THE MATCHUP

In their second consecutive clash against an NFC North opponent, the New Orleans Saints (3-2) will face the Green Bay Packers (4-2) on Sunday, Oct. 22 at Lambeau Field.

While the Saints have an 8-16 all-time record against the Packers, New Orleans has won three of the five meetings against Green Bay since **Sean Payton** became head coach in 2006. Eight of the games in the series have been decided by a touchdown or less. Since Payton's arrival, the Saints are 15-9 against NFC North opponents.

New Orleans enters the contest 3-2 after defeating the Lions, 52-38, at the Mercedes-Benz Superdome on Sunday, recording a franchise-record three defensive touchdowns. Tied for second place in the NFC South with one win in hand against first place Carolina (4-2), they will be looking to improve on their 2-1 mark against NFC opponents.

Through five regular season games, the Saints are tied for fourth in the league in turnover differential (+6). New Orleans has nine takeaways, seven of which are interceptions. Defensively, they are currently ranked 11th in the NFL in opponent rushing yards per game. Following a standout effort on Sunday vs. Detroit, where he led the team with two sacks and caught an interception in the end zone for a touchdown DE **Cameron Jordan** is tied for ninth in the NFL in takedowns and moved up two spots on the

all-time team rankings to sixth place (51.5). LB **A.J. Klein** leads the team with 26 tackles (15 solo), while S **Kenny Vaccaro** leads with two interceptions.

Offensively, RB **Mark Ingram II** leads the club in rushing yards (284) and total yards from scrimmage (445), following an afternoon on Sunday when he led New Orleans in both rushing yards (114) and receptions (five). QB **Drew Brees** has completed 126 passes for 1,321 yards with ten touchdowns and two interceptions. WR **Michael Thomas** leads all New Orleans pass catchers with 28 grabs for 321 yards (11.5 avg.) with two TDs. Rookie RB **Alvin Kamara** is second on that list with 24 catches for 159 yards with one touchdown.

After losing their first two contests, New Orleans has rallied in strong fashion and rattled off three consecutive wins. In addition to playing back-to-back NFC North opponents, the Saints will be facing a team tied for the division lead with Minnesota. Green Bay will be looking to rebound from a 23-10 loss at the Vikings on Sunday, where they also lost QB **Aaron Rodgers** to a collarbone injury. Third-year QB **Brett Hundley** will be making his first career start on Sunday at Lambeau Field against a resurgent Saints defense.

This Week In The NFC South: The Atlanta Falcons will face the New England Patriots at Gillette Stadium on Sunday night, the Carolina Panthers will play at the Chicago Bears and Tampa Bay plays at Buffalo.

THE COACHES

New Orleans Saints Head Coach **Sean Payton** has posted a 97-68 regular season record and a 6-4 postseason mark, guiding the team to the postseason five times, to the NFC Championship game twice and to the Super Bowl XLIV Championship in the 2009 campaign. He's the club's lone head coach to open a season with 13 straight victories and post a 13-game winning streak and has the franchise's top winning percentage (.588). Payton's 52-30 (.634) home record and 45-38 (.542) mark away from the Mercedes-Benz Superdome are the club's top all-time winning percentages in both categories (regular season). He holds the records for most wins by a head coach in team history with 103 total, ranked 43rd all-time in National Football League history. In his first season with the club in 2006, he took over a Saints team that had previously posted a 3-13 record in 2005 to the NFC Championship game and was named NFL Coach of the Year by the *Associated Press* and most other major media outlets. The Saints are the only team to finish in the top 10 in net yards per game each season since 2006, including finishing first in 2016, when they averaged 426.0 yards per game. Payton was hired as New Orleans' 14th head coach on January 18, 2006, after serving on the Dallas Cowboys coaching staff from 2003-05 under Pro Football Hall of Fame Head Coach Bill Parcells. Prior to joining the Cowboys in 2003, Payton served on the New York Giants coaching staff from 1999-2002, including the final three seasons as offensive coordinator. His tenure was highlighted by a Super Bowl berth in his first full season calling plays for New York. Payton's prior NFL coaching experience came as quarterbacks coach for the Philadelphia Eagles from 1997-98. He played quarterback at Eastern Illinois University, where he passed for 10,665 yards, then the third-highest total in NCAA Division I-AA history. The three-time *Associated Press* All-American selection had professional stints with the Chicago Bruisers of the Arena Football League, Ottawa of the Canadian Football League and the Chicago Bears in 1987. Starting his college coaching career at San Diego State, Payton wrapped two stints as an assistant with the Aztecs (1988-89 and 1992-93) around a stop at Indiana State (1990-91). He moved to Miami (Ohio), where he coached quarterbacks from 1994-95 before doing the same at the University of Illinois in 1996.

Mike McCarthy was named the 14th head coach in Packers history on Jan. 12, 2006. He joined Vince Lombardi and Mike Holmgren as the only coaches to guide the Packers to a Super Bowl title with a Super Bowl XLV win. McCarthy joined Pittsburgh's Bill Cowher (2005) as the only Super Bowl-winning coaches to lead their respective teams to three road wins as the number six seed in the postseason en route to a world title. He's led the Packers to playoff appearances in nine of his 11 seasons, and the team's eight consecutive berths and nine over the past 10 are the most by any NFC team. The Pittsburgh native has guided the Packers to 128 wins since 2006, ranked second in the NFL over that span.

LAST MEETING

New Orleans Saints 44, Green Bay Packers 23; October 26, 2014 @ Mercedes-Benz Superdome – The New

Orleans Saints snapped the Packers' four-game winning streak with a 44-23 victory in a prime time, nationally televised Sunday night contest at the Mercedes-Benz Superdome.

The Packers took the ball on the opening series of the game and marched 80 yards in five plays, ending with a 70-yard TD pass from quarterback **Aaron Rodgers** to wide receiver **Randall Cobb** on third-and-10. New Orleans bounced back with a seven-play, 80-yard drive that saw them make it to the Green Bay four-yard line where wide receiver **Brandin Cooks** ran it in. Quarterback **Drew Brees** completed both of his passing attempts, totaling 50 yards, en route to the score. The Packers took a three-point lead with 6:13 remaining in the third quarter on a 31-yard field goal by kicker **Mason Crosby**. The Saints tied the score at the end of the first quarter when kicker **Shayne Graham** booted a 31-yard field goal.

The Packers took a 13-10 lead at the start of the second quarter on a Crosby 49-yard field goal, when they put together a nine-play, 49-yard drive, keyed by a 27-yard completion from Rodgers to Cobb. The Saints responded with a 15-play, 69-yard drive that ended with a 29-yard field goal by Graham. The key play came on a 14-yard completion from Brees to Cooks, which put the Saints in field goal range. The Packers regained their lead with 1:56 left in the second quarter on a 27-yard field goal by Crosby, capping a nine-play, 71-yard drive, where Rodgers completed five-of-six passes, totaling 70 yards. Seven plays later, the Saints tied the game again as time expired in the half on a 37-yard field goal by Graham.

New Orleans got the ball first in the third quarter and after they failed to convert on downs, the defense came up big when inside linebacker **David Hawthorne** intercepted Rodgers and four plays later, Brees completed a 50-yard touchdown to Cooks to give the Saints their first lead at 23-16. On the next drive, Hawthorne and defensive end **Tyrann Walker** stuffed Green Bay running back **Eddie Lacy** on a fourth-and-one rush. The Saints got the ball back and traveled 40 yards in four plays, ending with a 22-yard touchdown pass from Brees to tight end **Jimmy Graham**. The Saints were not done from a defensive standpoint as on the first play of the fourth quarter, defensive end **Cameron Jordan** sacked Rodgers and then cornerback **Corey White** picked him off to set up a touchdown that gave New Orleans a 21-point lead.

For the fourth game in a row, the Saints surpassed the 400-yard mark in total yardage as they compiled 495 yards. Brees completed 27 of 32 passes for 311 yards with three touchdowns and no interceptions. Running back **Mark Ingram** carried 24 times for a career-high 172 yards with one touchdown. Cooks caught six passes for 94 yards with one touchdown, in addition to the four-yard touchdown run. Jordan posted two quarterback takedowns, the fifth time in his career he produced two or more sacks in a game with the Saints putting up a 5-0 record in those contests.

SERIES HISTORY

New Orleans bested Green Bay in the last meeting, 44-23 at the Mercedes-Benz Superdome on October 26, but the Packers lead the all-time series, 16-8. With the first seven road contests having been played in Milwaukee, the Saints have posted a 1-4 record in contests played at Lambeau Field and will be trying to break a two-game skid in contests played in Green Bay.

GAME SUMMARIES

WEEK 1: Minnesota Vikings 29, Saints 19; September 11, 2017 @ US Bank Stadium – Minnesota Vikings quarterback Sam Bradford set the National Football League record for completion percentage for Minnesota last season, his accuracy aided by the volume of short passes under heavy pressure. With protection from the rush, he showed he can throw the ball down the field with the best of them. Bradford started his second year with Minnesota in style, passing for 346 yards and three touchdowns to help the Vikings beat New Orleans 29-19 and spoil running back Adrian Peterson's first game with the New Orleans Saints.

"When I've got time to sit back there and kind of evaluate things, I've got all the confidence in the world that our guys outside are going to win," Bradford said.

Minnesota wide receiver Stefon Diggs had seven receptions for 93 yards, two for scores and all in the first half, and wideout Adam Thielen racked up 157 yards on nine catches as Bradford had success against a Saints defense that opened the season with the youngest starting lineup in the NFL since 1991.

Rookie running back Dalvin Cook rushed for 127 yards on 22 carries in the formal takeover from Peterson. Peterson was limited to 18 yards on six carries, in a time share with running backs Mark Ingram and Alvin Kamara with the Saints forced to throw the ball more once they started to fall behind. Quarterback Drew Brees was quiet, too, with 291 yards on 27-for-37 passing

"We didn't do anything different or try to out-trick them," Vikings linebacker Anthony Barr said. "You know, line up and play, do your job."

Saints Tight end Coby Fleener caught their only touchdown toss, after the two-minute warning. Kicker Wil Lutz made four field goals, three under 25 yards.

"The bottom line," Brees said, "is you've got to score touchdowns."

WEEK 2: New England Patriots 36, Saints 20; September 17, 2017 @ Mercedes-Benz Superdome – If Tom Brady and the Patriots were suffering from a Super Bowl hangover, it looks as though a trip to New Orleans pulled the defending champions out of it.

The 40-year-old Brady hasn't often looked better in his long, illustrious career. Bouncing back with a vengeance from a season-opening loss, Brady threw three touchdown passes in the first quarter for the first time in his career, eclipsed 300 yards passing in the first half for only the second time, and New England scored 30 first-half points en route to a 36-20 victory over the Saints, who dropped their first two games of the season.

Brady's maiden Super Bowl triumph in the Superdome back in February 2002 is bound to be one of his fondest memories, but the 18-year veteran looked like a superior quarterback in his latest visit. He finished 30 of 39 for 447 yards without an interception -- at least not one that counted. Saints defenders caught Brady's passes twice, but both plays were wiped out by New Orleans penalties. Brady joined Warren Moon as the only QBs age 40 or older in NFL history to pass for at least 400 yards and 3 touchdowns in a game, according to the Elias Sports Bureau.

Patriots tight end Rob Gronkowski had a 53-yard catch

and run to highlight his six-catch, 116-yard performance, but left the game in the second half with a groin injury and did not return.

In Brady and the Saints' Drew Brees, the game featured the National Football League's top two active quarterbacks in terms of career yards and touchdowns. Their 922 touchdown passes and 128,251 yards passing combined coming in represented the most by starting signal-callers in the same NFL game.

But in this matchup, Brees couldn't keep up. He was 27 of 45 for 356 yards and two touchdowns. The Saints' desperation to stay close was encapsulated by a failed attempt to convert a fourth down -- despite being well within field goal range on the Patriots 25-yard line -- with 2:27 left in the first half and New England up by 13 points. Brady responded by marching New England to the Saints ten-yard line to set up Stephen Gostkowski's field goal, making it 30-13 at halftime

The Patriots' first three drives ended with a 19-yard touchdown pass to running back Rex Burkhead, Gronkowski's long touchdown and a 13-yard scoring pass to wide receiver Chris Hogan. New Orleans briefly rallied with Brees' 5-yard touchdown pass to wide receiver Brandon Coleman and kicker Wil Lutz's field goal on consecutive drives, pulling as close as 20-13. But New England responded with running back Mike Gillislee's short scoring run on a drive highlighted by downfield passes from Brady to the skilled Patriots trio of Gronkowski, Hogan and former Saints wideout Brandin Cooks.

WEEK 3: Saints 34, Panthers 13; September 24, 2017 @ Bank of America Stadium– Quarterback Drew Brees shredded the league's top-ranked defense, throwing for 220 yards and three touchdowns as the New Orleans Saints defeated the previously unbeaten Carolina Panthers 34-13 as New Orleans would then embark on a trip to London to prepare for a contest against the Miami Dolphins to be played at Wembley Stadium the following Sunday. Brees led six scoring drives and threw touchdown passes to wide receivers Michael Thomas, Brandon Coleman and ex-Panthers wideout Ted Ginn Jr. as the Saints avoided an 0-3 start. Rookie running back Alvin Kamara put the game away with a 25-yard touchdown run with 4:42 left, the first score of his short career. Carolina had only allowed six points in its previous two games.

The Saints' defense, which came in ranked 32nd in the league, intercepted Panthers quarterback Cam Newton three times and sacked him four times before he was replaced late in the fourth quarter.

The Panthers, who were already without injured Pro Bowl tight end Greg Olsen, lost wide receiver Kelvin Benjamin in the first quarter to a knee injury; his leg got bent back awkwardly after being dragged down from behind. Carolina's only real offense came from rookie running back Christian McCaffrey, who had 101 yards receiving on nine catches. The Saints led 17-6 when Ginn beat cornerback James Bradberry down the middle of the field for a 40-yard touchdown reception to break it open. It was the same type of big play Ginn provided for the Panthers in previous seasons. Brees was sharp all day, completing 22 of 29 passes.

GAME SUMMARIES

WEEK 4: Saints 20, Dolphins 0; October 1, 2017 @

Wembley Stadium— It took quarterback Drew Brees and the New Orleans Saints six days and a first half before they finally found their footing in soggy Britain.

Brees threw for 268 yards and two touchdowns and the Saints scored all but three of their points in the second half as they defeated the Miami Dolphins 20-0 on a rainy Sunday afternoon at Wembley Stadium.

Wide receiver Michael Thomas had a touchdown reception in the third quarter, running back Alvin Kamara added one in the fourth and kicker Wil Lutz made two of his three field-goal attempts for New Orleans (2-2), which arrived for the game on Monday and won the lowest-scoring game ever held in London.

"The defense got a shutout," Brees said. "Offensively, we sustained drives, we did all the things you need to do for winning football."

It was expected to be a big homecoming for the Dolphins' Jay Ajayi, who was born in the city, but the running back finished with 46 yards on 12 carries.

Lutz missed his first try, a 41-yarder, wide right on the second play of the second quarter, and the teams threatened to have the first scoreless opening half since Week 14 of the 2011 season until Lutz connected from 43 yards with no time remaining.

Brees found Thomas, who had eight catches for 89 yards, on a 4-yarder to push the score to 10-0 in the third quarter, and Kamara took a shovel pass from Brees 12 yards into the end zone with 3:57 remaining to wrap up the victory. Kamara finished with 96 total yards, including 71 receiving, and fellow running back Mark Ingram ran for 45 yards. Quarterback Jay Cutler completed 20 of 28 passes for Miami (1-2), which finished with 185 yards, its fewest since its last shutout, a 19-0 loss at Buffalo on December 22, 2013.

New Orleans last shut out an opponent on Dec. 16, 2012, a 41-0 win against Tampa Bay.

"Obviously those first two weeks weren't what we aspired to be, we played two real good teams, the Vikings and Patriots," Brees said. "Basically now, two road wins ... I felt we had a great plan coming out here, obviously it's a tough trip coming across the pond."

WEEK 6: Saints 52, Lions 38; October 15, 2017 @ Mercedes Benz Superdome

— Running backs Mark Ingram and Alvin Kamara combined for 237 yards from scrimmage, the Saints' resurgent defense forced five turnovers and scored a franchise-record three times, and New Orleans took a 52-38 victory over the Detroit Lions in a game full of crazy bounces and unusual plays.

New Orleans (3-2), which has a winning record for the first time since its last playoff season in 2013, built a five-touchdown lead, only to wind up gutting out a remarkable comeback bid by Detroit.

Detroit (3-3) scored four straight touchdowns, including one on a punt return by rookie cornerback/return specialist Jamal Agnew and another on defensive tackle A'Shawn Robinson's close-range interception near the Saints goal line, in less than 15 minutes off the game clock to pull as close as 45-38 with 6:41 to go. But after Agnew muffed a punt and barely got it out of the end zone, Saints defensive end Cam Jordan scored on virtually the same type of play

as Robinson when he got his hand on Matt Stafford's pass from the end zone.

The Saints' defense produced its first points on Detroit's first possession, when Alex Okafor sacked and stripped Stafford in the end zone and safety Kenny Vaccaro recovered. In the third quarter, rookie cornerback Marshon Lattimore, New Orleans' top draft choice last spring, made his first interception and returned it 27 yards for a TD. Stafford was sacked five times and turned the ball over five times -- twice on fumbles and three times on interceptions, two of which were tipped. New Orleans also batted down 13 of Stafford's throws.

Saints quarterback Drew Brees completed 21 for 31 passes for 186 yards and touchdowns of 20 yards to wide receiver Ted Ginn Jr. and two yards to tight end Michael Hoomanawanui. However, he was also intercepted for the first and second time this season. The first interception -- also the Saints' first turnover this season -- came when cornerback Darius Slay wrestled the ball away from Michael Thomas before the receiver could secure it. Stafford completed 25 of 52 passes for 312 yards and three touchdowns.

Ingram scored two TDs on short runs and rushed for 114 yards on 25 carries in the first game since the Saints traded Adrian Peterson to Arizona. He also fumbled after a short reception.

Special Teams Coordinator **Bradford Banta** - A fourth round (106th overall) draft pick of the Indianapolis Colts in 1994 out of the University of Southern California and played in 156 career regular season games and five more postseason contests primarily as a long snapper with Indianapolis, the New York Jets, the Detroit Lions and Buffalo Bills.

Assistant Head Coach/Tight Ends **Dan Campbell** - A third round draft pick of the New York Giants in 1999 out of Texas A&M, who went on to appear in 114 total games with 75 starts for New York, Dallas and Detroit, where he caught 91 passes for 934 yards and 11 touchdowns, also appearing in five postseason contests with two starts.

Assistant Wide Receivers Coach **Ronald Curry** - Curry was a seventh round draft pick of the Oakland Raiders in 2002 out of North Carolina and played for the Silver and Black for seven seasons, appearing in 76 games with 32 starts and registering 193 receptions for 2,347 yards with 13 touchdowns.

Secondary Coach **Aaron Glenn** - Glenn was the 12th overall pick of the New York Jets in 1994 out of Texas A&M and started 176 of 205 career games during his tenure with New York, the Houston Texans, the Dallas Cowboys, the Jacksonville Jaguars and New Orleans and was a three-time Pro Bowl selection. Glenn recorded 41 career interceptions with six brought back for touchdowns, adding one more score on a kickoff return.

Defensive Assistant **Leigh Torrence**—Torrence enjoyed a seven-year career with Atlanta, Washington and New Orleans for his final four seasons, where he played in 73 career games.

Pass Rush Specialist **Brian Young** - Young played in the National Football League from 2000-08 with the St. Louis Rams for his first four seasons, who originally selected him in the fifth round of the 2000 NFL Draft (139th overall) out of Texas El-Paso and for his final five seasons with the Saints, appearing in 124 career games and recording 22.5 sacks, one interception seven forced fumbles eight fumble recoveries, adding two more takedowns and one more recovery in six postseason contests.

Offensive Coordinator Pete Carmichael - Father, Pete, served as an assistant coach in the NFL from 1994-2003 with the Jacksonville Jaguars and the Chicago Bears.

Quarterbacks Coach Joe Lombardi - The son of legendary NFL head coach Vince Lombardi, who led both the Green Bay Packers and Washington Redskins and also had a long distinguished career as an assistant.

Secondary Coach Aaron Glenn - Younger brother, Jason, was a linebacker and sixth-round draft pick of the Detroit Lions in the 2001 NFL Draft, playing six seasons in the NFL with the New York Jets, Miami and Minnesota.

Linebackers Coach Mike Nolan - Father, Dick, played safety in the NFL for nine years before becoming a coach. He led San Francisco from 1968 to 1975 and was the head coach of the New Orleans Saints from 1978 to 1980.

Assistant General Manager/College Scouting Director Jeff Ireland - Stepson of Kansas City Chiefs Hall of Fame LB/C E.J. Holub and the grandson of former Eagles player and Bears personnel executive Jim Parmer.

National Scout Terry Wooden - Brother, JoJo, is director of player personnel for the Los Angeles Chargers.

Area Scout Joey Vitt - Father, Joe Vitt is a longtime NFL coach who served as assistant head coach/linebackers of the Saints for 11 seasons.

CB Ken Crawley - Cousin, Stephon Morris, spent the 2012 season with the New England Patriots.

RB Trey Edmunds - Father, Ferrell Jr., enjoyed a seven-year career as a tight end with Miami and Seattle and was selected to two Pro Bowls.

CB De'Vante Harris - Father, Rod, was a wide receiver, playing three seasons in the NFL and spending the 1989 season with New Orleans where he would appear in 11 games, handling the club's kickoff and punt return duties.

RB Mark Ingram II - Father, Mark Ingram Sr., was a 10-year NFL veteran who played for the New York Giants, Miami, Green Bay and Philadelphia.

DE Cameron Jordan - Father, Steve, had a 13-year ca-

reer as a tight end with Minnesota, with six Pro Bowl selections.

T/G Andrus Peat - Father, Todd, played six NFL seasons as a lineman with the Cardinals and the Raiders.

LB Nate Stupar - Older brother, Jonathan, played two NFL seasons from 2009-10, while his uncle, Jeff Hostetler, won two Super Bowl titles with the New York Giants, as part of a 12-year career in the league.

WR Michael Thomas - Uncle, Keyshawn Johnson, is a former wide receiver, spending 11 seasons in the NFL with the New York Jets, Tampa Bay, Dallas and Carolina, earning three Pro Bowls and the Super Bowl XXXVII title.

Ahead is a synopsis of several returning players and newcomers through the draft, free agency and trade to the 2017 Saints offensive line:

LT Terron Armstead - The club's first third round draft choice in 2013 out of Arkansas-Pine Bluff, Armstead impressed scouts by running the fastest 40-yard dash time (4.71) by an offensive lineman in the history of the NFL Scouting Combine. He has opened 37 regular season games and two postseason contests for New Orleans, returning to action in week six vs. Detroit after missing the first four contests with a shoulder injury.

G/C Senio Kelemete - Originally a fifth round selection of the Arizona Cardinals (151st overall) in the 2012 NFL Draft, since first joining the New Orleans practice squad at the start of the 2013 season, this fifth-year lineman has displayed the versatility to play every position on the line. The 6-foot-3, 300-pounder saw action in 35-of-36 games over the past four seasons with 15 starts and has become an invaluable piece of the Black and Gold line. In 2017, Kelemete has already played at right tackle in the season opener and played at left guard the other four games.

T/G Andrus Peat - A first round selection (13th overall) in the 2015 NFL Draft out of Stanford, Peat was considered one of the top college offensive linemen. In 2016, Peat took a big step forward from his rookie season, starting 15 contests at left guard, left tackle and as an extra tight end and blocking for the most productive offense in the NFL (426.0 ypg.). Headed into his third season, Peat's a key to the Saints' future success, starting at both left guard and left tackle in 2017.

OFFENSIVE NOTES

T Ryan Ramczyk - The Black and Gold used their second first round selection in the 2017 NFL Draft to snag Ramczyk, viewed by many as one of the best offensive linemen in the entire draft. The 6-6, 314 lb. tackle moved from Division III Wisconsin-Stevens Point to the University of Wisconsin, and in just one season with the Badgers, he flourished. Ramczyk started all 14 games in 2016 and was a consensus All-American, blocking for an offense that gained 203.1 rushing yards per game and allowing just a single sack. Ramczyk figures to make an immediate impact for the Black and Gold, adding valuable depth to the outside of the offensive line, starting two games at left tackle and three contests at right tackle.

C Max Unger - Since being acquired by the Saints via trade at the start of the 2015 offseason, Max Unger has anchored the middle of the Saints offensive line, opening 34-of-35 contests, missing only one game in 2016 due to a foot injury. Originally a second round draft pick of the Seahawks in 2009, Unger has been named a first-team All-Pro by the *Associated Press* in 2012 and is a two-time Pro Bowler, helping the Seahawks to two Super Bowl appearances and a victory in Super Bowl XLVIII. Unger has opened all 103 games he has played in since 2009. Sidelined in the offseason and some of the preseason by a foot injury, Unger returned to his spot by the season opener.

G Larry Warford - A third-round pick by the Detroit Lions in 2013, Warford has been one of the best offensive linemen in the NFL since his arrival. In 2013, he was named *Pro Football Focus* Rookie of the Year after starting all 16 games without surrendering a sack. This offseason, the 6-3, 317 lb. guard joined the Saints, and he will play a critical role in the team's efforts to repeat as the National Football League's top offense manning the right guard position.

DEFENSIVE NOTES

DEFENSIVE DRAFT

Over the last three NFL Drafts, New Orleans has shown a commitment to improving the defense, spending 14-of-21 picks on that side of the ball. With nine picks in the 2015 NFL Draft, the Saints picked six defensive players, the most taken since New Orleans chose nine defensive players in a 12-round selection meeting in 1990. Below is an overview of the 11 players selected by New Orleans since 2015 on the 53-man roster:

S Vonn Bell, Ohio State (D2b-16) - Selected by New Orleans in the second round (61st overall) of the 2016 NFL Draft, Bell was a consensus All-American and one of the top rated defensive backs in the NFL Draft. As a senior, the Rossville, Ga. native was a Jim Thorpe Award semifinalist

after recording 65 tackles and adding two interceptions, one brought back for a touchdown, one fumble recovery and 11 passes defensed. During his 2016 rookie season, Bell translated that collegiate success to the NFL with ease, starting 14 games and finishing second on the team with 98 tackles (59 solo) and first on the team with two forced fumbles. Now a proven asset, Bell will look to enter the upper echelon of NFL safeties in 2017.

DT Tyeler Davison, Fresno State (D5b-15) - This run-stopping widebody defensive lineman played in 53 career games at Fresno State and made 28.5 stops for a loss and 14.5 sacks. After moving into the starting lineup in 2016, Davison has continued to improve, with his 11 tackles (eight solo) and one pass defensed not showing his true value as a run-stopper for the NFL's 11th ranked rushing defense.

DE Trey Hendrickson, Florida Atlantic (D3c-17) - A product of Florida Atlantic University, Trey Hendrickson joins the Black and Gold in 2017 hoping to add depth to the defensive line. The four-year letterman for the Owls dominated in his final two seasons; as a senior, he was named Conference-USA Defensive Most Valuable Player and led the nation with four blocked kicks. As a junior in 2015, Hendrickson recorded 13 sacks, second-best in the nation, and five forced fumbles. Powerful, agile, and with an eye for getting to the football, Hendrickson will be a welcome addition to the defensive front. He made his first impact in a week three win at Carolina with his first career sack.

LB Hau'oli Kikaha, Washington (D2-15) - Though a pre-season knee injury prematurely ended his 2016 campaign, Kikaha still enters 2017 as a key member of the Saints' front seven and pass rush. He came to New Orleans after a senior season at Washington in 2014 where he was the nation's leader with 19 sacks. In his rookie campaign, Kikaha played in 15 games with 10 starts and recorded 56 tackles (41 solo), one pass defensed, four sacks and four forced fumbles to tie for sixth in takedowns and first in forced fumbles among rookies. The Hawaii native finished the season tied for second in the league in forced fumbles, the lone rookie with four. Kikaha has made a nice rebound from missing the 2016 campaign, recording two sacks.

CB Marshon Lattimore, Ohio State (D1a-17) - The 11th pick in the 2017 draft and the first cornerback taken, Lattimore possesses all the traits of a future lockdown defender. In 2016 at Ohio State, he was named first team All-Big Ten after recording four interceptions during the year. With his agile, fluid style of play, Lattimore has the ability to shut down even the best wide receivers. He will play a critical role in the Black and Gold pass defense in 2017, as he moved into the starting lineup in week one and recording an interception return for a touchdown on Sunday vs. Detroit.

DE Al-Quadin Muhammad, Miami (Fla.) (D6-17) - Muhammad joins the Saints in 2017 after showing potential as a pass rusher at the University of Miami. While he did not play in 2016, in 2015 he notched 54 tackles, good for third on the squad, while leading the team in tackles for loss and sacks with 8.5 and 5, respectively. He also forced a fumble and broke up one pass. Muhammad's strength on the line should be a valuable asset for a Saints front looking to improve on its 30-sack mark from 2016 after leading the team in quarterback takedowns in the preseason.

DT David Onyemata, Manitoba (D4-16) - Possessing a unique combination of size and speed, this Lagos, Nigeria native had an impressive rookie year after becoming the first player from the University of Manitoba to be drafted into the NFL. Despite being extraordinarily new to football, the fourth round pick appeared in all 16 games in 2016, notching 32 tackles on the year. Now with experience under his belt, Onyemata has become a critical member on the interior of the Saints defensive front as an important member of its defensive tackle rotation. In week four against the Dolphins in London, he recorded the first sack of his NFL career.

DT Sheldon Rankins, Louisville (D1-16) - Selected by New Orleans 12th overall in the first round of the 2016 NFL Draft, the Covington, Ga. native played in 46 games along the defensive line at Louisville from 2012-15, producing 133 total tackles (72 solo), 31.5 tackles for loss and 18 sacks during his collegiate career. A broken leg delayed his National Football League debut last season until Week Nine, but he made the most of his limited action, still finishing tied for third on the club with four sacks.

S Marcus Williams, Utah (D2-17) - A three-year starter at Utah, Williams was twice named All-Pac 12 and earned second-team All-American honors as a junior before declaring for the NFL Draft. In 2016, he tied for second in the conference with five interceptions, even after missing two games due to injury. The defender boasts a dangerous mix of speed, fluidity, and instinct that allows him to read the offense and make breaks on the ball. His athleticism was on display in week three at Carolina, when he snared his first career interception with his fingertips.

CB P.J. Williams, Florida State (D3b-15) - One of the most gifted athletes among the Black and Gold, Williams' career was limited in the beginning by missing all but two games in his first two seasons with injuries, but has come on in 2017. An experienced starter from Florida State University who developed into one of the nation's top cover

corners as a junior in 2014, Williams finished his college career with 123 tackles (82 solo), four interceptions and 18 passes defended. In year three, Williams recorded his first career interception in week three at Carolina.

NEW FACES ON DEFENSE

Along with the NFL Draft, New Orleans used free agency to add pieces to its defense, bringing players from other teams, as well as other leagues to help create the perfect mixture of veteran leadership and young talent in the Saints locker room. Below is an overview of those players:

S Rafael Bush (UFA-17 DET) - The six-year NFL veteran returns to the Saints after spending the 2016 campaign in Detroit. Bush joined the Saints following the 2012 preseason and was a significant contributor both in the secondary and on special teams for four seasons. In his only season in Detroit, he appeared in all 16 games with four starts and finished fifth on the team with 48 tackles (31 solo) and added one sack, two picks and three passes defended. In 64 career games, he has accrued 18 starts, 183 tackles (117 solo), two sacks, three interceptions, 13 passes defended, 29 special teams stops, and one coverage fumble recovery. In 2017, Bush will contribute to the Saints both in multiple defensive back packages and on special teams.

LB A.J. Klein (UFA-17 CAR) - Klein joined the Saints in 2017 at the start of unrestricted free agency, after spending his first four NFL seasons with Carolina. The 2013 fifth-round draft choice out of Iowa State has appeared in 64 games with 27 starts, posting 181 tackles (136 solo), five sacks, an interception, three passes defended, four forced fumbles, and 27 special teams stops. In 2016, he played in 15 games for the Panthers with seven starts and made 31 tackles (26 solo), one sack, a career-high two forced fumbles and two special teams stops. Experienced, intelligent, and athletic, he leads the team with 26 stops, one sack, two passes defended and one forced fumble in 2017, starting all five games.

DE Alex Okafor (UFA-17 ARI) - Okafor, a fourth-round selection in 2013 by the Arizona Cardinals out of Texas, enters the fifth year of his career and his first with the Saints. In the past five seasons, Okafor has totaled 120 tackles (69 solo), 15.5 sacks, six passes defended, an interception, three forced fumbles, and two fumble recoveries. Okafor has enjoyed what shows the potential for his most productive season in 2017, recording 19 tackles (16 solo), two sacks, one pass defended and one forced fumble, coming off a performance with two stops, one sack and the pass deflection and forced fumble, which was recovered by teammates Kenny Vaccaro for a touchdown on Sunday vs. Detroit.

LB Manti Te'o (UFA-17 SD) - The 2012 Heisman Trophy runner-up joins the Black and Gold this season after four years as a San Diego Charger. In his career, he has appeared in 42 games with 35 starts, recording 305 tackles (178 solo), 1.5 sacks, nine passes defended, and two picks. In 2017, Te'o has 16 stops (nine solo) through the first five contests.

QUARTERBACKS

DREW BREES

- Since signing with the New Orleans Saints as an unrestricted free agent in 2006 from the San Diego Chargers, quarterback Drew Brees has thrown for 4,000 or more yards each season, became the only NFL signal-caller to throw for 5,000 yards five different times, set the league single-season yardage record in 2011 (broken by Peyton Manning in 2013) and ranked at or near the top in every passing category, both in single-seasons and over the 11-year period, breaking virtually every club passing record.
- In 2016, Brees completed 471-of-673 passes (70.0%) for 5,208 yards with 37 touchdowns, two rushing touchdowns, 15 interceptions and a 101.7 passer rating. Brees led the league in passing yards for the seventh time, breaking the 5,000-yards passing barrier for the fifth time in his illustrious career (no other player has surpassed the mark more than once).
- Brees has kept up the pace in 2017, leading New Orleans on a three-game winning streak, completing 126-of-183 passes (68.9%) for 1,321 yards with 10 touchdown passes, two interceptions and a 103.2 passer rating. Through five games, he is ranked third in the NFL in completion percentage and fifth in passer rating and third down passer rating (108.6).
- Since signing with New Orleans in 2006 and playing in 179 games for the Black and Gold, Brees leads the National Football League with 55,084 passing yards, 395 touchdown passes, 7,132 attempts, 4,837 completions, a 67.8% completion percentage, 100 games with at least 300 yards passing, 15 with at least 400 yards passing, 419 passes of 25 yards or more and stands at third in the league with a 99.4 passer rating. He did not throw an interception through the first four games of the season for the first time.
- Brees has been selected to play in a franchise-record nine Pro Bowls as a member of the Saints, with ten overall berths in the National Football League's all-star game,

twice as a starter, including a selection following the 2016 season. His seven consecutive selections as a Saint is tied for first in franchise history with Pro Football Hall of Fame tackle William Roaf.

- Brees has posted a 104-75 regular season record in contests he has started since signing with the Saints in 2006. In Week 15 of the 2016 campaign, Brees earned his 100th regular season victory in a Saints uniform. Including his six playoff victories, his 110 total wins as a member of the Saints make him the winningest quarterback in franchise history.
- In his 17-year National Football League career during which he has appeared in 238 games with 237 starts, Brees has completed 5,962-of-8,941 passes (66.7%) for 67,432 yards, 475 touchdown passes and a 96.4 passer rating. He stands as the NFL's all-time most accurate passer, is ranked third in completions, third in touchdown passes, third in passing yardage and sixth in passer rating.

- 3** – Number of NFC Offensive Player of the Month awards won by Brees in his 11-year career in Black and Gold, the most monthly awards won by a Saints player in team history.
- 4** – Brees, Dan Marino (Miami 1984 and 1986) Peyton Manning (Denver, 2013 and Indianapolis, 2014), and Aaron Rodgers (Green Bay 2011 and 2016) are the only four NFL players to throw for 40 or more touchdowns twice. • One of the club's two first round draft picks in 2011, the 2009 Heisman Trophy winner has been an integral part of the rushing attack since his arrival in New Orleans. In 2016, Ingram had the most productive season of his seven-year NFL career, rushing for 1,043 yards on 205 carries (5.1 yards per attempt) and six touchdowns. This was the first time Ingram had broken the 1,000 yard barrier in his career. He became the first Black and Gold back to hit the mark since Deuce McAllister ran for 1,057 in 2006 and the seventh back to do so in franchise history. On November 6 at San Francisco, Ingram carried the ball 15 times for 158 yards, including a 75-yard touchdown run, the longest run of his career. On November 27 vs. the Los Angeles Rams, Ingram picked up 146 yards on 14 carries, including a 61-yard run, the third longest of his career.

• In 2017, Ingram has picked back up where he left off in 2016, playing in all five games and leading the team in rushing with 67 carries for 284 yards (4.2 avg.) with two touchdowns and adding 20 receptions for 161 yards for 445 total yards from scrimmage, which is currently ranked 19th in the National Football League. Ingram is coming off of his first 100-yard performance of the season on Sunday vs. Detroit, when he carried 25 times for 114 yards with two touchdowns and added five receptions for 36 yards for 150 total yards from scrimmage.

• Through the first five games of the 2017 season, Thomas is New Orleans' receiving leader in both catches and yardage and tied for first in touchdown receptions, recording 28 receptions for 321 yards with two scoring grabs.

TED GINN JR.

• Ginn joins the Saints in 2017 as he enters his 11th NFL season. He has been a member of five teams since being selected with the ninth overall pick in the 2007 NFL Draft by the Miami Dolphins out of Ohio State in 2007, and has appeared in 156 games with 65 starts over that period. In his long career marked by big play ability, he has accumulated 4,497 yards off 324 catches, recording 27 touchdowns. In his first season in New Orleans, Ginn has played in all five games with four starts and has recorded 15 grabs for 212 yards with two touchdowns to tie for the team lead, has carried four times for 32 yards and has brought back eight punts for 60 yards (7.5 avg.)

BRANDON COLEMAN

• Originally signed by the New Orleans Saints out of Rutgers following the 2014 NFL Draft, Coleman won a roster spot on the 2015 opening day roster after spending most of his rookie campaign on the practice squad, appearing in all 16 games with four starts. Coleman finished the 2015 season with 30 receptions for 454 yards and two touchdowns. In 2016, again appeared in all 16 games with four starts, tacking in 281 yards through the air and scoring three touchdowns. Coleman has taken his production to a new level in 2017, appearing in all five games with one start and making ten grabs for 160 yards and two touchdowns.

WILLIE SNEAD IV

• A third-year veteran out of Ball State, Willie Snead IV has become one of QB Drew Brees' favorite targets over his two seasons with the New Orleans Saints. In 2015, his first season on the New Orleans active roster, Snead was electric, taking in 69 passes for 984 yards and three touchdowns. His 2016 campaign played out in much the same way, as he caught 72 passes for 895 yards and four touchdowns. On Nov. 27 against the Rams, Snead showed off his talented arm as well, as he launched a 50-yard pass to RB Tim Hightower that went for a score. After missing the first four games of the season, Snead made his 2017 debut on Sunday vs. Detroit and recorded one reception for 11 yards.

TIGHT ENDS

COBY FLEENER

• A combination of athleticism, strength and speed, Fleener's sure hands and ability to get open are an important facet of the Saints offense. Originally a second round draft pick of Indianapolis in 2012, he came to New Orleans as an unrestricted free agent after being a potent weapon in the Colts passing game for four seasons. In 2016, he appeared in all 16 games with eight starts, hauling in 50 passes for 631 yards (12.6 avg) and three touchdowns. He also had one rush for two yards and a score. Over his six-year career, he has played in 81 games with 53 starts, made 244 catches for 2,914 yards, and scored 23 total touchdowns.

JOSH HILL

• Signed as an undrafted free agent from Idaho State in 2013, Hill's combination of hands, speed and special teams acumen have served him well in his first five seasons where he has posted 55 grabs for 521 yards with nine TDs, while adding 27 special teams stops. In 2016, the Black-foot, Idaho native appeared in all nine games with eight starts, recording 149 yards and a score before suffering an ankle injury vs. Detroit that left him on Injured Reserve.

MICHAEL HOOMANAWANUI

• Brought to New Orleans in Week Four of the 2015 season after a trade with the New England Patriots, Hoomanawanui appeared in 12 games for the Black and Gold before spending the 2016 campaign on Injured Reserve. In his 12 games with the club in 2015, he recorded eight starts, 11 catches, 76 yards, and three touchdowns. During his entire career, he has appeared in 77 games with 50 starts, recording 602 yards and seven total TD on 52 catches.

• Jordan is enjoying another standout season in 2017, recording 24 tackles, five sacks, one interception return for a touchdown, five passes defended and one forced fumble. He is currently ranked ninth in the NFL in quarterback takedowns.

• New Orleans' first choice in the 2011 NFL Draft (24th overall) out of California, 2016, Saints defensive end Cameron Jordan started all 16 games for the five consecutive year, posting 66 tackles (39 solo), 7.5 sacks, four passes defended, and a forced fumble. With 51.5 sacks in seven seasons with the Black and Gold, Jordan is sixth on the Saints career sack list. Jordan has also proven to be one of the NFL's best run defenders, known for generating pressure on quarterbacks that doesn't always show up on the stat sheet.

ALEX OKAFOR

• Selected by the Arizona Cardinals in the fourth round of the 2013 NFL Draft, Okafor joins the Saints in 2017 where he will add valuable depth on the defensive line. Okafor has appeared in 47 games with 3 starts in five years, collecting 15.5 sacks, an interception, three forced fumbles, one fumble recovery, and five passes defended. In 2017, he has 19 tackles (16 solo), two sacks, one pass defended and a team-high two forced fumbles.

DEFENSIVE TACKLES

TYELER DAVISON

• The Fresno State product followed up a solid rookie season with an even better season in 2016, helping to improve the 31st ranked run defense in 2015 to the 14th best in the league in 2016. Starting 15 games, the disruptive defensive tackle finished the 2016 campaign with 29 tackles (14 solo) and two pass deflections. In 2015, Davison became a key Saints defender while still a rookie, appearing in all 16 games with five starts and attacking for 18 tackles (10 solo) and 1.5 sacks. In 2017, the New Orleans run defense has improved three more spots to 11th and this defender has played a key role in this improvement, starting all five games and recording 11 tackles (eight solo) and one pass defended.

SHELDON RANKINS

• Rankins was limited by injury in 2016, yet he nonetheless produced an impressive campaign. After a broken fibula delayed his National Football League debut, the rookie exploded for 20 tackles (15 solo) in nine games, adding four sacks and a forced fumble. The third defensive lineman selected in the 2016 NFL Draft (12th overall), Rankins played in 46 games along the defensive line at Louisville, producing 133 tackles (72 solo), 31.5 tackles for loss and 18 sacks during his collegiate career. In his senior campaign, the former Cardinals standout racked up a single-season career-high 58 tackles (28 solo), 13 stops for loss, six sacks, one pass defended and a fumble recovery returned 46 yards for a touchdown. Rankins was named second-team All-Atlantic Coast Conference following his efforts.

DAVID ONYEMATA

• David Onyemata was chosen with the team's fourth round pick (120th overall) in 2016 after a stellar college career at the University of Manitoba of the CIS, becoming the first member of the Bisons program to be drafted. Over the course of his rookie campaign, Onyemata shined, appearing in all 16 games and recording 32 tackles (15 solo). On Oct. 1, against Miami in London, Onyemata recorded his first career sack and through five games, as an integral part of the club's defensive line rotation, he has recorded 11 tackles (six solo), the takedown and one special teams tackle.

LINEBACKERS

Key free agent acquisitions combined with an extra year of growth have rendered the 2017 Saints linebacking corps a young, hard-hitting squad that looks to wreak havoc on opposing offenses this season.

CRAIG ROBERTSON

- In just his first year with the Saints, Robertson quickly became one of the most important members of the young defense. After four seasons with Cleveland, Robertson joined the Saints looking to contribute on defense and special teams, yet his production outpaced even the highest expectations. Starting 15 games, Robertson led the Saints with 131 tackles (100 solo), while adding a sack, four passes defended, and interception, and two fumble recoveries. Robertson will continue to be a leader Saints defenders look to during the upcoming campaign, as he has returned to the starting lineup and has posted 15 tackles, one sack, one pass defended, one forced fumble and one fumble recovery. He comes off a monster performance on Sunday vs. Detroit when he led the team with 11 tackles and had the sack, forced fumble and recovery all on the same play.

A.J. KLEIN

- Signed as an unrestricted free agent from Carolina, where he spent his first four NFL seasons, Klein has taken over play-calling duties on defense for New Orleans. Opening all four games on the strongside for the Saints, Klein leads the Saints with 26 tackles (15 solo), one sack, two passes defended and one forced fumble.

NATE STUPAR

- Originally drafted by Oakland in the seventh round of the 2012 NFL Draft (230th overall), Stupar came to New Orleans as part of a revamped linebacker group in 2016. After three seasons spent with four teams, he found a home with the Black and Gold, appearing in all 16 games with 6 starts while setting or tying career-highs in all major categories. He finished the 2016 season with 62 tackles (38 solo), one sack, two passes defended, an interception, two forced fumbles, and two fumble recoveries.

MANTI TE'O

- Coming to New Orleans as a free agent in 2017, Te'o has used his four seasons in San Diego to become a talented, linebacker. A second round pick in 2013 out of Notre Dame where he finished second in the voting for the 2012 Heisman Trophy, In 2015, his third season in San Diego,

he started all 12 games he appeared in, recording a career-high 83 tackles (63 solo), a half-sack, an interception, and a forced fumble. Last year, he started the first three games of the season, before an Achilles injury ended his campaign. In 2017, he ranks among team leaders with 16 tackles (nine solo).

KEN CRAWLEY

- Crawley came to the Saints as an undrafted free agent in 2016 from Colorado. During his rookie year, he appeared in

DEFENSIVE BACKS

15 games with five starts, recording 50 stops (41 solo), 10 passes defended, a forced fumble and a fumble recovery. A corner who played in all 47 games at Colorado, Crawley will look to continue his development in 2017. He saw his first action of 2017 in a contest in which he started, Sept. 24 at Carolina, and recorded a team-high nine tackles (eight solo) and two passes defended. He followed that standout performance with another in the Saints' win at Miami at London's Wembley Stadium, Oct. 1, when he recorded his first career interception and also added four stops and two more passes defended. Overall in 2017, he has 18 tackles, one interception and is tied for the team lead with five passes defended.

MARSHON LATTIMORE

- Taken 11th overall in the 2017 NFL Draft from Ohio State, Lattimore possesses the physicality, speed, and intelligence to impact the Saints secondary. Despite appearing in just 20 games during his college career, Lattimore wowed NFL scouts. As a redshirt sophomore in 2016, he started all 13 games and was named first-team All-Big Ten. He notched four interceptions, one of which he returned for a touchdown. Lattimore figures to become a critical component of the Saints secondary. Through four games, Lattimore, is tied for the lead among cornerbacks with 21 stops and added a 27-yard interception return for a touchdown and two passes defended on Sunday vs. Detroit.

P.J. WILLIAMS

- After being sidelined for the majority of his first two seasons, this third-season defender is primed for a jump. An experienced starter from Florida State, who developed into one of the nation's top cover corners in 2014, Williams finished his college career with 123 tackles (82 solo), four interceptions and 18 passes defended. In 2017, through the first five games, Williams is tied for the lead among New Orleans cornerbacks with 21 tackles and recorded his first career interception in the Sept. 24 win at Carolina.

KENNY VACCARO

• Originally a first round selection of New Orleans in 2013 out of the University of Texas, Vaccaro has filled up the stat sheet for the past three seasons, primarily from the strong safety position, where he has appeared in 61 games with 60 starts and has posted 446 tackles, six sacks, seven interceptions, 27 passes defensed, five forced fumbles and three fumble recoveries. Through the first five games of 2017, Vaccaro is tied for second on the club with 24 tackles (team-high 20 solo), a club best two interceptions, five passes defensed and a fumble recovery for a touchdown.

VONN BELL

• Bell left onlookers impressed with his 2016 rookie campaign, alerting the NFL to his arrival through his hard-hitting play. Appearing in every game with 14 starts, he totaled 98 tackles (59 solo) both of which were second on the team. He also added four passes defensed, a sack, two forced fumbles, and a fumble recovery. Drafted by New Orleans in the second round of the 2016 NFL Draft (61st overall), Bell was a consensus first-team All-American, was voted First-team All-Big Ten and was also a Jim Thorpe Award semifinalist following his junior season at Ohio State. In 2017, he's appeared in all five games and has posted 18 tackles (13 solo), one sack and one pass defensed.

RAFAEL BUSH

• A Saint from 2012 to 2015, Bush returns to New Orleans after spending 2016 with Detroit. Last season, he appeared in all 16 games with four starts, recording 53 tackles (34 solo), a sack, three passes defensed, and two interceptions, one of which he returned for a touchdown vs. Jacksonville in Week 11. Over his first four seasons with the Saints, Bush appeared in 40 games with 14 starts, totaling 118 tackles (90 solo), eight passes defensed, an interception, a forced fumble, and three fumble recoveries.

MARCUS WILLIAMS

• Drafted in the second round of the 2017 NFL Draft, Williams is coming off a brilliant career at Utah, where he was a three-year starter. In 2016, he was named a second-team All-American by *Pro Football Focus* after starting all 11 games he played. He came in second in the Pac-12 in interceptions (five). The year prior, he started all 13 games as a free safety, again taking in five picks. His freshman year, he started six of 13 contests, notching an interception and two forced fumbles. During his sophomore and junior years, he was named a first-team Pac-12 All-Academic selection. Sept. 24, at Carolina Williams posted his first career interception.

SPECIAL TEAMS

P THOMAS MORSTEAD

• Morstead has established himself as one of the National Football League's top punters, where he's posted career club-best 47.0 gross and 41.1 net punting averages. In 2016 over 16 games, he punted 57 times for 2,751 yards, putting 22 of his punts inside the 20-yard line, with five touchbacks. He posted a 48.3 gross average with a net average of 42.4.

FOLLOW THE LEADER

Morstead is the team's all-time leader in both gross and net punting averages. His 43.2 net in 2012 ranks ninth all-time and he has the 10th and 11th-best. His career 41.2 net ranks third in NFL records since the statistic was first compiled in 1976.

• Lutz came to the Saints in Week One of 2016 and immediately made an impact. The rookie out of Georgia State was named NFC Special Teams Player of the Week in Weeks Six and Eight, after drilling a game-winning 52-yard field goal with 0:11 remaining vs. Carolina in the former and after converting all four field goal attempts, including a 53-yard attempt, during a 25-20 victory over Seattle in the latter. Lutz was 28-of-34 on field goals and 49-of-50 on PATs in 2016, and was named to the *PFWA* All-Rookie team for his efforts.

STRONG LEG

In a Week Three loss to the Atlanta Falcons in the 2016 season, Lutz lined up for and converted a 57-yard field goal with no time remaining in the first half; that successful effort tied him for the third longest field goal in franchise history, behind only legends Tom Dempsey and Morten Andersen. Lutz took over kickoff duties from Morstead in 2016 and was successful in that area as well. On 89 kickoffs, Lutz forced touchbacks on 49 of them, allowing only 40 returns.

SAINTS POSTGAME NOTES

- With the win, New Orleans Saints moves to 3-2 on the season, marking the first time they are over .500 since the end of the 2013 season.
The Saints travel to Green Bay for a week seven match-up against the Packers (Oct. 22) at Lambeau Field. Kickoff is set for 12:00 p.m. CST. The game will be aired on FOX (WVUE-FOX 8 in the New Orleans area).
- With the win, the Saints improved their record against Detroit in the regular season to 12-12-1, increasing the number of teams that they have at least a .500 record against to 12. It also ended a three-game losing streak against the Lions. New Orleans has also won the NFC Wild Card playoff game vs. Detroit in the 2011 postseason.
- Saints Head Coach **Sean Payton** tallied his 103rd win as Saints head coach (regular season and postseason), surpassing San Francisco's **Bill Walsh** (1986-96) for sole possession of 43rd place on the NFL's all-time victories list.
- The Saints scored 52 points which marks the most points scored by the Saints since 11/27/16 vs. the Los Angeles Rams (49). It is tied for the second-highest single-game point total in Saints history. The top four scoring totals in franchise history have all occurred under Payton's watch.
- Today's win marks the first time since 2015 (10/15-11/1) that the Saints have won three games in a row.
- New Orleans outrushed Detroit 193-66.
- New Orleans scored a franchise-record three defensive touchdowns; a fourth quarter interception by DE **Cameron Jordan** in the end zone, a third quarter 27-yard interception return for a touchdown by rookie CB **Marshon Lattimore** and the other a first quarter fumble recovery in the end zone by S **Kenny Vaccaro**.
- New Orleans won the giveaway/takeway battle against Detroit 5-3, with three interceptions for the second time in three weeks and the first two fumble recoveries of the season. With a third quarter interception by Detroit of QB **Drew Brees**, New Orleans had their first turnover of the season, tying them with the 1995 St. Louis Rams and 2013 Tennessee Titans as the only teams to go through the first four games of a season without a turnover.
- QB **Drew Brees**, completed 21-of-31 passes for a total of 186 yards, he has now surpassed 55,000 passing yards as a Saint. He also threw touchdowns to WR **Ted Ginn Jr.** and TE **Michael Hoomanawanui**. Brees now has 475 career touchdown passes.
- RB **Mark Ingram** led the Saints in rushing with 25 carries for 114 yards and two rushing touchdowns to tie a career-high. Ingram also hauled in a club-best five catches for 36 yards. Ingram now has 38 career touchdowns, surpassing WR **Danny Abramowicz** to move into sole possession of ninth place on the club's all-time list. It was Ingram's seventh career multi-touchdown game. It was his tenth career 100-yard rushing game.
- RB **Alvin Kamara** received his first career NFL start and finished the game with 75 yards on ten attempts with a long of 21 yards and also added four receptions for 12 yards.
- WR **Ted Ginn Jr.** scored the Saints first offensive touchdown of the game, catching a 20-yard pass from Brees. Ginn finished with four catches for a team-high 66 receiving yards.
- TE **Michael Hoomanawanui** scored his first touchdown of the season, catching a two-yard pass from Brees to bring the Saints lead to 38-10. Hoomanawanui finished with two catches for 27 yards.
- DE **Alex Okafor** sacked Lions QB **Matthew Stafford** in the end zone on Detroit's first possession, causing a forced fumble that was recovered by Vaccaro for a touchdown, his

first career NFL touchdown. Okafor finished the game with two tackles, one sack, and a forced fumble.

- LB **Craig Robertson** caused the Lions second turnover of the game, forcing a fumble by Stafford. Robertson then recovered the fumble. He finished the game with a team-high 11 tackles and one sack.
- Jordan played in his 101st career game to move into a tie for 50th in club record books and started his 100th career contest and recorded two sacks creating a 5-yard loss and a 7-yard loss. He also had an interception for a touchdown. Jordan finished the game with five tackles, two sacks and the interception for a touchdown. His last interception was 11/30/14 at Pittsburgh. He now has 51.5 career sacks, surpassing DT **La'Roi Glover** and DE **Joe Johnson** to move into sole possession of sixth place on the club's all-time list for quarterback takedowns. It was the ninth multi-sack game of Jordan's career with the Saints boasting a 9-0 mark in those contests.
- Lattimore recorded his first career interception, picking off Stafford, returning it for a 27-yard touchdown. He became the first Saints rookie to return an interception for a touchdown since CB **Fred Weary** in 1998.
- Vaccaro finished the game with four tackles, a fumble recovery for a touchdown and an interception, giving him the team lead on the season for interceptions with his second pick.
- S **Vonn Bell** had his first sack of the season and the Saints fifth takedown of the game, creating a three-yard loss. Bell finished with five total tackles.
- K **Wil Lutz** nailed a 41-yard field goal to bring the Saints lead to 17-7 with four seconds left in the first quarter.
- P **Thomas Morstead** punted seven times for 344 yards (49.1 avg.) with a long of 67 yards. Morstead appeared in his 131th career game, tying tackle **William Roaf** for 24th place on the club's games played list.

Opening Statement

“Obviously, (it was) a crazy game. Credit our defense for 21 points. That was significant. I have been involved in a couple of games where you go from a big lead. In New York it would’ve been the 2002 Wild Card game against San Francisco. We did enough things in a similar fashion this game. Our punt return and punt coverage stunk. It was poor. I thought the turnovers by us in the second half were poor. We did a lot of dumb things, but fortunately our defense did a lot of good things.”

On the batted passes throughout the game

“We knew Matt (Stafford) was going to be getting rid of the ball quick. They were banged up at the offensive line and, obviously, he was banged up. When you start getting that early passing game to avoid the pressure guys will look good.”

On blitzing to affect the quarterback

“There was some. It was pretty back and forth. We had a lot of three-man rushes too.”

On player mentality having above .500 winning percentage for the first time since 2013

“They don’t look at the long history picture and I don’t encourage them to. There’s a lot of new guys on this team that haven’t been here for a year. It’s good to play and get another win. You win two in a row then you have a bye (week). I felt like it was important to play well against this team and important for us to get the win.”

On running the ball early

“I was encouraged by that. It was part of the plan.”

On the impact Cam Jordan had throughout the game

“It was significant. You bat a ball down and catch it in the end zone. I thought we did a good job affecting the passer and our looks changed. I thought that helped us. Some of those plays that you don’t get some days, it seemed like we got. The tipped interception to Marshon (Lattimore). We got a few of those big plays. Sack-fumble early. Penalties were discouraging. I didn’t think it was officiated very well and yet I’m sure when you get to 13 penalties, you deserve a lot of them. That being said, we’ll see that on tape.”

On if being without Adrian Peterson was a good thing for the team.

“Listen, it’s a dumb question. We’re trying to win games. I’d love to have that player, but it’s hard to have that many and get into rhythm. I thought Mark (Ingram) and Alvin (Kamara) had some great plays and I would hope to think that we would have had that type of rushing output if Adrian was part of it.”

On slow start to the second half

“You start with a turnover. You don’t convert third downs. I thought we did a lot of good things, offensively, but the turnovers and our third down numbers were awful. I had just a quick peek at them and they weren’t good. We had a number of opportunities.”

On fourth down call (fullback with the option pitch)

“In that area of the field, it made sense for us to go for it there. It was just a play we’d looked at. It was a play we ran in Dallas, actually, in 2003. Maurice Carthon and Bill Parcells, that was their play.”

On crowd energy

“I thought it was good. I thought it was very good.”

On passing Bill Walsh for career total wins

“He has a lot of Super Bowls. He was a huge influence in our game. I am trying to be happy today. It is hard to when you win like that. When you do a bunch of things silly in the second half, but hopefully we can continue to win. He’s a special guy.”

On thought process when the lead was cut down to seven

“We’ve got to get some first downs.”

On having over 180 yards rushing

“Each game is different. You’d like to say we want to have that balance each week, but teams can play a defense differently and you can pound your head into the wall. Hopefully, we can be flexible and want to do either.”

On keeping the momentum after this game

“I think more importantly there are some lessons learned in a game like this. Turnovers, big plays in the passing game, and your coverage units. Those are generally things that are involved in a large comeback. There’s a lot of tape we have to watch tomorrow.”

Thoughts on the game and what happened after having such a big lead going into halftime.

“The first half was bang, bang, bang. Obviously we come in at halftime at 31-10. We had the momentum as well because defense came up with a huge fourth down stop there at the one-yard line to prevent them from getting any points coming into halftime. Then (we) got a big stop I think third and out to start the third quarter. Offensively, we knew the type of game this was going to be in the second half. They’re a high-powered offense. We knew that they were going to kind of make a run at it. Unfortunately, there were certain things that couldn’t happen that ended up happening. We knew that we could not turn the ball over. We turned the ball over three times in the second quarter, that cannot happen. We did get the ball back and went right down and scored. And then we got the pick six for a touchdown right after that, so it was 45-10 midway through the third quarter. You felt like a lifetime of football had already been played and yet it was still only mid-third quarter. (We have to) Lock in and keep rolling. (I’m) Really disappointed with the way that we finished the game offensively in that last quarter and a half. (It) Did not feel like we ever found our rhythm. (It) Did not feel like we ever established any type presence of any of those drives. Defensively, we were playing lights out and continued to get another turnover or two. Obviously they make a big special teams play and then defensive lineman gets that tipped ball for a touchdown. So the game ended up being much closer than it needed it to be based upon the way our defense was playing. They played lights out. It is one of those where we walk away from it glad we got the win. Probably one of the crazier games I have been a part of and yet it’s still so many ways we can get better, offensively, defensively and in the kicking game to just be more complementary with one another and move forward and continue to win games. We are excited that we have won three in a row now. It is certainly something to build on. We have some momentum but we have to get better.”

With being three in a row, how does that make you feel being such a young team to win how you did?

“It’s a confidence builder just to know you had a huge lead and all of a sudden they kind of scratch and claw get their way back. Then you know plays need to be made and the team makes them to win the game. Those are always big moments.”

Did you see anything in Matthew Stafford that would lead you to believe he was a little slow from maybe an injury?

“I’m not sure. I know our defense played great. They seemed to get after him pretty good. But Stafford is a great player and continues to make plays regardless if it is in the pocket or out of the pocket.”

S Kenny Vaccaro

(On the game being fun) "It was fun when you are forcing turnovers and getting off the field. It's been a while since I've been a part of that. It's been since maybe my rookie year. In 2013, we didn't get a whole lot of turnovers. It was mainly sacks. It was a lot of fun taking the ball away."

(On getting over .500) "We don't want to be a yo-yo team. Since I've been here, we'd win one, lose one, win two, lose three in a row. I think it's big for us to win three games in a row. We have to prepare for the next one."

(On the wild game) "It was wild and we almost did everything that we could to let them back in it. I was proud of our defense because we still kept getting turnovers. Usually when you are up 45-10, you lay back a little bit and play more zone. We kept that aggressive mentality. Dennis Allen did a great job of calling the plays. We were able to create two to three more turnovers on the last few drives and it helped."

RB Mark Ingram II

(On running the ball effectively) "It felt good. It was great to come out here and help my team get a victory. I just want to be efficient and productive and do whatever I can to help us win."

(On finding a rhythm) "We always say that. Any running back will tell you that it feels good to get into a rhythm. It's important to get your sweat going, get your second wind and get a feel for the defense. The offensive line, tight ends and receivers did a great job of blocking."

(On the performance of the defense today) "They were huge. They were so strong today. They scored 21 points. They had lots of sacks and lots of hits on the quarterback. It is huge for us. It builds their confidence and we can play complementary football as a team. It just shows how hard they've been working as a unit. The goal is to play football like we did in the first half. We will win a lot of games if we do that."

DE Cameron Jordan

(On the performance of the defense) "Interceptions, fumbles, recoveries. It was a tremendous game by the defense. I can't speak enough of how young our defense is, but how much they love to play this game."

(On the batted passes today) "We knew that he (Matthew Stafford) was giving up sacks and that he had a whole lot of passes batted. We had to take advantage of that. Did it result in my first (career NFL) touchdown? Yes it did. Did I enjoy every minute of it? For sure. That being said, we have a lot of stuff to clean up for next week. We had a strong hold on them in the first half and we almost let it go. That's something that we need to focus on."

(On the first defensive touchdown of the contest setting the tone) "That was one of the things that pushed a lot in our favor. I thought David (Onyemata) had a forced fumble on the running back and they reversed the call. It gave Detroit some life for a second, but it was our job to deflate them."

(On the comeback and if he considered bringing in QB Jake Rudock when the Saints led by five touchdowns) "You are always, during the course of the game, really considering a lot of different things. One thing that we certainly knew is that we had a chance to bring it back. Nobody else in this universe probably thought so, except for the guys in that locker room. The guys fought back and gave us a chance, particularly with some of the injuries that we had. I am proud of the way in which the guys played. They played tough and hard-nosed. You're still giving someone (the Saints) points, in terms of turnovers. When they score on the defensive end of it, (it makes it difficult). We just didn't play as well as we would like."

(On the large amount of tipped balls today) "Guys were getting their hands up in the lane and tipping the ball in the air, obviously more than we have probably ever seen. We will look at all of the details. Some of it was obvious you could see. There were some others that weren't so clear. We will take a look at it and see."

(On giving up 193 rushing yards to the Saints) "Any time that we allow a team to run consistently on us and run well, we are not happy about that. One of the things when we start (game-planning) is being able to stop a team on defense, in terms of the run. We weren't able to do that consistently. Once things got turned down a little bit, we started playing better defense and started tackling better. We gave ourselves a chance."

(On how much time will be spent during the bye week on protecting the quarterback) "It's one of those things, for us, that is a priority. It is, kind of, where we start everything. We just have to keep working on it."

(On the mindset of how to almost come back from a 35-point deficit) "We just don't give up. Our guys show a lot of resolve. They know that we will get the things straightened out as we move along. Our guys always think that they have a chance to get it done. We always think that we have a chance to close the gap. They believe in one another. We fell a little bit too short. I don't think that these guys ever think that they will be out of a ballgame."

(On if he was surprised how good the Saints defense played most of the game) "No. Any team in the National Football League has a lot of really good players. They have good players. They played well. Obviously, they got five turnovers. They gave up three, obviously, which they had not done at all. Their defense played really well."

(On his decision to inactivate Cornelius Washington today) "What we do is we look at a situation, who we're playing, what the situation is, and make a determination on what's best for our team. That is what we do. We look at a player, based on his playing, and make a decision based on that."

(On if it was schematic today that the Saints linebackers were in the lanes looking to deflect passes) "We'll have to look at that and see. We will just have to take a look and see. Sometimes, strange things happen out there. Some of them were at the line of scrimmage, more so than anything else. Those are the ones that really cost us."

(On if it was difficult managing changes to the offensive line) "It's, kind of, what happens in games. Often-times you cannot predict it, but you have to be able to make adjustments and keep going. That's why we have 53 men on the roster. That's why we dress 46 on gameday. You have to be able to adjust."

(On if the bye week is coming at a good time for Matthew Stafford) "He had a lot of ups and downs in this game. He still put us in position where we had a chance to tie this thing up and go....The guy did

a lot of really good things for us, but not consistently enough from how he usually plays. And, he's got to have some help, too. It's not just a one man show. One thing we do know is that he will keep getting better."

(On if the bye week is coming at a good time for the entire team) "I think that in terms of our health it does, yes. We are going to need a little time (to get healthier). It's a good thing that we are not playing a Thursday night game or something of that nature, we would be in a little bit of an issue.

On the batted passes and fumbles:

“I think their guys were just being players. I do not know if it was a concerted effort coming into the game. I have no idea. I am not in their meeting rooms, but (I) just got to find a way to get it through. Obviously (they) led to some big plays. Some tips led to some interceptions. I am probably more frustrated at the fumbles than anything, for myself. So, I got to be better early on, not turn that ball over, got to find a way to hold on to that ball both times. Keep us out of that situation where we are having to dig ourselves out of a giant hole. ”

On confusion with so many different offensive lineman playing:

“I am not going to speak to anyone else’s confusion. I felt like our guys did a great job of coming in playing. This is the NFL, injuries happen. We were a little short to start the day. I thought the guys came in and battled. That’s all you can ask for or of them. I think they did a nice job fighting.”

On coming back:

“Just trying to stay even-keeled. Knowing that when we were down by a bunch or when it was a one-score game, just trying to stay even-keeled. It was going to take just playing good football to get a chance to go back and win that thing. Obviously, kind of a fluky, crazy game with a lot of weird and crazy plays, but we have to better early on. It starts with me. I just got to be better. ”

On craziness of game:

“It was a different one, for sure. I talked to Drew [Brees] about that after the game. He came up and said ‘that was a weird one, huh?’ And yeah it was, it was crazy. We got to find a way to start a little bit faster and make that thing a little more competitive early on. ”

On going into the bye week at 3-3:

“We’ve had some good moments and some bad moments. I think we’ve been up and down. We got to work that out. We got to be trending in the right direction at all times and playing at a higher level, it’s myself included. I think we are banged up. We got to have guys find a way to get back healthy as soon as possible come and help us and go on from there. There is a lot to learn not only from this game, but the first five, and we will learn from that and go from there.”

On Aaron Rodgers breaking collarbone:

“I did not know that. That’s tough. Injuries are tough.”

On second fumble:

“The right tackle and the right guard did the correct thing. We just got to communicate our hot (reads) a little bit better with Theo (Riddick) and myself. I was thinking one thing and he was thinking another. I was about to throw it and saw he was going a different way than (what) I was thinking. I tried to pull it back in. That guy made a great play. I got to find a way to hold onto that ball if I can. I know he kind of raked me right across the hands, but I got to find a way to hold onto that and make it a sack or an incomplete pass, rather than a big play of them. ”

On not having Golden Tate down the stretch:

“Obviously he was playing at a high level today. He was playing great. He was competing. That first touchdown was a great play. Sorry to see him to go off the field with whatever he has got, but he is a big part of our offense. He is a really talented player. He worked the middle of the field great today and made some big plays. So, anytime you lose somebody it’s next guy up and we got to go.”

On his ankle and bye week rest coming up:

“Ankle felt great. I felt like I was moving around enough. Got that first down on the scramble early in the game. (I) Was able to move. The bye week, as far as my body goes, is coming at a good time. There is no question about that. I will just learn as much as I possibly can about our team, about our guys, and myself.”

On if he ever thought about coming out of game:

“No, absolutely not. The quarterback of this team will fight ‘til three zeroes on the clock. That is the attitude that our team has. That is the attitude that I have. No matter how I am feeling, I am going to be out there and trying to help us win. ”

On body language postgame:

“I am just a little tired at the moment. I think obviously anytime you turn the ball over five times, it is not good and I can be better. Just know the effort that our guys put in, man. A lot of effort going into that game. Fighting our ass off, tooth and nail, trying to get back in. Had a chance at one score then another kind of crazy play. It was a crazy, up-and-down game.”

Punt Returner/Cornerback Jamal Agnew

On punt return: "It was cool. Whenever we get an opportunity like that, there is no doubt in my mind that we can score. Just because our punt return team works really hard. I think we have one of the best punt return units, as a whole, in the league, just because we have all 11 guys doing their job and eager to do their job. So whenever we get an opportunity there is no doubt in my mind that we can get some points."

On mistake on punt return in fourth quarter: "I just got to make a better decision. As a return if you have any doubt in your mind if you should catch it or not, you got to just let it go. I should have let that roll into the end zone. I got a little too excited. Great punter (Thomas Morstead). He hung that thing up there. A lot of credit to him, but I just got to make a better decision."

On TD interception after muffed punt: "I immediately said 'that was my fault.' We wouldn't have been backed up like that if I didn't muff that punt, but the vets came around me. They said you can't blame that on yourself. Use that as a coaching point, get better."

Safety Charles Washington

On Jamal Agnew and return: "Whats that twice in six weeks? He is excellent. He makes our job easy as blockers. All credit goes to him. He can read it, his block leverage and make plays off of that. He is a special kid."

On defense in second half: "We locked in and played our game. There was not anything that changed. Kind of played for GQ (Glover Quin). His presence was missed out there, but we had to keep it pushing."

On almost coming back in the game: "I promise you, it didn't surprise me a bit. I know that type of team that we have. I know the type of players that we have. We just watched the lead go down and got into a rhythm. These boys, we have a tough team, no matter what the scoreboard says. I know until that clock hits zero-zero our guys are going to play for us until the end, both sides of the ball."

On Matthew Stafford and his performance today: "Tough guy. I am glad he is my quarterback. He was battling a lot of things all week. He still ran with the ball and took sacrifices to get the first down on plays, to put his receivers in position. So that is an excellent quarterback."

Linebacker Jarrad Davis

On defensive performance tonight: "It's a tough outing. Got to be better. Got to attack next week. Come out and improve as a team, as a unit."

New Orleans Saints Head Coach Sean Payton

What did you see out of Marshon Lattimore yesterday?

“I thought he played well. He’s one of the guys that we gave a game ball to. He is contesting throws, (and) competing on every throw. He has good instincts, good balance and I think his length is something that shows up. I was real encouraged.”

Has there been a common thread you’ve seen defensively in these last three games, have you guys been communicating better?

“I think one thing would be the front end coverage has gone pretty handily together. In other words, we’ve been able to get pressure on the quarterbacks and with that, the coverage has been tight. We’ve had some tipped plays, some interceptions, some near interceptions. We’ve had some takeaways, but I think those would be some early things if you were just talking about the last few weeks.”

What are the things you focused on today as far as cleaning up?

“We had this discussion as a team and after you get through the first half and you start looking at being a smarter team, (such as) keeping the ball in front of you. This sounds very fundamental and yet (it’s important to be) understanding the situation, understanding what has to happen. The ball security on offense here, we turned the ball over three times in the second half. We have a chance to do something that no one in the history of the NFL has done and that is go through five games with no turnovers but we don’t do that. So we have to be a little bit better with the ball and then the punt return for a touchdown. In order for them to win that game, eight things are going to have to happen. Five of the eight, probably or four of the eight, did. Just understanding where you’re at in the game. That largest lead that we had (45-10), you look up and you still had 12-something left in the third quarter. There was a lot of football. But we have to be a little smarter in those situations. I thought the penalties were problematic and those will be addressed.”

It wasn’t necessarily a crazy number of snaps but when a game does go on that long, what if anything, do you have to do to counteract fatigue?

“Well I don’t know that it’s fatigue really. I think because it wasn’t a crazy number of snaps it was just the ebb and flow to the game (that) was unique. Generally, after a score the other side of the ball is on the field and yet, you have three defensive touchdowns, you’re right back on the field either defensively or in the case where your special teams gives up a return for a touchdown. It was unique in a lot of ways and yet there were some fundamental things that we have to be better at.”

When you saw Alvin Kamara high jump Darius Slay live yesterday what was your reaction and when you looked at it again what did you think?

“I was impressed, obviously. I couldn’t see it from the sideline view of the game. It was a lot clearer to see on video. Obviously it was extremely athletic.”

You’ve had some really well-timed blitzes the last few weeks. How do you decide when to blitz and when not to?

“A lot of it’s down and distance. Sometimes, you’re paying attention to how the protections are evolving. Detroit was banged up with some of their offensive linemen. I think if you start having success, then you generally start repeating success if you can offensively and the same thing would be defensively. But I mean defensively if you send a certain pressure and it gets home, you’re probably going to send that again. I thought Dennis (Allen), the last few weeks, we’ve been real good that way.”

Would this be the first week that Delvin Breaux could practice?

“I wouldn’t know yet if it’s the first week that he’s ready to go. We’ll see. We’ll keep you guys posted.”

What did you think of Adrian Peterson’s performance for Arizona?

“I did see and I was glad for him. I knew when he left here he was going to have those opportunities, he and I had met and talked about it. I think it was outstanding.”

What are your thoughts playing the Packers without Aaron Rodgers? How does it change things?

“You’re putting a plan together for the overall offense or defense. Certainly, there’s changes when you have a player at the quarterback position and yet, you still have to put your gameplan around what you’ve been seeing. Aaron is one of those guys that moves well and throws on the run well and I think we’re preparing to play a real good football team. None of us wants to be without our starting quarterback, but this is a team that’s won a lot of games and I think our players will understand that.”

What did you guys think of Terron Armstead in his first game back?

“It was good, it was encouraging. I was pleased with both his rehab and Max’s (Unger) rehab. Those guys did a great job. Our training room did a great job in getting them ready on time or ahead of schedule.”

How much confidence are you having in your defense considering you are seeing some things happen now that you have preached, such as ball population?

“I was pleased. I felt overall one of the positives (Sunday) was our energy, the way guys moved around. I thought they handled the bye week the correct way and we played with a certain level of urgency. That can overcome a lot. I was encouraged, especially early in the game defensively how we did that.”

Is it possible Cameron Jordan is playing his best football ever?

“I think he had one of his better games of his career yesterday. I think he’s improving and I think he was very good yesterday. I don’t think you plateau where he’s at. I thought yesterday he was exceptional.”

Was Terron Armstead leaving in the second half related to the score at all or was it conditioning?

“No, I was asked that yesterday. The plan was for us to play Terron and then at some point maybe four play series in, 20 plays in give Andrus (Peat) some reps at tackle and Senio (Kelemete) at left guard and then rotate Terron back in just so we weren’t throwing him out there for 80 plays. Now, in the third quarter...we didn’t have a ton of snaps in the first half, but when we made that decision we just felt like, hey let’s go a series or two, maybe if the score stayed that way the remainder of the game and yet he was healthy, loose and warmed up, so we had made that decision and then brought him back in later.”

Was that game from Craig Robertson what you expected out of him?

“He played well. He’s smart, instinctive. I was pleased. When he steps in and receives the reps he did, he did a good job.”
