SERIES INFORMATION

Detroit (1-1) embarks on a two-game road stand beginning with a Week 3 trip to Green Bay (1-1) to face the Packers. Sunday's matchup marks the 172nd all-time meeting between the NFC North rivals, as Green Bay leads the all-time series, 96-68-7. The Lions and Packers have split the season series each year since 2013, with the Packers winning the most recent contest, 27-23 at Ford Field in 2016. The team's win at Green Bay last season (11/15) snapped a 23-game regular season losing streak on the road against the Packers.

SECOND-HALF TURNAROUND IN 2015

Following a 1-7 start, Caldwell led the Lions to a 7-9 record in 2015 on the shoulders of a 6-2 surge to finish off the year. Detroit became the fourth team since 1991 to start a season with 1 or fewer wins in the first 8 games (1-7 or 0-8 record) and finish with a 6-2 record. A 6-2 finish is the best record by any team since 1991 to start the season with a 1-7 or 0-8 record. It marks the Lions' best second-half finish since the team finished 7-1 in 1995.

FIRST SEASON IN DETROIT

By finishing the 2014 season with an 11-5 regular season record, Caldwell tied Patsy Clark (1931, Portsmouth Spartans) for the most wins in franchise history by a coach in his first year with the club.

- Caldwell is the third coach in team history to lead the Lions to the playoffs in his first year with Detroit (George Wilson in 1957; Bobby Ross in 1997).
- He is the seventh coach in franchise history (since 1930) to lead the Lions to a winning record (entire season) in his first year with the club.

COACHING OVERVIEW

- Hired as head coach for the Detroit Lions January 14, 2014.
- In 15 NFL seasons, Caldwell has worked on coaching staffs that have led teams to 12 winning seasons and only twice finished below .500. Overall, Caldwell's teams he coached for have compiled a 161-86 regular season record, along with 12 playoff appearances, eight division titles, three conference championships and two Super Bowl wins.
- In five years as an NFL head coach, Caldwell has led a team to 11+ wins twice (14 with Indianapolis in 2009). Coached in three Super Bowls with Indianapolis (XLI and XLIV) and Baltimore (XLVII) and won two Super Bowl titles (Indianapolis and Baltimore).
- In his first year as head coach for Indianapolis (2009), he won the AFC Championship and led the franchise to Super Bowl XLIV. He became the first NFL coach to win his first 14 games and the fifth rookie head coach to reach the Super Bowl.
- One of four head coaches to produce 24+ regular-season wins and a Super Bowl berth in their first two career seasons as head coach.
- In eight of the 10 seasons Caldwell coached in Indianapolis, the Colts ranked in the Top-10 in total offense eight times and six times in the Top-5.
- From 2003-09, Caldwell was the Colts quarterbacks coach and was also promoted to assistant head coach and associate head coach during that time. He worked closely with QB Peyton Manning and the team's quarterbacks. During that span, Indianapolis set NFL records with seven consecutive seasons finishing with 11+ wins (6, Dallas 1976-81) and 12+ victories (4, Dallas, 1992-95).
- Manning won four (2003, 2004, 2008, 2009) of his five NFL MVP awards under Caldwell's tutelage.
- Two of his quarterbacks, Manning (Super Bowl XLI) and Ravens QB Joe Flacco (Super Bowl XLVII) were named Super Bowl MVPs following their teams' respective championship runs.
- After being appointed Ravens offensive coordinator in December 2012, the team went on to win five of its next seven games, including Super Bowl XLVII. During that span, the offense averaged 400.6 yards per game, including an average of 410.3 yards per game during the four playoff wins.

QUINN MAKES HIS MARK

Bob Quinn, hired January 11, 2016 as executive vice president and general manager, oversees the entire Lions' football operations and reports directly to Owner and Chairman of the Board Martha Firestone Ford.

- Since joining the Lions, Quinn, who spent the previous 16 seasons with the New England Patriots, has begun building the football foundation which he believes will provide the team with the optimum chance for success. During his introductory press conference, he quickly set forth his vision.
- Among the numerous free agents acquired by Quinn this offseason was WR Marvin Jones, considered by many to be the top free agent wide receiver on the market. Additionally, Quinn also retained key Lions free agents, including DT Haloti Ngata and LB Tahir Whitehead.
- His initial draft class featured the selection of the most linemen (offense and defense) in a Lions draft since 1989, highlighted by the team's first three picks (T Taylor Decker, DT A'Shawn Robinson and C Graham Glasgow).

PATRIOTS PAST

During his time with New England, Quinn served a number of roles in the player personnel department, including most recently as Director of Pro Scouting from 2012-15. While he worked as Director of Pro Scouting, the Patriots won the 2014 Super Bowl and four-straight AFC East Division championships.

- From 2009-2012, Quinn was the Assistant Director of Pro Personnel. For the previous nine years, Quinn worked in several different capacities within the Patriots player personnel department, including roles in college scouting as a National Scout and Regional Scout. He played an integral role in evaluating and procuring talent for the team through the NFL draft process, free agency, trades, etc.
- While working for the New England Patriots, he helped contribute to one of the most impressive stretches in NFL history, one that produced **four Super Bowl titles, including the most recent championship in 2014 (Super Bowl XLIX). Since 2000, Quinn's first year with New England, the Patriots have won six AFC Championships, 13 AFC East titles, 12+ games in a season 10 times (which includes the past six years) and 10+ games in 14 of his 16 seasons.**
- As Director of Pro Scouting, Quinn utilized all possible methods to seek the Patriots' "next player." This approach had a tremendous impact on the Patriots' Super Bowl XLIX championship as seven players, who were acquired (including two via trades) after the start of the regular season, all played in the Super Bowl.
- Another key player during the Super Bowl XLIX Championship run, CB Malcolm Butler, signed with the club after a rookie minicamp tryout. Butler, who sealed the Super Bowl victory with a goal line interception, would join All-Pro CB Darrelle Revis in the New England secondary. Prior to serving as Director of Pro Scouting,

Quinn was the Patriots' assistant director of pro personnel. Prior to that, he worked in college scouting as the team's national scout in 2008 and as a regional scout from 2004-07.

- In 2008, the Patriots drafted LB Jerod Mayo in the first round and WR Matthew Slater in the fifth round. Mayo was a two-time Pro Bowl linebacker and Slater has become one of the league's elite special teams players having earned five Pro Bowl selections and three All-Pro honors. Quinn also served two seasons (2002-03) as a pro scout and two season (2000-01) as a player personnel assistant for the Patriots.

WHAT TO WATCH FOR

D-LIVERING AGAINST GREEN BAY

In a showdown between two NFC North rivals, the Lions come into Green Bay with the hopes of having the upper hand when it comes to who can stop the man playing under center. Limiting Packers QB **Aaron Rodgers** and his attack through the air will be on the forefront of the Lions defense's mind, as QB **Matthew Stafford** tries to connect with his receivers on the other side of the ball. In Detroit's last two meetings with Green Bay, the Lions defense held Rodgers to a 60.8% completion percentage. The Lions pass defense will look to establish its efficiency in the team's first NFC North game of the season.

Detroit's defense currently ranks 27th in opponent completion percentage (70.0) and passer rating (112.7) heading into Sunday's matchup. In an effort to shore up Detroit's pass defense, the Lions will try to capitalize on a Packers offense that is currently ranked 28th in the NFL in completion percentage (57.1) and 22nd in passer rating (82.6).

Last week against the Titans may serve as a sign of good things to come for Detroit's defense. Lions S **Glover Quin** recorded not only his 20th career interception last week against Tennessee, but also forced Detroit's first turnover of the year. The Lions ability to keep Green Bay's offense quiet may be contingent upon the ability of the defense to make big plays.

Lions S Glover Quin on if his interception vs. Tennessee is a good sign that the team can force turnovers: "We're trying to create turnovers all the time. They're hard to get. Sometimes you've got to pull the ball out and get the ball out some kind of way and when they give you opportunities in the pass game to do it, you've got to take advantage of them. They gave me a chance on that one and I just caught it. Hopefully Aaron Rodgers does it next and try to catch the next one. It's not like, OK, now we're on a roll. I mean, we had one turnover, so definitely have to get one."

Green Bay ran for its two lowest rushing totals of the 2015 season against Detroit. The Lions held the Packers to less than three yards per carry and one rushing touchdown in those two meetings, as the two teams split the regular season series 1-1.

- Lions Head Coach **Jim Caldwell** was on the Nittany Lions coaching staff while Packers Defensive Backs Coach **Darren Perry** played at Penn State from 1987-90. Caldwell served as the quarterbacks/wide receivers coach.
- Packers Head Coach **Mike McCarthy** and Lions Senior Coaching Advisor **Gunther Cunningham** were on the same coaching staff in Kansas City from 1995-98. McCarthy coached quarterbacks while Cunningham was the defensive coordinator. Packers Special Teams Coordinator **Ron Zook** joined the Chiefs staff in 1999 as the defensive backs coach.
- Packers Associate Head Coach **Tom Clements** also joined the Chiefs staff in 2000, replacing McCarthy as the quarterbacks coach. Clements also coached with Lions Defensive Assistant **Matt Raich** under Bill Cowher in Pittsburgh from 2002-03.
- Packers Defensive Coordinator **Dom Capers** and Lions Special Teams Coordinator **Joe Marciano** worked together in New Orleans from 1986-91. Marciano was the special teams/tight ends coach while Capers was the Defensive Backs Coach.
- Marciano and Lions Defensive Backs Coach **Tony Oden** both coached under Capers from 2004-05 in Houston when Capers was the head coach of the Texans. Marciano was the special teams coordinator and Oden was a defensive assistant.

HOMETOWN ROOTS

- Lions LB **DeAndre Levy** grew up in Milwaukee, Wisc. and played his college ball at the University of Wisconsin.
- Packers LB **Nick Perry** is a native of Detroit, Mich., and won a high school state championship as a Detroit Martin Luther King High School Crusader in 2007.
- Packers G **T.J. Lang** grew up in Birmingham, Mich., and attended Brother Rice High School.
- Packers LB **Jake Ryan** played his college football for the Maize and Blue at the University of Michigan.
- Packers WR **Jeff Janis** hails from Tawas City, Mich., and played college football at Saginaw Valley State.

WHAT TO WATCH FOR

Lions Head Coach Jim Caldwell on the importance of winning at Green Bay: "Last year is last year. This game is important because it's the next game. It's the most important game of the year for us. Regardless of who we're playing, this game coming up is the one that gets our whole focus, the one that gets our concentration, who we prepare for. We're playing in a very, very tough place to play against an outstanding football team and we've got to get ready to go."

RECEIVING REPORT

This offseason, the Lions made a point of bolstering the offense through free agency by adding two receiving threats to round out a deadly trio alongside WR **Golden Tate**. WR **Marvin Jones Jr.** officially became a Lion in March, and WR **Anquan Boldin** signed before training camp in July. Both Jones and Boldin have demonstrated the capacity to be playmakers for Detroit, combining for 19 receptions, 286 yards and one touchdown through Week 2 of the 2016 season.

An undeniable component needed for a quarterback and receiver to be successful in the National Football League is chemistry. Jones and QB **Matthew Stafford** have demonstrated a natural rhythm when it comes to operating as a unit, as the two have connected for a combined 12 receptions over the first two weeks of the season. Since his debut as a Lion, Jones has tied his career-record for longest reception with a 47-yard catch in Week 2, and notched his second career game with 100+ receiving yards with a 118-yard performance against the Titans. He currently ranks seventh in the NFL in receiving yards with 203.

Jones Jr. on his chemistry with QB Matthew Stafford: "It's good, you know, us as wide receivers we've had a lot of repetition with the quarterbacks, so it's been good. You know, obviously it's still a process and there's still a lot more in there, a long way to go, but it's going in the right direction. Between the receivers and quarterbacks, that's what we do. We go out there and we see everything through the same eyes, in the film room and stuff like that, and you know it translates."

While this season may be Boldin's first in Honolulu blue, 2016 marks the veteran's 14th year in the NFL. As a starting offensive weapon for the Lions, Boldin has so far racked up seven receptions for 83 yards and one touchdown, displaying his sure-handed catching skills and ability to make plays.



Head Coach Jim Caldwell on Boldin's work ethic at practice: "He learns quickly. He's constantly working at it, standing back even when he's not in the huddle, listening to the call, imagining in his mind and visualizing where he would line up. Also kind of going through the steps in which he would take to run the route. He's a real student of the game."

With a proven track record of success across both the NFC and AFC, Boldin marked his place in the history books in Week 2 against Tennessee when he caught a 24-yard touchdown pass from QB **Matthew Stafford**. With this reception Boldin became the 33rd player in NFL history with 75 receiving touchdowns, and only the second player in NFL history (Terrell Owens) to have at least 1,000 career receptions (1,016) and record a touchdown with four different teams (Arizona-44, San Francisco-16, Baltimore-14, Detroit-1).

Boldin on what he has learned about the offense so far: "I know we have a chance to be very explosive this year. We have a lot of weapons outside, as well as in the backfield. Matt (Stafford) does a great job of getting us in and out of the right plays, so I'm looking forward to it."

Through 188 career games Boldin has logged 1,016 receptions for 13,278 yards. He currently stands in 12th place for all-time receptions in NFL history and 16th in receiving yards.

DEFENSIVE LINE DEPTH

Week 2 featured a low-scoring affair between the Detroit Lions and the Tennessee Titans as Tennessee led a late-fourth quarter rally to edge out a one point victory. Lost in the unfavorable outcome was Detroit's exceptional

defensive line play, which anchored a Lions defense that allowed just 16 points over 48 minutes of work. Among the standouts were DE's **Devin Taylor** and **Kerry Hyder**.

With seven total tackles, 1.5 sacks, and two hits on the quarterback, Taylor secured a depleted defense that saw Pro Bowl DE **Ezekiel Ansah** leave due to injury on the game's first possession. The Beaufort, S.C. native opened the scoring in the first quarter when he tackled Titans RB DeMarco Murray in the end zone for a safety, one of his two tackles for loss on the day. He attributed a 'next man up' mentality to the defense's success after playing through numerous injuries.

Taylor on playing through injuries: "I mean for us, you know, we kind of practice as if maybe someone's not going to be in the game. The amount of running and stuff we do at practice allows us to keep us energized, just in case someone were to go down, if someone has to step up, be able to play the entire game if need be."

One of those players who stepped up was Hyder, a first-year pro out of Texas Tech. Hyder, who has burst onto the scene in 2016 after spending two seasons on two different practice squads, tallied another sack in the loss, bringing his season-total to three. Through the first two weeks of the season, his 3.0 sacks are tied for first in the NFC and tied for second in the NFL, trailing only reigning Super Bowl 50 MVP Von Miller (4.0). The undrafted defensive end took over for Ansah early in the first quarter and lined up for 73 percent of the snaps defensively, proving once again that he belongs on the game's biggest stage.

Caldwell on how the defensive line performed after DE Ezekiel Ansah left the game with an injury: "Kerry Hyder does what he usually does. He fights and scratches and digs and made some plays for us. Devin (Taylor) also played well, played tough, showed up. That's the way it's supposed to be. The guys fought and they hung in there, just didn't make enough plays overall. It didn't necessarily have to be them, but I'm just talking about overall as a team we just didn't make enough plays."

Through two games, Detroit's defensive line has accumulated five sacks for a combined 31 yards, six tackles for loss and 10 hits on the quarterback. The team's five sacks through Weeks 1 and 2 are tied for eighth in the NFL.

LIONS BY THE NUMBERS

1

Rookie RB **Dwayne Washington** scored on a 1-yard rushing touchdown in the second quarter in the Lions' 39-35 win at Indianapolis (9/11). Washington, a seventh-round draft selection, became the first Lions player who was acquired in the fourth round or later in the draft to score a rushing touchdown as a rookie in the season opening game since undrafted RB Lindy Pearson scored a 2-yard touchdown at Green Bay September 17, 1950.

With 1.5 sacks and a safety in Week 2 vs. Tennessee (9/18), DE **Devin Taylor** collected the second-most sacks in a game by a Lions defensive player who also recorded a safety in a game. He had the most since DE Tracy Scroggins has 3 sacks and a safety vs. Indianapolis November 23, 1997

3

First-year DE **Kerry Hyder** registered 2.0 sacks in the Lions' 39-35 win at Indianapolis and another in Week 2 at Tennessee. Hyder became the 11th Lions defensive player to notch 2+ sacks in the season opener since sacks became official in 1982 and first to do so since DE Kalimba Edwards at Oakland September 9, 2007. Through Week 2, he is tied for second in the NFL with 3.0 sacks.

4

The Lions' running backs accounted for four of the team's five touchdowns in the team's 39-35 win at Indianapolis. Touchdowns were scored by RB **Theo Riddick** (2, 1 RecTD, 1 RuTD), RB **Ameer Abdullah** (1, 1 RecTD) and rookie RB **Dwayne Washington** (1, 1 RuTD). This was the first game in which Lions running backs scored four offensive touchdowns since Detroit's backs registered four at Jacksonville on November 4, 2012.

By kicking the game-winning field goal with :04 left at Indianapolis, K **Matt Prater** now has nine career game-winning kicks with less than 2:00 to play in the fourth quarter or in overtime, including four since joining the Lions in 2014.

S **Glover Quin** registered his first interception of the season in Week 2 vs. Tennessee (9/18). He currently leads the NFL in interceptions since joining the Lions in 2013 with 15 picks.

21

With the last-minute rally at Indianapolis, QB **Matthew Stafford** tallied his 21st career game-winning drive in the fourth quarter or overtime. Among those game-winning drives now includes 13 that have occurred with less than 2:00 to play in the fourth quarter or in overtime. Under Caldwell, Stafford leads the NFL with nine game-winning drives since 2014.

39

The Lions scored 39 points in their season-opening win at Indianapolis (9/11/16). The team tallied the most points in a season opener since scoring 42 points against Arizona September 7, 2003. On the road, the 39-point tally equaled the third-highest total in a season opener and the most since scoring 41 against the Los Angeles Rams September 7, 1980.

55.5

In the Lions' 39-35 win at Indianapolis, P **Sam Martin** tied the second-highest single-game net punting average (55.5) in NFL history since net punting became an official statistic in 1976 (minimum qualifier: 4 punts). Martin's 55.5 net punting average also set a new team single-game record.

75

WR **Anquan Boldin** caught a 24-yard touchdown pass from QB **Matthew Stafford** in the first quarter against Tennessee. It was the 75th receiving touchdown of his career and first since joining the Lions. He has now caught touchdown passes with four different teams, including Arizona (44), Baltimore (14), San Francisco (16) and Detroit (1).

100

RB **Ameer Abdullah** collected 120 yards from scrimmage (63 rush, 57 receiving) and RB **Theo Riddick** garnered 108 total yards (45 rush, 63 receiving) against Indianapolis. By both running backs surpassing 100 total yards, it marked the first time since November 28, 2013 (vs. GB: Reggie Bush, 182; Joique Bell, 128) that the Lions had two running backs total over 100 yards from scrimmage in a game.

With a passer rating 128.6 at Indianapolis, QB **Matthew Stafford** became the first Lions quarterback since at least 1950 to register a passer rating of 115.0+ in four consecutive games. He started where he left off in the 2015 season as he finished with three-straight games featuring a passer rating over 115.0 (148.6 at NO, 118.6 vs. SF and 119.4 at Chi).

182

By playing in Week 2 vs. Tennessee (9/18), LS **Don Muhlbach** played in his 182nd career game and passed LB Corey Schlesinger (181) for seventh place on the Lions' all-time list for career games played.

448

Detroit racked up 448 yards of total offense in the Lions' season-opening win at Indianapolis. The team's 448 total offensive yards were the fourth-most by the club to open the season since at least 1950. The offensive output also ranks as the second-highest total on the road since at least 1950, behind the Lions' 494 yards gained at Los Angeles September 7, 1980.

489

QB **Matthew Stafford** needs just 489 yards to surpass Dan Marino (27,064) for the most passing yards by a player in his first 100 games. Stafford, currently at 95 games, has thrown for 26,576 passing yards.

With 3 receptions for 35 yards at Indianapolis in Week 1, WR **Anquan Boldin** surpassed WR Andre Reed (13,198) for 16th place on the NFL's all-time receiving yards list. His current total stands at 13,278 following a four-catch, 48-yard performance vs. Tennessee.

By finishing the 2015 season with a 71.8 completion percentage in Week 17 against Chicago (1/3/16), **Stafford became the first quarterback in NFL history to record at least a 60.0 completion percentage in all 16 games.**

SEASON YARDS

With 298 passing yards at Chicago in the 2015 season finale (1/3/16), Stafford become the second quarterback in NFL history to record 4,000-yards five times in his first seven seasons. He finished with 4,262 yards on the season and became the fifth quarterback (six times) in NFL history to reach 4,000 yards in five consecutive seasons.

- His 4,262 yards in 2015 rank fifth in team history. Stafford now claims five of the Top-8 highest single-season totals in franchise history.

SEASON TOUCHDOWNS

- Stafford's 32 touchdowns in 2015 tied QB Scott Mitchell (1995) for the second-most in Lions single-season history. With 41 touchdowns in 2011, 29 in 2013, 22 in 2014 and 20 in 2012, Stafford now holds five of the top nine marks for single-season passing touchdowns in Lions history. Stafford is the first player in Lions history to reach 30+ touchdowns in two different seasons.
- Conversely, Stafford had one of his best seasons when it comes to securing the football, as his +19 TD-INT margin (32 TD, 13 INT) ranks third in Lions history.

➤ Stafford led the Lions to an 18-16 win over the Green Bay Packers at Lambeau Field in Week 11 (11/15/15) in his 88th career start, including playoffs. By starting in his 88th career game, Stafford surpassed Hall of Fame QB Bobby Layne for the most overall starts (including playoffs) in team history. During his career, Layne started 87 career games (83 regular season and four postseason).

- Boldin led the 49ers last year with 69 receptions and 789 yards. He currently ranks 12th in receptions (1,016) and 16th in receiving yards (13,278) on the NFL's all-time lists.
- Only 13 players in NFL history have recorded 1,000 or more receptions in their careers. With 1,012, Boldin trails only Cowboys TE Jason Witten (1,032) and Cardinals WR Larry Fitzgerald (1,032) for the most among active players.
- In 2015, Boldin was also named the NFL's Walter Payton Man of the Year.

DESTRUCTIVE D-LINE

Over the past six seasons, few defensive line units have disrupted opponents in both the passing and running games as the Detroit Lions. The Lions, under the direction of Defensive Line Coach **Kris Kocurek** since 2010, feature an attack upfront that first concentrates on stopping the run and then applies heavy pressure on the quarterback.

In 2015, the Lions defensive line generated 82.0 total tackles for loss or no gain (3rd in NFL), which includes 34.5 sacks (2nd in NFL), 44.0 tackles for loss or no gain against the rush (8th in NFL) and 8 forced fumbles (tied for 2nd in NFL).

➤ The Lions' defensive line displays great depth across the board, led by first-year DE **Kerry Hyder**. Hyder earned a roster spot this offseason and has emerged on the scene as one of the NFL's upstart pass rushers so far, as he is currently tied for second in the NFL in sacks through Week 2 with 3.0.

Quin, with an interception in the Lions' 20-14 win at Chicago last season (12/21/14), recorded his seventh pick of the season to become the first Lions defensive player to record seven interceptions in a season since S Kurt Schulz (7) in 2000.

- Quin became the first Lions player to lead the NFL in interceptions since Hall of Fame CB Lem Barney in 1967 when he registered 10 during his exceptional rookie campaign.

After the Lions traded up to draft him in the fifth round (165 overall) of the 2013 NFL Draft, P **Sam Martin** has continued his success as one of the best young punters in the League. Entering only his fourth NFL season, Martin is already the Lions franchise leader in career punting average and net punting average.

- In the Lions' 39-35 win at Indianapolis, Martin tied the second-highest single-game net punting average (55.5) in NFL history since net punting became an official statistic in 1976 (minimum qualifier: 4 punts). Martin's 55.5 net punting average also set a new team single-game record.
- Martin's gross punting average of 58.8 (4-235) against the Colts was the highest by a Lions punter since at least 1960, surpassing the previous best of 57.3 by Hall Famer Yale Lary against San Francisco October 6, 1963.

➤ The Lions claimed a 40-10 win against the Packers in the team's 74th Thanksgiving Day game on November 28, 2013. The team's 30-point victory margin against the Packers is the largest since a 34-0 win (34-point margin) vs. Green Bay October 28, 1973. The 126 total offensive yards allowed by the Lions is the lowest yielded by the team since allowing just 95 yards at Cincinnati November 22, 1992.

➤ In the teams' first meeting of 2014 (9/21), the Lions knocked off the Packers 19-7 as the team's defense recorded a safety and fumble return for a touchdown, outscoring the Packers offense 9-7. LB DeAndre Levy and S Don Carey picked up the safety and defensive touchdown, respectively, while RB Reggie Bush's 26-yard touchdown run in the fourth quarter sealed the win.

➤ In the teams' first meeting of 2015 (11/15), the Lions defeated the Packers at Lambeau Field for the first time since 1991. The team's win at Green Bay snapped a 23-game regular season losing streak on the road against the Packers.

➤ In the teams final meeting of 2015 (12/3), the Packers defeated the Lions in primetime at Ford Field on a game-winning 'Hail Mary' pass from QB Aaron Rodgers to TE Richard Rodgers.

The Detroit Lions' start to the 2016 regular season highlighted the duel between two marquee quarterbacks in Lions QB Matthew Stafford and Colts QB Andrew Luck. With the help of a balanced offense through the air and a consistent rushing attack on the ground, the Lions jumped out to a 21-3 lead. After a 21-yard touchdown run by RB Theo Riddick to put Detroit up 7-0, rookie RB Dwayne Washington scored his first career touchdown to extend the lead 14-0. Seven of Stafford's 14 first half completions all went to different receivers including a six-yard touchdown strike to TE Eric Ebron that put Detroit up 21-3. Luck and the Colts responded with a 75-yard drive ending in a touchdown reception by Colts WR Donte Moncrief to set the score at 21-10 right before halftime. After a Lions drive stalled, Luck and the Colts put together an 85-yard drive ending in a 19-yard touchdown pass to TE Dwayne Allen. Following a successful two-point conversion pass to Allen, Indianapolis trailed 21-18 halfway through the third quarter. Detroit responded with a 71-yard drive ending with an 11-yard touchdown pass to RB Ameer Abdullah to go up 28-18. Following an Adam Vinatieri 40-yard field goal, Luck and the Colts added a 94-yard drive ending with a 16-yard touchdown strike to TE Jack Doyle to tie the game at 28-28. With completions to five different receivers, Stafford connected with Riddick for a 13-yard score. A missed extra point by K Matt Prater put the Lions lead at 34-28 with 4:11 left to play. The Colts put together an eight play drive for 75 yards as Doyle hauled in his second touchdown reception from six yards out to go up 35-34 on Detroit with 37 seconds left in regulation. With three timeouts, Stafford and the Lions completed three passes for a total of 50 yards before Prater lined up for a 43-yard field goal to put Detroit ahead 37-35 with four seconds left to play. After a series of laterals on the ensuing kickoff, Detroit was awarded a safety, ending regulation and giving the Lions a 39-35 victory.

The Lions hosted the Tennessee Titans in their home opener at Ford Field in Week 2 of the 2016 regular season (9/18). After a Sam Martin 48-yard punt and a holding penalty on the Titans, Tennessee started a drive from their own 10-yard line early in the first quarter. Lions DE Devin Taylor stuffed Titans RB DeMarco Murray in the end zone for a Detroit safety. The Lions immediately added an eight play scoring drive for 79 yards that was capped by a 24-yard Matthew Stafford touchdown strike to Anquan Boldin, putting the Lions up 9-0 in the first quarter. After a series of short completions by Titans QB Marcus Mariota, Tennessee put the score at 9-3 with a 46-yard field goal by Titans K Ryan Succop. Following a series of stops by both defenses, Detroit put together a 13-play, 75-yard drive that ended in a 42-yard field goal by K Matt Prater, giving the Lions a 12-3 lead going into halftime. Detroit constructed a 14-play drive midway through the third quarter that ended in a 27-yard field goal by Prater, giving the Lions a 15-3 lead heading into the fourth quarter. After a 20-yard completion, Mariota quickly connected with TE Delanie Walker for a 30-yard touchdown strike to bring the score to 15-10 with more than 14 minutes left to play. After forcing Detroit to punt on multiple drives, the Titans took the ball back with 7:04 to play. Mariota connected on all nine of his last pass attempts, including a nine yard touchdown pass to Titans WR Andre Johnson. The Titans took a 16-15 lead with 1:13 to play after a sack by Detroit on their failed two-point conversion attempt. Titans CB Perrish Cox intercepted a pass by Stafford at midfield on the Lions last drive of the game to give Tennessee a 16-15 victory.
