CAROLINA TAKES ON SEATTLE IN SUNDAY NIGHT FOOTBALL MATCHUP

CAROLINA AT SEATTLE

Carolina continues its West Coast swing as the Panthers head to Seattle for Sunday Night Football.

The Panthers enter the game against the Seahawks following a 35-32 loss at the Oakland Raiders. Seattle is also coming off a loss, falling 14-5 to the Tampa Bay Buccaneers.

The Panthers and Seahawks are familiar foes. The teams are meeting for the seventh time in the past five seasons, and the fifth time in the past three seasons as the teams met in the regular season and postseason in 2014 and 2015. Seattle leads the all-time series 7-4.

THE HEAD COACHES



Ron RIVERA

Ron Rivera became the fourth coach in Carolina Panthers history on January 11, 2011.

In five seasons, Rivera has guided the team to a Super Bowl appearance, an NFC Championship and three NFC South titles. He is a two-time (2013 and 2015) Associated Press NFL Coach of the Year award winner.

In 2015, Rivera led the Panthers to the second Super Bowl appearance in team history following a franchise-best 15-1 record and their third consecutive NFC South championship. In the process, Carolina became the fourth team in the Super Bowl era to start a season 14-0, joining the 1972 Miami Dolphins, 2007 New England Patriots and 2009 Indianapolis Colts. Carolina's 18-game regular season winning streak was the longest in NFC history. In 2014, Rivera led the Panthers to their second consecutive NFC South championship and the team's first playoff win since 2005. The Panthers became the first team since 1970 to overcome a six-game losing streak and win their division. In 2013, Rivera directed Carolina to 12 wins, the NFC South title and its first playoff appearance since 2008.

Before joining the Panthers, Rivera was an assistant coach with the San Diego Chargers (2007-2010), Chicago Bears (2004-06, 1997-98) and Philadelphia Eagles (1999-2003). In 2006, the Bears defense led the NFL with 44 takeaways, helping propel Chicago to an appearance in Super Bowl XLI. He is just the third Latino head coach in NFL history, joining Tom Flores with the Oakland Raiders (1979-1987) and Seattle Seahawks (1992-94) and Tom Fears with the New Orleans Saints (1967-1970).

A second-round draft choice in 1984 by Chicago, Rivera played nine seasons with the Bears. Primarily an outside linebacker, he was a member of the 1985 Super Bowl XX winning team.

Rivera played linebacker at Cal (1980-83), where he finished as the school's all-time leader in sacks (22) and tackles (336).

Born January 7, 1962 in Fort Ord, Calif., Rivera and his wife, Stephanie, have two children—Christopher and Courtney.

Pete Carroll was named as Seattle's eighth head coach on January 11, 2010.

Carroll led Seattle to its first Super Bowl title in franchise history in 2013 after posting a 13-3 record and a 43-8 victory over Denver in Super Bowl XLVIII, followed by a consecutive appearance in Super Bowl XLIX vs. New England.

Carroll began his NFL career with the Buffalo Bills (defensive backs, 1984) before coaching with the Minnesota Vikings (defensive backs, 1985-89), New York Jets (defensive coordinator 1990-93, head coach 1994), San Francisco 49ers (defensive coordinator 1995-96) and New England Patriots where he served as head coach from 1997-99. With the Patriots Carroll posted a 27-21 record and led the team to two playoff appearances.

Carroll coached collegiately at Pacific (1974-76, 1983), Arkansas (1977), Iowa State (1978), Ohio State (1979), North Carolina State (1980-82) and the University of Southern California from 2001-09, where he posted a 97-19 record, won seven consecutive Pac-10 titles (2002-08) and two national championships.

Carroll was a two-time All-Pacific Coast Conference safety at Pacific (1971-72), where he earned degree in business administration (1973) and secondary teaching credential and master's degree in physical education (1976).

Born September 15, 1951 in San Francisco, Calif., Carroll and his wife, Glenna, have three children and four grandchildren.

NFC DIVISIONAL PLAYOFFS

JANUARY 17, 2016 • BANK OF AMERICA STADIUM • CHARLOTTE, N.C.

Carolina earned a 31-24 victory over Seattle in the NFC Divisional Playoffs at Bank of America Stadium. As a result, Carolina earned the opportunity to host an NFC Championship for the first time in franchise history. By the middle of the second quarter, the Panthers had scored a playoff franchise record 31 points while allowing the Seahawks 17 yards on their first four possessions. However, Seattle scored 24 second-half points to mount a strong comeback before Carolina sealed the game. On the very first offensive snap of the game, running back Jonathan Stewart – back from a three-game absence with a foot injury – slashed through the middle of Seattle's defense for 59 yards. Three plays later, he scored from 4 yards. The defense needed just two snaps to score. After defensive tackle Star Lotulelei threw running back Marshawn Lynch for a 3-yard loss on Seattle's first play, fellow tackle Kawann Short's pressure of Wilson forced a bad pass for Lynch that Luke Kuechly picked off and returned 14 yards for a 14-0 lead. The rest of the quarter was dedicated to an 86-yard touchdown drive that consumed nearly nine minutes – capped by a Stewart leaping score from the 1. Cornerback Cortland Finnegan picked off a pass on Seattle's next snap to set up a field goal, and soon after tight end Greg Olsen made an incredible grab in the back of the end zone on third-and-14 from the 19. Out of halftime, however, the Seahawks found a way to turn the tide. The momentum shift began when Seahawks speedster Tyler Lockett returned the opening kickoff of the second half to midfield, and a penalty moved the ball to the 35. The ensuing drive would end with a 13-yard touchdown pass from Wilson to wide receiver Jermaine Kearse to put the Seahawks on the board. Later in the third quarter, Wilson found wide receiver Tyler Lockett for a 33-yard touchdown and in the fourth quarter Wilson and Kearse connected again for a 3-yard touchdown. However, despite the three touchdown passes from Wilson after halftime, the Seahawks offense only snapped the ball twice the entire game in position to tie the score. Those were their first two snaps of the game, the second of which resulted in a touchdown for Kuechly and a 14-0 cushion for the Panthers. Steven Hauschka's 36-yard field goal with 1:12 to go did pull the Seahawks within a single score at 31-24, but when linebacker Thomas Davis skied high to secure a very good outside kick, the Seahawks never got the chance they pursued throughout the second half.

GINN GOES DEEP

In Week Twelve at Oakland (11/27/16), wide receiver Ted Ginn, Jr. hauled in a career-long 88-yard touchdown reception, surpassing his previous career-long of 74 yards vs. Atlanta (12/13/15).

The 88-yard reception is tied for the third-longest in team history.

Ginn finished the game with 115 receiving yards, the fourth regular season game of his career with 100-plus receiving yards.

Ten of Ginn's 17 touchdown catches in 2-plus seasons with Carolina have gone for 25 or more yards, including seven of 40 or more yards.

In 42 career games with Carolina (2013, 2015-16), Ginn has 17 touchdown catches. In 104 career games with other teams, Ginn totaled six touchdown catches.

BENJAMIN PRODUCING IN RETURN

Wide receiver Kelvin Benjamin, the Panthers first-round draft choice in 2014, returned to the lineup in Week One at Denver (9/8/16) after missing all of last season with a knee injury.

This season, Benjamin has totaled 58 receptions for 736 yards and five touchdowns.

In 2014, Benjamin ranked third among NFL rookies with 1,008 receiving yards, 73 receptions and nine receiving touchdowns. Fifty of Benjamin's 73 catches resulted in first downs, second among rookies to only New York Giants receiver Odell Beckham, Jr. (57).

That season Benjamin and tight end Greg Olsen finished the year tied for the team lead with 1,008 receiving yards, becoming the first pair of Panthers to each gain 1,000 receiving yards in a single season since Muhsin Muhammad and Patrick Jeffers in 1999.

Benjamin's numbers are the best by a rookie in Panthers history, surpassing Keary Colbert's numbers in 2004 (47 for 754 and five).

OLSEN LEADS THE WAY AT TIGHT END

In 2015, Greg Olsen tallied a career-high 1,104 receiving yards, his second consecutive season with 1,000 yards. He is the seventh tight end in NFL history with consecutive 1,000-yard seasons. Olsen is seeking to become the first tight end in NFL history to record three consecutive 1,000-yard seasons.

With 790 receiving yards this season, Olsen has registered at least 500 yards in eight of the past nine seasons (2008-09, 2011-16). He has also notched the seventh 50-catch season of his career. Olsen is on pace for his fifth consecutive season with at least 800 yards and is aiming for his fourth consecutive 70-catch season.

Olsen's seven touchdown catches in 2015 made him the only active NFL tight end with five or more touchdowns in every season since from 2008 to 2015.

LOTULELEI EARNS PLAYER OF THE WEEK

Defensive tackle Star Lotulelei earned his first career NFC Defensive Player of the Week Award for his performance in Week Eight vs. Arizona (11/6/16).

Against the Cardinals, Lotulelei recorded a career-high 3.0 sacks. The 3.0 sacks matched Lotulelei's previous career high for a single season set in 2013 rookie season.

Lotulelei's first sack of the game came on Arizona's first drive and was a strip-sack that resulted in a 46-yard touchdown return by linebacker Thomas Davis.

Lotulelei's three sacks were part of an eight-sack performance by Carolina. The eight sacks are the second-most in a regular season game in Panthers history.

Lotulelei also contributed to a defense that limited Arizona running back David Johnson to 24 rushing yards. Johnson entered the game with three consecutive 100-yard rushing games.

Lotulelei is the second defensive tackle in franchise history to win a Defensive Player of the Week Award, joining Kawann Short in 2015.



GANO GETS HIS KICKS

In Week Three vs. Minnesota kicker Graham Gano scored four points to pass wide receiver Steve Smith (454 from 2001-13) for second on the franchise's all-time points scored list. Gano has 506 points in his Panthers career (2012-present). John Kasay (1,482 from 1995-2010) is the franchise's all-time leader.

In Week Two vs. San Francisco (9/18/16), Gano set a career high with 16 points by converting all four field goal attempts and four of five PATs (one was blocked).

Last season, Gano set the Panthers franchise record with 146 points in 2015, surpassing John Kasay's previous record of 145 in 1996. Gano's 146 points ranked second in the NFL behind New England's Stephen Gostkowski (151).

Gano made 30-of-36 field goals in 2015. The 30 field goals tied for fifth-most in the NFL and third-most in a season in team history. Gano kicked two game-winning field goals (final two minutes of the fourth quarter or in overtime) in 2015.

Gano earned his first career Player of the Month Award, garnering NFC Special Teams Player of the Month for November

In addition to his field goal abilities, Gano has been important in the field position game. Since the start of 2013, Gano leads the NFL with a 74.1 touchback percentage.
