

PACKERS HOST THE SEAHAWKS AT LAMBEAU

The Green Bay Packers will take on the Seattle Seahawks at home on Sunday. Green Bay leads the all-time series, 11-8, including 2-1 in the postseason.

- ► Including the postseason, Sunday will be the fifth time the two teams have played since 2012. The Packers beat the Seahawks at home last season, 27-17, in Week 2.
- ►Green Bay is 9-3 against the Seahawks at home during the regular and postseason, including six straight wins.
- Seattle is playing at Green Bay for just the third time ever in December (1990, 2009).
- ► The Packers and Seahawks are the only two teams in the NFC to make the playoffs each of the past four seasons.
- ► The Packers have won three of four home games against NFC teams this season. Green Bay's 3-1 home record against the NFC is tied for the third-best record among NFC teams this season, trailing only Seattle and Detroit, who are both 4-0.
- Under Head Coach Mike McCarthy, Green Bay is 84-43-1 during the regular season against NFC opponents. The Packers' 84 wins and .660 winning percentage both rank No. 1 among NFC teams over that span.
- Since 2006, the Packers are 48-15-1 at home during the regular season agianst NFC teams. The 48 wins and .758 winning percentage are No. 1 in the NFC.
- ►Green Bay has only given up 13.0 points per game over the last two weeks, tied for the fourth fewest in the NFL over that span.
- ► In a snowy Week 13 victory, Green Bay registered seven offensive plays of 10-plus yards in the fourth quarter, including three plays 20-plus yards.
- ▶QB Aaron Rodgers has multiple passing touchdowns in seven straight games, the second-longest active streak in the NFL (Titans QB Marcus Mariota, eight).
- Green Bay has had one or more players register 10-plus receptions and/ or 100-plus receiving yards in nine of the last 10 games.
- The Packers have scored 21 or more points in nine of the last 10 games. Dating back to Week 3, they are tied for the most 21-plus-point games in the NFL (Atlanta Falcons, Dallas Cowboys, New England, San Diego) according to pro-football-reference.com.
- The Packers will finish the regular season with four games against NFC foes, including the last three against division opponents.
- ▶ Next week, Green Bay goes back on the road when it travels to Chicago to take on the Bears. It will be the first time the Packers have played in Chicago in December since 2013, a 33-28 Green Bay victory.

WITH THE CALL

FOX Sports, now in its 23rd season as an NFL network television partner, will broadcast the game to the majority of the country.

- Play-by-play man Joe Buck joins analyst Troy Aikman and sideline reporter Erin Andrews.
- Milwaukee's WTMJ (620 AM), airing Green Bay games since November 1929, heads up the Packers Radio Network that is made up of 50 stations in five states. Wayne Larrivee (play-by-play) and two-time Packers Pro Bowler Larry McCarren (analyst) call the action. McCarren first joined the team's broadcasts in 1995 and enters his 22nd season calling Packers games. After originally being paired together in 1999, McCarren and Larrivee enter their 18th season of broadcasts together.
- SportsUSA Radio will air the game on radio across the country. Wayne Randazzo (play-by-play) and Hank Bauer (analyst) will call the action.
- The broadcast is also available on Sirius Satellite Radio (WTMJ feed).
 DIRECTV subscribers can watch the game on Channel 716.

STAT OF THE WEEK

- ►LB Julius Peppers registered a 10-yard sack in the second quarter against Houston, giving him 142.5 sacks for his career as he moved past DE Michael Strahan for sole possession of the No. 5 spot in NFL history (since 1982). The four players ahead of him on the all-time sack list (Bruce Smith, Reggie White, Kevin Greene, Chris Doleman) are all in the Pro Football Hall of Fame.
- His current streak of three straight games with a sack gives him a streak of three games in each season with the Packers (Weeks 7-8 and 10 in 2014, Weeks 4-6 in 2015, Weeks 11-13 this season).

IN THE RED ZONE

According to STATS, QB **Aaron Rodgers** has completed 51 of 82 passes (62.2 percent) for 287 yards, 23 touchdowns, zero interceptions and a passer rating of 108.1 in the red zone this season, ranking near the top of the league:

GREEN BAY IN DECEMBER

Dating back to 2014, Green Bay has won seven of the nine games it has played in December. The Packers' seven December wins since 2014 are tied for the third most in the NFL, trailing the eight wins by Plttsburgh and Seattle.

- ► Under McCarthy, the Packers are 30-13 (.698) in the month of December, No. 3 in the NFL.
- ► Green Bay is 19-3 (.864) at home in the month of December under McCarthy, tied with New England for No. 1 in the NFL since 2006.
- ► In eight of the first 10 seasons under McCarthy (2006-15), including each of the last five, Green Bay has won three-plus games and lost just one in the month of December.
- QB Aaron Rodgers has started 30 total games in the month of December, recording a passer rating of 101.6, No. 2 in the NFL (min. 268 att.) among active quarterbacks since 2008. His 61 passing touchdowns in the month of December rank No. 3 in the NFL since 2008.
- ► In 15 career starts at Lambeau Field in the month of December, Rodgers has completed 313 of 470 passes (66.6 percent) for 4,150 yards and 36 TDs with five INTs for a 115.5 passer rating. The Packers are 14-1 in those games.

ODDS AND ENDS

Below are some random notes from this season:

- Green Bay is tied for No. 3 in the NFL in 10-play drives (26) and No.
 4 in 10-play touchdown drives (12).
- ► The Packers' 98-yard TD drive in the fourth quarter of the Week 13 victory over Houston was the team's longest TD drive since a 99-yarder at Cleveland on Oct. 25, 2009.
- ►The Packers have eclipsed 400 total net yards five times this season (406 vs. N.Y. Giants and Chicago Bears / 405 vs. Indianapolis / 402 at Tennessee / 424 at Washington), tied for the fourth-most games with 400 total net yards in the NFL this season (New Orleans, six; Washington, seven; Dallas, eight).
- ► The Packers converted 71.4 percent of third downs in Week 12 (10-14), the highest single-game third-down conversion rate in the NFL this season and the second highest under Head Coach **Mike McCarthy** (72.2 percent, 13-18, Oct. 27, 2013, at Minnesota).
- Green Bay ranks No. 2 in the NFL in third-down conversions this season:

- ►The Packers rank No. 5 in the NFL in average time of possession (31:18) this season.
- ►Green Bay ranks in the top-10 in the NFL in both rushing yards allowed per game (9th, 92.9) and rushing yards allowed per play (8th, 3.84).
- ► The Packers rank **No. 4 in the NFL** in sacks/pass attempt (7.54 percent) this season and are **tied for No. 7** in sacks (30).
- ►QB Aaron Rodgers threw for 371 yards in Week 10 and 351 yards in Week 11, marking only the third time in his career he has thrown for 350-plus passing yards in back-to-back games (2009, 2011).
- ► In Weeks 11-12, QB **Aaron Rodgers** registered passer ratings of 115.0 and 116.7, throwing for over 300 yards and mulitple touchdowns in both games.
- Rodgers has registered a passer rating of 115.0-plus in four games this season (129.3 vs. Detroit / 125.5 at Atlanta / 115.0 at Washington / 116.7 at Philadelphia), tied for the third most in the NFL.
- According to the Elias Sports Bureau, Green Bay recorded 23-plus first downs in five consecutive games (Weeks 5-9) in a single regular season for the first time in franchise history.
- ► WR **Trevor Davis** registered a 55-yard punt return against Atlanta, the longest punt return by Green Bay since DB **Micah Hyde** returned a punt 55 yards for a touchdown vs. Detroit on Dec. 28, 2014.
- ► In Week 7, Green Bay recorded 32 first downs, the most by the Packers since Nov. 27, 1983, at Atlanta (32). It tied for the second most in franchise history. Green Bay also possessed the ball for 39:36, the best mark by the team since Oct. 27, 2013, at Minnesota (40:54).
- ▶P Jacob Schum set career highs (min. four punts) in Week 10 by posting a 50.5-yard gross average on four punts. In Week 9, he set a career best (min. four punts) with a 47.5-yard net average on four punts.

GROUP EFFORT

The Packers have a history of relying on many receivers over the years and this season is no different.

- The Packers are one of two teams in the NFL (Washington) to have three players with 55-plus receptions and 575-plus receiving yards each this season (Jordy Nelson 69 rec. for 872 yds. / Davante Adams 59 rec. for 793 yds. / Randall Cobb 57 rec. for 577 yds.).
- ► Nelson (10) and Adams (eight) are the **only teammate duo in the NFL** with seven-plus touchdown catches this season.
- ► Nelson is tied for No. 2 in the NFL in receiving touchdowns this season and Adams is tied for No. 4:

- Nelson joins Mike Evans, Antonio Brown, and Odell Beckham Jr. as the only players in the league to rank in the top 10 in all three of the major receiving categories (catches, yards, receiving TDs).
- Adams and Nelson are tied for the team lead and No. 7 in the NFL with three 100-yard receiving games this season.
- Adams and Evans are the only players to record 100-plus yards receiving and two-plus TDs in two games this season.
- ► For the first time in his career, Nelson posted a touchdown reception in each of the first four games of the season, becoming the first Packer to do so since WR Bill Schroeder in 2001.
- Nelson's five touchdown receptions in the first four games of this season were tied for the fourth most in franchise history.
- The Packers' six individual 10-catch games have come via four different players (Davante Adams-two, Ty Montgomery-two, Randall Cobb, Jordy Nelson). According to the Elias Sports Bureau, four different players having at least one 10-catch game is tied for the most in a single season in NFL history (2015 New England Patriots / 2013 Atlanta Falcons / 2010 Indianpolis Colts / 2002 St. Louis Rams / 1991 Buffalo Bills).
- Green Bay's six individual 10-catch games are the most in a single season in franchise history (five in 2004 / three in 2014, 1993, 1942).
- ► In Week 11, TE Jared Cook registered 105 yards and one touchdown on five receptions (17.5 avg.). According to the Elias Sports Bureau, Cook became only the second TE (Benjamin Watson) to register a 100yard receiving game with three different franchises.
- Dating back to 1996, Cook's 17.5 yards-per-catch average was the third highest by a Green Bay tight end in single game (min. five receptions), according to STATS (Jermichael Finley, Oct. 5, 2009, six for 128 yards, 21.3 avg. / Richard Rodgers, Dec. 3, 2015, eight for 146 yards, 18.3 avg.).
- ►In Week 10, Adams became the only Packer player to reigster three receptions of 35-plus yards in the same game (dating back to 1991).
- ► Week 10 also saw Adams (six receptions for 156 yards) and Nelson (12 receptions for 126 yards, one TD) became the second pair of teammates to record 120-plus receiving yards in the same game this season (New Orleans WRs Willie Snead and Brandin Cooks in Week 1).
- In Week 9, the Packers had four players with a reception of 20-plus yards (Nelson, Adams, TE Richard Rodgers, WR Jeff Janis).

With 12 receptions for 74 yards (6.2 avg.) in Week 8, Adams became the first Packer to have back-to-back games with 12-plus catches, and his 25 over Weeks 7-8 were a franchise record for most over a two-game span.

DOPE SHEET

- ► Week 8 also saw three Packers post their first career TD catches in the game at Atlanta (Janis, **Geronimo Allison**, **Trevor Davis**), which was the first time an NFL team had done that since the Jets on Oct. 23, 2000.
- Allison and Davis became first rookie duo to both have a TD catch in a game for the Packers since Max McGee and Joe Johnson on Dec. 12, 1954.
- According to the Elias Sports Bureau, in Week 7 the Packers became just the second team in NFL history to feature three players with 10-plus catches in a game (Adams, 13; Cobb, 11; Montgomery, 10), joining the New England Patriots (Leroy Thompson, Ben Coates, Michael Timpson) vs. Minnesota on Nov. 13, 1994.
- Adams' 13 receptions for 132 yards (10.2 avg.) and two touchdowns against Chicago tied for the second-most receptions in a single game in franchise history (Don Hutson, 13 receptions vs. Cleveland, Oct. 18, 1942, and 14 vs. N.Y. Giants on Nov. 22, 1942).
- ► Montgomery became the first Packer to post back-to-back games with 10-plus catches (10 vs. Dallas in Week 6) since WR Sterling Sharpe in 1993 (Oct. 10, Oct. 24). Adams joined him in Weeks 7 (13) and 8 (12). The only other player to accomplish that feat in a single season in team annals is Hutson in 1942 (Nov. 15, Nov. 22).
- Montgomery recorded 60 yards rushing and 66 yards receiving in Week 7, becoming the first Green Bay player since RB Ahman Green (63 rushing/68 receiving) at Detroit on Sept. 24, 2006, to register 60-plus rushing yards and 60-plus receiving yards in a game.

NELSON MOVES UP

- This is the third time in Nelson's career that he has recorded 10-plus receiving TDs in a season (2011 and 2014). He joins Sterling Sharpe (four) and Don Hutson (three) as the only players in franchise history to post 10-plus TD catches in three or more seasons.
- Nelson has 23 100-yard receiving games in his career, tied with Greg Jennings for No. 4 in team history.
- Rodgers and Nelson have connected for 55 touchdowns, the second most by a duo in team history behind QB Brett Favre and WR Antonio Freeman (57 TD passes).
- Nelson ranks in the top five in franchise history in both receptions and receiving yards:

PACKERS VS. SEAHAWKS - WEEK 14

AT THE HELM

Having led Green Bay to the playoffs in eight of his first 10 seasons as head coach, **Mike McCarthy** is joined by Vince Lombardi and Mike Holmgren as the only coaches to guide the Packers to a Super Bowl win with a victory over Pittsburgh in Super Bowl XLV.

- McCarthy guided the Packers to a franchise-record fourth consecutive division title in 2014.
- ►With a win at Tampa Bay in Week 16 of the 2014 season, McCarthy passed Lombardi for the No. 2 spot in team history as far as overall victories:

- ► The 118 overall wins are the most in the NFC and the third most in the NFL since 2006 (NE 146 and IND 119).
- McCarthy reached 100 career wins (including playoffs) in just his 155th game. He was the fastest to reach 100 wins in the NFL since George Seifert in 1996 (132 games).
- McCarthy's 104 regular-season wins in his first 10 years as a head coach (2006-15) rank No. 3 in NFL history:

- McCarthy recorded his third regular season with 12-plus wins in 2014 (2007, 2011), passing Curly Lambeau (1929, 1931), Lombardi (1962, 1966), Holmgren (1996-97) and Mike Sherman (2001-02) for the most by a coach in franchise history.
- ► McCarthy has guided the Packers to five seasons with 11-plus wins (2007, 2009, 2011-12, 2014), passing Lombardi (1961-63, 1966) and Holmgren (1995-98) for the **most by a coach in franchise history**.
- ► McCarthy's seven regular seasons with 10-plus wins are a franchise record (since 1921).
- McCarthy joined Pittsburgh's Bill Cowher (2005) as the only Super Bowlwinning coaches to lead their respective teams to three road wins as the No. 6 seed in the postseason en route to a world title.
- Including playoffs, McCarthy has a 118-68-1 record since taking over as head coach in 2006, a .634 winning percentage that ranks No. 2 among current NFL head coaches (minimum 75 games):

► McCarthy coached in his 134th game in Week 13 at Detroit in 2013 (including playoffs), moving him past Bart Starr for No. 2 in team history:

►In the Week 6 victory over the San Diego Chargers in 2015, McCarthy earned the 100th regular-season win of his career in just his 150th game, making him the seventh-fastest coach in NFL history and the fastest current NFL coach to reach the 100-win plateau:

BURNETT BRINGS IT

Packers S **Morgan Burnett** has has been a steady force on the Packers defense for years, starting 91 games (including playoffs) since 2011.

- From 2011-14, he was the only Packer to surpass 100 tackles each season, and despite missing five games in 2015, he tied for the team lead in solo tackles (54) and led the team with 14 total tackles in the postseason. So far in 2016, he ranks No. 1 on the team in tackles (74) despite missing a game.
- He has set a single-season career high with three sacks, tied for No. 1 among safeties this year according to STATS:

ONE OF THE BEST

Packers LB **Julius Peppers** is one of the greatest pass rushers of alltime and continues to contribute, ranking **No. 2 on the team** with 6.5 sacks this season.

- ► Last season (10.5) marked his ninth season with 10-plus sacks, which tied John Randle for the fourth-most 10-sack seasons since 1982 (Bruce Smith, 13 / Reggie White, 12 / Kevin Greene, 10).
- Peppers ranks No. 1 among active players in career sacks during the regular season:

- ▶ Peppers passed Michael Strahan (141.5) for **No. 5 in NFL history** with 142.5 career sacks (since 1982). He trails Chris Doleman (150.5) for No. 4 all-time.
- Peppers recorded a sack and forced fumble on Dallas QB Dak Prescott in Week 6. According to STATS LLC, he ranks No. 5 in the NFL in forced fumbles (46) since 1994.
- Peppers is the first player in NFL history with 100 career sacks and four interception returns for touchdowns. In 2014, he became the first linebacker in Packers' history to post two interception returns for touchdowns in the same season.
- Peppers is the only player in NFL history to register at least 10 interceptions and 100.0 sacks (since 1982).

PERRY LEADS THE RUSH

Packers LB **Nick Perry** has led a pass rush that has recorded multiple sacks in 10 of 12 games and includes two-plus sacks by six players.

- Perry has registered a team-high eight sacks, tied for No. 11 in the NFL in 2016.
- Perry has registered a half-sack or more in eight games this season, tied for No. 3 in the NFL.

- ►In Week 6, Perry registered his first career interception and added a sack, making him the first Green Bay LB to post both in a game since Clay Matthews at the N.Y. Giants on Dec. 4, 2011.
- Perry matched his career high with a team-best two sacks in Week 3 vs. Detroit.
- ▶ Perry has at least one two-sack game in each of the last four seasons (2013-16), the lone Packer to accomplish that feat over that span.

CONTINUAL IMPACT

In his career, DT **Mike Daniels** has seen his playing time steadily increase as well as his production. After playing in 14 games as a rookie in 2012, he has played in every game since the start of the 2013 season.

- ► In Week 2 at Minnesota, he recorded a sack and tied for the team lead with four QB hits. In Week 3, he led the Packers with two QB hits, and he registered a sack in both Weeks 8 and 12.
- ► In 2015, Daniels led the Packers' defensive line in tackles (66) and sacks (four). He finished third on the team with 12 QB hits.
- ►In Week 5 versus St. Louis last season, he tied for the team lead with a career-best nine tackles (eight solo).
- ► Daniels registered his first career interception in Week 16 at Arizona (2015), returning it 23 yards. According to STATS LLC, it was the first interception by a Packers DT since Cullen Jenkins on Oct. 18, 2009. Dating back to 1960, his 23-yard interception return was the longest by a Green Bay DT on an interception.
- ► He led Green Bay's defensive line with 5.5 sacks and was the team leader in quarterback hits (19) and pressures (22) during the 2014 regular season.
- Daniels is third on the Packers with 19.0 sacks since the start of the 2013 season (Peppers-24.0 / Matthews-29.0). He is tied for No. 10 among NFL defensive tackles over that span, according to STATS LLC:

ON THE RISE

S **Ha Ha Clinton-Dix** has been a presence on the Packers defense since his rookie season.

DOPE SHEET

- After starting 10 of 16 games and both postseason contests as a rookie, he has started every game since 2015.
- His career-best three interceptions are tied for No. 2 among NFL safeties this season, trailing only NYG Landon Collins (five).
- According to STATS, he joins Ravens S Eric Weddle and Eagles S Rodney McLeod are the only NFL safeties with one or more forced fumbles and three interceptions this season.
- In 2016, Clinton-Dix posted a career high in Week 9 with two interceptions and became the first Green Bay safety to register two INTs in a game since Morgan Burnett did so vs. Minnesota on Dec. 2, 2012. He joined CB Al Harris (vs. New Orleans, Oct. 9, 2005) as the only players to post two INTs in a first quarter for the Packers since 1993.
- His three career postseason interceptions rank No. 1 among safeties since he entered the league in 2014, according to STATS.
- ►Clinton-Dix finished second on the team with 95 tackles (73 solo) in 2014 and led the Packers with 117 tackles (97 solo) last season.
- He registered a total of three interceptions last season (including playoffs). He tied for fourth on the team with two during the regular season and registered one in the postseason.
- According to STATS, his three sacks during the 2015 regular season were tied for the fifth most in a single regular season by a Packers safety (since 1982) and the most since Mark Roman recorded 3.5 in 2004.
- Clinton-Dix's three sacks also tied for No. 3 in the NFL in 2015 among safeties.
- During the 2015 regular season, he registered eight-plus tackles in eight games, including setting career highs in both total tackles (12) and solo tackles (11) in the Week 10 game vs. Detroit, in which he also registered an interception.

RACKING UP POINTS

K Mason Crosby is moving his way up the record books.

Crosby passed Ryan Longwell in Week 2 of the 2015 season to become the franchise career points leader:

- Crosby (319) eclipsed Longwell (277) for the most field goal attempts in Packers' history.
- Crosby (1,352) passed Longwell (1,119) for the most points scored in the regular and postseason combined in franchise history.
- Dating back to 2013, Crosby has made 104 field goals during the regular season, tied for No. 6 in the NFL over that span.
- Crosby recorded 108 points during the 2015 regular season, giving him the ninth 100-point season of his career and passing Ryan Longwell (1997-2004) for the franchise record.
- In Week 11 of 2015, he tied the single-game team record with five field goals and became the first player in NFL history to have five field goals of 40-plus yards in a game. In the same game, Crosby connected on a 52-yard field goal, extending his career franchise record for the most 50-yard FGs to 26.

ON THE ROAD AGAIN

Green Bay went 7-1 away from Lambeau Field in 2011, with the seven road wins setting a single-season franchise record.

- The Packers have been able to stay above the .500 mark on the road during Head Coach Mike McCarthy's tenure, a notable achievement in the National Football League.
- Since 2006, McCarthy's first season as the head coach in Green Bay, only nine of 32 NFL teams have regular-season road records above .500.

324 AND COUNTING

Another packed house at Lambeau Field against the Houston Texans in Week 13 brought the stadium's consecutive-sellouts streak to 324 regularseason games (not including replacement games).

- The league's longest-tenured stadium, Lambeau Field is hosting its 60th season of football in 2016. For the victory over Dallas in the Divisional round of the 2014 playoffs, Packers fans set a new Lambeau Field paid attendance record (79,704).
- Across American professional sports, only Boston's Fenway Park (1912) and Chicago's Wrigley Field (1914) have longer tenures.

THE LAMBEAU ADVANTAGE

The crown jewel of the National Football League, Lambeau Field has long been known as one of the tougher venues to play in, particularly during the harsh Wisconsin winter.

- ► Re-establishing home-field advantage after a 4-4 mark in 2008 was one of the goals of 2009, and with the Packers finishing 6-2 at home, they accomplished that goal. Green Bay followed that up with a 7-1 mark at Lambeau Field in 2010, a perfect 8-0 record in 2011, the first undefeated home mark since 2002, and a 7-1 mark in 2012. The Packers were one of two teams to finish undefeated at home during the 2014 regular season (Denver).
- Head Coach Mike McCarthy stated consistently upon his arrival in Green Bay that one of the team's goals would be to reclaim the mystique of playing at Lambeau Field. Mission accomplished. The team is 62-22-1 (.735) at home in the regular season since 2006, No. 2 in the NFL.
- Since Ron Wolf and Mike Holmgren began the revitalization of the franchise in 1992, Green Bay owns the best home record in the NFL. A look at the top regular-season home W-L records since the '92 season:

A LOOK AT THE SCHEDULE

The Green Bay Packers' 96th NFL regular-season schedule is headlined by five prime-time games (subject to flexible scheduling).

- Green Bay's schedule includes five games against 2015 playoff teams. Three of those contests (Minnesota, Houston, Seattle) will be at Lambeau Field, while two (Minnesota, Washington) will come on the road.
- ► The Packers kicked off their season on the road for the fourth consecutive year, the longest streak in team history, opening with two road games for the first time since 1924. Green Bay traveled to Jacksonville, playing on the road against an AFC team in Week 1 for the first time since facing the New England Patriots in 1985.
- Green Bay faced division opponents in Weeks 2-3. They began with a trip to Minnesota to face the Vikings in a prime-time game and returned to Lambeau Field last week for the home opener against the Detroit Lions.
- For the second time in four years, the Packers had their bye in Week 4.
- ►Green Bay returns to action with three consecutive home games against NFC teams over a 12-day span. In Week 5, the Packers played on Sunday night against the New York Giants. It was the Giants' first regular-season game at Lambeau Field since 2010. In Week 6, Green Bay played the Dallas Cowboys for the fourth consecutive season (including playoffs) and for the second straight year at home in the regular season. Green Bay finished the homestand playing the Chicago Bears on a Thursday night for the second consecutive season (11th straight year in primetime).
- Four of the Packers' next five games will be on the road, including three road games in a row for the first time since 2012.
- After a trip to play the Atlanta Falcons in Week 8, Green Bay faced the Indianapolis Colts at home for the first time since 2008. The Packers made just their third regular-season visit to Tennessee to play the Titans in Week 10.
- ► Green Bay will play two prime-time road games in a row, first traveling to play against the Washington Redskins on a Sunday night in Week 11 and then to Philadelphia to face the Eagles on *Monday Night Football* in Week 12. It marked the 24th consecutive season (1993-2016) that Green Bay has appeared on *MNF*.
- ►Green Bay played its first game at home in almost a month when it faced the Houston Texans in Week 13 for just the second time ever at Lambeau Field.
- Week 14 brings a familiar matchup as the Packers welcome the Seattle Seahawks to Lambeau Field for the second consecutive year. Including the postseason, Green Bay and Seattle will meet for the fifth time in five years.
- ► For the first time since 2006, the Packers will finish the regular season with three straight games against NFC North opponents.
- ► In Week 15, Green Bay will travel to Chicago to play the Bears. The Packers have won four consecutive games against the Bears in December, three of which were played in Chicago.
- ►Green Bay returns home to play the Vikings in Week 16 on Christmas Eve, playing on a Saturday for the first time since 1997. The Packers last played on Christmas Eve in 2004, a 34-31 victory at Minnesota. Including playoffs, Green Bay has a 8-2-1 mark (.773) against the Vikings at Lambeau Field under McCarthy.
- ► The Packers will finish the regular season in Detroit for the first time since 1993. Green Bay has won seven of 10 games at Ford Field under McCarthy. It will be only the third time the Packers have played at the Lions during the regular season in the month of January (1983, 1994).

BREAKING DOWN THE ROSTER

The Packers have a 53-man roster that is composed of 24 offensive players, 26 defensive players and three specialists.

- ▶ Of the 53 players on the roster, 48 began their pro careers with the Packers (90.6 percent) and 35 of them (66.0 percent) were draft picks of the Packers. Dating back to 2009, Green Bay has selected nine players in the first round, seven of which are still on the team.
- ► Green Bay has 15 players on the roster that began their careers as undrafted free agents, with 13 of those originally signed by Green Bay.
- ► Six 2016 undrafted rookie free agents are currently on the roster (WR Geronimo Allison, S Kentrell Brice, CB Makinton Dorleant, S Marwin Evans, CB Josh Hawkins, FB Joe Kerridge).
- ► 39.6 percent of the players (21 of 53) on Green Bay's roster entered the league as a sixth-round or seventh-round pick or as an undrafted player.
- The Packers have five players on the roster that played in the NFL prior to the 2009 season. Three of those players were draft picks of the Packers (QB Aaron Rodgers, K Mason Crosby and WR Jordy Nelson) and two (Rodgers, Nelson) have made at least one Pro Bowl.
- Only 19 of the 53 players on the roster (35.8 percent) were selected in the first three rounds of the draft, with 17 being drafted by the Packers.
- ► Of the 53 players on the roster, 43 of them (81.1 percent) are 28 years old or younger (as of Dec. 11) and 25 players (47.2 percent) are 24 years old or younger.

PACKERS STARTERS – OFFENSE

WR Jordy Nelson, 9th Year, Kansas State, D2a-08

- Tied for No. 2 in the NFL with 10 receiving touchdowns this season.
- ► Has 59 career receiving TDs, ranking No. 4 in Packers history. Trails Donald Driver (61) for the third most.
- For the first time in his career, posted a touchdown reception in each of the first four games of the season, becoming the first Packer to do so since WR Bill Schroeder in 2001.
- ► His five touchdown receptions in the first four games this year tied for the fourth most in franchise history.
- Missed all of the 2015 season due to a knee injury.
- Finished the 2014 regular season ranked fourth in receiving yards (1,519), seventh in receptions (98) and tied for second in receiving touchdowns (13). Earned first selection to the Pro Bowl.
- ▶ Led the team in 2013 with 85 catches for 1.314 yards and eight TDs. Ranked No. 10 in the NFL that season in receiving yards.
- ▶ With 15 TD catches in 2011, became only the third player in franchise history to catch 15 or more TDs in a season, joining WRs Sterling Sharpe (18 in 1994) and Don Hutson (17 in 1942).

LT David Bakhtiari, 4th Year, Colorado, D4a-13

- Has started all but two games at LT since the start of the 2013 regular season. Missed the final two games of the 2015 regular season due to injury
- Started all 16 games at left tackle in 2013, the only rookie in the NFL to do so in 2013 and the first Packer rookie to do so since the league went to a 16-game schedule in 1978.
- Became just the fourth Green Bay rookie to start at LT in the season opener since the 1970 AFL-NFL merger and the first since 1985.

LG Lane Taylor, 4th Year, Oklahoma State, FA-13

Has played in 42 regular-season games for Green Bay with 14 starts.

- ► Made the first starts of his career in 2015, opening at RG at Detroit in Week 13 in place of an injured T.J. Lang and at LG in Week 17 vs. Minnesota with Josh Sitton sliding to LT in place of an injured David Bakhtiari.
- ► A four-year letterman at OSU, starting 47 of 50 games played at right guard. Unanimous first-team All-Big 12 selection by the conference's coaches as a senior.

C JC Tretter, 4th Year, Cornell, D4b-13

- Started the first seven games this season before a knee injury sidelined him for Weeks 9-13. Set career highs with 16 games played and three starts (all at C) during the 2015 regular season. Also started at LT in the NFC Wild Card game at Washington.
- Has seen game action at C, LG and both T spots during his career.
- ► Was on track to be the starting C in 2014, opening at that position for the first three preseason games, but sustained a knee injury vs. Oakland (Aug. 22) that would sideline him for the first half of the season. Returned to play in the final eight games and both postseason contests.
- Grew from a high school guarterback, running back and slot receiver into an All-American LT in college, starting 20 consecutive games in his final two seasons at Cornell.

RG T.J. Lang, 8th Year, Eastern Michigan, D4-09

- Has started games at four different positions on the line as a pro (56 at RG, 27 at LG, five at RT, two at LT). Played C in Week 10 in 2013.
- ► Has started 87 contests since 2011, most by a Packers' offensive player.
- Started games at both tackle spots in his first season (2009) and became the first Packers rookie to start consecutive games at left tackle since Chad Clifton in 2000.
- Began his college career as a defensive lineman, but converted to the offensive line as a sophomore and started 36 straight games (10 at RT, 26 at LT) over his final three years.

RT Bryan Bulaga, 7th Year, Iowa, D1-10

- Has started 39 of 44 games since the start of the 2014 season.
- Missed the second part of the 2012 season after suffering a hip injury vs. Arizona on Nov. 4 and missed all of the 2013 season after injuring his knee on Aug. 3.
- Started 37 games at RT in his first three seasons in the league.
- Started the final 12 games of 2010 and the entire postseason at right tackle after taking over for veteran Mark Tauscher (shoulder).
- Named to the Pro Football Weekly/PFWA All-Rookie team in 2010.
- Capped his rookie season by becoming the youngest player at the time, according to STATS LLC, to ever start in the Super Bowl (21 years, 322 days).

TE Jared Cook, 8th Year, South Carolina, FA-16

- In Week 11, registered 105 yards and a touchdown on five receptions (17.5 avg.). According to the Elias Sports Bureau, Cook became only the second TE (Benjamin Watson) to register a 100-yard receiving game with three different franchises.
- Signed with the Packers as a free agent in March 2016 after spending three seasons with the St. Louis Rams (2013-15) and four with the Tennessee Titans (2009-12).
- Has posted at least 35 receptions in each of the last five seasons (2011-15), one of only five active tight ends in the NFL to do so (Antonio Gates, Jimmy Graham, Rob Gronkowski, Greg Olsen).
- Holds the single-game franchise record for the most receiving yards by a tight end for both the Titans (169 vs. Jacksonville, Dec. 24, 2011) and the Rams (141 vs. Arizona, Sept. 8, 2013).

WR Randall Cobb, 6th Year, Kentucky, D2-11

- Ranks No. 3 on the team with 57 receptions this season.
- Leads the team with a 13.5 punt return average this season.
- Posted the 12th 100-yard receiving game of his career in Week 4 (108) on nine receptions) and tied his single-game high for receptions (11 for 95 yards and a TD) in Week 7.
- Led the team in receptions (79), was No. 2 in receiving yards (829) and was No. 3 in touchdown receptions (six) in 2015.
- Set a new single-season career high with five 100-yard receiving games during the 2014 season (three-2012). Earned first trip to the Pro Bowl.
 His career-best 91 receptions in 2014 were the seventh most in team
- history.
- Finished the regular season tied for fourth in the NFL with 12 touchdown receptions in 2014.
- Before suffering a knee injury in Week 6 in 2013, led the team in receptions with 29 and was No. 2 in receiving yards with 378. Set a franchise single-season record with a league-high 2,342 combined
- net yards in 2012, topping the previous team mark of 2,250 yards by RB Ahman Green in 2003.

QB Aaron Rodgers, 12th Year, California, D1-05

- In 131 regular-season starts (86-45 record), has posted 47 games with 300-plus passing yards, 77 without an increption and 73 with a 100-plus passer rating (min. 15 attempts).
 Earned his fifth selection to the Pro Bowl in 2015, passing Bart Starr
- Earlied his multi selection to the rite bown in 2016, passing bart order (1960-62, 1966) for the second-most selections by a Green Bay quarterback behind Brett Favre's nine (1992-93, 1995-97, 2001-03, 2007).
 His career passer rating of 103.5 ranks No. 1 in NFL history.
- Finished the 2014 regular season ranked No. 2 in the NFL in passer rating (112.2), touchdown percentage (7.3), No. 1 in interception percentage (1.0) and No. 3 in touchdown passes (38). ▶Recorded a passer rating of at least 120.0 in seven regular-season
- games in 2014, setting a single-season career high and tying for the third most in a single season in the NFL, dating back to 1960. Posted 21,332 passing yards from 2008-12, which ranks No. 1 in league
- history for the most passing yards by a QB in his first five seasons as a starter (previous record was Peyton Manning, 20,618, 1998-2002).
- ▶ In 2011, set an NFL record with a 122.5 passer rating and set franchise marks for TD passes (45), passing yards (4,643), completion percent-age (68.3), yards per attempt (9.25) and 300-yard games (eight) on his way to earning NFL Most Valuable Player honors from *The Associated* Press.

- **RB James Starks, 7th Year, Buffalo, D6-10** Has started 13 of 71 career games played during the regular season. Set career highs in starts (four), rushing yards (601), receptions (43), receiving yards (392), receiving TDs (three) and yards from scrimmage (993) last season.
- In 2015, he put together two of the finest rushing games of his career. In Week 2, he carried the ball 20 times for 95 yards (4.8 avg.), and in Week 6, he racked up 112 yards on just 10 carries (11.2 avg.), becom-ing the first Packers player to rush for 100-plus yards on 10 or fewer carries since RB Brandon Jackson at Washington on Oct. 10, 2010 (115 yards on 10 carries). He also registered a 65-yard touchdown against San Diego, the longest by a Green Bay player since RB DeShawn Wynn's 73-yard touchdown vs. Detroit on Dec. 28, 2008.

FB Aaron Ripkowski, 2nd Year, Oklahoma, D6a-15

- Scored his first career rushing touchdown in Week 12 and followed it up with one in Week 13.
- Set career highs with 34 yards on six carries (5.7 avg.) in Week 8
- Played in 15 games as a rookie, seeing action primarily on special teams.

PACKERS STARTERS – DEFENSE

DE Kenny Clark, Rookie, UCLA, D1-16

- Ranks No. 3 on the Packers' defensive line in tackles (27).
- Became the youngest player to appear in a season opener for the Packers since Arnie Herber (20 years old) in 1930.
- ► Earned third-team All-America honors from *The Associated Press* and first-team All-Pacific-12 recognition from the coaches and media as a junior in 2015.
- ► Was a team co-captain in '15 and recorded career highs in tackles (75), tackles for a loss (11) and sacks (six). Also ranked third on the team with five pass breakups.

NT Letroy Guion, 9th Year, Florida State, FA-14

- ► Leads the Packers defensive-line with 37 tackles this season.
- ► Has started 31 of the 40 regular-season games he has played in since the start of the 2014 season.
- Signed with Green Bay during the 2014 offseason after spending his first six NFL seasons with the Minnesota Vikings.
- Started all 28 games he appeared in for Minnesota in 2012-13, recording 72 tackles (32 solo) and three sacks over that span.
- ► Was the only Viking to block a field goal in both 2011 and 2012.

DT Mike Daniels, 5th Year, Iowa, D4a-12

- ▶ Ranks third on the team with 19.0 sacks since the start of the 2013 regular season (LB Julius Peppers-24.0 / LB Clay Matthews-29.0).
- ► Led the defensive line in both tackles and sacks each of that last two seasons.
- Returned a fumble 43 yards for a TD vs. Detroit in Week 14 of 2012, the longest fumble return for a TD by a rookie in franchise history.
- Starred as an interior pass rusher at Iowa, posting a team-high 24.5 tackles for a loss and 13 sacks from 2010-11.

LOLB Nick Perry, 5th Year, Southern California, D1-12

- Leads the team with a career-high eight sacks this season.
- Registered mulitple sacks in each of his first five seasons in the NFL and has posted a two-sack game in each of the last four seasons (2013-16).
- Has totaled six sacks in five playoff games, including 3.5 in the 2015 postseason which tied Clay Matthews (2010) for the franchise record in a single posteason.
- His six postseason sacks rank No. 3 in franchise history behind Matthews (10) and Reggie White (eight) and are the most in team history (since 1982) by a player in his first five games with Green Bay.

ILB Jake Ryan, 2nd Year, Michigan, D4-15

- Ranks No. 2 on the team with 65 tackles on the season.
- Started the final five games of the regular season and both playoff contests in 2015.
- Recorded a team-best nine tackles (eight solo) and one fumble recovery in Week 13 last season at Detroit in his first pro start.
- Served as a team captain for his final two seasons at Michigan and was a three-time winner (2012-14) of the Roger Zatkoff Award, given to the Wolverines top linebacker. He was the only player to win the award (est. 1991) three times.
- ► Joined LB John Anderson (first round, 26th overall) as the only Michigan linebackers ever drafted by Green Bay.
- Started 41 of 46 games played in college, appearing at inside linebacker as a senior after spending his first three seasons at outside linebacker and defensive end.

ILB Blake Martinez, Rookie, Stanford, D4a-16

- Ranks No. 4 on the team with 58 tackles this season. Has started nine of 10 games he has played in this year.
- Became the first rookie to start on defense for Green Bay in Week 1 since Nick Perry in 2012.
- Finished collegiate career with 257 tackles (137 solo), 13.5 tackles for a loss, 6.5 sacks, five interceptions and five forced fumbles in 51 games played.
- Started all 27 games played in his final two seasons, leading the team in tackles as a junior (102) and senior (141).
- Led the Pacific-12 and ranked No. 7 nationally with 141 tackles (75 solo) as a senior, averaging a conference-best 10.1 tackles per game.

ROLB Clay Matthews, 8th Year, Southern California, D1b-09

HE DOPE SHEET

- For the first time in his career, recorded at least one sack in each of the first three regular-season games he played in.
- Selected to his sixth Pro Bowl and first as an inside linebacker in 2015 after recording 6.5 sacks (second on the team), 15 QB hits (No. 1 on the team), and a career-high 85 tackles (No. 2 on the team).
- ► With 71.5 careeer sacks, passed Reggie White (68.5) for the second most sacks in Packers history (Kabeer Gbaja-Biamila, 74.5).
- With a team-high 11.0 sacks in 2014, is tied for the most 10-plus sack seasons in franchise history (four).
- Is the only player in franchise history to score a defensive TD (interception or fumble return) in each of his first three seasons in the NFL (2009-11).

LCB Damarious Randall, 2nd Year, Arizona State, D1-15

- Played in 15 games with nine starts (six at LCB, two at RCB, one in the slot) in 2015 and tied for the team lead and No. 2 among NFL rookies with three interceptions, including one he returned for a TD. Finished with a team-best 16 passes defensed.
- ▶ Named the NFL's Defensive Rookie of the Month for November 2015, joining CB Casey Hayward (October 2012) as the only Green Bay defensive backs to win the award.
- Earned first-team All-Pacific-12 honors at safety as a senior in 2014 after he led the Sun Devils in tackles (106) and passes defensed (12) and tied for the team lead with three interceptions.

RCB Quinten Rollins, 2nd Year, Miami (Ohio), D2-15

- Has started seven of the nine games (three at LCB, three as the third CB) he has appeared in this season. Missed Weeks 6-8 with a groin injury.
 Played in 14 games with four starts (two at LCB, two at RCB) in 2015.
- Tied for No. 3 on the team and No. 4 among NFL rookies with two interceptions last season.
- Returned his first career interception 45 yards for a touchdown, becoming the first Packers rookie to record a pick-six since S Marques Anderson in 2002 (vs. Detroit, Nov. 10).
- Played one season of college football and was named Mid-American Conference Defensive Player of the Year and first-team All-MAC.

SS Morgan Burnett, 7th Year, Georgia Tech, D3-10

- Tied for No. 1 among NFL safeties with a career-best three sacks this season. Ranks No. 1 on the team with 74 tackles.
- Missed five games due to injury in 2015, but finished No. 4 on the team with 54 solo tackles.
- ► Totaled a team-high 125 tackles in 2014, the second most of his career (137 in 2012). Ranked No. 2 on the team with 106 tackles (77 solo) in 2013, despite missing the first three games due to injury. Recovered three fumbles, including one for a TD, and added nine passes defensed.
- Participated in all 1,088 plays for Green Bay's defense in 2012, one of only four non-OL in the NFL to appear in 100 percent of his team's snaps.
- Started the first four games of the 2010 season at SS before sustaining a season-ending knee injury vs. Detroit in Week 4.

FS Ha Ha Clinton-Dix, 3rd Year, Alabama, D1-14

- According to STATS, joins Ravens S Eric Weddle and Eagles S Rodney McLeod are the only safeties with one or more forced fumbles and three interceptions this season.
- Posted a career high in Week 9 with two INTs and became the first Green Bay safety to register two INTs in a game since Morgan Burnett did so vs. Minnesota on Dec. 2, 2012. He joined CB Al Harris (vs. New Orleans, Oct. 9, 2005) as the only players to post two INTs in a first quarter for the Packers since 1993.
- Led the team in tackles in 2015 with 117 (97 solo) and was tied for fourth on the team in interceptions (two).
- According to STATS, his three sacks during the 2015 regular season tied for the fifth most in a single regular season by a Packers safety (since 1982) and the most since Mark Roman recorded 3.5 in 2004.
- Started every game in 2015 after starting 10 of 16 games as a rookie when he finished second on the team in tackles (95).
- Was a consensus All-America selection in 2013 as a junior, earning first-team recognition from *The Associated Press*, the Football Writers Association of America and *Sporting News*.

- However, position coaches are available for questions on specific players and the position group only. Broader interview topics need to be directed to the respective coordinators.
- ► No assistant coach should be contacted directly by telephone (at his desk, home or on his cell phone), or by email. All interviews must be arranged through the P.R. department.
- ► Sarah Quick (920-569-7213) serves as the primary contact for assistant coaches. In her absence, feel free to contact another member of the P.R. staff.

PRACTICE ACCESS, PHOTOGRAPHY AND SOCIAL-MEDIA GUIDELINES

During the regular season, practices will be open to state media who regularly cover the team for designated periods during the first half of each session, similar to previous seasons. Also as in prior years, photo opportunities will be limited to the beginning portions of practice.

- ► The team reserves the right to limit photography to certain periods for competitive reasons. This restriction applies to both training-camp and regular-season practices.
- During practice periods in which B-roll and still photography are NOT permitted, the media may not utilize camera phones either. The P.R. staff will alert the media of the permissible "shooting" periods before and during each practice.
- ► Video of practice, press conferences or locker-room interviews by an individual or media outlet may not be posted at any time on social-media sites or live-broadcasting applications (this includes applications such as Facebook, Twitter, Vine, Instagram, Snapchat, Ustream, Periscope and Meerkat, etc).
- ►No still photography is permitted in the locker room at any time. Signs, notes and other personal items or information posted in and around the locker room at player lockers are not to be photographed or captured on video.

ONLINE-CONTENT POLICY

According to the 2016 NFL non-game online content policy, accredited organizations may distribute online non-game audio and video content, including interviews, press conferences and team practices at NFL venues, acquired as a result of credentialed access ("Game Information") to games or club/league facilities provided that such distribution: is 90 seconds maximum per day (180 seconds in two-team markets – 90 seconds per team); may not be "archived" (i.e., made available for on-demand public access) for more than 24 hours; appears in an editorial context only (no sponsorship, merchandising or advertising integrated with or around the content); is not posted live; and is accompanied by links back to NFL.com and to the club website.

The 90-second limit does not include video/audio material that is composed entirely of a credentialed media employee providing commentary or analysis ("talking head" reporting), including pregame or postgame stand-up material shot on the field or other facility location.

While a game is in progress, any forms of accounts of the game must be sufficiently time-delayed and limited in amount (e.g., score updates with detail given only in quarterly game updates, fewer than 10 photographs during the game) so that the accredited organization's game coverage cannot be used as a substitute for, or otherwise approximate, authorized play-by-play accounts.

The Packers have their own social-media and online-content policies for practice reporting, which will be communicated by the P.R. staff for both training camp and the regular season. Members of the media are encouraged to contact the public relations staff with any questions.

MEDIA INFORMATION & POLICIES

CONFERENCE CALLS

The Packers' P.R. department will arrange a conference call with the head coach and a key player of the opposing team each week during the regular season. These conference calls will be made from the media workroom, and generally will be held on Wednesday.

In the Lee Remmel Press Box at Lambeau Field, more than a dozen "co-op" phones are available to media throughout the box. Instruments also may be obtained through Guth, upon request.

Dedicated internet service also may be ordered through Dataline Services – on a game-by-game or full-season basis – for installation in either the Lee Remmel Press Box or in the downstairs Photo/Media Workrooms.

Photo credentials will not be issued to freelance photographers unless on a specific assignment from an accredited organization. Credentials are not provided to "grips" due to on-field space limitations.

Credentials not obtained prior to gameday will be left at Media Will Call on the south side of the stadium near the Shopko Gate. Media Will Call opens three hours prior to kickoff.

MINIVEAPOLIS -- Sam Bradford had a Minnesota debut almost as dazzling as the new \$1.1 billion building itself, completing 22 of 31 passes for 286 yards, two touchdowns and no turnovers to lead the Vikings to a 17-14 victory over the Green Bay Packers on Sunday night just 15 days after be arrived in a trade. Rodgers threw for 205 yards and four touchdowns, including two in the first half to Jordy Nelson, and the Packers snapped out of their offensive funk before holding off the Detroit Lions for a 34-27 win Sunday. Rodgers was 15 of 24, leading the Packers to touchdowns on their first three series. Nelson had 101 yards on six catches, returning to the form that made him one of the NFL's best receivers before missing the 2015 season with a knee injury.

They moved the ball on the Lions' short-handed defense with ease in the first half. The Packers (2-1) led 31-10 at halftime before the Lions slowly

Marvin Jones' 35-yard touchdown catch with 3:34 left got Detroit (1-2) within seven. But Rodgers had a critical 11-yard run on third-and-8 from

Jones had a career-high 205 yards on six receptions. Matthew Stafford passed for 385 yards and three scores for the Lions, who held advantages in total yardage (418-324) and time of possession, holding the ball for 35 minutes. But the Packers burned the secondary with big plays to build a big lead, and Eddie Lacy ran for 103 yards on 17 carries. Coach Mike McCarthy and Rodgers heard questions about the out-of-sync passing game following the 17-14 loss last week to Minnesota. Now the Packers head into an early by week with renewed confidence after a successful opener at Lambeau Field. The Lions gained chunks of yardage in the second half after being forced to play casth-up following Green Bay's big early lead. The Packers' defense was also missing four starters, including intelacker Cay Matthews. Stafford found holes over the middle of the field. He connected with Jones for a 23-yard completion on the first play from scrimmage in the

second half to the Detroit 46. But Green Bay's staunch run defense had another big day, albeit against a Lions offense playing without injured tallback Ameer Abdullah. Detroit managed just 50 yards on 23 carries, with a team-high 38 yards on 10 carries by Dwayne Washington. Jones gave the Lions a boost going into halftime with a 73-yard touchdown pass from Stafford to get Detroit within 31-10. He stiff-armed corner-back Josh Hawkins before sprinting untouched 45 yards into the end zone.

The Packers' offense accomplished two of McCarthy's bigger goals for this week: Receivers worked the middle of the field, and Lacy got more car-ries in the running game. Nelson was lined up in the slot on his 8-yard touchdown catch in the first quarter, when Rodgers pump-faked, then stepped up in the pocket to find Nelson. Lacy looked rejuvenated as he bounced off defenders for a 25-yard run in the second quarter.

ATLANTA (AP) — The Atlanta Falcons found themselves in another tight game. This time, they came through with the winning play. After two excruciating losses, the Falcons rallied for a 33-32 victory over the Green Bay Packers when Matt Ryan threw an 11-yard touchdown pass to Mohamed Sanu with 31 seconds remaining Sunday.

• With 88 catches in 2014-15, joined WRs Randall Cobb (105 in 2011-12) and Greg Jennings (98 in 2006-07) as the only Packers over the last 25 seasons to register 85-plus receptions in their first two seasons in the league.

Caught a career-high 50 passes for a career-best 483 yards (9.7 avg.) and a TD last season despite missing three games due to an ankle injury.
Played in all 16 games with 11 starts as a rookie in 2014, hauling in 38 receptions for 446 yards (14.2 avg.) and three TDs.

• Set franchise postseason single-game records for the most catches and receiving yards by a rookie when he posted seven grabs for 117 yards (16.7 avg.) and a TD in a 2014 NFC Divisional playoff victory vs. Dallas.

2016 SEASON: Has played in all 12 games with 11 starts and has made 58 catches for 793 yards (13.4 avg.) and a career-high eight TDs...Is tied for No. 4 in the NFL in TD catches and joins WR Jordy Nelson (10) as the only teammate duo in the NFL with eight-plus TD receptions each this season...Is tied for the team lead (Nelson) with a career-high three 100yard receiving games this season...Has posted two games this season with both 100-plus receiving yards and two TD catches, tied with Buccaneers WR Mike Evans for the league lead...Is tied for No. 4 in the league with 10 red-zone catches...Is tied for No. 4 in the league with 44 receptions since Week 7 and ranks No. 3 in the NFL over that span with 575 receiving yards. ►At Jacksonville (Sept. 11): Started as the team opened with three WRs and finished with three catches for 50 yards (16.7 avg.), highlighted by his 29-yard TD catch with 13 seconds in the first half that gave the Packers a 21-17 lead that they would not relinquish...With CB Davon House on his back, made a diving grab in the end zone for the longest TD catch of his career in the regular season as QB Aaron Rodgers fought off

a sack attempt from CB Jalen Ramsey. ►At Minnesota (Sept. 18): Started as the third WR and played 54 snaps, finishing with three catches for 26 yards (8.7 avg.)...On a third down midway through the first quarter, drew a 40-yard pass-interference penalty on Vikings CB Terence Newman that gave Green Bay the ball at the Minnesota 5 to help set up a 1-yard TD pass from Rodgers to WR Jordy Nelson.

►Vs. Detroit (Sept. 25): Caught two passes for 23 yards (11.5 avg.) in 25 snaps of action, highlighted by a 14-yard TD grab on Green Bay's opening drive...Beat CB Quandre Diggs on a slant and then shook off a tackle attempt near the goal line from S Glover Quin to get into the end zone... Also had a 9-yard catch late in the game that helped the Packers clinch the win and run out the clock.

►Vs. N.Y. Giants (Oct. 9): Started as the third WR and posted a season-high five receptions for a season-best 85 yards (17.0 avg.) and a TD...His 17.0-yard receiving average was his second-best single-game mark (min. three rec.) behind only his six-catch, 121-yard effort (20.2 avg.) vs. New England on Nov. 30, 2014...Caught a 29-yard TD pass midway through the second quarter, matching the longest TD reception of his career...Beat CB Michael Hunter down the right sideline and hauled in the pass from Rodgers near the 10-yard line, keeping his feet in bounds for the final few yards as he extended the ball past the pylon.

► Vs. Dallas (Oct. 16): Started as the third WR and had two receptions for 34 yards (17.0 avg.)...Left the game to be evaluated for a concussion after absorbing a big hit on his 12-yard catch on a third-and-11 in the third quarter, and did not return.

►Vs. Chicago (Oct. 20): Started as the third WR and posted career highs in receptions (13), receiving yards (132) and TD catches (two), with his catch total tying the second-best mark in franchise history behind only Don Hutson's 14-catch game at the N.Y. Giants on Nov. 22, 1942...Set a team record for the most catches in a game at Lambeau Field...Along with WRs Randall Cobb (11) and Ty Montgomery (10), became only the second trio in NFL history to all record 10-plus catches in the same game...Made a leaping 5-yard TD grab on third down over CB De'Vante Busby in the third quarter, giving Green Bay a 13-10 lead it would not relinquish...On the first play of the fourth quarter, found himself wide open on a slant for a 4-yard TD...Was named NFC Offensive Player of the Week for his performance, his first time winning the award as he joined Greg Jennings as the only Green

Bay WRs to earn the honor over the past 15 seasons.

►At Atlanta (Oct. 30): Started and played 58 of 62 snaps, leading the team with 12 catches for 74 yards (6.2 avg.) to become the first player in team history to register 12-plus receptions in back-to-back games...His 25 receptions in Weeks 7-8 set a franchise record for the most combined catches over a two-game span...Now holds two of the top six single-game catch totals in franchise history, joining Hutson as the only players in team annals to do so...Came out of the backfield to catch a swing pass from Rodgers for a 22-yard gain late in the first quarter, making S Keanu Neal miss as he took it down the sideline to the Atlanta 24.

►Vs. Indianapolis (Nov. 6): Started and had four receptions for 41 yards (10.3 avg.) and a TD...Had a 40-yard catch in the fourth quarter, getting open near the right sideline against CB Rashaan Melvin and then making Melvin miss to pick up extra yardage down to the Indianapolis 13...Three plays later, caught a slant for a 2-yard TD against CB Patrick Robinson.

► At Tennessee (Nov. 13): Started and played 74 of 78 snaps, finishing with a career-high 156 yards receiving on six catches (26.0 avg.)... Marked the highest receiving-yardage total by a Green Bay player since Nelson recorded 209 yards vs. the N.Y. Jets on Sept. 14, 2014...Had three receptions of 35-plus yards (46, 38, 35), becoming the first Packer to do so since STATS began charting catches of 25-plus yards in 1991...On his season-long 46-yard grab, was matched up on the outside with CB Perrish Cox in the second quarter and caught a back-shoulder throw from Rodgers before taking it down the middle of the field to the Tennessee 39...Later in the quarter, beat CB Brice McCain to find room in the middle of the field for a 38-yard catch-and run to the Tennessee 19 that set up Rodgers' 13-yard TD pass to RB James Starks two plays later...Early in the third quarter on a fourth down, beat CB Jason McCourty down the sideline, laying out to make a 35-yard catch to the Tennessee 22, a reception that helped set up Rodgers' 20-yard TD run two plays later.

► At Washington (Nov. 20): Started and played 67 of 70 snaps, hauling in three catches for 42 yards (14.0 avg.), highlighted by a 37-yard reception late in the fourth quarter...Found an opening over the middle to make the grab near the Green Bay 27 before taking it down the sideline to the Washington 46.

• Is tied for No. 1 in franchise history (since 1982) with four 10-sack seasons (White and Gbaja-Biamila).

2016 SEASON: Has started all eight games he has played in (five at OLB, three at ILB) and ranks No. 3 on the team with four sacks...Has registered 21 tackles (17 solo), five tackles for a loss, 11 QB hits (No. 3 on the team) and nine pressures...Was sidelined for four games (Weeks 3, 8-10) due to injury.

• One of only three players in team annals to have three or more seasons with 10-plus TD receptions (Sharpe, four; Hutson, three).

• Eclipsed the 1,000-yard receiving mark three times over a four-year span (2011, 2013-14).

• Ranks No. 5 in franchise history in receptions (461) and receiving yards (6,981) and No. 4 in TD receptions (59).

• Set a single-season franchise record with 1,519 receiving yards in 2014, topping WR Robert Brooks' mark of 1,497 yards in 1995, on the way to being selected to his first career Pro Bowl and earning second-team All-Pro honors from *The Associated Press*.

• Is tied for No. 4 in the NFL for the most TD catches since 2011 with 52 despite missing the entire 2015 season due to injury.

2016 SEASON: Has started all 12 games and leads the team with 69 receptions for 872 yards (12.6 avg.) and 10 TDs...Is tied for No. 2 in the league in TD catches, tied for No. 9 in the league in receptions and ranks No. 9 in receiving yards...Joins Mike Evans, Antonio Brown and Odell Beckham Jr. as the only players in the league to rank in the top 10 in all three major receiving categories (catches, receiving yards, receiving TDs)...Has posted a TD catch in nine games this season, the most in the NFL...Ranks No. 1 in the league with 14 red-zone receptions and leads the NFL in red-zone TDs with eight, two more than any other player in the league...Has posted six games with 90-plus receiving yards, tied for No. 2 in the NFL.

• Has played in 230 games with 223 starts as a pro, appearing in all 16 contests in 12 of his first 14 seasons in the NFL. Has missed just two games due to injury during his career.

• Is the only player in NFL history with 100-plus sacks (142.5) and 10-plus interceptions (11).

• Since entering the NFL in 2002, ranks No. 1 in the league in sacks (142.5) and No. 3 in forced fumbles (46). His career sack total ranks No. 5 in NFL history (since 1982), with all four players ahead of him (Bruce Smith, Reggie White, Kevin Greene, Chris Doleman) in the Pro Football Hall of Fame.

2016 SEASON: Has played in all 12 games with seven starts and ranks No. 2 on the team with 6.5 sacks...Has posted 22 tackles (17 solo), eight tackles for a loss (tied for No. 2 on the team), a forced fumble, nine QB hits and 11 pressures (tied for No. 2 on the team).

• Named the NFL's Defensive Rookie of the Month for November 2015, joining CB Casey Hayward (October 2012) as the only Green Bay defensive backs to win the award.

• Earned first-team All-Pacific-12 honors at safety as a senior in 2014 after he led the Sun Devils in tackles (106) and passes defensed (12) and tied for the team lead with three interceptions.

• Originally drafted by the Packers as their second selection in the sixth round (210th overall) of the 2015 NFL Draft. Was on Green Bay's practice squad for the entire 2015 season.

• Started all 13 games as a senior in 2014, anchoring a defensive line that helped the Ragin' Cajuns lead the Sun Belt in rushing defense while ranking third in sacks.

• Was named the state's Defensive Player of the Year by the Louisiana Sports Writers Association after ranking seventh in the nation in tackles for loss (20) and 12th in the country in sacks (11½). His 11½ sacks tied the school single-season record and he also finished tied for No. 1 in school history with 21.0 career sacks.

2016 SEASON: Has played in five games and has posted four tackles (one solo)...Has been inactive for the other seven contests (Weeks 5-6 and 9-13, healthy scratch).

► At Jacksonville (Sept. 11): Played 12 snaps on defense in his NFL debut and posted a solo tackle, stopping RB T.J. Yeldon for a 1-yard loss on a run up the middle in the second quarter.

• Ranks No. 1 in NFL history (min. 1,500 attempts) in career passer rating (103.5), interception percentage (1.59) and TD/INT ratio (3.97, 286/72).

• Has posted five seasons (2009, 2011-12, 2014-15) with 500-plus passing attempts and eight or fewer INTs, the most in NFL history ahead of Patriots QB Tom Brady (three seasons) and five QBs (one season each).

• Was named the league's Most Valuable Player by *The Associated Press* in 2014 for the second time in his career (2011), becoming the eighth player in league history to win the honor multiple times.

• Is the only quarterback in league history to record a 100-plus passer rating in six consecutive seasons (2009-14), with no other QB doing so in more than four straight years.

• Is one of only eight quarterbacks in NFL annals with 30,000-plus passing yards and 2,000-plus rushing yards. Has posted four 300-yard rushing seasons, No. 2 among QBs in franchise history behind only Tobin Rote (five).

• In 131 career regular-season starts (86-45 record), has posted 47 games with 300-plus passing yards, 76 without an interception (min. 15 attempts) and 72 with a 100-plus passer rating.

• Has been selected to the Pro Bowl in five of the last seven seasons (2009, 2011-12, 2014-15).

the second-most prolific combo in franchise history behind only QB Brett Favre and WR Antonio Freeman (57)...On Green Bay's opening drive, had a key 11-yard run to the Giants' 6 on third-and-10, bouncing around the pocket before taking it down the left sideline for the first down that set up his TD pass to Nelson just two plays later...Midway through the second quarter, perfectly placed a ball over the shoulder of Adams down the right sideline with CB Michael Hunter covering him for a 29-yard score.

►Vs. Dallas (Oct. 16): Completed a season-high 31 passes on 42 attempts for a season-best 294 yards and a TD with one INT for a 90.8 passer rating...Completed passes to nine different players, a season high.

Connected with Nelson on a season-long 58-yard pass on Green Bay's opening drive, hitting him perfectly in stride as Nelson took it down the sideline to the Atlanta 7...Posted a career-high 60 rushing yards on just six carries (10.0 avg.), including a 23-yard scamper down the sideline at the end of the first half out to the Green Bay 48 to help set up K Mason Crosby's 29-yard FG as time expired...Dating back to 1960, his rushing total was the second-best mark by a Green Bay QB behind only Don Majkowski's 88-yard outing at Detroit on Sept. 30, 1990...Tied his career high with three runs of 10-plus yards (23, 13, 11)...Joined Panthers QB Cam Newton (Dec. 20, 2015, at N.Y. Giants) as the only QBs over the past four seasons (2013-16) to register four-plus passing TDs and 60-plus rushing yards in a game.

►Vs. Indianapolis (Nov. 6): Completed 26 of 43 passes for 297 yards and three TDs with one INT for a 94.8 passer rating...It marked his 50th career regular-season game with three-plus TD passes...Was his third straight game with three-plus TD passes, the only NFL quarterback to accomplish that feat in 2016...Drew the Colts offside on the final play of the first quarter on a third down and found Nelson for a 26-yard jump-ball TD in the end zone...Rushed for 43 yards on six carries (7.2 avg.), the first time in his career that he had posted 40-plus rushing yards in back-to-back games...Had a 21-yard run down the right sideline late in the fourth quarter to the Indianapolis 16 that helped set up his TD pass to Cobb, giving him a 20-yard run in back-to-back games for the first time in his career.

► At Washington (Nov. 20): Connected on 26 of 41 passes for 351 yards and three TDs with no INTs for a 115.0 passer rating, his fourth game this season with three-plus passing TDs and no INTs...It marked just the third time in his career (2009, 2011) that he posted back-to-back 350-yard passing games...Averaged 8.56 yards per attempt, a season high...

Posted a season-high five completions of 25-plus yards, connecting with TE Jared Cook (47 and 29), Cobb (47) and Adams (37), and RB James Starks (31-yard TD)...Recorded a 151.4 passer rating on third down, completing 9 of 13 attempts for 195 yards and two TDs...The 195 yards passing on third down was the second-highest output of his career behind only

his 217 yards at Pittsburgh on Dec. 20, 2009...Went over the 35,000-yard passing mark for his career, reaching it on his 4,446th attempt, the second fastest in NFL history behind only Unitas (4,388 attempts)...Rushed for 33 yards on three carries (11.0 avg.), including a 17-yard scamper to the Washington 6 late in the second quarter that helped set up a 36-yard Mason Crosby FG.

► At Philadelphia (Nov. 28): Completed 30 of 39 passes for 313 yards and two TDs with no INTs for a 116.7 passer rating, his first game this season with 30-plus completions and a completion percentage of 75 percent or higher...Posted 300-plus passing yards for the third straight game, tied for the second-longest single-season streak of his career behind only a four-game streak in 2011...Helped the offense convert 10 of 14 third downs, a 71.4 percentage that is the best in the NFL this season and the second-best mark posted by Green Bay under Head Coach Mike McCarthy (13 of 18, 72.2 percent, at Minnesota, Oct. 27, 2013)...Both of his TD passes went to Adams, with the second one a perfectly placed 20-yarder in a tight window that Adams caught in the back of the end zone with CB Nolan Carroll in tight coverage...Completed 9 of 10 passes on third down for 94 yards (105.8 rating)...Also rushed for 26 yards on six carries (4.3 avg.), with three of the runs picking up first downs.

►Vs. Houston (Dec. 4): Playing with an injured hamstring, completed 20 of 30 passes for 209 yards and two TDs with no INTs for a 108.9 passer rating, his third straight game with a 100-plus rating...It marked his seventh straight game with two-plus TD passes, tied for the second-longest streak of his career (2012) behind only a 13-game streak in 2011...It also marked his third straight game without an INT...Rolled out to his right and threw across his body to find Cobb in the end zone for a 9-yard TD pass in the second quarter...Led the offense on a 12-play, 98-yard TD drive in the fourth quarter that was capped off with his 32-yard TD pass to a wide-open Nelson in the end zone...The drive was the longest by the Packers since a 99-yarder at Cleveland on Oct. 25, 2009...Later in the quarter, led the offense on an eight-play, 89-yard drive that put the Packers up 21-7...Also had three carries for 16 yards (5.3 avg.), including a key 11-yard scramble early in the fourth quarter on Green Bay's go-ahead drive.

82 Richard Rodgers, TE, 3rd Year, California

• Had 58 receptions in 2015, becoming just the fourth TE in team history to record 55-plus receptions in a season (Paul Coffman, Jermichael Finley, Jackie Harris).

• Was one of only four TEs in the NFL last season to register 55-plus catches, 500-plus receiving yards and eight or more TD receptions (Rob Gronkowski, Jordan Reed, Gary Barnidge).

• Registered 10 TD catches in 2014-15, tied for the most by a Green Bay TE in his first two seasons since the 1970 AFL-NFL merger (Bubba Franks, 2000-01). His eight TD receptions in '15 were tied for the fifth most in a season by a Packers TE.

 Saw the most significant action of his career in 2015, appearing in all 16 games with three starts at center in place of an injured Corey Linsley.

Has seen game action at center, left guard and both tackle spots during his NFL career.

Was on track to be the starting center in 2014, opening at that position for the first three preseason contests that year, but sustained a knee injury vs. Oakland (Aug. 22) that would sideline him for the first half of the season.
Played in the final eight regular-season games and both playoff contests. Spent the majority of his rookie campaign in 2013 on reserve/physically unable to perform after sustaining a significant ankle injury during the first practice of Organized Team Activities in the spring.

2016 SEASON: Has started all seven games he has played in at C... Part of a line that has helped the Packers rank in the top 10 in the NFL in third-down conversions (No. 2, 47.9), time of possession (No. 5, 31:18), first downs (tied for No. 7, 264), 10-play drives (tied for No. 4, 26) and passing yards (No. 10, 261.2)...Has been inactive for five games (Weeks 9-13) due to a knee injury.

►At Jacksonville (Sept. 11): Started at C and played all 64 snaps...

►At Atlanta (Oct. 30): Started at C and played all 62 snaps, helping protect Rodgers as he threw for 246 yards and four TDs on 28-of-38 passing...Helped the offense rack up 108 rushing yards on 19 carries (5.7 avg.)...Sustained a knee injury on the second-to-last play of the game.

►Vs. Indianapolis (Nov. 6) – Vs. Houston (Dec. 4): Inactive (knee).
