CAROLINA PANTHERS (3-5) vs. KANSAS CITY CHIEFS (6-2)

CAROLINA AND KANSAS CITY FACE OFF FOR FIRST TIME SINCE 2012

CAROLINA VS. KANSAS CITY

Carolina returns to Bank of America Stadium to take on the Kansas City Chiefs on Sunday.

The Panthers enter the game on a two-game winning streak following a 13-10 victory at Los Angeles (11/6/16). Linebacker Thomas Davis contributed 12 tackles, a strip-sack and an interception against the Rams, and defensive end Mario Addison notched two sacks to lead a defensive effort that keyed the Panthers to victory.

Kansas City enters this week's game following a 19-14 victory over the Jacksonville Jaguars at Arrowhead Stadium. Kansas City is 6-2 on the year and brings a four-game winning streak to Charlotte.

The Panthers and Chiefs are meeting for the sixth time in history. Kansas City holds a 3-2 advantage in the all-time series, including a 27-21 victory in the most recent meeting in Kansas City (12/2/12).

- Panthers head coach Ron Rivera was the linebackers coach for the Philadelphia Eagles from 1999-2003, under current Chiefs head coach Andy Reid, who held the same position in Philadelphia from 1999-2012.

- Panthers running game coordinator John Matsko was a member of the Chiefs coaching staff from 2006-07.
- Panthers special teams coordinator Thomas McGaughey served as an assistant special teams coach for the Chiefs in 2002.
- Panthers tight ends coach Pete Hoener was on the University of Missouri coaching staff from 1975-76.
- Panthers safety Kurt Coleman played for Kansas City in 2014, prior to joining Carolina.
- Panthers defensive end Kony Ealy is from New Madrid, Mo., and played collegiately at Missouri.
- Panthers defensive tackle Kyle Love appeared in one game for the Chiefs in 2013.
- Chiefs co-offensive coordinator Matt Nagy played quarterback for the Carolina Cobras of the Arena Football League in 2004.
- Chiefs defensive coordinator Bob Sutton coached the running backs at N.C. State in 1982.
- Chiefs assistant special teams coach Brock Olivo was the running backs and assistant special teams coach for Coastal Carolina from 2012-13.
- Chiefs defensive back Ron Parker spent time with the Panthers during the 2012 season, appearing in three games. Parker is originally from St. Helena Island, S.C., and played collegiately at Newberry.

THE HEAD COACHES

Ron Rivera became the fourth coach in Carolina Panthers history on January 11, 2011.

In five seasons, Rivera has guided the team to a Super Bowl appearance, an NFC Championship and three NFC South titles. He is a two-time (2013 and 2015) Associated Press NFL Coach of the Year award winner.

In 2015, Rivera led the Panthers to the second Super Bowl appearance in team history following a franchise-best 15-1 record and their third consecutive NFC South championship. In the process, Carolina became the fourth team in the Super Bowl era to start a season 14-0, joining the 1972 Miami Dolphins, 2007 New England Patriots and 2009 Indianapolis Colts. Carolina's 18-game regular season winning streak was the longest in NFC history. In 2014, Rivera led the Panthers to their second consecutive NFC South championship and the team's first playoff win since 2005. The Panthers became the first team since 1970 to overcome a six-game losing streak and win their division. In 2013, Rivera directed Carolina to 12 wins, the NFC South title and its first playoff appearance since 2008.

Before joining the Panthers, Rivera was an assistant coach with the San Diego Chargers (2007-2010), Chicago Bears (2004-06, 1997-98) and Philadelphia Eagles (1999-2003). In 2006, the Bears defense led the NFL with 44 takeaways, helping propel Chicago to an appearance in Super Bowl XLI. He is just the third Latino head coach in NFL history, joining Tom Flores with the Oakland Raiders (1979-1987) and Seattle Seahawks (1992-94) and Tom Fears with the New Orleans Saints (1967-1970).

A second-round draft choice in 1984 by Chicago, Rivera played nine seasons with the Bears. Primarily an outside linebacker, he was a member of the 1985 Super Bowl XX winning team.

Rivera played linebacker at Cal (1980-83), where he finished as the school's all-time leader in sacks (22) and tackles (336).

Born January 7, 1962 in Fort Ord, Calif., Rivera and his wife, Stephanie, have two children—Christopher and Courtney.

Andy Reid was named the 13th head coach in Kansas City Chiefs history on January 7, 2013. He is in his 25th season in the National Football League and his 18th season as an NFL head coach in 2016.

In his third season with the Chiefs, Reid and company tallied 11 wins, bringing his total to 31 victories in his first three seasons with Kansas City. Additionally, Reid led the Chiefs to their first playoff win since 1993, with a win at Houston in the Wild Card round of the 2015 playoffs. In his first season in Kansas City in 2013, Reid helped orchestrate the franchise's best single-season turnaround as the Chiefs won 11 games and made the playoffs after going 2-14 the previous season.

Prior to joining the Chiefs, Reid served as the head coach of the Philadelphia Eagles for 14 years (1999-2012), earning NFL Coach of the Year honors three times. Reid compiled the best win total (140) and playoff victory total (10) in Philadelphia Eagles history. He captured six division titles and five trips to the NFC Championship Game.

In his 24-year NFL coaching career, Reid's teams have made the playoffs 17 times (19-16 record). He has coached in the Super Bowl three times and the NFC Championship Game nine times.

Reid was an assistant coach with Green Bay (1992-98) under Mike Holmgren. With Green Bay, Reid helped the Packers earn a Super Bowl XXXI victory over New England.

Reid coached at Brigham Young (1982), San Francisco State (1983-85) Northern Arizona (1986), Texas-El Paso (1987-88) and Missouri (1989-1991). Reid was an offensive tackle and guard on three BYU Cougar Holiday Bowl teams. Reid graduated with a bachelor's degree in physical education. He also received a master's degree in professional leadership in physical education and athletics.

Born March 19, 1958 in Los Angeles, Calif., Reid and his wife Tammy have five children—Britt, Crosby, Drew Ann, Spencer, the late Garrett, and grandson, Maverick.

GAME SUMMARY

KANSAS CITY 27, CAROLINA 21

DECEMBER 2, 2012 • ARROWHEAD STADIUM • KANSAS CITY, Mo.

Kansas City quarterback Brady Quinn completed 19-of-23 passes for 201 yards and two touchdowns leading the Chiefs to a 27-21 victory. Each offense started the game with a six-play scoring drive. Kansas City running back Peyton Hillis found the end zone on a 2-yard run, and Carolina quickly countered when quarterback Cam Newton connected with tight end Greg Olsen for a 47-yard touchdown. A 42-yard field goal from Ryan Succop gave the Chiefs a 10-7 lead, but the Panthers carried their momentum on offense into the second quarter. An 11-play drive was culminated by a 23-yard touchdown catch by Steve Smith in the left corner of the end zone. The Chiefs then proceeded to methodically drive downfield, using all of the 7:25 that remained in the first half. After calling a timeout with two seconds left, Kansas City faced fourth-and-goal from the 1-yard line on the 13th play of the drive. Quinn executed a play-action fake and located tight end Tony Moeaki open in the back of the end zone to give the Chiefs a 17-14 advantage at the half. Carolina threatened to regain the lead on its opening possession of the third quarter, but a dropped pass on what would have been a big gain forced a punt. Kansas City responded with another meticulous scoring drive. The Chiefs moved 87 yards in 17 plays, converting two fourth-and-1 opportunities in the process. Wide receiver Jonathan Baldwin extended the lead to 24-14 with a 3-yard touchdown catch with 2:56 remaining in the third quarter. Wide receiver Louis Murphy cut into the lead with an 8-yard touchdown grab at the start of the fourth quarter, but that proved to be the only score the Panthers produced in the second half. Succop's 52-yard field goal gave the Chiefs a six-point lead with 4:54 remaining. Kansas City then took over on its own 30-yard line with 3:47 left and the Chiefs churned valuable time off the clock before a punt pinned the Panthers at their own 14-yard line with 30 seconds left. Smith hauled in a 53-yard catch at the Chiefs' 8-yard line but there was no time left.

Linebacker Thomas Davis was productive in Week Nine at Los Angeles, contributing 12 tackles, one sack, one forced fumble and an interception.

In the second quarter, Davis was credited with a strip-sack of Rams quarterback Case Keenum that forced a punt. The forced fumble was the 16th of Davis' career, tying him with Mike Minter (1997-2006) for the third-most in Panthers franchise history.

OLSEN FINDS THE END ZONE

In Week Nine at Los Angeles (11/6/16), tight end Greg Olsen scored his third touchdown of the season and his first since Week Four at Atlanta (10/2/16).

Olsen, who leads NFL tight ends in receptions (45) and receiving yards (673) this season, has 52 career receiving touchdowns and needs one more to tie Dallas Clark (53 from 2003-13) for 10th in NFL history among tight ends.

Olsen has registered at least 500 yards in six consecutive seasons (2011-16) and eight of the past nine (2008-09, 2011-16).

STEWART REACHES 6,000

In Week Eight vs. Arizona (10/30/16), running back Jonathan Stewart surpassed the 6,000 career rushing yards mark.

Stewart (6,109) joins DeAngelo Williams (6,846 from 2006-14) as the only backs in team history with at least 6,000 rushing yards.

Stewart missed three games this season due to a hamstring injury, but he stands just 737 yards behind DeAngelo Williams for the team's all-time mark.

Last season, Stewart's 989 rushing yards ranked eighth in the NFL. He rushed a career-high 242 times, the seventh-most in the NFL. Stewart's six touchdowns are his most since he tallied 10 touchdowns in back-to-back seasons in 2008 and 2009.

BENJAMIN PRODUCING IN RETURN

Wide receiver Kelvin Benjamin, the Panthers first-round draft choice in 2014, returned to the lineup in Week One at Denver (9/8/16) after missing all of last season with a knee injury.

This season, Benjamin has totaled 36 receptions for 543 yards and four touchdowns.

In 2014, Benjamin ranked third among NFL rookies with 1,008 receiving yards, 73 receptions and nine receiving touchdowns. Fifty of Benjamin's 73 catches resulted in first downs, second among rookies to only New York Giants receiver Odell Beckham, Jr. (57).

That season Benjamin and tight end Greg Olsen finished the year tied for the team lead with 1,008 receiving yards, becoming the first pair of Panthers to each gain 1,000 receiving yards in a single season since Muhsin Muhammad and Patrick Jeffers in 1999.

Benjamin's numbers are the best by a rookie in Panthers history, surpassing Keary Colbert's numbers in 2004 (47 for 754 and five).

OLSEN LEADS THE WAY AT TIGHT END

In 2015, Greg Olsen tallied a career-high 1,104 receiving yards, his second consecutive season with 1,000 yards. He is the seventh tight end in NFL history with consecutive 1,000-yard seasons. Olsen is seeking to become the first tight end in NFL history to record three consecutive 1,000-yard seasons.

With 673 receiving yards this season, Olsen has registered at least 500 yards in eight of the past nine seasons (2008-09, 2011-16). Olsen is on pace for his fifth consecutive season with at least 800 yards and is aiming for the fourth consecutive 70-catch season and the seventh 50-catch season of his career.

Olsen's seven touchdown catches in 2015 made him the only active NFL tight end with five or more touchdowns in every season since 2008 (2008-15).

Newton is one of just three players in NFL history, along with Peyton Manning of the Indianapolis Colts from 1998-2002 and Andy Dalton of the Cincinnati Bengals from 2011-15, to have at least 3,000 passing yards in each of their first five seasons.

Newton rushed for 636 yards in 2015, his fifth consecutive of at least 500 rushing yards. On Aug. 30, Carolina acquired punter Andy Lee and a 2017 seventh-round draft choice in a trade with the Cleveland Browns, in exchange for a 2018 fourth-round draft choice and punter Kasey Redfern.

In Lee's first game as a Panther in Week One at Denver (9/8/16), he established a Panthers single-game record with a 63.0-yard gross average and also recorded the longest punt in team history, a 76-yarder.

A 13-year NFL veteran, Lee is a four-time All-Pro (2007, 2009, 2011, 2012) and a three-time Pro Bowler (2007, 2009, 2011).

Lee ranks ninth all-time in gross punting average (46.3), 11th all-time in net average (39.5) and eighth all-time in punts inside the 20 (343) in NFL history.

In 2015, Lee set Browns single-season records with a 46.7-yard gross average and a 40.1-yard net average. He punted 70 times with 25 punts inside the 20-yard line.

In 2011, Lee recorded the second-best single-season net punting average in league history (44.0). He followed that performance with a 43.2 net punting average in 2012, the sixth-best single-season average in NFL history. In 2007, Lee recorded 42 punts downed inside the 20, which is tied for the third-best total in NFL history.

GANO GETS HIS KICKS



Graham Gano

In Week Three vs. Minnesota kicker Graham Gano scored four points to pass wide receiver Steve Smith (454 from 2001-13) for second on the franchise's all-time points scored list. Gano has 488 points in his Panthers career (2012-present). John Kasay (1,482 from 1995-2010) is the franchise's all-time leader.

In Week Two vs. San Francisco (9/18/16), Gano set a career high with 16 points by converting all four field goal attempts and

four of five PATs (one was blocked).

Last season, Gano set the Panthers franchise record with 146 points in 2015, surpassing John Kasay's previous record of 145 in 1996. Gano's 146 points ranked second in the NFL behind New England's Stephen Gostkowski (151).

Gano made 30-of-36 field goals in 2015. The 30 field goals tied for fifth-most in the NFL and third-most in a season in team history. Gano kicked two game-winning field goals (final two minutes of the fourth quarter or in overtime) in 2015.

Gano earned his first career Player of the Month Award, garnering NFC Special Teams Player of the Month for November

In addition to his field goal abilities, Gano has been important in the field position game. Since the start of 2013, Gano leads the NFL with a 74.1 touchback percentage.

In 2014, Gano placed 61 of his 79 kickoffs resulted in touchbacks. The 77.2 percent touchback rate was best in the League and his 61 kickoffs were the most in the NFC.

In 2013, 63 of Gano's 79 kickoffs resulted in touchbacks. His 79.7 touchback percentage was the top mark in the NFL that season and is the highest percentage in a season since Brad Daluiso in 1992 (81.3 percent).
