PACKERS RETURN HOME TO HOST THE BENGALS

The Green Bay Packers take on the Cincinnati Bengals at Lambeau Field on Sunday afternoon.

- ▶ The Packers look to win their first two home games for the fifth consecutive season and for the seventh time in the last eight seasons.
- ▶ Including the postseason, Green Bay has won five consecutive games at Lambeau Field.
- ▶ Green Bay has started 1-1 for the fifth time in the last six years.
- ▶ The Packers have won seven of their last eight regular-season games.
- ▶ Six of the last seven contests between Green Bay and Cincinnati have been settled by seven points or less, including each of the last four.
- ▶ While the Packers are 4-3 as the home team against Cincinnati, they are 4-1 in Green Bay.
- ▶ The Bengals play in Green Bay for just the sixth time and the first time since 2009, when they won, 31-24.
- ▶ The Packers are looking to snap a three-game losing streak against Cincinnati and record their first victory over the Bengals since 1998.
- ▶ Green Bay and Cincinnati will meet for the sixth time in the month of September, including the fourth time in the last five times they have faced each other.
- ▶ Under Head Coach **Mike McCarthy** (since 2006), the Packers are 15-7 at home against AFC opponents. Green Bay's .682 winning percentage is tied with Philadelphia for **No. 3 in the NFC** and behind Arizona (16-6, .727) and Seattle (17-5, .773).
- ▶ Dating back to 2006, Green Bay has outscored AFC opponents by 178 points at Lambeau Field, ranking **No. 1 among NFC teams and No. 7 in the NFL**.
- ▶ The Packers are 4-1 in September home games versus AFC opponents under McCarthy. The last time Green Bay hosted an AFC team in September was in 2015, a 38-28 win over Kansas City.
- ▶ Since 2006, the Packers are 4-4 against AFC North teams during the regular season.
- ▶ LB **Clay Matthews** has two sacks and two forced fumbles in two games against the Bengals.
- ▶ Matthews (74.0) is a sack away from passing Kabeer Gbaja-Biamila (74.5, 2000-08) for the most in franchise history (since 1982).
- ▶ The Packers will play two games in five days, as they face the Chicago Bears at Lambeau Field on Thursday night. It is the 12th straight year that Green Bay and Chicago will meet in primetime and the third consecutive season that they will play on Thursday night.

WITH THE CALL

CBS will broadcast the game to a regional audience with play-by-play man **Jim Nantz** and analyst **Tony Romo** handling the call from the broadcast booth and **Tracy Wolfson** reporting from the sidelines.



- ▶ Milwaukee's WTMJ (620 AM), airing Green Bay games since November 1929, heads up the Packers Radio Network that is made up of 50 stations in five states. **Wayne Larrivee** (play-by-play) and two-time Packers Pro Bowler **Larry McCarren** (analyst) call the action. McCarren first joined the team's broadcasts in 1995 and enters his 23rd season calling Packers games. After originally being paired together in 1999, McCarren and Larrivee enter their 19th season of broadcasts together.
- ▶ Sports USA will air the game on radio across the country. **Larry Kahn** (play-by-play) and **Hank Bauer** (analyst) will call the action, with **Troy West** reporting from the sideline.
- ▶ The broadcast is also available on Sirius Satellite Radio (WTMJ feed).
- ▶ DIRECTV subscribers can watch the game on Channel 715.

HOME SWEET HOME

Green Bay has a long tradition of playing well at Lambeau Field.

- ▶ Green Bay is 1-0 this season and was 6-2 at home during the 2016 regular season. The Packers have finished with a record of .500 or better at home in 10 of the first 11 seasons under Head Coach **Mike McCarthy**.

- ▶ Green Bay's victory in Week 1 was the 218th at Lambeau Field, the most home wins by any franchise at one stadium in NFL history.
- ▶ The Packers are 10-2 (.833) in home openers under McCarthy, including 9-1 (.900) when QB **Aaron Rodgers** starts.
- ▶ Since the start of 2014, Green Bay is **tied for No. 2 in the NFL** in winning percentage at home during the regular season:

- ▶ In 2014, Green Bay's plus-155 point differential at home was the highest in franchise history (dating back to 1940), eclipsing the plus-151 in 1996.
- ▶ Dating back to 2014, Green Bay ranks **No. 1 in the NFL** in first-quarter scoring margin (plus-159) at home (according to pro-football-reference.com).
- ▶ Under McCarthy, Green Bay has scored 30-plus points at home during the regular season 39 times, winning 37 of those contests. The Packers' 39 home games with at least 30 points are **No. 3 in the league** since 2006:

SEPTEMBER STARTS

Under Head Coach **Mike McCarthy**, Green Bay has been one of the most successful teams in the league early in the season.

- ▶ The Packers opened the 2017 season with a 17-9 victory over Seattle at home. Green Bay has won its past five home openers and eight of its past 11 Kickoff Weekend games dating back to 2007.
- ▶ Under McCarthy, the Packers are 8-4 in regular-season openers, including a 5-2 mark at home.
- ▶ The Packers are 1-1 this season and have not lost consecutive games in the month of September since 2008.
- ▶ In 2016, Green Bay recorded its 55th win in a road opener, further extending the top mark in NFL history.
- ▶ In 2015, Green Bay went 3-0 in September, marking the third time under McCarthy that the Packers finished the month undefeated (4-0 in 2007 and 3-0 in 2011).
- ▶ Since McCarthy took over in 2006, the Packers have a 25-14 (.641) mark in the month of September. Green Bay's 25 wins are **tied for No. 1 in the NFC and tied for No. 4 in the NFL**:

Two years after he co-founded the Packers with Curly Lambeau, George Calhoun began writing a piece called The Dope Sheet, which served as the official press release from 1921-24.

FACING THE AFC

The Green Bay Packers have played well against AFC teams. Under Head Coach **Mike McCarthy**, the Packers are 26-18 during the regular and postseason against teams from the AFC.

- ▶ Green Bay's 26 wins versus the AFC are the second most among NFC teams since 2006 (Dallas, 27).
- ▶ The Packers' .591 winning percentage against AFC teams since 2006 ranks **No. 2 in the NFC** and **No. 5 in the NFL**.

VERSATILITY

RB **Ty Montgomery** was converted from wide receiver to running back a few weeks into last season, starting six of the final 10 games in the backfield and both games this season.

- ▶ Among NFL running backs with 75-plus carries in 2016, he ranked **No. 1 in the league** with an average of 5.94 yards per carry.

- ▶ Ranks **No. 1 in the NFL** with 133 yards after the catch this season.

- ▶ In Week 2, Montgomery hauled in six receptions for 75 yards (12.5 avg.) and a touchdown to go with 10 carries for 35 yards (3.5 avg.) and a TD, becoming the first Packer to have a rushing TD, receiving TD and 75-plus receiving yards in the same games since Dorsey Levens at Indianapolis on Nov. 16, 1997 (two rushing TDs, one receiving TD, 92 receiving yards).

IN THE CONFERENCE

The Packers have established themselves as one of the best teams in the NFC.

AT THE HELM

Having led Green Bay to the playoffs in nine of his first 11 seasons as head coach, **Mike McCarthy** is joined by Vince Lombardi and Mike Holmgren as the only coaches to guide the Packers to a Super Bowl win with a victory over Pittsburgh in Super Bowl XLV.

- ▶ McCarthy guided the Packers to a franchise-record fourth consecutive division title in 2014. In his 11 seasons, he has won six division titles, tying Lombardi for the second most in franchise history.
- ▶ With a win at Tampa Bay in Week 16 of the 2014 season, McCarthy passed Lombardi for the No. 2 spot in team history as far as overall victories:

- ▶ The 125 overall wins are the most in the NFC and the second most in the NFL since 2006 (New England, 154).
- ▶ McCarthy reached 100 career wins (including playoffs) in just his 155th game. He was the fastest to reach 100 wins in the NFL since George Seifert in 1996 (132 games).
- ▶ McCarthy's 114 regular-season wins in his first 11 years as a head coach (2006-16) are **tied for No. 3 in NFL history**:

- ▶ McCarthy recorded his third regular season with 12-plus wins in 2014 (2007, 2011), passing Curly Lambeau (1929, 1931), Lombardi (1962, 1966), Holmgren (1996-97) and Mike Sherman (2001-02) for the most by a coach in franchise history.
- ▶ McCarthy has guided the Packers to five seasons with 11-plus wins (2007, 2009, 2011-12, 2014), passing Lombardi (1961-63, 1966) and Holmgren (1995-98) for the **most by a coach in franchise history**.
- ▶ McCarthy's eight regular seasons with 10-plus wins are a **franchise record** (since 1921). Among current NFL head coaches, only Bill Belichick (16) and Andy Reid (11) have more 10-plus win seasons.
- ▶ McCarthy is the **only coach in franchise history** to post three or more consecutive 10-win seasons twice in his career (2009-12, 2014-16).
- ▶ McCarthy joined Pittsburgh's Bill Cowher (2005) as the only Super Bowl-winning coaches to lead their respective teams to three road wins as the No. 6 seed in the postseason en route to a world title.
- ▶ Including playoffs, McCarthy has a 125-70-1 record since taking over as head coach in 2006, a .638 winning percentage that ranks **No. 3 among current NFL head coaches** (minimum 100 games):

- ▶ McCarthy became just the **fourth head coach in NFL history** to lead a single franchise to eight-plus consecutive playoff appearances:

MIKE MCCARTHY...Is in his 12th year as the Packers' 14th head coach.

- ▶ Led the Packers to their eighth consecutive playoff appearance last season, tied for the third-longest streak in NFL history. Has also led the team to nine playoff appearances in the last 10 years (2007, 2009-16).
- ▶ Ranks second in franchise history in total victories, trailing only Curly Lambeau.
- ▶ Guided the Packers to top-10 finishes in scoring in eight straight seasons (2007-14), joining the Patriots as the only other team to accomplish the feat over that time; Packers finished first overall in scoring in 2014.
- ▶ Reached the 100-win plateau faster than any active NFL head coach, needing just 155 games.
- ▶ Joined Vince Lombardi and Mike Holmgren as the only coaches to guide the Packers to a Super Bowl title with a win over Pittsburgh in Super Bowl XLV.

MARVIN LEWIS...Is in his 15th year as the Bengals' ninth head coach.

- ▶ Has posted the longest tenure (15) and the most wins (118) of any head coach in franchise history.
- ▶ His Bengals have made seven postseason appearances in his time at the helm, including each of the last five seasons.
- ▶ Led the Bengals to AFC North titles in 2005, 2009, 2012-13 and 2015 as he was the consensus NFL Coach of the Year in 2009 when Cincinnati swept all six division contests.

THE PACKERS-BENGALS SERIES

- ▶ The Bengals have won the last three regular-season meetings (2005, 2009 and 2013). Prior to 2005, Green Bay owned a three-game winning streak in the series (24-23 in 1992 and 24-10 in 1995, both in Green Bay, and 13-6 in 1998 at Cincinnati).
- ▶ Perhaps the most memorable game in the series came in 1992 when Brett Favre, summoned to replace an injured Don Majkowski at quarterback in the first quarter, proceeded to direct the Packers to an electrifying, 24-23 come-from-behind victory, forged when he hit wide receiver Kitrick Taylor for a 35-yard scoring pass with only 13 seconds remaining in the game.
- ▶ The series launched at Lambeau Field in 1971, when the legendary Paul Brown was head coach of the Bengals, a team he had founded three years earlier as a member of the then American Football League. The Packers posted a 20-17 victory in their first meeting, with a Lou Michaels field goal providing the victory margin.

TAKING HIS PLACE AMONG THE GAME'S BEST

QB **Aaron Rodgers** surpassed the 1,500-attempt plateau for his career in 2010, the benchmark to qualify for passer rating in the NFL record book.

▶ Rodgers ranks **No. 1 in NFL history** in career passer rating:

▶ Rodgers registered the sixth 4,000-yard passing season of his career in 2016, setting the **franchise record** as he surpassed Brett Favre's mark of five 4,000-yard seasons.

▶ Rodgers had 11 zero-INT games last season (min. 15 att.), the third time in his career with 10-plus zero-INT games (13 in 2014, 12 in 2009). The only other QB in team history to have 10 in a season was Starr (10) in 1964.

▶ In 2016, Rodgers set the **single-season franchise record for completions** with 401, surpassing Favre's mark of 372 in 2005.

▶ In the Week 7 victory over Chicago (2016), Rodgers set a **single-game franchise record** with 39 completions, besting the previous high of 36 by Favre at Chicago on Dec. 5, 1993.

▶ Rodgers went over the 35,000-yard passing mark for his career last season in Week 11 at Washington. According to the Elias Sports Bureau, he reached the mark on his 4,446th attempt, the **second-fewest attempts needed in NFL history** behind QB Johnny Unitas (4,388 attempts).

▶ In 2016, Rodgers posted a season passer rating of 104.2, the seventh time in his career that he had registered a 100-plus passer rating, the most in NFL history (Peyton Manning and Steve Young, six each).

▶ Rodgers recorded his sixth season with 500-plus attempts and eight or fewer INTs in 2016, the most in NFL history (Tom Brady, three; nine others with one).

▶ The 2016 regular season saw Rodgers become just the second QB in NFL history to have 600-plus passing attempts and seven or fewer INTs in a season (Brady, 624 attempts, seven INTs in 2015).

▶ In Week 14 of 2016, Rodgers recorded a passer rating of 150.8 in a win over Seattle, marking his fourth career game a passer rating of 150-plus which is the fourth most (min. 10 pass att.) among active quarterbacks (Drew Brees and Brady, five / Ben Roethlisberger, eight).

▶ Rodgers rushed for a touchdown in Week 16 last season, marking his 13th game with two-plus passing touchdowns and one-plus rushing touchdowns since 2008, which is **No. 2 among NFL QBs** over that span behind Cam Newton (18).

RODGERS AND TOUCHDOWNS

QB **Aaron Rodgers** has found the end zone a lot in his career, and that continued in the 2016 regular season. Rodgers threw for a league-best 40 touchdowns, his franchise-record fourth season (2011-12, 2014, 2016) with 35-plus TD passes (Brett Favre, three, 1995-97).

- ▶ With 40 passing TDs during the 2016 regular season, Rodgers became just the fourth QB in NFL history to record two seasons (also 2011) with 40-plus TD passes (Dan Marino, Peyton Manning, Drew Brees).
- ▶ In 2016, Rodgers became the first GB quarterback to lead the NFL in TD passes since Favre in 2003.
- ▶ Rodgers now has five seasons with 4,000-plus passing yards and 30-plus passing TDs (2009, 2011-12, 2014, 2016), further extending his team mark.
- ▶ In 2016, Rodgers registered his third straight season with 30-plus touchdown passes, the second-longest streak in franchise history (Favre, five straight, 1994-98)
- ▶ Rodgers has thrown 38-plus TD passes four times in his career, the most in NFL history (Brees and Manning have three each).
- ▶ Rodgers ranks **No. 1 in the NFL** in passing TDs since the start of the 2016 season:

- ▶ In 2016, Rodgers was **No. 1 in the NFL** with four games with four-plus TD passes and zero INTs, **the most in a season in franchise history**, passing his own mark set in 2011 and Favre's total in 1995.
- ▶ Rodgers has thrown four-plus touchdowns in a game 20 times, a **franchise record**, the **sixth most in NFL history** and **No. 3 among active quarterbacks**:

- ▶ In 2016, Rodgers became the **first NFL quarterback** to record seven games with three-plus TDs/zero INTs in two different seasons (eight games in 2014). The only other QBs to do accomplish that feat in a season were Brady (eight in 2007) and Manning (seven in 2013).
- ▶ In Week 14 of last season, Rodgers recorded a 66-yard TD pass to WR **Davante Adams**, giving him a TD pass of 65 yards or more in each of the last nine seasons (2008-16). Rodgers joins Brees as the only QBs in the league to do so over that span.

RODGERS THE RUNNER

QB **Aaron Rodgers** uses his feet to not only create more time to throw but also gain yards.

- ▶ Rodgers is just the **fourth QB in NFL history** to post 35,000-plus passing yards and 2,500-plus rushing yards in his career, joining Fran Tarkenton, John Elway and Donovan McNabb as the only players to accomplish that feat.
- ▶ Since the start of the 2016 season, Rodgers ranks **No. 5 among NFL quarterbacks** with 398 rushing yards.
- ▶ Rodgers recorded a career-high 369 yards rushing during the 2016 regular season, the most by a Green Bay QB since Tobin Rote (398) in 1956.
- ▶ Rodgers finished the 2016 regular season **No. 3 in the NFL** in rushing yards among quarterbacks:

- ▶ QB **Aaron Rodgers** became the 11th NFL player to throw 300 passing touchdowns, reaching the mark in his 144th career game to pass Peyton Manning and Dan Marino (157) for the fewest games needed to reach 300 passing TDs in NFL history.
- ▶ Rodgers reached 300 passing TDs on his 4,742nd pass attempt, surpassing Peyton Manning (5,306) for the fewest in league history.
- ▶ Rodgers also became the first quarterback to reach 300 passing TDs before throwing 100 interceptions. His 73 interceptions passed Tom Brady (115) for the fewest at the time of reaching 300 passing TDs.
- ▶ Dating back to last season, Rodgers has completed 27-plus passes in each of his last four games. That is tied for the longest streak in team history with Brett Favre (Weeks 2-5, 2007).

- ▶ Dating back to last season, Rodgers has four straight 300-yard passing games, tying himself (Games 4-7, 2011) for the longest streak in team history.
- ▶ Rodgers has seven 300-yard games in his last 10 regular-season games.
- ▶ Rodgers joins Philadelphia Eagles QB Carson Wentz as the only players to throw for 300-plus yards in two games this season.

- ▶ Dating back to last season, WR **Geronimo Allison's** last 11 receptions have all picked up first downs. For his career, he has 14 first downs on 15 catches.
- ▶ The Packers were one of two teams in the NFL (New Orleans) to have three wide receivers with 60-plus receptions and 600-plus receiving yards each in 2016 (Nelson - 97 rec. for 1,257 yds. / Adams - 75 rec. for 997 yds. / Cobb - 60 rec. for 610 yds.).
- ▶ Nelson (14) and Adams (12) were the **only teammate duo in the NFL** with 10-plus touchdown catches last season.
- ▶ In 2016, Adams and Nelson were just the **second duo in team history to both record 10-plus TD catches in the same season** (Nelson and Cobb in 2014).
- ▶ Nelson **tied for No. 4 in the NFL** with five 100-yard receiving games last season while Adams (four) was **tied for No. 6**.
- ▶ Adams and Nelson joined New Orleans WR Brandin Cooks and Tampa Bay WR Mike Evans as the only players to record 100-plus yards receiving and two-plus TDs in two games during the 2016 regular season.
- ▶ Nelson and Adams **tied for No. 1 in the NFL** last season with three multi-receiving touchdown games (Beckham, Brown, Evans).
- ▶ Adams and New England WR Chris Hogan were the **only players in the league last season** to have two games with four-plus receptions and a 25-plus-yard receiving average.
- ▶ During the 2016 regular season, Green Bay had one or more players register 10-plus receptions and/or 100-plus receiving yards in 12 games.
- ▶ The Packers' six individual 10-catch games came via four different players (Adams-two, Montgomery-two, Cobb, Nelson). According to the Elias Sports Bureau, four different players having at least one 10-catch game is **tied for the most in a single season in NFL history** (2015 New England Patriots / 2013 Atlanta Falcons / 2010 Indianapolis Colts / 2002 St. Louis Rams / 1991 Buffalo Bills).
- ▶ Green Bay's six individual 10-catch games were the **most in a single season in franchise history** (five in 2004 / three in 2014, 1993, 1942).

- ▶ According to the Elias Sports Bureau, in Week 7 the Packers became just the second team in NFL history to feature three players with 10-plus catches in a game (Adams, 13; Cobb, 11; Montgomery, 10), joining the New England Patriots (Leroy Thompson, Ben Coates, Michael Timpson) vs. Minnesota on Nov. 13, 1994.
- ▶ Montgomery became the first Packer to post back-to-back games with 10-plus catches (10 vs. Dallas and 10 vs. Chicago in 2016) since WR Sterling Sharpe in 1993 (Oct. 10, Oct. 24). Adams joined him in Weeks 7 (13) and 8 (12). The only other player to accomplish that feat in a single season in team annals was Hutson in 1942 (Nov. 15, Nov. 22).

- ▶ In 2016, Nelson registered the fourth 1,200-yard (1,257) receiving season of his career, tying James Lofton for the **best mark in team history**.
- ▶ It was the third time in Nelson's career that he recorded 10-plus receiving TDs in a season (2011 and 2014). He joined Sharpe (four) and Don Hutson (three) as the **only players in franchise history to post 10-plus TD catches in three or more seasons**.
- ▶ Nelson is the **first player in franchise history to record 13-plus receiving touchdowns in three different seasons** (2011, 2014, 2016). His three seasons of 13-plus TD receptions tie Pro Football Hall of Famers Lance Alworth, Cris Carter and Marvin Harrison for the fourth most in NFL history. Only Pro Football Hall of Famer Jerry Rice (eight), Terrell Owens (seven) and Randy Moss (six) have more such seasons in NFL history.
- ▶ With at least one touchdown reception in 11 games last season, Nelson tied Sharpe (1992 and 1994) for the most games with at least one TD catch in a single season in franchise history.
- ▶ Nelson has 25 100-yard receiving games in his career, **passing Hutson (24) for No. 3 in team history**. He trails Sharpe (29) for the second most.

- Perry tied DT **Mike Daniels** for the team lead in sacks in Week 1 with 1.5.
- Despite missing two games, Perry registered a team-high 11 sacks, **tied for No. 8 in the NFL** , in 2016. He became the 11th player in team history (since 1982) to register a double-digit sack total in a season.

- ▶ In Week 9 of 2016, he joined CB Al Harris (vs. New Orleans, Oct. 9, 2005) as the only players to post two INTs in a first quarter for the Packers since 1993.
- ▶ He was named NFC Defensive Player of the Week for his Week 15 performance in 2016, becoming the first Packers DB to win the award since Woodson in 2010 (Week 4).
- ▶ Clinton-Dix finished second on the team with 95 tackles (73 solo) in 2014 and led the Packers with 117 tackles (97 solo) in 2015.
- ▶ He registered a total of three interceptions during the 2015 season (including playoffs). He tied for fourth on the team with two during the regular season and registered one in the postseason.
- ▶ According to STATS, his three sacks during the 2015 regular season were tied for the fifth most in a single regular season by a Packers safety (since 1982) and the most since Mark Roman recorded 3.5 in 2004.
- ▶ Clinton-Dix's three sacks also tied for **No. 3 in the NFL** in 2015 among safeties.
- ▶ During the 2015 regular season, he registered eight-plus tackles in eight games, including setting career highs in both total tackles (12) and solo tackles (11) in the Week 10 game vs. Detroit, in which he also registered an interception.

CONTINUAL IMPACT

In his career, DT **Mike Daniels** has seen his playing time steadily increase as well as his production, earning him a role as a standout on the defense.

- ▶ Daniels ranks **No. 3 among Packers defensive tackles** in sacks (since 1982), according to STATS LLC:

- ▶ Daniels is third on the Packers with 21.5 sacks since the start of the 2013 season. He is **tied for No. 10 among NFL defensive tackles** over that span, according to STATS LLC.
- ▶ He has started every regular-season and postseason game for Green Bay and has played the most defensive snaps among Packers defensive linemen since the start of the 2014 season.
- ▶ In 2015, Daniels led the Packers' defensive line in tackles (66) and sacks (four). He finished third on the team with 12 QB hits.
- ▶ In Week 5 versus St. Louis (2015), he tied for the team lead with a career-best nine tackles (eight solo).
- ▶ Daniels registered his first career interception in Week 16 at Arizona (2015), returning it 23 yards. According to STATS LLC, it was the first interception by a Packers DT since Cullen Jenkins on Oct. 18, 2009. Dating back to 1960, his 23-yard interception return was the longest by a Green Bay DT on an interception.
- ▶ He led Green Bay's defensive line with 5.5 sacks and was the team leader in quarterback hits (19) and pressures (22) during the 2014 regular season.

RACKING UP POINTS

K **Mason Crosby** is moving his way up the record books.

- ▶ Crosby passed Ryan Longwell in Week 2 of the 2015 season to become the franchise career points leader:

- ▶ Crosby's 1,267 points from 2007-16 were the **second most by an NFL player in his first 10 seasons** (NE Stephen Gostkowski, 1,330 from 2006-15).
- ▶ Crosby (1,414) passed Longwell (1,119) for the most points scored in the regular and postseason combined in franchise history.
- ▶ Dating back to 2013, Crosby has made 112 field goals during the regular season, **No. 7 in the NFL** over that span.
- ▶ Crosby recorded 122 points during the 2016 season, giving him the 10th 100-point season of his career and **extending his franchise record**. Crosby's 10 seasons with 100-plus points are the **most in the NFL since 2007**. The only other kickers to have 10 or more consecutive seasons of 100-plus points are Jason Elam (16, 1993-2008) and Adam Vinatieri (13, 1996-2008).



PACKERS VS. BENGALS - WEEK 3

ON THE ROAD AGAIN

Green Bay went 7-1 away from Lambeau Field in 2011, with the seven road wins setting a single-season franchise record.

- ▶ The Packers have been able to stay above the .500 mark on the road during Head Coach **Mike McCarthy's** tenure, a notable achievement in the National Football League.
- ▶ Since 2006, McCarthy's first season as the head coach in Green Bay, only nine of 32 NFL teams have regular-season road records above .500.

327 AND COUNTING

Another packed house at Lambeau Field against the Seattle Seahawks in Week 1 brought the stadium's consecutive-sellouts streak to 327 regular-season games (not including replacement games).

- ▶ The league's longest-tenured stadium, Lambeau Field is hosting its 61st season of football in 2017. For the victory over Dallas in the Divisional round of the 2014 playoffs, Packers fans set a new Lambeau Field paid-attendance record (79,704).
- ▶ Across American professional sports, only Boston's Fenway Park (1912) and Chicago's Wrigley Field (1914) have longer tenures.

THE LAMBEAU ADVANTAGE

The crown jewel of the National Football League, Lambeau Field has long been known as one of the tougher venues to play in, particularly during the harsh Wisconsin winter.

- ▶ Re-establishing home-field advantage after a 4-4 mark in 2008 was one of the goals of 2009, and with the Packers finishing 6-2 at home, they accomplished that goal. Green Bay followed that up with a 7-1 mark at Lambeau Field in 2010, a perfect 8-0 record in 2011, the first undefeated home mark since 2002, and a 7-1 mark in 2012. The Packers were one of two teams to finish undefeated at home during the 2014 regular season (Denver).
- ▶ Head Coach **Mike McCarthy** stated consistently upon his arrival in Green Bay that one of the team's goals would be to reclaim the mystique of playing at Lambeau Field. Mission accomplished. The team is 66-22-1 (.747) at home in the regular season since 2006, **No. 2 in the NFL**.
- ▶ Since **Ron Wolf** and **Mike Holmgren** began the revitalization of the franchise in 1992, Green Bay owns the best home record in the NFL. A look at the top regular-season home W-L records since the '92 season:

- ▶ However, Green Bay has remained among the most successful teams since the advent of free agency in 1993. The Packers have won 10 or more games 15 times since '93 and captured 10 division crowns.

A LOOK AT THE SCHEDULE

The Green Bay Packers' 97th NFL regular-season schedule – highlighted by five prime-time contests (subject to flexible scheduling) – was released April 20 by the National Football League.

- ▶ It will be the first regular season that has the Packers playing home games on a Saturday, Thursday and Monday.
- ▶ Green Bay's schedule includes six games against 2016 playoff teams. Two of those contests (Detroit, Seattle) are at Lambeau Field, while four (Atlanta, Dallas, Detroit, Pittsburgh) will come on the road. The Packers will play two teams (Atlanta, Dallas) that it played during the 2016 regular and postseason.
- ▶ For the first time since 2012, the Packers opened the season at home, and will play three of their first four games at Lambeau Field.
- ▶ In Week 1, Green Bay hosted the Seattle Seahawks, marking the third consecutive regular season that the Packers have played the Seahawks at home. Green Bay improved to 11-3 against the Seahawks at home during the regular and postseason, including eight straight wins.
- ▶ For the second straight season, the Packers played a prime-time game on the road in Week 2, traveling to Atlanta for an NFC Championship rematch with the Falcons.
- ▶ Week 3 will see the Cincinnati Bengals play in Green Bay for just the sixth time, and Week 4 has the Packers hosting the Chicago Bears on a Thursday night for the third consecutive season (12th straight year in primetime). The division rivals square off in a prime-time contest for the 12th straight season.
- ▶ Green Bay will begin October with back-to-back road games. The Packers will first travel to play the Dallas Cowboys, marking the fourth matchup between the two clubs since 2015 (including postseason), and then will face the Vikings in Minnesota in Week 6.
- ▶ In Week 7, the New Orleans Saints visit Lambeau, their latest trip by date to Wisconsin since playing the Packers in Milwaukee on Nov. 17, 1985.
- ▶ The Packers have a Week 8 bye, the latest bye week for Green Bay since 2014 (Week 9).
- ▶ Green Bay hosts the Detroit Lions on *Monday Night Football* in Week 9, marking the third time the two teams have met on *MNF* and the first since 1972. Green Bay swept the regular-season series with the Lions last season for the first time since 2012 and for the seventh time under McCarthy.
- ▶ In Week 10, Green Bay will face the Bears in Chicago, a place they have won in the regular season each of the last six years.
- ▶ After welcoming the Baltimore Ravens to Lambeau Field in Week 11 for just the fourth time, the Packers will travel to Pittsburgh to play the Steelers in a Sunday night matchup in Week 12.
- ▶ After stopping back in Green Bay in Week 13 to play Tampa Bay, the Buccaneers' first December trip to Lambeau since 2000, the Packers will begin a stretch of three road games in four weeks with a trip to Cleveland in Week 14. It is the first time since 2009 that Green Bay will finish the regular season with three of the final four games taking place on the road.
- ▶ The Packers will finish their slate against the NFC South when they play at the Carolina Panthers in Week 15.
- ▶ For the second consecutive season, Green Bay will host the Vikings on a Saturday in Week 16. The Packers have won their last five regular-season games played on Saturdays.
- ▶ Green Bay will close out the regular season at Detroit for the second consecutive year, marking the first time it has finished the regular season on the road against the same team in back-to-back seasons since 1991-92 (Minnesota).

BREAKING DOWN THE ROSTER

The Packers currently have an 53-man roster that is composed of 26 offensive players, 24 defensive players and three specialists.

- ▶ Of the 53 players on Green Bay's roster, 36 of them (67.9 percent) were draft picks of the Packers. Dating back to 2007, Green Bay has at least one member of each draft class still on the roster.
- ▶ Green Bay has 12 players on the roster that began their careers as undrafted free agents, with nine of those originally signed by Green Bay.
- ▶ Almost a third (32.1 percent) of the players (17 of 53) on Green Bay's roster entered the league as a sixth-round or seventh-round pick or as an undrafted player.
- ▶ The Packers have six players on the roster that played in the NFL prior to the 2009 season. Four of those five players were draft picks of the Packers (QB **Aaron Rodgers**, K **Mason Crosby**, WR **Jordy Nelson** and LB **Clay Matthews**) and three have made at least one Pro Bowl.
- ▶ Of the 53 players on the roster, 45 began their pro careers with the Packers (84.9 percent).
- ▶ Only 22 of the 53 players on the roster (41.5 percent) were selected in the first three rounds of the draft, with 19 being drafted by the Packers.

PACKERS STARTERS – OFFENSE

WR Jordy Nelson, 10th Year, Kansas State, D2a-08

- ▶ Became the fourth player in franchise history to reach 500 receptions.
- ▶ Has 64 career receiving TDs, No. 3 in Packers history, needs one to tie Sterling Sharpe for No. 2 behind Don Hutson (99).
- ▶ Became the first player in franchise history to record 13-plus receiving touchdowns in three different seasons (2011, 2014, 2016). His three seasons of 13-plus TD receptions tie Pro Football Hall of Famers Lance Alworth, Cris Carter and Marvin Harrison for the fourth most in NFL history.
- ▶ Missed all of the 2015 season due to a knee injury.
- ▶ Finished the 2014 regular season ranked fourth in the NFL in receiving yards (1,519), seventh in receptions (98) and tied for second in receiving touchdowns (13). Earned first selection to the Pro Bowl.
- ▶ Led the team in 2013 with 85 catches for 1,314 yards and eight TDs. Ranked No. 10 in the NFL that season in receiving yards.
- ▶ With 15 TD catches in 2011, became only the third player in franchise history to catch 15 or more TDs in a season, joining WRs Sterling Sharpe (18 in 1994) and Don Hutson (17 in 1942).

LT David Bakhtiari, 5th Year, Colorado, D4a-13

- ▶ Named to first career Pro Bowl in 2016.
- ▶ Has started all but three games at LT since the start of the 2013 regular season. Missed Week 2 this season and the final two games of the 2015 regular season due to injury.
- ▶ Started all 16 games at left tackle in 2013, the only rookie in the NFL to do so in 2013 and the first Packer rookie to do so since the league went to a 16-game schedule in 1978.
- ▶ Became just the fourth Green Bay rookie to start at LT in the season opener since the 1970 AFL-NFL merger and the first since 1985.

LG Lane Taylor, 5th Year, Oklahoma State, FA-13

- ▶ Has played in 48 regular-season games for Green Bay with 20 starts, including starting every game since the start of 2016 at LG.
- ▶ Made the first starts of his career in 2015, opening at RG at Detroit in Week 13 in place of an injured T.J. Lang and at LG in Week 17 vs. Minnesota with Josh Sitton sliding to LT in place of an injured David Bakhtiari.
- ▶ A four-year letterman at OSU, starting 47 of 50 games played at right guard. Unanimous first-team All-Big 12 selection by the conference's coaches as a senior.

C Corey Linsley, 4th Year, Ohio State, D5a-14

- ▶ Has started every game at C since Week 9 of 2016. Was on reserve/physically unable to perform for the entire preseason and the first seven regular-season games.
- ▶ Started 29 games and four postseason contests in his first two seasons.
- ▶ First rookie center to start for Green Bay in Week 1 since the merger.
- ▶ Was the first rookie center to start every game for the Packers since the league went to a 16-game schedule in 1978.
- ▶ Named to PFWA's All-Rookie team, the first Green Bay center to be honored since its inception in 1974.

RG Jahri Evans, 12th Year, Bloomsburg, UFA (NO)-17

- ▶ Selected to six Pro Bowls (2009-14) and has been named first-team All-Pro by *The Associated Press* four times (2009-12).
- ▶ Has started all 171 games he has played in since entering the league in 2006, the most games played by an active NFL offensive lineman over that span.
- ▶ Started all 16 games in nine of his 11 seasons in New Orleans (2006-16), missing just seven contests due to injury.
- ▶ Helped the Saints finish in the top six in the NFL in total offense in all 11 of his seasons in New Orleans (2006-16), including six No. 1 rankings (2006, 2008-09, 2011, 2014, 2016).
- ▶ Entered the NFL with New Orleans in 2006 as a fourth-round pick (No. 108 overall) out of Bloomsburg (Pa.) University, where he was a finalist for the Gene Upshaw Player of the Year Award in both of his final two seasons.

RT Bryan Bulaga, 8th Year, Iowa, D1-10

- ▶ Has started 43 of 50 games since the start of the 2014 season.
- ▶ Missed the second part of the 2012 season after suffering a hip injury vs. Arizona on Nov. 4 and missed all of the 2013 season after injuring his knee on Aug. 3.
- ▶ Started 37 games at RT in his first three seasons in the league.
- ▶ Started the final 12 games of 2010 and the entire postseason at right tackle after taking over for veteran Mark Tauscher (shoulder).
- ▶ Named to the *Pro Football Weekly*/PFWA All-Rookie team in 2010.
- ▶ Capped his rookie season by becoming the youngest player at the time, according to STATS LLC, to ever start in the Super Bowl (21 years, 322 days).

TE Martellus Bennett, 10th Year, Texas A&M, UFA (NE)-17

- ▶ Posted 50-plus receptions in each season from 2012-16, one of only three tight ends in the league (Greg Olsen, Jason Witten) to do so over that span.
- ▶ Posted a career-high three 100-yard receiving games in 2016 with the Patriots, tied for No. 2 in the NFL among TEs, and a career-best seven TD catches, tied for No. 3 in the league among TEs.
- ▶ Registered a career-high 90 receptions with the Chicago Bears in 2014, the most among NFL tight ends that season, on his way to earning Pro Bowl recognition.
- ▶ Entered the NFL in 2008 as a second-round pick (No. 61 overall) with Dallas and went on to play four seasons with the Cowboys (2008-11). Also played one season with the N.Y. Giants (2012), three with the Bears (2013-15) and one with the Patriots (2016).

WR Randall Cobb, 6th Year, Kentucky, D2-11

- ▶ Ranks No. 4 in the NFL with a team-leading 15 receptions this season.
- ▶ Led the team with a 13.5-yard punt-return average in 2016.
- ▶ Posted the 12th 100-yard receiving game of his career in Week 4 (108 on nine receptions) and tied his single-game high for receptions (11 for 95 yards and a TD) in Week 7.
- ▶ Led the team in receptions (79), was No. 2 in receiving yards (829) and was No. 3 in touchdown receptions (six) in 2015.
- ▶ Set a new single-season career high with five 100-yard receiving games during the 2014 season (three-2012). Earned first trip to the Pro Bowl.
- ▶ His career-best 91 receptions in 2014 are the eighth most in team history.
- ▶ Finished the regular season tied for fourth in the NFL with 12 touchdown receptions in 2014.
- ▶ Set a franchise single-season record with a league-high 2,342 combined net yards in 2012, topping the previous team mark of 2,250 yards by RB Ahman Green in 2003.

QB Aaron Rodgers, 12th Year, California, D1-05

- ▶ His career passer rating of 103.8 ranks No. 1 in NFL history.
- ▶ In 137 regular-season starts (91-46 record), has posted 51 games with 300-plus passing yards, 81 without an interception and 76 with a 100-plus passer rating (min. 15 attempts).
- ▶ Earned his sixth selection to the Pro Bowl in 2016, the second-most selections by a Green Bay quarterback behind Brett Favre's nine (1992-93, 1995-97, 2001-03, 2007).
- ▶ Finished the 2014 regular season ranked No. 2 in the NFL in passer rating (112.2), touchdown percentage (7.3), No. 1 in interception percentage (1.0) and No. 3 in touchdown passes (38).
- ▶ Recorded a passer rating of at least 128.0 in seven regular-season games in 2014, setting a single-season career high and tying for the third most in a single season in the NFL, dating back to 1960.
- ▶ Posted 21,332 passing yards from 2008-12, which ranks No. 1 in league history for the most passing yards by a QB in his first five seasons as a starter (previous record was Peyton Manning, 20,618, 1998-2002).
- ▶ In 2011, set an NFL record with a 122.5 passer rating and set franchise marks for TD passes (45), passing yards (4,643), completion percentage (68.3), yards per attempt (9.25) and 300-yard games (eight) on his way to earning NFL Most Valuable Player honors from *The Associated Press*.

RB Ty Montgomery, 2nd Year, Stanford, D3-15

- ▶ Tied for No. 3 in the NFL with three total touchdowns this season.
- ▶ After being converted from wide receiver to running back during the 2016 season, has started eight games at RB, including both games this season.
- ▶ In Week 15 at Chicago (2016), rushed for 162 yards on 16 carries and two touchdowns. His 162 yards were the most by a Packers player in a single game since Dec. 11, 2005 (Samkon Gado, 171 yards on 29 carries, 5.9 avg.). Dating back to 1960, his 10.13 yards-per-carry average was the third highest (min. 15 carries) by a Green Bay player.
- ▶ Played in six games with three starts as a rookie in 2015 before an ankle injury sustained in Week 6 sidelined him for the remainder of the season.
- ▶ Posted 5,190 all-purpose yards at Stanford (334 rushing, 2,125 receiving, 238 PR, 2,493 KOR), the fourth most in school history at the time.

FB Aaron Ripkowski, 2nd Year, Oklahoma, D6a-15

- ▶ Has played in 32 career games with eight starts.
- ▶ Scored his first career rushing touchdown in Week 12 (2016) and followed it up with one in Week 13.
- ▶ Led the team and set career highs in Week 17 (2016) at Detroit with 61 rushing yards on nine carries (6.8 avg.)
- ▶ Played in 15 games as a rookie, seeing action primarily on special teams. Tied for No. 4 on the team with nine special teams tackles.



PACKERS STARTERS – DEFENSE

DE Dean Lowry, 2nd Year, Northwestern, D4b-16

- ▶ Made first career start in the season-opening win over Seattle.
- ▶ Saw action in 15 games as a rookie (2016) and registered 14 tackles (eight solo), two sacks, three tackles for a loss, nine QB pressures and three QB hits. Also appeared in all three postseason contests and posted two tackles (one solo) and a QB pressure.
- ▶ Posted sacks in back-to-back games in 2016, recording one in Week 13 vs. Houston and one in Week 14 vs. Seattle.
- ▶ Played in 48 games with 33 starts for Northwestern and registered 134 tackles (83 solo), 31½ tackles for a loss, 12½ sacks, three interceptions (one returned for a TD), 21 passes defended, three fumble recoveries and three forced fumbles.
- ▶ Earned second-team All-Big Ten honors as a senior in 2015 after posting 46 tackles (27 solo), 13½ tackles for a loss (second on the team), three sacks, an interception, a fumble recovery and seven passes defended.

NT Kenny Clark, 2nd Year, UCLA, D1-16

- ▶ Finished the 2016 regular season No. 3 on the GB defensive line in tackles (33).
- ▶ Became the youngest player to appear in a season opener for the Packers since Arnie Herber (20 years old) in 1930.
- ▶ Earned third-team All-America honors from *The Associated Press* and first-team All-Pacific-12 recognition from the coaches and media as a junior in 2015.
- ▶ Was a team co-captain in '15 and recorded career highs in tackles (75), tackles for a loss (11) and sacks (six). Also ranked third on the team with five pass breakups.

DT Mike Daniels, 6th Year, Iowa, D4a-12

- ▶ Leads Packers defensive linemen with 21.5 sacks since the start of the 2013 regular season.
- ▶ Led the defensive line in both tackles and sacks in 2014 and 2015.
- ▶ Returned a fumble 43 yards for a TD vs. Detroit in Week 14 of 2012, the longest fumble return for a TD by a rookie in franchise history.
- ▶ Starred as an interior pass rusher at Iowa, posting a team-high 24.5 tackles for a loss and 13 sacks from 2010-11.

LOLB Clay Matthews, 9th Year, Southern California, D1b-09

- ▶ With 74.0 career sacks, passed Reggie White (68.5) for the second-most sacks in Packers history (Kabeer Gbaja-Biamila, 74.5).
- ▶ Despite injuries forcing him to miss four games and limiting him in six others, finished No. 3 on the team with five sacks in 2016.
- ▶ For the first time in his career, recorded at least one sack in each of the first three regular-season games he played in (2016).
- ▶ Selected to his sixth Pro Bowl and first as an inside linebacker in 2015 after recording 6.5 sacks (second on the team), 15 QB hits (No. 1 on the team) and a career-high 85 tackles (No. 2 on the team).
- ▶ With a team-high 11.0 sacks in 2014, is tied for the most 10-plus sack seasons in franchise history (four).
- ▶ Is the only player in franchise history to score a defensive TD (interception or fumble return) in each of his first three seasons in the NFL (2009-11).

ILB Jake Ryan, 3rd Year, Michigan, D4-15

- ▶ Finished No. 2 on the team with 84 tackles during the 2016 regular season.
- ▶ Started the final five games of the regular season and both playoff contests in 2015.
- ▶ Recorded a team-best nine tackles (eight solo) and one fumble recovery in Week 13 (2015) at Detroit in his first pro start.
- ▶ Served as a team captain for his final two seasons at Michigan and was a three-time winner (2012-14) of the Roger Zatkoff Award, given to the Wolverines top linebacker. He was the only player to win the award (est. 1991) three times.
- ▶ Joined LB John Anderson (first round, 26th overall) as the only Michigan linebackers ever drafted by Green Bay.
- ▶ Started 41 of 46 games played in college, appearing at inside linebacker as a senior after spending his first three seasons at outside linebacker and defensive end.

ILB Blake Martinez, Rookie, Stanford, D4a-16

- ▶ Started nine of 13 games he played in 2016 during the regular season, missing Weeks 12-14 due to injury.
- ▶ Became the first rookie to start on defense for Green Bay in Week 1 since LB Nick Perry in 2012.
- ▶ Finished collegiate career with 257 tackles (137 solo), 13.5 tackles for a loss, 6.5 sacks, five interceptions and five forced fumbles in 51 games played.

- ▶ Started all 27 games played in his final two seasons, leading the team in tackles as a junior (102) and senior (141).
- ▶ Led the Pacific-12 and ranked No. 7 nationally with 141 tackles (75 solo) as a senior, averaging a conference-best 10.1 tackles per game.

ROLB Nick Perry, 6th Year, Southern California, D1-12

- ▶ Led the team with a career-high 11.0 sacks in 2016.
- ▶ Registered multiple sacks in each of his first five seasons in the NFL and has posted a two-sack game in each of the last four seasons (2013-16).
- ▶ Has totaled seven sacks in eight playoff games, including 3.5 in the 2015 postseason, which tied Clay Matthews (2010) for the franchise record in a single postseason.
- ▶ His seven postseason sacks rank No. 3 in franchise history (since 1982) behind Matthews (11) and Reggie White (eight).

LCB Davon House, 7th Year, New Mexico State, FA-17

- ▶ Rejoined the Packers after spending the 2015-16 seasons with the Jacksonville Jaguars, starting 19 of 32 games played.
- ▶ In 2015, his first season in Jacksonville, set career highs in starts (15), tackles (60), solo tackles (49), passes defended (23, franchise single-season record) and interceptions (four).
- ▶ Despite missing three regular-season games with a shoulder injury in 2014, his 11 passes defended tied for No. 4 on the Packers.
- ▶ After seeing action in two games as a rookie (2011), appeared in 25 games for Green Bay between 2012-13, starting five games in each season.
- ▶ Was the first player to be drafted by the Packers out of New Mexico State in franchise history, and was the first Aggie drafted since S Siddeeq Shabazz (Oakland, seventh round) in 2003.

RCB Damarious Randall, 3rd Year, Arizona State, D1-15

- ▶ Was second on the team with three interceptions in 2016 despite missing six games due to injury.
- ▶ Played in 15 games with nine starts (six at LCB, two at RCB, one in the slot) in 2015 and tied for the team lead and No. 2 among NFL rookies with three interceptions, including one he returned for a TD. Finished with a team-best 16 passes defended.
- ▶ Named the NFL's Defensive Rookie of the Month for November 2015, joining CB Casey Hayward (October 2012) as the only Green Bay defensive backs to win the award.
- ▶ Earned first-team All-Pacific-12 honors at safety as a senior in 2014 after he led the Sun Devils in tackles (106) and passes defended (12) and tied for the team lead with three interceptions.

SS Morgan Burnett, 8th Year, Georgia Tech, D3-10

- ▶ Tied for No. 1 among NFL safeties with a career-best three sacks last season. Finished No. 1 on the team in tackles (92).
- ▶ Missed five games due to injury in 2015, but finished No. 4 on the team with 54 solo tackles.
- ▶ Totaled a team-high 125 tackles in 2014, the second most of his career (137 in 2012). Ranked No. 2 on the team with 106 tackles (77 solo) in 2013, despite missing the first three games due to injury. Recovered three fumbles, including one for a TD, and added nine passes defended.
- ▶ Participated in all 1,088 plays for Green Bay's defense in 2012, one of only four non-OL in the NFL to appear in 100 percent of his team's snaps.
- ▶ Started the first four games of the 2010 season at SS before sustaining a season-ending knee injury vs. Detroit in Week 4.

FS Ha Ha Clinton-Dix, 4th Year, Alabama, D1-14

- ▶ Named to his first career Pro Bowl in 2016. His career-best five interceptions tied for No. 5 in the NFL last season and tied for No. 1 among safeties. It was the most interceptions by a Packers safety in a single season since Charles Woodson (seven) and Charlie Peprah (five) in 2011.
- ▶ In 2016, posted a career-high two interceptions in both Week 9 and Week 14, becoming the first Packer to have two two-INT games in a season since Woodson in 2011.
- ▶ Led the team in tackles in 2015 with 117 (97 solo) and was tied for fourth on the team in interceptions (two).
- ▶ According to STATS, his three sacks during the 2015 regular season tied for the fifth most in a single regular season by a Packers safety (since 1982) and the most since Mark Roman recorded 3.5 in 2004.
- ▶ Started every game in 2015 after starting 10 of 16 games as a rookie when he finished second on the team in tackles (95).
- ▶ Was a consensus All-America selection in 2013 as a junior, earning first-team recognition from *The Associated Press*, the Football Writers Association of America and *Sporting News*.

MEDIA INFORMATION & POLICIES

MIKE MCCARTHY PRESS CONFERENCES

During the regular season (for a Sunday game), the head coach will be available in the Media Auditorium on Monday, Wednesday, Thursday and Friday. One-on-one interviews with McCarthy should be arranged through Jason Wahlers.

PLAYER INTERVIEWS

The team’s locker room will generally be open Monday, Wednesday, Thursday, Friday and following games.

- ▶ At the conclusion of all games, the locker room will be opened following the NFL’s standard “cooling-off period.”
- ▶ All interviews with players on the practice squad or injured reserve need to be requested and approved through the P.R. department.
- ▶ Any requests to interview players other than at the aforementioned times should be directed to a member of the Packers’ P.R. department.

ASSISTANT COACH AVAILABILITY

All by request only, through the P.R. department

- ▶ Coordinators – Edgar Bennett (offense), Dom Capers (defense) and Ron Zook (special teams) – will continue to serve as primary spokesmen in their respective areas.
- ▶ During the regular season, assistants generally will be available on Thursdays at the podium in the Media Auditorium with offense and defense rotating every other week. During a week when offensive coaches are available, Capers will also be available on Thursday to represent the defense. When defensive coaches are available, Bennett will also be available on Thursday to represent the offense. On Mondays, the coordinators will be available at the podium in the Media Auditorium.
- ▶ Following games, Head Coach Mike McCarthy will be the only coach available to the media.
- ▶ However, position coaches are available for questions on specific players and the position group only. Broader interview topics need to be directed to the respective coordinators.
- ▶ No assistant coach should be contacted directly by telephone (at his desk, home or on his cell phone), or by email. All interviews must be arranged through the P.R. department.
- ▶ Sarah Quick (920-569-7213) serves as the primary contact for assistant coaches. In her absence, feel free to contact another member of the P.R. staff.

PRACTICE ACCESS, PHOTOGRAPHY AND SOCIAL-MEDIA GUIDELINES

- ▶ During the regular season, practices will be open to state media who regularly cover the team for designated periods during the first half of each session, similar to previous seasons. Also as in

prior years, photo opportunities will be limited to the beginning portions of practice.

- ▶ The team reserves the right to limit photography to certain periods for competitive reasons. This restriction applies to both training-camp and regular-season practices.
- ▶ During practice periods in which B-roll and still photography are NOT permitted, the media may not utilize camera phones either. The P.R. staff will alert the media of the permissible “shooting” periods before and during each practice.
- ▶ Video of practice, press conferences or locker-room interviews by an individual or media outlet may not be posted at any time on social-media sites or live-broadcasting applications (this includes applications such as Facebook, Twitter, Vine, Instagram, Snapchat, Ustream, Periscope and Meerkat, etc).
- ▶ No still photography is permitted in the locker room at any time. Signs, notes and other personal items or information posted in and around the locker room at player lockers are not to be photographed or captured on video.

ONLINE-CONTENT POLICY

- ▶ According to the 2017 NFL non-game online content policy, accredited organizations may distribute online non-game audio and video content, including interviews, press conferences and team practices at NFL venues, acquired as a result of credentialed access (“Game Information”) to games or club/league facilities provided that such distribution: is 90 seconds maximum per day (180 seconds in two-team markets – 90 seconds per team); may not be “archived” (i.e., made available for on-demand public access) for more than 24 hours; appears in an editorial context only (no sponsorship, merchandising or advertising integrated with or around the content); is not posted live; and is accompanied by links back to NFL.com and to the club website.
- ▶ The 90-second limit does not include video/audio material that is composed entirely of a credentialed media employee providing commentary or analysis (“talking head” reporting), including pregame or postgame stand-up material shot on the field or other facility location.
- ▶ While a game is in progress, any forms of accounts of the game must be sufficiently time-delayed and limited in amount (e.g., score updates with detail given only in quarterly game updates, fewer than 10 photographs during the game) so that the accredited organization’s game coverage cannot be used as a substitute for, or otherwise approximate, authorized play-by-play accounts.
- ▶ The Packers have their own social-media and online-content policies for practice reporting, which will be communicated by the P.R. staff for both training camp and the regular season. Members of the media are encouraged to contact the public relations staff with any questions.

MEDIA INFORMATION & POLICIES

CONFERENCE CALLS

The Packers' P.R. department will arrange a conference call with the head coach of the opposing team each week during the regular season. These conference calls will be made from the media workroom, and generally will be held on Wednesday.

Lambeau Field features complimentary wireless Internet in the main press box. Please contact the public information department if you require assistance.

In the Lee Rempel Press Box at Lambeau Field, more than a dozen "co-op" phones are available to media throughout the box. If dedicated service is desired, please contact Scott Guth of Dataline Services seven to 10 days prior to the game at 920-569-7090 or sguth@datalineservicesinc.com. Instruments also may be obtained through Guth, upon request.

Dedicated internet service also may be ordered through Dataline Services – on a game-by-game or full-season basis – for installation in either the Lee Rempel Press Box or in the downstairs Photo/Media Workrooms.

As assigned by the Professional Football Writers of America (PFWA), the Green Bay pool reporter for the 2017 season is Rob Demovsky of ESPN.com. Pete Dougherty of the *Green Bay Press-Gazette* is the alternate.

PHOTO CREDENTIALS

Photo credentials will not be issued to freelance photographers unless on a specific assignment from an accredited organization. Credentials are not provided to "grips" due to on-field space limitations.

CREDENTIALS

All credential requests are acquired through an online credential link, which should be obtained by contacting Sarah Quick, assistant director of public relations. Requests may be sent via email (Sarah Quick; quicks@packers.com). Credentials will not be mailed, unless the requesting outlet provides a Federal Express or UPS number, and if scheduled in advance, should be picked up in person at the Packers' corporate offices, located in the Lambeau Field Atrium. Credentials not obtained prior to gameday will be left at Media Will Call on the south side of the stadium near the Shopko Gate. Media Will Call opens three hours prior to kickoff.

12 Aaron Rodgers, QB, 13th Year, California

- Ranks No. 1 in NFL history (min. 1,500 attempts) in career passer rating (103.8), interception percentage (1.56) and TD/INT ratio (4.05, 300/74).
- Has posted six seasons (2009, 2011-12, 2014-16) with 500-plus passing attempts and eight or fewer INTs, the most in NFL history ahead of Patriots QB Tom Brady (three) and nine QBs (one).
- Has been named the NFL's Most Valuable Player by *The Associated Press* twice in his career (2011, 2014), one of only eight players in league history to win the award multiple times.
- Is the only quarterback in league history to record a 100-plus passer rating in six consecutive seasons (2009-14), with no other QB doing so in more than four straight seasons. Has posted a 100-plus rating in seven seasons (2009-14, 2016), the most in NFL annals.
- Is one of only four QBs in NFL annals with 35,000-plus passing yards and 2,500-plus rushing yards (Fran Tarkenton, John Elway, Donovan McNabb).
- Is the lone QB in NFL history to throw 40-plus TD passes with seven or fewer INTs in a season, having done it twice in his career (45/6 in 2011, 40/7 in 2016).
- In 137 career regular-season starts (since 2008), has posted 51 games with 300-plus passing yards (No. 3 in the NFL over that span), 80 without an interception (No. 1, min. 15 attempts) and 75 with a 100-plus passer rating (No. 2).

- In the franchise record books, holds seven of the top eight single-season marks for passer rating (2009-14, 2016), four of the top six for passing TDs (2011-12, 2014, 2016), six of the top seven for completion percentage (2010-14, 2016) and four of the top six for passing yards (2009, 2011, 2014, 2016).

2017 SEASON: Has completed 61 of 92 passes (66.3 percent) for 654 yards and three TDs with two INTs for an 88.8 passer rating...Ranks No. 1 in the league in completions and No. 2 in the NFL in passing yards and passing first downs (34)...Has added 29 rushing yards on nine carries (3.2 avg.).

►**Vs. Seattle (Sept. 10):** Threw for 311 yards and a TD with one INT on 28-of-42 passing for an 86.5 rating...It marked his fifth 300-yard passing game in his last seven home openers...Dating back to last season, it also marked his third straight 300-yard passing effort, which is tied for the second-longest streak in team history behind his own streak of four games in 2011...Was his 50th career 300-yard passing game, second in franchise

history to only Brett Favre (55)...Late in the third quarter, found WR Jordy Nelson for a 32-yard TD pass down the middle of the field on a free play for the Packers (12 men on the field for Seattle)...Completed 6 of 9 passes on third down for 109 yards and a TD for a 145.1 passer rating...Added 21 rushing yards on seven carries (3.0 avg.)...Saw his streak of consecutive attempts without an INT end at 251, the second-longest streak in franchise history behind only QB Bart Starr (294, 1964-65).

• Has not missed a game in his NFL career, appearing in all 48 regular-season games and seven postseason contests since joining the Packers in 2014.

• Had 58 receptions in 2015, becoming just the fourth TE in team history to record 55-plus receptions in a season (Paul Coffman, Jermichael Finley, Jackie Harris).

• Was one of only four TEs in the league in '15 to register 55-plus catches, 500-plus receiving yards and eight or more TD receptions (Rob Gronkowski, Jordan Reed, Gary Barnidge).

2017 SEASON: Has played in both games and has two catches for 22 yards (11.0 avg.).

►**Vs. Seattle (Sept. 10):** Appeared on five plays on offense and three on special teams.

• Is one of only four players in school history to register multiple 1,000-yard rushing seasons, posting 1,233 yards in 2013 and a career-best 1,375 yards in 2016.

• Ranked No. 5 in the nation in 2016 in rushing yards per game (137.5) and registered six 100-yard rushing games, including two with 200-plus yards.

2017 SEASON: Has played in both games, rushing for 15 yards on four carries (3.8 avg.) with one reception for 5 yards.

►**Vs. Seattle (Sept. 10):** Had two carries for 9 yards (4.5 avg.) in his NFL debut.

►**At Atlanta (Sept. 17):** Rushed for 6 yards on two carries (3.0 avg.) and posted a 5-yard reception in the fourth quarter, the first catch of his NFL career.
