## **NOTE THE QUOTE**

## DT Brandon Williams on the Ravens' defensive standard & win over Miami:

"We have a standard to keep in Baltimore. We needed to get back to what Baltimore does: that is hard-nosed defense, and that's stopping the run. ... I know what the Baltimore Ravens have and who we are. What you just saw [vs. Miami] is exactly who we are - a hard-nosed team, a defense that runs to the ball and stops the run, gets a bunch of tackles in the backfield. That is who we are, and that is what we displayed."

## JUST THE FACTS

- The Baltimore Ravens (4-4) battle the Tennessee Titans (4-3) at Nissan Stadium on Sunday, Nov. 5 in a 1 p.m. kickoff. Baltimore looks to capture its third road victory of the season, already producing wins at Cincinnati and Oakland. The Titans are 2-1 at home in 2017 and come off their bye week having won two-straight games.
- Baltimore and Tennessee have split the regular season series, 9-9, with the Ravens emerging as 21-7 victors in the most-recent meeting, which took place in 2014 at M&T Bank Stadium. The last time Baltimore played in Nashville was 2011, when the Titans won 26-13.
- The Ravens were dominant in all phases when they shut out the visiting Dolphins at M&T Bank Stadium, 40-0, last Thursday. It was the Ravens' second shutout of the season and the third-largest margin of victory in team history. Baltimore's defense produced 2 fourth-quarter TDs, the first by ILB C.J. Mosley on a 63-yard theft. The second came on a 50-yard INT by CB Jimmy Smith. Miami registered only 196 yards of offense, the lowest allowed by the Ravens this season. Despite RB Jay Ajayi posting a 21-yard run on his first carry, the Ravens' defense limited Miami to 45 rushing yards (also a Baltimore season low). QB Joe Flacco was 10-of-15 for 101 vards and 1 TD before leaving the game with a concussion in the second quarter.
- In their 22nd year of existence, the Ravens have earned a playoff berth in six of the past nine full seasons. Since head coach John Harbaugh's arrival in 2008, Baltimore has posted the NFL's fourthmost total victories (99), won the league's second-most playoff games (10), advanced to an impressive three AFC Championship contests, and in 2012, captured the World Championship in SB XLVII.

## SPOTLIGHT: MATTHEW JUDON

You graduated from Grand Valley State with a degree in sports management and business. How do you hope to utilize that degree? "I want to be an athletic director. So,

I want to go back to school and get my MBA, but that's far down the line. Hopefully, I can play 11 more years."

What interested you in being an athletic director? "GVSU had a pretty cool athletic director, Tim Selgo. I really wanted to be an engineer, but I couldn't be an engineer and play football at the same time. I chose football, and it worked out for me."

What's your favorite thing about Baltimore? "The fans – they love you out here. They are passionate, and they're good people."

Can you explain the meaning of the tattoo on your arm? "I have nine brothers and sisters, so I have all their names wrapped around my arm, and it's a tree going through it. I have a cross on my forearm with my mom and dad's name on it. It's like a family tree."

## SHUT 'EM DOWN

With last week's 40-0 win over Miami, the Ravens notched their second shutout of the season (20-0 victory in Week 1 at Cincy). It marked Baltimore's 12th-ever shutout, which ranks as the NFL's most since the Ravens moved to Charm City in 1996. Additionally, the Ravens and Steelers are now the only NFL teams to produce multiple shutouts in three separate seasons dating back to 1996.

## **QUOTH THE RAVENS**

## OLB TERRELL SUGGS ON THE RAVENS' 40-0 WIN OVER MIAMI AND GOING BACK TO WORK:

"We know how we are capable of playing. [Against Miami], I think we got a little back to 'Raven Football.' You can't take shutouts for granted. We have two of them this year, which is pretty good. But we also have been on the other side of that where we have been lit up. We are .500; we have been here before. Eight [games] left, it is all about what we do with it. ... You definitely want to be consistent; I have said that before. Mediocrity is the worst thing in the world. You do not want to just be average. Like I said, we have a lot of work to do. We are 4-4. We got one in the win column [vs. Miami], and we are going back to work."

#### The Baltimore Sun's Childs Walker on CB Brandon Carr:

"Brandon Carr was probably the team's fourth-most-hyped offseason signing, behind [Brandon] Williams, [Tony] Jefferson and [Jeremy] Maclin. Well, hype isn't everything, because Carr has been a godsend for a secondary so frequently depleted by injuries in recent seasons. Though he's known for his durability, Carr is also a better playmaker than he got credit for, as we saw with his interception on a contested ball early in the game against Minnesota [on 10/22]. He lacks the world-class physical skills of Jimmy Smith and Marlon Humphrey, but he's a good athlete, a reliable cover man and a respected personality in the locker room."

## Steelers head coach Mike Tomlin on what makes OLB Terrell Suggs so special:

"I think it's his football intelligence. His physical talents are what they are, and they are well-documented. He is athletic. He is powerful. But his awareness, his feel for the game is displayed statistically in the number of passes that he bats and the fact that he is always not just playing for a sack, but that he is a ball-aware guy. He is a sack-fumble guy. I just think his football intelligence is on display in just about every element of his game. He is a very aware player. He makes plays because of that. He has very good hands and eyes."

## "O" coordinator Marty Mornhinweg on T Ronnie Stanley:

"Ronnie Stanley, I know this, with hard work, continued hard work – because he is a hard worker – he may end up being one of the best in the league. He's a fine, fine player. We're glad to have Ronnie at the left tackle spot."

#### QB Joe Flacco on how he motivates his receiving corps:

"The biggest thing for those guys is to continue to know I have confidence in them. I let them know, 'Listen, we're prepared. We're all prepared here. We've done our preparation. Every one of us is as prepared as we can be. We've all been putting the time in, so now, it's just going out there and letting it fly.' Come game time, you can't be thinking about anything like that. You can't be batting an eye; you just have to go out there, and I'm going to continue to let it fly. Those guys are going to continue to do everything, in terms of letting it fly, that they can. From a quarterback, just like we all need that boost of confidence to continue to go, it's the same thing."

#### Head coach John Harbaugh on LB C.J. Mosley:

"He is a talented guy. He is big, he is fast – he has size and speed – but he's more athletic. He has great body control. He has great awareness of the game. He has a real feel for leverage, so he is a tough guy to block. He has a knack for getting off blocks and getting to the ball carrier. That is not easy to do. When guys are pulling around on you, you are hitting those guards in the hole. He has a way of slipping those blocks and making plays, which is probably what the great ones do as linebackers."

## The Sporting News' Ron Clements on RB Alex Collins:

"Alex Collins is a star in the making. Collins might have other NFL running backs take Irish dance lessons if he continues to play like he did [vs. Miami]. Collins, a fifth-round pick from Arkansas in the 2016 NFL Draft, recorded his first-career 100-yard game against the NFL's fifth-ranked rush defense. He has an explosive burst through the hole and runs with excellent vision. He's also shifty in the open field and caught two passes for 30 yards."

## RB Alex Collins on how rewarding this year has been:

"It's been really important. I just give a lot of credit to the staff and the head coach and everybody for giving me that opportunity coming in, and trusting and believing in me. I had a few [fumble] mishaps earlier in the season, and [I appreciate them] just sticking with me. It's a great feeling. I feel the family atmosphere. Everybody's got your back, and I love it here. Just the perseverance of coming to a new team and learning a new system. I just definitely just kept my head down and just worked hard to get where I am."

## LB C.J. Mosley on the Ravens' 40-0 win over Miami and improving after a tough few games on defense:

"We knew we could do it, and for the most part, we [weren't] doing it. Like I said, [we were] letting those runs leak out; they always leaked out at the wrong time in the game. It's a good thing to put it on tape. [Against Miami], we got back to what we do. We can look at the things that we did wrong, the plays that got out and look at this whole game, but once we play our technique and everybody stays square in your gap, the results showed. We've just got to make sure we have that same mentality going forward."



The Ravens were dominant in all phases when they shut out the visiting Dolphins at M&T Bank Stadium, 40-0, last Thursday. It was the Ravens' second shutout of the season and the third-largest margin of victory in team history. Baltimore's defense produced 2 fourth-quarter TDs, the first by ILB C.J. Mosley on a 63-yard theft and sprint. The second came on a 50-yard INT by CB Jimmy Smith. The Dolphins produced only 196 yards on offense, the lowest allowed by the Ravens this season. Despite RB Jay Ajayi posting a 21-yard run on his first carry, the Ravens' "D" limited Miami to 45 rushing yards. The win stopped a three-game Dolphins' winning streak. QB Joe Flacco, who was 10-of-15 for 101 yards and whose 34-yard TD pass to WR Jeremy Maclin gave the Ravens a 7-0, first-quarter lead, left the game with a concussion in the second quarter. RB Alex Collins produced a career-high 113 rushing yards on 18 carries as part of the 174 ground yards by the Ravens. K Justin Tucker added FGs of 55 and 48 yards, both coming in the second quarter. QB Ryan Mallett, who replaced Flacco and was 3-of-7 for 20 yards, threw a 2-yard TD to TE Benjamin Watson at the end of the second quarter, giving the Ravens a 20-0 halftime lead. The teams were scoreless in the third quarter. Along with the 2 INTs for TDs, the Ravens added a third fourth-quarter TD when WR Chris Moore recovered a Mallett fumble in the end zone. Miami QB Matt Moore was 25-of-44 for 176. It was Baltimore's ninth-consecutive primetime triumph at home (6-0 under John Harbaugh).

In a magnificent effort showcasing thrilling performances by their defense, offense and special teams units, the Baltimore Ravens won Super Bowl XXXV with a 34-7 victory over the New York Giants. Allowing the Giants a meager 152 total net yards, New York's attack crossed midfield just twice, while Baltimore's "D" posted 4 INTs. LB Ray Lewis was named the game's MVP, capping an accolade-filled season in which he was also tabbed the NFL's Defensive Player of the Year.



QB Joe Flacco - 2012 Super Bowl XLVII MVP

Baltimore defeated San Francisco, 34-31, in Super Bowl XLVII, capturing the franchise's second World Championship. After an amazing first-half performance, the Ravens took a commanding 28-6 lead. But following a bizarre, 34-minute power outage that halted play, the 49ers stormed back into contention. Clinging to a 34-29 edge late in the game, the Ravens stood firm on a pivotal goal-line stand, jamming SF on four-straight plays inside the 7-yard line. QB Joe Flacco was named the game's MVP.

## THE HARBAUGH FILE

John Harbaugh has led the Ravens to a playoff berth in six (2008-12 & 2014) of his nine full seasons in Baltimore, and in 2012, captured the franchise's second Super Bowl title. Under his guidance, the Ravens have secured an appearance in three AFC Championships (2008, 2011 & 2012).

## Here are several Harbaugh quick hits:

- The Ravens are one of seven teams with at least six playoff berths in the past nine seasons (2008-16): GB (8), NE (8), Bal. (6), Cin. (6), Ind. (6), Pit. (6) & Sea. (6).
- The Ravens' 10 playoff wins since 2008 rank second only to New England's 11.
- "Harbs" is the only head coach in NFL history to win a playoff game in each of his first four and five seasons.
- John and his brother, Jim (formerly of the 49ers), are the only head coaches to advance to three conference title games in the first five years as NFL bosses.
- Harbaugh is the only coach in NFL history to win a playoff game in six of the first seven seasons of a coaching career.
- In 2012, Harbaugh became the third coach (with Bill Cowher & Chuck Knox) since the 1970 merger to guide his team to the playoffs in each of his first five seasons.
- Harbaugh owns the second-most playoff wins (10, tied) by a coach in his first nine seasons (since the 1970 merger).
- With the Ravens' 2014 playoff berth, Harbaugh became one of eight coaches in NFL history to make the postseason in six of their first seven seasons coaching.
- For coaches to make the playoffs in at least six of their first nine years, "Harbs" is one of five active coaches to do so (Pete Carroll, Mike McCarthy, Andy Reid & Mike Tomlin).

## ROSBURG LEADS RAVENS SPECIALISTS

SEASONS RAVENS: 10TH NFL: 17TH Special teams coordinator/associate head coach **Jerry Rosburg** has guided a stellar special teams group since arriving in Baltimore in 2008. Below are several standout notes about the coach and his successful group of specialists:

#### SIX PRO BOWLERS

• Six Ravens have earned eight combined Pro Bowl honors while playing for Rosburg: ST Brendon Ayanbadejo (2008), K Billy Cundiff (2010), RS Jacoby Jones (2012), K Justin Tucker (2013 & 2016), LS Morgan Cox (2015 & 2016) and P Sam Koch (2015).

#### PRIME KICKER & PUNTER

• Two-time Pro Bowl **K Justin Tucker**, who Rosburg scouted and helped sign as a rookie free agent, owns the NFL's most FGs (183) since entering the NFL in 2012. With an 89.3% career success mark, "Tuck" is the second-most accurate kicker in league history (183-of-205 on FGAs). Earning his first Pro Bowl nod in 2015, **P Sam Koch**'s 46.7 gross average ranked No. 9 in the NFL that season, while his 42.9 net average was No. 2. In 2014, Koch posted the NFL's No. 3 gross (47.4) and No. 1 net (43.3) averages, both career highs and Ravens records.

#### RAVENS' BIG RETURNS

• Led by Pro Bowl RS Jacoby Jones in the 2012 Super Bowl season, Baltimore ranked first in the NFL in KOR average (27.3). Jones, who became the first player ever to record dual KORs of at least 105 yards in a career, tied for a league-leading 3 kick return TDs (2 KORs & 1 PR). He also tied an NFL record for longest KOR in a Super Bowl with his 108-yard KOR-TD. (In 2014's game at Pit., he added another 108-yarder to his resume, marking 4 total KOR-TDs over 100 yards in his career.)

#### 2017: RAVENS RETURN GAMES SOARS IN WEEK 6 VS. CHICAGO

• In Week 6 vs. Chicago, for the first time in franchise history, the Ravens returned a kickoff and punt return for a TD in the same game. **RB Bobby Rainey Jr.** posted a 96-yard KOR-TD, while **WR Michael Campanaro** registered a 77-yard PR-TD. The Ravens are the first NFL team to have KOR and PR touchdowns in the same game since 2013, when Detroit and Kansas City each accomplished the feat on 12/8/13.

## BALTIMORE BLOCK PARTY

Since 2014, the Ravens have produced the NFL's most blocked kicks (12, tied, Phi.), including an NFL-high 4 (tied, Mia.) in 2016.

Marty Mornhinweg was elevated to offensive coordinator on Oct. 10, 2016. A 23-year NFL coaching veteran, Mornhinweg, who joined Baltimore as QBs coach in 2015, is a former head coach of the Lions (2001-02). He has also served as offensive coordinator for the New York Jets (2013-14), Philadelphia Eagles (2004-12) and San Francisco 49ers (1997-2000).

#### FIVE PRO BOWLERS

• Throughout his NFL coaching career, five quarterbacks have earned Pro Bowl honors under Mornhinweg's direction: Michael Vick, Donovan McNabb, Steve Young, Jeff Garcia and Brett Favre.





## MARTY'S NFL COORDINATOR ROLES

#### 1997-2000: 49ers - Offensive Coordinator/QBs Coach

- During this span, SF offense ranked third in total net yards (364.6 ypg), including third in rushing (131.4 ypg) and fifth in passing (233.2 ypg).






TACKLES FOR LOSS

**NFL Safeties in 2017** 









#### ESPN.com's Kevin Seifert on Sam Koch's arsenal of punts:

"Some are designed to hook toward the sideline with maximum hang time. Others use an intentionally low trajectory to aid coverage teams. He has a knuckler and one kick that drops, from the returner's perspective, roughly in the shape of the letter "S." He's debuted a "boomerang" punt that does just what you would imagine it might. Most, but not all, of these punts are intended to discourage a clean catch and minimize the return.

"It's not unusual for NFL punters to develop a "changeup" of sorts, but no one has ever had multiple options at the ready. ... The NFL changes every day, but there are only a few moments in each generation when it transforms. This is one of them. In plain sight, Sam Koch and the Ravens have introduced a new way to punt."

## A TREMENDOUS 2016

In 2016, All-Pro **K Justin Tucker** connected on 38 of 39 FGAs (lone miss was a block), posting the fifth-best percentage in NFL single-season history. In addition to making 35-straight FGs at one point (tied for fifth-best streak ever), here are several facts about his remarkable season, which is arguably the best ever by a kicker:

- ✓ Tucker's 38 FGs made ranked No. 1 in the NFL. He was also 27-of-27 on PATs. An NFL single-season record 24 of Tucker's 38 FGs made in 2016 came from 40 yards or beyond.
- ✓ Tucker's 10 FGs of 50-plus yards are a Ravens' single-season record. They tie (Blair Walsh, 2012) for the most in NFL history. (Tucker was a perfect 10-for-10 from 50 yards and out during the 2016 season.)
- ✓ Tucker's 141 points ranked second in the league only behind Atlanta's Matt Bryant (158).
- ✓ In Week 12 vs. Cincy, Tucker became just the ninth kicker in league history to make 3 FGs of 50-plus yards in a single game (52, 57 & 54). He is also the first kicker in NFL history to make 3 FGs of 50-plus yards in the first half of a game. (These feats earned him AFC ST POW honors.)

## CRUCIAL CATCH DAY





In partnership with the American Cancer Society (ACS), the NFL's *Crucial Catch: Intercept Cancer* campaign has provided another year of funding to support increased access to cancer education and screening resources in underserved communities. Money raised from joint efforts allowed the NFL and ACS to award a \$50,000 grant to the Baltimore Medical Systems facility at St. Agnes Hospital, continuing its efforts to increase breast and colon cancer screenings in the area. As part of the grant, the Ravens participated in *Crucial Catch Day* on Wednesday, Oct. 18, a nationwide event that was held in cities across the country to help people receive detectable and screenable cancer education and participate in screenings. During the event, Ravens cheerleaders and mascot Poe were onsite at St. Agnes Hospital to greet patients undergoing treatment and fans who had participated in cancer screenings throughout the day.

## RAVENS AND VERIZON PASS IT FORWARD

On Oct. 10, the Baltimore Ravens and Verizon continued their four-month "Pass It Forward" campaign when they surprised fans with random acts of kindness at various locations throughout the Baltimore community. Ravens **DE Bronson Kaufusi** greeted fans at a West Baltimore Royal Farms gas station, where he distributed gift cards to help fuel up their cars. Next, Bronson and Ravens cheerleaders traveled to Mary Anne Winterling Elementary School in Baltimore City, where he surprised students with a complimentary lunch. Following the lunch period, Verizon led fifth-grade students through a STEM activity in the school's library. The campaign is a joint effort between the Ravens and Verizon to create a positive social movement that encourages recipients to "Pass It Forward."







## JOHN HARBAUGH MONDAY PRESS CONFERENCE: WEEK 9

**Opening statement:** "It is good to see everybody here; I appreciate you guys coming. It has been a while. It seems like a long time, doesn't it? Three days is a lifetime in an NFL season, I guess. It is good to see everybody, and we are well on the way to preparing for Tennessee. We started that on Friday, and we have gone to work. We will start practicing tomorrow and on through the normal work week on Wednesday, Thursday, Friday."

It is obviously the big question – the concussion and the hit. How is TE Vince Mayle doing? (*Jerry Coleman*) (*laughter*) "Both of those guys [Joe Flacco and Vince Mayle] are doing well. Both the two guys are doing well. The symptoms are zero right now for both of those two guys, so that is good news."

The evaluation process [for a concussion], it is a five-step evaluation? (Jerry Coleman) "Correct, exactly."

Have you looked at the film of the hit on QB Joe Flacco and the slide? There are some who believe that the slide and the technique of the slide brought on the hit. Your response to something like that? (Jerry Coleman) "I've been in those meetings a lot, and that is just not the case. Joe slid; he is protected. We have a technique to teach those guys coming in there, and we teach our guys that. They try to do their best with it, but the responsibility is on the defender, clearly. That is not even part of the conversation at the NFL meetings when we have the official meetings. We understand how that rule works."

Are you still waiting to hear from the NFL [regarding Dolphins LB Kiko Alonso]? (Jerry Coleman) "Yes, we have heard nothing. I'm sure we will hear when you guys hear. It really is not a concern of ours right now, in all frankness. It is not going to impact our game against the Titans."

Is there an inclination to rest QB Joe Flacco because you have the bye in two weeks, or is it, "If he is ready, he is playing"? (*David Ginsburg*) "If he is ready, he is playing, right."

Does it matter how much practice QB Joe Flacco gets this week? (David Ginsburg) "No. He will play if he is ready."

Do you think there is a chance of QB Joe Flacco playing based on the progress he has made so far? (Jamison Hensley) "Sure, absolutely. I think there is a good chance he will play. As I have said before, I am not a doctor, but I play one in press conferences. (laughter) That is my diagnosis."

Sorry to prolong this, but does QB Joe Flacco stay at home? Does he come by here? Have you seen him or talked to him? (David Ginsburg) "He comes by here. There is a routine he does. There is a process, as Jerry [Coleman] alluded to, for that. I don't really know the details of what the rehab process is. We are working on the football. The trainers and doctors work on that part of it. He has been here every day doing what he is supposed to do."

Does that include meetings, in terms of getting QB Joe Flacco ready for Tennessee? (David Ginsburg) "It will. We haven't had those meetings yet, but it will include meetings starting tomorrow."

It was kind of a scary hit seeing how dazed he was and the blood coming down. Is it a relief to see QB Joe Flacco now compared to what you saw Thursday as he walked off the field? (Jeff Zrebiec) "I guess you kind of learn not to make any kind of assumptions with injuries. There have been plenty of times where you think a player is fine, it doesn't look like much, and it turns out to be a season-ender – some kind of a tear. Other times, what looks to be a very serious injury, isn't. Joe's ... I don't want to minimize what went down with Joe. I thought that was a very vicious type of a hit. He was definitely defenseless and couldn't protect himself. Therefore, he got his ear sliced open and he got hit in the head. You never minimize that. He is an extremely tough person. We missed him for the rest of the game. He missed over a half of football. We are very hopeful for this week, and it will be in the hands of Joe and the doctors to decide what we can do. We will get him ready to play if he can play, and that is all you really can do."



Talking about the win, do you feel it can really turn into something, momentum-wise? It wasn't just a squeaker, it was a dominant performance. Obviously, you hope to build on that going into a bye. (David Ginsburg) "We just have to play this game. All of that stuff is good to look at, and I'm sure it is possible and it is true in the big picture. But our focus needs to be on one thing – one three-and-a-half hour block of time on Sunday afternoon down in Nashville. That is what we have to focus on. We have to get ready for that. All other considerations or conversations are really irrelevant to what we are trying to accomplish. It is fun and good to talk about that stuff, and I hope it turns out to be the case, but it will only be the case if we play well enough on Sunday to win the game, and that is what we have to focus on."

RB Alex Collins is ninth in rushing in the NFL. He has 30 fewer carries than some of the guys in front of him. Are you getting confident where you can lean on him to help carry the offense to be an every-down back? (Todd Karpovich) "He is doing a great job. Alex is doing a great job, and he has been very productive. Guys who are productive, they always get more opportunities. That is what he is doing, and he has made the most of his opportunities. He is going to continue to get more and more opportunities. [Javorius] 'Buck' [Allen] has done a really good job as well. We are going to try and run our offense. It is never based on one person, although, when guys are making plays and they are doing well, that is really the key. You need players to make plays. You need guys to break tackles and make people miss. You need guys to catch passes. You need guys to go over the top of somebody and make a contested catch. You need quarterbacks to make throws. You need linemen to make blocks. Really, in the end, that is what the game boils down to. We tell our guys all the time, 'Sunday afternoon is players' time.' The preparation is done. Coaches do everything they can to call a good game, but the players are the ones who are playing the game, and that is what the fans pay to see. That is what the game is all about – it is about the players. So to see a player like that come from where he has come – which is kind of what you are talking about – to have the success he has had is really an awesome thing. It is what it is all about. We are excited about it. His focus is like the rest of us – it is on Sunday afternoon for a block of time."

What are you seeing from RB Alex Collins in other aspects of the game and his development as a pass protector? (Luke Jones) "He's done a good job with that. His pass protection is something he's working really hard on. I see him at practice every day; he's picking up the right guys, his technique gets better and better every day. He's attacking pass protection. He didn't miss any pass protections this last week – neither he nor 'Buck' [Javorius Allen] did – which is never easy for a back. Those guys were spot-on in what they were doing Thursday night. That's very important, and they both made the catches – at least [Alex Collins] did. Did 'Buck' have catches? I forget. I haven't thought about the game since Friday morning. But, both of those guys are doing a good job in the passing game."

How do you handle the situation of having five running backs on your roster? (Ed Lee) "It will have to be addressed whether we can hold on to five running backs or not – assuming Danny [Woodhead] is healthy soon and he's out there playing for us. That'll be a decision that will have to be made. That'll be a roster-wide-type of decision. We'll have to compare all of our options and try to keep the players that give us the best chance or make us the strongest team."

Is that a good dilemma to be in, to have that much depth in one position? (Ed Lee) "Sure – it's good to have players. All of those guys are reliable players. So, it's a good problem to have. I agree with that."

Is RB Danny Woodhead eligible to start practicing this week? (Jamison Hensley) "There is [eligibility]. You have to practice for two weeks before you can play, and you have up to three weeks to make the decision. This would be the week that he'd be eligible to practice. We're talking about it now. I think there's a chance he'll practice this week, to some degree. We'll see."

How instrumental were the tight ends on Thursday in maintaining the running game? (Jeff Zrebiec) "You're right – that's a really good observation on your part. The tight ends have been a big part of what we've been doing. We had a lot of those schemes in there, where we were trapping and whamming, creating angles for our backs against the type of front that they were playing. Nick [Boyle] was a big part of that, and the other tight ends were, as well. I think that's something that our offensive coaches have been very creative with. They've done a really nice job of putting that together, and the results were about as good as they can be Thursday night. We've never had bad results; our running game has been pretty solid throughout the course of the year. But, we've had some games that have been better than others, and we keep chasing that. We keep trying to find ways to pop our guys into the secondary and create chunk runs. So, the backs making tacklers miss is

part of it, but the guys blocking ... And then coming up with good, creative schemes is a big part of it, too. The tight ends have been a big part of that."

Are you thankful that your backup QB Ryan Mallett is a similar playing style to QB Joe Flacco? It seems like it would be an easy transition should he be forced to play. (David Ginsburg) "Yes, they are the same style, I guess you could say. Ryan is definitely a dropback thrower-type of a guy, student of the game, always prepared, always studies, knows the game plan inside and out. He's always ready to go. He was ready to go Thursday night – didn't skip a beat, as far as operational things he had to do [like] run checks, pass checks, the protections. He did a good job with all that; that's very important. He made some throws that he needed to make. I thought the touchdown pass was really a great throw. So, that was good to see. Yes, that's a plus for us."

It was DT Brandon Williams' second game back. Were his legs under him more? The run defense was much improved. (Todd Karpovich) "That's a good question for Brandon. I felt that he played pretty well at Minnesota, for not playing for a month before that. But, he was better in this game, there's no doubt. The run defense as a whole was much better – fundamentally more sound, stronger at the point of attack – just better in all the basic things that you do to stop the run. So, that was a big key to the game."

How critical was it to have neither QB Joe Flacco or QB Ryan Mallett sacked? (Ed Lee) "The pass protection was very good in the game. Joe made a couple good decisions; he helped himself there a few times. He scrambled once to the right and threw the ball away – underhanded, if I remember right. That was a really smart play on his part to avoid loss yardage and a sack. But, it's a team effort. It's the offensive line; they did a good job. [Miami] has a good front. Cameron Wake and [Ndamukong] Suh are very good pass rushers – and not just those guys. They have a good front, nice scheme. They were blitzing us regularly throughout the game. It was a blitz fest, pretty much. I thought our guys did a good job with it."

How much of a benefit is a Thursday night game, to have those extra few days, to recover from injuries? (Jamison Hensley) "It's a plus. The downside and the upside of Thursday night games, is as you said, [the downside is] the quick turnaround, and the upside is that you have 10 days to get ready for the next game and heal up a little bit. For our team, this is good, this is positive. We want to take advantage of it."

What are your impressions of Tennessee QB Marcus Mariota? (Jamison Hensley) "Heck of a player. [He's] getting healthy. I think he had a hamstring [injury] that he seems to be back from now. Of course, that's great timing for them – not for us. He's a very talented guarterback, playing well. He's a must-defend player."
