NOTABLE STORYLINES

🕵 The Browns travel to Indianapolis to face the Colts at 1:00 p.m. on Sunday, Sept. 24. The Browns hold a 15-14 advantage in the all-time series, including a 10-6 record on the road.

🕵 In the first quarter against the Ravens, OL Joe Thomas surpassed 10,000 consecutive offensive snaps in his career. He extended his streak to 10,062, the longest active stretch in the league and believed to be the longest in NFL history. The 10-time Pro Bowler has started the past 162 games at left tackle, which is also the longest active streak in the NFL among offensive linemen.

處 The Browns are tied for third in the NFL with 11 passing plays of 20-plus yards this season. Eight different players have hauled in passes of 20-plus yards, the most of any team in the league.

🕵 LB Christian Kirksey tied for the team lead with nine tackles and added his first sack of the season at Baltimore (9/17). He finished third in the league in tackles last season. In May, the Browns inked the 2014 third-round pick to a fourvear contract extension.

處 WR Rashard Higgins, who was signed off the practice squad one day prior to the Ravens game, set career highs in receptions (seven) and receiving yards (95). Higgins, a fifthround pick in 2016, recorded six receptions for 77 yards all of last season.

🕵 Rookie TE David Njoku recorded three receptions for 27 yards and a touchdown at Baltimore. In the second quarter, he hauled in a 23-yard score for his first career touchdown. Among all rookie tight ends this season, he is tied for first in touchdowns (one), second in receptions (five) and third in vards (47). He is tied for third among all NFL rookies in touchdown receptions.

🕵 RB Duke Johnson Jr. registered three receptions for 59 vards, including a 34-vard catch at Baltimore. The 34-vard reception tied for the second-longest of his career. Last season, he became the first Browns running back to record 500 receiving yards in each of his first two NFL seasons. He joined Dub Jones (1951-52) and Earnest Byner (1987-1988) as the only running backs in franchise history to accomplish the feat in back-to-back seasons. Johnson finished second among all NFL rookies with 61 receptions in 2015. Among all NFL running backs since 2015, Johnson ranks second in receiving yards (1,127) and fourth in receptions (119).

Cleveland -- Hue Jackson: 9-25, third season as head coach, second with the Browns.

Hue Jackson was named the 16th full-time head coach in Cleveland Browns history on January 13, 2016. He enters his 31st year as a coach, including the last 17 in the NFL. He has spent 10 seasons coaching in the AFC North, helping his team advance to the postseason seven times over that span. Jackson was head coach of the Oakland Raiders in 2011 and guided the team to an 8-8 record. He has also served as offensive coordinator in Washington (2003), Atlanta (2007), Oakland (2010) and Cincinnati (2014-15). Jackson spent 14 years coaching on the college level and was a guarterback at Pacific from 1985-86.

Indianapolis -- Chuck Pagano: 49-33, sixth season as head coach.

Named head coach of the Colts on January 25, 2012, Chuck Pagano led the team to an AFC South Division Championship in 2013. The 2017 season marks Pagano's 35th year of coaching and 17th season in the NFL. Prior to joining the Colts, he spent four seasons with the Baltimore Ravens, the last (2011) as the team's defensive coordinator, and two years as the defensive backs coach for the Oakland Raiders. Pagano began his NFL coaching career with the Cleveland Browns, where he coached the secondary from 2001-04.

WHAT TO LOOK FOR THIS WEEK

The Browns are looking for their first road win since a 33-30 overtime victory at Baltimore on Oct. 11, 2015.

With a win, the Browns would improve to 16-14 (.533) alltime against the Colts in the regular season and 11-6 (.648) as the away team.

RB Isaiah Crowell

With 44 yards from scrimmage, would became the fifth Browns player to record 3,000 scrimmage yards since the team returned in 1999.

With 100 rushing vards, would record his sixth career 100yard rushing game and tie him for first on the Browns' 100-yard rushing games list since 1999 (Williams Green, Peyton Hillis and Jamal Lewis.

His next rushing TD will mark the 20th of his career.

Is 79 receiving yards away from 700 for his career. The mark would also make him the first Browns running back since Kevin Mack (1985-88) to record at least 2,300 rushing yards and 700 receiving yards in his first four NFL seasons.

OL Joe Thomas

Has started all 162 career games and has not missed an offensive snap since joining the Browns as the third overall selection of the 2007 draft. His consecutive snaps streak of 10,062 is the longest active stretch in the league and beleived to be the longest in NFL history.

TE David Njoku

A receiving TD will make him the first Browns rookie tight end to record multiple TDs in his first three career games.

WR Kenny Britt

Is 104 receiving yards away from reaching 5,000 for his career.

Needs 90 yards from scrimmage to total 5,000 since entering the league in 2009.

WR Sammie Coates

Is 54 receiving yards away from 500 for his career.

The Browns fell to the visiting Colts in the final seconds, 25-24, despite coming away with four takeaways and scoring 17 points off of turnovers. Cleveland's first points were scored after LB Craig Robertson recovered a Colts fumble in the end zone. On the play, LB Paul Kruger notched his ninth sack of the season, while stripping QB Andrew Luck. Indianapolis tied the game, 7-7, with 5:57 to play in the second quarter after Luck crossed the goal line on an 11-yard run. Rookie RB Isaiah Crowell capped a 9-play, 77-yard drive with a 9-yard rushing score to take back the lead, 14-7, heading into halftime. The Browns defense came away with another takeaway on the first drive of the second half after DB Joe Haden forced a fumble at the Indianapolis 38-yard line. Kruger recovered the fumble on the play. Later in the contest, rookie DB Justin Gilbert picked off Luck for his first career interception, returning it 23 yards for a touchdown. The Colts drew closer after K Adam Vinatieri converted on a 51-yard field goal with 7:16 to play in the third quarter. Indianapolis scored on its next offensive drive after Luck found WR T.Y. Hilton for a 42-yard touchdown, but failed on a two-point conversion attempt. Vinatieri split the uprights from 33 yards out to make the score 21-19 at the start of the fourth quarter. After Indianapolis started at their own 8-yard line and drove to midfield, Browns DB Jim Leonhard intercepted Luck, returning it 34 yards with 10:21 to play in the contest. The turnover set up a 39-yard Billy Cundiff field goal at the 8:34 mark in the fourth quarter. Luck capped an 11-play, 90-yard drive with a 1-yard touchdown pass to Hilton with 32 second left in regulation, marking the Colts' first lead of the game. QB Brian Hoyer was picked off with two seconds remaining by CB Josh Gordy to seal the Indianapolis victory.

OL Joel Bitonio - Started all 33 games he's appeared in since being drafted by the Browns in the second round (35th overall) of the 2014 NFL Draft...Inked a five-year contract extension in March.

C JC Tretter - Started at center in both regular season games this season...Originally selected by the Green Bay Packers in the fourth round (122nd overall) of the 2013 NFL Draft... Signed by the Browns as an unrestricted free agent on March 9, 2017.

TE Randall Telfer - Caught one pass for a career-long 20 yards against the Ravens last week...Selected by the Browns in the sixth round of the 2015 NFL Draft out of USC.

WR Kenny Britt - Recorded two receptions for 15 yards this season...Signed by the Browns as an unrestricted free agent on March 9, 2017...Totaled 1,002 receiving yards last season.

QB DeShone Kizer - Became just the second Browns rookie QB to start a season opener against the Steelers in Week 1... Has completed 35 of 61 passes for 404 yards and a TD in 2017... Left the Week 2 matchup in Baltimore with a migraine, but returned...Drafted by the Browns in the second round (52nd overall) of the 2017 NFL Draft.

RB Isaiah Crowell - Has rushed for a team-leading 70 yards on 27 carries this season...Moved into ninth place on the Browns all-time rushing list against the Steelers in Week 1...Originally came to the Browns as an undrafted free agent out of Alabama State.

FB Danny Vitale - Saw action in both games this year...Signed by the Browns off the Buccaneers' practice squad in Week 6... Originally a sixth-round draft pick by Tampa Bay in 2016 out of Northwestern.

QB Kevin Hogan - Saw his first action of the 2017 season when he relieved Kizer in the second quarter against the Ravens...Converted five of 11 passes for 118 yards and tossed his first career TD (23-yards)...Originally a fifth-round draft pick by the Chiefs in 2016 out of Stanford.

RB Duke Johnson Jr. - Was second on the team in receiving against the Ravens with three receptions for 59 yards and a long of 34, tied for the second-longest of his career...Has rushed four times for 21 yards and caught five passes for 79 yards on the year...Selected by the Browns in the third round of the 2015 NFL Draft.

QB Cody Kessler - Inactive in Weeks 1 and 2...Completed 128 of 195 attempts for 1,380 yards with six TDs in nine games (eight starts) last season...Selected by the Browns in the third round of the 2016 NFL Draft.

WR Ricardo Louis - Caught four passes for 59 yards this season...His 16.0 receiving average in Week 1 matched a singlegame career high...Selected by the Browns in the fourth round of the 2016 NFL Draft.

Williams also oversaw a Saints defensive unit that won Super Bowl XLIV and a Titans defense that advanced to Super Bowl XXIV. Williams spent the past three seasons (2014-16) as the defensive coordinator for the St. Louis/Los Angeles Rams. In 2016, the Rams defense finished in the top 10 in the NFL in total defense and passing defense.

🖬 WILSON SPEARHEADS RUN GAME 💳

Kirby Wilson was named the Browns running backs coach/ run game coordinator in 2016. He has 19 years of experience coaching running backs in the NFL, during which time he has coached five running backs who rank in the top 25 for career rushing yards (Emmitt Smith #1, Curtis Martin #4, Edgerrin James #12, Adrian Peterson #16 and Thomas Jones #25) and two of the top four all-time reception leaders among running backs (Larry Centers #1 and Keith Byers #4). Wilson has helped seven different running backs break the 1.000-vard plateau a total of eight times. He has mentored four players to the Pro Bowl and has been to the playoffs with four different franchises, highlighted by the 2002 Buccaneers and 2008 Steelers Super Bowl victories. In Wilson's first season in Cleveland, the Browns finished second in the NFL with a 4.89 rushing average. The average was the seventh-best in team history and the team's best mark since 1966.



Last year, Crowell finished with a career-high 952 rushing yards, the most by a Brown since **Peyton Hillis** rushed for 1,177 yards in 2010. Crowell had the longest run in the NFL in 2016, an 85-yard touchdown run against the Ravens on Sept. 18, the second-longest in Browns history. His four runs of 50-plus yards since 2015 are the most in the NFL. Crowell's 19 career rushing touchdowns are tied for the fifth-most by a Browns player in his first four seasons.

Last season, he became the first Browns running back to record 500 receiving yards in each of his first two NFL seasons. TASTE OF THE BROWNS

On Monday, the Browns, players and alumni and Greater Cleveland Food Bank hosted the 19th Annual Taste of the Browns at FirstEnergy Stadium. This year's honorary co-hosts were OL Joe Thomas, Josh Cribbs and celebrity chef Rocco Whalen. Hue Jackson was named the 16th full-time head coach in Cleveland Browns history by Dee and Jimmy Haslam on January 13, 2016. He has 30 years of coaching experience, including the last 16 in the NFL. He has spent 10 seasons coaching in the AFC North, during which time he helped his team advance to the postseason seven times. Jackson was head coach of the Oakland Raiders in 2011 and guided the team to an 8-8 record. He has also served as offensive coordinator in Washington (2003), Atlanta (2007), Oakland (2010) and Cincinnati (2014-15).

In his first year with Cleveland, he helped the Browns finish second in the NFL with a 4.89 rushing average, the team's best mark since 1966. Linebacker Christian Kirksey finished third in the NFL with 148 tackles, while left tackle Joe Thomas was selected to his 10th career Pro Bowl.

Jackson helped develop one of the youngest teams in NFL history. The Browns opened the 2016 season with 17 rookies on their 53-man roster, the most by an NFL team in a season opener since 2002. First-round pick wide receiver Corey Coleman was named NFL Rookie of the Week after a 104-yard, two touchdown performance in Week 2. Second-round pick defensive lineman Emmanuel Ogbah recorded a team-best 5.5 sacks, tied for the fourth-most by a Browns rookie. Third-round pick quarterback Cody Kessler registered the second-highest single-game passing yardage total by a Browns rookie with 336 in Week 6.

Prior to joining the Browns, Jackson spent the previous four seasons (2012-15) with the Cincinnati Bengals. During that time, he helped the Bengals to two division titles and a trip to the postseason all four years. In 2012, he served as secondary/assistant special teams coach before coaching the running backs in 2013. Jackson spent 2014-15 as offensive coordinator.

With Jackson as coordinator in 2015, the Bengals offense finished third in the AFC in yards per play (5.7) and points per game (26.2). He was voted by the Professional Football Writers of America (PFWA) as the Co-Assistant Coach of the Year as quarterback Andy Dalton set a career high and franchise record with a 106.3 rating, which led the AFC and was second in the NFL. After losing Dalton to injury in Week 14, Jackson guided quarterback A.J. McCarron to a 2-1 record in the final three games of the season as the Bengals clinched the AFC North title. The Cincinnati running game produced two 700-yard rushers in Jeremy Hill (794) and Giovani Bernard (730) for the first time since 1988. Tight end Tyler Eifert experienced a breakout season after hauling in 13 touchdown receptions, the most by a Bengals tight end in franchise history and the most by a Cincinnati player since 2001. Wide receiver A.J. Green added 10 receiving touchdowns on 86 receptions for 1,297 yards. Eifert, Green and left tackle Andrew Whitworth were selected to the Pro Bowl.

In Jackson's first year as offensive coordinator for Cincinnati in 2014, the run game posted its highest yards per game average (134.1) since 2000. Dalton passed for 3,398 yards and Green to taled 1,041 receiving yards. Hill led all NFL rookies with 1,124 rushing yards, the second-most by a Bengals rookie in team history.

After spending the 2010 season as the Raiders offensive coordinator, Jackson was promoted to head coach in 2011. Oakland finished the year 8-8 and tied for first in the AFC West but missed the postseason via tiebreaker. The 8-8 mark was the best record by any Raiders team since 2002. The Raiders finished ninth in the NFL in total offense (379.5 yards per game) and seventh in rushing offense (131.9).

Before joining the Raiders, Jackson spent two seasons (2008-09) as quarterbacks coach for Baltimore, helping the Ravens advance to the playoffs both years. He was vital in the development of Joe Flacco, who was named NFL Rookie of the Year in 2008 and became the first rookie quarterback to win two playoff games as the Ravens advanced to the AFC Championship game.

From 2004-06, Jackson served as the Bengals wide receivers coach, helping develop one of the best wide receiver tandems in NFL history with Chad Johnson and T.J. Houshmandzadeh. During that span, the two combined to average 173.3 catches, 2,363.3 receiving yards and 15 touchdowns per season. In 2005, Johnson led the AFC with 1,432 receiving yards. In 2006, Johnson and Houshmandzadeh became the first Bengals duo to each top 1,000 receiving yards in the same season.

Jackson gained his first fulltime NFL experience with Washington, where he served as the running backs coach from 2001-02, before being promoted to offensive coordinator in 2003. Under Jackson's tutelage, running back Stephen Davis led the NFC with 1,432 rushing yards in 2001.

Jackson spent 14 years coaching on the college level, going from a graduate assistant at Pacific all the way to offensive coordinator at Southern California. He spent four seasons (1997-2000) as USC's offensive coordinator, where he also helped to recruit and develop players, including quarterback Carson Palmer, who went on to win the Heisman Trophy and be selected No. 1 overall in the NFL draft.

He was a minority coaching fellowship intern with the Los Angeles Rams in 1990, Arizona Cardinals in 1992 and Washington Redskins in 1995. He also served as the running backs/wide receivers/special teams coach for the London Monarchs of the World League in 1991.

Born Oct. 22, 1965, Jackson was a quarterback at Pacific from 1985-86 and threw for 2,544 yards and 19 touchdowns. The Los Angeles native also lettered in basketball and earned his degree in physical education.

Jackson and his wife, , Michelle, have three daughters, Jordyn, Baylee and Haydyn.

Hue Jackson and his wife, Michelle, launched the Hue Jackson Foundation on July 20, 2017. The foundation is committed to empowering children, teen and adult survivors of human trafficking through the funding of organizations that champion for and serve as a voice for those who are exploited. STEELERS 21 **BROWNS 18**



Sept. 10, 2017 FirstEnergy Stadium, Cleveland, Ohio

The Cleveland Browns dropped the 2017 season opener to the Pittsburgh Steelers, 21-18. Despite limiting the Steelers to 290 yards, two touchdown receptions by Steelers TE Jesse James proved to be the difference in the contest. On the game's opening possession. Pittsburgh forced a three-and-out and on fourth down, deep in Browns territory, its special teams unit opened the scoring. LB Tyler Matakevich blocked Britton Colquitt's punt and Steelers LB Anthony Chickillo recovered it in the end zone for a touchdown to give the Steelers an early 7-0 advantage. Later in the quarter, rookie QB DeShone Kizer led the team on a 12-play, 68-yard drive, which he capped off by sneaking into the end zone from a yard out to even the scoring. With 45 seconds left in the first half, Steelers QB Ben Roethlisberger found James in the back of the end zone for a 4-yard score to give Pittsburgh a 14-7 lead heading into the locker room. As Cleveland's defense forced a three-and-out on Pittsburgh's first possession of the second half, Kizer led the offense down the field and set up fellow rookie K Zane Gonzalez, who notched a 24-yard field goal to cut Pittsburgh's lead to 14-10. On the game's next possession, Roethlisberger marched the Steelers 75 yards down the field and connected with James again for his second touchdown reception on the afternoon to extend their lead to 21-10. Late in the fourth quarter, DB Derrick Kindred picked off Roethlisberger and returned it 30 yards to the Cleveland 31-yard line. Later in the quarter, on fourth-and-two from the 3-yard line, Kizer hit WR Corey Coleman at the goal line for a touchdown, the first touchdown pass of his career. RB Isaiah Crowell punched in a two-point conversion to cut the lead to 21-18, but Pittsburgh would not let Cleveland get the ball back as they sealed 21-18 victory.

RAVENS 24 BROWNS 10



Sept. 17, 2017 M&T Bank Stadium, Baltimore, Md.

The Cleveland Browns dropped their second game as Baltimore's defense forced five turnovers in a 24-10 Ravens victory. Early in the first quarter, a strip-sack by Ravens LB Terrell Suggs gave Baltimore's offense a short field and a 4-yard TD run by RB Terrence West for a 7-0 lead. Midway through the second quarter, Ravens QB Joe Flacco led Baltimore on a six-play, 64-yard drive capped by a 4-yard TD strike to RB Javorious Allen, extending the lead to 14-0. Replacing injured QB DeShone Kizer, QB Kevin Hogan responded with a five-play, 83-yard drive. Hogan connected with rookie TE David Njoku for a 23-yard TD, the first TD pass of Hogan's career and the first TD recep-tion of Njoku's, to cut the deficit, 14-7. Later in the second quarter, Ravens rookie LB Tyus Bowser intercepted a Hogan pass, resulting in a 27-yard return and a 2-yard TD pass from Flacco to WR Jeremy Maclin for a 21-7 Ravens lead at halftime. Midway through the third quarter, rookie K Zane Gonzalez connected on a 38-yard field goal to shrink Baltimore's lead, but Ravens K Justin Tucker converted a 28-yard field goal in the fourth quarter to make the score 24-10. On the game's next possession, Kizer marched the Browns 70 yards down the field before Ravens DB Lardarius Webb intercepted a Kizer pass in the end zone. Cleveland's offense wasn't able to muster any more points as Baltimore's defense sealed the 24-10 victory with a late fourth quarter stand. Early in the first quarter, OL Joe Thomas exceeded 10,000 straight snaps for his career, the longest-known streak in NFL history.
