#### NEW ENGLAND PATRIOTS (6-1) at BUFFALO BILLS (4-3) Sunday, Oct 30, 2016 • New Era Field (71,870) • 1:00 p.m. ET

The New England Patriots improved to 6-1 with a 27-16 win over the Pittsburgh Steelers last week and will be on the road for the second straight week when they travel to Buffalo to face the Bills. The Patriots will attempt to avenge a 16-0 shutout loss to Buffalo in the first meeting of the season on Oct. 2 at Gillette Stadium and avoid a season sweep. New England has not been swept by a division opponent in 15 seasons, the longest such streak since the 1970 NFL merger. The LA Rams (1970-80) and Dallas Cowboys (1971-81) previously held the mark with 11 consecutive seasons without being swept.

QB Tom Brady has a 25-3 record against Buffalo. He has more wins against the Bills than another team and his 25 wins are the second most by a quarterback against an opponent.

#### SERIES HISTORY





The Patriots and Bills will meet for the 114th time and for the second of two meetings in 2016. Buffalo beat the Patriots 16-0 in the first meeting of the season, shutting out the Patriots for the first time at Gillette stadium on Oct. 2, 2016. It is the first time the Patriots and Bills will play each of the two annual games in the same month since the 1998 season.

The Patriots have gone 15 straight seasons without being swept by a division opponent and will attempt to keep the streak alive with a victory this Sunday.

New England holds a 69-43-1 edge in the series. The Patriots swept the series last season for the 24th time with a 40-32 win at Buffalo on Sept 20, 2015 and a 20-13 win at Gillette Stadium on Nov. 23, 2015.

New England' has swept the series 24 times. The Patriots have won 28 of the last 33 games between the clubs, dating back to the 2000 season.

The series between the AFC East rivals began in 1960. The Patriots' 69 wins over the Bills are their highest victory total over any opponent, ten more than they own over the New York Jets [59].

After seven straight series sweeps and 15 straight Patriots wins, Buffalo ended the streak with a 34-31 victory at Ralph Wilson Stadium in the first meeting of the two teams in 2011 on Sept. 25. The 15-game win streak is the third longest winning streak over a single opponent in NFL history. The Patriots avenged that loss in the 2011 regular season finale on Jan. 1, 2012 by overcoming a 21-0 first quarter deficit and scoring 49 unanswered points en route to a 49-21 victory.

The teams have had many memorable matchups over the years, including a five-game span from 1999 to 2001 where four of the five contests were decided in overtime.

The Buffalo Bills handed the New England Patriots their first ever shutout loss at Gillette stadium with a 16-0 victory.

The first play of the game pretty much summed up the Patriots day. Rookie QB Jacoby Brissett, who made his second straight start, completed a short pass to WR Julian Edelman who turned the play into a 90-yard catch-and-run. However, the play was negated by a pass interference penalty against the Patriots.

The Bills responded with scoring drives on their first three offensive series for a 13-0 first half lead, Buffalo marched on a 12-play, 65-yard drive that ended with a 7-yard touchdown pass from QB Tyrod Taylor to RB LeSean McCoy for a 7-0 first-quarter lead. A 10-play, 52-yard drive ended with a 34-yard field goal early in the second quarter for a 10-0 lead. Buffalo moved 71 yards on the next series before settling for a 43-yard field goal to go in front, 13-0.

Taylor finished the game 27-of-39 for 246 yards with one touchdown and directed a unit that converted 7-of-15 third downs. New England was 1-of-12 on third down attempts.

New England squandered their only scoring opportunity in the first half after a fumble deep inside Buffalo territory. Brissett connected with TE Martellus Bennett on a 58-yard pass play for a first down at the Bills 17-yard line. The Patriots reached the 8-yard line before a holding call pushed them back to the 18. On the next play, Brissett scrambled up the middle before being hit and fumbling the ball to Buffalo.

New England drove into Buffalo territory three more times in the second half, but the drives resulted in a missed field goal, a turnover on downs and the last drive was on the final minutes of the game.

Brissett made his second straight start after QB Jimmy Garoppolo was a game day inactive due to a shoulder injury. He finished 17-of-27 for 205 yards with no touchdowns and no interceptions.

The Patriots allowed 16 first downs by Buffalo in the first half and managed just two first downs. The Patriots had nine penalties and had a total of five fumbles in the game.

The New England Patriots improved to a 6-1 record behind a 127-yard rushing effort by RB LeGarrette Blount that helped the Patriots to a 27-16 victory over the Pittsburgh Steelers at Heinz Field. Blount also scored two rushing touchdowns.

The Patriots broke open a close game in the second half with two big throws from QB Tom Brady to TE Rob Gronkowski. After Pittsburgh closed to within one after a field goal made it 14-13 in the third quarter, Blount had an 11-yard run followed by a 25-yard run, before Brady connected with Gronkowski for a 36-yard touchdown to make it 20-13.

Pittsburgh kicked a field goal early in the fourth quarter on the ensuing drive to close the gap to 20-16, but a 37-yard pass play from Brady to Gronkowski helped get in position for a 5-yard touchdown run by Blount for a 27-16 final.

The Patriots offense was 7-of-12 (58%) on third-down, and held Pittsburgh to 5-of-16 (31%) on third-down.

The Patriots defense held strong after two fumbles were recovered by the Steelers inside New England territory. Pittsburgh failed to score on both turnovers with an intercepted pass in the end zone and a missed field goal.

The Steelers ended the Patriots first drive of the game when LB Jarvis Jones forced and recovered a fumble by WR Chris Hogan at the New England 45-yard line. Pittsburgh moved to the 16-yard line before Patriots CB Malcolm Butler picked off a QB Landry Jones pass intended for WR Antonio Brown in the end zone.

The Patriots took over and engineered a 13-play, 80-yard drive that took over seven minutes before Brady connected with RB James White on a 19-yard touchdown pass for a 7-0 first quarter lead.

New England took a 14-0 lead in the second quarter when Blount scored the first of his two touchdowns on a 3-yard run to culminate an 84-yard drive.

A 51-yard pass from Landry to Brown helped Pittsburgh get in position for 14-yard touchdown pass from Landry to WR Darrius Heyward-Bey on the next drive to make it 14-7. Pittsburgh got into New England territory on its next two drives but missed a field goal before a 32-yard field goal before the end of the half made it 14-10.

Pittsburgh scored a field goal on its first possession in the third quarter to make close to a 1-point New England lead at 14-13. Brady and Gronkowski responded with the 36-yard touchdown pass to make it 20-13 heading into the final quarter of play.

Pittsburgh answered with a field goal to make it 20-16 early in the fourth quarter before Brady and Gronkowski connected on a 37-yard pass to set up a 5-yard touchdown run by Blount for a 27-16 lead.



#### **HOT START FOR PATS**

The Patriots have started the season with at least six wins in their first seven games for the eighth time in team history and for the sixth time under head coach Bill Belichick after the 27-16 win over Pittsburgh pushed the Patriots to a 6-1 start. The Patriots started the season 6-1 in 1974, 1980, 2004, 2006, 2010 and 2016. In 2007, New England started the season 7-0 and in 2015 the Patriots started the season 10-0.

RB LeGarrette Blount scored on a 3-yard touchdown run in the second quarter for his seventh rushing touchdown of the season to match his career single-season high. - \*The Patriots can pass the Oakland Raiders (1973-1977) as the only team to advance to six straight Conference Championship games.
- \*The Patriots have won seven straight division titles [2009-15] to match the Los Angeles Rams [1973-79] for the most consecutive division titles and look to pass that mark in 2016.
- \*The Patriots have 15 straight winning seasons and need one more to tie the San Francisco 49ers (1983-98) and the Dallas Cowboys (1970-85) for the most consecutive winning seasons since the 1970 merger.
- \*The Patriots have qualified for the playoffs for seven straight seasons and can become the fifth team in NFL history to play in a postseason game in at least eight consecutive seasons in 2016.
- \*The Patriots have advanced in the postseason for five straight seasons and need to advance in the postseason in 2016 to match the record of six straight seasons of postseason advancement by the Dallas Cowboys (1991-96).

#### **BILL BELICHICK**

- \*Bill Belichick (6) needs to reach one more Super Bowl as a head coach to break a tie with Don Shula (6) for the most conference titles.
- \*Belichick has four Super Bowl wins as a head coach to match Pittsburgh's Chuck Noll for the most wins. With one more Super Bowl win, Belichick will have the most wins by a head coach in Super Bowl history.
- \*Belichick is tied with Tom Landry and Don Shula with 13 division titles and needs one more division title to set the record for most among all head coaches.
- \*Bill Belichick passed Curly Lambeau for fourth place and now has 229 regular seasons wins. He is behind Don Shula (328), George Halas (318) and Tom Landry (250).
- \*Belichick's Patriots teams have twice recorded five straight years of playoff advancement [2003-07 and 2011-15], tying the NFL record. If the Patriots advance in 2016, they will set the NFL record. John Harbaugh [2008-12], Mike Holmgren [1993-97], John Madden [1973-77] and Andy Reid [2000-04] also won a playoff game in five consecutive seasons.

#### TOM BRADY

- \* Tom Brady (175) needs five more wins to become just the third NFL quarterback with 180 career regular-season wins to join Brett Favre (186) and Peyton Manning (186).
- \*Brady has 197 wins overall (175 in the regular season and 22 in the postseason) and needs four more wins to become the all-time leader for most wins by an NFL quarterback. Peyton Manning (200: 186 in the regular season and 14 in the postseason) and Brett Favre (199: 186 in the regular season and 13 in the postseason) have the most wins in NFL history by a starting quarterback.
- \*If Brady reaches 30 or more touchdowns passes in 2016, he will become just the fourth player in NFL history with 30 or more touchdown passes in seven seasons, joining Brett Favre [9], Peyton Manning [9] and Drew Brees [8].
- \*Brady is tied with Peyton Manning with four seasons with 35 or more touchdowns and needs to reach 35 touchdowns in 2016 for his fifth season with 35 or more touchdowns to become the all-time leader in this category.
- \*Brady is currently fifth on the NFL's all-time list with 59,032 career passing yards and needs 968 yards to become the fifth NFL player to reach 60,000 passing yards.
- \*Brady has passed for 4,000 yards eight times in his career and if he reaches 4,000 yards in 2016, he will be the third player to reach nine seasons with 4,000 yards, joining Peyton Manning [14] and Drew Brees [10].
- \*Brady led the NFL with 36 touchdowns passes in 2015, his fourth time leading the NFL in touchdowns. He tied Drew Brees, Len Dawson, Brett Favre, Peyton Manning, Johnny Unitas and Steve Young for most seasons leading the NFL in touchdown passes.

#### **TOM BRADY (CONT.)**

- \*Brady is in his 17th season in 2016 and became the longest tenured Patriots player, surpassing the 16 seasons by Steve Grogan (1975-90).
- \*Brady's 17 seasons with one team are tied for the most by an NFL quarterback with John Brodie (San Francisco) and Dan Marino (Miami).

#### STEPHEN GOSTKOWSKI

- \*If Stephen Gostkowski leads the NFL in scoring in 2016, he will set the NFL mark for most seasons leading the NFL in scoring with six, moving past Don Hutson (5) and Gino Cappelletti (5). Gostkowski has led the NFL in scoring in 2008 and 2012-15.
- \*Stephen Gostkowski has led the NFL in scoring in each of the last four seasons (2012-15). He can become just the second player to lead the NFL in scoring in five straight seasons in 2016, joining Don Hutson (1940-44).
- $^*\mbox{ln}$  2015, Gostkowski became the first NFL player with four seasons of 150 or more points and can add to that in 2016.
- \*Gostkowski has the second-best field goal percentage in NFL history from 50 yards or more (75.0 percent (18-of-24).
- \*Gostkowski [4] needs one more 30-field goal season to tie David Akers and John Carney for the most in NFL history with five seasons of 30 or more field goals.
- \*Gostkowski has led the NFL in field goals three times (2008, 2013 and 2014). If he leads the NFL in field goals in 2016, he will join Lou Groza (5), Jack Manders (4), Ward Cuff (4) and Mark Moseley (4) as the only NFL players to lead the NFL in field goals in at least four seasons.

#### ROB GRONKOWSKI

- \*Rob Gronkowski is tied with Stanley Morgan for first in team history with 68 total touchdowns and needs one more touchdown to become the Patriots all-time leader in touchdowns.
- \*Gronkowski (67) is tied with Stanley Morgan (67) for most touchdown receptions in team history and needs one more touchdown receotion to become the all-time leader in receiving touchdowns for the Patriots.
- $^*$ Gronkowski (5,930) moved past Irving Fryar vs. Cincinnati (10/16/16) and is now in fourth place on the Patriots all-time receiving list. He is ranked 14th all-time among NFL tight ends in receiving yards.
- \*Gronkowski has 5,930 receiving yards and needs 639 yards to move past Heath Miller (6,569) for 10th place all-time among tight ends.
- $^*\mbox{Gronkowski}$  needs one more 1,000-yard season to join Tony Gonzalez and Jason Witten for the most 1,000-yard seasons by an NFL tight end with four.
- \*Gronkowski has an NFL-leading five seasons with 10 or more touchdowns by a tight end and can add to his record in 2016.
- \*Gronkowski has 66 touchdown receptions from Tom Brady, the second-most TD receptions from a QB and a tight end, behind the 79 by Philip Rivers and Antonio Gates. The 66 TD connections are the seventh most overall.
- \*Gronkowski has 22 100-yard games, including two in 2016 and is tied with-Jackie Smith for the third-most among all NFL tight ends. Only Tony Gonzalez [31] aand Kellen Winslow [24] have more.
- \*Gronkowski has 393 receptions and needs seven more to reach 400 receptions.

#### News & Notes

Since Robert Kraft purchased the team in 1994, the Patriots have experienced one of the most dramatic turnarounds in the history of sports. Now in his 23rd season of ownership, Kraft has transformed one of the league's least successful clubs into what observers view as a model NFL franchise. In the five seasons immediately preceding his purchase (1989-93), the Patriots were a moribund team, winning just 19 of 80 games (.238 pct.) and logging the worst record in the NFL over that span. When he bought the franchise on Jan. 21, 1994, Kraft



announced his intention to bring a championship to New England, a tall order considering the team's previous success rate. But under Kraft's leadership, the Patriots have won more division titles (15), conference crowns (7) and Super Bowl championships (4) than any other NFL team. Super Bowl XLIX was the seventh Super Bowl appearance since Kraft purchased the team, a period during which no other team has earned more than four berths. In Kraft's 22 seasons, the Patriots have qualified for the playoffs 17 times, more than doubling the franchise's accomplishments during its first 34 seasons.

The New England Patriots 2001 season was filled with numerous memorable moments that eventually led up to the team's first Super Bowl championship. As New England travels to Buffalo to take on the Bills this Sunday, specific memories of another game played in Buffalo resurface. On Dec. 16, 2001, the Patriots took the field at Ralph Wilson Stadium, riding a three-game win streak. With the score tied at nine at the end of regulation, the Bills and Patriots headed to overtime to decide the winner of the Week 14 matchup. Five minutes into the extra frame, David Patten caught a pass from Tom Brady at the Buffalo 41-yard line and was hit by Bills DB Keion Carpenter. The ball popped loose and was recovered by Buffalo's Nate Clements. The ruling on the field was a fumble until, upon review, officials determined that Patten's head was out of bounds while the ball remained loose under his leg. From there, Patriots RB Antowain Smith made a run down the sideline and was pushed out of bounds at the 3-yard line, setting up Adam Vinatieri for the game-winning kick. The 23-yard field goal was good, and the Patriots took home the overtime victory.

The Patriots forced two fumbles on kickoffs in the 27-0 win vs. Houston on Sept. 22, 2016.

WR Chris Hogan caught two 40-yard passes (63 and 43) at Cleveland (10/9/16) to become the first Patriots player to do so in a game since Rob Gronkowski (50 and 49) at Washington (12/11/11).

TE Martellus Bennett had his fourth career 100-yard game and his second of the 2016 season after finishing with five receptions for 109 yards vs. Buffalo (10/2/16). Bennett also had 109 yards receiving vs. Miami (9/18/16).

Stephen Gostkowski executed a successful onside kick vs. Washington (11/08/15) and vs. Philadelphia (12/06/15). It was his third (Cleveland -12/08/13 and the fourth in team history. The first came when Jim Lee Hunt recovered a Gino Cappelletti kick at the end of the first half in a 26-10 win vs. the NY Jets (9/27/64).

The Patriots became the first team in NFL history in 2014 to earn five straight first-round byes and extended that record with their sixth straight bye in 2015. Dallas and San Francisco earned four straight byes from 1992 through 1995 and Denver earned four straight from 2012-15.

The Patriots have yet to throw an interception in the first seven games of 2016, setting a new team record with to start a season without a pick. The old mark was the first four games of the 2015 season. The overall team record is eight consecutive contests, set in the second half of the 2010 season. The NFL record to start a season without an interception is nine games set by Cleveland in 1960.

The Patriots and Green Bay Packers are the only teams that have made the playoffs in each of the last seven seasons (2009-2015).

The Patriots have now had at least one rookie free agent make the team in 13 straight seasons (D.J. Foster, Woodrow Hamilton and Jonathan Jones), the second-longest streak to 17 by Indianapolis.

Following a perfect 3-0 record in September in 2016, the Patriots now have 22 undefeated months since 2000, the most in the NFL. Indianapolis is second with 15.

The Patriots special teams in 2016 have the best kickoff unit in the NFL, holding their opponent to an NFL-low starting possession average at the 22.2-yard



Brandon Bolden blocked his first NFL punt in the win at San Diego [12/7/14] to give the Patriots a first down at the Chargers 25-yard line. It was the Patriots first blocked punt since Patrick Chung blocked a punt at Miami on Oct. 4, 2010.



## **OVERCOMING ADVERSITY**

On April 20, 2011, just days before Texas Christian offensive line prospect Marcus Cannon was to enter the NFL Draft, he was diagnosed with non-Hodgkin's lymphoma, a treatable form of cancer found in lymph tissue. A little more than one week later, the Patriots selected Cannon in the fifth round [138th overall] of the draft with the knowledge of his illness. The Patriots placed Cannon on the Reserve/Non Football Injury list to start the 2011 season while he received treatment and recovered. Cannon was activated to the 53-man roster later that year and is now in his fifth season with the team. Cannon made a full recovery and was named the Patriots 2011 Ed Block Courage Award winner - an annual award presented to select players in the National Football League who are voted by their teammates as role models of inspiration, sportsmanship and courage.

Edelman began his college football career with a year at the College of San Mateo [Calif.] before transferring to Kent State where as a senior he completed 56 percent of his passes [153 of 275 passes for 1,820 yards) with 13 touchdowns. He was also the leading rusher, gaining 1,551 yards on 215 attempts [an average of 7.5 yards per carry] and scoring 13 touchdowns. His offensive numbers broke Kent State's single-season record for total offense set by Joshua Cribbs in 2003. Said head coach Bill Belichick on the versatility of Edelman: "He played the quarterback position in college at Kent State and all the positions really that he's played in the NFL – covering kicks, returning kicks, slot receiver, outside receiver, slot defender – he didn't do any of those things in college. I think that really speaks to his versatility and how much he's grown as a player and how many things he's learned how to do that he really didn't have much experience with in college. I'd say that's pretty unusual, especially to be as competent in them as he is."

## EDELMAN TAKES HIS FATHER'S ADVICE

If there is one thing Julian Edelman has never lacked, it's athletic ability. A dual-threat quarterback at Kent State and former baseball standout in high school, Edelman once wowed Toronto Blue Jays players with his impressive footwork while fielding ground balls in an appearance at batting practice in 2011.

This natural ability may have been overlooked by NFL scouts, who let him fall to the Patriots in the seventh round of the 2009 NFL Draft. Edelman remains focused on the lessons his father, Frank Edelman, taught him at a young age. "I'm still constantly trying to learn," Edelman told *The Boston Herald*. "My dad always put it in my head, when you're green, you're growing, when you're ripe, you're lost. When you're done learning, you're done."



## GAROPPOLO MAKES FIRST START





Despite a successful three-year lacrosse career at Penn State, Hogan, also a standout football player in high school, said that playing college football was always in the back of his mind. Having redshirted his sophomore year of lacrosse, Hogan had an extra year of athletic eligibility following his fourth academic year at Penn State. As the football itch still lurked in the back of his mind, Chris played his final year of eligibility with the Monmouth football team, and at the end of the season, joined in on some workouts with teammates who were training for the NFL Combine.

"I honestly didn't know if I had what it took to play in the NFL," Hogan wrote in the Tribune. "Still, it was one of those things where I didn't want to look back in five years and be like, 'Man, I wish I would've tried."

Chris did not get invited to compete in that year's Combine, but turned heads during a Pro Day held at Fordham. Later that summer, he signed with the San Francisco 49ers as an undrafted free agent.

## **ELECTED TEAM LEADER**

Patriots wide receiver Matthew Slater has been named to five straight Pro Bowls (2011-15) for his special teams work, but perhaps more revealing of his value to New England is the fact that he was elected a captain by his teammates for the sixth straight season in 2016.

The special teams ace was willing to share his advice on being a great captain with high school football players in a story published by *The Boston Globe*. "I think first and foremost, you have to be able to put others before yourself. Being a captain and leadership is about serving, and to me, that means a great deal of sacrifice – putting aside personal agendas for the greater common goal. Leadership is equated with sacrifice. I think you have to be willing to do whatever it takes for the unit to succeed. I think you need to lead by example. A lot of times, it's about what you do, not what you say."

### SLATER'S EMERGENCE WAS SPECIAL

Bill Belichick acknowledged Matthew Slater's role as a gunner on special teams: "Matt is one of the best in the league," Belichick said. "Any time the punt return team has to double somebody, that makes it one less guy they can use somewhere else in the return. He almost always draws two guys out there unless they're in an eight-man rush. Most of the time, there's two guys out there — fourth-and-short, where they're trying to protect the box — but he draws a lot of double teams, and deservedly so. He does an outstanding job of covering punts."



## WHITE HAS CAREER DAY

James White set career highs with 10 receptions and 115 receiving yards vs. Philadelphia (12/6/15). White's 115 receiving yards are the second-highest such total for a Patriots running back since the 1970 AFL-NFL merger, trailing only Shane Vereen's team-record 153 receiving yards vs. Cleveland on Dec. 8, 2013. White's 10 catches are the third highest such total of the Bill Belichick era for a running back (since 2000), trailing only Shane Vereen's club record 12 catches vs. Cleveland on Dec. 8, 2013, and Kevin Faulk's 11 catches vs. Tampa Bay on Sept. 3, 2000.

## **JAMIE COLLINS' JOURNEY**



The road to the NFL has been anything but easy for linebacker and 2013 second-round draft pick Jamie Collins. The youngest of five siblings growing up in Meadville, Miss., Collins lost both of his parents when he was six years old and was raised by one of his sisters, who was in her mid 20s.

Collins turned to football as an outlet to help him through the tough times. "It means a lot. It's my living," Collins told *The Boston Herald.* "It kept me on track." Collins' resiliency in dealing with adversity has made a lasting impact on fellow Mississippi native and former Patriots RB Stevan

Ridley, who grew up 30 miles west of Meadville in Natchez, Miss., and got to know Collins through a family friend. "What I've known about him, he really has been a strong person," Ridley told the *Herald*. "Anybody that's gone through the things that he's gone through and can still find a way to be successful on the football field, you have to be mentally tough. That's what he's kind of done as a teammate here. He's come in here and accepted his role and did a pretty good job as a rookie."

## **COLLINS SETS CAREER HIGH**

LB Jamie Collins set a career high with 2 1/2 sacks in the win at Buffalo on Sept. 20, 2015. It was his second career multi-sack game. He registered his first NFL two-sack game at San Diego [12/7/14].

## **TEAM LEADER**

Collins had a standout second season in 2014. He led the team in total tackles (109), forced fumbles (4) and fumble recoveries (2), and tied for the team lead in interceptions (2).

#### **COLLINS CAME TO PLAY**

Collins notched an interception his second straight game vs. Houston [9/22/16], bringing his regular-season interception total to five. He has two additional interceptions in the postseason. Collins also finished with an personal-best of 14 total tackles in the Texans game, besting his previous high of 13 vs. NY Jets on Oct. 16, 2014 and at Green Bay on Nov. 30, 2014.

### **COLLINS BLOCKS FIRST XP SINCE 2008**

LB Jamie Collins blocked a fourth quarter extra point at Indianapolis (10/18/15). It was the Patriots first blocked extra point since Vince Wilfork blocked a PAT at Oakland on Dec. 14, 2008. It is Collins' second blocked kick. He blocked a field goal attempt vs. Miami on Dec. 14, 2014.



## MAKING THE OLYMPICS



On July 18, Nate Ebner was selected to the 2016 U.S. Olympic Rugby squad and after he was given an excused leave of absence from his football obligations in Foxboro, suited up for Team USA in Rio de Janeiro in August. The Dublin, Ohio native was introduced to the sport of rugby around the age of six and developed a passion and a talent that stemmed from his father and role model, Jeff Ebner, who played the game at the University of Minnesota. Nate did not play football in high school but was a two-time MVP of the USA Rugby team at the Junior World Cup and a standout on the U19 and U20 national teams.

Although his parents were divorced, Nate and his father remained very close. "We were super tight," Nate told the Boston Globe. "I would put my father-son relationship against anyone's. He taught me how to be a man." The two often spent time working together at the family's auto reclamation business, Ebner & Sons in Springfield, Ohio, and would also train in the gym together behind the motto, "Finish Strong," - a message Jeff always preached to his son.

Nate played rugby at Ohio State during his first two years of college, but as an All-American on the school's club team, he decided to walk on to the Buckeyes football team and finish his career with his sights set on reaching the NFL.

McCourty's identical twin brother, Jason, is a cornerback with Tennessee, selected in the sixth round of the 2009 NFL Draft. The two are the 12th set of twins to play in the NFL. Devin redshirted for the 2005 season and therefore was a year behind his brother in eligibility. McCourty is the second twin to suit up for the Patriots, after CB Kato Serwanga was a member of the team from 1998-2000. His twin brother, Wasswa, played for San Francisco and Minnesota from 1999-2001. According to McCourty's mother, the two can only be told apart by tiny scars on their faces left by chickenpox. The McCourty twins are one of two active sets of twins playing in the NFL.

## WHERE DID HE COME FROM?

Rob Ninkovich's journey to the Patriots was not easy. He entered the league as a fifth-round pick by the Saints in 2006 and was waived four times by New Orleans and Miami before landing in New England on Aug. 2, 2009. He spent the 2009 offseason trying to make the New Orleans team as a long snapper. Before coming to the Patriots, he had appeared in just eight games over three seasons. He doubled that total in his first year in New England, appearing in 15 games in 2009 and his role on the team has grown since, earning a starting role at linebacker in 2010 and 2011 before moving to a starting role on the defensive line in 2011.

## **CAREER DAY IN BUFFALO**

Ninkovich finished with a three-sack game for the first time in his career in the win at Buffalo (10/12/14), He has had two two-sack performances - vs. Miami (1/2/11) and at Carolina (11/18/13).

#### CRAZY EIGHTS

Ninkovich had eight sacks in three consecutive seasons from 2012-14, becoming the first Patriots player to have at least eight sacks in three consecutive seasons since Pro Football Hall of Famer Andre Tippett achieved the feat from 1985-87 (1985,  $16\frac{1}{2}$ , 1986,  $9\frac{1}{2}$  and 1987,  $12\frac{1}{2}$ ).

## NINKOVICH SCORED AS A TE IN COLLEGE

Ninkovich played some at tight end in college at Purdue and caught two touchdown passes with a 2-yard touchdown pass from Buffalo QB Kyle Orton and a 1-yard touchdown pass from former New York Giants and Indianapolis QB Curtis Painter.

# DB LOGAN RYAN AND DB DURON HARMON

## **CLASSMATES REUNITE IN NEW ENGLAND**

Defensive backs Logan Ryan and Duron Harmon are used to working together. Ryan and Harmon began their college football careers together as members of the same recruiting class at Rutgers University and developed a close friendship during their four years in Piscataway, N.J. As fate would have it, Ryan and Harmon would begin their NFL journeys together as well when the Patriots selected the two defensive backs just eight picks apart in the third round of the 2013 NFL Draft.

Reunited once again, the former Scarlet Knights are excited and eager to make their mark, just as they did at Rutgers. "We talked before the draft and said how good it would be to play on the same team again, and for it to happen again, it's exciting and it's a blessing," Harmon told *The Boston Globe.* "It's great [we're contributing], because at the end of the day you want to play, and to contribute to a team like this, it's fun."

## **RYAN RETURNS... TO SCHOOL**

When Logan Ryan decided to leave Rutgers and enter the NFL Draft after his redshirt junior season in 2012, he made a promise to his parents that after his rookie year, he would return to school and earn his degree.

Ryan kept his promise and graduated in the spring of 2014 with a degree in labor relations and a minor in psychology.

"I committed to Rutgers, not only as a football player, but as a student, so I was going to make sure I finished that end too," Ryan told NJ.com.

"It's a big accomplishment in my life. I held my word to my parents and stuck with it and I'm fortunate. It took a lot of work, but I was able to go back and finish and walk in graduation."

### **SCORING FLURRY**

The Patriots scored three touchdowns in a 57-second span during the final two minutes of the first half against Chicago on Oct. 26, 2014 to turn a 17-7 lead into a 38-7 cushion. It was the fastest three-touchdown flurry in the NFL since the Patriots had three touchdowns in 52 seconds against the New York Jets on Nov. 22, 2012. The Patriots are one of three teams to score three touchdowns in under a minute since the 1970 merger, and are the only team to have achieved the feat twice.

- ★ On the Bears' first play following the LaFell touchdown, Zach Moore forced a Jay Cutler fumble that was recovered by Rob Ninkovich and returned for a 15yard touchdown and a 38-7 Patriots lead with 55 seconds left in the first half.

## A COMEBACK FOR THE AGES

The Patriots came back from a 24-point deficit to defeat the Broncos, 34-31, in overtime in a Sunday Night Football matchup on Nov. 24, 2013, marking the largest comeback win in team history, after trailing 24-0 at halftime.

New England's previous best comeback win was from a 23-0 deficit to win, 38-23, vs. Seattle (9/16/84). The Patriots also came back from 22 points down to win at the New York Giants, 23-22 (12/21/96). The Patriots have come from 21 points down to win four times, most recently vs. Buffalo (1/1/12).





## PATRIOTS IN THE PLAYOFFS

The Patriots have qualified for the playoffs 23 times in their 56-year history. Seventeen of those playoff berths have come in the 22 seasons since Robert Kraft purchased the team in 1994, a dramatic contrast to the six total playoff berths the team earned in its first 34 years of existence. The Patriots have won 18 division crowns, including 13 in the last 15 seasons, and have qualified as a Wild Card team four times (1976, 1985, 1994 and 1998). The Patriots also qualified for the playoffs in 1982 during the strike season.
