PHILADELPHIA EAGLES (4-1) AT CAROLINA PANTHERS (4-1)

CAROLINA AND PHILADELPHIA FACE OFF ON THURSDAY NIGHT FOOTBALL

PHILADELPHIA AT CAROLINA

A pair of 4-1 teams meet on Thursday Night Football as Carolina welcomes Philadelphia to Bank of America Stadium.

This marks Carolina's fourth 4-1 start in franchise history (2003, 2008, 2015, 2017) and Carolina is 3-0 on the road this season following a 27-24 victory at Detroit on Sunday.

Against Detroit, Carolina received big contributions offensively from quarterback Cam Newton and tight end Ed Dickson. Newton passed for 300 yards in his second consecutive game and notched three touchdown passes in the victory. Dickson was on the other end of five of Newton's passes for a career-high 175 yards. Dickson's 175 yards are the fourth-highest in a single game by any player in the NFL this season. It also ranks as the second-best receiving game by a tight end in Panthers history (Greg Olsen, 181, 2016). Dickson's 175 yards bettered his cumulative season totals from each of the past three seasons. (2014 – 115, 2015 – 121, 2016 – 134).

Defensively, Carolina put pressure on Lions quarterback Matthew Stafford, sacking him six times. Defensive tackle Kawann Short notched two sacks, including a strip-sack of Stafford, that helped Carolina record its first takeaway since Week One. Defensive end Julius Peppers added to his team-leading sack total as well and now leads the Panthers with 5.5 sacks on the season. He is just 1.5 sacks away from tying Chris Doleman (150.5) for fourth all-time in NFL history.

This is the third consecutive meeting in primetime between Carolina and Philadelphia. The teams met on Monday Night Football in 2012 and 2014, and on Sunday Night Football in 2015. The Eagles hold a 6-4 advantage in the all-time regular season and postseason series.

Statistics and rankings in this release are accurate through Sunday, October 8. They do not reflect Monday Night Football.

THE HEAD COACHES



Ron RIVERA

Ron Rivera became the fourth coach in Carolina Panthers history on January 11, 2011.

In six seasons, Rivera has guided the team to a Super Bowl appearance, an NFC Championship and three NFC South titles. He is a two-time (2013 and 2015) Associated Press NFL Coach of the Year award winner. In 2015, Rivera led the Panthers to the second Super Bowl appearance in team history following a franchise-best 15-1 record and their third consecutive NFC South championship. In the process, Carolina became the fourth team in the Super Bowl era to start a season 14-0, joining the 1972 Miami Dolphins, 2007 New England Patriots and 2009 Indianapolis Colts. Carolina's 18-game regular season winning streak, beginning in 2014, was the longest in NFC history. In 2013, Rivera guided Carolina to its first playoff appearance in 2008 and in 2014, he led the Panthers to the team's first playoff win since 2005.

Before joining the Panthers in 2011, Rivera coached the San Diego Chargers (2007-2010), Chicago Bears (2004-06, 1997-98) and Philadelphia Eagles (1999-2003). In 2006, the Bears defense led the NFL with 44 takeaways, helping propel Chicago to an appearance in Super Bowl XLI.

Rivera is just the third Latino head coach in NFL history, joining Tom Flores with the Oakland Raiders (1979-1987) and Seattle Seahawks (1992-94) and Tom Fears with the New Orleans Saints (1967-1970).

A second-round draft choice in 1984 by Chicago, Rivera played nine seasons with the Bears. Primarily an outside linebacker, he was a member of the Super Bowl XX championship team in 1985.

An All-American at the University of California, Rivera finished his career as the school's all-time leader in sacks with 22 and tackles with 336.

Born January 7, 1962 in Fort Ord, Calif., he and his wife, Stephanie, have two children – Christopher and Courtney.

Doug PEDERSON

Doug Pederson was named head coach of the Philadelphia Eagles on January 18, 2016, after having served as the Kansas City Chiefs offensive coordinator (2013-15).

In his first season with the Eagles, Pederson helped develop rookie quarterback Carson Wentz, who set a team and all-time NFL rookie record with 379 completions. Under Pederson's direction, Wentz also posted franchise rookie records in pass attempts, passing yards and passing touchdowns.

While with the Chiefs, Pederson helped guide the team to 10 consecutive victories to close out the 2015 season and reach the postseason. In 2013, Pederson and the coaching staff helped turn a 2-14 Chiefs team into an 11-5 playoff contender, marking the largest one-year turnaround in team history.

Pederson, who enjoyed a 12-year playing career in the NFL, began his pro coaching career in Philadelphia where he served under Andy Reid as an offensive quality control coach (2009-10) and quarterbacks coach (2011-12).

Pederson attended Northeast Louisiana, where he was a three-year starter at quarterback and graduated with a B.B.A. in business management. A 12-year NFL veteran, he played quarterback for the Green Bay Packers, Miami Dolphins, Eagles and Cleveland Browns. Pederson served as a backup quarterback for the Packers when the team won Super Bowl XXXI. He began coaching as head coach at Calvary Baptist Academy (Shreveport, La.).

Born January 31, 1968 in Bellingham, Wash., Pederson and his wife, Jeannie, have three sons: Drew, Josh and Joel.

GAME SUMMARY

CAROLINA 27, PHILADELPHIA 16
OCTOBER 25, 2015 • BANK OF AMERICA STADIUM • CHARLOTTE, N.C.

Despite three turnovers, Carolina remained unbeaten, defeating the Philadelphia Eagles, 27-16, at Bank of America Stadium on Sunday Night Football. Carolina started each half with a touchdown drive and stopped the Eagles each time they produced a takeaway to improve to 6-0 for the first time in franchise history. After the Eagles received the game's opening kick-off and picked up a single first down before punting, Carolina needed just four plays to cover 72 yards. Running back Jonathan Stewart – who finished with a season-high 125 yards – bulled his way to nine yards then sped for 36 yards. Wide receiver Corey Brown followed with a 25-yard reception down to the 2-yard line, setting up fullback Mike Tolbert for his first touchdown of the season. The fast start continued when safety Colin Jones picked off Sam Bradford at the Philadelphia 21 on the first play after Tolbert's touchdown, and wide receiver Ted Ginn, Jr. followed with what looked like a catch at the 6 on the next play but was ruled an interception. That only served to delay the strong start, which got back on track when Ginn gained 43 yards on a reverse down to the 8 with five minutes left in the half, setting up Newton for a 2-yard touchdown run and a 14-3 lead. The Panthers led 14-6 at halftime and quickly extended it with an 80-yard march out of the break. The drive featured four passes that covered 13 or more yards, and Tolbert finished it off with a remarkable 2-yard touchdown reception on which he was knocked back by a big hit but recovered to power into the right corner for a 21-6 lead. The Eagles responded on their ensuing possession as running back Ryan Mathews took a handoff and found significant daylight through the middle of the Carolina defense, sprinting 63 yards virtually untouched to pull Philadelphia within 21-13. After the third interception of the night from Newton – on a ball that bounced off rookie wide receiver Devin Funchess' hands midway through the third quarter – Philadelphia found itself 18 yards away from tying the game with a touchdown and two-point conversion. But the Panthers stopped Philadelphia shy of the end zone – just as they had after a first-half interception at the Carolina 29 – and the Eagles had to settle for a field goal that pulled them within 21-16. In the fourth quarter, Carolina closed the deal with three sacks and the Eagles wouldn't threaten to score again, failing to advance past their own 32-yard line on either of their two remaining drives facing a one-score deficit. Kicker Graham Gano added two field goals in the final frame for the final scores of the night. Defensive tackle Kawann Short tallied a career-high 3.0 sacks to pace the Panthers.

DICKSON HAS CAREER DAY AT DETROIT

In Week Five at Detroit (10/8/17), tight end Ed Dickson set a career high with 175 receiving yards, marking the first 100-yard receiving game of his career.

Dickson's 175 yards are the fourth-highest in a single game by any player in the NFL this season. It also ranks as the second-best receiving game by a tight end in Panthers history (Greg Olsen, 181, 2016).

Dickson becomes just the second tight end in NFL history to tally at least 175 receiving yards on five or fewer receptions (Dave Kocourek, 1961). It also ranks as the fourth-most receiving yards by an NFL tight end in a game since 2003.

Dickson's yardage total included a career-long 64-yard reception on Carolina's first scoring drive. Dickson later had a 57-yard reception, the third-longest reception his career. He is the first player in franchise history with two receptions of 50-plus yards in the same game.

Dickson's 175 yards against Detroit bettered his cumulative season totals from each of the past three seasons. (2014 – 115, 2015 – 121, 2016 – 134).

NEWTON REACHES 300 AGAIN

In Week Five at Detroit (10/8/17), quarterback Cam Newton passed for 355 yards, marking the 16th 300-yard passing game of his career.

It was Newton's second consecutive 300-yard passing game after throwing for 313 in Week Four at New England (10/1/17). Newton has only had back-to-back 300-yard passing games once previously in his career – in the first two games of his rookie season when he threw for 422 at Arizona (9/11/11) and 432 vs. Green Bay (9/18/11).

Newton produced a strong first half, completing 15-of-17 passes for 237 yards and two touchdowns for a passer rating of 158.0. The 237 passing yards are the second-most in a first half in Newton's career behind the 246 vs. Atlanta (12/13/15).

Newton now has two consecutive games with passer ratings over 130. He and Tom Brady are the only quarterbacks to achieve that so far in 2017. Newton's rating of 141.8 against the Lions was the fourth-highest of his career.

A RUNNING HISTORY

Carolina made headlines this offseason with the selection of elite Stanford running back Christian McCaffrey with the eighth pick of the NFL Draft. A Heisman finalist in his junior season, McCaffrey broke Barry Sanders' record for most all-purpose yards in a single college season.

McCaffrey brings his speed and quickness to a Panthers running game that has been among the NFL's best for nearly a decade.

Since 2008, the year Carolina drafted Jonathan Stewart, the Panthers lead the NFL in total rushing yards with 19,928. The Panthers have over 500 more rushing yards than the second-place New York Jets over that span. Carolina also ranks second in rushing touchdowns since 2008 with 163, just nine behind the New England Patriots.

Newton is one of just three players in NFL history, along with Peyton Manning of the Indianapolis Colts from 1998-2003 and Andy Dalton of the Cincinnati Bengals from 2011-16, to have at least 3,000 passing yards in each of their first six seasons.

NEWTON IS PANTHERS QB WINS LEADER

In Week Four at New England (10/1/17), quarterback Cam Newton earned his 54th career victory as a starter, setting a franchise record for wins by a quarterback.

In the game, Newton totaled four touchdowns (three passing and one rushing). It was Newton's 36th career game with at least one rushing touchdown and at least one passing touchdown.

Newton led his 13th career game-winning drive as he directed the offense into field goal range for kicker Graham Gano to convert from 48 yards as time expired. The win was the 54th regular season victory in Newton's career,

Newton tallied the 15th 300-yard passing game of his career as he completed 22-of-29 passes for 316 yards and a passer rating of 130.8. The 75.9 completion percentage was the sixth-best of his career.

Newton's rushing touchdown was the 50th of his career. He is the first quarterback in NFL history to reach 50 career rushing touchdowns.

Julius Peppers, Charles Johnson, Mario Addison, Thomas Davis and Kawann Short all rank in the top eight of the Panthers all-time sack leaders, and all of them are back in Panthers uniforms in 2017.

Peppers and Johnson rank first and second all-time in sacks, and those five players currently account for 27.2 percent of all 861.0 sacks ever recorded in Panthers history. Since Peppers was drafted in 2002, the Panthers rank fourth in the NFL with 612.0 sacks.

GANO SETS TOUCHBACK RECORD

In Week Four at New England (10/1/17), kicker Graham Gano had a streak of 15 consecutive kickoffs resulting in touchbacks to start the 2017 season broken on his third kickoff of the game when New England's Dion Lewis returned a Gano kickoff from the New England 3-yard line to the 26-yard line.

The streak of 15 consecutive kickoffs resulting in touchbacks is the longest such streak in the NFL to start a season since at least 1970. Gano held the previous long streak with 14 to start the 2013 season.

In 2016, first-year punter Michael Palardy joined the Panthers after Andy Lee was placed on injured reserve with a hamstring injury.

At the time of his injury, Lee was among the NFL leaders, ranking fourth with a 49.1-yard gross average and tied for seventh with 18 punts inside the 20.

Palardy was a capable replacement, making his debut in Week Eleven vs.

New Orleans (11/17/16). He produced a then career-high 46.7-yard gross average in each of his first two games vs. New Orleans and in Week Twelve at Oakland (11/27/16).

In the final seven weeks of the season, Palardy recorded a 42.5-yard gross average and tied for 12th in the NFL with 13 punts inside the 20. In Week Fourteen vs. San Diego (12/11/16), Palardy recorded a career-high 42.6-yard net average and placed two punts inside the 20-yard line, including one in the fourth quarter that was downed at the 3-yard line.

Palardy turned that performance and a strong 2017 preseason into a spot on this season's 53-man roster. In the 2017 season opener at San Francisco (9/10/17), Palardy posted a career-best 48.7 net average on three punts, the second-best net punting average in a Panthers season opener since Jason Baker (51.0) at St. Louis (9/9/07).

Palardy uncorked a career-long 60-yard punt in Week Five at Detroit (10/8/17).
