SERIES INFORMATION

Detroit (1-3) enters a Week 5 matchup with the Philadelphia Eagles (3-0) that begins a three-game home stand for the Lions. Sunday's game marks the 33rd all-time meeting between the two franchises, with the Eagles holding the edge in the series, 16-14-2. Detroit has won two of the last three clashes with Philadelphia, including last season's 45-14 win on Thanksgiving Day (11/26/15).

SECOND-HALF TURNAROUND IN 2015

Following a 1-7 start, Caldwell led the Lions to a 7-9 record in 2015 on the shoulders of a 6-2 surge to finish off the year. Detroit became the fourth team since 1991 to start a season with 1 or fewer wins in the first 8 games (1-7 or 0-8 record) and finish with a 6-2 record. A 6-2 finish is the best record by any team since 1991 to start the season with a 1-7 or 0-8 record. It marks the Lions' best second-half finish since the team finished 7-1 in 1995.

FIRST SEASON IN DETROIT

By finishing the 2014 season with an 11-5 regular season record, Caldwell tied Patsy Clark (1931, Portsmouth Spartans) for the most wins in franchise history by a coach in his first year with the club.

- Caldwell is the third coach in team history to lead the Lions to the playoffs in his first year with Detroit (George Wilson in 1957; Bobby Ross in 1997).
- He is the seventh coach in franchise history (since 1930) to lead the Lions to a winning record (entire season) in his first year with the club.

COACHING OVERVIEW

- Hired as head coach for the Detroit Lions January 14, 2014.
- In 15 NFL seasons, Caldwell has worked on coaching staffs that have led teams to 12 winning seasons and only twice finished below .500. Overall, Caldwell's teams he coached for have compiled a 161-88 regular season record, along with 12 playoff appearances, eight division titles, three conference championships and two Super Bowl wins.
- In five years as an NFL head coach, Caldwell has led a team to 11+ wins twice (14 with Indianapolis in 2009). Coached in three Super Bowls with Indianapolis (XLI and XLIV) and Baltimore (XLVII) and won two Super Bowl titles (Indianapolis and Baltimore).
- In his first year as head coach for Indianapolis (2009), he won the AFC Championship and led the franchise to Super Bowl XLIV. He became the first NFL coach to win his first 14 games and the fifth rookie head coach to reach the Super Bowl.
- One of four head coaches to produce 24+ regular-season wins and a Super Bowl berth in their first two career seasons as head coach.
- In eight of the 10 seasons Caldwell coached in Indianapolis, the Colts ranked in the Top-10 in total offense eight times and six times in the Top-5.
- From 2003-09, Caldwell was the Colts quarterbacks coach and was also promoted to assistant head coach and associate head coach during that time. He worked closely with QB Peyton Manning and the team's quarterbacks. During that span, Indianapolis set NFL records with seven consecutive seasons finishing with 11+ wins (6, Dallas 1976-81) and 12+ victories (4, Dallas, 1992-95).
- Manning won four (2003, 2004, 2008, 2009) of his five NFL MVP awards under Caldwell's tutelage.
- Two of his quarterbacks, Manning (Super Bowl XLI) and Ravens QB Joe Flacco (Super Bowl XLVII) were named Super Bowl MVPs following their teams' respective championship runs.
- After being appointed Ravens offensive coordinator in December 2012, the team went on to win five of its next seven games, including Super Bowl XLVII. During that span, the offense averaged 400.6 yards per game, including an average of 410.3 yards per game during the four playoff wins.

QUINN MAKES HIS MARK

Bob Quinn, hired January 11, 2016 as executive vice president and general manager, oversees the entire Lions' football operations and reports directly to Owner and Chairman of the Board Martha Firestone Ford.

- Since joining the Lions, Quinn, who spent the previous 16 seasons with the New England Patriots, has begun building the football foundation which he believes will provide the team with the optimum chance for success. During his introductory press conference, he quickly set forth his vision.
- Among the numerous free agents acquired by Quinn this offseason was WR Marvin Jones, considered by many to be the top free agent wide receiver on the market. Additionally, Quinn also retained key Lions free agents, including DT Haloti Ngata and LB Tahir Whitehead.
- His initial draft class featured the selection of the most linemen (offense and defense) in a Lions draft since 1989, highlighted by the team's first three picks (T Taylor Decker, DT A'Shawn Robinson and C Graham Glasgow).

PATRIOTS PAST

During his time with New England, Quinn served a number of roles in the player personnel department, including most recently as Director of Pro Scouting from 2012-15. While he worked as Director of Pro Scouting, the Patriots won the 2014 Super Bowl and four-straight AFC East Division championships.

- From 2009-2012, Quinn was the Assistant Director of Pro Personnel. For the previous nine years, Quinn worked in several different capacities within the Patriots player personnel department, including roles in college scouting as a National Scout and Regional Scout. He played an integral role in evaluating and procuring talent for the team through the NFL draft process, free agency, trades, etc.
- While working for the New England Patriots, he helped contribute to one of the most impressive stretches in NFL history, one that produced **four Super Bowl titles, including the most recent championship in 2014 (Super Bowl XLIX). Since 2000, Quinn's first year with New England, the Patriots have won six AFC Championships, 13 AFC East titles, 12+ games in a season 10 times (which includes the past six years) and 10+ games in 14 of his 16 seasons.**
- As Director of Pro Scouting, Quinn utilized all possible methods to seek the Patriots' "next player." This approach had a tremendous impact on the Patriots' Super Bowl XLIX championship as seven players, who were acquired (including two via trades) after the start of the regular season, all played in the Super Bowl.
- Another key player during the Super Bowl XLIX Championship run, CB Malcolm Butler, signed with the club after a rookie minicamp tryout. Butler, who sealed the Super Bowl victory with a goal line interception, would join All-Pro CB Darrelle Revis in the New England secondary. Prior to serving as Director of Pro Scouting,

Quinn was the Patriots' assistant director of pro personnel. Prior to that, he worked in college scouting as the team's national scout in 2008 and as a regional scout from 2004-07.

- In 2008, the Patriots drafted LB Jerod Mayo in the first round and WR Matthew Slater in the fifth round. Mayo was a two-time Pro Bowl linebacker and Slater has become one of the league's elite special teams players having earned five Pro Bowl selections and three All-Pro honors. Quinn also served two seasons (2002-03) as a pro scout and two season (2000-01) as a player personnel assistant for the Patriots.

WHAT TO WATCH FOR

BRING IT HOME

Week 5 begins a three-game home stand for Detroit, kicking off with a visit from the Philadelphia Eagles. Following a Week 4 loss at Chicago, Head Coach **Jim Caldwell** said a focus for the Lions on both sides of the ball will be limiting penalties over the course of a game, as well as taking accountability for repeated offenses.

Caldwell on decreasing the amount of penalties: "You know, you look at the reasons why they happen and sometimes it's a technical issue, sometimes it's over-aggressiveness in some cases. We talk about those, we get them straightened out. You know, did we do the normal things we normally do? Make certain we have officials at practice that point those things out, that throw flags and we go about it the normal way of attacking it, looking at it and see if we can get it straightened away."

Caldwell on the challenge as a coach of getting the team mentally prepared following a loss: "It's one that you certainly have to be mindful of, in terms of your approach and how you address it. But, you don't have to do it alone, that's why you have assistant coaches and strong leaders, as well, in the locker room. We're fortunate to have a really good group of guys that have been through a lot of different scenarios, and they can get themselves focused."

Since the installation of a new offense as well as the addition of a number of new players on defense to the roster, the 2016 Lions have been stressing the importance of effective communication. The Lions look to keep building and improving on-field communication each week, and three straight games at Ford Field will offer an opportunity for Detroit to do so in the comfort of one's own home.

Defensive Coordinator Teryl Austin on the focus on improving communication: "It is, it's always a focus. The thing we just try to stress to our guys, is the simple fact that a lot of plays are given up before the ball is ever snapped. If you don't have it communicated right, you don't know what you're doing, or you think it's something else, then a lot of times that's when guys, what we like to say 'Pop out of the ground.' We've got to do a better job of that."

A SPECIAL UNIT

Prior to last week's matchup against the Bears, the Lions were waiting patiently for a big play to emerge from their return game. The Lions had yet to see a spark on special teams, but Head Coach **Jim Caldwell** remained hopeful that impact plays were on the horizon with a bit of a self-fulfilling prophecy.

- Eagles Offensive Coordinator **Frank Reich** served as the Lions backup quarterback to Scott Mitchell and Charlie Batch from 1997-1998.
- Eagles Vice President of Player Personnel **Joe Douglas** was the National Scout for the Baltimore Ravens in 2012-2013 while Lions Head Coach **Jim Caldwell** and Defensive Coordinator **Teryl Austin** coached up the Ravens offense and secondary, respectively.

EAGLES WITH MICHIGAN ROOTS

- Eagles DE **Connor Barwin** is a native of Detroit, Mich.
- Eagles DE **Brandon Graham** is also a Detroit native and played his college ball at the University of Michigan from 2006-2009 where he ranks 2nd in school history in sacks, tackles for loss and forced fumbles.
- Before transferring to Wisconsin, Eagles S **Chris Maragos** played on the offensive side of the ball as a wide receiver for the Western Michigan Broncos in 2006.

Caldwell on the team not having a big kick return play prior to Week 4: "I think that's important because often times I think that people will look at three games in the season, and think that the season's over with. But, there's still a lot of time, there's a lot of time to improve and I think you'll see us continue to improve in that area. We try not to look and talk about what we miss, we talk about what we have. Do we have individuals that are capable of giving us big plays? You better believe it. They've got to show up. Do we have individuals that are capable of giving us long runs on our return game? You better believe it, we do, plus our punt return and our kickoff return. But, it has to show up, but it's not just them. It's the guys that are blocking for them that give them the alleys to run and things of that nature. We have that capability, we haven't gotten it yet, but I think you'll see it forthcoming."

With Lions P **Sam Martin** ranking first in the NFL in net punting average, (47.0) Detroit's special teams unit continues to develop as one of the strongest in the League through four weeks of the season. WR **Andre Roberts** contributed to the productivity with a career-game last week. Roberts returned his first career punt return for a touchdown with an 85-yard return late in the game against the Bears. A Lions team that averages nearly 20 yards per punt return looks to continue an upward trend of favorable returns.

The Lions have also been among the League's best in covering punts, giving up a stingy five yards per punt return to opponents. They match up with an Eagles team that has already given up a 65-yard punt return for a touchdown and an average of 34 yards per return. This week's contest against Philadelphia may be an opportunity for Roberts to strike gold again on special teams.

Caldwell on WR Andre Roberts' punt return at Chicago: "Yeah, I think he did decently. I told you, you'll see the guy has ability, if we get some guys blocked he can make some things happen. He did a nice job on that punt return, found some space, they blocked for him well. Obviously he was able to turn on the jets there at the end and get that thing in the end zone. It's not easy to return a punt in the National Football League for a touchdown."

Roberts on his confidence the team can continue to make big plays in the return game: "I'm very confident in our ability as a return team on doing something special every play, no matter who we have back there returning kicks or punts. It definitely helps to know that we're able to do it and that we've done it now. We just have to keep trying to do it every week."



HYDER'S HOT START

First-year DE **Kerry Hyder** continued his improbable start to the season by sacking Bears QB Brian Hoyer in the second quarter of Week 4 at Chicago, marking his fifth sack of the year. His 5.0 sacks through the first four games rank first in the NFC and second in the NFL, trailing only reigning Super Bowl 50 MVP Von Miller (5.5). With his Week 4 sack at Chicago, Hyder became just the third Lions player in franchise history to record 5+ sacks through the first four weeks of the season (DE William Gay, 8.5 in 1983; DE Robert Porcher, 5.0 in 2001). The Austin, Texas native also joined Gay (1983) as the only players to record or share a sack in each of the first four games of the season.

Hyder spent nearly all of the 2014 and 2015 seasons on the New York Jets and Detroit Lions practice squads, respectively. Prior to coming into the league as an undrafted free agent, Hyder spent four years at Texas Tech University where he tallied 176 total tackles and 11 sacks. In Hyder's senior campaign, he started all 13 games for the Red Raiders while only sacking the quarterback twice. Through the first four weeks of his first year as a contributor in the National Football League, Hyder has more than doubled that number. He attributes his blue-collar attitude to his early success in the NFL.

Hyder on being an undrafted player who's had to earn everything: "It feels great to see the work I put in and finally seeing it on the field. I've got a lot to work to do, I've got a long hill to climb, so I'm still grinding."

Since 1982, there have only been nine Lions players to finish with 10+ sacks in a season, with the most recent being DE **Ezekiel Ansah** (14.5) in 2014. Hyder is on pace to record at least one sack in every game this season (16), which would give him the most single-season sacks in franchise history, surpassing Robert Porcher's 15.0 in 1999. Look for Hyder to continue his hot start as Detroit plays host to Philadelphia in a Week 5 matchup against the NFC East-leading Eagles.

Defensive Coordinator Teryl Austin on if he's at a point where DE Kerry Hyder's level of play doesn't surprise him: "The funny thing is when we had him on the practice squad last year, during the season when he would play inside or outside, he was always a handful for our guys in terms of the rush. He's a guy that has natural rush ability, he's very good with his hands, he's got good bend, he can slip. He does a lot of things that a good rusher does, he just doesn't have all the measurables and all the other stuff. When he started having an opportunity to play, and the success is coming the way it did, it doesn't surprise me. They say, 'If he bites as a puppy, he's going to bite when he's a grown dog.' He's doing that."

Caldwell on Hyder's play: "I'll tell you, the guy is interesting because of the fact that he just finds a way. He has just an unbelievable motor, but also he's really slippery. He doesn't necessarily overpower you, but he can. He doesn't necessarily run around you, but he can, but he just doesn't stop. And I think I've mentioned it, we've seen that from him. We saw it when he was actually on the practice squad. He was always in the backfield one way or another and he proved he can do it out here with the big guys, too. We're proud of him, proud of the way he plays. He's a tough, hard-nosed guy."

Picking up where he left off last season, RB **Theo Riddick** currently leads the NFL in receptions by running backs with 20, while his 157 receiving yards rank sixth.

With the last-minute rally at Indianapolis, QB **Matthew Stafford** tallied his 21st career game-winning drive in the fourth quarter or overtime. Among those game-winning drives now includes 13 that have occurred with less than 2:00 to play in the fourth quarter or in overtime. Under Caldwell, Stafford leads the NFL with nine game-winning drives since 2014.

With a 50-yard field goal second quarter field goal at Chicago in Week 4 (10/2), K **Matt Prater** connected on his 31st career 50+ yard field goal. Prater became the third kicker in Lions history to make at least 10 50-yard field goals with the Lions (Jason Hanson, 52; Eddie Murray, 16).

WR **Anquan Boldin** caught a 24-yard touchdown pass from QB **Matthew Stafford** in the first quarter against Tennessee. He has now caught touchdown passes with four different teams, including Arizona (44), Baltimore (14), San Francisco (16) and Detroit (2), and his current career total stands at 76.

By playing in Week 4 at Chicago (10/2), LS **Don Muhlbach** played in his 184th career game. He trails Hall of Fame CB Dick LeBeau (185) for sixth place on the Lions' all-time list for career games played.

Since joining the Lions in 2014, WR **Golden Tate** ranks seventh in the NFL in receptions over the past three seasons with 203.

With 6 receptions for 205 yards and two touchdowns at Green Bay, WR **Marvin Jones Jr.** became the fifth player in Lions history to surpass 200 receiving yards in a game, joining Calvin Johnson (5), Cloyce Box (2), Richard Johnson (1) and Roy Williams (1) in that elite group. Jones recorded the 10th 200-yard receiving game in team history and his 205 yards were the eighth-most by a Lions receiver in a single game.

With 74 receiving yards at Chicago, WR **Marvin Jones Jr.** has now registered the most receiving yards by any player in Lions history through the first four games of a season. Jones now has 482 yards through four games and passed the total compiled by WR Calvin Johnson (423 yards) in the first quarter of the 2012 season. Throughout his career, Stafford has proven the ability to bring the team from behind to claim victory and perform great in the closing minutes of the game.

➤ Thus far, Stafford has led the Lions to 21 victories when trailing or tied in the fourth quarter or overtime, including Week 1 at Indianapolis (9/11). He has six career game-winning touchdown passes with less than one minute to play in fourth quarter (franchise record) and six after the two-minute warning.

➤ Stafford's nine game-winning drives since the beginning of 2014 also leads all NFL quarterbacks.

SEASON TOUCHDOWNS

Stafford's 32 touchdowns in 2015 tied QB Scott Mitchell (1995) for the second-most in Lions single-season history. With 41 touchdowns in 2011, 29 in 2013, 22 in 2014 and 20 in 2012, Stafford now holds five of the top nine marks for single-season passing touchdowns in Lions history. By starting in his 88th career game, Stafford surpassed Hall of Fame QB Bobby Layne for the most overall starts (including playoffs) in team history. ON THE RECEIVING END

The Lions offense features one of the deepest veteran receiving corps in the NFL with the likes of WRs **Marvin Jones Jr.**, **Golden Tate** and **Anquan Boldin**, combining for 26 total years of pass-catching experience.

MARV-ELOUS MR. JONES

Jones Jr. joins the Lions following a four-year career (2012-15) with the Cincinnati Bengals, where he was a key piece of the Bengals' high-powered offense. He recorded a career high 10 touchdowns in 2013, and so far leads the Lions with 482 receiving yards.

- With 6 receptions for 205 yards and two touchdowns at Green Bay (9/25), Jones Jr. became the fifth player in Lions history to surpass 200 receiving yards in a game, joining Calvin Johnson (5), Cloyce Box (2), Richard Johnson (1) and Roy Williams (1) in that elite group.
- Jones recorded the 10th 200-yard receiving game in team history and his 205 yards were the eighth-most by a Lions receiver in a single game.
- Through Week 4, Jones Jr. ranks second in the NFL in receiving yards with 482 and first in 25+-yard receptions with 7.

A BOLD CAREER

Beginning his 14th NFL season, WR **Anquan Boldin** joins the Lions receiving corps in 2016 with numbers worthy of Hall of Fame consideration.

- Boldin led the 49ers last year with 69 receptions and 789 yards. He currently ranks 11th in receptions (1,026) and 16th in receiving yards (13,331) on the NFL's all-time lists.
- Only 13 players in NFL history have recorded 1,000 or more receptions in their careers. With 1,026, Boldin trails only Titans WR Andre Johnson (1,060), Cardinals WR Larry Fitzgerald (1,043) and Cowboys TE Jason Witten (1,041) for the most among active players.
- In 2015, Boldin was also named the NFL's Walter Payton Man of the Year.

RUSH TO SCORE

The 2016 Lions backfield features multiple weapons with dual-threat capabilities, led by RBs **Theo Riddick**, **Dwayne Washington** and **Zach Zenner**.

- Through four games, the Lions running backs rank tied for third in receptions (28), fourth in receiving yards (241), tied for second in receiving touchdowns (2), tied for third in receiving first downs (11) and third in yards after the catch (226).
- Detroit saw three backs reach the end zone in Week 1 vs. Indianapolis (9/11) with scores from Riddick, Abdullah and Washington. Abdullah collected 120 yards from scrimmage (63 rush, 57 receiving) and Riddick garnered 108 total yards (45 rush, 63 receiving). By both running backs surpassing 100 total yards, it marked the first time since November 28, 2013 (vs. GB: Reggie Bush, 182; Joique Bell, 128) that the Lions had two running backs total over 100 yards from scrimmage in a game.

DESTRUCTIVE D-LINE

Over the past seven seasons, few defensive line units have disrupted opponents in both the passing and running games as the Detroit Lions. The Lions, under the direction of Defensive Line Coach **Kris Kocurek** since 2010, feature an attack upfront that first concentrates on stopping the run and then applies heavy pressure on the quarterback.

In 2015, the Lions defensive line generated 82.0 total tackles for loss or no gain (3rd in NFL), which includes 34.5 sacks (2nd in NFL), 44.0 tackles for loss or no gain against the rush (8th in NFL) and 8 forced fumbles (tied for 2nd in NFL).

KERRYING THE LOAD

The Lions' defensive line displays great depth across the board, led by first-year DE **Kerry Hyder**. Hyder earned a roster spot this offseason and has emerged on the scene as one of the NFL's upstart pass rushers so far.

➤ Through Week 4, Hyder currently ranks second in the NFL in sacks (5.0), behind only Broncos LB Von Miller (5.5), and ranks first in the NFC.

➤ Hyder piled on his early-season sacks total by adding another sack at Chicago (10/2). Through four games, he has tallied 5.0 sacks and became the third Lions defensive player to register 5+ sacks through the team's first four games (DE William Gay, 8.5 in 1983; DE Robert Porcher, 5.0 in 2001).

➤ With 1 sack at Chicago, Hyder joined DE William Gay (1983) as the only Lions defensive players to record a sack in each of the first four games of the season.

Prater connected on a 59-yard field goal to end the first half in the 2015 season finale at Chicago (1/3/16), setting a new team record for the longest field goal in Lions history. Prater's 59-yarder surpassed the previous record of 56 accomplished twice by K Jason Hanson (Cle 10/8/95; at Car 11/16/08).

- Prater's kick was the longest in the history of Soldier Field. Bears K Robbie Gould made the previous long of 58 yards.
- With his 59-yarder, Prater joined K Jason Hanson (8 in 2008 and 5 in 2011) as the only kickers in team history to make five 50-yard field goals in a season. Additionally, Prater has now tallied five 50+-yard field goals in a season for the third time in his career (5 in 2008 and 6 in 2013).

- With 6 points (1 FG, 3 PAT) at Chicago last season, Prater finished the season with 102 points and surpassed the 100+-point mark for the fifth time in his career. Prater is the sixth player in team history with 100+ points in a season and the first since K Jason Hanson in 2012 (134). He joins Hanson (12 seasons), K Eddie Murray (4 seasons), K Errol Mann (3 seasons), RB Doak Walker (2 seasons) and RB Barry Sanders (1 season) as the only players in team history to score 100 points in a season.

RETURN OF ROBERTS

Lions WR **Andre Roberts** came to Detroit this offseason as a free agent and has already made his impact known as a weapon in the return game.

- Entering Week 5, Roberts ranks second in the NFL in punt return average (19.7), third in punt return yards (138) and is one of only four players with a punt return touchdown so far this season.
- Roberts returned two punts for 100 yards at Chicago, which included an 85-yard punt return touchdown in the fourth quarter. His 100 yards established a new single-game career high (previous best: 72 vs. Den 12/12/10) and his punt return touchdown was longest of his career (previous best: 37 at Dal 10/27/14).
- Roberts' punt return was the sixth-longest in team history and longest since WR Reggie Swinton's 89-yard punt return at Carolina December 21, 2003. It was also the first by a Lions returner since WR Jeremy Ross scored on a 58-yard punt return at Philadelphia December 8, 2013. Additionally, Roberts' 85-yard punt return touchdown marked the longest ever by a Lions returner against the Bears.

- Detroit claimed victories in the first four games of the series, with each being a shutout. The Lions also won seven of the first nine meetings.
- The Lions' defense had three takeaways that helped Detroit's offense score three touchdowns and grab a commanding 24-0 halftime lead over the Eagles, before defeating Philadelphia 38-10 in the 1961 Playoff Bowl.
- The Lions' last tie in a regular season game was against the Eagles (23-23) November 4, 1984, the only tie in Silverdome history.
- In the Lions' first visit to Lincoln Financial Field (Sept. 23, 2007), QB Jon Kitna set a then-franchise record with 446 passing yards. Kitna connected with WR Roy Williams for a 91-yard TD, career highs for both players. With 204 receiving yards, Williams' career high was the then third-highest tally by a receiver in Lions history.
- QB Matthew Stafford then led his eighth-career game-winning drive as the Lions defeated the Eagles, 26-23 in an overtime win that was capped off by K Jason Hanson's 45-yard game-winning field goal.
- With 49 receiving yards at Philadelphia on December 8, 2013, WR Calvin Johnson (9,184) broke the Lions franchise record for career receiving yards, surpassing WR Herman Moore (9,174).
- WR Jeremy Ross became the second player in Lions history to register a punt return touchdown (58 yards) and kickoff return touchdown (98 yards) in the same game at Philadelphia December 8, 2013. Ross joins RB Eddie Payton (vs. Minnesota December 17, 1977) as the only Lions players to accomplish this feat.
- The Lions defeated the Eagles in their second ever Thanksgiving Day matchup 45-14 at Ford Field (November 26, 2015). WR Calvin Johnson tied a franchise record for touchdowns on Thanksgiving Day with three.

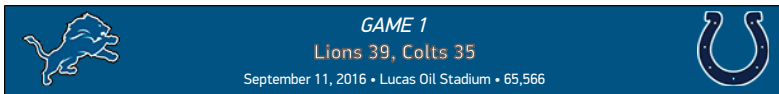

The Detroit Lions' start to the 2016 regular season highlighted the duel between two marquee quarterbacks in Lions QB Matthew Stafford and Colts QB Andrew Luck. With the help of a balanced offense through the air and a consistent rushing attack on the ground, the Lions jumped out to a 21-3 lead. After a 21-yard touchdown run by RB Theo Riddick to put Detroit up 7-0, rookie RB Dwayne Washington scored his first career touchdown to extend the lead 14-0. Seven of Stafford's 14 first half completions all went to different receivers including a six-yard touchdown strike to TE Eric Ebron that put Detroit up 21-3. Luck and the Colts responded with a 75-yard drive ending in a touchdown reception by Colts WR Donte Moncrief to set the score at 21-10 right before halftime. After a Lions drive stalled, Luck and the Colts put together an 85-yard drive ending in a 19-yard touchdown pass to TE Dwayne Allen. Following a successful two-point conversion pass to Allen, Indianapolis trailed 21-18 halfway through the third quarter. Detroit responded with a 71-yard drive ending with an 11-yard touchdown pass to RB Ameer Abdullah to go up 28-18. Following an Adam Vinatieri 40-yard field goal, Luck and the Colts added a 94-yard drive ending with a 16-yard touchdown strike to TE Jack Doyle to tie the game at 28-28. With completions to five different receivers, Stafford connected with Riddick for a 13-yard score. A missed extra point by K Matt Prater put the Lions lead at 34-28 with 4:11 left to play. The Colts put together an eight play drive for 75 yards as Doyle hauled in his second touchdown reception from six yards out to go up 35-34 on Detroit with 37 seconds left in regulation. With three timeouts, Stafford and the Lions completed three passes for a total of 50 yards before Prater lined up for a 43-yard field goal to put Detroit ahead 37-35 with four seconds left to play. After a series of laterals on the ensuing kickoff, Detroit was awarded a safety, ending regulation and giving the Lions a 39-35 victory.

The Lions hosted the Tennessee Titans in their home opener at Ford Field in Week 2 of the 2016 regular season (9/18). After a Sam Martin 48-yard punt and a holding penalty on the Titans, Tennessee started a drive from their own 10-yard line early in the first quarter. Lions DE Devin Taylor stuffed Titans RB DeMarco Murray in the end zone for a Detroit safety. The Lions immediately added an eight play scoring drive for 79 yards that was capped by a 24-yard Matthew Stafford touchdown strike to Anquan Boldin, putting the Lions up 9-0 in the first quarter. After a series of short completions by Titans QB Marcus Mariota, Tennessee put the score at 9-3 with a 46-yard field goal by Titans K Ryan Succop. Following a series of stops by both defenses, Detroit put together a 13-play, 75-yard drive that ended in a 42-yard field goal by K Matt Prater, giving the Lions a 12-3 lead going into halftime. Detroit constructed a 14-play drive midway through the third quarter that ended in a 27-yard field goal by Prater, giving the Lions a 15-3 lead heading into the fourth quarter. After a 20-yard completion, Mariota quickly connected with TE Delanie Walker for a 30-yard touchdown strike to bring the score to 15-10 with more than 14 minutes left to play. After forcing Detroit to punt on multiple drives, the Titans took the ball back with 7:04 to play. Mariota connected on all nine of his last pass attempts, including a nine yard touchdown pass to Titans WR Andre Johnson. The Titans took a 16-15 lead with 1:13 to play after a sack by Detroit on their failed two-point conversion attempt. Titans CB Perrish Cox intercepted a pass by Stafford at midfield on the Lions last drive of the game to give Tennessee a 16-15 victory.

The Packers defeated the Lions 34-27 in Week 3 at Lambeau Field after getting out to an early 31-3 lead which included scores on all of Green Bay's first six possessions. The Packers scored first with a 14-yard touchdown pass from Packers QB Aaron Rodgers to WR Davante Adams to take a 7-0 lead. The Lions responded with a 16-play drive that ended in a 42-yard field goal from K Matt Prater, setting the score at 7-3. After a kickoff out of bounds by Detroit, Rodgers and the Packers started a drive from their own 40. Rodgers quickly followed up on a 40-yard pass across the middle to WR Jordy Nelson with an eight-yard touchdown pass back to Nelson, giving Green Bay a 14-3 lead at the end of the first quarter. On the first play of the second quarter, Lions CB Nevin Lawson was called for defensive pass interference, a penalty for 66 total yards against Detroit. Rodgers and Packers TE Richard Rodgers connected for a two-yard touchdown pass following the infraction for a 21-3 Green Bay lead. A Matthew Stafford pass intended for Lions TE Eric Ebron was picked off on the ensuing Detroit drive, leading to a Green Bay field goal by K Mason Crosby. After a stalled Lions drive, Rodgers found Nelson again in the second quarter in the back of the end zone for a 17-yard touchdown and 31-3 Packers lead. In two plays Stafford connected with Lions WR Marvin Jones Jr. before the end of the first half for a 73-yard touchdown strike, giving the Packers a 31-10 lead at halftime. Detroit scored on the first possession of the second half when Stafford hit WR Anquan Boldin for a touchdown early in the third quarter to set the score at 31-17. Crosby nailed a 46-yard field goal on Green Bay's next drive, giving the Packers a 34-17 lead heading into the fourth quarter. With a 50-yard field goal by Prater, two stops by the Lions defense and another deep touchdown pass to Jones Jr., the Lions pulled within one score at 34-27 with more than three minutes left to play. A scramble by Rodgers on third and long gave Green Bay a 34-27 victory as time expired.

The Chicago Bears defeated the Detroit Lions 17-14 in Week 4 at Soldier Field. After getting the ball on their own 45-yard line in the first quarter, the Bears put together a 10-play drive that ended in a Brian Hoyer touchdown pass to WR Eddie Royal to give Chicago a 7-0 lead. The Lions failed to score in the first quarter, but the defense put together a series of stops that kept the score at 7-0 midway through the second quarter. Lions K Matt Prater put Detroit on the board after nailing a 50-yard field goal with four minutes left to play in the first half. After another defensive stop by Detroit, the Lions offense moved the ball into Bears territory looking to close the gap on a 7-3 Bears lead before halftime. A pass by Lions QB Matthew Stafford was picked off by Bears CB Jacoby Glenn with 16 seconds left in the second quarter, robbing the Lions of any points before the half. With Detroit opting to receive the second half kickoff, the Lions offense drove 66 yards in nearly eight minutes but failed to get in the end zone at Chicago's one yard line. Prater knocked in a 21-yard field goal to put Chicago's lead at 7-6. Hoyer and the Bears offense quickly responded as they went 75-yards in six plays ending with Hoyer connecting with Bears TE Zach Miller for a six yard touchdown catch. After a Bears defensive stop to end the third quarter, Chicago went 11-plays for 73 yards that ended in a 25-yard field goal by Bears K Connor Barth. The Lions trailed 17-6 with more than 10 minutes left to play in regulation. A Lions series was halted at the Bears 23-yard line when a Stafford pass intended for Lions WR Anquan Boldin was intercepted by Bears CB Deiondre' Hall with four minutes left. After a defensive stop, Lions WR Andre Roberts returned a Chicago punt 85-yards for a touchdown. The Lions' two-point conversion attempt was successful, giving the Bears a 17-14 lead with 1:52 left to play. Chicago escaped with a 17-14 victory after Detroit failed to recover an onside kick attempt late in the game.
