## STEELERS PRONUNCIATION GUIDE

The Steelers have won each of their three primetime games in 2016: a Kickoff Weekend Monday Night Football victory at the Washington Redskins (38-16), a Week Four Sunday Night Football win vs. Kansas City at Heinz Field (43-14) and a Thursday Night Football win on Thanksgiving Day at the Indianapolis Colts (28-7).

Pittsburgh will host the Baltimore Ravens in Week 16 (NFL Network, 4:30 p.m.) on Dec. 25 to mark the first Christmas Day game in franchise history.

### COLOR RUSH ON CHRISTMAS DAY

Pittsburgh will debut its 'color rush' uniforms on Christmas Day when the team hosts the Baltimore Ravens at Heinz Field. Steelers President **Art Rooney II** announced during halftime of the team's first preseason game on KDKA-TV that the team's 'color rush' uniforms will be all black with gold numbers.

### STEELERS ON THANKSGIVING

The Steelers earned their second win on Thanksgiving Day in team history on Nov. 24 (Week 12), defeating the Indianapolis Colts 28-7 in a nationally televised primetime game on Thursday Night Football.

This marked the fifth straight season Pittsburgh donned their 1934 throwback uniforms and the last occasion.

The team first wore these in 2012 during the team's 80th season in professional football.

### **THE STEELERS**

- Pittsburgh improved to 7-5 overall, 4-2 at home and to 2-2 vs. NFC teams in 2016.
- Pittsburgh earned its fourth win at Heinz Field in 2016, extending the team's streak of at least four regular-season home wins to 17 seasons, dating back to 2000.
- The Steelers are now 30-44-3 in regular-season history against the Giants (14-22-3 at home) and 1-1 at Heinz Field.
- The Steelers have won two consecutive regular-season games against the Giants (Nov. 4, 2012 at New York, 24-20).
- Pittsburgh improved to 5-9 in regular-season games against New York in the month of December (3-1 at home in the month).
- The Steelers are now 25-6-1 at Heinz Field against NFC teams since the stadium opened in 2001.
- The Steelers have won each of their last previous seven regular-season home games in the month of December, dating back to Dec. 15, 2013.
- Pittsburgh improved to 30-9 in regular-season home games in the month of December at Heinz Field since the stadium opened in 2001.
- The Steelers were credited with a safety in the first quarter – the team's first safety recorded since Oct. 26, 2014 vs. Indianapolis.
- Held New York scoreless in the first half to mark the defense's third first half shutout of 2016 and the 17th of Mike Tomlin era.
- Held New York scoreless in the first quarter to mark the defense's fourth first quarter shutout of 2016.

### **HEAD COACH MIKE TOMLIN**

- Is now 99-57 during the regular season in his Steelers' tenure since 2007 (57-21 at home).
- Improved to 2-1 as the Steelers' head coach in regular-season games vs. New York (1-1 at home).
- Is now 26-14 in regular-season games vs. NFC teams (15-5 at home).
- Improved to 26-13 in regular-season games during the month of December (18-6 at home during the month).
- Is now 76-14 when the Steelers hold a lead at halftime.

### **QB BEN ROETHLISBERGER**

- Completed 24-of-36 passes for 289 yards with two touchdowns and one interception for a passer rating of 98.0
- Improved to 120-60 as a starter during the regular season (68-22 at home).
- Increased his Steelers franchise record for the most wins as a starting quarterback to 120 (Terry Bradshaw, 107).
- Is now 3-1 against New York in the regular season as a starter (1-1 at home).
- Improved to 32-15 in his regular-season career against NFC teams (18-5 at home).
- Eclipsed 3,000 passing yards on the season to mark his 11th consecutive 3,000-yard campaign, dating back to 2006.
- Has connected with WR Antonio Brown on 49 touchdown passes – tying as the most QB-WR touchdown strikes in Steelers history (Terry Bradshaw-Lynn Swann: 49).
- Has thrown at least one touchdown pass in 43 consecutive home games in which he has played – the third-longest streak in NFL history and the longest active (Tom Brady: 47, Drew Brees: 60).

### **QB BEN ROETHLISBERGER (Cont'd)**

- Threw his 25th touchdown pass of the season on his second scoring toss to mark his sixth season with at least 25 touchdown passes.
- Reached 200 passing yards in the first half (204) to mark his second opening half of a game in 2016 with at least 200 yards (18th of his NFL career).
- Threw for 104 yards in the first quarter to mark his third opening quarter of a game with at least 100 yards in 2016 (31st of his NFL career).

### **WR ANTONIO BROWN**

- Tied for the team high with six receptions for 54 yards, one of those being a 22-yard touchdown.
- Extended his consecutive regular-season games started streak to 48 – the third-longest active consecutive games started streak among NFL wide receivers.
- Has registered at least one reception in 101 consecutive games in which he has played, including the postseason – dating back to October 3, 2010.
- Has registered at least one reception in 96 consecutive regular-season games – dating back to October 3, 2010.
- Recorded 88 catches through the first 12 games of a season, the fourth-most in Steelers history through the first 12 games of a season.
- Eclipsed 1,000 receiving yards in 2016 (1,052) to mark the fifth 1,000-yard season of his NFL career and fourth consecutive.
- Is the second player in Steelers history (Hines Ward, 2001-04) to register four straight 1,000-receiving yard campaigns.
- Broke a tie with Lynn Swann (53) for sole possession of the fifth-most total touchdowns in Steelers history, now with 54.
- Hauled in his 11th touchdown reception of the season to tie for the fifth-most in a season in Steelers history and the second-most in his NFL career of his team record of 13 in 2014.

### **RB Le'VEON BELL**

- Totaled game highs in rushing yards (118) and yards from scrimmage (182: 118 rushing / 64 receiving).
- Surpassed Rashard Mendenhall (3,549) for ninth on the Steelers' all-time rushing yardage list, now with 3,594.
- Posted the 12th 100-yard rushing game of his NFL career.
- Eclipsed 100 rushing yards in three consecutive games for the first time in his NFL career.
- Recorded his third consecutive 100-yard rushing game to mark the longest streak in his NFL career.
- Is the first Steeler with a three-game 100-yard rushing streak since the 2006-07 seasons (Willie Parker, four games, Dec. 31, 2006-Sept. 23, 2007).
- Has posted at least 100 yards from scrimmage in 29 career regular-season games.
- Has posted at least 100 yards from scrimmage in four consecutive games and in eight of his nine games played in 2016.
- Registered at least 150 yards from scrimmage for the 10th time in his NFL career during the regular-season.
- Surpassed Dick Hoak (5,417) for the 10th-most yards from scrimmage in Steelers history, with 5,484.
- Notched 60 receptions in 2016 on his third catch to mark the second 60-catch season of his NFL career (2014: 83).

**TE LADARIUS GREEN**

- Recorded the first 100-yard game of his NFL career, finishing with single-game career highs in receptions (6) and receiving yards (110).
- Scored his first touchdown as a Steeler on a 20-yard pass in the third quarter.

**G DAVID DeCASTRO**

- Extended his consecutive regular-season games started streak to 52 – the fourth-longest active consecutive games started streak among NFL guards.

**K RANDY BULLOCK**

- Made his Steelers debut and converted three field goal attempts (44, 34 and 38 yards) and one extra point try, improving to 28-of-37 on field goal tries within 40-49 yards and 26-of-28 on field goal attempts within 30-39 yards in his NFL career.

**CB WILLIAM GAY**

- Extended his consecutive regular season games played streak to 156 – the longest active consecutive games played streak among NFL defensive players.

**S MIKE MITCHELL**

- Extended his consecutive regular season games started streak to 58 – the fifth-longest active consecutive games played streak among NFL safeties.

**S SEAN DAVIS**

- Tied for the team lead with seven tackles and recorded the first interception of his NFL career, picking off New York QB Eli Manning in the fourth quarter.

**CB ARTIE BURNS**

- Tied for the team lead with seven tackles.

**LB JAMES HARRISON**

- Credited with a sack of New York QB Eli Manning in the third quarter, increasing his Steelers sack total to 79.5 – the most by a Steeler since the statistic became official in 1982.
- Has recorded a sack in three consecutive games for the fifth time in his NFL career (Sept. 29-Oct. 19, 2008, Nov. 3-Nov. 16, 2008, Sept. 27-Nov. 11, 2009 and Nov. 18-Dec. 2, 2012).
- Increased his 2016 sack total to 5.0 – the ninth season of his NFL career with at least 5.0 quarterback takedowns.

**LB LAWRENCE TIMMONS**

- Extended his streak of consecutive regular-season games started to 97 – the longest active streak among current Steelers – and the longest active streak among NFL linebackers.
- Extended his consecutive regular season games played streak to 116 – the longest active consecutive games played streak among NFL linebackers.
- Tied for the team lead with seven tackles.

**DE RICARDO MATHEWS**

- Credited with a sack of New York QB Eli Manning in the fourth quarter, his first sack as a Steeler and the fifth of his NFL career.

**PITTSBURGH** – The Steelers used a balanced attack on offense and a stingy defense to beat the Buffalo Bills, 23-10, at Heinz Field.

On Pittsburgh's first drive of the game, S Jarius Byrd picked off **QB Ben Roethlisberger** and returned it to the Steelers' 36-yard line. K Dan Carpenter made a 20-yard field goal to give Buffalo a 3-0 lead.

But it would be the last points Buffalo would score until late in the fourth quarter. On the Bills' next 10 possessions, Pittsburgh either forced Buffalo to punt or caused a turnover.

Midway through the second quarter, K Shaun Suisham tied the game, 3-3, with a 36-yard field goal. And after the two-minute warning, Roethlisberger connected with WR Jerricho Cotchery on a five-yard touchdown to extend the lead, 10-3.

Late in the third quarter, **WR Antonio Brown** returned a punt 24 yards, and on the next play, Roethlisberger and Brown connected on a 40-yard pass. Six plays later, RB Le'Veon Bell scored on a four-yard run to extend Pittsburgh's lead, 17-3.

S Ryan Clark intercepted QB E.J. Manuel midway through the fourth quarter. Three plays later, Suisham made a 37-yarder to increase the Steelers' lead, 20-3. Suisham also added a 23-yarder late in the fourth quarter to give Pittsburgh a 23-3 lead.

Pittsburgh's defense allowed a season-low 227 total net yards and tied a season high with three sacks.

### FROM THE STEELERS

- With a win over Buffalo, the Steelers would improve to 441-282-2 during the regular season since 1970.
- The Steelers look to improve to 14-8 all-time against the Bills in regular-season history and to 6-7 in road games at Buffalo.
- Pittsburgh is aiming for their sixth straight win against Buffalo in the regular season.
- With a win, Pittsburgh would improve to 3-1 against Buffalo in the month of December.
- With a win, the Steelers will have won each of their last three regular-season road games.
- With a win, the Steelers would finish with a 2-2 record against the AFC East in 2016.

### FROM HEAD COACH MIKE TOMLIN

- A win would improve Tomlin to 100-57 during the regular season (43-36 on the road) and have him join Chuck Noll (193) and Bill Cowher (149) as the third head coach in team history with at least 100 wins in the regular season.

## TOMLIN AT HOME

**Mike Tomlin** has guided the Steelers to a 57-21 career regular-season record at Heinz Field. He has led the Steelers to a 4-2 mark at home in 2016 through the team's first six home games of the season.

Tomlin earned his 50th regular season home win in Week 9 in 2015 vs. Oakland and joined Chuck Noll (119) and Bill Cowher (85) as the third head coach in Steelers history with 50 regular season home victories.

Tomlin has led Pittsburgh to at least five home wins in each of his first nine seasons as the team's head coach and six in six of his nine at the helm.

## PRIMETIME SPECIALIST

Since the 2011 season, the Steelers have played in 28 primetime games, including a Week One Monday Night Football game at the Washington Redskins to kickoff the 2016 season (W, 38-16), a Week Four Sunday Night Football tilt at Heinz Field vs. Kansas City (W, 43-14) and a Week 12 Thursday Night tilt on Thanksgiving Day at the Indianapolis Colts (W, 28-7).

Mike Tomlin, the 10th-year head coach, has guided Pittsburgh to a 30-16 overall record in regular-season primetime games.

He is 10-2 on Monday Night Football, 14-8 on Sunday Night Football and 6-6 on Thursday Night Football.

Tomlin joined only Bill Cowher (Steelers), Tom Flores (Raiders), Steve Mariucci (49ers), George Seifert (49ers) and Don Shula (Colts, Dolphins) as coaches to win their first six Monday Night Football games.

## GOOD FIRST NINE



In his 10th season as the head coach of the Steelers, **Mike Tomlin** has an extensive list of accomplishments.

Tomlin earned his 90th regular-season victory in Week 14 of 2015 at Cincinnati and closed out his ninth season with 92 wins following the team's Week 17 victory at Cleveland.

His 92 wins in his first nine seasons are the most wins in team history for any coach after his first nine campaigns and his two Super Bowl appearances also are tied for the franchise best for a coach in his first nine seasons.

Tomlin's six postseason berths are tied as the most in a coach's first nine seasons with the Steelers and his four division titles are third-most.

**Mike Tomlin** earned his 90th regular-season victory in Week 14 at Cincinnati in 2015, and has accumulated a 92-52 regular-season record in his first nine seasons as a head coach in NFL (2007-15).

Tomlin is one of nine head coaches in NFL history with 90 or more regular-season wins in their first nine seasons as a head coach and his 92 wins are tied as the fourth-most among the group:

## TOMLIN'S 90TH IN NINE

**Mike Tomlin** became the third head coach in Steelers history to record 90 regular season wins in Week 14 of 2015, with the team's 33-20 victory at Cincinnati.

He joined Chuck Noll (1969-91: 193) and Bill Cowher (1992-2006: 149) in the team's 90-win club.

Tomlin's 90th win occurred in his ninth season with the Steelers, becoming the first Pittsburgh head coach to reach 90 wins in his first nine years (Bill Cowher: 1992-2000: 86 and Chuck Noll: 1976-77: 74).

Tomlin also joined several elite head coach fraternities in NFL history by reaching 90 wins in his ninth season:

- Tomlin is the ninth head coach in NFL history to win 90 games in his first nine seasons as a head coach, joining Mike Ditka, Joe Gibbs, Dennis Green, Mike Holmgren, John Madden, Mike McCarthy, George Seifert and Don Shula.
- He is the sixth head coach in NFL history to win 90 games in his first nine seasons with one franchise, joining Mike Ditka, Joe Gibbs, Dennis Green, John Madden and Mike McCarthy.

## EIGHT IN EACH OF FIRST NINE

Along with securing his 90th win in Week 14 at Cincinnati in 2015, **Mike Tomlin** also led the Steelers to its eighth win of the season.

Tomlin has guided the Steelers to at least eight wins in each of his nine seasons as the team's head coach.

- Tomlin is the third head coach in NFL history to win at least eight games in each of their first nine years as an NFL head coach and with the same team (Dennis Green: Minnesota, John Madden: Oakland and Mike Tomlin: Pittsburgh).
- He became the sixth head coach in NFL history to lead a team to at least eight wins in each of their first nine years as a NFL head coach (George Allen: Los Angeles/Washington, Dennis Green: Minnesota, John Madden: Oakland, George Seifert: San Francisco/Carolina, Don Shula: Baltimore/Miami and Mike Tomlin: Pittsburgh).
- Tomlin is the fourth head coach in NFL history to win at least eight games in their first nine years as a head coach with a team (Dennis Green: Minnesota, John Madden: Oakland, Marty Schottenheimer: Kansas City and Mike Tomlin: Pittsburgh).

## TOMLIN GOING FOR TWO

Pittsburgh has converted three of their eight two-point attempts in 2016, their first two conversions both coming in the first quarter of games (Oct. 2 vs. Kansas City and Oct. 16 at Miami).

The Steelers converted 8-of-11 two-point attempts in 2015. Their eight successful two-point conversions set a new NFL record in a single-season.

The Steelers have won four of their home games at Heinz Field in 2016 - a 24-16 home opener win vs. Cincinnati, a 43-14 victory over Kansas City on Sunday Night Football, a 31-13 win vs. the New York Jets in Week Five and a 24-14 win vs. the New York Giants in Week 13.

Pittsburgh won six of its eight regular season games in 2015, and have won at least six home games in eight seasons at Heinz Field since the stadium opened in 2001.

## BEN IN 2016



**QB Ben Roethlisberger** threw his 20th touchdown pass of 2016 in Week 10's game at Dallas, extending his streak of 20-touchdown seasons to six (eighth overall).

Through Week 13, Roethlisberger has completed 266-of-409 passes for 3,034 yards and 25 touchdowns with eight interceptions for a passer rating of 99.4.

Roethlisberger threw for 300 yards on 27 completions and three touchdowns with an interception for a passer rating of 112.4 in the team's Week One 38-16 win on Monday Night Football at Washington. The win gave him his 50th career road win as a starter and he joined Tom Brady (75) and Drew Brees (57) as the only active quarterbacks with at least 50 road wins.

In Week Two's home opener at Heinz Field, Roethlisberger threw for 259 yards on 19-of-37 passing with three touchdowns and two interceptions, leading the Steelers to a 24-16 win over Cincinnati. The game marked his 80th career regular-season game with multiple scoring passes, and his 45th at Heinz Field.

The Miami (Oh.) product completed 24-of-44 passes for 257 yards with an interception in Week Three's loss at Philadelphia.

In Week Four on Sunday Night Football, Roethlisberger notched his fifth career regular-season game with at least five touchdown passes - becoming the sixth player in NFL history to accomplish the feat - completing 22-of-27 passes for 300 yards for a passer rating of 152.5.

Roethlisberger threw four touchdowns while completing 34-of-47 attempts for 380 yards for a passer rating of 124.4 in Week Five vs. New York at Heinz field.

In Week 10's game, Roethlisberger threw for 408 yards - his ninth career 400-yard game - while completing 37-of-46 passes with three touchdowns and zero interceptions for a passer rating of 125.4. During the game, he reached the 45,000 yardage marker, in his 179th career game, the fifth-fewest to the milestone, and surpasses Warren Moon (290) for the 10th-most touchdown passes in NFL history.

Roethlisberger completed 14-of-20 passes for 221 yards with three touchdowns and zero interceptions for a passer rating of 146.0 in Week 12's 28-7 win at Indianapolis.

Roethlisberger made his 150th career regular season start in Week 8 vs. Indianapolis in 2014 to become just the fourth quarterback in NFL history to record 100 wins in their first 150 regular season starts (Tom Brady: 116, Joe Montana: 108, Terry and Bradshaw: 102).

Roethlisberger registered his 90<sup>th</sup> career win in his 135<sup>th</sup> career start, becoming the fifth fastest quarterback who began their career in the Super Bowl era to reach 90 wins.

His 63-27 record after his first 90 starts in the NFL ranked third (tied) in league history for the best record in such starts. Only Brady (67-23) and Stabler (66-23-1) had better records in their first 90 starts in the NFL. Roethlisberger's record is tied with Jim McMahon.

## THE 45,000 CLUB

**QB Ben Roethlisberger** became the first player in Steelers history to register 45,000 career passing yards in Week 10's game vs. Dallas.

Bell set a Steelers record for the most 200-scrimmage yard games with his fourth in Week 11 at Cleveland, racking up 201 yards (146 rushing / 55 receiving) and adding a one-yard touchdown run.

Bell returned to the playing field in Week Four on Sunday Night Football against Kansas City and totaled up a game-high 144 rushing yards on 18 carries, to go along with 34 receiving yards on five catches, for a total of 178 scrimmage yards.

Bell totaled a game-high 154 yards from scrimmage (66 rushing and 88 receiving) in Week Five vs. New York.

Bell posted a game-high 149 yards from scrimmage (81 rushing and 68 receiving) in Week Seven vs. New England, his 25th regular-season game with at least 100 scrimmage yards, and set a personal regular-season single-game high of 10 receptions.

It marked Gay's fifth consecutive interception return for a touchdown, setting a new NFL record, and his fifth pick six with the Steelers, tying Rod Woodson for the most in team history:

**CB William Gay** extended his consecutive regular-season games played streak to 156 in Week 13 vs. New York - the longest active consecutive games played streak among NFL defensive players.

## MITCHELL IN THE BACKFIELD

**S Mike Mitchell** leads the Pittsburgh secondary with 57 combined tackles in 2016 (39 solo) and has added eight pass break-ups and a quarterback hit through the first 12 games of the season.

In Week 12 at Indianapolis, Mitchell picked off Indianapolis QB Scott Tolzien in the fourth quarter to mark his 10th career interception and fourth as a Steeler.

Mitchell made his 57th consecutive regular-season at Indianapolis in Week 12 - the fifth-longest active consecutive games

## TUITT TIES SINGLE-GAME MARK

**DE Stephon Tuitt** tied a single-game career-high with 2.0 sacks in Week 11 at Cleveland, his third career multi-sack game.

Tuitt was named AFC Defensive Player of the Week for his Week 11 performance, his first such accolade, and became the Steeler to receive the honor since Troy Polamalu in 2013 (Week 12).

Along with a sack in Week 11, he posted his second career sack streak (three games, Sept. 20-Oct. 1, 2015).

**LB Lawrence Timmons** leads the Steelers' defense in 2016 with 89 total tackles (60 solo) through the team's first 12 games, to go along with an interception he posted in Week 13.

Timmons led the Steelers with eight stops in the first game of the season on Monday Night Football at Washington, including four solo stops, and totaled a game-high 11 tackles in Week Seven vs. New England, all solo. In Week 12, Timmons posted a game-high 10 total tackles (8 solo), along with a quarterback hit.

Timmons became the fourth Steeler with 30 sacks and 10 interceptions in 2015, joining Joey Porter, Greg Lloyd and Mike Merriweather, since sacks became an official statistic in 1982.

He recorded the 10th interception of his NFL career in Week 6 of 2015 vs. Arizona. He became the ninth Steelers linebacker to record 10 interceptions since the 1970 AFL-NFL merger.

## WILLIAMS LEADS THE 'D'

**LB Vince Williams** led the Steelers' defense in tackles in back-to-back games (Weeks Four-Five).

In Week Four, Williams made his first start of the 2016 season in vs. Kansas City on Sunday Night Football, and tallied a game and single-game personal best 15 tackles (13 solo). He was also redited with a sack in the second quarter, his first of the season, increasing his career total to 1.5.

Williams led the defense with a game high of 9 tackles (8 solo) in Week Five against the New York Jets, to go along with a sack, three stops for losses and two quarterback hits.

## BURNS ON THE CORNER

**CB Artie Burns** made his first career start in Week Nine at Baltimore and hauled in the first interception of his NFL career. He became the first rookie in Steelers history since 2006 (Anthony Smith) to record an interception.

In Week 11 at Cleveland, Burns hauled in his second interception of the season, picking off Cleveland QB Cody Kessler on the Browns' opening possession of the game, and led the team with a single-game career-high three pass breakups.

## BOS-DOES-WELL

**K Chris Boswell** has converted 12 of his 16 field goal attempts in 2016 - including six of seven attempts from 40-49 yards.

Since joining the Steelers in 2015, Boswell is 41-of-48 overall on field goal attempts (84.4%), including 15-of-19 (78.9%) between 40-49 yards.

**P Jordan Berry** boomed two punts covering 107 yards for a 53.5 average in Week One at Washington.

In Week Two vs. Cincinnati, he pinned five punts inside the Bengals' 20 yard line, marking the fifth game of his NFL career with at least three inside the 20's.

Berry landed each of his three punts in Week Five against the New York Jets inside their 20-yard line.

In Week Nine at Baltimore, Berry punted the ball a single-game career-high nine times.

Through the team's first 12 games, Berry has pinned opponents inside their 20-yard line on 20 of his 54 punts.

**LANDOVER, Md.** - The Steelers were victorious in the team's 2016 regular-season opener, defeating the Washington Redskins, 38-16, on Monday Night Football.

Washington K Dustin Hopkins connected from 31 yards out midway through the first quarter, and after CB Bashaud Breeland intercepted **QB Ben Roethlisberger** on Pittsburgh's ensuing drive, Hopkins made a 40-yard field goal to give Washington an early 6-0 lead. It would be the Redskins' final lead of the game.

Early in the second quarter, Roethlisberger threw a 29-yard touchdown pass to **WR Antonio Brown** on a fourth-and-one play to give the Steelers a 7-6 lead. Roethlisberger threw a three-yard touchdown to WR Eli Rogers with 31 seconds remaining in the first half to give Pittsburgh a 14-3 advantage at the break.

**K Chris Boswell** made a 46-yard field goal on the Steelers' first drive of the second half to give Pittsburgh a 17-6 lead. On Washington's ensuing possession, **LB Ryan Shazier** picked off QB Kirk Cousins. Five plays later, Roethlisberger and Brown connected again, this time for a 26-yard touchdown, to give the Steelers a 24-6 advantage.

The Redskins got within one score early in the fourth quarter, as the team scored 10 points on a Hopkins' 34-yard field goal a one-yard rushing touchdown by RB Chris Thompson.

But Pittsburgh's offense could not stop its momentum. **RB DeAngelo Williams** scored two rushing touchdowns in the fourth quarter, one from 15 yards and one from six yards, to seal the victory for the Steelers.
