- Baltimore is the only team in the NFL that Dallas has never defeated.

A Cowboys Win Would:

- Improve Dallas' record to 9-1 for the fourth time (1976, 1983, 2007) in franchise history and first since 2007.
- Give the Cowboys their ninth straight win to surpass the 1977 team for the longest single-season win streak in franchise history.
- Mark the first time in franchise history that Dallas has started the season 0-1 and gone on to win the next nine games.
- Allow Dallas to claim its first win over Baltimore and snap a four-game losing streak against the Ravens.

Player Spotlight EZEKIEL ELLIOTT

Elliott rushed for 114 yards and had 95 receiving yards at Pittsburgh, totaling 209 scrimmage yards, fourth-most by a Cowboys rookie and the most by an opposing player in Heinz Field history.

Dan Bailey holds the Heinz Field record for longest field goal, booting a 53-yarder that also moved him into second place all-time in field goal percentage from 50-plus yards (75%).

Prescott and Elliott connected on an 83-yard touchdown at Pittsburgh, marking the longest by a rookie quarterback/rookie receiver tandem in team history, and the longest rookie combo in the NFL since 1986, when Indianpolis Colts quarterback Jack Trudeau threw an 84-yard scoring strike to wide receiver Bill Brooks.

The Cowboys offense continued its franchise record, recording its seventh consecutive games of 400+ net yards, tying Indianapolis ('14) and San Diego ('83) for the third-longest single-season streak in NFL history. Dallas also had a 300-yard passer (Prescott, 319), 100-yard rusher (Elliott, 114) and 100-yard receiver (Bryant, 116) in the same game for the first time since 2013.

UPCOMING MILESTONES AND CURRENT NOTES

With the 2016 season underway for the Dallas Cowboys, the following information pertains to the most current notes and page location in the release for the remainder of the information, as well as upcoming milestones:

2016 DALLAS COWBOYS CURRENT TEAM HIGHLIGHTS:

The Cowboys offense is fourth in the NFL with 219 total first downs and leads the league with 91 rushing first downs (FIRST DOWN COWBOYS - page 25). The Dallas offense has produced the top-ranked rushing attack by averaging 161.0 yards-per-game (RUSHING TO THE TOP - page 25). Dallas is tied for the league with 16 rushing touchdowns (214 + 46 + 25 = RUSHING TDS - page 26).

The Cowboys have 41 big play runs of 10-or-more yards to rank second in the NFL. Dallas also has 10 rushes of 20+ yards for third (BIG PLAY RUNS - page 27). The Owboys offense boasts 24 drives of five-or-more minutes - 21 for scores, both tops in the NFL in 2016. The unit also has had 12 drives go five-or-more minutes and result in touchdowns, best in the league (DRIVE FOR FIVE - page 27).

The Cowboys have recorded 25 drives of 10-or-more plays to boast the most in the NFL (TEN PLAYS-OR-MORE - page 27).

The Dallas offense has scored on 46 of its 92 drives for a 50.0% scoring efficency rate to rank second in the NFL, while boasting the highest touchdown efficiency rate (31.5%) (FINISHING DRIVES WITH SCORES - page 27).

The Dallas offense has scored on 46 of its 92 drives for a 50.0% scoring efficency rate to ratik second in the INFL, while boasting the highest cooling rate (31.5%) (FINISHING DRIVES WITH SCORES - page 27).

Dallas'offense is fourth in the league with a 47.3 third down percentage (53-of-112) (THIRD-AND-NO PROBLEM - page 27).

The Dallas defense is the only team in the NFL to not allow a 100-yard rusher in a single game (NO HUNDREDS EXCHANGED HERE - page 29).

The Cowboys are one of nine teams to give up 20-or-more points to opposing team's offenses four times-or-less this season - tied for the second-fewest games in the NFL (20 POINT LIMIT - page 29).

Elliott and Prescott became the second rookie duo in NFL history with 2,000 passing yards and 1,000 rushing yards in a season, joining Robert Griffin III (3,200 passing yards) and Alfred Morris (1,613 rushing yards) who did so with Washington in 2012 (214 - page 26).

Dak Prescott - QB

With a win, Dak Prescott (8) will increase his streak of consecutive wins as the starting quarterback to nine to pass Kyle Orton (8 - 2005) for the second-longest winning streak by a rookie quarterback during the Super Bowl era and also surpass Roger Staubach (8 - 1977) for the most consecutive wins in consecutive starts by any Cowboys quarterback in team history (THE DAK KNIGHT RISES - page 14).

Prescott (280) needs 14 attempts to pass Troy Aikman (293 - 1989) for the most by a rookie quarterback in team history. (DAK ATTACK - page 14).

With a 100.0 rating, Prescott will reach his eighth game of the season to tie for the second-most by a rookie in NFL history (PRESCOTT RAINGS AT 100.0 - page 15).

Prescott (4) needs two rushing touchdowns to suprass Don Meredith (5 - 1966) for for the most rushing scores by a Dallas quarterback in a single season in franchise history (RAYNE MAN - page 26).

* The win also improved the Cowboys 2016 record against the AFC North to 3-0, extended the current overall win streak against the division to six and gave Dallas its 98th win against the AFC - tops in the NFC (DALLAS VS. AFC/THE NORTH FACE - page 5).

Dez Bryant caught six passes for 116 yards - his 18th career 100-yard game - and a touchdown (DEZ-STRUCTIVE - page 20).

<u>Ezekiel Elliott - RB</u>

Ezekiel Elliott rushed 21 times for 114 yards and two touchdowns, caught two passes for 95 yards and a touchdown.

Elliott surpassed 1,000 yards (1,005) on the season in the ninth game of the year, tying Emmitt Smith (9 – 1995) as the second-fastest rushers in team history to reach that mark - while becoming only the second rookie in team history to reach 1,000 yards in a season (1,000 ALREADY - page 24).

Elliott's 1,005 rushing yards are the most by a Cowboys rookie rusher - third in the NFL - during his first nine games (COMPARING ROOKIE RUSHERS - page 24).

Elliott scored two rushing touchdowns today to mark his third career multi-touchdown game - tied for the most games in a single season by a Cowboys rookie in team history. He also became the seventh Cowboy - second rookie - to log consecutive games with two-plus rushing touchdowns and the first league rookie to accomplish the feat since Trent Richardson in 2012 with Cleveland (ZEKE MONSTER - page 24).

Elliott's 209 scrimmage yards (114 rush; 95 rec.) allowed him to become the sixth Cowboys rookie to reach that mark while tying Julius Jones for the fourth-highest amount (ZEKE & DESTROY - page 25).

Elliott's 83-yard receiving touchdown was the longest scoring catch by a rookie in team history, the longest by a Cowboys running back since Herschel Walker had an 84-yard score against Philadelphia (12/14/86) and the fourth-longest overall by a Dallas running back (ZEKE & DESTROY - page 25).

Elliott is the first rookie running back in the league to boast a 60-plus yard touchdown run and an 80-plus yard touchdown catch in a single season since Gale Sayers in 1965 (ZEKE & DESTROY - page 25).

Prescott completed 22-of-32 passes for for a career-high 319 yards with two touchdowns and no interceptions for a 121.7 quarterback rating.

Prescott bad two touchdown passes that each traveled 50 yards-or-more (83 and 50) to become the first rookie in franchise history to accomplish that feat (50 YARDS-OR-MORE FOR SCORES - page 15).

Prescott scored a 121.7 rating to mark his seventh game with a 100.0 rating to tie for fourth by a rookie quarterback in a single season in NFL history (PRESCOTT RATINGS AT 100.0 - page 15).

Prescott's 319 passing yards in today's game were the second-nigriest by a construction only the third rookie in team history to throw for 300 yards in a single game.

Lucky Whitehead - WR/KR/PR

Lucky Whitehead returned two punts for 44 yards, including a career-long 39-yard punt return in the third quarter that set up a Cowboys touchdown three plays later. It was the longest by a Cowboys player since Dwayne Harris had a 38-yard return against Houston on Oct. 5, 2014.

Jason Witten - TE

100.1 a bis secret to pass Andre Johnson (1,062) for ninth on the league's all-time receptions list (LEADING)

Witten's six receptions also gave him 44 on the season for his 13th straight season of 40 catches-or-more to become only the sixth player – second tight end – to reach that milestone (40X12 - page 17).

HEAD COACHES

JASON GARRETT (54-45, 6th Year)

Jason Garrett was named the eighth head coach in Dallas Cowboys history on January 5, 2011. Garrett became the first former Dallas Cowboys player to become the team's head coach. As a backup quarterback during his playing career in Dallas, he started nine-of-23 games played and was a member of teams that won six division titles and three Super Bowl championships. The 2015 season was a challenge as injuries sidelined two of Dallas' top playmakers - Tony Romo and Dez Bryant - for a majority of the season and the club finished with a 4-12 record. Romo (collarbone) started only four games and finished the year on Reserve/ Injured and Bryant (foot) was slowed through a majority of his nine starts, also finishing on IR. Garrett saw four different players start at quarterback for the club for only the second time in team his-tory. Veterans Brandon Weeden (three) and Matt Cassel (seven)

at quarterback for the club for only the second time in team history. Veterans Brandon Weeden (three) and Matt Cassel (seven) started the majority of games while Kellen Moore made the first two starts of his career. The running game saw a burst through the second half of the season as Darren McFadden posted his second career 1,000-yard season (1,089) to mark the first time in club history two different running backs each rushed for 1,000 yards in consecutive seasons. Despite the struggles, Dallas still sent five players to the Pro Bowl - Tyron Smith (third), Travis Frederick (second), Zack Martin (second), Dan Bailey (first) and Sean Lee (first). Garrett was elevated to the Cowboys top job after taking over as the team's interim head coach midway through 2010. He guided the club to a 5-3 mark to finish the season after the team started 1-7. He led Dallas to an 8-8 record, narrowly missing the playoffs and an NFC East Division title in each his first three full seasons as head coach (2011-13). With Garrett at the helm of the offense, the unit reached new heights from 2007-13, ranking among st the NFL's top-10 in total offense in five of his seven years at the helm: 2013 (10th), 2012 (6th), 2010 (10th), 2009 (2nd) and 2007 (2nd). Inclusively from the start of the 2007 season, the club has averaged 364.9 total yards-per-outing (sixth in the NFL) and 24.3 points-per-game (eighth). Since his arrival in 2007, not only has the team set single-season records in numerous offensive categories but the club's cumulative numbers for total net vards (52.540). the team set single-season records in numerous offensive categories, but the club's cumulative numbers for total net yards (52,540), gross passing yards (38,325) and total points (3,498) are among the best totals over a nine-year span in the history of the organization. Under Garrett's tutelage, 13 different offensive players have earned 34 total trips to the Pro Bowl.

JOHN HARBAUGH (92-60, 9th Year)
Super Bowl-winning head coach John Harbaugh is in his ninth season at the helm in Baltimore. He has led the Ravens to a playoff berth in six (2008-2012 and 2014) of his eight previous seasons, and in 2012, captured the franchise's second Super Bowl championship. Under Harbaugh's guidance, the Ravens have secured an appearance in three AFC Championship games (2008, 2011 & 2008, 2011). . Baltimore is one of only five teams with at least six playoff berths in the past eight seasons. Additionally, under Harbaugh, the Ravens 10 playoff wins since 2008 rank as the NFL's most. Last season, the Ravens finished third in the AFC North after posting a 5-11 record to mark just the second time Baltimore did not make the playoffs in Harbaugh's eight seasons. In 2014 the Ravens posted a 10-6 record en route to capturing a 30-17 victory at Pittsburgh in the Wild Card round. In 2012 the Ravens seized the franchise's second Super Bowl championship. Baltimore topped the Colts, Broncos and Patriots to advance to Super Bowl XLVII in New Orleans, where the Ravens bested the San Francisco 49ers by a final of 34-31. The Ra-Ravens bested the San Francisco 49ers by a final of 34-31. The Ravens produced one of the most electrifying postseasons in NFL history by averaging 410.3 yards-per-game (134.8 rush & 275.5 pass), scoring 31.0 points-per-contest and allowing just 22.0. During the regular season, Baltimore set a then single-season franchise record by scoring 398 points, averaging the NFL's 10th-most points-pergame (24.9). The offense scored a team-record 254 points at home, producing the NFL's fourth-best home average of 31.8 ppg. The defense also surrendered just 16 give-aways, setting a franchise single-season record-low. In his initial season with the team (2008), Harbaugh set an NFL record that season for most total wins (13) by a team with both a rookie head coach and a rookie starting quartera team with both a rookie head coach and a rookie starting quarter-back (Joe Flacco). Harbaugh spent his first 10 NFL seasons (1998-2007) with the Philadelphia Eagles. He was the team's secondary coach in 2007 after nine seasons as its special teams coordinator. He was voted the 2001 NFL's Special Teams Coach of the Year by his coaching peers. Among Harbaugh's 32 years of coaching was a two-year stint (1995-96) as the assistant head coach at the University of Coaching the State S sity of Cincinnati, finishing 6-5 both seasons with the Bearcats. He coached 10 years on offense and four on defense at the collegiate level, launching his coaching career in 1984 at the age of 21 as a graduate assistant for his father at Western Michigan. He also coached at the University of Pittsburgh (1987), Cincinnati (1989-96) and Indiana (1997).

WINNING HEAD COACH

Dallas Cowboys Head Coach Jason Garrett had his best season as a head coach by wrapping up the 2014 regular season with a record of 12-4 - the fifth coach to reach 12 wins-or-better in a season in team history. He also secured his first NFC East Division title as the head coach. Against the N.Y. Giants (10/19/14), Garrett passed former head coaches Bill Parcells and Wade Phillips (both with 34) with his 35th regular season win as the head coach of the Dallas Cowboys to place fourth in team history. He passed Barry Switzer (40) for third with his 41st victory at Washington (12/28/14), then tied Jimmy Johnson (44) for the second-most victories at Miami (11/22/15), and passed Johnson at Washington (12/7/15). Garrett won his 50th regular season game at Green Bay (10/16/16) to become only the second head coach in franchise history to reach 50 wins.

Following a 4-12 record in 2015, and an 8-1 start to 2016, Gar-rett's current regular season record as the head coach of the Dallas Cowboys stands at 53-44, with the second-most wins all-time in team history:

INSIDE THE SERIES HISTORY

The series between the Dallas Cowboys and Baltimore Ravens has been a rare occurence. In total, the clubs have met four times, tied with Houston for the fewest opponents faced by Dallas.

- The final game played at Texas Stadium (12/20/08)
- 63 points scored by Dallas, 121 allowed

DALLAS LAST GAME

The Dallas Cowboys earned a hard-fought victory at Heinz Field in front of a record 76,737 fans for their eighth-straight victory on Sunday, tying the best single-season streak in team history The Cowboys again saw outstanding play from their two rookies. Dak Prescott and Ezekiel Elliott. The young quarterback completed 68.7 percent of his passes on his way to a career-high 319 yards and two touchdowns. He led his team to 12 fourth quarter points, which included the game-winning drive with under one minute to play. Elliott also had a career day, finishing with 209 yards from scrimmage. He rushed for 114 yards and two touchdowns and hauled in two catches for 95 yards and a score. Elliott became the third rookie rusher in NFL history to record 1,000 yards in his first nine games, joining Eric Dickerson and Adrian Peterson.

The Cowboys played from behind for most of the game after Prescott was sacked and fumbled the ball on the third play of the opening drive. Pittsburgh capitalized, using eight plays to reach the end zone with Le'Veon Bell darting in from the twoyard line to get the home team on the board. After Dan Bailey kicked a 37-yard field goal to give Dallas three points, the Steelers marched right back down on another eight-play drive, this time for 75 yards, before Ben Roethlisberger found Eli Rogers in the end zone. Dallas then executed a perfect screen play, and Elliott took the ball 83 yards for a touchdown. It was the longest score for the Cowboys since Bryant had an 85-yard catch and run on Nov. 22, 2012 against Washington, and the longest touchdown reception for a Dăllas running back since Herschel Walker had an 84-yarder against Philadelphia on Dec. 14, 1986. That narrowed the score to 12-10, and when Bailey kicked a 53-yard field on the Cowboys next possession, the longest in an NFL game in the history of Pittsburgh's Heinz Field, Dallas had the lead. The two teams traded field goals for the next several possessions, and then a wild fourth quarter ensued. Prescott hit Dez Bryant for a 50-yard touchdown, then Bell ran in for a one-yard score, followed by an Elliott rush for a touchdown. With time winding down, the Steelers faked a spike and threw an arching touchdown pass to Antonio Brown to take a one-point lead. With 42 seconds remaining, Prescott showed no nerves as he led Dallas down the field and capped the win with a 32-yard Elliott rushing score.

BALTIMORE LAST GAME

The Baltimore Ravens defeated the Cleveland Browns 28-7 at home on Thursday Night Football. Following a scoreless first quarter, Baltimore drew first blood when Justin Tucker connected on a 25-yard field goal. Cleveland briefly took the 7-3 lead shortly after when Seth DeValve caught a 25-yard touchdown pass from Cody Kessler. The Ravens cut the lead to 7-6 before halftime on

Tucker's second field goal (40).

Baltimore re-took a 13-7 lead in the third quarter when Joe Flacco found Darren Waller for a four-yard touchdown. The Ravens then added to their lead with another Flacco touchdown pass - this time on an 11-yard strike to Steve Smith - in the third quarter, then on a 27-yard catch-and-score from Flacco-to-Bre-shad Perriman while shutting out the Browns offense in the final two quarters to claim the 28-7 victory.

ON THE ROAD TO SUCCESS

Since the AFC/NFC merger in 1970, the Dallas Cowboys boast the most road wins (187) and highest win percentage (.518) in the NFL. Dallas is 5-0 in road games and one of only three teams (New England, Oakland) that remains undefeated on the road in 2016:

The Cowboys finished the 2014 regular season with an undefeated 8-0 record on the road - the only squad with a perfect mark away from home in the NFL. The Cowboys eight road wins were the most in team history during the regular season since the NFL began a 16-game schedule. They were the second team in franchise history to win all road games in a season, joining the 1968 team, which won all seven of its road games during a 14-game season. In NFL history, they were the sixth team since the 1970 NFL merger to form a perfect 8-0 record on the road, joining the 2007 New England Patriots, the 2001 St. Louis Rams, the 1984, 1989 and the 1990 San Francisco 49ers.

Dallas continued its road victory streak into 2015, winning the first contest away from home at Philadelphia (9/20) before falling to the Saints at New Orleans (10/4) in overtime, ending the road run. Dating back to the Cowboys final road game of the 2013 season at Washington (12/22), Dallas won 10 consecutive regular season road games to tie a franchise-high with both the 2006-07 and 1968-69 squads for the longest road win streak in team history.

AT&T STADIUM RECORD WHEN...

The Dallas Cowboys are currently in their eighth season in what is now AT&T Stadium in 2016, owning a 30-30 regular season record at home. The Cowboys finished their seventh season in their home building with a 1-7 record in 2015, and are 3-1 at home in 2016.

SOLD OUT STADIUMS

The Cowboys have played in front of sold out stadiums in 431 of their last 433 games (including playoffs) and in 233 consecutive games. They played in front of sold out crowds in 153 consecutive games at Texas Stadium (including playoffs) - dating back to Dec. 16, 1990 against Phoenix, their last home non-sellout. Dallas opened what is now named AT&T Stadium with the largest crowd to witness a regular season NFL game with 105,121 tickets distributed and have 62 straight sellouts (including playoffs). The Cowboys have sold out each of their last 214 home games.

On the road, Dallas has played in front of sold out crowds in 117 straight games (including playoffs), dating back to its last road non-sellout - at Arizona (10/20/02).

ROMO AT 30K

Tony Romo climbed to 30,000 passing yards following his 176-yard performance at Tennessee (9/14/14), and now has 34,154 for his career. By reaching 30,000 career passing yards Romo became the second Cowboys quarterback to reach that milestone (Troy Aikman - 32,942), the 38th player in NFL history and only the fifth undrafted player to do so. He reached that mark in 138 games to tie Kerry Collins and Donovan McNabb as the 16th-fastest players to reach 30,000 passing yards, and he did it in 3,834 attempts, the fourth-fewest attempts in NFL 8history:

ALL-TIME COWBOYS QB WATCH

Tony Romo entered the 2015 season tops in club history with 33,626 passing yards and 242 touchdown passes, and second in attempts (4,255) and completions (2,779). Through his career Romo has steadily climbed the club's all-time quarterback charts, making strides in 2012 by moving into second for completions, then established the club mark in touchdown throws against Philadelphia (12/2/12) to break Aikman's old record of 165. He also moved up the ladder in all-time wins and starts amongst Cowboys quarterbacks, passing Danny White (62) in 2013 to claim the third-most wins as a Dallas quarterback, and passed Roger Staubach (114) for second-most quarterback starts in team history against the N.Y. Giants (10/19/14). He overtook Aikman (32,942) as the club's all-time passing yards leader against Indianapolis (12/21/14). In 2014 he had his first game over 100.0 at St. Louis (9/21) with a 116.8 rating, then had a 137.4 rating the next week against New Orleans (9/28). At Seattle (10/12) Romo finished with a 110.2 rating, then registered his next game against the N.Y. Giants (10/19) with a 135.7 rating. ROMO'S ROAD

With his 78-49 record as a starter, Tony Romo has had success when playing on the road. Since being named the club's starter leading into the game at Carolina (10/29/06), Romo holds a 40-24 record away from home.

Romo began his career as a starting quarterback on the road at Carolina (10/29/06) and went on to post an 11-2 road record during his first season and a half at the reins of the Cowboys offense. He was 4-1 in his first season in 2006, then followed that up with a 7-1 record in 2007. In 2008 Romo fought through a finger injury and missed two games to finish 3-3 away from home. He finished 2009 with a 5-3 road record, then in 2010, his season ended three road games in where he was 1-2 before he fractured his left clavicle against the N.Y. Giants (10/25). Romo was 3-5 in 2011, then was 4-4 in 2012. In 2013 he was 3-5. Romo finished 2014 with a perfect 8-0 record and continued it into 2015 as he was victorious at Philadelphia (9/20), but suffered a broken clavicle to his left shoulder that forced him to miss the next seven games. He returned at Miami (11/22) and picked up the win:

In 2014 Romo had a streak of four consecutive road games with at least three passing touchdowns and no interceptions - an NFL record - at Jacksonville (11/9), at the N.Y. Giants (11/23), at Chicago (12/4) and at Philadelphia (12/14). The previous record was three games held by Nick Foles in 2013.

CONSECUTIVE TD STREAK ENDS

Tony Romo had a streak of 38 consecutive games with a touchdown pass end against Philadelphia (11/27/14) when he failed to connect on a scoring throw. His 38 games are a club record and the fifth-longest streak in NFL history that began on Oct. 1, 2012 against Chicago. He threw at least one in each of the remaining 12 games of 2012 and in each of the 15 he played in 2013. He continued it through 10 games played in 2014 before it ended:

CALL IT A COMEBACK

Since taking over as the Dallas Cowboys starting quarterback during the 2006 season, Tony Romo has been at the helm of some thrilling wins for the club. Included in his 78 wins as a starter are 24 occasions in which he led the team to a come-from-behind victory in the fourth quarter or overtime during the regular season. Romo's 24 wins are a franchise-best, and in 2012 he had three straight games in which he had a come-from-behind win and followed that up with two in 2013.

Romo had three late comebacks in 2014 highlighted by his performance at St. Louis (9/21) as the team battled back from 21 points down to overcome the most points to win a game in a non-overtime game in franchise history. He wasted no time to earn his first comeback win in the fourth quarter or overtime in 2015, coming back from a 10-point deficit in the season opening game against the N.Y. Giants (9/13)

DAK TO THE FUTURE

The Dallas Cowboys selected Rayne Dakota "Dak" Prescott in the fourth round of the 2016 NFL Draft (135th overall), allowing the Mississippi State product to become the first quarterback drafted by Dallas since Stephen McGee in 2009, and only the fifth since Jerry Jones bought the team in 1989. Dallas' intention was to groom Prescott for the future and slowly bring him along at the position. However, Prescott's trajectory took a quick turn, beginning in training camp after veteran and intended No. 2 back-up quarterback Kellen Moore suffered a season-ending leg injury during the first week of camp on Aug. 2. Prescott then battled first-year player Jameill Showers for the No. 2 role for the right to backup Tony Romo. However, before the decision could be made, Romo went down with a back injury during the third preseason game at Seattle (8/25), forcing Prescott to enter the game with the first unit. With Romo recovering from injury, Prescott assumed the role as the starting quarterback for Dallas.

Prescott dazzled in the preseason, and in three games com-

Prescott dazzled in the preseason, and in three games completed 39-of-50 passes (78.0%) for 454 yards with five touchdowns and no interceptions for a 137.8 quarterback rating to lead all NFL quarterbacks. His five scoring tosses led the NFL, while he finished second with a 78.0 completion percentage, and his 454 passing yards placed him seventh (fourth in the NFC). Prescott

passing yards placed him seventin (fourth in the NFC). Prescott also added 53 rushing yards on seven carries with two scores. Amongst league quarterbacks in 2016, Prescott ranks third in yards-per-attempt (8.35), fourth in quarterback rating (106.2) and is tied for ninth in completion percentage (66.8) while completing 187-of-280 passes for 2,339 yards with 14 touchdowns and two interceptions. He leads all NFL rookies in wins (eight), passing varies are truebled touch processing touchdowns. yards, passing touchdowns, rating, rushing touchdowns (four) and rushing yards (125).

Prescott has started all nine games of the 2016 season for

Prescott has started all nine games of the 2016 season for Dallas to become the first rookie quarterback in team history to accomplish that feat, while his 8-1 record is the best in franchise history. Prescott is the third rookie quarterback with an eightgame winning streak since the 1970 NFL merger, behind Ben Roethlisberger (13 - Pittsburgh 2004) and tied with Kyle Orton (8 - Chicago 2005) for second, and he is only the second rookie in NFL history to lead his team to a 8-1 start, joining Johnny Lujack of the 1948 Chicago Bears.

His season-highs of completions (25 - vs. NYG, 9/11), attempts (45 - vs. NYG, 9/11), passing touchdowns (3 - twice, @ GB, 10/16 and @ Cle, 11/6), quarterback rating (141.8 - @ Cle, 11/6) and completion percentage (79.1 - vs. Chi, 9/25) are all franchise rookie single-game records. He also has seven games this season with a 100.0 rating, five games with a 70.0 completion percentage and two games with three touchdowns which are all team records by a rookie quarterback. He has also set the NFL record for most pass attempts without an interception (176) to begin a career. He established another NFL record at Cleveland (11/6) with his eighth consecutive game with at least 225-plus passing with his eighth consecutive game with at least 225-plus passing

yards and is currently at nine games.

This season he has set Cowboys single season rookie quarter-back records for wins (eight), consecutive wins (eight) - also fied for longest by any Cowboys quarterback - passing yards (2,339), completions (187), completion percentage (66.8), consecutive games with 225-plus passing yards (nine), passing touchdowns (14), quarterback rating (106.2), games with a 100.0 rating (seven), consecutive games with a 100.0 rating (five), games with 70.0 percent (five) and rushing touchdowns (four).

THE DAK KNIGHT RISES

Down 23-13 in the fourth quarter against Philadelphia (10/30) Dak Prescott rallied the team to force overtime and threw the game-winning five-yard touchdown pass to Jason Witten to complete the comeback win. By doing so, he became the first Cowboys rookie quarterback to overcome a deficit of at least 10 points in the fourth quarter in franchise history. It also marked his sixth consecutive win tied for the third-longest streak by a league rookie in the Super Bowl era. Prescott has since extended his win streak to eight following the victory at Pittsburgh (11/13) to tie for second:

Dak Prescott's accuracy has been on display since taking over the reigns of the Dallas offense, and his 66.8 completion percentage (187-of-280) currently ranks ninth in the NFL. He has already registered five games with a completion percentage of 70 percent-or-better for the most games - and longest consecutive (four) - by a rookie in a season in team history. He had a completion percentage of 73.3 at Washington (9/18) before topping that with a 79.2 mark against Chicago (9/25) to set the highest mark in franchise history. Prescott completed 72.7 percent at San Francisco (10/2/16), then had a 75.0 mark against Cincinnati (10/9). He ended his streak at four games by not completing 70 percent of his passes at Green Bay (10/16). Prescott's mark of 77.8 at Cleveland (11/6) was the second-highest by a Cowboys rookie and his fifth overall game on the season with 70.0 percent-or-better for the fourth-most by an NFL rookie:

Prescott registered a 103.7 quarterback rating in his second career game at Washington (9/18), then topped that with a 123.6 rating against Chicago (9/25) - the then highest in franchise history. PASS NO PICK NFL RECORD

After 45 attempts against the N.Y. Giants (9/11) and 30 attempts at Washington (9/18), Dak Prescott's combined number of 75 surpassed Warren Moon's (72 - 1984) for the most pass attempts through a player's first two career games without an interception in NFL history. At San Francisco (10/2) he didn't throw a pick on 32 attempts to move up to 131 passes without an interception - tied for second-most by a player to begin his career, most by a rookie and were also the most by a player in his first four career games. He upped his streak against Cincinnati (10/9) to 155 passes - second-most by a quarterback to start his career, and most by a rookie. At Green Bay (10/16), Prescott surpassed Tom Brady (162) with his 163rd passing attempt without an interception to establish an NFL record, but he was picked off in the third quarter to end his streak at 176 pass attempts:

50 YARDS-OR-MORE FOR SCORES

Dak Prescott showcased his ability to air the ball out at Pittsburgh (11/13), as he tossed an 83-yard scoring strike to Ezekiel Elliott for the longest pass by a rookie in team history, then later hit Dez Bryant for a 50-yard touchdown. With both passes traveling 50 yards-or-more, it allowed him to become the first rookie in team history to throw two scores of 50-or-more yards and the first in league history since Teddy Bridgewater (Minnesota) in 2014.

Overall, the 83-yard completion was the longest passing touchdown by a Cowboy since Tony Romo threw an 85-yard touchdown to Bryant against Washington (11/22/12). By making the connection with fellow rookie Elliott, it marked the longest by a rookie quarterback/rookie receiver tandem in team history, and was the longest rookie combo in the NFL since 1986, when Indianpolis Colts quarterback Jack Trudeau threw an 84-yard scoring strike to wide receiver Bill Brooks at San Francisco (10/5/86).

CLIMBING THE TE CHARTS

Since entering the league in 2003, Jason Witten has proven his skills as an offensive weapon. He has provided Dallas with the full package at tight end. In his 14th season, Witten has caught 1,064 passes for 11,698 yards and 62 touchdowns. He is the second all-

passes for 11,698 yards and 62 touchdowns. He is the second all-time leading tight end in career receptions and receiving yards. To open the 2011 season Witten became the seventh tight end in league history to reach 7,000 receiving yards. His work through the 2011 season allowed him to crack the top-five on the tight end receiving yards list. In 2012 against Tampa Bay (9/23), Witten moved into third all-time. He then crossed the 8,000-yard mark against Chicago (10/1) with his 15th career 100-yard game. He opened the 2013 season by crossing the 9,000-yard threshold.

By mid-November of 2011, Witten passed Ozzie Newsome (662) for third on the all-time receptions list. With four catches at Seattle (9/16) in 2012, he became the third tight end in league history with 700 career catches. His seven catches in the finale at Washington (12/30) made him the third tight end in league history to reach 800 career receptions. In Week 2 of 2013 at Kansas City (9/15) Witten passed Shannon Sharpe (817) for second in catches. In 2014 he reached 10,000 career receiving yards on a 34-yard

In 2014 he reached 10,000 career receiving yards on a 34-yard catch against Houston (10/5) to become only the third tight end in NFL history to reach that mark. The very next game at Seattle (10/12) he caught his 900th career pass on a three-yard scoring strike from Romo in the second quarter to become the second tight end in league history, the first Dallas Cowboy and the 16th overall player to reach 900. In 2015 he had 27 yards against the N.Y. Giants (10/19) to pass Sharpe (10,060) for the second-most receiving yards by an NFL tight end. Witten surpassed 11,000 career receiving yards against Carolina (11/26) to become only the second tight end in NFL history to do so. He reached 1,000 career receptions at Washington (12/7), becoming the 12th player in NFL history - second tight end - to reach that mark.

Coming off a 2010 season in which he registered a career-high and club tight end record-tying nine touchdowns, Jason Witten became the seventh Dallas Cowboy with 40 career touchdown catches in 2011. Later that same season, Witten tied Billy Joe DuPree (41) for sixth in club history. He then broke that tie in 2012 with a scoring grab against Chicago (10/1) to give him sole possession of sixth. He reached 48 against Minnesota (11/3/13) to tie Drew Pearson for fifth, then tied Frank Clarke for fourth with two more snags at the N.Y. Giants (11/24/13). Witten tied Tony Hill for third with a score at Chicago (12/9/13) and passed him with one against Green Bay (12/15/13). Already placing in the top-two in career receptions and receiving yards all-time among league tight ends, Jason Witten is climbing the NFL's all-time receptions and receiving yards charts among all position players. Witten opened 2016 ranked 10th in receptions (1,020) and 32nd in receiving yards (11,215). In league all-time receiving yards, he climbed up to 30th all-time when he passed Keenan McCardell (11,373) and Rod Smith (11,389) at San Francisco (10/2), then moved past Muhsin Muhammad (11,438) for 29th against Cincinnati (10/9). He passed Calvin Johnson (11,619) for 28th at Cleveland (11/6). Witten began the 2016 season with nine catches in the season opener against the N.Y. THAT'S A BUNCH OF WITT

After coming into the league as Dallas' third round draft pick in 2003, Jason Witten has strung together a Hall of Fame career. He has appeared in the most Pro Bowls by a Cowboys tight end (10, seven consecutive - 2004-10 and three consecutive 2012-14), and is seven consecutive - 2004-10 and three consecutive 2012-14), and is tied for the second-most by any Dallas player in team history, is tops on the club's all-time receptions chart and second on the receiving yards chart. In 2012 he took the top spot on the club's receptions chart from Michael Irvin at Atlanta (11/4). Witten took 151 games to reach the top of the team's receptions chart which was faster than Irvin (159). When compared to the two other NFL tight ends with at least 750 catches - Tony Gonzalez and Shannon Sharpe - Witten also reached the mark faster - Gonzalez (163 games), Sharpe (169). Witten hit 950 career receptions after an eight catch performance against the N.Y. Giants (9/13/15). By reaching that mark in his 192nd career game, he did it faster than Gonzalez (198 games) - the only other tight end to reach 950 career receptions.

He surpassed 1,000 career receptions at Washington (12/7/15)

He surpassed 1,000 career receptions at Washington (12/7/15) with five catches against the Redskins, reaching that mark in his 203rd game to become the sixth-fastest NFL player to do so, and the fastest tight end.

Witten accounts for 649 catches and 7,287 yards of Tony Romo's 2,826 completions and 34,154 yards. Both numbers are more than any other player that has caught a pass from Romo.

In 2012 Witten caught 13 passes against Chicago (10/1) which was third in his career and tied for third among any Cowboys pass catcher and tied for eighth by an NFL tight end. He then bettered that with a club-record 18-catch game against the N.Y. Giants (10/28). His reception total was second all-time among club rookies, his touchdowns were third and receiving yards fifth.

He improved upon those numbers in his second season (2011), catching 63 passes for 928 yards and nine touchdowns before topping club receiving charts in 2012 with 1,382 yards (fourth in club history) and 12 touchdowns (tied for fifth) on 92

catches (seventh).

Bryant finished 2013 as the team leader in receptions (93) yards (1,233) and touchdowns (13). He continued in 2014 where he left off, leading the team with 88 receptions for 1,320 yards and a franchise-best 16 touchdowns. He fought through foot and ankle injuries and was limited to nine games in 2015, catching a career-low 31 passes for 401 yards and three touchdowns.

Now in his seventh season, Bryant has totaled 434 receptions for 6,223 yards and 62 touchdowns. His totals all rank amongst the top five spots in club history through a player's first seven

With the selection of Dez Bryant in the first round of the 2010 With the selection of Dez Bryant in the first round of the 2010 NFL Draft, the Dallas Cowboys added to their lineage of homegrown talent at wide receiver. Bryant was issued the jersey number 88 to follow in the footsteps of two of the previous 88s in club history - Drew Pearson (1973-83) and Michael Irvin (1988-99). His progress as a rookie was slowed after landing on IR with an ankle injury suffered at Indianapolis (12/5/10). He returned in 2011 with 63 catches for 238 vards and hing touchdowns. In 2012

2011 with 63 catches for 928 yards and nine touchdowns. In 2012 Bryant notched his first career 1,000-yard receiving season with a career-best 1,382 yards on 92 catches and 12 touchdowns. In 2013 Bryant led the team in receiving yards (1,233) with his second consecutive 1,000-yard season while also leading with a career-high in catches (93) and a then career-high in touchdowns (13).

Bryant came on strong in 2014 leading the team with 88 re-

Bryant came on strong in 2014, leading the team with 88 receptions for 1,320 yards and a club-record 16 touchdowns.

He looked to return to form in 2015 following a contract ex-

He looked to return to form in 2015 following a contract extension, but suffered a foot injury against in the season opener against the N.Y. Giants (9/13) that would linger for the rest of the season, limiting him to nine games. Bryant finished the year with 31 receptions for 401 yards and three touchdowns.

Bryant began the 2016 season with one catch for eight yards in the season opener against the N.Y. Giants (9/11). He increased his production significantly at Washington (9/18) with seven receptions for 102 yards - his 16th career 100-yard game. Bryant caught his 60th career touchdown against Chicago (9/25) as part of a three reception, 40-yard game, then had his best game of the year to date against Philadelphia (10/30) with 113 yards on four receptions and a score while crossing the 6,000-yard threshold. receptions and a score while crossing the 6,000-yard threshold Bryant made six receptions for a team-high 116 yards and a score

Bryant is currently third on the team with 398 yards on 22 catches - good for fourth - and three touchdowns, second-highest on the club.

He accomplished the feat in 2012 with 1,382 yards, and had 1,233 in 2013. Bryant's 1,000-yard season in 2014 marks the 31st in franchise history, and he is the 12th different Cowboy to top 1,000 yards in a season. His mark of 1,320 yards in 2014 tied for seventh in a season in team history:

Dez Bryant is second on the team in 2016 with three touchdowns. He caught his first score of the season against Chicago (9/25), then after missing the next three games with a knee injury, returned against Philadelphia (10/30) and caught his second score of the year. Bryant hauled in his third at Pittsburgh (11/13).

In 2014 Bryant found the endzone a franchise-high 16 times to lead the NFL. This is beginning to be a trend for Dallas' top receiver. He finished the 2013 season with 13 scores to tie for third in the league, was third in 2012 with 12 touchdowns, tied for sixth in 2011 with nine and logged six scores in 2010 - third amongst rookies.

DEZ-STRUCTIVE

Since entering the league as the Dallas Cowboys first round draft choice in 2010, Dez Bryant has continued his rise each season as arguably one of the league's best receivers. He has reached the century mark in 16 career games, and has steadily improved his output in each season of his early pro career.

As a rookie in 2010 he logged his first career 100-yard game with a 104-yard output at the N.Y. Giants (11/14/10). After no 100-yard games in 2011, he returned in 2012 to log a career-best five games including a career-best 224-yard effort against New Orleans (12/23/12). It was the 10th 200-yard game in team history and was the fourth highest number in a game in franchise record books. In 2013 he turned in his first Pro Bowl campaign highlighted by four games with 100 yards, including a season-best 153 yards against Green Bay (12/15/13). He tied his effort in 2014 as he once again recorded four games north of the century mark, with his centerpiece game of 2014 coming across the pond in London, England with a 158-yard effort at Jacksonville (11/9/14) - the second-highest yardage output of his career.

After returning from a foot injury he suffered in Week 1, Bryant notched his lone 100-yard game of the 2015 season with 104 yards against Philadelphia (11/8) on five catches with one touchdown to break a tie with Miles Austin (14) for the sixth-most career 100-yard receiving games in team history.

He added his first 100-yard game of the 2016 season with 102 yards at Washington (9/18), then had his second with 113 yards against Philadelphia (10/30). Bryant's third came at Pittsburgh (11/13) with a 116-yard effort.

Over that span, he led the league with six touchdown catches, was third with 475 yards and seventh with 29 catches. He logged three 100-yard games, including back-to-back 145-yarders against Cleveland (11/18) and Washington (11/22).

THE REAL DEAL T-WILL

After concluding his third pro season, Terrance Williams has emerged as one of the Cowboys top receiving targets, particularly in catching touchdowns. After posting five scores as a rookie in 2013, he proved as a threat to score again in 2014 by surpassing his rookie total with eight touchdowns in 2014, good for second on the team. His three scores in 2015 tied for second on the squad, and he has one so far in 2016. Together, his 17 career touchdowns are the seventh-most by a Cowboys receiver during his first four pro seasons: first four pro seasons:

He increased his scoring production in 2014 with eight touchdowns, including a stretch of three straight games with a scoring grab: at St. Louis (9/21/14), against New Orleans (9/28/14) - where he had two touchdowns to tally the first multi-touchdown game of his career - and against Houston (10/5/14) to record the game of his career - and against Houston (10/5/14) to record the second-longest touchdown streak of his career. He recorded his second career multi-touchdown game with two scoring catches

against Indianapolis (12/21/14).

Terrance Williams serves as a deep threat option to compliment Dez Bryant. Since entering the league in 2013, Williams led all Cowboys receivers in each of his first three pro seasons in receiving average (from players with at least 15 catches). He has maintained a top average and currently ranks second on the team in 2016 with a 14.4 average. His career average of 16.2 is the seventh-highest in the league from 2013-16 among active receivers with at least 50 catches during that span:

In 2015 Williams posted nine games with an average of 15.0-or-better, and three games with an average of 20.0-or-better. He posted career-highs with eight catches for 173 yards in the season finale against Washington (1/3/16), while his 21.6 average was the third-highest number of his career (with at least three receptions). It was also Williams' second career 100-yard receiving game, and his 173 yards were the most by a Cowboys receiver since Bryant had 224 against New Orleans (12/23/12).

Against Chicago (9/25) Williams caught four passes for 88

yards for a 22.0 average - highest of the 2016 season. He then had a season-high five grabs for 70 yards and a 14.0 average against Cincinnati (10/9). Williams boasted an 18.8 average on

four catches for 75 yards at Green Bay (10/16).

COLE WORLD

Cole Beasley has steadily increased his production at the receiver position since entering the league as an undrafted free agent in 2012. Since then, he has become an automatic weapon in the Cowboys passing game, collecting 191 receptions for 1,984 yards and 15 touchdowns in his career.

He finished the 2015 season with a team-best five touchdowns, tied for second with 52 receptions and third with 536 yards - all-career-highs. Included his highlight season was a breakout game against Philadelphia (11/8/15), hauling in nine passes for 112 yards - both career-highs - and a career-high tying two touchdowns. It was his first career 100-yard receiving game, while his two scores marked his second career multi-touchdown game. Beasley also tied his career-best with five first downs, including two on third down, and hauled in a 30-yard pass in the fourth quarter that was the second-longest catch of his career. He matched his career-high in the 2015 season finale against Washington (1/3/16), hauling in two scores - his third career multi-touchdown game - on five receptions for 53 yards.

Beasley continues to be one of Dallas' top options in the passing game in 2016. Through nine games he leads the team with 48 receptions for 532 yards and four touchdowns. Beasley also currently leads all Cowboys receivers with 30 first downs, including 14 on third down - tied for second in the NFL - on 17 overall

receptions on third down - tied for third in the league.

He collected eight passes for 65 yards - both second on the team - with a team-high and career-high tying five first downs in the season opener against the N.Y. Giants (9/11). Beasley was second on the team in receptions (five), yards (75) and receiving first downs (four) at Washington (9/18). He once again led the team with seven receptions - two on third down - for 73 yards against Chicago (9/25), then posted a team-high 66 yards - including a career-long catch of 47 yards - on three receptions with two first downs and one on third down at San Francisco (10/2) Beasley was second on the team with four catches for 53 yards - including four for first downs with one on third down - and his first touchdown of the season against Cincinnati (10/9). Beasley led the team with six receptions for 58 yards - including four for first downs - and two touchdowns at Green Bay (10/16). His two scores marked his fourth career multi-touchdown game. At Cleveland (11/6) Beasley caught six passes for 56 yards and one touchdown, with four of his catches going for first downs, including three on third down.

'BEAS' IN THE TRAP

On third down, Cole Beasley has recorded 14 first downs to tie for second in the NFL on 17 receptions - tied for third - for 181 yards (10.6 avg.) through Week 10 in 2016. More specifically, Beasley's receiving output has accounted for 17-of-53 completions (32.0%) and 181-of-644 passing yards for Dallas Cowboys rookie quarterback Dak Prescott, who is fourth in the league with a 100.6 rating on third down.

Overall, Beasley has produced his highest yards-per-catch (11.0) output, second-highest receiving yardage amount (751) receptions (68) and touchdowns (six) on third down throughout his career.

THE BOOK OF EZEKIEL

For only the second time in franchise history, the Dallas Cowboys used a top-five pick to choose Ezekiel Elliott out of Ohio State with the fourth overall selection in the 2016 NFL Draft. Dallas selected Tony Dorsett with the second pick in the 1977 NFL Draft. The former Buckeye has started since Week 1 as the team's feature runner.

Limited during training camp due to a hamstring injury, Elliott saw action in only one game during the preseason at Seattle (8/25). In one half against the Seahawks first team defense, Elliott rushed seven times for 48 yards (6.9 avg.).

Elliott made his NFL debut against the N.Y. Giants (9/11) and became only the fourth rookie running back in team history to start a season opener, joining Calvin Hill (1969), Ron Springs (1979) and Derrick Lassic (1993). He rushed 20 times for 51 yards and his first career touchdown as his totals were the most carries and the third-highest rushing yardage by a Cowboys rookie rusher to start a season opener. At Washington (9/18) he upped his effort to amass 83 yards on 21 carries with a touchdown, although he had two fumbles with one lost. However, his score allowed him to become the first rookie running back for the Cowboys to rush for a touchdown in each of the first two games of the season and the season that feat since 1900. inad two fumbles with one lost. He posted 138 yards on 23 carries with one score at San Francisco (10/2). Against Cincinnati (10/9) Elliott rushed for 134 yards on 15 carries with two touchdowns. His two scores marked his first career multi-touchdown game. He had a career-long 60-yard rushing touchdown in the third quarter that tied the fifth-longest rush by a Cowboys rookie and the longest since Joseph Randle had a 65-yard run and score at Washington (12/28/14). Elliott rushed for a season-high 157 yards - fourth-most by a Cowboys rookie - on 28 carries at Green Bay (10/16), who entered the game with the NFL's No. 1 rushing defense. Ezekiel Elliott became a one-man wrecking crew at Pittsburgh (11/13), contributing three of the Dallas' four touchdowns in the victory against the Steelers including two rushing scores and his first career receiving score. Elliott helped clinch the win when he scored twice in the final period, as he became the first player to score two go-ahead touchdowns in the final two minutes of the fourth quarter of the same game since Buffalo's Ahmad Rashad in 1974 at Oakland (9/16/74).

His three total scores allowed him to become the seventh Cowboys rookie to have three touchdowns in a game in team history, and the first player to rush for a touchdown (two) and catch a touchdown (one) in a single game since DeMarco Murray at Washington (12/22/13).

Elliott's receiving touchdown came on an 83-yard strike from Dak Prescott in the first quarter to serve as the second-longest scoring catch by a rookie in team history:

Combined with his 60-yard rushing touchdown against Cincinnati (10/9), Elliott became the first rookie running back in the league to boast a 60-plus touchdown run and an 80-plus touchdown catch in a single season since Gale Sayers in 1965.

OFFENSIVE ROOKIE OF THE MONTH

Ezekiel Elliott put up close to historic numbers for the month of October, rushing for 525 yards on 88 carries (6.0 avg.) with three touchdowns. He rushed for 130-plus yards in three straight games in October to improve his streak to four straight 130-yard games – the first rookie in NFL history to accomplish the feat. Elliott's average of 131.2 rushing yards-per-game through the month have him on pace to edge out Eric Dickerson's rookie rushing record (1,808 in 1983). His 525 rushing yards led the league for the month, also making him one of two players to top 500 rushing yards in October. Elliott hauled in 10 passes for 125 yards to give him 650 scrimmage yards (third in the month) while his 162.5 scrimmage yards-per-game also leads the league.

This is only the third time that a Cowboy has won the NFL Rookie of The Month award, as Elliott joins Julius Jones (November 2004) and DeMarco Murray (November 2011).

The Dallas Cowboys rushing attack has produced 12 touch-downs behind a stable of rushers as Ezekiel Elliott (nine), Alfred Morris (two), Lance Dunbar (one) and quarterback Dak Prescott (four) have all contributed to the running cause. The 16 total rushing touchdowns have already surpassed the eight scores that the 2015 team had all last season

2015 team had all last season.

Along with Elliott and Prescott's rushing scores at Washington (9/18), former Redskin Morris added to the rushing attack with a game-clinching four-yard touchdown in the fourth quarter against his ex-team. Collectively, it marked the first time that the Dallas offense had boasted three different players with at least one rushing touchdown since Miles Austin, Marion Barber III and Tashard Choice each had one against New Orleans (11/25/10). The Cowboys repeated that feat for the second consecutive game against Chicago (9/25), as Morris, Prescott and Dunbar - who scored his Chicago (9/25), as Morris, Prescott and Dunbar - who scored his first career touchdown - each got into the endzone. It marked the first time that has happened in consecutive weeks in team history since the 1983 season (11/20 against Kansas City and 11/24 against St. Louis). Elliott scored the team's lone rushing touchdown at San Francisco (10/2), before the squad added three more (Elliott - two; Prescott - one) against Cincinnati (10/9). Prescott added his fourth of the season against Philadelphia (10/30) Elliott posted two touchdowns in back-to-back games then at Cleveland (11/6) and at Pittsburgh (11/13)

As an unexpected surprise, the 2016 NFL Draft brought two new rookie starters on opening day. Ezekiel Elliott was drafted with the fourth overall pick with the intention of starting from day one, but fourth round selection Dak Prescott worked his way up the ladder following injuries to backup Kellen Moore in training camp and starter Tony Romo during the preseason. With Moore out for the year, and Romo mending a back injury until his return, Prescott will take the helm as the team's starting quarterback.

Due to the circumstances, the combination of number 21 (Elliott) and number 4 (Prescott) - which ironically is the area code for Dallas - allowed the Cowboys to open the season with a rookie quarterback and rookie running back for only the second time in team history when Roger Staubach and Calvin Hill started the 1969 opener. The Cowboys won that game against the St. Louis Cardinals with Staubach passing for 220 yards and a touchdown, while Hill rushed 18 times for 70 yards. Against the N.Y. Giants (9/11/16), Prescott passed for 227 yards on 25-of-45 passes with no touchdowns and no interceptions, while Elliott rushed 20 times for 51 yards and his first career touchdown.

The Cowboys also became the first team to start two rookies in the effoncive backling the 2013 Washington Podeking

The Cowboys also became the first team to start two rookies in the offensive backfield since the 2012 Washington Redskins rolled out rookies Robert Griffin III and Alfred Morris.

Overall, the Cowboys have featured a rookie QB/RB duo fivetimes in their history, and suffered their first loss in a game that featured a rookie backfield against the N.Y. Giants (9/11):

Following the fifth game of the season which saw rookie quarterback Dak Prescott pass for 227 yards and rookie running back Ezekiel Elliott rush for 134 yards against Cincinnati (10/9), Prescott had 1,239 passing yards along with 546 rushing yards for Elliott at that point of the season. With those totals, the Cowboys became the first team in NFL history to boast a rookie quarterback with at least 1,000 passing yards and a rookie running back with at least 500 rushing yards in the first five games of a season.

At Cleveland (11/6), Prescott passed for 274 yards to reach 2,020 yards on the season, while Elliott rushed for 92 yards to give him 891 in 2016. Combined, it allowed Dallas to become the first franchise in NFL history to boast a rookie 2,000-yard passer

first franchise in NFL history to boast a rookie 2,000-yard passer and a rookie with 800+ rushing yards in a team's first eight games. The duo also reached another milestone against the Browns after Prescott tossed three touchdowns and Elliott had two rushing touchdowns to allow Dallas to become the second team in NFL history to have a rookie throw for three touchdowns and a rookie throw for three touchdowns and a rookie throw for three touchdowns and a rookie throw for three touchdowns. rookie rush for two touchdowns in a single game since November 21, 1948, when New York Giants rookie quarterback Charlie Conerly threw three touchdown passes and rookie running back Ray Coates rushed for two touchdowns in the Giants' 49-3 win at Green Bay:

Prescott and Elliott once again combined for a dramatic win at Pittsburgh (11/13) for the team's club-tying eighth straight vicat Pittsburgh (1773) for the team's club-tying eighth straight victory. During the waning seconds of the first quarter, Prescott connected with Elliott for an 83-yard touchdown. The pass served as the longest by a rookie quarterback/rookie receiver tandem in team history, and was the longest from a rookie passer to a rookie teammate since the Indianapolis Colts in 1986 when Jack Trudeau connected with Bill Brooks for an 84-yard touchdown at Trudeau connected with Bill Brooks for an 84-yard touchdown at San Francisco (10/5/86). It was longest pass and longest pass for a touchdown by a rookie quarterback in team history, the second-longest reception by a rookie and the longest scoring connection since Dez Bryant caught an 85-yard touchdown from Tony Romo against Washington (11/22/12). With Elliott surpassing 1,000 yards against the Steelers, combined with Prescott passing for 2,000 yards, the duo became only the second rookie quarterback and rookie running back teammates in NFL history with at least 2,000 passing yards and 1,000 rushing yards in a season, joining Robert Griffin III (3,200 passing yards) and Alfred Morris (1,613 rushing yards) who did so with Washington in 2012.

BIG PLAY RUNS

After only three combined runs of 10+ runs in the first two games, the Cowboys ground game has begun to make longer games, the Cowboys ground game has begun to make longer runs throughout the course of a game. Against Chicago (9/25) the offense produced five runs of 10-plus, including one run over 20 yards. They added four more at San Francisco (10/2) including two 20+ runs by Ezekiel Elliott (23, 26). Against Cincinnati (10/9) the offense tacked on five more including a 60-yard romp by Elliott - the longest run from scrimmage by a Cowboy since Joseph Randle had a 65-yard run at Washington (12/28/14). At Green Bay (10/16) the offense tallied six 10-plus runs, including three 20-plus runs. Dallas ripped off a season-high nine runs of 10-against Philadelphia (10/30), with one for 20-plus. At Cleveland (11/6) the offense ripped off seven runs of 10-plus, then they had two at Pittsburgh (11/13) that both went for scores.

For the 2016 season, Dallas' 41 runs of 10-plus yards rank second in the NFL, led by Elliott's league-high 29:

Dallas produced a 59.0% third down conversion rate in the season opener against the N.Y. Giants (9/11), including a season-best 10 first downs on 17 attempts. The Cowboys produced their second consecutive game with a 50.0 percent conversion mark, going six-of-12 (50.0) at Washington (9/18), then were four-of-eight (50.0) against Cincinnati (10/9). At Cleveland (11/6) the unit was successful on a season-high 66.7% (eight-of-12) to tie for the third highest rate since 1991 - the furthest that stat can be researched - and the highest since the offense hit a mark of 72.7% (eight-of-11) at Cleveland (9/7/08). They added their fifth game with a 54.0% mark (seven-of-13) at Pittsburgh (11/13).

FOLLOW THE LEE-DER

Dallas Cowboys linebacker Sean Lee returned to the field in 2015, this time coming back from a torn ACL he suffered in a spring practice that took away his 2014 season. Before that, Lee had bounced back in 2013 to tally a team-best 123 tackles after

landing on Reserve/Injured with a toe injury in 2012.

Having manned the middle linebacker spot since his rookie season, Lee moved to a new position in 2015 with a shift over to the weakside spot to further utilize his speed and playmaking ability in the Cowboys 4-3 defense. Lee led the squad with a career-high 156 tackles along with his first career sacks (2.5), a team and career-high 11 tackles for loss, six pressures, an interception and five pass breakups. He was named to his first Pro

Bowl as an injury replacement for Justin Houston (Kansas City). Known to always be around the ball, Lee has collected 12 interceptions since entering the league as Dallas' 2010 second round draft choice to mark the most on the team and is tied for the most amongst league linebackers in the NFL during that span. His 12 are also fifth among linebackers in team history. Lee has intercepted a career-high four passes twice in season during his career - leading the team in 2013 and tying for the team lead in 2011 - to tie for sixth-most in a single-season in team history:

loss, while also adding two pass breakups. In the season opener against the N.Y. Giants (9/11), Lee led the team with 15 tackles. He topped the defense again with 10 stops at Washington (9/18) along with a breakup. Lee made seven tackles and a tackle for loss against Chicago (9/25). He tied for the team lead with 10 stops at San Francisco (10/2) along with a tackle for loss. Lee made a season-high tying 15 tackles against Cincinnati (10/9), then notched 14 stops and a breakup at Green Bay (10/16). Lee had 10 tackles including two for loss against Dhilddhala (10/20). Philadelphia (10/30). He made eight stops and a tackle for loss at Cleveland (11/6), then had nine tackles, including two for loss, at Pittsburgh (11/13).

"CINDERELLA MAN"

Tyrone Crawford, dubbed "Cinderella Man" by Dallas Cowboys Defensive Coordinator Rod Marinelli, leads the team in 2016 with 3.5 sacks and a career-best two fumble recoveries, is tied for the lead with eight pressures and is second with a career-high tying four tackles for loss and has logged 16 tackles. He spent the previous two seasons (2014-15) playing defensive tackle, including last season where he logged a career-high 5.0 sacks, but has moved back to defensive end in 2016 where he was originally slotted to play as a 2012 draft pick by the Cowboys.

Crawford collected his first sack of the season at Washing-

ton (9/18) along with a pressure, then posted two tackles, two tackles for loss, a pressure and recovered his first career fumble against Chicago (9/25). He had his second sack of the season at San Francisco (10/2) along with two quarterback hurries and four stops. Crawford registered his second career multi-sack game with 1.5 takedowns against Philadelphia (10/30) while also col-

lecting his second career fumble.

CHURCH IN SESSION

Barry Church has consistently been one of Dallas' top defensive performers and leaders. He has posted over 100+ tackles in each of the last three seasons (2013-15) - the longest such streak since Bradie James recorded six seasons (2005-10) with 100+ tackles - while finishing as either the leading and second-leading tackler in each of those seasons. Church made his mark on the Cowboys defense in 2013, turn-

ing in a team-leading, and career-best 147 tackles, bouncing back after missing the majority of the 2012 season after suffering a ruptured Achilles tendon three weeks into the season. He posted eight games with 10-or-more tackles in 2013 - most on the defense in the defense i - including a career-high 17 at New Orleans (11/10/13). Overall, his tackle totals were the third-most by a Cowboys safety, and the 11th-most overall by any Cowboys defender, dating back to 1989:

He finished 2014 atop Dallas' defense with 110 tackles his second consecutive season with 100+ stops - to become the first player to lead the team in tackles in back-to-back seasons since James' six seasons streak (2005-10). It was also the first time a Dallas defender posted consecutive 100+ tackle seasons since James had six in a row from 2005-10.

In 2015, Church finished second on the team with 136 tackles to mark his third consecutive 100-plus tackle season, the longest

streak since James' six (2005-10).

He began 2016 not unlike the past few seasons, amassing 12 stops in the season opener against the N.Y. Giants (9/11) - good stops in the season opener against the N.Y. Glants (9/11) - good for second on the squad. Church made six stops, a pass breakup and an interception - fourth of his career - at Washington (9/18). He had 13 tackles and two pass breakups - both season-highs - to lead the team against Chicago (9/25). Church made 10 stops and two tackles for loss at San Francisco (10/2), then had 11 tackles against Cincinnati (10/9). He totaled eight stops, his second interception of the season - tied a career-high - and also had a break-up and a forced fumble. Church made four stops to surpass 500 tackles for his career against Philadelphia (10/30) before leaving the game with an arm injury and missed the games at Cleveland (11/6) and at Pittsburgh (11/13) with a fractured forearm.

Church currently leads the feam with two interceptions, is second with 64 tackles, is tied for fourth with four pass breakups, and

also has two tackles for loss and a forced fumble.

BYRON THE BREAKUP ARTIST

Byron Jones was a standout defensive player in the Cowboys secondary as a rookie in 2015, finishing the season fifth on the team with 76 tackles, adding two tackles for loss, and first on the defense with 12 passes defensed. Jones was the first Cowboys rookie defender to lead the team in pass breakups since Derek Ross (12) in 2002, and is the only rookie defender in Cowboys history to finish the season with 75-plus tackles and lead the team in breakups (Cowboys did not track PBUs before 1984):

Jones returned to swatting passes to start 2016, breaking up one pass against the N.Y. Giants (9/11) in the season opener along with seven tackles. He had six stops and a breakup at Washington (9/18). Jones made five tackles, a breakup and a forced fumble against Chicago (9/25). He had six stops and a breakup against Cincinnati (10/9), then at Green Bay (10/16) contributed four stops and a breakup. Jones posted nine tackles - good for second on the team - against Philadelphia (10/30). He led the team at Pittsburgh (11/13) with a career-high 12 tackles and tackle for loss.

For the 2016 season, Jones currently is tied for second on the team in pass breakups with five. He also is fourth on the team with

50 tackles.

UNLEASH MALIEK

Maliek Collins had 2.0 sacks against Cody Kessler at Cleveland (11/6) to mark the first time a rookie defender recorded two-plus sacks in a single game since DeVonte Holloman had 2.0 against Philadelphia (12/29/13). DeMarcus Ware owns the rookie record with 3.0 sacks against Carolina (12/24/05).

On the season, Collins is tied for second with 2.0 sacks and tied for the team lead with eight quarterback pressures while he also has 14 tackles and a tackle for loss in his first pro season.

NFC DEFENSIVE PLAYER OF THE WEEK

The Dallas Cowboys added David Irving via the Kansas City Chiefs practice squad last season as a rookie. In 12 games in 2015 he became a rotational player on the defensive line, summing up 14 tackles, a half sack, two tackles for loss, 14 quarterback pressures and a blocked field goal.

He returned in 2016 to contribute more to the defense and thus far leads the team with a career-high three forced fumbles and is tied for the team lead with eight quarterback pressures, is tied for third with three tackles for loss and has also made four

tackles, a sack, two pass breakups and a fumble recovery.

In the season opener against the N.Y. Giants (9/11) he posted three tackles and a tackle for loss. Irving led the team with a career-high four pressures against Chicago (9/25). He had his best game to date at Green Bay (10/16), notching a tackle, a sack, a tackle for loss, a breakup, a fumble recovery and three forced fumbles. His three forced fumbles tied for third-most all-time in a single game in NFL history, and he became the second Cowboy to do accomplish that feat, joining DeMarcus Ware (2005).

For his efforts against the Packers, Irving was named the NFC

Defensive Player of The Week for Week 6, becoming the first Dallas defender to win the award since Sean Lee did it last season (Week 2 - 2015) and the first defensive lineman since Leon Lett

(Week 5 - 1996).

20 POINT LIMIT

Through eight games played, the Dallas Cowboys defensive unit is allowing only 17.5 points-per-game to tie for fourth in the league. The defense had a streak of not allowing a team to score more than 17 points in four consecutive games (9/25/16-10/30/16) to mark the longest such streak in a single season since the 2009 team had a streak of five games in 2009 (11/1-11/26).

Additionally, Dallas is one of nine teams to give up 20-or-more points to opposing team's offenses four times-or-less this season

tied for the second-fewest games in the NFL.

NO HUNDREDS EXCHANGED HERE

Through 10 weeks of the 2016 season the defense of the Dallas Cowboys are the only unit in the National Football League to not allow a 100-yard rusher.

TAKEAWAYS FROM "MIGHTY ORPHANS"

Dallas Cowboys Defensive Coordinator Rod Marinelli has dubbed his defense "The Mighty Orphans" in respect of his group of defenders that are made up of "castaways" in the NFL that are not top draft picks or major free agent signees. Instead, they are a core group of men who will fight on every snap, a mantra that Marinelli distills upon his unit.

The nickname, one that Marinelli gives with respect, is based on the book the "Twelve Mighty Orphans" written by Jim Dent, which tells the story of the Masonic Orphanage in Fort Worth, TX. During the 1930s and '40s, the orphanage, under coach Rusty Russell, played high school football with a limited enrollment of 150 and little to no budget as they went on to tie Corsicana in the 1932 high school state championship game.

With that nickname and mantra, the defense has been opportunistic with 10 takeaways (6 fumble recoveries; 4 INTs) in the team's first eight games to tie for 19th in the NFL.
The unit had two takeaways (two fumble recoveries) against Chicago (9/25). At Green Bay (10/16) the defense gathered a season-high four takeaways (3 fum; 1 INT) to mark the most in a single game since four at Washington (12/28/14).

SHUTOUTS AND SACKS

The Dallas Cowboys defense turned in its best performance against Cincinnati (10/9). The unit held the Bengals offense scoreless through through the third quarter to mark the first shutout through three quarters since at Philadelphia (9/20/15). It was also the fifth consecutive game that the Cowboys have held their opponent scoreless during at least one quarter in 2016 to join the 1975 team as the only two times that has happened in franchise history. The defense extended that streak at Green Bay (10/16), helding the Packers offense excelless in the third quarter to match holding the Packers offense scoreless in the third quarter to match the 1975 defense as the only two teams to accomplish that feat through the first six games. At Cleveland (11/6), the defense shut out the Browns offense in the second half while also limiting their offense to 33 yards.

The defense also logged four sacks on Cincinnati's Andy Dalton - the most since logging five against New England (10/11/15) - with Terrell McClain leading the way with a career-high 1.5, while Benson Mayowa and Cedric Thornton each had one and Jack Crawford had a half sack. The unit produced three sacks against Philadelphia (10/30) with Tyrone Crawford producing his second career multi-sack game with 1.5 takedowns while Orlando Scandrick added one and Thornton had a 0.5 sack. The defense tied its season high with four quarterback takedowns at Cleveland (11/6) season high with four quarterback takedowns at Cleveland (11/6) led by the first two of Maliek Collins' career, while Justin Durant (1.0), Anthony Hitchens (0.5) and Damien Wilson (0.5) also con-

tributed

On the year, the defensive unit has produced 19.0 sacks with Tyrone Crawford leading the way with 3.5.

LIMITING BIG PLAYS

BAILEY FROM 50

For his career, Dan Bailey is 24-of-32 (75.0) from 50-plus yards, and sits atop the club's charts for 50-yarders in a season (six - 2013) and career, while he also tied a franchise-long 56-yard field goal twice - at Seattle (10/12/14) and against the N.Y. Giants (9/11/16). He also boasts the second-highest percentage of field goals from this range in NFL history with a 75.0 clip.

Bailey has hit two 50+ field goals in a game four times (three times in 2013), including most recently in the 2016 season opener against the N.Y. Giants (9/11/16), to tie Eddie Murray (at Minnesota, 12/12/93) for the most

in a single game.

At Kansas City (9/15/13) Bailey was true on three tries, including a pair from 50-plus yards (51 and a career-long 53). Bailey's two 50-yard field goals marked the second time in team history a kicker hit two 50-plus tries in the same game. The first was Eddie Murray at Minnesota, 12/12/93 (51 and 52 yards). Bailey did it twice more after nailing two 53-yarders at Detroit (10/27) and two 50-yarders against Green Bay (12/15).

In 2014, Bailey finished five-of-seven (71.4) on field goals from 50 yards-or-more during the regular season for the second-most field goals

made in a single season in team history.

He was five-of-six from 50 yards in 2015, the second-highest percentage (83.3) in team history in a single season from 50-yards, and tied for

the second-most made in a single season.

Bailey opened 2016 with four field goals against the N.Y. Giants (9/11), with two from 50 yards (including a career and franchise-long to tying 56-yarder) to tie for the most 50-yard field goals in a single game in team history. He is three-of-three in 2016 from 50 yards.

GAME-WINNING KICKS

In his rookie season, Dan Bailey was called upon six times to win or tie the game with his foot. Four times he came through for Dallas. Bailey's four game-winning field goals were the most by a Dallas

Cowboy in a single season and the most by a rookie in NFL history. In 2012 Bailey had four opportunities to do the same, and he came through in three games including two in overtime. He added one game-winner in 2013 with a 35-yarder at the N.Y. Giants (11/24). Bailey was one-of-two during the 2014 season.

His only game-winner of the 2015 season came at Washington (12/7) where he nailed a 54-yarder - tied for the second-longest kick of his career, and the longest game-winner of his career.

In team history, there have now been 39 instances in which a kicker was true on a game-winning field goal with 2:00-or-less left in the fourth

quarter or in overtime.

Bailey has rang true with 10 game-winners - and a franchise-best five in overtime - to serve as the most in team history:

BAILEY'S BOOTS

Since joining the Dallas Cowboys as an undrafted free agent in 2011 as the club's kicker, Dan Bailey has recorded 23 games with three-or-more field goals - the most in team history. He also has seven games with four-or-more field goals - tops in team his-

Bailey had five games with three-or-more field goals as a rookie in 2011, including his first game with four-or-more when he struck a career-best six against Washington (9/26/11). He matched that total with five games in 2012, while also adding one game with four field goals at Carolina (10/21/12). For the third consecutive season in 2013 he notched five games with three-or-more field goals with a season high five field goals made against more field goals, with a season-high five field goals made against Green Bay (12/15/13). In 2014 and 2015 he recorded three each, while he added one four field goal game in 2014 and a career-high two in 2015.

Bailey began 2016 with a bang, connecting on all four field goal attempts against the N.Y. Giants (9/11) to break a tie with Rafael Septien for his 22nd game with three-or-more field goals to establish a team record, while also extending his team record with his seventh career game with four-or-more field goals made: On the season he has recorded four games with three-or-more field goals, and one game with four-plus:

MORE RELIABLE IS BETTER

Dan Bailey came to Dallas in 2011 as a rookie free agent and immediately earned his spot as the club's place kicker, finishing the season 32-of-37 (86.5%) on field goals for the second-best field goal percentage by a rookie in franchise history. His 32 field goals made were also a club rookie record. He had a streak of 26 consecutive made which were the most by a rookie in NFL history. In his second season he finished with a 93.5 (29-of-31) field goal percentage - second in team history. He went 28-of-30 (93.3) in 2013, hitting 30 consecutive field goals from 2013 into 2014 to establish a team record. Bailey finished 2014 25-of-29 (86.2) with a career-high 56 extra points to tie the third-most in team history.

a career-high 56 extra points to tie the third-most in team history. He was 30-of-32 with field goal tries and hit all 25 PATs in 2015, and is 17-of-19 on field goals while connecting on all 27 PATs for 78 points in 2016.

For his career, Bailey has converted 161-of-178 tries (90.4%), and his field goals made are second in team history. Bailey has also hit all 231 PAT tries - second in franchise history:

In 2014 Bailey passed Michael Irvin (392), Bob Hayes (456) and Tony Dorsett (516) for third on Dallas' all-time points list. He also reached 400 points during the season to become the second kicker (Rafael Septien - 874) in team history - fifth player overall to do so. At Philadelphia (12/14/14) he reached 500 career points Bailey in his 62nd game to become the second-fastest kicker in NFL history to hit that mark. He reached 600 points against Carolina (11/26/15). Bailey crossed off 700 points at Cleveland (11/6/16) to become the third Cowboy - second kicker (Septien) - to reach that number. to reach that number.

CAN'T MISS KICKER

The Dallas Cowboys feature one of the league's most depend-The Dallas Cowboys reature one of the league's most dependable kickers, as the former 2011 undrafted free agent has hit true on 150-of-165 field goals for his career. During that time, Dan Bailey has challenged some of the franchise's longest consecutive field goal records, including 26 in a row in his first season to tie the second-longest streak in team history and mark the longest streak of field goals made by a rookie in team and NFL history. He then hit 21 in a row in between his second and third seasons (2012-13)

- the third-longest in team history.

However, after that streak was snapped, Bailey quickly embarked on a new field goals streak in 2013 and extended it into the 2014 season. He opened the season with one field goal made against San Francisco (9/7) to extend his streak to 22 straight field goals made and may be to third longest others. field goals made and move to the third-longest streak. Bailey then hit all four of his tries at Tennessee (9/14/14) to extend his field goals made to 26 in a row, tying Chris Boniol (1995) and his 2011 total for the second-longest streak in team history. He had two field goals at St. Louis (9/21/14) to reach 28 in a row and pass Boniol's 1995 total of 27 to establish the longest streak of field goals made in team history. He continued that streak up to 30 success-

ful kicks before missing a 53-yarder against Houston (10/5/14).

Bailey had a streak of 21 consecutive field goals made - tied for fifth-longest in team history - that began with three made at Washington (12/28/14) in 2014 and continued with 18 straight in 2015 until he missed his first one at Tampa Bay (11/15) to end the

In 2015, Bailey made 30-of-32 field goals (career-high 93.8) to tie for the league lead in field goal percentage, tied for fifth in field goals made and was 12th with 115 total points to earn his first trip to the Pro Bowl.

He is 17-of-19 on field goals (89.5%) with 27 PATs in 2016 to tie for fourth in PATs, tied for eighth in points (78) and field goal percentage and tie for 11th in field goals made.

2016 DRAFT CLASS

The Dallas Cowboys drafted nine players - five defensive, four offensive - in the 2016 NFL Draft. It was the third consecutive seaoftensive - in the 2016 NFL Draft. It was the third consecutive season the team leaned more towards defense, as 17 of the last 26 picks by Dallas in the last three drafts (2014-16) have been on that side of the ball. The new class started off with Dallas' first round choice - running back Ezekiel Elliott - who was selected with the fourth overall pick to mark just the second time in team history that the club has selected a running back with a top-five pick (Tony Dorsett, No. 2 overall - 1977).

Of the nine players chosen by Dallas, eight made the final roster entering Week One while one (Rico Gathers) was signed to the club's practice squad.
