NOTABLE STORYLINES

The Browns host the Dallas Cowboys at 1:00 p.m. on Sunday, Nov. 6. The Browns own a 15-12 advantage in the all-time regular season series, but the Cowboys have won the past three meetings. Cleveland's last win against Dallas came during a 19-14 victory on Dec. 10, 1994.

The Browns will highlight their year-round platform of local and national military appreciation by recognizing military personnel, veterans and their families throughout Sunday's game as part of the NFL's Salute to Service initiative. Cleveland will salute and host servicemen and servicewomen from each military branch, incorporating various in-stadium elements and tributes to these local heroes.

On Monday, the Browns acquired LB **Jamie Collins** from New England via trade in exchange for a conditional draft pick. Collins is in his fourth NFL season out of Southern Mississippi. Originally selected by New England in the second round of the 2013 draft, he has appeared in 50 games with 41 starts. He has totaled 285 career tackles, 10.5 sacks, five interceptions, 10 forced fumbles, four fumble recoveries, one defensive touchdown and one blocked extra point. In 2015, he earned his first career Pro Bowl selection and was named to the Associated Press All-Pro second team. He led New England in tackles and played every defensive snap during the team's win in Super Bowl XLIX.

Last week, WR **Andrew Hawkins** registered a career-high two receiving touchdowns against the Jets. QB **Josh McCown** completed 25 of 49 passes for 341 yards with two touchdowns. It marked his 13th career 300-yard passing game. WR **Terrelle Pryor Sr.** recorded six receptions for 101 yards. RB **Isaiah Crowell** registered a rushing touchdown and RB **Duke Johnson Jr.** recorded a career high 87 receiving yards on six catches. DB **Jamar Taylor** set a career-high with four passes defensed, while rookie DL **Carl Nassib** added three.

The Browns are second in the NFL with 33 rushing plays of 10-plus yards and third in the league with a 4.93 rushing average. The team is also tied for seventh in rushing yards with 912. The Browns have eclipsed 160 rushing yards in three games this season.

LT **Joe Thomas** has been selected to the Pro Bowl in each of his first nine NFL seasons. He is the eighth player in NFL history to make the Pro Bowl in his first nine seasons. The other seven players are in the Pro Football Hall of Fame. Thomas is tied with Hall of Famers **Jim Brown** and **Lou Groza** for the most Pro Bowl selections in team history.

Rookie LB **Emmanuel Ogbah** has recorded three sacks in the past three weeks. The second-round pick is tied for third among all NFL rookies in sacks this season.

Coaching capsules:

Cleveland -- Hue Jackson: 8-16, second season as head coach, first with the Browns.

Hue Jackson was named the 16th full-time head coach in Cleveland Browns history on January 13, 2016. He is in his 30th year as a coach, including the last 16 in the NFL. He has spent nine seasons coaching in the AFC North, during which time he helped his team advance to the postseason seven times. Jackson was head coach of the Oakland Raiders in 2011 and guided the team to an 8-8 record. He has also served as offensive coordinator in Washington (2003), Atlanta (2007), Oakland (2010) and Cincinnati (2014-15). Jackson spent 14 years coaching on the college level and was a quarterback at Pacific from 1985-86.

Dallas -- Jason Garrett: 51-44, seventh season as head coach.

Named the eighth head coach in Dallas Cowboys history on Jan. 5, 2011 and became the first former Cowboys player to become the team's head coach. Named the club's interim head coach at the midpoint of the 2010 season and went on to guide a Dallas team that had started the season with a 1-7 record to a 5-3 mark down the stretch. In 2014 he oversaw a team that finished 12-4 and won the NFC East, his first division championship as head coach, and won a Wild Card playoff game. En route to winning the 2009 NFC Eastern Division title, Dallas established club records for total offensive yards (6,390), net passing yards (4,287) and pass completions (347). Dallas won the NFC East in 2007 with a team-record tying 13 victories and finished second in the NFL in scoring. Garrett was named Pro Football Weekly's NFL's Assistant Coach of the Year in March of 2008.

The Browns travel to Baltimore to face the Ravens at 8:25 p.m. on Thursday, Nov. 10. The Browns have won two of their last three Thursday night games and are 5-7 all-time on Thursday night. This will mark the second meeting between the Browns and Ravens on Thursday night as the teams also met in 2012. The Ravens lead the all-time series, 26-9, including a 25-20 victory in Week 2 this season.

- Defensive coordinator **Ray Horton** played four seasons (1989-1992) with the Dallas Cowboys where he won Super Bowl XXVII.
- Tight ends coach **Greg Seamon** spent the 2002 season as the Cowboys tight ends/offensive quality control coach.
- Assistant offensive line coach **Mark Hutson** was a third-round draft choice (67th overall) of the Dallas Cowboys in 1988.
- Strength and conditioning assistant/skills development coach **Joe Kim** served as a pass rush consultant with the Dallas Cowboys in 1998.
- LS **Charley Hughlett** was originally signed by the Dallas Cowboys as an undrafted free agent in 2012.
- Dallas running backs coach **Gary Brown** spent four seasons (2009-12) in the same role with the Browns.
- Dallas linebackers coach **Matt Eberflus** (2009-10) spent two seasons in the same role with the Browns.
- Dallas assistant special teams coach **Keith O'Quinn** served as the Browns director of pro personnel in 2009.
- Dallas defensive ends coach **Ben Bloom** spent two seasons (2009-10) with the Browns.
- LB **Tank Carder** (Texas Christian), DB **Derrick Kindred** (Texas Christian), QB **Josh McCown** (Sam Houston State), WR **Corey Coleman** (Baylor) and OL **Spencer Drango** (Baylor) played college football in the state of Texas.
- LB **Tank Carder** (Sweeny), WR **Corey Coleman** (Dallas), WR **Rashard Higgins** (Dallas), DB **Derrick Kindred** (San Antonio) and QB **Josh McCown** (Jacksonville) are Texas natives.

WHAT TO LOOK FOR THIS WEEK

With 100 rushing yards by a player other than Isaiah Crowell or Kevin Hogan, the Browns could record 100-yard rushing games from three different players in the same season for the first time since 2003 when William Green, Lee Suggs and Jamel White recorded 100-yard games on the ground.

RB Isaiah Crowell

With a rushing touchdown, Crowell will have found the end zone in three consecutive games. It would mark the first time a Browns running back has run for touchdowns in three consecutive games since Trent Richardson rushed for a touchdown in four consecutive games in Weeks 12-15 of 2012 season.

With a 100-yard game on the ground, Crowell would become the first Brown to run for 100 yards or more three times in a season since Trent Richardson in 2012.

With 100 rushing yards and a score on the ground, Crowell would be the first Brown to rush for 100 yards or more and a touchdown three times in a season since Peyton Hillis accomplished the feat four times in 2010.

With 76 rushing yards, Crowell would be the first Browns player to rush for at least 600 yards in three consecutive seasons since Kevin Mack in 1985-87.

WR Andrew Hawkins

With two or more receiving touchdowns, Hawkins would be the first Browns receiver to catch multiple touchdown passes in consecutive games since Braylon Edwards did it in 2007.

RB Duke Johnson Jr.

With six or more receptions, Johnson will become the first Browns running back to record 40 or more receptions in multiple seasons since Jamel White accomplished the feat from 2001-03.

OL Joe Thomas

Has started all 152 career games and has not missed an offensive snap since joining the Browns as the third overall selection of the 2007 draft. His consecutive snaps streak of 9,458 is the longest active stretch in the league.

COWBOYS 23 BROWNS 20 (OT)



November 18, 2012

Cowboys Stadium, Arlington, Texas

The Cowboys overcame a 13-0 halftime defeat by scoring 17 points in the fourth quarter to send the game into overtime where they emerged victorious, 23-20, in Arlington, Texas. The Browns got on the board first as rookie QB Brandon Weeden found TE Ben Watson in the end zone for a 10-yard touchdown to give the Browns a 7-0 lead. The Browns extended their lead to 10-0 on their next possession as K Phil Dawson connected on a 51-yard field goal. Dawson would give the Browns a 13-0 advantage on their next possession as he connected on a 37-yard field goal with 5:18 remaining in the half. The Cowboys got on the scoreboard in the third quarter when kicker Dan Bailey connected on a 44-yard field goal to cut the Browns lead to 13-3. QB Tony Romo completed four passes for 39 yards on the drive to set up the field goal. RB Felix Jones then put the Cowboys within a field goal as he scored a 2-yard touchdown on the third play of the fourth quarter. The touchdown was set up by Romo as he completed all seven of his pass attempts for 74 yards on the drive. Following a three and out by the Browns, Romo would put the Cowboys on top 17-13 after connecting with WR Dez Bryant for a 28-yard touchdown. The Browns next possession ended with a Weeden fumble, but the defense held strong as defensive end Frostee Rucker stripped Romo on the Cowboys next possession and the ball was recovered by linebacker Craig Robertson. The Browns would then take the lead two possessions later after Weeden again found Watson for a 17-yard touchdown to give the Browns a 20-17 advantage with 1:07 remaining in the game. The touchdown was set up by wide receiver Josh Cribbs' 21-yard punt return which resulted in a penalty against the Cowboys and gave the Browns the ball at the Cowboys 32 yard line. Romo would then lead the Cowboys on an eight-play, 66-yard drive capped on by Dan Bailey's game-tying 32-yard field goal as time expired to send the game into overtime. In overtime, the Cowboys took their second possession 28 yards over seven plays and Bailey connected on a 38-yard field goal to give Dallas the 23-20 victory.

WR Andrew Hawkins - 22 receptions for 224 yards and three TDs this season...Led Cleveland in receiving in 2014...Joined the Browns in 2014 as a restricted free agent from Cincinnati...Originally signed by the Rams in 2011 as an undrafted free agent.

LT Joe Thomas - Nine-time Pro Bowl selection who has started at left tackle in all 152 career contests...Has not missed an offensive snap since being selected as the third overall pick in the 2007 draft...His nine Pro Bowl selections are tied with Jim Brown and Lou Groza for the most by a Browns player.

LG Spencer Drango - Appeared in eight games with two starts this season...Started 48 career games at Baylor, earning All-America honors in 2014 and 2015...Selected by the Browns in the fifth round of the 2016 NFL Draft.

C Cameron Erving - Started five games at C this season...Suffered a pulmonary contusion against Baltimore...Selected by the Browns 19th overall in the 2015 NFL Draft out of Florida State.

RG John Greco - Appeared in 107 career contests...Started 63 games for the Browns...Started six games this season at RG and two at C...Traded to Cleveland in 2011...Originally drafted by the Rams in the third round of the 2008 draft.

RT Austin Pasztor - Started all eight games this season at RT...Claimed by the Browns via waivers prior to the start of the 2015 season...Originally signed by Jacksonville as an undrafted free agent.

TEAM NOTES

HORTON RETURNS TO BROWNS

This season **Ray Horton** rejoined the Browns as defensive coordinator. Horton has been an NFL defensive coordinator the past five seasons, including the 2013 season when he served as the Browns defensive coordinator. Horton orchestrated one of the best defensive turnarounds in Cleveland history. After finishing 23rd in the league the previous year, the Browns ranked ninth in the league in total defense in 2013, marking the team's best finish since 1994. The Browns limited opponents to an average of 3.9 yards per carry, which ranked eighth in the NFL and marked Cleveland's best total in 18 years. The Browns defense also registered 40 sacks, their most since 2001. Horton has coached in the NFL the past 22 seasons following a 10-year playing career as a defensive back. As a player and coach, he has made it to the Super Bowl five times, where he has three wins.

HAMILTON JOINS STAFF

Pep Hamilton joined the Browns as associate head coach – offense this season. He works closely with the quarterbacks. Hamilton spent 2013-14 and the first eight weeks of the 2015 season as the offensive coordinator for the Colts. In his two full seasons as coordinator, Indianapolis went 11-5 each year, won two AFC South division titles and advanced to the postseason each year, including a trip to the AFC Championship game in 2014. Prior to joining the Colts, Hamilton spent three seasons (2010-12) at Stanford, serving as the offensive coordinator and quarterbacks coach the final two years. Hamilton also served as the quarterbacks coach for the Chicago Bears from 2007-09.

WILSON SPEARHEADS RUN GAME

Earlier this year, **Kirby Wilson** was named the Browns running backs coach/run game coordinator. He has 18 years of experience coaching running backs in the NFL, during which time he has coached five running backs who rank in the top 25 for career rushing yards (Emmitt Smith #1, Curtis Martin #4, Edgerrin James #11, Adrian Peterson #17 and Thomas Jones #25) and two of the top four all-time reception leaders among running backs (Larry Centers #1 and Keith Byers #4). Wilson has helped seven different running backs break the 1,000-yard plateau a total of eight times. He has mentored four players to the Pro Bowl and has been to the playoffs with four different franchises, highlighted by the 2002 Buccaneers and 2008 Steelers Super Bowl victories. Wilson's teams have won six division titles and advanced to the postseason eight times.

HEAD COACH HUE JACKSON



Hue Jackson was named the 16th full-time head coach in Cleveland Browns history by Owners Dee and Jimmy Haslam on January 13, 2016. He brings 29 years of coaching experience, including the last 15 in the NFL. He has spent nine seasons coaching in the AFC North, during which time he helped his team advance to the postseason seven times. Jackson was head coach of the Oakland Raiders in 2011 and guided the team to an 8-8 record. He has also served as offensive coordinator in Washington (2003), Atlanta (2007), Oakland (2010) and Cincinnati

(2014-15).

Jackson has spent the past four seasons with the Cincinnati Bengals. During that time, he helped the Bengals to two division titles and a trip to the postseason all four years. In 2012, he served as secondary/assistant special teams coach before coaching the running backs in 2013. Jackson spent the past two seasons (2014-15) as offensive coordinator.

With Jackson as coordinator in 2015, the Bengals offense finished third in the AFC in yards per play (5.7) and points per game (26.2). He was voted by the Professional Football Writers of America (PFWA) as the Co-Assistant Coach of the Year as quarterback Andy Dalton set a career high and franchise record with a 106.3 rating, which led the AFC and was second in the NFL. After losing Dalton to injury in Week 14, Jackson guided quarterback A.J. McCarron to a 2-1 record in the final three games of the season as the Bengals clinched the AFC North title. The Cincinnati running game produced two 700-yard rushers in Jeremy Hill (794) and Giovani Bernard (730) for the first time since 1988. Tight end Tyler Eifert experienced a breakout season after hauling in 13 touchdown receptions, the most by a Bengals tight end in franchise history and the most by a Cincinnati player since 2001. Wide receiver A.J. Green added 10 receiving touchdowns on 86 receptions for 1,297 yards. Eifert, Green and left tackle Andrew Whitworth were selected to the Pro Bowl.

In Jackson's first year as offensive coordinator for Cincinnati in 2014, the run game posted its highest yards per game average (134.1) since 2000. Dalton passed for 3,398 yards and Green totaled 1,041 receiving yards. Hill led all NFL rookies with 1,124 rushing yards, the second-most by a Bengals rookie in team history.

After spending the 2010 season as the Raiders offensive coordinator, Jackson was promoted to head coach in 2011. Oakland finished the

year 8-8 and tied for first in the AFC West but missed the postseason via tiebreaker. The 8-8 mark was the best record by any Raiders team since 2002. The Raiders finished ninth in the NFL in total offense (379.5 yards per game) and seventh in rushing offense (131.9).

Before joining the Raiders, Jackson spent two seasons (2008-09) as quarterbacks coach for Baltimore, helping the Ravens advance to the playoffs both years. He was vital in the development of Joe Flacco, who was named NFL Rookie of the Year in 2008 and became the first rookie quarterback to win two playoff games as the Ravens advanced to the AFC Championship game.

From 2004-06, Jackson served as the Bengals wide receivers coach, helping develop one of the best wide receiver tandems in NFL history with Chad Johnson and T.J. Houshmandzadeh. During that span, the two combined to average 173.3 catches, 2,363.3 receiving yards and 15 touchdowns per season. In 2005, Johnson led the AFC with 1,432 receiving yards. In 2006, Johnson and Houshmandzadeh became the first Bengals duo to each top 1,000 receiving yards in the same season.

Jackson gained his first fulltime NFL experience with Washington, where he served as the running backs coach from 2001-02, before being promoted to offensive coordinator in 2003. Under Jackson's tutelage, running back Stephen Davis led the NFC with 1,432 rushing yards in 2001.

Jackson spent 14 years coaching on the college level, going from a graduate assistant at Pacific all the way to offensive coordinator at Southern California. He spent four seasons (1997-2000) as USC's offensive coordinator, where he also helped to recruit and develop players, including quarterback Carson Palmer, who went on to win the Heisman Trophy and be selected No. 1 overall in the NFL draft.

He was a minority coaching fellowship intern with the Los Angeles Rams in 1990, Arizona Cardinals in 1992 and Washington Redskins in 1995. He also served as the running backs/wide receivers/special teams coach for the London Monarchs of the World League in 1991.

Born Oct. 22, 1965, Jackson was a quarterback at Pacific from 1985-86 and threw for 2,544 yards and 19 touchdowns. The Los Angeles native also lettered in basketball and earned his degree in physical education.

Jackson and his wife, Michelle, have three daughters, Jordyn, Baylee and Haydyn.

Lincoln Financial Field, Philadelphia, Pa.

Despite trailing by just three points in the third quarter, the Cleveland Browns fell to the Eagles, 29-10, after Philadelphia pulled away late for the season-opening victory at Lincoln Financial Field. Eagles' rookie QB Carson Wentz got out to a fast start as he led a nine-play, 75-yard TD drive on their first possession of the game. Wentz connected with WR Jordan Matthews on a 19-yard TD pass to cap the drive and take a 7-0 lead. Cleveland's defense would bounce back including a sack from LB Christian Kirksey at the end of the first quarter. In the opening minutes of the second quarter, Eagles' K Caleb Sturgis converted a 22-yard field goal attempt to give Philadelphia a 10-0 advantage. The Browns responded on the ensuing possession as QB Robert Griffin III found WR Terrelle Pryor Sr. along the sideline on a 44-yard gain. Four plays later, RB Isaiah Crowell finished off the seven-play, 75-yard drive with a 2-yard TD run that left Cleveland trailing 10-7. Sturgis split the uprights once more at the end of the second quarter on a 38-yard field goal attempt, giving the Eagles a 13-7 lead at the half. In the third quarter, the Browns cut into the lead on their first drive of the half as Griffin connected with rookie WR Corey Coleman on a 58-yard pass that would lead to K Patrick Murray capping off Cleveland's drive with a 35-yard field goal and cutting the lead to 13-10. However, the Browns' following possession ended with the Eagles defense forcing a safety to take a 15-10 advantage. Philadelphia capitalized and scored once more on their next possession when Wentz conducted a nine-play, 73-yard scoring drive that finished with a 35-yard TD pass to WR Nelson Agholor. The Browns defense closed the third quarter with rookie DL Carl Nassib registering his first NFL sack. The final points of the game came late in the fourth quarter as Eagles' RB Ryan Mathews punched in a 1-yard TD run with just over a minute remaining in the game.

Despite a first quarter lead, the Ravens rallied back to defeat the Cleveland Browns, 25-20. The Browns started the game fast as QB Josh McCown led a nine-play, 75-yard opening drive that culminated in a 31-yard TD pass to rookie WR Corey Coleman, giving Cleveland a 7-0 advantage. After forcing a Baltimore punt, RB Isaiah Crowell broke free on the first play for an 85-yard TD rush on the Browns next possession. Cleveland extended its lead after an INT by DB Joe Haden – his first of two INTs in the game – gave the Browns the ball back in Ravens territory. McCown connected with Coleman once more for a 27-yard TD. The Browns could not convert on the ensuing PAT as K Patrick Murray's attempt was blocked and returned by the Ravens for the defensive two-point conversion, leaving Cleveland with a 20-2 advantage with just over four minutes remaining in the first quarter. Late in the second quarter, Ravens' QB Joe Flacco marched Baltimore down the field with a six-play, 75-yard scoring drive that ended with a 7-yard TD pass to WR Mike Wallace. After an interception by S Eric Weddle, Baltimore was able to score before the half as K Justin Tucker converted on a 52-yard field goal attempt as time expired, cutting the Cleveland lead to 20-12. The Ravens got out to a fast start in the third quarter as Flacco led a six-play, 75-yard TD drive to start the second half, connecting with Wallace yet again on a 17-yard TD pass that left Baltimore trailing 19-20. The final points of the game came in the fourth quarter as Tucker converted two more field goal attempts – the first from 49 yards away, and the second from 41 yards away to give the Ravens a 25-20 advantage. Despite a late push from the Browns offense, an INT by Baltimore LB C.J. Mosley with just 13 seconds remaining in the contest sealed the victory.

The Dolphins defeated the Browns in overtime, 30-24, in their home opener at Hard Rock Stadium. The Browns defense started strong as DB Jamar Taylor intercepted Dolphins' QB Ryan Tannehill on the second play of the game. Miami responded by forcing a turnover of their own as DL Cameron Wake strip-sacked Browns' rookie QB Cody Kessler. On their second possession, Tannehill led the Dolphins down the field on a five-play, 61-yard scoring drive including a 26-yard TD pass to WR DeVante Parker, giving Miami a 7-0 advantage. To open the second quarter, Browns' K Cody Parkey capped off a 10-play, 58-yard drive by connecting on a 46-yard field goal attempt, cutting the lead to 7-3. The Redskins pulled away from the Browns in the fourth quarter for a 31-20 victory at FedExField. Washington initiated the game's scoring as QB Kirk Cousins opened the day with a 12-play, 75-yard scoring drive, including an 8-yard TD pass to TE Jordan Reed. On their next possession, Cousins led the Redskins down the field again, eventually capping off the eight-play, 80-yard drive with a 9-yard TD pass to Reed, giving Washington a 14-0 advantage. Cleveland cut into the Redskins' lead in the second quarter with a 12-play, 81-yard drive courtesy of a 2-yard TD rush by RB Isaiah Crowell. Following an interception by DB Jamar Taylor, Cleveland evened the score at 14-14 when rookie QB Cody Kessler connected with WR Terrelle Pryor Sr. on a 9-yard TD pass - Pryor's first career TD reception. Washington regained its edge later in the half when Redskins K Dustin Hopkins split the uprights on a 49-yard field goal attempt, but K Cody Parkey tied the game up once more with a 51-yard field goal as time expired in the second quarter. Cleveland gained its first lead of the day on its opening possession of the third quarter when Parkey connected on another field goal - this time from 45 yards away - to take a 20-17 advantage. Washington stole momentum as the fourth quarter began, however, and capitalized following three different Cleveland turnovers. After forcing a fumble, Cousins found RB Chris Thompson on a 5-yard TD pass, giving the Redskins a 24-20 edge. The Browns defense bounced back and managed to keep Washington out of the end zone after another fumble, but an interception by Redskins DB Josh Norman set up a 1-yard TD rush by Redskins RB Matt Jones, giving Washington a 31-20 lead to seal the game.

PATRIOTS 33 BROWNS 13

FirstEnergy Stadium, Cleveland, Ohio

The New England Patriots defeated the Cleveland Browns, 33-13, at FirstEnergy Stadium. In his return from a four-game suspension, Patriots QB Tom Brady was effective and began his day by leading an eight-play, 80-yard TD drive, capped by a 1-yard RB LeGarrette Blount TD rush to gain a 7-0 advantage just under five minutes into the first quarter. The Browns answered quickly as rookie QB Cody Kessler responded with a nine-play, 75-yard TD drive of his own, including an 11-yard TD pass to WR Andrew Hawkins to even the game at 7-7. The Patriots soon regained their lead with another first quarter score as Brady orchestrated an eight-play, 75-yard TD drive, finding TE Martellus Bennett on a 7-yard TD pass. On the Browns' ensuing possession, a Kessler fumble on an incomplete backwards pass trickled out of the end zone for a Patriots safety, giving New England a 16-7 advantage. Early in the second quarter, Brady found Bennett in the end zone once again on a 5-yard TD pass to push the Patriots' lead to 23-7. The Patriots opened the third quarter with another scoring drive, going 75 yards in just eight plays, including a third and final Brady TD pass to Bennett - this time from 37-yards away - to garner a 30-7 advantage. In the fourth quarter, QB Charlie Whitehurst, who stepped in for Kessler following an injury late in the first quarter, connected with TE Connor Hamlett on a 17-yard TD strike, marking Hamlett's first TD reception in his first ever NFL game. Cleveland was unsuccessful on its ensuing two-point conversion attempt, leaving the Browns with a 30-13 deficit. The final points of the game came from the foot of Patriots K Stephen Gostkowski as he split the uprights on a 31-yard field goal attempt, stretching New England's lead to 33-13.

Nissan Stadium, Nashville, Tenn.

The Titans held on to defeat the Browns, 28-26, at Nissan Stadium. Titans QB Marcus Mariota got Tennessee off to a fast start with a scoring drive on the opening possession of the game, including a 41-yard rush by Mariota on the first play from scrimmage and an 11-yard TD pass to WR Rishard Matthews to cap the drive just six plays later. The Browns were able to respond on their first possession of the day as QB Cody Kessler got the Cleveland offense moving with a 43-yard completion to TE Gary Barnidge on Cleveland's first offensive play. Just four plays later, K Cody Parkey put the Browns on the board with a 45-yard field goal, leaving Cleveland with a 7-3 deficit midway through the first quarter. Parkey would go on to split the uprights once more - this time from 37 yards away - to leave the Browns trailing just 7-6 as the first quarter came to a close. Mariota extended the Titans' lead early in the second quarter when he found WR Kendall Wright on a 48-yard TD strike to go up 14-6. Cleveland was once again able to pull within one point of the Titans late in the second quarter when Kessler capped an impressive nine-play, 94-yard drive with a 7-yard TD pass to WR Terrelle Pryor Sr., which left the Browns trailing 14-13 at the half. Titans RB DeMarco Murray scored the only points of the third quarter when he finished Tennessee's seven-play, 70-yard drive with a 3-yard TD rush to garner a 21-13 advantage. In the fourth quarter, the Titans furthered the margin when Mariota ended a long 12-play, 80-yard drive that took up 6:59 with a 15-yard TD pass to TE Anthony Fasano. The Browns chipped away at the Tennessee lead on the ensuing drive, going 75-yards in 13 plays, including a Kessler 5-yard TD pass to Pryor. However, Kessler was unable to connect with a receiver on the two-point conversion attempt and the Browns trailed, 28-19. After WR Rashard Higgins recovered a Parkey onside kick, Cleveland found the end zone for the last time as RB Duke Johnson Jr. completed a nine-play, 62-yard drive with a 1-yard TD rush. Trailing 28-26, the Browns were not able to recover Parkey's second onside kick attempt and the Titans held on for the victory.

BENGALS 31 BROWNS 17



Oct. 23, 2016

Paul Brown Stadium, Cincinnati, Ohio

The Cincinnati Bengals defeated the Cleveland Browns, 31-17, at Paul Brown Stadium. The only points in the first quarter came on the game's opening possession as Bengals RB Jeremy Hill and QB Andy Dalton led Cincinnati down the field. RB Giovanni Bernard eventually capped the seven-play, 75-yard drive with a 5-yard TD rush to gain an early 7-0 advantage. To begin the second quarter, Browns K Cody Parkey got Cleveland on the scoreboard as he converted a 28-yard field goal to finish a 10-play, 60-yard drive that left the Browns trailing 7-3. After the Cleveland defense forced a Bengals three-and-out, the Browns scored on their second consecutive possession behind key rushes from rookie QB Kevin Hogan and RB Isaiah Crowell. Crowell ultimately found the end zone on a 1-yard TD rush to give Cleveland its first lead of the game, 10-7. The Bengals responded, as Dalton connected with WR Brandon LaFell on back-to-back plays – the first a 21-yard strike, followed by a 44-yard TD pass and reception – to regain the lead, 14-10. The final points of the first half came via a 48-yard Hail Mary TD pass from Dalton to WR A.J. Green as time expired, giving Cincinnati a 21-10 advantage at halftime. In the third quarter, Hogan (who took over for QB Cody Kessler after he left the game with a concussion) continued to have success in the run game, capping an eight-play, 75-yard drive with his first career TD on a 28-yard rush, the longest by a Browns QB in team history. Cincinnati responded just two plays later as Hill broke free on a long rush of his own and found the end zone on a 74-yard TD scamper to put the Bengals ahead 28-17. The final points of the game came on the Bengals ensuing possession when K Mike Nugent split the uprights on a 36-yard field goal attempt and gave Cincinnati a 31-17 advantage with just over four minutes remaining in the third quarter. In his first NFL game, Hogan rushed for 104 yards, the second-most ever by a Browns QB, while fellow rookie LB Emmanuel Ogbah recorded two sacks on the day.

The Cleveland Browns established a 20-7 lead at the half, but the New York Jets rallied to defeat the Cleveland Browns, 31-28. QB Josh McCown led the Browns down the field on the game's opening possession, eventually finding WR Andrew Hawkins on a 5-yard TD pass to cap the eight-play, 75-yard drive and take an early 7-0 lead. Hawkins finished the game with a career-best two TDs on five catches for 31 yards. After the Browns defense forced two consecutive New York three-and-outs, Cleveland scored once more in the first quarter as K Cody Parkey split the uprights on a 41-yard field goal attempt, giving the Browns a 10-0 advantage in the final minutes of the first quarter. The Jets scored their first points of the day in the early stages of the second quarter when Jets RB Bilal Powell finished a 12-play, 87-yard drive with a 35-yard TD rush along the sideline. Cleveland's defense responded nicely and the Browns managed to extend their lead, scoring twice after the two-minute warning as RB Isaiah Crowell capped a nine-play, 70-yard drive by punching in a 1-yard TD run and Parkey converted his second field goal of the game – this time from 27-yards away – to send the Browns into halftime up 20-7. New York scored on its first two possessions of the third quarter as Jets QB Ryan Fitzpatrick led back-to-back impressive drives. First, Fitzpatrick connected with Jets WR Quincy Enunwa on a 24-yard TD pass to complete a 12-play, 78-yard drive, cutting New York's deficit to six. The Jets then took their first lead of the day when Jets RB Matt Forte found the end zone on a 4-yard TD scamper to complete the eight-play, 84-yard drive and give New York a 21-20 advantage with just over two minutes remaining in the third quarter. Forte scored once more on a 2-yard TD rush to begin the fourth quarter, stretching the Jets lead to 28-20. After Jets K Nick Folk's 24-yard field goal, New York furthered the margin to an 11-point advantage with just over four minutes left to play. The final points of the game came when McCown connected with Hawkins for his second TD of the day and then connected with WR Terrelle Pryor Sr. on the ensuing two-point conversion. After an unsuccessful onside kick attempt, the Browns were unable to get the ball back and the Jets held on to win, 31-28.
