The New England Patriots will look to get back in the win column this Sunday when they travel to face the Cleveland Browns

After a 3-0 start, the Patriots lost last Sunday at home, 16-0, to the Buffalo Bills. Since the beginning of 2003, the Patriots are 40-6 (.869) in regular season games following a loss.

This Sunday's game is the first of three straight games against AFC North opponents for the Patriots. New England will return to Gillette Stadium following the Cleveland game to host the Cincinnati Bengals on Oct. 16 and then travel to face the Pittsburgh Steelers on Oct. 23. The Patriots will round out their schedule against the AFC North when they host the Baltimore Ravens on Monday Night Football on Dec. 12.

BROADCAST INFORMATION

TELEVISION: This week's game will be broadcast by CBS and can be seen locally on WBZ-TV Channel 4 in Boston. Greg Gumbel will handle play-by-play duties with Trent Green as the color analyst. Jamie Erdahl will work the sidelines. The game will be produced by Jim Rikhoff and directed by Suzanne Smith.

NATIONAL RADIO: This week's game will be broadcast to a national audience on Westwood One Sports. John Sadak and Mike Mayock will call the game.

LOCAL RADIO: 98.5 FM, The Sports Hub, is the flagship station for the Patriots Radio Network. Play-by-play broadcaster Bob Socci will call the action along with former Patriots quarterback Scott Zolak, who will provide color analysis. Produced by Marc Cappello.

#### SERIES HISTORY





The Patriots and Browns will meet for the 24th time overall, including one postseason meeting, when the clubs square off on Sunday.

The Teams will be playing against each other for the first time since a 27-26 victory by the Patriots at Gillette Stadium on Dec. 8, 2013. It will be the Patriots first visit to Cleveland since losing, 34-14, at FirstEnergy Stadium. That loss was one of only two losses the Patriots had during the 2010 regular season.

Cleveland leads the all-time series with a 13-10 mark, including the one postseason game when the Bill Belichick-led Browns claimed a 20-13 victory over the Patriots on New Year's Day, 1995 in a Wild Card Playoff game at Cleveland's Municipal Stadium

The Patriots are 4-8 overall in games played in Cleveland, including a 2-2 record at Cleveland Browns Stadium.

Cleveland is 5-6 all-time against the Patriots in games played in New England, including 0-3 at Gillette Stadium following losses in 2003 and 2007. Overall, the Browns have lost four straight times in New England.

Tom Brady threw two touchdown passed in the final 61 seconds of the game to rally the Patriots to a 27-26 come-from-behind win over the Cleveland Browns, as the Patriots improved to a 10-3 record.

The Patriots trailed 6-0 at halftime. It was the fifth time in six games that they were behind at intermission. The Patriots deficit grew to 19-3 when WR Josh Gordon scored on an 80-yard catch and run with 1:25 left in the third quarter.

RB Shane Vereen's 6-yard touchdown run and a subsequent 2-point conversion cut the lead to 19-14 with six seconds left in the third quarter. New England fell behind 26-14 when QB Jason Campbell threw his third touchdown pass on a 4-yarder to TE Jordan Cameron with 2:39 left to play.

The Patriots responded on the next series when Brady followed a 23-yard pass to WR Julian Edelman with a 19-yard pass to Edelman to get into Cleveland territory. A combination of short passes from Brady to RB Shane Vereen and Edelman helped get in position for a 2-yard touchdown pass to Edelman to make it 26-21 with 1:01 left to play.

The Patriots then executed a successful onside kick that was recovered by CB Kyle Arrington at the Cleveland 40-yard line. After a 10-yard pass from Brady to WR Danny Amendola, Cleveland CB Leon McFadden was called for pass interference on a pass into the end zone to give the Patriots a first down at the 1-yard line with 35 seconds to play. On the next play, Brady connected with Amendola on 1-yard pass to give the Patriots a 27-26 lead.

After a failed two-point play, Cleveland took the ensuing kick and moved to the 40-yard line where K Billy Cundiff missed on a 58-yard field goal try with one second to play.

Brady finished the game with 418 yards passing but completed just 7-of-19 pass attempts for 95 yards in the first half. He was 25-of-33 for 323 yards with two touchdowns in a big second half.

Vereen finished with 12 receptions for 153 receptions, setting single-game franchise records for most receptions and most receiving yards by a running back. Vereen's 153 receiving yards topped the 53-year old franchise running back record of 124 receiving yards, achieved by Dick Christy against the Oakland Raiders on Nov. 4, 1960.

The Patriots had only one of their first six first half drives reach Cleveland territory, but that drive stalled at the Cleveland 37-yard line. Cleveland took a 3-0 lead after taking the opening kickoff into New England territory, resulting in a 43-yard field goal. Later in the first quarter, Brady was intercepted by Cleveland at the 44-yard line, leading to a second Browns field goal early in the second quarter.

Campbell, who finished with 391 passing yards and three touchdowns, had a 40-yard touchdown pass to TE Gary Barnidge in the third quarter and his 80-yarder to Gordon to take a 19-3 lead.

The Patriots scored on their final five drives to secure the win.

The Buffalo Bills handed the New England Patriots their first ever shutout loss at Gillette stadium with a 16-0 victory.

The first play of the game pretty much summed up the Patriots day. Rookie QB Jacoby Brissett, who made his second straight start, completed a short pass to WR Julian Edelman who turned the play into a 90-yard catch-and-run. However, the play was negated by a pass interference penalty against the Patriots.

The Bills responded with scoring drives on their first three offensive series for a 13-0 first half lead, Buffalo marched on a 12-play, 65-yard drive that ended with a 7-yard touchdown pass from QB Tyrod Taylor to RB LeSean McCoy for a 7-0 first-quarter lead. A 10-play, 52-yard drive ended with a 34-yard field goal early in the second quarter for a 10-0 lead. Buffalo moved 71 yards on the next series before settling for a 43-yard field goal to go in front, 13-0.

Taylor finished the game 27-of-39 for 246 yards with one touchdown and directed a unit that converted 7-of-15 third downs. New England was 1-of-12 on third down attempts.

New England squandered their only scoring opportunity in the first half after a fumble deep inside Buffalo territory. Brissett connected with TE Martellus Bennett on a 58-yard pass play for a first down at the Bills 17-yard line. The Patriots reached the 8-yard line before a holding call pushed them back to the 18. On the next play, Brissett scrambled up the middle before being hit and fumbling the ball to Buffalo.

New England drove into Buffalo territory three more times in the second half, but the drives resulted in a missed field goal, a turnover on downs and the last drive was on the final minutes of the game.

Brissett made his second straight start after QB Jimmy Garoppolo was a game day inactive due to a shoulder injury. He finished 17-of-27 for 205 yards with no touchdowns and no interceptions.

The Patriots allowed 16 first downs by Buffalo in the first half and managed just two first downs. The Patriots had nine penalties and had a total of five fumbles in the game.



#### **PATRIOTS SHUT OUT**

The Patriots were shut out for the 21st time in team history and for the first time since a 21-0 loss at Miami on Dec. 10, 2006. It is the first time the Patriots were shutout at home since losing 6-0 to the New York Jets on Nov. 28, 1993.



#### **BENNETT GOES OVER 100**

Bennett had his fourth career 100-yard game and his second of the 2016 season after finishing with five receptions for 109 yards. Bennett also had 114 yards receiving vs. Miami on Sept. 18, 2015.

#### BENNETT SETS CAREER LONG

TE Martellus Bennett caught a 58-yard pass from QB Jacoby Brissett in the second quarter. It is a career long for Bennett. His previous long was a 43-yard reception on Nov. 17, 2013, vs. Baltimore when he played for Chicago.

#### GRONKOWSKI PASSES COATES

Rob Gronkowski became the seventh Patriots player to reach 5,000 receiving yards with the team last season and entered the 2016 season tied with Ben Coates with 5,555 receiving yards all-time among NFL tight ends. Gronkowski (5,566) needs 161 receiving yards in 2016 to move past Irving Fryar (5,726) into fourth place on the Patriots all-time receiving yards list.

- *Belichick has four Super Bowl wins as a head coach to match Pittsburgh's Chuck Noll for the most wins. With one more Super Bowl win, Belichick will have the most wins by a head coach in Super Bowl history.
- *Belichick is tied with Tom Landry and Don Shula with 13 division titles and needs one more division title to set the record for most among all head coaches.
- *Bill Belichick is tied with Curly Lambeau for fourth place with 226 regular seasons wins and needs one more to pass him for sole possession of fourth place. He is behind Don Shula (328), George Halas (318) and Tom Landry (250).
- *Belichick's Patriots teams have twice recorded five straight years of playoff advancement (2003-07 and 2011-15), tying the NFL record. If the Patrioits advance in 2016, they will set the NFL record by a head coach. John Harbaugh (2008-12), Mike Holmgren (1993-97), John Madden (1973-77) and Andy Reid (2000-04) also won a playoff game in five consecutive seasons.

#### TOM BRADY

- * Tom Brady (172) needs eight more wins to become just the third NFL quarterback with 180 career regular-season wins to join Brett Favre (186) and Peyton Manning (186).
- *Brady has 194 wins overall (172 in the regular season and 22 in the postseason) and needs seven more wins to become the all-time leader for most wins by an NFL quarterback. Peyton Manning (200: 186 in the regular season and 14 in the postseason) and Brett Favre (199: 186 in the regular season and 13 in the postseason) have the most wins in NFL history by a starting quarterback.
- *If Brady reaches 30 or more touchdowns passes in 2016, he will become just the fourth player in NFL history with 30 or more touchdown passes in seven seasons, joining Brett Favre [9], Peyton Manning [9] and Drew Brees [8].
- *Brady is tied with Peyton Manning with four seasons with 35 or more touchdowns and needs to reach 35 touchdowns in 2016 for his fifth season with 35 or more touchdowns to become the all-time leader in this category.
- *Brady enters the 2016 season fifth on the NFL's all-time list with 58,028 career passing yards and needs 1,972 yards to become the fifth NFL player to reach 60,000 passing yards.
- *Brady has passed for 4,000 yards eight times in his career and if he reaches 4,000 yards in 2016, he will be the third player to reach nine seasons with 4,000 yards, joining Peyton Manning [14] and Drew Brees [10].
- *Brady led the NFL with 36 touchdowns passes in 2015, his fourth time leading the NFL in touchdowns. He tied Drew Brees, Len Dawson, Brett Favre, Peyton Manning, Johnny Unitas and Steve Young for most seasons leading the NFL in touchdown passes.

#### **TOM BRADY (CONT.)**

*Brady will play in his 17th season in 2016 and become the longest tenured Patriots player, surpassing the 16 seasons by Steve Grogan (1975-90).

*Brady's 17 seasons with one team will tie for the most by an NFL quarterback with John Brodie (San Francisco) and Dan Marino (Miami).

#### STEPHEN GOSTKOWSKI

- *If Stephen Gostkowski leads the NFL in scoring in 2016, he will set the NFL mark for most seasons leading the NFL in scoring with six, moving past Don Hutson (5) and Gino Cappelletti (5). Gostkowski has led the NFL in scoring in 2008, 2012, 2013, 2014 and 2015.
- *Stephen Gostkowski has led the NFL in scoring in each of the last four seasons (2012-15). He can become just the second player to lead the NFL in scoring in five straight seasons in 2016, joining Don Hutson (1940-44).
- *  In 2015, Gostkowski became the first NFL player with four seasons of 150 or more points and can add to that in 2016.
- *Gostkowski has the best field goal percentage in NFL history from 50 yards or more (78.3 percent (18-of-23).
- *Gostkowski [4] needs one more 30-field goal season to tie David Akers and John Carney for the most in NFL history with five seasons of 30 or more field goals.
- *Gostkowski has led the NFL in field goals three times (2008, 2013 and 2014). If he leads the NFL in field goals in 2016, he will join Lou Groza (5), Jack Manders (4), Ward Cuff (4) and Mark Moseley (4) as the only NFL players to lead the NFL in field goals in at least four seasons.

#### ROB GRONKOWSKI

- *Rob Gronkowski has 66 overall touchdowns and needs three touchdowns in 2016 to move past Stanley Morgan (68) to become the all-time leader in touchdowns scored for the Patriots.
- *Gronkowski (65) needs 3 receiving touchdowns to move past Stanley Morgan (67) to become the all-time leader in receiving touchdowns for the Patriots.
- *With 5,566 receiving yards, Gronkowski needs 161 more yards in 2016 to move past Irving Fryar (5,726) into fourth place on the Patriots all-time receiving yards list.
- *Gronkowski needs one more 1,000-yard season to join Tony Gonzalez and Jason Witten for the most 1,000-yard seasons by an NFL tight end with four.
- *Gronkowski has an NFL-leading five seasons with 10 or more touchdowns by a tight end and can add to his record in 2016.
- *Gronkowski enters the 2016 season with 64 touchdown receptions from Tom Brady, the second-most TD receptions from a QB and a tight end, behind the 78 by Philip Rivers and Antonio Gates. The 64 TD connections are the 8th most overall.
- $\star$ Gronkowski enters the 2016 season with 20 100-yard games, tied with Jason Witten for the fifth most among all NFL tight ends.
- *Gronkowski has 5,566 receiving yards and needs 742 yards to move past Steve Jordan (6,307) for 10th place all-time among tight ends.

# KRAFT

#### News & Notes

Since Robert Kraft purchased the team in 1994, the Patriots have experienced one of the most dramatic turnarounds in the history of sports. Now in his 23rd season of ownership, Kraft has transformed one of the league's least successful clubs into what observers view as a model NFL franchise. In the five seasons immediately preceding his purchase (1989-93), the Patriots were a moribund team, winning just 19 of 80 games (.238 pct.) and logging the worst record in the NFL over that span. When he bought the franchise on Jan. 21, 1994, Kraft



announced his intention to bring a championship to New England, a tall order considering the team's previous success rate. But under Kraft's leadership, the Patriots have won more division titles (15), conference crowns (7) and Super Bowl championships (4) than any other NFL team. Super Bowl XLIX was the seventh Super Bowl appearance since Kraft purchased the team, a period during which no other team has earned more than four berths. In Kraft's 22 seasons, the Patriots have qualified for the playoffs 17 times, more than doubling the franchise's accomplishments during its first 34 seasons.

# IN HISTORY

JANUARY 1, 1995

The Browns have called home to its newest field at FirstEnergy Stadium since it opened on the grounds of the old Cleveland Municipal Stadium in 1999.

When the Patriots travel to Cleveland to take on the Browns this week, they'll being stepping foot on the same grounds of the old Cleveland Municipal Stadium, the city's former multi-purpose park that served as home to the Browns for nearly 50 years. Cleveland's current playing field, most recently renamed, FirstEngery Stadium, opened on the grounds of the old arena in 1999. The Browns and Patriots share a history that dates back to November 21, 1971, the first time New England ever kicked off against Cleveland. That 1971 regular season matchup between the two teams was played at Municipal Stadium, but when the Browns and Patriots played each other for the last time on the historic field, a lot was on the line. On January 1, 1995, Cleveland hosted New England in the 1994 AFC Wild Card Game at Cleveland Municipal Stadium. The Patriots fell 20-13 in the contest after taking a lead early in the second quarter on a 60-yard drive led by quarterback Drew Bledsoe. New England scored the game's first touchdown on the end of that series when Bledsoe found running back Leroy Thompson in the end zone on the end of a 13yard pass. The Browns quickly came back with a 51-yard drive to take the 10-7 lead before New England responded with a 23-yard Matt Bahr field goal to tie the game before the half, but the comeback just wasn't enough. For one last time against the Patriots, home field advantage at Cleveland Municipal Stadium prevailed.



Bill Belichick is the only head coach in NFL history to win three Super Bowl titles in a four-year span. He won more regular season games (123) and more games overall [136] during a 10-year stretch [2002-11] than any other coach in NFL history. In the 2007 season, Belichick led the Patriots to the fourth undefeated and untied regular season in NFL history and the first since the NFL established a 16-game schedule in 1978. His 42 consecutive years as an NFL coach are second in NFL history to 44 by Tennessee's Dick LeBeau.

#### **BOLDEN BLOCK PART'**

Brandon Bolden blocked his first NFL punt in the win at San Diego [12/7/14] to give the Patriots a first down at the Chargers 25-yard line. It was the Patriots first blocked punt since Patrick Chung blocked a punt at Miami on Oct. 4, 2010.



# **OVERCOMING ADVERSITY**

On April 20, 2011, just days before Texas Christian offensive line prospect Marcus Cannon was to enter the NFL Draft, he was diagnosed with non-Hodgkin's lymphoma, a treatable form of cancer found in lymph tissue. A little more than one week later, the Patriots selected Cannon in the fifth round (138th overall) of the draft with the knowledge of his illness. The Patriots placed Cannon on the Reserve/Non Football Injury list to start the 2011 season while he received treatment and recovered. Cannon was activated to the 53-man roster later that year and is now in his fifth season with the team. Cannon made a full recovery and was named the Patriots 2011 Ed Block Courage Award winner - an annual award presented to select players in the National Football League who are voted by their teammates as role models of inspiration, sportsmanship and courage.

# FROM STANDOUT QB TO WR

Edelman began his college football career with a year at the College of San Mateo (Calif.) before transferring to Kent State where as a senior he completed 56 percent of his passes [153 of 275 passes for 1,820 yards] with 13 touchdowns. He was also the leading rusher, gaining 1,551 yards on 215 attempts (an average of 7.5 yards per carry) and scoring 13 touchdowns. His offensive numbers broke Kent State's single-season record for total offense set by Joshua Cribbs in 2003. Said head coach Bill Belichick on the versatility of Edelman: "He played the quarterback position in college at Kent State and all the positions really that he's played in the NFL – covering kicks, returning kicks, slot receiver, outside receiver, slot defender – he didn't do any of those things in college. I think that really speaks to his versatility and how much he's grown as a player and how many things he's learned how to do that he really didn't have much experience with in college. I'd say that's pretty unusual, especially to be as competent in them as he is.'

#### EDELMAN TAKES HIS FATHER'S ADVICE

If there is one thing Julian Edelman has never lacked, it's athletic ability. A dual-threat quarterback at Kent State and former baseball standout in high school, Edelman once wowed Toronto Blue Jays players with his impressive footwork while fielding ground balls in an appearance at batting practice in 2014.

This natural ability may have been overlooked by NFL scouts, who let him fall to the Patriots in the seventh round of the 2009 NFL Draft. Edelman remains focused on the lessons his father, Frank Edelman, taught him at a young age. "I'm still constantly trying to learn," Edelman told *The Boston Herald.* "My dad always put it in my head, when you're green, you're growing, when you're ripe, you're lost. When you're done learning, you're done."



# **GAROPPOLO MAKES FIRST START**

Jimmy Garoppolo became just the fifth quarterback in the last 30 years to make his first regular-season start in a season-opening night game (Sept. 11, vs. Cardinals). Aaron Rodgers was the last (2008, win vs. Minnesota), with Philip Rivers (2006), David Carr (2002) and Brian Griese (1999) before him. Garoppolo finished 24-of-33 for 264 yards with one touchdown.

# **UNCONVENTIONAL JOUNEY**

Despite a successful three-year lacrosse career at Penn State, Hogan, also a standout football player in high school, said that playing college football was always in the back of his mind. Having redshirted his sophomore year of lacrosse, Hogan had an extra year of athletic eligibility following his fourth academic year at Penn State. As the football itch still lurked in the back of his mind, Chris played his final year of eligibility with the Monmouth football team, and at the end of the season, joined in on some workouts with teammates who were training for the NFL Combine.

"I honestly didn't know if I had what it took to play in the NFL," Hogan wrote in the Tribune. "Still, it was one of those things where I didn't want to look back in five years and be like, 'Man, I wish I would've tried."

Chris did not get invited to compete in that year's Combine, but turned heads during a Pro Day held at Fordham. Later that summer, he signed with the San Francisco 49ers as an undrafted free agent.

## **ELECTED TEAM LEADER**

Patriots wide receiver Matthew Slater has been named to five straight Pro Bowls (2011-15) for his special teams work, but perhaps more revealing of his value to New England is the fact that he was elected a captain by his teammates for the sixth straight season in 2016.

The special teams ace was willing to share his advice on being a great captain with high school football players in a story published by *The Boston Globe*. "I think first and foremost, you have to be able to put others before yourself. Being a captain and leadership is about serving, and to me, that means a great deal of sacrifice – putting aside personal agendas for the greater common goal. Leadership is equated with sacrifice. I think you have to be willing to do whatever it takes for the unit to succeed. I think you need to lead by example. A lot of times, it's about what you do, not what you say."

#### SLATER'S EMERGENCE WAS SPECIAL

Bill Belichick acknowledged Matthew Slater's role as a gunner on special teams: "Matt is one of the best in the league," Belichick said. "Any time the punt return team has to double somebody, that makes it one less guy they can use somewhere else in the return. He almost always draws two guys out there unless they're in an eight-man rush. Most of the time, there's two guys out there — fourth-and-short, where they're trying to protect the box — but he draws a lot of double teams, and deservedly so. He does an outstanding job of covering punts."



# WHITE HAS CAREER DAY

James White set career highs with 10 receptions and 115 receiving yards vs. Philadelphia (12/6/15). White's 115 receiving yards are the second-highest such total for a Patriots running back since the 1970 AFL-NFL merger, trailing only Shane Vereen's team-record 153 receiving yards vs. Cleveland on Dec. 8, 2013. White's 10 catches are the third highest such total of the Bill Belichick era for a running back (since 2000), trailing only Shane Vereen's club record 12 catches vs. Cleveland on Dec. 8, 2013, and Kevin Faulk's 11 catches vs. Tampa Bay on Sept. 3, 2000.

# **JAMIE COLLINS' JOURNEY**



The road to the NFL has been anything but easy for linebacker and 2013 second-round draft pick Jamie Collins. The youngest of five siblings growing up in Meadville, Miss., Collins lost both of his parents when he was six years old and was raised by one of his sisters, who was in her mid 20s.

Collins turned to football as an outlet to help him through the tough times. "It means a lot. It's my living," Collins told *The Boston Herald.* "It kept me on track." Collins' resiliency in dealing with adversity has made a lasting impact on fellow Mississippi native and former Patriots RB Stevan

Ridley, who grew up 30 miles west of Meadville in Natchez, Miss., and got to know Collins through a family friend. "What I've known about him, he really has been a strong person," Ridley told the *Herald*. "Anybody that's gone through the things that he's gone through and can still find a way to be successful on the football field, you have to be mentally tough. That's what he's kind of done as a teammate here. He's come in here and accepted his role and did a pretty good job as a rookie."

# **COLLINS SETS CAREER HIGH**

LB Jamie Collins set a career high with 2 1/2 sacks in the win at Buffalo on Sept. 20, 2015. It was his second career multi-sack game. He registered his first NFL two-sack game at San Diego (12/7/14).

# **TEAM LEADER**

Collins had a standout second season in 2014. He led the team in total tackles (109), forced fumbles (4) and fumble recoveries (2), and tied for the team lead in interceptions (2).

#### **COLLINS CAME TO PLAY**

Collins notched an interception his second straight game vs. Houston [9/22/16], bringing his regular-season interception total to five. He has two additional interceptions in the postseason. Collins also finished with an personal-best of 14 total tackles in the Texans game, besting his previous high of 13 vs. NY Jets on Oct. 16, 2014 and at Green Bay on Nov. 30, 2014.

# **COLLINS BLOCKS FIRST XP SINCE 2008**

LB Jamie Collins blocked a fourth quarter extra point at Indianapolis (10/18/15). It was the Patriots first blocked extra point since Vince Wilfork blocked a PAT at Oakland on Dec. 14, 2008. It is Collins' second blocked kick. He blocked a field goal attempt vs. Miami on Dec. 14, 2014.



# MAKING THE OLYMPICS



On July 18, Nate Ebner was selected to the 2016 U.S. Olympic Rugby squad and after he was given an excused leave of absence from his football obligations in Foxboro, suited up for Team USA in Rio de Janeiro in August. The Dublin, Ohio native was introduced to the sport of rugby around the age of six and developed a passion and a talent that stemmed from his father and role model, Jeff Ebner, who played the game at the University of Minnesota. Nate did not play football in high school but was a two-time MVP of the USA Rugby team at the Junior World Cup and a standout on the U19 and U20 national teams.

Although his parents were divorced, Nate and his father remained very close. "We were super tight," Nate told the Boston Globe. "I would put my father-son relationship against anyone's. He taught me how to be a man." The two often spent time working together at the family's auto reclamation business, Ebner & Sons in Springfield, Ohio, and would also train in the gym together behind the motto, "Finish Strong," - a message Jeff always preached to his son.

Nate played rugby at Ohio State during his first two years of college, but as an All-American on the school's club team, he decided to walk on to the Buckeyes football team and finish his career with his sights set on reaching the NFL.

McCourty's identical twin brother, Jason, is a cornerback with Tennessee, selected in the sixth round of the 2009 NFL Draft. The two are the 12th set of twins to play in the NFL. Devin redshirted for the 2005 season and therefore was a year behind his brother in eligibility. McCourty is the second twin to suit up for the Patriots, after CB Kato Serwanga was a member of the team from 1998-2000. His twin brother, Wasswa, played for San Francisco and Minnesota from 1999-2001. According to McCourty's mother, the two can only be told apart by tiny scars on their faces left by chickenpox. The McCourty twins are one of two active sets of twins playing in the NFL.

# WHERE DID HE COME FROM?

Rob Ninkovich's journey to the Patriots was not easy. He entered the league as a fifth-round pick by the Saints in 2006 and was waived four times by New Orleans and Miami before landing in New England on Aug. 2, 2009. He spent the 2009 offseason trying to make the New Orleans team as a long snapper. Before coming to the Patriots, he had appeared in just eight games over three seasons. He doubled that total in his first year in New England, appearing in 15 games in 2009 and his role on the team has grown since, earning a starting role at linebacker in 2010 and 2011 before moving to a starting role on the defensive line in 2011.

# **CAREER DAY IN BUFFALO**

Ninkovich finished with a three-sack game for the first time in his career in the win at Buffalo (10/12/14), He has had two two-sack performances - vs. Miami (1/2/11) and at Carolina (11/18/13).

#### **CRAZY EIGHTS**

Ninkovich had eight sacks in three consecutive seasons from 2012-14, becoming the first Patriots player to have at least eight sacks in three consecutive seasons since Pro Football Hall of Famer Andre Tippett achieved the feat from 1985-87 (1985,  $16\frac{1}{2}$ , 1986,  $9\frac{1}{2}$  and 1987,  $12\frac{1}{2}$ ).

#### NINKOVICH SCORED AS A TE IN COLLEGE

Ninkovich played some at tight end in college at Purdue and caught two touchdown passes with a 2-yard touchdown pass from Buffalo QB Kyle Orton and a 1-yard touchdown pass from former New York Giants and Indianapolis QB Curtis Painter.

# DB LOGAN RYAN AND DB DURON HARMON

### **CLASSMATES REUNITE IN NEW ENGLAND**

Defensive backs Logan Ryan and Duron Harmon are used to working together. Ryan and Harmon began their college football careers together as members of the same recruiting class at Rutgers University and developed a close friendship during their four years in Piscataway, N.J. As fate would have it, Ryan and Harmon would begin their NFL journeys together as well when the Patriots selected the two defensive backs just eight picks apart in the third round of the 2013 NFL Draft.

Reunited once again, the former Scarlet Knights are excited and eager to make their mark, just as they did at Rutgers. "We talked before the draft and said how good it would be to play on the same team again, and for it to happen again, it's exciting and it's a blessing," Harmon told *The Boston Globe.* "It's great [we're contributing], because at the end of the day you want to play, and to contribute to a team like this, it's fun."

# **RYAN RETURNS... TO SCHOOL**

When Logan Ryan decided to leave Rutgers and enter the NFL Draft after his redshirt junior season in 2012, he made a promise to his parents that after his rookie year, he would return to school and earn his degree.

Ryan kept his promise and graduated in the spring of 2014 with a degree in labor relations and a minor in psychology.

"I committed to Rutgers, not only as a football player, but as a student, so I was going to make sure I finished that end too," Ryan told NJ.com.

"It's a big accomplishment in my life. I held my word to my parents and stuck with it and I'm fortunate. It took a lot of work, but I was able to go back and finish and walk in graduation."

Stephen Gostkowski made five field goals vs. Cincinnati (10/5/14), setting a new single-game career high. The last time a Patriots player had five field goals in a game was on Nov.14, 2004, when Adam Vinatieri had five field goals vs. Buffalo.

Gostkowski drilled a 51-yard field goal and a 53-yarder vs. Arizona (9/16/12) and connected on two 53-yard field goals at Houston on (12/1/13). He is the first Patriots player to have two 50-yard field goals in the same game.

### RYAN COMES UP BIG

P Ryan Allen had six of his seven punts downed inside the 20-yard line and helped hold Houston (9/22) to no punt return yards. He landed punts at the 11, 10, 10 14, 5 and 4. His only punt that did not land inside the 20, was downed at the 20-yard line. Ryan's previous best was five punts inside the 20-yard line on Oct. 6, 2013 at Cincinnati. He was named AFC Special Teams Player of the Week for his performance.

#### **SCORING FLURRY**

The Patriots scored three touchdowns in a 57-second span during the final two minutes of the first half against Chicago on Oct. 26, 2014 to turn a 17-7 lead into a 38-7 cushion. - ★ After the Patriots defense forced a quick three-and-out, a 42-yard Julian Edelman punt return gave New England possession at the Chicago 9-yard line, and Brady found Brandon LaFell for a 9-yard touchdown on the next play to give the Patriots a 31-7 lead with 1:07 left in the first half.
- ★ On the Bears' first play following the LaFell touchdown, Zach Moore forced a Jay Cutler fumble that was recovered by Rob Ninkovich and returned for a 15yard touchdown and a 38-7 Patriots lead with 55 seconds left in the first half.

#### A COMEBACK FOR THE AGES

The Patriots came back from a 24-point deficit to defeat the Broncos, 34-31, in overtime in a Sunday Night Football matchup on Nov. 24, 2013, marking the largest comeback win in team history, after trailing 24-0 at halftime.

New England's previous best comeback win was from a 23-0 deficit to win, 38-23, vs. Seattle (9/16/84). The Patriots also came back from 22 points down to win at the New York Giants, 23-22 (12/21/96). The Patriots have come from 21 points down to win four times, most recently vs. Buffalo (1/1/12).





# PATRIOTS IN THE PLAYOFFS

The Patriots have qualified for the playoffs 23 times in their 56-year history. Seventeen of those playoff berths have come in the 22 seasons since Robert Kraft purchased the team in 1994, a dramatic contrast to the six total playoff berths the team earned in its first 34 years of existence. The Patriots have won 18 division crowns, including 13 in the last 15 seasons, and have qualified as a Wild Card team four times (1976, 1985, 1994 and 1998). The Patriots also qualified for the playoffs in 1982 during the strike season.
