

PACKERS RETURN HOME TO HOST THE TEXANS

The Green Bay Packers return to Lambeau Field to host the Houston Texans in the first home game in nearly a month.

- ▶This will be the fourth overall meeting between the two franchises. Green Bay holds a 2-1 advantage in the series.
- ▶The two teams last played in 2012, a 42-24 Green Bay victory.
- ► Sunday will be the Texans' second visit to Green Bay, having previously won, 24-21, in 2008.
- ►Two of the three matchups were decided by three points.
- ▶ Packers defensive coordinator Dom Capers was the first head coach of the Houston Texans (2001-05).
- ►Under Head Coach Mike McCarthy, the Packers are 8-5 in games played the week after appearing on Monday Night Football, including wins in six of the last eight.
- ▶QB Aaron Rodgers has multiple passing touchdowns in six straight games, the second-longest active streak in the NFL (Marcus Mariota, eight).
- ► Green Bay has had one or more players register 10-plus receptions and/ or 100-plus receiving yards in eight of the last nine games.
- ▶ The Packers have scored 23 or more points in eight of the last nine games. Dating back to Week 3, they are tied for the second-most 23-plus point games in the NFL (Atlanta Falcons), trailing only the Dallas Cowboys, who have nine (according to pro-football-reference.com).
- ▶ The Packers will finish the regular season with four games against NFC foes, including the last three against division opponents.
- ▶ Next week. Green Bay will welcome the Seattle Seahawks to Lambeau Field. Including the postseason, it will be the fifth time the two teams have played since 2012. The Packers beat the Seahawks at home last season, 27-17.

GREEN BAY IN DECEMBER

Dating back to 2014, Green Bay has won six of the eight games it has played in December. The Packers' six December wins since 2014 are tied for the fourth most in the NFL, trailing the seven wins by Carolina, Plttsburgh and Seattle.

- ► Under McCarthy, the Packers are 29-13 (.690) in the month of December, No. 3 in the NFL.
- ► Green Bay is 18-3 (.857) at home in the month of December under McCarthy, tied with New England for No. 1 in the NFL since 2006.
- ► In eight of 10 seasons under McCarthy, including each of the last five, Green Bay has won three-plus games and lost just one in the month of December.
- ▶QB Aaron Rodgers has started 29 total games in the month of December, recording a passer rating of 101.4, **No. 4 in the NFL** (min. 268 att.) among active quarterbacks since 2008. His 59 passing touchdowns in the month of December rank No. 3 in the NFL since 2008.
- ► Sunday will be Green Bay's first noon home game in December since Week 14 vs. Atlanta in 2013 (Dec. 8).

WITH THE CALL

CBS will broadcast the game to a regional audience with playby-play man Jim Nantz and analyst Phil Simms handling the call from the broadcast booth and Tracy Wolfson reporting from the sidelines.



WEEK 13

- ► Milwaukee's WTMJ (620 AM), airing Green Bay games since November 1929, heads up the Packers Radio Network that is made up of 50 stations in five states. Wayne Larrivee (play-by-play) and two-time Packers Pro Bowler Larry McCarren (analyst) call the action. McCarren first joined the team's broadcasts in 1995 and enters his 22nd season calling Packers games. After originally being paired together in 1999, McCarren and Larrivee enter their 18th season of broadcasts together.
- ►ESPN Radio will air the game on radio across the country. Mark Kestecher (play-by-play) and Mark Schlereth (analyst) will call the action.
- ▶ The broadcast is also available on Sirius Satellite Radio (WTMJ feed).
- ▶ DIRECTV subscribers can watch the game on Channel 707.

- ▶QB Aaron Rodgers threw for 371 yards in Week 10 and 351 yards in Week 11, marking only the third time in his career he has thrown for 350-plus passing yards in back-to-back games (2009, 2011).
- ► Rodgers' 1,035 passing yards in Weeks 10-12 rank **No. 2 in the NFL** over that time span (Kirk Cousins, 1,086).
- ►According to pro-football-reference.com, the Packers' six games with 23-plus first downs from Weeks 5-12 tied New England and New Orleans for No. 1 in the NFL over that span.

STAT OF THE WEEK

- ▶ Over the last two weeks, QB **Aaron Rodgers** has registered passer ratings of 115.0 and 116.7, throwing for over 300 yards and mulitple touchdowns in both games.
- ► He joined Kirk Cousins as the only quarterbacks in the NFL to record 115.0-plus passer ratings in both games over the last two weeks, according to pro-football-reference.com.
- ► Rodgers is one of six NFL quarterbacks to throw for 300-plus yards and a passer rating of 115.0-plus in two straight games this season, (pro-football-reference.com).
- ►Rodgers has registered a passer rating of 115.0-plus in four games this season (129.3 vs. Detroit / 125.5 at Atlanta / 115.0 at Washington / 116.7 at Philadelphia), tied for the third most in the NFL.
- ►Rodgers has thrown for 300-plus yards and a passer rating of 115.0-plus in 25 career games, **No. 2 in the NFL** since 2008 (Drew Brees, 36).



FACING THE AFC

The Green Bay Packers have played well against AFC teams. Under Head Coach **Mike McCarthy**, the Packers are 26-18 during the regular and postseason against teams from the AFC, including a 7-4 mark against the AFC during the regular season since the start of 2014.

► The Packers' .636 winning percentage against AFC teams since 2014 is tied for No. 4 among NFC teams:

- ► Green Bay's 26 wins versus the AFC (including postseason) are tied with the N.Y. Giants for No. 2 among NFC teams since 2006 (Dallas, 27-17).

ODDS AND ENDS

Below are some random notes from this season:

- ► The Packers converted 71.4 percent of third downs in Week 12 (10-14), the highest single-game third-down conversion rate in the NFL this season and the second highest under Head Coach **Mike McCarthy** (72.2 percent, 13-18, Oct. 27, 2013, at Minnesota).
- ► Green Bay ranks No. 2 in the NFL in third-down conversions this season:

- ►The Packers rank **No. 3 in the NFL** in average time of possession (31:33) this season.
- ► According to the Elias Sports Bureau, Green Bay recorded 23-plus first downs in five consecutive games (Weeks 5-9) in a single regular season for the first time in franchise history.
- ▶WR Trevor Davis registered a 55-yard punt return against Atlanta, the longest punt return by Green Bay since DB Micah Hyde returned a punt 55 yards for a touchdown vs. Detroit on Dec. 28, 2014.
- ▶In Week 7, Green Bay recorded 32 first downs, the most by the Packers since Nov. 27, 1983, at Atlanta (32). It tied for the second most in franchise history. Green Bay also possessed the ball for 39:36, the best mark by the team since Oct. 27, 2013, at Minnesota (40:54).
- ▶The Packers have eclipsed 400 total net yards five times this season (406 vs. N.Y. Giants and Chicago Bears / 405 vs. Indianapolis / 402 at Tennessee / 424 at Washington), the third-most games with 400 total net yards in the NFL this season (New Orleans, six; Washington, seven; Dallas, eight).
- ▶P Jacob Schum set career highs (min. four punts) in Week 10 by posting a 50.5-yard gross average on four punts. In Week 9, he set a career best (min. four punts) with a 47.5-yard net average on four punts.
- ► Since Week 6, Schum ranks **No. 3 in the league** (min. 12 punts) with a 49.0-yard gross average over that span. He is **tied for No. 6** over that span with a 42.9-yard net average.



GROUP EFFORT

The Packers have a history of relying on many receivers over the years and this season is no different.

- ► The Packers are one of three teams in the NFL (New Orleans and Washington) to have three players with 50-plus receptions and 550-plus receiving yards each this season (**Jordy Nelson** 61 rec. for 754 yds. / **Davante Adams** 58 rec. for 776 yds. / **Randall Cobb** 54 rec. for 558 yds.).
- ► Nelson (nine) and Adams (eight) are the **only teammate duo in the**NFL with seven-plus touchdown catches this season.
- ► Nelson ranks No. 3 in the NFL in receiving touchdowns this season and Adams is tied for No. 4:

- ► For the first time in his career, Nelson posted a touchdown reception in each of the first four games of the season, becoming the first Packer to do so since WR Bill Schroeder in 2001.
- ► Nelson's five touchdown receptions in the first four games of this season were tied for the fourth most in franchise history.
- ► Rodgers and Nelson have connected for the 54 touchdowns, the second most by a duo in team history behind QB Brett Favre and WR Antonio Freeman (57 TD passes).
- ▶ The Packers' six individual 10-catch games have come via four different players (Davante Adams-two, Ty Montgomery-two, Randall Cobb, Jordy Nelson). According to the Elias Sports Bureau, four different players having at least one 10-catch game is tied for the most in a single season in NFL history (2015 New England Patriots / 2013 Atlanta Falcons / 2010 Indianpolis Colts / 2002 St. Louis Rams / 1991 Buffalo Bills).

- ► Green Bay's six individual 10-catch games are the most in a single season in franchise history (five in 2004 / three in 2014, 1993, 1942).
- ▶ In Week 12, Adams recorded his third 100-plus yard receiving game of this season with 113 yards on five receptions with two touchdowns. Adams' three 100-plus yard receiving games are tied for No. 6 in the NFL this season.
- ►Adams joins Tampa Bay WR Mike Evans as the only players to record 100-plus yards receiving and two-plus TDs in two games this season.
- ▶In Week 11, TE **Jared Cook** registered 105 yards and one touchdown on five receptions (17.5 avg.). According to the Elias Sports Bureau, Cook became only the second TE (Benjamin Watson) to register a 100-yard receiving game with three different franchises.
- ▶ Dating back to 1996, Cook's 17.5 yards-per-catch average was the third highest by a Green Bay tight end in single game (min. five receptions), according to STATS (Jermichael Finley, Oct. 5, 2009, six for 128 yards, 21.3 avg. / Richard Rodgers, Dec. 3, 2015, eight for 146 yards, 18.3 avg.).
- ►In Week 10, Adams became the only Packer player to reigster three receptions of 35-plus yards in the same game (dating back to 1991).
- ► Week 10 also saw Adams (six receptions for 156 yards) and Nelson (12 receptions for 126 yards, one TD) became the second pair of teammates to record 120-plus receiving yards in the same game this season (New Orleans WRs Willie Snead and Brandin Cooks in Week 1).
- ► In Week 9, the Packers had four players with a reception of 20-plus yards (Nelson, Adams, TE **Richard Rodgers**, WR **Jeff Janis**).
- ►With 12 receptions for 74 yards (6.2 avg.) in Week 8, Adams became the first Packer to have back-to-back games with 12-plus catches, and his 25 over Weeks 7-8 were a franchise record for most over a two-game span.
- ► Week 8 also saw three Packers post their first career TD catches in the game at Atlanta (Janis, **Geronimo Allison**, **Trevor Davis**), which was the first time an NFL team had done that since the Jets on Oct. 23, 2000
- ► Allison and Davis became first rookie duo to both have a TD catch in a game for the Packers since Max McGee and Joe Johnson on Dec. 12, 1954.
- ► According to the Elias Sports Bureau, in Week 7 the Packers became just the second team in NFL history to feature three players with 10-plus catches in a game (Adams, 13; Cobb, 11; Montgomery, 10), joining the New England Patriots (Leroy Thompson, Ben Coates, Michael Timpson) vs. Minnesota on Nov. 13, 1994.
- ►Adams' 13 receptions for 132 yards (10.2 avg.) and two touchdowns against Chicago tied for the second-most receptions in a single game in franchise history (Don Hutson, 13 receptions vs. Cleveland, Oct. 18, 1942, and 14 vs. N.Y. Giants on Nov. 22, 1942).
- ► Montgomery became the first Packer to post back-to-back games with 10-plus catches (10 vs. Dallas in Week 6) since WR Sterling Sharpe in 1993 (Oct. 10, Oct. 24). Adams joined him in Weeks 7 (13) and 8 (12). The only other player to accomplish that feat in a single season in team annals is Hutson in 1942 (Nov. 15, Nov. 22).
- ► Montgomery recorded 60 yards rushing and 66 yards receiving in Week 7, becoming the first Green Bay player since RB Ahman Green (63 rushing/68 receiving) at Detroit on Sept. 24, 2006, to register 60-plus rushing yards and 60-plus receiving yards in a game.



AT THE HELM

Having led Green Bay to the playoffs in eight of his first 10 seasons as head coach, **Mike McCarthy** is joined by Vince Lombardi and Mike Holmgren as the only coaches to guide the Packers to a Super Bowl win with a victory over Pittsburgh in Super Bowl XLV.

- ► McCarthy guided the Packers to a franchise-record fourth consecutive division title in 2014.
- ►With a win at Tampa Bay in Week 16 of the 2014 season, McCarthy passed Lombardi for the No. 2 spot in team history as far as overall victories:

- ► The 117 overall wins are the most in the NFC and the third most in the NFL since 2006 (NE 145 and IND 118).
- ► McCarthy reached 100 career wins (including playoffs) in just his 155th game. He was the fastest to reach 100 wins in the NFL since George Seifert in 1996 (132 games).
- ► McCarthy's 104 regular-season wins in his first 10 years as a head coach (2006-15) rank No. 3 in NFL history:

- ► McCarthy recorded his third regular season with 12-plus wins in 2014 (2007, 2011), passing Curly Lambeau (1929, 1931), Lombardi (1962, 1966), Holmgren (1996-97) and Mike Sherman (2001-02) for the most by a coach in franchise history.
- ►McCarthy has guided the Packers to five seasons with 11-plus wins (2007, 2009, 2011-12, 2014), passing Lombardi (1961-63, 1966) and Holmgren (1995-98) for the most by a coach in franchise history.
- ► McCarthy's seven regular seasons with 10-plus wins are a franchise record (since 1921).
- ► McCarthy joined Pittsburgh's Bill Cowher (2005) as the only Super Bowlwinning coaches to lead their respective teams to three road wins as the No. 6 seed in the postseason en route to a world title.
- ►Including playoffs, McCarthy has a 117-68-1 record since taking over as head coach in 2006, a .632 winning percentage that ranks No. 2 among current NFL head coaches (minimum 75 games):

▶In the Week 6 victory over the San Diego Chargers in 2015, McCarthy earned the 100th regular-season win of his career in just his 150th game, making him the seventh-fastest coach in NFL history and the fastest current NFL coach to reach the 100-win plateau:

WINNING WAYS

- ► The Packers are the only NFC team and one of two teams in the league (New England) to make the playoffs each of the past seven seasons (2009-15). Those seven appearances were more than the rest of the NFC North Division combined during that span (Minnesota-three / Detroittwo / Chicago-one).
- Below are the head coaches who have led a single franchise to seven or more consecutive playoff appearances:

- ▶ Joined Vince Lombardi and Mike Holmgren as the only coaches to guide the Packers to a Super Bowl title with a win over Pittsburgh in Super Bowl XLV.
- ► Led the Packers to their seventh consecutive playoff appearance last season, joining New England as the only two NFL teams to do so over that span. Has also led the team to eight playoff appearances in the last nine years (2007, 2009-15).

- ► Had 104 regular-season wins in his first 10 seasons as a head coach, ranking No. 3 in NFL history.

BILL O'BRIEN...Is in his third year as the Texans' third head coach.

- ► Coached WR DeAndre Hopkins to become the third-youngest player in NFL history to reach 200 receptions and 3,000 receiving yards.
- ► Guided the Texans to a 9-7 record in his first season (2014), making Houston the sixth team since 1978 to post a winning season following a year with two or fewer victories.
- ▶ In 2015, led Houston to another 9-7 record, winning the AFC South.
- ► Coordinated a New England offense that scored 32.1 points per game and gained 428.0 yards per game in 2011.
- ▶ Despite scholarship reductions and postseason ban, led Penn State to an 8-4 record in 2012, his first season as head coach.

THE PACKERS-TEXANS SERIES

- ▶ This will be just the fourth meeting between the clubs since the Texans entered the NFL as an expansion club in 2002.
- ▶ The first meeting came in a nationally televised Sunday night contest at Reliant Stadium in Houston, one that the Packers won, 16-13, on a 46-yard field goal by Ryan Longwell as time expired.
- ► Houston native and longtime Packers WR Donald Driver led Green Bay with 10 catches for 148 yards (14.8 avg.) and QB Brett Favre threw for 383 yards in the win.
- ▶The second meeting, which is the only other at Lambeau Field, saw another game-winning field goal as time expired, this time by Houston's Kris Brown on a 40-yard attempt.

ONE OF THE BEST

Packers LB **Julius Peppers** is one of the greatest pass rushers of alltime and continues to contribute, ranking No. 2 on the team with 5.5 sacks this season.

- ► Last season (10.5) marked his ninth season with 10-plus sacks, which tied John Randle for the fourth-most 10-sack seasons since 1982 (Bruce Smith, 13 / Reggie White, 12 / Kevin Greene, 10).
- ► Peppers ranks No. 1 among active players in career sacks during the regular season:

- ▶ Peppers is tied with Michael Strahan for No. 5 in NFL history with 141.5 career sacks (since 1982). He trails Chris Doleman (150.5) for No. 4 all-time.
- ▶ Peppers recorded a sack and forced fumble on Dallas QB Dak Prescott in Week 6. According to STATS LLC, he ranks No. 5 in the NFL in forced fumbles (46) since 1994.
- ▶ Peppers is the first player in NFL history with 100 career sacks and four interception returns for touchdowns. In 2014, he became the first linebacker in Packers' history to post two interception returns for touchdowns in the same season.
- ▶ Peppers is the **only player in NFL history** to register at least 10 interceptions and 100.0 sacks (since 1982).



PERRY LEADS THE RUSH

Packers LB **Nick Perry** has led a pass rush that has recorded multiple sacks in nine of 11 games and includes two-plus sacks by six players.

- ► Perry has registered a team-high eight sacks, tied for No. 10 in the NFL in 2016.
- ▶ Perry has registered a half-sack or more in eight games this season, tied for No. 2 in the NFL.

- ►In Week 6, Perry registered his first career interception and added a sack, making him the first Green Bay LB to post both in a game since Clay Matthews at the N.Y. Giants on Dec. 4, 2011.
- ▶Perry matched his career high with a team-best two sacks in Week 3 vs. Detroit.
- ▶ Perry has at least one two-sack game in each of the last four seasons (2013-16), the lone Packer to accomplish that feat over that span.

CONTINUAL IMPACT

In his career, DT **Mike Daniels** has seen his playing time steadily increase as well as his production. After playing in 14 games as a rookie in 2012, he has played in every game since the start of the 2013 season.

- ▶In Week 2 at Minnesota, he recorded a sack and tied for the team lead with four QB hits. In Week 3, he led the Packers with two QB hits, and in he registered a sack in both Weeks 8 and 12.
- ►In 2015, Daniels led the Packers' defensive line in tackles (66) and sacks (four). He finished third on the team with 12 QB hits.
- ►In Week 5 versus St. Louis last season, he tied for the team lead with a career-best nine tackles (eight solo).
- ▶ Daniels registered his first career interception in Week 16 at Arizona (2015), returning it 23 yards. According to STATS LLC, it was the first interception by a Packers DT since Cullen Jenkins on Oct. 18, 2009. Dating back to 1960, his 23-yard interception return was the longest by a Green Bay DT on an interception.
- ► He led Green Bay's defensive line with 5.5 sacks and was the team leader in quarterback hits (19) and pressures (22) during the 2014 regular season.
- ▶ Daniels is third on the Packers with 19.0 sacks since the start of the 2013 season (Peppers-23.0 / Matthews-29.0). He is **tied for No. 10**among NFL defensive tackles over that span, according to STATS LLC:

ON THE RISE

S **Ha Ha Clinton-Dix** has been a presence on the Packers defense since his rookie season.

- ►After starting 10 of 16 games and both postseason contests as a rookie, he has started every game since 2015.
- ►His career-best three interceptions are tied for No. 2 among NFL safeties this season, trailing only NYG Landon Collins (five).
- ► According to STATS, he and Eagles S Rodney McLeod are the only safeties with one or more forced fumbles and three interceptions this season
- ▶In 2016, Clinton-Dix posted a career high in Week 9 with two interceptions and became the first Green Bay safety to register two INTs in a game since **Morgan Burnett** did so vs. Minnesota on Dec. 2, 2012. He joined CB Al Harris (vs. New Orleans, Oct. 9, 2005) as the only players to post two INTs in a first quarter for the Packers since 1993.
- ►His three career postseason interceptions rank No. 1 among safeties since he entered the league in 2014, according to STATS.
- ► Clinton-Dix finished second on the team with 95 tackles (73 solo) in 2014 and led the Packers with 117 tackles (97 solo) last season.
- ►He registered a total of three interceptions last season (including playoffs). He tied for fourth on the team with two during the regular season and registered one in the postseason.
- ►According to STATS, his three sacks during the 2015 regular season were tied for the fifth most in a single regular season by a Packers safety (since 1982) and the most since Mark Roman recorded 3.5 in 2004.
- ► Clinton-Dix's three sacks also tied for **No. 3 in the NFL** in 2015 among safeties.
- ▶ During the 2015 regular season, he registered eight-plus tackles in eight games, including setting career highs in both total tackles (12) and solo tackles (11) in the Week 10 game vs. Detroit, in which he also registered an interception.

RACKING UP POINTS

K Mason Crosby is moving his way up the record books.

▶ Crosby passed Ryan Longwell in Week 2 of the 2015 season to become the franchise career points leader:

- ► Crosby (319) eclipsed Longwell (277) for the most field goal attempts in Packers' history.
- ► Crosby (1,349) passed Longwell (1,119) for the most points scored in the regular and postseason combined in franchise history.
- ▶ Dating back to 2013, Crosby has made 104 field goals during the regular season, **tied for No. 5 in the NFL** over that span.
- ► Crosby recorded 108 points during the 2015 regular season, giving him the ninth 100-point season of his career and passing Ryan Longwell (1997-2004) for the franchise record.
- ▶In Week 11 of 2015, he tied the single-game team record with five field goals and became the first player in NFL history to have five field goals of 40-plus yards in a game. In the same game, Crosby connected on a 52-yard field goal, extending his career franchise record for the most 50-yard FGs to 26.

ON THE ROAD AGAIN

Green Bay went 7-1 away from Lambeau Field in 2011, with the seven road wins setting a single-season franchise record.

- ►The Packers have been able to stay above the .500 mark on the road during Head Coach Mike McCarthy's tenure, a notable achievement in the National Football League.
- ► Since 2006, McCarthy's first season as the head coach in Green Bay, only nine of 32 NFL teams have regular-season road records above .500.

323 AND COUNTING

Another packed house at Lambeau Field against the Indianpolis Colts in Week 9 brought the stadium's consecutive-sellouts streak to 323 regular-season games (not including replacement games).

- ►The league's longest-tenured stadium, Lambeau Field is hosting its 60th season of football in 2016. For the victory over Dallas in the Divisional round of the 2014 playoffs, Packers fans set a new Lambeau Field paid attendance record (79,704).
- ► Across American professional sports, only Boston's Fenway Park (1912) and Chicago's Wrigley Field (1914) have longer tenures.

THE LAMBEAU ADVANTAGE

The crown jewel of the National Football League, Lambeau Field has long been known as one of the tougher venues to play in, particularly during the harsh Wisconsin winter.

- ▶Re-establishing home-field advantage after a 4-4 mark in 2008 was one of the goals of 2009, and with the Packers finishing 6-2 at home, they accomplished that goal. Green Bay followed that up with a 7-1 mark at Lambeau Field in 2010, a perfect 8-0 record in 2011, the first undefeated home mark since 2002, and a 7-1 mark in 2012. The Packers were one of two teams to finish undefeated at home during the 2014 regular season (Denver).
- ► Head Coach **Mike McCarthy** stated consistently upon his arrival in Green Bay that one of the team's goals would be to reclaim the mystique of playing at Lambeau Field. Mission accomplished. The team is 62-22-1 (.735) at home in the regular season since 2006, **No. 2** in the NFL.
- ► Since Ron Wolf and Mike Holmgren began the revitalization of the franchise in 1992, Green Bay owns the best home record in the NFL. A look at the top regular-season home W-L records since the '92 season:

A LOOK AT THE SCHEDULE

The Green Bay Packers' 96th NFL regular-season schedule is headlined by five prime-time games (subject to flexible scheduling).

- ▶ Green Bay's schedule includes five games against 2015 playoff teams. Three of those contests (Minnesota, Houston, Seattle) will be at Lambeau Field, while two (Minnesota, Washington) will come on the road.
- ►The Packers kicked off their season on the road for the fourth consecutive year, the longest streak in team history, opening with two road games for the first time since 1924. Green Bay traveled to Jacksonville, playing on the road against an AFC team in Week 1 for the first time since facing the New England Patriots in 1985.
- ► Green Bay faced division opponents in Weeks 2-3. They began with a trip to Minnesota to face the Vikings in a prime-time game and returned to Lambeau Field last week for the home opener against the Detroit Lions.
- ▶ For the second time in four years, the Packers had their bye in Week 4.
- ▶Green Bay returns to action with three consecutive home games against NFC teams over a 12-day span. In Week 5, the Packers played on Sunday night against the New York Giants. It was the Giants' first regular-season game at Lambeau Field since 2010. In Week 6, Green Bay played the Dallas Cowboys for the fourth consecutive season (including playoffs) and for the second straight year at home in the regular season. Green Bay finished the homestand playing the Chicago Bears on a Thursday night for the second consecutive season (11th straight year in primetime).
- ► Four of the Packers' next five games will be on the road, including three road games in a row for the first time since 2012.
- ► After a trip to play the Atlanta Falcons in Week 8, Green Bay faced the Indianapolis Colts at home for the first time since 2008. The Packers made just their third regular-season visit to Tennessee to play the Titans in Week 10.
- ► Green Bay will play two prime-time road games in a row, first traveling to play against the Washington Redskins on a Sunday night in Week 11 and then to Philadelphia to face the Eagles on *Monday Night Football* in Week 12. It marked the 24th consecutive season (1993-2016) that Green Bay has appeared on *MNF*.
- ► Green Bay will play its first game at home in almost a month when it faces the Houston Texans in Week 13 for just the second time ever at Lambeau Field.
- ►Week 14 brings a familiar matchup as the Packers welcome the Seattle Seahawks to Lambeau Field for the second consecutive year. Including the postseason, Green Bay and Seattle will meet for the fifth time in five years.
- ► For the first time since 2006, the Packers will finish the regular season with three straight games against NFC North opponents.
- ▶In Week 15, Green Bay will travel to Chicago to play the Bears. The Packers have won four consecutive games against the Bears in December, three of which were played in Chicago.
- ► Green Bay returns home to play the Vikings in Week 16 on Christmas Eve, playing on a Saturday for the first time since 1997. The Packers last played on Christmas Eve in 2004, a 34-31 victory at Minnesota. Including playoffs, Green Bay has a 8-2-1 mark (.773) against the Vikings at Lambeau Field under McCarthy.
- ► The Packers will finish the regular season in Detroit for the first time since 1993. Green Bay has won seven of 10 games at Ford Field under McCarthy. It will be only the third time the Packers have played at the Lions during the regular season in the month of January (1983, 1994).



BREAKING DOWN THE ROSTER

The Packers have a 53-man roster that is composed of 24 offensive players, 26 defensive players and three specialists.

- ▶ Of the 53 players on the roster, 48 began their pro careers with the Packers (90.6 percent) and 36 of them (67.9 percent) were draft picks of the Packers. Dating back to 2009, Green Bay has selected nine players in the first round, seven of which are still on the team.
- ► Green Bay has 14 players on the roster that began their careers as undrafted free agents, with 12 of those originally signed by Green Bay.
- ► Six 2016 undrafted rookie free agents are currently on the roster (WR Geronimo Allison, S Kentrell Brice, S Marwin Evans, CB Josh Hawkins, RB Don Jackson, FB Joe Kerridge).
- ▶ 39.6 percent of the players (21 of 53) on Green Bay's roster entered the league as a sixth-round or seventh-round pick or as an undrafted player.
- ► The Packers have five players on the roster that played in the NFL prior to the 2009 season. Three of those players were draft picks of the Packers (QB Aaron Rodgers, K Mason Crosby and WR Jordy Nelson) and two (Rodgers, Nelson) have made at least one Pro Bowl.
- ▶ Only 19 of the 53 players on the roster (35.8 percent) were selected in the first three rounds of the draft, with 17 being drafted by the Packers.
- ► Of the 53 players on the roster, 43 of them (81.1 percent) are 28 years old or younger (as of Dec. 4) and 24 players (45.3 percent) are 24 years old or younger.

PACKERS STARTERS - OFFENSE

WR Jordy Nelson, 9th Year, Kansas State, D2a-08

▶ Ranks No. 3 in the NFL with nine receiving touchdowns this season.

► Has 58 career receiving TDs, ranking No. 4 in Packers history. Trails Donald Driver (61) for the third most.

- ► For the first time in his career, posted a touchdown reception in each of the first four games of the season, becoming the first Packer to do so since WR Bill Schroeder in 2001.
- ► His five touchdown receptions in the first four games this year tied for the fourth most in franchise history.

► Missed all of the 2015 season due to a knee injury.

- Finished the 2014 regular season ranked fourth in receiving yards (1,519), seventh in receptions (98) and tied for second in receiving touchdowns (13). Earned first selection to the Pro Bowl.
- ► Led the team in 2013 with 85 catches for 1,314 yards and eight TDs. Ranked No. 10 in the NFL that season in receiving yards.
- ► With 15 TD catches in 2011, became only the third player in franchise history to catch 15 or more TDs in a season, joining WRs Sterling Sharpe (18 in 1994) and Don Hutson (17 in 1942).

LT David Bakhtiari, 4th Year, Colorado, D4a-13

- ► Has started all but two games at LT since the start of the 2013 regular season. Missed the final two games of the 2015 regular season due to injury.
- ➤ Started all 16 games at left tackle in 2013, the only rookie in the NFL to do so in 2013 and the first Packer rookie to do so since the league went to a 16-game schedule in 1978.
- ▶ Became just the fourth Green Bay rookie to start at LT in the season opener since the 1970 AFL-NFL merger and the first since 1985.

LG Lane Taylor, 4th Year, Oklahoma State, FA-13

- ► Has played in 41 regular-season games for Green Bay with 13 starts.
- ► Made the first starts of his career in 2015, opening at RG at Detroit in Week 13 in place of an injured T.J. Lang and at LG in Week 17 vs. Minnesota with Josh Sitton sliding to LT in place of an injured David Bakhtiari.
- ► A four-year letterman at OSU, starting 47 of 50 games played at right guard. Unanimous first-team All-Big 12 selection by the conference's coaches as a senior.

C JC Tretter, 4th Year, Cornell, D4b-13

- Started the first seven games this season before a knee injury sidelined him for Weeks 9-12. Set career highs with 16 games played and three starts (all at C) during the 2015 regular season. Also started at LT in the NFC Wild Card game at Washington.
- ► Has seen game action at C, LG and both T spots during his career.
- ►Was on track to be the starting C in 2014, opening at that position for the first three preseason games, but sustained a knee injury vs. Oakland (Aug. 22) that would sideline him for the first half of the season. Returned to play in the final eight games and both postseason contests.
- ▶Grew from a high school quarterback, running back and slot receiver into an All-American LT in college, starting 20 consecutive games in his final two seasons at Cornell.

RG T.J. Lang, 8th Year, Eastern Michigan, D4-09

- ► Has started games at four different positions on the line as a pro (56 at RG, 27 at LG, five at RT, two at LT). Played C in Week 10 in 2013.
- ► Has started 87 contests since 2011, most by a Packers' offensive player.
- ► Started games at both tackle spots in his first season (2009) and became the first Packers rookie to start consecutive games at left tackle since Chad Clifton in 2000.
- ▶ Began his college career as a defensive lineman, but converted to the offensive line as a sophomore and started 36 straight games (10 at RT, 26 at LT) over his final three years.

RT Bryan Bulaga, 7th Year, Iowa, D1-10

- ► Has started 38 of 43 games since the start of the 2014 season.
- ► Missed the second part of the 2012 season after suffering a hip injury vs. Arizona on Nov. 4 and missed all of the 2013 season after injuring his knee on Aug. 3.
- ► Started 37 games at RT in his first three seasons in the league.
- Started the final 12 games of 2010 and the entire postseason at right tackle after taking over for veteran Mark Tauscher (shoulder).
- ▶ Named to the *Pro Football Weekly*/PFWA All-Rookie team in 2010.
- Capped his rookie season by becoming the youngest player at the time, according to STATS LLC, to ever start in the Super Bowl (21 years, 322 days).

TE Jared Cook, 8th Year, South Carolina, FA-16

- ▶In Week 11, registered 105 yards and a touchdown on five receptions (17.5 avg.). According to the Elias Sports Bureau, Cook became only the second TE (Benjamin Watson) to register a 100-yard receiving game with three different franchises.
- ➤ Signed with the Packers as a free agent in March 2016 after spending three seasons with the St. Louis Rams (2013-15) and four with the Tennessee Titans (2009-12).
- ► Has posted at least 35 receptions in each of the last five seasons (2011-15), one of only five active tight ends in the NFL to do so (Antonio Gates, Jimmy Graham, Rob Gronkowski, Greg Olsen).
- ► Holds the single-game franchise record for the most receiving yards by a tight end for both the Titans (169 vs. Jacksonville, Dec. 24, 2011) and the Rams (141 vs. Arizona, Sept. 8, 2013).

WR Randall Cobb, 6th Year, Kentucky, D2-11

- ▶ Ranks No. 3 on the team with 54 receptions this season.
- ▶Posted the 12th 100-yard receiving game of his career in Week 4 (108 on nine receptions) and tied his single-game high for receptions (11 for 95 yards and a TD) in Week 7.
- ►Led the team in receptions (79), was No. 2 in receiving yards (829) and was No. 3 in touchdown receptions (six) in 2015.
- Set a new single-season career high with five 100-yard receiving games during the 2014 season (three-2012). Earned first trip to the Pro Bowl.
- ►His career-best 91 receptions in 2014 were the seventh most in team history.
- ► Finished the regular season tied for fourth in the NFL with 12 touchdown receptions in 2014.
- ▶ Before suffering a knee injury in Week 6 in 2013, led the team in receptions with 29 and was No. 2 in receiving yards with 378.
- Set a franchise single-season record with a league-high 2,342 combined net yards in 2012, topping the previous team mark of 2,250 yards by RB Ahman Green in 2003.

QB Aaron Rodgers, 12th Year, California, D1-05

- In 130 regular-season starts (85-45 record), has posted 47 games with 300-plus passing yards, 76 without an interception and 72 with a 100-plus passer rating (min. 15 attempts).
 ► Earned his fifth selection to the Pro Bowl in 2015, passing Bart Starr
- ► Earned his fifth selection to the Pro Bowl in 2015, passing Bart Starr (1960-62, 1966) for the second-most selections by a Green Bay quarterback behind Brett Favre's nine (1992-93, 1995-97, 2001-03, 2007).
- ► His career passer rating of 103.5 ranks No. 1 in NFL history.
- ▶ Finished the 2014 regular season ranked No. 2 in the NFL in passer rating (112.2), touchdown percentage (7.3), No. 1 in interception percentage (1.0) and No. 3 in touchdown passes (38).
 ▶ Recorded a passer rating of at least 120.0 in seven regular-season
- ▶ Recorded a passer rating of at least 120.0 in seven regular-season games in 2014, setting a single-season career high and tying for the third most in a single season in the NFL, dating back to 1960.
 ▶ Posted 21,332 passing yards from 2008-12, which ranks No. 1 in league
- Posted 21,332 passing yards from 2008-12, which ranks No. 1 in league history for the most passing yards by a QB in his first five seasons as a starter (previous record was Peyton Manning, 20,618, 1998-2002).
- In 2011, set an NFL record with a 122.5 passer rating and set franchise marks for TD passes (45), passing yards (4,643), completion percentage (68.3), yards per attempt (9.25) and 300-yard games (eight) on his way to earning NFL Most Valuable Player honors from *The Associated Press*.

RB James Starks, 7th Year, Buffalo, D6-10

- ► Has started 12 of 70 career games played during the regular season.
- Set career highs in starts (four), rushing yards (601), receptions (43), receiving yards (392), receiving TDs (three) and yards from scrimmage (993) last season.
- ▶ In 2015, he put together two of the finest rushing games of his career. In Week 2, he carried the ball 20 times for 95 yards (4.8 avg.), and in Week 6, he racked up 112 yards on just 10 carries (11.2 avg.), becoming the first Packers player to rush for 100-plus yards on 10 or fewer carries since RB Brandon Jackson at Washington on Oct. 10, 2010 (115 yards on 10 carries). He also registered a 65-yard touchdown against San Diego, the longest by a Green Bay player since RB DeShawn Wynn's 73-yard touchdown vs. Detroit on Dec. 28, 2008.
- ▶ Led the NFL with 315 rushing yards during the 2010 playoffs.

FB Aaron Ripkowski, 2nd Year, Oklahoma, D6a-15

- Scored his first career rushing touchdown in Week 12.
- ► Set career highs with 34 yards on six carries (5.7 avg.) in Week 8.
- Played in 15 games as a rookie, seeing action primarily on special teams.
- ▶ Tied for No. 4 on the team with nine special teams tackles last season.



PACKERS STARTERS - DEFENSE

DE Kenny Clark, Rookie, UCLA, D1-16

- ► Ranks No. 3 on the Packers' defensive line in tackles (25).
- ► Became the youngest player to appear in a season opener for the Packers since Arnie Herber (20 years old) in 1930.
- ► Earned third-team All-America honors from *The Associated Press* and first-team All-Pacific-12 recognition from the coaches and media as a junior in 2015.
- ► Was a team co-captain in '15 and recorded career highs in tackles (75), tackles for a loss (11) and sacks (six). Also ranked third on the team with five pass breakups.

NT Letroy Guion, 9th Year, Florida State, FA-14

- ► Has started 30 of the 39 regular-season games he has played in since the start of the 2014 season.
- ➤ Signed with Green Bay during the 2014 offseason after spending his first six NFL seasons with the Minnesota Vikings.
- ► Started all 28 games he appeared in for Minnesota in 2012-13, recording 72 tackles (32 solo) and three sacks over that span.
- ► Was the only Viking to block a field goal in both 2011 and 2012.

DT Mike Daniels, 5th Year, Iowa, D4a-12

- ► Ranks third on the team with 19.0 sacks since the start of the 2013 regular season (LB Julius Peppers-23.0 / LB Clay Matthews-29.0).
- ► Leads the Packers' defensive line in tackles (31).
- ► Led the defensive line in both tackles and sacks each of that last two seasons.
- ► Returned a fumble 43 yards for a TD vs. Detroit in Week 14 of 2012, the longest fumble return for a TD by a rookie in franchise history.
- ► Starred as an interior pass rusher at lowa, posting a team-high 24.5 tackles for a loss and 13 sacks from 2010-11.

LOLB Nick Perry, 5th Year, Southern California, D1-12

- Leads the team with a career-high eight sacks this season.
- ▶ Registered mulitple sacks in each of his first five seasons in the NFL and has posted a two-sack game in each of the last four seasons (2013-16).
- ► Has totaled six sacks in five playoff games, including 3.5 in the 2015 postseason which tied Clay Matthews (2010) for the franchise record in a single posteason.
- ► His six postseason sacks rank No. 3 in franchise history behind Matthews (10) and Reggie White (eight) and are the most in team history (since 1982) by a player in his first five games with Green Bay.

ILB Jake Ryan, 2nd Year, Michigan, D4-15

- ► Leads the team with 61 tackles on the season.
- ► Started the final five games of the regular season and both playoff contests in 2015.
- ▶ Recorded a team-best nine tackles (eight solo) and one fumble recovery in Week 13 last season at Detroit in his first pro start.
- ➤ Served as a team captain for his final two seasons at Michigan and was a three-time winner (2012-14) of the Roger Zatkoff Award, given to the Wolverines top linebacker. He was the only player to win the award (est. 1991) three times.
- ► Joined LB John Anderson (first round, 26th overall) as the only Michigan linebackers ever drafted by Green Bay.
- Started 41 of 46 games played in college, appearing at inside linebacker as a senior after spending his first three seasons at outside linebacker and defensive end.

ILB Blake Martinez, Rookie, Stanford, D4a-16

- ► Ranks No. 3 on the team with 58 tackles this season.
- ▶ Became the first rookie to start on defense for Green Bay in Week 1 since Nick Perry in 2012.
- ► Finished collegiate career with 257 tackles (137 solo), 13.5 tackles for a loss, 6.5 sacks, five interceptions and five forced fumbles in 51 games played.
- ► Started all 27 games played in his final two seasons, leading the team in tackles as a junior (102) and senior (141).
- ► Led the Pacific-12 and ranked No. 7 nationally with 141 tackles (75 solo) as a senior, averaging a conference-best 10.1 tackles per game.

ROLB Clay Matthews, 8th Year, Southern California, D1b-09

- For the first time in his career, recorded at least one sack in each of the first three regular-season games he played in.
- ➤ Selected to his sixth Pro Bowl and first as an inside linebacker in 2015 after recording 6.5 sacks (second on the team), 15 QB hits (No. 1 on the team), and a career-high 85 tackles (No. 2 on the team).
- ► With 70.5 careeer sacks, passed Reggie White (68.5) for the second most sacks in Packers history (Kabeer Gbaja-Biamila, 74.5).
- ▶ With a team-high 11.0 sacks in 2014, is tied for the most 10-plus sack seasons in franchise history (four).
- ▶ Is the only player in franchise history to score a defensive TD (interception or fumble return) in each of his first three seasons in the NFL (2009-11).

LCB Damarious Randall, 2nd Year, Arizona State, D1-15

- ▶ Played in 15 games with nine starts (six at LCB, two at RCB, one in the slot) in 2015 and tied for the team lead and No. 2 among NFL rookies with three interceptions, including one he returned for a TD. Finished with a team-best 16 passes defensed.
- Named the NFL's Defensive Rookie of the Month for November 2015, joining CB Casey Hayward (October 2012) as the only Green Bay defensive backs to win the award.
- ► Earned first-team All-Pacific-12 honors at safety as a senior in 2014 after he led the Sun Devils in tackles (106) and passes defensed (12) and tied for the team lead with three interceptions.

RCB Quinten Rollins, 2nd Year, Miami (Ohio), D2-15

- ► Has started six of the eight games (three at LCB, three as the third CB) he has appeared in this season. Missed Weeks 6-8 with a groin injury.
- ▶ Played in 14 games with four starts (two at LCB, two at RCB) in 2015.
- ► Tied for No. 3 on the team and No. 4 among NFL rookies with two interceptions last season.
- ▶ Returned his first career interception 45 yards for a touchdown, becoming the first Packers rookie to record a pick-six since S Marques Anderson in 2002 (vs. Detroit, Nov. 10).
- ▶ Played one season of college football and was named Mid-American Conference Defensive Player of the Year and first-team All-MAC.

SS Morgan Burnett, 7th Year, Georgia Tech, D3-10

- ►Tied for No. 1 among NFL safeties with a career-best three sacks this season.
- ► Missed five games due to injury in 2015, but finished No. 4 on the team with 54 solo tackles.
- ▶Totaled a team-high 125 tackles in 2014, the second most of his career (137 in 2012). Ranked No. 2 on the team with 106 tackles (77 solo) in 2013, despite missing the first three games due to injury. Recovered three fumbles, including one for a TD, and added nine passes defensed.
- ▶ Participated in all 1,088 plays for Green Bay's defense in 2012, one of only four non-OL in the NFL to appear in 100 percent of his team's snaps.
- Started the first four games of the 2010 season at SS before sustaining a season-ending knee injury vs. Detroit in Week 4.

FS Ha Ha Clinton-Dix, 3rd Year, Alabama, D1-14

- ▶According to STATS, he and Eagles S Rodney McLeod are the only safeties with one or more forced fumbles and three interceptions this season.
- ▶ Posted a career high in Week 9 with two INTs and became the first Green Bay safety to register two INTs in a game since Morgan Burnett did so vs. Minnesota on Dec. 2, 2012. He joined CB Al Harris (vs. New Orleans, Oct. 9, 2005) as the only players to post two INTs in a first quarter for the Packers since 1993.
- ▶Led the team in tackles in 2015 with 117 (97 solo) and was tied for fourth on the team in interceptions (two).
- ► According to STATS, his three sacks during the 2015 regular season tied for the fifth most in a single regular season by a Packers safety (since 1982) and the most since Mark Roman recorded 3.5 in 2004.
- ► Started every game in 2015 after starting 10 of 16 games as a rookie when he finished second on the team in tackles (95).
- Was a consensus All-America selection in 2013 as a junior, earning first-team recognition from *The Associated Press*, the Football Writers Association of America and *Sporting News*.

- ► At the conclusion of all games, the locker room will be opened following the NFL's standard "cooling-off period."
- ►All interviews with players on the practice squad or injured reserve need to be requested and approved through the P.R. department.
- ► Any requests to interview players other than at the aforementioned times should be directed to a member of the Packers' P.R. department.

ASSISTANT COACH AVAILABILITY

All by request only, through the P.R. department

- ► Coordinators Edgar Bennett (offense, bottom left), Dom Capers (defense, bottom middle) and Ron Zook (special teams, bottom right) will continue to serve as primary spokesmen in their respective areas.
- During the regular season, assistants generally will be available on Thursdays at the podium in the Media Auditorium with offense and defense rotating every other week. During a week when offensive coaches are available, Capers will also be available on Thursday to represent the defense. When defensive coaches are available, Bennett will also be available on Thursday to represent the offense. On Mondays, the coordinators will be available at the podium in the Media Auditorium.
- ► Following games, Head Coach Mike McCarthy will be the only coach available to the media.
- ► However, position coaches are available for questions on specific players and the position group only. Broader interview topics need to be directed to the respective coordinators.
- ► No assistant coach should be contacted directly by telephone (at his desk, home or on his cell phone), or by email. All interviews must be arranged through the P.R. department.
- ► Sarah Quick (920-569-7213) serves as the primary contact for assistant coaches. In her absence, feel free to contact another member of the P.R. staff.

PRACTICE ACCESS, PHOTOGRAPHY AND SOCIAL-MEDIA GUIDELINES

▶ During the regular season, practices will be open to state media who regularly cover the team for designated periods during the first half of each session, similar to previous seasons. Also as in

- prior years, photo opportunities will be limited to the beginning portions of practice.
- ► The team reserves the right to limit photography to certain periods for competitive reasons. This restriction applies to both training-camp and regular-season practices.
- ► During practice periods in which B-roll and still photography are NOT permitted, the media may not utilize camera phones either. The P.R. staff will alert the media of the permissible "shooting" periods before and during each practice.
- ▶ Video of practice, press conferences or locker-room interviews by an individual or media outlet may not be posted at any time on social-media sites or live-broadcasting applications (this includes applications such as Facebook, Twitter, Vine, Instagram, Snapchat, Ustream, Periscope and Meerkat, etc).
- ► No still photography is permitted in the locker room at any time. Signs, notes and other personal items or information posted in and around the locker room at player lockers are not to be photographed or captured on video.

ONLINE-CONTENT POLICY

According to the 2016 NFL non-game online content policy, accredited organizations may distribute online non-game audio and video content, including interviews, press conferences and team practices at NFL venues, acquired as a result of credentialed access ("Game Information") to games or club/league facilities provided that such distribution: is 90 seconds maximum per day (180 seconds in two-team markets – 90 seconds per team); may not be "archived" (i.e., made available for on-demand public access) for more than 24 hours; appears in an editorial context only (no sponsorship, merchandising or advertising integrated with or around the content); is not posted live; and is accompanied by links back to NFL.com and to the club website.

The 90-second limit does not include video/audio material that is composed entirely of a credentialed media employee providing commentary or analysis ("talking head" reporting), including pregame or postgame stand-up material shot on the field or other facility location.

While a game is in progress, any forms of accounts of the game must be sufficiently time-delayed and limited in amount (e.g., score updates with detail given only in quarterly game updates, fewer than 10 photographs during the game) so that the accredited organization's game coverage cannot be used as a substitute for, or otherwise approximate, authorized play-by-play accounts.

The Packers have their own social-media and online-content policies for practice reporting, which will be communicated by the P.R. staff for both training camp and the regular season. Members of the media are encouraged to contact the public relations staff with any questions.



MEDIA INFORMATION & POLICIES

CONFERENCE CALLS

The Packers' P.R. department will arrange a conference call with the head coach and a key player of the opposing team each week during the regular season. These conference calls will be made from the media workroom, and generally will be held on Wednesday.

In the Lee Remmel Press Box at Lambeau Field, more than a dozen "co-op" phones are available to media throughout the box. If dedicated service is desired, please contact Scott Guth of Dataline Services seven to 10 days prior to the game at 920-569-7090 or sguth@datalineservicesinc.com. Instruments also may be obtained through Guth, upon request.

Dedicated internet service also may be ordered through Dataline Services – on a game-by-game or full-season basis – for installation in either the Lee Remmel Press Box or in the downstairs Photo/Media Workrooms.

As assigned by the Professional Football Writers of America (PFWA), the Green Bay pool reporter for the 2016 season is Tom Silverstein of the *Milwaukee Journal Sentinel*. Pete Dougherty of the *Green Bay Press-Gazette* is the alternate.

PHOTO CREDENTIALS

Photo credentials will not be issued to freelance photographers unless on a specific assignment from an accredited organization. Credentials are not provided to "grips" due to on-field space limitations.

CREDENTIALS

All credential requests are acquired through an online credential link, which should be obtained by contacting Sarah Quick, assistant director of public relations. Requests may be sent via email (Sarah Quick; quicks@packers.com). Credentials will not be mailed, unless the requesting outlet provides a Federal Express or UPS number, and if scheduled in advance, should be picked up in person at the Packers' corporate offices, located in the Lambeau Field Atrium. Credentials not obtained prior to gameday will be left at Media Will Call on the south side of the stadium near the Shopko Gate. Media Will Call opens three hours prior to kickoff.

MINNEAPOLIS -- Sam Bradford had a Minnesota debut almost as dazzling as the new \$1.1 billion building itself, completing 22 of 31 passes for 286 yards, two touchdowns and no tumovers to lead the Vikings to a 17-14 victory over the Green Bay Packers on Sunday night just 15 days after the arrived in a tradie.

The defense did the rest, harassing Aaron Rodgers for five sacks and two fourth-quarter tumovers that quashed the comeback and sent the crowd

Rodgers, who ran for 29 yards and a touchdown, began to find a groove throwing the ball down the stretch. He finished 12 for 21 for 154 yards withstanding an early touchdown pass by Rodgers to Jordy Nelson on a drive aided by two penalties by cornerback Terence Newman.

Trae Waynes, who had two penalties himself, intercepted Rodgers' pass in Vikings territory with 1:50 left to seal the victory. The previous drive

The Vikings, who aggressively traded two premium draft picks including next year's first-rounder to Philadelphia to fetch Bradford after Teddy Bridgewater went down with a massive left knee injury, boldly eschewed a field-goal try early in the second quarter.

GREEN BAY, Wis. — The timing is back for quarterback Aaron Rodgers and the rest of Green Bay's offense. The Packers' pass defense might

need a little work, though.

Rodges threw for 205 yards and four touchdowns, including two in the first half to Jordy Nelson, and the Packers snapped out of their offensive funk before holding off the Detroit Lions for a 34-27 win Sunday.

Rodgers was 15 of 24, leading the Packers to touchdowns on their first three series. Nelson had 101 yards on six catches, returning to the form that made him one of the NFL's best receivers before missing the 2015 season with a knee injury. They moved the ball on the Lions' short-handed defense with ease in the first half. The Packers (2-1) led 31-10 at halftime before the Lions slowly

chipped away.

Marvin Jones' 35-yard touchdown catch with 3:34 left got Detroit (1-2) within seven. But Rodgers had a critical 11-yard run on third-and-8 from the Packers' 27 with 3:22 left to effectively seal the win.

Jones had a career-high 205 yards on six receptions. Matthew Stafford passed for 385 yards and three scores for the Lions, who held advantages in total yardage (418-324) and time of possession, holding the ball for 35 minutes.

But the Packers burned he secondary with big plays to build a big lead, and Eddle Lacy ran for 103 yards on 17 carries.

Coach Mike McCarthy and Rodgers heard questions about the out-of-sync passing game following the 17-14 loss last week to Minnesota. Now the Packers head into an early bye week with renewed confidence after a successful opener at Lambeau Field.

The Lions gained chunks of yardage in the second half after being forced to play catch-up following Green Bay's big early lead. The Packers' defense was also missing four staffers, including linebacker Clay Matthews.

Stafford found holes over the middle of the field. He connected with Jones for a 23-yard completion on the first play from scrimmage in the

second half to the Detroit 46.

But Green Bay's staunch run defense had another big day, albeit against a Lions offense playing without injured tailback Ameer Abdullah. Detroit managed just 50 yards on 23 carries, with a team-high 38 yards on 10 carries by Dwayne Washington.

Jones gave the Lions a boost going into halftime with a 73-yard touchdown pass from Stafford to get Detroit within 31-10. He stiff-armed cornerback Josh Hawkins before sprinting unbuched 45 yards into the end zone.

The Packers' offense accomplished two of McCaffarb bigger goals for this week: Receivers worked the middle of the field, and Lacy got more carries in the running game. Nelson was lined up in the slot on his 8-yard touchdown catch in the first quarter, when Rodgers pump-faked, then stepped up in the pocket to find Nelson. Lacy looked rejuvenated as he bounced off defenders for a 25-yard run in the second quarter.

GREEN BAY, Wis. (AP) — The Green Bay Packers got pushy on both sides of the line of scrimmage against the New York Giants. The offensive line kept Aaron Rodgers clean in the pocket and helped drive the running attack. The defensive line is playing so well that that the MVP quarterback is taking notice.

Rodgers threw for 259 yards and two touchdown passes, and Green Bay's defense disrupted Eli Manning and limited Odell Beckham Jr. in a 23-16 win on Sunday night.

Manning was 18 of 35 for 199 yards and was sacked three times. The Giants (2-3) lost their third straight game, and the offense has struggled in road losses at Minnesota and Green Bay the last two weeks.

The Packers defense contained the Giants in the red zone, holding New York to three field goals until late in the fourth quarter. Green Bay's secondary played well, especially considering the Packers (3-1) were without starling cornerbacks Sam Shields (concussion) and Damarious Randall (groin). The Packers had another stellar day against the run, albeit against a team that was missing lead running back Rashad Jennings (thumb). The Giants managed just 43 yards on 15 carries against a defense ranked first against the run coming into the night.

Mike Daniels and Letroy Guion led the effort on the defensive line, with first-round draft pick Kenny Clark becoming a key sub. The line only gigures to only get stronger with the expected return of top backup Mike Pennel next week from a four-game suspension for violating the league's substance-abuse policy.

Beckham finished with five catches for 56 yards, but did get his first touchdown catch of the season.

The 8-yard score stood on replay review after the receiver jumped high in the air for Manning's pass and was ruled inbounds after straddling the back line of the end zone.

Randall Cobb was the Packers' most consistent receiver with nine catches for 108 yards. With the Giants missing starting safety Nat Berhe because of an injury, Cobb excelled in his specialty of working the middle of the field and turning short passes into long gains.

Cobb appeared to be OK on the sideline after taking a hit to the back of his head or neck from safety Landon Collins on a 13-yard catch on third-

and-10 with about 2 minutes left.

Glants cornerback Janon's Jenkins had two interceptions in the first half, one coming on third-and-6 at the Glants 21 after a pass deflected off receiver Jordy Nelson's hands. It was Jenkins' first two-interception game since his rookie season with St. Louis, when he had two against Arizona on Nov. 25, 2012.

Given what happened a year ago — Atlanta started the season 6-1, then lost six in a row and missed the playoffs — it was imperative to turn things around against the Packers. It didn't look good when Aaron Rodgers threw his fourth touchdown pass, putting the Packers ahead with 3:58 remaining. The Falcons were coming off a 26-24 loss at Seattle and a 33-30 overtime setback to San Diego in which they squandered a 17-point lead at home.

Sanu had nine catches for 84 yards, both season highs in his first year with the Falcons. Atlanta needed every one of them, since Jones was held to three catches for 29 yards and targeted only once in the second half — a dropped pass on the final possession.

But Jones helped Sanu get open on the winning play, drawing two defenders when they lined up on the same side of the field.

Ryan was 28 of 35 for 288 yards and three touchdowns.

GREEN BAY, Wis. (AP) — Jordan Todman set the tone early for the Indianapolis Colts on special teams and Andrew Luck made the clutch throws late.

In between, the defense made just enough plays to hold off Green Bay despite the Packers' frantic fourth quarter. The Colts survived for a 31-26 win on Sunday after letting an 18-point lead with 9:35 left nearly disappear.

Todman had a 99-yard return for a touchdown on the opening kickeff, Frank Gore rushed for two touchdowns and Luck shook off two interceptions in the first quarter to finish with 261 yards passing and a touchdown. Indianapolis (4-5) heads into a bye week with a confidence-building victory after withstanding Aaron Rodgers' comeback attempt. Rodgers' 3-yard touchdown pass to Randall Cobb with 3:29 left got Green Bay (4-4) within five, capping a 14-point spurt in four-plus minutes. Rodgers finished 26 of 43 for 297 yards with three scores and an interception.

Luck responded on the Colts next drive with what Pagano called "two unbelievable plays."

The quarterback dodged a potential sack by blitzing safety Ha Ha Clinton-Dix to throw a 20-yard pass on third-and-10 with 3:07 left toight end Jack Duyle.

Luck also found 1.Y. Hitton for a 27-yard completion on third-and-2 with two minutes left to put the game away. He finished 23 of 36, throwing both interceptions to Clinton-Dix.

The Colts, who had allowed an NFL-worst 31 sacks coming into the game, gave their quarterback decent protection. Luck was sacked two.

LANDOVER, Md. (AP) — Kirk Cousins went deep late and often, throwing for 375 yards and three touchdowns to lead the Washington Redskins to a 42-24 victory over the Green Bay Packers on Sunday night.

Cousins and the Redskins (63-31) have won six of their past eight games. The Packers (4-6) have lost four consecutive games and five of six, allowing 30 or more points in all of those defeats.

Washington's Robert Kelley ran for a career-best 137 yards and three touchdowns against a Green Bay defense that allowed completions of 70, 53 and 44 yards. Cousins was 21 of 30, connecting with Pierre Garcon, DeSean Jackson and Jamison Crowder for touchdowns and becoming the franchise

leader in 300-yard games.

Aaron Rodgers was 26 of 41 for 355 yards and three touchdowns, but he couldn't keep up with what his defense gave up. Washington gained 517

yards and converted on 64 percent of third-down attempts.

Packers receiver Jordy Nelson's 13-yard touchdown catch stood up after video review, despite the ambiguity over whether he held on to the ball. Redskins cornerback Josh Norman knocked the ball out of Nelson's hands in the end zone and thought it was an incomplete pass, but officials ruled it a

touchdown on the field and replay confirmed it.

The Redskins picked up three delay-of-game penalties — two of them on defense. Norman got his NFL-leading 11th penalty of the season for spiking the ball in the second quarter, and connerback Bashaud Breeland was penaltized for "throwing the ball ownfield" in the third. Green Bay got a traditional delay of game penalty earlier and avoided another when Rodgers called a timeout at the last second.

After kickers around the league missed 11 extra-point attempts going in, Washington coach kay Gruden opted to go for 2 wice — and converted neither. But he was validated when Green Bay's Mason Crosby missed a 36-yard attempt at that end in the third quarter and when his kicker, Dustin Hopkins, shanked an extra-point attempt off the right upright in the fourth.

PHILADELPHIA (AP) — Aaron Rodgers threw two touchdown passes to Davante Adams and the Green Bay Packers beat the Philadelphia Eagles 27-13. Monday night to snap a four-game losing streak.

Rodgers had 313 yards passing and Adams had 113 yards receiving to help send Philadelphia (5-6) to its first home loss this season. The Packers (5-6) kept their sinking playoff hopes alive but they're still two games behind the Lions (7-4) in the NFC North. Carson Wentz had 254 yards passing ran for a score and threw an interception. The barylace Eagles are 2-6 since a 3-0 start. Rodgers came out firing and led the Packers on consecutive touchdown drives to start the game. Rodgers extended the opening drive by running twice for 25 yards and tossed a 12-yard TD pass to Adams for a 7-0 lead.

After the Eagles answered on Wentz's 1-yard TD run, Rodgers led another 75-yard scoring drive. He threw a perfect 20-yard TD pass to Adams to give the Packers at 14-7 lead early in the second quarter. Nolan Carroll had excellent coverage on the play, but Rodgers put the ball in a tight spot and hit Adams in stride in the back of the end zone.

Are agles had allowed only three touchdowns at home while outscoring opponents 18 09-38 in their first four games at Lincoln Financial Field. - With 88 catches in 2014-15, joined WRs Randall Cobb (105 in 2011-12) and Greg Jennings (98 in 2006-07) as the only Packers over the last 25 seasons to register 85-plus receptions in their first two seasons in the league.

- **2016 SEASON:** Started all five games he appeared in and posted 360 rushing yards on 71 carries (5.1 avg.)...Registered 10 runs of 10-plus yards and also had four receptions for 28 yards (7.0 avg.)...Was placed on injured reserve (ankle) on Oct. 20.

- One of just two players in franchise history (WR Sterling Sharpe, 1989 and 1992) to register two seasons with 85-plus receptions and 1,300-plus receiving yards, having done it in 2011 and 2014.
- Eclipsed the 1,000-yard receiving mark three times over a four-year span (2011, 2013-14).
- Ranks No. 5 in franchise history in receptions (461), No. 6 in receiving yards (6,853) and No. 4 in TD receptions (58).
- Set a single-season franchise record with 1,519 receiving yards in 2014, topping WR Robert Brooks' mark of 1,497 yards in 1995, on the way to being selected to his first career Pro Bowl and earning second-team All-Pro honors from *The Associated Press*.
- Is tied for No. 4 in the NFL for the most TD catches since 2011 with 52 despite missing the entire 2015 season due to injury.
- **2016 SEASON:** Has started all 11 games and leads the team with 61 receptions for 754 yards (12.4 avg.) and nine TDs...Ranks No. 3 in the league in TD catches...Has posted a TD catch in eight games this season, the most in the NFL...Ranks No. 1 in the league with 13 red-zone receptions and leads the NFL in red-zone TDs with eight, two more than any other player in the league.
- ► At Jacksonville (Sept. 11): After missing the entire 2015 season due to a knee injury, returned to the starting lineup and played 54 snaps, tying for the team lead with six catches for 32 yards (5.3 avg.) and a TD...The TD catch was the 50th of his career and came with just over three minutes remaining in the first half to give the Packers a 14-10 lead as he found an opening in the middle of the end zone.

- Has played in 229 games with 222 starts as a pro, appearing in all 16 contests in 12 of his first 14 seasons in the NFL. Has missed just two games due to injury during his career.
- Is the only player in NFL history with 100-plus sacks (141.5) and 10-plus interceptions (11).
- Since entering the NFL in 2002, ranks No. 1 in the league in sacks (141.5) and No. 3 in forced fumbles (46). His career sack total is tied for No. 5 in NFL history (since 1982).
- **2016 SEASON:** Has played in all 11 games with six starts and ranks No. 2 on the team with 5.5 sacks...Has posted 15 tackles (12 solo), seven tackles for a loss (No. 3 on the team), a forced fumble, seven QB hits and 10 pressures (No. 2 on the team).

- Was named the state's Defensive Player of the Year by the Louisiana Sports Writers Association after ranking seventh in the nation in tackles for loss (20) and 12th in the country in sacks (11½). His 11½ sacks tied the school single-season record and he also finished tied for No. 1 in school history with 21.0 career sacks.

- Has posted five seasons (2009, 2011-12, 2014-15) with 500-plus passing attempts and eight or fewer INTs, the most in NFL history ahead of Patriots QB Tom Brady (three seasons) and five QBs (one season each).
- Was named the league's Most Valuable Player by The Associated Press in 2014 for the second time in his career (2011), becoming the eighth player in league history to win the honor multiple times.
- Is the only quarterback in league history to record a 100-plus passer rating in six consecutive seasons (2009-14), with no other QB doing so in more than four straight years.
- Is one of only eight quarterbacks in NFL annals with 30,000-plus passing yards and 2,000-plus rushing yards.
- In 130 career regular-season starts (85-45 record), has posted 47 games with 300-plus passing yards, 75 without an interception (min. 15 attempts) and 71 with a 100-plus passer rating.
- Has been selected to the Pro Bowl in five of the last seven seasons (2009, 2011-12, 2014-15).
- **2016 SEASON:** Has completed 289 of 449 passes (63.2 percent) for 3,074 yards and 27 TDs with seven INTs for a 97.8 passer rating...Ranks No. 2 in the league in TD passes and No. 6 in TD percentage (6.0)... - Was one of only four TEs in the NFL last season to register 55-plus catches, 500-plus receiving yards and eight or more TD receptions (Rob Gronkowski, Jordan Reed, Gary Barnidge).
- Registered 10 TD catches in 2014-15, tied for the most by a Green Bay TE in his first two seasons since the 1970 AFL-NFL merger (Bubba Franks, 2000-01). His eight TD receptions in '15 were tied for the fifth most in a season by a Packers TE.
- Set a single-game franchise record for tight ends with 146 receiving yards last season at Detroit in Week 13, highlighted by his game-winning 61-yard TD catch on the final play of the game.
- **2016 SEASON:** Has played in all 11 games with five starts and has 23 catches for 203 yards (8.8 avg.) and a TD.
- ►At Jacksonville (Sept. 11): Appeared on 25 plays on offense and made a season-long 22-yard catch in the third quarter to the Jacksonville 8 that helped set up K Mason Crosby's 25-yard FG...Was covered by S Johnathan Cyprien on the play, extending his arms out to make a diving grab near the sideline.
