



# BRIAN PATTERSON SPORTS PERFORMANCE CENTER



An exciting new chapter in the storied history of Rice Stadium and Rice Athletics debuts this fall when the Owls move into their sparkling new end zone facility, the Brian Patterson Sports Performance Center.

The fully-funded \$33 million project includes a 60,000-square-foot, two-story structure that houses a weight room, a home team locker room, coaching and staff offices, an auditorium, a football team lounge and areas for training and sports medicine that include hydrotherapy, plunge pools and exam rooms. The weight room and sports medicine areas will be available to student-athletes from all sports at Rice.

The new building features a glass wall on the side facing the football field that offers a view of the weight rooms on the ground and second floors. The other three sides will be made of brick that complements the color of the brick on the rest of the stadium. White columns supporting the roof will be similar to the columns in other parts of the stadium. A concrete ramp will provide access to the football field.

Fans will also benefit from the dramatic upgrade in facilities with the installation of a new Daktronics video system

Rice Stadium will also feature two acoustically transparent video displays in front of the venue's speaker systems. These free-form LED stick applications will measure 29 feet high by 10 feet wide to provide additional video and graphics capabilities in a space typically used for fixed signage. These displays will provide flexibility to show multiple sponsorship messages throughout an event or additional graphics to pump up the crowd at key moments during the game. Rice is the second school in the country to implement the new technology and this installation is the largest of its kind.

Rice alumnus and three-year football letterman Brian Patterson provided the naming gift for the facility.

Patterson joined the Rice football program from Fort Worth Paschal High School in 1980 and graduated in 1984. He twice led the Owls in interceptions, and his nine career interceptions are tied for seventh best in school history. In 1983 he was named to the Academic All-America Division I football team by the College Sports Information Directors of America.

The architect for the project was HKS, which built the AT&T Stadium in Arlington, Texas, and the Lucas Oil Stadium in Indianapolis. Anslow Bryant has served as the general contractor.

## DAVID BAILIFF HEAD COACH 11TH SEASON

As he enters his second decade helm of the Rice Owls, David Bailiff continues to deliver an unparalleled standard of success on the field and in the classroom.

Bailiff is just the fourth head coach to lead the Owls for more than a decade, joining Jess Neely (27 years), Ken Hatfield (12 years) and Phillip Arbuckle (11 years) and his 56 career wins on South Main rank second to Neely in school history. He has led the Owls to two of the three 10-win seasons in school history and has won eight or more games three times, matching Jess Neely for the most at Rice while his three bowl victories also match Neely's mark during his Hall of Fame career.

In 10 seasons on South Main, Bailiff has built a program that has become one of the most consistent in Conference USA. Under his watch, the Owls have earned four bowl berths and won three bowl championships and have produced the most wins in school history over a two (18), three (25) and four (30) year periods. Rice's 18-9 mark from 2013-14 was the second best of any FBS program in Texas.

Bailiff has twice been honored by his peers as C-USA Coach of the Year (2008 & 2013) and after leading the Owls to their first outright conference championship in 56 years in 2013, he joined Art Briles (Baylor),

Mark Dantonio (Michigan State), Gus Malzahn (Auburn) and David Shaw (Stanford) as Bear Bryant Coach of the Year award finalists. He was also honored by the San Antonio Express News as its Co-Sportsman of the Year.

While reaching new heights on the field, Bailiff's teams continue to excel in the classroom while also making a profound impact on the Houston community. Last year, football contributed 59 of the 255 Rice student-athletes to earn a spot on the C-USA Commissioner's Honor Roll. Twice in his tenure, the Owls were honored by the American Football Coaches Association with its Academic Achievement Award, having posted a 100 percent graduation rate. Rice has led Conference USA football teams in GPA in seven of his 10 seasons and has dominated Texas on the conference in the NCAA's annual graduation rate studies.

Four of his players (David Berken, Travis Bradshaw, Gabe Baker and Darik Dillard) have been honored with the Bob Quin Award as Rice's top male student-athlete.

He was honored with the Greater Houston Football Coaches Association's John Kelley Distinguished Service Award and by the Conference USA Student-Athlete Advisory Committee (SAAC) Coaches Choice Award winner for 2011-12. He was also cited by the Houston Press as "Houston's Best Sports Role Model" in its 2013 Best of Houston edition.

Bailiff's staff has made the state of Texas a priority in recruiting, solidifying relationships with high school coaches throughout the state and the result has shown itself both in the team success and in the number of players reaching the NFL as well as in his successful efforts to bring the Texas High School Coaches Association Convention to Houston in 2015. The Owls have had eight players taken in the NFL Draft during Bailiff's tenure, matching the output of the previous 23 years prior to his arrival. A

total of six players from his first six recruiting classes have been selected. A record nine Owls recruited by Bailiff saw action in the NFL in 2015 and a 10th, Jordan Taylor, was on the practice squad with Denver and became the second Bailiff recruit in the last four years to win a Super Bowl ring (Luke Willson, Seattle, 2014). Nine Owls were active in 2016.

He has also made good on his promise to keep the Owls active in community work, as the Owls have been tireless in their efforts with local schools as well as reaching out to Rice's diverse student population through an annual International Students' Clinic each August. In July of 2009, Bailiff accepted an invitation to join with four other college football coaches on a goodwill tour to visit military personnel stationed in Afghanistan and again honored our troops in 2011 by participating as a driver in the "Crossing of America" tour. The Owls also are regular participants in efforts to send care packages to members of the armed forces deployed overseas.

The Rice football team was honored by the Texas Association of Partners in Education with their TAPE's Crystal Award for the program the Owls conducted in 2007 with the students at Arizona Fleming Elementary School in Houston. The Owls support of Big Brothers helped Rice Athletics be honored in 2012 as one of the Houston chapter's Community Partners of the Year.

In 2008, the Owls endured a series of challenges as well as the aftermath of Hurricane Ike and produced the first 10-win season for Rice since 1949 and the Owls' first victory in a bowl game since their memorable win over Alabama in the 1954 Cotton Bowl. For his efforts, Bailiff was honored by his conference peers with his first Conference USA Coach of the Year honor.

Bailiff came to Rice after three seasons as the head coach at Texas

State University in San Marcos where he posted a 21-15 record while leading the Bobcats to their first Southland Conference championship and the semifinals of the NCAA Division I-AA playoffs in 2005.

He produced a total of 14 All Southland Conference first team selections, and 13 players who were named to the academic all-conference squad in his last two years. The 2005 season was truly a magical one. The Bobcats went 9-2 during the regular season and earned the school's first berth in the Division I-AA playoffs.

In their first game, the Bobcats stormed back from a 35-16 deficit against Division I-AA national power Georgia Southern to score 34 unanswered points and beat the Eagles 50-35. The Cats then defeated Cal Poly 14-7 to move on to the national semifinals. Only a 40-37 overtime loss to Northern Iowa stood between Texas State and an appearance in the Division I-AA title game.

Bailiff was named the American Football Coaches Association's Region 5 Coach of the Year and finished third in the voting for the Eddie Robinson Award presented annually to the top coach in Division I-AA. Prior to being named Texas State head coach, Bailiff spent three seasons on the staff at TCU. He served as the Horned Frogs' defensive coordinator in both 2002 and 2003 while working with the team's defensive linemen.

The 2003 Horned Frogs posted an 11-2 record and were ranked 25th in the final Associated Press writer's poll and 24th in the ESPN/USA Today Coaches Poll. Bailiff was part of a staff which built a tradition on defense at TCU. During his three seasons in Fort Worth, the Horned Frogs were ranked 24th, 1st and 38th in the country in total defense and 10th, first and ninth against the run.

In 2002, TCU allowed just 240.2 yards of total offense per game which led the country. The Horned Frogs surrendered an average 64.8 yards on the ground. During the year, the Frogs held Tulane to a school-record -53 yards

rushing. TCU also ranked second in the country in pass efficiency defense, allowing opponents to complete less than 39 percent of their passes.

Six TCU defensive players earned all-conference accolades in 2002 including Conference USA Defensive Player of the year and Second-Team All-American LaMarcus MacDonald.

While at TCU, the Horned Frogs played in a bowl game every season - the galleryfurniture.com Bowl (2001), AXA Liberty Bowl (2002) and the Plains Capital Fort Worth Bowl (2003).

He began his coaching career as the defensive line coach at New Braunfels High School (1982-84). He went into private business from 1984-88 before returning to the coaching ranks as a defensive graduate assistant coach at Texas State in 1988. He was elevated to the Bobcats' defensive line coach in 1989.

Bailiff left Texas State in 1992 for an assistant coaching position at New Mexico. He returned to Texas State in 1997 as defensive coordinator and added assistant head coach responsibilities to his role in 1999.

It was in 1999 that Bailiff was selected the NCAA Division I-AA Assistant Coach of the Year by the American Football Coaches Association. While at TCU, Bailiff was also honored as the Top Assistant Football Coach by the All-American Football Foundation following the Horned Frogs' 2002 season.

As a player, Bailiff was named All-Lone Star Conference as well as All-America honorable mention while playing at Texas State from 1977-80. He served as a team captain in 1980 and was named honorable mention to the Lone Star Team of the Decade.

Bailiff is married to the former Angie Daniels of Versailles, Mo. He has a daughter, Brooke and the couple has twin 20-year-old sons, Grayson and Gregory.

# DARRELL PATTERSON

ASST. HEAD COACH/RUN GAME COORD.

LINEBACKERS

11TH SEASON

Darrell Patterson is back for his 11th season at Rice University and his sixth as Assistant Head Coach and his eighth year of coaching the Owl's linebackers. He also serves as Special Teams Coordinator (seven years) and Run Game Coordinator (fourth year).

Patterson enters the 2017 with a linebacking corps led by 2016 All Conference USA pick Emmanuel Ellerbee and a host of experienced players looking to step into the void created by the graduation of three-year starter Alex Lyons at linebacker. His special teams lineup is highlighted by junior punter Jack Fox, who also handles the kickoff duties, while incoming freshman Will Harrison and two-year letterman Haden Tobola come into camp competing for the placekicking duties.

Ellerbee led C-USA and finished sixth nationally in tackles last year and enters his senior year as a candidate for a number of national honors.

In his seven seasons overseeing the Owls special teams, Patterson has produced one All-American (punter Kyle Martins) and one freshman All-American (kick returner Mario Hull) in addition to the most productive kicker in school history, Chris Boswell who departed with

all the school records for field goals and kick scoring. Boswell took over as the Pittsburgh Steelers kicker in 2015 and set a club record for field goals by a first-year player (29) as well as records for more postseason field goals (7).

In addition to his coaching duties, Patterson also continues to spearhead Rice's recruiting efforts in Canada, where he had a playing career in the CFL for seven seasons (1984-90). The Owls have signed a total of eight Canadians in the past nine years, including All C-USA offensive tackle Scott Mitchell and All C-USA tight end Luke Willson. Two of those signees (Willson and Christian Covington) were drafted into the NFL. In 2016, Canadian product Peter Godber will enter his second year as one of the starters at offensive guard.

Patterson joined the Rice coaching staff on February 20, 2007 after two seasons coaching the linebackers at Stanford University.

Patterson's collegiate playing experience took place at Texas Christian University, where he was a standout linebacker from 1979-82. He is a member of the TCU Hall of Fame and remains the school's all-time leader in tackles (544), unassisted tackles (286), and assisted tackles (258).

He was selected in the sixth round of the 1983 NFL Draft by the New York Giants, but made his way to the Canadian Football League (CFL) for a seven-year career—playing for the Winnipeg Blue Bombers from 1984-88 and the Hamilton Tiger Cats from 1988-90. Patterson won a Grey Cup championship with Winnipeg in 1984 and was on the runner-up team with Hamilton in 1989.

Following his playing days, Patterson began his coaching career as an intern for the British Columbia Lions in 1991. His coaching ca-

reer has, since then, led him to Akron (1992-94), Temple (1995-96), Kentucky (1997-00), Arkansas State (2001), Baylor (2002), Southern Methodist (2003-04), and Stanford (2005-07). He also had a coaching stint with Ottawa of the CFL in 1995 as the defensive line and special teams coach.



# BILLY LYNCH

## OFFENSIVE COORDINATOR WIDE RECEIVERS SEVENTH SEASON

Billy Lynch enters his first year as the Owls' Offensive Coordinator after sharing the assignment the previous three years and his seventh coaching Owls' wide receivers. 2017 will also mark his second year Lynch has called the Owls plays on offense.

This season, Lynch has an exciting array of weapons on the outside to call upon including Kylan Granson, who led the team with 381 receiving yards was second on the team with 33 receptions after his redshirt was pulled in the fifth game of the year.

In his first six seasons at Rice, Lynch has developed a productive unit of wideouts, including a four who found their way into NFL camps (Mario Hull, Donte Moore, Dennis Parks and Jordan Taylor). Taylor enjoyed his first playing time with Denver in 2016 after earning a Super Bowl ring with Denver while spending the year on the practice squad and earning national acclaim from Peyton Manning as his training partner while the future Hall of Famer rehabbed from an injury before leading the Broncos to the NFL title. Taylor completed his career as the Owls ranked second in receiving yards (2,585) and receiving touchdowns (20) and third in receptions (175) while Parks finished his career ranked 10th in yards (1,507) and Hull ranked in a tie for sixth with his eight touchdown catches in 2014.

Rice's drive to the 2013 C-USA Championship was highlighted by the big play production of Taylor and Parks. Three of Taylor's eight touchdown receptions

were from 60 yards out or longer, including a 75-yard bomb from Taylor McHargue that set a C-USA Championship game record. Parks led the team by averaging 17.5 yards per catch while finishing second to Taylor in catches and receiving yards.

Taylor emerged as a vital component of the Owls 2012 air attack, punctuated by his record-setting effort in the Armed Forces Bowl. He set a Rice bowl game record with 153 yards and three touchdowns on nine receptions to earn Rice MVP honors in the game. Lynch also guided the transition of Sam McGuffie from running back to receiver and the senior responded with 54 receptions and five touchdowns.

Lynch joined the Rice coaching staff on Feb. 22, 2011 after six seasons at Indiana where he developed some of the most productive receivers in Hoosiers' history.

In 2010 his top three receivers, Damarlo Belcher (78/832/4), Terrance Turner (67/681/3) and Doss (63/706/7 touchdowns) topped 60 catches and 700 yards and the unit set a school record with 3,446 total yards.

In 2009, Tandon Doss became Lynch's second All-Big Ten receiver as he earned first team honors (media) and second team recognition from the league's coaches.

As sophomores in 2009, Doss and Belcher became the first duo in IU history to each collect 60-plus receptions and 700-plus yards in a season. Their 138 combined catches rank first in Hoosier lore and 1,732 yards sit second. Doss finished second in the Big Ten in yards per game (80.2) and third in the league and tied for 22nd nationally in catches per game (6.64). He closed out the year second on IU's single-season receptions list and fifth in the school's single-season yardage rankings.

The 2008 corps, led by Ray Fisher and Andrew Means, saw four receivers reach 25 receptions and post over 275 yards. It also featured one of the top true freshman duos in IU history - Belcher and Doss.

Fisher and Means, who signed a professional baseball contract with the Cin-

cinnati Reds in 2008, became the 13th and 14th Hoosiers, respectively, to go over 100 career receptions and 1,000 career yards, joining Hardy as wideouts under Lynch to enter the elite club. Belcher (25/337/2) and Doss (14/186/1) combined for the second-highest receiving yardage total by a true freshman duo in school history.

The 2007 season saw Lynch's wide receivers re-write the IU record books, as they recorded a school-record 3,073 yards. Hardy, who was selected in the second round (41st pick) by the Buffalo Bills, set new school marks with 16 receiving TDs and 79 catches. He finished his career as the school's all-time receiving yardage (2,740), receptions (191) and receiving touchdowns (36) leader. Hardy was a semi-finalist for the Biletnikoff Award, named All-America by five publications and selected first team All-Big Ten.

The 2006 Hoosiers finished third in the Big Ten in receiving yards per game. Hardy was second team All-Big Ten (51/722/10).

In 2005, Lynch tutored Hardy to one of the most prolific debut seasons IU has seen at wide receiver. Hardy finished with 61 receptions (fourth in school history), 10 touchdowns (tied for third all-time) and 893 yards (seventh all-time). In addition, his five 100-yard games were tied for the second most in a season in school history. One of five assistant coaches that came from Miami (Ohio) University to Indiana, Lynch was the RedHawks' tight ends coach in 2004 and offensive graduate assistant in 2002-03. During his tenure in Oxford, Lynch assisted with a potent offense that led the nation at 43.0 points per game in 2003.

He spent his undergraduate years as a wide receiver and three-year letter winner at Ball State University, where he graduated with a bachelor's degree in education in 2002. He led the Cardinals with 40 receptions his senior year. He also lettered three years in basketball, including the 2000-01 and 2001-02 seasons for then-BSU head coach and current Indiana assistant basketball coach Tim Buckley.

Billy and his wife, Carla, have four children, daughter Lindsey (11), and sons, Max (9), Ryan (8) and Michael (4)



## **BRIAN STEWART**

### **DEFENSIVE COORDINATOR CORNERBACKS FIRST SEASON**

Brian Stewart was named Rice's new Defensive Coordinator on January 18, 2017, returning to a region he knows well from previous stops in his coaching career. He brings seven years of experience in coordinating defensive effort at both the FBS and NFL levels in addition to 25 years of coaching acumen to South Main.

Stewart was a member the Houston Texans inaugural coaching staff (2002-03), then after three seasons with the San Diego Chargers, he returned to Texas to become the DC of the Dallas Cowboys for two years (2007-08) and later served as the defensive coordinator at the University of Houston (2010-11).

He came to Rice after spending the previous two seasons coaching secondary at the University of Nebraska. He coached the entire secondary in 2015 before concentrating on the cornerbacks the following year.

Last season, his corners led the way as the Huskers improved 78 spots to finish 30th in the nation in pass efficiency defense while closing the year tied for 14th with 16 interceptions. Junior cornerback Chris Jones earned honorable-mention All-Big Ten honors and was named to Pro Football's Focus' early-season All-America team.

In his first season in Lincoln, Stewart coached an NU secondary that had seven different starters in 2015, including 23 starts from freshmen or sophomores. Safety Nate Gerry led the Huskers in tackles and interceptions and earned third-team All-Big Ten honors, while cornerback Joshua Kalu was an honorable-mention all-conference pick.

Stewart joined the Nebraska staff after three seasons as the defensive coordinator and secondary coach at the University of Maryland where he helped the Terrapins to a pair of bowl appearances. The attacking Terrapin defense tallied more than 30 sacks each of his last two seasons.

Defensive back Will Likely was a standout under Stewart's guidance, leading the Big Ten in interceptions in 2014 en route to first-team all-conference honors. In Stewart's first year at Maryland in 2012, his defense finished in the top three in the ACC in total defense, rushing defense and pass defense and was 21st nationally in total defense.

Stewart re-joined the college ranks as the defensive coordinator at the University of Houston in 2010 and 2011. Stewart's stingy defense played a key role in the Cougars' 13-1 record and No. 14 final national ranking in 2011, ending the year ranked in the top 15 nationally in red zone scoring, interceptions, tackles for loss, takeaways and opponent completion percentage.

Prior to joining the Cougars, he spent the previous eight years in the NFL, including a two-year stint as the Dallas Cowboys defensive coordinator in 2007 and 2008. As the Cowboys' defense coordinator, Stewart guided Dallas to two top-10 rankings in fewest yards allowed. He helped the Cowboys to a 13-3 record and NFC East divisional title in 2007 and saw an NFL-best five defenders make the Pro Bowl that year--DeMarcus Ware,

Roy Williams, Greg Ellis, Ken Hamlin and Terrence Newman.

Stewart also served as an assistant coach with the Philadelphia Eagles (2009), San Diego Chargers (2004-06) and the Houston Texas (2002-03). Each of the teams Stewart coached in his final six NFL seasons won at least nine games, including three division champions and four playoff teams. During his time in the NFL, Stewart helped 14 players make Pro Bowl appearances.

Before his stint in the National Football League, Stewart had college assistant coaching stops at Syracuse, Missouri, San Jose State, Northern Arizona and Cal Poly. Stewart serves as the president of the Urban Football Coaches Association, conducting an annual coaches' clinic in Los Angeles. Stewart graduated from Nogales High School in La Puente, Calif., and remains active there, conducting a free youth football camp there.

He is a graduate of Northern Arizona where he played defensive back.

He and wife Kimberly are the parents of three daughters, Leila, Mya and Zara.



## WESLEY BESCHORNER QUARTERBACKS FIRST SEASON

Wesley Beschorner was named the new Rice quarterbacks coach on January 25, 2017 after spending the 2016 season helping spark the Pitt Panthers to a record setting offensive output as an offensive quality control assistant.

In his one season with the Panthers, working with senior quarterback Nate Peterman , Pitt finished 10th nationally, scoring a school-record 532 points and Peterman led the ACC in passing efficiency (163.4), throwing for 2,855 yards and 27 TDs while completing 60.5 percent and throwing only seven interceptions.

Beschorner came to Pitt after spending 10 seasons coaching at the University of South Dakota, where he also starred on the field, earning All-American honors and was a runner-up as the national player of the year.

He worked his way up the coaching ladder at USD taking over as offensive coordinator in 2008 and being elevated to associate head coach in 2012. Over his decade on the sidelines, he crafted an offensive attack that rivaled the one he led on the field from 2001-05.

A three-year starting quarterback, Beschorner is one of the most accomplished players in USD history. He set 33 school records, including career standards for passing yards (6,240), passing touchdowns (64) and touchdown accountability (87).

As a senior in 2005, Beschorner was a first team All-American and finished as the runner-up for the prestigious Harlon Hill Trophy, annually presented to the Division II College Football Player of the Year. That season he passed for more than 3,000 yards and accounted for 47 touchdowns against just four interceptions.

Beschorner is a 2005 graduate of South Dakota with a bachelor's degree in history education. He went on to receive his master's degree in athletic administration from USD in 2008.

He and his wife, Kiki, have three sons, Burke, Rhett and Troy. .



# FRANK OKAM

## DEFENSIVE LINE SECOND SEASON

Frank Okam enters his second season as the Owls defensive line coach, a position he assumed in March of 2016 after spending two years as a graduate assistant with the Owls.

In his first year with Rice, Okam guided a youthful corps to a productive campaign of development allowing him to welcome a deep and experienced group in 2017.

Okam was a four-year letterman at defensive tackle at Texas, where he earned All-America and All Big 12 honors. He earned freshman All-America honors from The Sporting News in 2004 and was an All Big 12 selection in 2006 (first team) and 2007 (second team). He was a starter for the Longhorn's 2005 BCS Champions and was credited with a pair of tackles, including a sack, in the National Championship game vs. USC in the Rose Bowl.

He was drafted in the fifth round of the 2008 draft by the Houston Texans and played with them for three seasons. He was waived during the 2010 season and was signed by Seattle. He also played with Tampa Bay and saw his final league action when he

was in training camp with the New York Giants in 2013.

Okam graduated from Texas in 3 1/2 years with a degree in Sport Management while minoring in Business. He attended Lake Highlands High School in Dallas where he was a Parade and US Army All-American and graduated in the top 5 percent of his class.

Is one course from completing work on a Masters in liberal studies from Rice.



## DAVID SLOAN

### TIGHT ENDS RECRUITING COORDINATOR SEVENTH SEASON

Former All-Pro tight end David Sloan enters his seventh season of coaching the Owls tight ends in 2016, and his fourth year of overseeing the Owls recruiting efforts.

In 2017, Sloan will rely on senior Robby Wells and a host of exciting younger talents to handle the varied demands the position. In his six seasons at Rice, Sloan has sent two of his players on to successful careers in the NFL.

In his initial campaign as tight ends coach, Sloan oversaw a loaded lineup that included a pair of draftees (Vance McDonald and Luke Willson) along with third (Taylor Cook) who earned a tryout with the Dallas Cowboys. McDonald and Willson allowed Rice to match Stanford as the only schools to have a pair of tight ends taken in the 2013 NFL Draft.

Willson helped spark Seattle to a return trip to the Super Bowl in 2015. He caught a game-winning touchdown in the final minute vs. Carolina and then a game-tying, two-point conversion from Russell Wilson during the Seahawks comeback playoff win over Green Bay.

Willson became the sixth Owl to win a Super Bowl ring, starting for Seattle in Super Bowl XLVIII and catching a pair of passes for 17 yards against Denver. Willson met McDonald in the NFC title game. McDonald was taken in the second round (55th overall) by the 49ers, the highest draft selection for Rice since Bert Emanuel (a former teammate of Sloan's) in 1994.

McDonald, who saw his 2014 playing time with San Francisco limited by an injury, finished his career ranked in the Owls top ten in receptions, receiving yards and receiving touchdowns and became the first Owl since ND Kalu in 1996 to be invited to play in the Senior Bowl. Willson was a four-year starter who was drafted by the Toronto Argos of the CFL prior to his senior year and was a standout in the NFLPA Collegiate Bowl.

Sloan is in his eighth season overall at Rice, having come to campus as a graduate assistant and also serving in a quality control position. When Sloan joined the Owls in 2010, he reunited with Rice head coach David Bailiff, who was on the staff at the University of New Mexico in 1993 when Sloan signed with the Lobos out of junior college.

A two-time Academic All-Conference selection while playing basketball at Fresno City College from 1990-91, Sloan made the jump to football in the fall of 1992.

He caught the eye of Bailiff after catching 13 passes for 254 yards and 4 touchdowns. He signed with New Mexico and earned All-WAC Honorable Mention as a junior in 1993. He improved on that effort

as a senior, earning first-Team All-WAC honors and was named one of the Lobos' team co-captains after catching 24 receptions for 320 yards and 1 touchdown during his senior campaign.

After his senior year, he played in the Blue Gray All-Star Game, Senior Bowl and participated in NFL Scouting combine in Indianapolis.

Sloan was selected in the third round of the 1995 by the Detroit Lions and became a starter midway through his rookie season and the Lions won seven straight to earn a playoff spot. He enjoyed his best season in 1999, when he earned a spot in the Pro Bowl after catching 47 passes for 591 yards and four touchdowns as the Lions again reached the playoffs. Sloan started for the NFC in the 2000 Pro Bowl and was named as an alternate in 2001. He led the Lions with seven touchdown passes in 2001.

He was signed by New Orleans in 2002 and retired after the 2003 season. He finished his NFL career with 199 receptions, for 2251 yards and 17 touchdowns including seven catches for 100 yards and two touchdowns in three playoff games.

He has two daughters: Trinity (13) and Bentley (11) while he and wife Angela welcomed a daughter, Braxton, to the family during the 2016 season.



## A.J. STEWARD RUNNING BACKS FOURTH SEASON

A.J. Steward enters his fourth year of coaching the Rice running backs. He was promoted to running backs coach on March 7, 2014 after spending the previous two seasons as an offensive graduate assistant.

Steward once again has a deep corps of running backs at his disposal in 2017, led by juniors Samuel Stewart and Austin Walter and sophomores Emmanuel Esupka and Nashon Ellerbe who averaged a combined 5.6 yards per carry (159/892) while scoring 10 times on the ground.

In his time at Rice, he has already seen two of his backs move in the Rice career rushing lists, with Darik Dillard finishing seventh with 2,198 and Jowan Davis tied for eighth (2,028) while becoming just the second set of running backs to top 2,000 career yards in the same season.

Steward originally joined the staff prior to the 2012 season as a GA after graduating from the University of Kansas with a BSE in Health and Physical Education.

Steward was a four-year letterman at Kansas. Originally recruited as a quarterback, Steward found his first playing time as a wide receiver before switching to tight end. He was a member of the 2008 Orange Bowl Championship team, earning the Otto Schnellbacher Scout Team Player of the Year as a quarterback, as well as the 2008 Insight Bowl champions.

He was a four-time member of the Athletic Director's Honor Roll. Steward and wife Virginia make their home in Houston.



## SCOTT VESTAL

### SAFETIES FIRST SEASON

Texas native Scott Vestal was named Rice's new safeties coach on January 18, 2017, after spending the 2016 season at Maryland where he was a Defensive Assistant/Quality Control and worked with the Terrapin safeties as Maryland advanced to the Quick Lane Bowl against Boston College.

Prior to joining the staff at Maryland, he spent three seasons with the Kansas Jayhawks, the last two as the safeties coach. Vestal, who also worked closely with the Jayhawk special teams, spent the 2012 season as the assistant director of football operations for KU.

Under Vestal's guidance, KU safety Isaiah Johnson was named the 2013 Big 12 Defensive Newcomer of the Year after finishing his sophomore season with five interceptions, which ranked second in the conference. Johnson also finished second on the KU defense with 73 tackles. Additionally, Johnson picked up honorable mention All-Big 12 honors from the conference coaches.

Vestal joined the Kansas program from the University of Florida. He was the quality control coach for defense for the Gators in 2011 and served in the same role at Texas during the 2010 season.

Prior to his work with the Longhorns, Vestal was a graduate assistant

at Louisiana Tech, North Texas and SMU. Overall, Vestal spent four years at SMU, including a year as an assistant to the Director of Football Operations in 2003 before becoming the video graduate assistant in 2004. He also spent one year coaching in the Texas high school ranks, serving as an assistant coach at Berkner High School in Richardson, Texas.

He played safety at Arlington Lamar High School. Vestal earned his bachelor's degree in kinesiology with a minor in history from Texas A&M in 2003 and a master's degree in liberal arts at SMU.



## **RONNIE VINKLAREK**

### **OFFENSIVE LINE NINTH SEASON**

Ronnie Vinklarek enters his ninth season of coaching the Rice offensive line, having joined the Owls' football staff on February 28, 2009.

Vinklarek welcomes a veteran unit in 2017 led by four starters in seniors Peter Godber and Trey Martin and juniors Calvin Anderson and Sam Pierce along with junior Corey Klingler who made a total of eight starts last year between center and guard.

Two of Vinklarek's three graduating 2014 seniors, Ian Gray (Bears) and Nico Carlson (Cowboys), found their way into NFL rookie camps while 2015 senior Caleb Williams earned a tryout with the Denver Broncos.

Vinklarek is no stranger to the Houston area or Conference USA. He coached the linemen at the University of Houston from 1988-93 and at SMU from 2004-07. He also coached at the high school level in Houston, coaching the defensive line at Spring Branch High School in 1983 and was the offensive coordinator at Clear Lake High School 1994 in a district championship season and at Conroe High

School in 1996.

While at Houston, he mentored the offensive line that protected Andre Ware during his Heisman Trophy winning season (1989) and was selected to coach in the 1990 Blue-Gray Game after helping UH to a 10-1 season. He originally came to Houston as a graduate assistant under former Houston Oilers and Washington Redskins head coach Jack Pardee and was promoted to full-time assistant in 1990.

Vinklarek coached in the NFL for three seasons. He broke into the league in 2000 with the Tennessee Titans as their defensive quality control, linebackers and special teams coach. He moved on to the Buffalo Bills in 2001 and coached their offensive line for two seasons. In 2002 the Bills offensive line paved the way for a 4,359-yard passer in Drew Bledsoe, a 1,439-yard rusher in Travis Henry and two 1,200-yard-plus receivers in Eric Moulds and Peerless Price.

Prior to joining the Owls, he coached the offensive line for the Edmonton Eskimos of the CFL. He broke into the coaching ranks as the seventh and eighth grade coach at Hill Country Middle School after graduating from Southwest Texas in 1981. From 1983 to 1984, was the defensive line coach for Spring Branch High School in Houston before becoming the defensive coordinator at Marble Falls (Texas) High School from 1984-86.

He also served as offensive line coach at Oklahoma State (1998 & 1999), Valdosta State (1997), Middle Tennessee State (2003) as well as with the CFL's Birmingham Barracudas (1995).

A Flatonia, Texas, native, Vinklarek is married to the former Marianne Britz. The couple has two sons, Trevor, who is a sophomore at Rice, and Trent.



## **JOE FOTEH**

### **QUALITY CONTROL SECOND SEASON**

Joe Foteh is in his second season as a quality control coach for the Owls.

Foteh comes to Rice after serving as an offensive assistant at West Texas A&M last spring.

Foteh earned his Masters at Northwestern Oklahoma State in 2015 while coaching the Rangers' wide receiver corps to the NCAA Division II lead in completions. He coached the cornerbacks in his first year with Northwestern Oklahoma.

Foteh is a graduate of the University of Houston where he was a student manager from 2010-2013 where he earned his Bachelor's degree in Kinesiology - Exercise Science.

The Missouri City, Texas native graduated from Elkins High School in 2009. He played cornerback all four seasons and was named the 2008 Gridiron Player of the Year as a senior.



## **MIKE HUDSON**

### **QUALITY CONTROL FIRST SEASON**

Mike Hudson joined the Rice staff in 2017 as a quality control coach for special teams.

He brings 29 years of coaching experience to South Main, including a total of 18 years at Texas State working on the defensive side of the ball.

Most recently he coached the Bobcats defensive line from 2011-15 and previously coached the linebackers from 1995-2000 before becoming defensive coordinator in 2001-02. He began his coaching career in San Marcos as a student coach (1997-98) and graduate assistant (1990-91). During his combined time with the Bobcats, Hudson's pupils earned numerous all-conference honors as well as second-team All-Americans Ypres Thomas in 1995 and Myron Coleman in 2000 and Greg Pitts in 2002. Pitts also earned third team honors in 2001.

In 2012, Hudson tutored Joplo Bartu, who earned second-team All-WAC honors as a defensive end and linebacker before playing in the NFL with the Atlanta Falcons in 2013 and 2014.

Hudson returned to Texas State as an assistant coach for the third time in his career in 2011 after serving on the staff at Montana for six seasons.

He coached several positions during his six-year stint at Montana. He spent the 2010 season coaching linebackers after serving as Montana's secondary coach for two seasons. He also was the football director of operations in 2009, and was Montana's associate head coach while coaching running backs and secondary from 2005-08. During his tenure there, the Grizzlies were FCS Playoff finalists in 2008 and 2009. Montana also won or shared the Big Sky Conference from 2005-09.

Hudson went to Montana from Sam Houston State, where he was the defensive coordinator in 2003 and 2004 after serving one year as a defensive line coach. While at Sam Houston State, the Bearkats advanced to the semifinals of the 2004 NCAA FCS Playoffs.

In between his first two stints at Texas State, Hudson was an assistant coach at Trinity University in San Antonio for two seasons before moving to New Mexico as the defensive line coach in 1994.

Hudson earned a bachelor's degree in kinesiology at UTSA in 1994. Born in Bryan, Texas and raised in San Antonio, Hudson played collegiate football at Angelo State University in 1983 and 1984. The Rams won a Lone Star Conference championship in 1984.

He and his wife, Dyan, have two children, Lee and Loryn.

A veteran of 30 years on the Houston sports scene, Chuck Pool heads into his 12th year at the head of the Owls' publicity efforts.

He assumed his duties on August 23, 2006 when he became the third person to hold the Sports Information Director title at Rice, following Bill Whitmore (1950-84) and Bill Cousins (1984-2006). Pool guides athletic communications and publicity efforts for the Owls while serving as the primary contact for football as well as men's and women's tennis.

Pool and his staff were honored in 2014 by the Football Writers' Association of America as one of their Super 11 Sports Information staffs.

In his time at Rice, he has coordinated the Owls efforts to move their media information away from printed materials as well as developing a broader overall reach through sport-specific Facebook and Twitter initiatives with a heavy emphasis on video.

In 2011, he oversaw the redesign and relaunch of Riceowls.com while also writing and co-producing a five-part documentary on the 100th season of Rice Football. In 2010, he assumed administrative responsibility of the Owls' video productions and oversaw the creative aspects of *Owls Insider*, a half-hour show on Fox Sports Houston. That same year he was responsible for the expansion of OwlVision's baseball webcast production as well as the first-ever webcast of the C-USA outdoor track and field championship.

In 2006, his publicity efforts enabled a previously unknown sophomore wide receiver, Jarett Dillard, to become one of three finalists for the Biletnikoff Award finalist. In 2008 Dillard became Rice's first Football Writers All American in 50 years.

He served as Media Coordinator for the 2010 and 2015 NCAA Men's South Basketball Regionals at in Houston. He was Local Media Coordinator for the 2011 & 2016 Men's Final Four in Houston.

Pool, 59, joined the Owls after spending the previous four years running his own public relations company, Laysan Communications, which specialized in proactive sports-related public and media relations. His primary clients included the Rotary Lombardi Award, which honors the top linemen in college football, and the Roger Clemens Award, which was presented to the top pitcher in college baseball. Laysan also provided media services to the Houston Super Bowl Host Committee, the Harris County-Houston Sports Authority and USA Football.

He first came to Houston in 1985 when he joined the Houston Astros as the assistant director of public relations. He remained with the Astros through the spring of 1992 when he was selected to create the media relations department of the expansion Florida Marlins. He returned to the Astros in 1998 before entering private business in 1999.

Pool is a 1980 graduate of the University of Nebraska where he played freshman football (1977). He joined the Huskers' SID department as a student assistant and was named Publications Coordinator/Sports Information Assistant upon graduation.

During his time at Nebraska, he was part of publicity efforts that garnered a Heisman Trophy, three Outland, two Rotary Lombardi Award winners and 10 consensus All-America selections in football. He also headed up publicity efforts for the Huskers' gymnastics and swimming programs, and served as media coordinator for three NCAA men's gymnastics and one NCAA women's swimming and diving championship.

He is a member of the FWA and the College Sports Information Directors of America (CoSIDA). He is a past president of Pearland Little League and has served on the Advisory Council of the Rotary Lombardi Award.

Pool and wife Laura reside in Pearland. **BAYLOR 38, RICE 10**  
**SEPT. 16, 2016 • RICE STADIUM • HOUSTON, TEXAS**

Rice Stadium opened a new era with a familiar old foe as 19th ranked Baylor withstood a strong challenge from the Owls in the first half to post a 38-10 win over Rice in front of 27,047 in house and a national audience on ESPN.

The largest crowd to see a game at Rice Stadium since the University celebrated its Centennial in 2012 were treated to the dazzling debut of the new Daktronics video and audio system that was part of the \$33 million Brian Patterson Center project as well as to a spirited defensive effort by the Owls against the vaunted Baylor attack.

Rice held the Bears scoreless in the first quarter, forcing as many punts in a half (3) as they had needed in the three previous meetings with Rice and headed to the locker room trailing just 21-10. But the Bears clamped down in the second half, holding the Owls to just 74 yards over the final two stanzas to beat Rice for the eighth straight time in the series.

Darik Dillard cracked into the Rice career rushing top 10 by rushing for 124 yards on 14 carries, increasing his career total to 1,941 yards, surpassing Kosse Johnson (1,917 yards) into the top ten and moving to just 59 yards from becoming the ninth Owl to top 2,000 yards in a career.

He piled up 53 of those yards on a career-best carry that seemed to have Rice in position to answer Baylor's third score of the day, but Baylor's Tion Wright knocked the ball free from Dillard as he was tackled at the Baylor 15 with just 52 seconds left in the half.

For the second straight year, Rice opened the scoring against Baylor on the leg of kicker Haden Tabola, who capped 14-play, 74-yard march with a 24-yard field goal. The Bears answered right back with an 84 yard drive in eight plays, then took advantage of an errant rugby punt by Nate German to extend the lead to 14-3.

Rice struck back with a 75-yard march that ended with redshirt freshman Emmanuel Esupka's first career touchdown. Baylor answered to regain its 11-point edge before Dillard's dash near the end of the half.

The Owls (0-3) will open Conference USA play in earnest next week when they open a stretch of three consecutive league games when they host North Texas at Rice Stadium at 5 p.m. on September 24.

# GAME 4

## NORTH TEXAS 42, RICE 35 SEPT. 24, 2016 • RICE STADIUM • HOUSTON, TEXAS

Tyler Stehling threw for 232 yards and added 92 on the ground, but the Rice Owls saw their hopes for a comeback win thwarted on a fourth down stop in double overtime and North Texas took a 42-35 decision at Rice Stadium on Saturday night in front of a crowd of 20,792.

After sprinting out to a 17-0 lead, UNT fought back to take a 28-20 lead midway through the fourth quarter. Rice had rallied from an eight point deficit in the final five minutes to send the game into extra time, but North Texas scored game's final 14 points to emerge with its first win at Rice Stadium as a member of Conference USA.

Stehling and Zach Wright, who finished with a career-high 10 receptions for 120 yards, combined on a pair of completions for 22 yards to move the ball near midfield before Stehling bolted 41 yards up the middle to set the Owls up at the Mean Green two-yard line. Darik Dillard slammed into the end zone two plays later and then Stehling connected with Robby Wells on the two-point conversion to tie game.

After losing the coin toss, the Owls opened on offense in the first overtime and needed a fourth down conversion by Dillard at the UNT 16 to sustain their first possession. Three plays later, he gave Rice its last lead of the night on a three-yard run.

Dillard's two scores allowed him to move into seventh on the Rice career touchdown list with 24 while his 67 yards rushing allowed him to become the ninth Owl to rush for 2,000 yards in his career.

North Texas struck back with scores on the next two possession, the second aided by a crucial roughing penalty on the Owls on third down at the Rice nine. Moments later, the Owls were again faced with a fourth and one from the UNT 16 in overtime, but this time the Mean Green stopped Dillard for a loss to clinch the win.

Rice dominated the opening quarter, taking a 10-0 lead on a Haden Tobola connected on a 40-yard field goal and Stehling connected with Lance Wright on a 14-yard

touchdown pass, the first score of Wright's career. Emmanuel Esukpa's one-yard run early in the second quarter extended the lead to 17-0, but UNT closed to 17-14 at the half.

Tobola's second field goal of the night extended the Rice lead to 20-14 before the Mean Green struck right back on a 75-yard run by Jeffrey Wilson to take their first lead of the night with 7:27 in the third.

Emmanuel Ellerbee led the Owls defense with 11 tackles, his second consecutive game in double figures and the Owls defense was credited five sacks and 12 tackles for loss, their best marks since the 2014 season.

Rice fell to 6-5 all-time in overtime games, including a 3-2 mark at Rice Stadium in extra frames. This was the first double overtime game in Rice Stadium history and the third in school history.

# SOUTHERN MISS 44, RICE 28

OCT. 1, 2016 • M.M. ROBERTS STADIUM • HATTIESBURG, MISS.

Sam Stewart rushed for a career-high 132 yards and scored three touchdowns, but Rice could not hold off the big play proficiency of Southern Miss as the Golden Eagles took a 44-28 win in Hattiesburg on Saturday night.

Southern Miss quarterback Nick Mullens threw for a school-record 591 yards, 292 of them to Allenzae Stagers to set another school mark to hold off the Owls. The duo connected on touchdowns of 75, 81 and 93 yards, continually thwarting the Owls challenges.

Stewart, who had been missing in action since suffering an injury early the season opener at WKU, gave Rice and early 7-3 lead, combining with Tyler Stehling on a seven-yard touchdown pass with 9:03 in the second quarter. That lead was short-lived, as Mullens and Stagers combined on a 75-yard scoring strike on the first play from scrimmage after the Stewart score.

Stewart added a pair of touchdowns on the ground from 24 and 17 yards and Stehling hit Zach Wright with an 11-yard touchdown pass to close out the scoring for Rice. Stehling completed 14 of 18 passes on the night for 100 yards and a pair of touchdowns.

While Stewart returned to action on Saturday, the Owls were without five starters, including running back Darik Dillard, center Trey Martin and guard Peter Godber on offense and defensive linemen Zach Abercrombia and Carl Thompson on defense. True freshman Joseph Dill stepped into the void left by Godber, becoming the first true frosh to start for Rice on the offensive line since Scott Mitchell in 2007. Corey Klingler, who took over as a starter at guard in week two, moved to center in place of Martin. Isaiah Edwards shifted from tackle to guard and Sam Pierce returned to the starting lineup at tackle. On the defensive side, redshirt freshman Roe Wilkins joined his Hardin Jefferson HS teammate Blain Padgett in the starting lineup along with Preston Gordon.

Stewart also led the Owls in receiving, finishing with five receptions. Temi Alaka led in receiving yardage with a season-high 65 yards on a pair of catches.

Emmanuel Ellerbee led the Rice defense, reaching double figures for the third consecutive game (10) and also was credited with 1.5 sacks.

Junior corner V.J. Banks picked off a pass, broke up another and forced a fumble while his fellow corner J.T. Blasingame broke up three passes.

# GAME 6

## UTSA 14, RICE 13

OCT. 15, 2016 • RICE STADIUM • HOUSTON, TEXAS

Looking to break into the win column for the first time in 2016, the Rice Owls seemed poised to write their own miraculous addition to a college football script already brimming with improbable endings, only to see a furious final five minutes end in disappointment as UTSA held on for a 14-13 win at Rice Stadium on Saturday night.

The Owls moved inside the UTSA 30 twice in the game's final moments, only to see one field goal attempt go astray and then the game end when a receiver was tackled inbounds and they were unable to kill the clock.

Rice stopped the Roadrunners on fourth down at the Rice five with five minutes left and drove to the UTSA 24, but when Haden Tobola's 42-yard field goal attempt drifted wide to the right, the game appeared over until the Rice defense made three stops and used its timeouts to force a punt and take possession at its own 36 with 20 seconds left. Tyler Stehling hit Kylan Granson for a 18-yard gain to the UTSA 46 and one play later, he found the true freshman

again for 19 yards, but he was hauled down inbounds and the clock ran out on the Owls' hopes.

Rice came flying out of the gate, fashioning the longest scoring drive of the year on its first possession, an 84-yard march capped by a 13-yard run by Stehling. But Tobola's extra point was wide to the right and when UTSA's Josh Stewart broke free for a 75-yard touchdown, it gave the Roadrunners a lead they would never relinquish.

Other than Stewart's play, the Owls held a UTSA offense which had scorched Southern Miss for school records of 532 yards of total offense and 339 yards on the ground in check. Led by linebacker Emmanuel Ellerbee's fourth consecutive double digit tackle game (12) and safety Tabari McGaskey's career-high 10, the Owls held UTSA to an average of 3.3 yards on the ground and just 334 yards on the night.

McGaskey and friends rose up most dramatically

when the game was on the line.

He made back-to-back stops on third and fourth down to set up the Owls with 5:00 left and then sophomore defensive tackle Carl Thompson was credited with three of his seven tackles on the final series to give the Owls on last gasp.

Stehling threw for a career-high 237 yards and one touchdown in addition to his first-quarter touchdown run. Connor Cella caught a career-high six passes while Samuel Stewart ran for 78 yards (63 in the second half) and also caught five passes for 33 yards.

# RICE 65, PRAIRIE VIEW A&M 44

OCT. 22, 2016 • RICE STADIUM • HOUSTON, TEXAS

Tyler Stehling threw for five touchdowns and caught a sixth while becoming the fourth quarterback in school history to throw for more than 400 yards in a game to lead Rice to a 65-44 Homecoming win over Prairie View A&M

Rice won for the first time in 2016 while winning its Homecoming game for the 11th time in the last 12 years to improve its all-time mark in Homecomings to 47-47-3.

Stehling hit on 22 of 31 passes for 407 yards and added a touchdown reception of 27 yards to lead an Owl offense that piled up 634 yards, the most in a game since they totaled 647 in an overtime loss to Marshall in 2012. Temi Alaka exploded for a career-high 143 yards on six catches while Samuel Stewart piled up 116 yards on the ground to pace the offensive explosion that generated the most points ever in a Homecoming game and the most since Rice beat North Texas 77-20 in 2008.

He joined Tommy Kramer, Chase Clement and Nick Fanuzzi as the only Rice quarterbacks to top 400 yards passing in a game and his 407 yards were the fourth-best in school history. Fanuzzi's 405 yard effort vs. UTEP in 2011 also came in a Homecoming win.

The Owls came blazing in the first half, scoring on seven of eight possessions and scored 31 points in the second quarter to take a 45-14 lead into the locker room at halftime.

Stehling opened the scoring by hitting Austin Walter out of the backfield for a 12-yard score. After Prairie View returned the ensuing kickoff of a touchdown, Stewart put the Owls ahead to stay on a 31-yard run. One play after a D'Angelo Ellis interception, the Owls dipped into their bag of tricks as James Mayden took a pitch on a reverse and tossed touchdown pass to the wide open Stehling.

Stehling returned to his more familiar, hitting Alaka from 46 yards and true freshman Kylan Granson from 50 yards out and then redshirt freshman J.T. Granato ran in from four yards out on his first career series to extend the lead to 42-7. A Haden Tobola field goal just before halftime sent the Owls to the locker room with a 45-14 cushion.

The second half was more of a back and forth affair and the two teams traded scores on their way to scoring the most points ever in a Homecoming game (109).

Stehling's five touchdown passes were the most of his career and the most by a Rice quarterback since Chase Clement tossed five in the Owls 2008 Bayou Bucket win over Houston. The six total touchdown passes matched the school record, the sixth time in school history they have reached that mark—but the first time that Clement had not been at the controls.

## FLORIDA ATLANTIC 42, RICE 25 NOV. 5, 2016 • RICE STADIUM • HOUSTON, TEXAS

Florida Atlantic exploded for its top offensive output of the year to hand a battered Rice football team only its second November home loss in the last 18 games, 42-25 at Rice Stadium on Saturday afternoon.

Tyler Stehling threw for 254 yards and true freshman Kylan Granson caught a career-high eight for 87 yards for Rice, but FAU repeatedly answered Rice's attempts to rally with a series of quick strikes to post its first win in the fledgling series between the liked-named schools.

Rice opened the game by taking advantage of a short field to drive 56 yards to take a 7-0 lead when Stehling waited for Granson to clear into the middle and hit him with a 13-yard touchdown. That lead held for two additional possessions before FAU quarterback Jason Driskel used a pair of long completions to drive his Owls 73 yards to the tying score.

FAU took a 14-7 lead late in the first quarter, but Rice found its offensive momentum after four stalled series. Stehling moved them 80 yards to tie the game, with redshirt freshman Nahshon Ellerbe darting around the left end and diving into the end zone for his first career touchdown.

FAU scored on late in the half to take a 21-14 lead but Rice appeared to be poised with an immediate answer when Stehling hit Nate German in stride at the FAU 40, but as German turned towards the FAU goal, he lost control of the ball and FAU recovered.

FAU added to its advantage with a touchdown on its first possession of the third. Rice answered with a Haden Tobola field goal late in the quarter, but Driskel answered with a long touchdown pass to extend the lead to 35-18.

Stehling moved the Owls down the field again, with Austin Walter scoring from one yard out and then taking a toss from Stehling for a two-point conversion to close the gap to 10. However FAU's Devin Singletary put any hopes of a third consecutive Rice rally to win the series to an end by dashing 66 yards for a score.

# RICE 22, CHARLOTTE 21

The Rice football team rallied from a 21-0 deficit to claim a 22-21 Conference USA road victory over Charlotte Saturday afternoon in North Carolina.

Charlotte opened the day's scoring in the first quarter, moving 71 yards in eight plays. The 49ers then drove 75 yards late in the first quarter for another touchdown scored early in the second before an interception returned 41 yards for a touchdown. The 49ers made the right move by interfering with a long Rice pass attempt to Temi Alaka inside the 10-yard line, sacrificing the penalty yards at midfield before a Rice turnover on very next snap.

Down but not out, Rice proceeded to pile up the yards and possession time in the second quarter for ten points of their own. The Owls ran 32 plays for 159 yards while the defense held the 49ers to just 22 yards on 13. Haden Tabola's 24-yard field goal put Rice on the board after a ten-play, 66-yard drive. Tyler Stehling later found Temi Alaka for a three-yard touchdown strike to cap a 12-play

drive that made it 21-10 at the intermission.

Rice opportunistically converted a turnover into six points in the third quarter. Brandon Douglas forced a 49er fumble on punt return and Blain Padgett pounced on the ball inside the Charlotte red zone. On the next play Stehling dashed 17 yards around the left side into the endzone to make it a five-point game, 21-16.

The Blue & Gray took their first lead of the game with less than three minutes left in regulation. Stehling, with what seemed all 10 other Owls on the field and the sheer will of the entire team behind him, plunged into the endzone from a yard out to move in front 22-21. The defense held the rest of the way to improve to 2-8 on the season and 1-6 in Conference USA league play.

# RICE 44, UTEP 24

NOV. 19, 2016 • RICE STADIUM • HOUSTON, TEXAS

The future of Rice Football presented their outgoing seniors with the perfect going away present, packaging their most effective four quarters of the year into a 44-24 victory over UTEP on Senior Day at Rice Stadium on Saturday.

The win extended the Owls (3-8/2-6) winning streak on Senior Day to nine years and also allowed head coach David Bailiff to move past Ken Hatfield for second on the Rice coaching chart with his 56th win.

Redshirt freshman quarterback Jackson Tyner stepped into the void created by an injury to Tyler Stehling on the game's first series, weathered a potentially confidence crushing sack and fumble on his second snap and then expertly lead an balanced Owl attack that totaled 246 yards passing and 236 yards on the ground on their way to their highest point total against a C-USA foe since a 52-14 win over Louisiana Tech in 2013.

Looking to build on the momentum of a comeback win spurred by a standout effort by their senior quarterback last week at Charlotte, the Owls were suddenly faced with chasing a Senior Day win without Stehling, who was injured on a short run to the UTEP 40 on the game's first possession.

Enter Tyner, whose primary playing time had been in the "Wild Owl" package this season, as fellow redshirt freshman J.T. Granato had not practiced all week due to an illness.

On his second snap from scrimmage, Tyner had the ball stripped from his hands by UTEP's Gene Hopkins and picked up by Skye Hopkins who was tackled at the Rice 25 by Jowan Davis. But the Rice defense, itself flush from a suffocating performance at Charlotte, held to force a field goal.

Tyner and the Owls responded with a seven-play, 75 yard drive which ended with Austin Walter's nine yard touchdown run. UTEP blocked the extra point, but the three-point margin was as close as the Miners would be the rest of the day

Tyner found his footing in the second quarter, igniting a 28-point explosion by hitting on 9-10 passes for 105 yards. A short run by Davis on the Owls' first possession of the second extended the lead to 13-3 and on the their next possession, Tyner and Temi Akala combined for 65 yards on two plays, with each completing a pass to the other.

Alaka made a spectacular adjustment on a 41-yard throw by Tyner, then took a pitch on a reverse and found Tyner alone for a 24-yard touchdown.

Back to back sacks by Brian Womac and Parker Hanusa on the following series forced another punt and after Darik Dillard carried the ball five times to put the Owls in the red zone and Tyner rewarded the senior for his efforts by connecting with him on a nine-yard touchdown.

It was Dillard's 26th career touchdown allowing him to tie

Chase Clement for sixth on the Rice career list.

Tyner completed 18 of 25 passes for 196 yards and a pair of touchdowns in addition to his touchdown reception.

While Tyner stepped into Stehling's shoes and kept the Owls offense rolling, the linebackers Emmanuel Ellerbee and Alex Lyons spearheaded an effort that for the second straight week shackled one of the conference's top running backs. Ellerbee finished with 10 tackles, the sixth time this year he had reached double figures this season while Lyons added eight to increase his career total to 264.

Rice held UTEP to 63 yards on the ground, 115 under its average and bottled up the Miners Aaron Jones to just 75 yards on 14 carries, 44 of those yards coming after the outcome had been handily decided. Safety Destri White added to the defensive highlights by picking off a Ryan Metz pass and returning it 23 yards for a score to close out the second-quarter blitz.

Davis led the balanced ground attack, finishing with 84 yards to creep to 21 yards from joining Dillard in the 2,000 yard rushing club.

The Owls won for the 17th time in the last 19 home games in November or later and won the sixth straight over UTEP at Rice Stadium.

# STANFORD 41, RICE 17

Jowan Davis scored twice but it was not enough as Rice dropped its season finale at 24th-ranked Stanford, 41-17.

Davis rushed 10 times for 49 yards. The senior closed his career with 2,028 rushing yards, moving into a tie for eighth-place on the school's career rushing record.

Keller Chryst rushed for a 62-yard touchdown on Stanford's third play of the game. The Cardinal then drove into the red zone its next two possessions. But the Owls stopped them both times to force field goals.

After a Stanford touchdown pushed the lead to 20-0, the Owls got on the board, driving 63 yards in a season-long 19 plays and finishing when Davis scored on fourth down from two yards out just before the half. However, Rice was called for holding and was forced to settle for a field goal.

Rice was outgained 534-to-291 despite running 26 more plays.

The Cardinal opened the second half with a Christian McCaffery touchdown. Rice answered right back, driving 75 yards in 13 plays, capped off by a six-yard run by Davis. But, Stanford added two touchdowns late in the third quarter to put the game away.

The 2008 Texas Bowl Champion Owls were the most recent team to end the year receiving votes in the final AP poll, picking up eight after completing the second 10-win season in school history.

This season, two Owls will continue the tradition of honoring past Rice Football greats by changing their jersey numbers. The Honor Jersey program began in 2012.




## TREVOR COBB

Cobb was the first Owl to win one of college football's major individual awards Cobb was named the winner of the Doak Walker Award in 1991 as the nation's top running back. He was a consensus All-American in 1991 and went on to be named the 1992 Southwest Conference Offensive Player of the Year. He completed his career ranked second on the SWC career rushing list with 4,948 yards, which ranked eighth on the NCAA career list at that time and now ranks 22nd in NCAA history. In addition to his career rushing total, Cobb holds Rice season and career marks for rushing attempts (306/1,091), and all-purpose yards (1,844/6,512) in addition to the career mark for rushing touchdowns (38).
