ALL-TIME SERIES

The Vikings lead the all-time regular season series 32-22, but the Buccaneers have won six of the past seven contests between the two teams. Tampa Bay has won in its past three trips to Minnesota, including a 36-17 victory on Thursday Night Football in their last trip in 2012. The series started in 1977, when Tampa Bay joined the NFC Central Division. Minnesota won, 9-3, at Tampa Stadium in 1977 before the Bucs upset the Vikings, 16-10, at Metropolitan Stadium in 1978. That win was just the third in franchise history and the first against a divisional opponent. Tampa Bay also won, 12-10, at the Met the following year en route to its first division title, breaking Minnesota's six-year run as NFC Central champs. From 1980-1993, the Vikings won 20 of the 26 matchups between the teams. After the Buccaneers swept the series in 1990, the Vikings returned the favor the next two seasons (1991-92). Tampa Bay and Minnesota split the season series in the final nine years (1993-2001) the two teams were in the NFC Central. The Bucs' 41-13 decision in 2000 was the most lopsided victory for Tampa Bay in the long series; Minnesota's most dominant win came in a 45-13 win in 1986. Tampa Bay posted 41 points in consecutive home wins against the Vikings in 2000 and 2001 and scored 38 points in the 2002 meeting, a 38-24 win. Victories in 2005 (24-13 at Minnesota), 2008 (19-13 in Tampa), 2011 (24-20 at the Metrodome) and 2012 (36-17 in Minnesota) made it six in a row over the Vikings, before Minnesota won, 19-13, in overtime at Tampa in 2014.

NOTES FROM LAST GAME

- Tampa Bay took the opening kickoff and drove 51 yards in 13 plays, taking 6:02, setting up a 42-yard field goal from K **Nick Folk**. The Buccaneers also scored on their opening drive of the 2016 season. Dating back to 1999, today's game marks the fifth time the team has scored on the opening possession of its first game (also 2016, 2012, 2011 and 2001).
- On the ensuing Chicago possession, LB **Kwon Alexander** recorded Tampa Bay's first takeaway of the season, intercepting Bears QB **Mike Glennon** at the Buccaneers 16-yard line, returning it 22 yards, to the Tampa Bay 38-yard line. Alexander now has four career interceptions.
- The Buccaneers offense went three-and-out following the Alexander interception, but CB **Ryan Smith** forced a fumble from Chicago PR **Tarik Cohen**, which was recovered by Tampa Bay LB **Cameron Lynch** at the Chicago 13-yard line. It is the first career fumble recovery for Lynch.
- QB **Jameis Winston** connected with WR **Mike Evans** for a 13-yard touchdown on the first play following the special teams fumble recovery. Winston now has 51 career touchdown passes.
- **Evans** now has 28 career touchdown catches, tying WR **Joey Galloway** for the third-most receiving touchdowns in franchise history.

- The Buccaneers registered their third takeaway of the day when DE **Noah Spence** sacked **Mike Glennon** and forced a fumble that was recovered by LB **Lavonte David**. Spence now has 6.5 career sacks and four career forced fumbles. David now has five career fumble recoveries.
- Following David's fumble recovery, the Buccaneers scored their second touchdown of the day on a one-yard touchdown run from RB **Jacquizz Rodgers**, capping a nine-play, 35-yard drive that lasted 3:56. Rodgers now has eight career rushing touchdowns.
- On Chicago's next possession, **Mike Glennon** threw his second interception of the game, with CB **Robert McClain** picking off the pass and returning it 47 yards for a touchdown, his first career interception returned for a touchdown. McClain now has five career interceptions.

- Since the start of 2016, when Defensive Coordinator Mike Smith was hired, the Buccaneers have recorded 33 takeaways, the third-most in the NFL during that time.

- K **Nick Folk** made his second field goal of the game on the final play of the first half, connecting on a 50-yard field goal to give the Buccaneers a 26-0 halftime lead. Folk's field goal capped an eight-play, 48-yard drive that lasted 1:04.
- Tampa Bay's 26 first-half points were the most that the team has scored in an opening half since 2015 (28 at Philadelphia, 11/22/15) and the most in the first half of a home game since 2007 (27 vs. Atlanta, 12/16/07).
- Tampa Bay's 26-point first-half margin was the fifth-largest in team history and the largest since 2001 (30 points vs. New Orleans, 12/23/01).

NOTES FROM LAST GAME

- The Buccaneers shut the Bears out in the first half, the first time they have done so since October 16, 2016 at Carolina. It is the first time the team has recorded a first-half shutout at home since 2013 (vs. Arizona).
- The first points of the second half came on Nick Folk's 23-yard field goal in the fourth quarter, finishing off a 16-play, 87-yard drive that lasted 8:36.
- Tampa Bay allowed only 20 yards rushing in today's game, the ninth-lowest mark in a game in team history. The team's 1.25 rushing average allowed also stands as the ninth-lowest mark in a game in team history.

- The Buccaneers have now won five straight at home, tied for the sixth-longest home winning streak in team history and the longest since 2008 (six straight: 09/14/08 vs. Atlanta-11/30/08 vs. New Orleans).
- Tampa Bay's four takeaways team's were the most in an opening game since 2005 (five at Minnesota, 9/11/05).
- Tampa Bay's seven points allowed are the team's fewest in an opening game since 2003 (0 points, at Philadelphia, 9/8/03).
- The following players made their NFL debut in the game: LB Kendell Beckwith, S Justin Evans, WR Chris Godwin, TE O.J. Howard and WR Bernard Reedy.
- The following players made their Buccaneers debut in the game: DT Chris Baker, QB Ryan Fitzpatrick, K Nick Folk, WR DeSean Jackson, CB Robert McClain, LS Garrison Sanborn, G J.R. Sweezy and S T.J. Ward.

LAST GAME RECAP

TAMPA, FLORIDA — The Tampa Bay Buccaneers opened their regular season in Week 2 after Hurricane Irma caused their Week 1 game at Miami to be rescheduled to later in the season. The Buccaneers earned a decisive 29-7 victory over visiting Chicago thanks in large part to four takeaways (3 on defense, 1 on special teams). After the Bears won the coin toss and elected to defer, Tampa Bay put together a 13-play drive that included an 18-yard pass to receiver Mike Evans and a 10-yard pass to receiver DeSean Jackson, which led to a 42-yard field goal by kicker Nick Folk taking the Bucs to an early lead with 8:58 left in the first quarter. On the next drive, Bears quarterback Mike Glennon completed his first six pass attempts for 53 yards, but his seventh throw over the middle intended for tight end Dion Sims was intercepted by linebacker Kwon Alexander and returned for 22 yards to the Tampa Bay 38. The Buccaneers were unable to convert on third-and-one and were forced to punt. On the punt, Chicago rookie running back Tarik Cohen tried to field a bouncing ball while surrounded by defenders, resulting in a fumble that was recovered by Buccaneers linebacker Cameron Lynch at the Chicago 13. On the next

play, quarterback Jameis Winston threw a 13-yard touchdown to Evans to take the score to 10-0 with a successful extra point from Folk to end the first quarter. Chicago then committed their third straight turnover when Glennon fumbled the ball while being sacked by defensive end Noah Spence, which was recovered by linebacker Lavonte David on the Chicago 35. Tampa Bay was able to convert the turnover into a 1-yard touchdown run by running back Jacquizz Rodgers, extending the lead to 17-0. On the next series, Glennon swung a pass attempt to receiver Josh Bellamy, but was picked off by cornerback Robert McClain who took it to the end zone for a 47-yard touchdown, making the score 23-0. Folk had another chance before halftime as he made a 50-yard field goal attempt on the half's final play to bring the score to 26-0. In addition, Folk added a 23-yarder early in the fourth quarter to make it 29-0. Tampa Bay nearly registered the team's second shutout win in the past 13 seasons, but Glennon got Chicago on the board by connecting with receiver Deonte Thompson for a 14-yard touchdown with 1:43 remaining. The clock would run out with 29-7 on the board, taking the Buccaneers to 1-0 to start the season.

WHAT TO WATCH FOR

Team

- Tampa Bay held Chicago to 20 rushing yards. If the Buccaneers hold Minnesota to 20 or fewer rushing yards, it will mark the first time in franchise history that the team has held consecutive opponents to 20 or fewer rushing yards. Tampa Bay would be only the second team since the 1970 NFL/AFL merger to hold consecutive teams to 20 or fewer rushing yards (Minnesota: 11/19/06 at MIA-11/26/06 vs. ARI).
- Tampa Bay had four takeaways against Chicago. If the team records four or more takeaways at Minnesota, it will mark the first time the Buccaneers have had consecutive games with at least four takeaways since 2007 (11/18/07 at ATL-11/25/07 vs. WAS).
- Dating back to last season, Tampa Bay has recorded at least three takeaways in the team's past two games. With three or more takeaways at Minnesota, it would mark the first time recording three or more takeaways in three consecutive games since 2009-10 (1/3/10 vs. ATL-9/19/10 at CAR).
- Dating back to last season, Tampa Bay has held each of the team's last two opponents to 16 or fewer points. If Minnesota scores 16 or fewer points, it would be the team's longest streak holding opponents to 16 or fewer points since 2008 (four games: 10/5/08 at DEN-10/26/08 at DAL).
- Tampa Bay held Chicago to seven points. If the Buccaneers hold Minnesota to seven or fewer points, it will mark their first game with consecutive opponents held to seven or fewer points since 2007 (9/23/07 vs. STL-9/30/07 at CAR).
- Tampa Bay defeated Chicago by a 22-point margin. If the team defeats
 Minnesota by 20 or more points it will mark only the third time in team
 history that the Buccaneers have recorded consecutive games with 20+
 point victories (9/10/00 vs. CHI-9/17/00 at DET; 11/9/97 at ATL-11/16/97
 vs. NE).
- Against Chicago, Tampa Bay registered an interception returned for a touchdown. With an interception returned for a touchdown at Minnesota, it would mark the first time the team has had consecutive games with an interception returned for a touchdown since 2013 (11/17/13 vs. ATL-11/24/13 at DET).
- Tampa Bay has totaled at least 5,500 yards in each of the past two seasons, the longest such streak in team history. With at least 5,500 yards in 2017, the team would extend that record.
- Tampa Bay has scored at least 325 points in each of the past two seasons, tied for the longest such streak in team history (also 2007-08). With at least 325 points in 2017, the team will set a record for most consecutive seasons with at least 325 points
- Tampa Bay totaled 29 takeaways in 2016 and, with at least 29 takeaways in 2017, would have consecutive seasons with 29 or more takeaways for the first time since 2007-09.

TE Cameron Brate

- Brate has 11 career receiving touchdowns. He needs one more to tie Kellen Winslow (12 from 2009-11) for the third-most touchdown receptions by a tight end in team history.
- Brate has 83 career receptions. He needs 13 more to pass Ken Dilger (95 from 2002-04) for ninth-most, 19 more to pass Jerry Bell (101 from 1982-85) for eighth-most, 32 more to pass Calvin Magee (114 from 1985-88) for seventh-most, 47 more to pass Alex Smith (129 from 2005-08) for sixth-most and 55 more to pass Jackie Harris (137 from 1994-97) for the fifth-most receptions by a tight end in team history.
- Brate has 989 career receiving yards. He needs 230 more to pass Jerry Bell (1,218 from 1982-85) for eighth-most, 263 more to pass Alex Smith (1,252 from 2005-08) for seventh-most 391 more to pass Calvin Magee (1,379 from 1985-88) for sixth-most and 646 more to pass Jackie Harris (1,634 from 1994-97) for the fifth-most receiving yards by a tight end in team history.

LB Lavonte David

- David has 18.0 career sacks, and needs 11 more to pass Broderick Thomas (26.5 from 1989-93) for the most sacks by a linebacker in franchise history.
- David has 10 career interceptions, and needs one more to pass Dave Lewis (10 from 1977-81) for second-most, and 15 more to tie Derrick Brooks (25 from 1995-2008) for the most interceptions by a linebacker in franchise history.
- David has two career defensive touchdowns and needs one more to tie for the fifth-most in franchise history (Donnie Abraham, Cedric Brown, Wayne Haddix, Ricky Reynolds, Aqib Talib and Richard Wood).

WR Mike Evans

- Dating back to last season, Evans has caught a touchdown pass in each of the past three games. With a touchdown reception at Minnesota, he will tie a franchise record for consecutive games with a touchdown reception, which five players have accomplished Evans (11/2/14 at CLE-11/23/14 at CHI); Mike Williams (12/19/10 vs. DET-9/11/11 vs. DET); Antonio Bryant (11/30/08 vs. NO-12/21/08 vs. SD); Joey Galloway, twice (10/16/05 vs. MIA-11/13/05 vs. WAS; 12/5/04 vs. ATL-12/26/04 vs. CAR) and Bruce Hill (10/16/88 at IND-11/6/88 at CHI).
- Evans has surpassed 1,000 receiving yards in each of his first three seasons and, with 1,000 or more receiving yards this season, will join A.J. Green (2011-14) and Randy Moss (1998-2001) as the only players in NFL history to record 1,000 or more receiving yards in each of their first four seasons. Evans would become the first player in franchise history to have four consecutive 1,000-yard receiving seasons and his four 1,000-yard receiving seasons would be the most by any player in team history.

WHAT TO WATCH FOR

WR Mike Evans (Cont.)

- Evans has recorded 3,671 receiving yards in his first four seasons and needs 636 more this season to pass James Lofton (4,306 from 1978-81) for 10th-most, 660 more to pass Julio Jones (4,330 from 2011-14) for ninthmost, 743 more to pass T.Y. Hilton (4,413 from 2012-15) for eighth-most, 817 more to pass DeAndre Hopkins (4,487 from 2013-16) for seventh-most, 874 more to pass Larry Fitzgerald (4,544 from 2004-07) for sixth-most, 935 more to pass Anquan Boldin (4,605 from 2003-06) for fifth-most, 1,203 more to pass A.J. Green (4,874 from 2011-14) for fourth-most, 1,211 more to pass Jerry Rice (4,881 from 1985-88) for third-most, 1,417 more to pass Torry Holt (5,088 from 1999-2002) and 1,726 more to pass Randy Moss (5,396 from 1998-2001) for the most receiving yards in a players' first four seasons since the 1970 NFL/AFL merger.

Minnesota 19, Tampa Bay 13 (October 26, 2014)

TAMPA — Despite a late comeback attempt, the Tampa Bay Buccaneers were defeated by the Minnesota Vikings in overtime, 19-13. Following Minnesota winning the opening coin toss and electing to defer, the Tampa Bay offense took the field. Though the Buccaneers converted on fourthand-1 to extend the drive, quarterback Mike Glennon's next pass attempt was intercepted by cornerback Captain Munnerlyn at the Minnesota 15. Minnesota then drove to the Tampa Bay 38, where kicker Blair Walsh's 56yard field goal attempt went wide left. The game would remain scoreless throughout the remainder of the first quarter and most of the second, until, with five seconds left before the end of the first half, Minnesota was able to put up first points of the game, as Walsh connected on a 46-yard field goal. Opening the second half of play, the Vikings furthered their lead to 10-0, as quarterback Teddy Bridgewater led a drive down the field that ended with a 17-yard touchdown pass to wide receiver Greg Jennings. The Buccaneers began their comeback in the fourth quarter, first getting on the board with a 54-yard field goal by kicker Patrick Murray. Following a Vikings punt, Murray connected on his second field goal of the day, this time a 45-yard attempt, tightening the score to 10-6. Minnesota was forced to punt again, and Tampa Bay took full advantage of its next drive, moving 71 yards on nine plays, including converting on fourth-and-1 from the Minnesota 8. Tight end Austin Seferian-Jenkins nabbed the sevenyard touchdown pass from Glennon, giving the Buccaneers their first lead of the game, 13-10, with just over two minutes left in regulation. The Vikings fought back, however, and responded with a game-tying 38-yard field goal as time expired, sending the game into overtime. Though the Buccaneers took the first possession in overtime, linebacker Anthony Barr forced a fumble by Seferian-Jenkins on the first play from scrimmage, scooping the loose ball up and returning it 27 yards for the Minnesota touchdown and victory.

DIRK KOETTER



Dirk Koetter was named the 11th head coach in franchise history on January 15, 2016, after serving as offensive coordinator in 2015.

In his first season as an NFL head coach, Koetter led Tampa Bay to a 9-7 record, the team's most wins since 2010 and the second-most wins by any coach in their first season with the Buccaneers (Jon Gruden -12).

Over the past two seasons, Koetter has helped guide the Buccaneers to one of the NFL's top offenses, ranking ninth in yards per game (361.1), having the sixth-highest third-down conversion rate (42.8 pct.) and totaling the sixth-most first downs (676) during that timeframe. The Buccaneers set a franchise record for third-down conversion rate in 2016 at 43.9 pct. Tampa Bay has posted consecutive seasons with at least 5,500 yards of offense for the first time in franchise history. The team has scored at least 340 points in each of the past two seasons, the first time they have reached that mark in back-to-back years. After scoring 342 points (sixth-most in team history) and 37 touchdowns (ninth-most) in 2015, the Buccaneers increased those numbers in 2016, scoring 354 points (fourth-most) and 41 touchdowns (third-most).

In 2016, Koetter continued to help with the development of quarterback Jameis Winston, who set single-season franchise records for passing yards (4,090) and passing touchdowns (28). Winston became the youngest player to throw for 50 touchdowns in NFL history and the first player in league history to throw for at least 4,000 yards in each of his first two seasons. Winston has the second-most passing yards by any player through their first two seasons and the fifth-most passing touchdowns.

Much of Winston's success came from throwing to wide receiver Mike Evans, who earned his first career Pro Bowl nod after recording 96 catches for 1,321 yards and 12 touchdowns. His 12 touchdown receptions tied Evans' own franchise record and tied for the second-most in the NFL in 2016, while his 1,321 receiving yards were the third-most in a season in team history and the fourth-most in the league last year. Evans' 96 receptions are the second-most ever by a Buccaneer and ranked sixth in the NFL last season.

The 2016 season also saw a breakout performance from tight end Cameron Brate, who tied for the NFL lead in touchdown catches by a tight end, with eight, which matched the highest mark ever by a Buccaneers tight end (Jimmie Giles, 1985). Brate was second on the team in both receptions (57) and receiving yards (660), both of which ranked in the top 10 in Buccaneers history for tight ends.

Koetter's first season also saw a defensive improvement, with the Buccaneer recording 29 takeaways, the third-highest mark in the NFL and an improvement from 23 the previous season. After allowing 26.1 points per game in 2015 (26th in the league), the 2016 team allowed only 23.1 points per game (15th in the league). Tampa Bay punter Bryan Anger also had the best punting season in team history in 2016, setting franchise records for punts inside the 20 (37 — tied for the third-most in the NFL) and net punting average (42.7, the fourth-best mark in the NFL).

In his first season with Tampa Bay (2015), Koetter helped pilot one of the most successful offenses in the NFL and one of the best in team history. The team set the franchise records for total yards (6,014 - 357.0 per game), while posting the second-most rushing yards (2,162 - 135.1 per game), the then-second-most passing yards (3,852 - 240.8 per game), along with the then-fifth-most total points (342 - 21.4 per game). Tampa Bay ranked fifth in the NFL in yards per game (375.9), fifth in rushing yards per game (135.1) and second in the league in rush average (4.75). It marked the first time in franchise history that the Buccaneers have finished in the top five in total offense.

Much of Tampa Bay's offensive success in 2015 came at the hands of rookie quarterback Jameis Winston, who accounted for 28 total touchdowns (22 passing, six rushing). Koetter also helped guide Winston to 4,042 passing yards, which were the second-most in a single season in team history and the third-most by a rookie in NFL history. Winston's 22 passing touchdowns were tied for the fourth-most in a single season in team history and the fourth-most by a rookie in NFL history. His six rushing touchdowns and 28 combined touchdowns were the most in a single season by a Buccaneers quarterback, while his 28 total touchdowns were tied for the third-most by a rookie in NFL history.

Prior to Koetter's arrival, the Buccaneers ranked 29th in rushing and tied for 29th in sacks allowed in 2014. In 2015, under Koetter's guidance, the unit completed an impressive turnaround. Despite starting two rookies on the offensive line, Tampa Bay still managed to block for the NFL's second-leading rusher (Doug Martin — 1,402 yards) and tied for the fourth-fewest sacks in the league. While Martin was a large part of the team's success running the ball, he was aided by running back Charles Sims, who totaled 1,090 scrimmage yards (107 rushes for 529 yards, 51 catches for 561 yards). Sims averaged 6.9 yards per touch, the most by any player in the NFL with at least 150 touches since 2011 (Darren Sproles in 2011, 7.6 avg.). Martin and Sims' combined 2,566 yards from scrimmage were the most by a running back duo in the NFL in 2015 and set a franchise record for backfield teammates.

Koetter also played a key role in revamping the Buccaneers' passing game. Part of the team's success passing the ball came from targeting top wide receiver Mike Evans, who caught 74 passes for 1,206 yards. His 1,206 yards are the seventh-most in a single season in team history and stood as the 11th-most in the league in 2015. Sims' 561 receiving yards were the fourth-most by a running back in the NFL in 2015, while his four receiving touchdowns set a franchise record and tied for the second-most in the league by a running back.

DIRK KOETTER

Koetter joined the Buccaneers after three seasons working as the offensive coordinator for the Atlanta Falcons (2012-14). During his three seasons with Atlanta, the team cumulatively ranked second in the NFL in completion percentage (67.4), third in third-down conversion percentage (44.1), fourth in passing yards (277.2 per game), ninth in passing touchdowns (86), ninth in passer rating (93.9), 10th in points (24.0 per game) and 10th in total yardage (363.5 per game), while posting the second-fewest penalties (243) and penalty yards (2,043), seventh-fewest turnovers (69) and the ninth-lowest interception percentage (2.4) in the league. Koetter was part of the Falcons staff that went 13-3 in 2012 and played in the NFC Championship Game.

Under Koetter, Falcons quarterback Matt Ryan posted three of the four highest passing yardage seasons in franchise history to that point, as well as three of the five highest completion percentage seasons. In 2012, Ryan set then-franchise records and personal bests in passing yards (4,719), completion percentage (68.6) and passing touchdowns (32), while recording the second-highest passer rating mark in Falcons history (99.1). Atlanta wide receivers also flourished under Koetter, with Julio Jones setting a then-franchise record and ranking third in the NFL in receiving yards in 2014 with 1,593 yards. In those three seasons, the Falcons had a different player lead the team in receiving yards each season (Roddy White, 2012; Harry Douglas, 2013; Jones, 2014).

While Koetter was in charge of the Falcons' offense, he coached three players to Pro Bowl appearances (Julio Jones, 2012, 2014; Tony Gonzalez, 2012-13; Matt Ryan, 2012), with Gonzalez earning first-team All-Pro honors in 2012. In his first season with Koetter in 2012, Gonzalez set a franchise record for receiving yards by a tight end, recording 93 catches for 930 yards — the most he had recorded in either category since 2008. That same season, Jones and White combined for 2,549 receiving yards, the most by a duo in the NFL.

Prior to joining the Falcons, Koetter spent five seasons as the offensive coordinator of the Jacksonville Jaguars (2007-11). In his five years with the Jaguars, the team cumulatively ranked third in the NFL in rushing yards (132.0 per game) and sixth in rushing average (4.41). Koetter's Jacksonville offenses also showed a penchant for taking care of the football, tallying the seventh-fewest turnovers in the league during that time.

Koetter had immediate success in Jacksonville, with his 2007 team setting franchise records in points (25.7 per game, sixth in the NFL) and total offense (357 yards per game, seventh in the NFL). In his first season as the starter, quarterback David Garrard ranked third in the NFL and set a franchise record in passer rating (102.2), throwing a league-low three interceptions, while leading the team to a Wild Card playoff berth and a win over the Pittsburgh Steelers. In 2008, Garrard threw for a career-best 3,620 yards and in 2010 he tossed 23 touchdowns, a career high and a franchise record.

While with the Jaguars, Koetter coached four different players to six Pro Bowl selections, including running back Maurice Jones-Drew, who earned three trips to the Pro Bowl and led the NFL in rushing in 2010 en route to earning an All-Pro selection. Koetter also helped tight end Marcedes Lewis earn a Pro Bowl berth following the 2010 season, when Lewis caught 10 touchdown passes, then tied for the most in a season in Jaguars history.

Before joining the Jaguars, Koetter spent 22 years at the collegiate level, the final six as the head coach at Arizona State (2001-06). In his six seasons with the Sun Devils, Koetter led the team to four bowl games, posting a 40-34 record. Working as both the head coach and offensive coordinator, he helped Arizona State average nearly 30 points per game over six seasons, while ranking in the top 20 in the nation in passing offense in five of his six years. In addition, five of the six Sun Devil teams during Koetter's tenure produced a 1,000-yard receiver and quarterbacks that threw for 20 or more touchdowns in five of six seasons.

Koetter's first head coaching opportunity came at Boise State, where he spent three seasons (1998-2000), finishing with a 26-10 record and two consecutive bowl wins. He was a two-time Big West Coach of the Year and two-time conference champion.

A native of Pocatello, Idaho, Koetter played collegiately at Idaho State (1978-81), helping his team to a Division I-AA national championship as a senior. He graduated with a bachelor's degree in physical education and earned a master's in athletic administration a year later. After getting his master's, he became the head coach at Highland (Idaho) High School, where he worked from 1983-84, going 19-4 and winning the 1984 state championship.

In 1985, Koetter worked as the offensive coordinator at San Francisco State and from 1986-88 was the offensive coordinator and quarterbacks coach at the University of Texas El-Paso. He then served as offensive coordinator/quarterbacks coach at Missouri from 1989-93 and offensive coordinator at Boston College (1994-95) and Oregon (1996-97).

Koetter, 58, and his wife, Kim, have two daughters, Kaylee and Kendra, and two sons, Derek and Davis.

MIKE ZIMMER



Mike Zimmer was hired as the 9th Head Coach in Vikings history on January 15, 2014. A veteran defensive coordinator, Zimmer enters his 24th season on an NFL sideline, having spent 14 years as defensive coordinator for Cincinnati (2008-13), Atlanta (2007) and Dallas (2000-06).

In 2016, Zimmer coached the No. 3 defense in the NFL, highlighted by five Pro Bowlers- DE Everson Griffen, S

Harrison Smith, LB Anthony Barr, DT Linval Joseph and CB Xavier Rhodes. On offense, QB Sam Bradford completed 71.6 percent of his passes on the season, setting a new NFL record for completion percentage, while also setting a team record for interception percentage at 0.9 percent.

Zimmer led the team to an NFC North title and a Wild Card Playoff berth in 2015, his second season with the team. In his first season with Minnesota, Zimmer helped engineer vast improvements on the defense, going from 32nd in the league in offensive points allowed to 13th and from 31st in pass defense to seventh.

Zimmer has been a part of 12 playoff teams in his NFL tenure and teams that have won eight Division titles. He coached the Cowboys DBs when the team won Super Bowl XXX over Pittsburgh after the 1995 season. .

Zimmer's arrival in Cincinnati for the 2008 season signaled a franchise turnaround on the defensive side of the ball. The Bengals notched top-10 defensive rankings in 2009, '11, '12 and '13 after only cracking the NFL's top 10 once in 18 seasons prior to Zimmer joining the team. During his tenure, Zimmer coached Geno Atkins as he became one of the top DTs in the NFL, earning consensus All-Pro honors in 2012 and Pro Bowl berths in 2011 and 2012. In 2013, LB Vontaze Burfict continued his rise from an undrafted rookie free agent in 2012 to a Pro Bowler in 2013.

Zimmer led top-10 defenses for Dallas in both a 4-3 and 3-4 scheme. The 2003 Cowboys defense ranked #1 in the NFL with only 253.3 yards per game allowed. During Zimmer's tenure in Dallas as DBs coach (1994-99) and Defensive Coordinator (2000-06) the team ranked in the top 5 of NFL scoring defense a total of 6 times. The 1995 Cowboys hoisted the Lombardi Trophy in Super Bowl XXX with a win over Pittsburgh and one of Zimmer's pupils, CB Larry Brown, won the Super Bowl MVP award with a pair of INTs in the game. Brown is 1 of only 3 DBs to earn Super Bowl MVP honors in the history of the game.

Before moving to the NFL ranks, Zimmer spent 15 seasons coaching at the collegiate level. He spent his final 5 seasons in the college ranks as defensive coordinator at Washington State from 1989-93. Zimmer was at Weber State from 1981-88, serving as defensive coordinator from 1983-88. He entered the coaching profession at Missouri where he served as an assistant from 1979-80.

Zimmer played QB and later LB at Illinois State, earning a degree in physical education. He has 3 children, son Adam and daughters Corri and Marki. Vikki Zimmer, Mike's wife of 27 years, passed away in Cincinnati on October 8, 2009. The Pro Football Writers of America recognized Zimmer overcoming the tragedy and the Bengals #4 ranked defense playing a key role in winning then AFC North title by voting him the winner of the Halas Award for the season, an annual award presented to the individual in the NFL that overcame the most adversity to succeed.

JASON LIGHT




DT **Chris Baker** comes to Tampa Bay after spending the past five seasons with the Washington Redskins (2012-16). Prior to his time with Washington, Baker saw time with the Denver Broncos and Miami Dolphins. In his career, Baker has played in 78 regular season games, with 42 starts, totaling 181 tackles (26 for loss), 11.5

sacks, five passes defensed, five forced fumbles and two fumble recoveries.

In 2015, Baker earned the Sam Huff Defensive Player of the Year award from the Washington Redskins Alumni Association after posting career highs in sacks (6.0), quarterback hits (17), tackles for loss (10), forced fumbles (three) and fumble recoveries (two).

Per Stats, Inc., Baker has 64.5 combined quarterback knockdowns and hurries over the past two seasons. Dating back to 2015, Baker is one of six NFL players to post 100+ tackles, 9+ sacks, and 5+ forced fumbles, joining Khalil Mack, Von Miller, Carlos Dunlap, Melvin Ingram and Brandon Graham.



WR **DeSean Jackson**. comes to Tampa Bay after spending the past three seasons with the Washington Redskins (2014-16). Prior to his time with Washington, Jackson spent six seasons with the Philadelphia Eagles (2008-13). In his nine-year career, Jackson has started 123-of-126 regular season games played, catching 498 passes for 8,819 yards

and 46 touchdowns.

A three-time Pro Bowl selection (2009, 2010, 2013) and a 2009 second-team Associated Press All-Pro selection (kick returner), Jackson's 8,819 receiving yards are the fifth-most since he entered the league in 2008 (Calvin Johnson, Brandon Marshall, Larry Fitzgerald, Andre Johnson). Among players with 100 career games played, Jackson ranks 15th in league annals with a 70.0 receiving yards per game average. A veteran of postseason play, Jackson has also started all seven playoff contests he has played, catching 21 passes for 338 yards and two touchdowns.

Known for his big-play ability, Jackson is one of five players since the 1970 merger to account for 26 career touchdowns of 50+ yards, joining Jerry Rice (36), Randy Moss (29), Terrell Owens (26) and Steve Smith (26). Only Rice (23) has more than Jackson's 22 touchdowns of 60+ yards.

Since 2008, Jackson's 112 receptions of 25+ yards, 37 receptions of 50+ yards and 17.7 yards per reception average (min. 60 career catches) all lead the NFL. The 37 catches of 50+ yards are 14 more than any other player during that span, while his five 1,000-yard receiving seasons and 32 100-yard receiving games are each tied for the fifth-most. Additionally, his per catch averages in 2010 (22.5) and 2014 (20.9) rank second and fourth, respectively, among all single seasons over that nine-year period.

Showcasing his versatility, Jackson has also rushed 61 times for 380 yards (6.2 avg.) and three touchdowns and returned 134 punts for 1,289 yards and four touchdowns. In 2010, Jackson became the first player selected to the Pro Bowl at two different positions in the same year when he was chosen as a wide receiver and a return specialist.



S **T.J. Ward** spent the past three seasons (2014-16) with the Denver Broncos, earning Pro Bowl selections following the 2014 & 2015 seasons. He was also a member of the Broncos' Super Bowl 50 championship team. During his three seasons in Denver, Ward was a lynchpin of one of the most successful defenses in football, with the

Broncos ranking first in passing yards allowed per game (203.6), second in yards allowed per game (301.5) and fifth in points allowed per game (19.7).

Ward originally entered the NFL as a second-round pick (38th overall) of the Cleveland Browns in 2010. He spent his first four seasons with Cleveland (2010-13), earning a Pro Bowl selection following the 2013 season, before joining Denver as an unrestricted free agent in 2014. In his career, he has started all 95 regular season games he has played in, totaling 545 tackles (28 for loss), 41 passes defensed, 10 forced fumbles, 8.5 sacks, eight interceptions (returned 211 yards, one touchdown) and three fumble recoveries. Ward has also started all four postseason contests he has played in, registering 19 tackles, three passes defensed, one fumble recovery and one interception. His postseason interception and fumble recovery each came in Super Bowl 50, helping secure a Broncos victory.

TE **O.J.** Howard was chosen 19th overall out of the University of Alabama, where he started 37-of-57 career games played, including 28 of the final 30 in his collegiate career. He recorded 114 receptions for 1,726 yards and seven touchdowns as a member of the Crimson Tide. In two College Football Playoff National

Championship Games against Clemson, Howard totaled nine receptions for 314 yards and three touchdowns, winning the MVP award for his efforts in the 2015 contest. As a senior in 2016, Howard was named first-team All-American by Pro Football Focus and was a third-team selection by the Associated Press, while earning second-team All-SEC honors from both the coaches and the AP. He was a finalist for the John Mackey Award, given annually to the nation's best tight end. A native of Prattville, Alabama, he attended Autauga Academy.



S **Justin Evans** was chosen 50th overall out of the Texas A&M, where he played in 25 games over two seasons (2015-16), totaling 165 tackles, 14 passes defensed and five interceptions, while returning 17 kickoffs for 474 yards. In 2016, he led the Aggies with four interceptions, while adding 87 tackles and 10 passes

defensed, earning second-team AII-SEC honors.

Prior to his time at Texas A&M, Evans spent two seasons at Mississippi Gulf Coast Community College, where he tallied 86 tackles, 13 passes defensed and six interceptions, with two returned for touchdowns. Evans earned first-team all-conference honors during his final season at Mississippi Gulf Coast.



WR **Chris Godwin** was selected 84th overall out of Penn State, where he was one of the most prolific receivers in school history, finishing seventh in receptions (153), fourth in receiving yards (2,404) and tied for fourth in receiving touchdowns (18). As a true junior in 2016, Godwin started all 14 games for the Nittany Lions,

catching 11 touchdown passes, the second-most in a single season in school history, helping him earn third-team All-Big Ten honors from the conference's media and honorable mention All-Big Ten from the conference's coaches.

As a true sophomore (2015), Godwin had a career-high 1,101 receiving yards, the second-most in a single season in Penn State history. He earned second-team All-Big Ten honors from the conference's media and the Associated Press, while earning third-team All-Big Ten honors from the conference's coaches.



LB **Kendell Beckwith** was the second of Tampa Bay's two third-round picks, chosen 107th overall out of Louisiana State. He played in 47 career games, with 29 starts, totaling 263 tackles, 24.5 tackles for loss, eight passes defensed, 7.5 sacks, three forced fumbles, one fumble recovery and one interception. As

a senior (2016), Beckwith earned third-team All-America honors from the Associated Press and was named first-team All-SEC by the conference's coaches after leading the Tigers and ranking second in the SEC with 9.1 tackles per game.



DT **Stevie Tu'ikolovatu (IR)** was selected 223rd overall out of USC, where he played the 2016 season after transferring from Utah. In his collegiate career, the Salt Lake City, Utah, native played in 38 games, with 14 starts, totaling 89 tackles (nine for loss), four fumble recoveries, three passes defensed and two tackles for

loss. In his lone season with the Trojans, Tu'ikolovatu was named secondteam All-Pac-12 and earned Rose Bowl defensive player of the game honors after leading the team with eight tackles in a win over Penn State.

STRENGTH OF THE SOUTH

Over the previous 15 seasons, one could argue that the toughest division in the NFL is the NFC South. Since realignment in 2002, the NFC South is the only division to not only have each of its teams make a conference championship appearance, but have all four teams make it to the Super Bowl. The NFC East, NFC West and AFC West are the only other divisions to have all four teams earn a division championship since realignment.

The NFC South has also been represented nine times in a conference championship game, the best in the NFC and the second-most in the NFL. The NFC South is also tied for the second-most appearances in the Super Bowl (5), tied for the most by any NFC division. In 2016, The NFC South became the first division since realignment to have all four of its teams play in the Super Bowl, with Tampa Bay (XXXVII), Atlanta (LI), Carolina (XXXVIII & 50) and New Orleans (XLIV) all making it.

In 2010, the NFC South recorded another impressive feat, as they were the only division to have three teams finish with a winning record, with three of the four teams finish with a double-digit win total (Atlanta - 13-3; New Orleans - 11-5; Tampa Bay - 10-6). It marked just the second time, dating back to realignment in 2002, that a division has had three teams with double-digit wins in the same season (also the AFC South in 2007). The feat was matched by the NFC North in 2012, the NFC West in 2013 and the AFC North in 2014.

In 2008, the NFC South again showed its overall strength, as it finished as one of only three divisions in the League to have three of its four teams with a record of 9-7 or better (also AFC East and NFC East) and is one of two divisions to have all of its teams at 8-8 or better (also NFC East). The NFC South also finished with a remarkable 27-5 overall home record in 2008, the best combined home winning percentage by a division in NFL history (.844), with the next best division last season, the NFC East, holding an 23-9 record at home. The South was also a near-perfect 11-1 at home when facing other South division opponents in 2008. The Bucs contributed significantly to that mark, as they finished 6-2 at home, winning their first six games at Raymond James Stadium in 2008.
