COLOR RUSH ON CHRISTMAS DAY



Pittsburgh debuted its 'color rush' uniforms on Christmas Day when the team defeated the Baltimore Ravens 31-27 at Heinz Field to capture the AFC North title. Steelers President **Art Rooney II** announced during halftime of the team's first preseason game on KDKA-TV that the team's 'color rush' uniforms will be all black with gold numbers.

2016 SCHEDULE NOTES

The Steelers won each of their three primetime games in 2016: a Kickoff Weekend Monday Night Football victory at the Washington Redskins (38-16), a Week Four Sunday Night Football win vs. Kansas City at Heinz Field (43-14) and a Thursday Night Football win on Thanksgiving Day at the Indianapolis Colts (28-7).

Pittsburgh defeated the Baltimore Ravens in Week 16, 31-27, to mark the first Christmas Day game and win in franchise history.

STEELERS ON THANKSGIVING

The Steelers earned their second win on Thanksgiving Day in team history on Nov. 24 (Week 12), defeating the Indianapolis Colts 28-7 in a nationally televised primetime game on Thursday Night Football.

STEELERS CLAIM THE NORTH



STEELERS IN THE WILD CARD

The Pittsburgh Steelers have won six consecutive regular-season games, improving to 10-5 in 2016, en route to capturing the AFC North division title with a 31-27 come-from-behind win against Baltimore at Heinz Field on Christmas Day.

Pittsburgh has clinched the AFC North division title for the seventh time since NFL realignment in 2002 - the most among division teams (Pittsburgh: 7, Baltimore: 4 and Cincinnati: 4).

The Steelers are one of the most successful teams in NFL history. The team's 21 division titles are the most since the AFL-NFL merger in 1970 and is tied for the most playoff berths since the merger with 29:

STEELERS SUPER BOWL HISTORY

The Steelers are 34-23 (.596) in the postseason, including a 20-11 record at home, a 7-10 mark on the road and a 6-2 record at neutral sites (Super Bowls IX, X, XIII, XIV, XXX, XL, XLIII and XLV).

Pittsburgh has played in the Super Bowl three times since 2005 and the team's eight trips to the Super Bowl are tied for the most in NFL history with the Dallas Cowboys. The Steelers' six wins in the Super Bowl are the most in league history.

MISC. STEELERS POSTSEASON NOTES

Head Coach **Mike Tomlin** is only the second coach in NFL history to reach two Super Bowls in his first four seasons as a head coach (Joe Gibbs - Washington Redskins).

The Steelers are 6-4 during the Mike Tomlin era in the postseason, with three of the four losses being by six points or less.

Mike Tomlin is the youngest coach in NFL history to win a Super Bowl. The following is a look at the youngest head coaches in Super Bowl history:

- In 2005, the Steelers became the first No. 6 seed in NFL history to win the Super Bowl. Since then two other Wild Card teams have gone on to win the Super Bowl ('10 Green Bay, sixth seed and '07 Giants, fifth seed).
- Pittsburgh has played in 57 playoff games, which is second all-time behind Dallas (60).
- The Steelers have won 10 of their last 15 postseason games.
- Pittsburgh is 7-4 all-time in the postseason at Heinz Field since the stadium opened in 2001, including winning four of their previous five.
- The Steelers won the AFC Central title a team-record six consecutive seasons from 1974-79. They also won four consecutive division titles from 1994-97.
- The Steelers won a team-record seven consecutive postseason games, including two Super Bowls (IX and X), from Dec. 22, 1974 through Dec. 19, 1976. They won six consecutive postseason games from Dec. 30, 1978 through Jan. 20, 1980, including victories in Super Bowls XIII and XIV.
- The Steelers have been shut out only once in the postseason, during the 1947 Eastern Division Playoff game, Dec. 21, 1947, versus the Philadelphia Eagles. The Steelers and Eagles finished that season with 8-4 records and tied for first place in the Eastern Division. In those days, there was only one NFL Championship Game, so the two Pennsylvania neighbors squared off for the right to face the Chicago Cardinals in the Championship Game. The Eagles won, 21-0, but lost in the Championship Game, 28-21, to the Cardinals, the same franchise the Steelers faced in Super Bowl XLIII.
- The Steelers record for fewest points allowed in a playoff game is five, during a 34-5 win in the 1978 AFC Championship Game versus the Houston Oilers at Three Rivers Stadium, on Jan. 7, 1979. The Steelers allowed a team-high 45 points during a 45-28 AFC Championship Game road loss to the Miami Dolphins on Jan. 6, 1985.
- Pittsburgh has faced 22 different teams in the postseason and has a winning record against 12 of those opponents. The Steelers have split their postseason contests with one team and have a losing record versus nine teams.

STEELERS PLAYOFF OT GAMES

Pittsburgh's most recent playoff game - an overtime loss at Denver in the 2011 Wild Card - was the team's fifth overtime postseason game in franchise history.

The Steelers are 2-3 in those contests (1-3 on the road), with all games being decided by six points (except for the Broncos game). All three of the Steelers' overtime losses have come on the road.

THE STEELERS

- Pittsburgh clinched the 2016 AFC North title to mark the team's 22nd division title, seventh since 2002 and the second in the last three years (2014).
- Pittsburgh improved to 10-5 overall, 8-3 vs. AFC teams (4-1 vs. AFC North) and to 5-2 at home in 2016.
- The Steelers have won their 10th game in 2016 – the 24th season in team history with at least 10 wins – 11th since 2000.
- Pittsburgh now has 600 regular-season wins in franchise history.

Cleveland's lone touchdown of the game came when QB Josh McCown threw a 14-yard pass to TE Gary Barnidge early in the fourth quarter.

Pittsburgh's defense sealed the game when **LB Ryan Shazier** forced a fumble on McCown, and the fumble was recovered in the endzone by **NT Javon Hargrave** for a touchdown.

Since the 2011 season, the Steelers have played in 28 primetime games, including a Week One Monday Night Football game at the Washington Redskins to kickoff the 2016 season (W, 38-16), a Week Four Sunday Night Football tilt at Heinz Field vs. Kansas City (W, 43-14) and a Week 12 Thursday Night tilt on Thanksgiving Day at the Indianapolis Colts (W, 28-7).

Mike Tomlin, the 10th-year head coach, has guided Pittsburgh to a 30-16 overall record in regular-season primetime games.

He is 10-2 on Monday Night Football, 14-8 on Sunday Night Football and 6-6 on Thursday Night Football.

Tomlin joined only Bill Cowher (Steelers), Tom Flores (Raiders), Steve Mariucci (49ers), George Seifert (49ers) and Don Shula (Colts, Dolphins) as coaches to win their first six Monday Night Football games.

In his 10th season as the head coach of the Steelers, **Mike Tomlin** has an extensive list of accomplishments.

Tomlin earned his 100th regular-season victory in Week 14 of 2016 at Buffalo in his 157th career regular-season games to mark the fewest games by a Steelers head coach to reach the century mark in the win column (Chuck Noll: 158 and Bill Cowher: 163).

His 102 wins in his first 10 seasons are the most wins in team history for any coach in his first 10 campaigns and his two Super Bowl appearances are second-most for the franchise for a coach in his first 10 seasons.

Tomlin's seven postseason berths are tied as the most in a coach's first 10 seasons with the Steelers and his five division titles are third-most.

TOMLIN'S 100TH IN 10

Mike Tomlin became the third head coach in Steelers history to record 100 regular season wins in Week 14 of 2016, with the team's 27-20 victory at Buffalo.

He joined Chuck Noll (1969-91: 193) and Bill Cowher (1992-2006: 149) in the team's 100-win club to make the Steelers the first NFL franchise with three 100-win head coaches.

Tomlin's 100th win occurred in his 10th season with the Steelers, becoming the first Pittsburgh head coach to reach 100 wins in his first 10 years (Bill Cowher: 1992-2001: 99 and Chuck Noll: 1976-78: 88).

Tomlin also joined an elite head coach fraternity in NFL history by reaching 10 wins in his 10th season:

- He is the ninth head coach in NFL history to win 100 games in his first 10 seasons with one franchise, joining Bill Belichick (Patriots), Mike Ditka (Chicago), Joe Gibbs (Washington), John Madden (Oakland), Mike McCarthy (Green Bay), Marty Schottenheimer (Kansas City), Mike Shanahan (Denver) and Don Shula (Miami).

GOOD FIRST NINE

In his 10th season as the head coach of the Steelers, **Mike Tomlin** has an extensive list of accomplishments.

Tomlin earned his 90th regular-season victory in Week 14 of 2015 at Cincinnati and closed out his ninth season with 92 wins following the team's Week 17 victory at Cleveland.

His 92 wins in his first nine seasons are the most wins in team history for any coach after his first nine campaigns and his two Super Bowl appearances also are tied for the franchise best for a coach in his first nine seasons.

Tomlin's six postseason berths are tied as the most in a coach's first nine seasons with the Steelers and his four division titles are third-most.

TOMLIN'S 90TH IN NINE

Mike Tomlin became the third head coach in Steelers history to record 90 regular season wins in Week 14 of 2015, with the team's 33-20 victory at Cincinnati.

He joined Chuck Noll (1969-91: 193) and Bill Cowher (1992-2006: 149) in the team's 90-win club.

Tomlin's 90th win occurred in his ninth season with the Steelers, becoming the first Pittsburgh head coach to reach 90 wins in his first nine years (Bill Cowher: 1992-2000: 86 and Chuck Noll: 1976-77: 74).

Tomlin also joined several elite head coach fraternities in NFL history by reaching 90 wins in his ninth season:

- Tomlin is the ninth head coach in NFL history to win 90 games in his first nine seasons as a head coach, joining Mike Ditka, Joe Gibbs, Dennis Green, Mike Holmgren, John Madden, Mike McCarthy, George Seifert and Don Shula.
- He is the sixth head coach in NFL history to win 90 games in his first nine seasons with one franchise, joining Mike Ditka, Joe Gibbs, Dennis Green, John Madden and Mike McCarthy.

Along with securing his 90th win in Week 14 at Cincinnati in 2015, **Mike Tomlin** also led the Steelers to its eighth win of the season.

CONTROLLING THE NORTH

QB Ben Roethlisberger threw his 20th touchdown pass of 2016 in Week 10's game at Dallas, extending his streak of 20-touchdown seasons to six (eighth overall).

Roethlisberger has completed 328-of-509 passes for 3,819 yards and 29 touchdowns with 13 interceptions for a passer rating of 95.4 in 2016.

Roethlisberger threw for 300 yards on 27 completions and three touchdowns with an interception for a passer rating of 112.4 in the team's Week One 38-16 win on Monday Night Football at Washington. The win gave him his 50th career road win as a starter and he joined Tom Brady (75) and Drew Brees (57) as the only active quarterbacks with at least 50 road wins.

In Week Two's home opener at Heinz Field, Roethlisberger threw for 259 yards on 19-of-37 passing with three touchdowns and two interceptions, leading the Steelers to a 24-16 win over Cincinnati.

In Week Four on Sunday Night Football, Roethlisberger notched his fifth career regular-season game with at least five touchdown passes - becoming the sixth player in NFL history to accomplish the feat - completing 22-of-27 passes for 300 yards for a passer rating of 152.5.

Roethlisberger threw four touchdowns while completing 34-of-47 attempts for 380 yards for a passer rating of 124.4 in Week Five vs. New York at Heinz field.

In Week 10's game, Roethlisberger threw for 408 yards - his ninth career 400-yard game - while completing 37-of-46 passes with three touchdowns and zero interceptions for a passer rating of 125.4. During the game, he reached the 45,000 yardage marker, in his 179th career game, the fifth-fewest to the milestone, and surpasses Warren Moon (290) for the 10th-most touchdown passes in NFL history.

Roethlisberger completed 14-of-20 passes for 221 yards with three touchdowns and zero interceptions for a passer rating of 146.0 in Week 12's 28-7 win at Indianapolis.

He led the Steelers to a fourth quarter comeback for the 35th time in his regular-season career against Baltimore on Christmas Day (31-27) to secure the team an AFC North title, completing 24-of-33 passes for 279 yards with three touchdowns and two interceptions for a passer rating of 103.0.

Roethlisberger made his 150th career regular season start in Week 8 vs. Indianapolis in 2014 to become just the fourth quarterback in NFL history to record 100 wins in their first 150 regular season starts (Tom Brady: 116, Joe Montana: 108, Terry and Bradshaw: 102).

Roethlisberger registered his 90th career win in his 135th career start, becoming the fifth fastest quarterback who began their career in the Super Bowl era to reach 90 wins.

His 63-27 record after his first 90 starts in the NFL ranked third (tied) in league history for the best record in such starts. Only Brady (67-23) and Stabler (66-23-1) had better records in their first 90 starts in the NFL. Roethlisberger's record is tied with Jim McMahon.

Coates registered his first career 100-yard receiving game, tying a personal single-game high of six catches for a game-best 139 yards with two touchdowns in Week Five vs. the New York Jets. He caught a 72-yard touchdown from **QB Ben Roethlisberger**, the longest reception of his NFL career, and the first touchdown of his NFL career. He added a five-yard touchdown with less than two minutes remaining in the fourth quarter to mark his first career multi-touchdown game.

TE Jesse James set single-game career-highs with six catches (five, Sept. 12, 2016 at Washington) for 43 yards in Week Five against the New York Jets.

He caught a touchdown pass in back-to-back (Weeks Four-Five) games for the first time in his NFL career in 2016.

James has set single-season career-highs in receptions (37), receiving yards (322) and touchdown catches (3) in 2016.

ROGERS RECORDS FIRST 100

WR Eli Rogers registered the first 100-yard receiving game of his NFL career in Week Nine at Baltimore, finishing with 103 yards in six receptions. His six catches tied a single-game career-high (six at Washington, Sept. 12, 2016).

In Week 10 vs. Dallas, Rogers caught four passes for 42 yards, including a three-yard touchdown pass from **QB Ben Roethlisberger** in the first quarter, his second touchdown catch of the season and his career.

Rogers led the Steelers with 75 receiving yards on five catches, and caught his third touchdown of the season, a 24-yard pass from QB Ben Roethlisberger, in the fourth quarter to give the Steelers a 24-20 lead in Week 15 at Cincinnati.

He finished second in the game with 84 receiving yards on four receptions, including a career long 39-yard reception in Week 16's 31-27 win vs. Baltimore.

Rogers has caught 42 passes for 533 yards and three touchdowns on the season.

RINGING THE BELL IN 2016



RB Le'Veon Bell has eclipsed 100 scrimmage yards in seven consecutive games and in 11 of his 12 games played in 2016.

He totaled a game-high 137 scrimmage yards (122 rushing and 15 receiving), to go along with two total touchdowns, his sixth career multi-touchdown game, in the team's AFC North division clinching 31-27 win vs. Baltimore in Week 16.

Bell rushed for a single-game Steelers record 236 yards in Week 14 at Buffalo while tying a team record with three rushing touchdowns and his 298 scrimmage yards marked the second-most in team history.

He set a team record for the most 200-scrimmage yard games with his fourth in Week 11 at Cleveland, racking up 201 yards (146 rushing / 55 receiving) and adding a one-yard touchdown run.

Bell returned to the playing field in Week Four on Sunday Night Football against Kansas City and totaled up a game-high 144 rushing yards on 18 carries, to go along with 34 receiving yards on five catches, for a total of 178 scrimmage yards.

Bell totaled a game-high 154 yards from scrimmage (66 rushing and 88 receiving) in Week Five vs. New York.

Bell posted a game-high 149 yards from scrimmage (81 rushing and 68 receiving) in Week Seven vs. New England, his 25th regular-season game with at least 100 scrimmage yards, and set a personal regular-season single-game high of 10 receptions.

In Week 10 vs. Dallas, Bell posted 134 yards from scrimmage, along with a rushing (one-yard) and receiving (two-yard) touchdown to mark his second career game with a touchdown in both categories (Dec. 7, 2014 at Cincinnati).

In Week 11 at Cleveland, Shazier forced a fumble on a sack of QB Josh McCown, which was recovered in the endzone by **NT Javon Hargrave**. It marked his third forced fumble on the season, a new single-season career-high, and the fifth forced fumble of his career.

Shazier led the defense with eight tackles in Week 14 at Buffalo and registered a sack of Buffalo QB Tyrod Taylor.

He Finished with 10 total tackles, including five solo and an interception in Week 16's 31-27 win vs. Baltimore.

BIG PLAY GAY

CB William Gay has notched 44 tackles (32 solo) to go along with six passes defended, one interception, one sack, a forced fumble and a tackle for a loss through Week 14.

Gay picked off Cincinnati QB AJ McCarron and returned the ball 23 yards for a touchdown in Week 14's game of 2015. It marked Gay's fifth consecutive interception return for a touchdown, setting a new NFL record, and his fifth pick six with the Steelers, tying Rod Woodson for the most in team history:

CB William Gay extended his consecutive regular-season games played streak to 159 in Week 16 vs. Baltimore - the longest active consecutive games played streak among NFL defensive players.

MITCHELL IN THE BACKFIELD

S Mike Mitchell leads the Pittsburgh secondary with 70 combined tackles in 2016 (48 solo) and has added nine pass break-ups, an interception and a quarterback hit in 2016.

In Week 12 at Indianapolis, Mitchell picked off Indianapolis QB Scott Tolzien in the fourth quarter to mark his 10th career interception and fourth as a Steeler.

Mitchell made his 59th consecutive regular-season at Buffalo in Week 14 - the fifth-longest active consecutive games played streak among NFL safeties.

TUITT TIES SINGLE-GAME MARK

DE Stephon Tuitt tied a single-game career-high with 2.0 sacks in Week 11 at Cleveland, his third career multi-sack game.

Tuitt was named AFC Defensive Player of the Week for his Week 11 performance, his first such accolade, and became the Steeler to receive the honor since Troy Polamalu in 2013 (Week 12).

Along with a sack in Week 11, he posted his second career sack streak (three games, Sept. 20-Oct. 1, 2015).

Tuitt was credited with a half-sack of Buffalo QB Tyrod Taylor in the first quarter of Week 14's game at Buffalo, increasing his season total to 3.5 (11.0 in his NFL career).

Washington K Dustin Hopkins connected from 31 yards out midway through the first quarter, and after CB Bashaud Breeland intercepted **QB Ben Roethlisberger** on Pittsburgh's ensuing drive, Hopkins made a 40-yard field goal to give Washington an early 6-0 lead. It would be the Redskins' final lead of the game.

Early in the second quarter, Roethlisberger threw a 29-yard touchdown pass to **WR Antonio Brown** on a fourth-and-one play to give the Steelers a 7-6 lead. Roethlisberger threw a three-yard touchdown to WR Eli Rogers with 31 seconds remaining in the first half to give Pittsburgh a 14-3 advantage at the break.

K Chris Boswell made a 46-yard field goal on the Steelers' first drive of the second half to give Pittsburgh a 17-6 lead. On Washington's ensuing possession, **LB Ryan Shazier** picked off QB Kirk Cousins. Five plays later, Roethlisberger and Brown connected again, this time for a 26-yard touchdown, to give the Steelers a 24-6 advantage.

The Redskins got within one score early in the fourth quarter, as the team scored 10 points on a Hopkins' 34-yard field goal a one-yard rushing touchdown by RB Chris Thompson.

But Pittsburgh's offense could not stop its momentum. **RB DeAngelo Williams** scored two rushing touchdowns in the fourth quarter, one from 15 yards and one from six yards, to seal the victory for the Steelers.
