CAROLINA HEADS WEST FOR ROAD GAME AT LOS ANGELES

CAROLINA AT LOS ANGELES

Carolina travels to Los Angeles this week to take on the Rams at Los Angeles Memorial Coliseum. The Rams are the Panthers second consecutive NFC West opponent after Carolina earned a 30-20 victory over Arizona (10/30/16) in Week Eight.

Against Arizona, Jonathan Stewart rushed for 95 yards and two rushing touchdowns and the Panthers defense contributed a season-high eight sacks, tied for the second-most in team history.

Los Angeles is returning to action following a bye week. Prior to the bye, Los Angeles suffered a 17-10 loss to the New York Giants at Twickenham Stadium in England.

The Panthers and Rams will meet for the 21st time in history Sunday. Former division foes in the NFC West, the Panthers and Rams met twice a year from 1995-2001.

The Panthers hold a 12-8 edge in the all-time series, with one victory coming in the 2003 postseason. The teams last met in 2013 in Charlotte with the Panthers earning the victory.

- Panthers offensive line coach John Matsko served as the Rams offensive line coach from 1999-2005, earning a Super Bowl ring with a victory in Super Bowl XXXIV.
- Panthers wide receivers coach Ricky Proehl played for the Rams from 1998-2002 and was part of the Rams Super Bowl XXXIV championship team.

THE HEAD COACHES



Ron RIVERA

NFL: 20th season

Ron Rivera became the fourth coach in Carolina Panthers history on January 11, 2011.

In five seasons, Rivera has guided the team to a Super Bowl appearance, an NFC Championship and three NFC South titles. He is a two-time (2013 and 2015) Associated Press NFL Coach of the Year award winner.

In 2015, Rivera led the Panthers to the second Super Bowl appearance in team history following a franchise-best 15-1 record and their third consecutive NFC South championship. In the process, Carolina became the fourth team in the Super Bowl era to start a season 14-0, joining the 1972 Miami Dolphins, 2007 New England Patriots and 2009 Indianapolis Colts. Carolina's 18-game regular season winning streak was the longest in NFC history. In 2014, Rivera led the Panthers to their second consecutive NFC South championship and the team's first playoff win since 2005. The Panthers became the first team since 1970 to overcome a six-game losing streak and win their division. In 2013, Rivera directed Carolina to 12 wins, the NFC South title and its first playoff appearance since 2008.

Before joining the Panthers, Rivera was an assistant coach with the San Diego Chargers (2007-2010), Chicago Bears (2004-06, 1997-98) and Philadelphia Eagles (1999-2003). In 2006, the Bears defense led the NFL with 44 takeaways, helping propel Chicago to an appearance in Super Bowl XLI. He is just the third Latino head coach in NFL history, joining Tom Flores with the Oakland Raiders (1979-1987) and Seattle Seahawks (1992-94) and Tom Fears with the New Orleans Saints (1967-1970).

A second-round draft choice in 1984 by Chicago, Rivera played nine seasons with the Bears. Primarily an outside linebacker, he was a member of the 1985 Super Bowl XX winning team.

Rivera played linebacker at Cal (1980-83), where he finished as the school's all-time leader in sacks (22) and tackles (336).

Born January 7, 1962 in Fort Ord, Calif., Rivera and his wife, Stephanie, have two children—Christopher and Courtney.

Jeff FISHER

Jeff Fisher was named the 26th head coach in franchise history on January 17, 2012. Entering this season, Fisher ranked 17th on the NFL's career wins list (167, including postseason), and third among active coaches.

Fisher spent 16 full seasons as head coach of the Tennessee Titans, 11 as executive vice president. He guided the Titans to six playoff appearances, three division titles, two AFC Championship games (1999, 2002) and one Super Bowl appearance (XXXIV).

Fisher previously coached with the Philadelphia Eagles (1986-88), Los Angeles Rams (NFL's youngest defensive coordinator, 1989-1991), and San Francisco 49ers (1992-93). He was a defensive back and return specialist with the Chicago Bears (1981-85). Fisher earned a Super Bowl ring following Chicago's Super Bowl XX victory (1985).

Fisher played defensive back collegiately at Southern California.

Born February 25, 1958 in Woodland Hills, Calif., Fisher has three children: sons Brandon (age 26) and Trent (age 21), and daughter Tara (age 24).

CAROLINA 30, St. Louis 15

OCTOBER 20, 2013 • BANK OF AMERICA STADIUM • CHARLOTTE, N.C.

The Carolina Panthers improved to 3-3 on the year with a 30-15 win over the St. Louis Rams at Bank of America Stadium as quarterback Cam Newton completed 15-of-17 passes for 204 yards and a touchdown, while DeAngelo Williams paced the ground attack with 40 yards on 15 carries. Cornerback Captain Munnerylyn got things going for Carolina early returning a Sam Bradford interception for a 45-yard touchdown on the first play of the game. Carolina never trailed from there. After stopping St. Louis on downs at the Carolina one-yard line, fullback Mike Tolbert was tackled in the end zone for a safety cutting the Panthers lead to 7-2. The teams exchanged field goals before Tolbert recorded a 1-yard touchdown late in the second quarter to give the Panthers a 17-5 halftime lead. After Graham Gano converted a 31-yard field goal in the third quarter, the Rams cut the lead to 20-12 courtesy of a 4-yard touchdown pass to running back Zac Stacy. Carolina countered with an eight-play 72-yard drive culminated by a 19-yard touchdown from wide receiver Steve Smith late in the third quarter to extend the Panthers lead to 27-12. Gano closed the scoring for Carolina with a 50-yard field goal.

STEWART SCORES TWICE

For the second consecutive game, running back Jonathan Stewart rushed for two touchdowns, finding the end zone from 2 yards and 1 yard out in Week Eight vs. Arizona (10/30/16). It marked the first time in Stewart's career with consecutive games of multiple rushing touchdowns.

Stewart rushed 25 times for 95 yards and two touchdowns. It was the eighth game, including the postseason, of Stewart's career with two rushing touchdowns, and first since last season's Divisional Playoff game vs. Seattle (1/17/16).

LOTULELEI POSTS CAREER HIGH 3 SACKS

In Week Eight vs. Arizona (10/30/16), defensive tackle Star Lotulelei recorded a career high 3.0 sacks. The three sacks matched Lotulelei's previous career high for a single season set in 2013.

Lotulelei's first sack of the game came on Arizona's first drive and was a strip-sack that resulted in a 46-yard TD return by linebacker Thomas Davis.

Lotulelei's three sacks were part of an eight-sack performance by Carolina. The eight sacks are the second-most in a regular season game in Panthers history and tied for the most in a single-game by an NFL team this season.

TD SCORES FIRST TD OF 12-YEAR CAREER

In Week Eight vs. Arizona (10/30/16), linebacker Thomas Davis scored his first career touchdown, returning a fumble by quarterback Carson Palmer 46 yards for a score on Arizona's first drive of the game.

The fumble recovery for a touchdown was Carolina's third defensive score of the season. In addition to Davis' score, linebacker Shaq Thompson returned a fumble for a touchdown in Week Two vs. San Francisco (9/18/16), and safety Kurt Coleman returned an interception for a touchdown in Week Four at Atlanta (10/2/16).

JOHNSON MAKES SEASON DEBUT

Cornerback Leonard Johnson made his season debut in Week Eight vs. Arizona (10/30/16) after being activated from the reserve/non-football injury list.

Johnson played 65 of the team's 71 defensive snaps (92 percent) and established a career-high with 13 tackles, including the first sack of his career.

In his fifth season, Johnson joined the Panthers in the offseason. He previously played for the Tampa Bay Buccaneers (2012-15) and New England Patriots (2015). He has played in 53 career regular season games with 20 starts.

GROUND AND POUND

In Week Eight vs. Arizona (10/30/16), the Panthers produced 141 rushing yards as a team. Since the start of the 2013 season, Carolina has rushed for 100 or more yards in 48 of its 55 regular season games, including 33 of the past 34.

The Panthers franchise record streak of 30 consecutive regular season games with at least 100 rushing yards was snapped in Week Four vs. Atlanta (10/2/16). The streak was the longest in the NFL since Pittsburgh produced 43 consecutive during the 1974-77 seasons.

STEWART REACHES 6,000

In Week Eight vs. Arizona (10/30/16), running back Jonathan Stewart surpassed the 6,000 career rushing yards mark.

Stewart (6,067) joins DeAngelo Williams (6,846 from 2006-14) as the only backs in team history with at least 6,000 rushing yards.

Stewart missed three games this season due to a hamstring injury, but he stands just 779 yards behind DeAngelo Williams for the team's all-time mark.

Last season, Stewart's 989 rushing yards ranked eighth in the NFL. He rushed a career-high 242 times, the seventh-most in the NFL. Stewart's six touchdowns are his most since he tallied 10 touchdowns in back-to-back seasons in 2008 and 2009.

BENJAMIN PRODUCING IN RETURN

Wide receiver Kelvin Benjamin, the Panthers first-round draft choice in 2014, returned to the lineup in Week One at Denver (9/8/16) after missing all of last season with a knee injury.

Benjamin is tied for eighth in the NFL with four receiving touchdowns and has totaled 467 yards on 31 receptions.

In 2014, Benjamin ranked third among NFL rookies with 1,008 receiving yards, 73 receptions and nine receiving touchdowns. Fifty of Benjamin's 73 catches resulted in first downs, second among rookies to only New York Giants receiver Odell Beckham, Jr. (57).

That season Benjamin and tight end Greg Olsen finished the year tied for the team lead with 1,008 receiving yards, becoming the first pair of Panthers to each gain 1,000 receiving yards in a single season since Muhsin Muhammad and Patrick Jeffers in 1999.

Benjamin's numbers are the best by a rookie in Panthers history, surpassing Keary Colbert's numbers in 2004 (47 for 754 and five).

A first-round choice (31st overall) by Chicago in 2007, Olsen missed the first two games of that season with a knee injury sustained in the preseason. He made his NFL debut vs. Dallas (9/23/07) and has not missed a game since.

OLSEN LEADS THE WAY AT TIGHT END

In 2015, Greg Olsen tallied a career-high 1,104 receiving yards, his second consecutive season with 1,000 yards. He is the seventh tight end in NFL history with consecutive 1,000-yard seasons.

Olsen has tallied four consecutive seasons with at least 800 yards and has registered at least 500 yards in seven of the past eight seasons. 2015 was also the third consecutive 70-catch season for Olsen and the sixth 50-catch season of his career. Olsen's seven touchdown catches in 2015 make him the only active NFL tight end with five or more touchdowns in every season since 2008 (2008-15).

Olsen owns the top four single-season reception totals and four of the top five single-season receiving yards totals by a tight end in team history. In 2014, Olsen totaled a career-high 84 receptions, a new Panthers tight end record, surpassing his own team record of 73 catches (2013).

Newton is one of just three players in NFL history, along with Peyton Manning of the Indianapolis Colts from 1998-2002 and Andy Dalton of the Cincinnati Bengals from 2011-15, to have at least 3,000 passing yards in each of their first five seasons.

Newton rushed for 636 yards in 2015, his fifth consecutive of at least 500 rushing yards. Newton joins Randall Cunningham and Michael Vick (six each) as the only quarterbacks with five or more 500-yard rushing seasons in a career. He is the only player in NFL history to have five seasons with 3,000 or more passing yards and 500 or more rushing yards at any point in a career.

A 13-year NFL veteran, Lee is a four-time All-Pro (2007, 2009, 2011, 2012) and a three-time Pro Bowler (2007, 2009, 2011).

Lee ranks seventh all-time in gross punting average (46.3), ninth all-time in net average (39.6) and eighth all-time in punts inside the 20 (340) in NFL history.

In 2015, Lee set Browns single-season records with a 46.7-yard gross average and a 40.1-yard net average. He punted 70 times with 25 punts inside the 20-yard line.

Gano made 30-of-36 field goals in 2015. The 30 field goals tied for fifth-most in the NFL and third-most in a season in team history. Gano kicked two game-winning field goals (final two minutes of the fourth quarter or in overtime) in 2015.

Gano earned his first career Player of the Month Award, garnering NFC Special Teams Player of the Month for November

In addition to his field goal abilities, Gano has been important in the field position game. Since the start of 2013, Gano leads the NFL with a 74.1 touchback percentage.

In 2014, Gano placed 61 of his 79 kickoffs resulted in touchbacks. The 77.2 percent touchback rate was best in the League and his 61 kickoffs were the most in the NFC.

In 2013, 63 of Gano's 79 kickoffs resulted in touchbacks. His 79.7 touchback percentage was the top mark in the NFL that season and is the highest percentage in a season since Brad Daluiso in 1992 (81.3 percent).
