NOTABLE STORYLINES -

The Browns return home to host the New York Jets at 1:00 p.m. on Sunday, Oct. 30. The Browns own a 12-10 advantage in the all-time regular season series, including an 8-6 mark at home.

The Browns will host more than 25 members from the 1986 AFC Central Championship team for a special tribute to honor the 30-year anniversary of one of the franchise's most successful seasons. The Browns' commemoration is highlighted by a special halftime ceremony that will celebrate the group's team and individual accomplishments, as well as the excitement generated in Cleveland when the team recorded its most regular season wins (12) since joining the NFL and reached the AFC Championship Game for the first time in club history. The 1986 team featured nine players who have been inducted into the Cleveland Browns Legends program: RB Earnest Byner (1984-88, 1994-95), CB Hanford Dixon (1981-89), DT Bob Golic (1982-88), QB Bernie Kosar (1985-93), RB Kevin Mack (1985-93), LB Clay Matthews (1978-90) and T Cody Risien (1979-83, 1985-89).

The Browns are second in the NFL with a 5.05 rushing average. The team is also second in the league with 30 rushing plays of 10-plus yards and ninth in rushing yards (844). RB **Isaiah Crowell** (5.2) is fourth in the NFL in rushing average. The Browns registered a season-high 180 rushing yards on 26 attempts for a 6.9 average at Cincinnati. The 6.9 average was the most by the team since Dec. 20, 2009, when the club averaged 7.2 at Kansas City. The Browns have eclipsed 160 rushing yards in three games this season.

Rookie LB **Emmanuel Ogbah** recorded two sacks at Cincinnati. The second-round pick has three sacks in the past two games and is tied for third among all NFL rookies in sacks this season.

TE **Gary Barnidge** is second on the team with 30 receptions and 361 receiving yards. Since 2015, Barnidge is fourth among all NFL tight ends in receptions (109) and receiving yards (1,404).

Making his NFL debut last week in Cincinnati, rookie QB **Kevin Hogan** rushed for 104 yards, including five runs of 15-plus yards. He recorded a 28-yard touchdown run, which was the longest touchdown run by a Browns quarterback in team history. His 104 rushing yards were the second-most by a Browns quarterback in a single-game and the most by an NFL quarterback this season. He also completed 12 of 24 passes for 100 yards.

LT Joe Thomas has been selected to the Pro Bowl in each of his first nine NFL seasons. He is the eighth player in NFL history to make the Pro Bowl in his first nine seasons. The other seven players are in the Pro Football Hall of Fame. Thomas is tied with Hall of Famers Jim Brown and Lou Groza for the most Pro Bowl selections in team history.

Coaching capsules:

Cleveland -- Hue Jackson: 8-15, second season as head coach, first with the Browns.

Hue Jackson was named the 16th full-time head coach in Cleveland Browns history on January 13, 2016. He is in his 30th year as a coach, including the last 16 in the NFL. He has spent nine seasons coaching in the AFC North, during which time he helped his team advance to the postseason seven times. Jackson was head coach of the Oakland Raiders in 2011 and guided the team to an 8-8 record. He has also served as offensive coordinator in Washington (2003), Atlanta (2007), Oakland (2010) and Cincinnati (2014-15). Jackson spent 14 years coaching on the college level and was a quarterback at Pacific from 1985-86.

New York -- Todd Bowles: 14-12, third season as head coach, second season with the Jets.

Named the head coach of the New York Jets on January 14, 2015. In his second season as head coach of the Jets after leading the team to a 10-6 record – a six-win increase – in his first season. Served as defensive coordinator for the Arizona Cardinals from 2013-14. Earned NFL Assistant Coach of the Year honors in 2014. Coached with the Philadelphia Eagles (2012), Miami Dolphins (2008-2011, including three games as interim head coach in 2011), Dallas Cowboys (2005-07), Cleveland Browns (2001-04) and Jets (2000). Coached collegiately at Morehouse College (1997) and Grambling State (1998-99). While in Cleveland, he coached the Browns secondary.

- •Jets Head Coach **Todd Bowles** spent four seasons (2001-04) coaching the Browns secondary.
- •LB **Demario Davis** was originally drafted by the Jets in the third round (77th overall) of the 2012 NFL Draft and spent four seasons (2012-2015) in New York.
- •Jets DB **Buster Skrine** was a fifth-round pick (137th overall) by the Browns in 2011 and spent four years with the club before signing with New York as an unrestricted free agent in 2015.
- •Associate head coach offense **Pep Hamilton** spent three seasons (2003-05) on the Jets staff.
- •Defensive backs coach **Louie Cioffi** began his coaching career as a staff assistant with the Jets from 1993-94.
- •Outside linebackers coach **Ryan Slowik** was an assistant defensive line coach with the Jets last season.
- •Sports scientist **Jamey Mroz** spent the 2012 training camp with the Jets as a strength and conditioning intern.
- •Jets assistant head coach/inside linebackers coach **Mike Caldwell** played three seasons (1993-95) in Cleveland after joining the team as a third-round pick (83rd overall) in 1993.
- •Jets defensive backs assistant coach **Daylon McCutcheon** appeared in 103 games with the Browns as a defensive back from 1999-2005. He was a third-round pick (62nd overall) in 1999.
- •Jets special teams coordinator **Brant Boyer** played for the Browns from 2001-03 and spent time with the Browns as a training camp intern in 2009.
- •Jets defensive line coach **Pepper Johnson** played three seasons (1993-95) as a linebacker with the Browns.
- •Jets offensive line coach **Steve Marshall** spent two seasons (2007-08) in the same role with the Browns.
- •Jets TE Kellen Davis (2013) spent time with the Browns.
- •Strength and conditioning coordinator **Evan Marcus** (Union) is a native of New Jersey. He also spent a season at Rutgers as assistant strength and conditioning coach in 1993.
- •Jets defensive line coach Pepper Johnson (Ohio State), LB Darron Lee (Ohio State), C Nick Mangold (Ohio State), WR Jalin Marshall (Ohio State), WR Devin Smith (Ohio State) and G Brian Winters (Kent State) attended college in Ohio.

WHAT TO LOOK FOR THIS WEEK-

With 100 rushing yards by a player other than Isaiah Crowell or Kevin Hogan, the Browns could record 100-yard rushing games from three different players in the same season for the first time since 2003 when William Green, Lee Suggs and Jamel White recorded 100-yard games on the ground.

With 180 or more rushing yards, the Browns would record 180 yards or more on the ground in consecutive games for the first time since 1985.

RB Isaiah Crowell

With a 100-yard game on the ground, Crowell would become the first Brown to run for 100 yards or more three times in a season since Trent Richardson in 2012.

With 100 rushing yards and a score on the ground, Crowell would be the first Brown to rush for 100 yards or more and a touchdown three times in a season since Peyton Hillis accomplished the feat four times in 2010.

With 105 rushing yards, would be the first Browns player to rush for at least 600 yards in three consecutive seasons since Kevin Mack in 1985-87.

OB Kevin Hogan

With a 100-yard rushing game, Hogan would become the first Browns player to rush for 100 yards or more in consecutive games since Richardson did it in Weeks 8-9 in 2012.

With a 100-yard rushing game, Hogan would be the first NFL QB to rush for over 100 yards in consecutive games since 1961 when 49ers QB Billy Kilmer did it three games in a row.

LB Emmanuel Ogbah

With a sack, Ogbah will be the first rookie to record a sack in three straight game since Barkevious Mingo recorded a sack in the first three games of his career.

With two sacks, Ogbah will be the first Browns player to record two or more sacks in back-to-back games since Jamir Miller did it in 2001.

OL Joe Thomas

Has started all 151 career games and has not missed an offensive snap since joining the Browns as the third overall selection of the 2007 draft. His consecutive snaps streak of 9,388 is the longest active stretch in the league.

The Browns fell to the Jets in the 2015 season opener, 31-10. The Browns opened the game by forcing a Jets' punt on their first offensive drive. After New York's punt unit downed the ball at the Cleveland 9-yard line, OB Josh McCown led the Browns 90 yards down the field in 17 plays. On the final play of the drive, McCown rushed for a 13-yard gain before being tackled at the Jets' 1-yard line. S Calvin Pryor stopped McCown from reaching the end zone, forcing a fumble and the Browns' first turnover of the day. McCown sustained a concussion on the play and did not return. On the ensusing drive, the Browns defense stopped the Jets from converting on a fourth-and-1 at the Cleveland 45-yard line. Replacing McCown, QB Johnny Manziel threw a 54-yard TD pass to WR Travis Benjamin to give the Browns the lead, 7-0, with 14:15 to play in the second quarter. Jets QB Ryan Fitzpatrick responded with a 43-yard completion to WR Chris Owusu to move New York into Cleveland territory. On the next play, Fitzpatrick threw a pass that was intended for WR Brandon Marshall, but was picked off by Browns DB Tashaun Gipson at the Cleveland 17-yard line. However, Marshall stripped Gipson of the ball, recovering the fumble and advancing it to the Cleveland 9-yard line. Jets RB Chris Ivory finished off the drive with a 10-yard TD run to tie the game, 7-7, with 9:41 to play in the half. Cleveland took back the lead, 10-7, at the 2:46 mark in the second quarter when K Travis Coons split the uprights from 26 yards away. The Jets responded with a 9-play, 72-yard drive capped with a 15-yard TD pass from Fitzpatrick to WR Eric Decker with 49 seconds to play in the half, taking the lead, 14-10. New York picked up where it left off in the second half when it scored on its first drive as Fitzpatrick found Marshall for a 1-yard score. The Jets extended their lead on their next possession when K Nick Folk converted on a 34-yard field goal attempt. On the ensuing possession, DL Muhammad Wilkerson halted the Cleveland drive with a strip-sack of Manziel on the Cleveland 24-yard line. Ivory added the game's last score when he rushed for a 3-yard TD at the 10:38 mark in the fourth quarter.

- **LG** Spencer Drango Appeared in seven games with two starts this season...Started 48 career games at Baylor, earning All-America honors in 2014 and 2015...Selected by the Browns in the fifth round of the 2016 NFL Draft.
- C Cameron Erving Started four games at C this season... Suffering a pulmonary contusion against Baltimore...Did not return in the second half of last week's game with an illness after starting at C...Selected by the Browns 19th overall in the 2015 NFL Draft out of Florida State.
- **RG** John Greco Appeared in 106 career contests...Started 62 games for the Browns...Started five games this season at RG and two at C...Traded to Cleveland in 2011...Originally drafted by the Rams in the third round of the 2008 draft.
- **RT** Austin Pasztor Started all seven games this season at RT... Claimed by the Browns via waivers prior to the start of the 2015 season...Originally signed by Jacksonville as an undrafted free agent.
- **TE** Gary Barnidge 30 catches for 361 yards on the season... Tied Pro Football Hall of Famer Ozzie Newsome for the most TD receptions by a Browns TE in a season with nine in 2015...Named to the Pro Bowl in 2015...Originally a fifth-round draft pick by Carolina.

TEAM NOTES

HORTON RETURNS TO BROWNS

This season **Ray Horton** rejoined the Browns as defensive coordinator. Horton has been an NFL defensive coordinator the past five seasons, including the 2013 season when he served as the Browns defensive coordinator. Horton orchestrated one of the best defensive turnarounds in Cleveland history. After finishing 23rd in the league the previous year, the Browns ranked ninth in the league in total defense in 2013, marking the team's best finish since 1994. The Browns limited opponents to an average of 3.9 yards per carry, which ranked eighth in the NFL and marked Cleveland's best total in 18 years. The Browns defense also registered 40 sacks, their most since 2001. Horton has coached in the NFL the past 22 seasons following a 10-year playing career as a defensive back. As a player and coach, he has made it to the Super Bowl five times, where he has three wins.

HAMILTON JOINS STAFF

Pep Hamilton joined the Browns as associate head coach – offense this season. He works closely with the quarterbacks. Hamilton spent 2013-14 and the first eight weeks of the 2015 season as the offensive coordinator for the Colts. In his two full seasons as coordinator, Indianapolis went 11-5 each year, won two AFC South division titles and advanced to the postseason each year, including a trip to the AFC Championship game in 2014. Prior to joining the Colts, Hamilton spent three seasons (2010-12) at Stanford, serving as the offensive coordinator and quarterbacks coach the final two years. Hamilton also served as the quarterbacks coach for the Chicago Bears from 2007-09.

WILSON SPEARHEADS RUN GAME-

Earlier this year, **Kirby Wilson** was named the Browns running backs coach/run game coordinator. He has 18 years of experience coaching running backs in the NFL, during which time he has coached five running backs who rank in the top 25 for career rushing yards (Emmitt Smith #1, Curtis Martin #4, Edgerrin James #11, Adrian Peterson #17 and Thomas Jones #25) and two of the top four all-time reception leaders among running backs (Larry Centers #1 and Keith Byers #4). Wilson has helped seven different running backs break the 1,000-yard plateau a total of eight times. He has mentored four players to the Pro Bowl and has been to the playoffs with four different franchises, highlighted by the 2002 Buccaneers and 2008 Steelers Super Bowl victories. Wilson's teams have won six division titles and advanced to the postseason eight times.

BROWNS TO HONOR 1986 TEAM –

On Sunday, the Browns will host more than 25 members from the 1986 AFC Central Championship team for a special tribute. The Browns' commemoration is highlighted by a special halftime ceremony that will celebrate the group's team and individual accomplishments.

In addition to in-game and halftime recognition, the Browns will honor the 1986 team with exclusive in-depth feature content on www.ClevelandBrowns.com and the Browns Mobile App, as well through "The 1986 Browns; Beyond the Drive," a 30-minute special that will air Sunday, Oct. 30 from 5:30-6 p.m. on News 5. Exclusive interviews were conducted with many of the Browns players and coaches who made the historic season possible to share memories with Browns fans on team website, social media and TV programming leading into and after the game.

In 1986, the Browns compiled a 12-4 mark (13-5 including post-season) to register the most regular season and total combined wins since joining the NFL in 1950. To earn the division title and No. 1 AFC playoff seed, Cleveland won eight of its final nine, including a perfect 4-0 record at Cleveland Municipal Stadium and a 3-0 mark against division opponents. The Browns finished 5-1 in AFC Central games and went undefeated in road games within the division, highlighted by a 27-24 win over Pittsburgh in Week 5 to register Cleveland's first ever win at Three Rivers Stadium, which opened in 1970.

HEAD COACH HUE JACKSON



Hue Jackson was named the 16th full-time head coach in Cleveland Browns history by Owners Dee and Jimmy Haslam on January 13, 2016. He brings 29 years of coaching experience, including the last 15 in the NFL. He has spent nine seasons coaching in the AFC North, during which time he helped his team advance to the postseason seven times. Jackson was head coach of the Oakland Raiders in 2011 and guided the team to an 8-8 record. He has also served as offensive coordinator in Washington (2003), Atlanta (2007), Oakland (2010) and Cincinnati (2014-15).

Jackson has spent the past four seasons with the Cincinnati Bengals. During that time, he helped the Bengals to two division titles and a trip to the postseason all four years. In 2012, he served as secondary/assistant special teams coach before coaching the running backs in 2013. Jackson spent the past two seasons (2014-15) as offensive coordinator.

With Jackson as coordinator in 2015, the Bengals offense finished third in the AFC in yards per play (5.7) and points per game (26.2). He was voted by the Professional Football Writers of America (PFWA) as the Co-Assistant Coach of the Year as quarterback Andy Dalton set a career high and franchise record with a 106.3 rating, which led the AFC and was second in the NFL. After losing Dalton to injury in Week 14, Jackson guided quarterback A.J. McCarron to a 2-1 record in the final three games of the season as the Bengals clinched the AFC North title. The Cincinnati running game produced two 700-yard rushers in Jeremy Hill (794) and Giovani Bernard (730) for the first time since 1988. Tight end Tyler Eifert experienced a breakout season after hauling in 13 touchdown receptions, the most by a Bengals tight end in franchise history and the most by a Cincinnati player since 2001. Wide receiver A.J. Green added 10 receiving touchdowns on 86 receptions for 1,297 yards. Eifert, Green and left tackle Andrew Whitworth were selected to the Pro Bowl.

In Jackson's first year as offensive coordinator for Cincinnati in 2014, the run game posted its highest yards per game average (134.1) since 2000. Dalton passed for 3,398 yards and Green totaled 1,041 receiving yards. Hill led all NFL rookies with 1,124 rushing yards, the second-most by a Bengals rookie in team history.

After spending the 2010 season as the Raiders offensive coordinator, Jackson was promoted to head coach in 2011. Oakland finished the year 8-8 and

tied for first in the AFC West but missed the postseason via tiebreaker. The 8-8 mark was the best record by any Raiders team since 2002. The Raiders finished ninth in the NFL in total offense (379.5 yards per game) and seventh in rushing offense (131.9).

Before joining the Raiders, Jackson spent two seasons (2008-09) as quarterbacks coach for Baltimore, helping the Ravens advance to the playoffs both years. He was vital in the development of Joe Flacco, who was named NFL Rookie of the Year in 2008 and became the first rookie quarterback to win two playoff games as the Ravens advanced to the AFC Championship game.

From 2004-06, Jackson served as the Bengals wide receivers coach, helping develop one of the best wide receiver tandems in NFL history with Chad Johnson and T.J. Houshmandzadeh. During that span, the two combined to average 173.3 catches, 2,363.3 receiving yards and 15 touchdowns per season. In 2005, Johnson led the AFC with 1,432 receiving yards. In 2006, Johnson and Houshmandzadeh became the first Bengals duo to each top 1,000 receiving yards in the same season.

Jackson gained his first fulltime NFL experience with Washington, where he served as the running backs coach from 2001-02, before being promoted to offensive coordinator in 2003. Under Jackson's tutelage, running back Stephen Davis led the NFC with 1,432 rushing yards in 2001.

Jackson spent 14 years coaching on the college level, going from a graduate assistant at Pacific all the way to offensive coordinator at Southern California. He spent four seasons (1997-2000) as USC's offensive coordinator, where he also helped to recruit and develop players, including quarterback Carson Palmer, who went on to win the Heisman Trophy and be selected No. 1 overall in the NFL draft.

He was a minority coaching fellowship intern with the Los Angeles Rams in 1990, Arizona Cardinals in 1992 and Washington Redskins in 1995. He also served as the running backs/wide receivers/special teams coach for the London Monarchs of the World League in 1991.

Born Oct. 22, 1965, Jackson was a quarterback at Pacific from 1985-86 and threw for 2,544 yards and 19 touchdowns. The Los Angeles native also lettered in basketball and earned his degree in physical education.

Jackson and his wife, Michelle, have three daughters, Jordyn, Baylee and Haydyn.



Despite trailing by just three points in the third quarter, the Cleveland Browns fell to the Eagles, 29-10, after Philadelphia pulled away late for the season-opening victory at Lincoln Financial Field. Eagles' rookie QB Carson Wentz got out to a fast start as he led a nine-play, That Table 1 Town CVD Carson with 2 gorout of a last start as it led a mine-pay, 75-yard TD drive on their first possession of the game. Wentz connected with WR Jordan Matthews on a 19-yard TD pass to cap the drive and take a 7-0 lead. Cleveland's defense would bounce back including a sack from LB Christian Kirksey at the end of the first quarter. In the opening minutes of the second quarter, Eagles' K Caleb Sturgis converted a 22-yard field goal attempt to give Philadelphia a 10-0 advantage. The Browns responded on the ensuing possession as QB Robert Griffin III found WR Terrelle Pryor Sr. along the sideline on a 44-yard gain. Four plays later, RB Isaiah Crowell finished off the seven-play, 75-yard drive with a 2-yard TD run that left Cleveland trailing 10-7. Sturgis split the uprights once more at the end of the second quarter on a 38-yard field goal attempt, giving the Eagles a 13-7 lead at the half. In the third quarter, the Browns cut into the lead on their first drive of the half as Griffin connected with rookie WR Corey Coleman on a 58-yard pass that would lead to K Patrick Murray capping off Cleveland's drive with a 35-yard field goal and cutting the lead to 13-10. However, the Browns' following possession ended with the Eagles defense forcing a safety to take a 15-10 advantage. Philadelphia capitalized and scored once more on their next possession when Wentz conducted a nine-play, 73-yard scoring drive that finished with a 35-yard TD pass to WR Nelson Agholor. The Browns defense closed the third quarter with rookie DL Carl Nassib registering his first NFL sack. The final points of the game came late in the fourth quarter as Eagles' RB Ryan Mathews punched in a 1-yard TD run with just over a minute remaining in the game.

Despite a first quarter lead, the Ravens rallied back to defeat the Cleveland Browns, 25-20. The Browns started the game fast as QB Josh McCown led a nine-play, 75-yard opening drive that culminated in a 31-yard TD pass to rookie WR Corey Coleman, giving Cleveland a 7-0 advantage. After forcing a Baltimore punt, RB Isaiah Crowell broke free on the first play for an 85-yard TD rush on the Browns next possession. Cleveland extended its lead after an INT by DB Joe Haden – his first of two INTs in the game – gave the Browns the ball back in Ravens territory. McCown connected with Coleman once more for a 27-yard TD. The Browns could not convert on the ensuing PAT as K Patrick Murray's attempt was blocked and returned by the Ravens for the defensive two-point conversion, leaving Cleveland with a 20-2 advantage with just over four minutes remaining in the first quarter. Late in the second quarter, Ravens' QB Joe Flacco marched Baltimore down the field with a six-play, 75-yard scoring drive that ended with a 7-yard TD pass to WR Mike Wallace. After an interception by S Eric Weddle, Baltimore was able to score before the half as K Justin Tucker converted on a 52-yard field goal attempt as time expired, cutting the Cleveland lead to 20-12. The Ravens got out to a fast start in the third quarter as Flacco led a six-play, 75-yard TD drive to start the second half, connecting with Wallace yet again on a 17-yard TD pass that left Baltimore trailing 19-20. The final points of the game came in the fourth quarter as Tucker converted two more field goal attempts – the first from 49 yards away, and the second from 41 yards away to give the Ravens a 25-20 advantage. Despite a late push from the Browns offense, an INT by Baltimore LB C.J. Mosley with just 13 seconds remaining in the contest sealed the victory.

Hard Rock Stadium, Miami Gardens, Fla.

The Dolphins defeated the Browns in overtime, 30-24, in their home opener at Hard Rock Stadium. The Browns defense started strong as DB Jamar Taylor intercepted Dolphins' QB Ryan Tannehill on the second play of the game. Miami responded by forcing a turnover of their own as DL Cameron Wake strip-sacked Browns' rookie QB Cody Kessler. On their second possession, Tannehill led the Dolphins down the field on a five-play, 61-yard scoring drive including a 26-yard TD pass to WR DeVante Parker, giving Miami a 7-0 advantage. To open the second quarter, Browns' K Cody Parkey capped off a 10-play, 58-yard drive by connecting on a 46-yard field goal attempt, cutting the lead to 7-3. Later in the second, Cleveland DB Briean Boddy-Calhoun intercepted a Tannehill pass and returned it 27 yards for a Browns TD, giving Cleveland a 10-7 lead. The Dolphins were able to tie the game at 10 on their ensuing possession as K Andrew Franks split the uprights with a 37-yard field goal. Cleveland closed out the scoring in the first half as Parkey converted on a 48-yard field goal attempt and sent the Browns into halftime with a 13-10 advantage. Miami regained the lead in the third quarter as Tannehill connected with WR Jarvis Landry on a 42-yard TD pass. In the fourth quarter, the Dolphins stretched their margin when Tannehill found RB Damien Williams on a 10-yard TD pass, giving Miami a 24-13 edge. Cleveland responded, as WR Terrelle Pryor Sr. capped off a nine-play, 83-yard drive with a 3-yard TD rush. Kessler found TE Gary Barnidge on the ensuing two-point conversion attempt, cutting the lead to just three. The Browns were able to deadlock the contest at 24 with just over three minutes remaining in the fourth quarter as Parkey connected on his third field goal of the game, this time from 38 yards away. After a strip-sack by LB Corey Lemonier, Cleveland had a chance to win the game as time expired in the fourth quarter but could not convert a 46-yard field goal. In overtime, Landry set up the Dolphins' game-winning TD with a 32-yard reception along the sideline. On the next play, Miami RB Jay Ajayi found the endzone on an 11-yard TD rush to secure the Dolphins victory.

The Redskins pulled away from the Browns in the fourth quarter for a 31-20 victory at FedExField. Washington initiated the game's scoring as QB Kirk Cousins opened the day with a 12-play, 75-yard scoring drive, including an 8-yard TD pass to TE Jordan Reed. On their next possession, Cousins led the Redskins down the field again, eventually capping off the eight-play, 80-yard drive with a 9-yard TD pass to Reed, giving Washington a 14-0 advantage. Cleveland cut into the Redskins' lead in the second quarter with a 12-play, 81-yard drive courtesy of a 2-yard TD rush by RB Isaiah Crowell. FirstEnergy Stadium, Cleveland, Ohio

The New England Patriots defeated the Cleveland Browns, 33-13, at FirstEnergy Stadium. In his return from a four-game suspension, Patriots QB Tom Brady was effective and began his day by leading an eight-play, 80-yard TD drive, capped by a 1-yard RB LeGarrette Blount TD rush to gain a 7-0 advantage just under five minutes into the first quarter. The Browns answered quickly as rookie QB Cody Kessler responded with a nine-play, 75-yard TD drive of his own, including an 11-yard TD pass to WR Andrew Hawkins to even the game at 7-7. The Patriots soon regained their lead with another first quarter score as Brady orchestrated an eight-play, 75-yard TD drive, finding TE Martellus Bennett on a 7-yard TD pass. On the Browns' ensuing possession, a Kessler fumble on an incomplete backwards pass trickled out of the end zone for a Patriots safety, giving New England a 16-7 advantage. Early in the second quarter, Brady found Bennett in the end zone once again on a 5-yard TD pass to push the Patriots' lead to 23-7. The Patriots opened the third quarter with another scoring drive, going 75 yards in just eight plays, including a third and final Brady TD pass to Bennett - this time from 37-yards away to garner a 30-7 advantage. In the fourth quarter, QB Charlie Whitehurst, who stepped in for Kessler following an injury late in the first quarter, connected with TE Connor Hamlett on a 17-yard TD strike, marking Hamlett's first TD reception in his first ever NFL game. Cleveland was unsuccessful on its ensuing two-point conversion attempt, leaving the Browns with a 30-13 deficit. The final points of the game came from the foot of Patriots K Stephen Gostkowski as he split the uprights on a 31-yard field goal attempt, stretching New England's lead to 33-13.

The Titans held on to defeat the Browns, 28-26, at Nissan Stadium. Titans QB Marcus Mariota got Tennessee off to a fast start with a scoring drive on the opening possession of the game, including a 41-yard rush by Mariota on the first play from scrimmage and an 11-yard TD pass to WR Rishard Matthews to cap the drive just six plays later. The Browns were able to respond on their first possession of the day as QB Cody Kessler got the Cleveland offense moving with on their first possession of the day as QB Cody Kessler got the Cleveland offense moving with a 43-yard completion to TE Gary Barnidge on Cleveland's first offensive play. Just four plays later, K Cody Parkey put the Browns on the board with a 45-yard field goal, leaving Cleveland with a 7-3 deficit midway through the first quarter. Parkey would go on to split the uprights once more – this time from 37 yards away – to leave the Browns trailing just 7-6 as the first quarter came to a close. Mariota extended the Titans' lead early in the second quarter when he found WR Kendall Wright on a 48-yard TD strike to go up 14-6. Cleveland was once again able to pull within one point of the Titans late in the second quarter when Kessler capped an impressive nine-play, 94-yard drive with a 7-yard TD pass to WR Terrelle Pryor Sr., which left the Browns trailing 14-13 at the half. Titans RB DeMarco Murray scored the only points of the third quarter when he finished Tennessee's seven-play, 70-yard drive with a 3-yard TD rush to garner a 21-13 advantage. In the fourth quarter, the Titans furthered the margin when Mariota ended a long 12-play, 80-yard drive that took up 6:59 with a 15-yard TD pass to TE Anthony Fasano. The Browns chipped away at the Tennessee lead on the ensuing drive, going 75-yards in 13 plays, including a Kessler 5-yard TD pass to Pryor. However, Kessler was unable to connect with a receiver on the two-point conversion attempt and the Browns trailed, 28-19. After WR Rashard Higgins recovered a Parkey onside kick, Cleveland found the end zone for the last time as RB Duke Johnson Jr. completed a nine-play, 62-yard drive with a 1-yard TD rush. Trailing 28-26, the Browns were not able to recover Parkey's second onside kick attempt and the Titans held on for the victory.

The Cincinnati Bengals defeated the Cleveland Browns, 31-17, at Paul Brown Stadium. The The Cincinnati Bengals defeated the Cieveiand Browns, 51-17, at rain Brown Statium. The only points in the first quarter came on the game's opening possession as Bengals RB Jeremy Hill and QB Andy Dalton led Cincinnati down the field. RB Giovanni Bernard eventually capped the seven-play, 75-yard drive with a 5-yard TD rush to gain an early 7-0 advantage. To begin the second quarter, Browns K Cody Parkey got Cleveland on the scoreboard as he converted a 28-yard field goal to finish a 10-play, 60-yard drive that left the Browns trailing 7-3. After the Cleveland defense forced a Bengals three-and-out, the Browns scored on their second consecutive possession behind key rushes from rookie QB Kevin Hogan and RB Isaiah Crowell. Crowell ultimately found the end zone on a 1-yard TD rush to give Cleveland its first lead of the game, 10-7. The Bengals responded, as Dalton connected with WR Brandon LaFell on back-to-back plays - the first a 21-yard strike, followed by a 44-yard TD pass and reception - to regain the lead, 14-10. The final points of the first half came via a 48-yard Hail Mary TD pass from Dalton to WR A.J. Green as time expired, giving Cincinnati a 21-10 advantage at halftime. In the third quarter, Hogan (who took over for QB Cody Kessler after he left the game with a concussion) continued to have success in the run game, capping an eight-play, 75-yard drive with his first career TD on a 28-yard rush, the longest by a Browns QB in team history. Cincinnati responded just two plays later as Hill broke free on a long rush of his own and found the end zone on a 74-yard TD scamper to put the Bengals ahead 28-17. The final points of the game came on the Bengals ensuing possession when K Mike Nugent split the uprights on a 36-yard field goal attempt and gave Cincinnati a 31-17 advantage with just over four minutes remaining in the third quarter. In his first NFL game, Hogan rushed for 104 yards, the second-most ever by a Browns QB, while fellow rookie LB Emmanuel Ogbah recorded two sacks on the day.
