### Cleveland Browns (0-10) vs. Pittsburgh Steelers (4-5)

#### NOTABLE STORYLINES

The Browns return to action when they host the Steelers at 1:00 p.m. on Sunday, Nov. 20. The Steelers hold a 68-58 advantage in the all-time regular season series. The teams will face off again in Week 17. This contest opens the first of three consecutive home games for the Browns.

LB **Christian Kirksey** registered a game-high 13 tackles against the Ravens. According to NFL.com, Kirksey leads the league with 94 total tackles this season.

Rookie QB **Cody Kessler** has attempted 119 consecutive passes without an interception, the second-longest streak by a Browns rookie. His 1,241 passing yards this season are the fifth-most by a Browns rookie and his 95.7 passer rating is second among all NFL rookies this season.

DB **Joe Haden** recorded his team-leading third interception of the season against the Ravens. All three have come against Baltimore. He is tied for third in the NFL in interceptions this season. Haden has 19 career interceptions since joining the Browns as a first-round pick in 2010. His 99 career passes defended are the most by a Brown since figures were first tracked in 1992.

WR **Terrelle Pryor Sr.** recorded five receptions for 48 yards against the Ravens. He leads the team this year in receptions (51), receiving yards (627) and receiving touchdowns (four). He is also tied for the team lead with five total touchdowns (four receiving and one rushing).

Rookie DB **Brian Boddy-Calhoun** recorded his second interception of the season against Baltimore. With two interceptions this season, he is tied for the most among all NFL rookies. He is also one of two rookies this season with an INT-TD and one of three rookies with at least one sack and one interception this season.

LB **Jamie Collins Sr.**, who was acquired via trade from New England prior to Week 9, has made his impact felt in his two games with the Browns. He has recorded 17 tackles, one sack and three tackles for loss while playing every defensive snap.

LT **Joe Thomas** has been selected to the Pro Bowl in each of his first nine NFL seasons. He is the eighth player in NFL history to make the Pro Bowl in his first nine seasons. The other seven players are in the Pro Football Hall of Fame. Thomas is tied with Hall of Famers **Jim Brown** and **Lou Groza** for the most Pro Bowl selections in team history.

### Coaching capsules:

**Cleveland -- Hue Jackson:** 8-18, second season as head coach, first with the Browns.

Hue Jackson was named the 16th full-time head coach in Cleveland Browns history on January 13, 2016. He is in his 30th year as a coach, including the last 16 in the NFL. He has spent nine seasons coaching in the AFC North, during which time he helped his team advance to the postseason seven times. Jackson was head coach of the Oakland Raiders in 2011 and guided the team to an 8-8 record. He has also served as offensive coordinator in Washington (2003), Atlanta (2007), Oakland (2010) and Cincinnati (2014-15). Jackson spent 14 years coaching on the college level and was a quarterback at Pacific from 1985-86.

**Pittsburgh -- Mike Tomlin:** 102-62, 10th season as head coach. Named the 16th head coach in Steelers history when he replaced Bill Cowher on Jan. 22, 2007. Became the youngest coach (36 years, 323 days) in NFL history to win a Super Bowl when the Steelers defeated the Arizona Cardinals, 27-23, in Super Bowl XLIII on Feb. 1, 2009. Tomlin was the Minnesota Vikings defensive coordinator in 2006 after spending the previous five seasons (2001-05) as defensive backs coach for the Tampa Bay Buccaneers. Tomlin coached one of the top defensive backfields in the NFL for the Buccaneers, culminating with its performance in Super Bowl XXXVII.

## ON DECK

The Browns continue their three-game home stand when they host the Giants at 1:00 p.m. on Sunday, Nov. 27. The Browns own a 26-20-2 advantage in the all-time regular season series, including a 14-10 mark at home. The last time the team met in Cleveland, the Browns captured a 35-14 victory on Monday, Oct. 13, 2008.



## NOTABLE CONNECTIONS

- Defensive coordinator **Ray Horton** was the Steelers' assistant defensive backs coach from 2004-06, and later served as the defensive backs coach from 2007-10. During his tenure in Pittsburgh, he helped the Steelers defense rank in the top 10 in the NFL in total defense each season, including leading the NFL on three occasions (2004, 2007-08). He also helped the Steelers to victories in Super Bowls XL and XLIII.

- Running backs coach/run game coordinator **Kirby Wilson** spent seven seasons (2007-13) as the Steelers running backs coach. He helped guide RBs Willie Parker (2007) and Rashard Mendenhall (2009-10) to 1,000 yard rushing seasons.

- Pittsburgh defensive coordinator **Keith Butler** coached the Browns linebackers from 1999-02.

- Steelers wide receivers coach **Richard Mann** held the same position with the Browns from 1985-93.

- Pittsburgh assistant head coach/defensive line coach **John Mitchell** spent three seasons (1991-93) in Cleveland coaching the defensive line.

- Steelers DB **Justin Gilbert** was originally drafted by the Browns in the first round (8th overall) of the 2014 NFL Draft. He appeared in 23 games with three starts. He was traded by the Browns to the Steelers on Sept. 3, 2016.

- Steelers LB **James Harrison** (Kent State), DE **Cameron Heyward** (Ohio State), DE **Ricardo Mathews** (Cincinnati), S **Mike Mitchell** (Ohio), FB **Roosevelt Nix** (Kent State), QB **Ben Roethlisberger** (Miami), and LB **Ryan Shazier** (Ohio State) played collegiately in Ohio.

- Steelers RB **Le'Veon Bell** (Reynoldsburg), LB **James Harrison** (Akron), OL **Brian Mihalik** (Avon Lake), FB **Roosevelt Nix** (Reynoldsburg), QB **Ben Roethlisberger** (Cory Rawson), and RB **Fitzgerald Toussaint** (Youngstown) are Ohio natives.

- DB **Ibraheim Campbell** (Philadelphia), WR **Andrew Hawkins** (Johnstown), DL **Carl Nassib** (West Chester), and WR **Terrelle Pryor Sr.** (Jeannette) are Pennsylvania natives.

## WHAT TO LOOK FOR THIS WEEK

With 100 rushing yards by a player other than Isaiah Crowell or Kevin Hogan, the Browns could record 100-yard rushing games from three different players in the same season for the first time since 2003 when William Green, Lee Suggs and Jamel White recorded 100-yard games on the ground.

### RB Isaiah Crowell

With a 100-yard game on the ground, Crowell would become the first Brown to run for 100 yards or more three times in a season since Trent Richardson in 2012.

With 100 rushing yards and a score on the ground, Crowell would be the first Brown to rush for 100 yards or more and a touchdown three times in a season since Peyton Hillis accomplished the feat four times in 2010.

With 49 rushing yards, would be the first Browns player to rush for at least 600 yards in three consecutive seasons since Kevin Mack in 1985-87.

### DB Joe Haden

With one pass defended, Haden will have recorded 100 in his career. He currently leads the league with 99 passes defended since entering the league in 2010.

### RB Duke Johnson Jr.

With one or more receptions, Johnson will become the first Browns running back to record 40 or more receptions in multiple seasons since Jamel White accomplished the feat from 2001-03.

### QB Cody Kessler

Kessler has attempted 119 consecutive passes without an interception. With 16 more, he would pass Bernie Kosar (134 in 1985) for the longest streak by a Browns rookie. With 32 more he would pass Brady Quinn (150 in 2009) for the fifth-longest streak by a Brown.

Kessler has thrown for 1,241 yards, fifth-most by a Browns rookie. With 335 more he would pass Colt McCoy (1,576 in 2010) for fourth and with 338 more he would pass Bernie Kosar (1,578 in 1985) for third.

### OL Joe Thomas

Has started all 154 career games and has not missed an offensive snap since joining the Browns as the third overall selection of the 2007 draft. His consecutive snaps streak of 9,550 is the longest active stretch in the league.

## STEELERS 28 BROWNS 12

In the 2015 season finale, the Steelers defeated the Browns, 28-12, at FirstEnergy Stadium. The Browns were within reach in the fourth quarter, down five points, but were unable to complete the comeback. Pittsburgh notched the first points of the game when Steelers QB Ben Roethlisberger found Steelers TE Heath Miller for a 2-yard score on the team's second offensive possession. The Browns responded in the first quarter after DB Jordan Poyer intercepted Roethlisberger and returned it to the Steelers 24-yard line. Six plays later, K Travis Coons kicked a 29-yard field goal, making the score 7-3. Coons added a 39-yard field goal at the two-minute warning. Six plays and 80 yards later, Roethlisberger connected with Steelers WR Antonio Brown for a 17-yard score to extend their lead, 14-6. The Browns answered as QB Austin Davis orchestrated a nine-play, 65-yard scoring drive in 58 seconds, capped with a 33-yard Coons field goal, making the score 14-9 at half. LB Craig Robertson picked off Roethlisberger and returned it 38 yards to the Steelers 9-yard line, but Steelers LB James Harrison picked off Davis on 3rd-and-goal to keep Cleveland out of the end zone. Following the takeaway, Pittsburgh drove 74 yards in seven plays to set up a K Chris Boswell 39-yard field goal, extending its lead to 17-9. The Browns responded with a 17-play, 62-yard drive, capped with Coons' fourth field goal of the day, bringing the Browns within five points, at 17-12. Two turnovers plagued the Browns comeback late in the fourth quarter, as the Steelers capitalized on a Roethlisberger to WR Marcus Wheaton TD, plus a two-point conversion to Steelers RB Fitzgerald Toussaint. Boswell kicked a final field goal with 7:43 remaining to seal the Pittsburgh victory, 28-12.

# TEAM NOTES

## HORTON RETURNS TO BROWNS

This season **Ray Horton** rejoined the Browns as defensive coordinator. Horton has been an NFL defensive coordinator the past five seasons, including the 2013 season when he served as the Browns defensive coordinator. Horton orchestrated one of the best defensive turnarounds in Cleveland history. After finishing 23rd in the league the previous year, the Browns ranked ninth in the league in total defense in 2013, marking the team's best finish since 1994. The Browns limited opponents to an average of 3.9 yards per carry, which ranked eighth in the NFL and marked Cleveland's best total in 18 years. The Browns defense also registered 40 sacks, their most since 2001. Horton has coached in the NFL the past 22 seasons following a 10-year playing career as a defensive back. As a player and coach, he has made it to the Super Bowl five times, where he has three wins.

## HAMILTON JOINS STAFF

**Pep Hamilton** joined the Browns as associate head coach – offense this season. He works closely with the quarterbacks. Hamilton spent 2013-14 and the first eight weeks of the 2015 season as the offensive coordinator for the Colts. In his two full seasons as coordinator, Indianapolis went 11-5 each year, won two AFC South division titles and advanced to the postseason each year, including a trip to the AFC Championship game in 2014. Prior to joining the Colts, Hamilton spent three seasons (2010-12) at Stanford, serving as the offensive coordinator and quarterbacks coach the final two years. Hamilton also served as the quarterbacks coach for the Chicago Bears from 2007-09.

## WILSON SPEARHEADS RUN GAME

Earlier this year, **Kirby Wilson** was named the Browns running backs coach/run game coordinator. He has 18 years of experience coaching running backs in the NFL, during which time he has coached five running backs who rank in the top 25 for career rushing yards (Emmitt Smith #1, Curtis Martin #4, Edgerrin James #11, Adrian Peterson #17 and Thomas Jones #25) and two of the top four all-time reception leaders among running backs (Larry Centers #1 and Keith Byers #4). Wilson has helped seven different running backs break the 1,000-yard plateau a total of eight times. He has mentored four players to the Pro Bowl and has been to the playoffs with four different franchises, highlighted by the 2002 Buccaneers and 2008 Steelers Super Bowl victories. Wilson's teams have won six division titles and advanced to the postseason eight times.

## RADIO BROADCAST

In one of the most expansive radio rights deals in the NFL, the Browns in 2013 entered a long-term partnership with two local all-sports stations, CBS Radio's 92.3 The Fan (WKRK-FM) and ESPN 850 WKNR, to broadcast all Browns games. CBS Radio's WNCX (98.5 FM) will also carry live game action, as the team will have a triplecast of games in the local market. The stations will serve as the flagship stations on the PNC Bank Cleveland Browns Radio Network. In addition to game broadcasts, more than 1,000 hours of Browns-related shows will air on the PNC Bank Cleveland Browns Radio Network on an annual basis.

# HEAD COACH HUE JACKSON



Hue Jackson was named the 16th full-time head coach in Cleveland Browns history by Owners Dee and Jimmy Haslam on January 13, 2016. He brings 29 years of coaching experience, including the last 15 in the NFL. He has spent nine seasons coaching in the AFC North, during which time he helped his team advance to the postseason seven times. Jackson was head coach of the Oakland Raiders in 2011 and guided the team to an 8-8 record. He has also served as offensive coordinator in Washington (2003), Atlanta (2007), Oakland (2010) and Cincinnati

(2014-15).

Jackson has spent the past four seasons with the Cincinnati Bengals. During that time, he helped the Bengals to two division titles and a trip to the postseason all four years. In 2012, he served as secondary/assistant special teams coach before coaching the running backs in 2013. Jackson spent the past two seasons (2014-15) as offensive coordinator.

With Jackson as coordinator in 2015, the Bengals offense finished third in the AFC in yards per play (5.7) and points per game (26.2). He was voted by the Professional Football Writers of America (PFWA) as the Co-Assistant Coach of the Year as quarterback Andy Dalton set a career high and franchise record with a 106.3 rating, which led the AFC and was second in the NFL. After losing Dalton to injury in Week 14, Jackson guided quarterback A.J. McCarron to a 2-1 record in the final three games of the season as the Bengals clinched the AFC North title. The Cincinnati running game produced two 700-yard rushers in Jeremy Hill (794) and Giovani Bernard (730) for the first time since 1988. Tight end Tyler Eifert experienced a breakout season after hauling in 13 touchdown receptions, the most by a Bengals tight end in franchise history and the most by a Cincinnati player since 2001. Wide receiver A.J. Green added 10 receiving touchdowns on 86 receptions for 1,297 yards. Eifert, Green and left tackle Andrew Whitworth were selected to the Pro Bowl.

In Jackson's first year as offensive coordinator for Cincinnati in 2014, the run game posted its highest yards per game average (134.1) since 2000. Dalton passed for 3,398 yards and Green totaled 1,041 receiving yards. Hill led all NFL rookies with 1,124 rushing yards, the second-most by a Bengals rookie in team history.

After spending the 2010 season as the Raiders offensive coordinator, Jackson was promoted to head coach in 2011. Oakland finished the

year 8-8 and tied for first in the AFC West but missed the postseason via tiebreaker. The 8-8 mark was the best record by any Raiders team since 2002. The Raiders finished ninth in the NFL in total offense (379.5 yards per game) and seventh in rushing offense (131.9).

Before joining the Raiders, Jackson spent two seasons (2008-09) as quarterbacks coach for Baltimore, helping the Ravens advance to the playoffs both years. He was vital in the development of Joe Flacco, who was named NFL Rookie of the Year in 2008 and became the first rookie quarterback to win two playoff games as the Ravens advanced to the AFC Championship game.

From 2004-06, Jackson served as the Bengals wide receivers coach, helping develop one of the best wide receiver tandems in NFL history with Chad Johnson and T.J. Houshmandzadeh. During that span, the two combined to average 173.3 catches, 2,363.3 receiving yards and 15 touchdowns per season. In 2005, Johnson led the AFC with 1,432 receiving yards. In 2006, Johnson and Houshmandzadeh became the first Bengals duo to each top 1,000 receiving yards in the same season.

Jackson gained his first fulltime NFL experience with Washington, where he served as the running backs coach from 2001-02, before being promoted to offensive coordinator in 2003. Under Jackson's tutelage, running back Stephen Davis led the NFC with 1,432 rushing yards in 2001.

Jackson spent 14 years coaching on the college level, going from a graduate assistant at Pacific all the way to offensive coordinator at Southern California. He spent four seasons (1997-2000) as USC's offensive coordinator, where he also helped to recruit and develop players, including quarterback Carson Palmer, who went on to win the Heisman Trophy and be selected No. 1 overall in the NFL draft.

He was a minority coaching fellowship intern with the Los Angeles Rams in 1990, Arizona Cardinals in 1992 and Washington Redskins in 1995. He also served as the running backs/wide receivers/special teams coach for the London Monarchs of the World League in 1991.

Born Oct. 22, 1965, Jackson was a quarterback at Pacific from 1985-86 and threw for 2,544 yards and 19 touchdowns. The Los Angeles native also lettered in basketball and earned his degree in physical education.

Jackson and his wife, Michelle, have three daughters, Jordyn, Baylee and Haydyn.

## EAGLES 29 BROWNS 10

Lincoln Financial Field, Philadelphia, Pa.

Despite trailing by just three points in the third quarter, the Cleveland Browns fell to the Eagles, 29-10, after Philadelphia pulled away late for the season-opening victory at Lincoln Financial Field. Eagles' rookie QB Carson Wentz got out to a fast start as he led a nine-play, 75-yard TD drive on their first possession of the game. Wentz connected with WR Jordan Matthews on a 19-yard TD pass to cap the drive and take a 7-0 lead. Cleveland's defense would bounce back including a sack from LB Christian Kirksey at the end of the first quarter. In the opening minutes of the second quarter, Eagles' K Caleb Sturgis converted a 22-yard field goal attempt to give Philadelphia a 10-0 advantage. The Browns responded on the ensuing possession as QB Robert Griffin III found WR Terrelle Pryor Sr. along the sideline on a 44-yard gain. Four plays later, RB Isaiah Crowell finished off the seven-play, 75-yard drive with a 2-yard TD run that left Cleveland trailing 10-7. Sturgis split the uprights once more at the end of the second quarter on a 38-yard field goal attempt, giving the Eagles a 13-7 lead at the half. In the third quarter, the Browns cut into the lead on their first drive of the half as Griffin connected with rookie WR Corey Coleman on a 58-yard pass that would lead to K Patrick Murray capping off Cleveland's drive with a 35-yard field goal and cutting the lead to 13-10. However, the Browns' following possession ended with the Eagles defense forcing a safety to take a 15-10 advantage. Philadelphia capitalized and scored once more on their next possession when Wentz conducted a nine-play, 73-yard scoring drive that finished with a 35-yard TD pass to WR Nelson Agholor. The Browns defense closed the third quarter with rookie DL Carl Nassib registering his first NFL sack. The final points of the game came late in the fourth quarter as Eagles' RB Ryan Mathews punched in a 1-yard TD run with just over a minute remaining in the game.

## RAVENS 25 BROWNS 20

Despite a first quarter lead, the Ravens rallied back to defeat the Cleveland Browns, 25-20. The Browns started the game fast as QB Josh McCown led a nine-play, 75-yard opening drive that culminated in a 31-yard TD pass to rookie WR Corey Coleman, giving Cleveland a 7-0 advantage. After forcing a Baltimore punt, RB Isaiah Crowell broke free on the first play for an 85-yard TD rush on the Browns next possession. Cleveland extended its lead after an INT by DB Joe Haden – his first of two INTs in the game – gave the Browns the ball back in Ravens territory. McCown connected with Coleman once more for a 27-yard TD. The Browns could not convert on the ensuing PAT as K Patrick Murray's attempt was blocked and returned by the Ravens for the defensive two-point conversion, leaving Cleveland with a 20-2 advantage with just over four minutes remaining in the first quarter. Late in the second quarter, Ravens' QB Joe Flacco marched Baltimore down the field with a six-play, 75-yard scoring drive that ended with a 7-yard TD pass to WR Mike Wallace. After an interception by S Eric Weddle, Baltimore was able to score before the half as K Justin Tucker converted on a 52-yard field goal attempt as time expired, cutting the Cleveland lead to 20-12. The Ravens got out to a fast start in the third quarter as Flacco led a six-play, 75-yard TD drive to start the second half, connecting with Wallace yet again on a 17-yard TD pass that left Baltimore trailing 19-20. The final points of the game came in the fourth quarter as Tucker converted two more field goal attempts – the first from 49 yards away, and the second from 41 yards away to give the Ravens a 25-20 advantage. Despite a late push from the Browns offense, an INT by Baltimore LB C.J. Mosley with just 13 seconds remaining in the contest sealed the victory.

The Dolphins defeated the Browns in overtime, 30-24, in their home opener at Hard Rock Stadium. The Browns defense started strong as DB Jamar Taylor intercepted Dolphins' QB Ryan Tannehill on the second play of the game. Miami responded by forcing a turnover of their own as DL Cameron Wake strip-sacked Browns' rookie QB Cody Kessler. On their second possession, Tannehill led the Dolphins down the field on a five-play, 61-yard scoring drive including a 26-yard TD pass to WR DeVante Parker, giving Miami a 7-0 advantage. To open the second quarter, Browns' K Cody Parkey capped off a 10-play, 58-yard drive by connecting on a 46-yard field goal attempt, cutting the lead to 7-3. Later in the second, Cleveland DB Brian Boddy-Calhoun intercepted a Tannehill pass and returned it 27 yards for a Browns TD, giving Cleveland a 10-7 lead. The Dolphins were able to tie the game at 10 on their ensuing possession as K Andrew Franks split the uprights with a 37-yard field goal. Cleveland closed out the scoring in the first half as Parkey converted on a 48-yard field goal attempt and sent the Browns into halftime with a 13-10 advantage. Miami regained the lead in the third quarter as Tannehill connected with WR Jarvis Landry on a 42-yard TD pass. In the fourth quarter, the Dolphins stretched their margin when Tannehill found RB Damien Williams on a 10-yard TD pass, giving Miami a 24-13 edge. Cleveland responded, as WR Terrelle Pryor Sr. capped off a nine-play, 83-yard drive with a 3-yard TD rush. Kessler found TE Gary Barnidge on the ensuing two-point conversion attempt, cutting the lead to just three. The Browns were able to deadlock the contest at 24 with just over three minutes remaining in the fourth quarter as Parkey connected on his third field goal of the game, this time from 38 yards away. After a strip-sack by LB Corey Lemonier, Cleveland had a chance to win the game as time expired in the fourth quarter but could not convert a 46-yard field goal. In overtime, Landry set up the Dolphins' game-winning TD with a 32-yard reception along the sideline. On the next play, Miami RB Jay Ajayi found the endzone on an 11-yard TD rush to secure the Dolphins victory.

## PATRIOTS 33 BROWNS 13



Oct. 9, 2016

FirstEnergy Stadium, Cleveland, Ohio

The New England Patriots defeated the Cleveland Browns, 33-13, at FirstEnergy Stadium. In his return from a four-game suspension, Patriots QB Tom Brady was effective and began his day by leading an eight-play, 80-yard TD drive, capped by a 1-yard RB LeGarrette Blount TD rush to gain a 7-0 advantage just under five minutes into the first quarter. The Browns answered quickly as rookie QB Cody Kessler responded with a nine-play, 75-yard TD drive of his own, including an 11-yard TD pass to WR Andrew Hawkins to even the game at 7-7. The Patriots soon regained their lead with another first quarter score as Brady orchestrated an eight-play, 75-yard TD drive, finding TE Martellus Bennett on a 7-yard TD pass. On the Browns' ensuing possession, a Kessler fumble on an incomplete backwards pass trickled out of the end zone for a Patriots safety, giving New England a 16-7 advantage. Early in the second quarter, Brady found Bennett in the end zone once again on a 5-yard TD pass to push the Patriots' lead to 23-7. The Patriots opened the third quarter with another scoring drive, going 75 yards in just eight plays, including a third and final Brady TD pass to Bennett – this time from 37-yards away – to garner a 30-7 advantage. In the fourth quarter, QB Charlie Whitehurst, who stepped in for Kessler following an injury late in the first quarter, connected with TE Connor Hamlett on a 17-yard TD strike, marking Hamlett's first TD reception in his first ever NFL game. Cleveland was unsuccessful on its ensuing two-point conversion attempt, leaving the Browns with a 30-13 deficit. The final points of the game came from the foot of Patriots K Stephen Gostkowski as he split the uprights on a 31-yard field goal attempt, stretching New England's lead to 33-13.

## TITANS 28 BROWNS 26



Oct. 16, 2016

Nissan Stadium, Nashville, Tenn.

The Titans held on to defeat the Browns, 28-26, at Nissan Stadium. Titans QB Marcus Mariota got Tennessee off to a fast start with a scoring drive on the opening possession of the game, including a 41-yard rush by Mariota on the first play from scrimmage and an 11-yard TD pass to WR Rishard Matthews to cap the drive just six plays later. The Browns were able to respond on their first possession of the day as QB Cody Kessler got the Cleveland offense moving with a 43-yard completion to TE Gary Barnidge on Cleveland's first offensive play. Just four plays later, K Cody Parkey put the Browns on the board with a 45-yard field goal, leaving Cleveland with a 7-3 deficit midway through the first quarter. Parkey would go on to split the uprights once more – this time from 37 yards away – to leave the Browns trailing just 7-6 as the first quarter came to a close. Mariota extended the Titans' lead early in the second quarter when he found WR Kendall Wright on a 48-yard TD strike to go up 14-6. Cleveland was once again able to pull within one point of the Titans late in the second quarter when Kessler capped an impressive nine-play, 94-yard drive with a 7-yard TD pass to WR Terrelle Pryor Sr., which left the Browns trailing 14-13 at the half. Titans RB DeMarco Murray scored the only points of the third quarter when he finished Tennessee's seven-play, 70-yard drive with a 3-yard TD rush to garner a 21-13 advantage. In the fourth quarter, the Titans furthered the margin when Mariota ended a long 12-play, 80-yard drive that took up 6:59 with a 15-yard TD pass to TE Anthony Fasano. The Browns chipped away at the Tennessee lead on the ensuing drive, going 75-yards in 13 plays, including a Kessler 5-yard TD pass to Pryor. However, Kessler was unable to connect with a receiver on the two-point conversion attempt and the Browns trailed, 28-19. After WR Rashard Higgins recovered a Parkey onside kick, Cleveland found the end zone for the last time as RB Duke Johnson Jr. completed a nine-play, 62-yard drive with a 1-yard TD rush. Trailing 28-26, the Browns were not able to recover Parkey's second onside kick attempt and the Titans held on for the victory.

## BENGALS 31 BROWNS 17



Oct. 23, 2016

Paul Brown Stadium, Cincinnati, Ohio

The Cincinnati Bengals defeated the Cleveland Browns, 31-17, at Paul Brown Stadium. The only points in the first quarter came on the game's opening possession as Bengals RB Jeremy Hill and QB Andy Dalton led Cincinnati down the field. RB Giovanni Bernard eventually capped the seven-play, 75-yard drive with a 5-yard TD rush to gain an early 7-0 advantage. To begin the second quarter, Browns K Cody Parkey got Cleveland on the scoreboard as he converted a 28-yard field goal to finish a 10-play, 60-yard drive that left the Browns trailing 7-3. After the Cleveland defense forced a Bengals three-and-out, the Browns scored on their second consecutive possession behind key rushes from rookie QB Kevin Hogan and RB Isaiah Crowell. Crowell ultimately found the end zone on a 1-yard TD rush to give Cleveland its first lead of the game, 10-7. The Bengals responded, as Dalton connected with WR Brandon LaFell on back-to-back plays – the first a 21-yard strike, followed by a 44-yard TD pass and reception – to regain the lead, 14-10. The final points of the first half came via a 48-yard Hail Mary TD pass from Dalton to WR A.J. Green as time expired, giving Cincinnati a 21-10 advantage at halftime. In the third quarter, Hogan (who took over for QB Cody Kessler after he left the game with a concussion) continued to have success in the run game, capping an eight-play, 75-yard drive with his first career TD on a 28-yard rush, the longest by a Browns QB in team history. Cincinnati responded just two plays later as Hill broke free on a long rush of his own and found the end zone on a 74-yard TD scamper to put the Bengals ahead 28-17. The final points of the game came on the Bengals ensuing possession when K Mike Nugent split the uprights on a 36-yard field goal attempt and gave Cincinnati a 31-17 advantage with just over four minutes remaining in the third quarter. In his first NFL game, Hogan rushed for 104 yards, the second-most ever by a Browns QB, while fellow rookie LB Emmanuel Ogbah recorded two sacks on the day.

The Cleveland Browns established a 20-7 lead at the half, but the New York Jets rallied to defeat the Cleveland Browns, 31-28. QB Josh McCown led the Browns down the field on the game's opening possession, eventually finding WR Andrew Hawkins on a 5-yard TD pass to cap the eight-play, 75-yard drive and take an early 7-0 lead. Hawkins finished the game with a career-best two TDs on five catches for 31 yards. After the Browns defense forced two consecutive New York three-and-outs, Cleveland scored once more in the first quarter as K Cody Parkey split the uprights on a 41-yard field goal attempt, giving the Browns a 10-0 advantage in the final minutes of the first quarter. The Jets scored their first points of the day in the early stages of the second quarter when Jets RB Bilal Powell finished a 12-play, 87-yard drive with a 35-yard TD rush along the sideline. Cleveland's defense responded nicely and the Browns managed to extend their lead, scoring twice after the two-minute warning as RB Isaiah Crowell capped a nine-play, 70-yard drive by punching in a 1-yard TD run and Parkey converted his second field goal of the game – this time from 27-yards away – to send the Browns into halftime up 20-7. New York scored on its first two possessions of the third quarter as Jets QB Ryan Fitzpatrick led back-to-back impressive drives. First, Fitzpatrick connected with Jets WR Quincy Enunwa on a 24-yard TD pass to complete a 12-play, 78-yard drive, cutting New York's deficit to six. The Jets then took their first lead of the day when Jets RB Matt Forte found the end zone on a 4-yard TD scamper to complete the eight-play, 84-yard drive and give New York a 21-20 advantage with just over two minutes remaining in the third quarter. Forte scored once more on a 2-yard TD rush to begin the fourth quarter, stretching the Jets lead to 28-20. After Jets K Nick Folk's 24-yard field goal, New York furthered the margin to an 11-point advantage with just over four minutes left to play. The final points of the game came when McCown connected with Hawkins for his second TD of the day and then connected with WR Terrelle Pryor Sr. on the ensuing two-point conversion. After an unsuccessful onside kick attempt, the Browns were unable to get the ball back and the Jets held on to win, 31-28.

# GAME SUMMARIES



## COWBOYS 35 BROWNS 10



Nov. 6, 2016

First Energy Stadium, Cleveland, Ohio

As rookies QB Cody Kessler (concussion) and WR Corey Coleman (hand) returned to the lineup from injury, the Browns scored on their opening possession to grab the initial lead but ultimately fell to the Dallas Cowboys, 35-10, at FirstEnergy Stadium. Kessler completed 19 of 27 passes (70.4 percent) for 203 yards with one TD and no interceptions for a 104.4 rating, his third game with a rating of 100 or greater in the past four games, while Coleman posted three catches for 41 yards. After receiving the game's opening kickoff, Kessler directed a 62-yard FG drive, capped by K Cody Parkey's 31-yard conversion to provide Cleveland the initial 3-0 advantage. The drive was sparked by Kessler's 44-yard completion to RB Isaiah Crowell out of a unique formation that split multiple offensive linemen out wide, resulting in the longest pass and reception of Kessler's and Crowell's careers. Crowell finished the game with career bests on four receptions for 63 yards. The Cowboys responded with a 10-play, 75-yard TD drive to claim a 7-3 lead as Cowboys QB Dak Prescott found Cowboys TE Jason Witten for a 26-yard score. Dallas extended the lead to 21-3 with two TDs – a 10-yard rushing score by Cowboys RB Ezekiel Elliott and a 6-yard touchdown reception by Cowboys WR Cole Beasley – with 1:50 to play in the first half. In the ensuing two-minute drill, Kessler completed five of six passes for 58 yards, including a 12-yard TD to Terrelle Pryor Sr. with 23 seconds remaining in half, to set the score at 21-10 at halftime. The Cowboys registered TDs during each of their first two possessions of the second half on an 8-yard run by Elliott and a 2-yard reception by Cowboys TE Gavin Escobar, respectively, to increase the lead to 35-10.

## BROWNS 35 RAVENS 10



Nov. 10, 2016

M & T Bank Stadium, Baltimore, Md.

The Baltimore Ravens defeated the Cleveland Browns, 28-7, on Thursday Night at M&T Bank Stadium. Both teams were held scoreless in the first quarter as the Browns defense forced consecutive punts on the Ravens first two possessions. On Baltimore's third drive of the game, rookie DB Brian Boddy-Calhoun recorded his second INT of the season on a pass from Ravens QB Joe Flacco, bringing Baltimore's scoring chance to a halt as the first quarter came to a close. In the second quarter, the Ravens struck first as K Justin Tucker split the uprights on a 25-yard field goal attempt to gain a 3-0 advantage. Cleveland responded on the ensuing possession as rookie QB Cody Kessler capped a seven-play, 75-yard drive with a 25-yard TD pass to fellow rookie TE Seth DeValue. The TD reception was DeValue's first in the NFL and gave the Browns a 7-3 lead. As time expired in the half, Tucker converted one more field goal attempt – this time from 40-yards away – to leave Baltimore trailing just 7-6 at halftime. The Ravens also struck first in the third quarter when Flacco connected with TE Darren Waller on a 4-yard TD pass, finishing a nine-play, 64-yard Baltimore drive and regaining the lead, 13-7. Two possessions later, Flacco threw his second TD pass of the quarter when he found WR Steve Smith Sr. on an 11-yard TD strike. The Ravens converted on the ensuing two-point conversion attempt as Flacco connected on a pass to FB Kyle Juszczyk to give them a 21-7 edge with just over two minutes remaining in the third. The final points of the game came in the fourth quarter via a 27-yard TD pass from Flacco to WR Breshad Perriman, capping a 12-play, 90-yard drive and extending the Baltimore lead to 28-7. Browns DB Joe Haden recorded his third INT of the season while LBs Demario Davis and Jamie Collins Sr. both registered sacks.
