SERIES INFORMATION

The Detroit Lions (7-6) return home Saturday to Ford Field to conclude their 2017 series with the Chicago Bears (4-9). Detroit claimed its fifth road win of the season with a 24-21 victory over Tampa Bay in Week 14, while the Bears are coming off a 33-7 win over Cincinnati. The Lions claimed victory in the two teams' first meeting of the season in Week 11 by a score of 27-24 at Soldier Field (11/19). Saturday's matchup marks the 176th all-time meeting between the NFC North rivals, with the Lions winning eight of the last nine dating back to 2013.

CALDWELL'S FOURTH SEASON IN DETROIT



JIM CALDWELL **Head Coach** Years with Lions: 4 Years as NFL Head Coach: 7 Years in NFL: 17

REACHING 30 WINS

With two playoff appearances in his first three years, Jim Caldwell has established himself as one of the most successful head coaches in recent franchise history. In his 52nd game as the Lions Head Coach (Week 4 at Min; 10/1/17), Caldwell led the team to a 14-7 win at Minnesota and recorded his 30th overall win since joining the Lions in 2014. By reaching 30 career wins > One of four head coaches to produce 24+ regular-season with the club in 52 games, he became the fastest Lions head coach to reach 30 career wins since Head Coach Buddy Parker, who recorded 30 wins in 41 games (1951-54). His overall record > From 2003-09, Caldwell was the Colts quarterbacks coach and with the Lions stands at 34-27 (.557).

Beginning his football coaching career in 1977 as a graduate assistant at his alma mater, the University of Iowa, 2017 marks Caldwell's 40th consecutive season coaching football.

100 CLUB

With a 14-7 win over Minnesota in Week 4 of the 2017 season, After being appointed Ravens offensive coordinator in Caldwell logged his 56th overall win in his 100th career regular season game. His career record as a head coach (34-27 in DET; 26-22 in IND) now stands at 60-49 (.550) in 109 career games.

LIONS FINISH 9-7 IN 2016, EARN PLAYOFF BERTH

The Lions finished the 2016 season with a record of 9-7 and earned the team's second playoff berth in the past three seasons. The last time the Lions made the playoffs twice in a three-year span was 1997 and 1999.

➤ By earning a playoff berth in 2016, Caldwell joins Buddy Parker (1952, 1953) and Bobby Ross (1997, 1999) as the only coaches in Lions history to lead the team to the playoffs twice in their first three seasons with the club.

EIGHT COMEBACK WINS IN 2016

The Lions finished the 2016 season with a record of 9-7. In eight of the team's nine wins, the Lions trailed in the fourth quarter and went on to win the game. Detroit set a new NFL record, surpassing the previous total of seven set by the 2009 Indianapolis Colts (also coached by Jim Caldwell), for the most wins in a season after trailing in the fourth quarter.

COACHING OVERVIEW

> Hired as head coach for the Detroit Lions January 14, 2014.

In 16 previous NFL seasons, Caldwell has worked on coaching staffs that have led teams to 13 winning seasons and only twice finished below .500. Overall, Caldwell's teams he coached for have compiled a 172-97 regular season record, along with 14 playoff appearances, eight division titles, three conference championships and two Super Bowl wins.

➤ As an NFL head coach (six seasons), Caldwell has led a team to 11+ wins twice (14 with Indianapolis in 2009, 11 with Detroit in 2014). Coached in three Super Bowls with Indianapolis (XLI and XLIV) and Baltimore (XLVII) and won two Super Bowl titles (Ind and Bal).

➤ In his first year as head coach for IND (2009), he won the AFC Championship and led the franchise to Super Bowl XLIV. He became the first NFL coach to win his first 14 games and the fifth rookie head coach to reach the Super Bowl.

wins and a Super Bowl berth in their first two career seasons as head coach.

was also promoted to assistant head coach and associate head coach during that time. He worked closely with QB Peyton Manning and the team's quarterbacks. During that span, Indianapolis set NFL records with seven consecutive seasons finishing with 11+ wins (6, Dallas 1976-81) and 12+ victories (4, Dallas, 1992-95).

December 2012, Baltimore went on to win five of its next seven games, including Super Bowl XLVII. During that span, the offense averaged 400.6 yards per game, including an average of 410.3 yards per game during the four playoff wins.

QUINN MAKES HIS MARK



BOB QUINN
Executive Vice President and
General Manager
Years with Lions: 2
Years in NFL: 18

While working for the New England Patriots, he helped contribute to one of the most impressive stretches in NFL history, one that produced four Super Bowl titles, including the most recent championship in 2014 (Super Bowl XLIX). Since 2000, Quinn's first year with New England, the Patriots have won six AFC Championships, 13 AFC East titles, 12+ games in a season 10 times (which includes the past six years) and 10+ games in 14 of his 16 seasons.

FIRST SEASON AT THE HELM

Quinn's first season in the role of a franchise's top football executive culminated in a playoff appearance, and he became the only first-year executive among nine in the NFL to accomplish this feat since the 2013 season. In doing so, Quinn also became the Lions' first general manager to guide the team to the playoffs in his inaugural season since Nick Kerbawy in 1952.

Along with the nearly 40-percent changeover and upgrade to the team's roster that he inherited, Quinn's changes paid dividends in 2016 when the Lions finished 9-7 on the team's

way to the playoffs.

Entering his second season, Quinn's ongoing commitment to improve all aspects of the club's football operations has included restructuring the player personnel department and scouting evaluation processes; renovating the team's weight room and practice fields along with other facility improvements; upgrading the team's football information and video technology; and instituting a comprehensive nutritional program, which included the hiring of a performance dietician for the players.

DRAFTING EXPERTISE

Quinn's initial draft class in 2016 featured the selection of six linemen on offense and defense, the most linemen in a Lions draft since 1989 and the most ever in a seven-round draft. Highlighting last year's draft class was the Lions' first-round selection T Taylor Decker, who earned all-rookie honors in 2016. Additionally, DT A'Shawn Robinson and C/G Graham Glasgow would earn starting roles during their rookie seasons. > Of the 12 playoff teams in 2016, no team had members of its draft class play more games (108) than the Detroit Lions.

PATRIOTS PAST

During his time with New England, Quinn served a number of roles in the player personnel department, including most recently as Director of Pro Scouting from 2012-15. While he worked as Director of Pro Scouting, the Patriots won the 2014 Super Bowl and four-straight AFC East Division championships.

From 2009-2012, Quinn was the Assistant Director of Pro Personnel. For the previous nine years, Quinn worked in several different capacities within the Patriots player personnel department, including roles in college scouting as a National Scout and Regional Scout. He played an integral role in evaluating and procuring talent for the team through the NFL draft process, free agency, trades, etc.

WHAT TO WATCH FOR

TAKE IT AWAY, SLAY

The Lions defense stepped up in a big way in Detroit's 24-21 win over the Tampa Bay Buccaneers in Week 14, creating five turnovers, including two interceptions and three fumble it. And I think the biggest area he's made is really going after recoveries. This was the first time the Lions registered five-Bay, the Lions have now accumulated 24 takeaways in 2017, which are the most by the Lions through 13 games since the year. And I think that's a big difference, and I think that comes 2011 season.

Head Coach Jim Caldwell on the defense's ability to create turnovers in Week 14: "Got a lot of turnovers. The guys hit and ran to the ball and got tipped balls and things of that nature, which were good, a lot of great effort. Gave up a few yards along the way, but that's a team that doesn't give the ball away very often. So, I commend our defense for that and we hung in there."

CB Darius Slay highlighted the defensive performance, as the veteran defensive back continued his impressive 2017 campaign by recording six tackles (five solo), two pass defenses, a fumble recovery and an interception on the day. Now with five interceptions on the season, Slay became the first Lions cornerback to record five picks in a season since CB Chris Houston in 2011. Furthermore, with his first-career fumble recovery in the first quarter, in addition to the interception, Week 14 marked just the second time in Slay's career that he generated two defensive takeaways in a game, both from this season (Atlanta 9/24).

Slay on what he saw on his interception at Tampa Bay: " ${
m I}$ saw them rolling out, so my first guess was like, 'It's got to be some type of out route. And I just made a play on it. I jumped it and used my football IQ and I made the play."

Slay on what allowed the defense to create five turnovers at Tampa Bay: "We just made it simple for us, man. We just went out there and played ball. A lot of guys have been thinking too much. A lot of guys are out of the position they used to be in and we're just making plays, man, smart. We just know the scheme right now. We know what we came here to do. We came here to dominate and that's what we did."

Slay has now amassed 47 total tackles, 17 pass defenses (ties a single-season career high), five interceptions and a fumble recovery through the first 14 weeks of the season. Through 13 games, he has recorded the second-most takeaways (five interceptions, one fumble) in the NFL this season and is the first Lions cornerback with six-plus takeaways in a season since CB Alphonso Smith in 2010 (five interceptions, one fumble).

Defensive Coordinator Teryl Austin on where Slay has made the biggest growth this year: "I would say the biggest area is obviously he's very comfortable with what we do and how we do the ball and attacking the ball with no fear. A lot of times guys, plus takeaways in a game since the team had six vs. Minnesota if you're not sure you're going to get there, you're not quite December 11, 2011. Additionally, with five takeaways at Tampa sure, you take the safe route and knock the ball down. But you see him really going after plays and trying to get the ball this with confidence and obviously he's got plenty of that."

WHATEVER IT TAKES

Week 14 of the regular season showed continued resilience from QB Matthew Stafford. Stafford, who is currently ranks second in the NFL in passing yards this season with 3,683, had himself a day against the Tampa Bay Buccaneers. The veteran quarterback helped secure a crucial team win by contributing 381 yards and one touchdown. Stafford notched his 38th career 300+yard passing game and further proved his commitment to his teammates at a crucial point of the season despite fighting through a hand injury suffered in Week 13 at Baltimore.

Stafford on how much battling through injuries is his willingness to be competitive: "Yeah, I think for me I just want to be out there. I want to be competitive, I want to be fighting through whatever I can to play with the guys. I think, like I said, I'm not the only guy in that locker room and I think we all have a responsibility to each other to do everything we possibly can to be ready. And I think guys take it serious in that locker room and do a great job."

Stafford finished the game with a 81.8-percent completion percentage, which tied for the third-highest single-game total in NFL history by a passer with 44+ pass attempts in a game. Stafford finished the game with 36 completions on 44 attempts and became the first passer in team history to attempt 40+ passes in a game and complete over 80-percent of his passes, surpassing the 78.6 completion percentage accumulated by Stafford at Tennessee September 23, 2012.

With the win, No. 9 secured his 32nd career game-winning drive when trailing or tied in the fourth quarter or in overtime. Against the Buccaneers, Stafford guided the Lions to nine-play, 49-yard drive that positioned the team for a game-winning 46yard field goal. Stafford tied Falcons QB Matt Ryan for the most game-winning drives by a player in his first nine seasons. Since Jim Caldwell became the Lions head coach in 2014, the Lions quarterback has now led the team to 20 game-winning drives in the fourth quarter or overtime, the most in the NFL over the past four seasons.



WHAT TO WATCH FOR

Caldwell on the toughness that Stafford has shown Active Roster Only since he's been the head coach in Detroit: "Yeah, I don't think there's any question about that even before I arrived. Player Mentioned it here on several occasions, you probably could Ameer Abdullah check those transcripts if you go back well enough, do a little Ezekiel Ansah research. DT Akeem Spence on pulling out a win at Tampa Bay before returning home to face another division opponent: it's the NFL. It's hard to win. Every game, there's no slouches in the NFL. I hope we didn't think we were going to come in here and roll out the red carpet and they were just going to let us come out here and win. We have to fight for everything. It was hard fought, we got the W and then on to next week. Chicago, we had a tough game up there. We know they're going to bring it, so we just got to keep fighting."

The Lions 38.6-percent improvement since 2014 against divisional opponents is the largest winning percentage increase in the NFL when comparing the past four seasons (2014-17) to the first 12 seasons (2002-13) of the current alignment structure. The Lions record of 14-8 (.636) against the NFC North since 2014 ranks as the seventh-best divisional winning percentage in the NFL during that span.

Caldwell on continuing the team's late-season push by finishing close games: "Yeah, it's always been kind of a hallmark of ours, being able to battle at the end. Our guys show great resilience and they don't get nervous in tough situations at the end of games. They find a way to win it, and not always (will) be pretty. We've always been like that, but we lost quite a few this year just the opposite side of that with Atlanta and Carolina, and a couple others that were close right there at the end. We weren't able to finish them. So, we have been uncharacteristic in the middle portion of the season. So, hopefully we can see if we can continue to do that and be a little bit better this next week."

With two touchdown passes in the Lions' Week 8 comeback win over Atlanta in London in 2014 (10/26/14), Stafford reached 120 touchdown passes for his career and became the Lions' all-time leader in that category, breaking Hall of Fame QB Bobby Layne's previous record of 118. His current total stands at 210.

At Green Bay (11/6), Stafford connected with WR Marvin Jones, Jr. on a 25-yard TD that marked his 200th career touchdown pass. By reaching 200 career pass TDs in his 117th game, Stafford accomplished this feat in the sixth-fewest games in NFL history. (Credit: Elias Sports Bureau)

Stafford finished the 2016 regular season with 4,327 passing yards and reached 4,000 in a season for the sixth time in his career and for the sixth-consecutive season. By reaching 4,000 yards, Stafford joined QB Peyton Manning as the only quarterbacks in NFL history to throw for 4,000 yards in six of a player's first eight seasons. He also joined Drew Brees (11), Peyton Manning (6) and Matt Ryan (6) as the only players in NFL history to throw for 4,000 yards in six-consecutive seasons.

His 4,327 yards in 2016 rank fifth in team history. Stafford now claims six of the Top-7 highest single-season totals for passing yards in franchise history.

At Tampa Bay, the Lions secondary registered two interceptions (Darius Slay and Quandre Diggs), two fumble recoveries (Darius Slay, DJ Hayden) and two forced fumbles (Quandre Diggs, Glover Quin). The last time an NFL team's secondary recorded at least 2 interceptions, 2 fumble recoveries and 2 forced fumbles in the same game was the San Diego Chargers at Denver January 3, 2016. This is the first time the Lions secondary has recorded at least 2 in each of those three

defensive categories since at least 1991.

THE SNAPPING STANDARD

Muhlbach has served as one of the most critical pieces to the Lions field goal unit since he began long snapping for the Lions during the 2004 season (Week 10 at Jacksonville 11/14/04). He has snapped on 53 successful attempts from 50+ yards, which is the highest total by a long snapper since 2000. Over the past 18 seasons, he is the first and only long snapper to reach 50+ snaps on field goals made from 50-yards and beyond.

➤ In 2017, Muhlbach has snapped on seven 50+yard field goals, and now has 5+ snaps on 50-yarders in each of the past three seasons (5 in 2015, 7 in 2016). Carey recorded three total (solo) special teams tackles against Carolina in Week 5, the second-highest single-game total of his career. He now has 68 career special teams tackles as he became the fifth Lions player since 1994 to accumulate 60+ special teams tackles.

In the third quarter at New Orleans, Rookie CB **Jamal Agnew** returned a Saints punt 74 yards for a touchdown, his second of the season. He joined Hall of Fame CB Jack Christiansen (4 in 1951) as the only rookies in Lions history to return 2+ punts for TDs.

➤ He also became the fifth Lions player ever to record 2+ punt return touchdowns in a season, joining Christiansen (4 in 1951, 2 in 1952), Tom Watkins (2 in 1964), WR Eddie Drummond (2 in 2004) and WR Andre Roberts (2 in 2016).

Through Week 14, Agnew's two punt return TDs rank first in the NFL, as well as his 16.8 punt return average (22 PR, 370 vards).

SERIES NOTES

The Lions hosted the Bears for the inaugural Thanksgiving Day game on 11/29/34. The game, played in front of a then-record 26,000 fans at the University of Detroit Stadium, was won by the Bears, 19-16, giving the Bears the Western Division championship. NBC Radio Network broadcasted the game coast-to-coast and a Thanksgiving <u>tradition was born.</u>

➤ On Thanksgiving Day in 1997 (11/27), the Lions downed the Bears 55-20 for their largest offensive output ever against Chicago. RB Barry Sanders rushed for 167

Chicago. RB Barry Sanders rushed for 167 yards and three touchdowns in the win at the Silverdome. Earlier in the 1997 season, Sanders put up 161 yards on Chicago in a 32-7 victory over the Bears.

WR Herman Moore set a franchise record with 14 catches for 183 yards in a 27-7 win (12/4/95)at the Pontiac Silverdome. His record has since been tied by WR Calvin Johnson (10/27/13 vs. Dal).

Detroit had its best stretch against the Bears when it won 11 of 12 games from 9/22/68-12/9/73.

Five contests have gone to overtime—including both in 2002— with the Bears winning four of them.

winning four of them.
➤ In the 2004 season opener (9/12), Detroit topped Chicago 20-17 to end its 24-game road losing streak. A key play in the game

road losing streak. A key play in the game was S Bracy Walker's return of a blocked FG an NFL-record 92 yards.

With the Lions trailing 13-3 going into the fourth quarter vs. Chicago at Ford Field (9/30/07), the Lions reeled off an NFL record 34 points in the quarter to claim a 37-27 win. It marked just the fifth time in NFL history a team scored 30 or more points in a quarter. Detroit scored five touchdowns, including two passing one touchdowns, including two passing, one rushing, one interception and one kickoff return. The teams also combined for 48 points, which is a record for combined

fourth quarter points.

On 10/28/07, the Lions defeated the Bears 16-7 at Soldier Field. K Jason Hanson, connected on a 52-yarder, which was his career longest against the Bears on the road, and marked the longest in franchise history by a Lions kicker on the road vs. Chicago. It also marked the first 50-yard field goal on the road vs. the Bears by a Lions kicker in the series that dates back to 1930. Almost one year to the exact date (11/2/08), Hanson repeated this feat when he hit another 52 varder vs. the Bears.

➤ In front of a Ford Field record crowd (67,861), Detroit defeated the Bears 24-13 on ESPN's Monday Night Football (10/10/11). It was the Lions' first appearance on MNF since 2001. The game was highlighted by a 73-yard touchdown bomb from QB Matthew Stafford to WR Calvin Johnson and the second-longest rush in team history by RB Jahvid Best (88-yards). The crowd was so electric that their noise played a large part in Chicago committing nine false start penalties throughout the game.

► With two receiving touchdowns in the

With two receiving touchdowns in the Lions' 21-19 win at Chicago on (11/10/13), WR Calvin Johnson recorded his 62nd and 63rd career touchdowns and set a

new Lions career record for receiving touchdowns. He broke the record of 62 previously set by WR Herman Moore. Detroit's road victory marked the first win

at Soldier Field since a 16-7 win on 10/29/07.

In the Lions 75th Thanksgiving game (11/27/14), Detroit defeated the Chicago Bears 34-17. With 146 receiving yards against Chicago, WR Calvin Johnson against Chicago, WR Calvin Johnson against Chicago.

surpassed 10,000 career yards and became the first player in Lions history with 10,000 yards. He accomplished this feat in 115 games and set a new NFL

record for the fewest games to record 10,000 receiving yards.

With a 20-14 win at Chicago (12/21/14), the Lions reached 11 wins on the season for the fourth time in franchise history and the first since 1991, Head Coach Jim

Caldwell became the first Lions head coach in his first season with the club to win 11 games since Potsy Clark led the Portsmouth Spartans to an 11-3 record in 1931. By reaching 11 wins, Caldwell has tied Clark for the most wins by a head

tied Clark for the most wins by a head coach in his first year with the Lions.

With 74 receiving yards at Chicago on 10/2/16, WR Marvin Jones Jr. (482) registered the most receiving yards

by any player in Lions history through the first four games of a season. Jones passed WR Calvin Johnson's previous best of 423 yards in the first quarter of the 2012 season.

In Week 14 vs. Chicago (12/11/16), QB Matthew Stafford completed 21-of-35 passes (60.0 pct) for 223 yards and 1 touchdown in the Lions' 20-17 win over the Bears. Stafford led the Lions on a fourth-quarter comeback as he completed the game-winning drive with a 7-yard scramble for a touchdown with 3:17 left to play in the game. It was Stafford's eighth game-winning drive in the fourth quarter or OT in 2016, an NFL record.

The Lions started the season with a victory over Arizona in the season-opener 35-23. Both teams exchanged turnovers on their opening drives of the season, soon after Lions S Tavon Wilson's interception. Lions QB Matthew Stafford threw an interception on Detroit's first possession caught by Cardinals CB Justin Bethel who would return it 82 yards for a touchdown, putting the Cardinals up 7-0. Cardinals K Phil Dawson would later convert on a 24-yard field goal attempt, making it 10-0. After a few stalled drives from both teams, the Lions would get their first touchdown of the season, which was set up nicely by S Glover Quin's interception. It came with 4:30 left in the first half as Stafford found MR Maryin Jones Jr. for a 6-yard touchdown of the season of the se capping off an 11 play, 42-yard drive. Just before time expired in the first half, Lions K Matt Prater knocked through a 58-yard field goal putting the score at 10-9 going into halftime. Out of the half, it was Arizona scored first following an impressive 94yard drive from the Cardinals offense, as RB Kerwynn Williams took a handoff from Palmer up the middle for a 3-yard score, making it 17-9. However, the Lions defense once again would step up for the Lions, as DT A'Shawn Robinson would force a fumble while bringing down Cardinals RB David Johnson. The Lions made good on their opportunity, as Matthew Stafford found RB Theo Riddick in the middle of the field for a 7-yard touchdown to finish off a drive that took the Lions only two plays and 45 seconds to complete, closing the score to 17-15 in favor of the Cardinals. The ensuing Cardinals drive stalled thanks in part to a sack from DE Anthony Zettel, and the Lions once again able to respond as WR Kenny Golladay found the end zone on a 10-yard pass from Stafford for his first-career touchdown, giving the Lions a 21-17 lead with 9:33 left in the fourth quarter. It would not take Stafford long to once again connect with Golladay for a score, after another stalled Cardinals drive, Golladay was hit in stride and leaped into the air to bring down his second touchdown of the day on a 45-yard deep ball, once again extending the Lions lead to 28-17. The Lions defense would continue the already impressive performance. On the first play of the Cardinals ensuing drive, S Miles Killebrew picked off Palmer's pass intended for RB Andre Ellington for a 45-yard interception touchdown return upping the lead to 35-17 in favor of the Lions with 4:13 left to play in the game. It was the Lions third interception and fourth turnover created on the day. The Cardinals however would come down the field and score one last time, as Palmer finished off a 75-yard drive with a 1-yard touchdown pass to Cardinals J.J. Nelson, narrowing the Lions lead to 35-23. After a failed onside kick attempt, Stafford closed the win by taking a knee.

The Detroit Lions improved to 2-0 for the first time since 2011 after defeating the New York Giants 24-10 at MetLife Stadium on Monday Night Football. The first score of the game came after both offenses exchanged stalled drives, as QB Matthew Stafford was able to lead his offense down the field 54 yards to set up a 27-yard touchdown strike to WR Marvin Jones Jr. On the very next drive, Giants QB Eli Manning drove down the field for a score, leading his offense to an 8-play, 75-yard drive capped off by an 19-yard touchdown pass to rookie TE Evan Engram to tie things up at 7-7 at the start off the second quarter. The teams then exchanged turnovers on back-to-back plays. A Stafford fumble gave the Giants possession of the ball, but Lions LB Tahir Whitehead was able to pick off a Manning pass intended for Engram on the ensuing possession. The Lions were then able to take advantage of the short field in front of them, as Stafford found the end zone for the second time of the night, this time connecting with TE Eric Ebron on a 7-yard touch pass to put the Lions up 14-7 with 8:43 left in the second quarter. With :30 seconds left in the first half, K Matt Prater was able to knock a 56-yard field goal off the bottom post, giving the Lions the 17-7 lead into halftime. The Giants struck first in the second half, as K Aldrick Rosas connected on a 25-yard attempt, capping off a 10 play, 68-yard drive and cutting the Lions' lead down to 17-10 with 4:58 left in the third quarter. The final scoring play of the game was generated off of special teams, as Lions rookie CB Jamal Agnew returned a Brad Wing punt 88yards for a Lions touchdown, increasing the lead to 24-10 with 12:56 remaining in the fourth quarter. Agnew became the first player in Lions history to return a punt for a touchdown on Monday Night Football.

On the ensuing Lions drive, Prater would make his fifth field goal attempt of the game, a 19-yard attempt, pulling the Steelers back to a five-point lead at 20-15, a lead they would hold on to until the end of regulation.

The Lions improved to 7-6 on the season after a 24-21 road victory over the Tampa Bay Buccaneers. After both teams punted on their respective opening drives, Lions RB Theo Riddick would cap off a seven play, 74-yard drive with a one-yard touchdown rush, putting Detroit up 7-0 early. On the ensuing Buccaneers possession, RB Doug Martin rushed it in from one yard out for a touchdown, tying the game at 7-7 with 2:51 left in the first quarter. With 7:41 left in the second quarter, Lions QB Matthew Stafford found WR Golden Tate for a five-yard touchdown pass making it 14-7 in favor of Detroit. In the third quarter, Riddick found the end zone for a second time with an 18-yard touchdown run, extending the Lions lead to 21-7. With 13:47 left in the fourth quarter, the Buccaneers would reduce the Lions lead to one touchdown as QB Jameis Winton connected with TE 0.J. Howard for a short two-yard touchdown pass, setting the score at 21-14. The passing touchdown capped off a 10-play, 75 yard drive for the Buccaneers that took 4:30 to complete. After the ensuing Lions drive stalled T Leonard Wester lined up as an eligible receiver along the goal line for the Buccaneers. Winston dumped it off to Wester for a Buccaneers two-yard touchdown pass, effectively tying the game at 21-21. After Stafford moved the offense into Buccaneers territory, K Matt Prater came out to attempt a 46-yard field with just :25 seconds left in the game. Prater successfully connected from 46-yards out for the 14th game-winning field goal of his career with less than 2:00 to play in the fourth quarter or overtime, sealing the Lions' 24-21 win over Tampa Bay.
