Cleveland Browns (0-6) vs. Tennessee Titans (3-3)

NOTABLE STORYLINES

- The Browns host the Tennessee Titans at 1:00 p.m. on Sunday, Oct. 22. The Browns hold a 35-29 advantage in the all-time series. This will mark the fourth straight season the teams have met with Cleveland holding a 2-1 record during that span.
- Last season, the Browns finished 31st in the NFL in both total defense and rushing defense. Through six games this year, the Browns rank eighth in total defense and sixth in rushing defense. The Browns haven't had a top-10 rushing defense since 1992 and a top-eight defense since 1994.
- DB Jason McCourty returned an interception 56 yards for a touchdown at Houston. It was the first interception-touchdown in the nine-year vet's career. McCourty is leading the team this season in interceptions (three) and passes defensed (nine) and is tied for the team lead with two forced fumbles. McCourty is tied for second in the NFL in interceptions and tied for third in passes defensed.
- DL Myles Garrett has recorded three sacks in two games this season. Despite playing just two games, he ranks tied for second among all NFL rookies in sacks. In his first game against the Jets (10/8), Garrett became the only No. 1 overall pick to record multiple sacks in his NFL debut.
- Rookie TE **David Njoku** is leading all NFL rookies and is tied for fourth among all NFL tight ends with three receiving touchdowns. His three receiving scores lead the team and are tied for the most by a Browns rookie tight end.
- OL Joe Thomas extended his snaps streak to 10,325, the longest active stretch in the league and believed to be the longest in NFL history. The 10-time Pro Bowler has started the past 166 games at left tackle, which is also the longest active streak in the NFL among offensive linemen and fourth-longest among all NFL players.
- RB Duke Johnson Jr. is leading the Browns this season with 26 receptions and 269 receiving yards. He has also added 117 rushing yards and three total touchdowns (two rushing, one receiving). Among all NFL running backs since 2015, Johnson ranks second in receptions (140) and receiving yards (1,317).
- LB Joe Schobert led the Browns with a career-high 12 tackles at Houston. He is leading the team this season and is tied for fifth among all NFL players in tackles.

Coaching capsules:

Cleveland – Hue Jackson: 9-29, third season as head coach, second with the Browns.

Hue Jackson was named the 16th full-time head coach in Cleveland Browns history on January 13, 2016. He enters his 31st year as a coach, including the last 17 in the NFL. He has spent 10 seasons coaching in the AFC North, helping his team advance to the post-season seven times over that span. Jackson was head coach of the Oakland Raiders in 2011 and guided the team to an 8-8 record. He has also served as offensive coordinator in Washington (2003), Atlanta (2007), Oakland (2010) and Cincinnati (2014-15). Jackson spent 14 years coaching on the college level and was a quarterback at Pacific from 1985-86.

Titans -- Mike Mularkey: 30-49, sixth season as head coach, third season with the Titans.

Mularkey became the 18th head coach in franchise history on January 16, 2016 after serving as interim head coach for the final nine games of 2015. He is in his 23rd season coaching in the NFL following nine years in the NFL as a player. His coaching tenure includes two years (2004-05) as head coach of the Buffalo Bills and one year (2012) as head coach of the Jacksonville Jaguars. He joined the Titans as tight ends coach in 2014 and was promoted to assistant head coach/tight ends in 2015. Mularkey spent four seasons (2008-11) with the Atlanta Falcons as offensive coordinator and two seasons with the Miami Dolphins (2006-07). Mularkey's head coaching tenure with the Bills was preceded by eight seasons (1996-03) with the Pittsburgh Steelers. He served as the tight ends coach in his first five seasons in Pittsburgh, and his final three seasons were spent as offensive coordinator. Mularkey first coached in the NFL with Tampa Bay (1994-95).

ON DECK

The Browns will play their first regular season game outside of the United States when they play the Minnesota Vikings at London's Twickenham Stadium on Sunday, October 29. The game will kick off at 9:30 a.m. ET. The Vikings own a 10-4 advantage in the all-time series,



but the Browns won the last meeting 31-27 in Minnesota on Sept. 22, 2013.

BROWNS TO PLAY IN LONDON **=**

The NFL selected the Cleveland Browns to host the Minnesota Vikings at Twickenham Stadium in Week 8 for one of league's 2017 London Games. The Browns-Vikings matchup is one of four regular season games scheduled in London this year, the most in league history, and Cleveland's firstever regular season game outside of the United States. Including 2017 contests, the NFL will have held 21 games in the UK since 2007 with 27 of the league's 32 teams playing at least once in either London or Mexico during that time. Through the league's commitment to growing the game internationally, all 32 teams are expected to participate in the NFL's International Series. From 2007-17, 12 different clubs will have hosted a game outside of the United States. Since the league first held multiple games in London in 2013, 22 teams have been scheduled for at least one game in London or Mexico, including all four AFC North clubs.

NOTABLE CONNECTIONS

- DB **Jason McCourty** was a sixth-round pick by Tennessee in 2009 and spent eight season (2009-16) with the Titans.
- WR **Kenny Britt** was a first-round pick by Tennessee in 2009 and spent five seasons (2009-13) with the Titans.
- Titans QB **Brandon Weeden** was a first-round pick by Cleveland in 2012 and spent two seasons (2012-13) with the Browns.
- Titans offensive coordinator **Terry Robiskie** (2001-06), assistant wide receivers coach **Luke Steckel** (2009-12) and assistant offensive line coach **Mike Sullivan** (2001-04, 2007-08, 2013) all coached with the Browns.
- Titans defensive line coach **Nick Eason** was a defensive lineman for the Browns from 2004-06 and was a coaching intern in 2013.
- Titans wide receivers coach **Frisman Jackson** spent four seasons as a wide receiver for the Browns from 2002-05.
- Titans strength and conditioning assistant **Taylor Porter** was a strength and conditioning intern for the Browns in 2015.
- Defensive coordinator **Gregg Williams** was senior defensive assistant for the Titans in 2013. Beforehand, Williams spent 11 seasons with the Houston Oilers/Tennessee Titans from 1990-00, serving a number of different roles, including defensive coordinator from 1997-2002.
- OL **Shon Coleman** (Memphis) and P **Britton Colquitt** (Knoxville) are Tennessee natives. Colquitt also attended the University of Tennessee.
- Titans WR **Darius Jennings** was originally signed by the Browns as an undrafted free agent in 2015.
- Titans G **Josh Kline** is a native of Mason, Ohio and attended Kent State.
- Titans RB **David Fluellen** and P **Brett Kern** played collegiately at Toledo.
- Titans defensive assistant **Brandon Blaney** was a defensive graduate assistant at Ohio State in 2001.
- Senior offensive assistant/wide receivers coach **AI Saunders** was the offensive coordinator and quarterbacks coach at the University of Tennessee in 1982.
- Strength and conditioning assistant **Josh Cristovich** was the assistant strength and conditioning coach/intern coordinator at East Tennessee State University from 2013-15.
- Titans assistant special teams coach **Craig Aukerman** was the wide receivers coach at the University of Findlay (Ohio) in 2000, graduate assistant at Miami (Ohio) from 2001-02 and linebackers coach/co-special teams coordinator at Miami (Ohio) from 2005-08.

RB Isaiah Crowell

With 100 rushing yards, would record his sixth career 100yard rushing game and tie him for first on the Browns' 100yard rushing games list since 1999 (William Green, Peyton Hillis and Jamal Lewis.)

His next rushing TD will mark the 20th of his career.

Is 40 receiving yards away from 700 for his career. The mark would also make him the first Browns running back since Kevin Mack (1985-88) to record at least 2,500 rushing yards and 700 receiving yards in his first four NFL seasons.

DL Myles Garrett

With one sack, will record the second-best total (four) by a Brown in his first three career games. Will also be the first player in franchise history to reach the mark since Charles Buchanan in 1988 (4.5).

Will become the first NFL player to register a sack in each of his first three career games since Barkevious Mingo in 2013.

A sack would give him one in three consecutive games, making him the first Brown to do so since Desmond Bryant (Weeks 7-9 in 2015), the first Browns rookie to do so since Jabaal Sheard (Weeks 11-13 in 2011) and the first rookie No. 1 overall pick to do so since Mario Williams (Weeks 7-9 in 2006).

RB Duke Johnson Jr.

Is 10 catches away from tying for No. 10 on the Browns' alltime receptions by a running back list with 150 (Dub Jones).

With 83 receiving yards, would become the first Browns running back to register at least 1,400 receiving yards and 800 rushing yards in his first three NFL seasons.

A reception of 25-plus yards would tie him for the most bigplay receptions (4) ever recorded by a Browns running back in a single season (Himself, 2015-16; Jamel White, 2001).

DB Jason McCourty

An interception would tie his single-season career high of four. It would also make him the first Brown to register a pick in three consecutive games since Joe Haden did it in Weeks 11-13 in 2014.

An interception returned for a TD would make him the first Browns player to do so in consecutive games since Jim Houston in 1967.

TE David Njoku

A receiving TD would mark his fourth of the season and would be the most ever recorded by a Browns rookie tight end.

OL Joe Thomas

Has started all 166 career games and has not missed an offensive snap since joining the Browns as the third overall selection of the 2007 draft. His consecutive snaps streak of 10,325 is the longest active stretch in the league and believed to be the longest in NFL history.

Nissan Stadium, Nashville, Tenn.

The Titans held on to defeat the Browns 28-26 at Nissan Stadium. The Titans scored on their opening drive, which included a 41-yard rush by QB Marcus Mariota on the first play from scrimmage and an 11-yard TD pass to WR Rishard Matthews to cap the drive just six plays later. The Browns were able to respond on their first possession as QB Cody Kessler got the Cleveland offense moving with a 43-yard completion to TE Gary Barnidge on Cleveland's first offensive play. Four plays later, K Cody Parkey put the Browns on the board with a 45-yard field goal. Parkey later connected on a 37-yard field goal. Mariota extended the Titans' lead early in the second quarter when he found WR Kendall Wright on a 48-yard TD strike to go up 14-6. Cleveland was once again able to pull within one point when Kessler capped a nine-play, 94-yard drive with a 7-yard TD pass to WR Terrelle Pryor Sr., which left the Browns trailing 14-13 at the half. Titans RB DeMarco Murray scored the only points of the third quarter when 14-15 at the half. Thank RD Delviated Mulray scored the only points of the finished Tennessee's seven-play, 70-yard drive with a 3-yard TD rush to garner a 21-13 advantage. In the fourth quarter, the Titans furthered the margin when Mariota ended a 12-play, 80-yard drive that took up 6:59 with a 15-yard TD pass to TE Anthony Fasano. The Browns chipped away at the Tennessee lead on the ensuing drive, going 75-yards in 13 plays, including a Kessler 5-yard TD pass to Pryor. However, Kessler was unable to connect with a receiver on a Resset 3-yatd 1D pass to Fryot. Towever, Resset was unable to connect with a feetiver of the two-point conversion attempt and the Browns trailed, 28-19. After WR Rashard Higgins recovered a Parkey onside kick, Cleveland found the end zone for the last time as RB Duke Johnson Jr. completed a nine-play, 62-yard drive with a 1-yard TD rush. Trailing 28-26, the Browns were not able to recover Parkey's second onside kick attempt and the Titans held on for the victory

Kirby Wilson was named the Browns running backs coach/ run game coordinator in 2016. He has 19 years of experience coaching running backs in the NFL, during which time he has coached five running backs who rank in the top 25 for career rushing yards (Emmitt Smith #1, Curtis Martin #4, Edgerrin James #12, Adrian Peterson #16 and Thomas Jones #25) and two of the top four all-time reception leaders among running backs (Larry Centers #1 and Keith Byers #4). Wilson has helped seven different running backs break the 1.000-vard plateau a total of eight times. He has mentored four players to the Pro Bowl and has been to the playoffs with four different franchises, highlighted by the 2002 Buccaneers and 2008 Steelers Super Bowl victories. In Wilson's first season in Cleveland, the Browns finished second in the NFL with a 4.89 rushing average. The average was the seventh-best in team history and the team's best mark since 1966.



During the ride-alongs, Browns players and officers welcomed the opportunity to engage in meaningful one-on-one conversations and learn more about their shared Cleveland community. The groups also collectively interacted with organizations and individual members within the city, including visits to local neighborhoods, high schools, the Zelma George Recreation Center and the Lonnie Burten Recreation Center.

BREAST CANCER AWARENESS MONTH

The Cleveland Browns will honor National Breast Cancer Awareness Month throughout October, in partnership with the American Cancer Society. This year, the National Football League and the American Cancer Society are expanding their efforts to support the fight against cancer through the "Crucial Catch: Intercept Cancer" campaign. Browns players and staff will share the excitement of learning with 40 pre-kindergarten children at The Centers for Families and Children Glenville Early Learning Center in support of the 2,000 Days Pledge and Cuyahoga County's Invest in Children Universal Pre-Kindergarten Program (UPK). During the visit, the team will interact with the children through games focused on core learning standards motor skills, as well as read books with the growing scholars.









HEAD COACH HUE JACKSON



Hue Jackson was named the 16th full-time head coach in Cleveland Browns history by Dee and Jimmy Haslam on January 13, 2016. He has 30 years of coaching experience, including the last 16 in the NFL. He has spent 10 seasons coaching in the AFC North, during which time he helped his team advance to the postseason seven times. Jackson was head coach of the Oakland Raiders in 2011 and guided the team to an 8-8 record. He has also served as offensive coordinator in Washington (2003), Atlanta (2007), Oakland (2010) and Cincinnati (2014-15).

In his first year with Cleveland, he helped the Browns finish second in the NFL with a 4.89 rushing average, the team's best mark since 1966. Linebacker Christian Kirksey finished third in the NFL with 148 tackles, while left tackle Joe Thomas was selected to his 10th career Pro Bowl.

Jackson helped develop one of the youngest teams in NFL history. The Browns opened the 2016 season with 17 rookies on their 53-man roster, the most by an NFL team in a season opener since 2002. First-round pick wide receiver Corey Coleman was named NFL Rookie of the Week after a 104-yard, two touchdown performance in Week 2. Second-round pick defensive lineman Emmanuel Ogbah recorded a team-best 5.5 sacks, tied for the fourth-most by a Browns rookie. Third-round pick quarterback Cody Kessler registered the second-highest single-game passing yardage total by a Browns rookie with 336 in Week 6.

Prior to joining the Browns, Jackson spent the previous four seasons (2012-15) with the Cincinnati Bengals. During that time, he helped the Bengals to two division titles and a trip to the post-season all four years. In 2012, he served as secondary/assistant special teams coach before coaching the running backs in 2013. Jackson spent 2014-15 as offensive coordinator.

With Jackson as coordinator in 2015, the Bengals offense finished third in the AFC in yards per play (5.7) and points per game (26.2). He was voted by the Professional Football Writers of America (PFWA) as the Co-Assistant Coach of the Year as quarterback Andy Dalton set a career high and franchise record with a 106.3 rating, which led the AFC and was second in the NFL. After losing Dalton to injury in Week 14, Jackson guided quarterback A.J. McCarron to a 2-1 record in the final three games of the season as the Bengals clinched the AFC North title. The Cincinnati running game produced two 700-yard rushers in Jeremy Hill (794) and Giovani Bernard (730) for the first time since 1988. Tight end Tyler Eifert experienced a breakout season after hauling in 13 touchdown receptions, the most by a Bengals tight end in franchise history and the most by a Cincinnati player since 2001. Wide receiver A.J. Green added 10 receiving touchdowns on 86 receptions for 1,297 yards. Eifert, Green and left tackle Andrew Whitworth were selected to the Pro Bowl.

In Jackson's first year as offensive coordinator for Cincinnati in 2014, the run game posted its highest yards per game average (134.1) since 2000. Dalton passed for 3,398 yards and Green totaled 1,041 receiving yards. Hill led all NFL rookies with 1,124 rushing yards, the second-most by a Bengals rookie in team history.

After spending the 2010 season as the Raiders offensive coordinator, Jackson was promoted to head coach in 2011. Oakland finished the year 8-8 and tied for first in the AFC West but missed

the postseason via tiebreaker. The 8-8 mark was the best record by any Raiders team since 2002. The Raiders finished ninth in the NFL in total offense (379.5 yards per game) and seventh in rushing offense (131.9).

Before joining the Raiders, Jackson spent two seasons (2008-09) as quarterbacks coach for Baltimore, helping the Ravens advance to the playoffs both years. He was vital in the development of Joe Flacco, who was named NFL Rookie of the Year in 2008 and became the first rookie quarterback to win two playoff games as the Ravens advanced to the AFC Championship game.

From 2004-06, Jackson served as the Bengals wide receivers coach, helping develop one of the best wide receiver tandems in NFL history with Chad Johnson and T.J. Houshmandzadeh. During that span, the two combined to average 173.3 catches, 2,363.3 receiving yards and 15 touchdowns per season. In 2005, Johnson led the AFC with 1,432 receiving yards. In 2006, Johnson and Houshmandzadeh became the first Bengals duo to each top 1,000 receiving yards in the same season.

Jackson gained his first fulltime NFL experience with Washington, where he served as the running backs coach from 2001-02, before being promoted to offensive coordinator in 2003. Under Jackson's tutelage, running back Stephen Davis led the NFC with 1,432 rushing yards in 2001.

Jackson spent 14 years coaching on the college level, going from a graduate assistant at Pacific all the way to offensive coordinator at Southern California. He spent four seasons (1997-2000) as USC's offensive coordinator, where he also helped to recruit and develop players, including quarterback Carson Palmer, who went on to win the Heisman Trophy and be selected No. 1 overall in the NFL draft.

He was a minority coaching fellowship intern with the Los Angeles Rams in 1990, Arizona Cardinals in 1992 and Washington Redskins in 1995. He also served as the running backs/wide receivers/special teams coach for the London Monarchs of the World League in 1991.

Born Oct. 22, 1965, Jackson was a quarterback at Pacific from 1985-86 and threw for 2,544 yards and 19 touchdowns. The Los Angeles native also lettered in basketball and earned his degree in physical education.

Jackson and his wife, , Michelle, have three daughters, Jordyn, Baylee and Haydyn.

The Hue Jackson Foundation

Hue Jackson and his wife, Michelle, launched the Hue Jackson Foundation on July 20, 2017. The foundation is committed to empowering children, teen and adult survivors of human trafficking through the funding of organizations that champion for and serve as a voice for those who are exploited. The foundation also focuses its efforts to further awareness, prevention and healing for victims of human trafficking. The foundation's website is www.huejackson.org.

The Cleveland Browns dropped the 2017 season opener to the Pittsburgh Steelers, 21-18. Despite limiting the Steelers to 290 yards, two touchdown receptions by Steelers TE Jesse James proved to be the difference in the contest. On the game's opening possession, Pittsburgh forced a three-and-out and on fourth down, deep in Browns' territory, its special teams unit opened the scoring. LB Tyler Matakevich blocked Britton Colquitt's punt and Steelers LB Anthony Chickillo recovered it in the end zone for a touchdown to give the Steelers an early 7-0 advantage. Later in the quarter, rookie QB DeShone Kizer led the team on a 12-play, 68-yard drive, which he capped off by sneaking into the end zone from a yard out to even the scoring. With 45 seconds left in the first half, Steelers QB Ben Roethlisberger found James in the back of the end zone for a 4-yard score to give Pittsburgh a 14-7 lead heading into the locker room. As Cleveland's defense forced a three-and-out on Pittsburgh's first possession of the second half, Kizer led the offense down the field and set up fellow rookie K Zane Gonzalez, who notched a 24-yard field goal to cut Pittsburgh's lead to 14-10. On the game's next possession, Roethlisberger marched the Steelers 75 yards down the field and connected with James again for his second touchdown reception on the afternoon to extend their lead to 21-10. Late in the fourth quarter, DB Derrick Kindred picked off Roethlisberger and returned it 30 yards to the Cleveland 31-yard line. Later in the quarter, on fourth-and-two from the 3-yard line, Kizer hit WR Corey Coleman at the goal line for a touchdown, the first touchdown pass of his career. RB Isaiah Crowell punched in a two-point conversion to cut the lead to 21-18, but Pittsburgh would not let Cleveland get the ball back as they sealed 21-18 victory.

The Cleveland Browns dropped their second game as Baltimore's defense forced five turnovers in a 24-10 Ravens victory. Early in the first quarter, a strip-sack by Ravens LB Terrell Suggs gave Baltimore's offense a short field and a 4-yard TD run by RB Terrence West for a 7-0 lead. Midway through the second quarter, Ravens QB Joe Flacco led Baltimore on a six-play, 64-yard drive capped by a 4-yard TD strike to RB Javorious Allen, extending the lead to 14-0. Replacing injured QB DeShone Kizer, QB Kevin Hogan responded with a five-play, 83-yard drive. Hogan connected with rookie TE David Njoku for a 23-yard TD, the first TD pass of Hogan's career and the first TD recep-tion of Njoku's, to cut the deficit, 14-7. Later in the second quarter, Ravens rookie LB Tyus Bowser intercepted a Hogan pass, resulting in a 27-yard return and a 2-yard TD pass from Flacco to WR Jeremy Maclin for a 21-7 Ravens lead at halftime. Midway through the third quarter, rookie K Zane Gonzalez connected on a 38-yard field goal to shrink Baltimore's lead, but Ravens K Justin Tucker converted a 28-yard field goal in the fourth quarter to make the score 24-10. On the game's next possession, Kizer marched the Browns 70 yards down the field before Ravens DB Lardarius Webb intercepted a Kizer pass in the end zone. Cleveland's offense wasn't able to muster any more points as Baltimore's defense sealed the 24-10 victory with a late fourth quarter stand. Early in the first quarter, OL Joe Thomas exceeded 10,000 straight snaps for his career, the longest-known streak in NFL history.

Lucas Oil Stadium, Indianapolis, Ind.

In a Week 3 road contest, the Cleveland Browns fell to the Indianapolis Colts, 31-28. Trailing 7-O early in the second quarter, RB Duke Johnson Jr. avoided a couple would-be tacklers and leaped over the pylon for a 19-yard touchdown run to tie the game at 7-7. On the Colts' ensuing possession, QB Jacoby Brissett spun away from a defender and scampered into the end zone for a 7-yard touchdown to give the Colts a 14-7 advantage. After Browns P Britton Colquitt pinned Indianapolis inside its own 5-yard line, Brissett led the Colts on a five-play, 97-yard drive capped off by a 61-yard touchdown pass to WR T.Y. Hilton to extend their lead to 21-7. Indy would tack on its third score of the quarter as RB Frank Gore found the end zone from four yards out to give the Colts a 28-7 lead. With 44 seconds to play in the half, QB DeShone Kizer linked up with WR Jordan Leslie, who made a one-handed grab for a 26-yard gain down to the Colts' 2-yard line. Two plays later, Kizer found TE David Njoku in the back of the end zone for his second touchdown reception in as many games to cut Indy's lead to 28-14 at the half. After a scoreless third quarter, Colts K Adam Vinatieri notched a 33-yard field goal to extend their lead to 31-14. Later in the fourth, Kizer found WR Kenny Britt for an 11-yard touchdown to make it 31-21. Cleveland got the ball back with 4:05 to play and went on an 11-play, 70-yard drive in 2:01, capped off with a QB sneak by Kizer to cut the lead to 31-28. However, a final effort would see Colts S Malik Hooker intercept a Kizer pass with no time remaining to seal the victory, 31-28.

The Cleveland Browns dropped their fourth straight game as they fell to the Cincinnati Bengals, 31-7, in Week 4. On the Bengals second play of the game, DL Emmanuel Ogbah's strip-sack of Bengals QB Andy Dalton gave the Browns the ball at the Cincinnati 30-yard line, but a missed 48-yard field goal by rookie K Zane Gonzalez kept the game scoreless. In the second quarter, Dalton connected with WR A.J. Green, TE Tyler Kroft and RB Giovani Bernard for a trio of touchdowns, giving the Bengals a 21-0 halftime lead. Cincinnati opened up the second half with a 41-yard field goal from K Randy Bullock to extend the lead to 24-0. Later in the quarter, Dalton led the Bengals on a 10play drive, ending in a second touchdown strike to Kroft. Late in the fourth quarter, QB Kevin Hogan entered the game in relief of rookie QB DeShone Kizer and led the Browns on a 12-play, 63-yard drive capped by a RB Duke Johnson 1-yard touchdown rush. Ogbah finished the game with one sack, two forced fumbles and a fumble recovery, while DL Caleb Brantley and DL Trevon Coley recorded their first career sacks.

Despite outgaining the Jets 419-212, the Browns fell to New York, 17-14. On the game's opening possession, Browns rookie DL Myles Garrett, who was making his NFL debut, reached Jets OB Josh McCown to record the first sack of his career on his first NFL snap. Garrett would register another sack in the second quarter to become the first No. 1 overall pick to record multiple sacks in his NFL debut. Scoring opportunities plagued the Browns throughout the contest as the team had two red zone turnovers (one fumble and one interception) and two missed field goals. With time winding down in the first half, Jets K Chandler Catanzaro notched a 57-yard field goal to give New York a 3-0 lead at the half. To start the second half, Browns QB Kevin Hogan relieved rookie DeShone Kizer and led the team on a 10-play, 75-yard drive capped by a onehanded touchdown reception by rookie TE David Njoku to give the Browns a 7-3 advantage. Njoku's third touchdown reception of the year tied for the most by a Browns rookie tight end in a single season. Later in the quarter, McCown connected with TE Austin Seferian-Jenkins for a 2-yard score to regain the lead, 10-7. In the final frame, the Jets took over on downs and marched 97 yards down the field as McCown found WR Jermaine Kearse for a 24-yard touchdown to extend their lead to 17-7. Cleveland would tack on another late score as Hogan dumped off a short pass to RB Duke Johnson Jr., who scampered 41 yards to the end zone, to cut New York's lead to 17-14. However, after recovering an onside kick, New York would kneel out the clock to secure the victory.

Houston rookie QB Deshaun Watson tossed three touchdown passes as the Texans topped the Browns, 33-17. Texans K Ka'imi Fairbairn connected from 40 yards out to give the Texans an early 3-0 lead, but Browns K Zane Gonzalez responded with a 41-yard field goal of his own to even the score. Later in the first quarter, Watson hit WR Will Fuller V for a 39-yard touchdown, giving the Texans a 10-3 advantage. On the ensuing drive, Texans CB Jonathan Joseph intercepted QB Kevin Hogan and returned it 82 yards for a touchdown and a 16-3 Texans lead. Watson later connected with WR Braxton Miller for a 1-yard score and a 24-3 Texans lead at the half following a twopoint convetion. Early in the second half, Hogan was flagged for intentional grounding in the end zone, resulting in a safety and extending Houston's lead to 26-3. Watson threw a 3-yard touchdown pass to WR De'Andre Hopkins later in the third quarter, adding to the Texans' lead.
