NOTABLE STORYLINES

The Browns close out the home portion of the 2017 season when they host the Baltimore Ravens at 1:00 p.m. on Sunday, Dec. 17. The Ravens own a 28-9 advantage in the all-time series, including a 24-10 Week 2 victory in Baltimore earlier this season.

Since Week 8, the Browns are third in the league with a 4.97 rushing average. Overall, the Browns are seventh in the NFL with a rushing average of 4.42 yards. In 2016, the Browns finished second in the NFL with a 4.89 rushing average.

Last season, the Browns finished 31st in the NFL in both total defense and rushing defense. Through 14 weeks this year, the Browns rank 12th in total defense and sixth in rushing defense. The highest the Browns have finished in run defense since 1999 was in 2013 when the team finished 18th.

LBs **Joe Schobert** and **Christian Kirksey** rank second and sixth in the NFL in tackles this season, respectively. The pair have played every defensive snap for the Browns this season and join N.Y. Jets LB Demario Davis and K.C. DB Ron Parker as the only players in the NFL to have played every defensive snap for their team this season.

RB **Isaiah Crowell** rushed for a season-high 121 yards against Green Bay. He is leading the Browns with 716 rushing yards this year. Last year, Crowell finished with a career-high 952 rushing yards, the most by a Brown since 2010.

Rookie QB **DeShone Kizer** set career highs in touchdown passes (three) and rating (99.4) against the Packers. Kizer tied a Browns record for touchdown passes in a game by a rookie. On the season, Kizer has thrown for 2,252 yards and added 315 rushing yards with five touchdowns. His 315 rushing yards are the second-most by a Browns quarterback in a season and his 2,252 passing yards this year are the third-most by a Browns rookie.

WR **Josh Gordon** recorded three receptions for 69 yards, including an 18-yard touchdown against Green Bay. It marked his first score since Dec. 15, 2013.

RB **Duke Johnson Jr.** leads the team this season in receptions (56) and receiving yards (497), while adding five touchdowns (three receiving and two rushing). Among all NFL running backs since 2015, Johnson ranks first in receiving yards (1,545) and third in receptions (170).

In eight games this season, rookie DL **Myles Garrett** has recorded 24 tackles, five sacks and one fumble recovery. Despite missing five games, he is tied for third among all NFL rookies in sacks.

Cleveland -- Hue Jackson: 9-36, third season as head coach, second with the Browns.

Hue Jackson was named the 16th full-time head coach in Cleveland Browns history on January 13, 2016. He is in his 30th year as a coaching, including the last 16 in the NFL. He has spent 10 seasons coaching in the AFC North, during which time he helped his team advance to the postseason seven times. Jackson was head coach of the Oakland Raiders in 2011 and guided the team to an 8-8 record. He has also served as offensive coordinator in Washington (2003), Atlanta (2007), Oakland (2010) and Cincinnati (2014-15). Jackson spent 14 years coaching on the college level and was a quarterback at Pacific from 1985-86.

Baltimore -- John Harbaugh: 92-65, 10th season as head coach.

John Harbaugh is in his 10th season at the helm in Baltimore. He has led the Ravens to six playoff berths and in 2012, captured the franchise's second Super Bowl championship. Under Harbaugh's guidance, the Ravens have secured an appearance in three AFC Championship games (2008, 2011 & 2012). Harbaugh spent his first 10 NFL seasons (1998-07) with the Philadelphia Eagles. He was the team's secondary coach in 2007, after nine seasons as special teams coordinator. He was voted the 2001 NFL's Special Teams Coach of the Year by his coaching peers.

NOTABLE CONNECTIONS

- Ravens general manager **Ozzie Newsome** was selected by the Browns in the first round of the 1978 NFL Draft and went on to play in 198 consecutive contests over his 13 year career in Cleveland. The three-time Pro Bowler was inducted into the Cleveland Browns Ring of Honor and enshrined in the Pro Football Hall of Fame in 1999. After his playing career, Newsome got his start in the front office with the Browns' pro personnel department from 1991-95.
- Head Coach **Hue Jackson** served as Baltimore's quarterbacks coach from 2008-09.
- Senior offensive assistant **Al Saunders** spent two seasons (2009-10) on the Ravens' coaching staff.
- DL **Trevon Coley** was originally signed by the Ravens as an undrafted free agent in 2016.
- Ravens RB **Terrance West** was a third-round pick by the Browns in 2014.
- Ravens TE **Benjamin Watson** spent two seasons with the Browns (2010-11) where he hauled in 154 receptions for 1,674 yards and eight touchdowns.
- Ravens WR/TE **Vince Mayle** was selected by the Browns in the fourth round in the 2015 NFL Draft.
- Ravens special teams coordinator/associate head coach **Jerry Rosberg** was the special teams coordinator for the Browns from 2001-06.
- Ravens defensive line coach **Joe Cullen** held the same role with the Browns in 2013.
- Ravens senior personnel assistant **George Kokinis** began his NFL career working in the Browns' scouting department (1991-95) after serving an internship with the team's operations department. He also served as general manager for part of the 2009 season.
- Ravens head coach **John Harbaugh** attended Miami (Ohio) University.
- Ravens DT **Willie Henry** (Cleveland) and DE **Chris Wormley** (Toledo) are Ohio natives.
- Strength and conditioning assistant **Evan Marcus** held the same position at the University of Maryland in 1994.
- Ravens senior vice president of football administration **Pat Moriarty** began his playing career as a rookie free agent RB with the Browns in 1979. After his playing days, he went on to join the Browns' front office as the club's director of business operations from 1994-95. He is a native of Cleveland.

WHAT TO LOOK FOR THIS WEEK

RB Isaiah Crowell

With 100 rushing yards, would record his seventh career 100-yard rushing game and would give him sole possession of first place on the Browns' 100-yard rushing games list since 1999.

A 100-yard rushing game would make him the first Brown to record 100 or more rushing yards in back-to-back games since Trent Richardson in 2012.

RB Matthew Dayes

With a kickoff return of 50 or more yards, would become the first Brown to record three kickoff returns of 50-plus yards since Josh Cribbs did it in 2011.

RB Duke Johnson Jr.

A reception of 25-plus yards would tie him for the most big-play receptions (5) ever recorded by a Browns running back in a single season (Leroy Hoard, 1991).

With three receiving yards, could become the first NFL running back to record 500 receiving yards in each of his first three seasons since Herschel Walker in 1986-88.

Is 45 scrimmage yards away from passing Earnest Byner (2,611, 1984-86) as the Brown with the 10th-most scrimmage yards in his first three NFL seasons.

Is 155 receiving yards away from registering the most by a Browns running back in a season (Dub Jones, 651).

QB DeShone Kizer

A rushing TD would mark his sixth of the season and would tie Otto Graham (1950, 1953 and 1955) for the second-best total by a Browns quarterback in a single season. It would also tie him for fourth among all NFL rookie quarterbacks in the category since 2000. Six rushing TDs would also be the fourth-most by any Browns rookie since 2000.

With 81 rushing yards, would pass Mike Phipps (395, 1973) for first on the Browns' single-season quarterback rushing list.

With 196 passing yards, he will move into second on the Browns all-time rookie passing list (2,253).

Could become the first Browns quarterback with three or more TD passes in back-to-back games since Derek Anderson in 2007 (three vs. Miami on Oct. 14 and three at St. Louis on Oct. 28).

DB Jason McCourty

An interception would tie his single-season career high of four.

TE David Njoku

A receiving TD would mark his fifth of the season and would tie him for the sixth-best mark ever registered by a Browns tight end in a single season. It would also tie Josh Gordon (2012) for second-highest tally recorded by a Browns rookie since 2000.

Baltimore's defense forced five turnovers during a 24-10 Ravens victory. Early in the first quarter, a strip-sack by Ravens LB Terrell Suggs gave Baltimore's offense a short field and a 4-yard TD run by RB Terrence West for a 7-0 lead. Midway through the second quarter, Ravens QB Joe Flacco led Baltimore on a six-play, 64-yard drive capped by a 4-yard TD strike to RB Javorious Allen, extending the lead to 14-0. Replacing injured QB DeShone Kizer, QB Kevin Hogan led a five-play, 83-yard drive. Hogan connected with rookie TE David Njoku for a 23-yard TD, the first TD pass of Hogan's career and the first TD reception of Njoku's, to cut the deficit, 14-7. Later in the second quarter, Ravens rookie LB Tyus Bowser intercepted a Hogan pass, resulting in a 27-yard return and a 2-yard TD pass from Flacco to WR Jeremy Maclin for a 21-7 Ravens lead at halftime. Midway through the third quarter, rookie K Zane Gonzalez connected on a 38-yard field goal to shrink Baltimore's lead, but Ravens K Justin Tucker converted a 28-yard field goal in the fourth quarter to make the score 24-10. On the game's next possession, Kizer marched the Browns 70 yards down the field before Ravens DB Lardarius Webb intercepted a Kizer pass in the end zone. Cleveland's offense wasn't able to muster any more points as Baltimore's defense sealed the 24-10 victory with a late fourth quarter stand. Early in the first quarter, OL Joe Thomas exceeded 10,000 straight offensive snaps for his career, the longest-known streak in NFL history.

WR Josh Gordon - Led the team with 69 yards on three receptions and his first score since Dec. 15, 2013 last week...Activated to the team's 53-man roster after being reinstated on Nov. 30, 2017... Caught seven passes for 154 yards in two games played this season... Originally selected by the Browns in the second round of the 2012 NFL Supplemental Draft.

LT Spencer Drango - Appeared in every game this year with seven starts...Replaced an injured Joe Thomas at left tackle during the Titans game in Week 7...Made his first start of the season against the Texans in Week 6 as an extra offensive lineman...Selected by the Browns in the fifth round of the 2016 NFL Draft.

LG Joel Bitonio - Started all 44 games he's appeared in since being drafted by the Browns in the second round (35th overall) of the 2014 NFL Draft...Inked a five-year contract extension in March.

C JC Tretter - Started at center in every contest this season... Originally selected by the Green Bay Packers in the fourth round (122nd overall) of the 2013 NFL Draft...Signed by the Browns as an unrestricted free agent on March 9, 2017.

RG Kevin Zeitler - Started every game this year and has now started 84 of 85 career games...Originally drafted by the Cincinnati Bengals in the first round (27th overall) of the 2012 NFL Draft...Joined the Browns as an unrestricted free agent on March 9, 2017.

RT Shon Coleman - Made all 13 starts this season...Selected by the Browns in the third round of the 2016 NFL Draft.

TE Randall Telfer - Walter Payton Man of the Year nominee... Played in every game and started 12 this season...Caught three passes for 36 yards this year...Selected by the Browns in the sixth round of the 2015 NFL Draft out of USC.

Gregg Williams was named the Browns defensive coordinator on Jan. 7, 2017. Williams is in his 27th season in the NFL, including three as a head coach and 16 as a defensive coordinator. His defenses have finished in the top five in total defense five times, including the top defense in the NFL in 2000. Williams also oversaw a Saints defensive unit that won Super Bowl XLIV and a Titans defense that advanced to Super Bowl XXXIV. Williams spent the past three seasons (2014-16) as the defensive coordinator for the St. Louis/Los Angeles Rams. In 2016, the Rams defense finished in the top 10 in the NFL in total defense and passing defense.

WILSON SPEARHEADS RUN GAME

Kirby Wilson was named the Browns running backs coach/run game coordinator in 2016. He has 19 years of experience coaching running backs in the NFL, during which time he has coached five running backs who rank in the top 25 for career rushing yards (Emmitt Smith #1, Curtis Martin #4, Edgerrin James #12, Adrian Peterson #16 and Thomas Jones #25) and two of the top four all-time reception leaders among running backs (Larry Centers #1 and Keith Byers #4). Wilson has helped seven different running backs break the 1,000-yard plateau a total of eight times. He has mentored four players to the Pro Bowl and has been to the playoffs with four different franchises, highlighted by the 2002 Buccaneers and 2008 Steelers Super Bowl victories. In Wilson's first season in Cleveland, the Browns finished second in the NFL with a 4.89 rushing average. The average was the seventh-best in team history and the team's best mark since 1966.

On the season, Kizer has thrown for 2,252 yards and added 315 rushing yards with five touchdowns. His five rushing scores are the most by a Browns quarterback since **Mike Phipps** had five in 1972. Hall of Famer **Otto Graham** is the only Browns quarterback to record more rushing touchdowns in a season than Kizer's five this year. Kizer is tied for first among all NFL quarterbacks in rushing touchdowns this season. His 315 rushing yards are the second-most by a Browns quarterback in a season. Kizer's 2,252 passing yards this year are the third-most by a Browns rookie.

GORDON RETURNS

WR **Josh Gordon** recorded four receptions for 85 yards at Los Angeles (12/3) in his NFL return after missing the previous 44 consecutive games. Last week, he recorded three receptions for 69 yards, including an 18-yard touchdown, his first since Dec. 15, 2013. Gordon has appeared in 37 games since joining the Browns as a second-round pick in the 2012 supplemental draft. He has 168 receptions for 2,908 yards and 15 touchdowns. In 2013, he led the NFL with 1,646 receiving yards.

CHANGE AT LT

OL **Joe Thomas** tore his triceps in the third quarter against the Titans (10/22). The injury ended the 2007 first-round pick's streak of 10,363 consecutive offensive plays, believed to be the longest streak in NFL history. The next week the 10-time Pro Bowler's streak of 167 consecutive starts ended as **Spencer Drango** opened at left tackle.

RB **Isaiah Crowell** rushed for a season-high 121 yards against Green Bay (12/10). He is leading the Browns with 716 rushing yards this year. Last year, Crowell finished with a career-high 952 rushing yards, the most by a Brown since 2010. With 2,989 career rushing yards, he ranks eighth on the Browns all-time rushing list. Crowell's 21 career rushing touchdowns are the fourth-most by a Brown in their first four seasons. His 22 career touchdowns are the third-most by a Browns player since 1999 and his 3,759 scrimmage yards rank third.

RETURNS FOR DAYES

Rookie RB **Matthew Dayes** returned the opening kickoff 53 yards against Jacksonville (11/19). Dayes also recorded a 71-yard kickoff return against the Vikings (10/29), which is the fourth-longest kickoff return in the NFL this season. He is the first Browns player with two 50-plus yard returns in one season since RB **Fozzy Whittaker** in 2013. Dayes joins L.A. Rams WR Pharoh Cooper, New England RB Dion Lewis and Atlanta WR Andre Roberts as the only NFL players with two 50-plus yard kickoff returns this season.

HEAD COACH HUE JACKSON



Hue Jackson was named the 16th full-time head coach in Cleveland Browns history by Dee and Jimmy Haslam on January 13, 2016. He has 30 years of coaching experience, including the last 16 in the NFL. He has spent 10 seasons coaching in the AFC North, during which time he helped his team advance to the postseason seven times. Jackson was head coach of the Oakland Raiders in 2011 and guided the team to an 8-8 record. He has also served as offensive coordinator in Washington (2003), Atlanta (2007), Oakland (2010) and Cincinnati (2014-15).

In his first year with Cleveland, he helped the Browns finish second in the NFL with a 4.89 rushing average, the team's best mark since 1966. Linebacker Christian Kirksey finished third in the NFL with 148 tackles, while left tackle Joe Thomas was selected to his 10th career Pro Bowl.

Jackson helped develop one of the youngest teams in NFL history. The Browns opened the 2016 season with 17 rookies on their 53-man roster, the most by an NFL team in a season opener since 2002. First-round pick wide receiver Corey Coleman was named NFL Rookie of the Week after a 104-yard, two touchdown performance in Week 2. Second-round pick defensive lineman Emmanuel Ogbah recorded a team-best 5.5 sacks, tied for the fourth-most by a Browns rookie. Third-round pick quarterback Cody Kessler registered the second-highest single-game passing yardage total by a Browns rookie with 336 in Week 6.

Prior to joining the Browns, Jackson spent the previous four seasons (2012-15) with the Cincinnati Bengals. During that time, he helped the Bengals to two division titles and a trip to the postseason all four years. In 2012, he served as secondary/assistant special teams coach before coaching the running backs in 2013. Jackson spent 2014-15 as offensive coordinator.

With Jackson as coordinator in 2015, the Bengals offense finished third in the AFC in yards per play (5.7) and points per game (26.2). He was voted by the Professional Football Writers of America (PFWA) as the Co-Assistant Coach of the Year as quarterback Andy Dalton set a career high and franchise record with a 106.3 rating, which led the AFC and was second in the NFL. After losing Dalton to injury in Week 14, Jackson guided quarterback A.J. McCarron to a 2-1 record in the final three games of the season as the Bengals clinched the AFC North title. The Cincinnati running game produced two 700-yard rushers in Jeremy Hill (794) and Giovani Bernard (730) for the first time since 1988. Tight end Tyler Eifert experienced a breakout season after hauling in 13 touchdown receptions, the most by a Bengals tight end in franchise history and the most by a Cincinnati player since 2001. Wide receiver A.J. Green added 10 receiving touchdowns on 86 receptions for 1,297 yards. Eifert, Green and left tackle Andrew Whitworth were selected to the Pro Bowl.

In Jackson's first year as offensive coordinator for Cincinnati in 2014, the run game posted its highest yards per game average (134.1) since 2000. Dalton passed for 3,398 yards and Green totaled 1,041 receiving yards. Hill led all NFL rookies with 1,124 rushing yards, the second-most by a Bengals rookie in team history.

After spending the 2010 season as the Raiders offensive coordinator, Jackson was promoted to head coach in 2011. Oakland finished the year 8-8 and tied for first in the AFC West but missed

the postseason via tiebreaker. The 8-8 mark was the best record by any Raiders team since 2002. The Raiders finished ninth in the NFL in total offense (379.5 yards per game) and seventh in rushing offense (131.9).

Before joining the Raiders, Jackson spent two seasons (2008-09) as quarterbacks coach for Baltimore, helping the Ravens advance to the playoffs both years. He was vital in the development of Joe Flacco, who was named NFL Rookie of the Year in 2008 and became the first rookie quarterback to win two playoff games as the Ravens advanced to the AFC Championship game.

From 2004-06, Jackson served as the Bengals wide receivers coach, helping develop one of the best wide receiver tandems in NFL history with Chad Johnson and T.J. Houshmandzadeh. During that span, the two combined to average 173.3 catches, 2,363.3 receiving yards and 15 touchdowns per season. In 2005, Johnson led the AFC with 1,432 receiving yards. In 2006, Johnson and Houshmandzadeh became the first Bengals duo to each top 1,000 receiving yards in the same season.

Jackson gained his first fulltime NFL experience with Washington, where he served as the running backs coach from 2001-02, before being promoted to offensive coordinator in 2003. Under Jackson's tutelage, running back Stephen Davis led the NFC with 1,432 rushing yards in 2001.

Jackson spent 14 years coaching on the college level, going from a graduate assistant at Pacific all the way to offensive coordinator at Southern California. He spent four seasons (1997-2000) as USC's offensive coordinator, where he also helped to recruit and develop players, including quarterback Carson Palmer, who went on to win the Heisman Trophy and be selected No. 1 overall in the NFL draft.

He was a minority coaching fellowship intern with the Los Angeles Rams in 1990, Arizona Cardinals in 1992 and Washington Redskins in 1995. He also served as the running backs/wide receivers/special teams coach for the London Monarchs of the World League in 1991.

Born Oct. 22, 1965, Jackson was a quarterback at Pacific from 1985-86 and threw for 2,544 yards and 19 touchdowns. The Los Angeles native also lettered in basketball and earned his degree in physical education.

Jackson and his wife, Michelle, have three daughters, Jordyn, Baylee and Haydyn.

Hue Jackson and his wife, Michelle, launched the Hue Jackson Foundation on July 20, 2017. The foundation is committed to empowering children, teen and adult survivors of human trafficking through the funding of organizations that champion for and serve as a voice for those who are exploited. FirstEnergy Stadium, Cleveland, Ohio

The Cleveland Browns dropped the 2017 season opener to the Pittsburgh Steelers, 21-18. Despite limiting the Steelers to 290 yards, two touchdown receptions by Steelers TE Jesse James proved to be the difference in the contest. On the game's opening possession, Pittsburgh forced a three-and-out and on fourth down, deep in Browns' territory, its special teams unit opened the scoring. LB Tyler Matakevich blocked Britton Colquitt's punt and Steelers LB Anthony Chickillo recovered it in the end zone for a touchdown to give the Steelers an early 7-0 advantage. Later in the quarter, rookie QB DeShone Kizer led the team on a 12-play, 68-yard drive, which he capped off by sneaking into the end zone from a yard out to even the scoring. With 45 seconds left in the first half, Steelers QB Ben Roethlisberger found James in the back of the end zone for a 4-yard score to give Pittsburgh a 14-7 lead heading into the locker room. As Cleveland's defense forced a three-and-out on Pittsburgh's first possession of the second half, Kizer led the offense down the field and set up fellow rookie K Zane Gonzalez, who notched a 24-yard field goal to cut Pittsburgh's lead to 14-10. On the game's next possession, Roethlisberger marched the Steelers 75 yards down the field and connected with James again for his second touchdown reception on the afternoon to extend their lead to 21-10. Late in the fourth quarter, DB Derrick Kindred picked off Roethlisberger and returned it 30 yards to the Cleveland 31-yard line. Later in the quarter, on fourth-and-two from the 3-yard line, Kizer hit WR Corey Coleman at the goal line for a touchdown, the first touchdown pass of his career. RB Isaiah Crowell punched in a two-point conversion to cut the lead to 21-18, but Pittsburgh would not let Cleveland get the ball back as they sealed 21-18 victory.

M&T Bank Stadium, Baltimore, Md.

The Cleveland Browns dropped their second game as Baltimore's defense forced five turnovers in a 24-10 Ravens victory. Early in the first quarter, a strip-sack by Ravens LB Terrell Suggs gave Baltimore's offense a short field and a 4-yard TD run by RB Terrence West for a 7-0 lead. Midway through the second quarter, Ravens QB Joe Flacco led Baltimore on a six-play, 64-yard drive capped by a 4-yard TD strike to RB Javorious Allen, extending the lead to 14-0. Replacing injured QB DeShone Kizer, QB Kevin Hogan responded with a five-play, 83-yard drive. Hogan connected with rookie TE David Njoku for a 23-yard TD, the first TD pass of Hogan's career and the first TD reception of Njoku's, to cut the deficit, 14-7. Later in the second quarter, Ravens rookie LB Tyus Bowser intercepted a Hogan pass, resulting in a 27-yard return and a 2-yard TD pass from Flacco to WR Jeremy Maclin for a 21-7 Ravens lead at halftime. Midway through the third quarter, rookie K Zane Gonzalez connected on a 38-yard field goal to shrink Baltimore's lead, but Ravens K Justin Tucker converted a 28-yard field goal in the fourth quarter to make the score 24-10. On the game's next possession, Kizer marched the Browns 70 yards down the field before Ravens DB Lardarius Webb intercepted a Kizer pass in the end zone. Cleveland's offense wasn't able to muster any more points as Baltimore's defense sealed the 24-10 victory with a late fourth quarter stand. Early in the first quarter, OL Joe Thomas exceeded 10,000 straight snaps for his career, the longest-known streak in NFL history.

After Browns P Britton Colquitt pinned Indianapolis inside its own 5-yard line, Brissett led the Colts on a five-play, 97-yard drive capped off by a 61-yard touchdown pass to WR T.Y. Hilton to extend their lead to 21-7. Indy would tack on its third score of the quarter as RB Frank Gore found the end zone from four yards out to give the Colts a 28-7 lead. With 44 seconds to play in the half, QB DeShone Kizer linked up with WR Jordan Leslie, who made a one-handed grab for a 26-yard gain down to the Colts' 2-yard line. Two plays later, Kizer found TE David Njoku in the back of the end zone for his second touchdown reception in as many games to cut Indy's lead to 28-14 at the half. After a scoreless third quarter, Colts K Adam Vinatieri notched a 33-yard field goal to extend their lead to 31-14. Later in the fourth, Kizer found WR Kenny Britt for an 11-yard touchdown to make it 31-21. Cleveland got the ball back with 4:05 to play and went on an 11-play, 70-yard drive in 2:01, capped off with a QB sneak by Kizer to cut the lead to 31-28. However, a final effort would see Colts S Malik Hooker intercept a Kizer pass with no time remaining to seal the victory, 31-28.

Despite outgaining the Jets 419-212, the Browns fell to New York, 17-14. On the game's opening possession, Browns rookie DL Myles Garrett, who was making his NFL debut, reached Jets QB Josh McCown to record the first sack of his career on his first NFL snap. Garrett would register another sack in the second quarter to become the first No. 1 overall pick to record multiple sacks in his NFL debut. Scoring opportunities plagued the Browns throughout the contest as the team had two red zone turnovers (one fumble and one interception) and two missed field goals. With time winding down in the first half, Jets K Chandler Catanzaro notched a 57-yard field goal to give New York a 3-0 lead at the half. To start the second half, Browns QB Kevin Hogan relieved rookie DeShone Kizer and led the team on a 10-play, 75-yard drive capped by a one-handed touchdown reception by rookie TE David Njoku to give the Browns a 7-3 advantage. Njoku's third touchdown reception of the year tied for the most by a Browns rookie tight end in a single season. Later in the quarter, McCown connected with TE Austin Seferian-Jenkins for a 2-yard score to regain the lead, 10-7. In the final frame, the Jets took over on downs and marched 97 yards down the field as McCown found WR Jermaine Kearse for a 24-yard touchdown to extend their lead to 17-7. Cleveland would tack on another late score as Hogan dumped off a short pass to RB Duke Johnson Jr., who scampered 41 yards to the end zone, to cut New York's lead to 17-14. However, after recovering an onside kick, New York would kneel out the clock to secure the victory.

Later in the first quarter, Watson hit WR Will Fuller V for a 39-yard touchdown, giving the Texans a 10-3 advantage. On the ensuing drive, Texans CB Jonathan Joseph intercepted QB Kevin Hogan and returned it 82 yards for a touchdown and a 16-3 Texans lead. On the ensuing possession, Coons connected from 22 yards for a 9-7 Los Angeles halftime lead. The Chargers opened the second half with a 10-play, 78-yard drive capped by a 7-yard strike from QB Philip Rivers to WR Keenan Allen to extend Los Angeles' lead to 16-7. Later in the third quarter, Coons nailed his fourth field goal of the day to give the Chargers a 19-7 edge. In the fourth quarter, rookie K Zane Gonzalez connected on a 35-yard field goal to bring the Browns within nine, but a pair of late turnovers inside the Chargers 30-yard line sealed the 19-10 victory for Los Angeles.

Despite having a 14-point lead entering the fourth quarter, the Browns fell to the Green Bay Packers in overtime, 27-21. Green Bay opened the game with an 11-play, 74-yard drive, capped by a 30-yard touchdown pass from Packers QB Brett Hundley to RB Jamaal Williams for an early 7-0 Packers lead. On the ensuing possession, rookie QB DeShone Kizer connected with WR Josh Gordon for a 19-yard touchdown, Gordon's first since 2013, to even the score at 7-7. In the second quarter, RB Duke Johnson Jr. caught a shovel pass from Kizer and scampered into the end zone for a Browns' 14-7 halftime lead. Late in the third quarter, Kizer hit WR Corey Coleman from two yards out to extend the Browns' lead to 21-7. However, Hundley led Green Bay's offense on a 13-play, 75-yard drive, ending with a 1-yard touchdown run by Williams to cut Cleveland's lead to 21-14 in the fourth quarter. With less than a minute remaining in the game, Hundley found Packers WR Davante Adams from one yard out to even the score at 21-21 and send the game to overtime. On the opening drive, Packers S Josh Jones intercepted Kizer, and six plays later, Hundley connected with Adams on a 25-yard touchdown pass for a 27-21 final score.
