



PACKERS FACE ROAD TEST AT THE VIKINGS

The Green Bay Packers will travel across the state to take on the Minnesota Vikings at U.S. Bank Stadium on Sunday

- ► Green Bay has won five of the last seven at Minnesota.
- ▶ Of the past 29 regular-season meetings between the teams, 20 of those games have been decided by seven points or



- ▶ They have split the season series both of the past two years.
- ▶ The Packers have a 28-27 record in away games against the Vikings.
- ►Through 113 meetings, which includes two postseason contests (1-1), the Packers hold a 60-51-2 edge over the Vikings in the all-time series.
- ▶The Packers are 11-3-1 in the last 15 games between the teams during the regular and postseason.
- ►The Packers have scored 30-plus points in eight of their last 14 regularseason games against Minnesota. That included a 38-point effort the last time the two teams played last season, a 42-point game in 2014, a 44-point outing at Minnesota in 2013, the most points ever scored by Green Bay at the Metrodome, and a 45-point effort at Lambeau Field in
- ► Since Head Coach Mike McCarthy took over in 2006, the Packers have a 15-6-1 record (.705) against the Vikings in the regular season.
- Since 2006, the Packers have scored 20-plus points against the Vikings in 19 of 22 regular-season games. The Packers' 614 points scored in the regular season since 2006 are the most against the Vikings in the NFL, and Green Bay's average of 27.9 points per game leads the league among teams that have played Minnesota at least four times over that span.
- Sunday will kick off a stretch for the Packers of three NFC North contests in the next four games.
- ►Including the playoffs this will be McCarthy's 200th career game as head coach.
- ▶The Packers are 4-1 this season, marking the fourth time since 2006 that Green Bay has won at least four of its first five games (5-0 in 2015 / 5-0 in 2011 / 4-1 in 2007).
- ► The Packers have won 10 of their last 11 regular-season games and are tied with Kansas City of the best record in the NFL over that span.
- ▶ Dating back to 2006, the Packers (31-11, .738) hold the second-best winning percentage in the month of October behind the New England Patriots (40-8, .833). Green Bay has won 22 of its last 26 games played in the month of October.
- ▶ Dating back to 2008, Rodgers leads the NFL (min. 300 pass attempts) in passer rating (108.4), passing touchdowns (81) and touchdown percentage (6.9) in the month of October, while ranking No. 3 in passing yards (9,796).
- The Packers are the only team with four touchdowns on opening drives this season. Green Bay leads the league with 27 points on opening drives.
- ▶ The Packers are No. 1 in red-zone efficiency this season (15 TDs on 19 drives, 78.95 percent). Green Bay has scored nine TDs on 10 red-zone drives over the last two games.

RODGERS AND THE VIKINGS

- ►Including the postseason, Green Bay is 12-6 against Minnesota with Aaron Rodgers as the starting quarterback, and has won 11 of the last 14 contests.
- ▶In 18 games as the starter against the Vikings (including playoffs),

Rodgers has completed 400 of 586 passes (68.3 percent) for 4,810 yards, 40 TDs and six INTs with a passer rating of 111.7. His passer rating is the second highest of any opposing quarterback (min. 100 att.) vs. Minnesota (Kurt Warner, 112.4).

►Rodgers has recorded a 100-plus passer rating in 12 of his 18 starts against the Vikings, including the postseason.

▶In the last nine games versus Minnesota (including playoffs), Rodgers has thrown 20 touchdowns and two interceptions.

►Rodgers is the only player to have four games with four-plus touchdown passes with zero interceptions against the Vikings. No other quarterback has more than two.

WITH THE CALL

FOX Sports, now in its 24th season as an NFL network television partner, will broadcast the game.

Play-by-play man **Thom Brennaman** joins analyst **Troy** Aikman and sideline reporter Erin Andrews.

► Milwaukee's WTMJ (620 AM), airing Green Bay games since November 1929, heads up the Packers Radio Network that is made up of 50 stations in five states. Wayne Larrivee (play-by-play) and two-time Packers Pro Bowler Larry McCarren (analyst) call the action. McCarren first joined the team's broadcasts in 1995 and enters his 23rd season calling Packers games. After originally being paired together in 1999, McCarren and Larrivee enter their 19th season of broadcasts together.

►The broadcast is also available on Sirius Satellite Radio (WTMJ feed).

DIVISIONAL DRIVE

The Packers have a 49-17-1 (.739) overall regular-season record against NFC North opponents under Head Coach **Mike McCarthy**, a divisional mark that ranks **No. 2 in the NFL** since 2006:

- ►Under McCarthy Green Bay has had four winning streaks of six-plus games against NFC North opponents (six games: 2006-07, 2014-15 and 2016-present / 12 games from 2010-12).
- ▶ Dating back to 2016, Green Bay is plus-11 in turnover margin in division games, ranking **No. 1 in the NFL**. The Packers were plus-four in their first divisional game this season (vs. Chicago, Week 4).
- ►In the Packers' 67 divisional games under McCarthy, they have registered a plus-47 turnover differential (No. 2 in the NFL since 2006).
- ▶ Green Bay ranks No. 3 in the NFL in point differential against division opponents since 2016:

- ▶ For the fourth time in his career, Rodgers posted four-plus TD passes with zero INTs against the Bears in Week 4, one of two opponents he has done that against (Minnesota, four games). According to the Elias Sports Bureau, he joins Tom Brady (five games vs. Buffalo) as the only QBs in league history to have four or more games with four-plus TD passes/zero INTs vs. the same opponent.
- ▶Rodgers joins Fran Tarkenton as the only QBs in NFL history to register four games with four-plus TD passes vs. Chicago.



IN THE CONFERENCE

The Packers have established themselves as one of the best teams in the NEC.

- ► Green Bay has won eight of its last nine regular-season games against NFC opponents.
- ► Under Head Coach **Mike McCarthy**, Green Bay tallied a winning record against NFC opponents in 10 of his first 11 seasons (2006-16):

ON THE ROAD

- ► The Packers take to the road for the third time in the 2017 regular season, having split the first two contests.
- ► Dating back to last season, Green Bay has won four of its past five regular-season away games.
- ► With a 4-4 road record during the 2016 regular season, Green Bay finished with at least a .500 record away from Lambeau Field for the ninth time in the first 11 seasons under McCarthy.

STATS OF THE WEEK

- ► Green Bay has come back to win from 14-plus points down in two of the last three games (vs. Cincinnati and at Dallas). According to the Elias Sports Bureau, the last time the Packers recorded two comeback wins of 14-plus points in a three-game span in the same season was in 1989 (Sept. 17 vs. New Orleans and Oct. 1 vs. Atlanta).
- ►Green Bay has had two games in the last 14 seasons (2004-17) with 160-plus rushing yards on 25 or fewer attempts (25 rushes for 160 yards at Dallas on Oct. 8, 2017, and 23 rushes for 226 yards at Chicago on Dec. 18, 2016).
- ▶RB Aaron Jones totaled 125 yards on 19 carries (6.6 avg.) in the Week 5 win at Dallas, marking the fewest carries by a Green Bay rookie with 125-plus rushing yards in a game. He also became the first Green Bay rookie to record a 100-yard rushing game in his first career start since Samkon Gado (103 yards at Atlanta on Nov. 13, 2005).
- ►The Packers lead the league with seven touchdown drives of 10-plus plays this season.



AT THE HELM

Having led Green Bay to the playoffs in nine of his first 11 seasons as head coach, **Mike McCarthy** is joined by Vince Lombardi and Mike Holmgren as the only coaches to guide the Packers to a Super Bowl win with a victory over Pittsburgh in Super Bowl XLV.

- ► McCarthy guided the Packers to a franchise-record fourth consecutive division title in 2014. In his 11 seasons, he has won six division titles, tying Lombardi for the second most in franchise history.
- ►With a win at Tampa Bay in Week 16 of the 2014 season, McCarthy passed Lombardi for the No. 2 spot in team history as far as overall victories:

- ► The 128 overall wins are the most in the NFC and the second most in the NFL since 2006 (New England, 156).
- ► McCarthy reached 100 career wins (including playoffs) in just his 155th game. He was the fastest to reach 100 wins in the NFL since George Seifert in 1996 (132 games).
- ► McCarthy's 114 regular-season wins in his first 11 years as a head coach (2006-16) are **tied for No. 3 in NFL history**:

- ► McCarthy recorded his third regular season with 12-plus wins in 2014 (2007, 2011), passing Curly Lambeau (1929, 1931), Lombardi (1962, 1966), Holmgren (1996-97) and Mike Sherman (2001-02) for the most by a coach in franchise history.
- ► McCarthy has guided the Packers to five seasons with 11-plus wins (2007, 2009, 2011-12, 2014), passing Lombardi (1961-63, 1966) and Holmgren (1995-98) for the most by a coach in franchise history.
- ► McCarthy's eight regular seasons with 10-plus wins are a **franchise record** (since 1921). Among current NFL head coaches, only Bill Belichick (16) and Andy Reid (11) have more 10-plus win seasons.
- ► McCarthy is the **only coach in franchise history** to post three or more consecutive 10-win seasons twice in his career (2009-12, 2014-16).
- ► McCarthy joined Pittsburgh's Bill Cowher (2005) as the only Super Bowlwinning coaches to lead their respective teams to three road wins as the No. 6 seed in the postseason en route to a world title.
- ► Including playoffs, McCarthy has a 128-70-1 record since taking over as head coach in 2006, a .646 winning percentage that ranks No. 2 among current NFL head coaches (minimum 100 games):

WINNING WAYS

- ► The Packers are the only NFC team and one of two teams in the league (New England) to make the playoffs each of the past eight seasons (2009-16). Those eight appearances are more than the rest of the NFC North Division combined during that span (Minnesota-three / Detroit-three / Chicago-one).
- ► McCarthy became just the fourth head coach in NFL history to lead a single franchise to eight-plus consecutive playoff appearances:

- ►There are seven teams in the NFL with five-plus playoff appearances from 2009-16, with only two in the NFC (New England and Green Bay, eight / Cincinnati and Seattle, six / Baltimore, Denver, Indianapolis, five).
- ► With the victory over Dallas in the 2016 playoffs, McCarthy has led the Packers to 10 wins in the postseason, passing Vince Lombardi and Mike Holmgren for the **most in team history**:

▶ The 10 postseason wins since 2007 are tied for No. 2 in the NFL with Baltimore and Seattle (New England, 13). The rest of the NFC North has combined for two postseason wins over the last 10 seasons (Minnesota and Chicago).

MIKE McCARTHY...Is in his 12th year as the Packers' 14th head coach.

- ► Led the Packers to their eighth consecutive playoff appearance last season, tied for the third-longest streak in NFL history. Has also led the team to nine playoff appearances in the last 10 years (2007, 2009-16).
- ► Ranks second in franchise history in total victories, trailing only Curly Lambeau.
- ► Guided the Packers to top-10 finishes in scoring in eight straight seasons (2007-14), joining the Patriots as the only other team to accomplish the feat over that time; Packers finished first overall in scoring in 2014.
- ► Reached the 100-win plateau faster than any active NFL head coach, needing just 155 games.
- ► Joined Vince Lombardi and Mike Holmgren as the only coaches to guide the Packers to a Super Bowl title with a win over Pittsburgh in Super Bowl XLV.

MIKE ZIMMER...Is in his fourth year as the Vikings' 10th head coach.

- ► The Vikings defense ranked No. 3 in the NFL in 2016, producing four Pro Bowlers.
- ▶ Part of a coaching staff that acquired QB Sam Bradford late in the 2016 preseason, guiding Bradford to a 71.6 completion percentage, which set an NFL record.
- ▶ In 2015, led Minnesota to its third NFC North title and first since 2009.
- ► Coached DE Everson Griffen to 22.5 sacks from 2014-15, the sixthbest mark in the NFL over that span.
- ► Was the defensive coordinator in Dallas (2000-06), Atlanta (2007) and Cincinnati (2008-13) before being hired as Minnesota's head coach.

THE PACKERS-VIKINGS SERIES

- ► The Packers began the series with six straight wins before Minnesota rattled off 22 victories in 32 contests from 1964-79.
- ► Green Bay began a run of its own in 1979 that saw 16 wins over 21 games and lasted until 1990.
- ► Since 2000, the Packers are 23-12-1 (.653) versus the Vikings.
- ► Over two Wild Card playoff contests, Green Bay and Minnesota have each scored 41 total points and won a game by 14 points.

- ▶QB Aaron Rodgers completed 28 of 38 passes for 347 yards, four touchdowns and no turnovers for a 136.6 passer rating.
- ►WR Jordy Nelson caught nine passes for 154 yards (17.1 avg.) and two touchdowns.
- ► Rodgers and Nelson's first score of the afternoon was the 58th scoring connection between the duo, breaking the franchise record.
- ► Minnesota had two fumbles, with both turnovers eventually leading to Green Bay touchdown drives.



TAKING HIS PLACE AMONG THE GAME'S BEST

QB **Aaron Rodgers** surpassed the 1,500-attempt plateau for his career in 2010, the benchmark to qualify for passer rating in the NFL record book.

- ▶ Dating back to last season, Rodgers completed 27-plus passes in five consecutive games (Weeks 16-17 of 2016 and Weeks 1-3 of 2017), passing Brett Favre (four, Weeks 2-5, 2007) for the longest streak in franchise history.
- ► Rodgers registered the sixth 4,000-yard passing season of his career in 2016, setting the **franchise record** as he surpassed Favre's mark of five 4,000-yard seasons.
- ► Rodgers had 11 zero-INT games last season (min. 15 att.), the third time in his career with 10-plus zero-INT games (13 in 2014, 12 in 2009). The only other QB in team history to have 10 in a season was Bart Starr (10) in 1964.
- ►In 2016, Rodgers set the single-season franchise record for completions with 401, surpassing Favre's mark of 372 in 2005.
- ►In the Week 7 victory over Chicago (2016), Rodgers set a **single-game franchise record** with 39 completions, besting the previous high of 36 by Favre at Chicago on Dec. 5, 1993.
- ▶ Rodgers went over the 35,000-yard passing mark for his career last season in Week 11 at Washington. According to the Elias Sports Bureau, he reached the mark on his 4,446th attempt, the **second-fewest attempts needed in NFL history** behind QB Johnny Unitas (4,388 attempts).

- ▶In 2016, Rodgers posted a season passer rating of 104.2, the seventh time in his career that he had registered a 100-plus passer rating, the most in NFL history (Peyton Manning and Steve Young, six each).
- ► Rodgers recorded his sixth season with 500-plus attempts and eight or fewer INTs in 2016, the most in NFL history (Tom Brady, three; nine others with one).
- ►The 2016 regular season saw Rodgers become just the second QB in NFL history to have 600-plus passing attempts and seven or fewer INTs in a season (Brady, 624 attempts, seven INTs in 2015).
- ▶In Week 14 of 2016, Rodgers recorded a passer rating of 150.8 in a win over Seattle, marking his fourth career game a passer rating of 150-plus which is the fourth most (min. 10 pass att.) among active quarterbacks (Drew Brees and Brady, five / Ben Roethlisberger, eight).

RODGERS AND TOUCHDOWNS

QB **Aaron Rodgers** has found the end zone a lot in his career, and that has continued this season.

- ▶In Week 2, Rodgers became the 11th NFL player to throw 300 passing touchdowns, reaching the mark in his 144th career game to pass Peyton Manning and Dan Marino (157) for the fewest games needed to reach 300 passing TDs in NFL history.
- ► Rodgers reached 300 passing TDs on his 4,742nd pass attempt, surpassing Peyton Manning (5,306) for the fewest in league history.
- ▶Rodgers also became the first quarterback to reach 300 passing TDs before throwing 100 interceptions. His 73 interceptions passed Tom Brady (115) for the fewest at the time of reaching 300 passing TDs.
- ► With a league-best 40 passing TDs during the 2016 regular season, Rodgers became just the fourth QB in NFL history to record two seasons (also 2011) with 40-plus TD passes (Marino, Manning, Drew Brees). It was his franchise-record fourth season (2011-12, 2014, 2016) with 35-plus TD passes (Brett Favre, three, 1995-97).
- ► In 2016, Rodgers became the first GB quarterback to lead the NFL in TD passes since Favre in 2003.
- ► Rodgers now has five seasons with 4,000-plus passing yards and 30-plus passing TDs (2009, 2011-12, 2014, 2016), further extending his team mark.
- ► In 2016, Rodgers registered his third straight season with 30-plus touchdown passes, the second-longest streak in franchise history (Favre, five straight, 1994-98).

- ▶ In 2016, Rodgers became the **first NFL quarterback** to record seven games with three-plus TDs/zero INTs in two different seasons (eight games in 2014). The only other QBs to do accomplish that feat in a season were Brady (eight in 2007) and Manning (seven in 2013).
- ▶ In Week 14 of last season, Rodgers recorded a 66-yard TD pass to WR **Davante Adams**, giving him a TD pass of 65 yards or more in each of the last nine seasons (2008-16). Rodgers joins Brees as the only QBs in the league to do so over that span.

RODGERS THE RUNNER

QB **Aaron Rodgers** uses his feet to not only create more time to throw, but also gain yards.

- ▶Rodgers is just the **fourth QB in NFL history** to post 35,000-plus passing yards and 2,500-plus rushing yards in his career, joining Fran Tarkenton, John Elway and Donovan McNabb as the only players to accomplish that feat.
- ► Since the start of the 2016 season, Rodgers ranks No. 5 among active NFL quarterbacks with 452 rushing yards.
- ▶ Dating back to 2016, Rodgers ranks No.3 among active NFL quarterbacks with 32 rushing first downs and is tied for No. 3 with 19 runs of 10-plus yards.
- ► Rodgers recorded a career-high 369 yards rushing during the 2016 regular season, the most by a Green Bay QB since Tobin Rote (398) in 1956.
- ▶Rodgers finished the 2016 regular season No. 3 in the NFL in rushing vards among guarterbacks.

▶ For his career, Allison has 18 first downs on 21 catches. His first down percentage of 85.7 percent ranks No. 1 in the NFL since the start of the 2016 season (min. 15 receptions).

►TE Lance Kendricks scored on a 1-yard reception in the first quarter of the Week 3 win over Cincinnati, his first TD catch as a Packer. He also recorded a 51-yard reception against the Bengals, the second-longest catch of his career (80 yards at Tampa Bay, Dec. 23, 2012).

▶ In Week 2, RB **Ty Montgomery** hauled in six receptions for 75 yards (12.5 avg.) and a TD to go with 10 carries for 35 yards (3.5 avg.) and TD, becoming the first Packer to have a rushing TD, receiving TD and 75-plus receiving yards in the same games since Dorsey Levens at Indianapolis on Nov. 16, 1997 (two rushing TDs, one receiving TD, 92 receiving yards).

► For the second straight season, Nelson had five TD catches through the first four games (2016-17). He joined Don Hutson (1944-45) as the only players in franchise history to have five-plus TD catches in the first four games in back-to-back seasons.

▶ QB Aaron Rodgers and Nelson have connected for 65 touchdowns, the most by a duo in team history (Brett Favre and Antonio Freeman, 57).

► In 2016, Nelson joined WR Sterling Sharpe as the only players in team history to record two seasons with 95-plus catches.

▶ In 2016, Nelson registered the fourth 1,200-yard (1,257) receiving season of his career, tying James Lofton for the best mark in team history.

▶ It was the third time in Nelson's career that he recorded 10-plus receiving TDs in a season (2011 and 2014). He joined Sharpe (four) and Hutson (three) as the only players in franchise history to post 10-plus TD catches in three or more seasons.

▶ Nelson is the first player in franchise history to record 13-plus receiving touchowns in three different seasons (2011, 2014, 2016). His three seasons of 13-plus TD receptions tie Pro Football Hall of Famers Lance Alworth, Cris Carter and Marvin Harrison for the fourth most in NFL history. Only Pro Football Hall of Famer Jerry Rice (eight), Terrell Owens (seven) and Randy Moss (six) have more such seasons in NFL history.

► With at least one touchdown reception in 11 games last season, Nelson tied Sharpe (1992 and 1994) for the most games with at least one TD catch in a single season in franchise history.

Nelson has 25 100-yard receiving gamés in his career, passing Hutson (24) for No. 3 in team history. He trails Sharpe (29) for the second most.

- ▶ From 2011-14, he was the only Packer to surpass 100 tackles each season, and despite missing five games in 2015, he tied for the team lead in solo tackles (54) and led the team with 14 total tackles in the postseason. In 2016, he was **No. 1 on the team** in tackles (92) despite missing a game.

- ► Clinton-Dix is **tied for No. 5 among safeties** with 12 interceptions since 2014 (including the postseason):

- ▶It was the most interceptions by a Packers safety in a single season since Charles Woodson (seven) and Charlie Peprah (five) in 2011.
- ►In 2016, Clinton-Dix posted a career-high two interceptions in both Week 9 and Week 15, becoming the first Packer to have multiple two-INT games in a season since Woodson in 2011.
- ▶In Week 9 of 2016, he joined CB Al Harris (vs. New Orleans, Oct. 9, 2005) as the only players to post two INTs in a first quarter for the Packers since 1993.
- ► He was named NFC Defensive Player of the Week for his Week 15 performance in 2016, becoming the first Packers DB to win the award since Woodson in 2010 (Week 4).
- ► Clinton-Dix finished second on the team with 95 tackles (73 solo) in 2014 and led the Packers with 117 tackles (97 solo) in 2015.
- ► He registered a total of three interceptions during the 2015 season (including playoffs). He tied for fourth on the team with two during the regular season and registered one in the postseason.
- ►According to STATS, his three sacks during the 2015 regular season were tied for the fifth most in a single regular season by a Packers safety (since 1982) and the most since Mark Roman recorded 3.5 in 2004.
- ► Clinton-Dix's three sacks also tied for **No. 3 in the NFL** in 2015 among safeties.
- ▶ During the 2015 regular season, he registered eight-plus tackles in eight games, including setting career highs in both total tackles (12) and solo tackles (11) in the Week 10 game vs. Detroit, in which he also registered an interception.

CONTINUAL IMPACT

In his career, DT **Mike Daniels** has seen his playing time steadily increase as well as his production, earning him a role as a standout on the defense.

- ▶Daniels is third on the Packers with 21.5 sacks since the start of the 2013 season. He is No. 11 among NFL defensive tackles over that span, according to STATS LLC.
- ► He has started all but two regular-season and postseason games for Green Bay and has played the most defensive snaps among Packers defensive linemen since the start of the 2014 season.
- ►In 2015, Daniels led the Packers' defensive line in tackles (66) and sacks (four). He finished third on the team with 12 QB hits.
- ►In Week 5 versus St. Louis (2015), he tied for the team lead with a career-best nine tackles (eight solo).
- ▶ Daniels registered his first career interception in Week 16 at Arizona (2015), returning it 23 yards. According to STATS LLC, it was the first interception by a Packers DT since Cullen Jenkins on Oct. 18, 2009. Dating back to 1960, his 23-yard interception return was the longest by a Green Bay DT on an interception.
- ►He led Green Bay's defensive line with 5.5 sacks and was the team leader in quarterback hits (19) and pressures (22) during the 2014 regular season.

- ▶ Dating back to 2013, Crosby has made 115 field goals during the regular season, **No. 7 in the NFL** over that span.
- ▶ Crosby recorded 122 points during the 2016 season, giving him the 10th 100-point season of his career and **extending his franchise record**. Crosby's 10 seasons with 100-plus points are the **most in the NFL since 2007**. The only other kickers to have 10 or more consecutive seasons of 100-plus points are Jason Elam (16, 1993-2008) and Adam Vinatieri (13, 1996-2008).

ON THE ROAD AGAIN

Green Bay went 7-1 away from Lambeau Field in 2011, with the seven road wins setting a single-season franchise record.

- ►The Packers have been able to stay above the .500 mark on the road during Head Coach **Mike McCarthy's** tenure, a notable achievement in the National Football League.
- ► Since 2006, McCarthy's first season as the head coach in Green Bay, only nine of 32 NFL teams have regular-season road records above .500.

329 AND COUNTING

Another packed house at Lambeau Field against the Chicago Bears in Week 4 brought the stadium's consecutive-sellouts streak to 329 regular-season games (not including replacement games).

- ▶The league's longest-tenured stadium, Lambeau Field is hosting its 61st season of football in 2017. For the victory over Dallas in the Divisional round of the 2014 playoffs, Packers fans set a new Lambeau Field paid-attendance record (79,704).
- ► Across American professional sports, only Boston's Fenway Park (1912) and Chicago's Wrigley Field (1914) have longer tenures.

THE LAMBEAU ADVANTAGE

The crown jewel of the National Football League, Lambeau Field has long been known as one of the tougher venues to play in, particularly during the harsh Wisconsin winter.

- ▶ Re-establishing home-field advantage after a 4-4 mark in 2008 was one of the goals of 2009, and with the Packers finishing 6-2 at home, they accomplished that goal. Green Bay followed that up with a 7-1 mark at Lambeau Field in 2010, a perfect 8-0 record in 2011, the first undefeated home mark since 2002, and a 7-1 mark in 2012. The Packers were one of two teams to finish undefeated at home during the 2014 regular season (Denver).
- ► Head Coach **Mike McCarthy** stated consistently upon his arrival in Green Bay that one of the team's goals would be to reclaim the mystique of playing at Lambeau Field. Mission accomplished. The team is 68-22-1 (.753) at home in the regular season since 2006, **No. 2** in the NFL.
- ► Since Ron Wolf and Mike Holmgren began the revitalization of the franchise in 1992, Green Bay owns the best home record in the NFL. A look at the top regular-season home W-L records since the '92 season:

A LOOK AT THE SCHEDULE

The Green Bay Packers' 97th NFL regular-season schedule – highlighted by five prime-time contests (subject to flexible scheduling) – was released April 20 by the National Football League.

- ▶ It will be the first regular season that has the Packers playing home games on a Saturday, Thursday and Monday.
- ► Green Bay's schedule includes six games against 2016 playoff teams. Two of those contests (Detroit, Seattle) are at Lambeau Field, while four (Atlanta, Dallas, Detroit, Pittsburgh) will come on the road. The Packers will play two teams (Atlanta, Dallas) that it played during the 2016 regular and postseason.
- ► For the first time since 2012, the Packers opened the season at home, and will play three of their first four games at Lambeau Field.
- ►In Week 1, Green Bay hosted the Seattle Seahawks, marking the third consecutive regular season that the Packers have played the Seahawks at home. Green Bay improved to 11-3 against the Seahawks at home during the regular and postseason, including eight straight wins.
- ► For the second straight season, the Packers played a prime-time game on the road in Week 2, traveling to Atlanta for an NFC Championship rematch with the Falcons.
- ► Week 3 saw the Cincinnati Bengals play in Green Bay for just the sixth time, and Week 4 had the Packers hosting the Chicago Bears on a Thursday night for the third consecutive season (12th straight year in primetime). The division rivals squared off in a prime-time contest for the 12th straight season.
- ►Green Bay begins October with back-to-back road games. The Packers first traveled to play the Dallas Cowboys, marking the fourth matchup between the two clubs since 2015 (including postseason), and then will face the Vikings in Minnesota in Week 6.
- ► In Week 7, the New Orleans Saints visit Lambeau, their latest trip by date to Wisconsin since playing the Packers in Milwaukee on Nov. 17, 1985.
- ►The Packers have a Week 8 bye, the latest bye week for Green Bay since 2014 (Week 9).
- ► Green Bay hosts the Detroit Lions on *Monday Night Football* in Week 9, marking the third time the two teams have met on *MNF* and the first since 1972. Green Bay swept the regular-season series with the Lions last season for the first time since 2012 and for the seventh time under McCarthy.
- ►In Week 10, Green Bay will face the Bears in Chicago, a place they have won in the regular season each of the last six years.
- ►After welcoming the Baltimore Ravens to Lambeau Field in Week 11 for just the fourth time, the Packers will travel to Pittsburgh to play the Steelers in a Sunday night matchup in Week 12.
- ►After stopping back in Green Bay in Week 13 to play Tampa Bay, the Buccaneers' first December trip to Lambeau since 2000, the Packers will begin a stretch of three road games in four weeks with a trip to Cleveland in Week 14. It is the first time since 2009 that Green Bay will finish the regular season with three of the final four games taking place on the road.
- ►The Packers will finish their slate against the NFC South when they play at the Carolina Panthers in Week 15.
- ▶For the second consecutive season, Green Bay will host the Vikings on a Saturday in Week 16. The Packers have won their last five regularseason games played on Saturdays.
- ►Green Bay will close out the regular season at Detroit for the second consecutive year, marking the first time it has finished the regular season on the road against the same team in back-to-back seasons since 1991-92 (Minnesota).



BREAKING DOWN THE ROSTER

The Packers currently have an 53-man roster that is composed of 25 offensive players, 25 defensive players and three specialists.

- ▶ Of the 53 players on Green Bay's roster, 34 of them (64.2 percent) were draft picks of the Packers. Dating back to 2007, Green Bay has at least one member of each draft class still on the roster.
- ► Green Bay has 12 players on the roster that began their careers as undrafted free agents, with 10 of those originally signed by Green Bay.
- ► Over a third (34.0 percent) of the players (18 of 53) on Green Bay's roster entered the league as a sixth-round or seventh-round pick or as an undrafted player.
- ▶The Packers have five players on the roster that played in the NFL prior to the 2009 season. Four of those five players were draft picks of the Packers (QB Aaron Rodgers, K Mason Crosby, WR Jordy Nelson and LB Clay Matthews) and three have made at least one Pro Bowl.
- ▶ Of the 53 players on the roster, 44 began their pro careers with the Packers (83.0 percent).
- ▶ Only 21 of the 53 players on the roster (39.6 percent) were selected in the first three rounds of the draft, with 18 being drafted by the Packers.

WR Jordy Nelson, 10th Year, Kansas State, D2a-08

Became the fourth player in franchise history to reach 500 receptions.

► Has 69 career receiving TDs, No. 2 in Packers history behind Don

Hutson (99).

▶ Became the first player in franchise history to record 13-plus receiving touchowns in three different seasons (2011, 2014, 2016). His three seasons of 13-plus TD receptions tie Pro Football Hall of Famers Lance Alworth, Cris Carter and Marvin Harrison for the fourth most in NFL his-

► Missed all of the 2015 season due to a knee injury.

Finished the 2014 regular season ranked fourth in the NFL in receiving yards (1,519), seventh in receptions (98) and tied for second in receiving touchdowns (13). Earned first selection to the Pro Bowl.

Led the team in 2013 with 85 catches for 1,314 yards and eight TDs.

Ranked No. 10 in the NFL that season in receiving yards.

With 15 TD catches in 2011, became only the third player in franchise history to catch 15 or more TDs in a season, joining WRs Sterling Sharpe (18 in 1994) and Don Hutson (17 in 1942).

LT David Bakhtiari, 5th Year, Colorado, D4a-13

Named to first career Pro Bowl in 2016.

LG Lane Taylor, 5th Year, Oklahoma State, FA-13

► Has played in 51 regular-season games for Green Bay with all but two of his 23 starts (LT in Week 4-5 this season) taking place at LG.

► Made the first starts of his career in 2015, opening at RG at Detroit in Week 13 in place of an injured T.J. Lang and at LG in Week 17 vs. Minnesota with Josh Sitton sliding to LT in place of an injured David Bakhtiari.

► A four-year letterman at OSU, starting 47 of 50 games played at right guard. Unanimous first-team All-Big 12 selection by the conference's coaches as a senior.

► Has started all 174 games he has played in since entering the league in 2006, the most games played by an active NFL offensive lineman over that span.

► Started all 16 games in nine of his 11 seasons in New Orleans (2006-

16), missing just seven contests due to injury

► Helped the Saints finish in the top six in the NFL in total offense in all 11 of his seasons in New Orleans (2006-16), including six No. 1 rankings (2006, 2008-09, 2011, 2014, 2016).
 ► Entered the NFL with New Orleans in 2006 as a fourth-round pick (No. 1008).

RT Bryan Bulaga, 8th Year, Iowa, D1-10

Started 37 games at RT in his first three seasons in the league.
 Started the final 12 games of 2010 and the entire postseason at right tackle after taking over for veteran Mark Tauscher (shoulder).
 Named to the *Pro Football Weekly*/PFWA All-Rookie team in 2010.

Capped his rookie season by becoming the youngest player at the time. according to STATS LLC, to ever start in the Super Bowl (21 years, 322 days).

TE Martellus Bennett, 10th Year, Texas A&M, UFA (NE)-17
► Ranks No. 3 on the team with 20 receptions this season, which is tied

for the sixth most among NFL tight ends.

Posted 50-plus receptions in each season from 2012-16, one of only three tight ends in the league (Greg Olsen, Jason Witten) to do so over that span.

► Posted a career-high three 100-yard receiving games in 2016 with the Patriots, tied for No. 2 in the NFL among TEs, and a career-best seven TD catches, tied for No. 3 in the league among TEs.

► Registered a career-high 90 receptions with the Chicago Bears in 2014, the most among NFL tight ends that season, on his way to earning Pro

Entered the NFL in 2008 as a second-round pick (No. 61 overall) with Dallas and went on to play four seasons with the Cowboys (2008-11). Also played one season with the N.Y. Giants (2012), three with the Bears (2013-15) and one with the Patriots (2016).

WR Randall Cobb, 6th Year, Kentucky, D2-11

Despite missing a game, tied for the team lead with 23 receptions this season.

►Led the team with a 13.5-yard punt-return average in 2016. ►Posted the 12th 100-yard receiving game of his career in Week 4 (108 on nine receptions) and tied his single-game high for receptions (11 for 95 yards and a TD) in Week 7 last season.

▶Led the team in receptions (79), was No. 2 in receiving yards (829) and

was No. 3 in touchdown receptions (six) in 2015.

Set a new single-season career high with five 100-yard receiving games during the 2014 season (three-2012). Earned first trip to the Pro Bowl.

►His career-best 91 receptions in 2014 are the eighth most in team historv

► Finished the regular season tied for fourth in the NFL with 12 touchdown receptions in 2014.

► Set a franchise single-season record with a league-high 2,342 combined net yards in 2012, topping the previous team mark of 2,250 yards by RB Ahman Green in 2003.

QB Aaron Rodgers, 12th Year, California, D1-05

► His career passer rating of 104.1 ranks No. 1 in NFL history.

► In 140 regular-season starts (94-46 record), has posted 52 games with 300-plus passing yards, 83 without an interception and 79 with a 100-plus passer rating (min. 15 attempts).

► Earned his sixth selection to the Pro Bowl in 2016, the second-most

selections by a Green Bay quarterback behind Brett Favre's nine (1992-93, 1995-97, 2001-03, 2007).

Finished the 2014 regular season ranked No. 2 in the NFL in passer rating (112.2), touchdown percentage (7.3), No. 1 in interception percentage (7.3) and 1 in interception percentage (7.3).

age (1.0) and No. 3 in touchdown passes (38).

▶ Recorded a passer rating of at least 120.0 in seven regular-season

games in 2014, setting a single-season career high and tying for the third most in a single season in the NFL, dating back to 1960.

Posted 21,332 passing yards from 2008-12, which ranks No. 1 in league history for the most passing yards by a QB in his first five seasons as a starter (previous record was Peyton Manning, 20,618, 1998-2002).

▶ In 2011, set an NFL record with a 122.5 passer rating and set franchise marks for TD passes (45), passing yards (4,643), completion percentage (68.3), yards per attempt (9.25) and 300-yard games (eight) on his way to earning NFL Most Valuable Player honors from *The Associated* Préss.

RB Ty Montgomery, 2nd Year, Stanford, D3-15

► After being converted from wide receiver to running back during the 2016 season, has started 10 games at RB, including four games this season. Missed Week 5 due to injury

In Week 15 at Chicago (2016), rushed for 162 yards on 16 carries and two touchdowns. His 162 yards were the most by a Packers player in a single game since Dec. 11, 2005 (Samkon Gado, 171 yards on 29 carries, 5.9 avg.). Dating back to 1960, his 10.13 yards-per-carry average was the third highest (min. 15 carries) by a Green Bay player.

DE Dean Lowry, 2nd Year, Northwestern, D4b-16

Made first career start in the season-opening win over Seattle. Has started four of five games this season.

► Saw action in 15 games as a rookie (2016) and registered 14 tackles (eight solo), two sacks, three tackles for a loss, nine QB pressures and three QB hits. Also appeared in all three postseason contests and posted two tackles (one solo) and a QB pressure.

▶ Posted sacks in back-to-back games in 2016, recording one in Week 13

vs. Houston and one in Week 14 vs. Seattle.

▶ Played in 48 games with 33 starts for Northwestern and registered 134 tackles (83 solo), 311/2 tackles for a loss, 121/2 sacks, three interceptions (one returned for a TD), 21 passes defensed, three fumble recoveries and three forced fumbles.

► Earned second-team All-Big Ten honors as a senior in 2015 after posting 46 tackles (27 solo), 13½ tackles for a loss (second on the team), three sacks, an interception, a fumble recovery and seven passes defensed.

NT Kenny Clark, 2nd Year, UCLA, D1-16

Finished the 2016 regular season No. 3 on the GB defensive line in tackles (33).

▶ Became the youngest player to appear in a season opener for the Packers since Arnie Herber (20 years old) in 1930.

► Earned third-team All-America honors from The Associated Press and first-team All-Pacific-12 recognition from the coaches and media as a iunior in 2015.

► Was a team co-captain in '15 and recorded career highs in tackles (75), tackles for a loss (11) and sacks (six). Also ranked third on the team with five pass breakups.

DT Mike Daniels, 6th Year, Iowa, D4a-12

Leads Packers defensive linemen with 21.5 sacks since the start of the 2013 regular season.

▶ Led the defensive line in both tackles and sacks in 2014 and 2015.

▶ Returned a fumble 43 yards for a TD vs. Detroit in Week 14 of 2012, the longest fumble return for a TD by a rookie in franchise history

► Starred as an interior pass rusher at lowa, posting a team-high 24.5 tackles for a loss and 13 sacks from 2010-11.

LOLB Clay Matthews, 9th Year, Southern California, D1b-09

► With 75.0 career sacks, passed Kabeer Gbaja-Biamila (74.5) for the most sacks in Packers history.

▶ Despite injuries forcing him to miss four games and limiting him in six others, finished No. 3 on the team with five sacks in 2016.

▶ For the first time in his career, recorded at least one sack in each of the first three regular-season games he played in (2016).

► Selected to his sixth Pro Bowl and first as an inside linebacker in 2015 after recording 6.5 sacks (second on the team), 15 QB hits (No. 1 on the team) and a career-high 85 tackles (No. 2 on the team).

► With a team-high 11.0 sacks in 2014, is tied for the most 10-plus sack

seasons in franchise history (four).

▶ Is the only player in franchise history to score a defensive TD (interception or fumble return) in each of his first three seasons in the NFL (2009-11).

ILB Jake Ryan, 3rd Year, Michigan, D4-15

Finished No. 2 on the team with 84 tackles during the 2016 regular season.

▶ Started the final five games of the regular season and both playoff contests in 2015.

► Recorded a team-best nine tackles (eight solo) and one fumble recovery in Week 13 (2015) at Detroit in his first pro start.

► Served as a team captain for his final two seasons at Michigan and was a three-time winner (2012-14) of the Roger Zatkoff Award, given to the Wolverines top linebacker. He was the only player to win the award (est. 1991) three times.

▶ Joined LB John Anderson (first round, 26th overall) as the only Michigan linebackers ever drafted by Green Bay.

► Started 41 of 46 games played in college, appearing at inside linebacker as a senior after spending his first three seasons at outside linebacker and defensive end.

ILB Blake Martinez, Rookie, Stanford, D4a-16

► Ranks No. 1 on the Packers with 43 total tackles this season.

► Started nine of 13 games he played in 2016 during the regular season, missing Weeks 12-14 due to injury.

Became the first rookie to start on defense for Green Bay in Week 1 since LB Nick Perry in 2012.

► Finished collegiate career with 257 tackles (137 solo), 13.5 tackles for a loss, 6.5 sacks, five interceptions and five forced fumbles in 51 games played.

► Started all 27 games played in his final two seasons, leading the team in tackles as a junior (102) and senior (141).

► Led the Pacific-12 and ranked No. 7 nationally with 141 tackles (75 solo) as a senior, averaging a conference-best 10.1 tackles per game.

ROLB Nick Perry, 6th Year, Southern California, D1-12

► Led the team with a career-high 11.0 sacks in 2016.

▶ Registered mulitple sacks in each of his first five seasons in the NFL and has posted a two-sack game in each of the last four seasons (2013-16).

► Has totaled seven sacks in eight playoff games, including 3.5 in the 2015 postseason, which tied Clay Matthews (2010) for the franchise record in a single posteason.

► His seven postseason sacks rank No. 3 in franchise history (since 1982) behind Matthews (11) and Reggie White (eight).

_CB Davon House, 7th Year, New Mexico State, FA-17

▶ Rejoined the Packers after spending the 2015-16 seasons with the Jacksonville Jaguars, starting 19 of 32 games played.

► In 2015, his first season in Jacksonville, set career highs in starts (15), tackles (60), solo tackles (49), passes defensed (23, franchise singleseason record) and interceptions (four).

▶ Despite missing three regular-season games with a shoulder injury in 2014, his 11 passes defensed tied for No. 4 on the Packers.

► After seeing action in two games as a rookie (2011), appeared in 25 games for Green Bay between 2012-13, starting five games in each season.

► Was the first player to be drafted by the Packers out of New Mexico State in franchise history, and was the first Aggie drafted since S Siddeeq Shabazz (Oakland, seventh round) in 2003.

RCB Damarious Randall, 3rd Year, Arizona State, D1-15

▶ Tied for No. 4 in the NFL with two interceptions returned for touchdowns since 2015.

► Was second on the team with three interceptions in 2016 despite miss-

ing six games due to injury.

▶ Played in 15 games with nine starts (six at LCB, two at RCB, one in the slot) in 2015 and tied for the team lead and No. 2 among NFL rookies with three interceptions, including one he returned for a TD. Finished with a team-best 16 passes defensed.

► Named the NFL's Defensive Rookie of the Month for November 2015, joining CB Casey Hayward (October 2012) as the only Green Bay defen-

sive backs to win the award.

► Earned first-team All-Pacific-12 honors at safety as a senior in 2014 after he led the Sun Devils in tackles (106) and passes defensed (12) and tied for the team lead with three interceptions.

SS Morgan Burnett, 8th Year, Georgia Tech, D3-10

▶Tied for No. 1 among NFL safeties with a career-best three sacks last season. Finished No. 1 on the team in tackles (92)

►Missed five games due to injury in 2015, but finished No. 4 on the team with 54 solo tackles.

►Totaled a team-high 125 tackles in 2014, the second most of his career (137 in 2012). Ranked No. 2 on the team with 106 tackles (77 solo) in 2013, despite missing the first three games due to injury. Recovered three fumbles, including one for a TD, and added nine passes defensed.

▶ Participated in all 1,088 plays for Green Bay's defense in 2012, one of only four non-OL in the NFL to appear in 100 percent of his team's snaps.

FS Ha Ha Clinton-Dix, 4th Year, Alabama, D1-14

Named to his first career Pro Bowl in 2016. His career-best five interceptions tied for No. 5 in the NFL last season and tied for No. 1 among safeties. It was the most interceptions by a Packers safety in a single season since Charles Woodson (seven) and Charlie Peprah (five) in 2011

►In 2016, posted a career-high two interceptions in both Week 9 and Week 14, becoming the first Packer to have two two-INT games in a season since Woodson in 2011

►Led the team in tackles in 2015 with 117 (97 solo) and was tied for

fourth on the team in interceptions (two).

►According to STATS, his three sacks during the 2015 regular season tied for the fifth most in a single regular season by a Packers safety (since 1982) and the most since Mark Roman recorded 3.5 in 2004.

► Started every game in 2015 after starting 10 of 16 games as a rookie

when he finished second on the team in tackles (95).

► Was a consensus All-America selection in 2013 as a junior, earning first-team recognition from The Associated Press, the Football Writers Association of America and Sporting News.

MEDIA INFORMATION & POLICIES

MIKE McCARTHY PRESS CONFERENCES

During the regular season (for a Sunday game), the head coach will be available in the Media Auditorium on Monday, Wednesday, Thursday and Friday. One-on-one interviews with McCarthy should be arranged through Jason Wahlers.

PLAYER INTERVIEWS

The team's locker room will generally be open Monday, Wednesday, Thursday, Friday and following games.

- ► At the conclusion of all games, the locker room will be opened following the NFL's standard "cooling-off period."
- ►All interviews with players on the practice squad or injured reserve need to be requested and approved through the P.R. department.
- ► Any requests to interview players other than at the aforementioned times should be directed to a member of the Packers' P.R. department.

ASSISTANT COACH AVAILABILITY

All by request only, through the P.R. department

- ► Coordinators Edgar Bennett (offense), Dom Capers (defense) and Ron Zook (special teams) will continue to serve as primary spokesmen in their respective areas.
- ▶ During the regular season, assistants generally will be available on Thursdays at the podium in the Media Auditorium with offense and defense rotating every other week. During a week when offensive coaches are available, Capers will also be available on Thursday to represent the defense. When defensive coaches are available, Bennett will also be available on Thursday to represent the offense. On Mondays, the coordinators will be available at the podium in the Media Auditorium.
- Following games, Head Coach Mike McCarthy will be the only coach available to the media.
- ► However, position coaches are available for questions on specific players and the position group only. Broader interview topics need to be directed to the respective coordinators.
- ► No assistant coach should be contacted directly by telephone (at his desk, home or on his cell phone), or by email. All interviews must be arranged through the P.R. department.
- ► Sarah Quick (920-569-7213) serves as the primary contact for assistant coaches. In her absence, feel free to contact another member of the P.R. staff.

PRACTICE ACCESS, PHOTOGRAPHY AND SOCIAL-MEDIA GUIDELINES

▶ During the regular season, practices will be open to state media who regularly cover the team for designated periods during the first half of each session, similar to previous seasons. Also as in prior years, photo opportunities will be limited to the beginning portions of practice.

- ►The team reserves the right to limit photography to certain periods for competitive reasons. This restriction applies to both training-camp and regular-season practices.
- ▶ During practice periods in which B-roll and still photography are NOT permitted, the media may not utilize camera phones either. The P.R. staff will alert the media of the permissible "shooting" periods before and during each practice.
- ▶ Video of practice, press conferences or locker-room interviews by an individual or media outlet may not be posted at any time on social-media sites or live-broadcasting applications (this includes applications such as Facebook, Twitter, Vine, Instagram, Snapchat, Ustream, Periscope and Meerkat, etc).
- ► No still photography is permitted in the locker room at any time. Signs, notes and other personal items or information posted in and around the locker room at player lockers are not to be photographed or captured on video.

ONLINE-CONTENT POLICY

- ▶ According to the 2017 NFL non-game online content policy, accredited organizations may distribute online non-game audio and video content, including interviews, press conferences and team practices at NFL venues, acquired as a result of credentialed access ("Game Information") to games or club/league facilities provided that such distribution: is 90 seconds maximum per day (180 seconds in two-team markets − 90 seconds per team); may not be "archived" (i.e., made available for on-demand public access) for more than 24 hours; appears in an editorial context only (no sponsorship, merchandising or advertising integrated with or around the content); is not posted live; and is accompanied by links back to NFL.com and to the club website.
- ►The 90-second limit does not include video/audio material that is composed entirely of a credentialed media employee providing commentary or analysis ("talking head" reporting), including pregame or postgame stand-up material shot on the field or other facility location.
- While a game is in progress, any forms of accounts of the game must be sufficiently time-delayed and limited in amount (e.g., score updates with detail given only in quarterly game updates, fewer than 10 photographs during the game) so that the accredited organization's game coverage cannot be used as a substitute for, or otherwise approximate, authorized play-by-play accounts.
- ▶The Packers have their own social-media and online-content policies for practice reporting, which will be communicated by the P.R. staff for both training camp and the regular season. Members of the media are encouraged to contact the public relations staff with any questions.

CONFERENCE CALLS

The Packers' P.R. department will arrange a conference call with the head coach of the opposing team each week during the regular season. These conference calls will be made from the media workroom, and generally will be held on Wednesday.

In the Lee Remmel Press Box at Lambeau Field, more than a dozen "co-op" phones are available to media throughout the box. If dedicated service is desired, please contact Scott Guth of Dataline Services seven to 10 days prior to the game at 920-569-7090 or sguth@datalineservicesinc.com. Instruments also may be obtained through Guth, upon request.

Dedicated internet service also may be ordered through Dataline Services — on a game-by-game or full-season basis — for installation in either the Lee Remmel Press Box or in the downstairs Photo/Media Workrooms.

As assigned by the Professional Football Writers of America (PFWA), the Green Bay pool reporter for the 2017 season is Rob Demovsky of ESPN.com. Pete Dougherty of the *Green Bay Press-Gazette* is the alternate.

PHOTO CREDENTIALS

Photo credentials will not be issued to freelance photographers unless on a specific assignment from an accredited organization. Credentials are not provided to "grips" due to on-field space limitations.

CREDENTIALS

All credential requests are acquired through an online credential link, which should be obtained by contacting Sarah Quick, assistant director of public relations. Requests may be sent via email (Sarah Quick; quicks@packers.com). Credentials will not be mailed, unless the requesting outlet provides a Federal Express or UPS number, and if scheduled in advance, should be picked up in person at the Packers' corporate offices, located in the Lambeau Field Atrium. Credentials not obtained prior to gameday will be left at Media Will Call on the south side of the stadium near the Shopko Gate. Media Will Call opens three hours prior to kickoff.

A marquee season opener between two NFC heavyweights turned into a defensive slugfest, with Daniels landing the momentum-swinging punch. No talk about double moves or stunts. Daniels said he just flat-out beat glard Luke Joeckel to wreak havor in the backfield.

Packers QIB Aaron Rodgers was 28 of 42 for 311 yards and added a 32-yard tourchlown pass to Jordy Nelson to make it an eight-point game late in the third quarter. Rodgers went deep to his favorite receiver on a free play that was extended after Seattle was flagged for having too many

But the Green Bay defense fueled the victory.

GREEN BAY, Wis. (AP) — Aaron Rodgers burned another defense deep with a free play. The Cincinnati Bengals found their offense and a new

Mason Crosby kicked a 27-yard field goal with 6:26 left in overtime set up by Rodgers' 72-yard pass to Geronimo Allison, and the Green Bay Packers railled to beat Cincinnati, 27-24, on Sunday, Crosby's kick completed the Packers conneback from a 21-7 halftime deficit.

On third-and-10 from the Packers 21, Rodgers took advantage of yet another free play after defensive end Michael Johnson was whistled for offside. Officials let the play continue and the two-time NFL MVP found Allison on about a 40-yard pass before the receiver beat a couple defenders

for more yards.

Crosby, a veteran kicker, finished it off for the Packers (2-1).

The winless Bengals (0-3) won the toss in overline but went three-and-out on their opening drive. It was so loud at Lambeau Field that they had to call timeout before their first overline snap. Rodgers thrived under the pressure.

He connected with Jordy Nelson for a 3-yard foucidown pass with 17 seconds left in regulation to tie the game at 24. Bengals cornerback Dre

Kilpatrick narrowly missed batting away the bullet thrown by the quarterback into the front right corner of the end zone.

Rodgers finished 28 of 42 for 313 yards with three touchdowns and one interception. Allison had six catches for 122 yards.

The Packers filipped the script after the Bengals controlled the first half.

A.J. Green caught a 10-yard scoring pass on the game's opening drive for Cincinnati's first touchdown after two frustrating weeks for the offense. Bill Lazor made his debut as offensive coordinator for the fired Ken Zampese.

Andy Dalton was 21 of 27 for 212 yards and two scores. The Bengals were desperate to avoid their first 0-3 start since 2008. But they couldn't finish the Packers off in the second half.

Green Bay's defense generated a little more pressure on Dalton in the second half, and rookie safety Josh Jones gave the injury-laden defense

Rodgers shook off his early struggles to guide the Packers to another win. He was sacked six times, mostly against just the Bengals' four-man rush, though the protection shored up after halftime.

Rodgers threw just his second career pick-six — and his first at home — when William Jackson returned an interception 75 yards for a toucha boost with two sacks and 12 tackles.

Aaron Rodgers threw four touchdown passes, and the injury-riddled Packers converted three turnovers into scores in an eventful 35-14 victory GREEN BAY, Wis. — The Green Bay Packers keep finding ways to win despite more key injuries. The Chicago Bears never recovered from a

over the Chicago Bears on Thursday night.

Rodgers connected with Davante Adams and Randall Cobb on short touchdown passes to help build a 21-0 lead in the second quarter of a game delayed 45 minutes by lightning between the first two quarters. The Packers overpowered the Bears down the stretch to slog out a win as intermittent rain fell at Lambeau Field.

The Packers (3-1) lost two more key players to injuries. Adams left the field on a stretcher after getting hit in the head during a tackle by Danny Trevathan in the third quarter. Bunning back Ty Montgomery was knocked out in the first quarter with a chest injury.

But the Packers capitalized on an awful start by Glennon, who accounted for four turnovers. He fumbled on his first snap on a strip sack by Clay Matthews. Rodgers hit Cobb for a 2-yard foundrown pass three plays later for a 7-0 lead.

Glennon fumbled on his next series, too, but the Packers couldn't score on that drive. It was only a matter of time because the mistakes kept

Glennon threw his second interception with 2:54 left in the third quarter. Six plays later, receiver Jordy Nelson caught his second touchdown pass,

an 8-yarder from Rodgers, to make it a 28-point lead.

Rodgers was 18 of 26 for 179 yards. He picked apart the Bears (1-3) on short, quick passes, a game plan in part necessitated by a patchwork offensive line. The Packers played without starting tackes David Bakhtiari and Bryan Bulaga, and their three backup tackes are already on injured reserve. The injury to Adams cast a pall late in the third quarter. The game was delayed for about five minutes while medical personnel tended to the receiver, who gave a thumbs-up signal as he was wheeled off the field. The Packers said Adams was conscious and taken to a hospital for evaluation for possible head and neck injuries, and that he had feeling in all of his extremities.

Both the Packers and Bears were coming off overtime wins Sunday, Gleinnon finished 21 of 33 for 216 yards and one touchdown.

The Packers are 95-94-6 against the Bears, their first lead in the series since 1933. It's the oldest rivalry in football, dating to 1923. Matthews' sack on Gleinnon in the first quarter was the 75th of his career, breaking the franchise record (since 1982) held by Kabeer Gbaja-Blamila.

Packers rooke Aaron Jones, a fifth-round draft pick, had a team-high 49 yards on 31 carries and a 2-yard touchdown run in the second quarter. He was the only active running back left on the roster with Montgomery and backup Jamaal Williams (knee) both knocked out of the game.

DALLAS (AP) Aaron Rodgers had more magic in store for the Dallas Cowboys, who can't seem to find the mojo that carried them a year

Rodgers threw a 12-yard touchdown pass to Davante Adams with 11 seconds remaining. Rodgers capped a 75-yard drive in just 1:02, lifting the Packers over Dallas 35-31 on Sunday in another thriller nine months after their divisional playoff win on the same field.

Adams had been in the concussion protocol but was active 10 days after leaving the field on a stretcher on a helmet-to-helmet hit that resulted in a suspension for Chicago linebacker Danny Trevathan. He had seven catches for 66 yards and two touchdowns.

Dak Prescott, who had touchdown passes on Dallas' first three drives, put the Cowboys in front on an 11-yard touchdown run with 1:13 remaining to cap a 17-play drive that lasted almost nine minutes.

But another defensive letdown, just like a year ago in the postseason, left Dallas (2-3) already with the same number of losses from the magical rookie season when Prescott and running back Ezeklel Elliott led the Cowboys to the No. 1 seed in the NFC.

The Packers (4-1) had gone ahead earlier on Damarius Randall's 21-yard interception return for a touchdown, the third of five lead changes in

- Set a career high with three sacks in 2016 (No. 2 in the NFL among safeties, Giants S Landon Collins, four). Ranks No. 3 among Green Bay safeties (since 1982) in career sacks (7.5), according to STATS, trailing LeRoy Butler (20.5) and Mark Murphy (11.0).

- Started all 16 games in 2014 and posted career highs in catches (91), receiving yards (1,287) and receiving TDs (12) on the way to earning his first career Pro Bowl selection (injury replacement for WR Dez Bryant).
- Set a franchise single-season record with a league-high 2,342 combined net yards in 2012, topping the previous team mark of 2,250 yards by RB Ahman Green in 2003.
- With 954 receiving yards and 964 kickoff return yards in 2012, is the only player in NFL history to post 900-plus yards in each category in the same season.

- Became the first player in franchise history to earn Pro Bowl recognition in each of his first four seasons in the league (2009-12).
- **2017 SEASON:** Has started all five games and has posted 19 tackles (18 solo), a team-high five tackles for a loss, 2.5 sacks (tied for team lead), three QB hits and seven QB pressures.

- Ranks No. 4 in franchise history in receptions (516), No. 5 in receiving yards (7,596), No. 2 in TD receptions (69) and No. 3 in 100-yard receiving games (25).
- Is one of only two players in franchise history (WR Sterling Sharpe, 1992-94) to register three straight seasons with 85-plus receptions (2013-14, 2016).
- Is the only player in team annals to record three seasons with 13-plus TD receptions (2011, 2014, 2016) and is the only active player in the league to do so.
- Has posted 1,250-plus receiving yards and 13-plus TD catches in the same season three times in his career (2011, 2014, 2016), the fourth most in NFL history behind only Jerry Rice (six), Randy Moss (five) and Terrell Owens (four).
- Ranks No. 2 in the NFL with 63 TD receptions since 2011 despite missing the entire 2015 season due to injury. Has posted 15 games with two or more TD catches since 2011, No. 1 in the league over that span.

- Has been named the NFL's Most Valuable Player by *The Associated Press* twice in his career (2011, 2014), one of only eight players in league history to win the award multiple times.
- Is the only quarterback in league history to record a 100-plus passer rating in six consecutive seasons (2009-14), with no other QB doing so in more than four straight seasons. Has posted a 100-plus rating in seven seasons (2009-14, 2016), the most in NFL annals.
- Is one of only four QBs in NFL annals with 35,000-plus passing yards and 2,500-plus rushing yards (Fran Tarkenton, John Elway, Donovan McNabb).
- Is the lone QB in NFL history to throw 40-plus TD passes with seven or fewer INTs in a season, having done it twice in his career (45/6 in 2011, 40/7 in 2016).
- In 140 career regular-season starts (since 2008), has posted 52 games with 300-plus passing yards (No. 3 in the NFL over that span), 82 without an interception (No. 1, min. 15 attempts) and 78 with a 100-plus passer rating (No. 2).

82 Richard Rodgers, TE, 4th Year, California

- Has not missed a game in his NFL career, appearing in all 48 regularseason games and seven postseason contests since joining the Packers in 2014.
- Had 58 receptions in 2015, becoming just the fourth TE in team history to record 55-plus receptions in a season (Paul Coffman, Jermichael Finley, Jackie Harris).

- Was one of only four TEs in the league in '15 to register 55-plus catches, 500-plus receiving yards and eight or more TD receptions (Rob Gronkowski, Jordan Reed, Gary Barnidge).
- **2017 SEASON:** Has played in all five games and has three catches for 38 yards (12.7 avg.).
- ►Vs. Seattle (Sept. 10): Appeared on five plays on offense and three on special teams.
- ►At Atlanta (Sept. 17): Played 10 snaps on offense, recording two catches for 22 yards (11.0 avg.)...On Green Bay's opening possession, came out of the backfield and across the field to catch a short pass from QB Aaron Rodgers and pick up 14 yards on third-and-7.
- ►Vs. Cincinnati (Sept. 24): Appeared on 10 plays on offense and 11 on special teams.

- **2017 SEASON:** Has registered a 46.1-yard gross average and a 44.0-yard net average on 21 punts with six inside the 20...Ranks No. 7 in the league in net punting average and No. 14 in gross average...Has added a tackle on special teams.
- ▶Vs. Seattle (Sept. 10): Punted five times in his NFL debut, posting a 43.8-yard gross average with a 42.4-yard net average...Had a long punt of 57 yards in the second quarter and placed one punt inside the 20...On five punts, allowed only one return for 7 yards by WR Tyler Lockett...Became the first undrafted rookie to punt for the Packers in a regular-season game since Chris Hanson in 1999 (Week 1 vs. Oakland).

Chicago (Sept. 28): Registered a career-best (min. four punts) 46.2-yard net average (47.6-yard gross) on five punts, highlighted by a career-long 62-yard punt in the first quarter that was fair caught at the Chicago 15...His net average was tied for the sixth-best posted by a Green Bay punter in a game since 1976 (min. four punts)...Became the first Green Bay punter since Tim Masthay in 2013 to record a 60-yard punt in back-to-back games.

- Ranked No. 5 in the nation in 2016 in rushing yards per game (137.5) and

registered six 100-yard rushing games, including two with 200-plus yards. **2017 SEASON:** Has played in all five games, rushing for 33 yards on 10 carries (3.3 avg.) with two receptions for 7 yards (3.5 avg.).

- ►Vs. Seattle (Sept. 10): Had two carries for 9 yards (4.5 avg.) in his NFL debut.
- ►At Atlanta (Sept. 17): Rushed for 6 yards on two carries (3.0 avg.) and posted a 5-yard reception in the fourth quarter, the first catch of his NFL career.
