STEELERS PRONUNCIATION GUIDE

The Steelers have won each of their first two primetime games in 2016, a Kickoff Weekend Monday Night Football victory at the Washington Redskins (38-16) and a Week Four Sunday Night Football win vs. Kansas City at Heinz Field (43-14).

The Steelers will appear in their eighth Thanksgiving Day game in team history in Week 12 (Nov. 24) at the Indianapolis Colts (NBC, 8:30 p.m.). Pittsburgh's fourth nationally televised primetime contest occurs at the Cincinnati Bengals in Week 15 on Sunday Night Football, Dec. 18 (NBC, 8:30 p.m.).

Pittsburgh will host the Baltimore Ravens in Week 16 (NFL Network, 4:30 p.m.) on Dec. 25 to mark the first Christmas Day game in franchise history.

COLOR RUSH ON CHRISTMAS DAY

Pittsburgh will debut its 'color rush' uniforms on Christmas Day when the team hosts the Baltimore Ravens at Heinz Field. Steelers President **Art Rooney II** announced during halftime of the team's first preseason game on KDKA-TV that the team's 'color rush' uniforms will be all black with gold numbers.

1934 THROWBACKS IN WEEK 5

The Steelers wore their 1934 throwback uniforms in Week Five against the New York Jets at Heinz Field.

This marked the fifth straight season Pittsburgh donned their 1934 throwback uniforms and the last occasion.

THE STEELERS

- Pittsburgh fell to 4-5 overall, 3-2 at home and to 1-2 vs. NFC teams in 2016.
- The Steelers are now 13-16 in regular-season history against the Cowboys, 8-7 at home and 1-1 at Heinz Field against Dallas.
- Pittsburgh is now 24-6-1 in games against NFC opponents at Heinz Field since the stadium opened in 2001.
- The Steelers generated 448 yards of offense – the team's highest output of the season.
- The attendance of 67,737 set a Steelers home game record in team history.

HEAD COACH MIKE TOMLIN

- Is now 96-57 during the regular season in his Steelers' tenure since 2007 and 56-21 in regular-season home games.
- Is now 25-14 as the team's head coach in regular-season games vs. NFC opponents (14-5 at home).
- Is now 22-17 in regular-season games during the month of November (12-8 at home).

WR ANTONIO BROWN

- Finished with game highs in receptions (14) and receiving yards (154), adding one receiving touchdown.
- His 14 receptions tied for the third-most in a single game in team history.
- Extended his consecutive regular-season games started streak to 45 – the third-longest active consecutive games started streak among NFL wide receivers.
- Has registered at least one reception in 98 consecutive games in which he has played, including the postseason – dating back to October 3, 2010.
- Has registered at least one reception in 93 consecutive regular-season games – dating back to October 3, 2010.
- Hauled in his 60th reception of the season, extending his streak of 60-catch seasons to six.
- Recorded his 29th career 100-yard receiving game – tying Hines Ward for the most such games in Steelers history.
- Moved into a tie with Heath Miller (45) for the fourth-most touchdown catches in team history.
- Surpassed Heath Miller (592) for the second-most receptions in Steelers history, now with 595.
- Increased his Steelers record to 12 games with 10 or more catches.
- Became the sixth player in Steelers history with at least 45 combined touchdowns.
- Posted at least 100 receiving yards for the first time in his NFL career vs. Dallas.
- Increased his career totals in games vs. NFC teams to 174 catches for 2,276 receiving yards and 15 touchdown catches in 25 games.
- Surpassed Antwaan Randle-El (1,650) for the second-most punt return yards in Steelers history, now with 1,658.

QB BEN ROETHLISBERGER

- Finished 37-of-46 for 408 yards with three touchdowns and zero interceptions for a passer rating of 125.4. His 37 completions and 408 passing yards marked new season-bests.
- Is now 117-60 as a starter during the regular season, including 67-22 at home.
- Became the 11th quarterback in NFL history to record at least 45,000 passing yards and the eighth signal caller to do so with one team, increasing his career total to 45,352.
- Reached 45,000 passing yards in his 179th career regular-season game – the fifth-fewest games in NFL history to hit the milestone (Drew Brees: 168, Dan Marino: 172, Peyton Manning: 174 and Tom Brady: 178).
- Recorded his 49th 300-yard passing game of his career during the regular season, extending his franchise record.
- His 408 passing yards marked the ninth 400-yard game of his NFL career, the fourth-most in NFL history.
- Eclipsed 300 passing yards for the second time in his career against the Cowboys (339: Dec. 16, 2012 at Dallas).
- Has thrown at least 300 passing yards in each of his previous three regular-season home game starts.
- Has thrown at least one touchdown pass in 42 consecutive home games in which he has played – the third-longest streak in NFL history (Tom Brady: 47, Drew Brees, active streak: 59).
- Has connected with WR Antonio Brown on 45 touchdown passes – the second-most QB-WR touchdown strikes in Steelers history (Terry Bradshaw-Lynn Swann: 49).
- Surpassed Warren Moon (291) for the 10th-most touchdown passes in NFL history, now with 292.
- Threw his 20th touchdown pass of the season on his third scoring toss, extending his streak of 20-touchdown seasons to six, the longest such streak in Steelers history.
- Has thrown at least three touchdown passes in 40 games during the regular season, extending his franchise record.
- Has thrown at least three touchdown passes in each of his last six regular-season home game starts.
- Threw two touchdowns in the first quarter, his ninth career regular-season game with at least two scoring tosses in the opening stanza, and second occasion of the season (Week 4 vs. Kansas City).

**RB Le'VEON BELL**

- Tallied 134 yards from scrimmage (57 rushing and 77 receiving), along with two touchdowns.
- Scored a rushing (one-yard) and receiving (two-yard) touchdown to mark his second career game with a touchdown in both categories (Dec. 7, 2014 at Cincinnati).
- Recorded the 20th rushing touchdown of his career on a one-yard run to become the 15th player in Steelers history with at least 20 rushing scores.
- Scored his first touchdown of the season on a two-yard catch from QB Ben Roethlisberger to mark his fourth career touchdown reception.
- Has posted at least 100 yards from scrimmage in 26 career regular-season games and in five of his six games in 2016.

WR ELI ROGERS

- Caught four passes for 42 yards, including a three-yard touchdown pass from QB Ben Roethlisberger in the first quarter, his second touchdown catch of the season and his career.

RB FITZGERALD TOUSSAINT

- Returned a kickoff 33 yards in the third quarter to set a career-long and the longest by the Steelers in 2016.

TE LADARIUS GREEN

- Made his Steelers debut and caught three passes for 30 yards.

G DAVID DeCASTRO

- Extended his consecutive regular-season games started streak to 49 – the fourth-longest active consecutive games started streak among NFL guards.

CB WILLIAM GAY

- Extended his consecutive regular season games played streak to 153 – the longest active consecutive games played streak among NFL defensive players.

S MIKE MITCHELL

- Extended his consecutive regular season games started streak to 55 – the fifth-longest active consecutive games played streak among NFL safeties.

LB LAWRENCE TIMMONS

- Extended his streak of consecutive regular-season games started to 94 – the longest active streak among current Steelers – and the longest active streak among NFL linebackers.
- Extended his consecutive regular season games played streak to 113 – the longest active consecutive games played streak among NFL linebackers.

LB RYAN SHAZIER

- Led the team with 9 tackles (4 solo) and recovered a fumble forced by LB Anthony Chickillo in the first quarter – the second fumble recovery of his NFL career.

LB ANTHONY CHICKILLO

- Recorded a strip-sack of Dallas QB Duke Prescott in the first quarter, increasing his season and career sack total to 2.5, and his third career forced fumble.
- Along with a half-sack in Baltimore in Week 9, has recorded a sack in back-to-back games for the first time in his NFL career.

DE STEPHON TUITT

- Recorded his first sack of the season, bringing down Dallas QB Duke Prescott in the third quarter, to increase his career total to 8.5.

K CHRIS BOSWELL

- Converted two-of-three field goals (25- and 39-yards) improving to 9-of-13 on field goal attempts in 2016, and 10-of-11 on field goals from 30-39 yards in his NFL career.

This week's game will mark the 127th regular-season meeting between Pittsburgh and Cleveland, with the Steelers holding a 10-game advantage in the series (68-58)...the two teams have met 31 times in the month of November with the Steelers holding a 24-17 mark in the month against the Browns (11-10 at Cleveland in November).

Pittsburgh 28, Cleveland 12

Jan. 3, 2016

FirstEnergy Stadium (95,595)

CLEVELAND – The Steelers beat the Browns, 28-12, at FirstEnergy Stadium to secure the team's 10th postseason berth since 2000.

The Steelers scored first as **QB Ben Roethlisberger** threw a two-yard touchdown pass to TE Heath Miller to give Pittsburgh a 7-0 lead. Browns' K Travis Coons connected on two field goals (29 and 38 yards) to cut Pittsburgh's lead to 7-6.

On Pittsburgh's next possession, Roethlisberger threw a 17-yard touchdown pass to **WR Antonio Brown** to extend the Steelers' lead to 14-6. Brown totaled 187 receiving yards on 13 receptions in the game.

Coons made a 33-yard field goal with no time left on the clock, and Pittsburgh led 14-9 at halftime.

K Chris Boswell made a 39-yard field goal early in the third quarter to give Pittsburgh a 17-9 advantage. Coons connected from 29 yards out to get the Browns within five points, 17-12.

Pittsburgh's defense though would shut out the Browns for the remainder of the game. Roethlisberger hit **WR Markus Wheaton** for an eight-yard touchdown, and Boswell connected from 21 yards out to give the Steelers the 28-12 victory. Roethlisberger finished the game with 349 passing yards and three touchdowns.

The Steelers recorded a season-high seven sacks in the game and forced four turnovers.

Tomlin earned his 50th regular season home win in Week 9 in 2015 vs. Oakland and joined Chuck Noll (119) and Bill Cowher (85) as the third head coach in Steelers history with 50 regular season home victories.

Tomlin has led Pittsburgh to at least five home wins in each of his first nine seasons as the team's head coach and six in six of his nine at the helm.

Since the 2011 season, the Steelers have played in 27 primetime games, including a Week One Monday Night Football game at the Washington Redskins to kickoff the 2016 season (W, 38-16) and a Week Four Sunday Night Football tilt at Heinz Field vs. Kansas City (W, 43-14).

Mike Tomlin, the 10th-year head coach, has guided Pittsburgh to a 29-16 overall record in regular-season primetime games, including a 14-9 mark on the road.

He is 10-2 on Monday Night Football, 14-8 on Sunday Night Football and 5-5 on Thursday Night Football.

Tomlin joined only Bill Cowher (Steelers), Tom Flores (Raiders), Steve Mariucci (49ers), George Seifert (49ers) and Don Shula (Colts, Dolphins) as coaches to win their first six Monday Night Football games.

GOOD FIRST NINE



In his 10th season as the head coach of the Steelers, **Mike Tomlin** has an extensive list of accomplishments.

Tomlin earned his 90th regular-season victory in Week 14 of 2015 at Cincinnati and closed out his ninth season with 92 wins following the team's Week 17 victory at Cleveland.

His 92 wins in his first nine seasons are the most wins in team history for any coach after his first nine campaigns and his two Super Bowl appearances also are tied for the franchise best for a coach in his first nine seasons.

Tomlin's six postseason berths are tied as the most in a coach's first nine seasons with the Steelers and his four division titles are third-most.

TOMLIN'S 90TH IN NINE

Mike Tomlin became the third head coach in Steelers history to record 90 regular season wins in Week 14 of 2015, with the team's 33-20 victory at Cincinnati.

He joined Chuck Noll (1969-91: 193) and Bill Cowher (1992-2006: 149) in the team's 90-win club.

Tomlin's 90th win occurred in his ninth season with the Steelers, becoming the first Pittsburgh head coach to reach 90 wins in his first nine years (Bill Cowher: 1992-2000: 86 and Chuck Noll: 1976-77: 74).

Tomlin also joined several elite head coach fraternities in NFL history by reaching 90 wins in his ninth season:

CONTROLLING THE NORTH

QB Ben Roethlisberger threw his 20th touchdown pass of 2016 in Week 10's game at Dallas, extending his streak of 20-touchdown seasons to six (eighth overall).

Through Week 10, Roethlisberger has completed 205-of-317 passes for 2,357 yards and 20 touchdowns with seven interceptions for a passer rating of 98.8.

Roethlisberger threw for 300 yards on 27 completions and three touchdowns with an interception for a passer rating of 112.4 in the team's Week One 38-16 win on Monday Night Football at Washington. The win gave him his 50th career road win as a starter and he joined Tom Brady (75) and Drew Brees (57) as the only active quarterbacks with at least 50 road wins.

In Week Two's home opener at Heinz Field, Roethlisberger threw for 259 yards on 19-of-37 passing with three touchdowns and two interceptions, leading the Steelers to a 24-16 win over Cincinnati. The game marked his 80th career regular-season game with multiple scoring passes, and his 45th at Heinz Field.

The Miami (Oh.) product completed 24-of-44 passes for 257 yards with an interception in Week Three's loss at Philadelphia.

In Week Four on Sunday Night Football, Roethlisberger notched his fifth career regular-season game with at least five touchdown passes - becoming the sixth player in NFL history to accomplish the feat - completing 22-of-27 passes for 300 yards for a passer rating of 152.5.

Roethlisberger threw four touchdowns while completing 34-of-47 attempts for 380 yards for a passer rating of 124.4 in Week Five vs. New York at Heinz field.

In Week 10's game, Roethlisberger threw for 408 yards - his ninth career 400-yard game - while completing 37-of-46 passes with three touchdowns and zero interceptions for a passer rating of 125.4. During the game, he reached the 45,000 yardage marker, in his 179th career game, the fifth-fewest to the milestone, and surpasses Warren Moon (290) for the 10th-most touchdown passes in NFL history.

Roethlisberger made his 150th career regular season start in Week 8 vs. Indianapolis in 2014 to become just the fourth quarterback in NFL history to record 100 wins in their first 150 regular season starts (Tom Brady: 116, Joe Montana: 108, Terry and Bradshaw: 102).

Roethlisberger registered his 90th career win in his 135th career start, becoming the fifth fastest quarterback who began their career in the Super Bowl era to reach 90 wins.

His 63-27 record after his first 90 starts in the NFL ranked third (tied) in league history for the best record in such starts. Only Brady (67-23) and Stabler (66-23-1) had better records in their first 90 starts in the NFL. Roethlisberger's record is tied with Jim McMahon.

THE 45,000 CLUB

RB Le'Veon Bell returned to the playing field in Week Four on Sunday Night Football against Kansas City and racked up a game-high 144 rushing yards on 18 carries, to go along with 34 receiving yards on five catches, for a total of 178 scrimmage yards. It marked his eighth career 100-yard rushing performance.

Bell totaled a game-high 154 yards from scrimmage (66 rushing and 88 receiving) in Week Five vs. New York. It was his second straight game with at least 150 yards from scrimmage for the second time in his NFL career (three games, Nov. 17-Dec. 7, 2014), and his 23rd career regular-season game with at least 100 yards from scrimmage, eighth with 150.

Bell posted a game-high 149 yards from scrimmage (81 rushing and 68 receiving) in Week Seven vs. New England, his 25th regular-season game with at least 100 scrimmage yards, and set a personal regular-season single-game high of 10 receptions.

In Week 10 vs. Dallas, Bell posted 134 yards from scrimmage, along with a rushing (one-yard) and receiving (two-yard) touchdown to mark his second career game with a touchdown in both categories (Dec. 7, 2014 at Cincinnati).

Williams has totaled 276 rushing yards and 91 receiving yards for 367 yards from scrimmage in 2016.

He led all NFL players with 143 rushing yards to go along with two rushing touchdowns and six catches for 28 yards in Week One at Washington to open up the 2016 season.

In Week Two, Williams totaled a game-high 132 scrimmage yards (94 rushing and 38 receiving) with one receiving touchdown - his 39th career regular-season games with at least 100 scrimmage yards and eighth with Pittsburgh.

DE Cameron Heyward set a single-game career-high with 3.0 sacks on Sunday Night Football vs. Kansas City in Week Four, marking his second career multi-sack game, and became just the fourth defensive end in team history to record at least 3.0 sacks in a single game (since sacks became an official statistic in 1982), and first since Ray Seals in 1994 (11/6 at Houston).

In Week 10 vs. Dallas, Shazier led the team with 9 tackles (4 solo) and recovered a fumble forced by LB Anthony Chickillo in the first quarter - the second fumble recovery of his NFL career.

Timmons led the Steelers with eight stops in the first game of the season on Monday Night Football at Washington, including four solo stops, and totaled a game-high 11 tackles in Week Seven vs. New England, all solo.

Timmons became the fourth Steeler with 30 sacks and 10 interceptions in 2015, joining Joey Porter, Greg Lloyd and Mike Merriweather, since sacks became an official statistic in 1982.

He recorded the 10th interception of his NFL career in Week 6 of 2015 vs. Arizona. He became the ninth Steelers linebacker to record 10 interceptions since the 1970 AFL-NFL merger.

Timmons totaled 11 total tackles (11 solo) in Week Seven against New England. He has registered double digit tackles in 40 games during his career, including 27 times since the start of the 2012 season.

Timmons has eclipsed 100 total tackles five times in his NFL career (2010, '12, '13, '14, '15) and has led the defense in total tackles four times, including each of the previous three seasons (2010 '13 '14 and '15).

WILLIAMS LEADS THE 'D'

LB Vince Williams led the Steelers' defense in tackles in back-to-back games (Weeks Four-Five).

In Week Four, Williams made his first start of the 2016 season in vs. Kansas City on Sunday Night Football, and tallied a game and single-game personal best 15 tackles (13 solo). He was also redited with a sack in the second quarter, his first of the season, increasing his career total to 1.5.

Williams led the defense with a game high of 9 tackles (8 solo) in Week Five against the New York Jets, to go along with a sack, three stops for losses and two quarterback hits.

BURNS IN STARTING DEBUT

CB Artie Burns made his first career start in Week Nine at Baltimore and hauled in the first interception of his NFL career. He became the first rookie in Steelers history since 2006 (Anthony Smith) to record an interception.

BOS-DOES-WELL

K Chris Boswell has converted nine of his 13 field goal attempts in 2016 - including six of seven attempts from 40-49 yards.

Since joining the Steelers in 2015, Boswell is 38-of-45 overall on field goal attempts (84.4%), including 15-of-19 (78.9%) between 40-49 yards.

His 84.4 field goal percent ranks second in Steelers history among kickers with at least 30 field goal attempts:

In Week Two vs. Cincinnati, he pinned five punts inside the Bengals' 20 yard line, marking the fifth game of his NFL career with at least three inside the 20's.

Berry landed each of his three punts in Week Five against the New York Jets inside their 20-yard line.

In Week Nine at Baltimore, Berry punted the ball a single-game career-high nine times.

Through the team's first nine games, Berry has pinned opponents inside their 20-yard line on 17 of his 43 punts.

K Chris Boswell's 49-yard field goal gave the Steelers a 10-3 advantage late in the second quarter. Nugent made a 33-yarder as time expired in the second quarter, and Pittsburgh led 10-6 at the break.

TE Jesse James caught a nine-yard touchdown from Roethlisberger midway through the third quarter to extend the Steelers lead to 17-6. Nugent's 21-yard field goal late in the third quarter got the Bengals within one score, 17-9.

Midway through the fourth quarter, Roethlisberger threw a four-yard touchdown to **RB DeAngelo Williams** to give Pittsburgh a 24-9 lead. The Bengals got within one score again when QB Andy Dalton threw a 25-yard touchdown pass to RB Giovani Bernard to make it 24-16 Pittsburgh.

The Bengals had one last attempt to tie the game, but **LB James Harrison** forced a fumble on WR Tyler Boyd. The ball was recovered by **S Robert Golden** and he returned the fumble 21 yards, which sealed the victory for Pittsburgh.

PITTSBURGH - RB Ezekiel Elliott scored on a game-winning 32-yard touchdown run with less than 10 seconds remaining in the game to lift the Cowboys to a 35-30 victory over the Steelers at Heinz Field. The attendance of 67,737 was a Steelers' all-time record for a home game.

RB Le'Veon Bell caught a two-yard pass from **QB Ben Roethlisberger** to give Pittsburgh an early 6-0 advantage. K Dan Bailey connected on a 37-yard field goal to cut the lead to 6-3. Roethlisberger threw a three-yard touchdown to **WR Eli Rogers** to increase Pittsburgh's lead to 12-3. QB Dak Prescott connected with Elliott on an 83-yard touchdown pass late in the first quarter.

Teams exchanged field goals in the second quarter. Bailey made a 53-yarder, an NFL record at Heinz Field. And **K Chris Boswell** connected from 39 yards out. Pittsburgh led 15-13 at the break.

Boswell made a 25-yard field goal early in the third quarter. Bailey connected from 46 yards out on Dallas' next drive. On the Cowboys' ensuing possession Prescott threw a 50-yard touchdown pass to WR Dez Bryant to give the Cowboys a 23-18 lead heading into the fourth quarter.

Bell scored on a one-yard run midway through the fourth quarter to give Pittsburgh a 24-23 advantage. Elliott scored on a 14-yard run right after the two minute warning to give Dallas a 29-24 edge. Roethlisberger threw a 15-yard touchdown pass to **WR Antonio Brown** on a fake spike play on Pittsburgh's ensuing possession to give the Steelers a 30-29 lead.

But on Dallas' final drive, Elliott scored the game winning touchdown.
