NOTABLE STORYLINES

The Browns travel to Baltimore to face the Ravens at 1:00 p.m. on Sunday, Sept. 17. The Ravens hold a 27-9 advantage in the all-time series, including a 14-4 mark in Baltimore. The Browns will host the Ravens in Week 15.

LT **Joe Thomas** has played in all 9,996 offensive snaps since joining the Browns as the third overall pick in 2007. It is the longest active stretch in the league and believed to be the longest in NFL history. The 2007 first round pick has been selected to the Pro Bowl in each of his 10 NFL seasons. Thomas joins Pro Football Hall of Famers Merlin Olsen (14), Mel Renfro (10), Barry Sanders (10) and Lawrence Taylor (10) as the only players in NFL history to make the Pro Bowl in each of their first 10 seasons. Thomas' streak of 10 consecutive Pro Bowls is the longest active streak in the NFL.

Rookie QB **DeShone Kizer** completed 20 of 30 passes for 222 yards with one touchdown and one rushing touchdown against Pittsburgh. Kizer's 66.7 completion percentage was the second-highest of the nine rookies first start at quarterback for the Browns since 1999. He is also the first Browns rookie to throw a touchdown pass in his debut start since **Colt McCoy** in 2010. Kizer joined **Brandon Weeden** (2012) as the only rookie quarterbacks to start a season opener for the Browns.

WR **Corey Coleman** led the team in receptions (five) and receiving yards (53) with one touchdown against Pittsburgh. He has four receiving touchdowns in 11 career games. In 2016, he tied for sixth among all NFL rookies with three touchdown receptions, despite only playing 10 games.

Defensively, the Browns limited the Steelers to 290 yards. A trio of 2016 draft picks led the way as LB **Joe Schobert** (fourth round) led the team with a career-high nine tackles, DB **Derrick Kindred** (fourth round) recorded his first career interception and DL **Carl Nassib** (second round) added a sack.

RB **Isaiah Crowell** rushed for 33 yards and added a two-point conversion against the Steelers. With 2,298 career rushing yards, he moved into ninth place on the Browns all-time rushing list, passing **Bobby Mitchell** (2,297) and **Cleo Miller** (2,286). Last year, Crowell finished with a career-high 952 rushing yards, the most by a Brown since 2010.

The Browns made a number of moves to bolster their roster for 2017. In addition to adding 10 draft picks, including three in the first round, the Browns signed contract extensions with OL **Joel Bitonio**, LB **Jamie Collins Sr.** and LB **Christian Kirksey**. The team signed free agents WR **Kenny Britt**, DB **Jason McCourty**, OL **JC Tretter** and OL **Kevin Zeitler**. Cleveland also acquired WR **Sammie Coates** via trade.

Coaching capsules:

Cleveland – Hue Jackson: 9-24, third season as head coach, second with the Browns.

Hue Jackson was named the 16th full-time head coach in Cleveland Browns history on January 13, 2016. He enters his 31st year as a coach, including the last 17 in the NFL. He has spent 10 seasons coaching in the AFC North, helping his team advance to the postseason seven times over that span. Jackson was head coach of the Oakland Raiders in 2011 and guided the team to an 8-8 record. He has also served as offensive coordinator in Washington (2003), Atlanta (2007), Oakland (2010) and Cincinnati (2014-15). Jackson spent 14 years coaching on the college level and was a quarterback at Pacific from 1985-86.

Baltimore – John Harbaugh: 85-59, 10th season as head coach.

John Harbaugh enters his 10th season at the helm in Baltimore. He has led the Ravens to a playoff berth six (2008-2012, 2014) times, and in 2012, captured the franchise's second Super Bowl championship. Under Harbaugh's guidance, the Ravens have secured an appearance in three AFC Championship games (2008, 2011-12). Harbaugh spent his first 10 NFL seasons (1998-07) with the Philadelphia Eagles. He was the team's secondary coach in 2007, after nine seasons as special teams coordinator. He was voted the 2001 NFL Special Teams Coach of the Year by his coaching peers.

NOTABLE CONNECTIONS

- Ravens general manager **Ozzie Newsome** was selected by the Browns in the first round (23rd overall) of the 1978 NFL Draft and was enshrined in the Pro Football Hall of Fame in 1999. After his playing career, Newsome got his start in the front office with the Browns' pro personnel department from 1991-95.
- Head Coach **Hue Jackson** served as Baltimore's quarterbacks coach from 2008-09.
- Senior offensive assistant **Al Saunders** spent two seasons (2009-10) on the Ravens' coaching staff.
- DL **Trevon Coley** was originally signed by the Ravens as an undrafted free agent on May 6, 2016.
- DL **Jamie Meder** was originally signed by Baltimore as an undrafted free agent in 2014 and spent time on the club's practice squad.
- Ravens defensive line coach **Joe Cullen** held the same role with the Browns in 2013.
- Ravens senior personnel assistant **George Kokinis** began his NFL career working in the Browns' scouting department (1991-95) after serving an internship with the team's operations department. He also served as general manager for part of the 2009 season.
- Ravens RB **Terrance West** was a third-round pick by the Browns in 2014.
- Ravens TE **Benjamin Watson** spent three seasons (2010-12) with the Browns.
- Ravens special teams coordinator/associate head coach **Jerry Rosberg** was the special teams coordinator for the Browns from 2001-06.
- Ravens defensive backs coach **Chris Hewitt** served as an intern with the Browns in 2001 through the NFL's Minority Coaching Fellowship Program.
- Ravens head coach **John Harbaugh** attended Miami (Ohio) University where he won the Football Scholar Athlete Award as a defensive back.
- Ravens senior vice president of football administration **Pat Moriarty** began his playing career as a rookie free agent RB with the Browns in 1979. After his playing days, he went on to join the Browns' front office as the club's director of business operations from 1994-95. He is a native of Cleveland, Ohio.
- Ravens WR **Chris Matthews** was originally signed by the Browns as an undrafted free agent in 2011 and spent training camp with the team.
- Ravens Midwest area scout **Dwaune Jones** originally signed with the Browns as a rookie free agent in 2000.

WHAT TO LOOK FOR THIS WEEK

The Browns are looking for their first road win since a 33-30 overtime victory at Baltimore on Oct. 11, 2015.

DL Joe Thomas

With four plays, he will reach 10,000 consecutive snaps. It's believed to be the longest streak in NFL history.

RB Isaiah Crowell

With 81 yards from scrimmage, he would become the first Browns running back to reach 3,000 total yards in his first four career seasons since Eric Metcalf in 1989-92.

With 100 rushing yards, he would record his sixth career 100-yard rushing game and tie him for first on the Browns' 100-yard rushing games list since 1999 (William Green, Peyton Hillis and Jamal Lewis).

QB DeShone Kizer

With a rushing TD, would join Jake Delhomme (1999), Chris Weinke (2001), Cam Newton (2011) and Robert Griffin III (2012) as the only quarterbacks since 1999 to rush for two TDs in their first two career games.

RB Duke Johnson Jr.

Needs 27 receiving yards for the second-most in that category (1,095) among active running backs since 2015.

WR Kenny Britt

Is 106 receiving yards away from reaching 5,000 for his career.

DL Danny Shelton

Needs four stops to reach 100 total tackles for his career.

DB Jason McCourty

Needs four tackles to reach 500 total tackles since he entered the league in 2009.

The Baltimore Ravens defeated the Cleveland Browns, 28-7, on Thursday Night at M&T Bank Stadium. Both teams were held scoreless in the first quarter as the Browns defense forced consecutive punts on the Ravens first two possessions. On Baltimore's third drive of the game, rookie DB Brian Boddy-Calhoun recorded his second INT of the season on a pass from Ravens QB Joe Flacco, bringing Baltimore's scoring chance to a halt as the first quarter came to a close. In the second quarter, the Ravens struck first as K Justin Tucker split the uprights on a 25-yard field goal attempt to gain a 3-0 advantage. Cleveland responded on the ensuing possession as rookie QB Cody Kessler capped a seven-play, 75-yard drive with a 25-yard TD pass to fellow rookie TE Seth DeValve. The TD reception was DeValve's first in the NFL and gave the Browns a 7-3 lead. As time expired in the half, Tucker converted one more field goal attempt - this time from 40-yards away - to leave Baltimore trailing just 7-6 at halftime. The Ravens also struck first in the third quarter when Flacco connected with TE Darren Waller on a 4-yard TD pass, finishing a nine-play, 64-yard Baltimore drive and regaining the lead, 13-7. Two possessions later, Flacco threw his second TD pass of the quarter when he found WR Steve Smith Sr. on an 11-yard TD strike. The Ravens converted on the ensuing two-point conversion attempt as Flacco connected on a pass to FB Kyle Juszczyk to give them a 21-7 edge with just over two minutes remaining in the third. The final points of the game came in the fourth quarter via a 27-yard TD pass from Flacco to WR Breshad Perriman, capping a 12-play, 90-yard drive and extending the Baltimore lead to 28-7.

WR Corey Coleman - Led the team with five receptions for 53 yards against the Steelers in Week 1...Also registered his fourth career receiving TD in 11 games played...Selected by the Browns 15th overall in the 2016 NFL Draft.

LT Joe Thomas - 10-time Pro Bowl selection who has started at left tackle in all 161 career contests...Has not missed an offensive snap since being selected as the third overall pick in the 2007 NFL Draft...Four plays away from 10,000 consecutive offensive snaps.

OL Joel Bitonio - Started all 32 games he's appeared in since being drafted by the Browns in the second round (35th overall) of the 2014 NFL Draft...Inked a five-year contract extension in March.

C JC Tretter - Made his first start as a Brown in Week 1 against Pittsburgh...Played in 32 career games with 11 starts...Originally selected by the Green Bay Packers in the fourth round (122nd overall) of the 2013 NFL Draft...Signed by the Browns as an unrestricted free agent on March 9, 2017.

RG Kevin Zeitler - Saw his first action as a Brown last week and has now started 72 of 73 career games since being drafted by the Cincinnati Bengals in the first round (27th overall) of the 2012 NFL Draft...Joined the Browns as an unrestricted free agent on March 9, 2017.

RT Shon Coleman - Made the first start of his NFL career in Week 1...Selected by the Browns in the third round of the 2016 NFL Draft...Diagnosed with leukemia in 2010 and was cleared to return to football in 2012.

TE Randall Telfer - Started against Pittsburgh last week and has now played in 15 career games with six starts...Selected by the Browns in the sixth round of the 2015 NFL Draft out of USC.

WR Kenny Britt - Caught a 13-yard pass in his first action as a Brown in Week 1...Signed by the Browns as an unrestricted free agent on March 9, 2017.

Gregg Williams was named the Browns defensive coordinator on Jan. 7, 2017. Williams is in his 27th season in the NFL, including three as a head coach and 16 as a defensive coordinator. His defenses have finished in the top five in total defense five times, including the top defense in the NFL in 2000. Williams also oversaw a Saints defensive unit that won Super Bowl XLIV and a Titans defense that advanced to Super Bowl XXXIV. Williams spent the past three seasons (2014-16) as the defensive coordinator for the St. Louis/Los Angeles Rams. In 2016, the Rams defense finished in the top 10 in the NFL in total defense and passing defense.

WILSON SPEARHEADS RUN GAME

Kirby Wilson was named the Browns running backs coach/run game coordinator in 2016. He has 19 years of experience coaching running backs in the NFL, during which time he has coached five running backs who rank in the top 25 for career rushing yards (Emmitt Smith #1, Curtis Martin #4, Edgerrin James #12, Adrian Peterson #16 and Thomas Jones #25) and two of the top four all-time reception leaders among running backs (Larry Centers #1 and Keith Byers #4). Wilson has helped seven different running backs break the 1,000-yard plateau a total of eight times. He has mentored four players to the Pro Bowl and has been to the playoffs with four different franchises, highlighted by the 2002 Buccaneers and 2008 Steelers Super Bowl victories. In Wilson's first season in Cleveland, the Browns finished second in the NFL with a 4.89 rushing average. The average was the seventh-best in team history and the team's best mark since 1966.

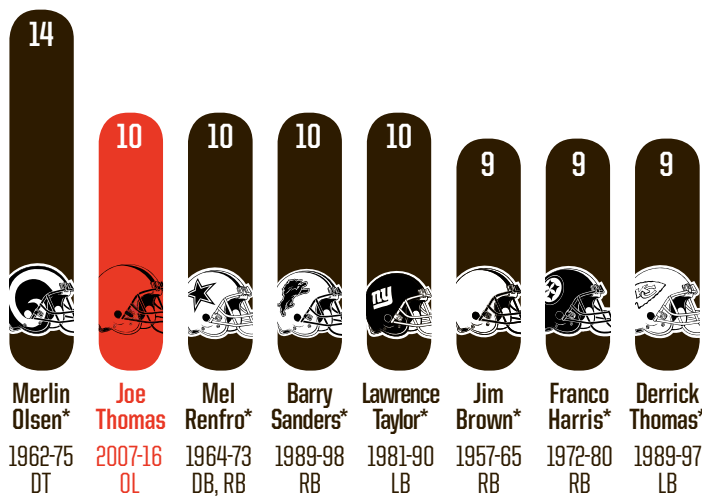

RB **Isaiah Crowell** rushed for 33 yards and added a two-point conversion against the Steelers. With 2,298 career rushing yards, he moved into ninth place on the Browns all-time rushing list, passing **Bobby Mitchell** (2,297) and **Cleo Miller** (2,286). Last year, Crowell finished with a career-high 952 rushing yards, the most by a Brown since **Peyton Hillis** rushed for 1,177 yards in 2010. Crowell had the longest run in the NFL last season, an 85-yard touchdown run against the Ravens on Sept. 18, the second-longest in Browns history. His four runs of 50-plus yards since 2015 are the most in the NFL. Crowell's 19 career rushing touchdowns are tied for the fifth-most by a Browns player in his first four seasons.

COLEMAN FINDS END ZONE

WR **Corey Coleman** led the team in receptions (five) and receiving yards (53) with one touchdown against Pittsburgh. He has four receiving touchdowns in 11 career games. In 2016, he tied for sixth among all NFL rookies with three touchdown receptions, despite only playing 10 games.

KIZER'S DEBUT

Rookie QB **DeShone Kizer** completed 20 of 30 passes for 222 yards with one touchdown and one rushing touchdown against Pittsburgh. Kizer's 66.7 completion percentage was the second-highest of the nine rookies to start at quarterback for the Browns since 1999. He is also the first Browns rookie to throw a touchdown pass in his debut start since **Colt McCoy** in 2010. Kizer joined **Brandon Weeden** (2012) as the only rookie quarterbacks to start a season opener for the Browns. At 21 years and 250 days, Kizer tied Buccaneers Jameis Winston (2015) as the third-youngest quarterback to start an NFL season opener since 1963, trailing Drew Bledsoe (1993) and Matthew Stafford (2009).

2016 DRAFT CLASS SHINES

Several members of the Browns 2016 draft class had an impact during the team's season opener. WR **Corey Coleman** (first round) led the team with five receptions for 53 yards and a touchdown. DL **Emmanuel Ogbah** (second round) started at defensive end and helped limited Pittsburgh to 290 yards, including holding Pro Bowl RB Le'Veon Bell to his lowest rushing total (32 yards) since 2014. DL **Carl Nassib** (third round) recorded a sack. OL **Shon Coleman** (third round) played every snap at right tackle. TE **Seth DeValve** (fourth round) added four receptions for 42 yards. LB **Joe Schobert** (fourth round) led the team with a career high nine tackles, while DB **Derrick Kindred** (fourth round) recorded his first career interception.

HEAD COACH HUE JACKSON



Hue Jackson was named the 16th full-time head coach in Cleveland Browns history by Dee and Jimmy Haslam on January 13, 2016. He has 30 years of coaching experience, including the last 16 in the NFL. He has spent 10 seasons coaching in the AFC North, during which time he helped his team advance to the postseason seven times. Jackson was head coach of the Oakland Raiders in 2011 and guided the team to an 8-8 record. He has also served as offensive coordinator in Washington (2003), Atlanta (2007), Oakland (2010) and Cincinnati (2014-15).

In his first year with Cleveland, he helped the Browns finish second in the NFL with a 4.89 rushing average, the team's best mark since 1966. Linebacker Christian Kirksey finished third in the NFL with 148 tackles, while left tackle Joe Thomas was selected to his 10th career Pro Bowl.

Jackson helped develop one of the youngest teams in NFL history. The Browns opened the 2016 season with 17 rookies on their 53-man roster, the most by an NFL team in a season opener since 2002. First-round pick wide receiver Corey Coleman was named NFL Rookie of the Week after a 104-yard, two touchdown performance in Week 2. Second-round pick defensive lineman Emmanuel Ogbah recorded a team-best 5.5 sacks, tied for the fourth-most by a Browns rookie. Third-round pick quarterback Cody Kessler registered the second-highest single-game passing yardage total by a Browns rookie with 336 in Week 6.

Prior to joining the Browns, Jackson spent the previous four seasons (2012-15) with the Cincinnati Bengals. During that time, he helped the Bengals to two division titles and a trip to the postseason all four years. In 2012, he served as secondary/assistant special teams coach before coaching the running backs in 2013. Jackson spent 2014-15 as offensive coordinator.

With Jackson as coordinator in 2015, the Bengals offense finished third in the AFC in yards per play (5.7) and points per game (26.2). He was voted by the Professional Football Writers of America (PFWA) as the Co-Assistant Coach of the Year as quarterback Andy Dalton set a career high and franchise record with a 106.3 rating, which led the AFC and was second in the NFL. After losing Dalton to injury in Week 14, Jackson guided quarterback A.J. McCarron to a 2-1 record in the final three games of the season as the Bengals clinched the AFC North title. The Cincinnati running game produced two 700-yard rushers in Jeremy Hill (794) and Giovani Bernard (730) for the first time since 1988. Tight end Tyler Eifert experienced a breakout season after hauling in 13 touchdown receptions, the most by a Bengals tight end in franchise history and the most by a Cincinnati player since 2001. Wide receiver A.J. Green added 10 receiving touchdowns on 86 receptions for 1,297 yards. Eifert, Green and left tackle Andrew Whitworth were selected to the Pro Bowl.

In Jackson's first year as offensive coordinator for Cincinnati in 2014, the run game posted its highest yards per game average (134.1) since 2000. Dalton passed for 3,398 yards and Green totaled 1,041 receiving yards. Hill led all NFL rookies with 1,124 rushing yards, the second-most by a Bengals rookie in team history.

After spending the 2010 season as the Raiders offensive coordinator, Jackson was promoted to head coach in 2011. Oakland finished the year 8-8 and tied for first in the AFC West but missed

the postseason via tiebreaker. The 8-8 mark was the best record by any Raiders team since 2002. The Raiders finished ninth in the NFL in total offense (379.5 yards per game) and seventh in rushing offense (131.9).

Before joining the Raiders, Jackson spent two seasons (2008-09) as quarterbacks coach for Baltimore, helping the Ravens advance to the playoffs both years. He was vital in the development of Joe Flacco, who was named NFL Rookie of the Year in 2008 and became the first rookie quarterback to win two playoff games as the Ravens advanced to the AFC Championship game.

From 2004-06, Jackson served as the Bengals wide receivers coach, helping develop one of the best wide receiver tandems in NFL history with Chad Johnson and T.J. Houshmandzadeh. During that span, the two combined to average 173.3 catches, 2,363.3 receiving yards and 15 touchdowns per season. In 2005, Johnson led the AFC with 1,432 receiving yards. In 2006, Johnson and Houshmandzadeh became the first Bengals duo to each top 1,000 receiving yards in the same season.

Jackson gained his first fulltime NFL experience with Washington, where he served as the running backs coach from 2001-02, before being promoted to offensive coordinator in 2003. Under Jackson's tutelage, running back Stephen Davis led the NFC with 1,432 rushing yards in 2001.

Jackson spent 14 years coaching on the college level, going from a graduate assistant at Pacific all the way to offensive coordinator at Southern California. He spent four seasons (1997-2000) as USC's offensive coordinator, where he also helped to recruit and develop players, including quarterback Carson Palmer, who went on to win the Heisman Trophy and be selected No. 1 overall in the NFL draft.

He was a minority coaching fellowship intern with the Los Angeles Rams in 1990, Arizona Cardinals in 1992 and Washington Redskins in 1995. He also served as the running backs/wide receivers/special teams coach for the London Monarchs of the World League in 1991.

Born Oct. 22, 1965, Jackson was a quarterback at Pacific from 1985-86 and threw for 2,544 yards and 19 touchdowns. The Los Angeles native also lettered in basketball and earned his degree in physical education.

Jackson and his wife, Michelle, have three daughters, Jordyn, Baylee and Haydyn.

The Hue Jackson Foundation

Hue Jackson and his wife, Michelle, launched the Hue Jackson Foundation on July 20, 2017. The foundation is committed to empowering children, teen and adult survivors of human trafficking through the funding of organizations that champion for and serve as a voice for those who are exploited. The foundation also focuses its efforts to further awareness, prevention and healing for victims of human trafficking. The foundation's website is www.huejackson.org.

FirstEnergy Stadium, Cleveland, Ohio

The Cleveland Browns dropped the 2017 season opener to the Pittsburgh Steelers, 21-18. Despite limiting the Steelers to 290 yards, two touchdown receptions by Steelers TE Jesse James proved to be the difference in the contest. On the game's opening possession, Pittsburgh forced a three-and-out and on fourth down, deep in Browns' territory, its special teams unit opened the scoring. LB Tyler Matakevich blocked Britton Colquitt's punt and Steelers LB Anthony Chickillo recovered it in the end zone for a touchdown to give the Steelers an early 7-0 advantage. Later in the quarter, rookie QB DeShone Kizer led the team on a 12-play, 68-yard drive, which he capped off by sneaking into the end zone from a yard out to even the scoring. With 45 seconds left in the first half, Steelers QB Ben Roethlisberger found James in the back of the end zone for a 4-yard score to give Pittsburgh a 14-7 lead heading into the locker room. As Cleveland's defense forced a three-and-out on Pittsburgh's first possession of the second half, Kizer led the offense down the field and set up fellow rookie K Zane Gonzalez, who notched a 24-yard field goal to cut Pittsburgh's lead to 14-10. On the game's next possession, Roethlisberger marched the Steelers 75 yards down the field and connected with James again for his second touchdown reception on the afternoon to extend their lead to 21-10. Late in the fourth quarter, DB Derrick Kindred picked off Roethlisberger and returned it 30 yards to the Cleveland 31-yard line. Later in the quarter, on fourth-and-two from the 3-yard line, Kizer hit WR Corey Coleman at the goal line for a touchdown, the first touchdown pass of his career. RB Isaiah Crowell punched in a two-point conversion to cut the lead to 21-18, but Pittsburgh would not let Cleveland get the ball back as they sealed 21-18 victory.
