CAROLINA PANTHERS (4-2) AT CHICAGO BEARS (2-4)

CAROLINA RETURNS TO THE ROAD TO FACE CHICAGO

CAROLINA AT CHICAGO

The Carolina Panthers return to the road to face off with Chicago in Week 7. The Panthers are coming off a tough Thursday night home loss to NFC East leader Philadelphia, while Chicago picked up an overtime win at Baltimore.

Carolina has been stellar on the road this season, posting a 3-0 road record with October wins at New England and Detroit. Quarterback Cam Newton has thrown for eight touchdowns and just two interceptions on the road for a passer rating of 122.9. Carolina started 3-0 on the road for just the fourth time in franchise history, and the Panthers are one of five NFL teams that are still undefeated on the road.

Against Philadelphia, Newton rushed for a season-high 71 yards on 11 carries, including his third rushing touchdown of the season. The Panthers defense forced two three-and-outs late in the game to give the offense opportunities down five, but an interception and turnover on downs dashed the Panthers' hopes.

Wide receiver Kelvin Benjamin finished with 99 yards receiving, and rookie Christian McCaffrey grabbed a career-high 10 receptions, the most by any Panthers rookie in a single game.

The Bears return home after a road win at Baltimore in overtime. Rookie quarterback Mitchell Trubisky threw for 113 yards and a touchdown with no interceptions in his second straight start. Running back Jordan Howard amassed 167 yards on the ground, including a 53-yard scamper in overtime to set up the game-winning field goal.

The Panthers and Bears are meeting for the 10th time in history with Chicago holding a 5-4 edge in the series. Carolina is 0-4 all-time in the regular season at Soldier Field. The Panthers' only win at Soldier Field came in the 2005 Divisional Playoff game, 29-21.

Sunday marks the second time that Carolina has faced John Fox since the former Panthers head coach left after the 2010 season. Fox's Broncos defeated Carolina in November 2012. This is Carolina's first game against Fox as a Bear.

NOTABLE CONNECTIONS

- Panthers head coach Ron Rivera was selected in the second round of the 1984 NFL Draft by Chicago, Rivera played all nine of his pro seasons with the Bears. He played linebacker for the Chicago Bears' top-ranked defense and Super Bowl XX championship team in 1985.
• Panthers offensive coordinator Mike Shula was the tight ends coach for the Bears from 1993-95.
• Panthers defensive coordinator Steve Wilks was the defensive backs coach for the Bears from 2006-08. Wilks was also the defensive backs coach at Illinois State in 2000.
• Panthers tight end coach Pete Hoener was the offensive line coach for the Bears in 2004. Hoener also coached the offensive line at Illinois State in 1977 and Illinois from 1987-88.
• Panthers assistant defensive backs coach Richard Rodgers played defensive back for the Chicago Bruisers (AFL) in 1987.
• Panthers defensive line coach Eric Washington was the defensive assistant/assistant defensive line coach for the Bears from 2008-10.
• Panthers coaching consultant Ron Turner was offensive coordinator for the Bears from 1993-96 and 2005-09. He also was an assistant coach at Northwestern from 1981-82.
• Panthers defensive end Mario Addison was an undrafted free agent by the Bears in 2011.
• Panthers tight end Greg Olsen (injured reserve) was selected in the first round (31st overall) of the NFL Draft by Chicago in 2007. Olsen played with the Bears from 2007-10.
• Panthers defensive end Julius Peppers played for the Bears from 2010-13. While with the Bears he was named to three Pro Bowls.
• Panthers guard Amini Silatolu spent training camp with the Bears in 2016.
• Panthers running back Fozzy Whittaker and Bears outside linebacker Sam Acho were college teammates at Texas.

THE HEAD COACHES



Ron RIVERA

Ron Rivera became the fourth coach in Carolina Panthers history on January 11, 2011.

In six seasons, Rivera has guided the team to a Super Bowl appearance, an NFC Championship and three NFC South titles. He is a two-time (2013 and 2015) Associated Press NFL Coach of the Year award winner. In 2015, Rivera led the Panthers to the second Super Bowl appearance in team history following a franchise-best 15-1 record and their third consecutive NFC South championship. In the process, Carolina became the fourth team in the Super Bowl era to start a season 14-0, joining the 1972 Miami Dolphins, 2007 New England Patriots and 2009 Indianapolis Colts. Carolina's 18-game regular season winning streak, beginning in 2014, was the longest in NFC history. In 2013, Rivera guided Carolina to its first playoff appearance in 2008 and in 2014, he led the Panthers to the team's first playoff win since 2005.

Before joining the Panthers in 2011, Rivera coached the San Diego Chargers (2007-2010), Chicago Bears (2004-06, 1997-98) and Philadelphia Eagles (1999-2003). In 2006, the Bears defense led the NFL with 44 takeaways, helping propel Chicago to an appearance in Super Bowl XLI.

Rivera is just the third Latino head coach in NFL history, joining Tom Flores with the Oakland Raiders (1979-1987) and Seattle Seahawks (1992-94) and Tom Fears with the New Orleans Saints (1967-1970).

A second-round draft choice in 1984 by Chicago, Rivera played nine seasons with the Bears. Primarily an outside linebacker, he was a member of the Super Bowl XX championship team in 1985.

An All-American at the University of California, Rivera finished his career as the school's all-time leader in sacks with 22 and tackles with 336.

Born January 7, 1962 in Fort Ord, Calif., he and his wife, Stephanie, have two children – Christopher and Courtney.

John Fox was named the fifteenth head coach in Chicago Bears history on January 16, 2015. He joined the Bears with 13 years of NFL head coaching experience with the Denver Broncos (2011-14) and Carolina Panthers (2002-2010). He has compiled a 130-116 (.528) regular season record, six division titles, six double-digit win seasons and seven playoff appearances. In the postseason, Fox has amassed an 8-7 (.533) record as a head coach with three conference championship game appearances leading to two trips to the Super Bowl (XXXVIII with Carolina in 2003 and XLVIII with Denver in 2013). Prior to coaching the Panthers, Fox was the defensive coordinator for the New York Giants (1997-2001). In 2000, Fox helped the Giants reach Super Bowl XXXV. Before joining the Giants, was a Rams' consultant (1996), defensive coordinator for the Raiders (1994-95), defensive backs coach for the Chargers (1992-93) and Steelers (1989-1991), and secondary coach for the USFL's Los Angeles Express (1985).

Fox played defensive back at San Diego State from 1976-77. He then coached collegiately at San Diego State (1978), U.S. International (1979), Boise State (1980), Long Beach State (1981), Utah (1982), Kansas (1983), Iowa State (1984), and Pittsburgh (1986-88).

He was born February 8, 1955, in Virginia Beach, Va. He and his wife, Robin, have four children - Mathew, Mark, Cody, and Halle.

GAME SUMMARY

CAROLINA 31, CHICAGO 24

OCTOBER 5, 2014 • BANK OF AMERICA STADIUM • CHARLOTTE, N.C.

Quarterback Cam Newton threw for 255 yards and two touchdowns, while tight end Greg Olsen chipped in six receptions for 72 yards and two scores leading Carolina to a 31-24 victory over Chicago. The scoring opened with a remarkably peculiar punt return in the first quarter. Wide receiver Philly Brown was interfered with before he fielded the punt and he, along with the ball, fell to the ground. But Brown got up and alertly found the loose ball. He then ran 79 yards down the sideline for a touchdown to give Carolina a 7-0 lead. Cutler and the Bears then rattled off 21 unanswered points. Chicago turned a Kelvin Benjamin fumble into a 10-yard touchdown pass to Forte three plays later. Newton lost a fumble after being sacked on the ensuing possession, setting up Chicago at the Carolina 13-yard line. Three plays later, Cutler scrambled for a 10-yard touchdown. After a Panthers' three-and-out, Cutler engineered an 8-play, 68-yard drive that ended with a third-down screen pass to wide receiver Alshon Jeffery against the blitz for a 25-yard touchdown. Carolina looked poised to answer as they approached the red zone, but Newton's pass was tipped at the line and intercepted by linebacker Lance Briggs. With 1:55 left in the first half, Bears kicker Robbie Gould — one of the most accurate kickers of all time — trotted on to attempt a 35-yard field goal to extend the lead to 24-7. But Gould's kick sailed wide right. Newton proceeded to engineer a critical two-minute drive. His first three passes were completed for 54 yards, and he later connected with Olsen for a 9-yard touchdown to cut the deficit to seven with 17 seconds left in the first half. Carolina continued its surge in the third quarter, as running back Chris Ogbonnaya scored a 1-yard touchdown on Carolina's first possession after halftime half to tie the game. Following safety Thomas DeCoud's interception of an overthrown pass by Bears quarterback Jay Cutler, Graham Gano converted a 44-yard field goal to tie the game at 24 with 4:29 left in the fourth quarter. On the first play of the ensuing drive, the Bears handed the ball off to running back Matt Forte who had done it all, rushing for 61 yards and recording 12 catches for 105 yards and a touchdown. But cornerback Antoine Cason stripped the ball, forcing a fumble that defensive tackle Kawaan Short recovered at the Bears' 23-yard line. An 11-yard completion to tight end Greg Olsen on third-and-three set up first-and-goal. On third-and-goal, quarterback Cam Newton faked a handoff to running back Darrin Reaves and fired a 6-yard touchdown to Olsen, who had worked himself open in the slot to seal the win.

NEWTON RUNS FOR SEASON HIGH

Cam Newton carried the Carolina running game on his shoulders against Philadelphia, rushing for a season-high 71 yards on 11 carries. It also marked the highest individual rushing game of any Panther since Week 15 of the 2016 season when Jonathan Stewart had 132 yards at Washington (12/19/16).

Newton currently ranks second among NFL quarterbacks with 161 yards and leads all quarterbacks with 40 rushing attempts. Newton's performance tied for the ninth-best rushing game of his career.

Cam Newton had a hand in both of Carolina's touchdowns against the Eagles, rushing for one and throwing for the other. He has accounted for all 12 of Carolina's touchdowns this season.

A RUNNING HISTORY

Carolina made headlines this offseason with the selection of elite Stanford running back Christian McCaffrey with the eighth pick of the NFL Draft. A Heisman finalist in his junior season, McCaffrey broke Barry Sanders' record for most all-purpose yards in a single college season.

McCaffrey brings his speed and quickness to a Panthers running game that has been among the NFL's best for nearly a decade.

Since 2008, the year Carolina drafted Jonathan Stewart, the Panthers lead the NFL in total rushing yards with 20,008. The Panthers have over 500 more rushing yards than the second-place New York Jets over that span. Carolina also ranks second in rushing touchdowns since 2008 with 164, just nine behind the New England Patriots.

Newton is the only player to lead a current NFL franchise in both career touchdown passes (145) and career rushing touchdowns (51). Newton is the first quarterback in NFL history with 50 rushing touchdowns in a career.

Newton has 37 career games with both a passing and rushing touchdown, the most in NFL history. Newton's most recent game with a passing touchdown and rushing touchdown was against Philadelphia (10/12/17). Pro Football Hall of Famer Steve Young previously held the record for the most such games with 31 from 1985-99.

Newton finished 2016 with 21,772 passing yards and 3,566 rushing yards in his career and is the only player in NFL history to have at least 20,000 passing yards and 3,000 rushing yards in his first six seasons. Newton is one of just three players in NFL history, along with Peyton Manning of the Indianapolis Colts from 1998-2003 and Andy Dalton of the Cincinnati Bengals from 2011-16, to have at least 3,000 passing yards in each of their first six seasons.

Newton has rushed for at least 500 yards in five of his six NFL seasons and joins Randall Cunningham and Michael Vick (six each) as the only quarterbacks with five or more 500-yard rushing seasons in a career. NEWTON IS PANTHERS QB WINS LEADER

In Week Four at New England (10/1/17), quarterback Cam Newton earned his 54th career victory as a starter, setting a franchise record for wins by a quarterback.

In that game, Newton totaled four touchdowns (three passing and one rushing). It was Newton's 36th career game with at least one rushing touchdown and at least one passing touchdown.

Newton led his 13th career game-winning drive as he directed the offense into field goal range for kicker Graham Gano to convert from 48 yards as time expired. The win was the 54th regular season victory in Newton's career,

Newton tallied the 15th 300-yard passing game of his career as he completed 22-of-29 passes for 316 yards and a passer rating of 130.8. The 75.9 completion percentage was the sixth-best of his career.

Newton's rushing touchdown was the 50th of his career. He is the first quarterback in NFL history to reach 50 career rushing touchdowns.

In 2016, Kuechly missed six games, but was credited with 102 tackles according to press box statistics. Despite missing three games in 2015, Kuechly finished 12th in the NFL with 118 tackles. He led the NFL in tackles in 2012 and 2014. In 2012, he became the first rookie since San Francisco's Patrick Willis in 2007 to lead the NFL in tackles. He finished fourth in 2013 with 156.

After film review, Panthers' coaches have credited Kuechly with 850 career tackles, the third-most in team history.

Kuechly has racked up his tackle totals by owning three of the top five single-season tackle totals in team history, including a team-record 205 stops as a rookie in 2012. Kuechly led the team in tackles in each of his first four seasons (2012-15).

Within a 40-foot stretch of the Carolina Panthers locker room sits 234.0 combined sacks in a Panthers uniform. Julius Peppers, Charles Johnson, Mario Addison, Thomas Davis and Kawann Short all rank in the top eight of the Panthers all-time sack leaders, and all of them are back in Panthers uniforms in 2017.

Peppers and Johnson rank first and second all-time in sacks, and those five players currently account for 27.3 percent of all 864.0 sacks ever recorded in Panthers history. Since Peppers was drafted in 2002, the Panthers rank fourth in the NFL with 615.0 sacks.

PANTHERS ALL-TIME SACK LEADER RETURNS

Julius Peppers established himself as the Panthers all-time leading sack leader in his first stint with the team from 2002-09, and has added to his total since returning to the team in 2017.

His 6.5 sacks in 2017 have pushed his franchise-leading total to 87.5. His 14.5 sacks in 2008 is tied for second most all-time in a single Panthers season.

From 2010-16, Peppers played for Chicago and Green Bay, registering another 62.5 sacks for a career total of 146 sacks.

Peppers has only had one season where he made less than seven sacks in his 15-year career.

Peppers ranks fifth all-time in the NFL with his 150.0 career sacks, the most of any active NFL player. He is the only player in NFL history with 150 sacks and 10 or more interceptions.

With one more sack, Peppers moves into fourth place all-time. Of the four all-time leaders, three (White, Greene, Peppers) spent time playing for the Panthers in their careers.

Since 2012, no group of defensive linemen produced more sacks than Carolina's 190.0.

Since 2013, a Panthers defensive lineman has earned NFC Defensive Player of the Week honors five times. Hardy was recognized twice in 2013 (Week Three and Week Seventeen). Short and Lotulelei are the only defensive tackles in Panthers history to earn NFC Defensive Player of the Week honors as Short was recognized in Week Six of 2015 and Lotulelei received recognition in Week Eight of 2016. Peppers won Defensive Player of the Week honors in Week Four of 2017.

Short also has two NFC Defensive Player of the Month awards on his resume, earning the recognition in October and December of 2015. Short is the first player in franchise history to win multiple Player of the Month Awards in a single season and the first defensive tackle in the NFL to win multiple Player of the Month Awards in a single season.

In the offseason, Carolina added Mike Adams and Captain Munnerlyn to the secondary to bring veteran leadership and play-making production. Adams has played some of his best football over the last three seasons, earning two Pro Bowl invites, and ranking sixth in the NFL with 12 interceptions since 2014.



MUNNERLYN HOLDS PANTHERS INT-TD MARK

This offseason, cornerback Captain Munnerlyn returned to Carolina. In his previous stint with the Panthers (2009-13), Munnerlyn had a knack for finding the end zone, returning five of his seven interceptions for touchdowns. He leads the Panthers record book for most interception returns for touchdowns.

GANO CONVERTS GAME-WINNER

In Week Four at New England (10/1/17), kicker Graham Gano converted a 48-yard field goal as time expired to give the Panthers a 33-30 victory.

The kick was Gano's third game-winning field goal (defined as a field goal that put the team ahead for good in the final two minutes of the fourth quarter or in overtime) as a Panther and the seventh of his career. On the season, Gano is 15-for-16 on field goal attempts.

GANO SETS TOUCHBACK RECORD

In Week Four at New England (10/1/17), kicker Graham Gano had a streak of 15 consecutive kickoffs resulting in touchbacks to start the 2017 season broken on his third kickoff of the game when New England's Dion Lewis returned a Gano kickoff from the New England 3-yard line to the 26-yard line.

The streak of 15 consecutive kickoffs resulting in touchbacks is the longest such streak in the NFL to start a season since at least 1970. Gano held the previous long streak with 14 to start the 2013 season.

GANO IS A FIELD POSITION WEAPON

In addition to his field goal abilities, kicker Graham Gano has been important in the field position game. Since the start of 2013, Gano is second in the NFL with a 75.4 touchback percentage (min. 100 kickoffs).

In 2016, Gano ranked third in the NFL with 74.1 percent of his kickoffs (63-of-85) resulting in touchbacks. In 2014, Gano placed 61 of his 79 kickoffs resulted in touchbacks. The 77.2 percent touchback rate was best in the League and his 61 kickoffs were the most in the NFC.

In 2013, 63 of Gano's 79 kickoffs resulted in touchbacks. His 79.7 touchback percentage was the top mark in the NFL and the highest percentage in a season since Brad Daluiso in 1992 (81.3 percent).

PALARDY GETS HIS KICKS

In 2016, first-year punter Michael Palardy joined the Panthers after Andy Lee was placed on injured reserve with a hamstring injury.

At the time of his injury, Lee was among the NFL leaders, ranking fourth with a 49.1-yard gross average and tied for seventh with 18 punts inside the 20.

Palardy was a capable replacement, making his debut in Week Eleven vs.

New Orleans (11/17/16). He produced a then career-high 46.7-yard gross average in each of his first two games vs. New Orleans and in Week Twelve at Oakland (11/27/16).

In the final seven weeks of the season, Palardy recorded a 42.5-yard gross average and tied for 12th in the NFL with 13 punts inside the 20. In Week Fourteen vs. San Diego (12/11/16), Palardy recorded a career-high 42.6-yard net average and placed two punts inside the 20-yard line, including one in the fourth quarter that was downed at the 3-yard line.

Palardy turned that performance and a strong 2017 preseason into a spot on this season's 53-man roster. In the 2017 season opener at San Francisco (9/10/17), Palardy posted a career-best 48.7 net average on three punts, the second-best net punting average in a Panthers season opener since Jason Baker (51.0) at St. Louis (9/9/07).

Palardy uncorked a career-long 60-yard punt in Week Five at Detroit (10/8/17).



BUILDING THROUGH THE DRAFT

The Carolina Panthers have maintained a philosophy of building through the NFL Draft. The Panthers still have the last seven consecutive first-round draft picks on the team's roster. That number ties San Francisco for the most consecutive first-round picks still on a roster and is second in the NFL behind Houston (10).

Dating back to 2002 with Julius Peppers, the Panthers have 10 of the last 14 first-round picks on the current roster (the Panthers did not have first-round selections in 2009 and 2010).
