NEW ENGLAND PATRIOTS (4-1) vs. CINCINNATI BENGALS (2-3) Sunday, Oct 16, 2016 • Gillette Stadium (66,829) • 1:00 p.m. ET

The New England Patriots return to the confines of Gillette stadium to face the second of three straight NFC North opponents when they host the Cincinnati Bengals on Sunday. After beating Cleveland, 33-13, last week and the Cincinnati game this week, the Patriots will travel to face Pittsburgh on Oct. 23.

The Patriots have won six straight home games vs. the Bengals, with the last loss coming in 1986. The team's last played on a Sunday Night Football game in 2014 with the Patriots taking a 43-17 win on Oct. 5, 2014.

The Patriots first win in the Kraft era came in Cincinnati against the Bengals on Sept. 18, 1994. After an O-3 start, New England pulled away with a 31-28 victory.

#### BROADCAST INFORMATION

TELEVISION: This week's game will be broadcast by CBS and can be seen locally on WBZ-TV Channel 4 in Boston. Ian Eagle will handle play-by-play duties with Dan Fouts as the color analyst. Evan Washburn will work the sidelines. The game will be produced by Mark Wolff and directed by Bob Fishman.

NATIONAL RADIO: This week's game will be broadcast to a national audience on ESPN Radio. Adam Amin and Bill Polian will call the game. Sal Palantonio will work the sidelines. LOCAL RADIO: 98.5 FM, The Sports Hub, is the flagship station for the Patriots Radio Network. Play-by-play broadcaster Bob Socci will call the action along with former Patriots quarterback Scott Zolak, who will provide color analysis. Produced by Marc Cappello.

#### SERIES HISTORY



The Patriots and Bengals will meet for the 25th time in team history. The last time the two teams met was when the Patriots hosted Cincinnati in a Sunday Night football game on Oct. 5, 2014 and came out on the winning side of a 43-17 decision.

New England leads the all-time series by a 15-9 margin in a series that dates back to 1968, including wins in six of the last eight meetings.

While New England is 9-2 all-time at home against Cincinnati, including 3-0 at Gillette Stadium, the Bengals are in front, 7-6, in games played at Cincinnati. The Patriots are 2-1 in games played at Paul Brown Stadium.

In 2013, the Patriots traveled to Cincinnati with a 4-0 record and failed to score a touchdown in a 13-6 loss to the Bengals at Paul Brown Stadium. Tom Brady ended a streak of 52 straight games with at least one touchdown pass in the loss to the Bengals, the second longest streak in NFL history. The Bengals win also snapped a four-game winning streak in the series by the Patriots.

#### BELICHICK REVERES PAUL BROWN Patriots head coach Bill Belichick admires and reveres Bengals founder Paul Brown, whom he calls the "father of professional football."

When ESPN counted down the greatest coaches of all time in the summer of 2013, Paul Brown and Bill Belichick checked in at No. 6 and No. 7, respectively. Fitting, considering the high regard in which Belichick holds one of his coaching idols. Their connection can be traced back to when an eight-year old Belichick attended a Browns training camp and watched the head coach walk the sidelines first-hand. Belichick's godfather, Bill Edwards, played and coached with Brown before going on to coach alongside Belichick's father, Steve, at Vanderbilt. And while Belichick didn't personally know Brown, he studied and admired his forward-thinking football philosophies. Brown, who was the first head coach and general manager of the Cleveland football franchise from 1946-62 as well as the founder of the Cincinnati Bengals in 1968, is credited with creating the draw and trap plays and implementing practices broken down by position groups, among other innovations. "He was so far ahead of his time in all other organizational things, a lot of schematic things," Belichick said. "The preparation that we all do, it's all very similar to what he did half a century ago. The more I know about Paul Brown, the more impressed I am with him." Belichick had such respect for Brown that when he tied him for most career wins on Nov. 14, 2010 at Pittsburgh, he wore a fedora to the stadium in honor of Brown's trademark style.

#### MY DOG ATE IT

In 2004, when Belichick was asked a question about Brown, he remarked that he owned two copies of Brown's autobiography, "PB: The Paul Brown Story," one of which was autographed. But Belichick wasn't the only one in his house who digested Brown's football wisdom. His dog ate the autographed copy, leaving him without the prized keepsake.

Six days after being embarrassed on Monday Night Football, the New England Patriots responded with a 43-17 rout of the previously undefeated Cincinnati Bengals in a Sunday Night Football game at Gillette Stadium. The Bengals entered the game ranked first in the NFL, allowing just 11.0 points per game.

QB Tom Brady became the sixth NFL player to reach 50,000 career passing yards, completing 23-of-35 passes for 292 yards with two touchdowns. He led the Patriots to scores on his first two drives for a 14-0 lead and helped the Patriots take a 20-3 halftime lead.

The Patriots ground game chalked up 220 yards, including a 113-yard rushing performance by RB Stevan Ridley and a 90-yard performance by RB Shane Vereen. TE Rob Gronkowski registered his 13th 100-yard day, finishing with six receptions for 100 yards with one touchdown.

K Stephen Gostkowski drilled a career-high five field goals, including a 48-yarder and a 47-yarder. The Patriots defense forced three fumbles, including one on a kickoff that was returned 9 yards for a touchdown by DB Kyle Arrington. In addition, the Patriots defense did not allow the Bengals to convert a third-down on seven attempts.

The Patriots opened the game with a 10-play, 80-yard drive that was highlighted by a 30-yard pass from Brady to TE Tim Wright and culminated with a 1-yard touchdown run by Ridley. After the Bengals missed on a 52-yard attempt on the next series, the Patriots offense took over and Brady connected with Gronkowski for a 27-yard gain, before finishing a 6-play, 58-yard drive with a 16-yard touchdown pass to Wright for a 14-0 first quarter lead.

After Cincinnati scored on a 23-yard field goal in the second quarter, the Patriots scored two field goals in the final five minutes of the first half for a 20-3 halftime lead. A 48-yard field goal by Gostkowski put the Patriots in front 17-3. Then on the ensuing drive, DB Darrelle Revis forced a fumble after a short reception by WR A.J. Green and LB Jamie Collins recovered the ball at the Cincinnati 25-yard line to set up a 19-yard field goal and a 20-3 first half lead.

A 47-yard punt return in the beginning of the third quarter helped set up a 37-yard touchdown pass from QB Andy Dalton to Green to close the Patriots lead to 20-10.

The Patriots responded on their next drive, as Brady completed a 17-yard pass to Gronkowski, a 25-yarder to Wright, combined with runs of 14 and 19 yards by Vereen, in a drive that ended with Brady throwing a 16-yard touch down pass to Gronkowski for a 27-10 lead.

Cincinnati KR Brandon Tate was stripped of the football on the ensuing kickoff by RB Brandon Bolden, and Arrington picked up the fumble and dove into the end zone for a touchdown and 34-17 lead.

Gostkowski drilled three field goals on New England's first three fourth quarter drives for a 43-17 final.

The New England Patriots beat the Cleveland Browns, 33-13, in QB Tom Brady's return to action. Brady passed for 406 yards and three touchdowns, all to TE Martellus Bennett, to help the Patriots improve to a 4-1 record and rebound from a 16-0 loss the week before.

Brady went over 400 yards passing for the eighth time in his career and it marked his 72nd game with at least 300 yards in the regular season. Bennett had his first career three-touchdown day, after scoring on a 7-yard pass in the first quarter, a 5-yard pass in the second quarter and a 37-yard pass in the third quarter. WR Chris Hogan had his first career 100-yard game after finishing with four receptions for 114 yards, including a career-long with a 63-yard reception in the second quarter. Hogan also had a 43-yard reception earlier in the second quarter. TE Rob Gronkowski had his first 100-yard game of the 2016 season and the 21st of his career after finishing with five receptions for 109 yards.

The Cleveland Browns entered the game first in the NFL in rushing with an average of 149.3 yards per game and were held to 27 yards rushing for a. 1.2yard average. Browns RB Isaiah Crowell entered the game third in the NFL in rushing yards and was held to 22 yards on 13 carries for a 1.7-yard average. The Patriots have now held their opponent under 30 yards rushing 17 times in team history.

The Patriots scored on their first three drives and also added a safety to build a 23-7 first half lead. RB LeGarrette Blount finished an 8-play, 80-yard drive with a 1-yard touchdown. A 34-yard pass from Brady to Gronkowski helped get into position for the score.

After Cleveland tied the game at 7 on their first possession, the Patriots scored the next 23 points to build a 30-7 lead heading into the fourth quarter. Brady capped an eight-play, 75-yard drive with a 7-yard touchdown to Bennett for a 14-7 lead. After being pinned down deep in their own territory on the ensuing kickoff, Cleveland QB Cody Kessler fumbled the ball out of the end zone for a safety and a 16-7 first quarter lead for New England. The Patriots took the free kick and a 43-yard pass from Brady to Hogan helped get into position for a 5-yard touchdown pass from Brady to Bennett for a 23-7 lead. The Patriots took their fourth offensive possession and had a chance to build on their lead after driving to the Cleveland 1-yard line. But the Patriots failed to score on a fourth-and-goal.

New England took the second-half kick and engineered an eight-play, 75yard drive that was culminated with a 37-yard touchdown pass from Brady to Bennett.

Cleveland added a touchdown in the fourth quarter, and New England added a field goal to make it a 33-13 final.



#### **BOUNCE BACK PATS**

Since the beginning of 2003, the Patriots are 41-6 (.872) in regular-season games following a loss. They have dropped back-to-back regular season games in 2006, 2009, 2011, 2012 and 2015 (twice).

#### BENNET HAS A CAREER DAY

TE Martellus Bennett has his first three-touchdown day and the third NFL multi-touchdown game of his career. He caught a 7-yard touchdown pass in the first quarter, a 5-yard touchdown pass in the second quarter and a 37-yard touchdown pass in the third quarter. Bennett had a two-touchdown performance vs. Minnesota (9-15-13) and at the New York Jets (9-22-14) while with the Chicago Bears. It marks the seventh time in Patriots history that a tight end has recorded a three-touchdown day. TE Rob Gronkowski has accomplished the feat three times. The last time the patriots had a tight end with three touchdowns was vs. Pittsburgh on Sept. 10, 2015.

#### HOGAN RACKS UP REC. YDS.

WR Chris Hogan had a career day after recording his first 100-yard day of his career with four receptions for 114 yards. His previous best was 95 yards on Nov. 23, 2015, vs. New England when he was with Buffalo. His 63-yard pass from Tom Brady in the second quarter is also a career-best. His previous long was a 46-yard reception at Tennessee on Oct. 11, 2015, while with Buffalo.

#### BROWN'S MULTI-SACK DAY

DL Malcom Brown registered his first sack of the 2016 sack when he dropped Cleveland QB Charlie Whitehurst for a 9-yard loss in the third quarter. Brown recorded his second sack in the fourth quarter for a 5-yard loss. It is his first NFL two-sack game. As a rookie in 2015, Brown had three sacks.

#### CHUNG GETS FIRST PICK

S Patrick Chung picked off a Cleveland QB Charlie Whitehurst pass in the third quarter for his first pick of the season. It is his first interception since Dec. 14, 2014, vs. Miami.

#### PATRIOTS

\*The Patriots can pass the Oakland Raiders (1973-1977) as the only team to advance to six straight Conference Championship games.

\*The Patriots have won seven straight division titles (2009-15) to match the Los Angeles Rams (1973-79) for the most consecutive division titles and look to pass that mark in 2016.

\*The Patriots have 15 straight winning seasons and need one more to tie the San Francisco 49ers (1983-98) and the Dallas Cowboys (1970-85) for the most consecutive winning seasons at 16 since the 1970 merger.

\*The Patriots have participated in a postseason game for seven straight seasons and can become the fifth team in NFL history to play in a postseason game in at least eight consecutive seasons in 2016.

\*The Patriots have advanced in the postseason for five straight seasons and need to advance in the postseason in 2016 to match the record of six straight seasons of postseason advancement by the Dallas Cowboys (1991-96).

#### **BILL BELICHICK**

\*Bill Belichick (6) needs to reach one more Super Bowl as a head coach to break a tie with Don Shula (6) for the most conference titles.

\*Belichick has four Super Bowl wins as a head coach to match Pittsburgh's Chuck Noll for the most wins. With one more Super Bowl win, Belichick will have the most wins by a head coach in Super Bowl history.

\*Belichick is tied with Tom Landry and Don Shula with 13 division titles and needs one more division title to set the record for most among all head coaches.

\*Bill Belichick passed Curly Lambeau for fourth place with 227 regular seasons wins. He is behind Don Shula (328), George Halas (318) and Tom Landry (250).

\*Belichick's Patriots teams have twice recorded five straight years of playoff advancement (2003-07 and 2011-15), tying the NFL record. If the Patrioits advance in 2016, they will set the NFL record by a head coach. John Harbaugh (2008-12), Mike Holmgren (1993-97), John Madden (1973-77) and Andy Reid (2000-04) also won a playoff game in five consecutive seasons.

#### TOM BRADY

\* Tom Brady (173) needs seven more wins to become just the third NFL quarterback with 180 career regular-season wins to join Brett Favre (186) and Peyton Manning (186).

\*Brady has 195 wins overall (173 in the regular season and 22 in the postseason) and needs seven more wins to become the all-time leader for most wins by an NFL quarterback. Peyton Manning (200: 186 in the regular season and 14 in the postseason) and Brett Favre (199: 186 in the regular season and 13 in the postseason) have the most wins in NFL history by a starting quarterback.

\*If Brady reaches 30 or more touchdowns passes in 2016, he will become just the fourth player in NFL history with 30 or more touchdown passes in seven seasons, joining Brett Favre (9), Peyton Manning (9) and Drew Brees (8).

\*Brady is tied with Peyton Manning with four seasons with 35 or more touchdowns and needs to reach 35 touchdowns in 2016 for his fifth season with 35 or more touchdowns to become the all-time leader in this category.

\*Brady is currently fifth on the NFL's all-time list with 58,434 career passing yards and needs 1,566 yards to become the fifth NFL player to reach 60,000 passing yards.

\*Brady has passed for 4,000 yards eight times in his career and if he reaches 4,000 yards in 2016, he will be the third player to reach nine seasons with 4,000 yards, joining Peyton Manning (14) and Drew Brees (10).

\*Brady led the NFL with 36 touchdowns passes in 2015, his fourth time leading the NFL in touchdowns. He tied Drew Brees, Len Dawson, Brett Favre, Peyton Manning, Johnny Unitas and Steve Young for most seasons leading the NFL in touchdown passes.

\* Brady is in his 17th season in 2016 and became the longest tenured Patriots player, surpassing the 16 seasons by Steve Grogan (1975-90).

\*Rob Gronkowski has 66 overall touchdowns and needs three touchdowns in 2016 to move past Stanley Morgan (68) to become the all-time leader in touchdowns scored for the Patriots.

\*Gronkowski (65) needs 3 receiving touchdowns to move past Stanley Morgan (67) to become the all-time leader in receiving touchdowns for the Patriots.

\*With 5,675 receiving yards, Gronkowski needs 51 more yards in 2016 to move past Irving Fryar (5,726) into fourth place on the Patriots all-time receiving yards list. He is ranked 18th all-time among NFL tight ends in receiving yards.

\*Gronkowski needs one more 1,000-yard season to join Tony Gonzalez and Jason Witten for the most 1,000-yard seasons by an NFL tight end with four.

\*Gronkowski has an NFL-leading five seasons with 10 or more touchdowns by a tight end and can add to his record in 2016.

\*Gronkowski enters the 2016 season with 64 touchdown receptions from Tom Brady, the second-most TD receptions from a QB and a tight end, behind the 78 by Philip Rivers and Antonio Gates. The 64 TD connections are the 8th most overall.

\*Gronkowski has 21 100-yard games, tied with Antonio Gates for the fourth most among all NFL tight ends.

\*Gronkowski has 5,675 receiving yards and needs 633 yards to move past Steve Jordan (6,307) for 10th place all-time among tight ends.

# INDIVIDUAL S. TEAM NOTES





Since Robert Kraft purchased the team in 1994, the Patriots have experienced one of the most dramatic turnarounds in the history of sports. Now in his 23rd season of ownership, Kraft has transformed one of the league's least successful clubs into what observers view as a model NFL franchise. In the five seasons immediately preceding his purchase (1989-93), the Patriots were a moribund team, winning just 19 of 80 games [.238 pct.] and logging the worst record in the NFL over that span. When he bought the franchise on Jan. 21, 1994, Kraft

announced his intention to bring a championship to New England, a tall order considering the team's previous success rate. But under Kraft's leadership, the Patriots have won more division titles [15], conference crowns (7) and Super Bowl championships (4) than any other NFL team. Super Bowl XLIX was the seventh Super Bowl appearance since Kraft purchased the team, a period during which no other team has earned more than four berths. In Kraft's 22 seasons, the Patriots have qualified for the playoffs 17 times, more than doubling the franchise's accomplishments during its first 34 seasons.

#### PATRIOTS ANNOUNCE SERIES OF INITIATIVES THROUGHOUT 2016 SEASON

The New England Patriots will introduce a series of initiatives throughout the 2016 season to celebrate the 15th anniversary of the 2001 Super Bowl Championship team. The Patriots forced two fumbles on kickoffs in the 27-0 win vs. Houston on Sept. 22, 2016.

Stephen Gostkowski executed a successful onside kick vs. Washington (11/08/15) and vs. Philadelphia (12/06/15). It was his third (Cleveland - 12/08/13 and the fourth in team history. The first came when Jim Lee Hunt recovered a Gino Cappelletti kick at the end of the first half in a 26-10 win vs. the NY Jets (9/27/64).

The Patriots have yet to throw an interception in 2016, setting a new team record with five straight games to start a season without a pick. The old mark was the first four games if the 2015 season. The overall team record is eight consecutive contests, set in the second half of the 2010 season. The NFL record to start a season without an interception is nine games set by Cleveland in 1960.

The Patriots became the first team in  $\widetilde{NFL}$  history in 2014 to earn five straight first-round byes and extended that record with their sixth straight bye in 2015. Dallas and San Francisco earned four straight byes from 1992 through 1995 and Denver earned four straight from 2012-15.

The Patriots and Green Bay Packers are the only teams that have made the playoffs in each of the last seven seasons (2009-2015).

The Patriots have now had at least one rookie free agent make the team in 13 straight seasons (D.J. Foster, Woodrow Hamilton and Jonathan Jones), the second-longest streak to 17 by Indianapolis.

The Patriots have gone 15 straight seasons without being swept by a division opponent after beating each of the AFC East teams in 2015, extending the longest such streak since the 1970 NFL merger.

#### FOOTBALL FAMILY TRADITION

Bolden's grandfather, Frank Pitts, played 10 years in the NFL (1965-74) as a receiver for Kansas City, Cleveland and Oakland. He was with Kansas City for two Super Bowls, losing Super Bowl I and winning Super Bowl IV. Said Bolden about his grandfather, "I remember being six years old, him popping in a highlight film of Super Bowl I and IV. I've seen that tape at least 500 times."

#### **BOLDEN BLOCK PARTY**

Brandon Bolden blocked his first NFL punt in the win at San Diego (12/7/14) to give the Patriots a first down at the Chargers 25-yard line. It was the Patriots first blocked punt since Patrick Chung blocked a punt at Miami on Oct. 4, 2010.



#### **OVERCOMING ADVERSITY**

On April 20, 2011, just days before Texas Christian offensive line prospect Marcus Cannon was to enter the NFL Draft, he was diagnosed with non-Hodgkin's lymphoma, a treatable form of cancer found in lymph tissue. A little more than one week later, the Patriots selected Cannon in the fifth round (138th overall) of the draft with the knowledge of his illness. The Patriots placed Cannon on the Reserve/Non Football Injury list to start the 2011 season while he received treatment and recovered. Cannon was activated to the 53-man roster later that year and is now in his fifth season with the team. Cannon made a full recovery and was named the Patriots 2011 Ed Block Courage Award winner - an annual award presented to select players in the National Football League who are voted by their teammates as role models of inspiration, sportsmanship and courage.

#### FROM STANDOUT QB TO WR

Edelman began his college football career with a year at the College of San Mateo [Calif.] before transferring to Kent State where as a senior he completed 56 percent of his passes [153 of 275 passes for 1,820 yards] with 13 touchdowns. He was also the leading rusher, gaining 1,551 yards on 215 attempts [an average of 7.5 yards per carry] and scoring 13 touchdowns. His offensive numbers broke Kent State's single-season record for total offense set by Joshua Cribbs in 2003. Said head coach Bill Belichick on the versatility of Edelman: "He played the quarterback position in college at Kent State and all the positions really that he's played in the NFL – covering kicks, returning kicks, slot receiver, outside receiver, slot defender – he didn't do any of those things in college. I think that really speaks to his versatility and how much he's grown as a player and how many things he's learned how to do that he really didn't have much experience with in college. I'd say that's pretty unusual, especially to be as competent in them as he is."

#### EDELMAN TAKES HIS FATHER'S ADVICE

If there is one thing Julian Edelman has never lacked, it's athletic ability. A dual-threat quarterback at Kent State and former baseball standout in high school, Edelman once wowed Toronto Blue Jays players with his impressive footwork while fielding ground balls in an appearance at batting practice in 2011.

This natural ability may have been overlooked by NFL scouts, who let him fall to the Patriots in the seventh round of the 2009 NFL Draft. Edelman remains focused on the lessons his father, Frank Edelman, taught him at a young age. "I'm still constantly trying to learn," Edelman told *The Boston Herald*. "My dad always put it in my head, when you're green, you're growing, when you're ripe, you're lost. When you're done learning, you're done."



#### GAROPPOLO MAKES FIRST START

Jimmy Garoppolo became just the fifth quarterback in the last 30 years to make his first regular-season start in a season-opening night game (Sept. 11, vs. Cardinals). Aaron Rodgers was the last (2008, win vs. Minnesota), with Philip Rivers (2006), David Carr (2002) and Brian Griese (1999) before him. Garoppolo finished 24-of-33 for 264 yards with one touchdown.

Gronkowski scored a 2-yard touchdown on a lateral from Tom Brady in the third quarter vs. Indianapolis (12/4/11), becoming the first tight end in Patriots history to score a rushing touchdown. Despite a successful three-year lacrosse career at Penn State, Hogan, also a standout football player in high school, said that playing college football was always in the back of his mind. Having redshirted his sophomore year of lacrosse, Hogan had an extra year of athletic eligibility following his fourth academic year at Penn State. As the football itch still lurked in the back of his mind, Chris played his final year of eligibility with the Monmouth football team, and at the end of the season, joined in on some workouts with teammates who were training for the NFL Combine.

"I honestly didn't know if I had what it took to play in the NFL," Hogan wrote in the Tribune. "Still, it was one of those things where I didn't want to look back in five years and be like, 'Man, I wish I would've tried.'"

Chris did not get invited to compete in that year's Combine, but turned heads during a Pro Day held at Fordham. Later that summer, he signed with the San Francisco 49ers as an undrafted free agent.

#### ELECTED TEAM LEADER

Patriots wide receiver Matthew Slater has been named to five straight Pro Bowls (2011-15) for his special teams work, but perhaps more revealing of his value to New England is the fact that he was elected a captain by his teammates for the sixth straight season in 2016.

The special teams ace was willing to share his advice on being a great captain with high school football players in a story published by *The Boston Globe*. "I think first and foremost, you have to be able to put others before yourself. Being a captain and leadership is about serving, and to me, that means a great deal of sacrifice – putting aside personal agendas for the greater common goal. Leadership is equated with sacrifice. I think you have to be willing to do whatever it takes for the unit to succeed. I think you need to lead by example. A lot of times, it's about what you do, not what you say."

#### SLATER'S EMERGENCE WAS SPECIAL

Bill Belichick acknowledged Matthew Slater's role as a gunner on special teams: "Matt is one of the best in the league," Belichick said. "Any time the punt return team has to double somebody, that makes it one less guy they can use somewhere else in the return. He almost always draws two guys out there unless they're in an eight-man rush. Most of the time, there's two guys out there — fourth-and-short, where they're trying to protect the box — but he draws a lot of double teams, and deservedly so. He does an outstanding job of covering punts."



#### WHITE HAS CAREER DAY

James White set career highs with 10 receptions and 115 receiving yards vs. Philadelphia (12/6/15). White's 115 receiving yards are the second-highest such total for a Patriots running back since the 1970 AFL-NFL merger, trailing only Shane Vereen's team-record 153 receiving yards vs. Cleveland on Dec. 8, 2013. White's 10 catches are the third highest such total of the Bill Belichick era for a running back (since 2000), trailing only Shane Vereen's club record 12 catches vs. Cleveland on Dec. 8, 2013, and Kevin Faulk's 11 catches vs. Tampa Bay on Sept. 3, 2000.

#### JAMIE COLLINS' JOURNEY



The road to the NFL has been anything but easy for linebacker and 2013 second-round draft pick Jamie Collins. The youngest of five siblings growing up in Meadville, Miss., Collins lost both of his parents when he was six years old and was raised by one of his sisters, who was in her mid 20s.

Collins turned to football as an outlet to help him through the tough times. "It means a lot. It's my living." Collins told *The Boston Herald.* "It kept me on track." Collins' resiliency in dealing with adversity has made a lasting impact on fellow Mississippi native and former Patriots RB Stevan

Ridley, who grew up 30 miles west of Meadville in Natchez, Miss., and got to know Collins through a family friend. "What I've known about him, he really has been a strong person," Ridley told the *Herald*. "Anybody that's gone through the things that he's gone through and can still find a way to be successful on the football field, you have to be mentally tough. That's what he's kind of done as a teammate here. He's come in here and accepted his role and did a pretty good job as a rookie."

#### **COLLINS SETS CAREER HIGH**

LB Jamie Collins set a career high with 2 1/2 sacks in the win at Buffalo on Sept. 20, 2015. It was his second career multi-sack game. He registered his first NFL two-sack game at San Diego (12/7/14).

#### **TEAM LEADER**

Collins had a standout second season in 2014. He led the team in total tackles (109), forced fumbles (4) and fumble recoveries (2), and tied for the team lead in interceptions (2).

#### COLLINS CAME TO PLAY

Collins notched an interception his second straight game vs. Houston (9/22/16), bringing his regular-season interception total to five. He has two additional interceptions in the postseason. Collins also finished with an personal-best of 14 total tackles in the Texans game, besting his previous high of 13 vs. NY Jets on Oct. 16, 2014 and at Green Bay on Nov. 30, 2014.

#### **COLLINS BLOCKS FIRST XP SINCE 2008**

LB Jamie Collins blocked a fourth quarter extra point at Indianapolis (10/18/15). It was the Patriots first blocked extra point since Vince Wilfork blocked a PAT at Oakland on Dec. 14, 2008. It is Collins' second blocked kick. He blocked a field goal attempt vs. Miami on Dec. 14, 2014.



#### MAKING THE OLYMPICS



On July 18, Nate Ebner was selected to the 2016 U.S. Olympic Rugby squad and after he was given an excused leave of absence from his football obligations in Foxboro, suited up for Team USA in Rio de Janeiro in August. The Dublin, Ohio native was introduced to the sport of rugby around the age of six and developed a passion and a talent that stemmed from his father and role model, Jeff Ebner, who played the game at the University of Minnesota. Nate did not play football in high school but was a two-time MVP of the USA Rugby team at the Junior World Cup and a standout on the U19 and U20 national teams.

Although his parents were divorced, Nate and his father remained very close. "We were super tight," Nate told the Boston Globe. "I would put my fatherson relationship against anyone's. He taught me how to be a man." The two often spent time working together at the family's auto reclamation business, Ebner & Sons in Springfield, Ohio, and would also train in the gym together behind the motto, "Finish Strong," - a message Jeff always preached to his son.

Nate played rugby at Ohio State during his first two years of college, but as an All-American on the school's club team, he decided to walk on to the Buckeyes football team and finish his career with his sights set on reaching the NFL.

linebacker would come in and be able to wear this number and be able to play as well. I feel honored. Tedy was a great player, and he means a lot to this organization. I'm definitely proud to be able to wear this number."

After being selected by the Patriots in the first round of the 2010 NFL Draft, DB Devin McCourty became part of a select group in league history. McCourty's identical twin brother, Jason, is a cornerback with Tennessee, selected in the sixth round of the 2009 NFL Draft. The two are the 12th set of twins to play in the NFL. Devin redshirted for the 2005 season and therefore was a year behind his brother in eligibility. McCourty is the second twin to suit up for the Patriots, after CB Kato Serwanga was a member of the team from 1998-2000. His twin brother, Wasswa, played for San Francisco and Minnesota from 1999-2001. According to McCourty's mother, the two can only be told apart by tiny scars on their faces left by chickenpox. The McCourty twins are one of two active sets of twins playing in the NFL.

#### WHERE DID HE COME FROM?

Rob Ninkovich's journey to the Patriots was not easy. He entered the league as a fifth-round pick by the Saints in 2006 and was waived four times by New Orleans and Miami before landing in New England on Aug. 2, 2009. He spent the 2009 offseason trying to make the New Orleans team as a long snapper. Before coming to the Patriots, he had appeared in just eight games over three seasons. He doubled that total in his first year in New England, appearing in 15 games in 2009 and his role on the team has grown since, earning a starting role at linebacker in 2010 and 2011 before moving to a starting role on the defensive line in 2011.

#### CAREER DAY IN BUFFALO

Ninkovich finished with a three-sack game for the first time in his career in the win at Buffalo (10/12/14), He has had two two-sack performances - vs. Miami (1/2/11) and at Carolina (11/18/13).

#### CRAZY EIGHTS

Ninkovich had eight sacks in three consecutive seasons from 2012-14, becoming the first Patriots player to have at least eight sacks in three consecutive seasons since Pro Football Hall of Famer Andre Tippett achieved the feat from 1985-87 (1985, 16½, 1986, 9½ and 1987, 12½).

#### NINKOVICH SCORED AS A TE IN COLLEGE

Ninkovich played some at tight end in college at Purdue and caught two touchdown passes with a 2-yard touchdown pass from Buffalo QB Kyle Orton and a 1-yard touchdown pass from former New York Giants and Indianapolis QB Curtis Painter.

## DB LOGAN RYAN AND DB DURON HARMON

#### **CLASSMATES REUNITE IN NEW ENGLAND**

Defensive backs Logan Ryan and Duron Harmon are used to working together. Ryan and Harmon began their college football careers together as members of the same recruiting class at Rutgers University and developed a close friendship during their four years in Piscataway, N.J. As fate would have it, Ryan and Harmon would begin their NFL journeys together as well when the Patriots selected the two defensive backs just eight picks apart in the third round of the 2013 NFL Draft.

Reunited once again, the former Scarlet Knights are excited and eager to make their mark, just as they did at Rutgers. "We talked before the draft and said how good it would be to play on the same team again, and for it to happen again, it's exciting and it's a blessing," Harmon told *The Boston Globe.* "It's great [we're contributing], because at the end of the day you want to play, and to contribute to a team like this, it's fun."

#### **RYAN RETURNS... TO SCHOOL**

When Logan Ryan decided to leave Rutgers and enter the NFL Draft after his redshirt junior season in 2012, he made a promise to his parents that after his rookie year, he would return to school and earn his degree.

Ryan kept his promise and graduated in the spring of 2014 with a degree in labor relations and a minor in psychology.

"I committed to Rutgers, not only as a football player, but as a student, so I was going to make sure I finished that end too," Ryan told NJ.com.

"It's a big accomplishment in my life. I held my word to my parents and stuck with it and I'm fortunate. It took a lot of work, but I was able to go back and finish and walk in graduation."

#### RYAN'S FIRST PICK FOR SIX

Ryan returned his first NFL interception 79 yards for a touchdown N.Y. Jets on Oct. 20, 2013. The last Patriots player to return their first career interception for a touchdown was Kyle Arrington in 2010. ★ On the Bears' first play following the LaFell touchdown, Zach Moore forced a Jay Cutler fumble that was recovered by Rob Ninkovich and returned for a 15-yard touchdown and a 38-7 Patriots lead with 55 seconds left in the first half.

#### A COMEBACK FOR THE AGES

The Patriots came back from a 24-point deficit to defeat the Broncos, 34-31, in overtime in a Sunday Night Football matchup on Nov. 24, 2013, marking the largest comeback win in team history, after trailing 24-0 at halftime.

New England's previous best comeback win was from a 23-0 deficit to win, 38-23, vs. Seattle (9/16/84). The Patriots also came back from 22 points down to win at the New York Giants, 23-22 (12/21/96). The Patriots have come from 21 points down to win four times, most recently vs. Buffalo (1/1/12).

#### PATRIOTS IN THE PLAYOFFS

The Patriots have qualified for the playoffs 23 times in their 56-year history. Seventeen of those playoff berths have come in the 22 seasons since Robert Kraft purchased the team in 1994, a dramatic contrast to the six total playoff berths the team earned in its first 34 years of existence. The Patriots have won 18 division crowns, including 13 in the last 15 seasons, and have qualified as a Wild Card team four times (1976, 1985, 1994 and 1998). The Patriots also qualified for the playoffs in 1982 during the strike season.
