

PACKERS RETURN HOME TO PLAY THE SAINTS

After back-to-back away games, the Green Bay Packers will host the New Orleans Saints at Lambeau Field on Sunday in the first noon home game this season.

► The Packers are 10-2 at home against New Orleans.



- It is the Saints' latest trip by date to Wisconsin since playing the Packers in Milwaukee on Nov. 17, 1985.
 This is the first time begins the Sainte since 2012, a 28, 27, Craw
- This is the first time hosting the Saints since 2012, a 28-27 Green Bay victory.
- Each team has scored 20-plus points in each of the last five matchups, with three being decided by eight or fewer points.
- ►As the home team, Green Bay has scored 21-plus points in all 12 games against the Saints.
- ► The Packers are 4-2 this season, marking the fifth straight season and the 10th time since 2000 that Green Bay has won at least four of its first six games (6-0 in 2011 and 2015 / 5-1 in 2002 and 2007 / 4-2 in 2001, 2009, 2013, 2014 and 2016).
- ► The Packers' four wins are tied for the third most in the NFL this season and the second most in the NFC.
- ► The Packers have won 10 of their last 12 regular-season games and are tied with Kansas City, New England and Pittsburgh for the best record in the NFL over that span.
- ► Dating back to 2006, the Packers (31-12, .721) hold the second-best winning percentage in the month of October behind the New England Patriots (41-8, .837).
- ►Green Bay has won 22 of its last 27 games played in the month of October and 12 of the last 13 at home in October.
- ►The Packers are 17-5 (.773) at home in the month of October since 2006, ranking No. 3 in the NFC (New Orleans, 19-4, .826 / New York Giants, 18-4, .818) and tied for No. 5 in the NFL over that span (New England, 21-2, .913 / Indianapolis, 15-4, .789 / Pittsburgh, 17-5, .773).
- ►Green Bay has outscored opponents by 226 points at home in October since 2006, No. 2 in the NFL over that span (New England, 321).
- ► The Packers rank No. 3 in the NFL in points per game allowed (19.1) in the month of October since 2006.
- ►Green Bay has registered 53 interceptions in the month of October since 2006, tied for No. 3 in the NFL over that span (New York Giants, 61 / New England, 56 / Arizona, 53).
- ► The Packers are the only team with four touchdowns on opening drives this season. Green Bay leads the league with 27 points on opening drives.
- ► The Packers are No. 1 in red-zone efficiency this season (16 TDs on 22 drives, 72.7 percent).

► The Packers will have a bye in Week 8, the latest bye week for Green Bay since 2014 (Week 9). After the bye, Green Bay will play consecutive games against NFC North opponents. In Week 9, they will host the Detroit Lions on *Monday Night Football*, and then face the Bears in Chicago in Week 10.

REGULAR-SEASON WEEK 7

WITH THE CALL

FOX Sports, now in its 24th season as an NFL network television partner, will broadcast the game.



- Play-by-play man Kenny Albert joins analyst Charles Davis and sideline reporter Pam Oliver.
- Milwaukee's WTMJ (620 AM), airing Green Bay games since November 1929, heads up the Packers Radio Network that is made up of 50 stations in five states. Wayne Larrivee (play-by-play) and two-time Packers Pro Bowler Larry McCarren (analyst) call the action. McCarren first joined the team's broadcasts in 1995 and enters his 23rd season calling Packers games. After originally being paired together in 1999, McCarren and Larrivee enter their 19th season of broadcasts together.
- Westwood One Sports will air the game across the country. Dan Miller (play-by-play) and Ross Tucker (analyst) will call the action and Scott Graham will host pregame and halftime shows.
- ▶ The broadcast is also available on Sirius Satellite Radio (WTMJ feed).
- DIRECTV subscribers can watch the game on Channel 709.

HOME SWEET HOME

Green Bay has a long tradition of playing well at Lambeau Field.

- ► Green Bay is 3-0 at home this season, marking the fifth time in the last seven seasons that the Packers have began the season 3-0 or better at home.
- ► Green Bay finished with a record of .500 or better at home in 10 of the first 11 seasons under Head Coach **Mike McCarthy**.

- ►Green Bay's victory in Week 4 vs. Chicago was the 220th at Lambeau Field, the most home wins by any franchise at one stadium in NFL history.
- ► The Packers are 10-2 (.833) in home openers under McCarthy, including 9-1 (.900) when QB Aaron Rodgers starts.
- Since the start of 2014, Green Bay ranks No. 1 in the NFL in winning percentage at home during the regular season:

- ► In 2014, Green Bay's plus-155 point differential at home was the highest in franchise history (dating back to 1940), eclipsing the plus-151 in 1996.
- Dating back to 2014, Green Bay ranks No. 1 in the NFL in first-quarter scoring margin (plus-173) at home (according to pro-football-reference. com). The Packers are plus-14 in first-quarter scoring margin at home this season, ranking No. 7 in the NFL.
- ►The Packers recorded 35 points in their last home game. Under McCarthy, Green Bay has scored 30-plus points at home during the regular season 40 times, winning 38 of those contests. The Packers' rank No. 3 in the league in home games with 30-plus points since 2006:

- ► WR Jordy Nelson has recorded at least one touchdown catch in 16 of the last 19 games he has played in at Lambeau Field, totaling 23 touchdown receptions over that span.
- Over his career, Nelson has registered at least one touchdown reception in 30 games at Lambeau Field. The Packers are 28-2 in those contests.
- Nelson has recorded five touchdown receptions in three home games this season, including two touchdowns in each of the past two home games.
- Dating back to the 2016 season, Nelson has 14 receiving touchdowns in 11 home games, ranking No. 1 in the NFL. WR Davante Adams is tied for No. 2 in the NFL over that span with eight receiving touchdowns at home.

FIRST CAREER START

On Sunday, QB **Brett Hundley** is expected to make his first career start for the Packers. Below are the top passing-yardage totals by a Packers QB in their first start with the team during the Super Bowl era:

► The last time a QB besides Aaron Rodgers started a regular-season game for Green Bay was QB Matt Flynn on Dec. 22, 2013 vs. Pittsburgh.

Rodgers is the last Packers QB to win his first career start for the team (24-19, vs. Minnesota, Sept. 8, 2008).

IN THE CONFERENCE

The Packers have established themselves as one of the best teams in the NFC.

- ► Green Bay has won eight of its last 10 regular-season games against NFC opponents.
- Under Head Coach Mike McCarthy, Green Bay tallied a winning record against NFC opponents in 10 of his first 11 seasons (2006-16):

► While LB Clay Matthews passed DE Kabeer Gbaja-Biamila for the franchise sack record earliest this season, his 56 career sacks against NFC teams trails Gbaja-Biamila (56.5) for the most by a Green Bay player since 1982.



Two years after he co-founded the Packers with Curly Lambeau, George Calhoun began writing a piece called The Dope Sheet, which served as the official press release from 1921-24.

AT THE HELM

Having led Green Bay to the playoffs in nine of his first 11 seasons as head coach, **Mike McCarthy** is joined by Vince Lombardi and Mike Holmgren as the only coaches to guide the Packers to a Super Bowl win with a victory over Pittsburgh in Super Bowl XLV.

- McCarthy guided the Packers to a franchise-record fourth consecutive division title in 2014. In his 11 seasons, he has won six division titles, tying Lombardi for the second most in franchise history.
- ►With a win at Tampa Bay in Week 16 of the 2014 season, McCarthy passed Lombardi for the No. 2 spot in team history as far as overall victories:

- ► The 128 overall wins are the most in the NFC and the second most in the NFL since 2006 (New England, 156).
- In Week 6, McCarthy recorded his 200th career game as a head coach (including the postseason), Having compiled 128 victories, he tied Bud Grant and Chuck Noll for the sixth-most wins by a head coach through 200 games: Don Shula, 149 / Joe Gibbs, 138 / George Halas, 134 / Tony Dungy, 130 / Curly Lambeau, 130.
- McCarthy reached 100 career wins (including playoffs) in just his 155th game. He was the fastest to reach 100 wins in the NFL since George Seifert in 1996 (132 games).
- McCarthy's 114 regular-season wins in his first 11 years as a head coach (2006-16) are tied for No. 3 in NFL history:

- McCarthy recorded his third regular season with 12-plus wins in 2014 (2007, 2011), passing Curly Lambeau (1929, 1931), Lombardi (1962, 1966), Holmgren (1996-97) and Mike Sherman (2001-02) for the most by a coach in franchise history.
- McCarthy has guided the Packers to five seasons with 11-plus wins (2007, 2009, 2011-12, 2014), passing Lombardi (1961-63, 1966) and Holmgren (1995-98) for the most by a coach in franchise history.
- McCarthy's eight regular seasons with 10-plus wins are a franchise record (since 1921). Among current NFL head coaches, only Bill Belichick (16) and Andy Reid (11) have more 10-plus win seasons.
- McCarthy is the only coach in franchise history to post three or more consecutive 10-win seasons twice in his career (2009-12, 2014-16).
- McCarthy joined Pittsburgh's Bill Cowher (2005) as the only Super Bowlwinning coaches to lead their respective teams to three road wins as the No. 6 seed in the postseason en route to a world title.
- Including playoffs, McCarthy has a 128-71-1 record since taking over as head coach in 2006, a .643 winning percentage that ranks No. 2 among current NFL head coaches (minimum 100 games):

McCarthy has coached in 200 games (including playoffs), No. 2 in team history behind Curly Lambeau (339 from 1921-49). In the Week 6 victory over the San Diego Chargers in 2015, McCarthy earned the 100th regular-season win of his career in just his 150th game, making him the seventh-fastest coach in NFL history and the fastest current NFL coach to reach the 100-win plateau:

WINNING WAYS

- The Packers are the only NFC team and one of two teams in the league (New England) to make the playoffs each of the past eight seasons (2009-16). Those eight appearances are more than the rest of the NFC North Division combined during that span (Minnesota-three / Detroitthree / Chicago-one).
- McCarthy became just the fourth head coach in NFL history to lead a single franchise to eight-plus consecutive playoff appearances:



- There are seven teams in the NFL with five-plus playoff appearances from 2009-16, with only two in the NFC (New England and Green Bay, eight / Cincinnati and Seattle, six / Baltimore, Denver, Indianapolis, five).
- With the victory over Dallas in the 2016 playoffs, McCarthy has led the Packers to 10 wins in the postseason, passing Vince Lombardi and Mike Holmgren for the most in team history:

The 10 postseason wins since 2007 are tied for No. 2 in the NFL with Baltimore and Seattle (New England, 13). The rest of the NFC North has combined for two postseason wins over the last 10 seasons (Minnesota and Chicago).

THE DOPE SHEET



- ► Ranks second in franchise history in total victories, trailing only Curly Lambeau.
- Guided the Packers to top-10 finishes in scoring in eight straight seasons (2007-14), joining the Patriots as the only other team to accomplish the feat over that time; Packers finished first overall in scoring in 2014.
- Reached the 100-win plateau faster than any active NFL head coach, needing just 155 games.
- Joined Vince Lombardi and Mike Holmgren as the only coaches to guide the Packers to a Super Bowl title with a win over Pittsburgh in Super Bowl XLV.

SEAN PAYTON...Is in his 11th year as the Saints' 14th head coach.

- ► Has led New Orleans to five playoff appearances, three NFC South titles, two NFC Championship games and a Super Bowl title in his time at the helm of the Saints.
- ► Is the longest-tenured head coach in the NFC South and only three head coaches across the NFL have been with their teams for a longer period of time, including McCarthy, who was hired one week before Payton in 2006.
- ►Has won six postseason games with the Saints since taking over a franchise that had won just once in the postseason in the nearly 40 years prior to his arrival.
- Before joining New Orleans he coached for the Dallas Cowboys from 2003-05, serving as the assistant head coach/quarterbacks the first two years and the assistant head coach/passing game coordinator in his last year.
- ▶ Began his coaching career in the NFL as the quarterbacks coach for the Philadelphia Eagles in 1997-98 and then coached for the New York Giants from 1999-2002, serving as the offensive coordinator his last three seasons.

THE PACKERS-SAINTS SERIES

- These clubs launched their series in 1968, when former Vince Lombardi assistants Phil Bengston (Packers) and Tom Fears (Saints) met in Milwaukee. The Packers, one year after winning Super Bowl II, defeated the second-year Saints, 29-7. Fears, a Packers assistant for five seasons, was New Orleans' first head coach.
- ► The Packers are 16-8 all-time against the Saints.
- From 1972-1985, Green Bay won nine of the teams' 10 matchups.
- Green Bay is 10-2 all-time at home against New Orleans.
- New Orleans is just 1-4 in games played at Lambeau Field.

NOTABLE CONNECTIONS

Packers head coach Mike McCarthy served as the Saints offensive coordinator from 2000-04...Packers G Jahri Evans spent the first 11 seasons of his career with the Saints, notching six Pro Bowl selections and four first-team All-Pro selections and ranks second among offensive linemen in Saints history with 169 games played...Other members of the Packers staff who coached in New Orleans include: defensive coordinator Dom Capers (1986-91), associate head coach/linebackers Winston Moss (2000-05) and special teams coordinator Ron Zook (2000-01)...Packers offensive line coach James Campen played two seasons in New Orleans (1987-88) after playing collegiately at Tulane...Packers QB Joe Callahan spent time on the Saints' active roster last season...Saints LB A.J. Klein is an Appleton, Wis., native and played at Kimberly High School...New Orleans T Ryan Ramczyk played at Wisconsin and is a native of Stevens Point, Wis. ... Saints QBs coach Joe Lombardi is Vince Lombardi's grandson...New Orleans S Chris Banjo spent his first four NFL seasons in Ğreen Bay (2013-16)...Saints QB Taysom Hill was a part of the Packers training camp and preseason roster in 2017...Packers safeties - secondary coach Darren Perry played for the Saints in 2000, the final year of his nine-year playing career...Packers vice president of football administration/player finance Russ Ball spent six seasons (2002-07) with the Saints, the final two as vice president of football administration and the first four as senior football administrator...Packers director of player personnel Brian Gutekunst assisted the offensive line of the Saint's during training camp in the summer of 1995...Packers S Kentrell Brice is a Ruston, La., native...Green Bay DT Ricky Jean Francois played collegiately at LSU.. Saints RB Mark Ingram's father, Mark Sr., played WR for the Packers in 1995...McCarthy was Saints LBs coach Mike Nolan's offensive coordinator in 2005 when Nolan was the 49ers head coach...Nolan coached Packers LB Ahmad Brooks in San Francisco in 2008...Brooks and Jean Francois were teammates of Saints WR Ted Ginn Jr. with the 49ers... RODGERS AND TOUCHDOWNS

QB **Aaron Rodgers** has found the end zone a lot in his career, and that continued this season.

- ► In Week 2, Rodgers became the 11th NFL player to throw 300 passing touchdowns, reaching the mark in his 144th career game to pass Peyton Manning and Dan Marino (157) for the fewest games needed to reach 300 passing TDs in NFL history.
- ► Rodgers reached 300 passing TDs on his 4,742nd pass attempt, surpassing Peyton Manning (5,306) for the fewest in league history.
- ►Rodgers also became the first quarterback to reach 300 passing TDs before throwing 100 interceptions. His 73 interceptions passed Tom Brady (115) for the fewest at the time of reaching 300 passing TDs.
- ► With a league-best 40 passing TDs during the 2016 regular season, Rodgers became just the fourth QB in NFL history to record two seasons (also 2011) with 40-plus TD passes (Marino, Manning, Drew Brees). It was his franchise-record fourth season (2011-12, 2014, 2016) with 35-plus TD passes (Brett Favre, three, 1995-97).
- In 2016, Rodgers became the first GB quarterback to lead the NFL in TD passes since Favre in 2003.
- ► Rodgers now has five seasons with 4,000-plus passing yards and 30-plus passing TDs (2009, 2011-12, 2014, 2016), further extending his team mark.

- ► In Week 9 of 2016, he joined CB AI Harris (vs. New Orleans, Oct. 9, 2005) as the only players to post two INTs in a first quarter for the Packers since 1993.
- ► He was named NFC Defensive Player of the Week for his Week 15 performance in 2016, becoming the first Packers DB to win the award since Woodson in 2010 (Week 4).

- Green Bay is one of four teams (Atlanta, Buffalo, Tennessee) that has only allowed one touchdown from outside the red zone this season.
- The Packers have registered 44 points off of takeaways this season, tied with the Los Angeles Rams for No. 3 in the NFL (Jacksonville, 77 / Detroit, 61).
- With 11 takeaways this season, Green Bay is tied with Philadelphia for No. 4 in the NFL (Jacksonville, 16 / Baltimore and Detroit, 14).
- The Packers lead the NFL in opponent fumbles recovered this season (seven).
- P Justin Vogel is No. 5 in the NFL in net punting average (44.2) this season.

CONTINUAL IMPACT

In his career, DT **Mike Daniels** has seen his playing time steadily increase as well as his production, earning him a role as a standout on the defense.

- Daniels is third on the Packers with 21.5 sacks since the start of the 2013 season. He is No. 11 among NFL defensive tackles over that span, according to STATS LLC.
- ► He has started all but two regular-season and postseason games for Green Bay and has played the most defensive snaps among Packers defensive linemen since the start of the 2014 season.
- In 2015, Daniels led the Packers' defensive line in tackles (66) and sacks (four). He finished third on the team with 12 QB hits.
- ►In Week 5 versus St. Louis (2015), he tied for the team lead with a career-best nine tackles (eight solo).
- ► Daniels registered his first career interception in Week 16 at Arizona (2015), returning it 23 yards. According to STATS LLC, it was the first interception by a Packers DT since Cullen Jenkins on Oct. 18, 2009. Dating back to 1960, his 23-yard interception return was the longest by a Green Bay DT on an interception.
- He led Green Bay's defensive line with 5.5 sacks and was the team leader in quarterback hits (19) and pressures (22) during the 2014 regular season.

- Dating back to 2013, Crosby has made 116 field goals during the regular season, No. 7 in the NFL over that span.
- Crosby recorded 122 points during the 2016 season, giving him the 10th 100-point season of his career and extending his franchise record. Crosby's 10 seasons with 100-plus points are the most in the NFL since 2007. The only other kickers to have 10 or more consecutive seasons of 100-plus points are Jason Elam (16, 1993-2008) and Adam Vinatieri (13, 1996-2008).

- ►Since 2006, McCarthy's first season as the head coach in Green Bay, only nine of 32 NFL teams have regular-season road records above .500.

Another packed house at Lambeau Field against the Chicago Bears in Week 4 brought the stadium's consecutive-sellouts streak to 329 regular-season games (not including replacement games).

- ► The league's longest-tenured stadium, Lambeau Field is hosting its 61st season of football in 2017. For the victory over Dallas in the Divisional round of the 2014 playoffs, Packers fans set a new Lambeau Field paid-attendance record (79,704).
- Across American professional sports, only Boston's Fenway Park (1912) and Chicago's Wrigley Field (1914) have longer tenures.

THE LAMBEAU ADVANTAGE

The crown jewel of the National Football League, Lambeau Field has long been known as one of the tougher venues to play in, particularly during the harsh Wisconsin winter.

- ► Re-establishing home-field advantage after a 4-4 mark in 2008 was one of the goals of 2009, and with the Packers finishing 6-2 at home, they accomplished that goal. Green Bay followed that up with a 7-1 mark at Lambeau Field in 2010, a perfect 8-0 record in 2011, the first undefeated home mark since 2002, and a 7-1 mark in 2012. The Packers were one of two teams to finish undefeated at home during the 2014 regular season (Denver).
- Head Coach Mike McCarthy stated consistently upon his arrival in Green Bay that one of the team's goals would be to reclaim the mystique of playing at Lambeau Field. Mission accomplished. The team is 68-22-1 (.753) at home in the regular season since 2006, No. 2 in the NFL.
- Since Ron Wolf and Mike Holmgren began the revitalization of the franchise in 1992, Green Bay owns the best home record in the NFL. A look at the top regular-season home W-L records since the '92 season:



BREAKING DOWN THE ROSTER

The Packers currently have an 53-man roster that is composed of 26 offensive players, 24 defensive players and three specialists.

- ► Of the 53 players on Green Bay's roster, 33 of them (62.3 percent) were draft picks of the Packers. Dating back to 2007, Green Bay has at least one member of each draft class still on the roster.
- ► Green Bay has 13 players on the roster that began their careers as undrafted free agents, with 11 of those originally signed by Green Bay.
- ► Over a third (35.8 percent) of the players (19 of 53) on Green Bay's roster entered the league as a sixth-round or seventh-round pick or as an undrafted player.
- ► The Packers have five players on the roster that played in the NFL prior to the 2009 season. Four of those five players were draft picks of the Packers (QB Aaron Rodgers, K Mason Crosby, WR Jordy Nelson and LB Clay Matthews) and three have made at least one Pro Bowl.
- ► Of the 53 players on the roster, 44 began their pro careers with the Packers (83.0 percent).
- Only 20 of the 53 players on the roster (37.7 percent) were selected in the first three rounds of the draft, with 17 being drafted by the Packers.

- Became the fourth player in franchise history to reach 500 receptions.
- Has 69 career receiving TDs, No. 2 in Packers history behind Don Hutson (99)
- Became the first player in franchise history to record 13-plus receiving touchowns in three different seasons (2011, 2014, 2016). His three seasons of 13-plus TD receptions tie Pro Football Hall of Famers Lance Alworth, Cris Carter and Marvin Harrison for the fourth most in NFL history
- Missed all of the 2015 season due to a knee injury.
- Finished the 2014 regular season ranked fourth in the NFL in receiving yards (1,519), seventh in receptions (98) and tied for second in receiving touchdowns (13). Earned first selection to the Pro Bowl.
- Led the team in 2013 with 85 catches for 1,314 yards and eight TDs. Ranked No. 10 in the NFL that season in receiving yards.
- With 15 TD catches in 2011, became only the third player in franchise history to catch 15 or more TDs in a season, joining WRs Sterling Sharpe (18 in 1994) and Don Hutson (17 in 1942).

LT David Bakhtiari, 5th Year, Colorado, D4a-13 ▶ Named to first career Pro Bowl in 2016.

- Has started all but six games at LT since the start of the 2013 regular season. Missed Weeks 2-5 this season and the final two games of the 2015 regular season due to injury.
- Started all 16 games at left tackle in 2013, the only rookie in the NFL to do so in 2013 and the first Packer rookie to do so since the league went to a 16-game schedule in 1978.
- Became just the fourth Green Bay rookie to start at LT in the season opener since the 1970 AFL-NFL merger and the first since 1985.

LG Lane Taylor, 5th Year, Oklahoma State, FA-13

- Has played in 52 regular-season games for Green Bay with all but two of his 23 starts (LT in Week 4-5 this season) taking place at LG.
- ► Made the first starts of his career in 2015, opening at RG at Detroit in Week 13 in place of an injured T.J. Lang and at LG in Week 17 vs. Minnesota with Josh Sitton sliding to LT in place of an injured David Bakhtiari.
- A four-year letterman at OSU, starting 47 of 50 games played at right guard. Unanimous first-team All-Big 12 selection by the conference's coaches as a senior.

- C Corey Linsley, 4th Year, Ohio State, D5a-14 Has started every game at C since Week 9 of 2016. Was on reserve/ physically unable to perform for the entire preseason and the first seven regular-season games last season.
- Started 29 games and four postseason contests in his first two seasons.

- Named to his first career Pro Bowl in 2016. His career-best five interceptions tied for No. 5 in the NFL last season and tied for No. 1 among safeties. It was the most interceptions by a Packers safety in a single season since Charles Woodson (seven) and Charlie Peprah (five) in 2011.
- ▶In 2016, posted a career-high two interceptions in both Week 9 and Week 14, becoming the first Packer to have two two-INT games in a season since Woodson in 2011.
- Led the team in tackles in 2015 with 117 (97 solo) and was tied for fourth on the team in interceptions (two).
- According to STATS, his three sacks during the 2015 regular season tied for the fifth most in a single regular season by a Packers safety (since 1982) and the most since Mark Roman recorded 3.5 in 2004.

- ► Following games, Head Coach Mike McCarthy will be the only coach available to the media.
- However, position coaches are available for questions on specific players and the position group only. Broader interview topics need to be directed to the respective coordinators.
- ► No assistant coach should be contacted directly by telephone (at his desk, home or on his cell phone), or by email. All interviews must be arranged through the P.R. department.
- Sarah Quick (920-569-7213) serves as the primary contact for assistant coaches. In her absence, feel free to contact another member of the P.R. staff.

PRACTICE ACCESS, PHOTOGRAPHY AND SOCIAL-MEDIA GUIDELINES

During the regular season, practices will be open to state media who regularly cover the team for designated periods during the first half of each session, similar to previous seasons. Also as in prior years, photo opportunities will be limited to the beginning portions of practice.

- ► The team reserves the right to limit photography to certain periods for competitive reasons. This restriction applies to both training-camp and regular-season practices.
- During practice periods in which B-roll and still photography are NOT permitted, the media may not utilize camera phones either. The P.R. staff will alert the media of the permissible "shooting" periods before and during each practice.
- ► Video of practice, press conferences or locker-room interviews by an individual or media outlet may not be posted at any time on social-media sites or live-broadcasting applications (this includes applications such as Facebook, Twitter, Vine, Instagram, Snapchat, Ustream, Periscope and Meerkat, etc).
- No still photography is permitted in the locker room at any time. Signs, notes and other personal items or information posted in and around the locker room at player lockers are not to be photographed or captured on video.

ONLINE-CONTENT POLICY

- According to the 2017 NFL non-game online content policy, accredited organizations may distribute online non-game audio and video content, including interviews, press conferences and team practices at NFL venues, acquired as a result of credentialed access ("Game Information") to games or club/league facilities provided that such distribution: is 90 seconds maximum per day (180 seconds in two-team markets 90 seconds per team); may not be "archived" (i.e., made available for on-demand public access) for more than 24 hours; appears in an editorial context only (no sponsorship, merchandising or advertising integrated with or around the content); is not posted live; and is accompanied by links back to NFL.com and to the club website.
- The 90-second limit does not include video/audio material that is composed entirely of a credentialed media employee providing commentary or analysis ("talking head" reporting), including pregame or postgame stand-up material shot on the field or other facility location.
- While a game is in progress, any forms of accounts of the game must be sufficiently time-delayed and limited in amount (e.g., score updates with detail given only in quarterly game updates, fewer than 10 photographs during the game) so that the accredited organization's game coverage cannot be used as a substitute for, or otherwise approximate, authorized play-by-play accounts.
- ►The Packers have their own social-media and online-content policies for practice reporting, which will be communicated by the P.R. staff for both training camp and the regular season. Members of the media are encouraged to contact the public relations staff with any questions.

Photo credentials will not be issued to freelance photographers unless on a specific assignment from an accredited organization. Credentials are not provided to "grips" due to on-field space limitations.

Credentials not obtained prior to gameday will be left at Media Will Call on the south side of the stadium near the Shopko Gate. Media Will Call opens three hours prior to kickoff.

GREEN BAY, Wis. - The Green Bay Packers keep finding ways to win despite more key injuries. The Chicago Bears never recovered from a

miserable start by quarterback Mike Genon. Aaron Rodgers threw four touchdown passes, and the injury-riddled Packers converted three turnovers into scores in an eventful 35-14 victory over the Chicago Bears on Thursday night. Rodgers connected with Davante Adams and Randall Cobb on short touchdown passes to help build a 21-0 lead in the second quarter of a game delayed 45 minutes by lightning between the first two quarters. The Packers overpowered the Bears down the stretch to slog out a win as intermittent rain fell at Lambeau Field.

The Packers (3-1) lost two more key players to injuries. Adams left the field on a stretcher after getting hit in the head during a tackle by Danny Trevathan in the third quarter. Running back Ty Montgomery was knocked out in the first quarter with a chest injury. But the Packers capitalized on an awful start by Glennon, who accounted for four turnovers. He fumbled on his first snap on a strip sack by Clay Matthews. Rodgets hit coob for a 2-yard touchdown pass three plays later for a 7-0 lead. Glennon fumbled on his next series, too, but the Packers couldn't score on that drive. It was only a matter of time because the mistakes kept

mounting.

Glennon threw his second interception with 2:54 left in the third quarter. Six plays later, receiver Jordy Nelson caught his second touchdown pass,

an B-yarder from Rodgers, to make it a 28-point lead. Rodgers was 18 of 26 for 179 yards. He picked apart the Bears (1-3) on short, quick passes, a game plan in part necessitated by a patchwork offen-sive line. The Packers played without starting tackets David Bakhtair i and Bryan Bulaga, and their three backup tackles are already on injured reserve. The injury to Adams cast a pall late in the third quarter. The game was delayed for about five minutes while medical personnel tended to the receiver, who gave a thumbs-up signal as he was wheeled off the field. The Packers said Adams was conscious and taken to a hospital for evaluation for possible head and neck injuries, and that he had feeling in all of his actremities. Both the Packers are 05-94-6 against the Bears, their first lead in the series since 1933. It's the oldest rivally in fotoball, dating to 1923. Matthews' sack on Glemon in the first quarter was the 75th of his career, breaking the franchise record (since 1982) held by Kabeer Gbaja-Biamia. Packers round draft pick, had a team-high 49 yards on 13 carries and a 2-yard touchdown unin the sector unin the sector was the only active running back left on the roster with Montgomery and backup Jamaal Williams (knee) both knocked out of the game.

DALLAS (AP) — Aaron Rodgers had more magic in store for the Dallas Cowboys, who can't seem to find the mojo that carried them a year

Rodgers threw a 12-yard touchdown pass to Davante Adams with 11 seconds remaining. Rodgers capped a 75-yard drive in just 1:02, lifting the Packers over Dalas 35-31 on Sunday in another thriller nine months after their divisional playoff win on the same field. Adams had been in the concussion protocol but was active 10 days after leaving the field on a stretcher on a helmet-to-helmet hit that resulted in a suspension for Chicago linebacker Dany Treathan. He had seven catches for 60 yards and two touchdowns. Dak Prescott, who had touchdown passes on Dalas' first three drives, put the Cowboys in front on an 11-yard touchdown run with 1:13 remaining to cap a 17-play drive that lasted almost nine minutes. ago.

But another defensive letdown, just like a year ago in the postseason, left Dallas (2-3) already with the same number of losses from the magical rookie season when Prescott and running back Ezekiel Elliott led the Cowboys to the No. 1 seed in the NFC. The Packers (4-1) had gone alread earlier on Damarius Randall's 21-yard interception return for a touchdown, the third of five lead changes in

the fourth quarter. Green Bay rallied from 15 points down in the first half after letting a 21-3 lead get away in last season's playoff win. Aaron Jones became the first Green Bay running back with 100 yards in his first start as a rookie since Samkon Gado in 2005. He had 19 carries for 125 yards and a touchdown. He replaced TV Montgomery, out after an injury to his ribs in the win over the Bears. Elilott ended a three-game drought without 100 yards, matching the longest from his rookie season, finishing with 116 yards on 29 carries. Rodgers was 19 of 29 for 221 yards and three touchdowns, and set up the winning score with an 18-yard scramble. After an incompletion to

build a 21-6 lead. Adams working against rookie Jourdan Lewis, Rodgers went there again. Adams made the grab as Lewis turned too late. Prescott looked the part of Rodgers, scrambling to set up big completions and running 21 yards himself on one play to help the Cowboys

He was 25 of 36 for 251 yards and three first-half touchdowns, two to Cole Beasley and one to Dez Bryant, who joined Hall of Farner Bob Hayes as the only Dallas receivers with at least 70 TD grabs. DE David Iving returned from a four-game suspension for Dallas with two sacks. He had a sack and three forced fumbles with a recovery in last year's 30-16 win in Green Bay during the regular season.

Harrison Smith led Minnesota's defense in a win over the Packers after Rodgers left the field on a cart, taking a big piece of Green Bay's title aspirations with him and paving the way for a 23-10 victory by the Vikings on Sunday at U.S. Bank Stadium that transformed the trajectory of the NFC North race.

The Packers said Rodgers could be done for the season after he fell on his throwing shoulder after being taken down by Anthony Barr during an incompletion on the second drive for the Packers. Backup Bert Hundley, who completed 18 of 33 passes for 157 Yards and his first career fouchdown to Davante Adams, threw three interceptions. Barr, who later left with a concussion, was not penalized for the hit on Rodgers. Smith had 115 sacks on safety biltzes, a diving interception and two pass breakups, helping the Vikings (4-2) limit the injury-depleted Packers to a season-low 227 yards. The Packers had five first downs and 102 yards over the first three quarters.
