### SECOND-HALF TURNAROUND IN 2015

Following a 1-7 start, Caldwell led the Lions to a 7-9 record in 2015 on the shoulders of a 6-2 surge to finish off the year. Detroit became the fourth team since 1991 to start a season with 1 or fewer wins in the first 8 games (1-7 or 0-8 record) and finish with a 6-2 record. A 6-2 finish is the best record by any team since 1991 to start the season with a 1-7 or 0-8 record. It marks the Lions' best second-half finish since the team finished 7-1 in 1995.

### FIRST SEASON IN DETROIT

By finishing the 2014 season with an 11-5 regular season record, Caldwell tied Patsy Clark (1931, Portsmouth Spartans) for the most wins in franchise history by a coach in his first year with the club.

- Caldwell is the third coach in team history to lead the Lions to the playoffs in his first year with Detroit (George Wilson in 1957; Bobby Ross in 1997).
- He is the seventh coach in franchise history (since 1930) to lead the Lions to a winning record (entire season) in his first year with the club.

### COACHING OVERVIEW

- Hired as head coach for the Detroit Lions January 14, 2014.
- In 15 NFL seasons, Caldwell has worked on coaching staffs that have led teams to 12 winning seasons and only twice finished below .500. Overall, Caldwell's teams he coached for have compiled a 161-87 regular season record, along with 12 playoff appearances, eight division titles, three conference championships and two Super Bowl wins.
- In five years as an NFL head coach, Caldwell has led a team to 11+ wins twice (14 with Indianapolis in 2009). Coached in three Super Bowls with Indianapolis (XLI and XLIV) and Baltimore (XLVII) and won two Super Bowl titles (Indianapolis and Baltimore).
- In his first year as head coach for Indianapolis (2009), he won the AFC Championship and led the franchise to Super Bowl XLIV. He became the first NFL coach to win his first 14 games and the fifth rookie head coach to reach the Super Bowl.
- One of four head coaches to produce 24+ regular-season wins and a Super Bowl berth in their first two career seasons as head coach.
- In eight of the 10 seasons Caldwell coached in Indianapolis, the Colts ranked in the Top-10 in total offense eight times and six times in the Top-5.
- From 2003-09, Caldwell was the Colts quarterbacks coach and was also promoted to assistant head coach and associate head coach during that time. He worked closely with QB Peyton Manning and the team's quarterbacks. During that span, Indianapolis set NFL records with seven consecutive seasons finishing with 11+ wins (6, Dallas 1976-81) and 12+ victories (4, Dallas, 1992-95).
- Manning won four (2003, 2004, 2008, 2009) of his five NFL MVP awards under Caldwell's tutelage.
- Two of his quarterbacks, Manning (Super Bowl XLI) and Ravens QB Joe Flacco (Super Bowl XLVII) were named Super Bowl MVPs following their teams' respective championship runs.
- After being appointed Ravens offensive coordinator in December 2012, the team went on to win five of its next seven games, including Super Bowl XLVII. During that span, the offense averaged 400.6 yards per game, including an average of 410.3 yards per game during the four playoff wins.

## NEW LIONS LEADER



### BOB QUINN

Executive Vice President and  
General Manager

#### QUINN MAKES HIS MARK

Bob Quinn, hired January 11, 2016 as executive vice president and general manager, oversees the entire Lions' football operations and reports directly to Owner and Chairman of the Board Martha Firestone Ford.

- Since joining the Lions, Quinn, who spent the previous 16 seasons with the New England Patriots, has begun building the football foundation which he believes will provide the team with the optimum chance for success. During his introductory press conference, he quickly set forth his vision.
- Among the numerous free agents acquired by Quinn this offseason was WR Marvin Jones, considered by many to be the top free agent wide receiver on the market. Additionally, Quinn also retained key Lions free agents, including DT Haloti Ngata and LB Tahir Whitehead.
- His initial draft class featured the selection of the most linemen (offense and defense) in a Lions draft since 1989, highlighted by the team's first three picks (T Taylor Decker, DT A'Shawn Robinson and C Graham Glasgow).

#### PATRIOTS PAST

During his time with New England, Quinn served a number of roles in the player personnel department, including most recently as Director of Pro Scouting from 2012-15. While he worked as Director of Pro Scouting, the Patriots won the 2014 Super Bowl and four-straight AFC East Division championships.

- From 2009-2012, Quinn was the Assistant Director of Pro Personnel. For the previous nine years, Quinn worked in several different capacities within the Patriots player personnel department, including roles in college scouting as a National Scout and Regional Scout. He played an integral role in evaluating and procuring talent for the team through the NFL draft process, free agency, trades, etc.
- While working for the New England Patriots, he helped contribute to one of the most impressive stretches in NFL history, one that produced **four Super Bowl titles, including the most recent championship in 2014 (Super Bowl XLIX)**. *Since 2000, Quinn's first year with New England, the Patriots have won six AFC Championships, 13 AFC East titles, 12+ games in a season 10 times (which includes the past six years) and 10+ games in 14 of his 16 seasons.*
- As Director of Pro Scouting, Quinn utilized all possible methods to seek the Patriots' "next player." This approach had a tremendous impact on the Patriots' Super Bowl XLIX championship as seven players, who were acquired (including two via trades) after the start of the regular season, all played in the Super Bowl.
- Another key player during the Super Bowl XLIX Championship run, CB Malcolm Butler, signed with the club after a rookie minicamp tryout. Butler, who sealed the Super Bowl victory with a goal line interception, would join All-Pro CB Darrelle Revis in the New England secondary. Prior to serving as Director of Pro Scouting,

Quinn was the Patriots' assistant director of pro personnel. Prior to that, he worked in college scouting as the team's national scout in 2008 and as a regional scout from 2004-07.

- In 2008, the Patriots drafted LB Jerod Mayo in the first round and WR Matthew Slater in the fifth round. Mayo was a two-time Pro Bowl linebacker and Slater has become one of the league's elite special teams players having earned five Pro Bowl selections and three All-Pro honors. Quinn also served two seasons (2002-03) as a pro scout and two season (2000-01) as a player personnel assistant for the Patriots.

## WHAT TO WATCH FOR

### KEYS TO THE D

With both the Lions and Bears fighting through plagues of injuries to impact players, the battle of efficiency will be a key element in Detroit's consecutive divisional showdown this week. The Lions offense ranks second in the NFL fourth in total offense and third in passing offense, but it will be up to Detroit's defense to capitalize on a Bears offense looking to find a rhythm. Key Lions players such as LB **DeAndre Levy** and DE **Ezekiel Ansah** both have missed time due to injuries, but this Week 4 matchup serves as a promising opportunity for Detroit's defense to start clicking on all cylinders. The Lions linebacker corps suffered important losses after Levy and LB **Antwone Williams** were both ruled out for the contest in Green Bay last week, further limiting Detroit's big play ability on the defensive side of the ball.

The Lions were only able to register one two sacks against the Packers, including one by DE **Kerry Hyder**, who is currently ranks second in the NFL with four sacks. As a unit, however, the defense only generated seven quarterback hurries and has been limited to just one forced turnover in three games.

**Lions Head Coach Jim Caldwell on how not forcing turnovers has contributed to early season struggles on defense:** "There's no question about it. Obviously, you'd like to have more and we haven't been able to get as many as we'd like and you ask why. We've just got to put ourselves in a little bit better position to make that happen, but we work at it. We've got to continue to work at it and I think it'll start to come."

A point of emphasis in getting the ball rolling on impact plays may be linked to getting off the field in third down situations. Through three weeks, teams facing the Lions have converted 50 percent of third downs this season, while the Bears offense currently ranks 26th in the NFL that category (30 percent). Another key component in limiting big plays is linked to the prowess the Lions defense can demonstrate in pass coverage, particularly in the middle of the field. Bears TE **Zach Miller** leads Chicago with 15 receptions for 125 yards and two touchdowns on the season and is tied for first among tight ends for most touchdowns caught through three weeks.

- Bears Linebackers Coach **Glenn Pires** was the linebackers coach in Detroit from 2001-02.

- Bears RB **Jeremy Langford** played at Michigan State from 2011-14, and is a native of Westland, Mich.
- Bears Offensive Line Coach **Dave Magazu** coached at both Western Michigan (assistant offensive line, 1981) and Eastern Michigan (offensive line, 1982) and also as a graduate assistant at Michigan in 1983.

**Lions S Glover Quin on the importance of preventing the opposing offense from getting into a rhythm:** “You need that stop every time. You go out there on the first drive, you get a stop. That just sets the momentum and changes the whole tone of the game. It might come down to the end of the game, and you’re like, ‘OK, we need this stop.’ But, if we had a stop earlier in the game we wouldn’t be in this situation. I don’t look at it as, ‘OK we’re in this situation where we need this stop.’ Every situation is a need to stop, we’re a defense. It’s not like we go out there like, ‘OK, well we don’t need to get a stop this drive, let them score.’ No, we need to stop (them) every drive we go out there.”

**KEEPING UP WITH JONES**

While 2016 may be WR **Marvin Jones Jr.’s** debut season in Honolulu Blue, the first-year Lion has already made an instant impact on the offense through Week 3. Demonstrating his speed, quick hands and natural chemistry with QB **Matthew Stafford**, Jones has tallied 18 receptions for a whopping 408 yards and two touchdowns this season. His 408 yards currently rank first in the NFL.

In Detroit’s Week 2 home opener against Tennessee (9/18), Jones posted 118 receiving yards and tied his career-record for longest reception with a 47-yard catch. Jones one-upped his Week 2 performance with a stellar showing in Week 3 at Green Bay (9/25), logging a single-game career-high 205 receiving yards against the Lions’ division rival. Displaying his ability to be a threat downfield, Jones shattered his career-long reception record with a 73-yard touchdown pass from Stafford. Weeks 2 and 3 marked the first time in Jones’ career that he posted 100+ receiving yards in consecutive weeks.

**Jones on if his back-to-back 100-yard games are the type of performances he envisioned for himself when he joined the Lions:** “I just knew it was a great opportunity, and we have the great players in place to do something big. The feeling of me being a part of something big, and guiding the team to win games. Obviously, we didn’t do that the past couple weeks, but I still think that this might be the most talented team that I’ve been a part of. You see it out there, and we just have to put it all together. That means start fast, so we need to start fast and continue to progress.”



**Jones on his mentality when he's downfield one-on-one:** "I'm going to win 100 percent of the time. As a receiver you have to have that mentality. If you don't have that mentality, then you shouldn't be playing receiver. I think when I'm on the sideline or wherever, whenever the ball, is up (to me) that I get the ball. Matt (Stafford) does a good job of throwing it in different spots for me to go get."

In addition to breaking his own career records and leading the League in receiving yards, the first-year Lion has also made his mark on Detroit's record book. Jones became the first Lion in the organization's history to reach 400 yards in the first three games of the season, surpassing the previous best of 369 yards set by WR Calvin Johnson in 2012. Jones' Week 3 performance marked the 10th 200-yard receiving game in team history, joining Calvin Johnson (5), Cloyce Box (2), Richard Johnson (1) and Roy Williams (1) as the only Lions to accomplish this feat. Jones' 205 yards were the eighth-most by a Lions receiver in a single game.

### STAFFING THE OFFENSE

Lions QB **Matthew Stafford** continued to climb the record books in Detroit's Week 3 loss to Green Bay, throwing for 385 yards and three scores. It was Stafford's 32nd career 300-yard game (tied for fifth-most through a player's first eight seasons) and his 18th career 350+-yard game, tying Hall of Fame QB Dan Marino (18; 1984-90) for most 350+-yard games in a player's first eight seasons.

On his first completion of the game, Stafford became the first player in NFL history to complete 2,300 passes in the first 100 games of a player's career, doing so in just his 96th game. In the second quarter, the eight-year vet out of Georgia linked up with the league's leading WR, Marvin Jones Jr. on a 73-yard strike for Detroit's first touchdown of the game.

Coming out of halftime down three scores, Detroit marched down the field behind the right arm of Stafford, who culminated a six-minute, 77-yard drive with a 2-yard touchdown pass to WR Anquan Boldin on fourth-and-goal. Responsible for his second touchdown of the game, Stafford surpassed Hall of Famer Johnny Unitas (169) for fifth-most touchdown passes in a player's first 100 career games.

Despite the loss, Stafford and Jones Jr. continued their new-found chemistry as the pair hooked up six times for 205 yards and two scores. It was the first time a Lions wide receiver recorded a 200-yard receiving game since former WR Calvin Johnson in 2013. With three touchdowns in the game, he recorded the most touchdowns by an opposing passer at Lambeau Field (15) in NFL history.

**Jones Jr. on how he's been able to develop chemistry with Stafford so early into his Lions career:** "I think, you know, we've just been together. Ever since I came in OTA's we got a lot of time together and that's us as receivers and the quarterbacks. It's been good in meetings early on, you know, us just talking about what we've seen, different things through the same eyes as receivers and quarterbacks, just all of us in general have done that. We're week three into the season, we've been at this for a while, so we just have to keep it up and do it consistently."

The Lions signal-caller has thrown for 3+ touchdowns in two of the first three games this season. Look for him to continue to get the ball in the hands of his playmakers as Detroit travels to Chicago for a Week 4 matchup against the 0-3 Bears.

**Stafford on if the offensive performance in the second half at Green Bay is a positive takeaway from Week 3's loss:** "I think we moved the ball well in the first half too, we just didn't score points. That's on us, but no question. There's going to be good stuff we did, and there's going to be some negative stuff. I'm going to look as hard as anybody in the mirror, and find out what I can do to be better to help our team win. I can sit here and tell you guys, 'This is what happened here, this is what happened there.' But if we don't score more points than them at the end of the day, it's on me and it's on our team."

First-year DE **Kerry Hyder** registered his fourth sack of the season as he collected a sack against the Packers that ended the first half. Hyder became the first Lions defensive player with 4+ sacks in the first three games of a season since DE Tracy Scroggins in 1995. He is just the fourth Lions player since sacks became official in 1983 to register 4+ sacks in the first three games of the season (William Gay, 7.5 in 1983; Doug English 4.0 in 1983; Tracy Scroggins, 4.0 in 1995).

Since Week 10 of the 2015 season, Offensive Coordinator **Jim Bob Cooter's** offense ranks first in the NFL in giveaways with only six during that span.

S **Glover Quin** registered his first interception of the season in Week 2 vs. Tennessee (9/18). He currently co-leads the NFL in interceptions with 15 picks (tied with Raiders S Reggie Nelson) since joining the Lions in 2013.

WR **Anquan Boldin** caught a 24-yard touchdown pass from QB **Matthew Stafford** in the first quarter against Tennessee. It was the 75th receiving touchdown of his career and first since joining the Lions. He has now caught touchdown passes with four different teams, including Arizona (44), Baltimore (14), San Francisco (16) and Detroit (2), and his current career total stands at 76.

## ATTACKING DEFENSE UNDER AUSTIN

Lions Defensive Coordinator **Teryl Austin's** defense, led by DE **Ezekiel Ansah** (14.5), finished in the Top 10 in the NFL in sacks for the second-consecutive year, ranking tied for seventh in 2015 with 43.0. The team's 43.0 sacks last season are also tied for fifth all-time in Lions single-season history.





- Since Austin took over the defense in 2014, the Lions rank among the NFL's best defenses in multiple categories. Over the past three seasons, the Lions rank sixth in opponent yards per game (329.9), fourth in opponent rushing yards per game (93.2), sixth in rush yards per attempt (3.9), ninth in team sacks (92) and first in tackles for loss (212).

## AT THE CONTROLS

Lions QB **Matthew Stafford**, beginning his eighth NFL season, has led the Lions offense to great offensive heights. He already has set single-season and career franchise records and closed in on more Lions career passing marks last season. Additionally, Stafford has finished among the top quarterbacks in the League passing rankings the past five seasons.

### STAFFORD AMONG LEAGUE LEADERS

Stafford maintained his place among the League's passing leaders following Week 3 at Green Bay (9/25), as he ranks fourth in the NFL in passer rating (105.0), third in passing yards (985), third in completions (81), fourth in completion percentage (67.5) and tied for third in touchdowns (7).

**START ME UP**

By starting in Week 11 at Pittsburgh in 2013 (11/17/13), Stafford set the franchise record for consecutive starts by a Lions quarterback with 42, dating back to September 11, 2011. He broke a tie with QB Greg Landry (41) for the most consecutive starts by a Lions QB in franchise history. He also set that same mark for consecutive starts including playoffs (43). **His current total stands at 85.**

➤ Stafford led the Lions to an 18-16 win over the Green Bay Packers at Lambeau Field in Week 11 (11/15/15) in his 88th career start, including playoffs. By starting in his 88th career game, Stafford surpassed Hall of Fame QB Bobby Layne for the most overall starts (including playoffs) in team history. ## ON THE RECEIVING END

The Lions offense features one of the deepest veteran receiving corps in the NFL with the likes of WRs **Marvin Jones Jr.**, **Golden Tate** and **Anquan Boldin**, combining for 26 total years of pass-catching experience.

### MARV-ELOUS MR. JONES

Jones Jr. joins the Lions following a four-year career (2012-15) with the Cincinnati Bengals, where he was a key piece of the Bengals' high-powered offense. He recorded a career high 10 touchdowns in 2013.

- With 6 receptions for 205 yards and two touchdowns at Green Bay, Jones Jr. became the fifth player in Lions history to surpass 200 receiving yards in a game, joining Calvin Johnson (5), Cloyce Box (2), Richard Johnson (1) and Roy Williams (1) in that elite group.
- Jones recorded the 10th 200-yard receiving game in team history and his 205 yards were the eighth-most by a Lions receiver in a single game.
- Through Week 2, Jones Jr. leads the NFL in receiving yards with 408, as well as 25+-yard receptions with 7.

## A BOLD CAREER

Beginning his 14th NFL season, WR **Anquan Boldin** joins the Lions receiving corps in 2016 with numbers worthy of Hall of Fame consideration.

- Boldin led the 49ers last year with 69 receptions and 789 yards. He currently ranks 12th in receptions (1,020) and 16th in receiving yards (13,300) on the NFL's all-time lists.
- Only 13 players in NFL history have recorded 1,000 or more receptions in their careers. With 1,020, Boldin trails only Titans WR Andre Johnson (1,057), Cowboys TE Jason Witten (1,034) and Cardinals WR Larry Fitzgerald (1,038) for the most among active players.
- In 2015, Boldin was also named the NFL's Walter Payton Man of the Year.

Boldin's 69 receptions and 789 receiving yards in 2015 made him the first player in NFL history to finish with at least 50 receptions and 600 receptions in each of his first 13 seasons.

- Since entering the NFL in 2003, Boldin ranks fourth in receptions (1,020) and third in receiving yards (13,300).
- With a 24-yard touchdown reception in Week 2 vs. Tennessee (9/18), Boldin has now caught touchdown passes with four different teams, including Arizona (44), Baltimore (14), San Francisco (16) and Detroit (2). Boldin is also the second player in NFL history (Terrell Owens) to have at least 1,000 career receptions (1,016) and record a touchdown catch with four different teams.

## RUSH TO SCORE

The 2016 Lions backfield features multiple weapons with dual-threat capabilities, led by RBs **Theo Riddick**, **Dwayne Washington** and **Zach Zenner**.

- Through three games, the Lions running backs rank ninth total offensive yards (446), second in receptions (22), tied for first in receiving touchdowns (2), tied for first in receiving first downs (10), second in yards after catch (182) and tied for sixth in total touchdowns (4).
- Detroit saw three backs reach the end zone in Week 1 vs. Indianapolis (9/11) with scores from Riddick, Abdullah and Washington. Abdullah collected 120 yards from scrimmage (63 rush, 57 receiving) and Riddick garnered 108 total yards (45 rush, 63 receiving). By both running backs surpassing 100 total yards, it marked the first time since November 28, 2013 (vs. GB: Reggie Bush, 182; Joique Bell, 128) that the Lions had two running backs total over 100 yards from scrimmage in a game.

## DESTRUCTIVE D-LINE

Over the past six seasons, few defensive line units have disrupted opponents in both the passing and running games as the Detroit Lions. The Lions, under the direction of Defensive Line Coach **Kris Kocurek** since 2010, feature an attack upfront that first concentrates on stopping the run and then applies heavy pressure on the quarterback.

*In 2015, the Lions defensive line generated 82.0 total tackles for loss or no gain (3rd in NFL), which includes 34.5 sacks (2nd in NFL), 44.0 tackles for loss or no gain against the rush (8th in NFL) and 8 forced fumbles (tied for 2nd in NFL).*

#### KERRYING THE LOAD

The Lions' defensive line displays great depth across the board, led by first-year DE **Kerry Hyder**. Hyder earned a roster spot this offseason and has emerged on the scene as one of the NFL's upstart pass rushers so far.

- Through Week 3, Hyder is currently tied for second in the NFL in sacks with 4.0 (21 yards) and ranks first in the NFC.
- Hyder registered his fourth sack of the season as he collected a sack against the Packers that ended the first half. He became the first Lions defensive player with 4+ sacks in the first three games of a season since DE Tracy Scroggins in 1995. He is just the fourth Lions player since sacks became official in 1983 to register 4+ sacks in the first three games of the season (William Gay, 7.5 in 1983; Doug English 4.0 in 1983; Tracy Scroggins, 4.0 in 1995).

## SERIES NOTES

- The Lions hosted the Bears for the inaugural Thanksgiving Day game on November 29, 1934. The game, played in front of a then-record 26,000 fans at the University of Detroit Stadium, was won by the Bears, 19-16, giving the Bears the Western Division championship. NBC Radio Network broadcasted the game coast-to-coast and a Thanksgiving tradition was born.
- On Thanksgiving Day (November 27) in 1995, the Lions downed the Bears 55-20 for their largest offensive output ever against Chicago. RB Barry Sanders rushed for 167 yards and three touchdowns in the win at the Silverdome. Earlier in the 1997 season, Sanders put up 161 yards on Chicago in a 32-7 victory over the Bears.
- WR Herman Moore set a franchise record with 14 catches for 183 yards in a 27-7 win December 4, 1995 at the Pontiac Silverdome. His record has since been tied by WR Calvin Johnson (10/27/13 vs. Dal).
- Detroit had its best stretch against the Bears when it won 11 of 12 games from September 22, 1968 to December 9, 1973.
- Five contests have gone to overtime—including both in 2002—with the Bears winning four of them.
- In the 2004 season opener, Detroit topped Chicago 20-17 to end its 24-game road losing streak. A key play in the game was S Bracy Walker's return of a blocked FG an NFL-record 92 yards.
- With the Lions trailing 13-3 going into the fourth quarter vs. Chicago at Ford Field September 30, 2007, the Lions reeled off an NFL record 34 points in the quarter to claim a 37-27 win. It marked just the fifth time in NFL history a team scored 30 or more points in a quarter. Detroit scored five touchdowns, including two passing, one rushing, one interception and one kickoff return. The teams also combined for 48 points, which is a record for combined fourth quarter points.
- On October 28, 2007, the Lions defeated the Bears 16-7 at Soldier Field. K Jason

Hanson, connected on a 52-yarder, which was his career longest against the Bears on the road, and marked the longest in franchise history by a Lions kicker on the road vs. Chicago. It also marked the first 50-yard field goal on the road vs. the Bears by a Lions kicker in the series that dates back to 1930. Almost one year to the exact date (November 2, 2008), Hanson repeated this feat when he hit another 52-yarder vs. the Bears.

- In front of a Ford Field record crowd (67,861), Detroit defeated the Bears 24-13 on ESPN's Monday Night Football October 10, 2011. It was the Lions first appearance on MNF since 2001. The game was highlighted by a 73-yard touchdown bomb from QB Matthew Stafford to WR Calvin Johnson and the second-longest rush in team history by RB Jahvid Best (88 yards). The crowd was so electric that their noise played a large part in Chicago committing nine false start penalties throughout the game.
- With two receiving touchdowns in the Lions' 21-19 win at Chicago on November 10, 2013, WR Calvin Johnson recorded his 62nd and 63rd career touchdowns and set a new Lions career record for receiving touchdowns. He broke the record of 62 previously set by WR Herman Moore. Detroit's road victory marked the first win at Soldier Field since a 16-7 win on October 28, 2007.
- In the Lions 75th Thanksgiving game Detroit defeated the Chicago Bears 34-17. With 146 receiving yards against Chicago, WR Calvin Johnson surpassed 10,000 career yards and became the first player in Lions history with 10,000 yards. He accomplished this feat in 115 games and set a new NFL record for the fewest games to record 10,000 receiving yards.
- With a 20-14 win at Chicago (12/21/14), the Lions reached 11 wins on the season for the fourth time in franchise history and the first since 1991. Head Coach Jim Caldwell became the first Lions head coach in his first season with the club to win 11 games since Patsy Clark led the Portsmouth Spartans to an 11-3 record in 1931. By reaching 11 wins, Caldwell has tied Clark for the most wins by a head coach in his first year with the Lions.
- With a 37-34 overtime victory over Chicago (10/18/15) the Lions claimed their first victory of the 2015 season. The Lions' game-winning 27-yard field goal vs. Chicago was set up when QB Matthew Stafford connected with WR Calvin Johnson on a 57-yard bomb to move the Lions down to the Chicago 6-yard line. The 57-yard pass play was the Lions' longest play from scrimmage during overtime in team history. The 57-yard pass play surpassed the previous long play of 40 yards, both pass plays, accomplished twice (Stafford-Johnson at Min 9/25/2011; Stafford-WR Ryan Broyles vs. Hou 11/22/12).
- With four catches by RB Theo Riddick and 10 catches from WR Calvin Johnson combined with WR Golden Tate's 90 catches, the Lions became just the fifth team in NFL history with three receivers with 80+ receptions in a season.

The Detroit Lions' start to the 2016 regular season highlighted the duel between two marquee quarterbacks in Lions QB Matthew Stafford and Colts QB Andrew Luck. With the help of a balanced offense through the air and a consistent rushing attack on the ground, the Lions jumped out to a 21-3 lead. After a 21-yard touchdown run by RB Theo Riddick to put Detroit up 7-0, rookie RB Dwayne Washington scored his first career touchdown to extend the lead 14-0. Seven of Stafford's 14 first half completions all went to different receivers including a six-yard touchdown strike to TE Eric Ebron that put Detroit up 21-3. Luck and the Colts responded with a 75-yard drive ending in a touchdown reception by Colts WR Donte Moncrief to set the score at 21-10 right before halftime. After a Lions drive stalled, Luck and the Colts put together an 85-yard drive ending in a 19-yard touchdown pass to TE Dwayne Allen. Following a successful two-point conversion pass to Allen, Indianapolis trailed 21-18 halfway through the third quarter. Detroit responded with a 71-yard drive ending with an 11-yard touchdown pass to RB Ameer Abdullah to go up 28-18. Following an Adam Vinatieri 40-yard field goal, Luck and the Colts added a 94-yard drive ending with a 16-yard touchdown strike to TE Jack Doyle to tie the game at 28-28. With completions to five different receivers, Stafford connected with Riddick for a 13-yard score. A missed extra point by K Matt Prater put the Lions lead at 34-28 with 4:11 left to play. The Colts put together an eight play drive for 75 yards as Doyle hauled in his second touchdown reception from six yards out to go up 35-34 on Detroit with 37 seconds left in regulation. With three timeouts, Stafford and the Lions completed three passes for a total of 50 yards before Prater lined up for a 43-yard field goal to put Detroit ahead 37-35 with four seconds left to play. After a series of laterals on the ensuing kickoff, Detroit was awarded a safety, ending regulation and giving the Lions a 39-35 victory.

The Lions hosted the Tennessee Titans in their home opener at Ford Field in Week 2 of the 2016 regular season (9/18). After a Sam Martin 48-yard punt and a holding penalty on the Titans, Tennessee started a drive from their own 10-yard line early in the first quarter. Lions DE Devin Taylor stuffed Titans RB DeMarco Murray in the end zone for a Detroit safety. The Lions immediately added an eight play scoring drive for 79 yards that was capped by a 24-yard Matthew Stafford touchdown strike to Anquan Boldin, putting the Lions up 9-0 in the first quarter. After a series of short completions by Titans QB Marcus Mariota, Tennessee put the score at 9-3 with a 46-yard field goal by Titans K Ryan Succop. Following a series of stops by both defenses, Detroit put together a 13-play, 75-yard drive that ended in a 42-yard field goal by K Matt Prater, giving the Lions a 12-3 lead going into halftime. Detroit constructed a 14-play drive midway through the third quarter that ended in a 27-yard field goal by Prater, giving the Lions a 15-3 lead heading into the fourth quarter. After a 20-yard completion, Mariota quickly connected with TE Delanie Walker for a 30-yard touchdown strike to bring the score to 15-10 with more than 14 minutes left to play. After forcing Detroit to punt on multiple drives, the Titans took the ball back with 7:04 to play. Mariota connected on all nine of his last pass attempts, including a nine yard touchdown pass to Titans WR Andre Johnson. The Titans took a 16-15 lead with 1:13 to play after a sack by Detroit on their failed two-point conversion attempt. Titans CB Perrish Cox intercepted a pass by Stafford at midfield on the Lions last drive of the game to give Tennessee a 16-15 victory.

The Packers defeated the Lions 34-27 in Week 3 at Lambeau Field after getting out to an early 31-3 lead which included scores on all of Green Bay's first six possessions. The Packers scored first with a 14-yard touchdown pass from Packers QB Aaron Rodgers to WR Davante Adams to take a 7-0 lead. The Lions responded with a 16-play drive that ended in a 42-yard field goal from K Matt Prater, setting the score at 7-3. After a kickoff out of bounds by Detroit, Rodgers and the Packers started a drive from their own 40. Rodgers quickly followed up on a 40-yard pass across the middle to WR Jordy Nelson with an eight-yard touchdown pass back to Nelson, giving Green Bay a 14-3 lead at the end of the first quarter. On the first play of the second quarter, Lions CB Nevin Lawson was called for defensive pass interference, a penalty for 66 total yards against Detroit. Rodgers and Packers TE Richard Rodgers connected for a two-yard touchdown pass following the infraction for a 21-3 Green Bay lead. A Matthew Stafford pass intended for Lions TE Eric Ebron was picked off on the ensuing Detroit drive, leading to a Green Bay field goal by K Mason Crosby. After a stalled Lions drive, Rodgers found Nelson again in the second quarter in the back of the end zone for a 17-yard touchdown and 31-3 Packers lead. In two plays Stafford connected with Lions WR Marvin Jones Jr. before the end of the first half for a 73-yard touchdown strike, giving the Packers a 31-10 lead at halftime. Detroit scored on the first possession of the second half when Stafford hit WR Anquan Boldin for a touchdown early in the third quarter to set the score at 31-17. Crosby nailed a 46-yard field goal on Green Bay's next drive, giving the Packers a 34-17 lead heading into the fourth quarter. With a 50-yard field goal by Prater, two stops by the Lions defense and another deep touchdown pass to Jones Jr., the Lions pulled within one score at 34-27 with more than three minutes left to play. A scramble by Rodgers on third and long gave Green Bay a 34-27 victory as time expired.
