JUST THE FACTS

• The Baltimore Ravens (3-4) host the Miami Dolphins in a Thursday night primetime showdown at M&T Bank Stadium. Kickoff for this AFC tilt is set for 8:25 p.m. The Ravens look to bounce back from twoconsecutive defeats, while the Dolphins have won three straight.

• Thursday marks the fifth-consecutive year these teams face each other, with Baltimore capturing wins in three of those meetings (including a 38-6 triumph in Charm City last season). The regular season series is tied, 6-6, however, the Ravens are 2-0 in postseason play.

• Last Sunday, Vikings K Kai Forbath kicked 6 FGs, and the Minnesota defense suffocated the Ravens' offense in Baltimore's 24-16 loss at U.S. Bank Stadium. The Ravens played without starting WRs Jeremy Maclin (shoulder) and Breshad Perriman (concussion), plus reserve WR Chris Matthews (thigh). Then, WR Mike Wallace suffered a concussion on the game's second possession, leaving the Ravens with just three healthy players at the position, one of whom (WR Griff Whalen) had signed earlier that week. The Vikings sacked QB Joe Flacco 5 times and did not allow a TD until the final play of the game when Flacco hit WR Chris Moore with a 13-yard strike. K Justin **Tucker** converted 3 FGs, including a 57-varder in the first half.

• In their 22nd year of existence, the Ravens have earned a playoff berth in six of the past nine full seasons. Since head coach John Harbaugh's arrival in 2008, Baltimore has posted the NFL's fourthmost total victories (98), won the league's second-most playoff games (10), advanced to an impressive three AFC Championship contests, and in 2012, captured the World Championship in SB XLVII.

COACH HARBS SAYS

John Harbaugh on the Ravens' leadership and team accountability:

"The thing I really expect and admire about this team - and the leadership of this team - is that we have a [team meeting] room that [takes accountability]. We don't have guys who are crossing their arms and turning their heads sideways or pointing the finger. Everybody in the room has clarity toward the accountability part of what we have to do. When you do that, you have a chance to get somewhere."

Standouts on Injured Reserve include six-time Pro Bowl RG Marshal Yanda (ankle), LG Alex Lewis (shoulder), DE Brent Urban (foot), RB Danny Woodhead (hamstring) and CB Tavon Young (knee). WR Jeremy Maclin (shoulder), G Matt Skura (knee) and RB Terrance West (calf) have missed two-straight games, while WR Breshad Perriman (concussion) and TE Maxx Williams (ankle) were out for last week's contest at Minnestota. WR Mike Wallace (concussion) left the Vikings game and did not return.


NOTE THE QUOTE

OLB TERRELL SUGGS ON LIVING UP TO THE RAVENS' DEFENSIVE STANDARD:

"I take more blame for that than anything, because I know how we're supposed to play. I know how it is supposed to look. I am just extremely frustrated and disappointed. SPOTLIGHT: ALEX COLLINS

Describe the Ravens' culture: "It is very welcoming. I love the grit and the way this organization handles adversity. The way they do things around here – the family

atmosphere, everyone is just close and together. From the outside in, you really appreciate it and want to be a part of it. We work hard together, we grind together, and it is really a family atmosphere."

Your running style in three words: "Relentless. Graceful. Powerful."

Did you grow up a Dolphins fan? "Absolutely. My whole family was huge Dolphins fans. I'm pretty sure they still are to an extent, but whatever team I am on, that is the main team all my family is a fan of. But definitely back in 2007, I was playing with the Dolphins on Madden. No matter how they did, that was my squad."

What players do you model your game after? "Ricky [Williams] was always my guy growing up. That was my first favorite player, especially being that I was such a Dolphins fan. As I got older and really started to learn about different backs, I just started to take in certain things. For instance – Frank Gore – I look at his running style. Edgerrin James was a guy I looked at. Brandon Jacobs, a strong guy who could run people over. I looked at guys' techniques and studied them."

What is the studying process like? "I would watch the way they did those things over and over and try and master it myself. I felt if I was one-dimensional, teams could always time up and know what I was going to do. But if I learned different moves, then sometimes I'm running by you, sometimes I'm doing a jump-cut, and sometimes I'm spinning. It confuses defenders; they don't know what to expect."

What is the best concert you have ever been to? "The Tortuga festival in Fort Lauderdale. I'm a huge country music fan, and it had a little bit of everybody that I enjoy listening to – Chris Young, Chris Stapleton, Joe Nichols, Thomas Rhett, Jason Aldean, Carrie Underwood. Hearing all of them and watching them perform was just incredible."

Why is your nickname Buddha? "Originally, I thought it was because I was a big baby; I was 12 pounds. But when I was in college, my head coach talked to my dad, and he asked him that same question. My dad told him that out of all of his kids, I'm the only one who came out with his complexion, and everyone else was my mom's. He said I was his good luck charm. People called me Buddha growing up, and it stuck."

Favorite thing to do in your down time? "Listen to music, play video games and play with my dogs. I have two German Shepherds – Scrappy and Chaos."

RAVENS' RED ZONE "D"

The Ravens' defense has been stout in the red zone this season, permitting a 38.1 touchdown percentage mark (8 TDs on 21 drives), which ranks No. 5 in the NFL. Baltimore has also produced an NFL-high 3 red zone take-aways (tied, NYJ).

QB JOE FLACCO ON HOW THE OFFENSE MOVES FORWARD & STRIVES TO IMPROVE:

"You go back to work. You get better, you look at where you made mistakes. But I wouldn't say that, overall, we are trying to fix something that is completely broken. We can't look at it that way. We have to look at the areas that we can do things well in and continue to exploit the defense in those things that we do well. We will make it happen. We have to keep our heads up and play one game at a time. This is where we are right now, and there's nothing we can do to go back in time to change it at this point. We work hard. We are in the building 24/7 trying to get everything as good as it can be, so we will continue to do that."

OLB Terrell Suggs on bouncing back for Thursday night:

"The team is built around the defense, and we don't have to be perfect, but we have to play better than we are. We are seven games in, we have nine left. Right now we stink; you can write it in there, 'Yeah the Ravens suck, yada yada yada.' But with the schedule going ahead, I still think we can do something magical. You know what kind of team we are once we get in 'The Show.' We have a home game on Thursday, an AFC home game on Thursday. So, you defend your home turf, and everything can look up for you."

K Justin Tucker on he and the team turning their attention to Thursday's game so they perform well:

"The short week does present challenges for everybody, coaches and players alike. In the years that I've been blessed to be here, we have done pretty well on Thursday nights, so it's a challenge that we look forward to. I think it will be a great atmosphere, and it will be fun, like it always is. I think if you ask anybody in here, we are all chomping at the bit to play another game, just to get back in the win column."

DT Brandon Williams on the Ravens' defensive effort in last Sunday's game at Minnesota:

"Obviously, the Ravens' defense is historical here. We know that it comes down to us getting out there and keeping offenses at bay. At the same time, I am proud of my guys. We only gave up one offensive touchdown – the rest were field goals. I am proud of my guys. They are fighting their butts off, just doing everything they possibly can to keep it a close game. I wouldn't go to war with anyone else."

Special teams coordinator/associate head coach Jerry Rosburg on punt returner Michael Campanaro:

"I think the word that comes to mind many times as I watch Mike is 'efficient.' He's catching the ball well; you've seen him track the ball over his shoulder a couple times when the guy hits long punts. He's getting vertical, and his ball security skills have been good. The touchdown [in Week 6 vs. Chicago] play was a really good sign, because he set it up well, and he used his speed to get to the edge. I've seen a guy who has been efficient. Now, he's showed a little explosive power, which is good."

RB Alex Collins on what it is like playing at Baltimore's M&T Bank Stadium:

"It's amazing. I love everything about the stadium – the atmosphere, coming out through the flames. The walk-out has to be the best thing about it, though. When we walk out of the locker room and the fans are there shaking our hands, I don't know if they do it like that anywhere else in the NFL. They have the hype song playing, and all your teammates are around. I think that has to be hands-down the best feeling. When I experienced that, I was like, 'Wow. This is one of the coolest things I have ever been a part of."

John Harbaugh on preconceived notions regarding WR Mike Wallace prior to his 2016 Baltimore arrival:

"Maybe it is a good lesson for all of us in life – this idea of judging people and things and circumstances, especially from afar when you have never met the person before, or you have never been in their shoes, or you don't know what they are dealing with. Mike Wallace has been nothing but a leader; he has been nothing but positive and nothing but energetic. I love when he walks out to practice. He pumps me up. He is confident, and he wants the ball and wants to play. But when things don't go well, he is the biggest supporter of just improving and having each other's back."

QB Joe Flacco on how safe T Ronnie Stanley makes him feel in the pocket:

"Ronnie is awesome. He's a young kid that wants to know it all. When you have a guy like that standing to the left of you, it definitely makes you feel comfortable, because you know he's on top of it all, and he's going to do the right thing when the time comes."

Vikings special teams coach Mike Zimmer on Baltimore's standout special teams:

"They're probably the best special teams unit in the league. I know [special teams coordinator/associate head coach] Jerry Rosburg does an unbelievable job – always has. They have the two best specialists [Justin Tucker and Sam Koch] in the league. They have returned a kick for a touchdown, a punt for a touchdown. They have great cover units."

WEEK 7 RECAP AT MINNESOTA

VIKINGS 24, RAVENS 16 • WEEK 7, OCT. 22 • U.S. BANK STADIUM

Vikings K Kai Forbath kicked 6 field goals, RB Latavius Murray rushed for 113 yards, and the Minnesota defense suffocated the Ravens' offense in Baltimore's 24-16 loss at U.S. Bank Stadium last Sunday. The Ravens played without starting wide receivers **WR Jeremy Maclin** (shoulder) and **WR Breshad Perriman** (concussion), plus reserve **WR Chris Matthews** (thigh). Then, **WR Mike Wallace** suffered a concussion on the second possession of the game, leaving the Ravens with just three healthy players at the position, one of whom (**WR Griff Whalen**) had signed earlier that week. The Vikings sacked **QB Joe Flacco** 5 times and did not allow a touchdown until the final play of the game when Flacco hit **WR Chris Moore** with a 13-yard scoring strike. **K Justin Tucker** converted 3 FGs, including a 57-yarder in the first half when neither team scored a touchdown. Baltimore took a 3-0 lead on a 48-yard Tucker FG. Forbath then blasted 52- and 51-yard FGs before Tucker's long tied the game at 6. Forbath then hit a 43-yarder with 35 seconds left in the second quarter. The Vikings opened the third period with another Forbath FG (43) to take a 12-6 lead. After a three-and-out by the Ravens, Minnesota produced its lone TD drive of the day, ending when Murray took an inside handoff and raced 29 yards to the end zone. A missed PAT made the score 18-6. The Ravens tried to rally on the following series, but fell short, settling for another Tucker FG (47). Forbath added 2 more FGs (34 and 32 yards) in the fourth quarter. The 9 FGs made in the contest tied an NFL record for most in one game. The Ravens managed just 208 yards of total offense with 68 added on the game's final drive. The Vikings produced 357 yards with 169 coming on the ground. QB Case Keenum completed 20 of 31 for 188, with TE Kyle Rudolph and WR Adam Thielen each catching 5 for 43 and 41 yards, respectively. Flacco was 27-of-39 for 186 yards, including 8 to **RB Javorius Allen** for only 29 yards. **CB Brandon Carr** stole a first-quarter INT to set up the Ravens' initial FG.

In a magnificent effort showcasing thrilling performances by their defense, offense and special teams units, the Baltimore Ravens won Super Bowl XXXV with a 34-7 victory over the New York Giants. Allowing the Giants a meager 152 total net yards, New York's attack crossed midfield just twice, while Baltimore's "D" posted 4 INTs. LB Ray Lewis was named the game's MVP, capping an accolade-filled season in which he was also tabbed the NFL's Defensive Player of the Year.



QB Joe Flacco - 2012 Super Bowl XLVII MVP

Baltimore defeated San Francisco, 34-31, in Super Bowl XLVII, capturing the franchise's second World Championship. After an amazing firsthalf performance, the Ravens took a commanding 28-6 lead. But following a bizarre, 34-minute power outage that halted play, the 49ers stormed back into contention. Clinging to a 34-29 edge late in the game, the Ravens stood firm on a pivotal goal-line stand, jamming SF on four-straight plays inside the 7-yard line. QB Joe Flacco was named the game's MVP.

THE HARBAUGH FILE

John Harbaugh has led the Ravens to a playoff berth in six (2008-12 & 2014) of his nine full seasons in Baltimore, and in 2012, captured the franchise's second Super Bowl title. Under his guidance, the Ravens have secured an appearance in three AFC Championships (2008, 2011 & 2012).

Here are several Harbaugh quick hits:

• The Ravens are one of seven teams with at least six playoff berths in the past nine seasons (2008-16): GB (8), NE (8), Bal. (6), Cin. (6), Ind. (6), Pit. (6) & Sea. (6).

• The Ravens' 10 playoff wins since 2008 rank second only to New England's 11.

• "Harbs" is the only head coach in NFL history to win a playoff game in each of his first four and five seasons.

• John and his brother, Jim (formerly of the 49ers), are the only head coaches to advance to three conference title games in the first five years as NFL bosses.

• Harbaugh is the only coach in NFL history to win a playoff game in six of the first seven seasons of a coaching career.

• In 2012, Harbaugh became the third coach (with Bill Cowher & Chuck Knox) since the 1970 merger to guide his team to the playoffs in each of his first five seasons.

• Harbaugh owns the second-most playoff wins (10, tied) by a coach in his first nine seasons (since the 1970 merger).

• With the Ravens' 2014 playoff berth, Harbaugh became one of eight coaches in NFL history to make the postseason in six of their first seven seasons coaching.

• For coaches to make the playoffs in at least six of their first nine years, "Harbs" is one of five active coaches to do so (Pete Carroll, Mike McCarthy, Andy Reid & Mike Tomlin).

• Harbaugh, Tom Landry (Dal.) and Tom Coughlin (Jax./NYG) own the most road playoff wins (7) by a HC in NFL history.

ROSBURG LEADS RAVENS SPECIALISTS

SEASONS RAVENS: 10TH NFL: 17TH Special teams coordinator/associate head coach **Jerry Rosburg** has guided a stellar special teams group since arriving in Baltimore in 2008. Below are several standout notes about the coach and his successful group of specialists:

SIX PRO BOWLERS

• Six Ravens have earned eight combined Pro Bowl honors while playing for Rosburg: ST Brendon Ayanbadejo (2008), K Billy Cundiff (2010), RS Jacoby Jones (2012), K Justin Tucker (2013 & 2016), LS Morgan Cox (2015 & 2016) and P Sam Koch (2015).

Prime Kicker & Punter

• Two-time Pro Bowl **K Justin Tucker**, who Rosburg scouted and helped sign as a rookie free agent, owns the NFL's most FGs (181) since entering the NFL in 2012. With an 89.6% career success mark, "Tuck" is the second-most accurate kicker in league history (181-of-202 on FGAs). Earning his first Pro Bowl nod in 2015, **P Sam Koch**'s 46.7 gross average ranked No. 9 in the NFL that season, while his 42.9 net average was No. 2. In 2014, Koch posted the NFL's No. 3 gross (47.4) and No. 1 net (43.3) averages, both career highs and Ravens records.

RAVENS' BIG RETURNS

• Led by Pro Bowl RS Jacoby Jones in the 2012 Super Bowl season, Baltimore ranked first in the NFL in KOR average (27.3). Jones, who became the first player ever to record dual KORs of at least 105 yards in a career, tied for a league-leading 3 kick return TDs (2 KORs & 1 PR). He also tied an NFL record for longest KOR in a Super Bowl with his 108-yard KOR-TD. (In 2014's game at Pit., he added another 108-yarder to his resume, marking 4 total KOR-TDs over 100 yards in his career.)

2017: RAVENS RETURN GAMES SOARS IN WEEK 6 VS. CHICAGO

• In Week 6 vs. Chicago, for the first time in franchise history, the Ravens returned a kickoff and punt return for a TD in the same game. **RB Bobby Rainey Jr.** posted a 96-yard KOR-TD, while **WR Michael Campanaro** registered a 77-yard PR-TD. The Ravens are the first NFL team to have KOR and PR touchdowns in the same game since 2013, when Detroit and Kansas City each accomplished the feat on 12/8/13.

BALTIMORE BLOCK PARTY

Since 2014, the Ravens have produced the NFL's most blocked kicks (12), including an NFL-high 4 (tied, Mia.) in 2016.



✓ Dating back to 2008, the Ravens have outscored opponents 1,831 to 1,244 at home. In their 55 wins during this span, the margin of victory has been a strong 13.7 points per game.

• Under John Harbaugh, the Ravens are 15-2 in September home games. The Ravens have won 18 of their past 20 home games in the month of September.

Super Bowl XLVII MVP QB Joe Flacco was masterful during the Ravens' 2012 playoff run, completing 73 of 126 passes for 1,140 yards, 11 TDs and 0 INTs to produce a 117.2 passer rating. 



NOTE THE QUOTE

ESPN.com's Kevin Seifert on Sam Koch's arsenal of punts:

"Some are designed to hook toward the sideline with maximum hang time. Others use an intentionally low trajectory to aid coverage teams. He has a knuckler and one kick that drops, from the returner's perspective, roughly in the shape of the letter "S." He's debuted a "boomerang" punt that does just what you would imagine it might. Most, but not all, of these punts are intended to discourage a clean catch and minimize the return.

"It's not unusual for NFL punters to develop a "changeup" of sorts, but no one has ever had multiple options at the ready. ... The NFL changes every day, but there are only a few moments in each generation when it transforms. This is one of them. In plain sight, Sam Koch and the Ravens have introduced a new way to punt."



A TREMENDOUS 2016

In 2016, All-Pro **K Justin Tucker** connected on 38 of 39 FGAs (lone miss was a block), posting the fifth-best percentage in NFL single-season history. In addition to making 35-straight FGs at one point (tied for fifth-best streak ever), here are several facts about his remarkable season, which is arguably the best ever by a kicker:

- ✓ Tucker's 38 FGs made ranked No. 1 in the NFL. He was also 27-of-27 on PATs. An NFL single-season record 24 of Tucker's 38 FGs made in 2016 came from 40 yards or beyond.
- ✓ Tucker's 10 FGs of 50-plus yards are a Ravens' single-season record. They tie (Blair Walsh, 2012) for the most in NFL history. (Tucker was a perfect 10-for-10 from 50 yards and out during the 2016 season.)
- ✓ Tucker's 141 points ranked second in the league only behind Atlanta's Matt Bryant (158).
- ✓ In Week 12 vs. Cincy, Tucker became just the ninth kicker in league history to make 3 FGs of 50-plus yards in a single game (52, 57 & 54). He is also the first kicker in NFL history to make 3 FGs of 50-plus yards in the first half of a game. (These feats earned him AFC ST POW honors.)
