GUS MALZAHN

HEAD COACH (5TH SEASON)

In four years as head coach at Auburn, Gus Malzahn has led the Tigers to a 35-18 record, four consecutive bowl game, a Southeastern Conference Championship and an appearance in the BCS National Championship Game (2013). Malzahn has directed Auburn to three New Year's Day bowl games in four seasons, a program first since 2004-06.

Malzahn, 44-21 in five seasons as a head coach, has directed teams to six conference championship game appearances in his 11 seasons as a collegiate coach, including a pair of SEC Championships at Auburn (2010, 2013) and a Sun Belt Championship at Arkansas State in 2012.

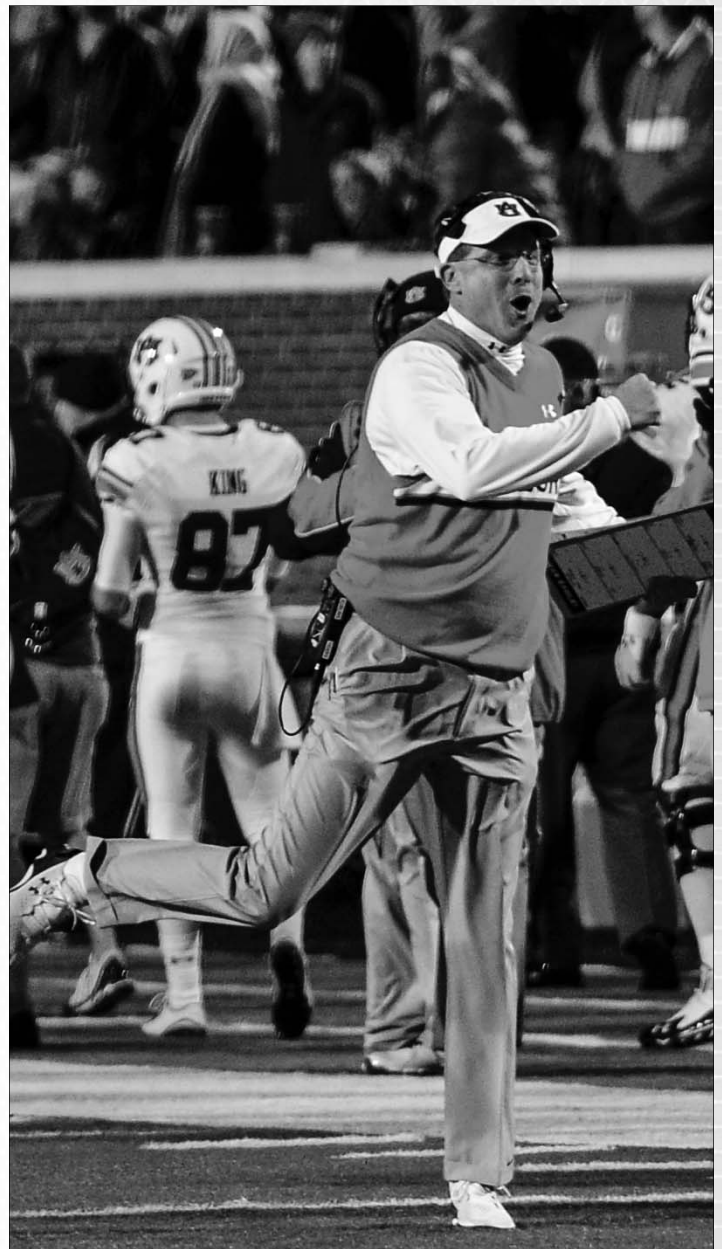
The 2013 Bear Bryant, Bobby Bowden, Eddie Robinson, Home Depot, Sporting News, SB Nation, Liberty Mutual and Associated Press National Coach of the Year, Malzahn earned SEC Coach of the Year honors after guiding Auburn to the biggest turnaround in SEC history.

He led the Tigers to a 12-2 record and one of the most memorable seasons in school history in 2013, with historic wins over Georgia and Alabama and a record-setting SEC Championship win over Missouri. He became just the third coach in SEC history to win an SEC title in his first year at a school, joining LSU's Bernie Moore in 1935 and Ole Miss' John Vaught in 1947.

Last season, Malzahn's team won six consecutive games, the third longest win streak by Auburn over the last 12 years, while finishing second in the nation's most difficult division, the SEC West. Under his direction, the 2016 Tigers ranked in the top 50 nationally in total offense and total defense, an Auburn first since 2005.

Auburn's balance in 2016 was displayed by a team that ranked first in the SEC and sixth nationally in rushing, coupled with a defense that was seventh in the country in scoring defense and 28th in total defense. The special team units have traditionally been a strong point under Malzahn and was no different in 2016 behind the strong leg of All-America and Groza Award finalist kicker Daniel Carlson.

In 2015, the youthful Tigers, which lost 14 players to the NFL from the previous season, faced 11 bowl teams en route to a





Birmingham Bowl victory over Memphis. Malzahn's 2014 team was ranked in the nation's top 10 for a majority of the season before finishing 8-5 after navigating the nation's most difficult schedule featuring seven ranked foes.

One of the most innovative offensive minds in football, Malzahn's high-powered offense has averaged over 450 yards of total offense and 33.8 points per game in his four seasons at Auburn.

He has produced 14 1,000-yard rushers in 11 seasons as a college coach, at least one in each season, including Heisman Trophy finalist Tre Mason (1,816) and Nick Marshall (1,068) in 2013 and Cameron-Artis Payne (1,608) in 2014. Kamryn Pettway ran for 1,123 yards in 2016 despite missing significant time with injuries.

On three occasions, he has had two 1,000-yard rushers in the same season: 2013 (Auburn), 2010 (Auburn) and 2006 (Arkansas) and this year, in addition to Pettway, Kerryon Johnson notched 862 rushing yards. Malzahn has also coached five 1,000-yard receivers and three 3,000-yard passers. His 2007 Tulsa team had three 1,000-yard receivers.

Since Malzahn's arrival, Auburn has the top rushing offense in the SEC, averaging 262.9 yards per game. In 2013, Auburn led the nation in rushing at 328.3 yards per game, the first SEC team ever to do so. Three of the top six team rushing totals in SEC history (2010, 2013, 2016) have come under Malzahn's leadership.

Auburn was just the second team in SEC history to gain more

than 7,000 yards of total offense in a season in 2013, finishing the year with 7,018 yards; the other was Texas A&M in 2012.

The Tigers set a school record with 48 rushing touchdowns in 2013 and set a school record against SEC opponents with 677 yards of total offense vs. No. 5 Missouri in the SEC Championship Game. The Tigers set SEC Championship Game team records with 26 rushing first downs, 74 rushing attempts, 545 rushing yards and seven rushing touchdowns.

Tre Mason, a Heisman Trophy finalist and SEC Player of the Year in 2013, ranked third in the nation with 23 touchdowns, was fifth nationally with 1,816 yards rushing, sixth with 10.7 points per game, sixth with 169.57 all-purpose yards per game and eighth with 129.7 rushing yards per game. Mason set the Auburn single-season record with 1,816 rushing yards and 2,374 all-purpose yards, is second with 317 rushing attempts. His 46 rushing attempts and 304 rushing yards vs. No. 5 Missouri set SEC Championship Game records and fell three yards shy of the Auburn record.

Four Auburn players were taken in the 2014 NFL Draft, including two first round picks; offensive tackle Greg Robinson No. 2 overall to the St. Louis Rams and defensive end Dee Ford No. 23 to the Kansas City Chiefs. Mason was a third round selection by the Rams while fullback Jay Prosch was a sixth round pick by the Houston Texans.

Malzahn has coached seven All-Americans as head coach at Auburn: running back Tre Mason and return specialist Chris

Davis in 2013, center Reese Dismukes in 2014, place kicker Daniel Carlson in 2015 and '16, and defensive linemen Carl Lawson, Montravious Adams and offensive lineman Braden Smith in 2016. Dismukes was named the 2014 Rimington Award winner as the nation's top center and Carlson was a Lou Groza Award finalist in 2015 and '16.

The Tigers have faced the nation's most difficult schedule collectively during Malzahn's four years on the Plains facing 24 ranked opponents, including 12 in the top 10. Auburn is the nation's only program in 2016 to face both the No. 1 and No. 2 ranked programs.

Malzahn has his coaching staff have been highly successful on the recruiting trail, recording five consecutive Top 10 nationally ranked recruiting classes, a first in the program's history.

Academically, Malzahn's Tigers have excelled as over 100 players have graduated since his arrival. In the fall 2016 semester a program-best 56 players posted a 3.0 grade point average.

Malzahn, who won the Broyles Award as the nation's top assistant coach in 2010 while helping the Tigers to the national title, returned to Auburn after serving as the head coach at Arkansas State in 2012, where he led the program to the Sun Belt Conference title.

As offensive coordinator, Malzahn made an immediate impact during his tenure at Auburn, highlighted by a record-setting offense in 2010 when the Tigers finished 14-0 and claimed the school's first national title since 1957.

Malzahn's arrival in 2009 and style of offense marked a drastic turnaround from the 2008 season when Auburn struggled offensively. In a two-year period, the Tigers improved from a tie for 110th to seventh in the nation in scoring offense (from 17.3 to 41.2) and from 104th to seventh in total offense.

The 2010 Auburn offense set nine school records, while leading the SEC and finished in the top 10 nationally in six statistical categories. He coached Heisman Trophy winner Cam Newton, who had one of the best single-season performances at the position in college football history. Newton threw for 2,908 yards and 30 touchdowns, while rushing for 1,586 yards and 20 TDs. Newton, the No. 1 overall draft pick in the 2011 NFL Draft, also won the Davey O'Brien, Manning and Maxwell Awards.

During two seasons (2007-08) at Tulsa, Malzahn's offenses were among the nation's finest, ranking first nationally in total offense. Tulsa's offense in 2007 established nine team and 12 individual school records; the 2008 Tulsa offense averaged 569.9 yards per game and was second nationally averaging 47.2 points per games.

Malzahn spent one season at Arkansas as offensive coordinator, coaching Heisman Trophy runner-up Darren McFadden and helping the SEC West champion Razorbacks finish fourth nationally in rushing offense.

Malzahn's coaching career began in his home state of Arkansas at the high school level. In 14 seasons as a high school head coach, Malzahn led seven teams to the state championship game and won three titles. In July 2013, he was inducted into the Arkansas High School Sports Hall of Fame.

Born in Irving, Texas, Malzahn graduated from high school in Fort Smith, Ark., and played football at Arkansas and Henderson State, earning his bachelor's degree from Henderson in 1990.

Malzahn is married to the former Kristi Otwell and they are the parents of two daughters, Kylie and Kenzie.

GREG BROWN

DEFENSIVE BACKS/SECONDARY COACH

Greg Brown joined the Auburn Family in January, 2017, as the Tigers' secondary coach. A 36-year coaching veteran, Brown has coached three winners of the Jim Thorpe Award, and has 19 years of college coaching experience (with three conference titles and 10 bowl berths) and 17 years of professional experience (15 NFL, two USFL) to his credit.

Brown came to Auburn from Missouri, where he coached the cornerbacks during the 2016 season, where the Tigers tied for the SEC lead in interceptions and corner Aarion Penton was Mizzou's only first team all-SEC honoree.

Brown's impressive resume also includes stops at Louisville (2014-15), Alabama (2013), Colorado (1991-93, 2006-09, 2011-12), Arizona (2010), Purdue (1989-90) and Wyoming (1987-88). The only coach to have ever coached three players that have won the Thorpe Award, Brown served as defensive coordinator at Colorado and Arizona.

His coaching experience in professional football includes work with the secondary of the New Orleans Saints (2002-05), Atlanta Falcons (2000-01, 1994), San Francisco 49ers (1999), Tennessee Oilers (1997-98), San Diego Chargers (1995-96), Tampa Bay Buccaneers (1984-86) and the USFL's Denver Gold (1983-84).

During his NFL career, he coached nine Pro Bowl players: Ashley Ambrose (Atlanta), Blaine Bishop (Tennessee), Ray Buchanan (Atlanta), Dale Carter (New Orleans), Rodney Harrison (Chargers), Tim McDonald (San Francisco), Marcus Robertson (Tennessee), Samari Rolle (Tennessee) and Lance Schulters (San Francisco).

His collegiate player roster reads like a who's who among defensive backs. Three of his pupils -- Deon Figures (Colorado, 1992), Chris Hudson (Colorado, 1994) and Gerod Holliman (Louisville, 2014) -- have won the Thorpe Award. In 2014, Holliman tied an NCAA record first set in 1968 with 14 interceptions, and Louisville led the nation with a 17-game string with at least one interception per contest.

The starting safeties in the 2016 Pro Bowl, Ha Ha Clinton-Dix (Green Bay) and Landon Collins (New York Giants), were both coached by Brown at Alabama, where he also tutored Vinnie Sunseri (San Francisco).

At Louisville, Holliman (Pittsburgh), James Sample (Jacksonville) and Josh Harvey-Clemons (Washington) were NFL draft picks, and the corners he coached at Arizona in 2010 -- Robert Golden (Pittsburgh) and Trevin Wade (New York Giants) -- and at Colorado (2011-12) -- Jimmy Smith (Baltimore) and Jalil Brown (Indianapolis) -- are still playing in the NFL.

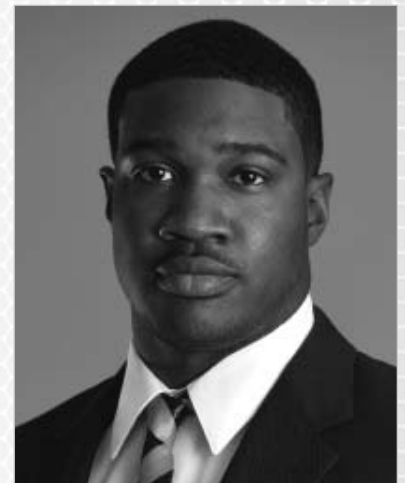
A 1980 UTEP graduate with a bachelor's degree in education (history/physical education), he lettered twice at cornerback (1978-79) for the Miners before taking his first coaching position as a graduate assistant at his alma mater in 1981. He earned his associate's degree from Glendale (Ariz.) Junior College in 1978.

Brown graduated from Arvada (Colo.) High School, where he lettered in both football and track. He and his wife, Stacie, have two daughters, Hannah and Grace.





KODI BURNS



CO-OFFENSIVE COORDINATOR/WIDE RECEIVERS

Former Auburn offensive standout Kodi Burns returned to his alma mater for the 2016 season as co-offensive coordinator and wide receivers coach.

Burns was a part of two Auburn BCS National Championship appearances. As a senior wide-out in 2010, he helped the Tigers to a perfect season and the BCS National Championship title, scoring the opening touchdown on a 35-yard pass reception in the Tigers' BCS win over Oregon. Burns served as a graduate assistant on offense in 2013, helping Auburn to an SEC Championship and an appearance in the 2014 BCS National Championship game.

Burns, who played at Auburn from 2007-10, came back to his alma mater from Arizona State, where he had been named the running backs coach after the 2015 season. In 2015, Burns served as wide receivers coach at Middle Tennessee State, where he mentored Richie James and Ed Battlies. James led Conference USA with 108 receptions and his 1,346 receiving yards were third in the conference. Battlies' 82 receptions and 1,048 receiving yards ranked fourth and fifth respectively in Conference USA.

Burns was the running backs coach at Samford University in 2014. Under Burns' guidance, Bulldog ballcarrier Denzel Williams tallied more than 1,000 all-purpose yards, including 918 rushing yards and 16 touchdowns, earning all-Southern Conference honors.

In 2013, Burns worked with Auburn's offense as a graduate assistant, as the Tigers led the nation in rushing (328.3 yds/game), and ranked 11th in total offense (501.3 yds/game) and 12th in scoring offense (39.5 pts/game). Running back Tre Mason was a Heisman Trophy finalist and the SEC Offensive Player of the Year; he set Auburn single-season records with 2,374 all-purpose yards and 1,816 rushing yards.

Burns began his coaching career in 2012 as a graduate assistant at Arkansas State under Gus Malzahn. The Red Wolves won the Sun Belt Conference with a 10-3 record and Burns helped an offense that included a 3,000-yard passer, a 1,000-yard receiver and a 1,000-yard rusher.

From 2007-10, Burns earned four varsity letters at Auburn, excelling in a variety of roles. He was a quarterback his first two seasons at Auburn; in 2007, he became the first Auburn true freshman quarterback to start a game since Gabe Gross in 1998. He moved to wide receiver for the second half of his career, collecting nearly 2,300 total yards and 22 career touchdowns.

A native of Fort Smith, Ark., Burns earned his bachelor's degree from Auburn in exercise science in 2011.





RODNEY GARNER

ASSOCIATE HEAD COACH/DEFENSIVE LINE

Former Auburn standout player and coach Rodney Garner, who helped the Tigers to the 2013 SEC Championship and a BCS Championship berth, now serves his alma mater as associate head coach and defensive line coach, a position he has held since 2013.

In 2016, the Tigers ranked seventh nationally in scoring defense, 11th in red zone defense and 28th in total defense, and held eight consecutive opponents without a rushing TD, the longest season streak at Auburn since 1957. Montravius Adams (Green Bay) and Carl Lawson (Cincinnati) were 2017 NFL draft selections.

In 2013, Auburn had the second biggest turnaround in college football history at +8.0 games. Garner coached first team all-SEC defensive end Dee Ford, a first round draft pick of the Kansas City Chiefs, No. 23 overall. Two more D-linemen -- Angelo Blackson (4th, Tennessee Titans) and Gabe Wright (4th, Detroit Lions) -- were selected in the 2015 NFL Draft, and DaVonte Lambert joined the Tampa Bay Buccaneers in 2016.

An all-SEC player himself at Auburn in 1988 who previously coached on The Plains from 1990-95, Garner coaches the defensive line daily in practice. Garner spent 15 years at Georgia in a similar capacity.

A native of Leeds, Ala., Garner was named all-SEC and honorable mention All-America as a senior at Auburn in 1988, captaining the team that captured the SEC title. Garner served on the Auburn coaching staff from 1990-95 as recruiting coordinator, tight ends coach, and assistant strength and conditioning coach.

During his 15 seasons at Georgia, he was part of a staff that led UGA to 117 victories, two SEC Championships, five SEC Eastern Division titles, seven bowl victories and six Top 10 finishes in the final polls, including No. 2 in 2007 and No. 3 in 2002. He added the title of assistant head coach at Georgia in 2005 after serving as defensive line coach and recruiting coordinator there since January, 1998.

The 2005 Georgia team finished eighth nationally in scoring defense (16.4 ppg). The 2003 Georgia defense finished second nationally in scoring defense (14.5 ppg), fourth in total defense (276.86 ypg), sixth in passing defense (174.50 ypg, 1st in the SEC); the 2002 Bulldog defense finished first in the SEC and fourth nationally in scoring defense (15.1 ppg), first in the SEC in red zone defense (58.8%) and second in the SEC in rushing defense (114.0 ypg). The 2002 Bulldogs finished 13-1, won the SEC and Nokia Sugar Bowl Championships and ranked third in the final national polls.

Garner participated in the inaugural Minority Coaches Forum in Scottsdale, Ariz., in 2006. He was also selected as one of 10 coaches to participate in the 2004 NCAA Expert Coaching Academy in Indianapolis and one of only 20 chosen for the NCAA's 2004 Advanced Coaching Academy in Orlando.

At Georgia, he coached five NFL first round draft choices -- Richard Seymour (Patriots) and Marcus Stroud (Jaguars), both Pro Bowl starters; David Pollack (Bengals); Charles Grant (Saints); and Johnathan Sullivan (Saints). He also coached draft picks DeAngelo Tyson (7th, Ravens, '12), Geno Atkins (4th, Bengals, '10), Corvey Irvin (3rd, Panthers, '09), Jarius Wynn (6th, Packers, '09), Kedric Golston (6th, Redskins, '06), Robert Geathers (4th, Bengals, '04), Emarlos Leroy (6th, Jaguars, '99), and free agents Ken Veal (Chargers, '04), Paul Snellings (Colts, 2000), Brandon Miller (Colts, 2000), Charles Johnson (Panthers, '07), Tyrone Robertson (Bills, 2000) and Demetric Evans (Cowboys, '01).

After his playing career at Auburn, Garner had a free agent tryout with the NFL's Tampa Bay Buccaneers and played with the Pittsburgh Gladiators arena football team in 1989. He began his coaching career at Auburn in 1990. Garner coached tight ends and offensive tackles at Tennessee in 1997 after coaching tight ends for the Volunteers in 1996.

Garner, whose cousin is Charles Barkley, was an outstanding player at Leeds High School. He is married to Kimberly Lawson Garner, a 1988 Auburn graduate in public relations. They have six children: Bridgett, Brielle, Jaiden, Kai, Sydney and Milan.





HERB HAND

OFFENSIVE LINE COACH



A key coaching component in some of the most explosive offenses in NCAA history, Herb Hand reunited with Gus Malzahn prior to the 2016 season as Auburn's offensive line coach.

Auburn led the SEC and was sixth nationally in rushing in 2016, with three offensive linemen – Braden Smith, Alex Kozan and Robert Leff – earning all-SEC recognition. The offensive line unit was a finalist for the Joe Moore Award, and Hand was a finalist for Football Scoop's offensive line coach of the year award.

Hand came to Auburn after two seasons at Penn State as the run game coordinator and offensive line coach. In 2014, Hand's young offensive line steadily improved and produced second-round NFL Draft pick Donovan Smith (Tampa Bay). In 2015, the unit blocked for Big Ten Freshman of the Year Saquon Barkley as he set Penn State's freshman rushing record with 1,076 yards.

Hand coached the offensive line at Vanderbilt from 2010-13, adding run game coordinator duties in 2013. In 2013, VU's offensive line blocked for 34 rushing touchdowns, including a school-record 14 by running back Jerron Seymour. Hand helped Wesley Johnson earn all-SEC honors in 2012 and 2013 and Johnson earned SEC Offensive Lineman of the Week a VU record four times before being selected in the fifth round of the 2014 NFL Draft by the Pittsburgh Steelers. The Commodores' Ryan Seymour was selected by the Seattle Seahawks in the 2013 NFL Draft.

Hand's 2011-12 offensive lines were instrumental in Zac Stacy breaking the Vanderbilt season and career (3,143 yards) rushing records.

Prior to Vanderbilt, Hand worked three years at Tulsa, serving as assistant head coach, offensive coordinator and line coach. Hand helped guide Tulsa to consecutive GMAC Bowl appearances behind one of the NCAA's most explosive spread offenses.

As Tulsa's co-offensive coordinator along with Gus Malzahn, Hand coached an offensive line that paved the way for the nation's top ranked offense in 2007 and 2008. He was a finalist for national offensive line coach of the year in 2008.

Hand spent six successful years at West Virginia, serving as tight ends coach and recruiting coordinator under Rich Rodriguez. Hand helped the Mountaineers win three Big East Conference titles and go to five straight bowl games during the span, including a 38-35 victory over SEC champion Georgia in the 2006 Sugar Bowl.

In 2006, West Virginia finished with an 11-2 record and had an offense that ranked second nationally in rushing, third in scoring, and fourth in total offense.

Prior to WVU, Hand served as an offensive graduate assistant at Clemson in 1999-2000, as the Tigers participated in the 1999 Peach Bowl and 2001 Gator Bowl.

Before that, he served as defensive coordinator and special teams coordinator at Concord College in West Virginia. He also was defensive coordinator at another WVIAC program, Glenville State, where he helped the Pioneers win three WVIAC Championships.

Hand earned his bachelor's degree in history from Hamilton College in 1990, where he was a three-year starter on the offensive line for the Continentals, serving as team captain and earning all-NESCAC honors in 1989. He earned a master's degree in business administration in 1993 from West Virginia Wesleyan while serving as a graduate assistant.

A product of Westmoreland, N.Y., Hand and his wife Debbie have three children: Trey and Bailey (both Auburn students) and Cade.





TIM HORTON

RUNNING BACKS COACH/ SPECIAL TEAMS COORDINATOR



SEC veteran Tim Horton, who helped the Tigers to a 2013 SEC Championship and BCS Championship berth, joined the Auburn Family prior to the 2013 season. He serves as running backs coach and has become special teams coordinator for the 2017 season. He served as recruiting coordinator in 2015-16, producing a fourth consecutive Top 10 recruiting class.

During his productive career, Horton has coached eight all-SEC running backs, nine different 1,000-yard rushers and two of the SEC's all-time single season rushing leaders in Tre Mason (1,816) and Darren McFadden (1,830). His all-SEC players include: Cameron Artis-Payne, Knile Davis, Felix Jones, Tre Mason, Darren McFadden, Kamryn Pettway, Michael Smith and Jonathan Williams.

The 2013 Tigers led the nation with 328.3 yards rushing per game. Junior Tre Mason, a Heisman Trophy finalist and the SEC Offensive Player of the Year, ranked third in the nation with 23 rushing touchdowns, sixth nationally with 1,816 yards rushing, sixth with 10.7 points per game, sixth with 169.57 all-purpose yards per game and eighth with 129.7 rushing yards per game.

In 2014, Cameron Artis-Payne led the SEC in rushing with 1,608 yards, 123.7 yards per game. In 2015, Peyton Barber (1,017) became the seventh 1,000-yard rusher Horton has coached since 2007, and in 2016, Kamryn Pettway rushed for 1,224 yards, leading the SEC in rushing.

Two Auburn running backs were selected in the 2014 NFL Draft -- Mason in the third round by St. Louis and fullback Jay Prosch in the sixth round by Houston. Artis-Payne was a fifth-round NFL draft pick in 2015 by the Carolina Panthers, and Corey Grant, who led the nation in yards per carry, joined the Jacksonville Jaguars that season. Barber signed with Tampa Bay in 2016. Eleven different running backs coached by Horton have been an NFL starter during the last 10 seasons; including Cameron Artis-Payne, Peyton Barber, Knile Davis, Corey Grant, Dennis Johnson, Felix Jones, Tre Mason, Darren McFadden, Keiro Small, Jonathan Williams and Ronnie Wingo.

Prior to arriving at Auburn, Horton spent six seasons in a similar capacity at Arkansas, where he was also recruiting coordinator. Horton was recognized by Rivals.com and ESPN.com as one of the nation's top recruiters during his time at Arkansas. He was one of just two coaches in the nation, and the only one in the SEC, to coach four different 1,000-yard rushers from 2007-10. Under his watch, 2007 Doak Walker Award winner Darren McFadden and Felix Jones earned All-America honors, while Dennis Johnson, Michael Smith, Jonathan Williams and Knile Davis earned all-SEC honors.

Horton, who played football at Arkansas from 1986-89, returned to his alma mater in 2007. He came to Arkansas after taking the offensive coordinator and wide receivers coaching position at Air Force in January, 2007. During the 2006 season, he was the running backs coach at Kansas State, helping the Wildcats earn a Texas Bowl appearance while tutoring future NFL running backs Thomas Clayton and James Johnson.

At Air Force from 1999-2005, serving as the wide receivers (1999-2004) and running backs coach (2005), Horton was recognized by the Fellowship of Christian Athletes Colorado chapter as one of its 2004 coaches of the year.

He began his coaching career at Appalachian State in 1990 and helped ASU to a 67-32 record during his eight years, including Southern Conference championships in 1991 and 1995 and five NCAA Division I-AA playoff appearances.

Horton currently serves as the SEC representative to the AFCA assistant coaches' committee and also gives back to the game by serving as the running backs expert for USA football. In 2016, Horton authored a book, "Complete Running Back" that was published by Human Kinetics.

Horton earned his bachelor's degree in marketing management from Arkansas in 1990, where he was a four-year letterman and three-year starter as a split end and punt returner under head coach Ken Hatfield. He caught 49 passes for 942 yards and one touchdown in his career, hauling in 23 catches for 453 yards as a senior in 1989. Horton also returned 78 punts for 657 yards in his collegiate career, fifth all-time in school history. The Razorbacks compiled a 38-11 record, still tied for the school record for the most wins in a four-year period, won back-to-back Southwest Conference titles (1988-89) and appeared in four straight bowl games.

A two-time academic all-conference selection, Horton was a second-team All-SWC selection in 1989 and served as team captain. Horton was a two-time all-state running back and a track standout at Conway (Ark.) High School. Horton and his wife Lauren have a daughter, Caroline (an Auburn student), and a son, Jackson.



CHIP LINDSEY

OFFENSIVE COORDINATOR/QUARTERBACKS



Chip Lindsey returned to Auburn in January, 2017, as offensive coordinator for Coach Gus Malzahn. Lindsey, who has 20 years of coaching experience, was on the Auburn staff as an offensive analyst during the Tigers' run to the SEC championship and BCS National Championship game in 2013.

Lindsey returned to Auburn from Arizona State, where he served as offensive coordinator and quarterbacks coach in 2016. The Sun Devils started the season 5-1 before losing three quarterbacks to injury; running back Kalen Ballage tied an NCAA record scoring eight touchdowns in a 68-55 win over Texas Tech.

As offensive coordinator at Southern Miss from 2014-15, he developed the Conference USA 2015 Offensive Player of the Year in Southern Miss quarterback Nick Mullens, who ranked second in the league in passing yards (4,145) and touchdown passes (36), and ranked in the top eight in the nation in both marks in 2015.

The Southern Miss offense broke five single-season school records in 2015: completions (312), passing yards (4,263), total offensive yards (6,758), touchdowns (67) and points (528), as the Golden Eagles recorded nine wins, a Conference USA West Division title, and a berth in the Zaxby's Heart of Dallas Bowl against Washington.

Lindsey's Golden Eagle offense ranked among the best in the nation in 2015 in several offensive categories, including fifth in total touchdowns, seventh in total points, eighth in total passing yards and completions, and 12th in points per game and passing yards per game. The 2015 Golden Eagles tallied nearly 6,800 yards of total offense, including more than 4,200 passing yards and just under 2,500 rushing yards. The national leader with 102 explosive plays, they were just the second school in FBS history with a 4,000-yard passer, a 1,000-yard receiver and two 1,000-yard rushers.

Prior to his first stint at Auburn, from 2011-12, Lindsey served as head coach at Spain Park (Ala.) High School, leading the school to its first Class 6A regional championship.

Lindsey served as quarterbacks coach at Troy University in 2010, following a long and distinguished career as a prep coach (1997-2009) in football and baseball. At Troy, he coached the 2010 Sun Belt Freshman of the Year Corey Robinson.

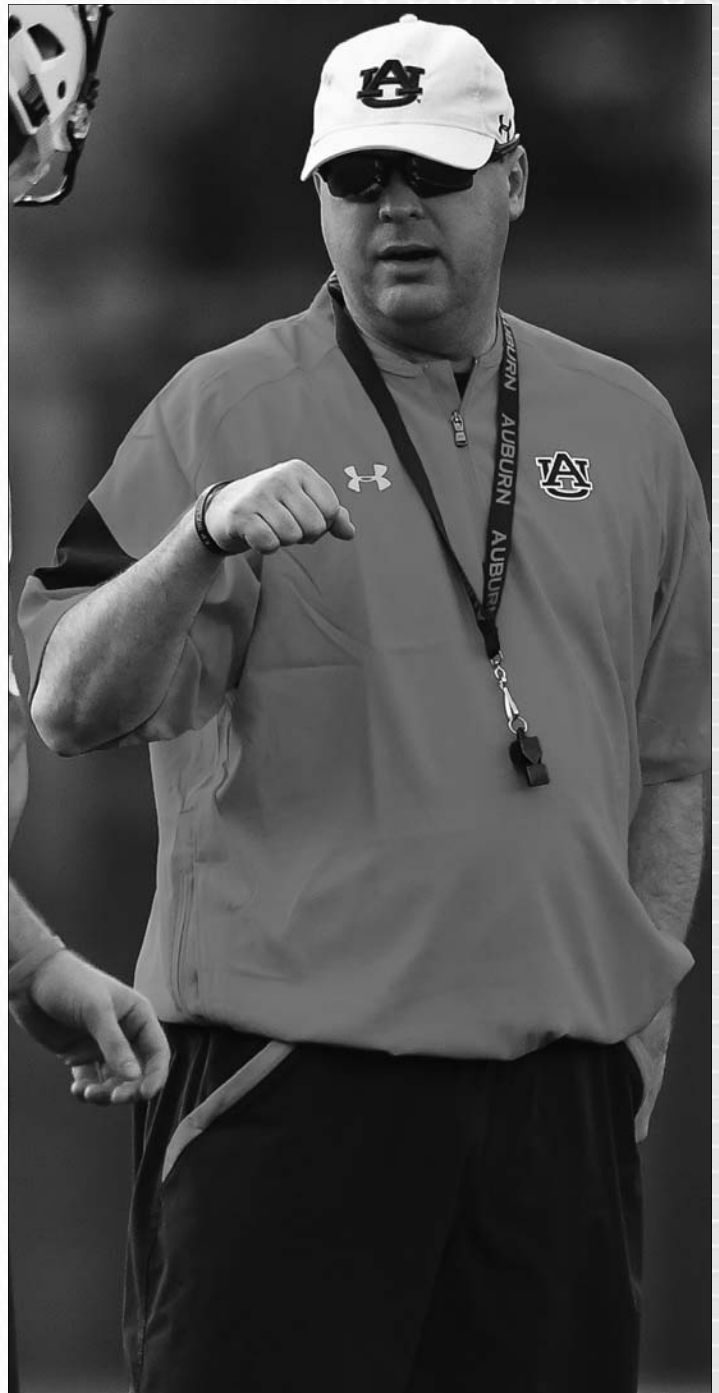
A two-time Coach of the Year honoree (2008-09) at Lassiter (Ga.) High School, he guided the development of Parade All-American and Georgia quarterback signee Hutson Mason, who broke every single-season state passing record in 2009, including passing yards (4,560) and touchdowns (54). The Trojans went 12-1 and won a regional championship in 2009, and Lindsey received state Coach of the Year honors from the Atlanta Falcons and the Cobb County Touchdown Club. The Associated Press, Marietta Daily Journal and Cobb County Touchdown Club named him the 2008 Georgia Coach of the Year.

Lindsey served as the offensive coordinator for Hoover (Ala.) High School in 2007 as the team finished 10-2 and advanced to the third round of the state playoffs. Lindsey's first experience as a head coach came from 2005-06 at Colbert Heights (Ala.) High School, where he earned 2006 Coach of the Year honors from the Florence Times-Daily.

Lindsey spent the 1997-2004 seasons as an assistant coach, including Florence, Deshler, Sparkman, and Springville High Schools in Alabama.

Lindsey played football at the University of North Alabama before transferring as a student to Alabama, where he received his bachelor's degree in history and English in 1997. He earned a master's in educational leadership from the University of Phoenix in 2005.

A native of Madison, Ala., Lindsey graduated from Bob Jones High School, where he was a three-sport letterman. Lindsey and his wife Cecily have four children: Claire, Caroline, Cooper and Conner.





LARRY PORTER

TIGHT ENDS/H-BACKS COACH RECRUITING COORDINATOR

Larry Porter, a 21-year coaching veteran and two-time national recruiter of the year, joined the Auburn program in February, 2017, as tight ends/H-backs coach and recruiting coordinator. He has been part of 11 bowl teams since 2002, including a pair of BCS bowls (2007 Sugar, 2008 BCS Championship).

Porter came to Auburn from North Carolina, where he spent three seasons as the running backs coach and special teams coordinator and was a 2016 Broyles Award nominee. Under his guidance, Carolina's running game ranked 18th nationally in 2015, averaging 224.4 yards per game, the best at UNC since 1994. Running back Elijah Hood, who rushed for 1,463 yards and 17 touchdowns in 2015, was a two-time all-ACC performer and ranked in the school's top 10 in career rushing yards and rushing touchdowns.

In 2016, the Tar Heels ranked first in the nation in punt return defense (0.22) and second in the nation in kickoff return average (26.97), and Porter tutored all-ACC running backs Elijah Hood and T.J. Logan (who ranked second nationally in kickoff return average (32.9 with 2 TD)). During Porter's tenure, UNC made three consecutive bowl appearances and won the ACC Coastal Division in 2015. Hood (Oakland) and Logan (Arizona) were both selected in the 2017 NFL Draft.

Porter came to UNC after one season as the running backs coach at Texas, one year as running backs coach at Arizona State and two seasons as the head coach at Memphis, his alma mater.

Porter spent five years on the LSU coaching staff from 2005-09, coaching running backs while also holding two key roles on staff as assistant head coach and chief recruiter. He was elevated to the position of assistant head coach during the spring of 2006 and was twice (2007, 2009) named National Recruiter of the Year by Rivals.com. Part of LSU's 2007 national championship team, Porter developed two 1,000-yard rushers at LSU in Jacob Hester (2007) and Charles Scott (2008) as well as having five players (Hester, Joseph Addai, Quinn Johnson, Charles Scott, Trindon Holliday) selected in the NFL Draft.

Porter coached 1,000-yard rushers for three straight seasons while at Oklahoma State. In 2004, Vernand Morency earned all-Big 12 honors after rushing for 1,474 yards and 12 touchdowns. A year earlier, Tatum Bell earned first team all-Big 12 honors with 1,286 yards and 16 touchdowns. Morency was a third-round pick of the Houston Texans in 2005 and Bell was a second-round draft pick by the Denver Broncos in the 2004 NFL Draft.

Prior to his arrival in Stillwater, Porter spent three years at Arkansas State, where he coached Jonathan Adams to back-to-back 1,000-yard seasons.

Porter began his coaching career at Wooddale High School in Memphis, Tenn., before moving to the collegiate ranks, coaching the running backs at Tennessee Martin in 1998.

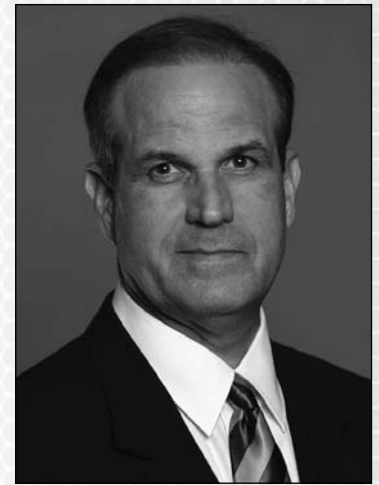
A native of Jackson, Miss., Porter lettered four years (1990-93) at Memphis, and graduated with a bachelor's degree in education in 1996. He is a member of the University of Memphis Athletics M Club Hall of Fame. Porter and his wife, Sharmane, have three children, sons Brandon and Omari, and daughter Olivia.





KEVIN STEELE

DEFENSIVE COORDINATOR



Kevin Steele, a veteran coach with tremendous success at both the college and NFL level, joined the Auburn coaching staff before the 2016 season as defensive coordinator.

The Tigers ranked seventh nationally in scoring defense, 11th in red zone defense and 28th in total defense his first season, an improvement of 43 spots over the previous season, and held eight consecutive opponents without a rushing TD, the longest season streak at Auburn since 1957. Montravius Adans (Green Bay), Carl Lawson (Cincinnati), Rudy Ford (Arizona) and Joshua Holsey (Washington) were 2017 NFL draft picks.

A familiar face in the SEC, in 2015, Steele served as defensive coordinator and linebackers coach for the LSU Tigers. He went to Baton Rouge from Alabama, where he spent the 2014 season coaching the Crimson Tide linebackers and special assistant to the head coach. In 2013, he served as Alabama's director of player personnel. A proven recruiter who helped Alabama sign the nation's No. 1 class, Steele has held defensive coordinator positions in the SEC and ACC as well as serving as the head coach at Baylor for four years.

Steele served as defensive coordinator at Alabama in 2007 and then held the same position at Clemson for three years from 2009-2011. While at Clemson, the Tigers won the 2011 ACC title, their first since 1991. Steele's 2010 Clemson defense led the ACC and ranked No. 13 nationally in points allowed, surrendering 18.8 points per game.

Before he joined the Alabama staff in 2007, Steele coached with Bobby Bowden at Florida State for four years (2003-06), serving as the executive head coach for the Seminoles. He was named the Rivals.com National Recruiter of the Year in 2005 at Florida State after helping the Seminoles sign the top class in the country.

Steele joined Florida State after serving as the head coach at Baylor University from 1999-2002, spending four seasons as a head coach in the Big 12 Conference.

Steele coached linebackers for the Carolina Panthers in the NFL from 1995-98. Under head coach Dom Capers, the Panthers reached the NFC Championship game in their second season (1996). After four years with Carolina, Steele was hired as head coach at Baylor in 1999.

From 1989-94, Steele coached the linebackers under Nebraska legend Tom Osborne. During his six years in Lincoln, the Cornhuskers went 60-11, appeared in six bowl games, won four conference championships and captured the 1994 national championship with a 13-0 record.

He has also held assistant coaching jobs at Tennessee (1987-88), Oklahoma State (1984-86) and New Mexico State (1983).

The Dillon, S.C., native is a 1981 graduate of the University of Tennessee. He spent his freshman season at Furman before transferring to Tennessee, where he was a member of Johnny Majors' squads. He was a student assistant coach in 1980 and then a graduate assistant the following year (1981) before being promoted to outside linebackers coach in 1982.

Steele and his wife, Linda, have one son Gordon and one daughter Caroline (an Auburn graduate). Gordon is on the football coaching staff at South Alabama. Steele's brother Jeff serves as associate athletics director for facilities and operations at Auburn.





TRAVIS WILLIAMS

LINEBACKERS COACH

Former Auburn linebacker Travis Williams was promoted to linebacker coach at his alma mater prior to the 2016 season, after holding various roles on the Tigers' football support staff.

In 2016, the Tigers ranked seventh nationally in scoring defense, 11th in red zone defense and 28th in total defense, an improvement of 43 spots over the previous season, and held eight consecutive opponents without a rushing TD, the longest season streak at Auburn since 1957.

Steeped in the Tiger tradition on defense, Williams signed with Auburn in 2001, redshirted his first season and then lettered the next four, earning all-SEC honors in 2004-05. He led Auburn in tackles (80) during the 2004 undefeated season; he was second in tackles in 2005 (68) and third in 2003 (67). He won the Pat Dye Leadership Award on defense in 2004 and 2005.

After his NFL career concluded, Williams returned to Auburn in 2009 as a defensive graduate assistant, and was part of Auburn's 2010 national championship season. After coaching stops at Northern Iowa and Creekside (Ga.) High School, Williams came back to Auburn in 2014 as a defensive analyst.

He served as an on-field coach on defense in preparations for Auburn's 2015 Outback and 2015 Birmingham Bowl appearances.

Williams played for the NFL's Atlanta Falcons during the 2006 and 2007 seasons, before beginning his coaching career at his alma mater, Spring Valley (S.C.) High School as a volunteer assistant.

Williams earned his bachelor's degree in criminology and criminal justice from Auburn in 2005, and received a master's degree in adult education from Auburn in 2011.

A native of Columbia, S.C., Williams and his wife Jeanine, an Auburn graduate, have two daughters, Tru and Reign.





DR. SIRAJ ABDULLAH

ASSOCIATE PRIMARY CARE TEAM PHYSICIAN

Dr. Siraj Abdullah, D.O., received his B.A. degree in psychology from Eastern Illinois University. He completed his post-baccalaureate studies at UNC Greensboro before earning his Doctor of Osteopathy from the Edward Via Virginia College of Osteopathic Medicine in Blacksburg, Va. He completed his residency with Palmetto Health at the University of South Carolina, where he also completed his Sports Medicine fellowship with the Department of Sports Medicine. After completing his fellowship, Dr. Abdullah served as the Associate Program Director of the Primary Care Sports Medicine fellowship and Assistant Professor of Family and Sports Medicine.

Dr. Abdullah now serves as an Assistant Professor and Associate Director of the Sports Medicine Fellowship on the Auburn campus of the Via College of Osteopathic Medicine. He is also is the Associate Team Physician for Auburn University.



DR. JAMES ANDREWS

ORTHOPAEDIC SURGEON

Dr. James R. Andrews, orthopaedic surgeon, serves as Medical Director for Intercollegiate Sports at Auburn University. Dr. Andrews is one of the founding members of Andrews Sports Medicine and Orthopaedic Center and the American Sports Medicine Institute located at St. Vincent's Hospital in Birmingham, Alabama, and the Andrews Institute located in Gulf Breeze, Florida. To date, Dr. Andrews has mentored more than 370 orthopaedic and sports medicine Fellows.

Dr. Andrews graduated from Louisiana State University in 1963, where he was Southeastern Conference indoor and outdoor pole vault champion. He completed LSU School of Medicine in 1967 and completed his orthopaedic residency at Tulane Medical School in 1972. He had surgical fellowships in sports medicine at the University of Virginia School of Medicine in 1972 with Dr. Frank McCue, III and at the University of Lyon, Lyon France in 1972 with Dr. Albert Trillat, who is known as the Father of European Knee Surgery.

Dr. Andrews is a member of the American Board of Orthopaedic Surgery and the American Academy of Orthopaedic Surgeons. He is a Past President of the American Orthopaedic Society for Sports Medicine and also served on that Board as its treasurer and secretary. BRIAN BLACKMON

ANALYST

Brian Blackmon joined the Auburn football staff as an offensive analyst in 2017 after two decades as a prominent coach and educator at Opelika High School.

Blackmon was head football coach at Opelika from 2009-16, compiling a 69-25 record and taking the Bulldogs to two Class 6A state title games (2012, 2016). Opelika's athletics director from 2009-17 and an assistant AD from 2001-08, he also coached soccer, wrestling and golf during his tenure.

He was honored as the Class 6A coach of the year in 2012 by the Alabama Sports Writers Association, the Alabama Football Coaches Association, the Opelika-Auburn News, Columbus SportsVision and AL.com. In 2004, Blackmon was named Alabama assistant coach of the year. He has coached in the Alabama-Mississippi and North-South all-star games.

He has served as president of the Alabama High School Athletic Directors and Coaches Association, on the advisory, Hall of Fame, reclassification and all-star selection committees of the Alabama High School Athletic Association, on the high school task force of USA Football, and as a district board member of the Alabama Football Coaches Association. A graduate of Robert E. Lee High in Montgomery, where he was part of the 1991 state champion team and was inducted into the Hall of Fame in 2017, Blackmon played one season at the University of North Alabama before transferring to Troy to complete his studies.

Blackmon earned his bachelor's degree in accounting from Troy in 1996 and a master's degree in business education from Auburn in 1998. He and his wife Kellie have two children, Cade and Carlyle.



AL BORGES

ANALYST

Al Borges returned to Auburn for the 2017 season as an analyst working with the Tiger offense. The veteran coach previously served as Auburn's offensive coordinator from 2004-07.

A veteran of 35 years of collegiate coaching, the two-time Broyles Award finalist most recently was offensive coordinator at San José State (2009-10 and 2015-16), Michigan (2011-13) and San Diego State (2009-10). Quarterbacks he has tutored include first-round NFL draft picks Cade McNown and Jason Campbell.

In his first stint at Auburn, Borges worked with SEC offensive player of the year Campbell and running backs Carnell Williams and Ronnie Brown; all three were first-round NFL Draft picks in 2005. Auburn went 41-9 during the four seasons he served as offensive coordinator, including an undefeated season and a No. 2 ranking in 2004, and was the only SEC team ranked in the Top 15 all four of those seasons.

His impressive resume before coming to Auburn includes offensive coordinator assignments at Indiana (2002-03), California (2001), UCLA (1996-2000), Oregon (1995), Boise State (1993-94), Portland State (1986-92) and Diablo Valley Community College (1985), as well as assistant coaching positions at Diablo Valley (1983-84) and California (1982). He also served as an assistant coach for the USFL's Oakland Invaders (1984-85). The native of Salinas, Calif., began his coaching career as a high school assistant at Salinas and Chico Pleasant Valley.

A 1981 graduate of Cal State Chico, Borges and his wife Nikki have two children, Cole and Mady Joe.



JORRELL BOSTROM

DIRECTOR OF
PLAYER DEVELOPMENT

Former Auburn offensive lineman Jorrell Bostrom works for the Tigers in player development. He joined Coach Gus Malzahn's staff in 2014 as assistant director of player development before being promoted to the director's role in 2015.

Bostrom earned two letters playing offensive line for the Tigers in 2009 and 2010, and was on the field for Wes Byrum's game-winning kick in the 2011 BCS national championship game. A member of that national championship and SEC championship team, from 2011-14, Bostrom served as an administrative assistant in the Auburn recruiting office.

Bostrom played football at Bakersfield (Calif.) Community College during the 2007 and 2008 seasons, and earned an associate's degree in communication. Making 12 career starts in 47 games played, he posted 53 career tackles and three fumble recoveries and was a part of two SEC championship teams. He served as the head athletic trainer for the Celts via the Memorial Hermann Hospital System as well as a preceptor for the University of Houston graduate athletic training program. During his two-year tenure St. Thomas, Crane was recognized as the Red River Athletic Trainer of the Year during the 2015-2016 athletic season. DOUG GOODWIN

DIRECTOR OF HIGH SCHOOL RELATIONS AND NFL LIASON

Auburn alum Doug Goodwin, who spent 29 years coaching high school football in Alabama, is in his third year as the Director of High School Relations for Auburn Football. He also serves as NFL liason and oversees the walk-on program.

His prep teams made 22 playoff appearances, including 20 consecutive, and advanced five times to the state title game. Fifteen of those teams were area or region champions and seven were state semifinalists. His 114-28 region record is among the best in state high school history.

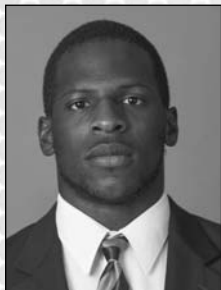
Goodwin spent three years at Homewood High, winning the region championship in 2012 and 2013. He became the first coach in AHSAA history to take three different schools to the state finals in 2008 with Russellville, which finished as the state runner-up in 2008 and 2009 as the Golden Tigers went 46-9 over four seasons (2007-10).



He had an eight-year stint at Demopolis (1999-2006) as the head football coach and athletic director; his teams won 82 games, reached the playoffs each season and won the state title in 2004 with a 15-0 mark, setting a state record for points in a single season with 761.

Goodwin was the head coach and athletic director at Lineville from 1993-98 where his teams won 59 games and played in the state championship game in 1996 and 1998. Each of his six teams qualified for the playoffs and won the region championship. He began his coaching career as an assistant coach at Lanett (1985-86) before becoming the head football coach and athletic director at Marion County (1987-92). He was inducted in the Alabama High School Athletic Association Hall of Fame in 2015.

The Sylacauga, Ala., native walked on to the football team at Auburn as a defensive back. Goodwin graduated from Auburn in 1984. He and his wife, Donna, have two children, Dustin and Devin.



MORRIS HENRY

ASSISTANT STRENGTH &
CONDITIONING COACH

Henry came to Auburn from the University of Tulsa, where he worked as a graduate assistant in the strength and conditioning program, training student-athletes in the football, golf, tennis and throwing programs.

A fourth-degree black belt in taekwondo, Henry did an internship with the EXOS training facility in Pensacola, Fla.

CONDITIONING COACH

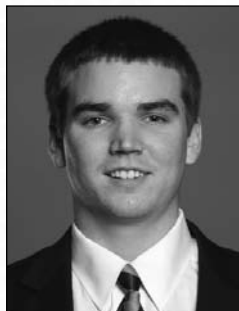
Anthony Kincy became an assistant strength and conditioning coach for the Auburn Tigers prior to the 2015 season, after joining the Auburn Family in January, 2013.

DIRECTOR OF FOOTBALL OPERATIONS

Brett Whiteside serves as the director of football operations for Auburn football, his second stint with the Tiger program. He worked with head coach Gus Malzahn as Director of Player Personnel at Arkansas State in 2012, overseeing on-campus recruiting, coordinating the Red Wolves' team travel and helping oversee the day-to-day operations of the ASU football program.

DR. STEVEN LEATH

AUBURN UNIVERSITY PRESIDENT

Steven Leath became Auburn University's 19th president on June 15, 2017.

Prior to arriving at Auburn, Dr. Leath served for more than five years as president of Iowa State University (ISU), one of the nation's top research institutions with an international reputation in science and technology. While president, Iowa State achieved its highest student graduation rate, lowered student debt, grew research expenditures, set fundraising records and secured the university's largest private gift for an academic facility. He also led efforts for the 200-acre expansion of ISU's research park, creating new jobs and attracting new companies, industry partnerships and government collaborations.

Trained as a plant scientist, Dr. Leath served at three universities in teaching, research and economic development posts en route to his positions at Iowa State and Auburn.

Dr. Leath was vice president for research and sponsored programs for the 16-campus University of North Carolina System. Under his leadership, external research grants and contracts steadily increased and technology transfer activities were streamlined to make the universities more attractive to private sector partners and more responsive to state needs. He also helped develop the North Carolina Research Campus, a private-public venture that fosters advancements in biotechnology, nutrition and health.

At North Carolina State University in Raleigh, Dr. Leath held several positions of increasing responsibility and prominence. Those positions include director of the North Carolina Agricultural Research Service (ARS), associate dean of the College of Agriculture and Life Sciences, professor, and research leader and plant pathologist with the U.S. Department of Agriculture's ARS.

Dr. Leath began his academic career at the University of Illinois, Urbana, as an extension plant pathologist. He has published numerous articles on plant disease resistance, plant breeding and related areas and has presented his scientific work throughout the U.S. and in numerous countries. He holds a B.S. in plant science from Pennsylvania State University, M.S. in plant science from the University of Delaware and Ph.D. in plant pathology from the University of Illinois.

Dr. Leath and his wife, Janet, have two sons, Eric and Scott, and two dogs.



JAY JACOBS

DIRECTOR OF ATHLETICS

Jay Jacobs was named Auburn's 14th Director of Athletics in December 2004. A walk-on football player under legendary coach Pat Dye, Jacobs earned his undergraduate and master's degrees in business administration from Auburn in 1985 and 1988, respectively. He is a member of the Auburn chapter of Phi Kappa Phi honorary.

Jacobs has grown annual revenue from \$46 million to over \$137 million. The department fully funds its 21 sports, 12 of which are women's sports, through the reinvestment of operating cash flow. During Jacobs' tenure as AD, each sports program has been provided a new or renovated facility through investments of over \$200 million. Auburn student-athletes currently hold an average cumulative GPA of 3.17, the highest in program history. Over 40% of Auburn's student-athletes are on track to graduate with honors. Auburn Athletics consistently ranks in the top ten percent of the NACDA Directors Cup standings. Under Jacobs' leadership, Auburn has won 11 National Championships and 24 SEC Championships.

Jacobs was named a 2017 NACDA / Under Armour Athletics Director of the Year and was one of five finalists for the Sports Business Journal Athletics Director of the Year. Jacobs is the current Chair of the Southeastern Conference Athletics Directors and is a member of NCAA Division I Strategic Vision and Planning Committee.

Jacobs is married to the former Angie Sapp of Dublin, Ga. The couple has three daughters, Haley, Meagan and Jayne. They are also foster parents.

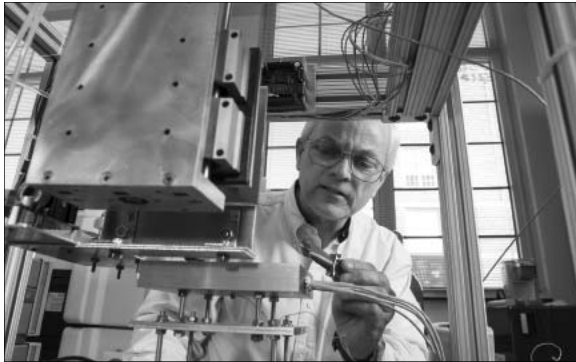

THE AUBURN EAGLES

For more than 100 years, eagles have been associated with Auburn University's football program. From a static presence on the sidelines to rousing flights over the field, WAR EAGLE has become an Auburn icon.

The role of Auburn University's eagles is to promote wildlife conservation as a part of the education initiatives of the U.S. Fish & Wildlife Service and the College of Veterinary Medicine's Southeastern Raptor Center. The USF&WS permits the Raptor Center to house eagles and use them on hundreds of educational presentations each year – including Auburn's home football games. Currently, flighted eagles and numerous other non-releasable raptors are used for these educational programs. Eagles stir emotions in many people as they have come to symbolize strength, power and courage as well as other important values such as freedom, American heritage and the preservation of our environment. Golden Eagles Tiger (War Eagle VI), Nova (War Eagle VII) and Spirit (a Bald Eagle) are the eagles who have inspired football fans with their graceful flights over Jordan-Hare Stadium since their inaugural untethered free flight in 2000. Tiger passed away in 2014.

TIGER WALK: AN AUBURN TRADITION

Tiger Walk is an Auburn tradition which began in the early 1960s when Auburn players would walk from Sewell Hall to the football stadium and fans would line Donahue Drive to wish them well. Over the years, Tiger Walk has grown into a major part of game day at Auburn, so much so that it is listed on the players' game weekend itinerary. The largest Tiger Walk is believed to have taken place prior to the 1989 Iron Bowl when more than 20,000 well wishers lined the street. Every Tiger Walk prior to home games draws thousands, and has become a standard as Auburn football players enter stadiums on the road. Tiger Walk traditionally begins two hours before kickoff for every game at Jordan-Hare Stadium.





ROLLING TOOMER'S CORNER

The center of town where the Auburn University campus meets the City of Auburn, Toomer's Corner, where College Street intersects Magnolia Avenue, has long been the gathering place for Auburn athletic celebrations. After any football win, and significant victories in other sports, Auburn students and citizens alike have joined forces to "roll" the Auburn Oaks at Toomer's Corner with toilet tissue. In February, two new trees were planted due to a fire that damaged one of the previous trees last season. Fans are asked not to roll the new trees this season because they are not fully established.

THE "ROLL" CALL

On Saturday, April 20, 2013, the Auburn Family showed that not only is the Auburn Spirit alive and well, but it is soaring to new heights! More than 83,000 fans filled Jordan-Hare Stadium to set an attendance record for A-Day, and later that evening they celebrated into the night with one final roll of the original Auburn Oaks at Toomer's Corner. Generations gathered beneath the oaks one final time, sharing stories and creating memories that will last a lifetime.





REFRESHED CORNER

Toomer's Corner was redesigned in 2015 to include more seating and shaded areas while retaining the 1917 gates in their current positions and maintaining the historic character of the corner. In 2016, the university planted 10 descendants of the original Auburn Oaks along a curved walkway in Samford Park, with trees reaching from Samford Hall to Toomer's Corner. The 15-year-old oaks were cultivated from acorns from the original trees, a project managed by Auburn's Forestry Club and Wildlife Society. Fans are also asked not to roll these descendent trees. Members of the Auburn Family have the opportunity to name a tree for themselves or someone of their choosing in recognition of a \$50,000 philanthropic gift benefitting the School of Forestry and Wildlife Sciences.

JORDAN-HARE STADIUM

Auburn’s showcase football stadium seats 87,451 with 70 luxury suites located between the lower level and upper deck on the East side. The stadium was dedicated Nov. 30, 1939, with 7,500 seats. Ten years later 14,000 more seats were added and the stadium was named Cliff Hare Stadium (named after a member of Auburn’s first football team and eventual professor and dean of the School of Chemistry), although only 12 home games were played there over that 10-year span. Additional seats were added in 1955, 1960 and 1970. The West upper deck was completed in 1980; the East upper deck and suites were finished for the 1987 season. The facility was renamed Jordan-Hare Stadium in 1973, recognizing Hall of Fame coach Ralph “Shug” Jordan.





PAT DYE FIELD

The turf at Jordan-Hare Stadium was officially named after Pat Dye, Auburn's Hall of Fame coach and athletics director, prior to the 2005 Iron Bowl. The Tigers posted a 99-39-4 record in 12 seasons under Dye from 1981-92, and won four SEC championships. Auburn's home games are now played at Pat Dye Field at Jordan-Hare Stadium.



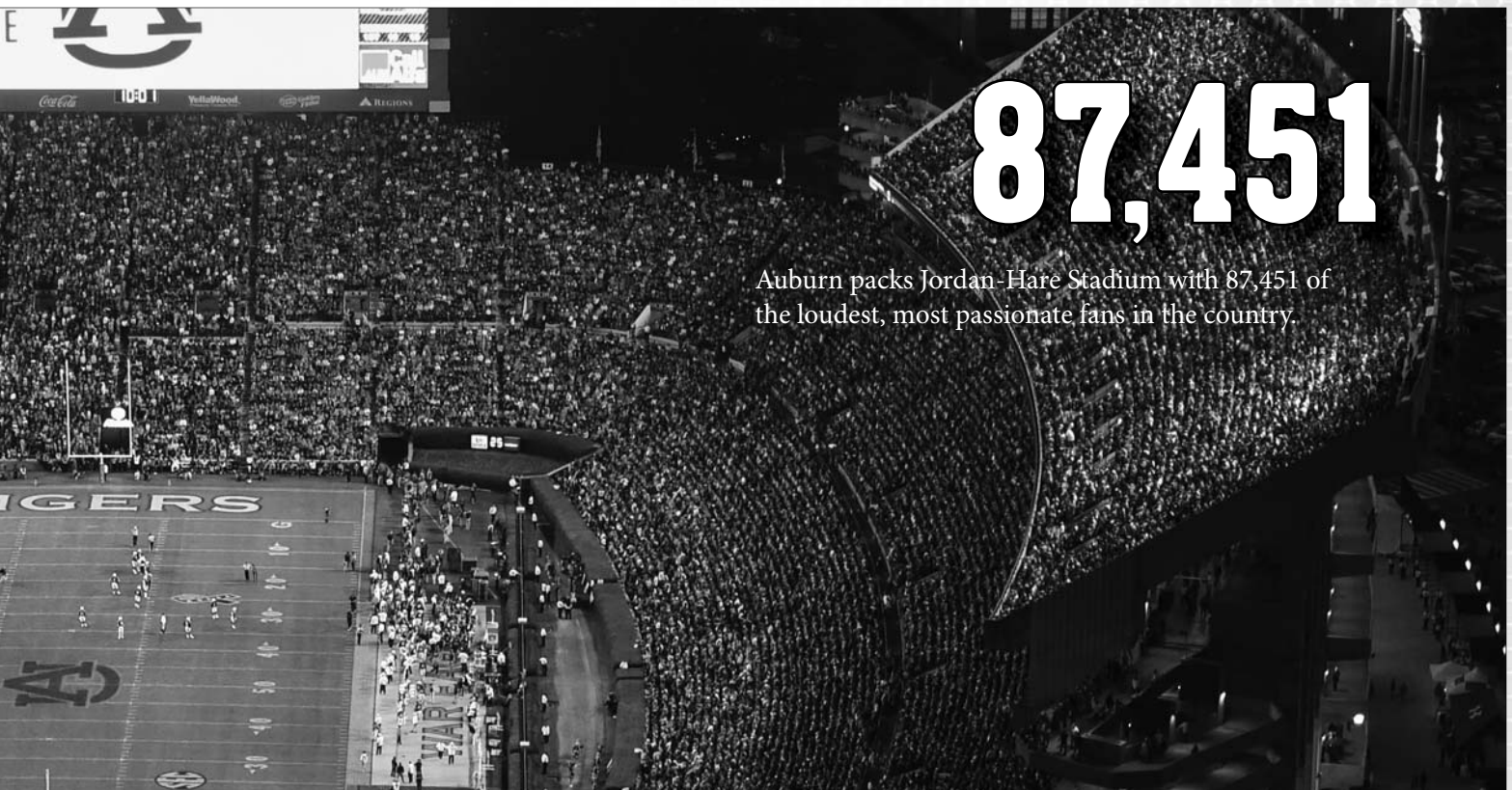

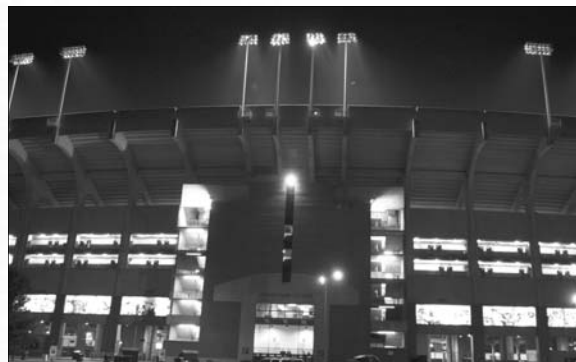

A crowd of thousands roared as former Heisman Trophy winners Pat Sullivan, Bo Jackson and Cam Newton took the stage moments before towering statues immortalizing the Auburn greats from three different eras were unveiled.

PAT 1971

Auburn quarterback Pat Sullivan picked up the Tigers' first Heisman Trophy in 1971 after throwing for 20 touchdowns and racking up 2,096 yards of total offense. He led Auburn to a 9-2 record and a Sugar Bowl appearance in his senior season.





BO 1985

Bo Jackson plowed through defenses in 1985 for 6.4 yards per carry, earning Auburn's second Heisman Trophy. The three-sport athlete ran for 1,786 yards and 17 touchdowns while helping the Tigers to an 8-4 record and a Cotton Bowl appearance.



CAM 2010

Cam Newton put together one of the most remarkable college football seasons ever in 2010, throwing for 30 touchdowns and rushing for 20 while leading Auburn to a 14-0 record and the BCS National Championship. Newton tallied 4,327 yards of total offense while completing 66.1% of his passes.



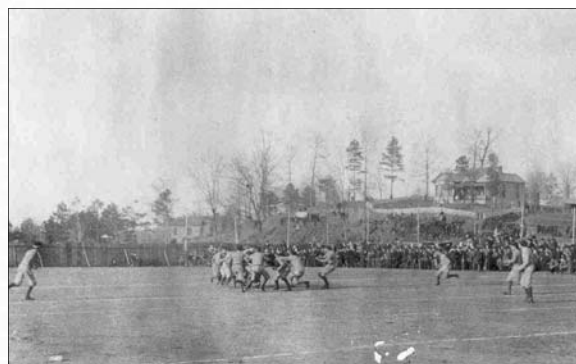


WHAT'S IN A NAME?

Of the first 53 meetings between Auburn and Alabama, 48 took place in Birmingham. The name "Iron Bowl" comes from Birmingham's historic role in the country's iron industry.

1893

The first Iron Bowl was played on Feb. 22, 1893 in Birmingham with Auburn taking the 32-22 win. The Tigers won the first two meetings and six of the first seven.



1982

The climax to a 23-22 Auburn victory over Alabama in 1982 was Bo Jackson's "Bo Over the Top" 1-yard leap over the Alabama goal line, which capped a 66-yard drive and set the stage for what Auburn people consider the Tigers' "coming out" party in the 1980s.



December 2, 1972: Trailing 16-3 with six minutes left, underdog Auburn's David Langner returned two blocked Alabama punts to win the game 17-16, handing the Crimson Tide their first loss of the season and ending hopes of a national title.



1989

The first time Auburn and Alabama met in Auburn was in 1989, and the No. 11 Tigers beat the No. 2 Crimson Tide, 30-20, on Dec. 2, 1989.



2010

Down 24-0 in the second quarter, the Auburn defense inspired a school-record comeback for a 28-27 win in Tuscaloosa in 2010, en route to a national championship.



KICK SIX: With one second remaining in the game, Auburn's Chris Davis returned a missed field goal 109 yards to give the Tigers a 34-28 win in the 2013 Iron Bowl.

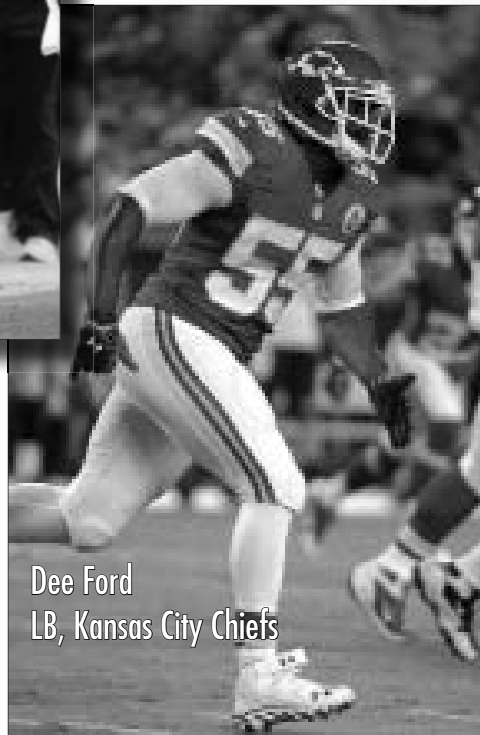
