SERIES INFORMATION

Detroit (2-3) enters Week 6 with a home game against the Los Angeles Rams (3-2) at Ford Field. The Lions are coming off a 24-23 win over the Eagles in Week 5, while the Rams fell to Buffalo last week 30-19. The two teams have met 83 times in the regular season, including last season when the Rams won 21-14 at the Edward Jones Dome (12/13/15). The last time the Lions and Rams squared off when the Rams were located in Los Angeles occurred on October 24, 1993 when Detroit won 16-13 in overtime.

SECOND-HALF TURNAROUND IN 2015

Following a 1-7 start, Caldwell led the Lions to a 7-9 record in 2015 on the shoulders of a 6-2 surge to finish off the year. Detroit became the fourth team since 1991 to start a season with 1 or fewer wins in the first 8 games (1-7 or 0-8 record) and finish with a 6-2 record. A 6-2 finish is the best record by any team since 1991 to start the season with a 1-7 or 0-8 record. It marks the Lions' best second-half finish since the team finished 7-1 in 1995.

FIRST SEASON IN DETROIT

By finishing the 2014 season with an 11-5 regular season record, Caldwell tied Patsy Clark (1931, Portsmouth Spartans) for the most wins in franchise history by a coach in his first year with the club.

- Caldwell is the third coach in team history to lead the Lions to the playoffs in his first year with Detroit (George Wilson in 1957; Bobby Ross in 1997).
- He is the seventh coach in franchise history (since 1930) to lead the Lions to a winning record (entire season) in his first year with the club.

COACHING OVERVIEW

- Hired as head coach for the Detroit Lions January 14, 2014.
- In 15 NFL seasons, Caldwell has worked on coaching staffs that have led teams to 12 winning seasons and only twice finished below .500. Overall, Caldwell's teams he coached for have compiled a 162-88 regular season record, along with 12 playoff appearances, eight division titles, three conference championships and two Super Bowl wins.
- In five years as an NFL head coach, Caldwell has led a team to 11+ wins twice (14 with Indianapolis in 2009). Coached in three Super Bowls with Indianapolis (XLI and XLIV) and Baltimore (XLVII) and won two Super Bowl titles (Indianapolis and Baltimore).
- In his first year as head coach for Indianapolis (2009), he won the AFC Championship and led the franchise to Super Bowl XLIV. He became the first NFL coach to win his first 14 games and the fifth rookie head coach to reach the Super Bowl.
- One of four head coaches to produce 24+ regular-season wins and a Super Bowl berth in their first two career seasons as head coach.
- In eight of the 10 seasons Caldwell coached in Indianapolis, the Colts ranked in the Top-10 in total offense eight times and six times in the Top-5.
- From 2003-09, Caldwell was the Colts quarterbacks coach and was also promoted to assistant head coach and associate head coach during that time. He worked closely with QB Peyton Manning and the team's quarterbacks. During that span, Indianapolis set NFL records with seven consecutive seasons finishing with 11+ wins (6, Dallas 1976-81) and 12+ victories (4, Dallas, 1992-95).
- Manning won four (2003, 2004, 2008, 2009) of his five NFL MVP awards under Caldwell's tutelage.
- Two of his quarterbacks, Manning (Super Bowl XLI) and Ravens QB Joe Flacco (Super Bowl XLVII) were named Super Bowl MVPs following their teams' respective championship runs.
- After being appointed Ravens offensive coordinator in December 2012, the team went on to win five of its next seven games, including Super Bowl XLVII. During that span, the offense averaged 400.6 yards per game, including an average of 410.3 yards per game during the four playoff wins.

QUINN MAKES HIS MARK

Bob Quinn, hired January 11, 2016 as executive vice president and general manager, oversees the entire Lions' football operations and reports directly to Owner and Chairman of the Board Martha Firestone Ford.

- Since joining the Lions, Quinn, who spent the previous 16 seasons with the New England Patriots, has begun building the football foundation which he believes will provide the team with the optimum chance for success. During his introductory press conference, he quickly set forth his vision.
- Among the numerous free agents acquired by Quinn this offseason was WR Marvin Jones, considered by many to be the top free agent wide receiver on the market. Additionally, Quinn also retained key Lions free agents, including DT Haloti Ngata and LB Tahir Whitehead.
- His initial draft class featured the selection of the most linemen (offense and defense) in a Lions draft since 1989, highlighted by the team's first three picks (T Taylor Decker, DT A'Shawn Robinson and C Graham Glasgow).

PATRIOTS PAST

During his time with New England, Quinn served a number of roles in the player personnel department, including most recently as Director of Pro Scouting from 2012-15. While he worked as Director of Pro Scouting, the Patriots won the 2014 Super Bowl and four-straight AFC East Division championships.

- From 2009-2012, Quinn was the Assistant Director of Pro Personnel. For the previous nine years, Quinn worked in several different capacities within the Patriots player personnel department, including roles in college scouting as a National Scout and Regional Scout. He played an integral role in evaluating and procuring talent for the team through the NFL draft process, free agency, trades, etc.
- While working for the New England Patriots, he helped contribute to one of the most impressive stretches in NFL history, one that produced **four Super Bowl titles, including the most recent championship in 2014 (Super Bowl XLIX). Since 2000, Quinn's first year with New England, the Patriots have won six AFC Championships, 13 AFC East titles, 12+ games in a season 10 times (which includes the past six years) and 10+ games in 14 of his 16 seasons.**
- As Director of Pro Scouting, Quinn utilized all possible methods to seek the Patriots' "next player." This approach had a tremendous impact on the Patriots' Super Bowl XLIX championship as seven players, who were acquired (including two via trades) after the start of the regular season, all played in the Super Bowl.
- Another key player during the Super Bowl XLIX Championship run, CB Malcolm Butler, signed with the club after a rookie minicamp tryout. Butler, who sealed the Super Bowl victory with a goal line interception, would join All-Pro CB Darrelle Revis in the New England secondary. Prior to serving as Director of Pro Scouting,

Quinn was the Patriots' assistant director of pro personnel. Prior to that, he worked in college scouting as the team's national scout in 2008 and as a regional scout from 2004-07.

- In 2008, the Patriots drafted LB Jerod Mayo in the first round and WR Matthew Slater in the fifth round. Mayo was a two-time Pro Bowl linebacker and Slater has become one of the league's elite special teams players having earned five Pro Bowl selections and three All-Pro honors. Quinn also served two seasons (2002-03) as a pro scout and two season (2000-01) as a player personnel assistant for the Patriots.

WHAT TO WATCH FOR

THE TALE OF TWO BACKFIELDS

As the Rams and Lions square off this week, all eyes will be on the starting running backs for both teams. After leading all running backs with 80 receptions in 2015, Lions RB **Theo Riddick** has certainly established himself as one of the League's most dynamic weapons out of the backfield. On the other side, the Rams come to Detroit with one of the NFL's most lethal ball carriers dating back to last season. Looking back at last season's matchup, Rams RB Todd Gurley proved his value when he finished third in the NFL in rushing yards (1,106) as rookie.

With both running backs expected to help shoulder the load of the respective offensive attacks in Week 6, the importance of ball security will not fly under the radar. Gurley fumbled twice last week in a loss to Buffalo, while the Lions forced critical fumble against the Eagles backfield and limited turnovers on their offensive side of the ball. Detroit's running backs have not fumbled in a game this season and must continue their sure-handed ways as they face a Rams defense that has forced 10 fumbles through five games (five recovered).

Riddick on the offensive running attack following a win against the Eagles: "That's a great defense and they made some adjustments. We just have to get positive yards on first down and we'll be OK. We did (make adjustments) and most certainly is we took care of the ball. That's obviously a huge, huge emphasis."

This season the Rams are averaging just 81 rushing yards per game. Despite the slow start, the Lions and Rams have relied heavily upon their running backs to put points on the board. With the Lions losing RB **Ameer Abdullah** early in the season due to injury, Riddick has stepped up to the challenge of being Detroit's primary back moving forward.

Riddick on playing as the starting running back option for the Lions: "It's just next-man-in philosophy all across the board, so I think everyone will be ready. We're definitely going to miss him (Ameer Abdullah) we have to protect the ball and that will put ourselves in the best position to win."

In each of the Lions' two wins this season, Riddick has managed to find the end zone at least twice in both contests. Gurley resembles the same type of value to his club, recording two touchdowns in his team's three wins this season. He has rushed for all three of the Rams' rushing touchdowns this season while Riddick leads Detroit with four total touchdowns on the year.

With his two receiving touchdowns against Philadelphia last week, Riddick became the seventh Lions running back in team history to catch 10+ touchdowns in a career and the first to reach that mark since Hall of Fame RB Barry Sanders (10, 1989-98). By catching two touchdown passes against the Eagles, Riddick also became the first Lions running back to register two receiving touchdowns in a game since RB Horace King vs. Minnesota December 9, 1978. This Week 6 outcome may be contingent upon which team can depend on the man in the backfield to break the pylon.

Lions Head Coach Jim Caldwell on Riddick's ability to find the end zone: "He's a very, very fine, it's an understatement to say he's a fine open-field runner. He really can make some things happen. He can make you miss, he's got a lot of God-given ability to get north and south. He shows up a lot in crucial times in games, he's not afraid of the moment."

DEFENSE GETS IT DONE

In Week 5 against Philadelphia, CB **Darius Slay** showcased in front of a home crowd exactly why his nickname is 'Big Play Slay.' With the Lions trailing Philadelphia 23-21 with just under three minutes to play in the fourth quarter, Eagles QB Carson Wentz received the snap from Philadelphia's 45-yard line and promptly pitched the ball to RB Ryan Mathews in the backfield. Slay identified the run and brought Mathews down to force his first career fumble as Detroit regained possession. A conversion by the Eagles would have sealed the game as the Lions had used all three timeouts prior to the play.

Slay on the forced fumble late in the game: "We just came back as a defense like, 'We need to make a play, so let's all make a play.' We knew they were going to run the ball, so we were being a lot more aggressive, so I just came up there and I think I stuck him pretty good. The ball came up. We saw that he had to carry the ball out wide, so we knew he was going to fumble once in a while, so I just made a play."

The Lions offense took over from 45 yards with 2:34 remaining in the game. QB **Matthew Stafford** connected with WR **Golden Tate** for a 27-yard gain, but Detroit was forced to settle for a 29-yard field goal to put the Lions up 24-23. Philadelphia's offense returned to the field, trailing by a mere point with 1:28 left in the game. Wentz took the snap and heaved the football deep down the field looking for WR Nelson Agholor, but a reaching Slay snatched Wentz's pass out of the air for an 11-yard interception, sealing the Lions' win with his fifth career interception.

Slay on his interception in the fourth quarter: "I was surprised he even threw that. I was in great position, so I'm like, 'OK.' But then I looked in the air and I said, 'Oh, the ball is coming for real. He's (Carson Wentz) really throwing this. Oh well, it's time for his first career pick.' I was like, 'Oh, this is me right here, for sure.' He's a talented guy, man. I was kind of surprised. I didn't believe all the hype at first, but he's a very, very great decision (maker). But right then I just made a better play."

On what it means to be able to make two big plays in a game: "It's big, man. That's my nickname, 'Big Play Slay,' so I try to make every play I do big. I'm just blessed and fortunate to be able to do it."

Additionally, LB **Tahir Whitehead** registered a career single-game high 12 total tackles against the Eagles last week, marking his fourth game this season with 10 or more tackles and fifth such game of his career. Through Week 5, Whitehead is tied for sixth in the NFL in total tackles with 46 (33 solo).

Whitehead on the importance of being able to overcome mistakes in the second half to find a way to win: "It's a huge step because it shows resilience. It shows that we're able to just keep fighting. It just shows that we have that grit, which we know we have. There's a bunch of men with pride on this team, you know. We love the game, so we've just got to keep that. Keep that intensity and just keep battling one game at a time and keep finding a way to give ourselves a chance."

STAFFORD SURGICAL IN COMEBACK WIN

Lions QB **Matthew Stafford** continued to shine in Detroit's 24-23 come-from-behind victory over the previously undefeated Philadelphia Eagles last Sunday. The eighth-year signal caller did most of his damage in the first half, completing 73 percent of his passes for 122 yards and three scores. It marked the 26th time he's thrown for 3+ touchdowns in a game (third time this season) and the sixth time he's done so in the first half of a game. Stafford knew the offense would have to play smart in order to penetrate an Eagles defense that had yet to allow a passing touchdown on the season.

Stafford on how he was able to exploit a stout Eagles defense on the first three drives: "I think we just played really smart, efficient football. There weren't massive, huge plays. We were just staying ahead of the chains, getting first downs. First downs lead to touchdowns in this league. We did a good job of that, and then we were converting in the red zone. We were by no means perfect on those drives, but played well."

Stafford and the Lions carried a 21-10 lead into the locker room at halftime last week, but the offense proved stagnant in the second half as Philly's defense was able to hold Detroit to just four first downs, after tallying 17 in the first half. Facing a crucial 3rd-and-6 with the game on the line with just over two minutes to spare, Stafford dropped back and faced heavy pressure, but was able to find WR **Golden Tate** for a 27-yard gain down to the Eagles 12-yard line.

Stafford on his pass to WR Golden Tate late in the game: "Yeah, you know, Golden did a great job. Little deeper than I expected him to be, but I was kind of waiting and waiting, waiting for him to kind of show up in a little bit of a crossing route. He got through some traffic, I saw 53 (Nigel Bradham) at the last second, you know, just bailing, getting a little bit of depth. I threw it to where I thought it was going to be a good spot. Didn't see the rest, but I'll see it on Monday."

Caldwell on his view of QB Matthew Stafford's fourth quarter pass to WR Golden Tate: "It was, perhaps, one of the better anticipatory passes that you'll see. He (Stafford) laid that thing out there in front of him and Golden was able to run right through the catch point and did a very, very nice job. It took a little bit of anticipation, but those two have gotten to know each other pretty well. Those kinds of things, it's great to see them happen certainly in a ball game."

Four plays later, with 1:28 remaining, K **Matt Prater** nailed his 14th career game-winning field goal from 29 yards out. Detroit's comeback win marked the 22nd time Stafford has led a game-winning drive when the Lions trailed or were tied in the fourth quarter or overtime, and the second time he's led a comeback win in the last five weeks.

Stafford on staying patient on the final drive: "I think you want to play smart. I think we called two really good plays to give us a chance to run the ball in and it didn't happen. But we made them use timeouts, and then the last play – I look at the picture now and they didn't cover it was well as they could have and I just was looking at the wrong guy at the wrong time. It just happens sometimes. Wish I could have thrown a touchdown pass there, but we knew a sack was going to be better than throwing the ball away, make them burn their last timeout. So tried to run around there for a little bit, just wish, as an offensive player, I always want to score a touchdown there and make them go score a touchdown. Didn't happen."

ON THE RECEIVING END

The Lions offense features one of the deepest veteran receiving corps in the NFL with the likes of WRs **Marvin Jones Jr.**, **Golden Tate** and **Anquan Boldin**, combining for 26 total years of pass-catching experience.

MARV-ELOUS MR. JONES

Jones Jr. joined the Lions following a four-year career (2012-15) with the Cincinnati Bengals, where he was a key piece of the Bengals' high-powered offense. He recorded a career high 10 touchdowns in 2013, and so far leads the Lions with 519 receiving yards.

- With 6 receptions for 205 yards and two touchdowns at Green Bay (9/25), Jones Jr. became the fifth player in Lions history to surpass 200 receiving yards in a game, joining Calvin Johnson (5), Cloyce Box (2), Richard Johnson (1) and Roy Williams (1) in that elite group.
- Jones recorded the 10th 200-yard receiving game in team history and his 205 yards were the eighth-most by a Lions receiver in a single game.
- Through Week 5, Jones Jr. leads the NFL in receiving yards with 519, and is tied for the league lead in 25+-yard receptions with seven.

A BOLD CAREER

In his 14th NFL season, WR **Anquan Boldin** joins the Lions receiving corps in 2016 with numbers worthy of Hall of Fame consideration.

- Boldin led the 49ers last year with 69 receptions and 789 yards. He currently ranks 11th in receptions (1,030) and 16th in receiving yards (13,379) on the NFL's all-time lists.
- Only 13 players in NFL history have recorded 1,000 or more receptions in their careers. With 1,030, Boldin trails only Titans WR Andre Johnson (1,062), Cardinals WR Larry Fitzgerald (1,049) and Cowboys TE Jason Witten (1,044) for the most among active players.



- In 2015, Boldin was also named the NFL's Walter Payton Man of the Year.

Boldin's 69 receptions and 789 receiving yards in 2015 made him the first player in NFL history to finish with at least 50 receptions and 600 receiving yards in each of his first 13 seasons.

- Since entering the NFL in 2003, Boldin ranks fourth in receptions (1,030) and third in receiving yards (13,379).
- With a 24-yard touchdown reception in Week 2 vs. Tennessee (9/18), Boldin has now caught touchdown passes with four different teams, including Arizona (44), Baltimore (14), San Francisco (16) and Detroit (2). - Through five games, the Lions rank second in receptions by running backs (36), third in receiving yards (297), first in receiving touchdowns (4), second in receiving first downs (15) and third in yards after the catch (301).

RB **Theo Riddick** has shown a knack for coming through in the clutch over the course of his young career, as he has demonstrated himself as a reliable contributor as both a rusher and pass catcher out of the backfield.

THEO'S THREE-YEAR SPAN

- Riddick caught two touchdown passes (1, 17 yards) in the Lions' 24-23 win over Philadelphia and became the first Lions running back to register two receiving touchdowns in a game since RB Horace King vs. Minnesota December 9, 1978.
- By catching two touchdown passes against the Eagles, Riddick became the fourth Lions running back to record 10+ receiving touchdowns over a three-year span, joining Bill Dudley (15, 1947-49), Howard Cassidy (10, 1956-58; 14, 1957-59; 12, 1958-60) and Doak Walker (10, 1950-52; 11, 1953-55).
- Riddick is the seventh Lions running back in team history to catch 10+ touchdowns in a career and the first to reach that mark since Hall of Fame RB Barry Sanders (10, 1989-98).

DESTRUCTIVE D-LINE

Over the past seven seasons, few defensive line units have disrupted opponents in both the passing and running games as the Detroit Lions. The Lions, under the direction of Defensive Line Coach **Kris Kocurek** since 2010, feature an attack upfront that first concentrates on stopping the run and then applies heavy pressure on the quarterback.

In 2015, the Lions defensive line generated 82.0 total tackles for loss or no gain (3rd in NFL), which includes 34.5 sacks (2nd in NFL), 44.0 tackles for loss or no gain against the rush (8th in NFL) and 8 forced fumbles (tied for 2nd in NFL).

KERRYING THE LOAD

The Lions' defensive line displays great depth across the board, led by first-year DE **Kerry Hyder**. Hyder earned a roster spot this offseason and has emerged on the scene as one of the NFL's upstart pass rushers so far.

- Through Week 5, Hyder currently ranks fifth in the NFL in sacks with 5.0.
- Hyder piled on his early-season sacks total by adding another sack at Chicago (10/2). Through four games, he tallied 5.0 sacks and became the third Lions defensive player to register 5+ sacks through the team's first four games (DE William Gay, 8.5 in 1983; DE Robert Porcher, 5.0 in 2001).
- With 1 sack at Chicago, Hyder joined DE William Gay (1983) as the only Lions defensive players to record a sack in each of the first four games of the season.

Following up on his Pro Bowl season in 2014, **S Glover Quin** solidified his place as the Lions' anchor in the secondary last season and has continued his ascent as one of the most consistent safeties in the NFL. He received the team's Joe Schmidt Leadership Award in 2015, as voted by his teammates.

In the 2015 season finale at Chicago (1/3/16), Quin started his 100th consecutive game, including his 48th straight start since joining the Lions in 2013. Quin, now with 105, has the longest active streak of consecutive starts among safeties and is second to Dallas CB Brandon Carr (133) among all defensive backs.

SLAY SAVES THE DAY

With less than 2:00 to play in the fourth quarter vs. Philadelphia (10/2), Slay picked off an Eagles pass (11-yard return) to seal the Lions' 24-23 win against Philadelphia. It was Slay's first interception of the season and fifth of his career.

- Slay also forced an Eagles fumble on 3rd-and-2 at the Eagles 45-yard line that was recovered by DT Tyrann Walker. The turnover gave the Lions the ball back with 2:34 to play in the fourth quarter and led to the game-winning field goal. The forced fumble was the first of Slay's career.
- *Slay is the first player to force a fumble resulting in a takeaway and intercept a pass in the last 3:00 of the fourth quarter since Indianapolis Colts CB Eugene Daniel at the New York Jets December 5, 1993.*
- In the game, Slay had 3 tackles (3 solo), 1 interception (11 yards), 1 forced fumble and 2 pass defenses.

- Prater's kick was the longest in the history of Soldier Field. Bears K Robbie Gould made the previous long of 58 yards.
- With his 59-yarder, Prater joined K Jason Hanson (8 in 2008 and 5 in 2011) as the only kickers in team history to make five 50-yard field goals in a season. Additionally, Prater has now tallied five 50+-yard field goals in a season for the third time in his career (5 in 2008 and 6 in 2013).

- With 6 points (1 FG, 3 PAT) at Chicago last season, Prater finished the season with 102 points and surpassed the 100+-point mark for the fifth time in his career. Prater is the sixth player in team history with 100+ points in a season and the first since K Jason Hanson in 2012 (134). RETURN OF ROBERTS

Lions WR **Andre Roberts** came to Detroit this offseason as a free agent and has already made his impact known as a weapon in the return game.

- Entering Week 6, Roberts ranks second in the NFL in punt return average (19.7), fifth in punt return yards (138) and is one of only five players with a punt return touchdown so far this season.
- Roberts returned two punts for 100 yards at Chicago, which included an 85-yard punt return touchdown in the fourth quarter. His 100 yards established a new single-game career high (previous best: 72 vs. Den 12/12/10) and his punt return touchdown was longest of his career (previous best: 37 at Dal 10/27/14).
- Roberts' punt return was the sixth-longest in team history and longest since WR Reggie Swinton's 89-yard punt return at Carolina December 21, 2003. It was also the first by a Lions returner since WR Jeremy Ross scored on a 58-yard punt return at Philadelphia December 8, 2013. SERIES NOTES

- In the Lions-Rams series, the Rams have been located in three different cities, Cleveland (1937-45), Los Angeles (1946-94; 2016) and St. Louis (1995-2015).
- Overall, Detroit was 8-7 vs. the Cleveland Rams, 4-4 vs. the St. Louis Rams and are 27-32-1 vs. the Los Angeles Rams.
- The inaugural game between the two teams was played September 10, 1937 when the Lions claimed a 28-0 shutout at Cleveland.
- After the Rams moved to Los Angeles in 1946, the clubs faced off twice each season from 1946-66. The Rams owned a slight edge, 21-20-1, in those games played.
- The Lions played the Rams on November 7, 1999 in the first meeting between the teams since the Rams moved from Los Angeles to St. Louis. Detroit won the affair 31-27 at the Silverdome in the final minute of the game when QB Gus Frerotte hit WR Johnnie Morton on a 12-yard touchdown pass with 28 seconds remaining to play for the game-winning score. On the final drive, Frerotte completed a 57-yard pass to WR Germane Crowell on a fourth-and-26 play to keep the drive alive.
- In the 2003 season finale, the Lions defeated the St. Louis Rams at Ford Field, 30-20, denying the Rams' bid for homefield advantage throughout the playoffs.
- In the Lions 44-6 win over St. Louis, October 10, 2010, KR Stefan Logan tied a team-record with a 105-yard kickoff return for a touchdown. QB Shaun Hill connected on three touchdown passes, CB Alphonso Smith returned a 42-yard interception for a touchdown and rookie DT Ndamukong Suh registered his first career interception on a tipped pass (20-yard return).
- In the Rams' most recent visit to Ford Field, the Lions orchestrated a 27-23 come-from-behind win over the Rams on September 9, 2012 in the team's season home opener. QB Matthew Stafford led the team on a nine-play, 80-yard drive with 1:55 left to play before finding RB Kevin Smith for a five-yard touchdown pass for the go-ahead score. The victory marked Stafford's seventh-career fourth-quarter game-winning drive when trailing or tied.
- The Lions were defeated by the Rams on December 13, 2015 at the Edward Jones Dome 21-14. QB Matthew Stafford surpassed 25,000 career passing yards and reached that mark in the fewest games by any player in NFL history. By reaching 25,000 yards in 90 career games, Stafford eclipsed the previous record of 92 games set by Hall of Fame QB Dan Marino. (Courtesy Elias Sports Bureau).

The Detroit Lions' start to the 2016 regular season highlighted the duel between two marquee quarterbacks in Lions QB Matthew Stafford and Colts QB Andrew Luck. With the help of a balanced offense through the air and a consistent rushing attack on the ground, the Lions jumped out to a 21-3 lead. After a 21-yard touchdown run by RB Theo Riddick to put Detroit up 7-0, rookie RB Dwayne Washington scored his first career touchdown to extend the lead 14-0. Seven of Stafford's 14 first half completions all went to different receivers including a six-yard touchdown strike to TE Eric Ebron that put Detroit up 21-3. Luck and the Colts responded with a 75-yard drive ending in a touchdown reception by Colts WR Donte Moncrief to set the score at 21-10 right before halftime. After a Lions drive stalled, Luck and the Colts put together an 85-yard drive ending in a 19-yard touchdown pass to TE Dwayne Allen. Following a successful two-point conversion pass to Allen, Indianapolis trailed 21-18 halfway through the third quarter. Detroit responded with a 71-yard drive ending with an 11-yard touchdown pass to RB Ameer Abdullah to go up 28-18. Following an Adam Vinatieri 40-yard field goal, Luck and the Colts added a 94-yard drive ending with a 16-yard touchdown strike to TE Jack Doyle to tie the game at 28-28. With completions to five different receivers, Stafford connected with Riddick for a 13-yard score. A missed extra point by K Matt Prater put the Lions lead at 34-28 with 4:11 left to play. The Colts put together an eight play drive for 75 yards as Doyle hauled in his second touchdown reception from six yards out to go up 35-34 on Detroit with 37 seconds left in regulation. With three timeouts, Stafford and the Lions completed three passes for a total of 50 yards before Prater lined up for a 43-yard field goal to put Detroit ahead 37-35 with four seconds left to play. After a series of laterals on the ensuing kickoff, Detroit was awarded a safety, ending regulation and giving the Lions a 39-35 victory.

The Lions hosted the Tennessee Titans in their home opener at Ford Field in Week 2 of the 2016 regular season (9/18). After a Sam Martin 48-yard punt and a holding penalty on the Titans, Tennessee started a drive from their own 10-yard line early in the first quarter. Lions DE Devin Taylor stuffed Titans RB DeMarco Murray in the end zone for a Detroit safety. The Lions immediately added an eight play scoring drive for 79 yards that was capped by a 24-yard Matthew Stafford touchdown strike to Anquan Boldin, putting the Lions up 9-0 in the first quarter. After a series of short completions by Titans QB Marcus Mariota, Tennessee put the score at 9-3 with a 46-yard field goal by Titans K Ryan Succop. Following a series of stops by both defenses, Detroit put together a 13-play, 75-yard drive that ended in a 42-yard field goal by K Matt Prater, giving the Lions a 12-3 lead going into halftime. Detroit constructed a 14-play drive midway through the third quarter that ended in a 27-yard field goal by Prater, giving the Lions a 15-3 lead heading into the fourth quarter. After a 20-yard completion, Mariota quickly connected with TE Delanie Walker for a 30-yard touchdown strike to bring the score to 15-10 with more than 14 minutes left to play. After forcing Detroit to punt on multiple drives, the Titans took the ball back with 7:04 to play. Mariota connected on all nine of his last pass attempts, including a nine yard touchdown pass to Titans WR Andre Johnson. The Titans took a 16-15 lead with 1:13 to play after a sack by Detroit on their failed two-point conversion attempt. Titans CB Perrish Cox intercepted a pass by Stafford at midfield on the Lions last drive of the game to give Tennessee a 16-15 victory.

The Packers defeated the Lions 34-27 in Week 3 at Lambeau Field after getting out to an early 31-3 lead which included scores on all of Green Bay's first six possessions. The Packers scored first with a 14-yard touchdown pass from Packers QB Aaron Rodgers to WR Davante Adams to take a 7-0 lead. The Lions responded with a 16-play drive that ended in a 42-yard field goal from K Matt Prater, setting the score at 7-3. After a kickoff out of bounds by Detroit, Rodgers and the Packers started a drive from their own 40. Rodgers quickly followed up on a 40-yard pass across the middle to WR Jordy Nelson with an eight-yard touchdown pass back to Nelson, giving Green Bay a 14-3 lead at the end of the first quarter. On the first play of the second quarter, Lions CB Nevin Lawson was called for defensive pass interference, a penalty for 66 total yards against Detroit. Rodgers and Packers TE Richard Rodgers connected for a two-yard touchdown pass following the infraction for a 21-3 Green Bay lead. A Matthew Stafford pass intended for Lions TE Eric Ebron was picked off on the ensuing Detroit drive, leading to a Green Bay field goal by K Mason Crosby. After a stalled Lions drive, Rodgers found Nelson again in the second quarter in the back of the end zone for a 17-yard touchdown and 31-3 Packers lead. In two plays Stafford connected with Lions WR Marvin Jones Jr. before the end of the first half for a 73-yard touchdown strike, giving the Packers a 31-10 lead at halftime. Detroit scored on the first possession of the second half when Stafford hit WR Anquan Boldin for a touchdown early in the third quarter to set the score at 31-17. Crosby nailed a 46-yard field goal on Green Bay's next drive, giving the Packers a 34-17 lead heading into the fourth quarter. With a 50-yard field goal by Prater, two stops by the Lions defense and another deep touchdown pass to Jones Jr., the Lions pulled within one score at 34-27 with more than three minutes left to play. A scramble by Rodgers on third and long gave Green Bay a 34-27 victory as time expired.

The Chicago Bears defeated the Detroit Lions 17-14 in Week 4 at Soldier Field. After getting the ball on their own 45-yard line in the first quarter, the Bears put together a 10-play drive that ended in a Brian Hoyer touchdown pass to WR Eddie Royal to give Chicago a 7-0 lead. The Lions failed to score in the first quarter, but the defense put together a series of stops that kept the score at 7-0 midway through the second quarter. Lions K Matt Prater put Detroit on the board after nailing a 50-yard field goal with four minutes left to play in the first half. After another defensive stop by Detroit, the Lions offense moved the ball into Bears territory looking to close the gap on a 7-3 Bears lead before halftime. A pass by Lions QB Matthew Stafford was picked off by Bears CB Jacoby Glenn with 16 seconds left in the second quarter, robbing the Lions of any points before the half. With Detroit opting to receive the second half kickoff, the Lions offense drove 66 yards in nearly eight minutes but failed to get in the end zone at Chicago's one yard line. Prater knocked in a 21-yard field goal to put Chicago's lead at 7-6. Hoyer and the Bears offense quickly responded as they went 75-yards in six plays ending with Hoyer connecting with Bears TE Zach Miller for a six yard touchdown catch. After a Bears defensive stop to end the third quarter, Chicago went 11-plays for 73 yards that ended in a 25-yard field goal by Bears K Connor Barth. The Lions trailed 17-6 with more than 10 minutes left to play in regulation. A Lions series was halted at the Bears 23-yard line when a Stafford pass intended for Lions WR Anquan Boldin was intercepted by Bears CB Deiondre' Hall with four minutes left. After a defensive stop, Lions WR Andre Roberts returned a Chicago punt 85-yards for a touchdown. The Lions' two-point conversion attempt was successful, giving the Bears a 17-14 lead with 1:52 left to play. Chicago escaped with a 17-14 victory after Detroit failed to recover an onside kick attempt late in the game.

The Lions snapped a three-game losing streak with a 24-23 victory against the Philadelphia Eagles. The Lions jumped out to a 14-point lead, including touchdowns on their first three possessions before the Eagles fought back to make the game a nail-biter. Detroit drove 75 yards on their first drive that ended with a Matthew Stafford touchdown pass to Theo Riddick. After forcing Philly to punt, Stafford found Riddick again for a 17-yard touchdown reception. Philly entered the second quarter down 14-0 before Eagles QB Carson Wentz led his team to a touchdown drive. The Eagles drove 75 yards in nine plays when Wentz found Eagles RB Ryan Mathews for a one-yard touchdown pass to make it a 14-7 margin. Stafford connected with five different receivers on Detroit's next possession that ended with a touchdown strike in the back of the end zone to Lions WR Marvin Jones Jr. The Eagles overcame three offensive penalties with a 50-yard field goal by K Caleb Sturgis to go into the half down 21-10. Philly opened the third quarter with another drive led by Wentz, who connected with four different receivers on five pass attempts before WR Jordan Huff hauled in a one-yard touchdown pass. An Eagles defense that held the Lions to 45 total yards in the second half forced a fumble on the ensuing drive to set up a 33-yard Sturgis field goal. With more than a quarter of football left to play, Philly trailed 21-20 before forcing a Lions three and out late in the third quarter. After stout performances by both defenses, a 20-yard completion by Wentz led to Sturgis' third field goal of the day, this time from 49 yards out. The Lions trailed 23-21 with a little more than five minutes left. After another three and out by Detroit's offense, Lions CB Darius Slay forced a fumble on a third and short that was recovered by Lions DT Tyrunn Walker. Detroit's offense took over in Eagles territory with 2:34 left in regulation. Stafford found WR Golden Tate on third and short for a 27-yard gain that moved the Lions within field goal range. A third down sack by Eagles DT Fletcher Cox brought out Lions K Matt Prater for an attempt at the 10th game winning field goal of his career. Prater drilled the kick from 29 yards out, but the Lions defense still needed to make a stop. Wentz and the Eagles offense took the field with 1:28 left and trailing 24-23. Slay forced his second straight turnover on as many defensive possessions when a 1st and 10 pass intended for Eagles WR Nelson Agholor was intercepted by Slay to seal a 24-23 victory for Detroit.
