

### PACKERS STOP BACK AT LAMBEAU TO PLAY THE COLTS

The Green Bay Packers return home to host the Indianapolis Colts at Lambeau Field.

- ► Sunday will be the Colts' first trip to Green Bay since 2008.
- ► Five of the last seven matchups between Green Bay and Indianapolis have been decided by seven or fewer points.
- ►The Packers have won three consecutive home games against Indianapolis.
- ▶The Colts last won at Lambeau Field in 1988.
- ▶The overall series between the Packers and Colts is tied at 21-21-1, including one postseason contest. The combined point differential in the series is 25 points in favor of the Colts.
- ▶It will be the fifth time in the last six matchups that the Packers will host the Colts in the month of November.
- ▶One or both of the teams have scored 30-plus points in four of the last five games against each other.
- ► Sunday will be the second AFC opponent Green Bay has faced this season, previously defeating the Jacksonville Jaguars, 27-23, in Week 1.
- ► Green Bay is above .500 through the first seven games of the season for the 10th consecutive season (4-3, 6-1, 5-2, 5-2, 4-3, 7-0, 4-3, 4-3, 6-1) according to pro-football-reference.com.
- ▶ The Packers are 52-25 in the first seven games of a season under Head Coach Mike McCarthy. Green Bay's .675 winning percentage in the first seven games of the season ranks No. 2 in the NFL since 2006, trailing only the New England Patriots (61-16, .792).
- ► Green Bay has scored 23 or more points in four of the last five games.
- ▶ Green Bay has registered 23 or more first downs in each of the last four contests.
- ► The Packers have possessed the ball for more than 30 minutes in each of the last four games (36:38, 30:10, 39:36, 31:17). Overall, Green Bay ranks sixth in the NFL in average time of possession this season (31:33).
- ►Two of the Packers' three losses this season have been on the road by a combined four points.
- ► Sunday will be the Packers' last home game until Dec. 4, when the Houston Texans come to town.
- ► After Sunday, Green Bay will play three road games in a row for the first time since 2012 and only the third time in the last 19 seasons (also 1998).
- ► Two of the three road games are scheduled to be played in primetime (Sunday night at Washington and Monday night at Philadelphia).
- ► Next week, the Packers travel to Nashville to play the Tennessee Titans. It will be Green Bay's third regular-season visit to Tennessee. The previous two regular-season matchups at the Titans were decided by six and three points.

#### WITH THE CALL

CBS will broadcast the game to a regional audience with playby-play man **Jim Nantz** and analyst **Phil Simms** handling the call from the broadcast booth and **Tracy Wolfson** reporting from the sidelines.



WEEK 9

- ► Milwaukee's WTMJ (620 AM), airing Green Bay games since November 1929, heads up the Packers Radio Network that is made up of 50 stations in five states. Wayne Larrivee (play-by-play) and two-time Packers Pro Bowler Larry McCarren (analyst) call the action. McCarren first joined the team's broadcasts in 1995 and enters his 22nd season calling Packers games. After originally being paired together in 1999, McCarren and Larrivee enter their 18th season of broadcasts together.
- ► Westwood One Sports will air the game on radio across the country.
  Tom McCarthy (play-by-play) and Ross Tucker (analyst) will call the action, with Scott Graham hosting the pregame and halftime shows.
- ► The broadcast is also available on Sirius Satellite Radio (WTMJ feed).
- ▶ DIRECTV subscribers can watch the game on Channel 713.

#### **FACING THE AFC**

The Green Bay Packers have played well against AFC teams. Under Head Coach **Mike McCarthy**, the Packers are 26-16 during the regular and postseason against teams from the AFC, including a 7-2 mark against the AFC since the start of the 2014 season.

► The Packers' .778 winning percentage against AFC teams since 2014 ranks No. 2 in the NFL.

### STAT OF THE WEEK

- ►After 12 receptions for 74 yards (6.2 avg.) in Week 8, WR **Davante**Adams became the first Packer to have back-to-back games with 12-plus catches, and his 25 over the last two weeks is a franchise record for most over a two-game span.
- ►Adams' 25 receptions since Week 7 lead the NFL over the last two weeks, and his 206 receiving yards are the third most in the league.



#### **HOME SWEET HOME**

Green Bay has a long tradition of playing well at Lambeau Field.

- ► The Packers are 3-1 at home this season, including improving to 9-2 (.818) in home openers under Head Coach **Mike McCarthy**.
- ► Green Bay has outscored its opponents, 185-22, in the first quarter in the last 19 regular-season games at Lambeau Field, including a 27-10 margin this season.
- ► Since the start of 2014, Green Bay ranks **No. 3 in the NFL** in winning percentage at home:

► In 2014, Green Bay's plus-155 point differential at home was the highest in franchise history (dating back to 1940), eclipsing the plus-151 in 1996.

- ► WR **Jordy Nelson** has recorded at least one touchdown catch in nine of the last 11 games he has played in at Lambeau Field, totaling 12 touchdown receptions over that span.
- ► Over his career, Nelson has registered at least one touchdown reception in 23 games at Lambeau Field. The Packers are 22-1 in those contests.

▶The Packers rank **No. 1 in the NFL** in third-down conversions:

- ► Green Bay ranks **No. 7 in the NFL** on defense in third-down percentage (34.5%), making them one of only two teams in the NFL to rank in the top 10 in third down on offense and defense (Arizona, No. 10 in offense and No. 8 in defense).
- ► Green Bay is **tied for No. 2 in the NFL** in penalties called against this season:

- ► The Packers rank **No. 6 in the NFL** in average time of possession (31:33) this season.
- ►WR **Trevor Davis** registered a 55-yard punt return against Atlanta, the longest punt return by Green Bay since DB **Micah Hyde** returned a punt 55 yards for a touchdown vs. Detroit on Dec. 28, 2014.
- ► In Week 8, FB **Aaron Ripkowski** recorded career highs in carries (six) and rushing yards (34).
- ▶QB Aaron Rodgers led the Packers with a career-best 60 rushing yards on six carries (10.0 avg.) at Atlanta. He recorded three runs of 10-plus yards, tying his single-game career high (at Indianapolis, Oct. 7, 2012, and vs. Cincinnati, Sept. 20, 2009).
- ▶ Dating back to 1960, Rodgers' 60 rushing yards in Week 8 were the second most in a single game by a Green Bay quarterback, trailing only the 88 yards on eight carries (11.0 avg.) by Don Majkowski at Detroit, Sept. 30, 1990.
- ▶ Rodgers joined Cam Newton (Dec. 20, 2015, at NYG) as the only QBs over the past four seasons (2013-16) to post four-plus passing TDs and 60-plus rushing yards in the same game.
- ▶In Week 7, Green Bay recorded 32 first downs, the most by the Packers since Nov. 27, 1983, at Atlanta (32). It tied for the second most in franchise history. Green Bay also possessed the ball for 39:36, the best mark by the team since Oct. 27, 2013, at Minnesota (40:54).
- ►LB **Blake Martinez** recorded his first career interception in the Week 7 victory over the Chicago Bears.
- ► Green Bay only gave up two sacks on 56 pass attempts in Week 7.
- ► The Packers have eclipsed 400 total net yards twice this season (406 vs. N.Y. Giants and Chicago Bears).
- ► Green Bay has registered 100-plus net rushing yards in four of the last five games (108, 103, 147, 123).
- ▶In Week 6, S **Morgan Burnett** recorded his first interception since Dec. 8, 2014, vs. Atlanta while also leading the team in tackles (10) and solo tackles (seven).

### **DEFENSIVE STRENGTH**

The Packers defense has been a strength for most of the season.

- ►According to the Elias Sports Bureau, Green Bay allowed the second-fewest rushing yards (171) by a team through the first four games since the NFL began compiling individual stats in 1933 (San Francisco, 157 yards on 74 attempts in 1995).
- ► The Packers have held five of seven opponents to less than 70 yards rushing. Green Bay's run defense ranks No. 3 in the NFL:

### QUICK OUT OF THE GATE

The Packers started games fast during the 2015 regular season, scoring touchdowns in the first quarter in nine games. They continued that by scoring in all seven games this season (tied for No. 1 in the NFL), including a touchdown in five contests.

► The Packers are **tied for No. 2 in the NFL** in first-quarter touchdowns this season.

- ► Green Bay has outscored its opponents, 27-10, in the first quarter in four home games this season and 185-26 in the first quarter in the last 19 regular-season games at Lambeau Field.
- ▶ Dating back to 2014, the Packers have a plus-148 point differential in the first quarter at Lambeau Field, ranking No. 1 in the NFL (according to pro-football-reference.com).
- ► The Packers rank No. 3 in the NFL in points per game in the first quarter this season:

- ► The Packers rank **No. 2 in the NFL** for scoring (34 points) on the first offensive possession this season (San Diego, 35 points).
- ► Green Bay's 151 first-quarter points during the 2014 regular season were the most in the NFL in a single season dating back to 1991.
- ► Rodgers has thrown 50 touchdowns and six interceptions in the first half since the start of the 2014 regular season.

MIKE McCARTHY...Is in his 11th year as the Packers' 14th head coach.

- ▶ Joined Vince Lombardi and Mike Holmgren as the only coaches to guide the Packers to a Super Bowl title with a win over Pittsburgh in Super Bowl XLV.
- ► Led the Packers to their seventh consecutive playoff appearance last season, joining New England as the only two NFL teams to do so over that span. Has also led the team to eight playoff appearances in the last nine years (2007, 2009-15).
- ► Guided the Packers to top-10 finishes in scoring in eight straight seasons (2007-14), joining the Patriots as the only other team to accomplish the feat over that time; Packers finished first overall in scoring in 2014.
- ► His .650 winning percentage during the regular season (105-56-1) ranks No. 3 among active NFL head coaches (min. 50 games).
- ► Had 104 regular-season wins in his first 10 seasons as a head coach, ranking No. 3 in NFL history.

**CHUCK PAGANO**...Is in his fifth year as the Colts' 15th head coach.

- ▶ Is in his fifth season as head coach; only Tony Dungy (seven, 2002-08) has started more seasons as the Colts' head coach since relocation.
- ► In 2014, coached the Colts to a playoff upset of Denver to appear in his first AFC Championship as a head coach (second overall).
- ► One of five current NFL head coaches to not have a losing season in his first four full seasons of head coaching.
- ► Was the defensive coordinator for Baltimore in 2011 when the Ravens had the No. 3-ranked overall and scoring defense, which resulted in an AFC title game berth.
- ►As a secondary coach (2008-10) and defensive coordinator (2011), oversaw Ravens All-Pro S Ed Reed as he posted 23 interceptions and three TDs.

#### THE PACKERS-COLTS SERIES

- ► The teams have only played seven games since the Colts relocated to Indianapolis in 1984 (Colts have won five of eight).
- ► Starting in 1953, the clubs were division opponents and played twice each season up until the 1967 season when the NFL was realigned in preparation for the NFL-AFL merger.
- ▶ In the 1965 season, the Colts and Packers met in the NFL playoffs after a tie in the Western Conference standings. Green Bay came back from a 10-point deficit to win 13-10 in overtime en route to the club's ninth NFL title.
- ► Chuck Pagano has registered a victory against Green Bay (2012), but has not been present to coach the Colts in a game against the Packers.

- ►In the Week 7 victory over Chicago, Rodgers set a single-game franchise record with 39 completions, besting the previous high of 36 by QB Brett Favre at Chicago on Dec. 5, 1993.
- ► Rodgers went over the 30,000-yard passing mark for his career in 2015 in Week 6 vs. San Diego. He reached the mark on his 3,652nd attempt, the fewest attempts needed in NFL history, as he bested the previous record held by QB Johnny Unitas (3,695 attempts).
- ► Rodgers reached the mark in his 116th career game, the fourth fewest in NFL history.
- ▶Rodgers reached 250 touchdown passes in Week 12 of 2015. He did in his 121st career game, surpassing MIA QB Dan Marino (128) for the NFL record.

#### **GROUP EFFORT**

The Packers' receivers have always been a big part of the offense, but with injuries to the top two running backs, Green Bay's receiving corps has been asked to step up even more.

- ► The Packers are one of five teams in the NFL (Detroit, Jacksonville, New Orleans, Washington) to have three wide receivers with over 30 receptions this season (**Davante Adams** 40 rec. for 424 yds. / **Randall Cobb** 39 rec. for 388 yds. / **Jordy Nelson** 31 rec. for 388 yds.).
- ► Nelson (six) and Adams (five) are the **only teammate duo in the**NFL with five-plus touchdown catches this season.
- ► Nelson is tied for **No. 1 in the NFL** in receiving touchdowns this season:

- ► For the first time in his career, Nelson posted a touchdown reception in each of the first four games of the season, becoming the first Packer to do so since WR Bill Schroeder in 2001.
- ▶ Nelson's five touchdown receptions in the first four games of this season were tied for the fourth most in franchise history.
- ► Rodgers and Nelson have connected for the 51 touchdowns, the second most by a duo in team history behind QB Brett Favre and WR Antonio Freeman (57 TD passes).
- ► The Packers have won 18 of the last 20 games in which Nelson has had at least one touchdown reception.
- ► With 12 receptions for 74 yards (6.2 avg.) in Week 8, Adams became the first Packer to have back-to-back games with 12-plus catches and his 25 over Weeks 7-8 were a franchise record for most over a two-game span.
- ►Week 8 also saw three Packers post their first career TD catches in yesterday's game (WRs Jeff Janis, Geronimo Allison, Trevor Davis), which was the first time an NFL team has done that since the Jets on Oct. 23, 2000.
- ► Allison and Davis became first rookie duo to both have a TD catch in a game for the Packers since Max McGee and Joe Johnson on 12/12/54.
- ► According to the Elias Sports Bureau, in Week 7 the Packers became just the second team in NFL history to feature three players with 10-plus catches in a game (Adams, 13; Cobb, 11; WR **Ty Montgomery**, 10), joining the New England Patriots (Leroy Thompson, Ben Coates, Michael Timpson) vs. Minnesota on Nov. 13, 1994.
- ► Adams' 13 receptions for a career-best 132 yards (10.2 avg.) and two touchdowns against Chicago tied for the second-most receptions in the single game in franchise history (Don Hutson, 13 receptions vs. Cleveland, Oct. 18, 1942 and 14 vs. N.Y. Giants on Nov. 22, 1942).
- ► Montgomery became the first Packer to post back-to-back games with 10-plus catches (10 vs. Dallas in Week 6) since WR Sterling Sharpe in 1993 (Oct. 10, Oct. 24). The only other player to accomplish that feat in a single season in team annals is Hutson in 1942 (Nov. 15, Nov. 22).
- ► Montgomery recorded 60 yards rushing and 66 yards receiving in Week 7, becoming the first Green Bay player since RB Ahman Green (63 rushing/68 receiving) at Detroit on Sept. 24, 2006, to register 60-plus rushing yards and 60-plus receiving yards in a game.



### **CLAY FINDS HIS WAY TO THE BALL**

LB Clay Matthews continues to make an impact on opposing offenses.

- ► For the first time in his career, Matthews recorded at least one sack in each of the first three regular-season games he played in.
- ▶ In 2015, Matthews was selected to his sixth Pro Bowl and first as an inside linebacker after recording 6.5 sacks (second on the team), 14 QB hits (No. 1 on the team), and a career high 84 tackles (No. 2 on the team). - ►In Week 6, Perry registered his first career interception and added a sack, making him the first Green Bay LB to post both in a game since Clay Matthews at the N.Y. Giants on Dec. 4, 2011.
- ▶ Perry matched his career high with a team-best two sacks in Week 3 vs. Detroit.
- ▶ Perry has at least one two-sack game in each of the last four seasons (2013-16), the lone Packer to accomplish that feat over that span.

#### CONTINUAL IMPACT

In his young career, DT **Mike Daniels** has seen his playing time steadily increase as well as his production. After playing in 14 games as a rookie in 2012, he has played in every game since the start of the 2013 season.

- ►In Week 2 at Minnesota, he recorded a sack and tied for the team lead with four QB hits. In Week 3, he led the Packers with two QB hits and in Week 8 he registered a sack.
- ► In 2015, Daniels led the Packers' defensive line in tackles (66) and sacks (four). He finished third on the team with 12 QB hits.
- ►In Week 5 versus St. Louis last season, he tied for the team lead with a career-best nine tackles (eight solo).
- ▶ Daniels registered his first career interception in Week 16 at Arizona, returning it 23 yards. According to STATS LLC, it was the first interception by a Packers DT since Cullen Jenkins on Oct. 18, 2009. Dating back to 1960, his 23-yard interception return was the longest by a Green Bay DT on an interception.
- ►He led Green Bay's defensive line with 5.5 sacks and was the team leader in quarterback hits (19) and pressures (22) during the 2014 regular season.
- ▶ Daniels is third on the Packers with 18.0 sacks since the start of the 2013 season (Peppers-21.0 / Matthews-28.0). He is **tied for No. 9 among NFL defensive tackles** over that span, according to STATS LLC:

### ON THE RISE

S **Ha Ha Clinton-Dix** has been a presence on the Packers defense since his rookie season.

- ►After starting 10 of 16 games and both postseason contests as a rookie, he has started every game since 2015.
- ►In 2016, he has registered a forced fumble while leading the team with 30 solo tackles.
- ►His three career postseason interceptions rank No. 1 among safeties since he entered the league in 2014, according to STATS.
- ►Clinton-Dix finished second on the team with 95 tackles (73 solo) in 2014 and led the Packers with 117 tackles (97 solo) last season.
- ► He registered a total of three interceptions last season (including playoffs). He tied for fourth on the team with two during the regular season and registered one in the postseason.
- ►According to STATS, his three sacks during the 2015 regular season were tied for the fifth most in a single regular season by a Packers safety (since 1982) and the most since Mark Roman recorded 3.5 in 2004.
- ► Clinton-Dix's three sacks also tied for **No. 3** in the **NFL** in 2015 among safeties.
- ▶ During the 2015 regular season, he registered eight-plus tackles in eight games, including setting career highs in both total tackles (12) and solo tackles (11) in the Week 10 game vs. Detroit, in which he also registered an interception.

#### **RACKING UP POINTS**

K Mason Crosby is moving his way up the record books.

► Crosby passed Ryan Longwell in Week 2 of the 2015 season to become the franchise career points leader:

- ► Crosby (310) eclipsed Longwell (277) for the most field goal attempts in Packers' history.
- ► Crosby (1,319) passed Longwell (1,119) for the most points scored in the regular and postseason combined in franchise history.
- ► Since the implementation of the new extra-point rule at the start of the 2015 season, Crosby has made 53-54. His 98.1 PAT percetage is **tied** for No. 5 in the NFL (min. 25 att.).
- ► Crosby ranks **No. 6 in the NFL** this season in field-goal percentage (min. seven att.):

- ► Crosby recorded 108 points during the 2015 regular season, giving him the ninth 100-point season of his career and passing Ryan Longwell (1997-2004) for the franchise record.
- ▶In Week 11 of 2015, he tied the single-game team record with five field goals and became the first player in NFL history to have five field goals of 40-plus yards in a game. In the same game, Crosby connected on a 52-yard field goal, extending his career franchise record for the most 50-yard FGs to 26.

#### ON THE ROAD AGAIN

Green Bay went 7-1 away from Lambeau Field in 2011, with the seven road wins setting a single-season franchise record.

- ►The Packers have been able to stay above the .500 mark on the road during Head Coach Mike McCarthy's tenure, a notable achievement in the National Football League.
- ► Since 2006, McCarthy's first season as the head coach in Green Bay, only nine of 32 NFL teams have regular-season road records above .500.

#### **322 AND COUNTING**

Another packed house at Lambeau Field against the Chicago Bears in Week 7 brought the stadium's consecutive-sellouts streak to 322 regular-season games (not including replacement games).

- ►The league's longest-tenured stadium, Lambeau Field is hosting its 60th season of football in 2016. For the victory over Dallas in the Divisional round of the 2014 playoffs, Packers fans set a new Lambeau Field paid attendance record (79,704).
- ► Across American professional sports, only Boston's Fenway Park (1912) and Chicago's Wrigley Field (1914) have longer tenures.

#### THE LAMBEAU ADVANTAGE

The crown jewel of the National Football League, Lambeau Field has long been known as one of the tougher venues to play in, particularly during the harsh Wisconsin winter.

- ▶ Re-establishing home-field advantage after a 4-4 mark in 2008 was one of the goals of 2009, and with the Packers finishing 6-2 at home, they accomplished that goal. Green Bay followed that up with a 7-1 mark at Lambeau Field in 2010, a perfect 8-0 record in 2011, the first undefeated home mark since 2002, and a 7-1 mark in 2012. The Packers were one of two teams to finish undefeated at home during the 2014 regular season (Denver).
- ► Head Coach **Mike McCarthy** stated consistently upon his arrival in Green Bay that one of the team's goals would be to reclaim the mystique of playing at Lambeau Field. Mission accomplished. The team is 62-21-1 (.744) at home in the regular season since 2006, **No. 2** in the NFL.
- ► Since Ron Wolf and Mike Holmgren began the revitalization of the franchise in 1992, Green Bay owns the best home record in the NFL. A look at the top regular-season home W-L records since the '92 season:

#### A LOOK AT THE SCHEDULE

The Green Bay Packers' 96th NFL regular-season schedule is headlined by five prime-time games (subject to flexible scheduling).

- ► Green Bay's schedule includes five games against 2015 playoff teams. Three of those contests (Minnesota, Houston, Seattle) will be at Lambeau Field, while two (Minnesota, Washington) will come on the road
- ► The Packers kicked off their season on the road for the fourth consecutive year, the longest streak in team history, opening with two road games for the first time since 1924. Green Bay traveled to Jacksonville, playing on the road against an AFC team in Week 1 for the first time since facing the New England Patriots in 1985.
- ► Green Bay faced division opponents in Weeks 2-3. They began with a trip to Minnesota to face the Vikings in a prime-time game and returned to Lambeau Field last week for the home opener against the Detroit Lions.
- ▶ For the second time in four years, the Packers had their bye in Week 4.
- ▶Green Bay returns to action with three consecutive home games against NFC teams over a 12-day span. In Week 5, the Packers played on Sunday night against the New York Giants. It was the Giants' first regular-season game at Lambeau Field since 2010. In Week 6, Green Bay played the Dallas Cowboys for the fourth consecutive season (including playoffs) and for the second straight year at home in the regular season. Green Bay finished the homestand playing the Chicago Bears on a Thursday night for the second consecutive season (11th straight year in primetime).
- ► Four of the Packers' next five games will be on the road, including three road games in a row for the first time since 2012.
- ▶ After a trip to play the Atlanta Falcons in Week 8, Green Bay will face the Indianapolis Colts at home for the first time since 2008. Five of the last seven matchups between Green Bay and Indianapolis have been decided by seven or fewer points. The Packers make just their third regular-season visit to Tennessee to play the Titans in Week 10. Green Bay is looking for its first victory at the Titans since they moved to Tennessee in 1997.
- ► Green Bay will play two prime-time road games in a row, first traveling to play against the Washington Redskins on a Sunday night in Week 11 and then going to Philadelphia to face the Eagles on *Monday Night Football* in Week 12. It marks the 24th consecutive season (1993-2016) that Green Bay is appearing on *MNF*.
- ► Green Bay will play its first game at home in almost a month when it faces the Houston Texans in Week 13 for just the second time ever at Lambeau Field.
- ► Week 14 brings a familiar matchup as the Packers welcome the Seattle Seahawks to Lambeau Field for the second consecutive year. Including the postseason, Green Bay and Seattle will meet for the fifth time in five years.
- For the first time since 2006, the Packers will finish the regular season with three straight games against NFC North opponents.
- ►In Week 15, Green Bay will travel to Chicago to play the Bears. The Packers have won four consecutive games against the Bears in December, three of which were played in Chicago.
- ► Green Bay returns home to play the Vikings in Week 16 on Christmas Eve, playing on a Saturday for the first time since 1997. The Packers last played on Christmas Eve in 2004, a 34-31 victory at Minnesota. Including playoffs, Green Bay has a 8-2-1 mark (.773) against the Vikings at Lambeau Field under McCarthy.
- ▶The Packers will finish the regular season in Detroit for the first time since 1993. Green Bay has won seven of 10 games at Ford Field under McCarthy. It will be only the third time the Packers have played at the Lions during the regular season in the month of January (1983, 1994).

# THE DOPE SHEET

#### **BREAKING DOWN THE ROSTER**

The Packers have a 52-man roster that is composed of 23 offensive players, 26 defensive players and three specialists.

- ▶ Of the 52 players on the roster, 47 began their pro careers with the Packers (90.4 percent) and 34 of them (65.4 percent) were draft picks of the Packers. Dating back to 2009, Green Bay has selected nine players in the first round, seven of which are still on the team.
- ► Green Bay has 15 players on the roster that began their careers as undrafted free agents, with 13 of those originally signed by Green Bay.
- ► Five 2016 undrafted rookie free agents are currently on the roster (WR Geronimo Allison, S Kentrell Brice, S Marwin Evans, CB Josh Hawkins, RB Don Jackson).
- ▶ 42.3 percent of the players (22 of 52) on Green Bay's roster entered the league as a sixth-round or seventh-round pick or as an undrafted player.
- ► The Packers have five players on the roster that played in the NFL prior to the 2009 season. Three of those players were draft picks of the Packers (QB Aaron Rodgers, K Mason Crosby and WR Jordy Nelson) and two (Rodgers, Nelson) have made at least one Pro Bowl.
- ▶ Only 19 of the 52 players on the roster (36.5 percent) were selected in the first three rounds of the draft, with 17 being drafted by the Packers.
- ► Of the 52 players on the roster, 42 of them (80.8 percent) are 28 years old or younger (as of Nov. 6) and 25 players (48.1 percent) are 24 years old or younger.

### PACKERS STARTERS - OFFENSE

### WR Jordy Nelson, 9th Year, Kansas State, D2a-08

- Leads the team with six receiving touchdowns this season.
- ► Has 55 career touchdowns, ranking No. 5 in Packers history.
- ► For the first time in his career, posted a touchdown reception in each of the first four games of the season, becoming the first Packer to do so since WR Bill Schroeder in 2001.
- ► His five touchdown receptions in the first four games this year tied for the fourth most in franchise history.
- ► Missed all of the 2015 season due to a knee injury.
- Finished the 2014 regular season ranked fourth in receiving yards (1,519), seventh in receptions (98) and tied for second in receiving touchdowns (13). Earned first selection to the Pro Bowl.
- ▶ Led the team in 2013 with 85 catches for 1,314 yards and eight TDs. Ranked No. 10 in the NFL that season in receiving yards.
- ► With 15 TD catches in 2011, became only the third player in franchise history to catch 15 or more TDs in a season, joining WRs Sterling Sharpe (18 in 1994) and Don Hutson (17 in 1942).

### LT David Bakhtiari, 4th Year, Colorado, D4a-13

- ► Has started all but two games at LT since the start of the 2013 regular season. Missed the final two games of the 2015 regular season due to
- ► Started all 16 games at left tackle in 2013, the only rookie in the NFL to do so in 2013 and the first Packer rookie to do so since the league went to a 16-game schedule in 1978.
- ▶ Became just the fourth Green Bay rookie to start at LT in the season opener since the 1970 AFL-NFL merger and the first since 1985.

#### LG Lane Taylor, 4th Year, Oklahoma State, FA-13

- ► Has played in 37 regular-season games for Green Bay with nine starts.
- ► Made the first starts of his career in 2015, opening at RG at Detroit in Week 13 in place of an injured T.J. Lang and at LG in Week 17 vs. Minnesota with Josh Sitton sliding to LT in place of an injured David Bakhtiari.
- ► A four-year letterman at OSU, starting 47 of 50 games played at right guard. Unanimous first-team All-Big 12 selection by the conference's coaches as a senior.

#### C JC Tretter, 4th Year, Cornell, D4b-13

- ► Has started each game this season. Set career highs with 16 games played and three starts (all at C) during the 2015 regular season. Also started at LT in the NFC Wild Card game at Washington.
- ► Has seen game action at C, LG and both T spots during his career.► Was on track to be the starting C in 2014, opening at that position for the first three preseason games, but sustained a knee injury vs. Oakland (Aug. 22) that would sideline him for the first half of the season. Returned to play in the final eight games and both postseason contests.
- ►Grew from a high school quarterback, running back and slot receiver into an All-American LT in college, starting 20 consecutive games in his final two seasons at Cornell.

#### RG T.J. Lang, 8th Year, Eastern Michigan, D4-09

- ► Has started games at four different positions on the line as a pro (54 at RG, 27 at LG, five at RT, two at LT). Played C in Week 10 in 2013.
- ► Has started 85 contests since 2011.
- ► Started games at both tackle spots in his first season (2009) and became the first Packers rookie to start consecutive games at left tackle since Chad Clifton in 2000.
- ▶ Began his college career as a defensive lineman, but converted to the offensive line as a sophomore and started 36 straight games (10 at RT, 26 at LT) over his final three years.

#### RT Bryan Bulaga, 7th Year, Iowa, D1-10

- ► Has started 34 of 39 games since the start of the 2014 season.
- ► Missed the second part of the 2012 season after suffering a hip injury vs. Arizona on Nov. 4 and missed all of the 2013 season after injuring his knee on Aug. 3.
- ▶ Started 37 games at RT in his first three seasons in the league.
- ► Started the final 12 games of 2010 and the entire postseason at right tackle after taking over for veteran Mark Tauscher (shoulder).
- Named to the *Pro Football Weekly*/PFWA All-Rookie team in 2010
- Capped his rookie season by becoming the youngest player at the time, according to STATS LLC, to ever start in the Super Bowl (21 years, 322 days).

- TE Jared Cook, 8th Year, South Carolina, FA-16

  ► Signed with the Packers as a free agent in March 2016 after spending three seasons with the St. Louis Rams (2013-15) and four with the Tennessee Titans (2009-12)
- ► Has posted at least 35 receptions in each of the last five seasons (2011-15), one of only five active tight ends in the NFL to do so (Antonio Gates, Jimmy Graham, Rob Gronkowski, Greg Olsen)
- ►Ranks No. 5 among NFL tight ends with a 12.7-yard receiving average since he entered the league in 2009.
- ► Holds the single-game franchise record for the most receiving yards by a tight end for both the Titans (169 vs. Jacksonville, Dec. 24, 2011) and the Rams (141 vs. Arizona, Sept. 8, 2013).

- WR Randall Cobb, 6th Year, Kentucky, D2-11

  ▶ Ranks No. 2 on the team with 39 receptions this season.

  ▶ Posted the 12th 100-yard receiving game of his career in Week 4 (108) on nine receptions) and tied his single game-high for receptions (11 for 95 yards and a TD) in Week 7.
- ►Led the team in receptions (79), was No. 2 in receiving yards (829) and was No. 3 in touchdown receptions (six) in 2015.
- Set a new single-season career high with five 100-yard receiving games during the 2014 season (three-2012). Earned first trip to the Pro Bowl.
- ►His career-best 91 receptions in 2014 were the seventh most in team history
- ► Finished the regular season tied for fourth in the NFL with 12 touchdown receptions in 2014.
- ▶ Before suffering a knee injury in Week 6 in 2013, led the team in receptions with 29 and was No. 2 in receiving yards with 378.
- Set a franchise single-season record with a league-high 2,342 combined net yards in 2012, topping the previous team mark of 2,250 yards by RB Ahman Green in 2003.

### QB Aaron Rodgers, 12th Year, California, D1-05

- In 126 regular-season starts (84-42 record), has posted 44 games with 300-plus passing yards, 74 without an interception and 70 with a 100plus passer rating (min. 15 attempts).
- ► Earned his fifth selection to the Pro Bowl in 2015, passing Bart Starr (1960-62, 1966) for the second-most selections by a Green Bay quarterback behind Brett Favre's nine (1992-93, 1995-97, 2001-03, 2007).
- ► His career passer rating of 103.6 ranks No. 1 in NFL history.
- Finished the 2014 regular season ranked No. 2 in the NFL in passer rating (112.2), touchdown percentage (7.3), No. 1 in interception percentage (1.0) and No. 3 in touchdown passes (38)
- ▶Recorded a passer rating of at least 120.0 in seven regular-season games in 2014, setting a single-season career high and tying for the third most in a single season in the NFL, dating back to 1960.
- ► Posted 21,332 passing yards from 2008-12, which ranks No. 1 in league history for the most passing yards by a QB in his first five seasons as a starter (previous record was Peyton Manning, 20,618, 1998-2002).

  In 2011, set an NFL record with a 122.5 passer rating and set franchise
- marks for TD passes (45), passing yards (4,643), completion percentage (68.3), yards per attempt (9.25) and 300-yard games (eight) on his way to earning NFL Most Valuable Player honors from *The Associated*

#### RB James Starks, 7th Year, Buffalo, D6-10

- ► Has started nine of 67 career games played during the regular season.
- ► Set career highs in starts (four), rushing yards (601), receptions (43), receiving yards (392), receiving TDs (three) and yards from scrimmage (993) last season.
- ►In 2015, he put together two of the finest rushing games of his career. In Week 2, he carried the ball 20 times for 95 yards (4.8 avg.), and in Week 6, he racked up 112 yards on just 10 carries (11.2 avg.), becoming the first Packers player to rush for 100-plus yards on 10 or fewer carries since RB Brandon Jackson at Washington on Oct. 10, 2010 (115) yards on 10 carries). He also registered a 65-yard touchdown against San Diego, the longest by a Green Bay player since RB DeShawn Wynn's 73-yard touchdown vs. Detroit on Dec. 28, 2008
- ▶ Led the NFL with 315 rushing yards during the 2010 playoffs.

### FB Aaron Ripkowski, 2nd Year, Oklahoma, D6a-15

- ► Set career highs with 34 yards on six carries (5.7 avg.) in Week 8.
- ► Played in 15 games as a rookie, seeing action primarily on special teams.
- ·Tied for No. 4 on the team with nine special teams tackles last season.
- ► Began collegiate career as a walk-on and went on to play in 47 games with 17 starts.



### PACKERS STARTERS - DEFENSE

#### DE Kenny Clark, Rookie, UCLA, D1-16

- ► Leads the Packers' defensive line in tackles (19).
- ▶ Became the youngest player to appear in a season opener for the Packers since Arnie Herber (20 years old) in 1930.
- ► Earned third-team All-America honors from *The Associated Press* and first-team All-Pacific-12 recognition from the coaches and media as a junior in 2015.
- ► Was a team co-captain in '15 and recorded career highs in tackles (75), tackles for a loss (11) and sacks (six). Also ranked third on the team with five pass breakups.

#### NT Letroy Guion, 9th Year, Florida State, FA-14

- ► Has started 26 of the 35 regular-season games he has played since the start of the 2014 season.
- ➤ Signed with Green Bay during the 2014 offseason after spending his first six NFL seasons with the Minnesota Vikings.
- ► Started all 28 games he appeared in for Minnesota in 2012-13, recording 72 tackles (32 solo) and three sacks over that span.
- ► Was the only Viking to block a field goal in both 2011 and 2012.

### DT Mike Daniels, 5th Year, Iowa, D4a-12

- ► Ranks third on the team with 18.0 sacks since the start of the 2013 regular season (LB Julius Peppers-21.0 / LB Clay Matthews-28.0).
- ▶Led the defensive line in both tackles and sacks each of that last two seasons.
- ► Returned a fumble 43 yards for a TD vs. Detroit in Week 14 of 2012, the longest fumble return for a TD by a rookie in franchise history.
- ► Starred as an interior pass rusher at lowa, posting a team-high 24.5 tackles for a loss and 13 sacks from 2010-11.

#### LOLB Nick Perry, 5th Year, Southern California, D1-12

- ▶Is tied for No. 13 in the NFL with a team-high 5.5 sacks this season.
- ▶ Registered mulitple sacks in each of his first five seasons in the NFL and has posted a two-sack game in each of the last four seasons (2013-16).
- ► Has totaled six sacks in five playoff games, including 3.5 in the 2015 postseason which tied Clay Matthews (2010) for the franchise record in a single posteason.
- ► His six postseason sacks rank No. 3 in franchise history behind Matthews (10) and Reggie White (eight) and are the most in team history (since 1982) by a player in his first five games with Green Bay.

#### ILB Jake Ryan, 2nd Year, Michigan, D4-15

- ► Leads the team with 52 tackles on the season.
- Started the final five games of the regular season and both playoff contests in 2015.
- ► Recorded a team-best nine tackles (eight solo) and one fumble recovery in Week 13 last season at Detroit in his first pro start.
- ➤ Served as a team captain for his final two seasons at Michigan and was a three-time winner (2012-14) of the Roger Zatkoff Award, given to the Wolverines top linebacker. He was the only player to win the award (est. 1991) three times.
- ► Joined LB John Anderson (first round, 26th overall) as the only Michigan linebackers ever drafted by Green Bay.
- Started 41 of 46 games played in college, appearing at inside linebacker as a senior after spending his first three seasons at outside linebacker and defensive end.

### ILB Blake Martinez, Rookie, Stanford, D4a-16

- ► Became the first rookie to start on defense for Green Bay in Week 1 since Nick Perry in 2012.
- ► Finished collegiate career with 257 tackles (137 solo), 13.5 tackles for a loss, 6.5 sacks, five interceptions and five forced fumbles in 51 games played.
- ► Started all 27 games played in his final two seasons, leading the team in tackles as a junior (102) and senior (141).
- ► Led the Pacific-12 and ranked No. 7 nationally with 141 tackles (75 solo) as a senior, averaging a conference-best 10.1 tackles per game.

#### ROLB Clay Matthews, 8th Year, Southern California, D1b-09

- For the first time in his career, recorded at least one sack in each of the first three regular-season games he played in.
- ➤ Selected to his sixth Pro Bowl and first as an inside linebacker in 2015 after recording 6.5 sacks (second on the team), 15 QB hits (No. 1 on the team), and a career-high 85 tackles (No. 2 on the team).
- ► With 70.5 careeer sacks, passed Reggie White (68.5) for the second most sacks in Packers history (Kabeer Gbaja-Biamila, 74.5).
- ▶ With a team-high 11.0 sacks in 2014, is tied for the most 10-plus sack seasons in franchise history (four).
- ▶ Is the only player in franchise history to score a defensive TD (interception or fumble return) in each of his first three seasons in the NFL (2009-11).
- ► Named first-team All-Pro by *The Associated Press* in 2010, the first Green Bay LB to earn that honor since Tim Harris in 1989. Finished second to Pittsburgh safety Troy Polamalu in the *AP's* Defensive Player of the Year voting.

#### LCB Damarious Randall, 2nd Year, Arizona State, D1-15

- ▶ Played in 15 games with nine starts (six at LCB, two at RCB, one in the slot) in 2015 and tied for the team lead and No. 2 among NFL rookies with three interceptions, including one he returned for a TD. Finished with a team-best 16 passes defensed.
- Named the NFL's Defensive Rookie of the Month for November 2015, joining CB Casey Hayward (October 2012) as the only Green Bay defensive backs to win the award.
- ► Earned first-team All-Pacific-12 honors at safety as a senior in 2014 after he led the Sun Devils in tackles (106) and passes defensed (12) and tied for the team lead with three interceptions.

#### RCB Quinten Rollins, 2nd Year, Miami (Ohio), D2-15

- ► Has started all four games (one at LCB, three as the third CB) he has appeared in this season. Missed the past three games with a groin injury.
- ▶ Played in 14 games with four starts (two at LCB, two at RCB) in 2015.
- ► Tied for No. 3 on the team and No. 4 among NFL rookies with two interceptions last season.
- ▶ Returned his first career interception 45 yards for a touchdown, becoming the first Packers rookie to record a pick-six since S Marques Anderson in 2002 (vs. Detroit, Nov. 10).
- ▶ Played one season of college football and was named Mid-American Conference Defensive Player of the Year and first-team All-MAC.

### SS Morgan Burnett, 7th Year, Georgia Tech, D3-10

- ► Missed five games due to injury in 2015, but finished No. 4 on the team with 54 solo tackles.
- ▶ Totaled a team-high 125 tackles in 2014, the second most of his career (137 in 2012). Ranked No. 2 on the team with 106 tackles (77 solo) in 2013, despite missing the first three games due to injury. Recovered three fumbles, including one for a TD, and added nine passes defensed.
- ▶ Participated in all 1,088 plays for Green Bay's defense in 2012, one of only four non-OL in the NFL to appear in 100 percent of his team's snaps.
- ▶ Enjoyed his first full season as a pro in 2011, joining DT B.J. Raji as the only two Green Bay defensive players to start all 16 regular-season games.
- Started the first four games of the 2010 season at SS before sustaining a season-ending knee injury vs. Detroit in Week 4.

### FS Ha Ha Clinton-Dix, 3rd Year, Alabama, D1-14

- ▶ Ranks second on the team with 35 solo tackles this season.
- ► Led the team in tackles in 2015 with 117 (97 solo) and was tied for fourth on the team in interceptions (two).
- ► According to STATS LLC, his three sacks during the 2015 regular season tied for the fifth most in a single regular season by a Packers safety (since 1982) and the most since Mark Roman recorded 3.5 in 2004.
- ► Started every game in 2015 after starting 10 of 16 games as a rookie when he finished second on the team in tackles (95).
- ► Was the second safety ever drafted by Green Bay in the first round (Alabama S George Teague, No. 29 overall in 1993).
- ► Was a consensus All-America selection in 2013 as a junior, earning first-team recognition from *The Associated Press*, the Football Writers Association of America and *Sporting News*.

### **MEDIA INFORMATION & POLICIES**

#### MIKE McCARTHY PRESS CONFERENCES

During the regular season (for a Sunday game), the head coach will be available in the Media Auditorium on Monday, Wednesday, Thursday and Friday. One-on-one interviews with McCarthy should be arranged through Jason Wahlers.

#### **PLAYER INTERVIEWS**

The team's locker room will generally be open Monday, Wednesday, Thursday, Friday and following games.

- ► At the conclusion of all games, the locker room will be opened following the NFL's standard "cooling-off period."
- ►All interviews with players on the practice squad or injured reserve need to be requested and approved through the P.R. department.
- ► Any requests to interview players other than at the aforementioned times should be directed to a member of the Packers' P.R. department.

#### **ASSISTANT COACH AVAILABILITY**

All by request only, through the P.R. department

- ► Coordinators Edgar Bennett (offense, bottom left), Dom Capers (defense, bottom middle) and Ron Zook (special teams, bottom right) will continue to serve as primary spokesmen in their respective areas.
- ▶ During the regular season, assistants generally will be available on Thursdays at the podium in the Media Auditorium with offense and defense rotating every other week. During a week when offensive coaches are available, Capers will also be available on Thursday to represent the defense. When defensive coaches are available, Bennett will also be available on Thursday to represent the offense. On Mondays, the coordinators will be available at the podium in the Media Auditorium.
- ► Following games, Head Coach Mike McCarthy will be the only coach available to the media.
- ► However, position coaches are available for questions on specific players and the position group only. Broader interview topics need to be directed to the respective coordinators.
- ► No assistant coach should be contacted directly by telephone (at his desk, home or on his cell phone), or by email. All interviews must be arranged through the P.R. department.
- ► Sarah Quick (920-569-7213) serves as the primary contact for assistant coaches. In her absence, feel free to contact another member of the P.R. staff.

# PRACTICE ACCESS, PHOTOGRAPHY AND SOCIAL-MEDIA GUIDELINES

▶ During the regular season, practices will be open to state media who regularly cover the team for designated periods during the first half of each session, similar to previous seasons. Also as in

- prior years, photo opportunities will be limited to the beginning portions of practice.
- ►The team reserves the right to limit photography to certain periods for competitive reasons. This restriction applies to both training-camp and regular-season practices.
- ▶ During practice periods in which B-roll and still photography are NOT permitted, the media may not utilize camera phones either. The P.R. staff will alert the media of the permissible "shooting" periods before and during each practice.
- ▶ Video of practice, press conferences or locker-room interviews by an individual or media outlet may not be posted at any time on social-media sites or live-broadcasting applications (this includes applications such as Facebook, Twitter, Vine, Instagram, Snapchat, Ustream, Periscope and Meerkat, etc).
- ► No still photography is permitted in the locker room at any time. Signs, notes and other personal items or information posted in and around the locker room at player lockers are not to be photographed or captured on video.

#### **ONLINE-CONTENT POLICY**

According to the 2016 NFL non-game online content policy, accredited organizations may distribute online non-game audio and video content, including interviews, press conferences and team practices at NFL venues, acquired as a result of credentialed access ("Game Information") to games or club/league facilities provided that such distribution: is 90 seconds maximum per day (180 seconds in two-team markets – 90 seconds per team); may not be "archived" (i.e., made available for on-demand public access) for more than 24 hours; appears in an editorial context only (no sponsorship, merchandising or advertising integrated with or around the content); is not posted live; and is accompanied by links back to NFL.com and to the club website.

The 90-second limit does not include video/audio material that is composed entirely of a credentialed media employee providing commentary or analysis ("talking head" reporting), including pregame or postgame stand-up material shot on the field or other facility location.

While a game is in progress, any forms of accounts of the game must be sufficiently time-delayed and limited in amount (e.g., score updates with detail given only in quarterly game updates, fewer than 10 photographs during the game) so that the accredited organization's game coverage cannot be used as a substitute for, or otherwise approximate, authorized play-by-play accounts.

The Packers have their own social-media and online-content policies for practice reporting, which will be communicated by the P.R. staff for both training camp and the regular season. Members of the media are encouraged to contact the public relations staff with any questions.

### **MEDIA INFORMATION & POLICIES**

#### **CONFERENCE CALLS**

The Packers' P.R. department will arrange a conference call with the head coach and a key player of the opposing team each week during the regular season. These conference calls will be made from the media workroom, and generally will be held on Wednesday.

#### **TELEPHONES/INTERNET**

Lambeau Field features complimentary wireless Internet in the main press box. Please contact the public information department if you require assistance.

In the Lee Remmel Press Box at Lambeau Field, more than a dozen "co-op" phones are available to media throughout the box. If dedicated service is desired, please contact Scott Guth of Dataline Services seven to 10 days prior to the game at 920-569-7090 or sguth@datalineservicesinc.com. Instruments also may be obtained through Guth, upon request.

Dedicated internet service also may be ordered through Dataline Services – on a game-by-game or full-season basis – for installation in either the Lee Remmel Press Box or in the downstairs Photo/Media Workrooms.

As assigned by the Professional Football Writers of America (PFWA), the Green Bay pool reporter for the 2016 season is Tom Silverstein of the *Milwaukee Journal Sentinel*. Pete Dougherty of the *Green Bay Press-Gazette* is the alternate.

#### **PHOTO CREDENTIALS**

Photo credentials will not be issued to freelance photographers unless on a specific assignment from an accredited organization. Credentials are not provided to "grips" due to on-field space limitations.

### **CREDENTIALS**

All credential requests are acquired through an online credential link, which should be obtained by contacting Sarah Quick, assistant director of public relations. Requests may be sent via email (Sarah Quick; quicks@packers.com). Credentials will not be mailed, unless the requesting outlet provides a Federal Express or UPS number, and if scheduled in advance, should be picked up in person at the Packers' corporate offices, located in the Lambeau Field Atrium. Credentials not obtained prior to gameday will be left at Media Will Call on the south side of the stadium near the Shopko Gate. Media Will Call opens three hours prior to kickoff.

Adrian Peterson limped off in the third quarter with a right knee injury, and only 19 yards on 12 carries, but the Vikings (2-0) proved they still have a lot of options. Stefon Diggs caught nine passes for 182 yards and a touchdown. They held the Packers (1-1) to 65 total yards in the first half,

was killed with a strip sack by Brian Robison, when Shamar Stephen recovered at the Minnesota 44 with 6:53 remaining.

Rodgers, who ran for 29 yards and a touchdown, began to find a groove throwing the ball down the stretch. He finished 12 for 21 for 154 yards withstanding an early touchdown pass by Rodgers to Jordy Nelson on a drive aided by two penalties by cornerback Terence Newman.

Trae Waynes, who had two penalties himself, intercepted Rodgers' pass in Vikings territory with 1:50 left to seal the victory. The previous drive

in the second half, but Bradford was the better quarterback on this night.

The Vikings, who aggressively traded two premium draft picks including next year's first-rounder to Philadelphia to fetch Bradford after Teddy Bridgewater went down with a massive left knee injury, boldly eschewed a field-goal try early in the second quarter.

Bradford found Diggs for a 4-yard completion on fourth-and-1 from the 18. Then he hit Kyle Rudolph for an 8-yard touchdown pass three plays

Bradford was hit hard on his non-throwing hand by Packers outside linebacker Clay Matthews while following through on a pass at one point during the drive. He visited the locker room briefly for further examination but never missed a snap, despite significant swelling beneath his left pinky. There were only a couple of instances that even hinted of newness for Bradford and the offense, when one throw on the first drive salled well past where Rudolph's route ended and another later in the first quarter was in the air too quickly for Rudolph to turn around.

GREEN BAY, Wis. — The timing is back for quarterback Aaron Rodgers and the rest of Green Bay's offense. The Packers' pass defense might

need a little work, though.

Rodges threw for 205 yards and four touchdowns, including two in the first half to Jordy Nelson, and the Packers snapped out of their offensive funk before holding off the Detroit Lions for a 34-27 win Sunday.

Rodgers was 15 of 24, leading the Packers to touchdowns on their first three series. Nelson had 101 yards on six catches, returning to the form that made him one of the NFL's best receivers before missing the 2015 season with a knee injury. They moved the ball on the Lions' short-handed defense with ease in the first half. The Packers (2-1) led 31-10 at halftime before the Lions slowly

chipped away.

Marvin Jones' 35-yard touchdown catch with 3:34 left got Detroit (1-2) within seven. But Rodgers had a critical 11-yard run on third-and-8 from the Packers' 27 with 3:22 left to effectively seal the win.

Jones had a career-high 205 yards on six receptions. Matthew Stafford passed for 385 yards and three scores for the Lions, who held advantages in total yardage (418-324) and time of possession, holding the ball for 35 minutes.

But the Packers burned he secondary with big plays to build a big lead, and Eddle Lacy ran for 103 yards on 17 carries.

Coach Mike McCarthy and Rodgers heard questions about the out-of-sync passing game following the 17-14 loss last week to Minnesota. Now the Packers head into an early bye week with renewed confidence after a successful opener at Lambeau Field.

The Lions gained chunks of yardage in the second half after being forced to play catch-up following Green Bay's big early lead. The Packers' defense was also missing four staffers, including linebacker Clay Matthews.

Stafford found holes over the middle of the field. He connected with Jones for a 23-yard completion on the first play from scrimmage in the

second half to the Detroit 46.

But Green Bay's staunch run defense had another big day, albeit against a Lions offense playing without injured tailback Ameer Abdullah. Detroit managed just 50 yards on 23 carries, with a team-high 38 yards on 10 carries by Dwayne Washington.

Jones gave the Lions a boost going into halftime with a 73-yard touchdown pass from Stafford to get Detroit within 31-10. He stiff-armed cornerback Josh Hawkins before sprinting unbuched 45 yards into the end zone.

The Packers' offense accomplished two of McCaffarb bigger goals for this week: Receivers worked the middle of the field, and Lacy got more carries in the running game. Nelson was lined up in the slot on his 8-yard touchdown catch in the first quarter, when Rodgers pump-faked, then stepped up in the pocket to find Nelson. Lacy looked rejuvenated as he bounced off defenders for a 25-yard run in the second quarter.

GREEN BAY, Wis. (AP) — The Green Bay Packers got pushy on both sides of the line of scrimmage against the New York Giants. The offensive line kept Aaron Rodgers clean in the pocket and helped drive the running attack. The defensive line is playing so well that that the MVP quarterback is taking notice.

Rodgers threw for 259 yards and two touchdown passes, and Green Bay's defense disrupted Eli Manning and limited Odell Beckham Jr. in a 23-16 win on Sunday night.

Manning was 18 of 35 for 199 yards and was sacked three times. The Giants (2-3) lost their third straight game, and the offense has struggled in road losses at Minnesota and Green Bay the last two weeks.

The Packers defense contained the Giants in the red zone, holding New York to three field goals until late in the fourth quarter. Green Bay's secondary played well, especially considering the Packers (3-1) were without starting cornerbacks Sam Shields (concussion) and Damarious Randall (groin). The Packers had another stellar day against the run, albeit against a team that was missing lead running back Rashad Jennings (thumb). The Giants managed just 43 yards on 15 carries against a defense ranked first against the run coming into the night.

Mike Daniels and Letroy Guion led the effort on the defensive line, with first-round draft pick Kenny Clark becoming a key sub. The line only gigures to only get stronger with the expected return of top backup Mike Pennel next week from a four-game suspension for violating the league's substance-abuse policy.

Beckham finished with five catches for 56 yards, but did get his first touchdown catch of the season.

The 8-yard score stood on replay review after the receiver jumped high in the air for Manning's pass and was ruled inbounds after straddling the back line of the end zone.

Randall Cobb was the Packers' most consistent receiver with nine catches for 108 yards. With the Giants missing starting safety Nat Berhe because of an injury, Cobb excelled in his specialty of working the middle of the field and turning short passes into long gains.

Cobb appeared to be OK on the sideline after taking a hit to the back of his head or neck from safety Landon Collins on a 13-yard catch on third-

and-10 with about 2 minutes left.

Glants cornerback Janon's Jenkins had two interceptions in the first half, one coming on third-and-6 at the Glants 21 after a pass deflected off receiver Jordy Nelson's hands. It was Jenkins' first two-interception game since his rookie season with St. Louis, when he had two against Arizona on Nov. 25, 2012.

Given what happened a year ago — Atlanta started the season 6-1, then lost six in a row and missed the playoffs — it was imperative to turn things around against the Packers. It didn't look good when Aaron Rodgers threw his fourth touchdown pass, putting the Packers ahead with 3:58 remaining. The Falcons were coming off a 26-24 loss at Seattle and a 33-30 overtime setback to San Diego in which they squandered a 17-point lead at home.

Sanu had nine catches for 84 yards, both season highs in his first year with the Falcons. Atlanta needed every one of them, since Jones was held to three catches for 29 yards and targeted only once in the second half — a dropped pass on the final possession.

But Jones helped Sanu get open on the winning play, drawing two defenders when they lined up on the same side of the field.

Ryan was 28 of 35 for 288 yards and three touchdowns.

Rödgers threw for 246 yards, teaming up with a bunch of young receivers as the banged-up Packers played without six starters. Linebacker Clay Matthews and receiver Randall Cobb were among those with couldn't go because of hamstring injuries.

Three Green Bay receivers — Geronimo Allson, Trevor Davis and Jeff Janis — got their first career touchdown. Allson, in fact, had just been promoted from the practice squad and never caught a pass in an NFL game. Ditto for Davis, a rookle who had mainly been used as a returner.

The Packers took a 32-26 lead after the Falcons were caught with too many men on the field, giving Green Bay a first down rather than having to

go for a fourth-and-1. Rodgers went to Janis for a 7-yard touchdown with 3:56 remaining, followed by a 2-point conversion.
It wasn't enough. Sanu's touchdown tied the game, and Matt Bryant booted through the winning extra point. Bryant had already become the Falcons career leading scorer, passing Morten Andersen, with a PAT after Atlanta's first TD.

Adrian Clayborn had the first multi-sack game of his six-year NFL career, bringing down Rodgers twice in the second half. Vic Beasley Jr. also had

a sack, giving him 61/2 over the last four games and 71/2 for the season. the highest rushing total by a Packers quarterback since Don Majkowski's 88-yard effort in 1990. Rodgers was also Green Bay's leading rusher with a career-high 60 yards on six carries. He broke his previous best of 57 yards in 2012, and posted

## 17 Davante Adams, WR, 3rd Year, Fresno State

- With 88 catches in 2014-15, joined WRs Randall Cobb (105 in 2011-12) and Greg Jennings (98 in 2006-07) as the only Packers over the last 25 seasons to register 85-plus receptions in their first two seasons in the league.
- Caught a career-high 50 passes for a career-best 483 yards (9.7 avg.) and a TD last season despite missing three games due to an ankle injury.
- Played in all 16 games with 11 starts as a rookie in 2014, hauling in 38 receptions for 446 yards (14.2 avg.) and three TDs.
- Set franchise postseason single-game records for the most catches and receiving yards by a rookie when he posted seven grabs for 117 yards (16.7 avg.) and a TD in a 2014 NFC Divisional playoff victory vs. Dallas.
- **2016 SEASON:** Has played in all seven games with six starts and has a team-high 40 catches for a team-leading 424 yards (10.6 avg.) and a career-high five TDs...Is tied for No. 4 in the NFL in TD catches.
- ▶At Jacksonville (Sept. 11): Started as the team opened with three WRs and finished with three catches for 50 yards (16.7 avg.), highlighted by his 29-yard TD catch with 13 seconds in the first half that gave the Packers a 21-17 lead that they would not relinquish...With CB Davon House on his back, made a diving grab in the end zone for the longest TD catch of his career in the regular season as QB Aaron Rodgers fought off a sack attempt from CB Jalen Ramsey.
- ▶At Minnesota (Sept. 18): Started as the third WR and played 54 snaps, finishing with three catches for 26 yards (8.7 avg.)...On a third down midway through the first quarter, drew a 40-yard pass-interference penalty on Vikings CB Terence Newman that gave Green Bay the ball at the Minnesota 5 to help set up a 1-yard TD pass from Rodgers to WR Jordy Nelson.

Detroit (Sept. 25): Caught two passes for 23 yards (11.5 avg.) in 25 snaps of action, highlighted by a 14-yard TD grab on Green Bay's opening drive...Beat CB Quandre Diggs on a slant and then shook off a tackle attempt near the goal line from S Glover Quin to get into the end zone... Also had a 9-yard catch late in the game that helped the Packers clinch the win and run out the clock.
- ▶Vs. N.Y. Giants (Oct. 9): Started as the third WR and posted a season-high five receptions for a season-best 85 yards (17.0 avg.) and a TD...His 17.0-yard receiving average was his second-best single-game mark (min. three rec.) behind only his six-catch, 121-yard effort (20.2 avg.) vs. New England on Nov. 30, 2014...Caught a 29-yard TD pass midway through the second quarter, matching the longest TD reception of his career...Beat CB Michael Hunter down the right sideline and hauled in the pass from Rodgers near the 10-yard line, keeping his feet in bounds for the final few yards as he extended the ball past the pylon.
- ►Vs. Dallas (Oct. 16): Started as the third WR and had two receptions for 34 yards (17.0 avg.)...Left the game to be evaluated for a concussion after absorbing a big hit on his 12-yard catch on a third-and-11 in the third quarter, and did not return.
- ▶Vs. Chicago (Oct. 20): Started as the third WR and posted career highs in receptions (13), receiving yards (132) and TD catches (two), with his catch total tying the second-best mark in franchise history behind only Don Hutson's 14-catch game at the N.Y. Giants on Nov. 22, 1942...Set a team record for the most catches in a game at Lambeau Field...Along with WRs Randall Cobb (11) and Ty Montgomery (10), became only the second trio in NFL history to all record 10-plus catches in the same game...Made a leaping 5-yard TD grab on third down over CB De'Vante Busby in the third quarter, giving Green Bay a 13-10 lead it would not relinquish...On the first play of the fourth quarter, found himself wide open on a slant for a 4-yard TD...Was named NFC Offensive Player of the Week for his performance, his first time winning the award as he joined Greg Jennings as the only Green Bay WRs to earn the honor over the past 15 seasons.
- ►At Atlanta (Oct. 30): Started and played 58 of 62 snaps, leading the team with 12 catches for 74 yards (6.2 avg.) to become the first player in team history to register 12-plus receptions in back-to-back games...His 25 receptions in Weeks 7-8 set a franchise record for the most combined catches over a two-game span...Now holds two of the top six single-game catch totals in franchise history, joining Hutson as the only players in team

annals to do so...Came out of the backfield to catch a swing pass from Rodgers for a 22-yard gain late in the first quarter, making S Keanu Neal miss as he took it down the sideline to the Atlanta 24.

### 81 Geronimo Allison, WR, Rookie, Illinois

- Was signed by Green Bay as an undrafted free agent on May 6, 2016, and was released in the final roster reduction at the end of the preseason.
- Caught six passes for 119 yards (19.8 avg.) in the preseason, highlighted by a 51-yard grab.
- Played two seasons at Illinois after starting his career at Iowa Western Community College, finishing with 106 receptions for 1,480 yards (14.0 avg.) and eight TDs with the Fighting Illini.
- **2016 SEASON:** Has played in one game and has two catches for 21 yards (10.5 avg.) and a TD...Has signed to the 53-man roster from the practice squad on Oct. 24...Spent the first six games on Green Bay's practice squad.
- ▶At Atlanta (Oct. 30): Made his NFL debut, catching two passes for 21 yards (10.5 avg.) and a TD in 19 snaps of action...Scored a TD on his first career catch, hauling in a 4-yard pass from QB Aaron Rodgers early in the second quarter to put the Packers up, 14-10...Made a move to separate himself from S Ricardo Allen as Rodgers stepped up in the pocket and found him for the score...Became the first Packer since TE Ryan Taylor (Dec. 11, 2011) to register a TD on his first career reception...Teamed up with WR Trevor Davis as they became the first Green Bay rookie duo to both catch a TD pass in the same game since Joe Johnson and Max McGee on Dec. 12, 1954, at the Los Angeles Rams.

#### 69 David Bakhtiari, T, 4th Year, Colorado

- Started all 46 games he played in at left tackle for the Packers in his first three seasons in the league and was named a Pro Bowl alternate in 2014.
- In 2013, became the first rookie to start every game at LT for Green Bay since the league went to a 16-game schedule in 1978.
- By starting at San Francisco in the 2013 season opener, he became just the fourth Green Bay rookie to start at LT in Week 1 since the 1970 AFL-NFL merger and the first since Ken Ruettgers in 1985.
- **2016 SEASON:** Has started all seven games at LT...Part of a line that has helped the Packers rank No. 1 in third-down conversions (51.6 percent). tied for No. 9 in the NFL in sacks allowed (14), and No. 6 in time of possession (31:33).
- ►At Jacksonville (Sept. 11): Started at LT and played all 64 snaps... Helped protect QB Aaron Rodgers as he was sacked just one time on the afternoon and as he threw for 199 yards and two TDs on 20-of-34 passing with a rushing TD.
- ▶ At Minnesota (Sept. 18): Started at LT and played all 71 snaps.
- ▶Vs. Detroit (Sept. 25): Started at LT and played all 54 snaps, helping to clear the way for RB Eddie Lacy's season-high 103 yards rushing on just 17 carries (6.1 avg.)...Also protected Rodgers as he threw a season-high four TD passes, with all of them coming in the first half.
- ►Vs. N.Y. - ▶At Atlanta (Oct. 30): Started at LT and played all 62 snaps, helping

protect Rodgers as he threw for 246 yards and four TDs on 28-of-38 passing...Helped the offense rack up 108 rushing yards on 19 carries (5.7 avg.).

### 67 Don Barclay, T/G, 5th Year, West Virginia

- Played in all 16 games last season with five starts, opening four contests at right tackle (Weeks 2-4, 13) and one at left tackle (Week 16).
- Missed the entire 2014 campaign after sustaining a season-ending knee injury in practice early in training camp.

- Enjoyed a career year as a junior in 2014 when he started all 14 games and registered career highs in tackles (86), solo tackles (65), sacks (four) and forced fumbles (four).
- **2016 SEASON:** Has played in all seven games, seeing time on defense and special teams...Has registered two solo tackles on defense and three tackles on special teams (No. 4 on the team).
- ►At Jacksonville (Sept. 11): Played 18 snaps on special teams and nine on defense in his NFL debut.
- ► At Minnesota (Sept. 18): Appeared on a team-high 20 plays on special teams and also played nine snaps on defense.

- Made 32 catches of 25-plus yards since '11, which was tied for No. 3 in the league among TEs over that time period behind only Gronkowski (49) and Graham (41).
- **2016 SEASON:** Has played in three games with two starts and has caught six passes for 53 yards (8.8 avg.)...Has missed three games (Weeks 5-7) due to an ankle injury.

## 27 Eddie Lacy, RB, 4th Year, Alabama

- With 3,075 rushing yards from 2013-15, joined RB John Brockington (3,276, 1971-73) as the only two players in franchise history to rush for 3,000-plus yards in their first three seasons in the NFL.
- Was one of only two NFL players (Bills RB LeSean McCoy) to have three or more 100-yard rushing games each season from 2013-15.
- With 1,178 rushing yards in 2013 and 1,139 in 2014, became just the fifth player in franchise history to register back-to-back 1,000-yard rushing seasons.
- **2016 SEASON:** Started all five games he has appeared in and leads the team with 360 rushing yards on 71 carries (5.1 avg.)...Has registered 10 runs of 10-plus yards and also has four receptions for 28 yards (7.0 avg.)...Was placed on injured reserve (ankle) on Oct. 20.
- ►At Jacksonville (Sept. 11): Led the team with 61 rushing yards on 14 attempts (4.4 avg.), highlighted by a 28-yard run late in the third quarter...Took the handoff to the right side, first cutting left before cutting right at the second level as he made S Tashaun Gipson miss as he took the ball to the Jacksonville 17, a run that would help set up K Mason Crosby's 20-yard FG...Added a 17-yard catch on a screen pass in the second quarter, bouncing off a tackle attempt by S Johnathan Cyprien and then diving over Gipson at the end of the play.
- ►At Minnesota (Sept. 18): Posted a team-high 50 yards rushing on 12 carries (4.2 avg.)...Had two runs of 10-plus yards, a 13-yarder up the middle in the fourth quarter and a 12-yard gain off the left end in the third quarter.
- ▶Vs. Detroit (Sept. 25): Led the team with 103 rushing yards on just

- 17 carries (6.1 avg.), the 11th 100-yard rushing game of his career as he moved past RB Dorsey Levens (10) for sole possession of the No. 5 spot in team history...Rushed for a season-high five first downs, highlighted by a 25-yard run in the second quarter that he took up the middle and then bounced out down the right sideline for the big gain.
- ▶Vs. N.Y. Giants (Oct. 9): Led the team with 81 yards rushing on just 11 carries (7.4 avg.), exiting the game in the third quarter due to an ankle injury...Rushed for 77 yards in the first half, the second-best mark in his career in a first half behind only his 84-yard effort at Tampa Bay on Dec. 21, 2014...His average of 7.4 yards per carry was the second best of his career in a game with 10-plus carries behind only his 8.1 yard average vs. Minnesota on Oct. 2, 2014 (13 carries for 105 yards)...Posted a seasonlong 31-yard run midway through the second quarter, initially taking the run outside before cutting inside and then bouncing it out again, making S Andrew Adams miss at the second level as he took it down the sideline to the New York 49.
- ▶Vs. Dallas (Oct. 16): Playing through an ankle injury, led the team with 65 yards on 17 carries (3.8 avg.), including a 25-yard run to the Dallas 28 midway through the first quarter...Took the carry off of right end, hurdling S Byron Jones toward the end of the run for extra yardage... It marked his third straight game with a carry of 25-plus yards, the first Packer to accomplish that feat in a single season since RB Ryan Grant in 2007 (Weeks 12-14).

## 70 T.J. Lang, G, 8th Year, Eastern Michigan

- Has started 86 games over the past five-plus seasons (2011-16), the most by any Green Bay player on the offensive side of the ball over that span.
- Opened all 15 contests he played in at RG in 2015 and was named a Pro Bowl alternate for the second straight season.
- Has started 88 games during his career, opening contests at four different positions (54 at RG, 27 at LG, five at RT, two at LT).
- **2016 SEASON:** Has started all seven games at RG...Part of a line that has helped the Packers rank No. 1 in third-down conversions (51.6 percent), tied for No. 9 in the NFL in sacks allowed (14), and No. 6 in time of possession (31:33).
- ►At Jacksonville (Sept. 11): Started at RG and played all 64 snaps... Helped protect QB Aaron Rodgers as he was sacked just one time on the afternoon and as he threw for 199 yards and two TDs on 20-of-34 passing with a rushing TD.
- ►At Minnesota (Sept. 18): Started at RG and played 70 of 71 snaps, coming off the field for one play in the third quarter when his shoe fell off. ►Vs. Detroit (Sept. 25): Started at RG and played all 54 snaps, helping to clear the way for RB Eddie Lacy's season-high 103 yards rushing on just 17 carries (6.1 avg.)...Also protected Rodgers as he threw a season-high four TD passes, with all of them coming in the first half.
- ▶Vs. N.Y. Giants (Oct. 9): Started at RG and played all 80 snaps, helping the offense record season bests for total yards (406), rushing yards (147), first downs (23) and time of possession (36:38)...Part of a line that did not allow a sack of Rodgers and helped clear the way for Lacy's 81 rushing yards on just 11 carries (7.4 avg.).
- ▶Vs. Dallas (Oct. 16): Started at RG and played all 70 snaps, helping the offense post season highs for total first downs (24) and passing first downs (17)...Protected Rodgers as he completed 31 of 42 passes for 294 yards and a TD with one INT and was sacked just once on the afternoon.
- ▶Vs. Chicago (Oct. 20): Started at RG and appeared on 71 of 87 plays, missing the first two series of the second half due to a hip injury...Helped the offense record 406 total yards (tied for the season high) and a 39:36 time of possession, the best mark by Green Bay since Oct. 27, 2013, at Minnesota (40:54)...Protected Rodgers as he completed a franchise-record 39 passes, including 10-plus passes to three different players (WRs Davante Adams, Randall Cobb and Ty Montgomery), only the second time in NFL history (New England Patriots, Nov. 13, 1994) that a team has accomplished that feat in a game.
- ▶At Atlanta (Oct. 30): Started at RG and played 59 of 62 snaps, departing the game briefly in the fourth quarter due to injury...Part of a line that protected Rodgers as he threw for 246 yards and four TDs on 28-of-38 passing...Helped the offense rack up 108 rushing yards on 19 carries (5.7 avg.).

#### 94 Dean Lowry, DE, Rookie, Northwestern

- Earned second-team All-Big Ten honors as a senior in 2015 after posting 46 tackles (27 solo), including 13½ tackles for a loss (second on the team), three sacks, an interception, a fumble recovery and seven passes defensed.
- Set a school single-game record and tied the sixth-best mark in conference history with six tackles for a loss in Northwestern's win at Nebraska in 2015.
- Was an honorable mention All-Big Ten choice as a junior in 2014 after recording 41 tackles (25 solo), including eight tackles for a loss, four sacks, a forced fumble and eight passes defensed.
- 2016 SEASON: Has played in all seven games, seeing limited action on defense and special teams...Has registered three tackles (two solo) and a tackle for a loss on defense along with three QB pressures and a QB hit.
- ► At Jacksonville (Sept. 11): Appeared on seven defensive plays in his NFL debut.
- ▶At Minnesota (Sept. 18): Appeared on six plays on defense.
- ►Vs. Detroit (Sept. 25): Played 11 snaps on defense and six on special teams...Shed a block from LT Taylor Decker to stop RB Theo Riddick for a 1-yard loss on a second-quarter run...Finished with two tackles (both solo).
- ►Vs. N.Y. Giants (Oct. 9): Played eight snaps on defense, posting an assisted tackle and two QB pressures.
- ►Vs. Dallas (Oct. 16): Appeared on three plays on defense and one on special teams.
- ►Vs. Chicago (Oct. 20): Played four snaps on defense, recording a QB pressure and a QB hit.
- ▶ At Atlanta (Oct. 30): Appeared on two plays on defense.

### 50 Blake Martinez, LB, Rookie, Stanford

- Finished his collegiate career with 257 tackles (137 solo), 13½ tackles for a loss, 6½ sacks, five interceptions and five forced fumbles in 51 games played. Led the team in tackles as a junior (102) and senior (141).
- Led the Pacific-12 and ranked seventh nationally with 141 tackles (75 solo) as a senior, averaging a conference-best 10.1 tackles per game. Recorded 84 more tackles than the No. 2 tackler on the team.
- In 2015, was named third-team All-America by *The Associated Press*, second-team All-America by *USA Today* and *Phil Steele's College Football*, and first-team All-Pac-12 by *AP* and *Phil Steele's College Football*.
- **2016 SEASON:** Has played in all seven games with six starts at ILB and ranks No. 4 on the team with 38 tackles (26 solo), a tackle for a loss, an interception and three passes defensed...Part of a run defense that ranks No. 2 in the league in rushing yards allowed per game (74.4) and No. 3 in yards allowed per carry (3.34 avg.) and runs of 10-plus yards allowed (14)...Has registered three tackles on special teams.
- ►At Jacksonville (Sept. 11): Started and played 47 snaps, becoming the first Green Bay rookie to start on defense in Week 1 since LB Nick Perry in 2012...Was tied for the team lead with nine tackles (five solo) and added a tackle on special teams...Helped limit the Jaguars to just 48 yards rushing on 26 carries (1.8 avg.), the first time they had rushed for 48 or fewer yards on 25-plus attempts since Nov. 14, 1999 (vs. Baltimore, 47 yards on 26 attempts).
- ►At Minnesota (Sept. 18): Started and played 41 snaps, recording six tackles (five solo) and a pass defensed...Tackled RB Matt Asiata for a 2-yard loss on a run late in the fourth quarter...Helped limit RB Adrian Peterson to just 19 yards on 12 carries (1.6 avg.), tied for the fourth-lowest yardage total of Peterson's career, with a long of 5 yards.

►At Atlanta (Oct. 30): Started and played 41 snaps, posting five tackles (four solo) and a pass defensed...Got his left hand to break up QB Matt Ryan's short pass over the middle intended for TE Levine Toilolo early in the third quarter...Added a tackle on special teams.

## 52 Clay Matthews, LB, 8th Year, Southern California

- Ranks No. 2 in franchise history with 70.5 career sacks, trailing only DE Kabeer Gbaja-Biamila (74.5).
- Has earned six Pro Bowl selections in his seven-year career, two more than any Packers linebacker and tied with DE Reggie White for the secondmost selections by a defensive player in team history, trailing only S Willie Wood (eight).
- Became the first player in franchise history to earn Pro Bowl recognition in each of his first four seasons in the league (2009-12).
- Is tied for No. 1 in franchise history (since 1982) with four 10-sack seasons (White and Gbaja-Biamila).
- **2016 SEASON:** Has started all five games he has played in (four at OLB, one at ILB) and ranks No. 3 on the team with three sacks...Has registered 16 tackles (13 solo), four tackles for a loss, nine QB hits (No. 2 on the team) and six pressures (tied for No. 2)...Has been sidelined for two games (Weeks 3 and 8) due to injury...Part of a run defense that ranks No. 2 in the league in rushing yards allowed per game (74.4) and No. 3 in yards allowed per carry (3.34 avg.) and runs of 10-plus yards allowed (14).
- ►At Jacksonville (Sept. 11): Started at LOLB and played 53 snaps, finishing with four tackles (three solo), a sack, a QB pressure and a QB hit...Came from the right side to beat LT Kelvin Beachum for a 10-yard sack of QB Blake Bortles on third-and-2 midway through the first quarter...The sack gave him 68.5 for his career as he moved into a tie with White for No. 2 on the all-time franchise list (since 1982)...Added a tackle for a loss later in the first quarter, powering his way into the backfield to bring down RB T.J. Yeldon for a 7-vard loss.
- ►At Minnesota (Sept. 18): Started at ROLB and played 38 snaps, finishing with three tackles (all solo) a sack, three QB pressures and two QB hits...On a third-and-2 early in the third quarter, fought off a block from T Matt Kalil to sack QB Sam Bradford for a 7-yard loss and force a Minnesota punt.
- ►Vs. Detroit (Sept. 25): Inactive (ankle/hamstring), snapping a streak of 34 straight games played in the regular season.
- ▶Vs. N.Y. Giants (Oct. 9): Returned to action, starting at ROLB and posting three tackles (all solo), a sack, a pressure and three QB hits...Early in the third quarter, fought off a block from LT Ereck Flowers to bring down QB Eli Manning for a 3-yard sack, the first time Matthews has started a season with a sack in each of his first three games played.
- ▶Vs. Dallas (Oct. 16): Started the game as the lone ILB and played 45 snaps on the afternoon, finishing with two tackles (one solo).
- ►Vs. Chicago (Oct. 20): Started at ROLB and played 27 snaps, recording four tackles (three solo), a team-high three QB hits and a pressure.
- ► At Atlanta (Oct. 30): Inactive (hamstring).

## 88 Ty Montgomery, WR, 2nd Year, Stanford

- Played in six games with three starts as a rookie in 2015 before an ankle injury that he sustained in Week 6 vs. San Diego would sideline him for the remainder of the season.
- Caught 15 passes for 136 yards (9.1 avg.) and two TDs and posted a 31.1-yard average on seven kickoff returns last season.
- Finished his career at Stanford as the school's all-time leader in kickoff return yards with 2,493, besting Chris Owusu's mark of 2,132 yards from 2008-11.
- **2016 SEASON:** Has played in six games with one start (at RB), seeing time on offense and special teams...Has 20 catches for 164 yards (8.2 avg.), 14 carries for 66 yards (4.7 avg.) and has returned six kickoffs for 147 yards (24.5 avg.)...Has posted a tackle on special teams.
- ►At Jacksonville (Sept. 11): Played 11 snaps on offense and 14 on special teams, returning one kickoff for 14 yards.

- ►At Minnesota (Sept. 18): Midway through the first quarter, partially blocked Jeff Locke's punt as the ball traveled just 3 yards to the Green Bay 46, giving the Packers their best field position of the evening to help set up their first score of the game (1-yard TD pass from QB Aaron Rodgers to WR Jordy Nelson)...Had one kickoff return for 21 yards.
- ▶Vs. Detroit (Sept. 25): Had a 24-yard kickoff return and provided the offense with good field position because of his decision on another return late in the first quarter...With P Sam Martin's kickoff bouncing near the sideline inside the 5-yard line, got his feet out of bounds and extended his body to fall on the ball at the 3-yard line, giving the Packers possession at their 40-yard line since the ball is considered out of bounds according to the rule book...Added a tackle on special teams.
- ▶Vs. N.Y. Giants (Oct. 9): Had one kickoff return for 24 yards.
- ▶Vs. Dallas (Oct. 16): Played 35 snaps on offense and registered a career-high 10 catches for a career-best 98 yards (9.8 avg.), with six of the catches going for first downs...His catch total was the best by a Packer on the season...Also had 6 rushing yards on three carries (2.0 avg.) and two kickoff returns for 64 yards (32.0 avg.), highlighted by a season-long 40-yard return in the fourth quarter
- ▶Vs. Chicago (Oct. 20): With injuries to RBs Eddie Lacy (ankle/injured reserve) and James Starks (knee), made his first pro start at RB, finishing with 10 catches for 66 yards (6.6 avg.) and a career-high 60 yards rushing on nine carries (6.7 avg.)...Became just the third player in team history to register back-to-back games with 10-plus catches in a single season, joining WRs Sterling Sharpe (1993) and Don Hutson (1942)...Became the first Packer to register 60-plus rushing yards and 60-plus receiving yards since RB Ahman Green at Detroit on Sept. 24, 2006...Had a career-long 30-yard run up the middle on the first play of Green Bay's second drive of the second half, helping to kick-start a 13-play, 85-yard TD drive, one of three straight TD drives for the Packers.
- ►At Atlanta (Oct. 30): Inactive (illness).

### 68 Kyle Murphy, T, Rookie, Stanford

- Played in 54 games with 34 starts in four years at Stanford. Named thirdteam All-America by *Phil Steele's College Football* as a senior after serving as a team captain and starting all 14 games at left tackle.
- Started all 13 games at right tackle as a junior and was selected secondteam All-Pacific-12 by *Phil Steele's College Football*.
- Played in 14 games with two starts in 2012, joining G Joshua Garnett as the first true freshmen offensive linemen to start at Stanford since 2000.
- **2016 SEASON:** Dressed but did not play in one game and has been inactive for the other six contests (healthy scratch).
- ►At Atlanta (Oct. 30): Was on the 46-man gameday roster for the first time in his career, but did not see any action.

### 87 Jordy Nelson, WR, 9th Year, Kansas State

- One of just two players in franchise history (WR Sterling Sharpe, 1989 and 1992) to register two seasons with 85-plus receptions and 1,300-plus receiving yards, having done it in 2011 and 2014.
- Eclipsed the 1,000-yard receiving mark three times over a four-year span (2011, 2013-14).
- Ranks tied for No. 6 in franchise history in receptions (431), No. 8 in receiving yards (6,524) and No. 5 in TD receptions (55).
- Set a single-season franchise record with 1,519 receiving yards in 2014, topping WR Robert Brooks' mark of 1,497 yards in 1995, on the way to being selected to his first career Pro Bowl and earning second-team All-Pro honors from *The Associated Press*.
- Ranked No. 4 in the NFL and No. 2 among wide receivers (Dez Bryant, 50) with 43 TD catches from 2011-14.
- **2016 SEASON:** Has started all seven games and has caught 31 passes for 415 yards (13.4 avg.) and six TDs...Is tied for No. 1 in the league in TD catches...Posted five TD receptions in the first four games, tied for the fourth most in franchise history behind only Don Hutson (seven in 1942, six in 1945) and Bob Mann (six in 1951).
- ► At Jacksonville (Sept. 11): After missing the entire 2015 season due to a knee injury, returned to the starting lineup and played 54 snaps, tying for the team lead with six catches for 32 yards (5.3 avg.) and a TD...The

- TD catch was the 50th of his career and came with just over three minutes remaining in the first half to give the Packers a 14-10 lead as he found an opening in the middle of the end zone.
- ▶At Minnesota (Sept. 18): Started and played 68 of 71 snaps, pacing the team with 73 yards receiving and a TD on five catches (14.6 avg.)... Caught a 1-yard TD pass from QB Aaron Rodgers in the first quarter, moving him into sole possession of the No. 6 spot in team history with 51 TD catches...It marked the third time in his career that he had caught at least one TD pass in both of the first two games (also 2011 and 2013)... Made a leaping 39-yard catch down to the Minnesota 4 early in the fourth quarter over CB Trae Waynes that helped set up Rodgers' 10-yard TD run three plays later...Also had a 21-yard grab in the second quarter, hauling in a quick pass over Waynes before taking it down the sideline to the Minnesota 48.
- ▶Vs. Detroit (Sept. 25): Started and played 49 of 54 snaps, leading the team with six catches for 101 yards (16.8 avg.) and two TDs, with all of his receptions coming in the first half...It marked the third time in his career that he had posted 100-plus receiving yards in a first half (Weeks 10-11 in 2014)...Joined WR James Jones as the only Packers over the past 15 sesaons (2002-16) to register at least one TD grab in each of the first three games of the season...On his first TD, an 8-yard grab late in the first quarter, came out of the slot and went to the middle of the end zone before moving to his right to find an opening for a scrambling Rodgers to get him the ball...Helped set up the score with a 49-yard catch, the longest reception by a Packer in the first three games, as he beat LB Thurston Armbrister over the middle to make a leaping grab in stride before taking it down the sideline to the Detroit 11...Late in the first half, beat CB Darius Slav down the right sideline to catch a perfectly thrown ball from Rodgers over his shoulder for the 17-vard score...His two TD catches gave him 53 for his career, moving him into a tie with WR Greg Jennings for the No. 5 spot in franchise history.
- ▶Vs. N.Y. Giants (Oct. 9): Started and played 72 of 80 snaps, finishing with four receptions for 38 yards (9.5 avg.) and a TD with all four catches going for first downs...On Green Bay's opening drive, freed himself from the coverage of CB Eli Apple in the end zone to make a diving grab for a 2-yard TD, making him the first Packer to catch a TD pass in each of the team's first four games since WR Bill Schroeder in 2001.
- ▶Vs. Dallas (Oct. 16): Started and played 64 of 70 snaps...Caught five passes for 68 yards (13.6 avg.), including a 25-yard reception midway through the fourth quarter to help set up a 6-yard TD pass from Rodgers to WR Randall Cobb two plays later...Beat CB Anthony Brown down the sideline on the play to make a leaping grab down to the Dallas 11.
- ▶Vs. Chicago (Oct. 20): Started and played 83 of 87 snaps, finishing with one catch for 9 yards...Drew a 44-yard pass-interference penalty on S Adrian Amos on a deep ball down the middle of the field to the Chicago 20. ▶At Atlanta (Oct. 30): Led the team with 94 yards receiving and a TD on four catches (23.5 avg.), highlighted by his season-long 58-yard reception in the first quarter...Came from the slot and got past S Keanu Neal to catch a perfectly placed ball from Rodgers near the Atlanta 30 before taking it down the sideline to the 7-yard line...Two plays later, found an opening between LB De'Vondre Campbell and CB Brian Poole to catch a 5-yard TD pass over the middle.

### 64 Mike Pennel, DT, 3rd Year, Colorado State-Pueblo

- Played in all 16 games with five starts in 2015 and posted 35 tackles (22 solo), a sack, a forced fumble, three QB hits and four pressures.
- Made the team as a rookie free agent and played in 13 games in 2014. One of two undrafted rookie free agents to be on the Packers' 53-man roster for Week 1 (LB Jayrone Elliott).
- **2016 SEASON:** Has played in three games and has registered five tackles (one solo), including a tackle for a loss, and a pass defensed...Was on reserve/suspended for the first four games of the season.
- ►Vs. Dallas (Oct. 16): Played 13 snaps on defense in his season debut, recording two tackles (one solo), including a tackle for a loss when he stopped RB Ezekiel Elliott for a 3-yard loss on a fourth-quarter run.
- ▶Vs. Chicago (Oct. 20): Appeared on 11 plays on defense, recording two tackles (both assisted) and a pass defensed...Batted down a QB Matt Barkley pass intended for WR Alshon Jeffery over the middle early in the

fourth quarter.

►At Atlanta (Oct. 30): Played 13 snaps on defense and posted an assisted tackle.

### 56 Julius Peppers, LB, 15th Year, North Carolina

- Has been selected to the Pro Bowl nine times during his career, including last season (2004-06, 2008-12, 2015), and has been named first-team All-Pro by *The Associated Press* three times (2004, 2006, 2010). Was named to the NFL's All-Decade Team for the 2000s.
- Has played in 225 games with 219 starts as a pro, appearing in all 16 contests in 12 of his first 14 seasons in the NFL. Has missed just two games due to injury during his career.
- Is the only player in NFL history with 100-plus sacks (139.5) and 10-plus interceptions (11).
- Since entering the NFL in 2002, ranks No. 1 in the league in sacks (139.5) and No. 3 in forced fumbles (46). His career sack total ranks No. 6 in NFL history (since 1982).
- **2016 SEASON:** Has played in all seven games with three starts and ranks No. 2 on the team with 3.5 sacks...Has posted nine tackles (six solo), three tackles for a loss, a forced fumble, six QB hits and six pressures.
- ►At Jacksonville (Sept. 11): Played 29 snaps and posted an assisted tackle
- ►At Minnesota (Sept. 18): Led the team with 1.5 sacks, moving into a tie for No. 7 in NFL history with Dent and Randle (137.5 sacks)...Midway through the second quarter, fought off a block from T Andre Smith to bring down QB Sam Bradford for a 7-yard sack and force a three-and-out... Shared a 9-yard sack with LB Nick Perry on a third-and-11 in the fourth quarter, knocking back Smith on his way to the 9-yard sack of Bradford.
- ►Vs. Detroit (Sept. 25): Started at LOLB with LB Clay Matthews sidelined (ankle/hamstring) and appeared on 32 plays...Posted two tackles (one solo) and a QB pressure.
- ►Vs. N.Y. Giants (Oct. 9): Appeared on 23 defensive plays and recorded a solo tackle, a pressure and a pass defensed...Walked back G John Jerry late in the third quarter and batted down a QB Eli Manning pass.
- ▶Vs. ## 99 Christian Ringo, DT, 1st Year, Louisiana-Lafayette

- Started all 13 games as a senior in 2014, anchoring a defensive line that helped the Ragin' Cajuns lead the Sun Belt in rushing defense while ranking third in sacks.
- Was named the state's Defensive Player of the Year by the Louisiana Sports Writers Association after ranking seventh in the nation in tackles for loss (20) and 12th in the country in sacks (11½). His 11½ sacks tied the school single-season record and he also finished tied for No. 1 in school history with 21.0 career sacks.

- Has posted five seasons (2009, 2011-12, 2014-15) with 500-plus passing attempts and eight or fewer INTs, the most in NFL history ahead of Patriots QB Tom Brady (three seasons) and five QBs (one season each).
- Was named the league's Most Valuable Player by *The Associated Press* in 2014 for the second time in his career (2011), becoming the eighth player in league history to win the honor multiple times.
- Is the only quarterback in league history to record a 100-plus passer rating in six consecutive seasons (2009-14), with no other QB doing so in more than four straight years.
- Is one of only eight quarterbacks in NFL annals with 30,000-plus passing yards and 2,000-plus rushing yards.
- In 126 career regular-season starts (84-42 record), has posted 44 games with 300-plus passing yards, 73 without an interception (min. 15 attempts) and 69 with a 100-plus passer rating.
- Has been selected to the Pro Bowl in five of the last seven seasons (2009, 2011-12, 2014-15).
- **2016 SEASON:** Has completed 176 of 275 passes (64.0 percent) for 1,742 yards and 17 TDs with four INTs for a 96.4 passer rating...Is tied for No. 3 in the league in TD passes and ranks No. 4 in TD percentage (6.2)...

Has rushed for 156 yards and two TDs on 28 carries (5.6 avg.), good for No. 5 among QBs in rushing yards per game (22.3 avg.).

▶ At Jacksonville (Sept. 11): Threw for 199 yards and two TDs on 20-of-34 passing for a 95.1 passer rating...Added a 6-yard rushing TD on Green Bay's opening possession, giving him 11 games with two-plus passing TDs and one-plus rushing TDs since 2008, second most over that span behind only Panthers QB Cam Newton...His TD passes came on back-to-back drives late in the first half...Connected with WR Jordy Nelson for a 6-yard TD pass with just over three minutes remaining in the first half, buying time in the pocket before moving to his right to find Nelson in the middle of the end zone...With CB Jalen Ramsey attempting to pull him down by the back of his jersey, threw a perfectly placed 29-yard TD pass to WR Davante Adams over CB Davon House in the end zone with 13 seconds remaining in the half.

Chicago (Oct. 20): Set a single-game franchise record with 39 completions, eclipsing the previous high of 36 by Favre at Chicago on Dec. 5, 1993...Posted a season-high 326 passing yards on 39-of-56 passing with three TDs and no INTs for a 102.2 rating, with all three TD passes coming in the second half...Completed 10-plus passes to three different receivers (Adams, 13; Randall Cobb, 11; Ty Montgomery, 10), becoming just the second QB in NFL history (Patriots QB Drew Bledsoe, Nov. 13, 1994) to accomplish that feat in a regular-season game...Posted a 127.9 passer rating on third down, completing 10 of 13 passes for 69 yards and two TDs

▶At Atlanta (Oct. 30): Threw for 246 yards and four TDs with no INTs on 28-of-38 passing for a 125.5 passer rating...It marked his 18th career game with four-plus TD passes as he moved past Johnny Unitas (17) for No. 6 on the all-time list...All four of his TD passes came to different players, with three of the players (WRs Jeff Janis, Trevor Davis and Geronimo Allison) recording the first regular-season TD catches of their career... Connected with Nelson on a season-long 58-yard pass on Green Bay's opening drive, hitting him perfectly in stride as Nelson took it down the sideline to the Atlanta 7...Posted a career-high 60 rushing yards on just six carries (10.0 avg.), including a 23-yard scamper down the sideline at the end of the first half out to the Green Bay 48 to help set up K Mason Crosby's 29-yard FG as time expired...Dating back to 1960, his rushing total was the second-best mark by a Green Bay QB behind only Don Majkowski's 88-yard outing at Detroit on Sept. 30, 1990...Tied his career

high with three runs of 10-plus yards (23, 13, 11)...Joined Panthers QB Cam Newton (Dec. 20, 2015, at N.Y. Giants) as the only QBs over the past four seasons (2013-16) to register four-plus passing TDs and 60-plus rushing yards in a game.

## 82 Richard Rodgers, TE, 3rd Year, California

- Had 58 receptions in 2015, becoming just the fourth TE in team history to record 55-plus receptions in a season (Paul Coffman, Jermichael Finley, Jackie Harris).
- Was one of only four TEs in the NFL last season to register 55-plus catches, 500-plus receiving yards and eight or more TD receptions (Rob Gronkowski, Jordan Reed, Gary Barnidge).
- Registered 10 TD catches in 2014-15, tied for the most by a Green Bay TE in his first two seasons since the 1970 AFL-NFL merger (Bubba Franks, 2000-01). His eight TD receptions in '15 were tied for the fifth most in a season by a Packers TE.
- Set a single-game franchise record for tight ends with 146 receiving yards last season at Detroit in Week 13, highlighted by his game-winning 61-yard TD catch on the final play of the game.

**2016 SEASON:** Has played in all seven games with three starts and has nine catches for 84 yards (9.3 avg.) and a TD.

►At Jacksonville (Sept. 11): Appeared on 25 plays on offense and made 22-yard catch in the third quarter to the Jacksonville 8 that helped set up K Mason Crosby's 25-yard FG...Was covered by S Johnathan Cyprien on the play, extending his arms out to make a diving grab near the sideline.
