SERIES INFORMATION

The Detroit Lions (6-5) travel to Baltimore in Week 13 to take on the Ravens (6-5) Sunday at 1 p.m. at M&T Bank Stadium. The Lions look to rebound following a 30-23 loss vs. Minnesota on Thanksgiving, while Baltimore is coming off a 23-16 win over Houston on Monday Night Football. Sunday's game marks only the fifth all-time meeting between the two clubs, with Baltimore leading the series 3-1-0. Detroit and Baltimore last met on December 16, 2013, with the Ravens claiming victory 18-16 at Ford Field.

REACHING 30 WINS

With two playoff appearances in his first three years, Jim Caldwell has established himself as one of the most successful head coaches in recent franchise history. In his 52nd game as the Lions Head Coach (Week 4 at Min; 10/1/17), Caldwell led the team to a 14-7 win at Minnesota and recorded his 30th overall win since joining the Lions in 2014. By reaching 30 career wins with the club in 52 games, he became the fastest Lions head coach to reach 30 career wins since Head Coach Buddy Parker, who recorded 30 wins in 41 games (1951-54). **His overall record with the Lions stands at 33-26 (.559).**

Beginning his football coaching career in 1977 as a graduate assistant at his alma mater, the University of Iowa, 2017 marks Caldwell's 40th consecutive season coaching football.

100 CLUB

With a 14-7 win over Minnesota in Week 4 of the 2017 season, Caldwell logged his 56th overall win in his 100th career regular season game. His career record as a head coach (33-26 in DET; 26-22 in IND) now stands at 59-48 (.551) in 107 career games.

LIONS FINISH 9-7 IN 2016, EARN PLAYOFF BERTH

The Lions finished the 2016 season with a record of 9-7 and earned the team's second playoff berth in the past three seasons. The last time the Lions made the playoffs twice in a three-year span was 1997 and 1999.

➤ By earning a playoff berth in 2016, Caldwell joins Buddy Parker (1952, 1953) and Bobby Ross (1997, 1999) as the only coaches in Lions history to lead the team to the playoffs twice in their first three seasons with the club.

EIGHT COMEBACK WINS IN 2016

The Lions finished the 2016 season with a record of 9-7. In eight of the team's nine wins, the Lions trailed in the fourth quarter and went on to win the game. **Detroit set a new NFL record, surpassing the previous total of seven set by the 2009 Indianapolis Colts (also coached by Jim Caldwell), for the most wins in a season after trailing in the fourth quarter.**

COACHING OVERVIEW

- Hired as head coach for the Detroit Lions January 14, 2014.
- In 16 previous NFL seasons, Caldwell has worked on coaching staffs that have led teams to 13 winning seasons and only twice finished below .500. Overall, Caldwell's teams he coached for have compiled a 171-96 regular season record, along with 14 playoff appearances, eight division titles, three conference championships and two Super Bowl wins.
- As an NFL head coach (six seasons), Caldwell has led a team to 11+ wins twice (14 with Indianapolis in 2009, 11 with Detroit in 2014). Coached in three Super Bowls with Indianapolis (XLI and XLIV) and Baltimore (XLVII) and won two Super Bowl titles (Ind and Bal).
- In his first year as head coach for IND (2009), he won the AFC Championship and led the franchise to Super Bowl XLIV. He became the first NFL coach to win his first 14 games and the fifth rookie head coach to reach the Super Bowl.
- One of four head coaches to produce 24+ regular-season wins and a Super Bowl berth in their first two career seasons as head coach.
- From 2003-09, Caldwell was the Colts quarterbacks coach and was also promoted to assistant head coach and associate head coach during that time. He worked closely with QB Peyton Manning and the team's quarterbacks. During that span, Indianapolis set NFL records with seven consecutive seasons finishing with 11+ wins (6, Dallas 1976-81) and 12+ victories (4, Dallas, 1992-95).
- After being appointed Ravens offensive coordinator in December 2012, Baltimore went on to win five of its next seven games, including Super Bowl XLVII. During that span, the offense averaged 400.6 yards per game, including an average of 410.3 yards per game during the four playoff wins.

QUINN MAKES HIS MARK



BOB QUINN
Executive Vice President and
General Manager
Years with Lions: 2
Years in NFL: 18

- While working for the New England Patriots, he helped contribute to one of the most impressive stretches in NFL history, one that produced **four Super Bowl titles, including the most recent championship in 2014 (Super Bowl XLIX). Since 2000, Quinn's first year with New England, the Patriots have won six AFC Championships, 13 AFC East titles, 12+ games in a season 10 times (which includes the past six years) and 10+ games in 14 of his 16 seasons.**

FIRST SEASON AT THE HELM

Quinn's first season in the role of a franchise's top football executive culminated in a playoff appearance, and he became the only first-year executive among nine in the NFL to accomplish this feat since the 2013 season. In doing so, Quinn also became the Lions' first general manager to guide the team to the playoffs in his inaugural season since Nick Kerbawy in 1952.

- Along with the nearly 40-percent changeover and upgrade to the team's roster that he inherited, Quinn's changes paid dividends in 2016 when the Lions finished 9-7 on the team's way to the playoffs.
- Entering his second season, Quinn's ongoing commitment to improve all aspects of the club's football operations has included restructuring the player personnel department and scouting evaluation processes; renovating the team's weight room and practice fields along with other facility improvements; upgrading the team's football information and video technology; and instituting a comprehensive nutritional program, which included the hiring of a performance dietician for the players.

DRAFTING EXPERTISE

Quinn's initial draft class in 2016 featured the selection of six linemen on offense and defense, the most linemen in a Lions draft since 1989 and the most ever in a seven-round draft. Highlighting last year's draft class was the Lions' first-round selection T **Taylor Decker**, who earned all-rookie honors in 2016. Additionally, DT **A'Shawn Robinson** and C/G **Graham Glasgow** would earn starting roles during their rookie seasons.

- *Of the 12 playoff teams in 2016, no team had members of its draft class play more games (108) than the Detroit Lions.*

PATRIOTS PAST

During his time with New England, Quinn served a number of roles in the player personnel department, including most recently as Director of Pro Scouting from 2012-15. While he worked as Director of Pro Scouting, the Patriots won the 2014 Super Bowl and four-straight AFC East Division championships.

- From 2009-2012, Quinn was the Assistant Director of Pro Personnel. For the previous nine years, Quinn worked in several different capacities within the Patriots player personnel department, including roles in college scouting as a National Scout and Regional Scout. He played an integral role in evaluating and procuring talent for the team through the NFL draft process, free agency, trades, etc.

- Lions Defensive Coordinator **Teryl Austin** coached Baltimore's secondary from 2011-2013, helping lead the team to a championship in Super Bowl XLVII.
- Ravens Defensive Line coach **Joe Cullen** spent three seasons (2006-08) as Detroit's defensive line coach.
- Ravens Offensive Coordinator/Quarterbacks Coach **Marty Mornhinweg** was the Lions head coach from 2001-2002.

WHAT TO WATCH FOR

CASHING IN ON RETURNS

After falling behind early 10-0 in the Lions' Week 11 matchup with the Chicago Bears, CB **DJ Hayden** was able to pick up a QB Mitchell Trubisky fumble and return it 27 yards for a Lions touchdown. The scoop-and-score was the Lions' seventh return for a touchdown this season, tying a franchise single-season record for most returns for a touchdown in a season, which was most recently accomplished in 2011. The feat was also achieved during the 1937, 1950, 1954, 1971, 1994, and 2003 seasons. The seven returns for a touchdown are tied with Jacksonville for the most in the NFL through the first 12 weeks of the season, an emphasis the Lions plan to continue to focus on leading into a playoff push.

Head Coach Jim Caldwell on how opportunistic the defense has been in terms of defensive touchdowns: "Yeah, I think it's been great. It's one of the things that we just harp on is balls on the ground and scooping them up regardless of the situation and trying to find a way to run with it. So, our guys have been working at it. They do it with - Often times, it's sometimes difficult to get like Nevin's (Lawson) last week was difficult to get up off the ground and get to that one. DJ (Hayden) did a nice job scooping that thing up and rolling with it. So, they're doing a good job."

This year, the returns for touchdowns have come in many ways as six different players have recorded a touchdown via a return, including three from interceptions, two from fumble recoveries and two by way of punt returns from rookie CB **Jamal Agnew**. The two punt returns for touchdowns by Agnew are currently tied with Eddie Drummond (2004) and Andre Roberts (2016) for first in franchise history as the most through the first 12 Weeks of the season.

Caldwell on Agnew's punt return ability and the impact it has on the game: "One of the things you notice about this guy is that he's got quickness and speed, and anytime you can take a return that far in the National Football League without getting caught from behind, you got a little bit of a motor going for you. He has done a really good job for us, you could see it coming just in terms of his quickness and ability to catch it and run and he'll get better, just a young guy right now."

As the offense continues to establish a groove late in the season, averaging 26.7 points per game (5th in the NFL), the Lions will also look to further its all-hands-on deck approach to generating points by way of returns.

Hayden on how big the returns for touchdowns have been for the team this year: "I mean, it's great for the team. It's great for the team, especially when we just need like a real spark. And then when the defense gets a touchdown, that's going to spark the whole team, it's going to spark the fans and will give us a lot of momentum. And the more we get the better, I hope we get a lot more."

MORE MARVIN

The Lions annual Thanksgiving Day game was a memorable one for WR **Marvin Jones Jr.** as he finished the day with 109 yards and two touchdowns on six receptions. Entering Week 13, Jones' eight touchdowns are tied with Seattle's Jimmy Graham and Pittsburgh's Antonio Brown for second in the NFL.

Jones Jr. on if he envisioned the consistency that he has been playing with: "Most definitely. Obviously, I want to be the guy that's going to make the plays, make all the plays I need to help this team. In our room, that's what we all want to be, and we're all doing that right now. So, it's just great to be a part of it, and we just still have more work to do."

The Thanksgiving Day game against the Vikings marked his third 100-yard game this season (sixth-career), which marks a single-season career high. It also marked the fourth time in his career he has registered 2+ receiving touchdowns in a game. On Jones Jr.'s 43-yard touchdown in the fourth quarter vs. Minnesota, the score marked his fifth receiving touchdown this season of 20+ yards. Entering 2017, Jones previously had five career touchdown receptions of 20+ yards and now has 10 for his career. Lions QB **Matthew Stafford** has voiced his confidence in his receiver about the threat he poses in the down-field passing game.

Stafford on what makes Jones Jr. so good catching the ball down the field: "He does a nice job of separating late, whether that's over the top or to a back shoulder, whatever it is. He does a nice job tracking the ball in the air, and has great body control by the sideline, out of bounds, all that kind of stuff. So, he's done a nice job for us, made some really big plays that have helped us out."



WHAT TO WATCH FOR CONT.

Caldwell on what Jones Jr. has brought to the team this year: "Yeah, he was intent on getting better. He had his eyes set on improving the things that he could control in terms of route running things of that nature and understanding of the system. When he came back, you could tell there was a little different crispness to his routes. There was a better, deeper understanding of the concepts. And also just catching the ball in traffic and things that he thought he needed to improve upon, and he's been obviously doing all of those things extremely well up to this point. And I think more so than anything else, it was his focus and concentration to get that done is what Assistant Coach (Robert) Prince does a great job with him, and in conjunction with the two of them working together. He's made great strides."

DWIGHT THE CAREER

The Lions claimed DE **Dwight Freeney** via waivers from Seattle last week as the 16-year NFL veteran looks to add a valuable leadership role on and off the field in a reunion with his former coaches **Jim Caldwell** and **Teryl Austin**. Freeney joins the Lions with historic numbers, ranking 17th all-time in sacks with 125.5.

Caldwell on what Freeney can bring to Detroit's defense: "He's still got juice. You take a look, he's been productive anytime that he's been on the field, and we'll expect him to be productive for us as well. How we'll use him, we'll make a real good determination of that as we go through the week, but he'll be able to do something for us."

The former first-round pick (11th overall) by the Indianapolis Colts in 2002 out of Syracuse, Freeney echoed his head coach's sentiments and considers his opportunity in Detroit to be unique and one where he plans to contribute however he can.

Freeney on the process of ending up with the Lions: "Thank God it was this team. I told my agent, 'I'm not going to go to just anybody. I'll retire before I do that.' And then Detroit called me, and that was a place I actually wanted to go to."

Freeney on reuniting with Caldwell's coaching staff, specifically with Defensive Coordinator Teryl Austin: "To be with Teryl, it's definitely been a blessing and I'm excited to be part of his scheme. You guys have, here, a great base. We just have to turn a corner here and stop the run a little bit more and get after the quarterback. But I don't think changes what team you're on, no matter your situation, you've got to do those two things and I think TA is the guy that can make that happen."

LIONS BY THE NUMBERS

2

With a blocked PAT and field goal in Week 12 vs. Minnesota (11/23), the game marked the first time the Lions blocked two place kicks in the same game since blocking two field goals vs. Seattle September 10, 2006. The Lions have now blocked two field goals and one PAT this season, which is the first time the team has recorded at least one blocked PAT and FG in the same season since 2004.

4

With a 27-24 win at Chicago in Week 11 (11/19), the Lions now hold a 4-1 record on the road this season, which ties the franchise record for the most wins through the first five road games of the season. They reached a 4-1 road record for the first time since 2011.

Detroit tied a team single-season record by registering its seventh return touchdown of the season on CB **DJ Hayden's** 27-yard fumble return touchdown in the second quarter at Chicago. WR Marvin Jones Jr. led the Lions with two touchdowns on Thanksgiving vs. Minnesota, scoring on receptions from six and 43 yards out. The game marked his fourth-career game with two or more touchdowns, as his eight touchdowns this season are currently tied with Pittsburgh's Antonio Brown and Seattle's Jimmy Graham for second in the NFL.

With two touchdowns in Week 12 vs. Minnesota (11/23), including a 43-yarder in the fourth quarter, **WR Marvin Jones Jr.** scored on his NFL-best fifth receiving touchdown of 20 yards or more, which marks a single-season career high. His five touchdowns of 20+ yards rank second in the NFL behind only **WR Robby Anderson's** (NYJ) six.

QB Matthew Stafford registered his 31st career game-winning drive (trailing or tied in the fourth quarter or OT) in the Lions' 27-24 win at Chicago. K Matt Prater connected on a 50-yard field goal in Week 12 vs. Minnesota (11/23), his seventh of the season. Now with 43 career 50+ yard field goals, he passed **K John Kasay** (42, 1991-2011) for the third-most career 50+ yard field goals in NFL history.

The Lions defense has generated 19 takeaways (8 FR, 11 INT) through 11 games in 2017, tied for fifth in the NFL. Detroit has generated those 19 takeaways into 78 points, which trails only **Jacksonville** (103) and **Baltimore** (83) for the most in the NFL.

VIDEO BOARDS

In each end zone, the Daktronics main video displays are more than twice the size of the current displays and measure 39.5 feet high by 152 feet wide. Flanking the main displays will be four additional displays measuring 13 feet high by 59 feet wide that can be used individually or coordinated with the main displays for one continuous 270-foot presentation to show live video, instant replays, statistics, graphics and animations, and sponsorship messages.

SEASON YARDS

Stafford finished the 2016 regular season with 4,327 passing yards and reached 4,000 in a season for the sixth time in his career and for the sixth-consecutive season. **By reaching 4,000 yards, Stafford joined QB Peyton Manning as the only quarterbacks in NFL history to throw for 4,000 yards in six of a player's first eight seasons.** He also joined Drew Brees (11), Peyton Manning (6) and Matt Ryan (6) as the only players in NFL history to throw for 4,000 yards in six-consecutive seasons.

➤ His 4,327 yards in 2016 rank fifth in team history. Stafford now claims six of the Top-7 highest single-season totals for passing yards in franchise history.

DE **Ezekiel "Ziggy" Ansah**, in only his fifth season, has already asserted himself as one of the NFL's best young pass rushers. He finished third in the NFL in sacks with 14.5 in 2015, paving the way to an Associated Press Second Team All-Pro selection and his first-career Pro Bowl nod.

THE SNAPPING STANDARD

Muhlbach has served as one of the most critical pieces to the Lions field goal unit since he began long snapping for the Lions during the 2004 season (Week 10 at Jacksonville 11/14/04). He has snapped on 53 successful attempts from 50+ yards, which is the highest total by a long snapper since 2000. Over the past 18 seasons, he is the first and only long snapper to reach 50+ snaps on field goals made from 50-yards and beyond.

➤ In 2017, Muhlbach has snapped on SEVEN 50+-yard field goals, and now has 5+ snaps on 50-yarders in each of the past three seasons (5 in 2015, 7 in 2016). - With a 51-yard field goal in the second quarter against Pittsburgh, Prater connected on the 20th 50+yard field goal since joining Detroit in 2014 (currently with 22) and became the second player in franchise history with at least 20 50+yard field goals. - By making two field goals from 55+ yards against Atlanta, Prater became the second player in NFL history to connect on at least 10 career 55+yard field goals. He joined Raiders K Sebastian Janikowski (13) as the only kickers to achieve this during their careers. - In the third quarter at New Orleans, Agnew returned a Saints punt 74 yards for a touchdown, his second of the season. He joined Hall of Fame CB Jack Christiansen (4 in 1951) as the only rookies in Lions history to return 2+ punts for TDs.
- He also became the fifth Lions player ever to record 2+ punt return touchdowns in a season, joining Christiansen (4 in 1951, 2 in 1952), Tom Watkins (2 in 1964), WR Eddie Drummond (2 in 2004) and WR Andre Roberts (2 in 2016).

- Through Week 12, Agnew's two punt return TDs rank first in the NFL, as well as his 16.8 punt return average (22 PR, 370 yards).

BLOCKED KICKS

DT **A'Shawn Robinson** blocked a Vikings PAT attempt in the first quarter on Thanksgiving, marking the first PAT block of his career. He is the first Lions player to block a PAT since DE Jared DeVries registered a block at Minnesota October 8, 2006. Robinson has now blocked both a PAT and field goal this season.

- DT **Jeremiah Ledbetter** also blocked the Vikings' 53-yard field goal attempt in the second quarter, which was also the first blocked kick of his career.
- With a blocked PAT and field goal, the game marked the first time the Lions blocked two place kicks in the same game since blocking two field goals vs. Seattle September 10, 2006.
- The Lions' three blocked kicks this season are the most by the club since 2007 (4).

SERIES NOTES

➤ The inaugural game between Detroit and Baltimore occurred December 27, 1998 at Ravens Stadium at Camden Yards (renamed M&T Bank Stadium) in Baltimore, with the Lions losing to the Ravens 19-10 in the '98 season finale.

➤ Detroit's first game with Baltimore ended up being RB Barry Sanders' final game in his 10-year career. He rushed 19 times for 41 yards, finishing nine yards (1,491) shy of collecting his fifth-straight 1,500-yard rushing season.

➤ In the Lions' 35-17 win over Baltimore October 9, 2005, Detroit's rushing attack was stellar as the offense registered four rushing touchdowns, the most ever yielded by the Ravens defense. Among the rushing touchdowns were two scores by RB Kevin Jones and a 77-yard dash by RB Shawn Bryson.

➤ On ESPN's Monday Night Football vs. Baltimore on December 16, 2013, WR Calvin Johnson caught six passes for 98 yards and became the first player in NFL history to register 5,000 receiving yards over a three-year span (2011-13).

The Lions started the season with a victory over Arizona in the season-opener 35-23. Both teams exchanged turnovers on their opening drives of the season, soon after Lions S Tavon Wilson's interception. Lions QB Matthew Stafford threw an interception on Detroit's first possession caught by Cardinals CB Justin Bethel who would return it 82 yards for a touchdown, putting the Cardinals up 7-0. Cardinals K Phil Dawson would later convert on a 24-yard field goal attempt, making it 10-0. After a few stalled drives from both teams, the Lions would get their first touchdown of the season, which was set up nicely by S Glover Quin's interception. It came with 4:30 left in the first half as Stafford found WR Marvin Jones Jr. for a 6-yard touchdown, capping off an 11 play, 42-yard drive. Just before time expired in the first half, Lions K Matt Prater knocked through a 58-yard field goal putting the score at 10-9 going into halftime. Out of the half, it was Arizona scored first following an impressive 94-yard drive from the Cardinals offense, as RB Kerwynn Williams took a handoff from Palmer up the middle for a 3-yard score, making it 17-9. However, the Lions defense once again would step up for the Lions, as DT A'Shawn Robinson would force a fumble while bringing down Cardinals RB David Johnson. The Lions made good on their opportunity, as Matthew Stafford found RB Theo Riddick in the middle of the field for a 7-yard touchdown to finish off a drive that took the Lions only two plays and 45 seconds to complete, closing the score to 17-15 in favor of the Cardinals. The ensuing Cardinals drive stalled thanks in part to a sack from DE Anthony Zettel, and the Lions once again able to respond as WR Kenny Golladay found the end zone on a 10-yard pass from Stafford for his first-career touchdown, giving the Lions a 21-17 lead with 9:33 left in the fourth quarter. It would not take Stafford long to once again connect with Golladay for a score, after another stalled Cardinals drive, Golladay was hit in stride and leaped into the air to bring down his second touchdown of the day on a 45-yard deep ball, once again extending the Lions lead to 28-17. The Lions defense would continue the already impressive performance. On the first play of the Cardinals ensuing drive, S Miles Killebrew picked off Palmer's pass intended for RB Andre Ellington for a 45-yard interception touchdown return upping the lead to 35-17 in favor of the Lions with 4:13 left to play in the game. It was the Lions third interception and fourth turnover created on the day. The Cardinals however would come down the field and score one last time, as Palmer finished off a 75-yard drive with a 1-yard touchdown pass to Cardinals J.J. Nelson, narrowing the Lions lead to 35-23. After a failed onside kick attempt, Stafford closed the win by taking a knee.

The Detroit Lions improved to 2-0 for the first time since 2011 after defeating the New York Giants 24-10 at MetLife Stadium on Monday Night Football. The first score of the game came after both offenses exchanged stalled drives, as QB Matthew Stafford was able to lead his offense down the field 54 yards to set up a 27-yard touchdown strike to WR Marvin Jones Jr. On the very next drive, Giants QB Eli Manning drove down the field for a score, leading his offense to an 8-play, 75-yard drive capped off by an 18-yard touchdown pass to rookie TE Evan Engram to tie things up at 7-7 at the start off the second quarter. The teams then exchanged turnovers on back-to-back plays. A Stafford fumble gave the Giants possession of the ball, but Lions LB Tahir Whitehead was able to pick off a Manning pass intended for Engram on the ensuing possession. The Lions were then able to take advantage of the short field in front of them, as Stafford found the end zone for the second time of the night, this time connecting with TE Eric Ebron on a 7-yard touch pass to put the Lions up 14-7 with 8:43 left in the second quarter. With :30 seconds left in the first half, K Matt Prater was able to knock a 56-yard field goal off the bottom post, giving the Lions the 17-7 lead into halftime. The Giants struck first in the second half, as K Aldrick Rosas connected on a 25-yard attempt, capping off a 10 play, 68-yard drive and cutting the Lions' lead down to 17-10 with 4:58 left in the third quarter. The final scoring play of the game was generated off of special teams, as Lions rookie CB Jamal Agnew returned a Brad Wing punt 88-yards for a Lions touchdown, increasing the lead to 24-10 with 12:56 remaining in the fourth quarter. Agnew became the first player in Lions history to return a punt for a touchdown on Monday Night Football.

The Detroit Lions dropped to 2-1 on the year after their 30-26 loss to the Falcons. Atlanta scored first, driving 75 yards on the opening drive for a WR Mohamed Sanu four-yard touchdown. The Lions were defeated by the Minnesota Vikings 30-23 in the 78th annual Thanksgiving Day game in Detroit. After the opening Lions drive stalled, the Vikings drove 80 yards on 14 plays capped off by a touchdown pass by QB Case Keenum to TE Kyle Rudolph, taking the early 6-0 lead after a K Kai Forbath PAT was blocked. The Vikings then recovered a Lions fumble on the next drive, followed by Keenum scrambling nine yards into the end zone to cap off a three play, 39-yard drive setting the score at 13-0. The Lions were able to get on the scoreboard in the second quarter, when K Matt Prater connected on a 32-yard field goal, making it 13-3 with 10:15 left in the first half. With 43 seconds left in the first half, the Vikings added to their lead as Keenum connected with Rudolph for a 22-yard touchdown pass. Shortly after, the Lions successfully organized a 75-yard drive in just three plays, finished off by a QB Matthew Stafford 6-yard touchdown pass to WR Marvin Jones Jr with just 10 seconds left in the second quarter. The scoring drive made it 20-10 in favor of the Vikings as the teams went into the half. On the opening drive of the second half, the Vikings added to their lead as RB Latavius Murray ran up the middle for a 2-yard touchdown, capping off a four play, 75-yard drive for Minnesota and putting the score at 27-10. With 7:12 left in the third quarter, Prater successfully kicked his second field goal of the game for the Lions, another 32-yarder, reducing the Vikings lead to 27-13. After the ensuing Vikings drive stalled, Prater once again would be called on to kick a field goal, his third of the game, which he successfully converted. The successful kick shrunk the Vikings lead to 27-16 with 1:09 left in the third quarter. Soon after, Stafford would lead the Lions offense down the field again and hit Jones Jr. in stride for a 43-yard touchdown pass. The touchdown reduced the Vikings lead to 27-23 with 14:16 left in the game. The last scoring play of the game came on a 36-yard field goal try from Forbath, as he gave the Vikings a one touchdown lead, 30-23 after successfully making his kick. On the ensuing Lions drive, Stafford would be intercepted by Vikings CB Xavier Rhodes on fourth down, ultimately sealing the Vikings win.
