The Broncos are 3-0 for the second consecutive year and the 14th time in franchise history. [See Page 5](#)

PAT BOWLEN IN 33rd YEAR WITH BRONCOS

Denver Broncos Owner Pat Bowlen, who is in his 33rd year with the franchise in 2016, has received significant consideration for enshrinement into the Pro Football Hall of Fame in the contributor category.

Mr. Bowlen's outstanding contributions to the Broncos, the community and the NFL have established him as one of the greatest and most influential contributors in professional football history.

TEAM SUCCESS

Former NFL Commissioner Paul Tagliabue (2/2/16): "Pat might have been the only owner who had a major role in every one of those four areas (when NFL was transformed in the late 80s and early 90s: television revenue, labor peace, stadium construction & international growth). I worked with over 100 owners. I would put Pat in the top five."

Dallas Cowboys Owner Jerry Jones (8/3/14): "Pat once told me: 'My full-time job is for this franchise at the league level.' No one in ownership spent more time on league matters than Pat Bowlen... When you talk about the league and you talk about contribution during these critical years and how we have evolved from where we were in television and how we were in stadium, what we were in all of it, Pat Bowlen spent that kind of time. I do distinguish an owner that did change the course. Pat changed the course."

Former NBC Sports Chairman Dick Ebersol (2/3/16): "They should drive (Pat) immediately to the Hall of Fame. It was on his watch that the economic indicator of the NFL, which has always been positive, went into super orbit."

ESPN's John Clayton (8/3/14): "I think it's inevitable (Pat) gets in (to the Pro Football Hall of Fame). He's what you want for an owner. He has his priorities taken care of. He's always made his franchise the best possible. He never scrimped on money. He never scrimped on resources. He always created a classy organization. So he's a winner on that front. His involvement in league issues is another big factor."

TEAM SUCCESS

* - Pat Bowlen is the first owner in professional football history to achieve 300 overall wins in his first 30 years.

* - In Pat Bowlen's 33 years as owner of the Broncos, the team has more Super Bowl appearances (7) than losing seasons (5), including three World Championships.

* - No team in NFL history has appeared in more Super Bowls (7) under a single owner than the Broncos have under Pat Bowlen. He is one of only seven owners in NFL history to preside over a team that has three or more Super Bowl wins.

* - The Broncos' 20 winning seasons and 18 playoff berths since 1984 are the most under a single owner in the NFL during that span. The Broncos have an NFL-low five losing seasons under Mr. Bowlen (never in consecutive years).

* - During Pat Bowlen's ownership, the Broncos have the most regular-season wins (316) in the NFL as well as the highest overall winning percentage (.614, 337-212-1), which ranks third in all of professional sports (trailing only the NBA's San Antonio Spurs and Los Angeles Lakers).

* - Pat Bowlen has helped Denver become the only NFL franchise to win at least 90 games in each of the last three decades (the Broncos are well on pace to win 90 games in the 2010s, needing only to finish out the decade with a 28-36 or better record to achieve that mark).

* - Under Pat Bowlen, the Broncos were the only AFC team to appear in three Super Bowls in the 1980s. They were also the only team from the conference to win a Super Bowl in the 1990s, capturing back-to-back World Championships in 1997-98 while setting an NFL record for most overall wins (33-6, .846) in a two-year period.

* - In his role as Chair of the NFL Broadcast Committee, Mr. Bowlen led the negotiations of the NFL's \$18 billion TV contract in 1998, the most lucrative single-sport contract in history.

* - In 1993, Mr. Bowlen gave an ultimatum to the networks that procured a bidding war, bringing FOX (NFC) and NBC (AFC) on as league broadcast partners and nearly doubling the television revenue from those streams.

Dallas Cowboys Owner Jerry Jones (2/3/16): "It was a watershed day. It changed NFL history and the game's relationship with TV."

* - Mr. Bowlen also was a key influencer in the 2006 launch of NBC's Sunday Night Football, which has become the most-watched TV program in the country.

Former NBC Sports Chairman Dick Ebersol (9/7/14): "As chairman of the TV committee, Pat Bowlen had more to do with how we watch football in America right now than anybody else in the league. He was the single major force in getting Sunday Night Football. It never would have happened without him."

* - In 1993, Mr. Bowlen fought to establish the introduction of the "franchise tag" in the Collective Bargaining Agreement, helping teams secure the rights to their key players.

Former NFL Commissioner Paul Tagliabue (1/28/14): "The franchise player tag, it was Pat who said, 'Call it the Elway Rule, call it whatever you want, but we're not letting our best player go out on the market.' It doesn't make sense from the fans' standpoint. That's what builds fan bases is continuity with the great players. That's what we as the league called the franchise tag in the beginning, the Elway Rule."

* - In his position as co-chair of the NFL Management Council Executive Committee, Mr. Bowlen played a key role in the six-year extension of the Collective Bargaining Agreement in 2006 and again was part of the new CBA discussions for the 10-year extension in 2011 that ensured labor peace for the next decade.

Former NFL Commissioner Paul Tagliabue (1/28/14): "When we had tough issues, I'd tell (players union boss) Gene Upshaw, 'Go talk to Pat Bowlen.' And he'd say, 'Why Bowlen?' And I'd say: 'Because he's realistic. If he says it, you can take it to the bank that it's something we as a league are willing to stand by.'"

* - Mr. Bowlen played an important role in the formation of NFL Network in 2003 and worked to increase its distribution among cable providers and its overall growth.

INTERNATIONAL GROWTH

* - The Broncos have played eight international games in six different countries under Mr. Bowlen's ownership (7 American Bowl, 1 regular season in London), marking the third-most such games in league history.

Former Broncos GM John Beake (8/3/14): "I remember when they first started the American Bowl, Pat would raise his hand. We went to (seven). He loved that. He loved taking the team over and expanding the game globally."

STADIUM EXPANSION / FAN EXPERIENCE

* - Pat Bowlen opened Sports Authority Field at Mile High in 2001, beginning a three-year period in which eight new stadiums opened around the NFL.

* - With a continued emphasis of improving the fan experience, he commissioned \$30 million worth of upgrades to Sports Authority Field at Mile High during the 2013 offseason that included increasing the size of the scoreboard by three times and improving the audio/visual elements, connectivity, suites and concourses.

FRANCHISE STABILITY / POPULARITY

* - During Mr. Bowlen's 33 years of ownership, the Broncos have sold out every regular-season and postseason contest (NFL-high 277 sellouts) as part of the club's 46-year, 381-game sellout streak that is the longest in NFL history in one city.

Patriots Chairman and CEO Robert Kraft (7/23/14): "Over the 30 years he's built an environment up there that I think everyone in the NFL would like to copy."

* - Mr. Bowlen's 33 years of ownership are the 13th-most in pro football history among single owners. He is the second-longest tenured owner in the NFL at this time.

* - Pat Bowlen helped put the Rocky Mountain Region on the professional sports map with the sustained success of the Broncos. In addition to the team's local popularity, a 2014 Harris Poll identified the Broncos as "America's Team."

PAT BOWLEN REACHES 300 WINS

Broncos Owner Pat Bowlen earned his 300th win in Week 10 against San Diego in 2013 to become the first owner in professional football history to reach 300 wins in 30 years.

BRONCOS OWN NFL'S LONGEST SCORING STREAK

The Broncos' 376-game scoring streak is the longest active streak in the league. The streak, which began on *Monday Night Football* with a 16-13 overtime loss at Seattle on Nov. 30, 1992, is the second-longest such streak in NFL history.

In the impressive run, the Broncos have scored on their first possession 146 times. Denver has scored in the first quarter 242 times during the streak and has had it extended by halftime 348 times.

Denver has had to wait until the fourth quarter to extend the streak just six times.

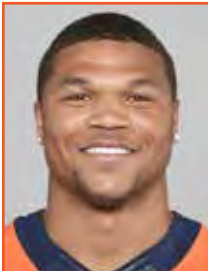

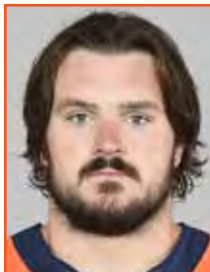

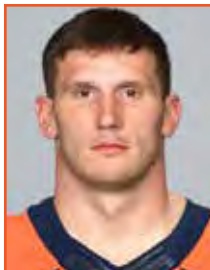

For the fifth consecutive season the Denver Broncos captured a victory in their season opener, defeating the Carolina Panthers by a score of 21-20 in a rematch of Super Bowl 50.

Denver running back C.J. Anderson rushed for a game-high 92 yards and had 47 yards receiving in the match up, which marked the first time since 1970 that Super Bowl participants from the previous season met in Week 1.

The Broncos' promising opening drive was thwarted when rookie running back Devontae Booker fumbled on his initial NFL carry. Panthers linebacker Shaq Thompson recovered the fumble, giving Carolina possession of the ball on its own 29-yard line.

The Panthers capitalized on the turnover, striking first off a 14-yard touchdown pass from quarterback Cam Newton to wide receiver Kelvin Benjamin.

On the Broncos' ensuing possession, quarterback Trevor Siemian, making his first NFL start, threw his first of two interceptions with Panthers linebacker Thomas Davis recording the takeaway.

After the Denver's defense held stout on the first drive of the second quarter, rookie fullback Andy Janovich ripped off a 28-yard touchdown run on his first career carry to tie the score at 7-7.

Carolina would tack on an additional 10 points before halftime to take a 17-7 lead into the locker room. Newton scrambled for a 2-yard touchdown, capping an 18-play, 89-yard drive, while kicker Graham Gano split the uprights from 44 yards with three seconds remaining in the half.

Siemian threw his second interception of the game to open the half in a scoreless third quarter for both teams.

The Broncos then came out firing on all cylinders in the fourth quarter, outscoring the Panthers 14-3.

On the first play of the fourth, Anderson took a screen pass from Siemian 25 yards for a score, pulling within 17-14.

Two plays later, Broncos cornerback Chris Harris Jr. tipped a Newton pass and caught the ball, registering the Broncos' only takeaway of the game.

Denver turned the interception into seven points after a 10-play, 23-yard drive ended in a 1-yard rushing score from Anderson—his second touchdown of the game. With the touchdown, Denver took its first lead of the game, 21-17.

Carolina and Gano answered with a 36-yard field goal to pull within one, 21-20, but that's as close as Carolina would get.

The Panthers mounted a final drive into field goal range after converting a 4th-and-21 thanks to a defensive penalty.

With nine seconds left, Gano pushed a potential game-winning 50-yard field goal wide left, sealing the Denver victory.

The win marked Denver's 29th victory in 33 home openers under Owner Pat Bowlen.

Two defensive touchdowns helped spark the Broncos as Denver topped the Indianapolis Colts, 34-20, for its second win of the 2016 season. With the victory, Denver moved to 2-0 to start the year, marking the fourth straight season the team opened up with a two-game win streak.

Denver opened the game with a promising offensive drive, but could not capitalize as kicker Brandon McManus pushed a 54-yard field goal wide left.

On the ensuing Colts drive, quarterback Andrew Luck marched Indianapolis down the field before stalling at Denver's 30-yard line. Colts kicker Adam Vinatieri gave the visitors a 3-0 lead off a 48-yard field goal.

Denver would then answer with three points of its own as a 44-yard pass from quarterback Trevor Siemian to wide receiver Demaryius Thomas set McManus up for a 23-yard field goal knotting the game at 3-3.

Siemian and the Denver offense opened up the second quarter by finding the end zone. From the Colt's 4-yard line, Anderson darted up the middle for the first touchdown of the game.

Indianapolis' defense generated the first turnover of the game after cornerback Darius Butler jumped a Siemian pass, returning it 19 yards. Butler injured his hamstring on the return, preventing a touchdown, and the Colts had to settle for a 52-yard field goal from Vinatieri to pull within 10-6.

With less than 10 seconds left in the first half, Denver extended its lead to 13-6 after McManus hit his second of the day, a 43-yarder.

On the first possession of the second half, the Colts put together a 13-play, 79-yard drive that culminated in a 5-yard touchdown run by Robin Turbin, tying the game at 13.

After McManus' third field goal—a 33-yarder—the Broncos padded their lead early in the fourth quarter when cornerback Aqib Talib jumped a Luck pass, taking it 46 yards for a pick-six.

Midway through the fourth, Indianapolis made things interesting when Luck found running back Frank Gore for a 7-yard touchdown pass, to pull within 23-20 with 4:02 remaining.

After a Denver field goal put the home team up by six points with less than two minutes remaining, the Colts took over looking to drive for the winning score.

On the first play of their drive, Luck was sacked by Broncos linebacker Von Miller, who forced a fumble that was recovered by teammate Shane Ray and returned 15 yards for a touchdown.

Siemian then hit Thomas for the two-point conversion, sealing the 34-20 victory.

The game marked the 10th time in team history—and the first since 2012—that the Broncos recorded multiple defensive touchdowns in a single contest.

The Denver Broncos picked up their first road victory of the season with a 29-17 victory over the Cincinnati Bengals in a back-and-forth affair in front of 63,850 fans at Paul Brown Stadium.

Denver was led by quarterback Trevor Siemian (23-of-35 for 312 yards, 4 TDs, 132.1 rtg.), who became the first player in NFL history to throw for 300 yards and four touchdowns without an interception in his first career road start.

Cincinnati opened the game on a 5-play, 74-yard drive, culminating in a 3-yard touchdown run from Bengals running back Jeremy Hill, the first of two from Hill on the day.

On the ensuing Broncos drive, Denver cut the Bengals' lead to 7-3 following a 20-yard field goal from kicker Brandon McManus.

At the end of the first quarter, Denver posted its first takeaway of the game after Cincinnati's Adam Jones fumbled a punt. Denver's Zaire Anderson forced the fumble, while Shiloh Keo recovered the ball at the Bengals' 46-yard line.

Three plays into the second quarter, the Broncos capitalized off the turnover, taking their first lead of the game. Siemian hit wide receiver Emmanuel Sanders for a 41-yard score to go up 10-7.

Cincinnati answered Denver's score with a touchdown drive of its own. Hill scampered four yards for his second touchdown run of the game, putting the Bengals up 14-10.

With less than five minutes remaining in the first half, Denver engineered a 10-play, 55-yard drive that resulted in Siemian's second touchdown pass to Sanders—a 7-yarder with 32 seconds remaining—to give Denver a 16-14 lead entering the half.

Both teams held each other scoreless in the third quarter before Bengals kicker Mike Nugent pushed Cincinnati ahead 17-16 early in the fourth with a 34-yard field goal.

On Denver's next drive, Siemian found tight end John Phillips in the middle of the end zone for a 1-yard score for his first touchdown catch as a Bronco. Denver failed to convert the two-point attempt, keeping the lead at 22-17.

After a three-and-out from the Cincinnati offense, Denver put the game away on its ensuing possession. Siemian found tight end Jeff Heuerman for a 29-yard connection to set the Broncos up near midfield.

On third-and-11, Siemian connected on his second deep touchdown pass of the day—a 55-yarder to wide receiver Demaryius Thomas—to put the Broncos ahead 29-17.

Denver safety Will Parks quelled any attempt of a Bengals comeback after a pass tipped by safety T.J. Ward found its way into the rookie's hands.

Linebacker Shane Ray helped seal the win with his third sack of the day to become the first NFL player in 14 seasons to post three sacks in his first career start.
