### SECOND-HALF TURNAROUND IN 2015

Following a 1-7 start, Caldwell led the Lions to a 7-9 record in 2015 on the shoulders of a 6-2 surge to finsih off the year. Detroit became the fourth team since 1991 to start a season with 1 or fewer wins in the first 8 games (1-7 or 0-8 record) and finish with a 6-2 record. A 6-2 finish is the best record by any team since 1991 to start the season with a 1-7 or 0-8 record. It marks the Lions' best second-half finish since the team finished 7-1 in 1995.

#### **COACHING OVERVIEW**

- Hired as head coach for the Detroit Lions January 14, 2014.
- In 15 NFL seasons, Caldwell has worked on coaching staffs that have led teams to 12 winning seasons and only twice finished below .500. Overall, Caldwell's teams he coached for have compiled a 164-89 regular season record, along with 12 playoff appearances, eight division titles, three
- conference championships and two Super Bowl wins. In five years as an NFL head coach, Caldwell has led a team to 11+ wins twice (14 with Indianapolis in 2009). Coached in three Super Bowls with Indianapolis (XLI and XLIV) and Baltimore (XLVII) and won two Super Bowl titles (Indianapolis and Baltimore).
- In his first year as head coach for Indianapolis (2009), he won the AFC Championship and led the franchise to Super Bowl XLIV. He became the first NFL coach to win his first 14 games and the fifth rookie head coach to reach the Super Bowl.
- One of four head coaches to produce 24+ regular-season wins and a Super Bowl berth in their first two career seasons as head coach.
- In eight of the 10 seasons Caldwell coached in Indianapolis, the Colts ranked in the Top-10 in total offense eight times and six times in the Top-5.
- From 2003-09, Caldwell was the Colts' quarterbacks coach and was also promoted to assistant head coach and associate head coach during that time. He worked closely with QB Peyton Manning and the team's quarterbacks. During that span, Indianapolis set NFL records with seven consecutive seasons finishing with 11+ wins (6, Dallas

1976-81) and 12+ victories (4, Dallas, 1992-95).
Manning won four (2003, 2004, 2008, 2009) of his five
NFL MVP awards under Caldwell's tutelage.

- Two of his quarterbacks, Manning (Super Bowl XLI) and Ravens QB Joe Flacco (Super Bowl XLVII) were named Super Bowl MVPs following their teams' respective championship runs.
- After being appointed Ravens offensive coordinator in December 2012, the team went on to win five of its next seven games, including Super Bowl XLVII. During that span, the offense averaged 400.6 yards per game, including an average of 410.3 yards per game during the four playoff wins.

#### **QUINN MAKES HIS MARK**

Bob Quinn, hired January 11, 2016 as executive vice president and general manager, oversees the entire Lions' football operations and reports directly to Owner and Chairman of the Board Martha Firestone Ford.

- Since joining the Lions, Quinn, who spent the previous 16 seasons with the New England Patriots, has begun building the football foundation which he believes will provide the team with the optimum chance for success. During his introductory press conference, he quickly set forth his vision.
- Among the numerous free agents acquired by Quinn this offseason was WR Marvin Jones, considered by many to be the top free agent wide receiver on the market. Additionally, Quinn also retained key Lions free agents, including DT Haloti Ngata and LB Tahir Whitehead.
- His initial draft class featured the selection of the most linemen (offense and defense) in a Lions draft since 1989, highlighted by the team's first three picks (T Taylor Decker, DT A'Shawn Robinson and C Graham Glasgow).

#### **PATRIOTS PAST**

During his time with New England, Quinn served a number of roles in the player personnel department, including most recently as Director of Pro Scouting from 2012-15. While he worked as Director of Pro Scouting, the Patriots won the 2014 Super Bowl and four-straight AFC East Division championships.

- From 2009-2012, Quinn was the Assistant Director of Pro Personnel. For the previous nine years, Quinn worked in several different capacities within the Patriots player personnel department, including roles in college scouting as National Scout and Regional Scout. He played an integral role in evaluating and procuring talent for the team through the NFL draft process, free agency, trades, etc.
- While working for the New England Patriots, he helped contribute to one of the most impressive stretches in NFL history, one that produced four Super Bowl titles, including the most recent championship in 2014 (Super Bowl XLIX). Since 2000, Quinn's first year with New England, the Patriots have won six AFC Championships, 13 AFC East titles, 12+ games in a season 10 times (which includes the past six years) and 10+ games in 14 of his 16 seasons.
- As Director of Pro Scouting, Quinn utilized all possible methods to seek the Patriots' "next player." This approach had a tremendous impact on the Patriots' Super Bowl XLIX championship as seven players, who were acquired (including two via trades) after the start of the regular season, all played in the Super Bowl.
- Another key player during the Super Bowl XLIX Championship run, CB Malcolm Butler, signed with the club after a rookie minicamp tryout. Butler, who sealed the Super Bowl victory with a goal line interception, would join All-Pro CB Darrelle Revis in the New England secondary. Prior to serving as Director of Pro Scouting,

Quinn was the Patriots' assistant director of propersonnel. Prior to that, he worked in college scouting as the team's national scout in 2008 and as a regional scout from 2004-07.

In 2008, the Patriots drafted LB Jerod Mayo in the first round and WR Matthew Slater in the fifth round. Mayo was a two-time Pro Bowl linebacker and Slater has become one of the league's elite special teams players having earned five Pro Bowl selections and three All-Pro honors. Quinn also served two seasons (2002-03) as a pro scout and two season (2000-01) as a player personnel assistant for the Patriots.

### WHAT TO WATCH FOR

#### RESOURCES RETURNING

Prior to Detroit's Week 8 matchup against the Houston Texans, the Lions had been without key pieces to their receiving corps, including RB Theo Riddick and TE Eric Ebron, who returned from injuries in Week 8 at Houston to The ability to generate a significant pass rush is a point of turn in the top two receiving performances of the contest.

After missing the last two weeks with an ankle injury, Riddick rejoined the starting lineup in Week 8 and made it clear early in the game that Houston had a problem. The play. fourth-year pro out of Notre Dame wreaked havoc on the ground and 77 yards receiving also totaled a new singlegame career high of 133 yards from scrimmage. It was his second time posting 100+ total yards from scrimmage in his career.

Trailing by two touchdowns early in the fourth guarter, OB Matthew Stafford moved the pocket and found Riddick out of the backfield for a one-yard score. It marked Riddick's fourth touchdown reception of the season and 11th of his Farr (10, 1967-73), James Jones (10, 1983-88), and Barry hands of the Lions offense. Sanders (10, 1989-98) for fourth among franchise running backs in career touchdown receptions. His four touchdown receptions through the first eight weeks of the season tied his previous single-season high set in 2014. Riddick also tied the third-highest two-year total for receptions by a running back with 114, similarly tying his previous mark set in 2014-

Riddick's running mate in Houston was another non-receiver. Returning from a leg injury that sidelined him for the better part of three weeks was TE Eric Ebron, who also posted a career day against the Texans.

Stafford on having Riddick and Ebron back: "It was good. You know, obviously they're talented players. We miss them when they're gone, so when they're out there it was nice to see them play like they did."

The former first-round tight end proved to be an integral part of the offense last Sunday, hauling in a career-high seven catches for a game-high 76 yards. Ebron surpassed his previous single-game high of five catches, which he's accomplished five times in his career and twice in 2016 (at Ind, 9/11, at GB, 9/25). He also recorded 75+ receiving yards in a game for the third time in his career.

Stafford on having Ebron back: "He did a nice job. You know, he had some tough matchups against safeties, not a whole lot of one-on-one routes against linebackers. He was getting a dime, safety or corner type body, so he was doing a nice job of winning against those guys. Just got to continue to have more of the same.

With Detroit's offense close to full-strength, look for the Lions to continue to utilize their weapons in a Week 9 road contest with the NFC North-leading Minnesota Vikings, as they travel to U.S. Bank Stadium for the first time in its inaugural season.

#### PICKING UP THE PRESSURE

> Head Coach Jim Caldwell on the Week 8 pass rush: "Three sacks and numerous knockdowns is pretty good pressure, I think. I think we had three sacks yesterday, believe the numbers are somewhere around there. We had one sack against us, so thinking that we get six or seven sacks in a game, in this League that's not common. But I do think we were putting some pressure on him. Would we like more? > Defensive Coordinator Tervl Austin on how concerning it is that the defense is giving up lengthy drives and third down conversions: "Part of the reason that I think we're giving up the third down conversion and it's so high is the fact that we have too many third-and-shorts. I believe we had three or four third-and-one's last week. We had nine third-and-four or less last week. You can't win that in this league. And so really it's not our third down I think is the problem, it's our second down defense because we're not getting them into third-and-longs and so we're making a focus on that. Under Cooter's tutelage, Stafford holds high marks during that span as he ranks third in passing touchdowns (36), third in completion percentage (68.4) and fifth in quarterback rating (104.3).

Stafford on if he's surprised at his performance through Week 8 under Cooter compared to where he was in Week 8 of 2015: "I don't think so. I think we're playing really well as a team, playing well as an offense. Still have room for improvement, as do I, as an individual player. I never lost confidence in myself, I always felt like I was a good player in this League, and as a team playing at a nice clip.'

Cooter on how his relationship with Stafford helps him as an offensive coordinator: "I think he's done a good job of telling me plays he likes or plays he doesn't like, or maybe we should run this route at this depth instead of that depth. So it's his offense as much as it is mine, maybe even more. So if he likes something, I've learned early in my career that if a quarterback really likes a play, he tends to make it work. So if he likes it, we'll get it in. If he doesn't like it, we'll try not to call it and we'll go from there."

#### START ME UP

By starting in Week 11 at Pittsburgh in 2013 (11/17/13), Stafford set the franchise record for consecutive starts by a Lions quarterback with 42, dating back to September 11, 2011. He broke a tie with QB Greg Landry (41) for the most consecutive starts by a Lions QB in franchise history. He also set that same mark for consecutive starts including playoffs (43). *His current total stands at 90.* 

In his 100th game (October 23 vs. Washington), Stafford completed 18-of-26 passes (62.1 pct) for 266 yards and 1 touchdown. He finished with a passer rating of 103.5. Stafford, who holds the franchise record for starts by a quarterback, now has become the first quarterback in team history with 100 career starts.

Stafford led the Lions to an 18-16 win over the Green Bay Packers at Lambeau Field in Week 11 last season (11/15/15) in his 88th career start, including playoffs. By starting in his 88th career game, Stafford surpassed Hall of Fame QB Bobby Layne for the most overall starts (including playoffs) in team history. During his career, Layne started 87 career games (83 regular season and four postseason).

### ON THE RECEIVING END

The Lions offense features one of the deepest veteran receiving corps in the NFL with the likes of WRs Marvin Jones Jr., Golden Tate and Anguan Boldin, combining for 26 total years of pass-catching experience.

#### **MARV-ELOUS MR. JONES**

Jones Jr. joined the Lions following a four-year career (2012-15) with the Cincinnati Bengals, where he was a key piece of the Bengals' high-powered offense. He recorded a career high 10 touchdowns in 2013, and so far leads the Lions with 656 receiving yards.

With 6 receptions for 205 yards and two touchdowns at Green Bay (9/25), Jones Jr. became the fifth player in Lions history to surpass 200 receiving yards in a game, joining Cálvin Johnson (5), Cloyce Box (2), Richard Johnson (1) and Roy Williams (1) in that elite group. Jones recorded the 10th 200-yard receiving game in team history and his 205 yards were the eighth-most by a Lions receiver in a single game.

Through Week 7, Jones Jr. ranks fifth in the NFL in receiving yards (656), seventh in yards per catch (18.2) and tied for fourth in 25+-yard receptions (8).

Boldin's 69 receptions and 789 receiving yards in 2015 made him the first player in NFL history to finish with at least 50 receptions and 600 receiving yards in each of his first 13 seasons.

- Since entering the NFL in 2003, Boldin ranks third in receptions (1,042) and second in receiving yards (13,471) among active players.

### **RUSH TO SCORE**

The 2016 Lions backfield features multiple weapons with dual-threat capabilities, led by RBs Theo Riddick, Dwayne Washington, Zach Zenner, Justin Forsett and FB Michael Burton.

- Through eight games in 2016, the Lions backfield ranks fifth in receptions by running backs (49), fourth in receiving yards (413), first in receiving touchdowns (5) and fourth in yards after catch (422).
- Detroit saw three backs reach the end zone in Week 1 vs. Indianapolis (9/11) with scores from Riddick, Abdullah and Washington. Abdullah collected 120 yards from scrimmage (63 rush, 57 receiving) and Riddick garnered 108 total yards (45 rush, 63 receiving). By both running backs surpassing 100 total yards, it marked the first time since November 28, 2013 (vs. GB: Reggie Bush, 182; Joique Bell, 128) that the Lions had two running backs total over 100 yards from scrimmage in a game.
- Zenner gave the Lions a 10-3 lead with 7:20 left to play in the third quarter vs. Washington (10/23) with a one-yard dive into the end zone. The touchdown was Zenner's first touchdown of his career as he finished with nine carries for 29 yards.

### DESTRUCTIVE D-LINE

Over the past seven seasons, few defensive line units have disrupted opponents in both the passing and running games as the Detroit Lions. The Lions, under the direction of Defensive Line Coach **Kris Kocurek** since 2010, feature an attack upfront that first concentrates on stopping the run and then applies heavy pressure on the quarterback.

#### **KERRYING THE LOAD**

The Lions' defensive line displays great depth across the board, led by first-year DE Kerry Hyder. Hyder earned a roster spot this offseason and has emerged on the scene as one of the NFL's upstart pass rushers so far.

  Through Week 8, Hyder leads the Lions in sacks with 5.0.
- Hyder piled on his early-season sacks total by adding another sack at Chicago (10/2). Through four games, he at allied 5.0 sacks and became the third Lions defensive player to register 5+ sacks through the team's first four games (DE William Gay, 8.5 n 1983; DE Robert Porcher, NFL Avg 5.0 in 2001).

#### **DOMINANT SINCE 2010**

- Since 2010, the Lions rank first in the NFL in sacks by defensive linemen with 215. During that span, under Kocurek's guidance, the Lions also rank in the top five for defensive line tackles for loss (326, 2nd), QB hits (519, 1st) and forced fumbles (53, 2nd.).
- The Lions have now surpassed 500 QB Hits by defensive linemen since the beginning of the 2010 season. Detroit is the only team with 500+ QB Hits over the past six seasons. The second-highest total is Cincinnati with 480.
- Through Week 8, the Lions rank fourth in the NFL in sacks by defensive linemen (16.0), first in tackles for loss (23) and seventh in quarterback hits (34).

#### THROUGH THE UPRIGHTS AND INTO THE RECORD BOOKS

Prater connected on a 59-yard field goal to end the first half in the 2015 season finale at Chicago (1/3/16), setting a new team record for the longest field goal in Lions history. Prater's 59-yarder surpassed the previous record of 56 accomplished twice by K Jason Hanson (Cle 10/8/95; at Car 11/16/08)

- Prater's kick was the longest in the history of Soldier Field. Bears K Robbie Gould made the previous long of 58 yards.
- With his 59-yarder, Prater joined K Jason Hanson (8 in 2008 and 5 in 2011) as the only kickers in team history to make five 50-yard field goals in a season. Additionally, Prater has now tallied five 50+-yard field goals in a season for the third time in his career (5 in 2008 and 6 in 2013).

With 6 points (1 FG, 3 PAT) at Chicago last season, Prater finished the season with 102 points and surpassed the 100+-point mark for the fifth time in his career. Prater is the sixth player in team history with 100+ points in a season and the first since K Jason Hanson in 2012 (134). He joins Hanson (12 seasons), K Eddie Murray (4 seasons), K Errol Mann (3 seasons), RB Doak Walker (2 seasons) and RB Barry Sanders (1 season) as the only players in team history to score 100 points in a season.

### **RETURN OF ROBERTS**

Lions WR **Andre Roberts** came to Detroit this offseason as a free agent and has already made his impact known as a weapon in the return game.

- Entering Week 9, Roberts ranks 10th in the NFL in punt return yards (147), fifth in punt return average (13.4) and first in kickoff return yards (382).
- Roberts returned two punts for 100 yards at Chicago, which included an 85-yard punt return touchdown in the fourth quarter. His 100 yards established a new singlegame career high (previous best: 72 vs. Den 12/12/10) and his punt return touchdown was longest of his career (previous best: 37 at Dal 10/27/14).
- Roberts' punt return was the sixth-longest in team history and longest since WR Reggie Swinton's 89-yard punt return at Carolina December 21, 2003. It was also the first by a Lions returner since WR Jeremy Ross scored on a 58-yard punt return at Philadelphia December 8, 2013. Additionally, Roberts' 85-yard punt return touchdown marked the longest ever by a Lions returner against the Bears.

#### **SERIES NOTES**

The Lions trail 36-71-2 in the series with the Vikings in a NFC North Division rivalry that dates back to a 37-10 Detroit victory November 19, 1961 at Minnesota.
 The Lions won the first five outings

and nine of the first 14 games in the series; however, Minnesota then won 13 straight contests and 19 of the next 21.

On two occasions, the Lions have accumulated 45 points in a single game against the Vikings. Detroit defeated Minnesota 45-14 December 9, 1978 and 45-7 December 12, 1981, with both games taking place at the Silverdome.

Silverdome.

RB Barry Sanders scored four touchdowns in the Lions' 34-14 win at Minnesota November 24, 1991. His four touchdowns established a new Lions' record for rushing touchdowns in a single game. His four touchdowns and 24-point performance also tied Lions' reintly approaches.

Lions' single-game marks.

OB Scott Mitchell set a then-franchise single-game record for passing yards, breaking Bobby Layne's previous mark of 375, when he accumulated 410 yards vs. Minnesota in a memorable Thanksgiving Day clash November 23, 1995. Mitchell completed 30-6f-45 passes and tossed four touchdowns. The wide receiver trio of Herman Moore, Brett Perriman and Johnnie Morton each reached the 100-yard receiving mark in the contest. The Lions won the game 44-38.

In their final road game and the second-to-last game of the 1997 season, the Lions claimed a 14-13 victory over the Vikings at the Metrodome when OB Scott Mitchell tossed a 1-yard pass to WR Herman Moore in the endzone to claim the come-from-behind victory with 0:02 remaining to play. Mitchell engineered the game-

winning 72-yard drive that began with 1:56 remaining to play and with only one timeout.

With his opening kickoff return for a touchdown at Minnesota November 21, 2004, KR Eddie Drummond became the first player in NFL history to score three consecutive touchdowns for his team via punt and kickoff returns. He became only the second player in NFL history to return two kickoffs and two punts for touchdowns in a single season, the other being Danté Hall (Kansas Cirb Lin 2002)

the other being Dante Hatt (Kansas City) in 2003.

The Lions overcame a 20-0 halftime deficit and roared back to beat the Vikings, 26-23, in overtime on September 25, 2011. K Jason Hanson kicked a game-winning 32-yard field goal in the extra session for the victory.

After trailing 20-0 at halftime at

Minnesota September 25, 2011, the Lions mounted a comeback in the second half and claimed a 26-23 win in overtime. It was the Lions' first win at Minnesota since 1997. WR Calvin Johnson caught 2 touchdown passes for the third-straight game, and had a critical 40-yard over-the-shoulder grab in overtime to set up the team's game-winning field goal. With a 34-28 win vs. Minnesota December 11, 2011, the Lions

captured its first season sweep of the Vikings since 1997 and kept their playoff hopes alive. Minnesota came back in the second half and had possession at the Lions 1-yard line with:09 left to play. LB DeAndre Levy raced in and forced a fumble on QB Joe Webb which caused a furious scramble for the ball. Eventually, DE Cliff Avril would recover it at the Vikings 43-yard line to seal the victory. In the 2013 season opener, RB Reggie Bush made his Lions debut

Reggie Bush made his Lions debut in style as he helped the Lions to a 34-24 win over Minnesota and collected 90 yards rushing and 101 the third player in Lions history with 90+ rushing yards and 100+ receiving yards (Billy Sims: 119 rush, 103 rec at LaRm 9/19/82; Barry Sanders: 90 rush, 135 rec at KC 10/14/90).

In the Lions 17-3 win at Minnesota (10/12/14), the Lions defense

In the Lions 17-3 win at Minnesota (10/12/14), the Lions defense generated eight total sacks against the Vikings. Eight sacks marked the most in a game for the Lions since accumulating eight vs. Indianapolis November 23, 1997. With a 16-14 victory over the

accumulating eight vs. Indianapolis November 23, 1997. With a 16-14 victory over the Minnesota Vikings in the teams' most recent meeting (12/14/14), the Lions claimed their 10th victory in the season's first 14 games and improved to 10-4. The win marked the first time the Lions reached 10 wins in the first 14 games of the season since the Lions started10-4 in 1991.

The Detroit Lions' start to the 2016 regular season highlighted the duel between two marquee quarterbacks in Lions QB Matthew Stafford and Colts QB Andrew Luck. With the help of a balanced offense through the air and a consistent rushing attack on the ground, the Lions jumped out to a 21-3 lead. After a 21-yard touchdown run by RB Theo Riddick to put Detroit up 7-0, rookie RB Dwayne Washington scored his first career touchdown to extend the lead 14-0. Seven of Stafford's 14 first half completions all went to different receivers including a six-yard touchdown strike to TE Eric Ebron that put Detroit up 21-3. Luck and the Colts responded with a 75-yard drive ending in a touchdown reception by Colts WR Donte Moncrief to set the score at 21-10 right before halftime. After a Lions drive stalled, Luck and the Colts put together an 85-yard drive ending in a 19-yard touchdown pass to TE Dwayne Allen. Following a successful two-point conversion pass to Allen, Indianapolis trailed 21-18 halfway through the third quarter. Detroit responded with a 71-yard drive ending with an 11-yard touchdown pass to RB Ameer Abdullah to go up 28-18. Following an Adam Vinatieri 40-yard field goal, Luck and the Colts added a 94-yard drive ending with a 16-yard touchdown strike to TE Jack Doyle to tie the game at 28-28. With completions to five different receivers, Stafford connected with Riddick for a 13-yard score. A missed extra point by K Matt Prater put the Lions lead at 34-28 with 4:11 left to play. The Colts put together an eight play drive for 75 yards as Doyle hauled in his second touchdown reception from six yards out to go up 35-34 on Detroit with 37 seconds left in regulation. With three timeouts, Stafford and the Lions completed three passes for a total of 50 yards before Prater lined up for a 43-yard field goal to put Detroit ahead 37-35 with four seconds left to play. After a series of laterals on the ensuing kickoff, Detroit was awarded a safety, ending regulation and giving the Lions a 39-35 victory.

The Lions hosted the Tennessee Titans in their home opener at Ford Field in Week 2 of the 2016 regular season (9/18). After a Sam Martin 48-yard punt and a holding penalty on the Titans, Tennessee started a drive from their own 10-yard line early in the first guarter. Lions DE Devin Taylor stuffed Titans RB DeMarco Murray in the end zone for a Detroit safety. The Lions immediately added an eight play scoring drive for 79 yards that was capped by a 24yard Matthew Stafford touchdown strike to Anquan Boldin, putting the Lions up 9-0 in the first quarter. After a series of short completions by Titans QB Marcus Mariota, Tennessee put the score at 9-3 with a 46-yard field goal by Titans K Ryan Succop. Following a series of stops by both defenses, Detroit put together a 13-play, 75-yard drive that ended in a 42-yard field goal by K Matt Prater, giving the Lions a 12-3 lead going into halftime. Detroit constructed a 14-play drive midway through the third guarter that ended in a 27-yard field goal by Prater, giving the Lions a 15-3 lead heading into the fourth quarter. After a 20-yard completion, Mariota quickly connected with TE Delanie Walker for a 30-yard touchdown strike to bring the score to 15-10 with more than 14 minutes left to play. After forcing Detroit to punt on multiple drives, the Titans took the ball back with 7:04 to play. Mariota connected on all nine of his last pass attempts, including a nine yard touchdown pass to Titans WR Andre Johnson. The Titans took a 16-15 lead with 1:13 to play after a sack by Detroit on their failed two-point conversion attempt. Titans CB Perrish Cox intercepted a pass by Stafford at midfield on the Lions last drive of the game to give Tennessee a 16-15 victory.

The Packers defeated the Lions 34-27 in Week 3 at Lambeau Field after getting out to an early 31-3 lead which included scores on all of Green Bay's first six possessions. The Packers scored first with a 14-yard touchdown pass from Packers QB Aaron Rodgers to WR Davante Adams to take a 7-0 lead. The Lions responded with a 16-play drive that ended in a 42-yard field goal from K Matt Prater, setting the score at 7-3. After a kickoff out of bounds by Detroit, Rodgers and the Packers started a drive from their own 40. Rodgers quickly followed up on a 40-yard pass across the middle to WR Jordy Nelson with an eight-yard touchdown pass back to Nelson, giving Green Bay a 14-3 lead at the end of the first quarter. On the first play of the second quarter, Lions CB Nevin Lawson was called for defensive pass interference, a penalty for 66 total yards against Detroit. Rodgers and Packers TE Richard Rodgers connected for a two-yard touchdown pass following the infraction for a 21-3 Green Bay lead. A Matthew Stafford pass intended for Lions TE Eric Ebron was picked off on the ensuing Detroit drive, leading to a Green Bay field goal by K Mason Crosby. After a stalled Lions drive, Rodgers found Nelson again in the second quarter in the back of the end zone for a 17-yard touchdown and 31-3 Packers lead. In two plays Stafford connected with Lions WR Marvin Jones Jr. before the end of the first half for a 73-yard touchdown strike, giving the Packers a 31-10 lead at halftime. Detroit scored on the first possession of the second half when Stafford hit WR Anguan Boldin for a touchdown early in the third quarter to set the score at 31-17. Crosby nailed a 46-yard field goal on Green Bay's next drive, giving the Packers a 34-17 lead heading into the fourth quarter. With a 50-yard field goal by Prater, two stops by the Lions defense and another deep touchdown pass to Jones Jr., the Lions pulled within one score at 34-27 with more than three minutes left to play. A scramble by Rodgers on third and long gave Green Bay a 34-27 victory as time expired.

The Chicago Bears defeated the Detroit Lions 17-14 in Week 4 at Soldier Field. After getting the ball on their own 45yard line in the first quarter, the Bears put together a 10-play drive that ended in a Brian Hoyer touchdown pass to WR Eddie Royal to give Chicago a 7-0 lead. The Lions failed to score in the first quarter, but the defense put together a series of stops that kept the score at 7-0 midway through the second quarter. Lions K Matt Prater put Detroit on the board after nailing a 50-yard field goal with four minutes left to play in the first half. After another defensive stop by Detroit, the Lions offense moved the ball into Bears territory looking to close the gap on a 7-3 Bears lead before halftime. A pass by Lions QB Matthew Stafford was picked off by Bears CB Jacoby Glenn with 16 seconds left in the second quarter, robbing the Lions of any points before the half. With Detroit opting to receive the second half kickoff, the Lions offense drove 66 yards in nearly eight minutes but failed to get in the end zone at Chicago's one yard line. Prater knocked in a 21-yard field goal to put Chicago's lead at 7-6. Hoyer and the Bears offense quickly responded as they went 75-yards in six plays ending with Hoyer connecting with Bears TE Zach Miller for a six yard touchdown catch. After a Bears defensive stop to end the third quarter, Chicago went 11-plays for 73 yards that ended in a 25yard field goal by Bears K Connor Barth. The Lions trailed 17-6 with more than 10 minutes left to play in regulation. A Lions series was halted at the Bears 23-yard line when a Stafford pass intended for Lions WR Anquan Boldin was intercepted by Bears CB Deiondre' Hall with four minutes left. After a defensive stop, Lions WR Andre Roberts returned a Chicago punt 85-yards for a touchdown. The Lions' two-point conversion attempt was successful, giving the Bears a 17-14 lead with 1:52 left to play. Chicago escaped with a 17-14 victory after Detroit failed to recover an onside kick attempt late in the game.

The Lions snapped a three-game losing streak with a 24-23 victory against the Philadelphia Eagles. The Lions jumped out to a 14-point lead, including touchdowns on their first three possessions before the Eagles fought back to make the game a nail-biter. Detroit drove 75 yards on their first drive that ended with a Matthew Stafford touchdown pass to Theo Riddick. After forcing Philly to punt, Stafford found Riddick again for a 17-yard touchdown reception. Philly entered the second quarter down 14-0 before Eagles QB Carson Wentz led his team to a touchdown drive. The Eagles drove 75 yards in nine plays when Wentz found Eagles RB Ryan Mathews for a one-yard touchdown pass to make it a 14-7 margin. Stafford connected with five different receivers on Detroit's next possession that ended with a touchdown strike in the back of the end zone to Lions WR Marvin Jones Jr. The Eagles overcame three offensive penalties with a 50-yard field goal by K Caleb Sturgis to go into the half down 21-10. Philly opened the third quarter with another drive led by Wentz, who connected with four different receivers on five pass attempts before WR Jordan Huff hauled in a one-yard touchdown pass. An Eagles defense that held the Lions to 45 total yards in the second half forced a fumble on the ensuing drive to set up a 33-yard Sturgis field goal. With more than a quarter of football left to play, Philly trailed 21-20 before forcing a Lions three and out late in the third quarter. After stout performances by both defenses, a 20-yard completion by Wentz led to Sturgis' third field goal of the day, this time from 49 yards out. The Lions trailed 23-21 with a little more than five minutes left. After another three and out by Detroit's offense, Lions CB Darius Slay forced a fumble on a third and short that was recovered by Lions DT Tyrunn Walker. Detroit's offense took over in Eagles territory with 2:34 left in regulation. Stafford found WR Golden Tate on third and short for a 27-yard gain that moved the Lions within field goal range. A third down sack by Eagles DT Fletcher Cox brought out Lions K Matt Prater for an attempt at the 10th game winning field goal of his career. Prater drilled the kick from 29 yards out, but the Lions defense still needed to make a stop. Wentz and the Eagles offense took the field with 1:28 left and trailing 24-23. Slay forced his second straight turnover on as many defensive possessions when a 1st and 10 pass intended for Eagles WR Nelson Agholor was intercepted by Slay to seal a 24-23 victory for Detroit.

The Lions pulled out a 31-28 win against the Los Angeles Rams led by another game-winning drive by QB Matthew Stafford and K Matt Prater's third game-winning field goal of the season. On the first series of the game the Lions drove 75-yards in eight plays, including a fourth-and-one conversion by RB Zach Zenner on Detroit's own 49 yard line. WR Marvin Jones Jr. caught his fourth touchdown of the season from seven yards out to give the Lions a 7-0 lead early in the first quarter. The Rams responded by going 75 yards in 10 plays. Rams QB Case Keenum completed 15 of his 17 first-half passes, including hitting WR Kenny Britt for a 20-yard touchdown to tie the game more than halfway through the first quarter. After a Detroit drive stalled, Los Angeles drove from its own 16-yard line in 11 plays, and 83 yards later Keenum scurried into the end zone from the goal line to take a 14-7 lead. With 11 minutes to play in the first half, Stafford and the Lions offense responded with completions to five different receivers and another fourth-down conversion, this time from the goal line ending in a touchdown strike to WR Andre Roberts. LA got the ball back with the game tied at 14-14 and 3:03 left in the first half. Keenum connected with Britt for 43 of Britt's 136 yards on the day to move the Rams into Lions territory. After two penalties were called on the Lions, LA lined up on the goal line threatening to score before the half. Three strong stops by the Lions defense brought up a crucial fourth down from Detroit's own one-yard line with four seconds to play in the first half. After a timeout, Los Angeles lined up to go for it on fourth down when Rams RB Todd Gurley was stuffed by Lions DT Tyrunn Walker and DT Stefan Charles to end the half with a 14-14 tie game. After another Lions defensive stop to start the second half, Stafford hit Lions WR Golden Tate for a deep 61-yard completion. Two plays later Stafford found Lions WR Anquan Boldin for a four-yard touchdown grab. Keenum and the Rams offense continued to respond as they answered with a 47-yard pass to Britt on first down to quickly move into Lions territory. Two plays later Keenum connected with Rams TE Lance Kendricks in the back of the end zone for a 15-yard touchdown to tie the game at 21. After forcing Detroit's offense to a three and out, the Rams drove 80 yards, ending with Britt's second touchdown reception of the day to take a 28-21 lead. With 14:09 to play Stafford and the Lions offense went 84 yards in 13-plays with the help of Zenner's career-long rush of 19-yards on first and 20. Tate then took a screen pass 23-yards and the distance to tie the score at 28-28 with nearly six minutes left in regulation. Detroit's defense then forced a key three-and-out to get the ball back into the hands of Stafford who passed for a quarterback rating of 139.8 and four touchdowns on the day. The Lions offense chewed up more than three-and-a-half minutes before Prater came out to drill a 34-yard field goal to give the Lions a 31-28 lead with 1:29 left in the game. Detroit needed one more stand by the defense when S Rafael Bush helped seal the game by registering an interception on second down with 1:09 left in regulation. Bush's second-career interception left the Rams with zero timeouts and a Lions kneel-down-victory formation.

The Lions won their third straight game with a 20-17 victory against the Redskins led by QB Matthew Stafford's 24th game-winning drive in the 100th game of his career. The first half highlighted a defensive battle and the kicking game of both teams with both Lions K Matt Prater and Washington K Dustin Hopkins both making one of each of their first two field goal attempts. The Detroit Lions fell to the Houston Texans on the road 20-13 to snap a three-game winning streak. Detroit received the opening kickoff and immediately drove into Houston territory, but saw a drive stall after a failed fourth down conversion attempt. After taking over at their own 38-yard line, a sack by Lions DE Armonty Bryant helped stop the Texans first possession of the game. Houston's defense withstood a Lions drive that made it to their own 31-yard line before Lions K Matt Prater missed a 49-yard field goal. The Texans offense took over with 3:50 left in the first quarter when Houston QB Brock Osweiler began a drive from Houston's own 39-yard line. Houston threatened to extend the lead before Osweiler threw an interception to Lions CB Johnson Bademosi late in the second quarter.
