THE MATCHUP

The New Orleans Saints, in sole possession of the NFC South lead at 6-2, travel to the Buffalo Bills (5-3) for Sunday's 12:00 p.m. CT contest at New Era Field. The Saints' record is the best at midseason since opening at 7-1 in 2013 and they are in the middle of their first six-game winning streak since they won their last eight games of the 2011 regular season. This will be the club's first trip to Buffalo since 2009.

New Orleans is 6-4 all-time against the Bills, including a 35-17 victory at the Mercedes-Benz Superdome on Oct. 27, 2013 that was the last meeting between the two clubs. The Saints have won four straight contests against Buffalo dating back to 2001 and have a 3-1 record at New Era Field.

New Orleans is coming off a 30-10 victory over the Tampa Bay Buccaneers at the Mercedes-Benz Superdome to extend their winning streak to six and to also improve to 2-0 in NFC South matchups.

The win featured sparkling performances on offense by QB **Drew Brees** and RB **Alvin Kamara** and backed by a standout blocking effort by an offensive line that was required to shuffle parts due to an in-game injury to LT **Terion Armstead**, but still surrendered only one sack and helped the offense gain 407 total net yards.

The 17-year veteran was efficient, posting a 131.9 passer rating by completing 22 of 27 for 263 yards and two touchdowns. Brees now has 225 career regular season touchdown passes at the Mercedes-Benz Superdome, the most all-time by an NFL passer at a stadium.

The victory also continued to usher in the emergence of Kamara as one of the NFL's most exciting rookies. He carried ten times for 68 yards with one TD and also caught six passes for career-high 84 yards with a 33-yard TD for a game-high and Saints season-high 152 total yards from scrimmage. He leads the NFL in yards per carry (6.0) and ranks among league rookie leaders in all rushing and receiving categories.

The defense was also stout against Tampa Bay. The unit did not allow a touchdown until late in the fourth quarter and held them to only 200 total net yards, including only 57 on the ground. DE **Cameron Jordan** had 1.5 sacks to move into fifth on the club's all-time takedown list (53.5). On special teams, rookie DB **Justin Hardee** blocked a punt that he returned seven yards for a TD.

Saints Head Coach **Sean Payton** moved up in the all-time wins chart with his 100th career regular season victory and 106 overall (regular and postseason combined) on Sunday. He moved into sole possession of 41st all-time in NFL record books in career victories.

THE COACHES

New Orleans Saints Head Coach **Sean Payton** has posted a 100-68 regular season record and a 6-4 postseason mark, guiding the team to the postseason five times, to the NFC Championship game twice and to the Super Bowl XLIV Championship in the 2009 campaign. He's the club's lone head coach to open a season with 13 straight victories and post a 13-game winning streak and has the franchise's top winning percentage (.595). Payton's 54-30 (.643) home record and 46-38 (.548) mark away from the Mercedes-Benz Superdome are the club's top all-time winning percentages in both categories (regular season). He holds the records for most wins by a head coach in team history with 106 total, ranked 41st all-time in National Football League history. In his first season with the club in 2006, he took over a Saints team that had previously posted a 3-13 record in 2005 to the NFC Championship game and was named NFL Coach of the Year by the *Associated Press* and most other major media outlets. The Saints are the only team to finish in the top 10 in net yards per game each season since 2006, including finishing first in 2016, when they averaged 426.0 yards per game. In 2017, Payton has rebounded the Saints from three consecutive 7-9 campaigns by getting them on a six-game winning streak and to 6-2 at the season's midpoint. Payton was hired as New Orleans' 14th head coach on January 18, 2006, after serving on the Dallas Cowboys coaching staff from 2003-05 under Pro Football Hall of Fame Head Coach Bill Parcells. Prior to joining the Cowboys in 2003, Payton served on the New York Giants coaching staff from 1999-2002, including the final three seasons as offensive coordinator. His tenure was highlighted by a Super Bowl berth in his first full season calling plays for New York. Payton's prior NFL coaching experience came as quarterbacks coach for the Philadelphia Eagles from 1997-98. He played quarterback at Eastern Illinois University, where he passed for 10,665 yards, then the third-highest total in NCAA Division 1-AA history. The three-time *Associated Press* All-American selection had professional stints with the Chicago Bruisers of the Arena Football League, Ottawa of the Canadian Football League and the Chicago Bears in 1987. Starting his college coaching career at San Diego State, Payton wrapped two stints as an assistant with the Aztecs (1988-89 and 1992-93) around a stop at Indiana State (1990-91). He moved to Miami (Ohio), where he coached quarterbacks from 1994-95 before doing the same at the University of Illinois in 1996.

Sean McDermott was named Buffalo's 19th head coach on January 11, 2017. He enters his first season as Buffalo's head coach, having led them to a 5-3 record at the season's midpoint and his 19th season in the NFL ranks. McDermott joins the Bills after spending six seasons as the defensive coordinator of the Carolina Panthers where he developed a unit that is considered to be one of the best in the NFL. McDermott led the Carolina defense to a top-10 finish in four of his six seasons in charge. Over the past six seasons, the Panthers defense ranked second in the NFL in sacks (261), third in turnovers forced (169), sixth in rushing yards allowed per game (103.3), ninth in yards per game (339.1) and 12th in points allowed per game (22.1). In his time in Carolina, McDermott helped the Panthers to three division titles and a trip to Super Bowl 50. An All-Atlantic 10 Conference choice at safety for Wil-

liam & Mary as a senior in 1997, McDermott graduated with a degree in finance and began his coaching career as a graduate assistant at his alma mater in 1998.

SERIES HISTORY

The Saints and Bills have met ten times with New Orleans holding a 6-4 lead riding a four-game winning streak in the series. The Saints have a 4-1 record in contests played at New Era Field. Two of the games have been decided by a touchdown or less, one by four points.

The teams first faced off in 1973, as the Saints recorded a 13-0 shutout, the first in club history. The teams did not meet again for seven years. This will be the first regular season meeting between the Saints and the Bills at New Era Field since a 27-7 New Orleans win in 2009. A view of the results:

GAME SUMMARIES

WEEK 1: Minnesota Vikings 29, Saints 19; September 11, 2017 @ US Bank Stadium – Minnesota Vikings quarterback Sam Bradford set the National Football League record for completion percentage for Minnesota last season, his accuracy aided by the volume of short passes under heavy pressure. With protection from the rush, he showed he can throw the ball down the field with the best of them. Bradford started his second year with Minnesota in style, passing for 346 yards and three touchdowns to help the Vikings beat New Orleans 29-19 and spoil running back Adrian Peterson's first game with the New Orleans Saints.

"When I've got time to sit back there and kind of evaluate things, I've got all the confidence in the world that our guys outside are going to win," Bradford said.

Minnesota wide receiver Stefon Diggs had seven receptions for 93 yards, two for scores and all in the first half, and wideout Adam Thielen racked up 157 yards on nine catches as Bradford had success against a Saints defense that opened the season with the youngest starting lineup in the NFL since 1991.

Rookie running back Dalvin Cook rushed for 127 yards on 22 carries in the formal takeover from Peterson. Peterson was limited to 18 yards on six carries, in a time share with running backs Mark Ingram and Alvin Kamara with the Saints forced to throw the ball more once they started to fall behind. Quarterback Drew Brees was quiet, too, with 291 yards on 27-for-37 passing

"We didn't do anything different or try to out-trick them," Vikings linebacker Anthony Barr said. "You know, line up and play, do your job."

Saints Tight end Coby Fleener caught their only touchdown toss, after the two-minute warning. Kicker Wil Lutz made four field goals, three under 25 yards.

"The bottom line," Brees said, "is you've got to score touchdowns."

WEEK 2: New England Patriots 36, Saints 20; September 17, 2017 @ Mercedes-Benz Superdome – If Tom Brady and the Patriots were suffering from a Super Bowl hangover, it looks as though a trip to New Orleans pulled the defending champions out of it.

The 40-year-old Brady bounced back with a vengeance from a season-opening loss, throwing three touchdown passes in the first quarter for the first time in his career, eclipsed 300 yards passing in the first half for only the second time, and New England scored 30 first-half points en route to a 36-20 victory over the Saints, who dropped their first two games of the season.

Brady's maiden Super Bowl triumph in the Superdome back in Feb. 2002 is bound to be one of his fondest memories, but the 18-year veteran looked like a superior quarterback in his latest visit. He finished 30 of 39 for 447 yards without an interception -- at least not one that counted. Saints defenders caught Brady's passes twice, but both plays were wiped out by New Orleans penalties. Brady joined Warren Moon as the only QBs age 40 or older in NFL history to pass for at least 400 yards and 3 touchdowns in a game, according to the Elias Sports Bureau. Patriots tight end Rob Gronkowski had a 53-yard catch

and run to highlight his six-catch, 116-yard performance, but left the game in the second half with a groin injury and did not return.

In Brady and the Saints' Drew Brees, the game featured the National Football League's top two active quarterbacks in terms of career yards and touchdowns. Their 922 touchdown passes and 128,251 yards passing combined coming in represented the most by starting signal-callers in the same NFL game.

But in this matchup, Brees couldn't keep up. He was 27 of 45 for 356 yards and two touchdowns. The Saints' desperation to stay close was encapsulated by a failed attempt to convert a fourth down -- despite being well within field goal range on the Patriots 25-yard line -- with 2:27 left in the first half and New England up by 13 points. Brady responded by marching New England to the Saints ten-yard line to set up Stephen Gostkowski's field goal, making it 30-13 at halftime

The Patriots' first three drives ended with a 19-yard touchdown pass to running back Rex Burkhead, Gronkowski's long touchdown and a 13-yard scoring pass to wide receiver Chris Hogan. New Orleans briefly rallied with Brees' 5-yard touchdown pass to wide receiver Brandon Coleman and kicker Wil Lutz's field goal on consecutive drives, pulling as close as 20-13. But New England responded with running back Mike Gillislee's short scoring run on a drive highlighted by downfield passes from Brady to the skilled Patriots trio of Gronkowski, Hogan and former Saints wideout Brandin Cooks.

WEEK 3: Saints 34, Panthers 13; September 24, 2017 @ Bank of America Stadium– Quarterback Drew Brees shredded the league's top-ranked defense, throwing for 220 yards and three touchdowns as the New Orleans Saints defeated the previously unbeaten Carolina Panthers 34-13 as New Orleans would then embark on a trip to London to prepare for a contest against the Miami Dolphins to be played at Wembley Stadium the following Sunday. Brees led six scoring drives and threw touchdown passes to wide receivers Michael Thomas, Brandon Coleman and ex-Panthers wideout Ted Ginn Jr. as the Saints avoided an 0-3 start. Rookie running back Alvin Kamara put the game away with a 25-yard touchdown run with 4:42 left, the first score of his short career. Carolina had only allowed six points in its previous two games.

The Saints' defense, which came in ranked 32nd in the league, intercepted Panthers quarterback Cam Newton three times and sacked him four times before he was replaced late in the fourth quarter.

The Panthers, who were already without injured Pro Bowl tight end Greg Olsen, lost wide receiver Kelvin Benjamin in the first quarter to a knee injury; his leg got bent back awkwardly after being dragged down from behind. Carolina's only real offense came from rookie running back Christian McCaffrey, who had 101 yards receiving on nine catches. The Saints led 17-6 when Ginn beat cornerback James Bradberry down the middle of the field for a 40-yard touchdown reception to break it open. It was the same type of big play Ginn provided for the Panthers in previous seasons. Brees was sharp all day, completing 22 of 29 passes.

GAME SUMMARIES

WEEK 4: Saints 20, Dolphins 0; October 1, 2017 @ Wembley Stadium—

It took quarterback Drew Brees and the New Orleans Saints six days and a first half before they finally found their footing in soggy Britain. Brees threw for 268 yards and two touchdowns and the Saints scored all but three of their points in the second half as they defeated the Miami Dolphins 20-0 on a rainy Sunday afternoon at Wembley Stadium. Wide receiver Michael Thomas had a touchdown reception in the third quarter, running back Alvin Kamara added one in the fourth and kicker Wil Lutz made two of his three field-goal attempts for New Orleans (2-2), which arrived for the game on Monday and won the lowest-scoring game ever held in London.

"The defense got a shutout," Brees said. "Offensively, we sustained drives, we did all the things you need to do for winning football."

It was expected to be a big homecoming for the Dolphins' Jay Ajayi, who was born in the city, but the running back finished with 46 yards on 12 carries.

Lutz missed his first try, a 41-yarder, wide right on the second play of the second quarter, and the teams threatened to have the first scoreless opening half since Week 14 of the 2011 season until Lutz connected from 43 yards with no time remaining.

Brees found Thomas, who had eight catches for 89 yards, on a 4-yarder to push the score to 10-0 in the third quarter, and Kamara took a shovel pass from Brees 12 yards into the end zone with 3:57 remaining to wrap up the victory. Kamara finished with 96 total yards, including 71 receiving, and fellow running back Mark Ingram ran for 45 yards. Quarterback Jay Cutler completed 20 of 28 passes for Miami (1-2), which finished with 185 yards, its fewest since its last shutout, a 19-0 loss at Buffalo on December 22, 2013.

New Orleans last shut out an opponent on Dec. 16, 2012, a 41-0 win against Tampa Bay.

"Obviously those first two weeks weren't what we aspired to be, we played two real good teams, the Vikings and Patriots," Brees said. "Basically now, two road wins ... I felt we had a great plan coming out here, obviously it's a tough trip coming across the pond."

WEEK 6: Saints 52, Lions 38; October 15, 2017 @ Mercedes Benz Superdome –

Running backs Mark Ingram and Alvin Kamara combined for 237 yards from scrimmage, the Saints defense forced five turnovers and scored a team-record three times, and New Orleans took a 52-38 win over Detroit.

New Orleans built a five-touchdown lead, only to wind up gutting out a remarkable comeback bid by Detroit. Detroit scored four straight touchdowns, including one on a punt return by rookie cornerback/return specialist Jamal Agnew and another on defensive tackle A'Shawn Robinson's close-range interception near the Saints goal line, in less than 15 minutes off the game clock to pull as close as 45-38 with 6:41 to go. But after Agnew muffed a punt and barely got it out of the end zone, Saints defensive tackle Cam Jordan scored on virtually the same type of play as Robinson when he got his hand on Matt Stafford's pass from the end zone.

The Saints' defense produced its first points on Detroit's

first possession, when Alex Okafor sacked and stripped Stafford in the end zone and safety Kenny Vaccaro recovered. In the third quarter, rookie cornerback Marshon Lattimore, New Orleans' top draft choice last spring, made his first interception and returned it 27 yards for a touchdown. Stafford was sacked five times and turned the ball over five times -- twice on fumbles and three times on interceptions, two of which were tipped. New Orleans also batted down 13 of Stafford's throws.

Saints quarterback Drew Brees completed 20 of 30 passes for 186 yards and touchdowns of 20 yards to wide receiver Ted Ginn Jr. and two yards to tight end Michael Hoomanawanui. However, he was also intercepted for the first and second time this season. The first interception -- also the Saints' first turnover this season -- came when cornerback Darius Slay wrestled the ball away from Thomas before the receiver could secure it. Ingram scored two touchdowns on short runs and rushed for 114 yards on 25 carries.

WEEK 7: Saints 26, Packers 17; October 22, 2017 @ Lambeau Field –

The way the Saints won on the road might serve as a valuable lesson in their quest to return to the playoffs.

The defense gave up a long touchdown run on the first series to Green Bay. Quarterback Drew Brees had two interceptions -- and the Saints weren't even out of the first quarter yet at Lambeau Field.

But Brees bounced back to throw for a touchdown, the 500th of his career both regular season and postseason combined and run for another, running back Mark Ingram rushed for a score and the Saints recovered for a 26-17 victory.

Green Bay lost its first game with Brett Hundley starting at quarterback for the injured Aaron Rodgers.

Kicker Wil Lutz kicked two second-half field goals, including a 44-yarder to put New Orleans up for good 19-17 with 10:26 remaining in the game. Brees' one-yard quarterback sneak gave the Saints a two-score lead with 4:55 remaining in the contest.

The Saints were fortunate to get their fourth straight victory. But after taking the first three wins by at least 14 points, they'll savor a victory earned following several early mistakes in addition to Brees picks.

The defense gave up a 46-yard touchdown run to rookie Aaron Jones on the opening drive. Lutz had a blocked extra point and New Orleans was penalized seven times for 80 yards.

Still, the Saints pulled away late at overcast Lambeau Field, scoring on four second-half drives before running out the clock.

After holding the Packers to a three-and-out inside the 20, New Orleans drove 55 yards in eight plays to seal the game with Brees' sneak over the goal line. Brees finished 27 of 38 for 331 yards, while Ingram ran for 105 yards on 22 carries.

Jones had 131 yards on 17 carries. Hundley showed toughness in running for a 14-yard score to give Green Bay a 14-7 lead with 8:37 left in the second quarter.

But the Packers managed just a 46-yard field goal from kicker Mason Crosby in the second half, which gave them a brief 17-16 lead.

The Saints took over from there, and the Packers couldn't keep up through the air.

Hundley finished 12 of 25 for 87 yards. He was intercepted

WEEK 8: Saints 20, Bears 12; October 9, 2017 @ Mercedes-Benz Superdome – Drew Brees completed 23 of 28 passes for 299 yards with a 111.2 passer rating against a Bears defense that ranked sixth against the pass, and the New Orleans Saints beat Chicago 20-12 Sunday for their fifth straight victory after starting the season 0-2. Running backs Mark Ingram and Alvin Kamara each ran for touchdowns for New Orleans (5-2). Ingram finished with 99 yards from scrimmage, including 75 on the ground, but his two late fumbles kept the Bears in the game into the final minutes. Kamara had 76 yards from scrimmage – 48 receiving.

The Saints were threatening to score twice in the fourth quarter when the Bears stripped the ball from Ingram. Chicago converted the first fumble into its only touchdown with 3:43 to go on rookie running back Tarik Cohen's short dive over a pile of players at the goal line. The second turnover occurred with a little more than two minutes left on the Bears 30-yard line, but Chicago was unable to get a first down as rookie quarterback Mitchell Trubisky's fourth-and-one pass fell incomplete, with it being batted down by safety Kenny Vaccaro, who led the team with nine tackles and split a sack with defensive end Cameron Jordan who now leads the club with 5.5 quarterback takedowns.

Chicago had one more chance to tie after Wil Lutz's 49-yard field goal with 1:35 left, but an interception by Saints rookie cornerback Marshon Lattimore ended that threat. Trubisky completed 14 of 32 passes for 164 yards in his fourth start for the Bears (3-5). Chicago running back Jordan Howard had 102 yards rushing on 23 carries.

Chicago had a touchdown overturned on video review after Zach Miller's 25-yard catch, during which the tight end's left leg bent unnaturally as he landed. As Miller was carted off the field with an apparently serious knee injury, officials ruled that replayed showed the ground caused the ball to loosen in Miller's grasp as his upper body crashed to the turf – after his knee had given out.

WEEK 9: Saints 30, Buccaneers 10; November 5, 2017 @ Mercedes-Benz Superdome – The Saints extended their winning streak to six when Drew Brees completed 81.2 percent of his passes for 263 yards and two touchdowns in a 30-10 victory over reeling Tampa Bay on Sunday.

The Buccaneers came in hoping to stem a four-game skid, but instead were not just beaten, but beaten up. Quarterback Jameis Winston left with shoulder soreness after the first half. Starting defensive end William Gholston was carted off the field with a neck injury.

Brees' touchdowns went for 33 yards to Alvin Kamara and 36 yards to Ted Ginn. Kamara, who also scored on a 6-yard run, did most of the work on his TD reception, thrilling the Superdome crowd with a waving, tackle-slipping run after his short catch.

The Saints also scored on Justin Hardee's blocked punt, which Hardee recovered in stride and returned for a touchdown.

Kamara finished with 172 yards from scrimmage, including six catches for 84 yards.

New Orleans' defense limited the Buccaneers' standout receiving tandem of Mike Evans and DeSean Jackson to

three catches for 38 yards. Saints rookie cornerback Marshon Lattimore, who also was involved in the sideline scuffle, blanketed Evans much of the game. New Orleans also got pressure in the backfield, finishing with four sacks. Cameron Jordan had 1.5 sacks.

Hardee's touchdown came on the first of two blocks on consecutive snaps.

First, Hardee came in clean up the middle for a smothering block on punter Bryan Anger. The ball then bounced high and behind Anger, allowing Hardee to run under it practically in stride and glide into the end zone.

Then the Bucs' Ryan Smith blocked Wil Lutz' extra point, leaving New Orleans with a 9-0 lead in the first quarter. Lutz also missed a field goal from 43 yards. Bucs kicker Patrick Murray missed from 54 yards.

Secondary Coach **Aaron Glenn** - Glenn was the 12th overall pick of the New York Jets in 1994 out of Texas A&M and started 176 of 205 career games during his tenure with New York, Houston, Dallas, Jacksonville and New Orleans and was a three-time Pro Bowl selection. Glenn recorded 41 career interceptions with six brought back for touchdowns, adding one more score on a kickoff return.

Defensive Assistant **Leigh Torrence**—Torrence enjoyed a seven-year career with Atlanta, Washington and New Orleans for his final four seasons, where he played in 73 career games.

Pass Rush Specialist **Brian Young** - Young played in the NFL from 2000-08 with the St. Louis Rams for his first four seasons, who originally selected him in the fifth round of the 2000 NFL Draft (139th overall) out of Texas El-Paso and for his final five with the Saints, appearing in 124 career games and recording 22.5 sacks, one interception seven forced fumbles eight fumble recoveries.

Numerous Saints players, coaches and administrators are not the only members of their families to make a name for themselves in pro football. No fewer than 16 of these people have relatives who have played, coached or served in the front office in the National Football League.

Defensive Coordinator Dennis Allen - Father, Grady, played linebacker for the Atlanta Falcons from 1968-72.

Offensive Coordinator Pete Carmichael - Father, Pete, served as an assistant coach in the NFL from 1994-2003 with the Jacksonville Jaguars and the Chicago Bears.

Quarterbacks Coach Joe Lombardi - The grandson of legendary NFL head coach Vince Lombardi, who led both the Green Bay Packers and Washington Redskins and also had a long distinguished career as an assistant.

Secondary Coach Aaron Glenn - Younger brother, Jason, was a linebacker and sixth-round draft pick of the Detroit Lions in the 2001 NFL Draft, playing six seasons in the NFL with the New York Jets, Miami and Minnesota.

Linebackers Coach Mike Nolan - Father, Dick, played safety in the NFL for nine years before becoming a coach. He led San Francisco from 1968 to 1975 and was the head coach of the New Orleans Saints from 1978 to 1980.

Assistant General Manager/College Scouting Director Jeff Ireland - Stepson of Kansas City Chiefs Hall of Fame LB/C E.J. Holub and the grandson of former Eagles player and Bears personnel executive Jim Parmer.

National Scout Terry Wooden - Brother, JoJo, is director of player personnel for the Los Angeles Chargers.

Area Scout Joey Vitt - Father, Joe Vitt is a longtime NFL coach who served as assistant head coach/linebackers of the Saints for 11 seasons.

CB Ken Crawley - Cousin, Stephon Morris, spent the 2012 season with the New England Patriots.

RB Trey Edmunds - Father, Ferrell Jr., enjoyed a seven-year career as a tight end with Miami and Seattle and was selected to two Pro Bowls.

CB De'Vante Harris - Father, Rod, was a wide receiver, playing three seasons in the NFL and spending the 1989 season with New Orleans where he would appear in 11 games, handling the club's kickoff and punt return duties.

RB Mark Ingram II - Father, Mark Ingram Sammy Sr., was a 10-year NFL veteran who played for the New York Giants, Miami, Green Bay and Philadelphia.

DE Cameron Jordan - Father, Steve, had a 13-year ca-

reer as a tight end with Minnesota, with six Pro Bowl selections.

T/G Andrus Peat - Father, Todd, played six NFL seasons as a lineman with the Cardinals and the Raiders.

LB Nate Stupar - Older brother, Jonathan, played two NFL seasons from 2009-10, while his uncle, Jeff Hostetler, won two Super Bowl titles with the New York Giants, as part of a 12-year career in the league.

WR Michael Thomas - Uncle, Keyshawn Johnson, is a former wide receiver, spending 11 seasons in the NFL with the New York Jets, Tampa Bay, Dallas and Carolina, earning three Pro Bowls and the Super Bowl XXXVII title.

Ahead's a synopsis of several returning players and newcomers through the draft, free agency and trade to the 2017 Saints offensive line:

LT Terron Armstead - The club's first third round draft choice in 2013 out of Arkansas-Pine Bluff, Armstead impressed scouts by running the fastest 40-yard dash time (4.71) by an offensive lineman in the history of the NFL Scouting Combine. He has opened 40 regular season games for New Orleans, returning to action in week six after missing the first four contests with a shoulder injury.

G/C Senio Kelemete - A fifth round selection of Arizona C (151st overall) in the 2012 NFL Draft, since first joining the Saints practice squad at the start of the 2013 season, this fifth-year lineman has displayed the versatility to play every position on the line. The 6-foot-3, 300-pounder saw action in 36-of-37 games over the past four seasons with 16 starts and has become an invaluable piece of the line. In 2017, Kelemete has already played at right tackle in the season opener and played at left guard in four games and at right guard in week seven and starting in week eight.

T/G Andrus Peat - A first round selection (13th overall) in the 2015 NFL Draft out of Stanford, Peat was considered one of the top college linemen. In 2016, Peat took a big step forward from his rookie season, starting 15 contests at left guard, left tackle and as an extra tight end, blocking for the most productive offense in the NFL (426.0 ypg.). Headed into his third season, Peat's a key to the Saints' future success, starting at both left guard and left tackle in 2017.

T Ryan Ramczyk - The Black and Gold used their second first round selection in the 2017 NFL Draft to snag Ramczyk, viewed by many as one of the best offensive linemen in the entire draft. The 6-6, 314 lb. tackle moved from Division III Wisconsin-Stevens Point to the University of Wisconsin, and in just one season with the Badgers, he flourished. Ramczyk started all 14 games in 2016 and was a consensus All-American, blocking for an offense that gained 203.1 rushing yards per game and allowing just a single sack. Ramczyk figures to make an immediate impact for the Black and Gold, adding valuable depth to the outside of the offensive line, starting two games at left tackle and six contests at right tackle.

OFFENSIVE NOTES

C Max Unger - Since being acquired by the Saints via trade at the start of the 2015 offseason, Max Unger has anchored the middle of the Saints offensive line, opening 37-of-38 contests, missing only one game in 2016 due to a foot injury. Originally a second round draft pick of the Seahawks in 2009, Unger has been named a first-team All-Pro by the *Associated Press* in 2012 and is a two-time Pro Bowler, helping the Seahawks to two Super Bowl appearances and a victory in Super Bowl XLVIII. Unger has opened all 105 games he has played in since 2009. Sidelined in the offseason and some of the preseason by a foot injury, Unger returned to his spot by the season opener.

G Larry Warford - A third-round pick by the Detroit Lions in 2013, Warford has been one of the best offensive linemen in the NFL since his arrival. In 2013, he was named *Pro Football Focus* Rookie of the Year after starting all 16 games without surrendering a sack. This offseason, the 6-3, 317 lb. guard joined the Saints, and he will play a critical role in the team's efforts to repeat as the National Football League's top offense manning the right guard position.

DEFENSIVE NOTES

DEFENSIVE DRAFT

Over the last three NFL Drafts, New Orleans has shown a commitment to improving the defense, spending 14-of-21 picks on that side of the ball. With nine picks in the 2015 NFL Draft, the Saints picked six defensive players, the most taken since New Orleans chose nine defensive players in a 12-round selection meeting in 1990. Below is an overview of the 11 players selected by New Orleans since 2015 on the 53-man roster:

S Vonn Bell, Ohio State (D2b-16) - Selected by New Orleans in the second round (61st overall) of the 2016 NFL Draft, Bell was a consensus All-American and one of the top rated defensive backs in the NFL Draft. As a senior, the Rossville, Ga. native was a Jim Thorpe Award semifinalist after recording 65 tackles and adding two interceptions, one brought back for a touchdown, one fumble recovery and 11 passes defensed. During his 2016 rookie season, Bell translated that collegiate success to the NFL with ease, starting 14 games and finishing second on the team with 98 tackles (59 solo) and first on the team with two forced fumbles. Now a proven asset, Bell will look to enter the upper echelon of NFL safeties in 2017, coming off of his best game of the season when he split a sack and also forced a fumble that was recovered by teammate Chris Banjo. For the season, he has 31 tackles, 1.5 sacks, two passes defensed and one forced fumble, also adding one special teams tackle.

DT Tyeler Davison, Fresno State (D5b-15) - This run-stopping widebody defensive lineman played in 53 career games at Fresno State and made 28.5 stops for a loss and 14.5 sacks. After moving into the starting lineup in 2016, Davison has continued to improve, with his 16 tackles (ten solo) and one pass defensed not showing his true value as a run-stopper.

DE Trey Hendrickson, Florida Atlantic (D3c-17) - A product of Florida Atlantic University, Trey Hendrickson joins the Black and Gold in 2017 hoping to add depth to the defensive line. The four-year letterman for the Owls dominated in his final two seasons; as a senior, he was named Conference-USA Defensive Most Valuable Player and led the nation with four blocked kicks. As a junior in 2015, Hendrickson recorded 13 sacks, second-best in the nation, and five forced fumbles. Powerful, agile, and with an eye for getting to the football, Hendrickson will be a welcome addition to the defensive front. He has made an impact with two sacks to lead the team's rookies.

DE Hau'oli Kikaha, Washington (D2-15) - Though a pre-season knee injury prematurely ended his 2016 campaign, Kikaha still enters 2017 as a key member of the Saints' front seven and pass rush. He came to New Orleans after a senior season at Washington in 2014 where he was the nation's leader with 19 sacks. In his rookie campaign, Kikaha played in 15 games with 10 starts and recorded 56 tackles (41 solo), one pass defensed, four sacks and four forced fumbles to tie for sixth in takedowns and first in forced fumbles among rookies. The Hawaii native finished the season tied for second in the league in forced fumbles, the lone rookie with four. Kikaha has made a nice rebound from missing the 2016 campaign, recording three sacks, including one in Sunday's win vs. Tampa Bay.

CB Marshon Lattimore, Ohio State (D1a-17) - The 11th pick in the 2017 draft and the first cornerback taken, Lattimore possesses all the traits of a future lockdown defender. In 2016 at Ohio State, he was named first team All-Big Ten after recording four interceptions during the year. With his agile, fluid style of play, Lattimore has the ability to shut down even the best wide receivers. He will play a critical role in the Black and Gold pass defense in 2017, as he moved into the starting lineup in week one and recording an interception return for a touchdown, Oct. 15 vs. Detroit and adding a game-clinching pick Sunday vs. Chicago. Lattimore is coming off an October where he became the first Saints rookie since 2000 to capture the NFL Defensive Rookie of the Month award, when he Lattimore had 16 tackles, two interceptions, one returned for a touchdown, five passes defensed and one fumble recovery. For the season, he has 31 stops, the two picks, a team-high eight passes defensed, one forced fumble and one fumble recovery.

DE Al-Quadin Muhammad, Miami (Fla.) (D6-17) - Muhammad joins the Saints in 2017 after showing potential as a pass rusher at the University of Miami. While he did not play in 2016, in 2015 he notched 54 tackles, good for third on the squad, while leading the team in tackles for loss and sacks with 8.5 and 5, respectively. He also forced a fumble and broke up one pass. Muhammad's strength on the line should be a valuable asset for a Saints front looking to improve on its 30-sack mark from 2016 after leading the team in quarterback takedowns in the preseason.

DT David Onyemata, Manitoba (D4-16) - Possessing a unique combination of size and speed, this Lagos, Nigeria native had an impressive rookie year after becoming the first player from the University of Manitoba to be drafted into the NFL. Despite being extraordinarily new to football, the fourth round pick appeared in all 16 games in 2016, notching 32 tackles on the year. Now with experience under his belt, Onyemata has become a critical member on the interior of the Saints defensive front as an important member of its defensive tackle rotation. In week four against the Dolphins in London, he recorded the first sack of his NFL career and split a takedown in the week nine win over Tampa Bay.

DT Sheldon Rankins, Louisville (D1-16) - Selected by New Orleans 12th overall in the first round of the 2016 NFL Draft, the Covington, Ga. native played in 46 games along the defensive line at Louisville from 2012-15, producing 133 total tackles (72 solo), 31.5 tackles for loss and 18 sacks during his collegiate career. A broken leg delayed his National Football League debut last season until Week Nine, but he made the most of his limited action, still finishing tied for third on the club with four sacks.

S Marcus Williams, Utah (D2-17) - A three-year starter at Utah, Williams was twice named All-Pac 12 and earned second-team All-American honors as a junior before declaring for the NFL Draft. In 2016, he tied for second in the conference with five interceptions, even after missing two games due to injury. The defender boasts a dangerous mix of speed, fluidity, and instinct that allows him to read the offense and make breaks on the ball. His athleticism was on display in week three at Carolina, when he snared his first career interception with his fingertips.

CB P.J. Williams, Florida State (D3b-15) - One of the most gifted athletes among the Black and Gold, Williams' career was limited in the beginning by missing all but two games in his first two seasons with injuries, but has come on in 2017. An experienced starter from Florida State Uni-

versity who developed into one of the nation's top cover corners as a junior in 2014, Williams finished his college career with 123 tackles (82 solo), four interceptions and 18 passes defensed. Williams recorded his first career interception in week three at Carolina.

NEW FACES ON DEFENSE

Along with the NFL Draft, New Orleans used free agency to add pieces to its defense, bringing players from other teams, as well as other leagues to help create the perfect mixture of veteran leadership and young talent in the Saints locker room. Below is an overview of those players:

S Rafael Bush (UFA-17 DET) - The six-year NFL veteran returns to the Saints after spending the 2016 campaign in Detroit. Bush joined the Saints following the 2012 preseason and was a significant contributor both in the secondary and on special teams for four seasons. In his only season in Detroit, he appeared in all 16 games with four starts and finished fifth on the team with 48 tackles (31 solo) and added one sack, two picks and three passes defensed. In 65 career games, he has accrued 18 starts, 184 tackles (118 solo), two sacks, three interceptions, 13 passes defensed, 29 special teams stops, and one coverage fumble recovery. In 2017, Bush will contribute to the Saints both in multiple defensive back packages and on special teams.

LB A.J. Klein (UFA-17 CAR) - Klein joined the Saints in 2017 at the start of unrestricted free agency, after spending his first four NFL seasons with Carolina. The 2013 fifth-round draft choice out of Iowa State has appeared in 66 games with 29 starts, posting 188 tackles (143 solo), five sacks, an interception, four passes defensed, four forced fumbles, and 27 special teams stops. In 2016, he played in 15 games for the Panthers with seven starts and made 31 tackles (26 solo), one sack, a career-high two forced fumbles and two special teams stops. Experienced, intelligent, and athletic, he ranks first on the team with 41 stops, one sack, six passes defensed and one forced fumble in 2017, starting all eight games.

DE Alex Okafor (UFA-17 ARI) - Okafor, a fourth-round selection in 2013 by the Arizona Cardinals out of Texas, enters the fifth year of his career and his first with the Saints. In the past five seasons, Okafor has totaled 124 tackles (70 solo), 15.5 sacks, seven passes defensed, an interception, two forced fumbles, and two fumble recoveries. Okafor has enjoyed what shows the potential for his most productive season in 2017, recording 33 tackles (23 solo), 3.5 sacks to rank second on the club, three passes defensed and two forced fumbles to tie for the team lead.

LB Manti Te'o (UFA-17 SD) - The 2012 Heisman Trophy runner-up joins the Black and Gold this season after four years as a San Diego Charger. In his career, he has appeared in 45 games with 37 starts, recording 311 tackles (184 solo), 1.5 sacks, ten passes defensed, and two picks. In 2017, Te'o has 23 stops (15 solo) and one pass defensed through the first eight contests.

SACK ATTACK

In 2017, while the improvement in the New Orleans defense can be credited to all three levels, the Saints are tied for ninth in the NFL with 23 sacks at the season's midway point after recording only 30 quarterback takedowns during the entire 2016 campaign.

DREW BREES

• Since signing with the Saints as an unrestricted free agent in 2006 from San Diego, QB Drew Brees has thrown for 4,000 or more yards each season, became the only NFL signal-caller to throw for 5,000 yards five different times and ranked at or near the top in every passing category, both in single-seasons and over the 12-year period, breaking virtually every club passing record.

• Brees has kept up the pace in 2017, leading New Orleans on a six-game winning streak, completing 197-of-275 passes (71.6%) for 2,214 yards with 13 touchdown passes, four interceptions and a 105.0 passer rating, adding one rushing touchdown. Through eight games, he is ranked first in the NFL in completion percentage, third in passer rating and fifth in fourth quarter passer rating (108.2) and passing yardage.

• Since signing with New Orleans in 2006 and playing in 182 games for the Black and Gold, Brees leads the NFL with 55,977 passing yards, 398 touchdown passes, 7,224 attempts, 4,908 completions, a 67.9% completion percentage, 101 games with at least 300 yards passing, 15 with at least 400 yards passing, 427 passes of 25 yards or more and stands at third in the league with a 99.3 passer rating. He did not throw an interception through the first four games of the season for the first time.

• Brees has been selected to play in a franchise-record nine Pro Bowls as a member of the Saints, with ten overall berths in the National Football League's all-star game, twice as a starter, including a selection following the 2016 season. His seven consecutive selections as a Saint is tied for first in franchise history with Pro Football Hall of Fame tackle William Roaf.

• Brees has posted a 107-75 regular season record in contests he has started since signing with the Saints in 2006. In Week 15 of the 2016 campaign, Brees earned his 100th regular season victory in a Saints uniform. Including his six playoff victories, his 113 total wins as a member of the Saints make him the winningest quarterback in franchise history.

• In his 17-year NFL career during which he has appeared in 241 games with 240 starts, Brees has completed 6,033-of-9,033 passes (66.9%) for 68,325 yards, 478 touchdown passes and a 96.4 passer rating. RUNNING BACKS

MARK INGRAM II

• One of the club's two first round draft picks in 2011, the 2009 Heisman Trophy winner has been an integral part of the rushing attack since his arrival in New Orleans. In 2016, Ingram had the most productive season of his seven-year NFL career, rushing for 1,043 yards on 205 carries (5.1 yards per attempt) and six touchdowns. This was the first time Ingram had broken the 1,000 yard barrier in his career. He became the first Black and Gold back to hit the mark since Deuce McAllister ran for 1,057 in 2006 and the seventh back to do so in franchise history. For his career, he ranks second in club record books with 4,779 yards rushing, third with 36 rushing touchdowns and eighth with 40 total touchdowns.

• In 2017, Ingram has picked back up where he left off in 2016, playing in all eight games with six and leading the team in rushing with 123 carries for 541 yards (4.4 avg.) with four touchdowns and adding 31 receptions for 192 yards for 733 total yards from scrimmage, which is currently ranked tenth in the National Football League, while his rushing yardage total is ranked ninth and his rushing touchdown total is tied for sixth. Ingram has had two 100-yard rushing performances in 2017

INGRAM'S BIG DAYS

New Orleans Saints RB Mark Ingram has reached 100 rushing yards 11 times over his Saints career, including for the second consecutive time in 2017 on Oct. 22 at Green Bay. New Orleans has posted a 9-2 record in those games.

• A talented runner and receiver with a 5-10, 215-pound frame who was selected by the Saints in the third round of the 2016 NFL Draft out of Tennessee, Alvin Kamara is enjoying an outstanding rookie campaign. TED GINN JR.

• Ginn joins the Saints in 2017 as he enters his 11th NFL season. He has been a member of five teams since being selected with the ninth overall pick in the 2007 NFL Draft by the Miami Dolphins out of Ohio State in 2007, and has appeared in 159 games with 67 starts over that period. In his long career marked by big play ability, he has accumulated 4,765 receiving yards off 337 catches (14.1 avg.), recording 28 touchdowns. In his first season in New Orleans, Ginn has played in all eight games with six starts and has recorded 24 grabs for 421 yards with two touchdowns, has carried four times for 32 yards and has brought back 14 punts for 84 yards and five kickoffs for 56 yards.

BRANDON COLEMAN

• Originally signed by the New Orleans Saints out of Rutgers following the 2014 NFL Draft, Coleman won a roster spot on the 2015 opening day roster after spending most of his rookie campaign on the practice squad, appearing in all 16 games with four starts. Coleman finished the 2015 season with 30 receptions for 454 yards and two touchdowns. In 2016, again appeared in all 16 games with four starts, tacking in 281 yards through the air and scoring three touchdowns. Coleman has taken his production to a new level in 2017, appearing in all seven games with two starts and making 14 grabs for 252 yards, averaging a team-high 18.0 yards per a catch and three touchdown grabs.

DEFENSIVE ENDS

CAMERON JORDAN

• New Orleans' first choice in the 2011 NFL Draft (24th overall) out of California, 2016, Cameron Jordan is enjoying another standout season in 2017, recording 38 tackles, seven sacks, one interception return for a touchdown, four passes defended and two forced fumbles. With 52 sacks in seven seasons with the Black and Gold, Jordan is fifth on the Saints career sack list. Jordan has also proven to be one of the NFL's best run defenders, known for generating pressure on quarterbacks that doesn't always show up on the stat sheet.

JORDAN SACK NOTES

ALEX OKAFOR

- Selected by the Arizona Cardinals in the fourth round of the 2013 NFL Draft, Okafor joins the Saints in 2017 where he will add valuable depth on the defensive line. Okafor has appeared in 49 games with 32 starts in five years, collecting 16.5 sacks, an interception, three forced fumbles, one fumble recovery, and eight passes defended. In 2017, he has 27 tackles (20 solo), three sacks to rank second behind Jordan, three passes defended and two forced fumbles.

DEFENSIVE TACKLES

TYELER DAVISON

- The Fresno State product followed up a solid rookie season with an even better season in 2016, helping to improve the 31st ranked run defense in 2015 to the 14th best in the league in 2016. Starting 15 games, the disruptive defensive tackle finished the 2016 campaign with 29 tackles (14 solo) and two pass deflections. In 2015, Davison became a key Saints defender while still a rookie, appearing in all 16 games with five starts and attacking for 18 tackles (10 solo) and 1.5 sacks. In 2017, the New Orleans run defense has continued to improve and this defender has played a key role in this improvement, starting all seven games and recording 16 tackles (ten solo) and one pass defended.

SHELDON RANKINS

- Rankins was limited by injury in 2016, yet he nonetheless produced an impressive campaign. After a broken fibula delayed his National Football League debut, the rookie exploded for 20 tackles (15 solo) in nine games, adding four sacks and a forced fumble. The third defensive lineman selected in the 2016 NFL Draft (12th overall), Rankins played in 46 games along the defensive line at Louisville, producing 133 tackles (72 solo), 31.5 tackles for loss and 18 sacks during his collegiate career. In his senior campaign, the former Cardinals standout racked up a single-season career-high 58 tackles (28 solo), 13 stops for loss, six sacks, one pass defended and a fumble recovery returned 46 yards for a touchdown. Rankins was named second-team All-Atlantic Coast Conference following his efforts. In 2017, he has posted eight stops (three solo) and the fumble he forced at Green Bay, Oct. 22, the second of his young career.

DAVID ONYEMATA

- David Onyemata was chosen with the team's fourth round pick (120th overall) in 2016 after a stellar college career at the University of Manitoba of the CIS, becoming the first member of the Bisons program to be drafted. Over the course of his rookie campaign, Onyemata shined, appearing in all 16 games and recording 32 tackles (15 solo). On Oct. 1, against Miami in London, Onyemata recorded his first career sack and through seven games, as an integral part of the club's defensive line rotation, he has recorded 21 tackles (eight solo) and 1.5 takedowns for losses of 8.5 yards.

LINEBACKERS

CRAIG ROBERTSON

- In just his first year with the Saints, Robertson quickly became one of the most important members of the young defense. After four seasons with Cleveland, Robertson joined the Saints looking to contribute on defense and special teams, yet his production outpaced even the highest expectations. Starting 15 games, Robertson led the Saints with 131 tackles (100 solo), while adding a sack, four passes defended, and interception, and two fumble recoveries. Robertson will continue to be a leader Saints defenders look to during the upcoming campaign, as he has returned to the starting lineup. In his first start of the season vs. Detroit, Oct. 15, he led the team with 11 tackles and had the sack, forced fumble and recovery all on the same play. In 2017 in eight games with starts in the last four contests, he has 31 stops (20 solo) and the sack/forced fumble/fumble recovery.

A.J. KLEIN

- Signed as an unrestricted free agent from Carolina, where he spent his first four NFL seasons, Klein has taken over play-calling duties on defense for New Orleans. Opening all four games on the strongside for the Saints, Klein leads the Saints with 41 tackles (29 solo), one sack, five passes defended and one forced fumble.

MICHAEL MAUTI

- Mauti, a Mandeville native who was originally selected by the Minnesota Vikings in the seventh round (213th overall) of the 2013 NFL Draft, returned to join his hometown team and made solid contributions on both defense and special teams when he was acquired off of waivers from Minnesota at the conclusion of the 2015 preseason. The son of former Saints wideout and special teams ace Rich Mauti, Michael Mauti has appeared in 50 career games with two starts in five NFL seasons and has tallied 42 tackles (27 solo), one sack, one forced fumble, 35 special teams stops and one blocked punt he recovered for a touchdown. Over eight games played in 2016, he registered 14 tackles (seven solo), one sack, one forced fumble and seven special teams stops.

MANTI TE'O

- Coming to New Orleans as a free agent, Te'o used his four seasons in San Diego to become a talented, linebacker. A second round pick in 2013 out of Notre Dame where he finished second in the voting for the 2012 Heisman Trophy, In 2015, his third season in San Diego, he started all

12 games he appeared in, recording a career-high 83 tackles (63 solo), a half-sack, an interception, and a forced fumble. Last year, he started the first three games of the season, before an Achilles injury ended his campaign. In 2017, he ranks among team leaders with 23 tackles (15 solo) and one pass defended.

DEFENSIVE BACKS

KEN CRAWLEY

- Crawley came to the Saints as an undrafted free agent in 2016 from Colorado. During his rookie year, he appeared in 15 games with five starts, recording 50 stops (41 solo), 10 passes defended, a forced fumble and a fumble recovery. A corner who played in all 47 games at Colorado, Crawley will look to continue his development in 2017. He saw his first action of 2017 in a contest in which he started, Sept. 24 at Carolina, and recorded a team-high nine tackles (eight solo) and two passes defended. He followed that standout performance with another in the Saints' win at Miami at London's Wembley Stadium, Oct. 1, when he recorded his first career interception and also added four stops and two more passes defended. Overall in 2017, he has 27 tackles, one interception and seven passes defended

MARSHON LATTIMORE

- Taken 11th overall in the 2017 NFL Draft from Ohio State, Lattimore possesses the physicality, speed, and intelligence to impact the Saints secondary. Despite appearing in just 20 games during his college career, Lattimore wowed NFL scouts. As a redshirt sophomore in 2016, he started all 13 games and was named first-team All-Big Ten. He notched four interceptions, one of which he returned for a touchdown. Lattimore figures to become a critical component of the Saints secondary. Through seven games, Lattimore has the lead among cornerbacks with 31 stops, two interceptions, one returned for a TD and eight passes defended in establishing himself as a candidate for NFL Defensive Rookie of the Year.

P.J. WILLIAMS

- This third-season defender is primed for a jump. An experienced starter from Florida State, who developed into one of the nation's top cover corners in 2014, Williams finished his college career with 123 tackles (82 solo), four interceptions and 18 passes defended. In 2017, through the first seven games, Williams has 23 tackles and recorded his first career interception in the Sept. 24 win at Carolina.

KENNY VACCARO

• Originally a first round selection of New Orleans in 2013 out of the University of Texas, Vaccaro has filled up the stat sheet for the past three seasons, primarily from the strong safety position, where he has appeared in 64 games with 62 starts and has posted 461 tackles, 6.5 sacks, eight interceptions, 29 passes defended, five forced fumbles and three fumble recoveries. Through the first seven games of 2017, Vaccaro is ranked second on the club with 39 tackles (30 solo), a club-best three interceptions, seven passes defended and a fumble recovery for a touchdown.

VONN BELL

• Bell left onlookers impressed with his 2016 rookie campaign, alerting the NFL to his arrival through his hard-hitting play. Appearing in every game with 14 starts, he totaled 98 tackles (59 solo) both of which were second on the team. He also added four passes defended, a sack, two forced fumbles, and a fumble recovery. Drafted by New Orleans in the second round of the 2016 NFL Draft (61st overall), Bell was a consensus first-team All-American, was voted First-team All-Big Ten and was also a Jim Thorpe Award semifinalist following his junior season at Ohio State. In 2017, he's appeared in all eight games and has posted 31 tackles (21 solo), 1.5 sacks and two passes defended.

RAFAEL BUSH

• A Saint from 2012 to 2015, Bush returns to New Orleans after spending 2016 with Detroit. Last season, he appeared in all 16 games with four starts, recording 53 tackles (34 solo), a sack, three passes defended, and two interceptions, one of which he returned for a touchdown vs. Jacksonville in Week 11. Over his first four seasons with the Saints, Bush appeared in 40 games with 14 starts, totaling 118 tackles (90 solo), eight passes defended, an interception, a forced fumble, and three fumble recoveries.

MARCUS WILLIAMS

SAINTS POSTGAME NOTES

- With the win, New Orleans moves to 6-2 on the season. It is their first six-game winning streak since an eight-game winning streak to close out the 2011 regular season. The six-game winning streak is tied for the sixth-longest in franchise history with a six-game run in 2000.
- The Saints take on the Buffalo Bills for a week ten matchup on November 12 at New Era Field in Buffalo, N.Y. Kickoff is set for 12:00 p.m. CST. The game will be aired on FOX (WVUE-FOX 8 in the New Orleans area).
- With the win, the Saints improved their record against the Buccaneers to 32-19 (.627).
- With the win, the Saints improved their all-time record at the Mercedes-Benz Superdome in the regular season to 162-161, upgrading their 2017 home record to 3-1. The win today improved New Orleans' record at the Mercedes-Benz Superdome against the Buccaneers to 18-10.
- The Saints currently have a streak of 248 games without having been shut out, dating back to a 26-20 win at the Tampa Bay Buccaneers on September 6, 2002 at Raymond James Stadium, the longest running streak in the National Football League.
- Today is the third consecutive contest that the Saints have surrendered 17 points or less, the first time they have done so in three straight games since they did so since the first four games of the 2013 campaign.
- New Orleans outgained Tampa Bay in total net yardage 407-200.
- New Orleans outrushed the Buccaneers 151-87.
- New Orleans outgained Tampa Bay in net passing yardage 256-113.
- Following the win, it marks the fifth time in 2017 that the Saints have surrendered 17 points or less. The last time New Orleans gave up 17 or fewer points in a season in at least four games was the 2013 campaign when they gave up 17 or fewer nine times.
- Head Coach **Sean Payton** has 106 career victories (regular season and postseason) after today's victory, He moved into sole possession of 41st all-time in career victories, surpassing **Tom Flores** and **Vince Lombardi**. Also today's win marks Payton's 100th career regular season win.
- QB **Drew Brees** appeared in his 241st career contest and completed 22-of-27 passes (81.5%) for 263 yards and a 131.9 passer rating. Brees threw touchdown passes to rookie RB **Alvin Kamara** and WR **Ted Ginn Jr.** With 225 career regular season touchdowns thrown in the Mercedes-Benz Superdome, Brees has the most touchdown passes by a quarterback at a single stadium in NFL history.
- It was Brees' 107th regular season win as starting quarterback of the Saints, tied for the second-most in the NFL with Peyton Manning since 2006.
- RB **Mark Ingram** led the Saints in rushing with 16 carries for 77 yards with the longest rush of the game for the Saints with a 32-yard run.
- Kamara scored two touchdowns in a game for the first time in his career. A 33-yard touchdown pass from Brees and a six-yard touchdown run. Kamara finished the game with 68 rushing yards on 16 attempts. Kamara also recorded six catches for 84 yards. In addition

to total touchdowns, he set career-highs in carries, receiving yardage and total yards from scrimmage (152). The 152 total yards from scrimmage was a season-high for a Saint.

- WR **Michael Thomas** finished the game with 65 yards on eight catches.
- Ginn reeled in four catches for a total of 59 yards, including a 36-yard touchdown pass from Brees.
- G/C **Senio Kelemete** received his second consecutive start at right guard in place of **Larry Warford** and played in his 50th career game today.
- DE **Cameron Jordan** played in his 104th consecutive game today and overall, putting him in a tie for 44th place on the club's all-time games played list with DE/LB **Renaldo** Turnbull. He finished with a team-high seven tackles (five solo), and a club-best 1.5 sacks for a loss of a team-high nine yards. Jordan now has 53.5 career sacks for the Saints putting him in fifth place in club record books past DL **Frank Warren**.
- DE **Alex Okafor** played in his 50th career game today. Okafor finished the game with six total tackles (three solo) and a half sack for a loss of three yards.
- DE **David Onyemata** recorded a half sack, combined with S **Vonn Bell**, part of a four-tackle day for the second-year defender.
- DE **Hau'oli Kikaha** recorded his third sack of the year, dropping Buccaneers QB **Ryan Fitzpatrick** for a five-yard loss.
- Rookie DB **Justin Hardee** blocked Buccaneers P **Bryan Anger's** punt in the first quarter, returning it seven yards for a touchdown. It was New Orleans' first special teams touchdown of the year and fourth return touchdown overall. It marks the first time the Saints have recorded four return touchdowns in a season since 2012, when they finished with five.
- LB **Craig Robertson** finished with five tackles (three solo) to lead the linebackers in stops.
- S **Vonn Bell** forced TE **O.J. Howard** to fumble on the Buccaneers own 36-yard line, recovered by S **Chris Banjo**, his first career fumble recovery. Bell finished the game with five total tackles (three solo), a forced fumble and a half sack.
- K **Wil Lutz** nailed a 40-yard field pushing him past 200 career points and added three extra points for a career total of 204.
- P **Thomas Morstead** punted twice for 91 yards (45.5 avg.) with a long of 51 yards, with two punts inside the 20. Morstead played in his 134th career game today, putting him in a tie for 21st place on the club's all-time games played list with linebacker QB **Archie Manning** and TE **John Tice**.

SAINTS HEAD COACH SEAN PAYTON

(On the way the defense played) “We did a good job of contesting the throw, keeping the ball in front of us and not allowing a big play. Third down numbers were really good.”

(On Alvin Kamara’s redemption following fumble in the second quarter) “We had a good drive there in the second half. I thought it was very important. We rushed the ball well today. The guys up front did a good job. I thought that drive was significant and I thought that (Alvin Kamara) and Mark (Ingram) handled it well.”

(On sprint down the sideline during Alvin Kamara’s 33-yard touchdown) “I was kind of fired up. Today I was just fired up.”

(On Alvin Kamara’s abilities) “He’s got good vision and good balance. Ball security we’ve got to get better at, but we will. He was able to keep his hand in the ground and keep his knee from going down and get a big run.”

(On the Mike Evans fight) “(I didn’t see) a lot good. I know it went to New York to look at. If there’s not an ejection in that situation than I don’t know when there’s supposed to be one. (Mike Evans) was a little angry.”

(On overall impression of the offense) “I thought we rushed the ball well. I thought we handled the line of scrimmage. We made enough plays in the passing game so it was good.”

(On rookie defensive back Justin Hardee and overall impression of this year’s rookie class) “We are trying to play the best guys. A lot of them are younger guys and some of them are more experienced. I think with each game you are hopefully getting better as a team. There are still a number of things we need to get better at. We have got to be able to catch a punt in the second half without it being a fire drill, but I am encouraged with some of those young guys. We are not really to send them to the Hall of Fame just yet, but the guys are competing. We are receiving a lot of production out of this group and that is encouraging. We’re going to need all of these guys. I like the level at which they’re competing and the way they’re playing.”

(On having Drew Brees as a locker room leader to the young guys) “I think we’ve got really good leadership throughout the locker room. When you start winning games you start wanting to play for each other instead of play for yourself. I think that’s always the challenge in today’s game. I like that. We talked about that earlier this week.”

(On talking to Marshon Lattimore after the Mike Evans incident) “I felt like we had pretty good control of our players. We’ve always prided ourselves in that. It’s no different than parenting.”

(On the fan impact throughout the season) “It has been fantastic. The crowd has been outstanding. It’s exciting. It is our job to go out there, perform, and play well. We feed off of it. We had a second quarter here were we knew in this four-game stretch that we were going to have three of four (games) at home. Fortunately, we were able to take advantage of that.”

(On the message the team received from 108-year-old World War II veteran, Lawrence Brooks, Saturday to the team’s walk-thru) “(It was) Outstanding. What is amazing is his health. He talked a little about how they kept ice (cold) before there was refrigeration and he shared some stories with the guys individually. It was a great visit Saturday. He is right here from New Orleans. We always have some different people visit on Saturdays. This one was special.”

(On Alvin Kamara’s impact on the offense as a receiver) “I think it helps. It’s a plus. It’s one of the things we saw on film that we thought we would have a vision for. Both he and Mark (Ingram) have versatility and I think that’s important as a runner.”

(On Drew Brees' efficiency today) "I thought it was good. I thought he did a good job. We had some key drives. He's really smart with the football. I thought it was really good."

(On the trick play on the kickoff return) "Not a lot (went) well. We did not work on sitting out there for thirty-five seconds and letting everyone see the alignment, but that is on us as coaches. We didn't do a good enough job managing that timeout. It was a longer timeout, so that was a dud."

QB Drew Brees

(On if this was some of the most complementary football by the team all year) “I think so. By no means was it perfect out there. I felt like we had some opportunities for more points and we had the turnovers where we could have gotten at least three points. We missed a field goal. I had a chance to hit Ted (Ginn Jr.) for a big play that would have lit things up in the first quarter. We are striving for that perfect game or a game where it all comes together. We did a lot of things well today. It was 4.7 yards per carry, so (we had a) good rushing average. We were able to make some big plays in the passing game. The screen game had a couple big plays as well. (The) Two-minute drive at the end of the half was big. (The) Defense played great, (and) got us a turnover that we turned into seven points, so whenever you can do that then you are winning a lot of football games now. We basically gave them a touchdown with a special teams turnover. I guess we traded them. We block a punt for a touchdown and drop a punt that ended up turning into seven. It probably all equaled out at the end. But all in all it was a good win.”

(On his confidence in Kamara) “Alvin is doing a lot of good things. He’s very versatile. He can be in the game at any moment. He can be in any personnel group. We feel comfortable with his skillset as we do with Mark (Ingram). It’s a great one-two punch.”

(On a long pass to Ted Ginn Jr. where the two of them failed to connect) “There’s some variability with the angle just depending on how they play it. I just left the ball too far outside as opposed to just kind of putting it down the middle of the field and allowing him to get his hands around it in traffic also. That was all me.”

(On being able to go to Ginn for deep balls, connecting on one for a touchdown later in the game after the miss earlier on) “It was a very similar type route to what we had missed earlier. We made the adjustment and the result was good.”

(On the energy of the Mercedes-Benz Superdome today and if it seems like it’s where it was four years ago) “Yes. We feel the energy. We feel the momentum. Obviously those third downs with our fans (when we are on) defense and the noise meter is going, fans are getting crazy and we’re getting off the field. (The) Offense (is) getting the ball (back), going down (the field and) getting points. A lot of good things (are) happening.”

(On rebounding from some first half struggles late in the first half with a touchdown) “Yes. We were able to run a scramble play to Coby (Fleener) and then a screen play to Kamara. Those two huge plays, they’d get us a touchdown. Then to come out first drive in the second half, (and get a) touchdown. (The) Defense gets a turnover, (and we score a) touchdown. That blows the whole thing wide open. You’re able to grab momentum and hold onto it.”

(On what it’s like to be at 6-2 midway through the season and 2-0 and in first place in the NFC South) “Division wins are great. Obviously those are very important. But I think each week we try to look at it as a faceless opponent. We’re still striving to play our best game and I don’t think we have achieved that yet. We are continuing to make strides in that direction, but there are still a lot of things we can do better. The road only gets tougher. We go on the road to Buffalo this week. They are a very good football team that’s playing really well on both sides of the ball so we have our work cut out for us.”

(On if this is the first time he’s played with a sleeve like that) “Yes, just compression. I do it on my legs at times, that kind of thing. It’s a comfort thing.”

(On if it’s an injury issue) “No.”

RB Alvin Kamara

(On bouncing back after the early fumble) “It stinks about the fumble, but it happened last week with Mark (Ingram). We are human. I just had to shake it off. Everybody was supportive. I just had to move on to the next play.”

(On getting in a groove) “Drew (Brees), Mark and the offensive line are making it real easy for me. They are doing a great job. It’s making me comfortable to go out there and make the plays that I am supposed to make.”

(On winning a division game today) “Wining a division game is huge. We still have some more games to play. We have to go to Buffalo next week and get a win.”

(On the first touchdown scoring drive) “It was huge. We got a lot of momentum coming off that drive. We had a lot of energy. The sideline was hyped. The defense played great and got us the ball back. It’s great to play complementary football.”

DE Cameron Jordan

(On the young guys) “We started out being one of the youngest defenses in the league. I could not be prouder of our defense and the way that they are playing. We are attacking offenses. We are trying to assert our identity in the football world.”

(On chasing perfection) “We talked about eliminating big plays. We talked about eliminating the quarterback scramble. I think Jameis (Winston) probably scrambled twice. Ryan Fitzpatrick had a major scramble up the middle. I take pride in eliminating that scramble. We’ll get after the quarterback next week and eliminate some of those mistakes. The defensive backs are playing awesome.”

DB Justin Hardee

(On what Head Coach Sean Payton said to him after the punt block that he returned for a touchdown) “Good job. He does not really say too much. He keeps me humble. He tells me good job and I know next week that I have to prove him even more.”

(On being a rookie and his punt block setting the tone) “I feel like I worked hard to be in this position. I’m not surprised at all that it happened to me because at practice I work hard. I believe in myself and I work hard. It’s just hard work paying off.”

(On the punt block) “They blocked down. They left me free. I saw a clear path. I was so surprised that it was so clear. Coaches talked about it all week. I was just so glad that I was in the position. I had enough speed to get to the ball.”

(On the loss) “We weren’t good enough in any phase. Of course, that starts with me. The type of football we are playing right now (is not good). We can’t get punts blocked. We can’t have four sacks (on our quarterback). We cannot miss tackles in the run game and not be able to run the football. We’re just not playing good enough in any aspect. That all starts with the head coach.”

(On the sideline issues between the two clubs that took place during the game that resulted in a personal foul penalty on wide receiver Mike Evans) “I didn’t see what happened on the fight. I was looking out on their team, I turned to my left and the fight broke out. I really don’t know what happened on that. I heard a report on what happened from people that did. I really didn’t see what happened there. That is definitely not the way that we want to represent ourselves, if it was, in fact, the way that I was told.”

(On the status of Jameis Winston) “Right shoulder injury. He is getting x-rayed right now. They are not sure yet if it is the same injury or a different injury.”

(On if he has a concussion) “Not to my knowledge.”

(On how Winston played in the first half) “I don’t think that we were playing good in any areas before that (injury). Part of that has to do with protection and not being able to run the ball.”

(On if he is concerned about his job status) “When you play like we did today, I am concerned about every aspect. Obviously, that is my responsibility.”

(On if Doug Martin was benched or was the team trying to get energy from others) “We were just trying to find a way to get something going. Peyton (Barber) went in there and found a way to get some yards after contact.”

(On the status of Will Gholston) “The report that I received is that Will is undergoing neurological testing at the hospital. Right now, he’s neurologically sound. They’re continuing to do some tests at a local hospital.”

(On if Donovan Smith suffered a knee injury) “He did. He has a knee injury and wasn’t able to go in the second half.”

(On his message to the team going forward) “Today, my message was that we weren’t good enough in any aspect in all three phases, including coaching.”

(On if he would consider not calling plays) “Everything is under consideration at this point.”

(On if there will be personnel changes) “There is only so much that you can do. (There are) 53 guys (on the active roster).”

(On activating Quarterback Ryan Griffin): “In the event that we had something happen, that is the one reason going back to the preseason why we did reserved-eligible to return Ryan Griffin. This is the week that a decision has to be made on that.”

(On who would play quarterback if Winston isn’t able) “It is too early to speculate on that. We will see what happens.”

(On Alvin Kamara being effective today) “Kamara has been effective all year. He has been effective. He was the same today. He was running hard. He broke some tackles when we were in position to make them. He is playing very well.”

(On if the team is embarrassed by their play recently) “I would hope so. I am totally embarrassed by it. I would hope that the players are (feeling the same).”

Quarterback Jameis Winston

(On if he will be able to throw in practice this week) "I don't know. It's not my decision."

(On how it felt being taken out of the game due to his shoulder injury) "I just hate losing. Ask me about the game. Don't ask me about my shoulder. I hate losing."

(On him and his team's offensive struggles in the first half) "I have to do my job better. (I'm) not playing well enough. We got to find a way to score touchdowns."

(On how surprised he is to see the Buccaneers at 2-6 at the midway point of the season) "It is getting to the point man. I hate losing. I hate losing. I hate losing."

(On how team has had a difficult time responding to losses this season) "I don't know. That is something we (are going) to have to handle internally, but we (are going) to handle it. We have to start winning."

(On being put in a position to win games) "I don't think I am doing a good job to put our offense in position to score. I know I am not doing my job, so I have to do a better job. Everyone has to do a better job. Everyone has to take ownership and start playing. Our coaches, they are doing their job. Coaches coach, players play. We got to play. I know I have to play. I am not playing well enough."

(On whose call it was to take him out of the game) "It (was) the doctors. I don't know (exactly) whose call it was. I just know they pulled me. That's all I know."

(On what he is not doing well) "Completing the football efficiently. Obviously, driving the team down there to score touchdowns. It's on me. We got a team, but the quarterback has to get the ball in the end zone. I'm not doing that."

(On his message to the team) "I got to fix myself before I can do anything out there. I got to fix myself. I got to do a better job. I can't go and expect somebody else to do their job to their caliber, and I am not doing my job."

(On seeing William Gholston get hurt) "We send our prayers to him. For somebody that plays as hard as he plays. That's enough to just make you want to play harder. I thought we (were) going to get some juice from that when we see our teammate go down, but we got to find out what's going to make it work."

(On the possibility that he could get shut down this season by the Buccaneers if there's risk to further injure his shoulder) "I do not control that at all. My job's to get better at my job. I have to do that. I am not doing a good job right now."

(On keeping the locker room together when sitting at 2-6) "We should want to be motivated because we don't want to finish the season with two (wins). I hate losing. Do you hate losing? Do all of you hate losing? We hate losing, too. So we (are going to) fix things. We got to start playing better."

Wide Receiver Mike Evans:

(On if he is concerned about discipline after shoving Marshon Lattimore) "Yeah, I want to play. I want to help my team, but the league is going to do what they are going to do."

(On if frustration from offensive struggles factored into shoving Marshon Lattimore) "A little bit. But I'm going to protect my quarterback no matter what, but I shouldn't have did that. That was kind of malicious. I shouldn't have hit him in his back like that. I should have just shoved him away to try to break it up, but I reacted to quick. I shouldn't have did it."

Tight End O.J. Howard

(On not executing on offense today) "I would just say it's disappointing more than frustrating because we practice all week so hard. We had a great week of practice and we just did not translate today. Our offense I'm seeing is just way better than that. It's just disappointing."

(On his fumble) "I was just trying to do too much. (I was) trying to make a play. The ball was low, (I) got to keep it high and tight. (The) guy ripped it out. That was just bad ball playing by me."

Defensive Tackle Chris Baker

(On mindset coming out of halftime) "Come out here and play football. Let's start fast and obviously, we didn't start fast enough. They came out and just played great. We got to figure out how we are going to get better as an offense, defense, special teams, and coaching. They beat us in every aspect of the game. If we want to win a game, we have to figure out how to stop teams and how to score. Until then we're going to keep having the same feeling. I'm just pissed off. We just want to get better. Guys are coming to work each and every day doing what the coaches ask us to do. We just got to translate that."

(On injury to Gholston) "We're praying for him. When it happened on the field, it's a tough situation, but we understand that any given play can be the last play in this league. So, we just pray for the best and hope nothing too serious is wrong, what happened to him. We'll see what happens the next couple of days."

Linebacker Kendell Beckwith

(On playing back in the Superdome) "It's a dream come true. As a kid, you grow up thinking about what if I play in the NFL. Actually playing an NFL game and coming back home against the home team, like I said, it's a dream come true. That's not the outcome that we wanted, but we just got to keep working, keep fighting."

(On Saints offensive adjustments in the second half) "Some good game planning. They definitely had some good gameplanning. Hats off to them. You got to give credit where credit is due. They had a good game plan. I guess we just got to execute better."

(On the sideline scuffle) "It is some trash talking going on. It is a lot of emotions. Especially, when you're down. We were down, lot of emotions. It's a competitive game and that kind of stuff happens."

What sticks out about the way the defense has played over the last six weeks?

“I think we’ve done a good job of contesting throws and I think that we’ve done a good job of disrupting the timing whether it been the quarterback or the routes. And yet, there’s still a handful of things that we’re working to improve on. But I think each one’s been a little different too. Yesterday’s game I thought we really played the run well and they became one-dimensional. I thought we really did a good job covering them.”

At the midpoint of the season, do you feel like you have a good feel for the identity of this team and how it responded from that start?

“A lot better than the start of the season and yet I think they are still establishing who and what they’re going to be. But yes, this is a group that likes to compete and I think we have gained confidence and some of these games have unfolded differently than maybe expected. But I think it is still a process we are finding out. I think there are things that are taking place right before our eyes and (there are things) we are working to correct and improve on. I think through that performance you are seeing guys come in and play with a little bit more of a swagger and a little bit more confidence and that is encouraging.”

I know injuries are expected but (regarding) the offensive line, have you experienced anything like this with multiple guys playing the both tackle and both guard positions?

“Hopefully it can settle down some, but it’s a little bit unusual. The guys have done a good job of adjusting.”

On the offensive line, how much has it helped that Max (Unger) has been as reliable with the changes that have happened at the guard spot?

“It helps a lot with communication. I think him rehabbing and getting back, both he and Terron (Armstead) were on schedule (and), ahead of schedule. That was significant. But he is someone that is responsible for a lot of the communication up front and he’s having a great year.”

Yesterday you had two dropped punts, Ted Ginn Jr. and Willie Snead IV, when you look at the tape how much of that is them trying to do too much?

“I think that is a good question, but it is not (at the same time). We have to be able to, in the NFL, when we’re faced with a situation where teams punting in, where normally it is (a situation of) a fair catch or a let it bounce decision, we have to be able to catch that

ball 100% of the time and we will find someone that can. Because, it's not like those are rarely returned situations. Those are generally at that landmark of (where you) secure the catch here or let it fall here. We just need someone that is reliable enough to do that."

Do you think you have someone on the roster now that can?

"We'll see. If I had him and I knew he could, I would have put him out there. I feel like Snead and Ginn can do that. But we have to know it and we got away with one at Green Bay and now yesterday. Obviously we have to do a better job coaching it."

DeSean Jackson mentioned that he saw some different looks from the defense than they had on film. Was that part of the gameplan?

"Each week it is. You are always trying to mix things up and yet plan for the team you are playing. There are subtle changes. It might be third down, (or) who is covering who. It might be how many are going to rush. It happens week to week in our league."

Even though you aren't one to talk about personal accolades, yesterday you passed Vince Lombardi on the all-time wins list. What does that mean to you, when you pass a legendary guy like Vince Lombardi?

"Until you just said that, I did not realize it. I feel like it is early in my career. I have been with a lot of good teams and a lot of good players. I just feel like it's such a team game that it is hard to look at individual numbers like that. Yesterday they gave me a hard time. It was the 100th win for regular season and I got a ball from (Drew) Brees and then Mickey (Loomis) congratulated Pete Carmichael the same way and Pete said, 'well I'm already at 107' because he was here in '12. There are so many guys that are involved in winning a game and I think it's a privilege to be able to coach and work with guys, (and) work with young players too."

You also currently sit 41st all-time in combined wins, regular season and postseason?

"Well, I'm trying to get that lower."

How has (Alex) Okafor compared to the expectations from when you signed him?

"I think he has done a good job. He has been very steady. He is a pro's pro. He's smart. I think he comes to work every day. I think he's been a good leader for us too. I'm encouraged with how he's played."

I know you preach not to look ahead or big picture, you want the guys to focus on the week coming up. But how much do you think the trials and tribulations that a lot of your players have gone through the last few years have maybe helped them keep that focus as they've been winning this year?

"I don't know. I think there are a lot of new faces on this team and I think they look at it like it's their own identity. I don't think necessarily they draw to responsibilities or team

mistakes three years ago. There are obviously a number of players that were here three years ago. But I think it's viewed more about this season. Certainly the guys that have been here understand how close these games can come down to (details), whether it's a two-minute drive, a goal line situation. I think there's that balance of understanding how quickly and how close things are in our league with other teams and week to week, and then appreciating that week in the preparation, in the moment of that game."

Offensive line-wise, have you seen a team that has the kind of upheaval that you guys have on the line? Multiple guys have played every position except yours.

"Yes, it stinks, but it is kind of a testament to the depth that we have and the depth we have been able to build here and have guys come in and play out of position and not really have a drop in production. It is part of the game. There are five O-linemen out there. There is a good chance that somebody's going to get hurt, so it's kind of a next man up mentality. But we've had a tough run."

As the guy that's in the middle and making those calls, do you find yourself at some point in time having to settle things down either on the field or in practice?

"We've done a good job of rotating in practice. We've had some moving parts. For the most part everyone's been right on the same page. Coach (Dan) Roushar's done a good job of breaking it down and getting people experience in places that they haven't naturally been. I really haven't had to do too much calming down. I think everybody's been kind of, not okay with the situation, but able to adapt to it."

You're the only one that's actually played every snap at your own position the entire season, did you envision that at all being possible going through your own injury issue this offseason?

"Late surgeries are never really in the offseason plan. (I had a) Good surgery, awesome rehab with our staff here and I got to come back early and play. Honestly, no I didn't think that I would be back (as early as I was) but it turned out that I was able to get back and play okay."

If you just isolate you and Alvin Kamara on that screen pass, I think you had him all the way up until about the 50-yard line. Did you think you could keep up with him the whole way?

"Yes, I got hit pretty hard. I thought he was down honestly until he kind of stopped. That's never a good idea in an NFL football game to assume somebody is down so he made a heck of a play and that's a good lesson learned. He's going to keep going."

I know you're a pretty humble guy, but offensive linemen are known for toughness, how much pride do you take on your athleticism on screen passes and things like that which are obviously a big part of this offense?

"We've been working pretty hard on our screen game. This was actually a point of emphasis toward the end of last year, this offseason and definitely training camp. It's an element of our game that we want to feature. So there's been, from our entire staff, an emphasis on this. I think that a lot of that relies on us being able to execute these plays and detail them up and I think we've done a good job with that. That part of our game is where we want it to be right now."

Is there any method to recovering a fumble the way you did?

"We practice it every Thursday. You never want to be the guy recovering a fumble like that. You just have to get down there and grab it."

When we've talked to opposing coaches they've mentioned how good the Saints screen game is so they're obviously trying to prepare for it and they know it's coming and they still can't stop it. In your experience, what has to come together for something to be predictable but yet still tough to stop?

"It's a variety and it's tendency breakers. Honestly, Drew (Brees) does a good job of putting up in a position to be able to get out and block the linebackers, if they are hugging in the back. If it is a zone, he kind of lets us know. It is definitely gameplan stuff. Sean (Payton) and Dan (Roushar) and our (coaching) staff are always out there looking for an element for the screen game to pop because you can get really explosive plays with them. But, yes like I said earlier it's a part of our game we've been focusing on for a little while now because we saw a need for it."

Is there any part of your game that you felt you've gotten better at or expanded in your years in New Orleans because of the switch in offenses or just your own natural evolution?

"It's a lot of different offenses out there. But for the most part they are pretty similar. Along those lines there is a lot of improvement out there just watching the film from this week. As a group there's a lot we can do better and myself definitely. But as far as specific things, we'd be on this phone for a while if I had to name them all off."

Well what's number one? What's your most proud of that you've developed in your game in the last couple of years?

"That's a hard question. I don't even know how to answer that. Sorry. I have nothing for you man. It's hard to isolate yourself when you rely on the guy to the left and the right of you so much It's a lot more than just kind of being solo out there."

What sticks out about the way the defense has played over the last six weeks?

“Really just the confidence and the preparation guys are putting in. Guys are anticipating and making plays and guys (are) having celebrations ready. It’s just a fun atmosphere to be around to be honest.”

Do you guys feed off of each other?

“Definitely. We definitely do. We’re playing a complementary defensive game. Guys are holding up on the back end really well and it’s making our pass rushers get there, even when we don’t hold it up as well, our pass rushers are getting there. So it’s just kind of feeding off each other and letting things go and having fun out there.”

If you could put a finger on a signature moment during the first part of the season, where was the turnaround from the first two games that you lost and the defense struggled in to where you are now?

“That’s a tough question. Honestly I don’t have the answer for you. But I would say it was something that didn’t happen in a game. It was more so something that happened in practice. Just guys who are just fully committed. Things we are doing now and we’re doing in practice and it just kind of started after we started slow in those first two games. We started practicing differently as a defense and things went just on a roll after that.”

Do you guys feel like you made some strides against the run yesterday?

“We did. Obviously they did not run the ball as much as they wanted to just with us jumping up on the score and just trying to get back into the game. But when they did run the ball we didn’t let any explosive runs get us. We let the quarterback get out of the pocket a couple of times which kind of goes on our run defense. But other than that, I feel we played solid in the run game. The biggest part’s not letting explosive runs kill us.”

What kind of confidence does that give you as you get ready to prepare for a guy like LeSean McCoy?

“He’s one of the best backs in the league, so he’s definitely somebody that you have to be fully confident going up against. He’s a guy that you have to keep bottled up. If he gets any type of space, any type of room, he can make something happen. He will be a good challenge for us as a defense.”

How do you think Kelvin Benjamin is going to affect their offense or alter it? What are your thoughts on what you expect from him?

“He’s a great player. He can do a lot of things. We will kind of expect the same things that he did in Carolina that he’ll do in Buffalo. Just being that big target, being that

security blanket for Tyrod (Taylor). Just being a guy with just great hands that can catch a lot of balls over the middle and didn't have to take those hits (but he did). I feel like he'll be that same type of presence in Buffalo."

It seems like you guys all seem pretty focused on the task at hand, how much of that is you guys taking what coaches are saying? Do you think last year's results have played any impact on you guys having more focus this year?

"Last year's results and our coaches keeping us focused. You can't worry about whatever anybody is saying. With a gas mask, don't let anybody gas us up. We just have to keep our focus on each week at a time and that's what we're trying to do."

How hard is it to stay focused and not listen to that stuff that comes when you've won six in a row?

"It's not hard at all because we did it when we won our first game. We did it when we won our second game. It's just something that's become natural now. I wouldn't say it would be hard but it's easy for a lot of young guys to look forward after you string a couple together. We have a good presence in our room with enough older guys in each room and our coaches just doing a good job of keeping us focused on the task at hand and taking it week by week."

Have you ever run across a line like that with that delay of game penalty before like yesterday?

"No. I've done other things just kind of raise a hand or something just to get the attention. It was on zero for a second or two and I was like well I have to do something for them to see that. But I'm just trying to make sure we get that five yards."
