NOTABLE STORYLINES

The Browns are on the road for the third time in the first four weeks of the season when they travel to Washington to face the Redskins at 1:00 p.m. on Sunday, Oct. 2. The Browns hold a 33-11-1 record in the all-time series against the Redskins, including a 16-4-1 record in Washington.

Last week, the Browns fell 30-24 in overtime at Miami. Rookie **Cody Kessler** made his NFL debut, starting at quarterback. He completed 21 of 33 passes for 244 yards and zero interceptions.

WR **Terrelle Pryor Sr.** set career highs in receptions (eight) and receiving yards (144) at Miami. He also completed three passes for 35 yards and rushed for 21 yards with a touchdown. He became the first player to have at least 120 receiving yards, 30 passing yards and 20 rushing yards in a single game since Pro Football Hall of Famer Frank Gifford on December 6, 1959. Pryor's 144 receiving yards were the most by a Brown since WR **Josh Gordon** totaled 151 at New England on Dec. 18, 2013.

The Browns are second in the league with a rushing average of 5.71. The team is also fourth in the NFL in total rushing yards. The Browns have scored at least one rushing touchdown in every game this season.

RB **Isaiah Crowell** is second in the NFL with a rushing average of 6.01. He is tied for second in the league with 274 rushing yards. In Week 2, he recorded an 85-yard touchdown, the second-longest run in Browns history and the longest run by any NFL player this season.

Making his NFL debut, rookie DB **Briean Boddy-Calhoun** recorded an interception that he returned 27 yards for a touchdown at Miami. He is the first player in Browns history to record an INT-TD during his first NFL game. He is one of six NFL rookies with an interception this season and the only one with an INT-TD.

RB **Duke Johnson Jr.** is second in the NFL with eight third-down receptions this season. He is second on the team with 12 receptions for 84 yards. He also has 103 rushing yards on 16 attempts.

LT **Joe Thomas** has been selected to the Pro Bowl in each of his first nine NFL seasons. He is the eighth player in NFL history to make the Pro Bowl in his first nine seasons. The other seven players are in the Pro Football Hall of Fame. Thomas is tied with Hall of Famers **Jim Brown** and **Lou Groza** for the most Pro Bowl selections in team history.

Coaching capsules:

Cleveland -- Hue Jackson: 8-11, second season as head coach, first with the Browns.

Hue Jackson was named the 16th full-time head coach in Cleveland Browns history on January 13, 2016. He is in his 30th year as a coach, including the last 16 in the NFL. He has spent nine seasons coaching in the AFC North, during which time he helped his team advance to the postseason seven times. Jackson was head coach of the Oakland Raiders in 2011 and guided the team to an 8-8 record. He has also served as offensive coordinator in Washington (2003), Atlanta (2007), Oakland (2010) and Cincinnati (2014-15). Jackson spent 14 years coaching on the college level and was a quarterback at Pacific from 1985-86.

Washington -- Jay Gruden: 14-21, third season as head coach.

Named the 29th head coach in franchise history on January 9, 2014, Gruden guided the Redskins to a 9-7 record and an NFC East title in 2015, becoming only the sixth coach in team history to lead the franchise to a playoff berth within the first two years of a coaching tenure. He joined the Redskins after spending three seasons as offensive coordinator for the Cincinnati Bengals, during which time the Bengals averaged 10 wins a season, made three consecutive playoff appearances and earned an AFC North championship in 2013. He also spent seven seasons with the Tampa Bay Buccaneers as an offensive assistant (2002-08), helping the team to its first championship in Super Bowl XXXVII.

2016 DRAFT

During the 2016 NFL Draft, Cleveland bolstered its roster with 14 selections – the most among all teams and the most by the Browns since 1979. The Browns also acquired significant resources to continue to improve the team in future years with an additional first round pick in 2017 (Philadelphia), second round pick in 2017 (Tennessee) and second round pick in 2018 (Philadelphia). Twelve of the draft picks are on Cleveland's active roster and DB **Trey Caldwell** and LB **Scooby Wright III** are on the club's practice squad.

NOTABLE CONNECTIONS

- Head Coach **Hue Jackson** spent three years (2001-03) on Washington's staff, including his final season as offensive coordinator.
- Head coach **Hue Jackson** and Redskins head coach **Jay Gruden** coached together on the Bengals staff from 2012-13.
- Redskins G **Shawn Lauvao** was originally drafted in the third round by the Browns in 2010. He started in 44 games at right guard, including 32 consecutive starts from 2011-12.
- Redskins QB **Colt McCoy** was originally drafted in the third round by the Browns in 2010. He appeared in 24 games (21 starts) and completed 409 of 702 passes for 4,388 yards, 21 TDs and 20 INTs.
- Offensive quality control coach **Rock Cartwright** was a seventh-round pick by Washington and played eight seasons (2002-09) with the Redskins.
- Defensive coordinator **Ray Horton** spent three years (1994-96) on Washington's staff as defensive assistant and his last two seasons as assistant defensive backs coach.
- Defensive line coach **Robert Nunn** coached the Redskins defensive line in 2003.
- Senior offensive assistant **Al Saunders** spent 2006-07 as associate head coach/offense with Washington.
- Offensive quality control coach **Bob Saunders** spent 2006-07 as assistant wide receivers coach with Washington.
- Running backs coach/run game coordinator **Kirby Wilson** spent the 2000 season as the Redskins running backs coach.
- Strength and conditioning/skills development coach **Joe Kim** carried the same role with Washington in 2015.
- OL **Austin Reiter** was originally a seventh-round pick by Washington in the 2015 NFL draft.
- DL **Stephen Paea** appeared in 11 games with the Redskins last year.
- DB **Marcus Burley** (Richmond) and DB **Joe Haden** (Fort Washington, MD) are natives of the DC area.
- QB **Robert Griffin III** was originally selected by the Washington Redskins in the first round (second overall) of the 2012 NFL Draft.
- Redskins head coach **Jay Gruden** (Tiffin) and quarterbacks coach **Matt Cavanaugh** (Youngstown) are Ohio natives.
- Redskins offensive coordinator **Sean McVay** is a graduate of Miami (Ohio).

WHAT TO LOOK FOR THIS WEEK

With two or more interceptions, it would mark the first time the Browns defense has intercepted the opposing quarterback multiple times in three consecutive games since the unit did it in 2008 in five consecutive games.

An interception returned for a touchdown would mark the first time the Browns recorded interception-return touchdowns in back-to-back games since 2001 when Corey Fuller and Anthony Henry scored on interceptions in Weeks 13 and 14, respectively.

With 120 rushing yards, the Browns offense will have rushed for 120 yards or more in four straight games for the first time since the team put four consecutive 120-plus yard games together in 2009.

With a rushing touchdown, the Browns will record their fourth straight game with a rushing score for the first time since 2012.

If a Browns player other than Terrelle Pryor gains 100 or more receiving yards it will mark the first time in team history that the Browns have had 100-yard receiving performances from three different players in three straight games (Corey Coleman in Week 2 and Pryor in Week 3).

DB Briean Boddy-Calhoun

With an interception returned for a touchdown, Boddy-Calhoun would be the first Browns player to return an interception for a touchdown in consecutive games since LB Jim Houston did it in 1967.

WR Terrelle Pryor Sr.

With 100 receiving yards or more, he will be the first Browns receiver to record 100 yards receiving in back-to-back games since Josh Gordon put four consecutive 100-yard games together in 2013.

OL Joe Thomas

Has started all 147 career games and has not missed an offensive snap since joining the Browns as the third overall selection of the 2007 draft. His consecutive snaps streak of 9,134 is the longest active stretch in the league.

ON DECK

The Browns host the New England Patriots at 1:00 p.m. on Sunday, Oct. 9. The Browns hold a 12-10 advantage in the all-time regular season series, including a 7-4 mark at home. The last time the teams played in Cleveland, the Browns captured a 34-14 win on Nov. 7, 2010.

The Cleveland Browns fell to the Washington Redskins, 38-21, at FirstEnergy Stadium. The Browns opened up the scoring following a 6-yard touchdown run by rookie RB Trent Richardson. The touchdown gave him 10 rushing touchdowns on the year which broke the Browns rookie record. The play was set up by a DB T.J. Ward interception that he returned 37 yards to the Redskins 6-yard line. The Redskins responded as rookie QB Kirk Cousins found WR Leonard Hankerson for a 54-yard touchdown to tie the game. K Kai Forbath added a 44-yard field goal to give the Redskins a 10-7 advantage. The Browns then orchestrated a nine-play, 75-yard drive capped off by Richardson's second touchdown of the game to give the Browns a 14-10 lead heading into the half. The Redskins would score 21 consecutive points in the second half to build a 31-14 lead with 11:23 remaining in the fourth quarter. Rookie QB Brandon Weeden would then connect with rookie WR Travis Benjamin for a 69-yard touchdown to make the score 31-21, but it would not be enough as Washington would add an RB Alfred Morris touchdown with 5:05 remaining to make the score 38-21.

WR Andrew Hawkins - Five receptions for 42 yards this season...Led Cleveland in receiving in 2014...Joined the Browns in 2014 as a restricted free agent from Cincinnati...Originally signed by the Rams in 2011 as an undrafted free agent.

LT Joe Thomas - Nine-time Pro Bowl selection who has started at left tackle in all 147 career contests...Has not missed an offensive snap since being selected as the third overall pick in the 2007 draft...His nine Pro Bowl selections are tied with Jim Brown and Lou Groza for the most by a Browns player.

LG Joel Bitonio - Started all 29 games played in his career...Missed six games last season with an ankle injury...Selected in the second round (35th overall) of the 2014 NFL Draft...Voted to the PFWA All-Rookie team and the PFWA All-AFC team in 2014.

C John Greco - Appeared in 102 career contests...Started 58 games for the Browns...Started two games this season at RG and one at C...Traded to Cleveland in 2011...Originally drafted by the Rams in the third round of the 2008 draft.

RG Alvin Bailey - Played in 45 career games, starting at RG last week...Started at tackle for the Seahawks in their Super Bowl XLVIII victory...Signed by Cleveland this offseason...Originally signed by the Seahawks as an undrafted free agent in 2013.

RT Austin Pasztor - Started all three games this season at RT...Claimed by the Browns via waivers prior to the start of the 2015 season...Originally signed by Jacksonville as an undrafted free agent.

TE Gary Barnidge - Nine catches for 103 yards on the season...Tied Pro Football Hall of Famer Ozzie Newsome for the most TD receptions by a Browns TE in a season with nine in 2015...Named to the Pro Bowl in 2015...Originally a fifth-round draft pick by Carolina.

TEAM NOTES

HORTON RETURNS TO BROWNS

This season **Ray Horton** rejoined the Browns as defensive coordinator. Horton has been an NFL defensive coordinator the past five seasons, including the 2013 season when he served as the Browns defensive coordinator. Horton orchestrated one of the best defensive turnarounds in Cleveland history. After finishing 23rd in the league the previous year, the Browns ranked ninth in the league in total defense in 2013, marking the team's best finish since 1994. The Browns limited opponents to an average of 3.9 yards per carry, which ranked eighth in the NFL and marked Cleveland's best total in 18 years. The Browns defense also registered 40 sacks, their most since 2001. Horton has coached in the NFL the past 22 seasons following a 10-year playing career as a defensive back. As a player and coach, he has made it to the Super Bowl five times, where he has three wins.

HAMILTON JOINS STAFF

Pep Hamilton joined the Browns as associate head coach – offense this season. He works closely with the quarterbacks. Hamilton spent 2013-14 and the first eight weeks of the 2015 season as the offensive coordinator for the Colts. In his two full seasons as coordinator, Indianapolis went 11-5 each year, won two AFC South division titles and advanced to the postseason each year, including a trip to the AFC Championship game in 2014. Prior to joining the Colts, Hamilton spent three seasons (2010-12) at Stanford, serving as the offensive coordinator and quarterbacks coach the final two years. Hamilton also served as the quarterbacks coach for the Chicago Bears from 2007-09.

WILSON SPEARHEADS RUN GAME

Earlier this year, **Kirby Wilson** was named the Browns running backs coach/run game coordinator. He has 18 years of experience coaching running backs in the NFL, during which time he has coached five running backs who rank in the top 25 for career rushing yards (Emmitt Smith #1, Curtis Martin #4, Edgerrin James #11, Adrian Peterson #17 and Thomas Jones #25) and two of the top four all-time reception leaders among running backs (Larry Centers #1 and Keith Byers #4). Wilson has helped seven different running backs break the 1,000-yard plateau a total of eight times. He has mentored four players to the Pro Bowl and has been to the playoffs with four different franchises, highlighted by the 2002 Buccaneers and 2008 Steelers Super Bowl victories. Wilson's teams have won six division titles and advanced to the postseason eight times.

HEAD COACH HUE JACKSON



Hue Jackson was named the 16th full-time head coach in Cleveland Browns history by Owners Dee and Jimmy Haslam on January 13, 2016. He brings 29 years of coaching experience, including the last 15 in the NFL. He has spent nine seasons coaching in the AFC North, during which time he helped his team advance to the postseason seven times. Jackson was head coach of the Oakland Raiders in 2011 and guided the team to an 8-8 record. He has also served as offensive coordinator in Washington (2003), Atlanta (2007), Oakland (2010) and Cincinnati (2014-15).

Jackson has spent the past four seasons with the Cincinnati Bengals. During that time, he helped the Bengals to two division titles and a trip to the postseason all four years. In 2012, he served as secondary/assistant special teams coach before coaching the running backs in 2013. Jackson spent the past two seasons (2014-15) as offensive coordinator.

With Jackson as coordinator in 2015, the Bengals offense finished third in the AFC in yards per play (5.7) and points per game (26.2). He was voted by the Professional Football Writers of America (PFWA) as the Co-Assistant Coach of the Year as quarterback Andy Dalton set a career high and franchise record with a 106.3 rating, which led the AFC and was second in the NFL. After losing Dalton to injury in Week 14, Jackson guided quarterback A.J. McCarron to a 2-1 record in the final three games of the season as the Bengals clinched the AFC North title. The Cincinnati running game produced two 700-yard rushers in Jeremy Hill (794) and Giovani Bernard (730) for the first time since 1988. Tight end Tyler Eifert experienced a breakout season after hauling in 13 touchdown receptions, the most by a Bengals tight end in franchise history and the most by a Cincinnati player since 2001. Wide receiver A.J. Green added 10 receiving touchdowns on 86 receptions for 1,297 yards. Eifert, Green and left tackle Andrew Whitworth were selected to the Pro Bowl.

In Jackson's first year as offensive coordinator for Cincinnati in 2014, the run game posted its highest yards per game average (134.1) since 2000. Dalton passed for 3,398 yards and Green totaled 1,041 receiving yards. Hill led all NFL rookies with 1,124 rushing yards, the second-most by a Bengals rookie in team history.

After spending the 2010 season as the Raiders offensive coordinator, Jackson was promoted to head coach in 2011. Oakland finished the year 8-8 and

finished first in the AFC West but missed the postseason via tiebreaker. The 8-8 mark was the best record by any Raiders team since 2002. The Raiders finished ninth in the NFL in total offense (379.5 yards per game) and seventh in rushing offense (131.9).

Before joining the Raiders, Jackson spent two seasons (2008-09) as quarterbacks coach for Baltimore, helping the Ravens advance to the playoffs both years. He was vital in the development of Joe Flacco, who was named NFL Rookie of the Year in 2008 and became the first rookie quarterback to win two playoff games as the Ravens advanced to the AFC Championship game.

From 2004-06, Jackson served as the Bengals wide receivers coach, helping develop one of the best wide receiver tandems in NFL history with Chad Johnson and T.J. Houshmandzadeh. During that span, the two combined to average 173.3 catches, 2,363.3 receiving yards and 15 touchdowns per season. In 2005, Johnson led the AFC with 1,432 receiving yards. In 2006, Johnson and Houshmandzadeh became the first Bengals duo to each top 1,000 receiving yards in the same season.

Jackson gained his first fulltime NFL experience with Washington, where he served as the running backs coach from 2001-02, before being promoted to offensive coordinator in 2003. Under Jackson's tutelage, running back Stephen Davis led the NFC with 1,432 rushing yards in 2001.

Jackson spent 14 years coaching on the college level, going from a graduate assistant at Pacific all the way to offensive coordinator at Southern California. He spent four seasons (1997-2000) as USC's offensive coordinator, where he also helped to recruit and develop players, including quarterback Carson Palmer, who went on to win the Heisman Trophy and be selected No. 1 overall in the NFL draft.

He was a minority coaching fellowship intern with the Los Angeles Rams in 1990, Arizona Cardinals in 1992 and Washington Redskins in 1995. He also served as the running backs/wide receivers/special teams coach for the London Monarchs of the World League in 1991.

Born Oct. 22, 1965, Jackson was a quarterback at Pacific from 1985-86 and threw for 2,544 yards and 19 touchdowns. The Los Angeles native also lettered in basketball and earned his degree in physical education.

Jackson and his wife, Michelle, have three daughters, Jordyn, Baylee and Haydyn.

2016 RADIOTHON

Lincoln Financial Field, Philadelphia, Pa.

Despite trailing by just three points in the third quarter, the Cleveland Browns fell to the Eagles, 29-10, after Philadelphia pulled away late for the season-opening victory at Lincoln Financial Field. Eagles' rookie QB Carson Wentz got out to a fast start as he led a nine-play, 75-yard TD drive on their first possession of the game. Wentz connected with WR Jordan Matthews on a 19-yard TD pass to cap the drive and take a 7-0 lead. Cleveland's defense would bounce back including a sack from LB Christian Kirksey at the end of the first quarter. In the opening minutes of the second quarter, Eagles' K Caleb Sturgis converted a 22-yard field goal attempt to give Philadelphia a 10-0 advantage. The Browns responded on the ensuing possession as QB Robert Griffin III found WR Terrelle Pryor Sr. along the sideline on a 44-yard gain. Four plays later, RB Isaiah Crowell finished off the seven-play, 75-yard drive with a 2-yard TD run that left Cleveland trailing 10-7. Sturgis split the uprights once more at the end of the second quarter on a 38-yard field goal attempt, giving the Eagles a 13-7 lead at the half. In the third quarter, the Browns cut into the lead on their first drive of the half as Griffin connected with rookie WR Corey Coleman on a 58-yard pass that would lead to K Patrick Murray capping off Cleveland's drive with a 35-yard field goal and cutting the lead to 13-10. However, the Browns' following possession ended with the Eagles defense forcing a safety to take a 15-10 advantage. Philadelphia capitalized and scored once more on their next possession when Wentz conducted a nine-play, 73-yard scoring drive that finished with a 35-yard TD pass to WR Nelson Agholor. The Browns defense closed the third quarter with rookie DL Carl Nassib registering his first NFL sack. The final points of the game came late in the fourth quarter as Eagles' RB Ryan Mathews punched in a 1-yard TD run with just over a minute remaining in the game.

Despite a first quarter lead, the Ravens rallied back to defeat the Cleveland Browns, 25-20. The Browns started the game fast as QB Josh McCown led a nine-play, 75-yard opening drive that culminated in a 31-yard TD pass to rookie WR Corey Coleman, giving Cleveland a 7-0 advantage. After forcing a Baltimore punt, RB Isaiah Crowell broke free on the first play for an 85-yard TD rush on the Browns next possession. Cleveland extended its lead after an INT by DB Joe Haden – his first of two INTs in the game – gave the Browns the ball back in Ravens territory. McCown connected with Coleman once more for a 27-yard TD. The Browns could not convert on the ensuing PAT as K Patrick Murray's attempt was blocked and returned by the Ravens for the defensive two-point conversion, leaving Cleveland with a 20-2 advantage with just over four minutes remaining in the first quarter. Late in the second quarter, Ravens' QB Joe Flacco marched Baltimore down the field with a six-play, 75-yard scoring drive that ended with a 7-yard TD pass to WR Mike Wallace. After an interception by S Eric Weddle, Baltimore was able to score before the half as K Justin Tucker converted on a 52-yard field goal attempt as time expired, cutting the Cleveland lead to 20-12. The Ravens got out to a fast start in the third quarter as Flacco led a six-play, 75-yard TD drive to start the second half, connecting with Wallace yet again on a 17-yard TD pass that left Baltimore trailing 19-20. The final points of the game came in the fourth quarter as Tucker converted two more field goal attempts – the first from 49 yards away, and the second from 41 yards away to give the Ravens a 25-20 advantage. Despite a late push from the Browns offense, an INT by Baltimore LB C.J. Mosley with just 13 seconds remaining in the contest sealed the victory.

Hard Rock Stadium, Miami Gardens, Fla.

The Dolphins defeated the Browns in overtime, 30-24, in their home opener at Hard Rock Stadium. The Browns defense started strong as DB Jamar Taylor intercepted Dolphins' QB Ryan Tannehill on the second play of the game. Miami responded by forcing a turnover of their own as DL Cameron Wake strip-sacked Browns' rookie QB Cody Kessler. On their second possession, Tannehill led the Dolphins down the field on a five-play, 61-yard scoring drive including a 26-yard TD pass to WR DeVante Parker, giving Miami a 7-0 advantage. To open the second quarter, Browns' K Cody Parkey capped off a 10-play, 58-yard drive by connecting on a 46-yard field goal attempt, cutting the lead to 7-3. Later in the second, Cleveland DB Brian Boddy-Calhoun intercepted a Tannehill pass and returned it 27 yards for a Browns TD, giving Cleveland a 10-7 lead. The Dolphins were able to tie the game at 10 on their ensuing possession as K Andrew Franks split the uprights with a 37-yard field goal. Cleveland closed out the scoring in the first half as Parkey converted on a 48-yard field goal attempt and sent the Browns into halftime with a 13-10 advantage. In overtime, Landry set up the Dolphins' game-winning TD with a 32-yard reception along the sideline. On the next play, Miami RB Jay Ajayi found the endzone on an 11-yard TD rush to secure the Dolphins victory.
