**THE MATCHUP**

The Saints return to the Mercedes-Benz Superdome today for the second consecutive week to take on the Tampa Bay Buccaneers in a 12 p.m. kickoff as the Black and Gold return to NFC South division play for the first time since a week three 34-13 win at Carolina.

The Saints enter the game with a 5-2 record after defeating the Chicago Bears 20-12 on Sunday at the Mercedes-Benz Superdome. New Orleans is in the midst of a five-game winning streak, the second-longest current win streak in the NFL. After dropping their home opener to the New England Patriots, their last loss, New Orleans has won two consecutive home contests.

While the New Orleans offense struggled by failing to score a touchdown in the second half and with two lost fumbles, the defense and special teams picked up the slack with timely play. After New Orleans' second lost fumble with 2:18 left in the contest and the Saints holding onto a 17-12 lead, New Orleans forced Chicago to turn the ball over on downs, with key third and fourth down plays featuring pass breakups by LB **A.J. Klein** and S **Kenny Vaccaro**. Four plays later, K **Wil Lutz** booted a 49-yard field goal to extend the Saints' lead to 20-12 with 1:40 left. On the subsequent kick return, Lutz potentially saved a possible touchdown when he pushed Chicago RB **Tarik Cohen** out of bounds at the Bears 42-yard line. Three plays later, the victory was clinched when rookie CB **Marshon Lattimore** picked off fellow rookie QB **Mitchell Trubisky**.

With Lattimore's pick, New Orleans has recorded interceptions in five consecutive contests for the first time since a period spanning the 2012 season finale and the first four games of the 2013 campaign. Following a standout performance where he filled up the stat sheet with a team-high nine tackles, a split sack and a pass defended, Vaccaro leads the team with 38 tackles, a half-sack, a club-high three picks, seven passes defended and one fumble recovered for a touchdown.

The biggest difference in New Orleans' defense has been on the point ledger. After the Saints surrendered 65 points in their first two contests, they have only given up 80 during the five-game surge (16.5 points per game). DE **Cameron Jordan**, who has led the New Orleans pass rush, has a club-high 5.5 quarterback takedowns to go with an interception caught in the end zone for a touchdown and two forced fumbles.

Offensively, WR **Michael Thomas** leads the club with 42 receptions for 480 yards and two touchdowns. Rookie RB **Alvin Kamara** has 31 catches for 257 yards with one TD to go with 42 carries for 243 yards with two TDs, totaling 500 yards from scrimmage. RB **Mark Ingram II** is averaging a team-high 93.4 scrimmage yards per game and has three rushing touchdowns, with 464 rushing yards and 190 receiving yards. QB **Drew Brees** has completed 175 passes for 1,951 yards with 11 touchdowns and four interceptions. Brees owns a 70.6 completion percentage, currently ranked first in the NFL and a 101.7 passer rating, 110.0 in the fourth quarter when it matters most.

## THE COACHES

New Orleans Saints Head Coach **Sean Payton** has posted a 99-68 regular season record and a 6-4 postseason mark, guiding the team to the postseason five times, to the NFC Championship game twice and to the Super Bowl XLIV Championship in the 2009 campaign. He's the club's lone head coach to open a season with 13 straight victories and post a 13-game winning streak and has the franchise's top winning percentage (.593). Payton's 53-30 (.639) home record and 46-38 (.548) mark away from the Mercedes-Benz Superdome are the club's top all-time winning percentages in both categories (regular season). He holds the records for most wins by a head coach in team history with 105 total, tied for 41st all-time in National Football League history with Vince Lombardi and Tom Flores. In his first season with the club in 2006, he took over a Saints team that had previously posted a 3-13 record in 2005 to the NFC Championship game and was named NFL Coach of the Year by the *Associated Press* and most other major media outlets. The Saints are the only team to finish in the top 10 in net yards per game each season since 2006, including finishing first in 2016, when they averaged 426.0 yards per game. In 2017, Payton has rebounded the Saints from three consecutive 7-9 campaigns by getting them on a 5-2 start, featuring a running five-game winning streak. Payton was hired as New Orleans' 14th head coach on January 18, 2006, after serving on the Dallas Cowboys coaching staff from 2003-05 under Pro Football Hall of Fame Head Coach Bill Parcells. Prior to joining the Cowboys in 2003, Payton served on the New York Giants coaching staff from 1999-2002, including the final three seasons as offensive coordinator. His tenure was highlighted by a Super Bowl berth in his first full season calling plays for New York. Payton's prior NFL coaching experience came as quarterbacks coach for the Philadelphia Eagles from 1997-98. He played quarterback at Eastern Illinois University, where he passed for 10,665 yards, then the third-highest total in NCAA Division 1-AA history. The three-time *Associated Press* All-American selection had professional stints with the Chicago Bruisers of the Arena Football League, Ottawa of the Canadian Football League and the Chicago Bears in 1987. Starting his college coaching career at San Diego State, Payton wrapped two stints as an assistant with the Aztecs (1988-89 and 1992-93) around a stop at Indiana State (1990-91). He moved to Miami (Ohio), where he coached quarterbacks from 1994-95 before doing the same at the University of Illinois in 1996.

**Dirk Koetter** was named the 11th head coach in franchise history on January 15, 2016. He is in his second season with the team, after serving as offensive coordinator in 2015. In his first season with Tampa Bay (2015), Koetter helped pilot one of the most successful offenses in the NFL and one of the best in team history. The team set the franchise record for total yards (6,014 – 357.0 per game), while posting the second-most rushing yards (2,162 – 135.1 per game) and second-most passing yards (3,852 – 240.8 per game), along with the fifth-most total points (342 – 21.4 per game). In his first season as head coach of the Buccaneers, he led them to a 9-7 record, their first winning mark since the 2008 campaign. He joined the Buccaneers after three seasons working as the offensive coordinator for the Atlanta Falcons (2012-14). Under Koet-

ter, Falcons quarterback Matt Ryan posted the three of the four highest passing yardage seasons in franchise history, as well as three of the five highest completion percentage seasons. Prior to joining the Falcons, Koetter spent five seasons as the offensive coordinator of the Jacksonville Jaguars (2007-11). Before joining the Jaguars, Koetter spent 22 years at the collegiate level, the final six as the head coach at Arizona State (2001-06). Koetter's first head coaching opportunity came at Boise State, where he spent three seasons (1998-2000), finishing with a 26-10 record and two consecutive bowl wins.

The Saints and Buccaneers first met in 1977. New Orleans has posted a 31-19 record vs. Tampa Bay, the club's best winning percentage (.620) vs. an opponent.

## GAME SUMMARIES

**WEEK 1: Minnesota Vikings 29, Saints 19; September 11, 2017 @ US Bank Stadium** – Minnesota Vikings quarterback Sam Bradford set the National Football League record for completion percentage for Minnesota last season, his accuracy aided by the volume of short passes under heavy pressure. With protection from the rush, he showed he can throw the ball down the field with the best of them. Bradford started his second year with Minnesota in style, passing for 346 yards and three touchdowns to help the Vikings beat New Orleans 29-19 and spoil running back Adrian Peterson's first game with the New Orleans Saints.

"When I've got time to sit back there and kind of evaluate things, I've got all the confidence in the world that our guys outside are going to win," Bradford said.

Minnesota wide receiver Stefon Diggs had seven receptions for 93 yards, two for scores and all in the first half, and wideout Adam Thielen racked up 157 yards on nine catches as Bradford had success against a Saints defense that opened the season with the youngest starting lineup in the NFL since 1991.

Rookie running back Dalvin Cook rushed for 127 yards on 22 carries in the formal takeover from Peterson. Peterson was limited to 18 yards on six carries, in a time share with running backs Mark Ingram and Alvin Kamara with the Saints forced to throw the ball more once they started to fall behind. Quarterback Drew Brees was quiet, too, with 291 yards on 27-for-37 passing

"We didn't do anything different or try to out-trick them," Vikings linebacker Anthony Barr said. "You know, line up and play, do your job."

Saints Tight end Coby Fleener caught their only touchdown toss, after the two-minute warning. Kicker Wil Lutz made four field goals, three under 25 yards.

"The bottom line," Brees said, "is you've got to score touchdowns."

## GAME SUMMARIES

**WEEK 2: New England Patriots 36, Saints 20; September 17, 2017 @ Mercedes-Benz Superdome** – If Tom Brady and the Patriots were suffering from a Super Bowl hangover, it looks as though a trip to New Orleans pulled the defending champions out of it.

The 40-year-old Brady bounced back with a vengeance from a season-opening loss, throwing three touchdown passes in the first quarter for the first time in his career, eclipsed 300 yards passing in the first half for only the second time, and New England scored 30 first-half points en route to a 36-20 victory over the Saints, who dropped their first two games of the season.

Brady's maiden Super Bowl triumph in the Superdome back in Feb. 2002 is bound to be one of his fondest memories, but the 18-year veteran looked like a superior quarterback in his latest visit. He finished 30 of 39 for 447 yards without an interception -- at least not one that counted. Saints defenders caught Brady's passes twice, but both plays were wiped out by New Orleans penalties. Brady joined Warren Moon as the only QBs age 40 or older in NFL history to pass for at least 400 yards and 3 touchdowns in a game, according to the Elias Sports Bureau. Patriots tight end Rob Gronkowski had a 53-yard catch and run to highlight his six-catch, 116-yard performance, but left the game in the second half with a groin injury and did not return.

In Brady and the Saints' Drew Brees, the game featured the National Football League's top two active quarterbacks in terms of career yards and touchdowns. Their 922 touchdown passes and 128,251 yards passing combined coming in represented the most by starting signal-callers in the same NFL game.

But in this matchup, Brees couldn't keep up. He was 27 of 45 for 356 yards and two touchdowns. The Saints' desperation to stay close was encapsulated by a failed attempt to convert a fourth down -- despite being well within field goal range on the Patriots 25-yard line -- with 2:27 left in the first half and New England up by 13 points. Brady responded by marching New England to the Saints ten-yard line to set up Stephen Gostkowski's field goal, making it 30-13 at halftime.

The Patriots' first three drives ended with a 19-yard touchdown pass to running back Rex Burkhead, Gronkowski's long touchdown and a 13-yard scoring pass to wide receiver Chris Hogan. New Orleans briefly rallied with Brees' 5-yard touchdown pass to wide receiver Brandon Coleman and kicker Wil Lutz's field goal on consecutive drives, pulling as close as 20-13. But New England responded with running back Mike Gillislee's short scoring run on a drive highlighted by downfield passes from Brady to the skilled Patriots trio of Gronkowski, Hogan and former Saints wideout Brandin Cooks.

**WEEK 3: Saints 34, Panthers 13; September 24, 2017 @ Bank of America Stadium**– Quarterback Drew Brees shredded the league's top-ranked defense, throwing for 220 yards and three touchdowns as the New Orleans Saints defeated the previously unbeaten Carolina Panthers 34-13 as New Orleans would then embark on a trip to London to prepare for a contest against the Miami Dolphins to be played at Wembley Stadium the following Sunday. Brees led six scoring drives and threw touchdown passes

to wide receivers Michael Thomas, Brandon Coleman and ex-Panthers wideout Ted Ginn Jr. as the Saints avoided an 0-3 start. Rookie running back Alvin Kamara put the game away with a 25-yard touchdown run with 4:42 left, the first score of his short career. Carolina had only allowed six points in its previous two games.

The Saints' defense, which came in ranked 32nd in the league, intercepted Panthers quarterback Cam Newton three times and sacked him four times before he was replaced late in the fourth quarter.

The Panthers, who were already without injured Pro Bowl tight end Greg Olsen, lost wide receiver Kelvin Benjamin in the first quarter to a knee injury; his leg got bent back awkwardly after being dragged down from behind. Carolina's only real offense came from rookie running back Christian McCaffrey, who had 101 yards receiving on nine catches. The Saints led 17-6 when Ginn beat cornerback James Bradberry down the middle of the field for a 40-yard touchdown reception to break it open. It was the same type of big play Ginn provided for the Panthers in previous seasons. Brees was sharp all day, completing 22 of 29 passes.

**WEEK 4: Saints 20, Dolphins 0; October 1, 2017 @ Wembley Stadium**– It took quarterback Drew Brees and the New Orleans Saints six days and a first half before they finally found their footing in soggy Britain.

Brees threw for 268 yards and two touchdowns and the Saints scored all but three of their points in the second half as they defeated the Miami Dolphins 20-0 on a rainy Sunday afternoon at Wembley Stadium.

Wide receiver Michael Thomas had a touchdown reception in the third quarter, running back Alvin Kamara added one in the fourth and kicker Wil Lutz made two of his three field-goal attempts for New Orleans (2-2), which arrived for the game on Monday and won the lowest-scoring game ever held in London.

"The defense got a shutout," Brees said. "Offensively, we sustained drives, we did all the things you need to do for winning football."

It was expected to be a big homecoming for the Dolphins' Jay Ajayi, who was born in the city, but the running back finished with 46 yards on 12 carries.

Lutz missed his first try, a 41-yarder, wide right on the second play of the second quarter, and the teams threatened to have the first scoreless opening half since Week 14 of the 2011 season until Lutz connected from 43 yards with no time remaining.

Brees found Thomas, who had eight catches for 89 yards, on a 4-yarder to push the score to 10-0 in the third quarter, and Kamara took a shovel pass from Brees 12 yards into the end zone with 3:57 remaining to wrap up the victory. Kamara finished with 96 total yards, including 71 receiving, and fellow running back Mark Ingram ran for 45 yards. Quarterback Jay Cutler completed 20 of 28 passes for Miami (1-2), which finished with 185 yards, its fewest since its last shutout, a 19-0 loss at Buffalo on December 22, 2013.

New Orleans last shut out an opponent on Dec. 16, 2012, a 41-0 win against Tampa Bay.

"Obviously those first two weeks weren't what we aspired to be, we played two real good teams, the Vikings and Patriots," Brees said. "Basically now, two road wins ... I felt we had a great plan coming out here, obviously it's a tough trip coming across the pond."

## GAME SUMMARIES

**WEEK 6: Saints 52, Lions 38; October 15, 2017 @ Mercedes-Benz Superdome** – Running backs Mark Ingram and Alvin Kamara combined for 237 yards from scrimmage, the Saints defense forced five turnovers and scored a team-record three times, and New Orleans took a 52-38 win over Detroit.

New Orleans built a five-touchdown lead, only to wind up gutting out a remarkable comeback bid by Detroit. Detroit scored four straight touchdowns, including one on a punt return by rookie cornerback/return specialist Jamal Agnew and another on defensive tackle A'Shawn Robinson's close-range interception near the Saints goal line, in less than 15 minutes off the game clock to pull as close as 45-38 with 6:41 to go. But after Agnew muffed a punt and barely got it out of the end zone, Saints defensive tackle Cam Jordan scored on virtually the same type of play as Robinson when he got his hand on Matt Stafford's pass from the end zone.

The Saints' defense produced its first points on Detroit's first possession, when Alex Okafor sacked and stripped Stafford in the end zone and safety Kenny Vaccaro recovered. In the third quarter, rookie cornerback Marshon Lattimore, New Orleans' top draft choice last spring, made his first interception and returned it 27 yards for a touchdown. Stafford was sacked five times and turned the ball over five times -- twice on fumbles and three times on interceptions, two of which were tipped. New Orleans also batted down 13 of Stafford's throws.

Saints quarterback Drew Brees completed 20 of 30 passes for 186 yards and touchdowns of 20 yards to wide receiver Ted Ginn Jr. and two yards to tight end Michael Hoomanawanui. However, he was also intercepted for the first and second time this season. The first interception -- also the Saints' first turnover this season -- came when cornerback Darius Slay wrestled the ball away from Thomas before the receiver could secure it.

Ingram scored two touchdowns on short runs and rushed for 114 yards on 25 carries.

**WEEK 7: Saints 26, Packers 17; October 22, 2017 @ Lambeau Field** – The way the Saints won on the road might serve as a valuable lesson in their quest to return to the playoffs.

The defense gave up a long touchdown run on the first series to Green Bay. Quarterback Drew Brees had two interceptions -- and the Saints weren't even out of the first quarter yet at Lambeau Field.

But Brees bounced back to throw for a touchdown, the 500th of his career both regular season and postseason combined and run for another, running back Mark Ingram rushed for a score and the Saints recovered for a 26-17 victory.

Green Bay lost its first game with Brett Hundley starting at quarterback for the injured Aaron Rodgers.

Kicker Wil Lutz kicked two second-half field goals, including a 44-yarder to put New Orleans up for good 19-17 with 10:26 remaining in the game. Brees' one-yard quarterback sneak gave the Saints a two-score lead with 4:55 remaining in the contest.

The Saints were fortunate to get their fourth straight victory. But after taking the first three wins by at least 14 points, they'll savor a victory earned following several early mis-

takes in addition to Brees picks.

The defense gave up a 46-yard touchdown run to rookie Aaron Jones on the opening drive. Lutz had a blocked extra point and New Orleans was penalized seven times for 80 yards.

Still, the Saints pulled away late at overcast Lambeau Field, scoring on four second-half drives before running out the clock.

After holding the Packers to a three-and-out inside the 20, New Orleans drove 55 yards in eight plays to seal the game with Brees' sneak over the goal line. Brees finished 27 of 38 for 331 yards, while Ingram ran for 105 yards on 22 carries.

Jones had 131 yards on 17 carries. Hundley showed toughness in running for a 14-yard score to give Green Bay a 14-7 lead with 8:37 left in the second quarter.

But the Packers managed just a 46-yard field goal from kicker Mason Crosby in the second half, which gave them a brief 17-16 lead.

The Saints took over from there, and the Packers couldn't keep up through the air.

Hundley finished 12 of 25 for 87 yards. He was intercepted by safety Kenny Vaccaro on a deep ball down the middle of the field with 4:20 left, ending the Packers' comeback bid.

**WEEK 8: Saints 20, Bears 12; October 9, 2017 @ Mercedes-Benz Superdome** – Drew Brees completed 23 of 28 passes for 299 yards with a 111.2 passer rating against a Bears defense that ranked sixth against the pass, and the New Orleans Saints beat Chicago 20-12 Sunday for their fifth straight victory after starting the season 0-2.

Running backs Mark Ingram and Alvin Kamara each ran for touchdowns for New Orleans (5-2). Ingram finished with 99 yards from scrimmage, including 75 on the ground, but his two late fumbles kept the Bears in the game into the final minutes. Kamara had 76 yards from scrimmage – 48 receiving.

The Saints were threatening to score twice in the fourth quarter when the Bears stripped the ball from Ingram. Chicago converted the first fumble into its only touchdown with 3:43 to go on rookie running back Tarik Cohen's short dive over a pile of players at the goal line. The second turnover occurred with a little more than two minutes left on the Bears 30-yard line, but Chicago was unable to get a first down as rookie quarterback Mitchell Trubisky's fourth-and-one pass fell incomplete, with it being batted down by safety Kenny Vaccaro, who led the team with nine tackles and split a sack with defensive end Cameron Jordan who now leads the club with 5.5 quarterback takedowns.

Chicago had one more chance to tie after Wil Lutz's 49-yard field goal with 1:35 left, but an interception by Saints rookie cornerback Marshon Lattimore ended that threat.

Trubisky completed 14 of 32 passes for 164 yards in his fourth start for the Bears (3-5). Chicago running back Jordan Howard had 102 yards rushing on 23 carries.

Chicago had a touchdown overturned on video review after Zach Miller's 25-yard catch, during which the tight end's left leg bent unnaturally as he landed. As Miller was carted off the field with an apparently serious knee injury, officials ruled that replayed showed the ground caused the ball to loosen in Miller's grasp as his upper body crashed to the turf – after his knee had given out.

Secondary Coach **Aaron Glenn** - Glenn was the 12th overall pick of the New York Jets in 1994 out of Texas A&M and started 176 of 205 career games during his tenure with New York, Houston, Dallas, Jacksonville and New Orleans and was a three-time Pro Bowl selection. Glenn recorded 41 career interceptions with six brought back for touchdowns, adding one more score on a kickoff return.

Defensive Assistant **Leigh Torrence**—Torrence enjoyed a seven-year career with Atlanta, Washington and New Orleans for his final four seasons, where he played in 73 career games.

Pass Rush Specialist **Brian Young** - Young played in the National Football League from 2000-08 with the St. Louis Rams for his first four seasons, who originally selected him in the fifth round of the 2000 NFL Draft (139th overall) out of Texas El-Paso and for his final five with the Saints, appearing in 124 career games and recording 22.5 sacks, one interception seven forced fumbles eight fumble recoveries.

### FAMILY TIES

Numerous Saints players, coaches and administrators are not the only members of their families to make a name for themselves in pro football. No fewer than 16 of these people have relatives who have played, coached or served in the front office in the National Football League.

**Defensive Coordinator Dennis Allen** - Father, Grady, played linebacker for the Atlanta Falcons from 1968-72.

**Offensive Coordinator Pete Carmichael** - Father, Pete, served as an assistant coach in the NFL from 1994-2003 with the Jacksonville Jaguars and the Chicago Bears.

**Quarterbacks Coach Joe Lombardi** - The son of legendary NFL head coach Vince Lombardi, who led both the Green Bay Packers and Washington Redskins and also had a long distinguished career as an assistant.

**Secondary Coach Aaron Glenn** - Younger brother, Jason, was a linebacker and sixth-round draft pick of the Detroit Lions in the 2001 NFL Draft, playing six seasons in the NFL with the New York Jets, Miami and Minnesota.

**Linebackers Coach Mike Nolan** - Father, Dick, played safety in the NFL for nine years before becoming a coach. He led San Francisco from 1968 to 1975 and was the head coach of the New Orleans Saints from 1978 to 1980.

**Assistant General Manager/College Scouting Director Jeff Ireland** - Stepson of Kansas City Chiefs Hall of Fame LB/C E.J. Holub and the grandson of former Eagles player and Bears personnel executive Jim Parmer.

**National Scout Terry Wooden** - Brother, JoJo, is director of player personnel for the Los Angeles Chargers.

**Area Scout Joey Vitt** - Father, Joe Vitt is a longtime NFL coach who served as assistant head coach/linebackers of the Saints for 11 seasons.

**CB Ken Crawley** - Cousin, Stephon Morris, spent the 2012 season with the New England Patriots.

**RB Trey Edmunds** - Father, Ferrell Jr., enjoyed a seven-year career as a tight end with Miami and Seattle and was selected to two Pro Bowls.

**CB De'Vante Harris** - Father, Rod, was a wide receiver, playing three seasons in the NFL and spending the 1989 season with New Orleans where he would appear in 11 games, handling the club's kickoff and punt return duties.

**RB Mark Ingram II** - Father, Mark Ingram Sr., was a 10-year NFL veteran who played for the New York Giants, Miami, Green Bay and Philadelphia.

**DE Cameron Jordan** - Father, Steve, had a 13-year ca-

reer as a tight end with Minnesota, with six Pro Bowl selections.

**T/G Andrus Peat** - Father, Todd, played six NFL seasons as a lineman with the Cardinals and the Raiders.

**LB Nate Stupar** - Older brother, Jonathan, played two NFL seasons from 2009-10, while his uncle, Jeff Hostetler, won two Super Bowl titles with the New York Giants, as part of a 12-year career in the league.

**WR Michael Thomas** - Uncle, Keyshawn Johnson, is a former wide receiver, spending 11 seasons in the NFL with the New York Jets, Tampa Bay, Dallas and Carolina, earning three Pro Bowls and the Super Bowl XXXVII title.

Ahead is a synopsis of several returning players and newcomers through the draft, free agency and trade to the 2017 Saints offensive line:

**LT Terron Armstead** - The club's first third round draft choice in 2013 out of Arkansas-Pine Bluff, Armstead impressed scouts by running the fastest 40-yard dash time (4.71) by an offensive lineman in the history of the NFL Scouting Combine. He has opened 39 regular season games for New Orleans, returning to action in week six after missing the first four contests with a shoulder injury.

**G/C Senio Kelemete** - A fifth round selection of the Arizona Cardinals (151st overall) in the 2012 NFL Draft, since first joining the New Orleans practice squad at the start of the 2013 season, this fifth-year lineman has displayed the versatility to play every position on the line. The 6-foot-3, 300-pounder saw action in 36-of-37 games over the past four seasons with 16 starts and has become an invaluable piece of the line. In 2017, Kelemete has already played at right tackle in the season opener and played at left guard in four games and at right guard in week seven and starting in week eight.

**T/G Andrus Peat** - A first round selection (13th overall) in the 2015 NFL Draft out of Stanford, Peat was considered one of the top college linemen. In 2016, Peat took a big step forward from his rookie season, starting 15 contests at left guard, left tackle and as an extra tight end, blocking for the most productive offense in the NFL (426.0 ypg.). Headed into his third season, Peat's a key to the Saints' future success, starting at both left guard and left tackle in 2017.



## OFFENSIVE NOTES

**T Ryan Ramczyk** - The Black and Gold used their second first round selection in the 2017 NFL Draft to snag Ramczyk, viewed by many as one of the best offensive linemen in the entire draft. The 6-6, 314 lb. tackle moved from Division III Wisconsin-Stevens Point to the University of Wisconsin, and in just one season with the Badgers, he flourished. Ramczyk started all 14 games in 2016 and was a consensus All-American, blocking for an offense that gained 203.1 rushing yards per game and allowing just a single sack. Ramczyk figures to make an immediate impact for the Black and Gold, adding valuable depth to the outside of the offensive line, starting two games at left tackle and five contests at right tackle.

**C Max Unger** - Since being acquired by the Saints via trade at the start of the 2015 offseason, Max Unger has anchored the middle of the Saints offensive line, opening 36-of-37 contests, missing only one game in 2016 due to a foot injury. Originally a second round draft pick of the Seahawks in 2009, Unger has been named a first-team All-Pro by the *Associated Press* in 2012 and is a two-time Pro Bowler, helping the Seahawks to two Super Bowl appearances and a victory in Super Bowl XLVIII. Unger has opened all 105 games he has played in since 2009. Sidelined in the offseason and some of the preseason by a foot injury, Unger returned to his spot by the season opener.

**G Larry Warford** - A third-round pick by the Detroit Lions in 2013, Warford has been one of the best offensive linemen in the NFL since his arrival. In 2013, he was named *Pro Football Focus* Rookie of the Year after starting all 16 games without surrendering a sack. This offseason, the 6-3, 317 lb. guard joined the Saints, and he will play a critical role in the team's efforts to repeat as the National Football League's top offense manning the right guard position.

## DEFENSIVE NOTES

### DEFENSIVE DRAFT

Over the last three NFL Drafts, New Orleans has shown a commitment to improving the defense, spending 14-of-21 picks on that side of the ball. With nine picks in the 2015 NFL Draft, the Saints picked six defensive players, the most taken since New Orleans chose nine defensive players in a 12-round selection meeting in 1990. Below is an overview of the 11 players selected by New Orleans since 2015 on the 53-man roster:

**S Vonn Bell, Ohio State (D2b-16)** - Selected by New Orleans in the second round (61st overall) of the 2016 NFL Draft, Bell was a consensus All-American and one of the top rated defensive backs in the NFL Draft. As a senior, the Rossville, Ga. native was a Jim Thorpe Award semifinalist

after recording 65 tackles and adding two interceptions, one brought back for a touchdown, one fumble recovery and 11 passes defensed. During his 2016 rookie season, Bell translated that collegiate success to the NFL with ease, starting 14 games and finishing second on the team with 98 tackles (59 solo) and first on the team with two forced fumbles. Now a proven asset, Bell will look to enter the upper echelon of NFL safeties in 2017.

**DT Tyeler Davison, Fresno State (D5b-15)** - This run-stopping widebody defensive lineman played in 53 career games at Fresno State and made 28.5 stops for a loss and 14.5 sacks. After moving into the starting lineup in 2016, Davison has continued to improve, with his 14 tackles (nine solo) and one pass defensed not showing his true value as a run-stopper.

**DE Trey Hendrickson, Florida Atlantic (D3c-17)** - A product of Florida Atlantic University, Trey Hendrickson joins the Black and Gold in 2017 hoping to add depth to the defensive line. The four-year letterman for the Owls dominated in his final two seasons; as a senior, he was named Conference-USA Defensive Most Valuable Player and led the nation with four blocked kicks. As a junior in 2015, Hendrickson recorded 13 sacks, second-best in the nation, and five forced fumbles. Powerful, agile, and with an eye for getting to the football, Hendrickson will be a welcome addition to the defensive front. He has made an impact with two sacks to lead the team's rookies.

**DE Hau'oli Kikaha, Washington (D2-15)** - Though a pre-season knee injury prematurely ended his 2016 campaign, Kikaha still enters 2017 as a key member of the Saints' front seven and pass rush. He came to New Orleans after a senior season at Washington in 2014 where he was the nation's leader with 19 sacks. In his rookie campaign, Kikaha played in 15 games with 10 starts and recorded 56 tackles (41 solo), one pass defensed, four sacks and four forced fumbles to tie for sixth in takedowns and first in forced fumbles among rookies. The Hawaii native finished the season tied for second in the league in forced fumbles, the lone rookie with four. Kikaha has made a nice rebound from missing the 2016 campaign, recording two sacks.

**CB Marshon Lattimore, Ohio State (D1a-17)** - The 11th pick in the 2017 draft and the first cornerback taken, Lattimore possesses all the traits of a future lockdown defender. In 2016 at Ohio State, he was named first team All-Big Ten after recording four interceptions during the year. With his agile, fluid style of play, Lattimore has the ability to shut down even the best wide receivers. He will play a critical role in the Black and Gold pass defense in 2017, as he moved into the starting lineup in week one and recording an interception return for a touchdown, Oct. 15 vs. Detroit and adding a game-clinching pick Sunday vs. Chicago.

## DEFENSIVE NOTES

**DE Al-Quadin Muhammad, Miami (Fla.) (D6-17)** - Muhammad joins the Saints in 2017 after showing potential as a pass rusher at the University of Miami. While he did not play in 2016, in 2015 he notched 54 tackles, good for third on the squad, while leading the team in tackles for loss and sacks with 8.5 and 5, respectively. He also forced a fumble and broke up one pass. Muhammad's strength on the line should be a valuable asset for a Saints front looking to improve on its 30-sack mark from 2016 after leading the team in quarterback takedowns in the preseason.

**DT David Onyemata, Manitoba (D4-16)** - Possessing a unique combination of size and speed, this Lagos, Nigeria native had an impressive rookie year after becoming the first player from the University of Manitoba to be drafted into the NFL. Despite being extraordinarily new to football, the fourth round pick appeared in all 16 games in 2016, notching 32 tackles on the year. Now with experience under his belt, Onyemata has become a critical member on the interior of the Saints defensive front as an important member of its defensive tackle rotation. In week four against the Dolphins in London, he recorded the first sack of his NFL career.

**DT Sheldon Rankins, Louisville (D1-16)** - Selected by New Orleans 12th overall in the first round of the 2016 NFL Draft, the Covington, Ga. native played in 46 games along the defensive line at Louisville from 2012-15, producing 133 total tackles (72 solo), 31.5 tackles for loss and 18 sacks during his collegiate career. A broken leg delayed his National Football League debut last season until Week Nine, but he made the most of his limited action, still finishing tied for third on the club with four sacks.

**S Marcus Williams, Utah (D2-17)** - A three-year starter at Utah, Williams was twice named All-Pac 12 and earned second-team All-American honors as a junior before declaring for the NFL Draft. In 2016, he tied for second in the conference with five interceptions, even after missing two games due to injury. The defender boasts a dangerous mix of speed, fluidity, and instinct that allows him to read the offense and make breaks on the ball. His athleticism was on display in week three at Carolina, when he snared his first career interception with his fingertips.

**CB P.J. Williams, Florida State (D3b-15)** - One of the most gifted athletes among the Black and Gold, Williams' career was limited in the beginning by missing all but two games in his first two seasons with injuries, but has come on in 2017. An experienced starter from Florida State University who developed into one of the nation's top cover

corners as a junior in 2014, Williams finished his college career with 123 tackles (82 solo), four interceptions and 18 passes defended. In year three, Williams recorded his first career interception in week three at Carolina.

### NEW FACES ON DEFENSE

Along with the NFL Draft, New Orleans used free agency to add pieces to its defense, bringing players from other teams, as well as other leagues to help create the perfect mixture of veteran leadership and young talent in the Saints locker room. Below is an overview of those players:

**S Rafael Bush (UFA-17 DET)** - The six-year NFL veteran returns to the Saints after spending the 2016 campaign in Detroit. Bush joined the Saints following the 2012 preseason and was a significant contributor both in the secondary and on special teams for four seasons. In his only season in Detroit, he appeared in all 16 games with four starts and finished fifth on the team with 48 tackles (31 solo) and added one sack, two picks and three passes defended. In 65 career games, he has accrued 18 starts, 184 tackles (118 solo), two sacks, three interceptions, 13 passes defended, 29 special teams stops, and one coverage fumble recovery. In 2017, Bush will contribute to the Saints both in multiple defensive back packages and on special teams.

**LB A.J. Klein (UFA-17 CAR)** - Klein joined the Saints in 2017 at the start of unrestricted free agency, after spending his first four NFL seasons with Carolina. The 2013 fifth-round draft choice out of Iowa State has appeared in 66 games with 29 starts, posting 188 tackles (143 solo), five sacks, an interception, four passes defended, four forced fumbles, and 27 special teams stops. In 2016, he played in 15 games for the Panthers with seven starts and made 31 tackles (26 solo), one sack, a career-high two forced fumbles and two special teams stops. Experienced, intelligent, and athletic, he ranks second on the team with 37 stops, one sack, five passes defended and one forced fumble in 2017, starting all seven games.

**DE Alex Okafor (UFA-17 ARI)** - Okafor, a fourth-round selection in 2013 by the Arizona Cardinals out of Texas, enters the fifth year of his career and his first with the Saints. In the past five seasons, Okafor has totaled 124 tackles (70 solo), 15.5 sacks, seven passes defended, an interception, two forced fumbles, and two fumble recoveries. Okafor has enjoyed what shows the potential for his most productive season in 2017, recording 27 tackles (20 solo), three sacks, three passes defended and two forced fumbles to tie for the team lead.

**LB Manti Te'o (UFA-17 SD)** - The 2012 Heisman Trophy runner-up joins the Black and Gold this season after four years as a San Diego Charger. In his career, he has appeared in 44 games with 36 starts, recording 310 tackles (183 solo), 1.5 sacks, nine passes defended, and two picks. In 2017, Te'o has 22 stops (14 solo) through the first seven contests.

## QUARTERBACKS

### DREW BREES

- Since signing with the New Orleans Saints as an unrestricted free agent in 2006 from the San Diego Chargers, quarterback Drew Brees has thrown for 4,000 or more yards each season, became the only NFL signal-caller to throw for 5,000 yards five different times, set the league single-season yardage record in 2011 (broken by Peyton Manning in 2013) and ranked at or near the top in every passing category, both in single-seasons and over the 11-year period, breaking virtually every club passing record.
- In 2016, Brees completed 471-of-673 passes (70.0%) for 5,208 yards with 37 touchdowns, two rushing touchdowns, 15 interceptions and a 101.7 passer rating. Brees led the league in passing yards for the seventh time, breaking the 5,000-yards passing barrier for the fifth time in his illustrious career (no other player has surpassed the mark more than once).
- Brees has kept up the pace in 2017, leading New Orleans on a five-game winning streak, completing 175-of-248 passes (70.6%) for 1,951 yards with 11 touchdown passes, four interceptions and a 101.7 passer rating, adding one rushing touchdown. Through seven games, he is ranked first in the NFL in completion percentage.
- Since signing with New Orleans in 2006 and playing in 181 games for the Black and Gold, Brees leads the National Football League with 55,714 passing yards, 395 touchdown passes, 7,197 attempts, 4,886 completions, a 67.9% completion percentage, 101 games with at least 300 yards passing, 15 with at least 400 yards passing, 424 passes of 25 yards or more and stands at third in the league with a 99.3 passer rating. He did not throw an interception through the first four games of the season for the first time.
- Brees has been selected to play in a franchise-record nine Pro Bowls as a member of the Saints, with ten overall berths in the National Football League's all-star game, twice as a starter, including a selection following the 2016

season. His seven consecutive selections as a Saint is tied for first in franchise history with Pro Football Hall of Fame tackle William Roaf.

- Brees has posted a 106-75 regular season record in contests he has started since signing with the Saints in 2006. In Week 15 of the 2016 campaign, Brees earned his 100th regular season victory in a Saints uniform. Including his six playoff victories, his 112 total wins as a member of the Saints make him the winningest quarterback in franchise history.
- In his 17-year National Football League career during which he has appeared in 240 games with 239 starts, Brees has completed 6,011-of-9,006 passes (66.7%) for 68,062 yards, 476 touchdown passes and a 96.4 passer rating. He stands as the NFL's all-time most accurate passer, is ranked third in completions, third in touchdown passes, third in passing yardage and sixth in passer rating.

**17** – On October 22 at Green Bay, Brees scored on a dive, recording the 17th rushing touchdown of his career.

**20** – Franchise-record NFC Player of the Week awards won by Brees as a member of the Saints and the most conference Player of the Week honors since 2006. Including his five-year tenure with the San Diego Chargers, his 22 conference Player of the Week awards rank third all-time in NFL record books behind Brady (28) and Peyton Manning (27).

**30** – Number of successful drives in the fourth quarter or overtime engineered by Brees for a touchdown or field goal in the regular season to lead the Saints to victory since joining the club in 2006 including on Oct. 22 at Green Bay in the fourth quarter, where he completed two-of-three passes for 29 yards to set up the go-ahead 44-yard field goal by K wil Lutz.

**31** – The number regular season contests by Brees with at least four touchdown passes, ranked second all-time behind Manning (35).

history. The streak ended on November 29, 2015 at Houston.

**54** – Consecutive regular season contests between 2009-12 with at least one touchdown pass, the longest streak in National Football League history, surpassing the record previously held by Pro Football Hall of Fame passer Johnny Unitas (47). It was set on October 7, 2012 vs. San Diego. It ended on November 29, 2012 after a touchdown-free outing at Atlanta.

**56** – National Football League-record number of games with at least 30 completions, ahead of Peyton Manning (38).

**57** – Also, the National Football League-record number of consecutive regular season contests where Brees threw at least 20 completions until October 13, 2013 at New England.

## RUNNING BACKS

### MARK INGRAM II

• One of the club's two first round draft picks in 2011, the 2009 Heisman Trophy winner has been an integral part of the rushing attack since his arrival in New Orleans. In 2016, Ingram had the most productive season of his seven-year NFL career, rushing for 1,043 yards on 205 carries (5.1 yards per attempt) and six touchdowns. This was the first time Ingram had broken the 1,000 yard barrier in his career. He became the first Black and Gold back to hit the mark since Deuce McAllister ran for 1,057 in 2006 and the seventh back to do so in franchise history. On November 6, 2016 at San Francisco, Ingram carried the ball 15 times for 158 yards, including a 75-yard touchdown run, the longest run of his career. On November 27 vs. the Los Angeles Rams, Ingram picked up 146 yards on 14 carries, including a 61-yard run, the third longest of his career.

• In 2017, Ingram has picked back up where he left off in 2016, playing in all seven games and leading the team in rushing with 107 carries for 464 yards (4.3 avg.) with four touchdowns and adding 30 receptions for 190 yards for 654 total yards from scrimmage, which is currently ranked 11th in the National Football League, while his rushing yardage total is ranked 14th and his rushing touchdown total is tied for fourth. Ingram has had two 100-yard rushing performances in 2017

## INGRAM'S BIG DAYS

New Orleans Saints RB Mark Ingram has reached 100 rushing yards 11 times over his Saints career, including for the second consecutive time in 2017 on Oct. 22 at Green Bay. New Orleans has posted a 9-2 record in those games.

- A talented wide receiver with a large 6-3, 212-pound frame who was selected by the Saints in the second round of the 2016 NFL Draft out of Ohio State, Michael Thomas Thomas had an outstanding rookie campaign. Thomas led the team in receptions with 92, going for 1,137 yards and a team-leading nine receiving touchdowns. **TED GINN JR.**

- Ginn joins the Saints in 2017 as he enters his 11th NFL season. He has been a member of five teams since being selected with the ninth overall pick in the 2007 NFL Draft by the Miami Dolphins out of Ohio State in 2007, and has appeared in 158 games with 66 starts over that period. In his long career marked by big play ability, he has accumulated 4,706 yards off 333 catches (14.1 avg.), recording 27 touchdowns. In his first season in New Orleans, Ginn has played in all seven games with five starts and has recorded 24 grabs for 421 yards with two touchdowns, has carried four times for 32 yards and has brought back 12 punts for 89 yards (7.4 avg.) and three kickoffs for 35 yards.

**BRANDON COLEMAN**

- Originally signed by the New Orleans Saints out of Rutgers following the 2014 NFL Draft, Coleman won a roster spot on the 2015 opening day roster after spending most of his rookie campaign on the practice squad, appearing in all 16 games with four starts. Coleman finished the 2015 season with 30 receptions for 454 yards and two touchdowns. In 2016, again appeared in all 16 games with four starts, tacking in 281 yards through the air and scoring three touchdowns. Coleman has taken his production to a new level in 2017, appearing in all seven games with two starts and making 13 grabs for 245 yards, with a club-best 18.8 yards per catch and a team-leading three touchdown grabs.

**WILLIE SNEAD IV**

- A third-year veteran out of Ball State, Willie Snead IV has become one of QB Drew Brees' favorite targets over his two seasons with the New Orleans Saints. In 2015, his first season on the New Orleans active roster, Snead was electric, taking in 69 passes for 984 yards and three touchdowns. His 2016 campaign played out in much the same way, as he caught 72 passes for 895 yards and four touchdowns. On Nov. 27 against the Rams, Snead showed off his talented arm as well, as he launched a 50-yard pass to RB Tim Hightower that went for a score. After missing the first four games of the season, Snead made his 2017 debut on Oct. 15, vs. Detroit and recorded one reception for 11 yards.

## TIGHT ENDS

### COBY FLEENER

• A combination of athleticism, strength and speed, Fleener's sure hands and ability to get open are an important facet of the Saints offense. Originally a second round draft pick of Indianapolis in 2012, he came to New Orleans as an unrestricted free agent after being a potent weapon in the Colts passing game for four seasons. In 2016, he appeared in all 16 games with eight starts, hauling in 50 passes for 631 yards (12.6 avg) and three touchdowns. He also had one rush for two yards and a score. Over his six-year career, he has played in 83 games with 53 starts, made 247 catches for 2,935 yards, and scored 23 total touchdowns.

### JOSH HILL

• Signed as an undrafted free agent from Idaho State in 2013, Hill's combination of hands, speed and special teams acumen have served him well in his first five seasons where he has posted 55 grabs for 521 yards with nine TDs, while adding 27 special teams stops. In 2016, the Black-foot, Idaho native appeared in all nine games with eight starts, recording 149 yards and a score before suffering an ankle injury vs. Detroit that left him on Injured Reserve.

### MICHAEL HOOMANAWANUI

• Brought to New Orleans in Week Four of the 2015 season after a trade with the New England Patriots, Hoomanawanui appeared in 12 games for the Black and Gold before spending the 2016 campaign on Injured Reserve. In his 12 games with the club in 2015, he recorded eight starts, 11 catches, 76 yards, and three touchdowns. During his entire career, he has appeared in 80 games with 53 starts, recording 642 yards and seven total TDs on 55 catches.

## DEFENSIVE ENDS

### CAMERON JORDAN

• New Orleans' first choice in the 2011 NFL Draft (24th overall) out of California, 2016, Saints defensive end Cameron Jordan started all 16 games for the five consecutive year, posting 66 tackles (39 solo), 7.5 sacks, four passes defended, and a forced fumble. With 52 sacks in seven seasons with the Black and Gold, Jordan is sixth on the Saints career sack list, needing one to move into fifth. Jordan has also proven to be one of the NFL's best run defenders, known for generating pressure on quarterbacks that doesn't always show up on the stat sheet.

• Jordan is enjoying another standout season in 2017, recording 31 tackles, 5.5 sacks, one interception return for a touchdown, four passes defended and two forced fumbles.

### ALEX OKAFOR

- Selected by the Arizona Cardinals in the fourth round of the 2013 NFL Draft, Okafor joins the Saints in 2017 where he will add valuable depth on the defensive line. Okafor has appeared in 49 games with 32 starts in five years, collecting 16.5 sacks, an interception, three forced fumbles, one fumble recovery, and eight passes defensed. In 2017, he has 27 tackles (20 solo), three sacks to rank second behind Jordan, three passes defensed and two forced fumbles.

## DEFENSIVE TACKLES

### TYELER DAVISON

- The Fresno State product followed up a solid rookie season with an even better season in 2016, helping to improve the 31st ranked run defense in 2015 to the 14th best in the league in 2016. Starting 15 games, the disruptive defensive tackle finished the 2016 campaign with 29 tackles (14 solo) and two pass deflections. In 2015, Davison became a key Saints defender while still a rookie, appearing in all 16 games with five starts and attacking for 18 tackles (10 solo) and 1.5 sacks. In 2017, the New Orleans run defense has continued to improve and this defender has played a key role in this improvement, starting all seven games and recording 14 tackles (nine solo) and one pass defensed.

### SHELDON RANKINS

- Rankins was limited by injury in 2016, yet he nonetheless produced an impressive campaign. After a broken fibula delayed his National Football League debut, the rookie exploded for 20 tackles (15 solo) in nine games, adding four sacks and a forced fumble. The third defensive lineman selected in the 2016 NFL Draft (12th overall), Rankins played in 46 games along the defensive line at Louisville, producing 133 tackles (72 solo), 31.5 tackles for loss and 18 sacks during his collegiate career. In his senior campaign, the former Cardinals standout racked up a single-season career-high 58 tackles (28 solo), 13 stops for loss, six sacks, one pass defensed and a fumble recovery returned 46 yards for a touchdown. Rankins was named second-team All-Atlantic Coast Conference following his efforts. In 2017, he has posted eight stops (three solo) and the fumble he forced at Green Bay, Oct. 22, the second of his young career.

### DAVID ONYEMATA

- David Onyemata was chosen with the team's fourth round pick (120th overall) in 2016 after a stellar college career at the University of Manitoba of the CIS, becoming the first member of the Bisons program to be drafted. Over the course of his rookie campaign, Onyemata shined, appearing in all 16 games and recording 32 tackles (15 solo). On Oct. 1, against Miami in London, Onyemata recorded his first career sack and through seven games, as an integral part of the club's defensive line rotation, he has recorded 17 tackles (eight solo) and the takedown

## LINEBACKERS

### CRAIG ROBERTSON

- In just his first year with the Saints, Robertson quickly became one of the most important members of the young defense. After four seasons with Cleveland, Robertson joined the Saints looking to contribute on defense and special teams, yet his production outpaced even the highest expectations. Starting 15 games, Robertson led the Saints with 131 tackles (100 solo), while adding a sack, four passes defended, and interception, and two fumble recoveries. Robertson will continue to be a leader Saints defenders look to during the upcoming campaign, as he has returned to the starting lineup. In his first start of the season vs. Detroit, Oct. 15, he led the team with 11 tackles and had the sack, forced fumble and recovery all on the same play. In 2017 in seven games with starts in the last three contests, he has 26 stops (17) solo) and the sack/forced fumble/fumble recovery.

### A.J. KLEIN

- Signed as an unrestricted free agent from Carolina, where he spent his first four NFL seasons, Klein has taken over play-calling duties on defense for New Orleans. Opening all four games on the strongside for the Saints, Klein leads the Saints with 37 tackles (25 solo), one sack, five passes defended, including a key one late in the fourth quarter Sunday vs. Chicago, and one forced fumble.

### MICHAEL MAUTI

- Mauti, a Mandeville native who was originally selected by the Minnesota Vikings in the seventh round (213th overall) of the 2013 NFL Draft, returned to join his hometown team and made solid contributions on both defense and special teams when he was acquired off of waivers from Minnesota at the conclusion of the 2015 preseason. The son of former Saints wideout and special teams ace Rich Mauti, Michael Mauti has appeared in 49 career games with two starts in five NFL seasons and has tallied 42 tackles (27 solo), one sack, one forced fumble, 35 special teams stops and one blocked punt he recovered for a touchdown. Over eight games played in 2016, he registered 14 tackles (seven solo), one sack, one forced fumble and seven special teams stops.

### MANTI TE'O

- Coming to New Orleans as a free agent, Te'o used his four seasons in San Diego to become a talented, linebacker. A second round pick in 2013 out of Notre Dame where he finished second in the voting for the 2012 Heisman Tro-

phy, In 2015, his third season in San Diego, he started all 12 games he appeared in, recording a career-high 83 tackles (63 solo), a half-sack, an interception, and a forced fumble. Last year, he started the first three games of the season, before an Achilles injury ended his campaign. In 2017, he ranks among team leaders with 22 tackles (14 solo).

He notched four interceptions, one of which he returned for a touchdown. Lattimore figures to become a critical component of the Saints secondary. Through six games, Lattimore has the lead among cornerbacks with 27 stops, two interceptions, one returned for a TD and seven passes defended in establishing himself as a candidate for NFL Defensive Rookie of the Year.

### P.J. WILLIAMS

- This third-season defender is primed for a jump. An experienced starter from Florida State, who developed into one of the nation's top cover corners in 2014, Williams finished his college career with 123 tackles (82 solo), four interceptions and 18 passes defended. In 2017, through the first seven games, Williams has 21 tackles and recorded his first career interception in the Sept. 24 win at Carolina.

**KENNY VACCARO**

• Originally a first round selection of New Orleans in 2013 out of the University of Texas, Vaccaro has filled up the stat sheet for the past three seasons, primarily from the strong safety position, where he has appeared in 63 games with 62 starts and has posted 460 tackles, 6.5 sacks, eight interceptions, 29 passes defended, five forced fumbles and three fumble recoveries. **On Zach Miller's overturned touchdown, what exactly did you see or what did New York see to reverse that call?** "Obviously we are all familiar with the process of a catch at this point. So we ruled that he was going to the ground as part of the process of the catch. So when he goes to the ground, he has to survive the ground. He went to the ground, he temporarily lost control of the ball. The ball hit the ground, therefore it's incomplete. The ball hit the ground out of his control. So as part of the process of the catch, he did not complete that process, and therefore it was incomplete and they overturned the call on the field."

**Was it a cut and dry call basically?** "They are always close, but that process has been in place for some time now. So, that is what we ended up ruling."

**SAINTS POSTGAME NOTES**

- With the win, New Orleans moves to 5-2 on the season, it marks their first five-game winning streak since the first five contests of the 2013 season. It is tied with that 2013 streak for the third-longest winning streak by the Saints since Head Coach **Sean Payton** joined the Saints in 2006.
- The Saints take on the Tampa Bay Buccaneers for a week nine matchup on November 5 at the Mercedes-Benz Superdome. Kickoff is set for 12:00 p.m. CST. The game will be aired on FOX (WVUE-FOX 8 in the New Orleans area).
- With the win, the Saints improved their regular season record against the Bears to 15-13.
- With the win, the Saints improved their all-time record at the Mercedes-Benz Superdome in the regular season to 161-161, improving their 2017 home record to 2-1.
- The Saints currently have a streak of 247 games without having been shut out, dating back to a 26-20 win at Tampa Bay Buccaneers on September 6, 2002, the longest running streak in the NFL.
- New Orleans outgained Chicago in total net yardage 387-307.
- New Orleans outgained Chicago in net passing yardage 286-150.
- Following the win, it marks the fourth time in 2017 that the Saints have surrendered 17 points or less. The last time New Orleans gave up 17 or fewer points in a season in at least four games was the 2013 campaign when they gave up 17 or fewer nine times.
- Payton has 105 career victories (regular season and postseason) after today's victory, moving into a tie for 41st place all-time in career victories with Vince Lombardi (Green Bay Packers and Washington Redskins) and Tom Flores (Oakland/Los Angeles Raiders and Seattle Seahawks).
- QB **Drew Brees** appeared in his 240<sup>th</sup> career contest and completed 23-of-28 passes for 299 yards and a 111.2 passer rating. Brees joined Brett Favre (6,300) and Peyton Manning (6,125) as only the third player in NFL history with 6,000 career completions becoming the fastest player in NFL history to reach 6,000, beating Peyton Manning (259) by 19 games. Brees also joined Manning (71,940) and Favre (71,838) as only the third player in NFL history with 68,000 career passing yards.
  - RB **Mark Ingram** led the Saints in rushing with 18 carries for 75 yards and one touchdown. Ingram now has 40 career touchdowns, putting him past WR **Lance Moore** into eighth place all-time in club record books.
  - RB **Alvin Kamara** scored the game's first touchdown with an eight-yard touchdown run, marking the first opening drive touchdown for the Saints this season on a seven-play, 81-yard drive. He finished the game with 28 yards on eight attempts and also added three receptions for 48 yards, including a 34-yard grab.
  - WR **Michael Thomas** led the Saints in receiving with seven catches for 77 yards.
  - WR **Brandon Coleman** finished the game with a 54-yard catch on New Orleans' first offensive drive of the contest, marking the Saints longest play from scrimmage this year.
  - WR **Ted Ginn Jr.** reeled in two catches for a total of 68 yards, including a fourth-quarter 53-yard grab. Ginn also returned three punts for 22 yards and had nine kickoff return yards.
  - Rookie DE **Trey Hendrickson** recorded his second sack of the season, dropping Bears QB **Mitchell Trubisky** for a five-yard loss.
  - DE **Cameron Jordan** played in his 103<sup>rd</sup> consecutive game today and overall, putting him in a tie for 45th place on the club's all-time games played list with DE **Elex Price**, splitting a sack with S **Kenny Vaccaro** as part of a four tackle day.
  - Along with his half-sack and a key fourth quarter pass defended, Vaccaro finished the game with a team-leading nine total tackles (six solo).

- Rookie CB **Marshon Lattimore** recorded his second interception of the season with 1:22 to play in the fourth quarter, a 25-yard return. Lattimore finished the game with three total tackles and two passes defensed to go with his pick.
- LB **Craig Robertson** finished with five tackles (four solo) to lead the linebackers in stops.
- LB **A.J. Klein** had four tackles and a career-high two passes defensed, including a key deflection on a third-and-one situation late in the fourth quarter, where he blocked a pass intended from Trubisky intended for Bears WR **Kendall Wright**.
- K **Wil Lutz** nailed a 45 and 49-yard field goals and had four of his five kickoffs sail into the end zone for touchbacks. On his kickoff late in the fourth quarter that wasn't a touchback, Lutz pushed Chicago RB **Tarik Cohen** out of bounds for a key tackle at the Chicago 42-yard line to stop a return at 46 yards.
- P **Thomas Morstead** punted four times for 204 yards (51.0 avg.) with a long of 61 yards and two punts inside the 20. Morstead played in his 133rd career game today, putting him in a tie for 23rd place on the club's all-time games played list with LB **Sam Mills** (1986-94).

**Opening Statement**

“Obviously, it was a good win. We found a way to make it interesting. We’re going to have to clean up some of those mistakes and some of the things that are going to hurt us when we play a better team. Credit to Chicago. They fought hard and stayed in it. Fortunately, we were able to stay in it and come out with a win. (The) Defense did a great job getting the turnover. We had a couple of other opportunities that we will look at I’m sure.”

(On words to Mark Ingram about the two fumbles lost) “I didn’t see anything specific. The message to Mark (Ingram) will be between me and Mark (Ingram). Not for you.”

(On his initial anticipation of the game today) “They have a really good defense. We knew we were going to have to be smart. Fortunately, we scored some points early. I thought that was significant. You look at that team and how they’re built. They’ve done really well and they’ve had success when they’ve had leads after the first quarter and the second quarter. They haven’t been as successful when they haven’t had those leads. Fortunately, those early points ended up being significant.”

(On adjustments the defense has made since the start of the season when they struggled initially) “The confidence you gain is through experience. I think the two-game road trip to Carolina and London were good games for us. We’ve been able to build on those and get confident. You start seeing a lot of young guys playing. You start to see it in front of your eyes, the growth and the confidence. Hopefully we can continue that.”

(On the defense’s weak points this game) “The explosives (plays) were miscommunication errors and busted assignments. We’ll get those corrected, but when we needed it in the second half they did a really good job. I’m proud of all of those guys. As you know, each week’s a tough challenge. We have been able to manage some of the distractions and manage what should happen. We knew it was going to be a tough, hard-fought game. I credit our guys for doing enough to get the win, but we have to do more when we play better teams.”

(On the instant replay reversal on what was initially ruled a Bears touchdown by tight end Zach Miller but reversed to an incomplete pass) “It felt like there were three or four today that could’ve gone either way. Honestly, I felt like we had good angles and I felt like it was 50-50. I thought Ingram’s last fumble was 50-50. I really didn’t know. I was like everyone else, just waiting to see. You’re hoping you’ll get the breaks you need. We got a few and we didn’t get a few. It was probably the way the game should have gone.”

(On winning games despite not always having a strong performance from start to finish) “No one, three weeks from now, is going to ask the Bears how they beat Carolina. They’re just going to know they beat Carolina. They’re not going to ask about seven passing attempts. John (Fox) is smart enough to understand how hard it is to win in our league. Five weeks from now, this will be a win. What is most important is that we can clean up the corrections, so down the road it doesn’t cost you a game that becomes more significant.”

(On the performance of the special teams today overall) “I thought the field goals were important. (On) The last kickoff return, we kind of knew they were going to come out with that regardless of where it was kicked. (We knew that) if he had a chance in bounds, we were going to get a return just because of the way the game was flowing for them offensively. We lost contain. We’ll watch the film and make corrections. I thought we did some really good things changing the field. Thomas (Morstead) did some really good things. I thought we gained an edge there. Like anything else, when we watch it in its entirety we’ll have a better feel for it. The field goals were huge. We were fortunate for them to miss that field goal. Overall, (it was) good enough to win.”

(On his impressions of Mitchell Trubisky) “He’s a young, athletic quarterback. He’s obviously someone you want to keep in the pocket. He’s someone that is confident with running and moving.”

He can throw well when he runs and we knew that. I think we did a good job for the most part of keeping him really contained. I think he's got a bright future."

(On the Fats Domino tribute) "We did a little piece on him this week with our players. He's someone whose contributions to music were, I think, underrated. When you go back and you do all the information on him, this is a guy the Beatles opened up for in Liverpool. This is a guy that Elvis Presley felt uncomfortable being called "the King" because of. Many would argue he was the father of rock and roll and here he was one of our own. I just felt like his life was not celebrated enough when he passed. We did a little story about his accomplishments. All week long, when we were watching film as an offensive staff, we had Fats Domino music on. He's obviously an icon."

(On Marshon Lattimore's growth this season) "It is hard to predict a rookie's growth, but he has exceptional ball skills. Those young guys from Ohio State (have) really transitioned well. I'm really pleased for him. He works his tail off at it."

(On the performance of kicker Wil Lutz today and during the season as well so far) "He is striking the ball well. He's been consistent during the week. I think our snap (and) hold has been good. I think on one of the field goals we let a guy come through (on). We will have to clean up protection. He has been focused and he is going to continue to receive those opportunities. I am encouraged with the confidence he's been showing."

(On scoring a touchdown on their opening offensive drive for the first time this season today with the seven-play, 81-yard drive) "It was significant. A fast start is something you're always looking for. Against that defense, to come out and get enough big plays and be able to punch it in, all those things were big in winning."

(On Marshon Lattimore sealing the win with an interception today) "He's playing like a real good rookie player. He looks young. Obviously, the hardest thing to measure in the draft is how quickly guys can transition and how smart they are. He's someone that's got good football IQ, so he picks things up very quickly and plays with a lot of confidence."

(On the defense's increase in mental toughness) "I think it gets back to the confidence and gets back to the task each week. They were up for the challenge. I think especially when the offense turns it over twice in the end of the game like that, they did a real good job."

(On the injuries today) “Zach Miller was taken to the hospital. He dislocated his knee. We are further evaluating him. He will be in our thoughts and prayers on the flight home. The other guys, we had some nicks on the offensive line. Kyle Long went out with a hand (injury) as well as Cody Whitehair with an elbow (injury). Then, Josh Sitton (went out).”

(On the effort) “All in all, I thought that it was a great effort by our football team. We had plenty of opportunities. We just came up a little short.”

(On if the reversed touchdown catch to an incomplete pass on a Mitchell Trubisky-Zach Miller connection affected the team’s play afterwards) “Not really. It didn’t appear to be. Our guys continued to fight. We would rather have a touchdown than a field goal. I think that we had two calls that, I think, went to New York (for review), the (Alvin) Kamara fumble as well as the Zach Miller catch.”

(On if he thought the Miller reversal was a catch) “It doesn’t really matter what I think. It’s like asking me what you think. That was the rule. You know our restrictions. It can be complicated (to understand), no doubt.”

(On what he liked or didn’t like about Mitchell Trubisky’s last two drives) “I think our whole football team competed very hard. I’m proud of that. I told them to walk out of here with their heads high. We’ve got a bye week this week. We have a chance to get some guys well, healthy. We’ve got some young guys that we have plugged in, including Mitch, that will give us an opportunity to get up to speed and get better during that time.”

(On the solid play of the defense) “Our defense has been pretty salty for a month now. I think today’s no different as far as taking the ball away and putting it back in our offense’s hands. We missed a field goal. That was three points. We just don’t have a lot of room for error. It’s not a lack of compete, for sure.”

(On Zach Miller) “He is a fantastic person. He’s a great teammate. He is loved in our locker room. You hate to see it (injury) happen to anybody, especially somebody like that.”

(On the game today) "We found a way to win. It was a good team win, but nobody is real satisfied in that locker room right now. We still have a lot of work to do. We have a lot of room for improvement. We are not satisfied where we are right now. We still feel like we have a long way to go."

(On his emotions at the end of the game when defense is on the field) "You are preparing yourself. The first time we stopped them the score was 17-12. I was preparing to have a drive that is going to get us a field goal to win the game. After that, I'm preparing for overtime. I'm not a fan. I am very much locked in on what we might have to go out there and do to finish the game."

(On the Ted Ginn Jr. long pass play in the fourth quarter) "I just launched it. I had to step up. I felt like he had speed and the safety was recovering deep. I thought there was an opportunity to launch it and give him a chance. He came down with the catch and made a great play."

(On Chicago taking away the big plays) "We had opportunities for a couple of big plays, but the pressure got to us. They did a nice job. That's football. That's the balance. They better get there in time or they open themselves up for big plays. Sometimes they get you."

**RB Mark Ingram**

(On winning five in a row after today's win) "It feels good. It is great that we are able to overcome obstacles. We stay even keel during the game. We have a five-game winning streak, but have to keep improving. We have to get better. There's a lot of things that we need to do to get better and win bigger games in the future."

(On today's game) "I feel like we played a good game. We had a chance to ice it, but I let a lot of my teammates down. That's weak. That's terrible, but I'm going to bounce back. I'm going to work my butt off and try to make it up to my teammates and coaches."

**WR Ted Ginn Jr.**

(On the game) "Coming into this ballgame, we knew what the Chicago Bears were all about. We were trying to match their intensity a little bit. (On how he stays so humble after such an impressive start to an NFL career) "I always stay humble. That is what my dad taught me when I was younger. Just stay humble in everything I do. That is just me. I can't change up and try to stay humble and have the blessings come to me."

(On how for the last several years prior to his arrival, the offense has been carrying the team more than the defense and how it feels when the defense was making some mistakes and the defense was able to pick up the slack a little bit) "We are a team. If we are down, they (the offense) picks us up and if they are down, we pick them up. That is just how we operate as a team. It is great that we have each other's back like that. I love that."

Just taking the ball away and overall defense. To get those type of stats is great. It feels great for us as a defense after the slow start we had."

(On the Zach Miller touchdown play that was reversed to an incomplete pass following instant replay) "I just went through my progressions and fell into the corner on the back side. I just put it in a spot where Zach could make a play on it. He made a heck of a catch and it was a great effort on his part. The call was what it was, but I thought it was an awesome play and effort on his part. It was a big play in the game."

(On if he realized at first Miller was seriously hurt) "When I went over to him and he was still on the ground (I realized it)."

(On the Bears continuing to play New Orleans tough after the Miller injury) "It was tough. Zach means a lot to this team, beyond the X's and O's and what he brings to the field, but more what he brings to us as a person. Specifically, to me, how much he has helped me grow over this process. So, you never want to see a teammate go down like that."

(On how surprised he was that the play was reversed following an instant replay review) "(I was) Pretty surprised."

(On if he saw any evidence that the call should have been overturned) "Not from my point of view."

(On the last fourth down play where Saints S Kenny Vaccaro deflected the pass and got the Saints defense off the field) "We had a little in-cut coming, and I had to get it over the linebacker and I left it a little too high. So, we had what we wanted. It was a good call. I missed a little bit. I've made that throw hundreds of times. So, just learn from it, get better, and just got to bring it down a little bit to give your receiver a better chance."

(On what Drew Brees said to him after the game) "He just said, 'keep working, congrats.' We know a mutual friend, so we just talked about that a little bit. I said congrats to him on the landmark he reached (6,000 career completions). He is a great dude and awesome competitor."

(On if he feels that they are getting closer to completing late game drives) "Definitely. We were in it the whole game, and we still had a chance at the end. [The] Defense continues to play tremendously and keep us in these games. We're getting closer as an offense. We just need to become more consistent. I thought we communicated great in a hostile environment. We are getting close. Nobody has their head down, nobody is pouting. We just continue to lean on each other and know we have each other's back. We're going to keep working, keep getting better and get back to winning football."

(On priorities heading into the bye week) "Just watching film and getting better each day. Whether it's doing treatment, getting in the weight room, watching film. Just getting guys healthy. Just continue to stay focused. Really take advantage of this week, because we are at the halfway point, and then just come back even hungrier for next week, so that's what we are going to do. I am really excited where this football team is headed, even though we came up short today. We are going to keep fighting."

(On last kick return) "I just knew I was going to have to bring it out. You know, try to make a play just to try to put some momentum on our back and just finish through the last stretch of the game."

(On QB Mitchell Trubisky's big run in the fourth quarter) "It gives us a big lift because it puts us in scoring position. It really fires up the defense. (On Bear's passing game) "It was okay. It could be better. We made some plays. We left a lot of plays out there. It could definitely be better. I don't know where it comes from. We can be better. We can get our routes deeper. We haven't really had to pass the ball much the last few games, so for us, as receivers and quarterbacks, we just got to go out there and stay getting the extra work in. We have a lot of great backs. We never know when we have one of those games where we got to run it. Our job, we have to go out there and have to stay on our stuff and keep running routes with Mitch [Trubisky]. Just keep doing extra stuff because you never know when you have a day like this when you have to pass it."

(On passing success and the performance of Tre McBride III) "We definitely been pushing for it. That's what we want to do. We don't get a lot of opportunities, so we have to make those plays whenever they come to us. He [Tre McBride III] made a few good ones today. We just got to keep making those. The more plays we make the more we get a chance to throw it around. So, we just got to go back to the drawing board for this (next) weekend (after bye). Get some guys healthy and just go out there next week (in two weeks) when we play and play."

**Wide Receiver Tre McBride III**

(On big catch) "The goal is always to go out there and get open and make the big plays for Trubisky and the offense. That was the momentum that we needed and I think we capitalized off it."

(On Miller injury and call reversal) "Zach was somebody I really looked up to when I first got here. Really cool guy. Really down to earth. (On what he said when he gathered teammates on the sideline in the fourth quarter) "Just breathe. They weren't doing nothing they we haven't seen on film. They were gaming us with (a) hurry-up

offense and screen and run. I (was) just telling everybody to slow down the game and play football. Just breathe.”

(On the performance of the defense in the second half) “Play football. Play dominant. Be us. Be the Chicago Bears defense. I think we did a great job with doing that in the second half.”

(On Adrian Amos’ strip in the fourth quarter) “It was a great play. It was a great defensive play. It was a selfless play, just going all out for the defense and trying get the ball back so we can win.”

### **Safety Adrian Amos**

(On performance today) “It wasn’t good enough because we lost. We [are] playing to win. We lost, so we got to do a little better.”

(On if momentum swung with strip in fourth quarter) “It didn’t really result in points. (We) Just have to find a way to get up and go. Just as a team, we just have to be a little more (consistent) over the course of the game to try to win that game.”

## **New Orleans Saints Head Coach Sean Payton**

### **Conference Call with New Orleans Media**

**Monday, October 30, 2017**

#### **What did you see on film after reviewing yesterday**

“First off, I thought some of the main things we had talked about as goals, we accomplished. I thought we did a good job overall versus the running game. I thought our guys inside played well, defensive tackles. There were a few big plays given up; we missed the long run early on. I thought offensively, Drew (Brees) played well. I thought the ball was out a little too often for my liking, but we made enough plays in the passing game. The early points (the Saints scored), we mentioned yesterday, we thought were significant. I thought (in) the kicking game, we were outstanding barring the last kickoff return by Chicago. But we changed field position, Thomas (Morstead) had one of his better games. So there are some encouraging things on the film, and yet, we’re kind of going through some of the things that we have to improve on.”

#### **What did you think of how (Kenny) Vaccaro played?**

“I thought he was very good. He received a game ball. (It was) probably one of his better games. (He was) extremely active, he had a lot of production.”

#### **With Delvin Breaux continuing to progress physically, what are some of the challenges of trying to work him back into the lineup, since he is eligible to return to the active roster this week?**

“I think like anything else – it is kind of happening with Willie Snead – it is just getting the physical, the cardio, all the football-playing elements up to speed. I do not think you just flip the switch and then, ‘Bang.’ I think the same thing is taking place right now with Willie. He received several snaps yesterday, not as many as probably we would’ve liked and yet, he’s someone that we’re going to need down the stretch. I think that same process will take place with Delvin.”

#### **From yesterday, it sounded like you didn’t think it was maybe worth emphasizing some of the things that are out of the team’s control that may have influenced your success. But when you talk to the players about their perspective of how they’ve played recently, do you mention any of those things? Such as not having to play Aaron Rodgers a week ago in Green Bay and the overturned call in your favor yesterday?**

“No, I don’t. I think our league, each week is made up of breaks. We can’t control the quarterback (who didn’t play) a week ago and quite honestly, I thought they missed some calls yesterday. The key thing is understanding the true enemy or the true obstacles in front of you and how to overcome them, as opposed to paying attention to the things you can’t control. Our message with this team – it’s young – (is that) there’s a

lot of things we're doing well and yet, there's a number of things that we are not doing as well. And I do believe when we play in a bigger game against a better team, those can catch up with you. So we're still chasing a perfect four quarters of football, as opposed to a good half at Carolina or a good half at Green Bay. We are still working hard on improving some of these things that we have to get cleaned up. Each week, they understand that and they understand the challenge ahead. It is a week-to-week sprint here. We really feel like we have to win this work week versus Tampa Bay and have the good Wednesday and Thursday, Friday practice sessions. That's part of it."

**Are you seeing a maturing process from this team in that they're finding different ways to win, that it doesn't have to be a singular way?**

"It's been different and that's been encouraging. Defensively, we came up with some key stops in some tough situations. Short-field turnover, short-field kick return – and they responded. That's been outstanding."

**Cam (Jordan) has talked a lot about chasing perfection, and I feel like you've talked about demonstrated ability and things like that. When the defense is playing as well as it is, how much can the confidence from that demonstrated ability spur them to keep this going or play even better?**

"Absolutely, it can. Any defense that becomes very good, extremely good, and begins to feed off their past successes, does so because they gain confidence and they know they can repeat it again. I think that's been extremely encouraging. To their credit, to our credit, to the players that are out on the field, that's been a change and that's been something that we're going to need to continue to do."

**With Justin Hardee, a guy you picked up towards the end of the preseason and converted from wide receiver to defensive back, how pleased are you with his performances so far on special teams?**

"They've been good. Yesterday was a real good day for him. Punt coverage, he wins outside and makes a key stop. He has a little grit and attitude to him. He can run, he's tough, we saw that on his preseason film. And I've been encouraged that he has become a core player for us."
