COWBOYS & REDSKINS

Series Notables:

- * Dallas' 69 wins over Washington are the most victories over any other team in the league.
- * The Cowboys have faced only one team (Philadelphia - 117) more times than they have faced the Redskins (115).
- * The Cowboys won a series-high 10 straight games from 1997-02.
- * They played in two playoff games against each other, the 1972 and 1982 NFC Championship Game - both Redskins wins.

A Cowboys Win Would:

- * Mark Dallas' 70th win against Washington - most against any opponent.

- * End a three-game losing streak, including a two-game skid at home.

★ JERRY JONES ★ Owner/President/General Manager, 1989-Present 2017 Pro Football Hall of Fame Inductee

Recognized around the NFL as one of his era's most influential and passionate owners, Jerry Jones was selected for induction to the Pro Football Hall of Fame as a contributor in February of 2017 and completed his trek to Canton with the unveiling of his Hall of Fame bust and induction ceremony on August 5, 2017.

In addition to becoming the first NFL owner to lead his franchise to three Super Bowl titles (1992, 93 and 95) in a four year period of time, Jones' efforts in the areas of sports marketing, promotion, stadium development, and network television negotiations created a lasting imprint on the landscape of the NFL and the American sports culture.

Since his purchase of the Cowboys in 1989, the team has won 10 division titles, while advancing to the postseason 14 times and reaching the NFC Championship game four times.

As Dallas' general manager, Jones has overseen personnel efforts that include the acquisition of 47 different players who have combined for a collective total of 142 Pro Bowl appearances. Six Cowboys players from Jones' tenure of ownership have been inducted into the Pro Football Hall of Fame -- Troy Aikman, Michael Irvin, Emmitt Smith, Deion Sanders, Larry Allen and Charles Haley - while Jones has served as the presenter for three of those men: Irvin, Smith and Allen.

The lasting landmarks to Jones' legacy of promoting and protecting the future of the sport of football can be seen in the conception and construction of AT&T Stadium in Arlington, Texas and The Star in Frisco, Texas. The stadium, which opened in 2009, has a capacity of over 100,000 and is the largest and most technologically sound indoor/outdoor stadium in the world. The Star, which serves as the world training headquarters for the Dallas Cowboys, is a state-of-the-art venue that enjoys a first-of-its-kind partnership with its surrounding community in Frisco, Texas, and the young men and women who compete in athletics at the high school and youth sports levels.

On the league level, Jones has served lengthy stints on nearly every significant NFL ownership committee, including the Competition Committee, the Broadcast Committee, the Management Council's Executive Committee, the Health and Safety Advisory Committee, and he is currently the chairman of the NFL Network and Pro Football Hall of Fame Committees.

Born on October 13, 1942, Jones' connections to the game of football go back to his playing days at North Little Rock High School. He then earned a scholarship to play at the University of Arkansas where he was a co-captain of the 1964 Razorbacks' national championship team.

Jones, who became the 15th NFL owner to be selected for induction into the Hall of Fame, is the only man in football history to both play for a collegiate national championship football team and own a Super Bowl winning club.

Jones was born on Oct. 13, 1942 in Los Angeles, Calif.

Player Spotlight

82 JASON WITTEN

★ Jason Witten caught seven passes against the Chargers on Thanksgiving and has been a consistent target for Dak Prescott since the QB took over the offense in 2016. He has logged nine games with at least seven receptions over that span, the second-most among tight ends (Travis Kelce, 11) and tied for the eighth most overall. Over the course of his career, Witten has recorded the 11th-most seven catch games in NFL history, totaling 56 games for the Cowboys:

★ Witten now has 50 catches on the season, his 14th season of at least 50 receptions, tied for the third-most by an NFL player in league history. He is the fifth player in NFL history to post 14 seasons with at least 50 receptions

BY THE NUMBERS



4.72

The Cowboys are averaging 4.72 yards-per-rush on the season, which is second in the league behind only New Orleans (4.95). Dallas also has 44 runs of 10-plus yards in 2017, second behind Philadelphia, and the most rushing touchdowns of 10-plus yards in the league with six.

25.4

The Cowboys are limiting their opponents to an average starting field position of the 25.4-yard line in 2017, the second-best figure in the league, thanks in large part of punter Chris Jones, who has forced a league-high tying 27 punts downed inside the 20-yard line.

51.5

Dallas has been productive on first down in 2017, gaining four-plus yards on 51.5% of their first down plays, the fourth highest percentage in the league, with an average of 5.4 yards-per-play. Conversely, the Cowboys are allowing their opponents an average of 4.66 yards on first downs, the sixth lowest figure in the league.

85.7

Terrance Williams ranks first league-wide against the Redskins in receiving first down percentage, converting 24 of his 28 catches (85.7%) against Washington into first downs (minimum 25 receptions since 1994). Williams is averaging 18.9 yards-per-catch in nine career games against Washington.

2017 RANKINGS AND UPCOMING MILESTONES

With the 2017 season underway for the Dallas Cowboys, the following information pertains to the most current team rankings, upcoming milestones, last week's notes and page location in the release for the remainder of the information:

2017 DALLAS COWBOYS CURRENT TEAM RANKINGS:

- * The Dallas rushing attack ranks fourth in the NFL with an average of 134.8 rushing yards-per-game. The Cowboys are also second in the league lead with 82 rushing first downs and are third with 13 rushing touchdowns. **(RUSHING TO THE TOP - page 15)**.
- * The Cowboys have 44 big-play runs of 10-or-more yards to place second in the league. Dallas also has 10 rushes of 20+ yards to tie for fifth **(RUSHING TO THE TOP - page 15)**.
- * The Dallas offense boasts 18 drives of five-or-more minutes - tied for fourth in the NFL in 2017. The unit also has 73 points during those drives - second-most in the NFL **(DRIVE FOR FIVE - page 15)**.
- * The Dallas offense has scored on 43 of its 116 drives for a 37.1% scoring efficiency rate to place 11th in the NFL, while boasting the fourth-highest touchdown efficiency rate (25.0%) and is tied for the fifth-most touchdown drives (29) **(FINISHING DRIVES WITH SCORES - page 15)**.
- * The Cowboys have the fourth-highest red zone touchdown efficiency rate in the NFL (61.5), while their 24 touchdowns in the red zone are tied for third **(RED ALERT - page 15)**.
- * Dallas' offense is sixth in the league with a 43.8 third down percentage (60-of-137) **(THIRD-AND-NO PROBLEM - page 15)**.
- * The Cowboys defense has collected 28.0 sacks to tie for 13th in the league **(SACK ATTACK - page 21)**.

2017 DALLAS COWBOYS UPCOMING MILESTONES - TEAM:

- * Dallas (currently at 498) needs two wins to become the 12th NFL team with 500 regular season wins **(A WINNING TREND - page 7)**.

2017 DALLAS COWBOYS CURRENT INDIVIDUAL RANKINGS:

- * QB Dak Prescott is tied for 13th in the NFL in passing touchdowns (16) **(DAKOTA THE DUDE - page 10)**.
- * Prescott's five rushing touchdowns are tied for the most by a quarterback in the NFL in 2017 **(RAYNE MAN - page 11)**.
- * DE DeMarcus Lawrence is tied for third in the NFL with 11.5 sacks **(TANK ON A ROLL - page 21)**.
- * P Chris Jones is tied for the league lead with 27 punts downed inside the opponent's 20-yard line **(THE PUNT-ISHER - page 23)**.
- * KR Ryan Switzer ranks fourth in the NFL - tops among rookies - with 469 kickoff return yards and a 26.1 average **(SWITZ BEATZ - page 23)**.

2017 DALLAS COWBOYS UPCOMING MILESTONES - INDIVIDUAL:

Dez Bryant - WR

- * Dez Bryant (currently at 71) needs one touchdown to overtake Bob Hayes as the franchise leader in receiving touchdowns **(BY DEZIGN - page 19)**.
- * Bryant (currently at 7,199) needs 97 receiving yards to surpass Bob Hayes (7,295) for fifth all-time in team history **(BY DEZIGN - page 19)**.

Tyrone Crawford - DE

- * Tyrone Crawford (currently at 4.0) needs 1.5 sacks to top his 2015 total (5.0) and establish a single-season career-high.

Chris Jones - P

- * Chris Jones (currently at 27) needs one punt downed inside the opponent's 20-yard line to tie Mike Saxon (1986) and Mat McBriar (2005) - both with 28 - for the fourth-highest tally in a single season in team history. With three he ties his own career-best of 30 set in 2013 total for third.
- * Jones (currently at 140) needs five punts downed inside the opponents' 20-yard line to surpass Danny White (144) for third on the club's all-time career list.

DeMarcus Lawrence - DE

- * DeMarcus Lawrence (11.5) needs one sack to tie Randy White (1983 and 1984), Charles Haley (1994) and Greg Ellis (2007) - all with 12.5 - for the seventh-most sacks in a single season in team history, since sacks became official in 1982. With 2.0 sacks he passes Ed Jones (13.0 - 1985) for sixth.

Dak Prescott - QB

- * Dak Prescott (currently at 39) needs one passing touchdown to become the eighth player in team history to reach 40 career touchdowns **(THE DAK KNIGHT RISES - page 11)**.
- * Prescott (currently at five) needs two rushing touchdowns to surpass his 2016 total (six) for the most rushing scores by a Cowboys quarterback during a single season in franchise history **(RAYNE MAN - page 11)**.
- * Prescott (currently at 247) needs 36 yards to top his 2016 rushing yards total (282) and establish a career-high. With 53 yards he will become the fourth quarterback in team history - sixth time overall - to rush for 300 yards in a single season.
- * Prescott (currently at 519) needs 92 rushing yards to pass Tony Romo (620) for the fifth-most rushing yards by a Dallas quarterback. **(RAYNE MAN - page 11)**.

Ryan Switzer - WR/KR

- * By notching a 100-yard kickoff return yardage performance, Ryan Switzer (currently on a two-game streak) will become the fourth Cowboy to post a streak of at least three consecutive 100-yard kickoff return games, and the first since Tyson Thompson had a franchise-long streak of four games during the 2005 season **(SWITZ BEATZ - page 23)**.

Jason Witten - TE

- * Jason Witten (currently at 429) needs 71 receiving yards to reach 500 yards on the season for the 14th season of his career to become the 10th player - second tight end - in NFL history to reach that mark in at least 14 seasons. He would also become the fifth player - second tight end - to post at least 500 receiving yards in 14 consecutive seasons **(500x13 - page 18)**.
- * Witten (currently at 50) needs 10 receptions to give him 60 on the season for his 14th overall season to become the third player in NFL history - second tight end - to reach that mark in at least 14 seasons and serve as the third-most most seasons with 60-plus receptions in league history by any player. He would also become the second player - second tight end - to post 60 receptions in at least 14 consecutive seasons **(50x14 - page 17)**.

2017 MOST RECENT NOTES - VS LA CHARGERS (11/23)

2017 DALLAS COWBOYS MOST RECENT NOTES VS LA CHARGERS (11/23) - INDIVIDUAL:

Dez Bryant - WR

* Dez Bryant reached 50 receptions on the season for the sixth time of his career against the LA Chargers (11/23). His six seasons with 50 catches ranks third all-time in team history (**88 GOOD FOR 50 - page 20**).

L.P. Ladouceur - LS

* L.P. Ladouceur played in his 200th career regular season game.

Dak Prescott - QB

* Dak Prescott completed 20-of-27 passes for 179 yards with no touchdowns and two interceptions.

* Prescott threw for 179 yards to give him 5,985 for his career to surpass Quincy Carter (5,839) for eighth on the club's all-time passing yards list (**THE DAK KNIGHT RISES - page 11**).

* Prescott's 20 completions gave him 532 for his career and helped him move past Steve Pelluer (520) for seventh on the franchise's all-time completions list (**THE DAK KNIGHT RISES - page 11**).

Rod Smith - RB

* Rod Smith rushed a career-high nine times for 41 yards while scoring his first career touchdown on a two-yard run in the fourth quarter.

Ryan Switzer - WR/KR

* Ryan Switzer returned four kickoffs for 102 yards (25.5 avg.). It was his second career - second consecutive - 100-yard kickoff return game. He had 147 kickoff return yards last week against Philadelphia (11/19) (**SWITZ BEATZ - page 23**).

* Switzer became the first Cowboy returner with at least a two-game streak since Miles Austin had a two-game streak during the 2007 season. Overall, he is the 11th Cowboy with back-to-back 100-yard kickoff return games – 14th overall time (**SWITZ BEATZ - page 23**).

Jason Witten - TE

* Jason Witten caught seven passes for 44 yards.

* Witten's 44 yards gave him 12,317 for his career to move past Jimmy Smith (12,287) for 21st all-time amongst league pass catchers (**LEADING MAN - page 16**).

* Witten (853) moved past Detroit's Herman Moore (834) for the most receiving yards by an NFL player on Thanksgiving Day, and his seven receptions extended his Thanksgiving-best total to 80 receptions on Turkey Day – most in NFL history.

* Witten's seven catches gave him 50 on the season. Overall, it is his 14th season to reach at least 50 receptions, tied for the third-most by an NFL player in league history, and he is the fifth player in NFL history to post 14 seasons with at least 50 receptions (**50x14 - page 17**).

* He also became the fourth player – second tight end – to post 14 consecutive seasons with 50 receptions (**50x14 - page 17**).

HEAD COACHES

JASON GARRETT (64-54, 7th Year)

Jason Garrett was named the eighth head coach in Dallas Cowboys history on January 5, 2011. Garrett became the first former Dallas Cowboys player to become the team's head coach. As a backup quarterback during his playing career in Dallas, he started nine-of-23 games played and was a member of teams that won six division titles and three Super Bowl championships.

Garrett was elevated to the Cowboys top job after taking over as the team's interim head coach midway through 2010. He guided the club to a 5-3 mark to finish the season after the team started 1-7. He led Dallas to an 8-8 record, narrowly missing the playoffs and an NFC East Division title in each his first three full seasons as head coach (2011-13). Garrett guided the 2014 squad to an NFL-best tying 12-4 record, the club's 22nd Division title - 18th NFC East title - 31st postseason appearance and 34th playoff win. His team fought through adversity in 2015, especially on the injury front where they endured injuries to Tony Romo, Dez Bryant and Orlando Scandrick amongst others, while slipping to 4-12 on the season. The team bounced back under Garrett in 2016, completing the club's largest one-season turnaround in franchise history with a nine-game difference, finishing with a 13-3 record in 2016. The record included beginning the season 0-1 and going on to win 11 straight games - the longest single-season win streak in team history. Garrett's Cowboys won their second division championship with him at the helm, while earning the NFC's top overall seed and hosting an NFC Divisional Playoff Game for the first time since 2007. He was named AP Coach of the Year for his team's 2016 accomplishments.

From 2007-13, when Garrett was brought on as the Cowboys offensive coordinator, the unit finished among the NFL's top-10 in total offense in five of his seven years at the helm: 2013 (10th), 2012 (6th), 2010 (10th), 2009 (2nd) and 2007 (2nd). The team has set single-season records in a handful of categories, including topping 6,000 net yards for the first four times in franchise history (2009- 6,390; 2011 - 6,008; 2014 - 6,138 and 2016 - 6,027). Since his arrival in 2007, not only has the team set single-season records in numerous offensive categories, but the club's cumulative numbers for gross passing yards (39,993) and total points (3,919) represent the best totals over a 10-year span in the history of the organization while the club's 58,567 total net yards are second.

JAY GRUDEN (26-34-1, 4th Year)

Jay Gruden was named the 29th head coach of the Washington Redskins on January 9, 2014. He oversaw a record-shattering offense in 2016 that posted team records in total net yards (6,545), net passing yards (4,758) and yards-per-play (6.40), ranking in the top-three in the NFL in all three categories. Gruden guided the Redskins to a 9-7 record and an NFC East title in 2015, becoming only the sixth coach in team history to lead the franchise to a play-off berth within the first two years of a coaching tenure. Excluding interim coaches, Gruden, 46, became the team's youngest head coaching hire since hiring eventual Pro Football Hall of Famer Joe Gibbs at 40 years of age in 1981. He helped the Redskins to team records in completions (364) and completion percentage (66.5) in his first season in 2014. Before joining the Redskins, Gruden spent his previous three seasons as offensive coordinator for the Cincinnati Bengals. Prior to joining the Bengals, Gruden served two years with the Florida Tuskers of the United Football League from 2009-10, serving as the offensive coordinator in 2009, and in 2010, he assumed the roles of head coach and general manager, and led the Tuskers to their second consecutive championship game appearance. Gruden coached for seven seasons (2002-08) with the Tampa Bay Buccaneers, earning a Super Bowl championship ring as an offensive assistant in 2002. While coaching in the Arena Football League, he won six combined league championships - four as a quarterback and two as a head coach. Gruden played quarterback (2002-03) and served as head coach (2004-08) of the AFL's Orlando Predators, all while simultaneously working as an offensive assistant with the Buccaneers. In all, Gruden served as head coach of the Predators for nine seasons (1998-2001 and 2004-08), leading the Predators to four championship game appearances and two league titles as a coach. During a two-year hiatus from coaching the Predators in 2002-03, he returned to the playing field as Orlando's quarterback, leading the Predators to playoff appearances in both seasons. In his eight seasons as a player in the AFL, Gruden completed 1,673-of-2,775 passes (60.3 percent) for 21,578 yards with 398 touchdowns and 99 interceptions. In addition to his time with Orlando, he spent six seasons (1991-96) at quarterback for the Tampa Bay Storm, winning four AFL titles and being named MVP of ArenaBowl VII in 1993.

A WINNING TREND

The Dallas Cowboys entered the 2017 season as one-of-12 teams in the league with at least 490 regular season wins. At the end of Week 16 in 2014, Dallas became just the 12th team with 475 all-time wins with the win against Indianapolis (12/21/14). Dallas is currently 12th on the NFL's all-time regular season wins list:

WINNING HEAD COACH

Under Dallas Cowboys Head Coach Jason Garrett's direction, the team secured its second NFC East divisional title with a 13-3 record in 2016, and he was named AP Coach of the Year. He also had an 11-game win streak to establish the longest single-season win streak in franchise history. Garrett won his 50th regular season game at Green Bay (10/16/16) to become only the second head coach in franchise history to reach 50 wins. He tied his personal best with the club's 12th win of the season against Tampa Bay (12/18/16) - tied the second-most wins by a Cowboys head coach. It also marked Garrett's second 12-win season to give him the third-most 12-plus win seasons by a Dallas head coach. He then bettered his personal-best with his 13th win against Detroit (12/26/16), while tying Jimmy Johnson (1992) and Wade Phillips (2007) for the most wins by a Cowboys head coach in a single season.

Garrett wrapped up the 2014 regular season with a record of 12-4 - the fifth coach to reach 12 wins-or-better in a season in team history. He also secured his first NFC East Division title as the head coach. Against the N.Y. Giants (10/19/14), Garrett passed former head coaches Bill Parcells and Phillips (both with 34) with his 35th regular season win to place fourth in team history. He passed Barry Switzer (40) for third with his 41st victory at Washington (12/28/14), then tied Johnson (44) for the second-most victories at Miami (11/22/15), and passed Johnson at Washington (12/7/15).

Including his 5-6 record in the 2017 season, Garrett's current regular season record as the head coach of the Dallas Cowboys stands at 63-52, with the second-most wins all-time in team history:

PICK A DAY, ANY DAY

This week's game is Dallas' fourth-of-five scheduled primetime games in 2017. This season is the 12th straight in which Dallas plays three-or-more primetime games.

In total, Dallas has played in 162 primetime kickoffs - 82 Monday night, four on Thursday, one each Wednesday and Friday, 12 Saturday and 62 on Sunday. The Cowboys hold an 88-74 record in primetime games. Dallas' longest primetime win streak was 11 games (2006-08) and its longest losing streak was six (2010-11). Dallas won 12 straight primetime road games from 2005-09. The Cowboys were 5-1 in 2016, and are 2-1 in 2017.

Cole Beasley - WR

Has 37 receptions for 401 yards and two touchdowns in 11 career games. Caught two passes for eight yards in the first game this season.

In 13 games caught 62 passes for 916 yards and seven scores, including an eight-catch, two-score, 145-yard game (11/22/12). Made four grabs for 39 yards in the first game this season.

Byron Jones - S

Has 31 tackles, a tackle for loss, three pass breakups and an interception in five games. Recorded his first career touchdown on an 21-yard interception return earlier this season at Washington (10/29/17).

Chris Jones - P

In nine games has a gross average of 46.2 and a net average of 41.9 on 33 punts, with 13 downed inside the 20-yard line and a long of 57 yards.

DeMarcus Lawrence - DE

Logged 3.0 sacks, 14 tackles, six quarterback pressures and a tackle for loss in four games. Notched his first career multi-sack game with two quarterback takedowns at Washington (12/7/15). Had a sack, three pressures and a fumble recovery in the first game this season.

Alfred Morris - RB

Was drafted by Washington in the sixth round of the 2012 NFL Draft, and in four seasons, rushed 1,078 times for 4,713 yards (4.4 avg.) and 29 touchdowns while starting all 64 games of his Redskins career. Has nine carries for 22 yards and a touchdown in three games against his former team.

Dak Prescott - QB

Is 3-0 in three starts while completing 53-of-76 passes for 630 yards with one touchdown and no interceptions for a 99.1 rating. Also rushed 12 times for 61 yards (5.1 avg.) and two scores. Passed for 143 yards with no touchdowns and no interceptions in the first contest of 2017.

Orlando Scandrick - CB

Has two of his 9.5 career sacks against Washington and two of his seven career interceptions in 15 games. Returned a blocked field goal 86 yards along with seven tackles - two for loss - and a pass breakup in the first game this season.

Terrance Williams - WR

In nine games caught 28 passes for 530 yards and two touchdowns. Recorded career-highs in receptions (eight) and yards (173) in the season 2015 finale against Washington (1/3/16). Made two receptions for 36 yards in the first game of 2017.

Jason Witten - TE

In 29 games caught 128 passes for 1,438 yards and eight touchdowns. Had a career-long reception of 69 yards (12/27/09). Had one 10-catch game (12/19/10) and two 100-yard games (12/27/09 and 12/19/10). Made three receptions for 31 yards in the first matchup this season.

In 2017, the Dallas Cowboys hold a 2-4 record at home, and overall, boast a 36-34 regular season record, a 2-1 postseason record, and a 38-35 overall mark inside AT&T Stadium.

The Cowboys finished the 2014 regular season with an undefeated 8-0 record on the road - the only squad with a perfect mark away from home in the NFL. The Cowboys eight road wins were the most in team history during the regular season since the NFL began a 16-game schedule. They were the second team in franchise history to win all road games in a season, joining the 1968 team, which won all seven of its road games during a 14-game season. In NFL history, they were the sixth team since the 1970 NFL merger to form a perfect 8-0 record on the road, joining the 2007 New England Patriots, the 2001 St. Louis Rams, the 1984, 1989 and the 1990 San Francisco 49ers.

Dallas continued its road victory streak into 2015, winning the first contest away from home at Philadelphia (9/20) before falling to the Saints at New Orleans (10/4) in overtime, ending the road run. Dating back to the Cowboys final road game of the 2013 season at Washington (12/22), Dallas won 10 consecutive regular season road games to tie a franchise-high with both the 2006-07 and 1968-69 squads for the longest road win streak in team history.

SOLD OUT STADIUMS

The Cowboys have played in front of sold out stadiums in 450 of their last 452 games (including playoffs) and in 252 consecutive games. They played in front of sold out crowds in 153 consecutive games at Texas Stadium (including playoffs) - dating back to Dec. 16, 1990 against Phoenix, their last home non-sellout. Dallas opened what is now named AT&T Stadium with the largest crowd to witness a regular season NFL game with 105,121 tickets distributed and have 73 straight sellouts (including playoffs). The Cowboys have sold out each of their last 225 home games.

On the road, Dallas has played in front of sold out crowds in 125 straight games (including playoffs), dating back to its last road non-sellout - at Arizona (10/20/02).

DAK TO THE FUTURE

The Dallas Cowboys selected Rayne Dakota "Dak" Prescott in the fourth round of the 2016 NFL Draft (135th overall). Following injuries at the quarterback position during the preseason to Kellen Moore and Tony Romo that opened the way for him to start, Prescott never looked back, setting multiple franchise rookie quarterback records along the way. He started all 16 games of the 2016 season for Dallas to become the first rookie quarterback drafted in the fourth round-or-later in NFL history to accomplish that feat, while his 13-3 record is the best in franchise history by a rookie and tied the most wins by an NFL rookie in league history.

Amongst league quarterbacks in 2016, Prescott finished the regular season ranked third in quarterback rating (104.9) and fourth in completion percentage (67.8) and yards-per-attempt (7.99), while completing 311-of-459 passes for 3,667 yards with 23 touchdowns and four interceptions. He led all NFL rookies in wins (13), completion percentage, passing touchdowns, rating, rushing touchdowns (six) and rushing yards (282) en route to becoming the first Cowboys quarterback to be named the Associated Press Offensive Rookie of the Year.

Earlier this season Prescott threw an interception in the third quarter at Denver (9/17) to end his streak of passes without an interception at 136 attempts. That was Prescott's third streak of 100-plus attempts without an interception, and the third-longest of his career (176, 171, 136, 126). THE BOOK OF EZEKIEL

For only the second time in franchise history, the Dallas Cowboys used a top-five pick on a running back when they chose Ezekiel Elliott out of Ohio State with the fourth overall selection in the 2016 NFL Draft. Dallas selected Tony Dorsett with the second pick in the 1977 NFL Draft.

Elliott led the NFL in yards (1,631), attempts (322) and runs of 10-plus (48), was third in rushing touchdowns (15) - all tops by a rookie rusher - and was sixth in rushing average (5.1) in 2016.

In 2017 Elliott has 191 carries for 783 yards and eight touchdowns.

In his first season, Elliott produced seven 100-yard rushing games - most by a Cowboys rookie, tied for seventh by a league rookie all-time and tied for the most in the NFL in 2016.

In 2017 he has added four more 100-yard outings to give him 11 for his career for fifth all-time in team history.

Ezekiel Elliott won the NFL's rushing title in 2016 despite only playing in 15 games. Elliott rushed for 1,631 yards and outpaced the second-place rusher, Chicago's Jordan Howard (1,313), by 318 yards. It marked the sixth time that a Cowboy has led the league in rushing, the third overall rusher from Dallas, joining Emmitt Smith (1991-93, 95) and DeMarco Murray (2014), and the first rookie in franchise history to win the NFL rushing title. In NFL history, Elliott became the 16th rookie, sixth in the Super Bowl era - fifth since the NFL merger - and first since Edgerrin James in 1999, to win the league's rushing title:

Ezekiel Elliott is a focal point of the Dallas Cowboys offense. His 993 total scrimmage yards (783 rush; 210 rec.) are currently the 10th-highest tally in the NFL in 2017. He has also been a driving force at moving the chains, as he is 11th in the NFL with 49 total first downs.

Elliott established a career-high with 219 total scrimmage yards (147 rush; 72 receiving) at San Francisco (10/22/17). CHOOSE YOUR RUNNER

One of the strengths of the Dallas Cowboys is its depth at the running back position. In Dallas' stable of rushers behind 2016 league rushing champion Ezekiel Elliott are a strong mix, with veteran rusher Alfred Morris, and youth and upside with Rod Smith and Trey Williams.

Morris was signed away from divisional rival Washington in 2016 and has served as Elliott's primary back up this season. For his career, he has posted three 1,000-yard seasons, including a Redskins rookie record 1,613 rushing yards in 2012. Smith, the brother of Cowboys linebacker Jaylon Smith, was acquired off waivers from Seattle in 2015 and has seen action mainly on special teams in the last three seasons while flashing as a runner in the preseason and limited snaps in 2017. Williams is in his second stint with the Cowboys, having previously spent time on the club's roster during the 2015 season but didn't play in a game.

THAT'S A BUNCH OF WITT

After coming into the league as Dallas' third round draft pick in 2003, Jason Witten has strung together a Hall of Fame career. He has appeared in the most Pro Bowls by a Cowboys tight end (10, seven consecutive - 2004-10 and three consecutive 2012-14), and is tied for the second-most by any Dallas player in team history, is tops on the club's all-time receptions and receiving yards charts. In 2012 he took the top spot on the club's receptions chart from Michael Irvin at Atlanta (11/4). Witten took 151 games to reach the top of the team's receptions chart which was faster than Irvin (159). When compared to the two other NFL tight ends with at least 750 catches - Tony Gonzalez and Shannon Sharpe - Witten also reached the mark faster - Gonzalez (163 games), Sharpe (169).

He surpassed 1,000 career receptions at Washington (12/7/15) with five catches against the Redskins, reaching that mark in his 203rd game to become the sixth-fastest NFL player to do so, and the fastest tight end.

In 2012 Witten notched a club-record 18-catch game against the N.Y. Giants (10/28). His 18 receptions tied for third in a game in NFL history and were the most by a tight end in league history:

He passed Michael Irvin (117) with one catch at Buffalo (12/27/15) for the all-time record. The last game that Witten did not have a catch was at the N.Y. Giants (11/2/08), and during that time he posted 678 receptions for 7,236 yards (10.7 avg.) and 39 touchdowns until that streak came to an end at Minnesota (12/1/16) when he failed to make a reception for the first time in 130 games. Witten reached the 10,000-yard plateau in his 180th career game to become the second-fastest tight end to get to that point. He reached that mark in his 181st game, the fastest tight end - and eighth-fastest player overall - in NFL history to reach that mark. Dallas traded up in the 2010 NFL Draft to select Dez Bryant in the first round with the 24th overall pick, the Dallas Cowboys have seen nothing but production from the wide receiver. Bryant has steadily improved in each season of his career while earning three Pro Bowl nods (2013-14, 16).

His most successful seasons came in 2012-14. In 2012 he led the team with 1,382 yards (fourth in club history) and 12 touchdowns (tied for fifth) on 92 catches (seventh), then in 2013 was the team leader in receptions (93) yards (1,233) and touchdowns (13). He continued in 2014 where he left off, leading the team with 88 receptions for 1,320 yards and a franchise-best 16 touchdowns.

Bryant has 53 catches for 578 yards and four scores in 2017.

In his eighth season, Bryant has totaled 515 receptions for 7,199 yards and 71 touchdowns. His totals allow him to inch closer into all of the top-five career receiving ranks in club history:

With the selection of Dez Bryant in the first round of the 2010 NFL Draft, the Dallas Cowboys added to their lineage of home-grown talent at wide receiver. Bryant was issued the jersey number 88 to follow in the footsteps of two of the previous 88s in club history - Drew Pearson (1973-83) and Michael Irvin (1988-99).

In Dallas, Bryant has looked to follow in the footsteps of two former great 88's who finished their careers ranking atop the all-time career receiving lists for the Cowboys. Pearson made 489 receptions (third) for 7,822 yards (fourth) and 48 touchdowns (seventh) in 156 career games, while Irvin played in 159 games and caught 750 passes (second) for 11,904 yards (second) and 65 touchdowns (third).

In the 2017 season, Bryant has made 53 receptions for 578 yards and four touchdowns. He has 515 receptions (third) for 7,199 yards (sixth) and 71 touchdowns (tied for first) during 108 career games.

Dallas Cowboys linebacker Sean Lee returned to the field in 2015, this time coming back from a torn ACL he suffered in a spring practice that took away his 2014 season. Before that, Lee had bounced back in 2013 to tally a team-best 123 tackles after landing on Reserve/Injured with a toe injury in 2012.

Having manned the middle linebacker spot since his rookie season, Lee moved to a new position in 2015 with a shift over to the weakside spot to further utilize his speed and playmaking ability in the Cowboys 4-3 defense. Lee led the squad with a 156 tackles along with his first career sacks (2.5), a team-high 11 tackles for loss, six pressures, an interception and five pass breakups. He was named to his first Pro Bowl as an injury replacement for Justin Houston (Kansas City).

Lee led the 2016 team with 174 tackles and 12 tackles for loss - both career-highs - along with four quarterback pressures, two pass breakups and a fumble recovery.

In 2017 Lee is currently second on the team with 62 tackles along with a team-high seven tackles for loss with two pressures.

For his career, he has posted four seasons - two consecutive - with 100-plus tackles:

The All-American and Butkus award winner suffered a knee injury in the Fiesta Bowl in his final collegiate game, and subsequently missed his entire rookie season rehabbing the injury on Dallas' Reserve/NFI list.

Smith, through his "Clear Eye View" motto, stayed determined and made a miraculous return to the field during the Cowboys 2017 offseason activities, to his first game action in the preseason and finally making his much anticipated debut during the regular season.

BAILEY FROM 50

For his career, Dan Bailey is 25-of-36 (69.4) from 50-plus yards, and sits atop the club's charts for 50-yarders in a season (six - 2013) and career, while he also boasts a franchise-long 56-yard field goal that he's hit three times, but most recently at Denver (9/17/17). He also boasts the seventh-highest percentage of field goals from this range in NFL history.

Bailey has hit two 50+ field goals in a game four times (three times in 2013), including most recently in the 2016 season opener against the N.Y. Giants (9/11/16), to tie Eddie Murray (at Minnesota, 12/12/93) for the most in a single game.

Bailey was three-of-six in 2016 from 50 yards. He tied his career-long with a 56-yarder at Denver (9/17) for the 2017 season.

GAME-WINNING KICKS

In his rookie season, Dan Bailey was called upon six times to win or tie the game with his foot. Four times he came through for Dallas. Bailey's four game-winning field goals were the most by a Dallas Cowboy in a single season and the most by a rookie in NFL history.

In 2012 Bailey had four opportunities to do the same, and he came through in three games including two in overtime. He added one game-winner in 2013 with a 35-yarder at the N.Y. Giants (11/24).

Bailey was one-of-two during the 2014 season.

His only game-winner of the 2015 season came at Washington (12/7) where he nailed a 54-yarder - tied for the second-longest kick of his career, and the longest game-winner of his career.

In team history, there have now been 39 instances in which a kicker was true on a game-winning field goal with 2:00-or-less left in the fourth quarter or in overtime.

Bailey has rang true with 10 game-winners - and a franchise-best five in overtime - to serve as the most in team history:

PRO: The Dallas Cowboys brought back veteran linebacker Justin Durant to infuse some leadership and add depth at the second level of their defense in 2017. The Cowboys originally landed Justin Durant through free agency in 2013. Durant, an 11th-year pro, first came to Dallas after starting 68 of his 79 career games, playing in both Jacksonville (2007-10) and Detroit (2011-12). He started six of the 10 games he played in 2013, missing five games with a hamstring injury that landed him on Reserve/Injured, and tallied 30 tackles. He was named a team captain for Dallas in 2014 but was injured and only played in six games, making 59 tackles and four tackles for loss. Durant signed with Atlanta in 2015, and was a solid presence in their defense, playing in 13 games and tallying 82 tackles. He returned to Dallas in 2016 and put up good numbers on defense, posting 54 tackles, six pressures and a sack. A former second round draft pick (48th overall) by Jacksonville in 2007, Durant has started 92-of-121 games played and has recorded 809 tackles, 4.5 sacks, 32 tackles for loss, 23 pass breakups and three interceptions over his career.
