Randy Edsall begins his second stint as the UConn head football coach after being with the program for 12 seasons from 1999-2010. He led the program from Division I-AA status in 1999 to an appearance in the Bowl Championship Series and the Tostitos Fiesta Bowl following the 2010 season.

Coach Edsall returns to UConn from the NFL's Detroit Lions where he was Director of Research

-- Special Projects. Prior to that he served as head football coach of the University of Maryland from 2011-2015.

"It is an honor to have the opportunity to rejoin and lead the UConn program," said Edsall at the time of his hiring. "I want to thank President Herbst, Athletic Director David Benedict and the rest of the administration for believing I am the right person to build this program and develop its student-athletes. I look forward to working with David, our student-athletes and the entire athletic department."

During his time in Storrs, the program blossomed from a major college football newcomer to a team that made five bowl appearances in seven years and four consecutive. He has recorded the most wins in program history (74) and coached in the most

games (144). In addition to being the winningest coach in school history, Edsall's coaching record in the school's first nine FBS seasons (2002-2010) was 65-46.

Despite starting the 2010 season with an 0-2 conference mark and 3-4 overall, the Huskies rebounded and finished the year with five consecutive Big East wins to earn the league championship and a spot in a BCS bowl game. UConn's trip from the FCS (former Divison I-AA) to the BCS in 11 seasons was the most rapid in the history of the series. For his efforts and those of the team, he was named the 2010 Big East Coach of the Year.

UConn's trip to the 2011 Tostitos Fiesta Bowl marked the fourth consecutive bowl trip for the Huskies and the fifth since 2004. The Huskies defeated South Carolina in the 2010 Papajohns.com Bowl by a 20-7 score. Edsall guided the Huskies to a 38-20 win over Buffalo in the 2009 International Bowl and led the team to a victory in the 2004 Motor City Bowl (39-10 over Toledo) and an appearance in the 2007 Meineke Car Care Bowl.

Edsall's Huskies won their final three regular season games in 2009 - including a historic double-overtime win over Notre Dame on Nov. 21. UConn posted a 7-5 regular season record facing the 25th-toughest regular season schedule in the country. In 2007, the Bryant and Munger Coach of the Year Award finalist helped guide UConn to a share of its first-ever Big East Championship in a season where the Huskies were picked to finish seventh in the league.

Edsall was named the 2007 Bowl Championship Division Head Coach of the Year in New England by the Gridiron Club of Greater Boston.

At UConn, Edsall was a prominent voice in the college football community, as he was a member of the American Football Coaches Association Board of Trustees and the NCAA Football Rules Committee.

UConn joined the Big East Conference in 2004, finishing just one-win shy of tying for the conference championship. The Huskies led the conference in total defense each of their first two years in the league and again in 2008. During their debut season in 2004, UConn led the Big East in both total offense and total defense. During this span, UConn has finished in the national top 20 for total offense (2003, 2004) and total defense (2002, 2005, 2008). The Huskies finished an impressive sixth in the country in total defense in 2008.

Under Edsall's guidance, the Huskies defeated members of the Atlantic Coast Conference, Big East, Big Ten, Big 12, Conference USA and Southeastern Conference during their Football Bowl Subdivision tenure.

In addition to the great success on the field, UConn performed admirably in the classroom under Edsall. UConn was recognized by the American Football Coaches Association for its high graduation rate five times during Edsall's career.

In the October 2009 release of the NCAA Graduation Success Rate, UConn had the highest mark of any Big East team. In 2008, UConn had the highest GSR for African-American student-athletes

among all state universities that participated in a bowl game following the 2008 season.

In 2009, the NCAA's Academic Progress Rate (APR) for the UConn football team was an impressive 951, which was third in the Big East Conference and just five points behind the second-highest team. That mark also placed Connecticut ahead of the Bowl Subdivision average of 941 and among the top thirty percent of schools in the country.

In 2007, UConn was one of just six schools to play in a bowl game and also boast a Graduation Success Rate (GSR) over 80-percent for both its Caucasian and African-American student-athletes

In 2003, UConn was the only public I-A school to graduate at least 90 percent of its football players and in 2005, UConn was one of only eight schools to both graduate 70 percent and win a bowl game.

Edsall guided the 2002 team to a 6-6 record in its first year with a full Division I-A compliment of 85 scholarships. UConn ended the 2002 season impressively with four-straight wins to reach the .500 mark, including season-ending road wins at Navy and at bowl-bound lowa State of the Big 12 Conference.

UConn's .500 season was its best record since the squad won 10 games in 1998. The Huskies' six wins were more than the Huskies posted in 2000 (three) and 2001 (two) combined. The Huskies were the most improved Division I-A team in the country in 2002, according to preseason and postseason ratings by College Football News.

The excitement for Edsall and his team continued to swell in 2003 as the Huskies moved into their new home, Rentschler Field, and enjoyed the nation's largest attendance increase with a gain of 21,252 fans per game.

Finishing with a 9-3 record, many national media outlets, including Bristol-based ESPN, proclaimed that UConn should have received a bowl berth, a feat highly-uncommon for an independent team.

With their membership in the Big East for the 2004 season, another strong campaign by the Huskies resulted in a bowl berth. UConn went 8-4 against a challenging slate that fall as the program gained its highest ever level of exposure. The Huskies capped their historic season with the resounding win over Toledo in the Motor City Bowl.

The 2007 season witnessed a new level of excitement in Storrs as the Huskies earned their first ever national rankings, peaking at No. 13 in the BCS standings on Nov. 5. UConn became just the second Big East team to ever go 7-0 at home and defeated three teams there which were ranked in the Top 10 at some point during the season. The Big East Champion Huskies finished that season at 9-4 with a berth in the Meineke Car Care Bowl, earning Edsall New England Division I Coach of the Year accolades.

Edsall was named the 27th head football coach at the University of Connecticut on December 21, 1998.

Edsall brought 19 years of previous coaching experience to the Husky program, including 15 seasons on the collegiate level and three in the NFL. Edsall joined the Huskies after completing the 1998 season as the defensive coordinator at Georgia Tech, where he helped the 14th-ranked Yellow Jackets complete a 9-2 campaign.

Prior to joining the staff at Georgia Tech, Edsall spent three seasons as the secondary coach for the Jacksonville Jaguars of the National Football League. In his three seasons on Tom Coughlin's staff, Edsall was a part of one of the most successful expansion franchises in the history of the NFL. The Jaguars reached the playoffs in 1996 and 1997, including a berth in the AFC Championship Game in 1996.

Edsall began his coaching career in 1980 at his alma mater, Syracuse University. A former quarterback for the Orangemen, Edsall started as a graduate assistant from 1980-1982. In 1983, coach Dick MacPherson named Edsall running backs coach. He coached the running backs for three seasons at Syracuse (1983-84 and 1986) and coached the tight ends in 1985 before making the switch to the defensive side of the ball. He coached the Syracuse defensive backs from 1987-1990 and during that period the Orangemen were ranked amongst the National Division I-A leaders in pass defense.

Edsall was a three-year letterwinner in football, basketball and baseball at Susquehannock High School in Glen Rock, Pa. He was an all-state selection in all three sports in his senior season and has been inducted into the York Area Sports Hall of Fame. He then went on to Syracuse, where he was a member of the football team and earned one varsity letter as a quarterback for the Orangemen. He was a member of the Syracuse squad that captured the 1979 Independence Bowl title under head coach Frank Maloney.

Edsall is a native of Glen Rock, Penn., and earned a bachelor's degree in physical education from Syracuse in 1980 and added a master's degree in health and physical education in 1982 from Syracuse.

Edsall was honored with the Leadership Award at the Martin Luther King, Jr., Holiday National Liberty Bell Ringing Celebration in Hartford, Conn., in January of 2010.

Edsall was an active member of the Connecticut community and supported a number of charitable events. He is the former chairman of the annual Southern New England Arthritis Foundation Gridiron Gala. He was on the advisory council of The Children's Home in Cromwell, Conn., a center for over 100 neglected and abused children, and also took part in several other charitable endeavors including serving in the past as the honorary chairman of the Greater Hartford American Heart Association Walk.

He and his wife, Eileen, a former basketball and volleyball letterwinner at Syracuse, have a daughter, Alexi and a son, Corey.



Assistant Head Coach/Running Backs

Terry Richardson rejoins the Huskies after 12 successful seasons with Randy Edsall from 1999-2011. Richardson is the assistant head coach and running backs coach for the Huskies in 2017.

Richardson worked one season as running backs coach at the University of Maryland in 2015 after spending the previous two seasons (2013 & 2014) in the same role with the Jackson-ville Jaguars.

Under Richardson's direction, the Jaguars finished sixth in the NFL in 2014 in yards per carry (4.5). In 2013, Richardson oversaw a running back group that featured veteran Maurice Jones-Drew (803 yards), first-year pro Jordan Todman (256 yards) and 2013 fifth-round draft pick Denard Robinson (66 yards). Jones-Drew led the team with five touchdowns while Todman produced career-best numbers.

Prior to his two seasons with the Jaguars, Richardson, a veteran of 14 years coaching experience on the collegiate level, served as the University of Miami's running backs coach and Florida recruiting coordinator from 2011-12.

Under Richardson's guidance at Miami, Duke Johnson and Lamar Miller registered two of the best seasons in the school's history by a running back. Johnson was named Freshman All-America in 2012 after rushing for a school freshman-record 947 yards and 10 touchdowns while earning Walter Camp All-America honors as a kick returner. He was named the 2012 ACC Rookie of the Year.

In 2011, Richardson coached Miller who finished with 1,272 rushing yards, the third-most in school history behind Willis Mc-Gahee (1,753) and Edgerrin James (1,416). Miller became only the eighth player in school history to surpass the 1,000-yard mark in a season had seven games with 100-plus rushing yards.

Prior to joining Miami, Richardson spent 12 seasons at Connecticut as running backs coach under current Maryland head coach Randy Edsall. Richardson groomed Jordan Todman who was named the 2010 BIG EAST Offensive Player of the Year after he ranked second in the country with 143.1 rushing yards per game. He earned second-team All-America honors from the Walter Camp Foundation. The Huskies ranked 31st in the nation in 2010 with 179.9 rushing yards per game. Richardson was a nominee for the 2010 Broyles Award, given to the nation's top college football assistant coaches.

In 2009, Richardson worked with two 1,000-yard rushers in Todman and All-BIG EAST second-team selection Andre Dixon. UCONN was just one of three NCAA FBS schools to boast a pair of 1,000-yard rushers. The 2008 season saw running back Donald Brown become the nation's leading rusher as he was named the BIG EAST Offensive Player of the Year and a first-team All-America pick by the Sporting News. He became the school's first NFL first-round draft pick in 2009 as he was selected by the Indianapolis Colts.

A native of Broward (Fla.) County, Richardson was a four-year letter winner at running back for Syracuse and wore the fabled uniform number 44. The coveted jersey is awarded to only exceptional Orange rushers, including Jim Brown and 1961 Heisman Trophy winner Ernie Davis. Richardson led the team in rushing as a senior in 1993 and helped the Orange to three bowl berths during his career.

Richardson signed a free agent contract with the Cincinnati Bengals in 1994 and also spent time with the Philadelphia Eagles (1995), Kansas City Chiefs (1996) and Pittsburgh Steelers (1996-97).

In 1998 he returned to his high school, Northeast, in Oakland Park, Fla., as offensive coordinator and running backs coach to start his coaching career.





Defensive Coordinator

Billy Crocker begins his first season at UConn as the defensive coordinator.

Crocker completed his 12th year at Villanova in 2016 and his fifth as the team's Defensive Coordinator. After coaching the defensive line for five seasons, Crocker was elevated to linebackers coach and Special Teams Coordinator for the 2011 season, before earning the Defensive Coordinator title in 2012. Crocker is currently in his second stint at Villanova. From 2001-02, he was the team's defensive assistant.

Last Season Crocker's unit ranked No. 1 in the nation giving up 15 points per game. Villanova also led the FCS in total defense (259.9 yards per game). The Wildcats also ranked third in red zone defense and fourth in rushing defense.

In 2015, Crocker's defense gave up 18.4 points per game which ranked second in the CAA and 11th nationally. The Wildcats also ranked second in the CAA in total defense at 309.1 yards per game which was good enough for 16th in the national statistics. In addition, Villanova led the CAA and ranked fourth in the country a season ago in red zone defense allowing 18 scores in 31 attempts.

Crocker guided five players to All-CAA distinction last year highlighted by senior linebacker Don Cherry and junior defensive end Tanoh Kpassganon who were named to the first team. The other three defensive honorees included senior safety Cameron McCurry, junior corner Jason Ceneus and junior linebacker Austin Calitro who were all third team members.

In 2014, Crocker's defense gave up 22.1 points per game and led the CAA and ranked eighth nationally in rushing defense at 106.7 yards per contest. The Wildcat defense also ranked in the Top 25 in three other categories in the national statistics, including turnovers forced (17th), tackles for loss (23rd) and opponent third down percentage (25th). Under Crocker's direction in 2014, Cherry tallied 134 tackles, 21.5 tackles for loss and 10 sacks en route to being a first team All-American and a first team All-CAA honoree. In addition, Cherry finished second in the Buck Buchanan voting for the national defensive player of the year. Three other Wildcat defenders earned All-Conference accolades last season, including senior nose guard Pat Williams and senior safety Joe Sarnese who were second team honorees and Ceneus who was a third team selection.

Crocker was honored in 2014 as the Person of the Year by The Southeastern Connecticut Chapter of the National Football Foundation and Hall of Fame. Crocker is a native of Waterford, Conn., and a graduate of Waterford High School.

During the 2013 season, Crocker's defense produced five All-CAA players highlighted by senior defensive end Rakim Cox who was a first team selection and Cherry who was named second team All-Conference.

In his first year as the team's Defensive Coordinator in 2012, the Wildcats ranked second in the CAA in scoring defense at 20.9 points per game. Crocker's defense also produced six All-CAA performers in 2012, including three first team honorees.

As the team's linebacker coach in 2011, Crocker guided freshman linebacker Dillon Lucas to an outstanding rookie campaign. Lucas tallied a team-high 92 tackles and earned Defensive Rookie of the Year honors from both the CAA and ECAC. Lucas also earned third team All-CAA distinction.

In 2010 as the Wildcat defensive line coach, Crocker helped senior nose guard Thomas Weaver and true freshman defensive end Antoine Lewis to third team All-CAA honors.

Under Crocker's direction in 2009, senior defensive end Tim Kukucka was a first team All-CAA honoree and a third team All-American and senior nose guard Phil Matusz garnered second team All-CAA accolades. Crocker guided Kukucka to three seasons of All-Conference honors as he finished his Villanova career with 162 tackles, 25.5 sacks and 49 tackles for loss.

In 2008, Crocker coached senior defensive end Greg Miller to first team All-American honors from the Sports Network, Walter Camp Foundation and American Football Coaches Association, first team All-CAA honors and All-East distinction. Miller finished his outstanding season with 49 tackles, 15 tackles for loss, 5.5 tackles for loss and two forced fumbles. Miller wasn't the only Crocker product to earn All-Conference accolades last season. Kukucka garnered second team All-CAA honors and senior defensive lineman Dave Dalessandro was a third team choice. Kukucka was also a second team All-Conference choice in 2007.

Crocker came to Villanova from the University at Albany where he coached the running backs from 2003-04. During his stint at Albany, Crocker helped Albany to the 2003 NEC championship and coached running back Gary Jones to third team Associated Press All-American distinction. In addition, Jones graduated as Albany's all-time career rushing leader.

Crocker attended the United States Coast Guard Academy from 1997-2001 where he was a three-year letterwinner as a defensive back in football and a one-year letterwinner during his freshman year in baseball. He is a 2002 graduate of Villanova University where he earned a Bachelor of Science Degree in Business Administration. Crocker also owns a Master's Degree in Curriculum Development & Instructional Technology from the University at Albany.

Crocker and his wife Kristina have three children, a son Ryan and two-year old twins, Will and Bryn.



Offensive Coordinator

Rhett Lashlee begins his first season with the Huskies as the offensive coordinator. Prior to joining UConn he was the Auburn offensive coordinator for four seasons. He helped the Tigers to the 2013 SEC Championship and BCS Championship berth, While at Auburn he managed one of the most prolific offenses in college football. The 2013-14 seasons were the best back-to-back offensively in school history, and the 2014 squad set an Auburn record for total offense. Lashlee coaches the quarterbacks daily in practice. Lashlee has been nominated for the Broyle Award twice, the award is presented to the nation's top assistant coach, and was a finalist in 2013,

In 2013, Auburn had the second biggest turnaround in college football history at +8.0 games. Starting QB Nick Marshall did not practice until August, but Lashlee tutored the junior college transfer to 3,044 yards of total offense (1976 passing, 1068 rushing), 14 TD passes and 12 rushing TDs.

Marshall finished his two-year career second all-time in passing efficiency at Auburn, the school leader for rushing TD as a QB, and posted an AU-record 505 total yards (465 passing) in the 2014 Iron Bowl.

Auburn led the nation in rushing (328.3 yds/game), and ranked 11th in total offense (501.3 yds/game) and 12th in scoring offense (39.5 pts/game) in 2013. Running back Tre Mason was a Heisman Trophy finalist and the SEC Offensive Player of the Year; he set Auburn single-season records with 2,374 all-purpose yards, and 1,816 rushing yards.

Three offensive players were 2014 NFL Draft picks: tackle Greg Robinson No. 2 overall by the St. Louis Rams, Mason (third round, Rams) and fullback Jay Prosch (sixth round, Houston Texans). Three more -- third-rounder receiver Sammie Coates (Pittsburgh Steelers) and fifth-rounders TE C.J. Uzomah (Cincinnati Bengals) and RB Cameron Artis-Payne (Carolina Panthers) -- were 2015 selections, and OT Shon Coleman and WR Ricardo Louis (both Cleveland Browns) were 2016 picks.

During the 2012 season as offensive coordinator at Arkansas State, Lashlee helped ASU to a Sun Belt title. Record-setting quarterback Ryan Aplin was named the Sun Belt Player of the Year, leading the league in passing yards, passing efficiency and total offense.

Lashlee served as offensive coordinator and quarterbacks coach at Samford in 2011, installing a high-tempo offense that improved the Bulldogs' national ranking in total offense from No. 57 in the nation to No. 36 in just one year. Receiver Kelsey Pope broke the school record for receptions in a game, while quarterback Dustin Taliaferro broke Samford's career record for completions.

While at Auburn as an offensive graduate assistant during the 2009-10 seasons, Lashlee assisted Malzahn with all aspects of the offense and coached the slot receivers in 2010. In 2009, the Tigers finished 8-5 winning the Outback Bowl. During the 2010 season he helped the Tigers finish 14-0, winning the SEC title and the BCS National Championship behind Heisman Trophy winning quarter-back Cam Newton.

Lashlee's college career began in 2006 at Arkansas, where he served as a graduate assistant with Malzahn as the 10-4 Razorbacks won the SEC Western Division title. Lashlee coached at Springdale (Ark.) High School in 2004-05, working with the quarterbacks and 2005 National Player of the Year Mitch Mustain.

A backup quarterback at Arkansas from 2002-04, when his career was cut short by a shoulder injury, Lashlee graduated from Shiloh Christian High School in Springdale, Ark. He played quarterback for Malzahn (1999-2000) and Chris Wood (2001) at Shiloh Christian, posting a state-record 40 career wins (40-3-2 as a starter) while leading his team to three straight state championship game appearances and two state titles. The 2001 Arkansas Player of the Year, Lashlee owns virtually every state passing record; when his career had finished, he had broken the national record for career touchdown passes (171), career touchdowns (200), most passing yards in a game (672) and was second with 13,201 passing yards.

Lashlee graduated from Arkansas in 2006 with a degree in marketing and business administration. He received his master's degree in higher education from Auburn in 2009. He is married to the former Lauren Lee of Rogers, Ark., an Arkansas business graduate. They have twin sons, Thomas and Hudson, and twin daughters, Rowyn and Scarlet.

Defensive Backs

Former NFL defensive back Curome Cox joins the UConn coaching staff for his first season as the defensive backs coach.

Cox comes to Connecticut after spending four seasons on the Coastal Carolina football staff, coaching the corner backs and kickoff coverage unit on special teams.

Cox made an immediate impact in his first season as Coastal posted a then CCU-record 62 pass breakups (12 better than the previous mark) while his kickoff coverage unit led the Big South and ranked 16th nationally by allowing just 17.73 yards per return (an improvement of five yards per return over the previous season). Denzel Rice earned second team All-Big South honors as he tied a CCU single-season record with 12 pass breakups in a season. His total led the Big South and tied for 10th-best in the FCS for 2013. Also, then freshman Samson Baldwin was named Big South Freshman of the Week twice.

In year two, Coastal bettered its own mark with 64 pass breakups and set a school record with 77 passes defended. Coastal's defense led the Big South and ranked 26th nationally in pass efficiency defense. Rice, who went on to sign was once again named second team All-Big South as he and Kamron Summers each tallied 10 PBU. Also, Coastal's kick coverage unit ranked 24th in the NCAA FCS, allowing 17.67 yards per return.

The 2015 season saw even more improvement from the kick coverage unit as it ranked sixth in the NCAA FCS by allowing just 16.07 yards per return.

Cox came to Coastal Carolina after three seasons (2010-12) as a graduate assistant at Maryland. While at Maryland, Cox assisted with the Terrapins' defensive and special teams units. He also served as the junior college recruiter as well as on-campus liaison for potential student-athletes during official and unofficial visits.

Cox also spent time as an intern assistant coach as part of the NFL minority internship program with the Washington Redskins during July and August 2012. While with the Redskins, he contributed with the development and execution of practice elements and worked with the defensive secondary during film sessions.

The Arlington, Va., native spent five seasons in the NFL, playing for the Denver Broncos (2004-07) and Houston Texans (2007-09). While in Denver, Cox served on the special teams units, where he was a finalist for the 2006 AFC Special Team Player of the Year. He helped the Broncos to the AFC West title in 2005 and to the 2006 AFC Championship game. Once in Houston, Cox contributed on the special teams.

Cox played collegiately at Maryland where he earned All-ACC as well as All-ACC Academic honors in 2003. Cox, primarily a corner, ranks seventh on the Terps' all-time list with 10 career interceptions returned for 153 yards. He helped lead Maryland to the 2002 Orange Bowl, 2002 Peach Bowl and the 2004 Gator Bowl. During his time in Maryland, the Terps tallied a 41-20 record and claimed the 2001 ACC Championship.

Cox graduated from Maryland in 2003 with a degree in family studies. He earned a master's of arts degree in minority and urban education from Maryland in 2012.



Defensive Line

Dennis Dottin-Carter begins his first season with the Huskies as the defensive line coach.

Prior to joining UConn, Dottin-Carter worked at the University of Delaware for five seasons.

While at Delaware, he was was named the Blue Hens' defensive line coach in 2013 and was promoted to the position of co-defensive coordinator in 2014.

Dottin-Carter was selected as Interim Head Coach on Oct. 16, 2016 after head coach Dave Brock was relieved of his duties. He led the Blue Hens for the final five weeks of the season and posted a record of 2-3, posting victories at home over Towson and on the road at Albany.

In 2015, Delaware's defense ranked No. 3 in the CAA in rushing defense (123.5/17th in NCAA), No. 3 in third-down conversion defense (.346/31st), No. 3 in scoring defense (20.5/22nd), and No. 5 in total defense (329.2/24th). Five Delaware defensive players earned All-CAA honors.

During the 2014 season, Delaware ranked No. 4 in the CAA in pass defense (197.2) and sixth in sacks (28). Under his tutelage, redshirt freshman Blaine Woodson was named the CAA Defensive Rookie of the Year.

Dottin-Carter also played a big role in the development of 2013 All-American defensive tackle Zach Kerr, who closed out his third season with the Indianapolis Colts in 2016.

Dottin-Carter, a native of Cambridge, Mass., earned his degree in kinesiology and physical education from the University of Maine following an outstanding playing career that saw him lead the Black Bears to Atlantic 10 (now CAA) titles in 2001 and 2002. He was a first team All-Atlantic 10 selection as a linebacker in 2002 when he also was named All-New England.

Dottin-Carter began his coaching career with former head coach Jack Cosgrove at Maine in 2008 as tights ends coach and also led the fullbacks, running backs, defensive line, and special teams during his five-year tenure.

He most recently served as Maine's defensive line and special teams coach. During his tenure, he coached five all-conference players, including All-American fullback Jared Turcotte in 2008. Maine led the CAA in scoring defense (19.5 points per game) and was fourth in sacks (22) in 2012.

Tight Ends

In his first season at UConn, Corey Edsall will be in charge of the tight ends.


Edsall spent two seasons on the Colorado football staff, 2016 was his first as a graduate assistant working with the defense. He joined the program in 2015 and worked as a football intern. In 2016, he was part of the biggest turn around season in PAC-12 history. The Buffaloes went 10-4 (8-1) and won the PAC-12 South Championship and appeared in the 2016 PAC-12 Championship game against the Washington Huskies.

Edsall, 24, has spent two summers as a scouting intern in a pair of National Football League training camps, New England in 2013 and Philadelphia in 2014.

He graduated with his bachelor's degree in Family Science from the University of Maryland in 2015. In 2011 he started out as a freshman at Syracuse University, where he played quarterback for coach Doug Marrone, but then transferred to Maryland. At Maryland, he worked three years (2012-14) as a student assistant on the offensive side of the ball, and staffed a pair of bowl games

with the Terrapins (2013 Military, 2014 Foster Farms).

Graduated from East Catholic High School in Manchester, Conn., where he lettered four times in football, twice in baseball and once in lacrosse. At Syracuse, he made the Big East All-Academic team for the 2011 season.



Offensive Line

JB Grimes, joins the UConn staff as a veteran of 30-plus years in the coaching ranks. Grimes will work with the offensive line in his first season with the Huskies. In his illustrious career, he has coached 50+ NFL linemen.

Last season Grimes worked at the University of Cincinnati as the offensive line coach for the Bearcats.

Prior to joining the Bearcats, Grimes was at at Auburn for three seasons, where he helped the Tigers to a 2013 Southeastern Conference Championship and a BCS Championship berth. He has coached in 18 bowl games.

The 2015 Auburn line helped the Tigers rank in the top five of the SEC in numerous offensive categories, including fewest sacks (t-4th/19) and rushing yards per game (5th/196.4). Grimes coached Shon Coleman, one of the inspirational stories of the 2015 season, who beat cancer prior to enrolling, returned to the field in 2013 and earned his bachelor's and master's degrees while at ATT

In 2014, center Reese Dismukes was the 2014 Rimington Trophy winner and a consensus All-American and will be selected in the 2014 NFL Draft. Braden Smith was a Freshman All-SEC

selection.

The offensive line helped the Tigers lead the SEC in third-down conversion percentage (.525) and team passing efficiency (156.79) while the Tigers were second in team rushing (255.5), total offense (485.0) and yards per completion (14.35). Cameron Artis-Payne led the SEC in rushing at 123.7 yards per game and joined Tre Mason, Bo Jackson, Rudi Johnson and Cam Newton as the only rushers in Auburn history to post a 1,400-yard season.

Quarterback Nick Marshall posted a school QB record eight career 100-yard rushing games and finished second in Auburn career QB rushing at 1,863 yards. Nick Marshall was the fifth Auburn quarterback to throw 20 TDs in a season, joining Cam Newton (30/2010), Chris Todd (22/2009), Jason Campbell (20/2004) and Pat Sullivan (20/1971).

In 2013, Auburn had the second biggest turnaround in college football history in NCAA records at +8.0 games. Grimes coached second-team All-America left tackle Greg Robinson and Rimington Award finalist center Reese Dismukes. Robinson was the No. 2 pick overall in the 2014 NFL Draft by the St. Louis Rams.

Dismukes and Robinson were both first-team All-SEC selections while left guard Alex Kozan was named to the Coaches All-SEC Freshman team.

The offensive line paved the way for the Tigers to lead the nation in rushing with 328.3 yards per game. Running back Tre Mason was a Heisman Trophy finalist and named the SEC Player of the Year while Nick Marshall was an Associated Press honorable mention All-SEC selection. The line allowed only 1.29 sacks per game to rank 22nd nationally.

During the 2012 season at Arkansas State, Grimes coached an offensive line unit that helped set a school record with 481.8 yards of total offense per game while ranking 16th nationally in fewest sacks allowed. Senior offensive lineman Zach McKnight earned first-team All-Sun Belt honors under Grimes' direction as the offense led the Sun Belt in rushing and ranked in the top 25 nationally in total offense, scoring offense and rushing offense.

Prior to his arrival at ASU, Grimes spent two seasons at Kansas (2010-11) and Mississippi State (2004-08) as the offensive line coach. Grimes' coaching career also includes stints at East Carolina, Texas A&M, Virginia Tech, Arkansas, Louisiana-Monroe and Delta State as an assistant coach over the last three decades.

In his first season at Mississippi State, the Bulldogs rushed for 1,744 yards, the most at the school in four years. Behind his offensive line, MSU produced three seasons with a 1,000-yard rusher. In his one season at East Carolina (2003), the Pirates' offensive line paved the way for its third straight 1,000-yard individual rusher. At Texas A&M (1998-2002), Grimes coached the offensive line under R.C. Slocum as the Aggies posted a 40-22 overall record while playing in four straight bowl games.

While at Virginia Tech (1993-97) coaching for Frank Beamer, Grimes helped the Hokies to back-to-back Big East Championships and five bowl games in five seasons.

Grimes also coached at Arkansas, serving as a graduate assistant in 1981-82 and as a full-time assistant coach in 1989-92, where he helped the Razorbacks to the Southwest Conference championship and a Cotton Bowl appearance in 1990. At Arkansas, Grimes worked for Lou Holtz, Ken Hatfield and Jack Crowe.

Grimes also coached at Louisiana-Monroe (1979-80; 1985-88), Delta State (1983) and Missouri (1984) after spending his first two seasons at the high school level in the state of Arkansas, at Nashville (1977) and Des Arc (1978). Louisiana-Monroe won the 1987 Division I-AA national championship.

As an offensive lineman at Henderson State, he helped his team to a 40-6 record in four seasons, including a berth in the 1974 NAIA Championship game. He earned a bachelor's degree in education from Henderson State in 1977 and a master's degree in education from Louisiana-Monroe in 1981.

Grimes grew up in Clarendon, Arkansas, and is married to the former Jennifer Graves, who received a degree in advertising and public relations from Arkansas. The couple has four children, sons Aaron and Nick and daughters Danielle and Lindsey.

Wide Receivers

Aaron Smith rejoins the Huskies, this time as a coach, after playing on the football team from 2004-2006. Smith will work with the wide receivers.

Smith completed his fourth season on the University at Albany football staff in 2016, serving as recruiting coordinator, pass game coordinator, and wide receivers coach.

Under Smith's direction in 2014, Josh Gontarek was named the CAA Offensive Rookie of the Year, boasting the best freshman receiving numbers in program history with 58 receptions, 687 receiving yards, and eight receiving touchdowns.

Smith, a native of West Point, N.Y. and son of an Army colonel, brought seven years of collegiate coaching experience to UAlbany. He spent the 2012 season leading the wide receivers at Boston College where he helped junior Alex Amidon develop into one of the ACC's best. Amidon's 1,210 yards receiving at the end of the regular season ranked second in the ACC, just four yards behind the leader.

Smith spent the five seasons prior (2007-11) as the receivers coach at Columbia University, coaching two All-Ivy League honorees, including Austin Knowlin, Columbia's all-time leader in receptions (210) and receiving yards (2,484). Smith also served as the Lions' recruiting coordinator in 2011.

Smith started his coaching career at the United States Coast Guard Academy in 2006.

As an undergraduate, Smith played football at both the University of Maryland and the University of Connecticut, helping his teams to appearances in the Peach, Orange, and Motor City Bowls. While competing at UConn, he was presented with two Scholar Athlete Awards, and graduated with a degree in political science in 2006.

Smith and his wife Kristin have a daughter, Mia, and son, Cash.

Linebackers

Jon Wholley starts his second stint at UConn after spending four years with Connecticut from 2010-2013. Wholley will coach the linebackers this season.

Wholley just finished his third season as the defensive coordinator and linebackers coach at Fordham in 2016. A 2004 graduate of the University of Connecticut who earned a master's degree from UConn in 2008 He worked with the linebackers for the last three seasons after coaching the tight ends in 2010.

In 2015, Wholley co-coordinated a Fordham defense that led the Patriot League and was tenth in the NCAA FCS in turnovers gained (29) and fumbles recovered (13) while also leading the league and ranking 17th in the nation in passes intercepted (16). Individually the Rams had four players named All-Patriot League with Stephen Hodge (LB) and Jihaad Pretlow (DB) earning first team honors and JQ Bowers (DB) and Niko Thorpe (LB) being placed on the second team. Additionally, Hodge was named a consensus All-American.

In 2014, Wholley led a Fordham defense that saw seven players earn All-Patriot League honors, including linebackers Austin Hancock and De'Nard Pinckney. The Rams led the Patriot League and were ninth in the NCAA FCS in passing yards allowed (164.2) while also leading the league and ranking 14th in the nation in red zone defense (.714). Fordham also led the conference, and was 28th in the NCAA FCS, in fumbles recovered (11) as well as tackles for loss (6.9), ranking 32nd in the NCAA FCS. The Rams were also second in the Patriot League in both sacks (2.43) and third down conversions (.353), ranking 30th and 33rd, respectively, in the NCAA in each category

In 2012 at UConn, a pair of linebackers earned First Team All-BIG EAST honors in Sio Moore and Yawin Smallwood. Moore was a third round pick of the Oakland Raiders in the 2013 NFL Draft and played in the Senior Bowl and East-West Shrine Game and also took part in the NFL Combine.

Wholley worked a one year stint at Fordham 2009 as an assistant coach, he worked with the running backs and was the recruiting coordinator. The Rams led the NCAA Football Championship Subdivision in total offense that year at 488.82 yards per game.

A Southington, Conn. native, Wholley was a member of the UConn football team from 2001-04 as a running back, joining the team as a walk-on. He later earned a scholarship and was a member of the 2004 Motor City Bowl championship team.

Wholley earned his undergraduate degree in political science from UConn in December of 2004.

Following graduation, he was an assistant coach at Central Connecticut State for the 2005 season, working with the tight ends. The Blue Devils had a 7-4 record and were Northeast Conference co-champions.

Wholley then returned to UConn as a graduate assistant coach for the 2006-08 seasons working on the offensive side of the ball. He was part of the coaching staff that led the Huskies to a share of the 2007 BIG EAST Championship and an appearance in the 2007 Meineke Car Care Bowl.

Wholley earned his master's degree in kinesiology from UConn in December of 2008.

Wholley and his wife, the former Carly Venditto, were married in July 2012.

EAST HARTFORD, Conn. - UConn redshirt senior kicker Bobby Puyol (North Palm Beach, Fla.) hit a 37-yard field goal with 11 seconds left to go to lead the Huskies to a 24-21 win over Maine before a crowd of 29,377 at Pratt & Whitney Stadium at Rentschler Field. The game was the season-opener for both teams.

The Huskies scored the final ten points of the game as they trailed 21-14 with about ten minutes left to go in the game.

Junior running back Arkeel Newsome (Ansonia, Conn.) had a two-yard TD rush with 6:36 left to play that capped a six play-54 yard drive to tie the game at 21-21. Maine then had a 12-play drive and moved the ball to the UConn 30, but senior captain Mikal Myers (Newburgh, N.Y.) blocked a Black Bear field goal attempt.

The Huskies started the game-winning drive at their own 30 and junior quarter-back Bryant Shirreffs (Jefferson, Ga.) had all five rushes for a combined 12 yards and four pass completions for 38 yards to move the ball to the Maine 20 to set up the Puyol kick.

Shirreffs finished the game with 162 yards of passing (16 of 23) and 95 rushing yards. Junior tailback Ron Johnson (Naples, Fla.) had 65 rushing yards and two touchdowns. Senior wide receiver Noel Thomas, Jr. (Norwalk, Conn.) had nine receptions for 70 yards.

Junior linebacker Vontae Diggs (Downers Grove, III.) led UConn with nine tackles, two of them for a loss.

Maine quarterback Dan Collins passed the ball for 269 yards with two TD passes.

The Black Bears took a 7-0 lead with 50 seconds left to go in the first quarter on a 20-yard pass from Collins to Josh Mack. The game was tied at seven at halftime after Johnson scored a TD with 6:55 to go in the half to finish a five-play, 57-yard drive.

Johnson's 21-yard rush for a TD gave UConn its first lead of the game - 14-7 with 3:10 to go in the third quarter.

Collins had a 40-yard TD throw to Jaleel Reed to tie the game at 14-14 with a second left to go in the third quarter and the Black Bears took a 21-14 lead with 9:56 to go on a 74-yard fumble recovery by Najee Goode.

ANNAPOLIS, Md. - A furious, late drive by the UConn football team ended on the half-yard line as time expired on Saturday afternoon as Navy survived a second-half comeback attempt by the Huskies and posted a 28-24 win before a crowd of 31,501 at Navy-Marine Corps Memorial Stadium. The loss drops UConn to 1-1 on the season and 0-1 in American Athletic Conference play while the Midshipmen are 2-0 and 1-0.

Navy went out to a 21-0 lead in the game with 5:36 to go in the second quarter and did not score again until quarterback Will Worth ran on a one-yard TD run capped a four-play, 17-yard drive with 3:08 left to play to give the Mids a 28-24 lead.

UConn went right to business in attempts for a game-winning score. Redshirt junior quarterback Bryant Shirreffs (Jefferson, Ga.) completed six passes for 59 yards and rushed for 20 more on the drive. On first-and-goal from the Navy 10, he struck sophomore Hergy Mayala (Montreal, Que.) with a nine-yard pass to put the ball at the Navy one. UConn failed to move the ball on the next play, a rush, and time expired on the game.

Shirreffs was 23 of 26 in the air for 239 yards and a TD, while he carried the ball 13 times for 33 yards. Down 21-0 late in the second quarter, Shirreffs got UConn on the board when he hit redshirt senior Noel Thomas (Norwalk, Conn.) with a 34-yard TD pass to make it 21-7.

The UConn defense forced Navy three and out to start the second half and then cut the lead to 21-14 as junior Ron Johnson (Naples, Fla.) scored on a three-yard run that finished off a 10-play, 60-yard drive. Shirreffs had a third-down 17-yard completion to Thomas on the drive and redshirt freshman Tyler Davis (Bellmore, N.Y.), playing out of the tight end spot, connected with junior tight end Alec Bloom (Ligonier) for 23 yards and a fourth-and-four to highlight the drive.

Junior cornerback Jamar Summers (Orange, N.J.) tied the game at 21-21 with 2:39 left to play in the third quarter on an 86-yard fumble recovery. The fumble recovery for a TD was the first for the Huskies since Andrew Adams returned one in 2014 vs. SMU. It was the second-longest fumble return for a TD in school history as Paul Carney had a 100-yarder vs. Massachusetts in 1930.

UConn took its only lead of the game, 24-21, on a 38-yard field goal by redshirt senior Bobby Puyol (North Palm Beach, Fla.) with 9:08 to play.

Redshirt senior linebacker Matt Walsh (Madison, Conn.) led the Huskies in tackles with 12 while redshirt senior safety Obi Melifonwu (South Grafton, Mass.) had 10.

Worth had 130 yards of passing for Navy to go with 44 rushing yards and two TDs. Dishan Romine had 76 rushing yards.

EAST HARTFORD, Conn. UConn redshirt senior kicker Bobby Puyol (North Palm Beach, Fla.) had his second game-winning field goal of the young season on Saturday as the Huskies defeated Virginia by a 13-10 score before a crowd of 31,036 at Pratt & Whitney Stadium at Rentschler Field. UConn improves its record to 2-1 on the season while the Cavaliers are 0-3.

Puyol hit a 43-yard field goal with 1:33 left in the game that broke a 10-10 tie and gave UConn its winning margin. The FG wrapped up an eight play-50 yard drive for the Huskies. In UConn's opening night win over Maine on Sept. 1, Puyol hit a 37-yarder with 11 second to give the Huskies a 24-21 win.

UConn spotted the Cavaliers a 10-0 lead as Alex Furbank hit a 23-yard field goal for the only scoring of the first quarter and Albert Reid scored on a nine-yard run with 12:42 to go in the second quarter that capped a 90-yard drive.

The rest of the scoring belonged to the Huskies as Puyol made it 10-3 Cavaliers with a 21-yard field goal with 4:43 to go in the half. After a scoreless third quarter, UConn tied the game on a one-yard TD run by redshirt junior quarterback Bryant Shirreffs (Jefferson, Ga.) to complete a 37 yard drive with 7:55 to go in the game.

That tying drive was set up by an interception from junior cornerback Jamar Summers (Orange, N.J.). that gave UConn the ball at the Cavalier 25. Summers' interception came at an opportune time as the Huskies had lost the ball on a fumble one play earlier.

Summers, a first team All-American Athletic Conference pick last year, now has ten career interceptions, which places him in a tie for ninth place in UConn career history.

After Puyol's go-ahead field goal, Virginia moved the ball to the 73 yards to the UConn two, but the Cavaliers missed a field goal that would have put the game into overtime.

Shirreffs was 13 for 24 in the air for 154 yards and also had 33 yards of rushing. Junior running back Arkeel Newsome (Ansonia, Conn.) led UConn in rushing with 77 yards while senior wide receiver Noel Thomas (Norwalk, Conn.) had six receptions for 91 yards.

Redshirt senior safety Obi Melifonwu (South Grafton, Mass.) led UConn on defense with 11 tackles and a pass break-up.

UConn - Davis 24 yd pass from Shirreffs (Puyol kick), 0:33 (9-65, 1:41) EAST HARTFORD, Conn. - UConn senior wide receiver Noel Thomas (Norwalk, Conn.) had 14 receptions for 111 yards as the Huskies fell to Syracuse on Saturday by a 31-24 score before a crowd of 31,899 at Pratt & Whitney Stadium at Rentschler Field. The Huskies fall to 2-2 on the on the season while the Orange improve to 2-2.

Thomas' 14 receptions were the second-highest in UConn single-game history and tied the mark for the most-ever against a Syracuse team. The Husky school record is 15, set by Geremy Davis in 2013.

Orange wide receiver Amba Etta-Tawo caught 12 passes for a school-record 270 yards and two touchdowns. He scored twice in the game's first five minutes on touchdown receptions of 57 and 30 yards as the Orange went out to a 14-0 lead in the game's first five minutes.

The Huskies had two sustained drives in the second quarter to tie the game at 14-14 as junior tailback Ron Johnson (Naples, Fla.) scored on a two-yard run with 6:05 to go in the half and junior Arkeel Newsome (Ansonia, Conn.) scored on a six-yard run 34 second to go. Syracuse was able to move the ball far enough to set up a 47-yard field goal by Cole Murphy as the half expired for a 17-14 SU

UConn senior kicker Bobby Puyol (North Palm Beach, Fla.) kicked a 27-yard field goal to knot the game at 17-17 with 5:11 to go.

Syracuse defensive back Cordell Hudson changed the momentum of the game with he returned an interception 22-yards for a TD to give the Orange a 24-17 edge late in the fourth quarter.

The Huskies had a chance to tie the game in the fourth quarter after holder redshirt Tyler Davis (Bellmore, N.Y.), out of the holder position, hit redshirt junior tight end Tommy Myers (Coventry, Conn.) with a 17-yard pass on a fake field goal to set the Huskies up at the Syracuse eight-yard line with seven minutes to go. Syracuse's defense held and the Orange marched the length of the field to put the game away with a six-yard TD run by quarterback Eric Dungey to make it 31-17 Syracuse with 2:14 to play.

Newsome led UConn in rushing with 81 yards while redshirt junior quarterback Bryant Shirreffs (Jefferson, Ga.) was 27 of 45 with one TD.

HOUSTON - Senior wide receiver Noel Thomas, Jr. (Norwalk, Conn.) had a career-high 135 yards receiving redshirt junior quarterback Bryant Shirreffs (Jefferson, Ga.) passed for 239 as Houston handed the Huskies a 42-14 defeat on Thursday night before a crowd of 40,873 at TDECU Stadium.

Houston, currently ranked sixth in the country, is now 5-0 on the season and 2-0 in the American Athletic Conference while the Huskies drop to 2-3 overall and 0-2

Thomas now has 129 career receptions, which is ninth in school career history, and 1,579, which is 12th.

Sophomore wide receiver Hergy Mayala (Montreal, Que.) also had six receptions for 92 yards - both career highs.

Junior Vontae Diggs (Downers Grove, III.) had a career-high 12 tackles to lead UConn while senior Obi Melinfonwu (South Grafton, Mass) had 11 for his fourstraight double-figure tackle game.

Greg Ward Jr. threw for a career-high 389 yards and accounted for five touchdowns in just more than three quarters. The victory was a bit of redemption for the Cougars, whose only loss last season came in a 20-17 defeat by the Huskies when they were 10-0.

Ward didn't start that game, and there was a moment early in the second quarter when he took a hard hit on a flea-flicker and had to leave the game. He missed just one play before returning and showed no ill effects, leading the Cougars on three more touchdown drives in the half to leave Houston up 28-7 at halftime.

Ward had touchdown runs of 30 and 10 yards and threw scoring passes of three, 15 and four yards. He was replaced by Kyle Postma with 12 minutes remaining.

The Huskies didn't commit any turnovers after being plagued by them in recent weeks.

EAST HARTFORD, Conn. - UConn junior quarterback Bryant Shirreffs (Jefferson, Ga.) passed for 224 yards and two touchdowns and rushed for another 52 to lead the UConn football team to a 20-9 win over Cincinnati on Saturday before a crowd of 24,169 at Pratt & Whitney Stadium at Rentschler Field.

The Huskies improve their record to 3-3 with the win and are 1-2 in the American Athletic Conference while the Bearcats are also 3-3 with a 0-3 league mark.

The UConn defense was impressive all day as it limited Cincinnati to just two rushing yards and a minus-20 mark over the last three quarters. The minus-two yards was the sixth-best rushing defense day in UConn school history and the best since it held Rutgers to minus-nine in 2011.

Cincinnati went out to a 9-0 lead in the game on three second-quarter field goal from Josh Pasley - of 25, 43 and 26 yards. The UConn defense was tough on the goal line as Cincinnati failed to convert two first-and-goals and a first-and-ten from the UConn 25 into touchdowns.

The Huskies got a spark at the end of the first half as Shirreffs connected with sophomore Tyraiq Beals (East Orange, N.J.) on a 59-yard touchdown pass with 28 second left to halftime for a 9-7 score at intermission.

All the scoring belonged to UConn in the second half as the Huskies took the lead on a 26-yard TD pass from Shirreffs to senior wide receiver Noel Thomas (Norwalk, Conn.) that capped a 13 play-88 yard drive to make it 14-9 Huskies with 6:29 to play in the third quarter.

Thomas led UConn in receiving with nine receptions for 108 yards - his third-straight 100-yard receiving game and his fourth of the season and fifth of his career.

Senior kicker Bobby Puyol (North Palm Beach, Fla.) rounded out the scoring with a 30-yard field goal with 41 seconds to go in the third quarter and a 23-yard with 3:08 to play. Both field goals came after time consuming drives - the first was 3:13 and covered 76 yards while the final one took 16 plays, 74 yards in 6:49.

That first FG drive featured a 67-yard rush from the UConn 11-yard line by junior running back Akreel Newsome (Ansonia, Conn.), who finished the day with 14 carries to lead all rushers with 116 yards. It was the third 100-yard rushing game of Newsome's career.

Cincinnati QB Hayden Moore, coming back from an ankle injury, threw for 315 yards, but was intercepted twice.

UConn's last win over Cincinnati came in November 2010, the season the Huskies ended up in

TAMPA - USF quarterback Quinton Flowers passed for two touchdowns and ran for three more as the Bulls had 316 yards rushing and defeated the UConn football team by a 42-27 score on Saturday night before a crowd of 30,297 at Raymond James Stadium.

USF improves to 6-3 on the season and 3-0 in the American Athletic Conference while the Huskies are 3-4 overall and 1-3 in the league.

The Huskies trailed 14-3 at the half, but scored two touchdowns in the first 2:22 of the second half to take a 17-14 lead. Both TDs came off of turnover forced by the Husky defense.

The first TD came on a 70-yard pass from redshirt junior quarterback Bryant Shirreffs (Jefferson, Ga.) to junior running back Arkeel Newsome (Ansonia, Conn.). The 70-yard completion was the longest of Shirreffs' career. That TD was setup by an interception from senior redshirt safety Obi Melifonwu (South Grafton, Mass.).

UConn took the lead on a four-yard TD run by Newsome that was setup by a USF fumble at its own 26 that was forced by redshirt junior linebacker E.J. Levenberry (Woodbridge, Va.) and recovered by Melifonwu. USF took the lead for good on an eight-yard TD run by Flowers with 5:30 to go in the third quarter. Newsome led UConn in rushing with 72 yards while Shirreffs was 22 of 39 for 306 yards and two touchdowns. Senior Noel Thomas (Norwalk, Conn.) had 12 receptions.

Flowers was 22 of 37 in the air with two interceptions and rushed for 160 yards. Running back Marlon Mack added 107 yards of rushing and one TD.

EAST HARTFORD, Conn. -- UCF quarterback McKenzie Milton threw for a season-high 317 yards and three touchdowns to lead Knights to a 24-16 win over the UConn football team before a crowd of 28,008 (tickets distributed) at Pratt & Whitney Stadium at Rentschler Field on Saturday. UConn falls to 3-5 on the season and 1-4 in the American Athletic Conference while UCF is 4-3 overall and 2-1 in the league.

Milton completed 29 of 45 passes and the Knights moved over the .500 mark by scoring 17 unanswered points and holding the Huskies scoreless in the second half.

UConn junior tailback Arkeel Newsome (Ansonia, Conn.) ran 21 times for 101 yards and senior wide receiver Noel Thomas (Norwalk, Conn.) had his fifth straight 100-yard receiving game for UConn, catching nine passes for 165 yards.

UConn senior kicker Bobby Puyol (North Palm Beach, Fla.) gave the Huskies a 6-0 lead with field goals of 22 and 33-yards in the first quarter. The Huskies made it 13-0 on a three-yard TD run by Newsome with 9:41 left in the second quarter that capped a seven play-60 yard drive.

After UCF got on the board with a 22-yard pass from Milton to Dredrick Snelson that made it 13-7, Puyol connected on a 35-yard to make it 16-7 Huskies with 1:25 left in the half. UCF cut the halftime margin to two with a 19 yard TD pass from Milton to Jordan Atkins with a second left.

The only scoring in the second half was done by UCF with a 39-yard TD pass from Milton to Adrian Killins early in the second half and a 50-yard field goal by Matthew Wright 45 seconds into the fourth quarter. UConn moved the ball to the UCF 10 late in the game but could not get any closer.

UConn redshirt junior quarterback Bryant Shirreffs (Jefferson, Ga.) was 18 of 34 in the air for 242 yards. Redshirt junior cornerback Jhavon Williams (Delray Beach, Fla.) led UConn in tackles with nine.

GREENVILLE, N.C. - The East Carolina football team defeated UConn by a score of 41-3 on Saturday afternoon before a crowd of 41,370 at Dowdy-Finken Stadium. UConn falls to 3-6 on the season and 1-5 in the American Athletic Conference while the Pirates are 3-5 and 1-3.

UConn senior wide receiver Noel Thomas (Norwalk, Conn.) had seven receptions for 135 yards to lead the Huskies. He now has 83 receptions this season, which is second-highest in UConn single-season history as Mark Didio holds the record with 88 in 1991.

Thomas also has 166 career receptions, which is fifth in school history. Thomas now has 100-yard receiving games in six-straight games, seven this season and eight in his career.

UConn's only point in the game came on a 34-yard field goal by senior Bobby Puyol (North Palm Beach, Fla.) with 3:14 left in the half that made it 7-3 ECU. The Pirates, who scored a TD on their first possession of the game, made it a 14-3 halftime lead when the scored on a two-yard pass.

ECU wide receiver Zay Jones moved into secnd place on the all-time NCAA reception list with 19 catches for 185 yards and a touchdown. The 19 catches were the most ever by a UConn opponent in a game. Jones now has 355 career catches, six more than former Oklahoma receiver Ryan Broyles, trailing only the 387 catches tallied by his former East Carolina teammate Justin Hardy.

East Carolina QB Philip Nelson threw for 253 yards and two scores for the Pirates, who snapped a five-game losing streak. UConn redshirt junior quarterback Bryant Shirreffs (Jefferson, Ga.) was 16 of 30 for 180 yards.

EAST HAFTORD, Conn. -- UConn freshman quarterback Donovan Williams (Dumfries, Va.), playing in his first collegiate game, completed 12 of 21 passes for 69 yards and ran for 66 as Temple defeated the Huskies by a 21-0 score on Friday night before a crowd of 22,316 at Pratt & Whitney Stadium at Rentschler Field

The loss drops UConn to 3-7 on the season and 1-6 in American Athletic Conference play while the Owls are 7-3 overall and 5-1 in the league.

Temple quarterback Philip Walker threw for 215 yards and three touchdowns while running back Jahad Thomas caught two of those touchdowns and had 73 receiving yards to go with 83 yards rushing. The Owls other running back, Ryquell Armstead, ran 20 times for 133 yards and Temple put up 431 yards of offense.

Walker completed his first eight passes and Temple scored all of the game's points on its first three drives. The senior hit Thomas on scoring strikes of 23 and . 10-yards and found Romond Deloatch from 18-yards out.

After giving up touchdowns on the first three drives, the Huskies shutout the Owls on its next eight, which included two interceptions and a fumble return.

His ninth pass was intercepted in the end zone by UConn redshirt senior safety Obi Melifonwu (South Grafton, Mass.), who picked off another in the end zone in the fourth quarter to end a 13-play, 87-yard Temple drive. Melifonwu now has four interceptions on the season and eight in his career.

Temple limited the Huskies to 160 yards of total offense. Williams had a 43-yard first-quarter run set up UConn's best scoring chance, but Temple's Michael

Dogbe blocked a 35-yard field goal attempt.

CHESTNUT HILL, Mass. - Senior wide receiver Noel Thomas (Norwalk, Conn.) had four receptions on Saturday to give him 91 for the season and set a UConn single-season record in the process as the Huskies dropped a 30-0 decision to Boston College. The game was played before 36,220 at Alumni Stadium in the first game between the two schools, separated by only 90 miles, since 2004. UConn drops to 3-8 on the season while the Eagles are 5-6.

Thomas broke the UConn record of Mark Didio, who had 88 receptions in 1991.

BC quarterback Patrick Towles passed for 183 yards and a touchdown in the game as running back Davon Jones added a rushing score. Eagles' linebacker Matt Milano added a 19-yard interception return for a touchdown in the fourth quarter.

UConn freshman quarterback Donovan Williams (Dumfries, Va.) started his second career game and was 13 for 29 in the air for 127 yards.

Senior wide receiver Brian Lemelle (Harrisburg, Pa.) had a personal season-long 43-yard reception for UConn.

Husky senior safety Obi Melifonwu (South Grafton, Mass.) led UConn in tackles with 11 while redshirt junior defensive lineman Cole Ormsby (Windsor, Conn.) had two tackles for a loss.

EAST HARTFORD, Conn. - Junior running back Arkeel Newsome (Ansonia, Conn.) rushed for 166 yards and one touchdowns and also had a receiving touchdown as the UConn football team concluded its season on Saturday with a 38-13 loss at Pratt & Whitney Stadium at Rentschler Field before a crowd of 20,764. UConn ends the 2016 season with an overall mark of 3-9 and 1-7 in the American Athletic Conference while Tulane wraps up at 4-8 and 1-7.

UConn redshirt senior safety Obi Melifonwu (South Grafton, Mass.) had 24 tackles in the game, which tied a school single-game record with Troy Ashley vs. UMass in 1989, John Dorsey vs. Rhode Island in 1981 and Jeff Thomas vs. UMass in 1980.

Husky senior wide receiver Noel Thomas, Jr. (Norwalk, Conn.) had four receptions for 29 yards and ends his year with 100 receptions, a school record, for 1,179 yards - which is second. He finished his career with 178 career receptions, fourth in school history, with 2,204 yards, which is eighth.

UConn freshman quarterback Donovan Williams (Dumfries, Va.), making his third-career start, was 11 of 26 in the air for 104 yards with his first career TD pass.

Tulane running backs Lazedrick Thompson and Josh Rounds combined for five touchdowns in the win as the Green Wave snapped a six-game losing streak. Tulane scored the game's first 24 points to break a 14-game conference losing streak. Thompson finished with 108 yards on 23 carries and three touchdowns, including a 45-yard jaunt in the fourth quarter to complete the scoring. Rounds had 78 yards rushing on 16 carries and two touchdowns.

Larry Bryant blocked a UConn punt on the fifth play of the game, setting his team up at the 23-yard line for its first possession. UConn forced the Green Wave to settle for a 23-yard field goal for a 3-0 lead. After quickly forcing another UConn punt, a 32-yard pass from Glen Cuiellette to tight end Kendall Ardoin set the Green Wave up with a first-and-goal. Rounds scored on a one-yard plunge two plays later to make it 10-0.







1896

The history of intercollegiate football at the University of Connecticut begins with the formation of the Athletic League of New England State Colleges. Connecticut, Massachusetts and Rhode Island join for the purpose of scheduling regular meetings in football and baseball. Connecticut is known as Storrs Agricultural College.

1897

A year of firsts, all in one game; first game against Rhode Island, first game against a collegiate opponent and first game in the newly formed conference. S.A.C. wins 22-8.

1899

Storrs Agricultural College changes its name to Connecticut Agricultural College.

1901

The 1901 squad finished 8-2 and registered six shutouts on the season, including five straight in one stretch. Rhode Island was the only intercollegiate opponent on the schedule and was one of the shutout victims, falling to the "Aggies" of Connecticut Agricultural College by a count of 27-0.

1919

Gardner Dow, a native of New Haven, dies on September 20, 1919, after making a spectacular flying tackle in a game at New Hampshire. Dow suffered a concussion of the brain. The athletic fields behind Hawley Armory were named

after him and served as the site of home games for football, baseball, soccer, lacrosse and track meets.



1923

Connecticut enters the New England Conference, which includes all New England state schools except for the University of Vermont.

1924

This squad is down in the annals as one of the school's finest, finishing 6-0-2 and winning the New England Conference Championship. The Aggies are said by the New York Times to be among the best teams in the country and the team defense finishes first in the nation. The team gave up only 13 points all season and only three in the final seven games.

Senior team captain Martin "Red" O'Neill is the school's first All-America candidate, leading the 1923 and 1924 teams. As legend has it, his career started in 1922 during a loss to Springfield College. A Connecticut Agricultural College (now UConn) player was injured and the coaches could find no one to replace him among

the reserves. Someone spotted O'Neill watching the game from the stands and called to him to join in the game. He threw on a uniform and stepped into the line-up, where he would remain for three seasons.

1934

First season for head coach J.O. Christian. The school receives big press coverage at the end of the 1-7 campaign for stealing the Rhody Ram mascot before the game with Rhode Island (pictured above).

1935

First football team to come in early for preseason camp at the expense of the school.

1939

First season as the University of Connecticut; team defeats Coast Guard, 14-0, in the first game ever played under flood lights at Gardner Dow Field.



1942, 1944-1945

During the war years, head coach J.O. Christian and the Huskies put together a three-year stretch like none other in school history. In that three-season span (with no football being played in 1943), Connecticut won 20 of 24 contests. The Huskies registered separate winning streaks of six, eight and five games and shutout their opponents in 13 of the 20 wins.

1945

UConn tailback Walt Trojanowski shares the NCAA scoring title with Doc Blanchard of Army. Both men scored 132 points on the season.

1947

UConn becomes a charter member of the Yankee Conference.

1953

Memorial Stadium opens with a 26-6 Connecticut win over St. Lawrence on October 10, 1953. The 1953 season also marked the first appearance at a football game for the marching band.

1956-1960

UConn captures five straight Yankee Conference Championships, a leaguerecord for consecutive titles won or shared. During that span, the Huskies compile a 17-1-2 record in Yankee Conference play and go 18 league contests before their lone loss in the stretch, to New Hampshire.

1965

UConn beats Yale for the first time ever (pictured above), on September 25, 1965, 13-6. UConn becomes the first school from within the state of Connecticut to ever beat Yale.

1969

UConn joins the NCAA in celebrating the 100th anniversary of college football by selecting an 11-member All-Time UConn team. More than 130 UConn football players receive votes in the balloting of fans, alumni and former players.

1967-73

Connecticut captures four Yankee Conference championships in a sevenseason span, going 27-6-3 in league play during that stretch.

1983

Linebackers John Dorsey and Vernon Hargreaves become the first teammates in UConn football history to earn All-America honors in the same season. The duo combined for more than 300 tackles and helped UConn to a share of the Yankee Conference Championship.

1989

UConn plays the first night game in the history of Memorial Stadium on September 23, 1989, and defeats New Hampshire, 20-10.

1990

Matt DeGennaro finishes his Husky career as the leading passer in the history of the Yankee Conference, totaling 9,288 yards and 73 touchdowns.

199

UConn matches the most successful start in school history by winning its first six games of the year. Senior captain Wilbur Gilliard becomes the all-time leading rusher in school history. Gilliard finishes his career with 2,624 rushing yards. The 1995 team finishes 8-3 and ties the school record for wins in a season. The squad finished the year ranked No. 23 in the national I-AA top 25.

1998

UConn football celebrates its 100th season with a school-record 10 wins and advances to the NCAA I-AA football playoffs for the first time. UConn defeats Hampton, 42-34, in its first playoff game and advances to the NCAA Quarterfinals. The Huskies finish the season ranked No. 7 in the national I-AA rankings. Senior quarterback Shane Stafford is the only active player named to the UConn Football 100th Anniversary All-Time Team and finishes his career in the top two of every quarterbacking category in school history.

1999

Randy Edsall becomes UConn's 27th head coach and leads the Huskies through their final season in Division I-AA. UConn finishes 4-7, but wins its first ever game against a Division I-A opponent, beating Buffalo 23-0 on September 16.

2000

UConn begins play as a Division I-A Independent. The team earns two wins over Division I-A opponents and sets a single-season record for average home attendance (14,166), playing before the three largest crowds in school history (all advance sellouts) in their first three home games.

2001

UConn earned its first-ever victory over a BIG EAST opponent as Marc Hickok nailed a career-long 47-yard field goal with 3:04 remaining in the game to lift the Huskies to a 20-19 win over Rutgers.

2002

UConn has a breakthrough season, posting a 6-6 record, including a win at Big 12 member lowa State, which would advance to a bowl game. For the first time, the NCAA included UConn in the Division I-A statistics and the Huskies placed in the national top five in passing defense and ranked 19th in total defense. Terry Caulley was the nation's leading freshman rusher with 1,247 yards on the year. The Huskies closed a 50-year run at Memorial Stadium with a 63-21 win over Kent State in which Caulley tied an NCAA record by scoring four touchdowns in one quarter.

2003

UConn made its debut at Rentschler Field, playing to 93% capacity (37,059). The large home crowds helped push the Huskies to a 9-3 record, including a 34-10 win over Big Ten member Indiana on opening day.

2004

UConn made its debut as a member of the BIG EAST Conference in style as the Huskies finished one game back of the leaders and earned a berth in the Motor City Bowl. The Huskies led the conference in both total offense and total defense while Cornell Brockington led the BIG EAST with 1,218 rushing yards. The season ended with a win over Toledo in the Motor City Bowl as quarterback Dan Orlovsky was named MVP.

2007

UConn captured its first-ever BIG EAST Championship and appeared in the Meineke Car Care Bowl, selling out its allotment of 12,500 tickets for the game in Charlotte, N.C. During the season, UConn earned its first-ever national rankings, peaking at No. 16 in the AP Poll and No. 13 in the BCS.

2008

UConn advanced to a bowl in consecutive seasons for the first time in school history and defeated Buffalo in the 2009 International Bowl in Toronto. Running back Donald Brown led the country in rushing with 2,083 yards and became UConn's first All-American since the program moved to the FBS. Brown was also named the BIG EAST Offensive Player of the Year – UConn's first-ever BIG EAST individual award winner. Following the season, the Huskies had four players taken in the first two rounds of the NFL Draft.

2009

Connecticut advances to a bowl game for the third-straight season and posts a 20-7 win over South Carolina. The Huskies endured an emotional season with the death of teammate Jasper Howard on Oct. 19, but came back to win its final four games, including a 33-30 double overtime win at Notre Dame.

2010

UConn appears in a Bowl Championship series game for the first time as it plays Oklahoma in the Tostitos Fiesta Bowl. The Huskies won five consecutive games to close the regular season and claim the BIG EAST Championship and a trip to the BCS. Running back Jordan Todman was unanimously named the BIG EAST Offensive Player of the Year and was an All-American pick. Todman was also the second-leading rusher in the country. Nick Williams led the country in kickoff return average.

2012

Following the 2012 season, a record five Huskies are selected in the 2013 NFL Draft. Dwayne Gratz, Sio Moore and Blidi Wreh-Wilson are all taken in the third round while Trevardo Williams goes in the fourth and Ryan Griffin in the sixth.

2013

An all-time record crowd of 42,704 pack Rentschler Field as the Huskies took on Michigan on Sept. 21. Following the season, former Notre Dame defensive coordinator Bob Diaco was named the head coach of the Huskies.

2015

Diaco led UConn to an appearance in the St. Petersburg Bowl against Marshall in just his second year as Husky coach. The Huskies posted a 20-17 win over No. 13 Houston on November 21 at Pratt & Whitney Stadium at Rentschler Field.

an Orlovsky earned Most Valuable Player honors after going 20 of 41 in the air for 239 yards and two touchdowns as UConn defeated MAC Champion Toledo by a 39-10 score in the 2004 Motor City Bowl, UConn's first ever bowl appearance.

In addition to Orlovsky's honor, Tyler King was named the United Auto Workers Lineman of the Game.

The Huskies were led in rushing by Cornell Brockington, who had 15 carries for 72 yards. The leading receiver on the day for UConn was Keron Henry with nine catches for 239 yards.

UConn got out of the gates early, and set a Motor City Bowl record, by scoring 17 points in the first quarter while shutting the Rockets out. The Huskies took the opening drive 41 yards on eight plays to set up a 35-yard field goal by Matt Nuzie. Nuzie went

on to kick three more field goals, for a total of four, to set a new Motor City Bowl record and tie a UConn single-

The Huskies scored the first touchdown of the contest as Orlovsky, after eluding a blitzing Rocket, hit Jason Williams in the corner of the end zone for a dazzling 32-yard TD pass on a fourth and six play.

The final points of the first quarter came as Larry Taylor returned a punt 68 yards for a score.




Toledo scored its first points of the game as it grinded out a 13-play, 63-yard drive that ended with a one-yard touchdown run by quarterback Bruce Gradowski.

The Huskies scored 13 more points in the second guarter to take a 30-7 lead at the half. Orlovsky threw a seven-yard TD pass to Brian Sparks, whose sliding catch with 7:42 left in the half capped an eight-play, 41-yard drive. That touchdown was set up by a 54-yard kickoff return by Taylor.

Nuzie kicked a pair of field goals in the final 1:24 of the half - a 37-yarder and a 25-yarder on the final play of the half.

The teams traded a pair of field goals for the only scoring of the third quarter as Jason Robbins hit a 27-yard field goal for Toledo 3:13 into the half while Nuzie hit a 36-yarder with 1:53 left to play in

The only scoring of the fourth quarter came with 25 seconds remaining as sophomore Matt Lawrence scored a touchdown on an 11-yard run.

Wake Forest quarterback Riley Skinner was 29-of-38 in the air for 268 yards and a touchdown to lead the Demon Deacons to a 24-10 victory over UConn in the 2007 Meineke Car Care Bowl before a crowd of 53,126 at Bank of America Stadium.

The two halves were mirror images of each other as UConn shutout Wake Forest in the first half and the Demon Deacons held the Huskies scoreless in the second.

The contest was the second bowl game in the last four years for UConn – who has been playing as a member of the BIG EAST for only four years. The Huskies defeated Toledo in the 2004 Motor City Bowl. This year, UConn sold its

entire allotment of 12,500 tickets for

the bowl game in Charlotte – the second BIG EAST school to ever do that.

UConn led 10-0 at the half, but Wake Forest scored two third quarter touchdowns to take a 14-10 lead after three quarters.

Wake Forest took the opening possession of the second half and marched for a touchdown on a six-play, 66-yard drive. Josh Adams scored the touchdown on a 38-yard run 2:16 into the half.

The Demon Deacons took the lead for good on a 20-yard touchdown pass from Skinner to John Tereshinski on a third-and-14 play. Wake Forest made it 17-10 on a 43-yard field goal 3:07 into the final quarter by Sam Swank. The Demon Deacons sealed the win with a TD run by Micah Andrews in the final minute.

UConn was severely limited in the second half on offense as the Huskies had just 73 total yards of offense while the Deacons had 275.

UConn's Tyler Lorenzen was 13-of-26 in the air for 98 yards. Donald Brown led UConn in rushing with 13 carries for 72 yards. Brad Kanuch was the leading Husky receiver with three receptions for 36 yards.

Wake Forest senior wide receiver Kenny Moore was named the game's MVP as he made 11 receptions for 112 yards.

UConn scored all 10 of its points in the first half. Larry Taylor scored the only touchdown of the first half when he returned a punt 68 yards for a touchdown with 2:38 left in the first quarter. Ironically, Taylor had a 68-yard punt return for a TD in UConn's only other bowl game – a win over Toledo in the 2004 Motor City Bowl – which came with 2:31 left in the first quarter down the near (UConn) sideline running to the camera's right.

The only other first half points came with 5:00 left in the second quarter as Tony Ciaravino connected on a 29-yard field goal that finished an eight-play, 80-yard drive. That drive was highlighted by a 58-yard run by Brown on the first play of the drive.







n a defensively-minded game, the University of Connecticut footb<mark>all</mark> team nearly shutout South Carolina in the Papajohns.com Bowl to earn the school's first win over a Southeastern Conference opponent. The game was played in front of a crowd of 45,254 at Legion Field, a Papajohns.com Bowl record attendance. UConn finished with the 20-7 victory earning their second-straight and third overall bowl victory.

The Huskies shut out South Carolina in the first three quarters of the game and have shut out their bowl opponents in nine of 16 quarters played.

With his 126 yards on the day, senior tailback and Fred Sington Most Vaulable Player Andre Dixon reached the 1,000-yard mark for the season becoming the 12th running back in UConn history to reach the mark and joining teammate Jordan Todman, who accomplished the feat earlier in the season. Todman finished the day with 36 yards.




Junior quarterback Zach Frazer was nine of 21 in the air for 106 yards and connected with sophomore Kashif Moore two times for 40 vards and a touchdown.

Stephen Garcia led South Carolina by passing for 129 yards on a 16 for 38 effort also rushing for 56 yards on the day. Alshon Jeffery grabbed three passes for 28 yards for the Gamecocks.

The Huskies were the first to get on the board after an unbelievable one-handed 37-yard grab by Moore, who tiptoed along the sidelines and extended into the endzone to put the Huskies up with 6:31 remaining in the first quarter.

South Carolina decided to attempt a fourth and short at its own 32-yard line but senior Lindsey Witten stepped up and



Teggart boosted the lead to 13-0 in the second quarter with 8:26 remaining in the game connecting on his second field goal of the game, a 44-yard boot, setting a new Papajohns.com Bowl record. Later in the quarter, South Carolina earned their first first down of the game with 7:37 left in the half. They only managed four first downs in the entire first half for a net of 84 yards.

After SC fumbled at their own 35-yard line, Dixon used the opportunity to record his first touchdown of the day, a 10-yard run to boost the Huskies lead to 20 with 13:12 remaining in the fourth quarter. Dixon's TD capped a 3:53 minute, nine play 35-vard drive.

The Gamecocks got on the board with 3:24 remaining in the game capitalizing on a blocked punt and scoring on a two-play 40-yard drive. Alex Molina recovered an onside kick for the Huskies as UConn ran out the clock

he University of Connecticut played in its first-ever Bowl Championship Game and dropped a 48-20 decision to seventh-ranked Oklahoma in the 2011 Tostitos Fiesta Bowl before a crowd of 67,232 at the University of Phoenix Stadium.

UConn junior tailback Jordan Todman carried the ball 32 times for 121 yards and Husky senior quarterback Zach Frazer was 19 of 39 in the air for 223 yards.

Oklahoma sophomore quarterback Landry Jones was 34 of 49 in the air for 429 yards while senior DeMarco Murray rushed 25 times for 93 yards.

Oklahoma scored touchdowns on both of its first quarter possessions. After UConn began the game with a three-and-out, the Sooners marched 70 yards on nine plays for an eight-yard TD pass from Jones to junior James Hanna. The scoring play came on the only third down play the Sooners had on the drive.

UConn moved 55 yards on its next possession, but failed on a fourth-and-one play that gave the Sooners the ball at their own 19. The Sooners then moved the ball 81 yards on nine plays and scored on a three-yard rush by Murray. Oklahoma gained 63 yards on five first down plays during the drive.

The Huskies broke into the scoring column when redshirt sophomore Dwayne Gratz picked off a Jones pass and returned it 46 yards for a touchdown. The interception return for a TD was the fifth of the year for the Huskies tying a school record from 2007.

Oklahoma came right back and moved the ball from its own 20 to the Husky 20, but UConn's defense held strong and limited OU to a 41-yard field goal to make it 17-7 with 9:57 to go.



The teams then traded field goals the rest of the first half as junior kicker Dave Teggart hit a 37-yard field goal with 26 seconds left in the first half to make it 20-10 at the break.

The Sooners exploded for two quick TDs to start the second half as they took their second possession of the half a quick four plays in 80 yards as Jones hit senior Cameron Kenny on a 59-yard touchdown pass.

Oklahoma then made it 34-10 as Frazer threw an interception picked off by junior Jamell Fleming.

UConn junior Robbie Frey kept the pesky Huskies going as he returned the ensuing kickoff 95 yards for a score to cut the lead to 34-17. Junior kicker Dave Teggart hit on a 38-yard field goal with 5:04 left in the third to make it 34-20. The field goal marked the tenth-straight for Teggart, as he ended the season making 15 of his past 16 attempts.

Junior Ryan Broyles gave the Sooners a 41-20 lead when he had a five-yard reception for an Oklahoma touchdown with 7:49 left in the game. Broyles' score was followed up at the 2:40 mark when freshman Tony Jefferson had a 22-yard interception return for another Sooner touchdown, putting the final score at

arshall quarterback Chase Litton went 23 for 34 for 218 yards and one touchdown as the Thundering Herd defeated the UConn football team by a 16-10 score in the 2015 St. Petersburg Bowl at Tropicana Field.

The Huskies, who were back in bowl play for the first time since the 2010 season, finish the year at 6-7 while Marshall was 10-3.

The Huskies played stingy defense as Marshall was limited to three field goals following a first quarter TD. Nick Smith had three FGs for Marshall, including a 32-yarder with 1:44 to play that was part of a 13-play, 80-yard march that lasted 6:35.

UConn redshirt quarterback Bryant Shirreffs completed 10 of 17 passes for 86 yards and gained 75 yards on 19 carries for UConn.

The Huskies stopped Marshall on fourth-and-two at the UConn 17 on the initial drive of the second half after the Thundering Herd opted to skip a field goal try. The Thundering Herd also failed to increase a 13-7 lead on their next possession when Smith missed a 43-yard field goal attempt with less than three minutes left in the third.

The Huskies got within 13-10 on a 52-yard field goal by redshirt junior Bobby Puyol with two seconds left in the third. The 52-yarder was tied as the sixth-longest in school history and tied as the third-longest in UConn's FBS history. It was also a career-long for Puyol and the longest in UConn bowl and St. Petersburg Bowl history. Puyol was named UConn's Game MVP by the bowl.

Marshall took a 7-0 lead seven minutes into the game when Litton threw a 16-yard TD pass to Ryan Yurachek. Deandre Reaves' 26-yard punt return set up Marshall at the UConn 20. Reaves also had nine recep-


tions for 88 yards.

UConn tied it at 7-7- late in the first on an eight-yard run by sophomore tailback Ron Johnson that completed a 13-play, 75-yard drive.

Marshall responded with a 13-play, 65-yard drive that concluded with Smith's 21-yard field goal that gave the Thundering Herd a 10-7 advantage eight minutes before halftime. Smith made it 13-7 with a 29-yard field goal on the final play of the first half that finished off a 15-play, 85-yard drive.

UConn sophomore cornerback Jamar Summers got his eighth interception of the season, including six in the last five games, early in the fourth quarter. Summers' eight interceptions is tied for second in UConn single-season history and first in the Husky FRS era

Husky sophomore tailback Arkeel Newsome had five receptions for 33 yards for the Huskies. Senior safety Andrew Adams led the UConn defense with 14 tackles.



UCONN'S SUPER BOWL HISTORY

ormer UConn cornerback Robert McClain played in Super Bowl 50 for the Carolina Panthers in February 2016. He started all three of Carolina's postseason games at cornerback and had 18 tackles in those games.

McClain led the Panthers with five solo tackles on and had six total tackles in the NFC Championship game vs. Arizona. He had four tackles in the Super Bowl vs. Denver.

The 2015 season was McClain's sixth in the NFL. He played for Carolina in 2010 before returning to the team in December 2015. McClain played in 46 games for UConn from 2006-09 and had 129 career tackles and ten interceptions. He was a second team All-Big East pick as a senior.


UCONN'S OTHER SUPER BOWL HISTORY INCLUDES:

• Blidi Wreh-Wilson and Nick Williams were on the Atlanta Falcons for Super Bowl LI against the Patriots.

Former Husky All-American running back Donald Brown became the third UConn alumnus to play in the Super Bowl XLIV in February of 2010 when the rookie helped the Indianapolis Colts win the AFC championship.

 In addition, former Husky quarterback Tyler Lorenzen was on the practice squad for the Super Bowl champion New Orleans Saints that year.

 Kozlowski was the starting fullback for the AFC Champions.
- Nick Giaquinto, who played at UConn from 1975-76, participated in two Super Bowls with the Washington Redskins. He played in Super Bowl XVII in 1982 which the Redskins won and Super Bowl XVIII.
- In Super Bowl XLVI in February of 2012, Donald Thomas was on the New England Patriots active roster but did not dress for the game and Williams Beatty was on the New York Giants roster but was not active because of an injury.

UConn center Alex Mateas, a native of Ottawa, was selected as the top overall pick in the 2015 CFL

Draft by the Ottawa REDBLACKS. In his rookie year of 2015, he and his Ottawa teammates advanced to the Grey Cup championship game. Their team then won the 2016 Grey Cup over Calgary, 39-33.


Former Husky tight end Martin Bedard has won Grey Cup Championships with the Montreal Alouettes in 2009 and '11 and also played in the 2012 Grey Cup final. He played his seventh year with the team in 2015.

Two former Huskies – Jordan Younger and Danny Desriveaux – played for the 2012 Grey Cup Champion Toronto Argonauts. Younger had a nine-year CFL career and is now an assistant coach for Toronto.

Larry Taylor was a seven-year veteran of the league with Montreal and Calgary. He was with Montreal from 2008-10 and won a pair of Grey Cup titles. He was the 2009 CFL Special Teams Player of the Year. As a rookie in 2008, he returned two punts for a touchdown in the East Division final games vs. Edmonton.
