NOTABLE STORYLINES

The Browns return from their Week 9 bye when they travel to Detroit to face the Lions at 1:00 p.m. on Sunday, November 12. The Browns trail the all-time regular season series 15-4.

Last season, the Browns finished 31st in the NFL in both total defense and rushing defense. Through nine weeks this year, the Browns rank ninth in total defense and fourth in rushing defense. The highest the Browns have finished in run defense since 1999 was in 2013 when the team finished 18th. The Browns haven't had a top-five rushing defense since 1987.

LB **Christian Kirksey** has totaled 67 tackles, 1.5 sacks, five passes defended, one forced fumble and one fumble recovery this year. In May, the Browns inked the 2014 third-round pick to a four-year contract extension. Kirksey is third in the NFL in tackles since 2016 and is ninth in the NFL in tackles this year.

Despite missing the last two games with an ankle injury, DB **Jason McCourty** is tied for third in the NFL in interceptions. The last time he played, he returned an interception 56 yards for a touchdown (at Houston on 10/15). McCourty is leading the team in interceptions (three) and passes defended (nine) and is tied for the team lead with two forced fumbles.

Rookie DL **Myles Garrett** has recorded four sacks in three games this season. Despite playing just three games, he is tied for second among all NFL rookies in sacks. Garrett joined Oakland DT **Tommy Kelly** (2004) and Cleveland LB **Barkevious Mingo** (2013) as the only NFL players since 2004 to record at least one sack in each of their first three NFL games.

LB **Joe Schobert** registered a game-high 12 tackles and recorded his first career interception against Minnesota (10/29). The 2016 fourth-round pick is leading the team this season and is tied for fifth among all NFL players in tackles.

Rookie TE **David Njoku** is leading the Browns and is tied for third among all NFL rookies with three receiving touchdowns. His three receiving scores are tied for the most by a Browns rookie tight end. The first-round pick has 18 receptions for 195 yards on the season.

RB **Duke Johnson Jr.** is leading the Browns this season with 36 receptions and 324 receiving yards. He has also added 176 rushing yards and three total touchdowns (two rushing, one receiving). Among all NFL running backs since 2015, Johnson ranks second in receptions (150) and receiving yards (1,372).

Coaching capsules:

Cleveland – Hue Jackson: 9-31, third season as head coach, second with the Browns.

Hue Jackson was named the 16th full-time head coach in Cleveland Browns history on January 13, 2016. He is in his 31st year as a coach, including the last 17 in the NFL. He has spent 10 seasons coaching in the AFC North, helping his team advance to the postseason seven times over that span. Jackson was head coach of the Oakland Raiders in 2011 and guided the team to an 8-8 record. He has also served as offensive coordinator in Washington (2003), Atlanta (2007), Oakland (2010) and Cincinnati (2014-15). Jackson spent 14 years coaching on the college level and was a quarterback at Pacific from 1985-86.

Detroit – Jim Caldwell: 57-47, sixth season as head coach, fourth with the Lions.

Jim Caldwell was named the 24th head coach in Detroit Lions franchise history on January 14, 2014. Caldwell has produced two playoff appearances in his first three seasons. His 27 wins from 2014-16 were the most by a Lions head coach in his first three seasons. Caldwell's NFL coaching resume is highlighted by two Super Bowl titles in three appearances. His teams have qualified for the playoffs 13 times. As head coach in 2009, he led the Indianapolis Colts to an AFC Championship and a berth in Super Bowl XLV. Prior to the NFL, Caldwell coached on the college ranks from 1977-00, including a stint as the head coach at Wake Forest University from 1993-00.

WHAT TO LOOK FOR THIS WEEK

RB Isaiah Crowell

With 100 rushing yards, would record his sixth career 100-yard rushing game and tie him for first on the Browns' 100-yard rushing games list since 1999 (William Green, Peyton Hillis and Jamal Lewis.)

Could become the first Brown to lead the team in rushing yards and receiving yards in back-to-back games since Peyton Hillis did it in Weeks 11-12 in 2010.

Will pass Jamal Lewis for eighth on the franchise's all-time rushing list with 191 yards.

RB Matthew Dayes

With a kick return of 50-plus yards, would become the first Brown to do so in consecutive games since Josh Cribbs (Weeks 1-2) in 2011.

DL Myles Garrett

Could become the first player since 2003 (Baltimore's Terrell Suggs) to record at least one sack in each of his first four NFL games.

Needs a sack to become the first Brown to record a sack in four straight games played since Anthony Pleasant did it in five straight in 1995.

Could become the first rookie No. 1 overall selection to record a sack in four consecutive games played.

RB Duke Johnson Jr.

With 28 receiving yards, would become the first Browns running back to register at least 1,400 receiving yards and 800 rushing yards in his first three NFL seasons.

A reception of 25-plus yards would tie him for the most big-play receptions (four) ever recorded by a Browns running back in a single season (Himself, 2015-16; Jamel White, 2001).

QB DeShone Kizer

A rushing TD would mark his fourth of the season and would be the most recorded by a Browns quarterback since Brian Sipe in 1974 (four).

DB Jason McCourty

An interception would tie his single-season career high of four. It would also make him the first Brown to register a pick in three consecutive games played since Joe Haden did it in Weeks 11-13 in 2014.

An interception returned for a TD would make him the first Browns player to do so in consecutive games played since Jim Houston in 1967.

TE David Njoku

A receiving TD would mark his fourth of the season and would be the most ever recorded by a Browns rookie tight end.

The Browns held a 17-7 advantage at halftime, marking the first time Cleveland owned a halftime lead in each of its first six games to start a season since at least 1960, but the Detroit Lions posted 24 unanswered points in the second half to earn a 31-17 victory at FirstEnergy Stadium in front of 71,513 fans. Despite the loss, the Browns (3-3) have a record at or above .500 through six games for the first time since 2007. WR Josh Gordon earned his third career 100-yard receiving game and second of the season, totaling 126 yards on seven receptions (18.0 avg.). Gordon became the first Browns player to record multiple 100-yard receiving games in a season since Mohamed Massaquoi registered two in 2009. The Lions established a 7-0 lead with 3:27 to play in the first quarter as QB Matt Stafford connected with TE Joseph Fauria on a 1-yard TD pass. Stafford completed 25 of 43 passes (58.1 percent) for 248 yards with four touchdowns and one interception for a 95.9 rating, while Fauria finished with 34 yards on three receptions, all of which resulted in touchdowns. Cleveland responded with 17 consecutive points in the first half, charged by a season-high 115 rushing yards in the first two quarters alone. In the second quarter, QB Brandon Weeden tied a career high with two touchdown passes, scoring on a 4-yard and 2-yard completion to FB Chris Ogbonnaya and WR Gregg Little, respectively. Weeden completed 26 of 43 passes (60.5 percent) for 292 yards with two touchdowns and two interceptions for a 76.9 rating. Ogbonnaya registered a career-best seven receptions for 61 (8.7 avg.) yards with one TD and added 24 rushing yards on five carries (4.8 avg.), while Little caught two passes for 12 yards with one score. With a 14-7 advantage in the final two minutes of the first half, the defense forced a three-and-out to give the Browns possession with 0:50 on the clock. Weeden completed a 36-yard pass to Gordon, his fifth 30-yard reception of the season, to put Cleveland in range for K Billy Cundiff's 40-yard field goal that provided a 10-point lead with 0:08 remaining in the half. Detroit scored on four of its five second-half possessions, including three touchdowns, to earn the come-from-behind victory. DB Tashaun Gipson intercepted a Matt Stafford pass in the end zone that was deflected by CB Buster Skrine to protect a 17-14 edge in the third quarter, but the Lions posted two touchdowns and one field goal in the fourth quarter to earn a road victory.

WR Ricardo Louis - Played in every game with six starts this season...Recorded two receptions for 42 yards against the Vikings...Is second on the team in receiving with 23 receptions for 292 yards...His 16.0 receiving average in Week 1 matched a single-game career high...Selected by the Browns in the fourth round of the 2016 NFL Draft.

LT Spencer Drango - Appeared in every game this year with two starts...Replaced an injured Joe Thomas at left tackle during the Titans game in Week 7...Made his first start of the season against the Texans in Week 6 as an extra offensive lineman... Selected by the Browns in the fifth round of the 2016 NFL Draft.

LG Joel Bitonio - Started all 39 games he's appeared in since being drafted by the Browns in the second round (35th overall) of the 2014 NFL Draft...Inked a five-year contract extension in March.

C JCTretter - Started at center in every contest this season... Originally selected by the Green Bay Packers in the fourth round (122nd overall) of the 2013 NFL Draft...Signed by the Browns as an unrestricted free agent on March 9, 2017.

RG Kevin Zeitler - Started every game this year and has now started 79 of 80 career games...Originally drafted by the Cincinnati Bengals in the first round (27th overall) of the 2012 NFL Draft...Joined the Browns as an unrestricted free agent on March 9, 2017.

RT Shon Coleman - Made all eight starts this season...Selected by the Browns in the third round of the 2016 NFL Draft.

TE Randall Telfer - Caught two passes for 24 yards this year... Selected by the Browns in the sixth round of the 2015 NFL Draft out of USC.

WR Bryce Treggs - Played in four games this season and made his first start of the year against the Vikings...Caught five passes for 79 yards on the year...Signed off of the Philadelphia Eagles' practice squad on Oct. 4...Spent 2016 with the Eagles, playing in nine games with a start...Caught three passes for 80 yards with Philadelphia.

QB DeShone Kizer - Completed 111 of 213 passes for 1,144 yards and three TDs this season...Leads the team lead in rushing TDs with three...Started seven games this year...Dressed, but did not play Week 6...Drafted by the Browns in the second round (52nd overall) of the 2017 NFL Draft.

RB Isaiah Crowell - Has rushed for a team-leading 351 yards on 102 carries this season...Rushed for a season-high 64 yards in Week 8 and scored his first rushing TD of the season...Also led the team with 54 receiving yards on four receptions in the contest...Became the fifth Browns player and second running back to surpass 3,000 scrimmage yards since 1999 against the Colts in Week 3...Moved into ninth place on the Browns all-time rushing list against the Steelers in Week 1...Originally came to the Browns as an undrafted free agent out of Alabama State.

WILLIAMS NAMED D-COORDINATOR

Gregg Williams was named the Browns defensive coordinator on Jan. 7, 2017. Williams is in his 27th season in the NFL, including three as a head coach and 16 as a defensive coordinator. His defenses have finished in the top five in total defense five times, including the top defense in the NFL in 2000. Williams also oversaw a Saints defensive unit that won Super Bowl XLIV and a Titans defense that advanced to Super Bowl XXXIV. Williams spent the past three seasons (2014-16) as the defensive coordinator for the St. Louis/Los Angeles Rams. In 2016, the Rams defense finished in the top 10 in the NFL in total defense and passing defense.

WILSON SPEARHEADS RUN GAME

Kirby Wilson was named the Browns running backs coach/run game coordinator in 2016. He has 19 years of experience coaching running backs in the NFL, during which time he has coached five running backs who rank in the top 25 for career rushing yards (Emmitt Smith #1, Curtis Martin #4, Edgerrin James #12, Adrian Peterson #16 and Thomas Jones #25) and two of the top four all-time reception leaders among running backs (Larry Centers #1 and Keith Byers #4). Wilson has helped seven different running backs break the 1,000-yard plateau a total of eight times. He has mentored four players to the Pro Bowl and has been to the playoffs with four different franchises, highlighted by the 2002 Buccaneers and 2008 Steelers Super Bowl victories. In Wilson's first season in Cleveland, the Browns finished second in the NFL with a 4.89 rushing average. The average was the seventh-best in team history and the team's best mark since 1966.

GORDON REINSTATED

WR **Josh Gordon** was reinstated to the NFL on a conditional basis on November 1. Gordon is allowed to attend meetings, engage in conditioning work and individual workouts. Subject to compliance with clinical and other requirements, he will be permitted to practice with the team beginning on Monday, November 20. Beginning Monday, November 27, Gordon will be eligible at the team's discretion to return to active status or to remain on the Commissioner's Exempt list for an additional week before returning to active status. Gordon had been suspended indefinitely since September of 2016 without pay for violations of the NFL-NFLPA Policy and Program for Substances of Abuse.

Gordon has appeared in 35 games since joining the Browns as a second-round pick in the 2012 supplemental draft. He has 161 receptions for 2,754 yards and 14 touchdowns. In 2013, he led the NFL with 1,646 receiving yards.



RADIO BROADCAST

In one of the most expansive radio rights deals in the NFL, the Browns in 2013 entered a long-term partnership with two local all-sports stations, CBS Radio's 92.3 The Fan (WKRK-FM) and ESPN 850 WKNR, to broadcast all Browns games. CBS Radio's WNCX (98.5 FM) will also carry live game action, as the team will have a triplecast of games in the local market. The stations will serve as the flagship stations on the University Hospitals Cleveland Browns Radio Network. In addition to game broadcasts, more than 1,000 hours of Browns-related shows will air on the University Hospitals Cleveland Browns Radio Network on an annual basis.

As part of the team's Salute to Service throughout November, Browns players and staff will #give10 on Tuesday as they welcome 20 active military members representing all five branches at the team's facility in Berea. Members of the Browns and USO of Northern Ohio, a community partner of the First and Ten volunteering movement, will join to assemble care packages and deployment bags to be sent to troops stationed overseas, as well as prepare other items and cards to be sent to servicemen and servicewomen to express appreciation for their dedication to the country.

HEAD COACH HUE JACKSON



Hue Jackson was named the 16th full-time head coach in Cleveland Browns history by Dee and Jimmy Haslam on January 13, 2016. He has 30 years of coaching experience, including the last 16 in the NFL. He has spent 10 seasons coaching in the AFC North, during which time he helped his team advance to the postseason seven times. Jackson was head coach of the Oakland Raiders in 2011 and guided the team to an 8-8 record. He has also served as offensive coordinator in Washington (2003), Atlanta (2007), Oakland (2010) and Cincinnati (2014-15).

In his first year with Cleveland, he helped the Browns finish second in the NFL with a 4.89 rushing average, the team's best mark since 1966. Linebacker Christian Kirksey finished third in the NFL with 148 tackles, while left tackle Joe Thomas was selected to his 10th career Pro Bowl.

Jackson helped develop one of the youngest teams in NFL history. The Browns opened the 2016 season with 17 rookies on their 53-man roster, the most by an NFL team in a season opener since 2002. First-round pick wide receiver Corey Coleman was named NFL Rookie of the Week after a 104-yard, two touchdown performance in Week 2. Second-round pick defensive lineman Emmanuel Ogbah recorded a team-best 5.5 sacks, tied for the fourth-most by a Browns rookie. Third-round pick quarterback Cody Kessler registered the second-highest single-game passing yardage total by a Browns rookie with 336 in Week 6.

Prior to joining the Browns, Jackson spent the previous four seasons (2012-15) with the Cincinnati Bengals. During that time, he helped the Bengals to two division titles and a trip to the postseason all four years. In 2012, he served as secondary/assistant special teams coach before coaching the running backs in 2013. Jackson spent 2014-15 as offensive coordinator.

With Jackson as coordinator in 2015, the Bengals offense finished third in the AFC in yards per play (5.7) and points per game (26.2). He was voted by the Professional Football Writers of America (PFWA) as the Co-Assistant Coach of the Year as quarterback Andy Dalton set a career high and franchise record with a 106.3 rating, which led the AFC and was second in the NFL. After losing Dalton to injury in Week 14, Jackson guided quarterback A.J. McCarron to a 2-1 record in the final three games of the season as the Bengals clinched the AFC North title. The Cincinnati running game produced two 700-yard rushers in Jeremy Hill (794) and Giovani Bernard (730) for the first time since 1988. Tight end Tyler Eifert experienced a breakout season after hauling in 13 touchdown receptions, the most by a Bengals tight end in franchise history and the most by a Cincinnati player since 2001. Wide receiver A.J. Green added 10 receiving touchdowns on 86 receptions for 1,297 yards. Eifert, Green and left tackle Andrew Whitworth were selected to the Pro Bowl.

In Jackson's first year as offensive coordinator for Cincinnati in 2014, the run game posted its highest yards per game average (134.1) since 2000. Dalton passed for 3,398 yards and Green totaled 1,041 receiving yards. Hill led all NFL rookies with 1,124 rushing yards, the second-most by a Bengals rookie in team history.

After spending the 2010 season as the Raiders offensive coordinator, Jackson was promoted to head coach in 2011. Oakland finished the year 8-8 and tied for first in the AFC West but missed

the postseason via tiebreaker. The 8-8 mark was the best record by any Raiders team since 2002. The Raiders finished ninth in the NFL in total offense (379.5 yards per game) and seventh in rushing offense (131.9).

Before joining the Raiders, Jackson spent two seasons (2008-09) as quarterbacks coach for Baltimore, helping the Ravens advance to the playoffs both years. He was vital in the development of Joe Flacco, who was named NFL Rookie of the Year in 2008 and became the first rookie quarterback to win two playoff games as the Ravens advanced to the AFC Championship game.

From 2004-06, Jackson served as the Bengals wide receivers coach, helping develop one of the best wide receiver tandems in NFL history with Chad Johnson and T.J. Houshmandzadeh. During that span, the two combined to average 173.3 catches, 2,363.3 receiving yards and 15 touchdowns per season. In 2005, Johnson led the AFC with 1,432 receiving yards. In 2006, Johnson and Houshmandzadeh became the first Bengals duo to each top 1,000 receiving yards in the same season.

Jackson gained his first fulltime NFL experience with Washington, where he served as the running backs coach from 2001-02, before being promoted to offensive coordinator in 2003. Under Jackson's tutelage, running back Stephen Davis led the NFC with 1,432 rushing yards in 2001.

Jackson spent 14 years coaching on the college level, going from a graduate assistant at Pacific all the way to offensive coordinator at Southern California. He spent four seasons (1997-2000) as USC's offensive coordinator, where he also helped to recruit and develop players, including quarterback Carson Palmer, who went on to win the Heisman Trophy and be selected No. 1 overall in the NFL draft.

He was a minority coaching fellowship intern with the Los Angeles Rams in 1990, Arizona Cardinals in 1992 and Washington Redskins in 1995. He also served as the running backs/wide receivers/special teams coach for the London Monarchs of the World League in 1991.

Born Oct. 22, 1965, Jackson was a quarterback at Pacific from 1985-86 and threw for 2,544 yards and 19 touchdowns. The Los Angeles native also lettered in basketball and earned his degree in physical education.

Jackson and his wife, Michelle, have three daughters, Jordyn, Baylee and Haydyn.

The Hue Jackson Foundation

Hue Jackson and his wife, Michelle, launched the Hue Jackson Foundation on July 20, 2017. The foundation is committed to empowering children, teen and adult survivors of human trafficking through the funding of organizations that champion for and serve as a voice for those who are exploited. The foundation also focuses its efforts to further awareness, prevention and healing for victims of human trafficking. The foundation's website is www.huejackson.org.

FirstEnergy Stadium, Cleveland, Ohio

The Cleveland Browns dropped the 2017 season opener to the Pittsburgh Steelers, 21-18. Despite limiting the Steelers to 290 yards, two touchdown receptions by Steelers TE Jesse James proved to be the difference in the contest. On the game's opening possession, Pittsburgh forced a three-and-out and on fourth down, deep in Browns' territory, its special teams unit opened the scoring. LB Tyler Matakevich blocked Britton Colquitt's punt and Steelers LB Anthony Chickillo recovered it in the end zone for a touchdown to give the Steelers an early 7-0 advantage. Later in the quarter, rookie QB DeShone Kizer led the team on a 12-play, 68-yard drive, which he capped off by sneaking into the end zone from a yard out to even the scoring. With 45 seconds left in the first half, Steelers QB Ben Roethlisberger found James in the back of the end zone for a 4-yard score to give Pittsburgh a 14-7 lead heading into the locker room. As Cleveland's defense forced a three-and-out on Pittsburgh's first possession of the second half, Kizer led the offense down the field and set up fellow rookie K Zane Gonzalez, who notched a 24-yard field goal to cut Pittsburgh's lead to 14-10. On the game's next possession, Roethlisberger marched the Steelers 75 yards down the field and connected with James again for his second touchdown reception on the afternoon to extend their lead to 21-10. Late in the fourth quarter, DB Derrick Kindred picked off Roethlisberger and returned it 30 yards to the Cleveland 31-yard line. Later in the quarter, on fourth-and-two from the 3-yard line, Kizer hit WR Corey Coleman at the goal line for a touchdown, the first touchdown pass of his career. RB Isaiah Crowell punched in a two-point conversion to cut the lead to 21-18, but Pittsburgh would not let Cleveland get the ball back as they sealed 21-18 victory.

The Cleveland Browns dropped their second game as Baltimore's defense forced five turnovers in a 24-10 Ravens victory. Early in the first quarter, a strip-sack by Ravens LB Terrell Suggs gave Baltimore's offense a short field and a 4-yard TD run by RB Terrence West for a 7-0 lead. Midway through the second quarter, Ravens QB Joe Flacco led Baltimore on a six-play, 64-yard drive capped by a 4-yard TD strike to RB Javorious Allen, extending the lead to 14-0. Replacing injured QB DeShone Kizer, QB Kevin Hogan responded with a five-play, 83-yard drive. Hogan connected with rookie TE David Njoku for a 23-yard TD, the first TD pass of Hogan's career and the first TD reception of Njoku's, to cut the deficit, 14-7. Later in the second quarter, Ravens rookie LB Tyus Bowser intercepted a Hogan pass, resulting in a 27-yard return and a 2-yard TD pass from Flacco to WR Jeremy Maclin for a 21-7 Ravens lead at halftime. Midway through the third quarter, rookie K Zane Gonzalez connected on a 38-yard field goal to shrink Baltimore's lead, but Ravens K Justin Tucker converted a 28-yard field goal in the fourth quarter to make the score 24-10. On the game's next possession, Kizer marched the Browns 70 yards down the field before Ravens DB Lardarius Webb intercepted a Kizer pass in the end zone. Cleveland's offense wasn't able to muster any more points as Baltimore's defense sealed the 24-10 victory with a late fourth quarter stand. Early in the first quarter, OL Joe Thomas exceeded 10,000 straight snaps for his career, the longest-known streak in NFL history.

In a Week 3 road contest, the Cleveland Browns fell to the Indianapolis Colts, 31-28. Trailing 7-0 early in the second quarter, RB Duke Johnson Jr. avoided a couple would-be tacklers and leaped over the pylon for a 19-yard touchdown run to tie the game at 7-7. On the Colts' ensuing possession, QB Jacoby Brissett spun away from a defender and scampered into the end zone for a 7-yard touchdown to give the Colts a 14-7 advantage. After Browns P Britton Colquitt pinned Indianapolis inside its own 5-yard line, Brissett led the Colts on a five-play, 97-yard drive capped off by a 61-yard touchdown pass to WR T.Y. Hilton to extend their lead to 21-7. Indy would tack on its third score of the quarter as RB Frank Gore found the end zone from four yards out to give the Colts a 28-7 lead. With 44 seconds to play in the half, QB DeShone Kizer linked up with WR Jordan Leslie, who made a one-handed grab for a 26-yard gain down to the Colts' 2-yard line. Two plays later, Kizer found TE David Njoku in the back of the end zone for his second touchdown reception in as many games to cut Indy's lead to 28-14 at the half. After a scoreless third quarter, Colts K Adam Vinatieri notched a 33-yard field goal to extend their lead to 31-14. Later in the fourth, Kizer found WR Kenny Britt for an 11-yard touchdown to make it 31-21. Cleveland got the ball back with 4:05 to play and went on an 11-play, 70-yard drive in 2:01, capped off with a QB sneak by Kizer to cut the lead to 31-28. However, a final effort would see Colts S Malik Hooker intercept a Kizer pass with no time remaining to seal the victory, 31-28.

Despite outgaining the Jets 419-212, the Browns fell to New York, 17-14. On the game's opening possession, Browns rookie DL Myles Garrett, who was making his NFL debut, reached Jets QB Josh McCown to record the first sack of his career on his first NFL snap. Garrett would register another sack in the second quarter to become the first No. 1 overall pick to record multiple sacks in his NFL debut. Scoring opportunities plagued the Browns throughout the contest as the team had two red zone turnovers (one fumble and one interception) and two missed field goals. With time winding down in the first half, Jets K Chandler Catanzaro notched a 57-yard field goal to give New York a 3-0 lead at the half. To start the second half, Browns QB Kevin Hogan relieved rookie DeShone Kizer and led the team on a 10-play, 75-yard drive capped by a one-handed touchdown reception by rookie TE David Njoku to give the Browns a 7-3 advantage. Njoku's third touchdown reception of the year tied for the most by a Browns rookie tight end in a single season. Later in the quarter, McCown connected with TE Austin Seferian-Jenkins for a 2-yard score to regain the lead, 10-7. In the final frame, the Jets took over on downs and marched 97 yards down the field as McCown found WR Jermaine Kearse for a 24-yard touchdown to extend their lead to 17-7. Cleveland would tack on another late score as Hogan dumped off a short pass to RB Duke Johnson Jr., who scampered 41 yards to the end zone, to cut New York's lead to 17-14. However, after recovering an onside kick, New York would kneel out the clock to secure the victory.

Texans K Ka'imi Fairbairn connected from 40 yards out to give the Texans an early 3-0 lead, but Browns K Zane Gonzalez responded with a 41-yard field goal of his own to even the score. Later in the first quarter, Watson hit WR Will Fuller V for a 39-yard touchdown, giving the Texans a 10-3 advantage. On the ensuing drive, Texans CB Jonathan Joseph intercepted QB Kevin Hogan and returned it 82 yards for a touchdown and a 16-3 Texans lead. Watson later connected with WR Braxton Miller for a 1-yard score and a 24-3 Texans lead at the half following a two-point conversion. Despite a game-tying 54-yard field goal with under a minute to play from rookie K Zane Gonzalez, the Cleveland Browns fell to the Tennessee Titans, 12-9, in overtime. In a game that featured seven field goals, Titans K Ryan Succop opened the scoring with a 43-yarder to give Tennessee a 3-0 lead after the first quarter. Following a fumble recovery by DB Ibrahim Campbell midway through the second quarter, Gonzalez notched a 31-yarder to tie the game, 3-3. Later in the quarter, Succop answered back with a 23-yard field goal to give the Titans a 6-3 halftime advantage. QB Cody Kessler relieved QB DeShone Kizer in the third quarter and led the team on a 10-play, 70-yard scoring drive, capped by a Gonzalez 47-yard field goal to even the scoring, 6-6. In the fourth quarter, Succop tacked on his third field goal of the contest, this time from 46 yards out to give Tennessee a 9-6 lead. After the Browns defense forced a three-and-out with 4:26 remaining, Kessler drove the offense down the field and set up Gonzalez, who nailed a 54-yard field goal with 47 seconds remaining to send the game to overtime. In overtime, following three punts, Succop hit his fourth and final field goal of the game to give Tennessee a 12-9 victory.

The Cleveland Browns dropped its first-ever regular season game 33-16 to the Vikings in London. Following LB Joe Schobert's first career interception on the game's opening drive, RB Isaiah Crowell scampered 26 yards into the end zone two plays later. The Browns extra point attempts went off the upright. Later in the first, Vikings K Kai Forbath connected from 35 yards out to shrink the Browns' lead, 6-3. Vikings QB Case Keenum found WR Adam Theilen for an 18-yard touchdown in the second quarter, for a 9-6 Vikings' advantage. Rookie QB DeShone Kizer responded with an eight-play, 82-yard drive that he capped off with his third touchdown run of the season for a 13-9 Browns' lead. Forbath answered for the Vikings with a 34-yard field goal to shrink the Browns' lead to 13-12 at half. Forbath added a 43-yard field goal in the third quarter to put the Vikings up 15-13. Rookie K Zane Gonzalez responded with a 23-yard field goal of his own, giving the Browns a 16-15 lead. Late in the third quarter, Vikings RB Jerick McKinnon found the end zone to put the Vikings back in front, 23-16. In the fourth quarter, Vikings TE Kyle Rudolph hauled in a Keenum pass for a 4-yard score, extending the Vikings' lead to 30-16. Forbath would connect once again on a 51-yard field goal late in the fourth to give the Vikings the 33-16 victory.
