2016 SCHEDULE NOTES

The Steelers have won each of their first two primetime games in 2016, a Kickoff Weekend Monday Night Football victory at the Washington Redskins (38-16) and a Week Four Sunday Night Football win vs. Kansas City at Heinz Field (43-14).

The Steelers will appear in their eighth Thanksgiving Day game in team history in Week 12 (Nov. 24) at the Indianapolis Colts (NBC, 8:30 p.m.). Pittsburgh's fourth nationally televised primetime contest occurs at the Cincinnati Bengals in Week 15 on Sunday Night Football, Dec. 18 (NBC, 8:30 p.m.).

Pittsburgh will host the Baltimore Ravens in Week 16 (NFL Network, 4:30 p.m.) on Dec. 25 to mark the first Christmas Day game in franchise history.

COLOR RUSH ON CHRISTMAS DAY

Pittsburgh will debut its 'color rush' uniforms on Christmas Day when the team hosts the Baltimore Ravens at Heinz Field. Steelers President **Art Rooney II** announced during halftime of the team's first preseason game on KDKA-TV that the team's 'color rush' uniforms will be all black with gold numbers.

1934 THROWBACKS IN WEEK 5

The Steelers wore their 1934 throwback uniforms in Week Five against the New York Jets at Heinz Field.

This marked the fifth straight season Pittsburgh donned their 1934 throwback uniforms and the last occasion.

The team first wore these in 2012 during the team's 80th season in professional football.

2016 DRAFT CLASS

CB Artie Burns (1st round, 25th overall): Started 23-of-36 games played at Miami and finished his Hurricane career with 93 tackles, 14 pass breakups, seven interceptions, one forced fumble and a fumble recovery....led the Atlantic Coast Conference with six interceptions in 2015, the most by a Hurricane since 2003 (Sean Taylor, 10), en route to earning All-ACC second-team honors.

S Sean Davis (2nd round, 58th overall): Started 40-of-50 games played at Maryland and finished his Terrapin career with 318 tackles...led the Maryland defense with 70 solo tackles in 2015 (second with 88 combined stops), to go along with five forced fumbles (second in the nation) and three interceptions.

DT Javon Hargrave (3rd round, 89th overall): A a two-time SBN Sports Mel Blount Defensive Player of the Year and Defensive Player of the Year in the Mid-Eastern Athletic Conference at South Carolina State in 2014-15....totaled 37.0 sacks, including 10.0 or more in each of his final two campaigns.

LB Tyler Matakevich (7th round, 246th overall): The Temple all-time leading tackler with 493 stops, became the first school defensive player to earn first-team All-America honors and the first at any position since 1986 (Paul Palmer)...was the only player in the FBS to lead his team in tackles in every game in 2015, and became just the seventh player in NCAA history to eclipse the 100-tackle plateau in four seasons.

HEAD COACH MIKE TOMLIN

- Is now 96-55 during the regular season (56-20 at home).
- Is 2-5 as the Steelers' head coach in regular-season games vs. New England.

QB LANDRY JONES

- Made his third career start, finishing 29-of-47 for 281 yards with one touchdown and one interception.
- Established single game career highs in completions (29), attempts (47) and passing yards (281).
- Set a career high for passing yards in any half of a game with 179 in the opening half, surpassing his previous mark of 168 (Oct. 18, 2015 vs. Arizona, second half).

WR ANTONIO BROWN

- Totaled a game-high 106 receiving yards on seven catches, his third 100-yard game of the season.
- Extended his consecutive regular-season games started streak to 43 the third-longest active consecutive games started streak among NFL wide receivers.
- Has registered at least one reception in 96 consecutive games in which he has played, including the postseason dating back to October 3, 2010.
- Has registered at least one reception in 91 consecutive regular-season games dating back to October 3, 2010.
- Recorded his 28th career 100-yard receiving game the second-most such games in Steelers history (Hines Ward, 29).
- Posted at least 100 receiving yards for the second time in his NFL career vs. New England (133: Sept. 10, 2015 at New England).
- Caught a 51-yard pass in the second quarter to mark his longest reception of the season.

WR DARRIUS HEYWARD-BEY

- Tallied three catches for 30 yards, including a 14-yard touchdown pass in the second quarter. It was his third score of 2016, and increasing his career total to 17 touchdowns (16 receiving / 1 rushing).
- Along with his 60-yard touchdown run in Week Six, has recorded a touchdown in back-to-back games for the first time in his NFL career.

WR COBI HAMILTON

 Caught a career-high three catches and matched a career-best 36 receiving yards (Oct. 16, 2016 at Miami).

• Extended his consecutive regular season games started streak to 53 – the fifth-longest active consecutive games played streak among NFL safeties.

LB JARVIS JONES

- Totaled seven tackles (five solo), a stop for a loss, quarterback hit.

THE LAST TIME VS. BALTIMORE

Baltimore 20, Pittsburgh 17 Dec. 27, 2015 M&T Bank Stadium (71,261)

BALTIMORE – The Ravens stopped the Steelers on a fourth-down attempt late in the fourth quarter to seal the 20-17 victory at M&T Bank Stadium.

Baltimore scored on its first drive of the game as QB Ryan Mallett threw an eight-yard touchdown to WR Chris Matthews. Pittsburgh cut into the lead early in the second quarter on **K Chris Boswell**'s 34-yard field goal.

Ravens' K Justin Tucker made two second quarter field goals, one from 37 yards and one from 50 yards, to give Baltimore a 13-3 lead at halftime.

RB DeAngelo Williams scored on a one-yard run early in the fourth quarter to cut the lead to 13-10. Early in the fourth quarter, RB Javorius Allen extended the Ravens' lead to 20-10 on his three-yard touchdown run.

Midway through the fourth quarter, Williams scored his second touchdown of the game on a two-yard run. The Steelers' defense forced the Ravens to punt on their next possession.

Pittsburgh took over at its own 20-yard line. On fourthand-15, **QB Ben Roethlisberger**'s pass to **WR Markus Wheaton** fell incomplete, securing victory for the Ravens.

Since the 2011 season, the Steelers have played in 27 primetime games, including a Week One Monday Night Football game at the Washington Redskins to kickoff the 2016 season (W, 38-16) and a Week Four Sunday Night Football tilt at Heinz Field vs. Kansas City (W, 43-14).

Mike Tomlin, the 10th-year head coach, has guided Pittsburgh to a 29-16 overall record in regular-season primetime games, including a 14-9 mark on the road.

He is 10-2 on Monday Night Football, 14-8 on Sunday Night Football and 5-5 on Thursday Night Football.

Tomlin joined only Bill Cowher (Steelers), Tom Flores (Raiders), Steve Mariucci (49ers), George Seifert (49ers) and Don Shula (Colts, Dolphins) as coaches to win their first six Monday Night Football games.

GOOD FIRST NINE

In his 10th season as the head coach of the Steelers, **Mike Tomlin** has an extensive list of accomplishments.

Tomlin earned his 90th regular-season victrory in Week 14 of 2015 at Cincinnati and closed out his ninth season with 92 wins following the team's Week 17 victory at Cleveland.

His 92 wins in his first nine seasons are the most wins in team history for any coach after his first nine campaigns and his two Super Bowl appearances also are tied for the franchise best for a coach in his first nine seasons.

TOMLIN'S 90TH IN NINE

Mike Tomlin became the third head coach in Steelers history to record 90 regular season wins in Week 14 of 2015, with the team's 33-20 victory at Cincinnati.

He joined Chuck Noll (1969-91: 193) and Bill Cowher (1992-2006: 149) in the team's 90-win club.

Tomlin's 90th win occurred in his ninth season with the Steelers, becoming the first Pittsburgh head coach to reach 90 wins in his first nine years (Bill Cowher: 1992-2000: 86 and Chuck Noll: 1976-77: 74).

Tomlin also joined several elite head coach fraternities in NFL history by reaching 90 wins in his ninth season:

- Tomlin is the ninth head coach in NFL history to win 90 games in his first nine seasons as a head coach, joining Mike Ditka, Joe Gibbs, Dennis Green, Mike Holmgren, John Madden, Mike McCarthy, George Seifert and Don Shula.
- He is the sixth head coach in NFL history to win 90 games in his first nine seasons with one franchise, joining Mike Ditka, Joe Gibbs, Dennis Green, John Madden and Mike McCarthy.

EIGHT IN EACH OF FIRST NINE

Along with securing his 90th win in Week 14 at Cincinnati in 2015, **Mike Tomlin** also led the Steelers to its eighth win of the season. Tomlin has guided the Steelers to at least eight wins in each of his nine seasons as the team's head coach.

- Tomlin is the third head coach in NFL history to win at least eight games in each of their first nine years as an NFL head coach and with the same team (Dennis Green: Minnesota, John Madden: Oakland and Mike Tomlin: Pittsburgh).

TOMLIN GOING FOR TWO

BEN THROWS 16 IN FIRST SIX

QB Ben Roethlisberger set a Steelers record for the most touchdown passes in the first six games of a season to open up 2016 with 16 scoring tosses, surpassing the previous mark of 13 (Terry Bradshaw: 1980 and Ben Roethlisberger: 2007).

Roethlisberger threw for 300 yards on 27 completions and three touchdowns with an interception for a passer rating of 112.4 in the team's Week One 38-16 win on Monday Night Football at Washington. The win gave him his 50th career road win as a starter and he joined Tom Brady (75) and Drew Brees (57) as the only active quarterbacks with at least 50 road wins.

In Week Two's home opener at Heinz Field, Roethlisberger threw for 259 yards on 19-of-37 passing with three touchdowns and two interceptions, leading the Steelers to a 24-16 win over Cincinnati. The game marked his 80th career regular-season game with multiple scoring passes, and his 45th at Heinz Field.

The Miami (Oh.) product completed 24-of-44 passes for 257 yards with an interception in Week Three's loss at Philadelphia.

In Week Four on Sunday Night Football, Roethlisberger notched his fifth career regular-season game with at least five touchdown passes - becoming the sixth player in NFL history to accomplish the feat - completing 22-of-27 passes for 300 yards for a passer rating of 152.5.

Roethlisberger threw four touchdowns while completing 34-of-47 attempts for 380 yards for a passer rating of 124.4 in Week Five vs. New York at Heinz field.

Roethlisberger made his 150th career regular season start in Week 8 vs. Indianapolis in 2014 to become just the fourth quarterback in NFL history to record 100 wins in their first 150 regular season starts (Tom Brady: 116, Joe Montana: 108, Terry and Bradshaw: 102).

Roethlisberger registered his 90th career win in his 135th career start, becoming the fifth fastest quarterback who began their career in the Super Bowl era to reach 90 wins.

His 63-27 record after his first 90 starts in the NFL ranked third (tied) in league history for the best record in such starts. Only Brady (67-23) and Stabler (66-23-1) had better records in their first 90 starts in the NFL. Roethlisberger's record is tied with Jim McMahon.

THE 40,000 CLUB

QB Ben Roethlisberger became the first player in Steelers history to register 40,000 career passing yards in Week 8's game vs. Cincinnati in 2015. Roethlisberger is the 16th quarterback in NFL history to reach the mark, the ninth to do so with one team, and the fifth active signal caller with 40,000 passing yards.

Brown totaled game-highs in receptions (8), receiving yards (126) and receiving touchdowns (2) in the Steelers' first game of the 2016 season on Monday Night Football at Washington (W, 38-16. It marked his 26th career 100-yard receiving game and 10th career multi-touchdown catch game, while setting a Steelers record for the fewest games to 10,000 combined yards (87).

Brown tallied game-high and single-season highs in receptions (12) and receiving yards (14) in Week Three at Philadelphia. It marked his 27th career 100-yard game and the 11th double-digit reception game of his career.

In Week Four on Sunday Night Football, Brown caught each of his touchdown catches in the first quarter - his second career opening period with two scoring grabs - while marking his 11th career multi-touchdown game.

Brown tied for the game-high with nine receptions, as he recorded 78 receiving yards with one receiving touchdown in Week Five vs. the New York Jets, and eclipsed 7,500 receiving yards to become the 10th active NFL player to hit the mark.

He totaled a game-high 106 receiving yards on seven catches, his third 100-yard game of the season in Week Seven against New England.

RINGING THE BELL IN 2016

RB Le'Veon Bell returned to the playing field in Week Four on Sunday Night Football against Kansas City and racked up a game-high 144 rushing yards on 18 carries, to go along with 34 receiving yards on five catches, for a total of 178 scrimmage yards. It marked his eighth career 100-yard rushing performance.

Bell totaled a game-high 154 yards from scrimmage (66 rushing and 88 receiving) in Week Five vs. New York. It was his second straight game with at least 150 yards from scrimmage for the second time in his NFL career (three games, Nov. 17-Dec. 7, 2014), and his 23rd career regular-season game with at least 100 yards from scrimmage, eighth with 150.

He led the Steelers with 108 yards from scrimmage (53 rushing and 55 receiving) in Week Six at Miami, and his 55 receiving yards and six catches were both team-highs.

Bell posted a game-high 149 yards from scrimmage (81 rushing and 68 receiving) in Week Seven vs. New England, his 25th regular-season game with at least 100 scrimmage yards, and set a personal regular-season single-game high of 10 receptions.

Since seeing his first action in Week Four of 2016, Bell ranks fifth the NFL with 589 yards from scrimmage:

JONES MAKES FIRST START OF '16

QB Landry Jones made his third career start, finishing 29-of-47 for 281 yards with one touchdown and one interception, in Week Seven against New England. He established single-game career highs in completions (29), attempts (47) and passing yards (281), and set a career high for passing yards in any half of a game with 179 in the opening half, surpassing his previous mark of 168 (Oct. 18, 2015 vs. Arizona, second half).

JONES' DEBUT FOR THE AGES

QB Landry Jones led the Steelers to a 25-13 come-frombehind victory in Week Six vs. Arizona in 2015 after entering the game and seeing regular-season action for the first time in his NFL career. In the game, Jones:

- Completed 8-of-12 passes for 168 yards with two touchdowns for a passer rating of 149.3.
- He connected with WR Martavis Bryant for both touchdowns, one coming from eight yards and the other from 88 yards. The 88-yard touchdown is tied for the eighth-longest pass play in team history.
- His 149.3 passer rating is the second-highest for an NFL quarterback in their first career game (min. 10 attempts) behind only Tennessee's Marcus Mariota's 158.3 in 2015.

Jones made his first career NFL start in Week Seven at Kansas City in 2015, and completed 16-of-29 passing for 209 yards with a touchdown.

In Week Nine vs. Oakland in 2015, Jones entered the game in relief of injured **QB Ben Roethlisberger** in the fourth quarter and completed 4-of-6 passes for 79 yards, including a 57-yarder to **WR Antonio Brown** to set up the game-winning field goal.

Jones made his first career home start in the regular season in Week 10 vs. Cleveland in 2015 and completed 3-of-4 passes for 23 yards before leaving the game in the first quarter due to injury.

He became the eighth Steelers quarterback in the Super Bowl era to earn a win in his first career home start. (Dennis Dixon: Sept. 12, 2010 vs. Atlanta, Charlie Batch: Nov. 13, 2005 vs. Cleveland, Ben Roethlisberger: Oct. 3, 2004 vs. Cincinnati, Tommy Maddox: Oct. 21 2002 vs. Indianapolis, Steve Bono: Oct. 18, 1987 vs. Indianapolis, Mark Kruczek: Oct. 17, 1976 vs. Cincinnati and Joe Gilliam: Sept. 15, 1974 vs. Baltimore).

HEYWARD AMONG THE STEEL DL

DE Cameron Heyward set a single-game career-high with 3.0 sacks on Sunday Night Football vs. Kansas City in Week Four, marking his second career multi-sack game, and became just the fourth defensive end in team history to record at least 3.0 sacks in a single game (since sacks became an official statistic in 1982), and first since Ray Seals in 1994 (11/6 at Houston).

Heyward has recorded five sacks or more in each of the previous three seasons (2013: 5.0, 2014: 7.5, 2015: 6.0) and joined Keith Willis (1983-86 and 1989-91) as the only Steelers defensive ends to record five sacks in three consecutive seasons since sacks became an official statistic in 1982.

His 25.0 quarterback takedowns are tied as the fourth-most by a Steelers defensive lineman since 1982 and he is the seventh Steelers defensive lineman to reach 20 sacks with the team since sacks became an official statistic in 1982.

His tackles (20) and solo tackles (17) in a victory over Baltimore in Week 7 in 2013 were both career highs.

Timmons, who has missed only two games his entire career, started his team-leading 91st consecutive regular-season game in Week Seven vs. New England.

101-AND-102

Since the start of the 2010 season, Timmons has started (101) and played in (102) the most games out of any Steelers' linebacker, while also leading the group in tackles over that time.

Timmons has eclipsed 100 total tackles five times in his NFL career (2010, '12, '13, '14, '15) and has led the defense in total tackles four times, including each of the previous three seasons (2010 '13 '14 and '15).

WILLIAMS LEADS THE 'D'

LB Vince Williams led the Steelers' defense in tackles in back-to-back gaems (Weeks Four-Five).

In Week Four, Williams made his first start of the 2016 season in vs. Kansas City on Sunday Night Football, and tallied a game and single-game personal best 15 tackles (13 solo). He was also redited with a sack in the second quarter, his first of the season, increasing his career total to 1.5.

Williams led the defense with a game high of 9 tackles (8 solo) in Week Five against the New York Jets, to go along with a sack, three stops for losses and two quarterback hits.

BOS-DOES-WELL

K Chris Boswell has converted seven of his 10 field goal attempts in 2016 - including six of seven attempts from 40-49 yards.

Since joining the Steelers in 2015, Boswell is 36-of-42 overall on field goal attempts (85.7%), including 15-of-19 (78.9%) between 40-49 yards.

His 85.7 field goal percent ranks second in Steelers history among kickers with at least 30 field goal attempts:

Berry landed each of his three punts in Week Five against the New York Jets inside their 20-yard line.
