the Owls were asked to undertake, the line provided the protection for a record-setting running attack and they did so for a new starting quarterback. The receiving corps also benefitted from the efforts of the battle-tested line with a program-high seven games with an individual receiver tallying 100+ receiving yards. At season's end, center Dillon DeBoer was one of 11 student-athletes, conference wide, to earn C-USA Academic honors and was named C-USA Honorable Mention All-Conference. Junior lineman Antonyo Woods, who saw time at three different spots on the line, also earned Honorable Mention C-USA honors.

At Concord

Justice assumed the helm of Concord, a program that had been winless (0-11) as recently as 2008, in January of 2011. In his five-year stint, the Mountain Lions were 40-17, which included a 13-1 season in 2014. Additionally, Justice led Concord to two conference championships and two NCAA Division II playoff appearances. On Justice's watch, 84 players were named All-West Virginia Athletic Conference or All-Mountain East Conference selections while two athletes earned Defensive WVIAC Player of the Year accolades in addition 18 All-Region selections and eight All-American honorees were named.

His 2015 squad had 11 players earn Mountain East Conference honors and two received All-Region recognition. He coached the top offensive lineman in the MEC who led a unit that allowed the fewest sacks in the league and made way for the program's running back to set the all-time rushing record. His defense finished the season No. 2 in total defense.

In 2014, the Mountain Lions won the most games in school history (13) while also making an appearance in the national semifinals. Under Justice's guidance, CU won its first playoff games in school history, defeating West Chester (51-36) and Bloomsburg (32-26) which gave Concord its first Super One Region Championship. Not only did Concord set school records in wins (13),



but Justice also was named Mountain East Conference Coach of the Year. It was his second league coach of the year award in four seasons at Concord. Justice coached the offensive line at Concord and tutored two All-American linemen in Rustin Mayorga and Coleman Osborne. All five of Justice's linemen earned All-Conference during the 2014 season while paving the way for MEC Offensive Player of the Year Calvinaugh Jones.

The 2013 season was a showcase of what would come. Concord went 8-3 and narrowly lost out on winning the inaugural MEC title and earning a playoff bid. Concord tallied three-year highs under Justice on offense in points per game (26.6) and rushing yards per game (167.9). Just as impressive was Justice's defense which posted three-year lows in points allowed per game (14.2), rushing yards allowed per game (108.4) and passing yards allowed per game (159.7). His Concord teams excelled in all phases of the game defensively as well, with a No. 3 national rank in four categories and two players earned All-American honors for their efforts. Special teams held a No. 6 national mark.

In 2012, Justice's second season in Athens, Concord registered a 7-4 overall record and a 6-2 mark in the WVIAC. In Justice's first season as a head coach (2011), he led Concord to its first WVIAC title since 1990 as well as the school's first appearance in the NCAA Division II playoffs after CU finished 7-4 overall and 7-1 in WVIAC competition and he was named the 2011 WVIAC Coach of the Year.

A native of Gilbert, W. Va., Justice originally came to Concord in January of 2009 as the offensive line coach and strength & conditioning coordinator. Justice played a prominent role in Concord's remarkable turnaround after its 0-11 season in 2008. In 2009, Justice's first year on the CU staff, the Mountain Lions went 6-5. In 2010, Concord was 8-3, winning eight games for the first time in 19 years.

At Florida State

Justice spent two seasons at Florida State as an

offensive graduate assistant, offensive videographer, and weight room graduate assistant. Justice helped develop four freshmen All-Americans and two All-Atlantic Coast Conference performers. In his two seasons with the Seminoles, FSU was 16-10 overall. The offensive line provided protection for running backs who gained more than 2,300 yards on the ground with 27 TDs in 2008 and tallied more than 1,600 yards in 2007 with 12 TDs. The passing game covered 2,500 yards in 2008 and 3,143 in 2007. The line allowed an average of less than two sacks per game. He completed his master's degree from Florida State in sports administration in 2008. While at FSU, Justice was a member of two bowl staffs. The 2007 team fell to Kentucky in the Music City Bowl and the Seminoles downed Wisconsin in 2008 at the Citrus Bowl. He graduated FSU with a Masters of Sports Administration in 2008.

At West Virginia

Justice began his coaching career as a graduate assistant at West Virginia in 2006 where he worked with the offensive line and helped Dan Mozes win the Rimington Award as the nation's best center. The 2006 Mountaineers finished their campaign with an 11-2 record. The line provided protection for a running back corps that rushed for nearly 4,000 yards and tallied 48 scores. The passing game recorded 15 touchdowns and nearly 1,700 yards through the air and downed Georgia Tech in the Gator Bowl.

Justice was a three-year starting offensive tackle for West Virginia University and served as team captain in 2005 for a Mountaineer squad that went 11-1, defeated Georgia in the Sugar Bowl and ranked No. 5 in the season-ending AP Poll. Eric Mathies

ASSISTANT COACH/DL/RECRUITING COORDINATOR

At FAU

Eric Mathies joined the Florida Atlantic staff in January 2017 and quickly immersed himself in the recruiting process.

At USF

Mathies joined the University of South Florida football staff as defensive line coach in January of 2013 and added the duties of recruiting coordinator to his plate in 2016. He brought 15 years of collegiate coaching experience to USF, also having served as an assistant coach at Western Kentucky, Tennessee State and Midwestern (Texas) State. Mathies helped guide USF's defensive end Eric Lee to Second Team All-American Athletic Conference honors in 2015 as Lee led the Bulls with 12.0 tackles for loss and 5.0 sacks. USF ranked No. 13 nationally in tackles for loss (7.5 per game), led the AAC while ranking No. 26 nationally in sacks (2.62/pg), and was third in the conference and No. 31 nationally against the run (141.4/pg).

In his first season at USF, Mathies guided a strong defensive line that helped the Bulls earn a No. 12 FBS rank in 7.6 tackles for loss per game and No. 21 rank in total defense allowing 350.8 yards per game while nearly tripling the forced turnovers from nine the previous season to 25 and scoring three defensive

touchdowns. Mathies helped guide sophomore defensive end Aaron Lynch to First Team All-AAC honors, after leading the team with 12.5 tackles for loss and six sacks, and senior defensive tackle Luke Sager to Second Team honors after a career-best 11.5 tackles for loss.

At WKU

Prior to coming to USF, Mathies coached the defensive line for eight seasons at WKU and served as recruiting coordinator for three seasons. He joined the WKU staff in 2005, and when Willie Taggart took over the Hilltoppers in 2010, Mathies added the title of recruiting coordinator.

As recruiting coordinator, Mathies helped produce the top recruiting class in the Sun Belt Conference in both 2010 and 2011, and the league's second-ranked class in 2012, according to Rivals.com. Rivals and Scout also recognized Mathies as the Sun Belt Recruiter of the Year, while Scout named him one of the top recruiters in the nation following the 2010 season.

While coaching the defensive line, Mathies mentored Quanterus Smith, who earned All-America honors from both SI.com and Phil Steele after the 2012 season. Smith was named Sun Belt Defensive Player of the Year after totaling 12.5 sacks, which



ranked third nationally. As a whole, the WKU defense led the conference in sacks, TFL, total defense, rushing defense and pass efficiency defense in 2012.

At Tennessee State

Mathies coached two seasons at Tennessee State, where he worked with defensive tackles in addition to handling recruiting responsibilities.

At Midwestern State

Prior to working at TSU, he was the defensive line coach at Midwestern (Texas) State, where he was also the strength and conditioning coach, in addition to handling recruiting duties.

At Murray High School

He got his start in coaching at Murray High School

in 1998, helping the Tigers to a 7-4 mark as they advanced to the second round of the Kentucky state playoffs.

Clint Trickett

TIGHT ENDS COACH

AT FAU

Clint Trickett joined the Florida Atlantic University coaching staff in February of 2017 and will focus his attention with the tight ends.

At East Mississippi

Trickett spent two seasons as the quarterbacks coach at East Mississippi Community College, one of the most successful JUCO programs in the country. Trickett's role at EMCC, a three-time NJCAA National Champion, was primarily tutoring EMCC's quarterbacks among other coaching responsibilities. Under Head Coach Buddy Stephens' direction, EMCC has produced an NJCAA All-American quarterback every year dating back to 2008, including De'Andre Johnson who worked two seasons with Trickett and committed to the FAU program where Clint's brother Travis served as offensive coordinator in the fall of 2016. Johnson signed with FAU a day after Head Coach Lane Kiffin was hired and two months prior to the addition of Clint Trickett to the staff.

Collegiate Playing Career

Splitting his collegiate playing career between WVU and FSU, Trickett completed 62 percent (470-of-758) of his passes for 5,837 career yards and 32 total

touchdowns. The bulk of those impressive passing numbers came during the two years in Morgantown, where he threw for 4,890 total yards and 25 touchdowns in 19 games for the Mountaineers.

As a fifth-year senior at West Virginia, Trickett completed 67.1 percent (281-of-419) of his passes for 3,285 yards and 18 touchdowns in leading the Big 12 Conference and ranking 11th nationally in completion percentage. He also stood third in the Big 12 and No. 10 nationally with an average of 298.6 passing yards per contest. He was a Davey O'Brien Award semifinalist wearing a WVU uniform and was a member of the Garrett Ford Academic Honor Roll as well as the Big 12 Conference Commissioner's Honor Roll.

Trickett graduated from FSU in three years with a bachelor's degree in social sciences. Playing behind current Buffalo Bills quarterback EJ Manuel during his three years at Florida State, Trickett completed 62.3 percent (66-of-106) of his career passes for 947 yards and seven touchdowns. As a redshirt freshman in 2011, he threw for 675 yards and seven touchdowns in nine games, including starting assignments against Clemson and Wake Forest.

Trickett graduated early from high school with a 3.8 grade point average, after helping lead North Florida Christian School to a 29-6 composite

Johnson helped Ole Miss to lead the nation in scoring defense (16.0 ppg) and led the SEC in tackles for a loss (7.6 per game). He was a preseason All-SEC Third Team (Lindy's, College Sports Madness), Fourth Team (Phil Steele) selection and was rated the No. 8 DE in the SEC by ESPN.com.

As a sophomore he started the first four games at defensive end but missed the remainder of the season due to an injury and was granted a redshirt. Prior to the season he was named preseason All-SEC Second Team by Athlon and Birmingham News, Third Team by the league coaches, media and Lindy's, and Fourth Team by Phil Steele and was on the CFPA Defensive Lineman Trophy Preseason Watch List.

In 2012, he was All-SEC Third Team (College Sports Madness), College Football News Sophomore All-America honorable mention after he played in

every game at DE, with 10 starts. Johnson led team with 6.5 sacks, tied for eighth in SEC with 0.5 sacks per game and finished sixth on team with 55 tackles and 4th with 8.0 TFLs. He helped Ole Miss lead all SEC teams and rank fourth in the nation in TFLs (7.9/game) and rank second in the SEC and 11th nationally in sacks (2.9 per game).

As a freshman, Johnson played in 11 games, starting three at defensive end where he recorded 32 tackles, including 4.0 TFLs and 1.0 sack.

DJ McCarthy

D.J. McCarthy joined the Florida Atlantic University staff in February of 2017 as the Director of Player Development. He comes to FAU as a seasoned veteran of the coaching world, with 16 years of experience, having mentored 11 receivers into NFL careers, including most recently Bethune-Cookman's K.J. Stroud, now playing with the New York Jets. McCarthy brings the distinction of a national title as both a player (Washington) and as a coach (LSU) to his position at FAU.

At Florida A&M

Served as the wide receivers' coach for the Florida A&M Rattlers during the 2016 season. McCarthy saw 17 receivers record a reception in 2016 with Brandon Norwood leading all with 468 yards and Montavious Williams adding 422, both of whom earned All-MEAC honors. Also, served as the Rattlers' Special teams Coordinator. Punter Koby Blanton was All-MEAC as was Punt Return specialist Kereem Smith.

At Bethune-Cookman

McCarthy served as the assistant Head Coach, director of player personnel and wide receivers coach for Bethune-Cookman University for four seasons.

In 2013, it was thanks in part to McCarthy and the Wildcat receivers B-CU garnered its second consecutive MEAC crown, going 7-1 in league play and defeating its first-ever Football Bowl Subdivision (FBS) opponent in FIU. In his first year with the program, McCarthy helped elevate the Bethune-Cookman passing game, as the 2012 Wildcats' offensive unit finished atop the MEAC in several statistical categories, developing into one of the nation's most prolific and high-powered offenses. The Wildcats were not only the MEAC's top offensive team, they were the league's top scoring team as well, averaging 29.4 points per game, ranking them in the top 40 nationally as well.

Prior to his Collegiate Coaching Return

McCarthy served as the Co-Founder and National Director of WRA-Receiver Academy which has two locations: Annapolis Junction, MD and Vienna, VA. In addition to his work with the Receiver Academy, McCarthy oversaw the high-powered attack as

offensive coordinator at Atlantic High School in Delray Beach, Fla. His top three receivers combined for 1,200 yards receiving and 13 touchdowns in consecutive years under his tutelage.

At LSU

McCarthy coached three seasons at LSU as the Tigers' wide receivers coach and was recognized as one of the top-five recruiters in the SEC and nation for the 2009 class. He helped develop Brandon LaFell into one of the top receivers in LSU's history, while also overseeing the emergence of Terrance Toliver as one of the up-and-coming young receivers in college football. LaFell ended his collegiate playing career with the Tigers finishing among the top five in school history in three career receiving categories – receptions, yards, and touchdowns.

In 2008, LaFell earned All-SEC honors after leading the SEC in total receptions (63) and receiving TDs (eight), and ranking second in yards (929). LaFell, a junior in 2008, became the fifth LSU player this decade (2000-10) to earn First Team All-Conference honors. Senior Demetrius Byrd ranked second on the squad with 37 catches for 513 yards and four TDs.

In his first year with the Tigers, McCarthy's influence on the Tiger receivers was evident early as the squad was forced to play without senior Early Doucet for five games. In Doucet's absence, the Tigers' young receivers grew up in a hurry as LaFell and junior college transfer Byrd became LSU's "go-to" guys.

LaFell, in his first season as a starter in 2007, caught 50 passes for a team-best 656 yards and four scores, while Byrd ranked third on the team with 35 receptions for 621 yards and a team-high seven touchdowns. Byrd caught the game-winning TD with only one second left in LSU's win over Auburn.

Doucet, despite missing five games with an injury, led the Tigers with 57 receptions while adding 525 yards and five touchdowns. Doucet, who finished his career ranked third in LSU history in receiving TDs (20), fourth in receptions (160), and ninth in receiving yards (1,943), went on to become a fourth round draft pick of the Arizona Cardinals in the 2008 NFL Draft.



At UCLA

During his one season with the Bruins, McCarthy helped UCLA to a 7-6 mark and a berth in the Emerald Bowl. The Bruins capped their 2006 regular season with a stunning 13-9 win over second-ranked Southern Cal.

At UCF

Prior to joining the Bruins, McCarthy held the position of wide receivers coach at Central Florida for two years. While at UCF, McCarthy tutored two outstanding wide receivers, both of whom earned All-Conference USA acclaim in 2005.

Brandon Marshall caught 74 passes for 1,195 yards and 11 touchdowns while Mike Walker had 64 catches for 856 yards and eight scores for the Golden Knights in 2005. Marshall, who was a fourth round pick of the Denver Broncos in the 2006 NFL Draft, had seven games of at least 100 yards and finished the year ranked No. 22 nationally in receiving yards per game (91.9). UCF posted an 8-5 overall mark in 2005 and went on to play in the Aloha Bowl that year.

In his first season with the Golden Knights, McCarthy tutored a group of wideouts that included Tavaris Capers, who finished ranked in the top 10 in UCF history in career touchdown receptions. McCarthy also assisted in the development of Luther Huggins, who led the team with 42 receptions for 585 yards.

At Nevada

Before arriving at UCF, McCarthy was the receivers coach at Nevada for four seasons (2000-2003) and was instrumental in the development of record-setting receiver Nate Burleson, who led the nation in

receptions in 2002 with 138 catches for 1,629 yards and 12 touchdowns. Burleson set numerous Nevada and Western Athletic Conference records, including receptions in a game with 19 and receiving yardage in a game with 326.

Two of McCarthy's wide receivers at Nevada were picked in the NFL Draft following the conclusion of their collegiate careers: Burleson was a third round pick of the Minnesota Vikings, while Maurice Mann was a fifth round selection of the Cincinnati Bengals.

Oakland Raiders/Tampa Bay Buccaneers

McCarthy spent two years as a defensive coaches' assistant in the NFL with the Oakland Raiders (1998-99) prior to moving to Nevada. He also served as an intern with the Tampa Bay Buccaneers in the summer of 1998.

At Boca Raton High School

McCarthy began his coaching career at his alma mater, Boca Raton High School, where he spent two years (1994-95). He then coached at Fort Lauderdale High School before moving into the college ranks at West Hills Community College in Coalinga, Calif., where he coached the secondary and special teams.

Monte Kiffin, a defensive mastermind who has coached football for more than 50 years, including 20 among the college ranks, comes to Florida Atlantic as a defensive analyst and pro liaison. He will lend his experience and expertise to a program that has been playing college football at the FBS level for less than 10 years. He also brings two NCAA National Championship titles and a Super Bowl crown to the Owls.

Professional Coaching Experience

Kiffin, who was most recently with the Jacksonville Jaguars and prior to that the Dallas Cowboys, spent 26 seasons in the National Football League, 13 of which were with the Tampa Bay Buccaneers. One of the longest-tenured defensive coordinators in the NFL, and the developer of the Tampa Cover Two defense, Kiffin is generally considered as one of the modern era's best defensive minds. He was a catalyst for Tampa Bay's 2002 Super Bowl Championship and coached units that ranked among the NFL's top 10 in both total defense and points allowed in 11 of his 13 seasons with the Buccaneers.

His Super Bowl champion unit became the first since the 1985 Chicago Bears to lead the league in total defense (252.8 ypg), fewest points allowed (196) and total interceptions (31). Kiffin's crew continued its impressive play in the 2002 postseason, allowing just 16 points in victories over San Francisco and Philadelphia, before turning it up a notch in Super Bowl XXXVII. During the Buccaneers' 48-21 win over

Oakland, Tampa Bay recorded a Super Bowl-record five interceptions, including three picks that were returned for touchdowns (also a Super Bowl record). Kiffin's charges added five sacks and allowed only 19 total rushing yards in capping one of the most dominating defensive performances in Super Bowl history.

Collegiate Coaching Experience

In 2009, Kiffin returned to the collegiate ranks at Tennessee where son Lane served as Head Coach. The Volunteers finished the regular-season with a 7-5 record and a berth in the Chick-fil-A Bowl where they fell 37-14 to Virginia Tech. In his lone season at Tennessee, the Vols were No. 12 nationally in both pass defense and pass efficiency defense and 22nd in total defense. The Kiffin duo would join forces once again at USC where Monte served as the defensive coordinator to the storied Trojans. The USC defense was ranked in the nation's top 20, and in 2011, the Trojans held eight of 12 opponents to 17 points or less.

He gained his first coaching experience at Nebraska, following his Cornhusker playing career, under the direction of the legendary Dr. Tom Osborne and Bob Devaney. He has had collegiate coaching stints in the ACC, Big 10, Southwest, and Pac-12. Within the NFL, he coached for the New Orleans Saints, Buffalo Bills, Tampa Bay Buccaneers, Green Bay Packers, Minnesota Vikings, New York Jets, Dallas Cowboys and Jacksonville Jaguars.

PLAYER DEVELOPMENT ASSISTANT

At USC

Jaron Fairman served three seasons (2013-15) as a graduate assistant at USC, working with the offense. During the 2014 season, USC's offense was ranked in the nation's top 25 in passing efficiency, passing offense, third down conversions and scoring offense in 2014.

In 2013 while working with the special teams, fullback Soma Vainuku made the All-Pac-12 First Team as a special teams player, and Nelson Agholor was an All-American Second Team member and All-Pac-12 Second Team pick as a punt returner. USC blocked six kicks, returned three punts for TDs in a game to tie an NCAA record and allowed no punt return yards in eight games.

Additional Coaching Experience

Fairman spent the 2012 season as an assistant at Crespi High in Encino (Calif.), handling the wide receivers and working with the special teams. In 2011, he was the wide receivers coach and special teams assistant at Western State College (now Western State Colorado University).

Fairman spent the previous three seasons (2008-10) as the wide receivers coach and special teams assistant at Nichols College. He also served as Nichols' offensive coordinator in 2010 after being the passing game coordinator in 2009.

Collegiate Playing Career

Fairman was a four-year letter winner (2003-06) as a wide receiver and special teams performer at Fresno State. He caught 46 passes for 572 yards (12.4 avg.) with six touchdowns in his career. He

was a team captain as a senior, catching 12 passes for 101 yards with a score in three contests before suffering season-ending knee injury. He added 26 receptions for 348 yards (13.4 avg.) with two TDs in 2005 (the Bulldogs nearly upset top-ranked USC in the Coliseum that year) and eight catches for 123 yards (15.4 avg.) with three TDs in 2004. His five-yard rushing touchdown against Portland State in 2003 came just hours after his father, who was in town to watch the game, had passed away. He was twice named to the Western Athletic Conference All-Academic team. The Bulldogs played in four bowls during his collegiate career (2002, redshirt season, 2003 Silicon Valley Football Classics, 2004 MPC Computers Bowl and 2005 AutoZone Liberty Bowl), winning the first three.

High School Playing Career

Fairman, an All-State wide receiver and defensive back at South Hills High in West Covina, Calif., participated in the training camp for the Arena Football League's San Jose Sabercats following the completion of his bachelor's degree in health sciences and public health from Fresno State in 2007. He obtained his master's degree in communication at USC.
