## GAME SUMMARY

#### NEW ENGLAND PATRIOTS (8-2) at NEW YORK JETS (3-7) Sunday, Nov. 27, 2016 • MetLife Stadium (82,500) • 4:25 p.m. ET

The New England Patriots return to AFC East play following two games against NFC teams when they travel to face the New York Jets in the first of two meetings this season. The Jets will travel to face the Patriots on Saturday, Dec. 24th.

A victory on Sunday will give the Patriots a winning season for the 16th straight year, tying the San Francisco 49ers (1983-98) and the Dallas Cowboys (1970-85) for the most consecutive winning seasons since the 1970 AFL/NFL merger. A win would also give New England its 31st winning season since the 1970 merger to tie Dallas for second, behind the 33 winning seasons by Pittsburgh during that time.

<u>TELEVISION</u>: This week's game will be broadcast by CBS and can be seen locally on WBZ-TV Channel 4 in Boston. **Greg Gumbel** will handle play-by-play duties with **Trent Green** as the color analyst. **Jamie Erdahl** will work the sidelines. The game will be produced by **Jim Rikhoff** and directed by **Suzanne Smith**.

NATIONAL RADIO: This week's game will be broadcast to a national audience on ESPN Radio. Adam Amin and Chris Canty will call the game. Sal Paolantonio will work the sidelines. LOCAL RADIO: 98.5 FM, The Sports Hub, is the flagship station for the Patriots Radio Network. ## SERIES HISTORY



The Patriots and Jets will meet for the 115th time, including three postseason games, since the series between the AFC East rivals began in 1960. It will be the first meeting of the 2016 season. The Patriots will host the Jets at Gillette Stadium on Sat., Dec. 24.

Last season, the two teams split the series with the Patriots taking a 30-23 win at Gillette Stadium on Oct. 25, before losing 26-20 in overtime in the rematch at MetLife Stadium on Dec. 27.

The Patriots lead the series, 59-54-1 overall.

The Patriots are 32-25-1 all-time against the Jets at home, including 1-1 at home in the postseason.

The Patriots are 27-29 all-time on the road against the Jets, including 3-3 at MetLife Stadium.

The teams have played in the postseason three times – a 1985 Wild Card game, a 2006 Wild Card game and an AFC Divisional game in 2010. New England beat the Jets, 26-14, in 1985 at the Meadowlands on their way to Super Bowl XX. In 2006, the Patriots defeated the Jets, 37-16, at Gillette Stadium and the Jets beat the Patriots, 28-21, in the 2010 Divisional playoff game.

New England is 30-16 against the Jets since Robert Kraft purchased the team in 1994.

New England's 59 overall victories over the Jets (including two playoff wins) are the second most over any single opponent, trailing only Buffalo with 70 all-time wins.

The New England Patriots entered the fourth quarter down 17-16 and fell behind 20-16 at home against the New York Jets before scoring on their only two drives of the fourth quarter to take the lead and held on for a 30-23 victory to improve to a 6-0 record. It was the third time in team history and the first since 2007 that the Patriots began a season with a 6-0 record.

QB Tom Brady connected on 14-of-17 passes for 150 yards and two touchdowns in the fourth quarter to rally from the 20-16 deficit. Brady finished the game 34-of 54 for 355 yards and threw at least two touchdowns for the sixth time in 2015. Brady also scored on a 1-yard touchdown run on a fourth-andgoal from the 1-yard line in the second quarter.

TE Rob Gronkowski had a career-high 11 receptions for 108 yards, including a 15-yard touchdown in the fourth quarter that gave the Patriots a 30-20 lead with 1:13 left to play. WR Danny Amendola caught eight passes for 86 yards, including an 8-yard touchdown in the fourth quarter that gave New England a 23-20 lead.

After Gronkowski's touchdown made the score 30-20, the Jets rallied in the final minute, moving to the New England 37-yard line, where they kicked a 55-yard field goal on a first-down play with 23 seconds to play to make it 30-23. The Jets recovered the onside kick attempt on the ensuing drive and moved to the 37-yard before a false start penalty forced a time run off to secure the Patriots victory.

The Patriots defense held Jets RB Chris lvory to just 41 yards on 17 attempts for a 2.4-yard average, after he entered the game as the NFL's leading rusher. The Jets defense entered the game first in the NFL and limited the Patriots to just nine rushing attempts for 16 yards for a 1.8-yard average.

DE Chandler Jones forced a fumble on a 2-yard sack of Jets QB Ryan Fitzpatrick on the game's second play, and LB Dont'a Hightower recovered at the Jets 19-yard line. That helped lead to a 38-yard field goal for a 3-0 lead. The Jets scored the game's next 10 points with a field goal on their next possession and then finished a 14-play, 83-yard drive with a touchdown for a 10-3 second quarter lead.

Brady tied the game at 10 midway through the second quarter with his 1-yard touchdown on a fourth-down sneak and then the Patriots took a 13-10 halftime lead when K Stephen Gostkowski connected on a 46-yard field goal with 2:05 left to play.

The Patriots opened the third quarter with a 65-yard drive that ended with a field goal for the first points given up by the Jets in the third quarter all season to make it 16-10. But, the Jets scored on their next two drives to make it 20-16 early in the fourth quarter.

The New England Patriots dropped a 26-20 overtime game at the New York Jets at MetLife Stadium. Tom Brady rallied the Patriots from a17-3 deficit to tie the game at 20 with 1:55 to play in regulation on a 9-yard touchdown pass to RB James Whte. The Patriots won the overtime coin toss and elected to kick. A 48-yard pass play from Jets QB Ryan Fitzpatrick to WR Quincy Enunwa and a 20-yard pass to WR Brandon Marshall helped get in position for Fitzpatrick's game-winning 6-yard touchdown pass to WR Eric Decker.

Brady and TE Rob Gronkowski connected on two big fourth-down plays to help set up the game-tying touchdown. Faced with a fourth-and-1 from the Jets 44-yard line, Brady hit Gronkowski for an 8-yard pass for the first down. Then on a fourth-and-9 from the Jets 35-yard line, Gronkowski and Brady hooked up on a 26-yard pass to set up a first down at the 9-yard line. On the next play, Brady hit White for the game-tying touchdown.

After building a 17-3 third-quarter lead, the Patriots answered with 10 points. First, K Stephen Gostkowski drilled a 44-yard field goal to make it 17-6. Then, DL Jabaal Sheard forced a fumble on a 9-yard sack that was recovered by LB Jamie Collins and returned 14 yards for a touchdown to make it 17-13 heading into the fourth quarter.

A nine-play, 49-yard Jets drive ended with a 49-yard field goal early in the fourth quarter to extend their lead to 20-13.

The Jets scored the game's only first-quarter points on a 30-yard field goal. The Patriots tied the game at 3-3 in the second quarter after kicking a field goal when a drive stalled at the New York 17-yard line.

The Jets answered with a 13-play, 80-yard drive that culminated with a twoyard pass from Fitzpatrick to Marshall for a 10-3 halftime lead.

The Patriots took the second half kickoff, but the drive ended when Brady was intercepted by CB Darrelle Revis on a deep pass at the Jets 21-yard line. The Jets converted the turnover into a 61-yard drive that ended on a 33-yard touchdown pass to Marshall for a 17-3 lead.

The New England Patriots rebounded from the loss to Seattle with a 30-17 win at San Francisco to improve to an 8-2 record. With the win, the Patriots are guaranteed to finish with a record of .500 or better for the 16th consecutive season.

For the first time in his 17 seasons, QB Tom Brady played at San Francisco against his hometown team. He threw for 280 yards and four touchdowns to lead the Patriots to victory. With the win, Brady tied Brett Favre with 199 total wins, one win behind all-time leader Peyton manning at 200 career wins.

Brady completed eight of his first nine passes and nine of 11, while the defense recorded five first half sacks, including a sack by CB Malcolm Butler on the game's first play for his first career sack.

RB LeGarrette Blount inched closer to a 1,000-yard season with his fourth 100-yard game of the year, gaining 124 yards on 19 carries. He also set up a key Patriots score with a 44-yard run to the San Francisco 33-yard line.

Rookie WR Malcolm Mitchell had a career-day, with four receptions for 98 yards, including a 56-yard touchdown catch from Brady in the fourth quarter.

The Patriots scored touchdowns on their first two offensive drives and then slowed down until a 17-point fourth quarter. After stopping the 49ers on the game's opening drive, WR Danny Amendola's 30-yard punt return allowed the Patriots to open their first drive at the San Francisco 27-yard line. The Patriots moved to the 4-yard line where Brady connected with WR Julian Edelman on a touchdown pass for a 6-0 lead after a failed extra point. San Francisco answered with a field goal to make it 6-3 at the end of the first quarter.

Blount ripped off a 44-yard run on the ensuing drive that helped set up a touchdown in the second quarter on a 9-yard pass from Brady to RB James White, to extend the lead to 13-3. The 49ers scored before the end of the half to make it 13-10 at the break.

After a scoreless third quarter, the Patriots ended a 10-play, 80-yard drive with a 5-yard touchdown pass from Brady to Amendola on the first play of the fourth quarter to make it 20-10.

The Patriots defense stopped San Francisco on three straight series of three-and-out and scored on three of their four fourth quarter possessions before running out the clock to win the game on their fifth drive of the game, a drive that ended at the San Francisco 3-yard line.

Later in the fourth quarter, Brady connected with Mitchell for a 56-yard touchdown for a 27-10 lead. After stopping the 49ers on the ensuing drive, a 21-yard pass from Brady to Edelman followed by a 20-yard run by Blount helped set up a 38-yard field goal by K Stephen Gostkowski for a 30-10 lead.

San Francisco converted three third downs on its next possession to help set up a touchdown. The Patriots were able to move to the San Francisco 3-yard line and run off the final two minutes of the game to secure the victory.



## PATS BETTER THAN AVERAGE

After improving to 8-2 on the 2016 season, the Patriots are guaranteed to finish the season with a record of .500 or better for the 16th consecutive year. At the conclusion of the 2016 season, the Patriots will be the only NFL team to finish with a record of .500 or better in each of the last 16 years (2001-2016). Each of the other 31 NFL teams had at least one losing season since 2001.

## PATS SACK PARTY

The Patriots tied a team mark for most first half sacks with five sacks against the 49ers. The Patriots also had five first half sacks at Arizona on Sept. 19, 2004 in a game that they finished with five. The Patriots record for most sacks in a half overall is six, which was done three different times in the second half of a game, most recently on Oct. 27, 2013 vs. Miami.

## PATS SACK PARTY II

The Patriots finished with five sacks. The Patriots defense had five or more sacks four times in 2015, including a season-high of eight sacks at Buffalo on Sept. 20, 105.

## INTER-CONFERENCE SUCCESS

The New England Patriots own a 47-12 (.797) record vs. NFC teams since realignment in 2002, the best inter-conference record in the NFL during that time.

\*Belichick is tied with Tom Landry and Don Shula with 13 division titles and needs one more division title to set the record for most among all head coaches.

\*Bill Belichick passed Curly Lambeau for fourth place and now has 231 regular seasons wins. He is behind Don Shula (328), George Halas (318) and Tom Landry (250).

\*Belichick's Patriots teams have twice recorded five straight years of playoff advancement (2003-07 and 2011-15), tying the NFL record. If the Patriots advance in 2016, they will set the NFL record. # INDIVIDUAL S. TEAM NOTES





Since Robert Kraft purchased the team in 1994, the Patriots have experienced one of the most dramatic turnarounds in the history of sports. Now in his 23rd season of ownership, Kraft has transformed one of the league's least successful clubs into what observers view as a model NFL franchise. In the five seasons immediately preceding his purchase (1989-93), the Patriots were a moribund team, winning just 19 of 80 games [.238 pct.] and logging the worst record in the NFL over that span. When he bought the franchise on Jan. 21, 1994, Kraft

announced his intention to bring a championship to New England, a tall order considering the team's previous success rate. But under Kraft's leadership, the Patriots have won more division titles (15), conference crowns (7) and Super Bowl championships (4) than any other NFL team. Super Bowl XLIX was the seventh Super Bowl appearance since Kraft purchased the team, a period during which no other team has earned more than four berths. In Kraft's 22 seasons, the Patriots have qualified for the playoffs 17 times, more than doubling the franchise's accomplishments during its first 34 seasons.

The victory over the New York Jets (12/21/14) was the 250th win under Robert Kraft. His 250 wins in his first 368 total games tied Chicago's George Halas for the fastest an owner has reached 250 victories.

## CONTINUITY BREEDS SUCCESS

New England is the second team (1970s Pittsburgh Steelers) in NFL history – and first in 35 years – to win four Super Bowls with the same owner (Robert Kraft), head coach (Bill Belichick) and quarterback (Tom Brady).

## KRAFT PRODUCES MORE WINS THAN EV-ERY OTHER PATRIOTS OWNER COMBINED

The Patriots have 274 wins overall under Robert Kraft. He has produced more victories than every other Patriots owner combined. Under Kraft, the Patriots are 274-126 overall since he purchased the team in 1994. Kraft's predecessors in the owner's office went 225-276-9 in the 34 years prior to his purchase of the team.



## New England is set to take on the Jets this Sunday, almost exactly 15 years after its comeback win in New York on route to Super Bowl XXXVI.

Just shy of exactly 15 years removed from a Week 12 meeting at the Meadowlands on December 2, 2001, the Patriots and Jets will square off in East Rutherford, N.J. in Week 12 action yet again this Sunday. New England will look to repeat history as the 2001 matchup ended in favor of the red, white and blue. That victory was thanks to successful 28-yard Adam Vinatieri field goal attempt in the game's final minutes, a play that foreshadowed the Patriots' fate in New Orleans just two months later when the New England kicker sent a 48-yarder through the goal posts with the score tied and no time remaining to notch the franchise's first ever Super Bowl Championship. In December at the Meadowlands, the Patriots had fallen behind 13-0 at the half.



They went on to respond with two third quarter touchdowns to put the score at 16-14, Jets, heading into the fourth stanza after New York's John Hall added a three-point score on a 50-yard field goal. With 6:29 remaining in the game, Vinatieri's 28-yard try was good, and New England held on to seal the comeback win. Sixty-three days later, the circumstances were all too familiar. With the score tied at 17 and this time, zero seconds remaining on the clock, Vinatieri made good on a 48-yarder and the Patriots were Super Bowl champions.

## PATRIOTS ANNOUNCE SERIES OF INITIATIVES THROUGHOUT 2016 SEASON

The New England Patriots will introduce a series of initiatives throughout the 2016 season to celebrate the 15th anniversary of the 2001 Super Bowl Championship team. The season-long celebration kicked off with a special content series that gives fans the opportunity to relive that magical season. It began with the Patriots, much to the surprise of the TV broadcasters, choosing to be introduced as a team rather than the traditional introduction of individual players. The Patriots then went on to capture its first world championship in thrilling fashion over the heavily favored Rams, as Super Bowl XXXVI was the first to ever be won on the game's final play.

Bolden's grandfather, Frank Pitts, played 10 years in the NFL (1965-74) as a receiver for Kansas City, Cleveland and Oakland. He was with Kansas City for two Super Bowls, losing Super Bowl I and winning Super Bowl IV. Said Bolden about his grandfather, "I remember being six years old, him popping in a highlight film of Super Bowl I and IV. I've seen that tape at least 500 times."

#### BOLDEN BLOCK PARTY

Brandon Bolden blocked his first NFL punt in the win at San Diego (12/7/14) to give the Patriots a first down at the Chargers 25-yard line. It was the Patriots first blocked punt since Patrick Chung blocked a punt at Miami on Oct. 4, 2010.



#### OVERCOMING ADVERSITY

On April 20, 2011, just days before Texas Christian offensive line prospect Marcus Cannon was to enter the NFL Draft, he was diagnosed with non-Hodgkin's lymphoma, a treatable form of cancer found in lymph tissue. A little more than one week later, the Patriots selected Cannon in the fifth round (138th overall) of the draft with the knowledge of his illness. The Patriots placed Cannon on the Reserve/Non Football Injury list to start the 2011 season while he received treatment and recovered. Cannon was activated to the 53-man roster later that year and is now in his fifth season with the team. Cannon made a full recovery and was named the Patriots 2011 Ed Block Courage Award winner - an annual award presented to select players in the National Football League who are voted by their teammates as role models of inspiration, sportsmanship and courage.

Edelman began his college football career with a year at the College of San Mateo [Calif.] before transferring to Kent State where as a senior he completed 56 percent of his passes [153 of 275 passes for 1,820 yards] with 13 touchdowns. He was also the leading rusher, gaining 1,551 yards on 215 attempts [an average of 7.5 yards per carry] and scoring 13 touchdowns. His offensive numbers broke Kent State's single-season record for total offense set by Joshua Cribbs in 2003. Said head coach Bill Belichick on the versatility of Edelman: "He played the quarterback position in college at Kent State and all the positions really that he's played in the NFL – covering kicks, returning kicks, slot receiver, outside receiver, slot defender – he didn't do any of those things in college. I think that really speaks to his versatility and how much he's grown as a player and how many things he's learned how to do that he really didn't have much experience with in college. I'd say that's pretty unusual, especially to be as competent in them as he is."

EDELMAN TAKES HIS FATHER'S ADVICE

If there is one thing Julian Edelman has never lacked, it's athletic ability. A dual-threat quarterback at Kent State and former baseball standout in high school, Edelman once wowed Toronto Blue Jays players with his impressive footwork while fielding ground balls in an appearance at batting practice in 2011.

This natural ability may have been overlooked by NFL scouts, who let him fall to the Patriots in the seventh round of the 2009 NFL Draft. Edelman remains focused on the lessons his father, Frank Edelman, taught him at a young age. "I'm still constantly trying to learn," Edelman told *The Boston Herald.* "My dad always put it in my head, when you're green, you're growing, when you're ripe, you're lost. When you're done learning, you're done."



#### **GAROPPOLO MAKES FIRST START**

Jimmy Garoppolo became just the fifth quarterback in the last 30 years to make his first regular-season start in a season-opening night game (Sept. 11, 2016 vs. Cardinals). Despite a successful three-year lacrosse career at Penn State, Hogan, also a standout football player in high school, said that playing college football was always in the back of his mind. Having redshirted his sophomore year of lacrosse, Hogan had an extra year of athletic eligibility following his fourth academic year at Penn State. As the football itch still lurked in the back of his mind, Chris played his final year of eligibility with the Monmouth football team, and at the end of the season, joined in on some workouts with teammates who were training for the NFL Combine.

"I honestly didn't know if I had what it took to play in the NFL," Hogan wrote in the Tribune. "Still, it was one of those things where I didn't want to look back in five years and be like, 'Man, I wish I would've tried.'"

Chris did not get invited to compete in that year's Combine, but turned heads during a Pro Day held at Fordham. Later that summer, he signed with the San Francisco 49ers as an undrafted free agent.

#### ELECTED TEAM LEADER

Patriots wide receiver Matthew Slater has been named to five straight Pro Bowls (2011-15) for his special teams work, but perhaps more revealing of his value to New England is the fact that he was elected a captain by his teammates for the sixth straight season in 2016.

The special teams ace was willing to share his advice on being a great captain with high school football players in a story published by *The Boston Globe*. "I think first and foremost, you have to be able to put others before yourself. Being a captain and leadership is about serving, and to me, that means a great deal of sacrifice – putting aside personal agendas for the greater common goal. Leadership is equated with sacrifice. I think you have to be willing to do whatever it takes for the unit to succeed. I think you need to lead by example. A lot of times, it's about what you do, not what you say."

#### SLATER'S EMERGENCE WAS SPECIAL

Bill Belichick acknowledged Matthew Slater's role as a gunner on special teams: "Matt is one of the best in the league," Belichick said. "Any time the punt return team has to double somebody, that makes it one less guy they can use somewhere else in the return. He almost always draws two guys out there unless they're in an eight-man rush. Most of the time, there's two guys out there — fourth-and-short, where they're trying to protect the box — but he draws a lot of double teams, and deservedly so. He does an outstanding job of covering punts."



#### WHITE HAS CAREER DAY

James White set career highs with 10 receptions and 115 receiving yards vs. Philadelphia (12/6/15). White's 115 receiving yards are the second-highest such total for a Patriots running back since the 1970 AFL-NFL merger, trailing only Shane Vereen's team-record 153 receiving yards vs. Cleveland on Dec. 8, 2013. White's 10 catches are the third highest such total of the Bill Belichick era for a running back (since 2000), trailing only Shane Vereen's club record 12 catches vs. Cleveland on Dec. 8, 2013, and Kevin Faulk's 11 catches vs. Tampa Bay on Sept. 3, 2000.

On July 18, Nate Ebner was selected to the 2016 U.S. Olympic Rugby squad and after he was given an excused leave of absence from his football obligations in Foxboro, suited up for Team USA in Rio de Janeiro in August. The Dublin, Ohio native was introduced to the sport of rugby around the age of six and developed a passion and a talent that stemmed from his father and role model, Jeff Ebner, who played the game at the University of Minnesota. Nate did not play football in high school but was a two-time MVP of the USA Rugby team at the Junior World Cup and a standout on the U19 and U20 national teams.

★ In 2013, Long climbed Mt. Kilamanjaro with former teammate James Hall. While on the trip, Chris noticed the horrible water conditions facing the children and natives to Tanzania. Through his charitable organization, the Chris Long Foundation, Long started the Waterboys Initiative to help raise money and build wells in East Africa that could provide a source of clean water in poor areas.

★ Chris's brother, two-time Pro Bowler Kyle Long, plays for the Chicago Bears, while his father, a Charlestown, Mass. Native, Pro Football Hall of Famer and eight-time Pro Bowler, Howie Long, played 13 seasons for the Oakland Raiders. Long's youngest brother, Howie Jr., is a personnel assistant for the Raiders.



#### DOUBLE TROUBLE: DB DEVIN McCOURTY

After being selected by the Patriots in the first round of the 2010 NFL Draft, DB Devin McCourty became part of a select group in league history. McCourty's identical twin brother, Jason, is a cornerback with Tennessee, selected in the sixth round of the 2009 NFL Draft. The two are the 12th set of twins to play in the NFL. Devin redshirted for the 2005 season and therefore was a year behind his brother in eligibility. McCourty is the second twin to suit up for the Patriots, after CB Kato Serwanga was a member of the team from 1998-2000. His twin brother, Wasswa, played for San Francisco and Minnesota from 1999-2001. According to McCourty's mother, the two can only be told apart by tiny scars on their faces left by chickenpox. The McCourty twins are one of two active sets of twins playing in the NFL.

#### McCOURTY GOES LONG

#### WHERE DID HE COME FROM?

Rob Ninkovich's journey to the Patriots was not easy. He entered the league as a fifth-round pick by the Saints in 2006 and was waived four times by New Orleans and Miami before landing in New England on Aug. 2, 2009. He spent the 2009 offseason trying to make the New Orleans team as a long snapper. Before coming to the Patriots, he had appeared in just eight games over three seasons. He doubled that total in his first year in New England, appearing in 15 games in 2009 and his role on the team has grown since, earning a starting role at linebacker in 2010 and 2011 before moving to a starting role on the defensive line in 2011.

#### **CAREER DAY IN BUFFALO**

Ninkovich finished with a three-sack game for the first time in his career in the win at Buffalo (10/12/14), He has had two two-sack performances - vs. Miami (1/2/11) and at Carolina (11/18/13).

#### **CRAZY EIGHTS**

Ninkovich had eight sacks in three consecutive seasons from 2012-14, becoming the first Patriots player to have at least eight sacks in three consecutive seasons since Pro Football Hall of Famer Andre Tippett achieved the feat from 1985-87 (1985,  $16\frac{1}{2}$ , 1986,  $9\frac{1}{2}$  and 1987,  $12\frac{1}{2}$ ).

#### NINKOVICH SCORED AS A TE IN COLLEGE

Ninkovich played some at tight end in college at Purdue and caught two touchdown passes with a 2-yard touchdown pass from Buffalo QB Kyle Orton and a 1-yard touchdown pass from former New York Giants and Indianapolis QB Curtis Painter.

## DB LOGAN RYAN AND DB DURON HARMON

#### CLASSMATES REUNITE IN NEW ENGLAND

Defensive backs Logan Ryan and Duron Harmon are used to working together. Ryan and Harmon began their college football careers together as members of the same recruiting class at Rutgers University and developed a close friendship during their four years in Piscataway, N.J. As fate would have it, Ryan and Harmon would begin their NFL journeys together as well when the Patriots selected the two defensive backs just eight picks apart in the third round of the 2013 NFL Draft.

Reunited once again, the former Scarlet Knights are excited and eager to make their mark, just as they did at Rutgers. "We talked before the draft and said how good it would be to play on the same team again, and for it to happen again, it's exciting and it's a blessing," Harmon told *The Boston Globe.* "It's great [we're contributing], because at the end of the day you want to play, and to contribute to a team like this, it's fun."

#### RYAN RETURNS... TO SCHOOL

When Logan Ryan decided to leave Rutgers and enter the NFL Draft after his redshirt junior season in 2012, he made a promise to his parents that after his rookie year, he would return to school and earn his degree.

Ryan kept his promise and graduated in the spring of 2014 with a degree in labor relations and a minor in psychology.

"I committed to Rutgers, not only as a football player, but as a student, so I was going to make sure I finished that end too," Ryan told NJ.com.

"It's a big accomplishment in my life. I held my word to my parents and stuck with it and I'm fortunate. It took a lot of work, but I was able to go back and finish and walk in graduation."

#### RYAN'S FIRST PICK FOR SIX

Ryan returned his first NFL interception 79 yards for a touchdown N.Y. Jets on Oct. 20, 2013. The last Patriots player to return their first career interception for a touchdown was Kyle Arrington in 2010. #### SCORING FLURRY

The Patriots scored three touchdowns in a 57-second span during the final two minutes of the first half against Chicago on Oct. 26, 2014 to turn a 17-7 lead into a 38-7 cushion. It was the fastest three-touchdown flurry in the NFL since the Patriots had three touchdowns in 52 seconds against the New York Jets on Nov. 22, 2012. ★ After the Patriots defense forced a quick three-and-out, a 42-yard Julian Edelman punt return gave New England possession at the Chicago 9-yard line, and Brady found Brandon LaFell for a 9-yard touchdown on the next play to give the Patriots a 31-7 lead with 1:07 left in the first half.

 $\star$  On the Bears' first play following the LaFell touchdown, Zach Moore forced a Jay Cutler fumble that was recovered by Rob Ninkovich and returned for a 15-yard touchdown and a 38-7 Patriots lead with 55 seconds left in the first half.

#### A COMEBACK FOR THE AGES

The Patriots came back from a 24-point deficit to defeat the Broncos, 34-31, in overtime in a Sunday Night Football matchup on Nov. 24, 2013, marking the largest comeback win in team history, after trailing 24-0 at halftime.

New England's previous best comeback win was from a 23-0 deficit to win, 38-23, vs. Seattle (9/16/84). The Patriots also came back from 22 points down to win at the New York Giants, 23-22 (12/21/96). The Patriots have come from 21 points down to win four times, most recently vs. Buffalo (1/1/12).

#### PATRIOTS IN THE PLAYOFFS

The Patriots have qualified for the playoffs 23 times in their 56-year history. Seventeen of those playoff berths have come in the 22 seasons since Robert Kraft purchased the team in 1994, a dramatic contrast to the six total playoff berths the team earned in its first 34 years of existence. The Patriots have won 18 division crowns, including 13 in the last 15 seasons, and have qualified as a Wild Card team four times (1976, 1985, 1994 and 1998). The Patriots also qualified for the playoffs in 1982 during the strike season.
