NOTABLE STORYLINES

The Browns travel to Los Angeles to face the Chargers at 1:05 p.m. PT (4:05 p.m. ET) on Sunday, Dec. 3. This will mark the Browns first game in Los Angeles since 1993 when they beat both the Rams and Raiders in L.A. The Chargers hold a 15-9-1 advantage in the all-time series. The Browns picked up their lone win of the 2016 season against the Chargers, 20-17, on Dec. 24, 2016.

Last season, the Browns finished 31st in the NFL in both total defense and rushing defense. Through 12 weeks this year, the Browns rank ninth in total defense and eighth in rushing defense. The highest the Browns have finished in run defense since 1999 was in 2013 when the team finished 18th. Dating back to 2016, the Browns defense has not allowed a 300-yard passer in 12 consecutive games, tied for the second-longest active streak in the NFL.

LBs **Joe Schobert** and **Christian Kirksey** rank second and sixth in the NFL in tackles this season, respectively. The pair have played every defensive snap for the Browns this season and join Miami LB Kiko Alonso, N.Y. Jets LB Demario Davis and K.C. DB Ron Parker as the only players in the NFL to have played every defensive snap for their team this season. Schobert recorded a career-high 13 tackles against Cincinnati (11/26) and has logged double digit tackles in five of his last six games. Kirksey is third in the NFL in tackles since 2016.

In six games this season, rookie DL **Myles Garrett** has recorded 17 tackles, five sacks and one fumble recovery. Despite playing just six games, he is tied for second among all NFL rookies in sacks.

Rookie QB **DeShone Kizer** passed for a career-high 268 yards, while adding 39 rushing yards and one touchdown at Cincinnati. He has thrown for 1,823 yards and added 262 rushing yards with five touchdowns. Kizer is tied for first among all NFL quarterbacks in rushing touchdowns this season. His 262 rushing yards are the fourth-most by a Browns quarterback in a season. Kizer's 1,823 passing yards this year are the third-most by a Browns rookie.

RB **Duke Johnson Jr.** totaled four receptions for 32 yards, while adding 35 rushing yards at Cincinnati. He leads the team this season in receptions (50), receiving yards (446), while adding four touchdowns (two rushing and two receiving). Johnson is the first Browns player to record at least 50 receptions in three consecutive seasons since WR **Braylon Edwards** from 2006-08. Among all NFL running backs since 2015, Johnson ranks first in receiving yards (1,494) and second in receptions (164).

Coaching capsules:

Cleveland – Hue Jackson: 9-34, third season as head coach, second with the Browns.

Hue Jackson was named the 16th full-time head coach in Cleveland Browns history on January 13, 2016. He enters his 31st year as a coach, including the last 17 in the NFL. He has spent 10 seasons coaching in the AFC North, helping his team advance to the postseason seven times over that span. Jackson was head coach of the Oakland Raiders in 2011 and guided the team to an 8-8 record. He has also served as offensive coordinator in Washington (2003), Atlanta (2007), Oakland (2010) and Cincinnati (2014-15). Jackson spent 14 years coaching on the college level and was a quarterback at Pacific from 1985-86.

Los Angeles – Anthony Lynn: 5-7, first season as a head coach. Hired January 13, 2017, as the 16th head coach in team history, Anthony Lynn spent the previous two seasons (2015-16) with the Buffalo Bills, including the final game of the 2016 season as the team's interim head coach. Buffalo led the NFL in rushing yards (2,630 in 2016 and 2,432 in 2015) and rushing touchdowns (29 in 2016 and 19, tie in 2015) during both of Lynn's seasons. Over his last two coaching stops (New York Jets and Buffalo), his teams combined to rush for 18,218 yards during that span (2009-16), the most combined yards in the NFL over that time period. Prior to Buffalo, Lynn served as the running backs coach in New York (2009-14), Cleveland (2007-08), Dallas (2005-06) and Jacksonville (2003-04).

The Browns return to FirstEnergy Stadium for the first of consecutive home games when they host the Green Bay Packers at 1:00 p.m. on Sunday, Dec. 10. The Packers hold a 12-7 advantage in the all-time regular season series, including a 6-4 mark in Cleveland.

- Senior Offensive Assistant **Al Saunders** served as the head coach of the Chargers from 1986-88. Prior to being named head coach, **Saunders** served as the wide receivers' coach and assistant head coach from 1983-85.
- Chargers head coach **Anthony Lynn** spent two seasons (2007-08) as the Browns running backs coach.
- Chargers WR **Travis Benjamin** was originally selected by the Browns in the fourth round of the 2012 draft. He set multiple Browns punt return records before signing with San Diego in 2016.
- Chargers LB **Hayes Pullard** was a seventh-round draft pick by the Browns in 2015.
- LB **Deon King** appeared in two games for the Chargers during the 2016 season.
- LB **James Burgess Jr.** was a member of the Chargers' practice squad during the 2016 season.
- Chargers running backs coach **Alfredo Roberts** was the Browns tight ends coach from 2007-08.
- Chargers offensive coordinator **Ken Whisenhunt** served as Cleveland's special teams coordinator in 1999.
- Chargers quarterbacks coach **Shane Steichen** was an offensive quality control coach for the Browns in 2013.
- Chargers offense quality control coach **Dan Shamash** was an offensive assistant for the Browns from 2009-10.
- Head Coach **Hue Jackson** and running backs coach/run game coordinator **Kirby Wilson** are both Los Angeles natives.
- Browns from California: QB **Cody Kessler** (Bakersfield), WR **Bryce Treggs** (Inglewood), DB **Jamar Taylor** (San Diego), DB **Derron Smith** (Banning), OL **Marcus Martin** (Los Angeles), OL **Joel Bitonio** (Long Beach), TE **Randall Telfer** (Rancho Cucamonga), assistant defensive line coach **Ken Delgado** (San Jose), defensive quality control coach **Eric Sanders** (San Francisco) and offensive quality control/assistant wide receivers coach **Bob Saunders** (Walnut Creek). **Kessler** and **Martin** played collegiately at the University of Southern California along with OL **Zach Banner**, while **Treggs** played at the University of California and **Smith** played at Fresno State University.

WHAT TO LOOK FOR THIS WEEK

Defense

A forced fumble would tie for the ninth-most (12) ever recorded by a Browns defensive unit (2000).

RB Isaiah Crowell

With 100 rushing yards, would record his sixth career 100-yard rushing game and tie him for first on the Browns' 100-yard rushing games list since 1999 (William Green, Peyton Hillis and Jamal Lewis.)

With 46 yards on the ground, could become the first Brown to rush for at least 600 yards in four consecutive seasons since Greg Pruitt in 1975-78.

RB Matthew Dayes

With a kickoff return of 50 or more yards, will become the first Brown to record three kickoff returns of 50-plus yards since Joshua Cribbs in 2011.

RB Duke Johnson Jr.

A reception of 25-plus yards would tie him for the most big-play receptions (5) ever recorded by a Browns running back in a single season (Leroy Hoard, 1991).

With 50 receiving yards or more, would be the first Browns running back to record 50-plus receiving yards five times in a single season. It would also tie the fifth-best mark set by an AFC running back in the category since 2000.

With 54 receiving yards, could become the first NFL running back to record 500 receiving yards in each of his first three seasons since Herschel Walker in 1986-88.

Is 106 scrimmage yards away from passing Earnest Byner (2,611, 1984-86) as the Brown with the 10th-most scrimmage yards in his first three NFL seasons.

QB DeShone Kizer

A rushing TD would mark his sixth of the season and would tie Otto Graham (1950, 1953 and 1955) for the second-best total by a Browns quarterback in a single season. It would also tie him for fourth among all NFL rookie quarterbacks in the category since 2000.

With 18 rushing yards, would pass Mike Phipps (279, 1974) for second on the Browns' single-season quarterback rushing list.

DB Jason McCourty

Could start his 100th career game.

An interception would tie his single-season career high of four.

TE David Njoku

A receiving TD would mark his fourth of the season and would be the most ever recorded by a Browns rookie tight end.

The Cleveland Browns earned their only win of the 2016 season following a 20-17 victory over the San Diego Chargers. San Diego and QB Philip Rivers marched down the field and scored on the first possession of the game with an eight-play, 75-yard drive, capped by a 1-yard TD pass to TE Antonio Gates. The Browns answered with a 10-play, 72-yard TD drive, finished by an 8-yard RB Isaiah Crowell TD rush that tied the game at 7-7 just under 10 minutes into the first quarter. The Chargers scored once more in the first quarter as K Josh Lambo culminated the ensuing possession with a 43-yard field goal to gain a 10-7 advantage, but Cleveland answered again as the Browns opened the scoring in the second quarter behind another 10-play drive as Crowell found the end zone on a 4-yard rush for his second TD to give Cleveland a 14-10 advantage. DB Jamar Taylor brought the next San Diego drive to a halt when he picked off a Rivers pass and the Browns capitalized as K Cody Parkey capped the ensuing drive with a 49-yard field goal to take a 17-10 lead that Cleveland would carry into halftime. To begin the third quarter, Parkey finished an eight-play, 57-yard drive with a 27-yard field goal attempt, extending the Browns' lead to 20-10. The Chargers responded as Rivers led an 11-play, 75-yard drive capped by a 1-yard TD pass to WR Tyrell Williams. San Diego had an opportunity to tie the game in the fourth quarter with just over five minutes remaining, but DL Jamie Meder blocked a 32-yard Lambo field goal attempt by bursting through the middle and getting a hand on the kick. The Chargers had one last chance to score on their final possession, but Lambo missed a 45-yard field goal attempt wide right as time expired.

WR Corey Coleman - Caught a team-leading three passes for 64 yards against the Bengals...Has led the team in receiving in three of his four games played this season...Totaled 15 receptions for 206 yards and a score on the year...Returned to action in Week 11 after being activated from injured reserve (hand)...Selected by the Browns 15th overall in the 2016 NFL Draft.

LT Spencer Drango - Appeared in every game this year with five starts...Replaced an injured Joe Thomas at left tackle during the Titans game in Week 7...Made his first start of the season against the Texans in Week 6 as an extra offensive lineman...Selected by the Browns in the fifth round of the 2016 NFL Draft.

LG Joel Bitonio - Started all 42 games he's appeared in since being drafted by the Browns in the second round (35th overall) of the 2014 NFL Draft...Inked a five-year contract extension in March.

C JC Tretter - Started at center in every contest this season...Originally selected by the Green Bay Packers in the fourth round (122nd overall) of the 2013 NFL Draft...Signed by the Browns as an unrestricted free agent on March 9, 2017.

RG Kevin Zeitler - Started every game this year and has now started 82 of 83 career games...Originally drafted by the Cincinnati Bengals in the first round (27th overall) of the 2012 NFL Draft...Joined the Browns as an unrestricted free agent on March 9, 2017.

RT Shon Coleman - Made all 11 starts this season...Selected by the Browns in the third round of the 2016 NFL Draft.

TE Randall Telfer - Played in every game and started 10 this season...Caught two passes for 24 yards this year...Selected by the Browns in the sixth round of the 2015 NFL Draft out of USC.

WR Ricardo Louis - Played in every game with nine starts this season...Is second on the team in receiving with a career-high 26 receptions for 322 yards...Has one special teams tackle...Selected by the Browns in the fourth round of the 2016 NFL Draft.

QB DeShone Kizer - Completed 166 of 313 passes for 1,823 yards and five TDs this season...Leads the team in rushing TDs with five...Started 10 games this year...Dressed, but did not play Week 6...Was 18 of 31 for a career-high 268 passing yards against the Bengals...Added 39 rushing yards and a rushing TD last week...Drafted by the Browns in the second round (52nd overall) of the 2017 NFL Draft.

WILLIAMS NAMED D-COORDINATOR

Gregg Williams was named the Browns defensive coordinator on Jan. 7, 2017. Williams is in his 27th season in the NFL, including three as a head coach and 16 as a defensive coordinator. His defenses have finished in the top five in total defense five times, including the top defense in the NFL in 2000. Williams also oversaw a Saints defensive unit that won Super Bowl XLIV and a Titans defense that advanced to Super Bowl XXXIV. Williams spent the past three seasons (2014-16) as the defensive coordinator for the St. Louis/Los Angeles Rams. In 2016, the Rams defense finished in the top 10 in the NFL in total defense and passing defense.

WILSON SPEARHEADS RUN GAME

Kirby Wilson was named the Browns running backs coach/run game coordinator in 2016. He has 19 years of experience coaching running backs in the NFL, during which time he has coached five running backs who rank in the top 25 for career rushing yards (Emmitt Smith #1, Curtis Martin #4, Edgerrin James #12, Adrian Peterson #16 and Thomas Jones #25) and two of the top four all-time reception leaders among running backs (Larry Centers #1 and Keith Byers #4). Wilson has helped seven different running backs break the 1,000-yard plateau a total of eight times. He has mentored four players to the Pro Bowl and has been to the playoffs with four different franchises, highlighted by the 2002 Buccaneers and 2008 Steelers Super Bowl victories. In Wilson's first season in Cleveland, the Browns finished second in the NFL with a 4.89 rushing average. The average was the seventh-best in team history and the team's best mark since 1966.

DEFENSIVE IMPROVEMENTS

Last season, the Browns finished 31st in the NFL in both total defense and rushing defense. Through 12 weeks this year, the Browns rank ninth in total defense and eighth in rushing defense. The highest the Browns have finished in run defense since 1999 was in 2013 when the team finished 18th. In addition, the Browns are one of five teams (Tennessee, Minnesota, Philadelphia and Chicago) to have not allowed a 300-yard passer this season. Dating back to 2016, the Browns defense has not allowed a 300-yard passer in 12 consecutive games, tied for the second-longest active streak in the NFL.

GORDON REINSTATED

WR **Josh Gordon** was reinstated to the NFL on a conditional basis on November 1. From then on Gordon was allowed to attend meetings, engage in conditioning work and individual workouts. He has been permitted to practice with the team since Monday, November 20. Beginning Monday, November 27, Gordon became eligible at the team's discretion to return to active status or to remain on the Commissioner's Exempt list for an additional week before returning to active status. Gordon had been suspended indefinitely since September of 2016 without pay for violations of the NFL-NFLPA Policy and Program for Substances of Abuse.

Gordon has appeared in 35 games since joining the Browns as a second-round pick in the 2012 supplemental draft. He has 161 receptions for 2,754 yards and 14 touchdowns. In 2013, he led the NFL with 1,646 receiving yards.



RADIO BROADCAST

In one of the most expansive radio rights deals in the NFL, the Browns in 2013 entered a long-term partnership with two local all-sports stations, CBS Radio's 92.3 The Fan (WKRK-FM) and ESPN 850 WKNR, to broadcast all Browns games. CBS Radio's WNCX (98.5 FM) will also carry live game action, as the team will have a triplecast of games in the local market. The stations will serve as the flagship stations on the University Hospitals Cleveland Browns Radio Network. In addition to game broadcasts, more than 1,000 hours of Browns-related shows will air on the University Hospitals Cleveland Browns Radio Network on an annual basis.

Hall of Famer **Otto Graham** is the only Browns quarterback to record more rushing touchdowns in a season than Kizer's five this year. Kizer is tied for first among all NFL quarterbacks in rushing touchdowns this season. His 262 rushing yards are the fourth-most by a Browns quarterback in a season. Kizer's 1,823 passing yards this year are the third-most by a Browns rookie.

RB **Isaiah Crowell** is leading the Browns with 554 rushing yards this year. Last year, Crowell finished with a career-high 952 rushing yards, the most by a Brown since 2010. With 2,819 career rushing yards, he ranks eighth on the Browns all-time rushing list. Crowell's 21 career rushing touchdowns are the fourth-most by a Brown in their first four seasons. His 22 career touchdowns are the third-most by a Browns player since 1999 and his 3,584 scrimmage yards rank fourth.

He leads the team this season in receptions (50), receiving yards (446), while adding four touchdowns (two rushing and two receiving). Johnson is the first Browns player to record at least 50 receptions in three consecutive seasons since WR **Braylon Edwards** from 2006-08. Among all NFL running backs since 2015, Johnson ranks first in receiving yards (1,494) and second in receptions (164).

Rookie RB **Matthew Dayes** returned the opening kickoff 53 yards against Jacksonville (11/19). Dayes also recorded a 71-yard kickoff return against the Vikings (10/29), which is the fourth-longest kickoff return in the NFL this season. He is the first Browns player with two 50-plus yard returns in one season since **Fozzy Whittaker** in 2013. Dayes joins L.A. Rams WR Pharaoh Cooper, New England RB Dion Lewis and Atlanta WR Andre Roberts as the only NFL players with two 50-plus yard kickoff returns this season.

HEAD COACH HUE JACKSON



Hue Jackson was named the 16th full-time head coach in Cleveland Browns history by Dee and Jimmy Haslam on January 13, 2016. He has 30 years of coaching experience, including the last 16 in the NFL. He has spent 10 seasons coaching in the AFC North, during which time he helped his team advance to the postseason seven times. Jackson was head coach of the Oakland Raiders in 2011 and guided the team to an 8-8 record. He has also served as offensive coordinator in Washington (2003), Atlanta (2007), Oakland (2010) and Cincinnati (2014-15).

In his first year with Cleveland, he helped the Browns finish second in the NFL with a 4.89 rushing average, the team's best mark since 1966. Linebacker Christian Kirksey finished third in the NFL with 148 tackles, while left tackle Joe Thomas was selected to his 10th career Pro Bowl.

Jackson helped develop one of the youngest teams in NFL history. The Browns opened the 2016 season with 17 rookies on their 53-man roster, the most by an NFL team in a season opener since 2002. First-round pick wide receiver Corey Coleman was named NFL Rookie of the Week after a 104-yard, two touchdown performance in Week 2. Second-round pick defensive lineman Emmanuel Ogbah recorded a team-best 5.5 sacks, tied for the fourth-most by a Browns rookie. Third-round pick quarterback Cody Kessler registered the second-highest single-game passing yardage total by a Browns rookie with 336 in Week 6.

Prior to joining the Browns, Jackson spent the previous four seasons (2012-15) with the Cincinnati Bengals. During that time, he helped the Bengals to two division titles and a trip to the postseason all four years. In 2012, he served as secondary/assistant special teams coach before coaching the running backs in 2013. Jackson spent 2014-15 as offensive coordinator.

With Jackson as coordinator in 2015, the Bengals offense finished third in the AFC in yards per play (5.7) and points per game (26.2). He was voted by the Professional Football Writers of America (PFWA) as the Co-Assistant Coach of the Year as quarterback Andy Dalton set a career high and franchise record with a 106.3 rating, which led the AFC and was second in the NFL. After losing Dalton to injury in Week 14, Jackson guided quarterback A.J. McCarron to a 2-1 record in the final three games of the season as the Bengals clinched the AFC North title. The Cincinnati running game produced two 700-yard rushers in Jeremy Hill (794) and Giovani Bernard (730) for the first time since 1988. Tight end Tyler Eifert experienced a breakout season after hauling in 13 touchdown receptions, the most by a Bengals tight end in franchise history and the most by a Cincinnati player since 2001. Wide receiver A.J. Green added 10 receiving touchdowns on 86 receptions for 1,297 yards. Eifert, Green and left tackle Andrew Whitworth were selected to the Pro Bowl.

In Jackson's first year as offensive coordinator for Cincinnati in 2014, the run game posted its highest yards per game average (134.1) since 2000. Dalton passed for 3,398 yards and Green totaled 1,041 receiving yards. Hill led all NFL rookies with 1,124 rushing yards, the second-most by a Bengals rookie in team history.

After spending the 2010 season as the Raiders offensive coordinator, Jackson was promoted to head coach in 2011. Oakland finished the year 8-8 and tied for first in the AFC West but missed

the postseason via tiebreaker. The 8-8 mark was the best record by any Raiders team since 2002. The Raiders finished ninth in the NFL in total offense (379.5 yards per game) and seventh in rushing offense (131.9).

Before joining the Raiders, Jackson spent two seasons (2008-09) as quarterbacks coach for Baltimore, helping the Ravens advance to the playoffs both years. He was vital in the development of Joe Flacco, who was named NFL Rookie of the Year in 2008 and became the first rookie quarterback to win two playoff games as the Ravens advanced to the AFC Championship game.

From 2004-06, Jackson served as the Bengals wide receivers coach, helping develop one of the best wide receiver tandems in NFL history with Chad Johnson and T.J. Houshmandzadeh. During that span, the two combined to average 173.3 catches, 2,363.3 receiving yards and 15 touchdowns per season. In 2005, Johnson led the AFC with 1,432 receiving yards. In 2006, Johnson and Houshmandzadeh became the first Bengals duo to each top 1,000 receiving yards in the same season.

Jackson gained his first fulltime NFL experience with Washington, where he served as the running backs coach from 2001-02, before being promoted to offensive coordinator in 2003. Under Jackson's tutelage, running back Stephen Davis led the NFC with 1,432 rushing yards in 2001.

Jackson spent 14 years coaching on the college level, going from a graduate assistant at Pacific all the way to offensive coordinator at Southern California. He spent four seasons (1997-2000) as USC's offensive coordinator, where he also helped to recruit and develop players, including quarterback Carson Palmer, who went on to win the Heisman Trophy and be selected No. 1 overall in the NFL draft.

He was a minority coaching fellowship intern with the Los Angeles Rams in 1990, Arizona Cardinals in 1992 and Washington Redskins in 1995. He also served as the running backs/wide receivers/special teams coach for the London Monarchs of the World League in 1991.

Born Oct. 22, 1965, Jackson was a quarterback at Pacific from 1985-86 and threw for 2,544 yards and 19 touchdowns. The Los Angeles native also lettered in basketball and earned his degree in physical education.

Jackson and his wife, Michelle, have three daughters, Jordyn, Baylee and Haydyn.

The Hue Jackson Foundation

Hue Jackson and his wife, Michelle, launched the Hue Jackson Foundation on July 20, 2017. The foundation is committed to empowering children, teen and adult survivors of human trafficking through the funding of organizations that champion for and serve as a voice for those who are exploited. The foundation also focuses its efforts to further awareness, prevention and healing for victims of human trafficking. The foundation's website is www.huejackson.org.

FirstEnergy Stadium, Cleveland, Ohio

The Cleveland Browns dropped the 2017 season opener to the Pittsburgh Steelers, 21-18. Despite limiting the Steelers to 290 yards, two touchdown receptions by Steelers TE Jesse James proved to be the difference in the contest. On the game's opening possession, Pittsburgh forced a three-and-out and on fourth down, deep in Browns' territory, its special teams unit opened the scoring. LB Tyler Matakevich blocked Britton Colquitt's punt and Steelers LB Anthony Chickillo recovered it in the end zone for a touchdown to give the Steelers an early 7-0 advantage. Later in the quarter, rookie QB DeShone Kizer led the team on a 12-play, 68-yard drive, which he capped off by sneaking into the end zone from a yard out to even the scoring. With 45 seconds left in the first half, Steelers QB Ben Roethlisberger found James in the back of the end zone for a 4-yard score to give Pittsburgh a 14-7 lead heading into the locker room. As Cleveland's defense forced a three-and-out on Pittsburgh's first possession of the second half, Kizer led the offense down the field and set up fellow rookie K Zane Gonzalez, who notched a 24-yard field goal to cut Pittsburgh's lead to 14-10. On the game's next possession, Roethlisberger marched the Steelers 75 yards down the field and connected with James again for his second touchdown reception on the afternoon to extend their lead to 21-10. Late in the fourth quarter, DB Derrick Kindred picked off Roethlisberger and returned it 30 yards to the Cleveland 31-yard line. Later in the quarter, on fourth-and-two from the 3-yard line, Kizer hit WR Corey Coleman at the goal line for a touchdown, the first touchdown pass of his career. RB Isaiah Crowell punched in a two-point conversion to cut the lead to 21-18, but Pittsburgh would not let Cleveland get the ball back as they sealed 21-18 victory.

The Cleveland Browns dropped their second game as Baltimore's defense forced five turnovers in a 24-10 Ravens victory. Early in the first quarter, a strip-sack by Ravens LB Terrell Suggs gave Baltimore's offense a short field and a 4-yard TD run by RB Terrence West for a 7-0 lead. Midway through the second quarter, Ravens QB Joe Flacco led Baltimore on a six-play, 64-yard drive capped by a 4-yard TD strike to RB Javorious Allen, extending the lead to 14-0. Replacing injured QB DeShone Kizer, QB Kevin Hogan responded with a five-play, 83-yard drive. Hogan connected with rookie TE David Njoku for a 23-yard TD, the first TD pass of Hogan's career and the first TD reception of Njoku's, to cut the deficit, 14-7. Later in the second quarter, Ravens rookie LB Tyus Bowser intercepted a Hogan pass, resulting in a 27-yard return and a 2-yard TD pass from Flacco to WR Jeremy Maclin for a 21-7 Ravens lead at halftime. Midway through the third quarter, rookie K Zane Gonzalez connected on a 38-yard field goal to shrink Baltimore's lead, but Ravens K Justin Tucker converted a 28-yard field goal in the fourth quarter to make the score 24-10. On the game's next possession, Kizer marched the Browns 70 yards down the field before Ravens DB Lardarius Webb intercepted a Kizer pass in the end zone. Cleveland's offense wasn't able to muster any more points as Baltimore's defense sealed the 24-10 victory with a late fourth quarter stand. Early in the first quarter, OL Joe Thomas exceeded 10,000 straight snaps for his career, the longest-known streak in NFL history.

In a Week 3 road contest, the Cleveland Browns fell to the Indianapolis Colts, 31-28. Trailing 7-0 early in the second quarter, RB Duke Johnson Jr. avoided a couple would-be tacklers and leaped over the pylon for a 19-yard touchdown run to tie the game at 7-7. On the Colts' ensuing possession, QB Jacoby Brissett spun away from a defender and scampered into the end zone for a 7-yard touchdown to give the Colts a 14-7 advantage. After Browns P Britton Colquitt pinned Indianapolis inside its own 5-yard line, Brissett led the Colts on a five-play, 97-yard drive capped off by a 61-yard touchdown pass to WR T.Y. Hilton to extend their lead to 21-7. Indy would tack on its third score of the quarter as RB Frank Gore found the end zone from four yards out to give the Colts a 28-7 lead. With 44 seconds to play in the half, QB DeShone Kizer linked up with WR Jordan Leslie, who made a one-handed grab for a 26-yard gain down to the Colts' 2-yard line. Two plays later, Kizer found TE David Njoku in the back of the end zone for his second touchdown reception in as many games to cut Indy's lead to 28-14 at the half. After a scoreless third quarter, Colts K Adam Vinatieri notched a 33-yard field goal to extend their lead to 31-14. Later in the fourth, Kizer found WR Kenny Britt for an 11-yard touchdown to make it 31-21. Cleveland got the ball back with 4:05 to play and went on an 11-play, 70-yard drive in 2:01, capped off with a QB sneak by Kizer to cut the lead to 31-28. However, a final effort would see Colts S Malik Hooker intercept a Kizer pass with no time remaining to seal the victory, 31-28.

Despite outgaining the Jets 419-212, the Browns fell to New York, 17-14. On the game's opening possession, Browns rookie DL Myles Garrett, who was making his NFL debut, reached Jets QB Josh McCown to record the first sack of his career on his first NFL snap. Garrett would register another sack in the second quarter to become the first No. 1 overall pick to record multiple sacks in his NFL debut. Scoring opportunities plagued the Browns throughout the contest as the team had two red zone turnovers (one fumble and one interception) and two missed field goals. With time winding down in the first half, Jets K Chandler Catanzaro notched a 57-yard field goal to give New York a 3-0 lead at the half. To start the second half, Browns QB Kevin Hogan relieved rookie DeShone Kizer and led the team on a 10-play, 75-yard drive capped by a one-handed touchdown reception by rookie TE David Njoku to give the Browns a 7-3 advantage. Njoku's third touchdown reception of the year tied for the most by a Browns rookie tight end in a single season. Later in the quarter, McCown connected with TE Austin Seferian-Jenkins for a 2-yard score to regain the lead, 10-7. In the final frame, the Jets took over on downs and marched 97 yards down the field as McCown found WR Jermaine Kearse for a 24-yard touchdown to extend their lead to 17-7. Cleveland would tack on another late score as Hogan dumped off a short pass to RB Duke Johnson Jr., who scampered 41 yards to the end zone, to cut New York's lead to 17-14. However, after recovering an onside kick, New York would kneel out the clock to secure the victory.

Despite a late comeback attempt, Cleveland dropped its Week 12 matchup against the Cincinnati Bengals, 30-16. The Browns opened the game with an 11-play, 66-yard drive capped by a 27-yard field goal by rookie K Zane Gonzalez for an early 3-0 advantage. On the ensuing possession, the Bengals answered with an 8-yard touchdown pass from QB Andy Dalton to WR Tyler Boyd to put Cincinnati in front, 7-3. In the second quarter, Bengals K Randy Bullock added a trio of field goals (31, 49 and 21) to extend Cincinnati's lead, 16-3. Gonzalez connected once again with a 21-yard field goal to bring the Browns within 10 at half. Dalton opened the second half with a 10-play, 78-yard drive, ending with a 1-yard touchdown pass to TE Tyler Kroft for a 23-6 Bengals lead. Later in the third quarter, Gonzalez matched a career high with his third field goal made (39) to bring the Browns within two scores. In the fourth quarter, rookie QB DeShone Kizer found the end zone from three yard out to shrink Cincinnati's lead to 23-16. But a late 11-yard touchdown run by Bengals rookie RB Joe Mixon sealed Cincinnati's victory, 30-16.
